BOY! A POCKET GENIE!

Finding your Game Boy games difficult to beat? Not for long, thanks to this great new piece of kit from Hornby! It's called the Game Boy Genie, and it's the latest in a line of similar products allowing you to cheat on all your carts! The ball started rolling with the Game Genie on the NES, which those guys down Nintendo way weren't at all happy about, and moved on to the Megadrive, gaining full support and, indeed, the coveted Seal of Approval from Sega!

Basically, the Game Boy Genie works by reading the information stored on a Game Boy cartridge, finding the appropriate lines of code that determine lives, time and such, and gives the player the opportunity to alter that code to make games easier to play and complete! The cleverly colour co-ordinated little gizmo slots into the cartridge slot of your Boy, with games plugging into the Genie, and although you'll need to have quite hefty pockets to be able to carry the whole setup around, there's no denying that this is a very handy unit indeed!

Hornby say that the Game Boy Genie will work with any Game Boy game, and that they'll be releasing stacks of codes for carts old and new on a regular basis. We reckon that this is going to be something special - keep an eye out for it!

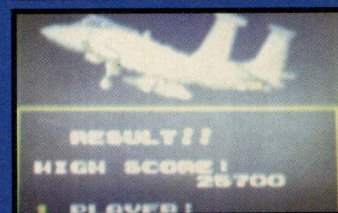

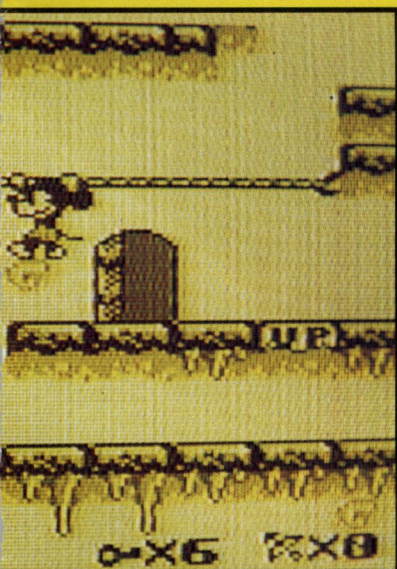
SEEN THE FILM GOT THE T - SHIRT

THE TERMINATOR

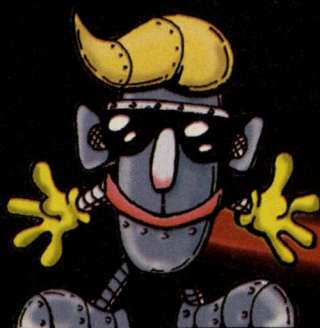

SPEEDBALL 2

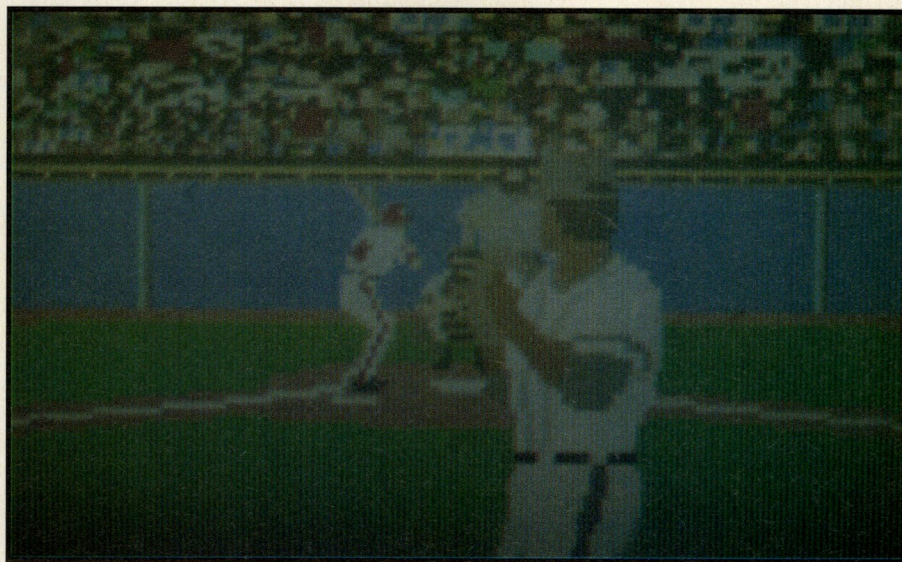
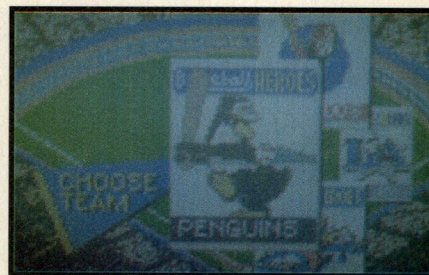

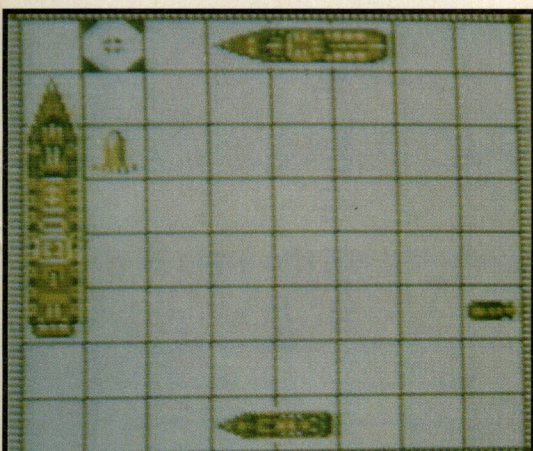
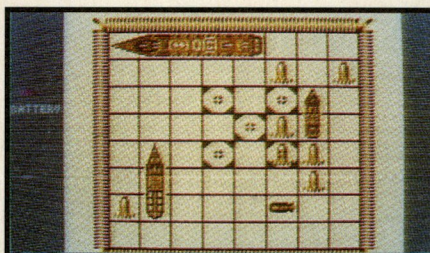
Baseball sims have been the darlings of the computer and consoles world for years, but one has yet to make an entrance on the Lynx - until now, that is. It's called **Baseball Hero** and, as you can see from the screen shots taken from the Beta Test version which found its way into the **GO!** office, it looks very tasty indeed. The most familiar problem with Baseball is that they just do not play well or realistically and the graphics can be a tad confusing. Fortunately though, this is not the case with **Baseball Hero**. Sprites are well drawn - both large and clear and animation is really smart. Sound is also of a high quality, with some brilliant

speech and pretty good effects dotted here and there throughout the proceedings. From what we've seen of this it looks as though **Baseball Heroes** could score a well-deserved home-run. Watch out for an up and coming **GO!** Review in the near future.

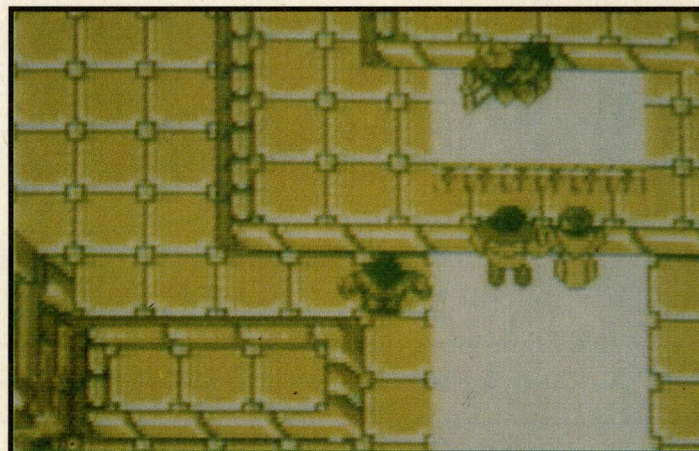


ROBIN HOOD

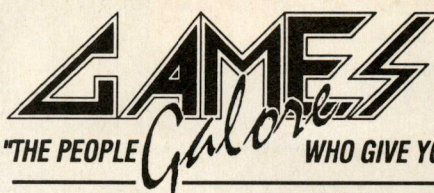

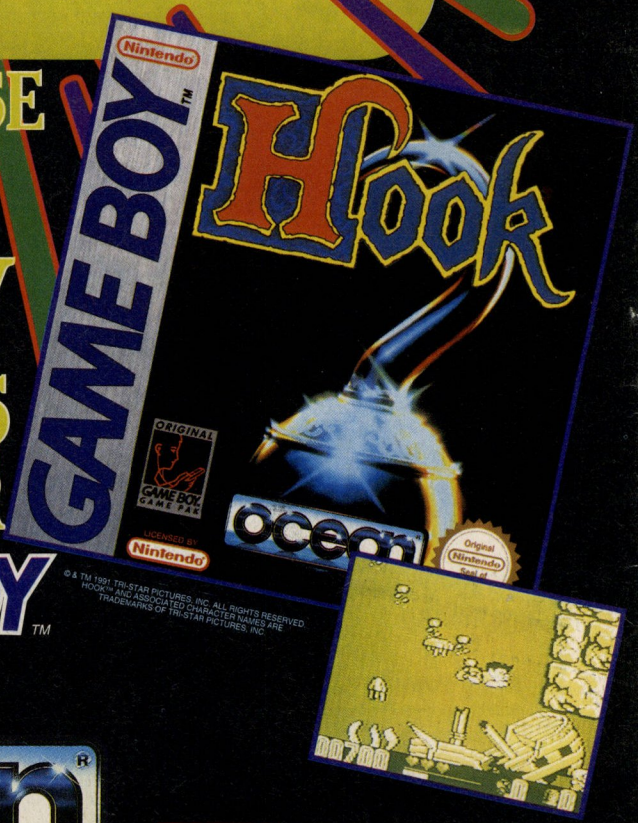
