THE CASH BOX POP POLL

The Cash Box Disk Jockey Poll was designed to determine which songs and artists have been the most popular and played the most during the past several months by deejays around the country.

The Poll was divided into three sections, popular, rhythm and blues, and country. Here we present the findings in the pop field.

Each disk jockey listed three choices in each category. Three points were awarded for each first choice, two points for each second choice, and one

point for each third choice. Of the total number of points cast, the following is the percentage each artist received. The maximum percentage an artist

could possibly receive was 50% since even if every disk jockey voted the same artist #1, it would still add up to only 50% of the six points available in each category.

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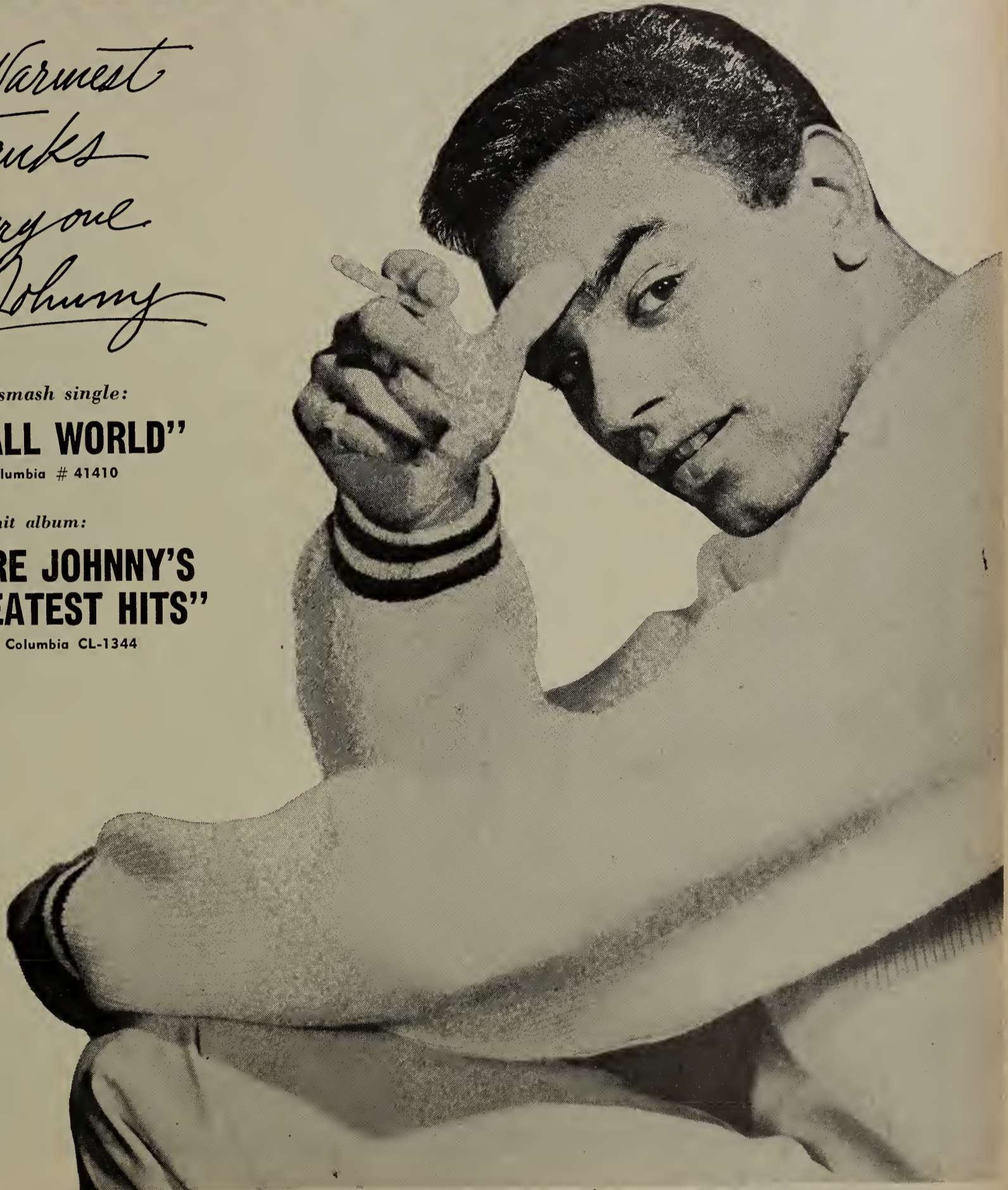

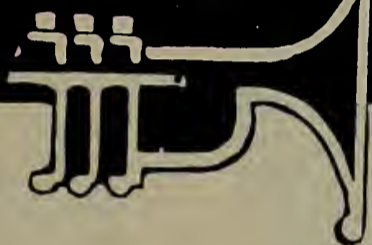

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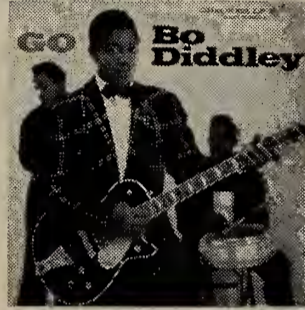

"SWING ME AN OLD SONG"—Julie London—Liberty LRP 3119

A dozen chestnuts provide vehicles for Miss London's provocative voice, and new breath is instilled into the tunes. Exciting ork-chorus backing is provided by Jimmy Rowles, fiercely swinging the fast numbers and appropriately subdued on the quiet tracks. Numbers include "Comin' Thru The Rye," "Camptown Races," "Darktown Strutters Ball" and "How Come You Do Me Like You Do." The swingin'est London yet.



"GO BO DIDDLEY"—Checker LP 1436

Bo Diddley has called on his three talents—songwriting, guitar playing, singing—to produce another set of exciting sounds. Leading off the deck of twelve self-penned items is Diddley's current two-market hit, "Crackin' Up," followed by such others as "I'm Sorry," "The Great Grandfather," "Little Girl" and two instrumentals. Big two-market potential riding here.



"THE AMAZING NINA SIMONE"—Colpix CP 407

Emerging as one of the bright new singing talents of the year, Nina Simone makes her Colpix LP debut, riding the R&B charts with her Bethlehem single of "Porgy." Package makeup spotlights her many vocal facets as it includes blues, spirituals, pop and jazz tunes: among them "Blue Prelude," "Children Go Where I Send You," "That's Him Over There" and "It Might As Well Be Spring." Her deep-toned expressive voice and exquisite phrasing are a listening delight. Outstanding album.

TONY BENNETT
HOMETOWN, MY TOWN



"HOMETOWN, MY TOWN"—Tony Bennett—Columbia CL 1301 (Monaural & Stereo)

A musical portrait of New York City in which Bennett presents various moods through extended performances of six songs. Opening with a poignant reading of Gordon Jenkins' haunting "Skyscraper Blues," Bennett then moves quietly or exuberantly through "Penthouse Serenade," "All By Myself," "I Cover The Waterfront," "Love is Here To Stay" and "The Party's Over." Ralph Burns' ork provides excellent backing. Outstanding set which can assume chart status.

"LURE OF PARADISE"—Andre Kostelanetz—Columbia CL 1335 (Monaural & Stereo)

Kostelanetz' soaring strings in the environment of exotic music, playing tunes flavored with the Pacific and Far East areas. 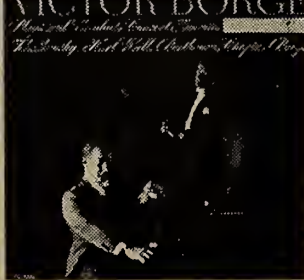

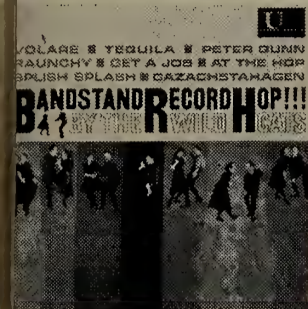
VICTOR BORGE

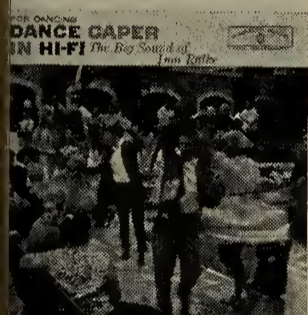
"BANDSTAND RECORD HOP"—The Wild Cats featuring Billy Mure—United Artists UAL 3031 & Stereo UAS 6031

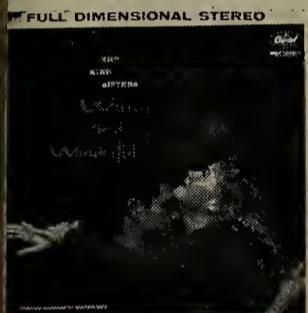
"RENE TOUZET AT THE CRESCENDO"—GNP 40

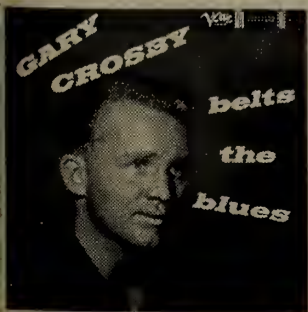
"LEAVE IT TO JANE"—Jane Harvey—Dot DLP 3158

Gary Crosby exhibits a solid singing talent here, though not all the tunes are blues and several are not belted. Marty Paich is present with exceptionally fine musical support for Crosby on such tunes as "What's Your Story Morning Glory," "Baltimore Oriole," "Mood Indigo" and "I Miss You So," superb but usually neglected numbers. Deck should open new doors for Crosby.

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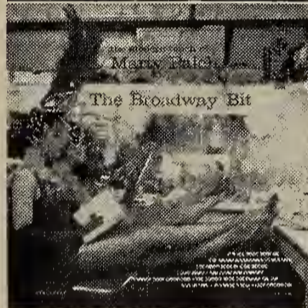
"CHA-CHA CHARM"—Jan August and his Orch.—Mercury MG 20408 & Stereo SR 60082

Pianist Jan August takes a small group of fine musicians and through the use of unique arrangements and fine stereo separation, fashions a music-filled set of contagious Latin danceables. Assisting August are organist Eddie Layton, guitarist Tony Mottola, an xylophone, French horn, bass and drums—all swinging cohesively on Latinized versions of "If I Could Be With You," "Begin The Beguine," "Lazy River" and "Tea For Two"; all cha cha chas. "ALL AMERICAN ACCORDIONIST" — Tony Lavelli—Urania USD 2021 (Monaural & Stereo)

Former All-American basketball player at Yale, and now a night club attraction, Lavelli's accordion virtuosity is heard on sixteen tunes, most of which are evergreens. He is assisted by an ork, but never relinquishes the spotlight on such memorables as "That Old Black Magic," "Beautiful Dreamer," "Lady of Spain" and "Chinatown, My Chinatown." Top item of its kind.



"THE BROADWAY BIT"—Marty Paich—Warner Bros. W 1296 & Stereo WS 1296

With due acknowledgment to their great melodies, Marty Paich has taken nine show tunes, refashioned them with modern settings and given them a lively, extended reading in this album. The arranger-leader has presumably lined up impressive soloists for the date, as the set is saturated with fine unbilled musicians. Tunes include "Younger Than Springtime," "If I Were A Bell," "I Love Paris" and "I've Never Been In Love Before." Exciting listening and dancing platter.



"A LITTLE BOY SINGS FLAMENCO"—Jose-lito—RCA Victor LPM 1979 & Stereo LSP 1979

Joselito, at twelve a Spanish film veteran, captured first prize at the International Film Festival of Venice, and has been dubbed "the boy with the golden voice." This title is most deserving as demonstrated by the remarkable singing performances in this set. The dozen tunes here, mostly flamenco, are from his latest films, and can achieve world-wide fame as his films have. Amazing album.



"HAVE HARP, CAN'T TRAVEL"—The Stanley-Johnson Orch.—Liberty LST 7118 (Mono & Stereo)

Ray Stanley and Hal Johnson have formed a very unique ork, two harps, two pianos, two bass, two percussionists, mallets and flute, which proves especially effective in stereo. The harps are the basic solo instruments on tunes which have been selected and arranged for the expressed purpose of showcasing their capabilities. Tunes include "I Got Rhythm," "Holiday For Strings," "Beyond the Sea" and "The Breeze and I." Exciting music and brilliant stereo makes this a choice musical package.



"JEAN SHEPHERD AND OTHER FOIBLES"—Elektra 172

Eleven stories are related by humorist Shepherd in his conversational style. Though the subjects touch on everyday Americana, they reflect the "beat" outlook, with Shepherd's whispered delivery adding to the effect. Deck is a real way out excursion. Liner notes by cartoonist Shel Silverstein, who also supplies kazoo and washboard music bridges between Shepherd's monologues, are a hilarious treat in themselves. For far-out humor shelf.

Acknowledged as the most important tenor sax man today, Rollins joins forces with other formidable jazz giants to offer his amazingly inventive improvisations of eight sturdy pop tunes. Selections include "I've Told Ev'ry Little Star," "The Song Is You," "Alone Together" and "How High The Moon." Jazz at its best; Important issue.

Among the musicians are Art Farmer, Harry Edison, Charlie Shavers, Bob Brookmeyer, Zoot Sims, Al Cohn, Phil Woods, Gene Quill, Charlie Persip, Bill Evans and others of equal calibre. Fourteen pages of pictures and data of the recording are extremely helpful. Issued as a limited edition in a book-type package, this is one of the best "P&B's" to date.



"SERENATA"—Bobby Scott, pianist—Verve MG V-8297

Ten subdued pieces are played by the young modern jazz pianist, offering a change of pace here by doing three of the numbers on vibes. Aside from the two Scott originals present, tunes include "Blues For Jamie," "Black Coffee," "Lover Man" and "I Remember You." Quiet jazz expression that continues to reveal Scott's increasing talents.



"SYNCOPATED CHAMBER MUSIC" — Red Nichols and his Pennies—Audiophile XL 326

The legendary Red Nichols, whose life has stirred up much current interest due to the "Five Pennies" flick, heads a six-man group here, playing eleven oldies in his familiar 1920's style. Sidemen include Joe Rushton, Matty Matlock and Nick Fatool on such tunes as "Tin Roof Blues," "Manhattan Rag," "Memories of You" and "Candlelights." Nostalgic interest.

NEW YORK — Lou Krefetz has been named national sales manager for United Artists Records, it was announced last week by David V. Picker, executive vice president of the company.

Krefetz, who assumes responsibility for directing sales of all United Artists Records product, is an industry veteran. During his career he has

been active in every phase of the record field. He entered the record business with the ARA label which operated out of Washington, D.C. Subsequently, he spent several years in record distribution with Oriole Distributors in Baltimore. In 1951, he discovered a group known as the Clovers which under his direction produced numerous hit records.

In 1952, Krefetz became national sales manager for Atlantic Records. He left in 1956 to produce a series of touring musical shows in cooperation with Shaw Artists.

Busy Connie Francis

NEW YORK—Connie Francis has been set for a series of recording dates, night club appearances, TV spots and guest performances that have been keeping her busy for the past month and will continue to do so for the next few.

Miss Francis' itinerary reads as follows: July 6: Recording session at Metropolitan Studios. July 8: Guest singer at a Providence, R.I., "block party," sponsored by a local radio station. July 9: Morning recording session followed by appearance on the Dick Clark "American Bandstand." July 10: Taped Australian deejay show and recorded jingles for the Heart Fund. July 11: Recording session. July 15-18: Show headliner at the Bolero in Wildwood, N. J. July 20: Appearance at the Casino Royal, Washington, D. C. August 13-15: Nightclub appearance in Ottawa, Can. August 18-27: Trip to England, France and Germany. Will cut four albums in England. August 27: Appearance on the Dick Clark Hollywood Bowl TV show. September 12-14: Night club engagement in Detroit. October 17: Leaves on an Australian tour.

MIAMI BEACH—At its sales convention here last weekend, Columbia Records introduced a seven-inch 33¹/₃ rpm stereophonic single record, with playing time up to 3½ minutes (the same as the present 45 single). The series, known as "Stereo Seven," will carry a list price of 98 cents, also the same as 45 singles, and will feature a selected repertoire from the current Columbia catalogue.

Goddard Lieberman, president of Columbia, stated the following reasons for the issuance of "Stereo Seven":

"We are aiming 'Stereo Seven' at what we think is a new and different audience for single records—the adult audience which has largely abandoned single-record buying in recent years. As consistent 33¹/₃ rpm LP buyers—and stereo fans in growing numbers—we believe they will be attracted by a 33¹/₃ rpm single; they have obviously never been attracted to 45 rpm singles requiring spindle adaptation.

"Today 33¹/₃ rpm disks account for 80% of total record industry sales volume. Thus we believe that 33¹/₃ rpm is certainly the logical speed for stereo singles, because consumers equipped for stereo are already LP purchasers. We think 'Stereo Seven' may also help to revitalize a singles market that has tended to flag in recent years."

The following constitutes the initial release on "Stereo Seven" records:

"Small World" and "You Are Everything To Me"—Johnny Mathis; "Anatomy of a Murder" and "Flirtibird"—Duke Ellington; "Smile" and "You

Can't Love 'Em All"—Tony Bennett; "Goodnight Irene" and "On Top of Old Smoky"—Mitch Miller and the Gang; "Got A Locket In My Pocket" and "The Real Thing"—the Four Lads; "Volare" and "I Love Paris"—the Kirby Stone Four; "Song From Moulin Rouge" and "Bouquet"—Percy Faith; "Love Is A Many Splendored Thing" and "Please"—Ray Conniff; "The Battle of New Orleans" and "All For The Love of A Girl"—Johnny Horton; "I Got Stripes" and "Five Feet High And Rising"—Johnny Cash.

Avon, Urania Subsid, Bows

NEW YORK—Sieg Bart, president of Urania Records, last week announced the formation of Avon Records, a subsidiary label that will produce low-priced stereo and monaural albums and singles.

First LP to be issued on Avon is "My Fair Lady," featuring an all-British cast accompanied by the Knightsbridge Theatre Chorus and Orchestra, available in stereo and monaural versions. The cast stars Hubert Gregg, who starred in the BBC performance of the show, Elizabeth Lerner, British musical comedy star, and John Slater. Conductor is John Gregory.

Bart, who feels that "special reduced-price classical and pop disks fill a real need in the continually expanding record business," plans to issue Avon albums every month, as well as regular Urania releases.

AF-Wallenstein Settle

NEW YORK—Audio Fidelity Records announced last week that it has amicably settled the litigation which was in process with conductor Alfred Wallenstein.

Wallenstein has recorded for the label's "First Component Series" with the Virtuoso Symphony of London and had failed to provide a written release for the recordings. The records in question are now completely approved and will be released in the fall.

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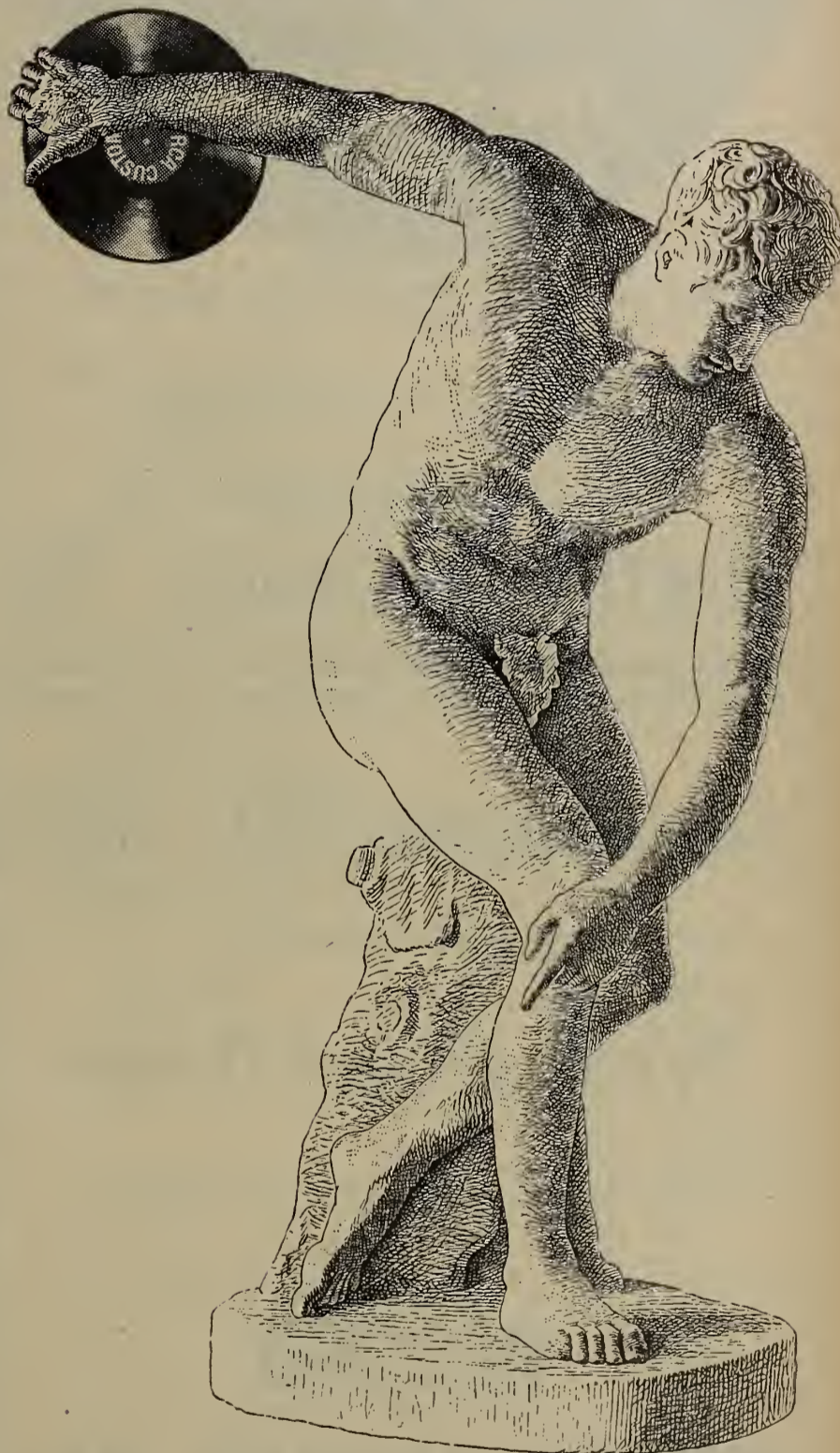

Britain's latest teenage idol, Cliff Richard, entered the chance this week with his latest release "Living Doll" which comes in at No. 15. Other new entries this week include Perry Como's "I Know" at No. 24 and Brook Benton's "Endlessly".

B.B.C. has won the battle with I.T.A. over Eddie Fisher. Lawrence Welk's "Champagne Music" series has been bought by B.B.C. and will be seen weekly in this country in the Autumn.

Although nothing definite is known yet it is thought that A.T.V. will secure the "Peter Gunn" series for Britain.

Watch for the new Edmundo Ros single, "Scotland the Brave". It is quite something.

The printing strike which still continues in this country is now affecting the record companies though only slightly at the moment.

"Trudie" has been in the British charts for one year and toasts were drunk in Tin Pan Alley over the week-end to her and to her composer recording artist and publisher—Joe Henderson.

Shirley Jones and her husband Jack Cassidy will return to Britain for a series of T.V. programmes in August. They will also tele-record several shows to be shown later in the year.

Jo Stafford starred in last Saturday's "Spectacular" which was tele-recorded during her recent visit to London.

Ted Heath and his Music fly to San Remo at the end of August for concerts. The band's next visit to America is scheduled for February 1960.

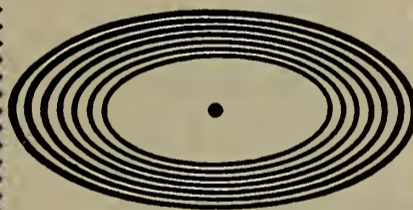

A new record club has sprung up in Sydney selling 12" LP products at 50¢ each. Most clubs are finding the going a lot tougher since the leading major labels began releasing top-grade low-priced disks on the open market. Public reaction to the low-priced LPs, whilst not overwhelming, is encouraging and with the heavy promotion and advertising campaigns behind them, it looks as though low-priced disks are here to stay.

Radio 2UE's star disk-jockey Bob Rogers, who is now on an overseas trip, has been sending back some interesting tapes for playing during his absence. Among the latest to be broadcast are interviews with Patti Page and Doris Day. Rogers is currently in England where he intends to visit his former secretary, Judy Wade, who is now with the Decca Company in London.

A surprise move in the record industry came during the week when popular representative Don Oates left the Mercury label's Melbourne headquarters. This week saw several other staff changes at Mercury, especially in their Sydney office.

Jack Argent of Leeds Music Pty. Ltd. in Sydney is on a quick visit to Melbourne to renew contacts in the trade. Also to appoint a distributor to handle the Leeds catalogue for Victoria and Tasmania. Jack is delighted over the success his publication "ONLY LOVE ME" is now enjoying via the Steve Lawrence disk.

John Laws, one of our best DJ's now working out of 2KO in Newcastle, with several programs beamed interstate through the Major Network, has bought a farm. In addition to supervising the management of his farm, John will still conduct his regular radio programs.

Alan Hefferman, from the Lee Gordon outfit, tells me that bookings for the forthcoming Lloyd Price & Co. show are very healthy. In fact they could well disprove the old belief that such shows "don't pay during the winter months". This new show, scheduled to start in Melbourne on 18th July, is the first Lee Gordon promotion to hit this country right in the middle of winter and if it proves a box-office success, it is almost certain that further shows will follow immediately.

For the third week in succession Lloyd Price's "Personality" is best-selling single throughout the nation and the Price visit to this country could keep it in the number one for a few more weeks. A strong contender for the top spot is Johnny Rebb's "Pathway To Paradise" which is already in the top ten in Sydney.

Judging by its fantastic leap into The Cash Box Top 100 Tunes, the RCA boys here can gear their pressing plant to absolute maximum capacity to cope with Presley's latest single, "A Big Hunk Of Love". RCA have already issued Ray Peterson's very attractive disk of "The Wonder Of You".

Graham Webb, who was conducting the early morning program on radio station 2KY, has joined the staff of 2UE where he commenced work on 3th July.

Records by local stars are really starting to hit the big time, among the artists currently enjoying hit parade success with their disks are Johnny Keefe, Denis Gibbons, Col Joye, Frankie Davidson, Heather Horwood, Johnny Rebb, Ernie Sigley, George Bracken and The Unichords. All of a sudden the record buying public is becoming conscious of disks by Australian talent to the point where they are selling almost equally as well as their overseas competition.

Performance: It's the Goodman sound all the way and the sound is excellent. Benny's big band. Helen Ward does three of her top tunes, "Never Again", "What A Little Moonlight Can Do", and "You're A Heavenly Thing". Great performance. Commercial Value: A natural. BG is as strong as ever. Deck should skyrocket sales. Name Value: Excellent.

"DINAH SHORE—BUTTONS AND BOWS" Harmony HL-7188, \$1.98
Content: Collection of Dinah's all-time hits including title, "Shoe-Fly Pie", "Dear Hearts", "Far Away Places" and others. Cover: Large color shot of the songbird with titles listed. Eye-catcher. Performance: Dinah glides through her past record of hits, cut before her TV fame, but in the same style heard today. Commercial Value: Shore fans should buy up the deck on strength of selections alone. TV fame gives added strength to LP. Name Value: It appears that Miss Shore will remain a top "name" on TV screens for a long while to come. Good rack choice.

"DANCE TO THE MUSIC OF 26 IRVING BERLIN SONGS", Jimmy Smith and His Orch., Vocalion VL-3664, \$1.98

Content: The bill of 26 Berlin tunes includes: "Alexander's Ragtime Band", "Blue Skies", "Easter Parade", "Cheek To Cheek", "They Say It's Wonderful", "You're Just In Love". MGM 1959 Distributor Convention Set For Nassau, July 30-31

NEW YORK — Arnold Maxin, president of MGM Records, announced last week that MGM Records' 1959 Distributor convention will be held at the British Colonial Hotel, Nassau, Bahamas, BWI, on July 30 and 31. This marks the first time that MGM Records has held a convention outside of the U.S.

Eddie Heller, Sol Handwerger and engineer Ed Budzinski will head the advance party, leaving on July 27 to

set up all details and to conclude all arrangements in Nassau.

Distributors are scheduled to arrive on Wednesday, July 29, and will receive full instructions as to the activity and the program for the two-day convention.

At press time MGM Records reports that every distributor has made arrangements to attend and that all are intrigued by the novelty of the idea.

Gavin Answers Questions Re DJ Org.

SAN FRANCISCO — The DeeJay Organization Bulletin No. 7 circulated by Bill Gavin, attempts to clear up some problems posed by disk jockeys in regard to the national organization, which held its first meeting in Milwaukee, this past weekend.

On the matter of the organization being dominated by "big guys" from the large cities, Gavin states that his "proposed revision of Article III of the draft constitution is designed to enlarge the National Board and convention so as to assure a large representation from outside the large cities."

In answer to Bob Klose (WFIL-Philadelphia), who's doubtful of the deejay's ability to maintain the organization without financial support from the record companies, Gavin comments that the financial problem is a big one, and that even 2,000 members paying \$10 dues a year would just barely provide a full time executive secretary and clerical help. A more optimistic objective, according to Gavin, would be just for an office secretary to handle the correspondence of the officers and national board.

Gavin reports on a proposal by Jim Hawthorne that would help the financial situation, that of televising the annual convention's all-star show under commercial sponsorship. The acts could be taped and edited for future viewing, with all revenues from this endeavor going to the deejay organization.

Concerning record company participation in the national convention Gavin discloses that the draft constitution provides for a joint advisory board made up of station managers and record manufacturers. "This would assure industry-wide planning and could eliminate the competitive promotional rat-race, which costs the manufacturers much more than it can possibly be worth".

Gavin then poses a list of reasons for the organization, outlining the advantages of membership. These reasons are as follows:

1. Public service. "Through a national organization such as this, the tremendous power of radio—and to a lesser extent television—could be concentrated on helping with such community problems as juvenile delinquency, improved recreation opportunities, pupil-teacher relationships in our schools, better inter-group relationships, and so on. Through our organization we could work with major public service projects on an effective national level, yet leaving it to each individual member how he might most effectively implement the project in his local community.
2. Professional growth. "Most men in our profession are ambitious, creative and hard working. Yet so many of us live almost isolated lives in our occupations. Our organization would expand opportunities for professional contacts, exchanges of ideas and experiences that could be of considerable mutual benefit. The idea of regional

meetings or seminars, in addition to a national convention, appeals to many as a practical arrangement.

3. Improved relations with the record industry. "It's pretty obvious that today's radio industry and the record industry are interdependent. The continuing prosperity of the one is essential to the other. In return for its music programming the question arises as to just what responsibility radio should accept for exposing new records. Other questions exist, such as formula radio's threat to the maximum sales potential of a hit record, and "fair trade" policies in dealing with promotion people. And yet there is now no common meeting ground where these critical problems can be discussed, on an industry level. A deejay association would be the ideal forum for such discussions of policy and practice.

4. Conventions. "We are indebted to Tod Storz for pioneering the national deejay conventions. However, many feel that a true disk jockey convention should not be sponsored by any single station ownership, but should be truly a joint effort by the deejays themselves. This idea embraces the joint participation of station management and of record manufacturers, through an Honorary Joint Advisory Committee."

In closing, Gavin states that they have not invited any record people to attend the Milwaukee discussions but he's sure there would be no objection to industry "observers" there. "Once the organization is a reality," concludes Gavin, "we will set up the Honorary Advisory Committee which will involve full industry representation from radio and record manufacturers."

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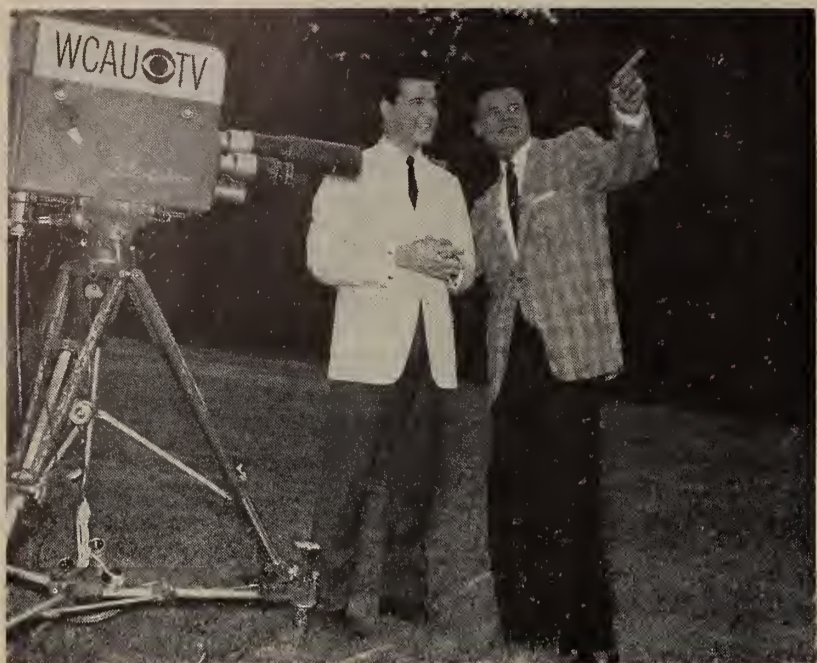

Columbia Unveils Sales Plans At Miami Convention

MIAMI BEACH—Analysis and intensification of marketing effort was the keynote of Columbia's 1959 Sales Convention discussion at the American Hotel in Miami Beach this past weekend (July 16-20). Plans for more effective merchandising of Fall and Winter products were presented at the gathering to more than 325 members of the Columbia sales organization as well as international representatives.

The sales program centered around a "Profit Pack," embodying fully integrated Fall product presentation. Each salesman was equipped with a deluxe zippered leather carrying case containing new product album covers, promotion material, catalogs, best-seller lists and order forms. The "Profit Pack" is designed to offer not only current product but suggested best-selling inventory for each catalog category—"Masterworks," popular, "Adventures in Sound," and Harmony. This guided selling program continues the Columbia plan introduced last year which offers dealers a 10 per cent exchange accrual on album purchases; by judicious purchasing, dealers will not require the 10 per cent return and can instead receive a five per cent credit (or 50 per cent of his 10 per cent exchange accrual).

Columbia's re-stocking plan, to be offered to dealers through distributors and branches, offered new August and September releases as well as the complete active catalog (except for Harmony and single records) at normal suggested dealer cost less ten per cent during the billing months of August and September.

Distributors and branches were offered extended dating terms (October, November, December, 1959) on purchases of all eligible catalog and new releases through August and September, 1959. Distributors and branches will extend and administer these credit advantages to their dealers based on their own local policies and credit terms.

New this year is a simplification of distribution on point of purchase material which will be shipped to distributors in individually packed cartons for salesmen's delivery to dealers.

Columbia also presented a completely reorganized accessories program, featuring brand name items at competitive prices and a quality needle line, uniquely catalogued to expedite identification and servicing by dealers.

Sales promotion: Major promotion in-store promotion pieces are window display items, consumer brochures, a Masterworks catalog, mobiles, and mounted album covers and streamers.

The large window display showcases popular albums by Johnny Mathis, Johnny Cash, Ray Conniff, Mitch Miller, Percy Faith, Miles Davis, Tony Bennett, Mahalia Jackson, Dave Brubeck, Les Elgart, Duke Ellington, Ed Kenney, Lola Albright, Jo Stafford and Sammy Kaye.

Mobiles feature albums by Mathis,

Faith, Brubeck, Albright, Bennett, Charlie Weaver, Ed Kenny and Mahalia Jackson.

Three four-panel displays for Masterworks albums feature selected repertoire categories. One display shows cases piano and violin music, another highlights orchestral arrangements, third features recordings by Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia Orchestra.

Itineraries included Dunn to New York; Maitland to Toronto; Max Callison, CRDC VP, to Cincinnati; Bud Fraser, sales administrator, to San Francisco; Bill Tallant, merchandising administrator, to Dallas; Dick Rising, merchandising director, to Chicago; and Bill Mikels, assistant national sales manager, CRDC, to Cleveland. Other meeting cities were Atlanta and Baltimore.

A week earlier Capitol's district sales managers flew to Hollywood for a sneak preview of the presentation which they subsequently put on in the field for their own sales organizations.

Highlight of each two-day meeting was a 3½-hour stereo presentation of Capitol's new album releases, pop and classical, for August and September. Presentation was made under the theme, "Capitol Kaleidoscope: A Brilliant Array of Stars and Sounds," and featured narration by "Tennessee" Ernie Ford, Dean Martin, and the two latest additions to Capitol's female roster, Dinah Shore and the recently re-signed Kay Starr. Special voice-tracks from many other pop artists having albums on release were also featured. Classics were handled by conductor Erich Leinsdorf.

Headlining the August pop release, which includes 21 albums, are new packages from Frank Sinatra, "Tennessee" Ernie Ford, Paul Weston, and—paired for the first time—Peggy Lee and George Shearing. (The Lee-Shearing disk was cut at the recent deejay convention in Miami.)

The ten-album classical release under the Capitol label is headed by new albums from Carmen Dragon and Roger Wagner, plus a new stereo recording of Puccini's one-act comic opera, "Gianni Schicchi," featuring soprano Victoria de Los Angeles.

Fifteen new albums on the Angel label, previewed at the same meeting, include a complete, three-record La Scala Opera package, Puccini's "Girl of the Golden West," as well as a complete recording of the Gilbert and Sullivan favorite, "H.M.S. Pinafore."

Sales and merchandising VP Maitland expressed his belief that Capitol's line-up for fall—product, promotion, and a special dealer-restocking program to be announced later—"is one of the most powerful we've had. As far as sales are concerned, we expect to move out smartly in the weeks and months ahead."

Decca, Coral, Brunswick Lower Stereo LP Prices

NEW YORK—Last week Decca Distributing Corp. announced that effective July 20 Decca, Coral and Brunswick stereophonic long play records in the series listed below will carry a suggested list price of \$4.98 replacing the former \$5.98 list price. This price reduction affects only counterparts of all \$3.98 series monophonic LP's. Thus, all Decca, Coral and Brunswick one-record stereo LP packages will list at \$1.00 more than their respective monophonic versions.

The affected series are: Decca DL-78000; Coral CRL-757000; Brunswick BL-754000.

At the same time Decca Distributing also announced that effective with purchases from and after July 1, a 10 per cent return privilege on LP's will be available to authorized Decca, Coral and Brunswick dealers.

Twice yearly each dealer will be notified of the amount of his return privilege for each label, which will be equal to 10 per cent of the previous six-months' net purchases of LP's. Full directions will be included regarding the authorized method to be used by the dealer in handling the return system. This plan is designed to permit the dealer to keep his inventory current. It can only be applied to albums and not to EP's or singles, which have their own 5 per cent return plan.

Dealers will receive their first return privilege shortly after Jan. 1, 1960, for the six months ending Dec. 31, 1959.

Signature Pacts Gates

NEW YORK—Bob Thiele, president of Hanover-Signature Records, announced last week the signing of George Cates to a Signature recording contract. His first record will be released shortly.

Cates had previously recorded for Thiele at Coral Records. He is currently the musical director for the Lawrence Welk organization.

Thiele stated that Cates' signing with him in no way affects his duties as conductor-arranger-musical director for Welk.

Biggest Sales Week In Carlton History

NEW YORK—Carlton Records last week reported the biggest week of single record sales in its history, single sales for the previous week totaling over 260,000.

According to Carlton, three disks accounted for this action. Leading the list is Anita Bryant's "Till There Was You," which accounted for 97,000 of the total. Future appearances by Miss Bryant include Jimmy Rodgers 7/28, Jack Paar 8/4 and Dave King 8/5.

Second to "Till There Was You" is Jack Scott's "The Way I Walk" with an 85,000 sales figure. Completing the list is the initial order of 78,000 for Gary Stites' recently released "A Girl Like You."

All Carlton executive personnel are currently on the road, blanketing key markets in an all-out promotion push for the three records.

Bullseye "Multi-Play" Bows

NEW YORK—This week Bullseye Records introduces a new phonograph record called "Multi-Play." Similar to the present 45 EP, the new record features two songs per side but without a separating band. The two songs, each under a minute and a half in time, will run together giving about three minutes of uninterrupted play per side. Multi-Play's will retail for 98 cents each, the present list price of standard 45's.

Bullseye's first release on its new disk will feature an ork called the Silver Strings of Paris playing "I'll Be Home" and "Cry My Love" on one side and "Falling Leaves" and "Raindrops" on the other side. The record, like all forthcoming Multi-Play releases, will be packaged in a two color sleeve and will be available in both monaural and stereo sound.

According to Woody Hinderling of Bullseye, Multi-Play aids the dealer since it gives him four tunes that he can sell for the price of the usual two; it aids the juke box operator in that it enables him to list the disk as an EP, but the lower purchase price and shorter running time returns him bigger profits; it offers the disk jockey more programming time to expose new releases—and saves him work in that he changes the record less often.

Angel Releases Fifteen Albums

HOLLYWOOD—Angel Records announced that it is releasing fifteen albums this week—eight in stereo and monaural, one in monaural only, and six stereo versions of previously released monaural albums.

Heading the new releases is a recording of Gerard Hoffnung's "Hoffnung Interplanetary Music Festival," a spoof of the classics, presented at the Royal Festival Hall in London last fall. This is Hoffnung's second such album for Angel.

Another headliner is a complete (3 disk) waxing of Puccini's "The Girl of The Golden West," featuring Birgit Nilsson, the Swedish dramatic soprano's first complete opera recording; Giovanni Gibin and Andrea Mongelli. Set was recorded at La Scala in Milan under the direction of Lovro von Matic.

Gilbert and Sullivan's "H.M.S. Pinafore" is the third G&S operetta in Angel. This recording of the very popular work features Richard Lewis, George Baker, John Cameron and Sir Malcolm Sargent conducting.

Other new Angel releases are: Two sets by David Oistrakh—Mozart Concerto No. 3, and Prokofiev's "Third Concerto" with the Philharmonia, and Schubert's "Trio No. 1" by the Oistrakh Trio; Haydn's Symphony No.

94 ("Surprise"), "Overture in D Major" and the "C Minor Symphony" performed by Carlo Maria Giulini and the Philharmonia; Haydn's "D Major Concerto" and Boccherini's "Concerto in B Flat" by cellist Janos Starker, with the Philharmonia conducted by Giulini; and "Scots Guards Pipes and Drums" by the Scots Guards Regiment.

The one monaural album is by Hungarian pianist Gyorgy Gzifra, in a recital of classical and pre-classical piano pieces.

The six previously released albums, now being issued stereophonically are: Dvorak: "New World Symphony," and Smetana: "Moldau" by Berlin Philharmonic, conducted by Herbert von Karajan; Beethoven's "First Piano Concerto" and "Sonata No. 27" by pianist Solomon and the Philharmonia in Brahms' "Fourth Symphony"; Alceo Galliera conducts the Philharmonia in works by Catalani, Zandonai, Wolf-Ferrari and Mascagni in "Italian Opera Intermezzi"; "Hi-Fi in the Highlands" by the regimental band and massed pipers of the Scots Guards; and Grieg's "Peer Gynt Suites 1 and 2" and Grieg's "Four Norwegian Dances," conducted by Walter Susskind.

WERE Answers Edwards

CLEVELAND, OHIO—In a letter to the trade, Guy Harris, program director of radio station WERE, this city, stated "there is no change in music policy, nor is any contemplated." This was in answer to a newsletter issued by Tommy Edwards, who stated last week that he had been "fired" from the station.

Said Harris: "In the past 24 hours I have received some calls relative to information contained in a 'newsletter' published by Tommy Edwards, dated July 17. The calls were prompted by statements in the letter concerning a music policy here at WERE—statements that were quite erroneous, so I feel it necessary to write you and assure you there is no change in music policy in effect, nor is any contemplated.

"WERE is not going formula in any sense of the word. Our music philosophy continues to be—hits, coupled with new releases and selections from albums. The disk jockeys continue to pick their own records, build their own shows and enjoy free reign on the use of new releases within their shows. New releases will continue to enjoy prime attention here.

"Our library is handled by Walt Tasky who maintains kits containing the top hundred records plus the new releases. Some of the jockeys work from these kits rather than work through their own stack of records. This is their option.

"Our new talent includes Russ Moore, formerly of Miami and Minneapolis, and Danny Dark from Tulsa, Oklahoma. They are young men in their twenties—frankly, a few years older than the other talent here was when it began at the station.

"Those of you who have been familiar with my performances as a Program Director these past ten years, now that I am an outspoken opponent of formula radio and have enjoyed considerable success in operating under a policy in which the disk jockey is a talented individual who is capable of building a bright and exciting show.

"I hope this has cleared up any misconception you might have had about WERE these past few days. If you have any questions, please write or call."

"Not Concerned With Retail Price" Says SORD

DALLAS, TEXAS—The Society of Record Dealers of America this week issued a press release designed to offset wrong interpretations of trade stories (not *The Cash Box*) that had appeared in recent weeks.

"Certain of the trade publications reporting the retail record industry have given the erroneous impression that the Society of Record Dealers of America is taking a position on price at which retail records should be sold. The Society of Record Dealers of America would like to correct this impression and state unequivocally that it is not at all concerned with the retail price at which any individual dealer sells his records. The only concern of SORD is the price which retail record dealers themselves must pay to the manufacturers and distributors for records, in that it is apparent that certain discounts are being granted to favored retailers. This, SORD is against. If one retail record dealer can operate successfully with a gross mark-up of 29% as opposed to another dealer operating at a gross mark-up of 33%, this is of no concern to SORD.

"A second impression gained from certain articles which have appeared in the trade publications is that the Society of Record Dealers of America has taken the position that the retail record dealers should refuse to deal with certain of the major record companies as to other items offered by them. This is also untrue. This impression was obviously obtained in a speech in which Mr. Martin Spector, President of the Society of Record Dealers of America, referred to an offer by Capitol Records to become one of the select group of 1,000 dealers who were being invited to handle the Capitol phonograph line. The only point which Mr. Spector was trying to make was that the record manufacturers were attempting to gain the favor of the retail record dealers on one hand by offering them exclusive dealings as to phonographs and on the other hand were cutting their throats by selling five LP's for \$1.97, directly to the customers of the same record dealers."

So stated promotion director Mike Collier, in pointing out the early success of the independent organization set up by RCA Victor.

The A & R team moved into the charts with their first release by newcomer Chico Holiday on "Young Ideas." They quickly followed this with their own hit of "La Plume De Ma Tante."

"Currently climbing the charts is the Tradewinds' "Furry Murray" while another newcomer Bill Courtney is starting to bring business into the nation's record stores with "Judy Is," continued Collier.

Their follow-up to "La Plume" has only just been released, but Collier reports that the top disk jockeys around the country have shown great enthusiasm over the side featuring a children's chorus and titled "Yalaloo."

Several key deejays are playing the other side, "Watusi Wedding," states Collier, but the majority vote seems to have gone to "Yalaloo."

"Stagger Lee" New Star?

NEW YORK — Eugene Gilbert, President of the Gilbert Youth Research Organization, published the results of a poll, taken among 1,200 teenagers to determine their choice for the top tunes and artists, in the July 16th issue of the New York Journal-American. Oddly, the third place position in the 'most promising new male recording star' went to Stagger Lee.

Leroy Holmes Gimmick

NEW YORK—Leroy Holmes, A&R head for Cub Records, is making the rounds scaring the local deejays with a 21-inch mechanical flying "Wham-O-Bird" as a promotional stunt for Cub's new release by Frankie Questa, "The Wham-O-Bird" coupled with "Begin The Beguine."

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"Listening Booths Hurt Record Sales"-Verber

PHILADELPHIA—Nelson Verbit, president of Marnel Distributing, this city and Baltimore, in a special letter sent last week to all record retailers serviced by the two branches of his firm, warned that, "The use of customer listening booths actually hurts rather than aids record sales."

Verbit stated that in a survey conducted in person by his sales force and through a mailed questionnaire, he found that top record retailers agreed that the listening booth actually retards sales. According to Verbit, three main reasons were given for the growing retailer disenchantment with special listening booths.

"First, they attract people who come to the store with no intention of buying, this is particularly true of the growing number of club members. Second, they tend to create a feeling in the customer that they should listen to the recording before they buy it, this takes a great deal of time and discourages people who have only a few moments to spare.

"The number of defective records made under today's conditions is so small," the distribution topper stated, "there really is no necessity for listening to them from beginning to end. By the same token, this business of listening limits the number of selections the customer will make during the time he spends in the store. Third, and this is particularly true of teenagers who take a handful of singles into the booth with them, the chances of pilferage are far higher."

The best system, according to Verbit, is to have a centrally located player or several of them on which a salesman can demonstrate a few bars of the recording. This gives the salesman an opportunity push the disk while he is playing it and also to add sales by pitching the platter to the other customers in the store.

"In these troubled times in our business," Verbit said, "it is the duty of a good distributor to do whatever he can to increase business among his retail customers. For this reason, we will be conducting surveys on a regular basis to determine how sales can be developed further and will pass this information on, free of charge, to all of our customers."

Urania Picks Up Master

NEW YORK—Bill Nielsen, general manager and director of sales for Urania Records, reported that the label has bought a master by the Della Sisters. "The Last Bell" and "Teach Him To Love Me".

According to Nielsen, reports from the New England area show that this disk is receiving extensive air play, and reaction to it is spreading. Accompanying The Della Sisters on the record is a new group, the Nightwinds.

Nielsen said that Urania is interested in buying pop masters of all types. Label's new address is 50 West 57 Street, this city.

"WHEN I'M GONE" (2:12) [Cajun BMI—Jericho] Fast moving handclapper with a cute lyric. Guy asks who's gonna take care of the gal when he's gone. Can attract some spins.

"LONESOME LIVIN'" (2:15) [Allstar BMI—Winn, Jericho] Quick paced lover's lament is sung with feeling by the chanter.

SONNY BURNS
(TNT 171)

"BOTTOM OF THE BOTTLE" (2:12) [TNT BMI—Word] Burns' deeply expressive reading of this heartbreaking tune is a good bet to attract attention. A real low-down country blues item.

"LEAVE THE DOOR OPEN" (2:06) [TNT BMI—Word] Burns continues the mood set on the lid with another one from the crying towel category. Two excellent showcases for the singer's honesty and sincerity.

BILL HARRELL
(Starday 445)

"TRAGIC HIGHWAY" (2:35) [Starday BMI—Harrell, Swan, Harlow] Bill Harrell and his Virginia Mountaineers debut with a potent side that could bring them quick recognition. Tune's an upbeat cryin' opus with large portions given over to some fine guitar pickin'. Bears watching.

"LOVE IS A STRANGER" (2:20) [Starday BMI—Davis, Harrell] Another good country blues item. Harrell should soon make a name for himself.

JIMMY WAKELY
(Shasta 107)

"SLIPPING AROUND" [Tillman] The Floyd Tillman-penned country standard is given a pleasant reading by Wakely. Should catch juke coin. Tune was a gold-disk for Wakely and Margaret Whiting a number of years back.

"I LOVE YOU SO MUCH IT HURTS" [Tillman] More fare for the boxes is served up on this side with Wakely's treatment of another Tillman-cleffed oldie. Two beautiful ballad sides.

DICKIE CHAFFIN
(Karl 0230)

"THINK TWICE BEFORE YOU GO" [BMI—Chaffin] Easy paced, tear-filled weeper that Chaffin delivers with feeling.

"PRINCESS WHITEFOOT" (2:03) [BMI—Chaffin] Chaffin loves the gal and exclaims it loudly (with loads of echo) on this fast moving, string-filled deck.

BOB NEWMAN
(King 5216)

"LONESOME TRUCK DRIVER BLUES" (2:42) [Tannen BMI—Roberts] Quick paced rocker that Newman wails feelingfully. Combo-chorus assists.

"HAULIN' FREIGHT" (2:36) [Lois BMI—Glover, Long] This end also concerns a truck driver. It's a pop-styled rhythm tune that Newman belts out energetically.

MIKE HARWOOD
(Knox 101)

"TROUBLE IN MIND" (3:05) [Leeds ASCAP—Jones] The first outing for both the artist and label could prove a big winner. Harwood delivers a stirring performance of a medium paced folk-blues number.

"LEAVIN' BLUES" (3:05) [Ledbetter, Lomax, Lomax] The tune here was penned by the legendary blues singer Huddie Ledbetter, and folklorists John and Alan Lomax. It's a slow moving, low down, blues opus.

"I'M NOBODY'S DARLING NOW" (2:29) [4 Star BMI—Slatton] Leo and Dot duet prettily on this upbeat tear drenched lover's opus—packing the wax with loads of emotion.

"YOU GO TO YOUR CHURCH (I'LL GO TO MINE)" (2:30) [Starday BMI—Clifton, York] Bill Clifton, accompanying himself on the five-string banjo, offers a lesson in religious tolerance with this sprightly semi-sacred outing. Bright future is in store for the deck.

"WHEN YOU KNEEL (AT MOTHER'S GRAVE)" (2:24) [Starday BMI—Clifton, Lilley] Also in the same area as the lid, this medium paced, country hymn has Clifton singing out with some excellent advice.

ANALYZATION OF THE 1st QUARTER (JAN., FEB., MAR., 1959)

EXPORTS DIP SLIGHTLY FOR 1st QUARTER 1959

However, Start Increasing In March. Prospects Good With England Open.

Analyzing the export statistics for the first quarter of 1959 (January, February and March) brings to light that the dollar volume of equipment sold to foreign buyers thruout the world by United States firms dropped off slightly again. In the preceeding quarter (October, November and December, 1958) total sales amounted to \$4,746,981. This compares to the total in the first quarter of 1959 of \$4,568,275. However, the number of machines in the current quarter was several thousand more than that of the previous quarter—19,273 against 16,501. These figures can be misleading in that the increase in number of machines was caused by the sale of low priced vendors. Eliminating these vendors from the analysis, the actual drop in the sales of total numbers of phonographs and games runs under 1,000 machines. Dollar value decrease from the last period is slightly more than \$200,000.

Exporters are cautioned not to be misled or discouraged by the statistical report of the first quarter. Actually, the differences in the sale of equipment, both numerically and dollar volume, can be traced to the import restrictions imposed by several European countries during this period. However, effective June 1, the British Government removed its restrictions on the importation of juke boxes, which opens this lucrative market for many, many reconditioned machines. While amusement machines are still on the restricted list, it is the opinion of England's coinmen that this restriction will be lifted in the near future. Another encouraging sign is the continual increase in purchases in both music machines and games by Venezuela. At the moment, Cuba is lost as a games buyer, but music machines are being imported in small quantities and it's possible more may be sent to this market as time goes on.

Further analysis in each division of the industry reveals the following information for the first quarter:

1) **Phonographs:** While shipments from the U. S. dropped slightly in this quarter from that of the previous quarter, more phonographs were exported than in the same quarter of a year ago. 3,857 music machines were shipped thruout the world in this first quarter, valued at \$2,803,990 compared with 4,141 machines valued at \$2,857,187 during the fourth quarter of 1958. However, in the first quarter of 1958, only 3,254 machines were exported, valued at \$2,433,387. As usual, Europe was the big buyer in this first quarter, buying 2,472 machines for a dollar value of \$1,616,905.

West German, Europe's biggest buyer, actually spent more money, \$873,385 for 1,361 machines, than it did the previous quarter. Belgium, next biggest importer, fell off slightly. Switzerland, third in volume, showed a big jump, taking in 232 machines, valued at \$182,438. South America became an important factor this period, with Venezuela a real big buyer. This country bought 731 phonographs, valued at \$723,663.

2) **Amusement Machines:** Purchases of amusement machines by importers, like that of phonographs, shows a slight dip. In this first quarter, U.S. firms shipped 5,181 games, valued at \$1,162,890. This compared with the last quarter of 1958, during which 6,637 machines were shipped, valued at \$1,330,377. While the number of machines shipped ran some 1,000 less, the dollar value dropped only slightly. Europe, biggest buyer in this division also, fell down, with Belgium buying almost as many games, and at practically the same dollar value as in the previous quarter. West Germany took the big drop from 991 machines and dollar value of \$251,711 in the previous quarter, to 584 machines valued at \$142,459 in the current period. Switzerland, while buying less machines, spent more money, \$203,790. In North and Central America, Canada's imports increased during the first quarter over the fourth quarter of 1958. Cuba didn't take a single machine, which, of course, reflects in the total sales to this area. In South America, altho sales were limited to only one country, Venezuela, 241 machines, for a dollar value of \$62,568 were shipped.

3) **Vending Machines:** While the number of machines exported ran to twice the number than the previous quarter, the actual dollars spent were only slightly higher. These statistics can be quite misleading, as North and Central America, which spent \$388,459 (of which Canada led with \$338,849) purchased only 2,796 machines, while Belgium bought 6,105 machines for a dollar value of only \$78,572—an average of \$13 a machine. All of Europe spent only \$159,742, but imported 7,099 machines.

Activities of the manufacturers during the past quarter (April, May and June)

AMI, Inc., Grand Rapids, Michigan, currently in production on its Model "J" series phonograph, with 100 and 200 selections in stereo and monaural units. Twin speakers are available for stereo installation.

Auto-Bell Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, still in production on its electronic upright game, "Circus Wagon Wheel" and introduced two new uprights, "Play Ball" and "Wagon Wheel", plus a new kiddie ride, "Old Smoke Train" and a shuffle, "Curved Shuffle".

Auto-Photo Company, Los Angeles, California, producing new Model "12" and new Model "14" automatic photograph machines, featuring two different print sizes.

Bally Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, continues to produce largest variety of amusement machines. Still in production during this quarter were: "Club Bowler"; "Sea Island", an in-line game; "Lucky Alley Bowler"; and "Deluxe Skill Parade". Introduced during this quarter were: "Sportsman", an electronic upright game; "Ballerina", a 5-ball game; "Jumbo", an electronic upright game, with handle or button models available; "Heavy Hitter", baseball game; and "Gunsmoke", an adult pistol target game. Still in production were the following kiddie rides: "Fire Chief", "Western Express", "Spook Gun", a kiddie shooting gallery; "Speed Queen", "Toonerville Trolley", "Model T" and "Champion".

Chicago Dynamic Industries, Inc., Chicago, Illinois, still in production on "King Bowler", "Monte Carlo Rebound Shuffle", (also super model), "Rocket Ball", shuffle baseball; "Red Pin" bowler, "Twin Bowler" and "Commando Machine Gun". Introduced during this quarter were "Jet Pilot", arcade machine, and "Star Rocket", an electronic upright game.

Empire Kiddie Rides, Chicago, Illinois, still producing "Old Smokey", a kiddie ride.

Fischer Sales & Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, currently in production on series of 6-pocket pool tables and bumper pool table line; "Imperial VII", "Imperial VI" and "Deluxe", all 6-pocket. "Party Pool", bumper pool game.

J. F. Frantz Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, still in production on "Dodge City", counter pistol game; "Kicker and Catcher"; ABT "Challenger" pistol; ABT "Guesser" scale; ABT "Rifle Sport", shooting gallery, and "Aristo" scale.

Games, Inc., Chicago, Illinois, still in production on "Wildcat" and "Double Shot", both electronic upright amusement games.

D. Gottlieb & Company, Chicago, Illinois, specialists in the manufacture of pinball amusement machines, introduced "Hi-Diver", a 5-ball; "Atlas" 2-player and are currently in production on the new "Queen of Diamonds" 5-ball game.

Irving Kaye Company, Brooklyn New York, still in production on the following pool games: "Leader", 6-pocket; "Jumbo Leader", 6-pocket and "Deluxe El Dorado", 6-pocket. Still in production are "Melody Tower", speaker, and "Deuces Wild".

J. H. Keeney & Company, Chicago Illinois, still in production on "Shawnee", "Twin Big Tent" and "Deluxe Big Tent". Introduced during this quarter were "Big 3" and "Big Round up", both electronic upright games.

Marvel Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, still shipping "Luck Horoscope".

Mills Bell-O-Matic Corporation, Chicago, Illinois, still producing machines in its Reno, Nevada plant.

Mike Munves Corporation, New York, N. Y., introduced a new arcade machine, "Satellite Tracker", currently in production.

Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corporation, Chicago, Illinois, still in production on its "Tempo" line of phonographs, Model "1475" and its "Playmaster" series, (hideaway), Mod "1460", both 200-selection units, available in stereo and monaural.

The Seeburg Corporation, Chicago, Illinois, continued production on its stereo phonographs, Model "222", 16 selections; Model "220", 100-selections, with Channel 1 and Channel 2 speakers available. Monaural sound can be reproduced from these same phonographs. Introduced the Seeburg "1000", a new background music system, 16 2/3 rpm, 1000-selections, and a new cigarette machine, Model E.

United Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois, continued in production on "Playmate" rebound shuffle "Deluxe" and "Yankee" baseball games and "Simplex" bowling alleys. Introduced during this quarter were "Advance" bowler; "Flash", "Deluxe Flash" and "Zenith" shuffle alleys.

United Music Corporation, Chicago, Illinois, continued production on 1959 "UPB-100" series phonographs.

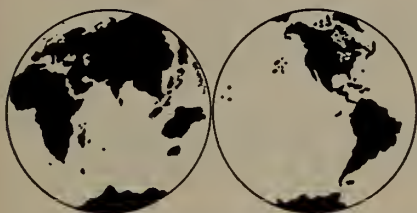

ANALYSIS DES ERSTEN VIERTELJAHRES (JAN., FEB., MARZ, 1959)

DIE AUSFUHR GEHT IM ERSTEN VIERTELJAHR VON 1959 ETWAS ZURÜCK

Sie nimmt jedoch im März wieder zu. Die Aussichten sind gut mit England offen.

Wenn man die Ausfuhr-Statistiken für das erste Vierteljahr von 1959 (Januar, Februar und März) analysiert, so wird es klar, dass der Dollarwert der von amerikanischen Firmen an Auslandskäufer in aller Welt verkauften Ausrüstungen wieder leicht abgefallen ist. Im vorhergehenden Vierteljahr (Oktober, November und Dezember 1958) belief sich der Umsatz auf \$ 4.746.981. Im Vergleich dazu war der Umsatz im ersten Vierteljahr von 1959 \$ 4.568.275. Doch überstiegt die Anzahl der im laufenden Vierteljahr verkauften Automaten die Anzahl der im vorhergehenden Vierteljahr verkauften bei mehreren Tausend — 19.273 in Vergleich zu 16.501. Diese Zahlen können irreführen, da der Anstieg in der Anzahl durch den Verkauf von wohlfeilen Verkaufsautomaten hervorgerufen wurde. Wenn man nun diese Verkaufsautomaten aus den Analyse ausschließt, so ergibt es sich, dass die tatsächliche Gesamtanzahl der verkauften Plattenspieler und Unterhaltungsspiele um weniger als 1000 Automaten zurückgegangen ist. Der Rückgang im Dollarwert im Vergleich mit der vorhergehenden Periode ist etwas über \$ 200.000.

Es ergeht aber eine Warnung an die Exporteure, sich nicht durch den statistischen Bericht des ersten Vierteljahrs irreführen oder entmutigen zu lassen. Die Unterschiede im Verkauf der Ausrüstungen, was die Anzahl wie auch den Dollarwert anbetrifft, kann nämlich auf Einfuhrbeschränkungen zurückgeführt werden, die von verschiedenen europäischen Ländern während dieser Zeitspanne auferlegt wurden. Die Regierung Grossbritanniens hat jedoch, seit dem ersten Juni, die Einfuhrbeschränkungen für Juke-Boxes aufgehoben, wodurch sich ein lukrativer Markt für eine grosse Anzahl von wiederstandsgesetzten Automaten eröffnet. Obgleich Unterhaltungsautomaten noch auf der Beschränkungsliste stehen, so sind doch die Münzautomatenexperten Englands der Ansicht, dass diese Beschränkungen sehr bald aufgehoben werden. Ein anderes ermutigendes Anzeichen ist der ständige Anstieg der Einkäufe von Musikautomaten wie auch von Unterhaltungsspielen in Venezuela. Zur Zeit ist Kuba als Käufer von Unterhaltungsspielen ausgefallen, doch werden Musikautomaten in kleinen Mengen eingeführt, und es ist sehr wohl möglich, dass dieser Markt mit der Zeit noch mehr aufnehmen wird.

Die weitere Analyse der verschiedenen Produktionsgruppen der Industrie ergibt für das erste Vierteljahr das folgende Bild:

1) Plattenspieler: Obgleich die aus den Vereinigten Staaten kommenden Lieferungen in diesem Vierteljahr im Vergleich mit dem vorhergehenden etwas zurückgingen, so wurden doch mehr Plattenspieler ausgeführt als im selben Vierteljahr des letzten Jahres. Im ersten Vierteljahr wurden 3.857 Musikautomaten im Werte von \$ 2.803.990 in alle Teile der Welt ver-

schifft im Vergleich zu 4.141 Automaten im Werte von \$ 2.857.187 im vierten Vierteljahr von 1958. Im ersten Vierteljahr von 1958 wurden jedoch 3.254 Automaten im Werte von \$ 2.433.387 ausgeführt. Wie zumeist kaufte Europa die meiste Ware, und zwar 2.472 Automaten im Werte von \$ 1.616.905. Der grösste Käufer Europas, West-Deutschland, gab \$ 873.385 für 1.361 Automaten aus, d.h. mehr als im vorhergehenden Vierteljahr. Belgien, der nächstgrösste Importeur, liess die Einkäufe leicht abfallen. Die Schweiz stand in der Menge an dritter Stelle: sie machte einen grossen Sprung vorwärts, indem sie 232 Maschinen im Werte von \$ 182.438 aufnahm. In dieser Periode gewann Süd-Amerika an Bedeutung, wobei Venezuela der Grosskäufer war. Das besagte Land kaufte 731 Plattenspieler im Werte von \$ 723.663.

2) Unterhaltungsautomaten: Wie bei den Plattenspielern zeigt der Einkauf der Importeure von Unterhaltungsspielen einen leichten Rückgang. Im ersten Vierteljahr wurden aus den Vereinigten Staaten 5.181 Spiele im Werte von \$ 1.162.890 verschifft. Im Vergleich dazu wurden im letzten Vierteljahr von 1958 6.637 Automaten im Werte von \$ 1.330.377 ausgeführt. Obgleich die Anzahl der Maschinen um ca. 1000 geringer war, so ging der Dollarwert nur um ein Geringes zurück. Der grösste Markt dieser Gruppe, Europa, wurde auch enger, doch kaufte Belgien fast ebenso viele Spiele und zu fast dem gleichen Dollarwerte als im vorhergehenden Vierteljahr. Die Einkäufe West-Deutschlands gingen stark zurück, und zwar von 991 Automaten im Werte von \$ 251.711 im vorhergehenden Vierteljahr auf 584 Maschinen im Werte von \$ 142.459 im laufenden Vierteljahr. Die Schweiz, die weniger Automaten kaufte, gab mit \$ 203.790 mehr Geld aus. Im Nord- und Zentralamerika-Gebiet stieg die Einfuhr Kanadas während des ersten Vierteljahrs über die Einfuhr im vierten Vierteljahr von 1958 an. Kuba nahm nicht einen einzigen Automaten auf, was natürlich die Gesamtumsatzzahl dieses Gebietes beeinflusst. Obgleich in Südamerika sich die Einkäufe auf ein einziges Land, Venezuela, beschränkten, so wurden doch 241 Automaten im Werte von \$ 62.568 verschifft.

3) Verkaufsautomaten: Obgleich die Anzahl der ausgeführten Automaten sich auf das Doppelte der Anzahl des vorhergehenden Vierteljahrs belief, so war doch der bezahlte Dollarwert nur wenig grösser. Diese Statistiken können aber recht irreführend sein, da Nord- und Zentralamerika \$ 388.459 (Kanada führte hier mit \$ 338.849) ausgaben, wurden dabei doch nur 2.796 Automaten erstanden, während Belgien 6.105 Automaten in einem Werte von nur \$ 78.572 einführt, was einen Durchschnittswert von \$ 13.00 die Maschine bedeutet. Alle Länder Europas zusammen genommen gaben nur \$ 159.742 aus, importierten aber 7.099 Automaten.

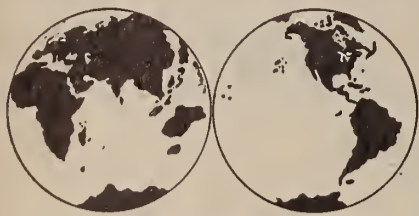

ANALYSE DU PREMIER TRIMESTRE (JAN., FEV., MARS, 1959)

LEGERE BAISSSE DES EXPORTATIONS DURANT LE PREMIER TRIMESTRE DE 1959.

Toutefois, elles commencent a monter en Mars. Bonnes perspectives, car L’Angleterre ouvre

L’analyse des statistiques d’exportation pour le premier trimestre de 1959, (Janvier, février et mars) fait à nouveau apparaître une légère baisse dans le volume en dollars du matériel vendu par des firmes américaines à travers le monde à la clientèle étrangère. Dans le trimestre précédent (octobre, novembre et décembre 1958), les ventes totales sélevèrent à \$4.746.981, à comparer avec le total du premier quart de 1959 et qui se monte à \$4.658.275. Toutefois, le nombre de machines vendues durant le premier trimestre de 1959, dépassait de plusieurs milliers celui du trimestre précédent, soit 19.273 contre 16.501. Ces chiffres pourraient être trompeurs, du fait que l’augmentation dans le nombre de machines provenait de la vente de machines à distribution automatique bon marché. Si l’on élimine ces distributeurs automatiques de l’analyse, la baisse réelle dans les ventes totales de phonographes et de machines de jeux set inférieure à 1.000 unités. La diminution en valeur dollars, comparée au trimestre précédent, est légèrement supérieure à \$200.000.

On recommande aux exportateurs de ne pas tirer de fausses conclusions ou de se décourager en étudiant le rapport des statistiques du premier trimestre. En effet, la différence dans les ventes de matériel, tant en nombre qu’en valeur dollars, est due aux restrictions à l’importation imposées par plusieurs pays européens durant cette période. Toutefois, à partir du 1 juin, le Gouvernement britannique abolit ses restrictions sur l’importation de machines à musique, ce qui ouvrira ce marché lucratif à un grand nombre de machines reconditionnées. Quoique les machines de jeux se trouvent toujours sur la liste des restrictions, cette restriction, selon l’opinion des marchands anglais, sera rapportée dans un avenir rapproché. Un autre signe encourageant est l’augmentation continue dans les achats de machines à musique et de machines de jeux par le Venezuela. Pour le moment, le Cuba est perdu comme acheteur de machines de jeux, mais des machines à musique sont importées en petites quantités et il est possible qu’on puisse y envoyer de plus en plus, le temps aidant.

En analysant chaque division de l’industrie, on obtient les informations suivantes pour le premier trimestre:

1) Phonographes: Pendant que les sé légèrement durant ce trimestre, expéditions des Etats-Unis ont baissé par rapport à la période précédente, on a exporté plus de phonographes que pendant le premier trimestre de l’année dernière. On a embarqué 3.857 machines à musique durant ce premier trimestre, pour une valeur de \$2.803.990, comparé à 4.141 machines d’une valeur de \$2.857.187 durant le

quatrième trimestre de 1958. Toutefois, pendant le premier quart de 1958, on a exporté seulement 3.254 machines, d’une valeur de \$2.433.387. Comme d’habitude, l’Europe fut le plus important acheteur durant ce premier trimestre, en prenant 2.472 machines pour une valeur dollars de \$1.626.905. L’Allemagne Occidentale, le plus fort acheteur européen, a en effet dépensé plus d’argent, \$873.385 pour 1.361 machines, que le trimestre précédent. La Belgique, au second rang, a légèrement baissé. La Suisse, le troisième client en volume, a fait un grand saut en avant, en prenant 232 machines pour une valeur de \$182.438. Durant cette période, l’Amérique du Sud est devenue un facteur important, avec le Venezuela se faisant connaître comme un client vraiment très fort. Ce pays a acheté 731 phonographes, d’une valeur de \$723.663.

2) Machines de Jeux: De même que pour les phonographes, les commandes pour machines de jeux, de la part des importateurs, accusent une légère diminution. Durant le premier trimestre les Etats-Unis ont exporté 5.181 jeux, d’une valeur de \$1.162.890. Ceci est à comparer avec le dernier trimestre 1958, durant lequel on a expédié 6.637 machines, d’une valeur de \$1.330.377. Pendant qu’il y eut donc à peu près 1.000 machines en moins, la valeur en dollars ne subissait qu’une légère baisse. L’Europe, le plus fort acheteur dans cette division, descendait, la Belgique achetant toutefois presque autant de machines de jeux, à pratiquement la même valeur, que le trimestre précédent. L’Allemagne Occidentale accusa la plus grande chute, en descendant de 991 machines pour \$251.71 durant le trimestre précédent, à 584 machines d’une valeur de \$142.459 pour la période en cours. La Suisse tout en achetant moins de machines, a augmenté ses dépenses, soit \$203.790. En Amérique du Nord et Centrale, ce sont les importations du Canada qui dépassèrent au premier trimestre, celles du dernier quart de 1958. Le Cuba n’a pas pris une seule machine, se qui influe évidemment sur les ventes totales dans cette région. En Amérique du Sud, malgré que les ventes se limitèrent à un seul pays, on a expédié au Venezuela 241 machines, d’une valeur de \$62.568.

3) Machines à Distribution Automatique: Quoique le nombre de machines exportées fût le double de celui du trimestre précédent, le valeur en dollars, n’était que légèrement supérieure. Ces statistiques peuvent donc être trompeuses, car l’Amérique du Nord et Centrale, qui dépensa \$388.459 (dont le Canada assumait \$338.849) n’a acheté que 2.796 ma-

chines, pendant que le Belgique acheta 6.105 machines pour une valeur de \$78.572 seulement—ou une moyenne de \$13 par machine. L’Europe entière ne dépensa que \$159.742 mais a importé 7.099 machines.

ANÁLISIS DEL PRIMER TRIMESTRE (JAN., FEV., MARS 1959)

CAJAN ALGO LA EXPORTACIONES EN EL PRIMER TRIMESTRE, 1959

En Embargo, Empiezan a Aumentar en Marzo. Buenas Perspectivas en el Mercado Inglés.

Un análisis de las estadísticas de exportación correspondientes al primer trimestre de 1959 (Enero, Febrero y Marzo) revelan que el volumen en dólares del equipo despachado a los clientes en el extranjero por empresas de los Estados Unidos fué ligeramente más bajo. En el trimestre anterior (Octubre, Noviembre y Diciembre de 1958) las ventas totales ascendieron a la suma de \$4.746.981, en comparación \$4.568.275 en el primer trimestre de 1959. Si embargo, en el trimestre actual se despacharon más máquinas que en el anterior—19.273 contra 16.501. Estas cifras pueden prestarse a malas interpretaciones, ya que el aumento en el número de máquinas fué causado por la venta de máquinas expendedoras de precio bajo. Al eliminarse estas máquinas del análisis, podrá establecerse que la baja ocurrida en el número total de fonógrafos y juegos exportados fué en realidad de menos de 1.000 máquinas. La reducción en dólares desde el último período fué ligeramente mayor de \$200.000.

Se advierte a los exportadores que sus informes estadísticos correspondientes al primer trimestre del año no deben ser interpretados erróneamente para causarles desaliento. En realidad, las diferencias en las ventas de equipos, tanto en número como en dólares, pueden atribuirse a las restricciones de importación impuestas por varios países europeos durante este período. Sin embargo, a partir el 1° de Junio el Gobierno de la Gran Bretaña suprimirá las restricciones a la importación de fonógrafos automáticos, con lo cual se abrirá un lucrativo mercado para la venta de muchas máquinas reconcondicionadas. Aunque las máquinas de diversión continúan en la lista de restricciones, los empresarios de Inglaterra indican que estas últimas serán suavizadas en el próximo futuro. Otra señal alentadora es el aumento continuo en las compras de máquinas musicales y juegos por Venezuela. Por el momento, Cuba ha dejado de ser compradora de juegos, pero las máquinas musicales siguen siendo exportadas en pequeñas cantidades y es posible que aumenten las ventas en ese mercado a medida que pase el tiempo.

Si se analiza más detenidamente la división de la industria, podrá tenerse la siguiente información sobre el primer trimestre:

(1) **Fonógrafos:** Aunque durante el presente trimestre los embarques fueron algo menores que en el anterior, de todas maneras se exportaron más fonógrafos que en el mismo trimestre del año pasado. En dicho trimestre se despacharon a todas partes del mundo 3.857 máquinas musicales por valor de \$2.803.990 en comparación con 4.141 máquinas por valor de \$2.857.187 en el último trimestre de 1958. No obstante, en el primer trimestre de 1958 sólo se ex-

portaron 3.254 máquinas valoradas en \$2.433.387. Como de costumbre, en este primer trimestre Europa fué el cliente principal, comprando 2.472 máquinas por valor total de \$1.616.905. Alemania Occidental, el principal cliente europeo, invirtió mayor cantidad de dinero—\$873.385 por 1.361 máquinas—que en el trimestre anterior. Las compras de Bélgica, el segundo comprador de importancia, decayeron ligeramente. Suiza, el tercer país en cuanto al volumen de compras, demostró un gran aumento con la importación de 232 máquinas por valor de \$182.438. La América del Sur vino a ser un factor importante en este período, siendo Venezuela uno de los mejores clientes. Este país compró 731 fonógrafos por valor de \$723.663.

2) **Máquinas de Diversión:** Las compras de máquinas de diversión por los importadores extranjeros, al igual que las de fonógrafos, acusaron una baja. En este primer trimestre, las empresas de los Estados Unidos despacharon 5.181 juegos por valor de \$1.162.890, en comparación con 6.637 máquinas por valor de \$1.330.377 exportadas en el último trimestre de 1958. Aunque se exportaron unas 1.000 máquinas de menos, su valor en dólares sólo descendió ligeramente. Europa, el mejor cliente en esta división, también redujo sus compras, aunque Bélgica importó casi tantos juegos, por más o menos el mismo valor en dólares, que en el trimestre anterior. Alemania Occidental fué la nación que más redujo sus importaciones, descendiendo de 991 máquinas por valor de \$251.711 en el trimestre anterior, a 584 máquinas por valor de \$142.459 en el presente trimestre. Aunque sus importaciones sufrieron una baja, Suiza invirtió mayor cantidad de dinero en la compra de máquinas, o sea, \$203.790. En cuanto a las Américas del Norte y del Centro, las importaciones del Canadá fueron mayores durante este trimestre que en el cuarto trimestre de 1958. Cuba no ordenó ni una sola máquina lo cual, naturalmente, se reflejó en las ventas totales a esta zona del hemisferio. Aunque las ventas a la América del Sur se limitaron a un solo país, Venezuela, se exportaron a ese continente 241 máquinas por valor de \$62.568.

3) **Máquinas Exendedoras:** Aunque el número de máquinas exportadas fué dos veces mayor que en el trimestre anterior, la inversión en dólares sólo fué un poco más alta. Estas cifras pueden ser muy engañosas, pues tanto Norteamérica como Centro América que invirtieron \$388.459 (contribuyendo el Canadá la mayor suma, ascendiente a \$338.849), sólo importaron 2.796 máquinas, en tanto que Bélgica compró 6.105 máquinas por valor de solamente \$78.572, o sea, un promedio de \$13 por máquina. Toda Europa sólo invirtió \$159.742, pero importó 7.099 máquinas.

Actividades de los fabricantes durante el último trimestre (abril, mayo, junio)

AMI, Inc., Grand Rapids, Michigan.—Esta empresa se ocupa actualmente en la producción de su fonógrafo de serie Modelo "J" con 100 y 200 selecciones, en unidades "stereo" y "monaural". Puede suministrar altoparlantes gemelos para instalaciones "stereo".

Auto-Bell Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois.—Esta compañía continúa fabricando su juego electrónico vertical, "Circus Wagon Wheel" y ha introducido dos nuevos juegos verticales, "Play Ball" y "Wagon Wheel", además de un nuevo juego de vehículos para niños y otro de tejos denominado "Curved Shuffle".

Auto-Photo Company, Los Angeles, California.—Esta casa produce las máquinas fotográficas automáticas Modelo "12" y Modelo "14", enteramente nuevas, que se distinguen por sus impresiones en dos tamaños diferentes.

Bally Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois.—Esta firma sigue fabricando una gran variedad de máquinas de diversión o entretenimiento. Durante el presente trimestre continuó produciendo lo siguiente: "Club Bowler"; "Sea Island", un juego "inline"; "Lucky Alley Bowler"; y "Deluxe Skill Parade". En el curso de este trimestre introdujo: "Sportsman", un juego electrónico vertical; "Ballerina", un juego de 5 bolas; "Jumbo", un juego electrónico vertical en modelos de manivela o de botón; "Heavy Hitter", un juego de beisbol; y "Gunsmoke", un juego de tiro al blanco para adultos. Aun continuaban en producción los siguientes juegos para niños: "Fire Chief"; "Western Express"; "Spook Gun", una galería de tiro al blanco infantil; "Speed Queen"; "Toonerville Trolley", "Modelo T" y "Champion".

Chicago Dynamic Industries, Inc., Chicago, Illinois.—Esta empresa sigue fabricando "King Bowler", Monte Carlo Rebound Shuffle (también el super modelo), "Rocket Ball", beisbol de tejos; juego de bolos "Red Pin"; "Twin Bowler" y "Commando Machine Gun". En este trimestre introdujo "Jet Pilot", una máquina de galerías, y "Star Rocket", un juego electrónico vertical.

Empire Kiddie Rides, Chicago, Illinois.—Esta casa continúa fabricando el "Old Smokey", un juego infantil.

Fischer Sales & Manufacturing Company, Chicago, Illinois.—Esta empresa fabrica actualmente una serie de mesas para juego de trucos, tanto de 6 bolsas como del tipo de tope; también los juegos de trucos "Imperial VII", "Imperial VI" y "Deluxe", todos de 6 bolsas, y el juego de trucos con topes denominado "Party Pool".

Mills Bell-O-Matic Corporation, Chicago, Illinois.—Esta firma continúa produciendo máquinas de campanas en su fábrica de Reno, Nevada.

Mike Munves Corporation, Nueva York, N. Y.—Esta compañía introdujo una nueva máquina para galerías denominada "Satellite Tracker" que actualmente se hallan en producción.

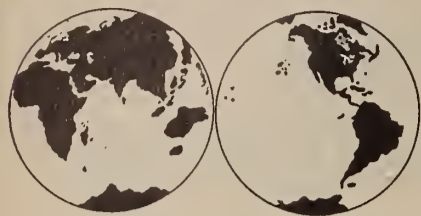

ANALISI DEL PRIMO TRIMESTRE (GEN., FEB., MARZO, 1959)

LEGGERA FLESSIONE DELLE ESPORTAZIONI NEL PRIMO TRIMESTRE DEL 1959

Tuttavia c’è stata una ripresa in Marzo. Le prospettive per il futuro sono buone e particolarmente quelle riguardanti l’Inghilterra, mercato recetemente acquisito.

L’analisi delle statistiche riguardanti le esportazioni del primo trimestre del 1959 (gennaio, febbraio e marzo) rivela che il volume di dollari del macchinario venduto agli acquirenti esteri in tutto il mondo da ditte degli Stati Uniti ha fatto registrare di nuovo una leggera flessione. Nel trimestre precedente (ottobre, novembre e dicembre del 1958) il totale delle vendite ammontò a \$4.746.981. L’ammontare equivalente per il primo trimestre del 1959 è stato di \$4.568.275. Comunque, il numero di macchine vendute nel trimestre attuale è stato superiore di parecchie migliaia a quello del trimestre precedente—19.273 contro 16.501. Queste cifre possono ingannare poiché l’aumento del numero di macchine è dovuto alla vendita di distributrici automatiche dal basso prezzo. Se si eliminano queste distributrici dall’analisi, si trova che la diminuzione effettiva delle vendite del numero globale di fonografi e di giochi è inferiore alle 1000 macchine. La diminuzione del valore in dollari rispetto all’ultimo periodo è leggermente superiore alle \$200.000.

Si avvertono gli esportatori a non lasciarsi ingannare o scoraggiare dalla relazione statistica del primo trimestre. In effetti, la differenza nella vendita di macchinario, sia numericamente che dal punto di vista del volume di dollari, può essere fatta risalire alle restrizioni sull’importazione imposte da diverse nazioni europee durante questo periodo di tempo. Tuttavia, a partire dal 1° giugno, il Governo Britannico ha abolito le proprie restrizioni sull’importazione di fonografi pubblici automatici, il che apre questo mercato lucrativo a molte, molte macchine rimesse a nuovo. Mentre le macchine da divertimento appartengono ancora alla categoria delle macchine colpite dalle restrizioni, è parere degli specialisti di macchine azionate a moneta dell’Inghilterra che questa restrizione sarà abolita nel prossimo futuro. Un altro segno incoraggiante è il costante aumento di acquisti sia di macchine musicali che di giochi da parte del Venezuela. Al momento attuale, Cuba è perduta come acquirente di giochi, mentre le macchine musicali vi vengono importate in piccole quantità ed è possibile che un numero perfino maggiore possa essere destinato a questo mercato con il passare del tempo.

Un’analisi ulteriore in ciascun settore dell’industria rivela i seguenti dati attinenti al primo trimestre:

1) **Fonografi:** Mentre le spedizioni da parte degli Stati Uniti hanno subito una leggera diminuzione in questo trimestre rispetto a quelle del trimestre precedente, sono stati esportati più fonografi che durante lo stesso periodo trimestrale di un anno fa. In questo primo trimestre sono state spedite in tutto il mondo 3857 macchine musicali, per il valore di

\$2.803.990, paragonate alle 4.141 macchine del quarto trimestre del 1958, valutate a \$2.857.187. Comunque, nel primo trimestre del 1958 furono esportate solo 3.254 macchine per un valore di \$2.433.387. Come al solito, l’Europa è stata il massimo acquirente in questo primo trimestre, con 2.472 macchine per un valore in dollari di \$1.616.905. La Germania Occidentale, la prima nazione dell’Europa negli acquisti, ha speso in effetti una somma maggiore di danaro, \$873.385, per il totale di 1361 macchine, di quanto non abbia fatto nel trimestre precedente. Il Belgio, secondo in graduatoria, ha fatto registrare una leggera flessione. La Svizzera, terza in volume di importazioni, ha fatto registrare un progresso molto sensibile, acquistando 232 macchine, valutate a \$182.438.

Il Sud America è diventata una zona importante durante questo periodo, con il Venezuela rivelatosi un acquirente veramente forte. Questa nazione ha comperato 731 fonografi valutati a \$723.663.

2) **Macchine da Divertimento:** Gli acquisti di macchine da divertimento da parte di importatori, come quelli dei fonografi, mostrano una leggera diminuzione. In questo primo trimestre, le ditte statunitensi hanno spedito 5.181 giochi valutati a \$1.162.890. Ciò va raffrontato con l’ultimo trimestre del 1958, durante il quale vennero spedite 6.637 macchine valutate a \$1.330.377. Mentre il numero di macchine spedito è stato inferiore di circa 1000 unità, il valore in dollari è diminuito solo leggermente. L’Europa, la massima acquirente in questo settore, ha fatto registrare una battuta di arresto con il Belgio che ha fatto totalizzare l’acquisto dello stesso numero di giochi comperati nel trimestre precedente, praticamente con lo stesso volume di dollari. La Germania Occidentale ha fatto registrare la forte diminuzione da 991 macchine e da un valore in dollari di \$251.711 per il trimestre precedente a 584 macchine valutate a \$142.459 per il trimestre in corso. La Svizzera, anche comperando un numero inferiore di macchine, ha speso una somma maggiore di danaro, \$203.790. Nell’America Settentrionale e Centrale, le importazioni del Canada sono aumentate durante il primo trimestre rispetto al quarto trimestre del 1958. Cuba non ha acquistato nemmeno una macchina, il che, naturalmente, si riflette nel volume totale di vendite a questa zona. Nell’America del Sud, sebbene le vendite si siano limitate ad una sola nazione, il Venezuela, vennero spedite 241 macchine per un valore in dollari di \$62.568.

3) **Distributrici Automatiche:** Mentre il numero di macchine esportate è stato il doppio di quello del trimestre precedente, la somma di danaro

effettivamente spesa è stata solo leggermente superiore. Questi dati statistici possono essere molto ingannevoli dal momento che l’America Settentrionale e Centrale, che hanno speso \$388.459 (con il Canada in testa alla graduatoria con \$338.849) hanno acquistato solo 2.796 macchine, mentre il Belgio ha acquistato 6.105 macchine per un valore di dollari di solo \$78.572—una media di \$13 per macchina. Tutta l’Europa ha speso soltanto \$159.742, ma ha importato 7.099 macchine.

88 Amusement Machines Produced

NEW YORK — The amusement machine operators of the world were supplied by a considerable number, and a large variety of amusement machines from July, 1958, thru June, 1959.

In all the manufacturers produced 88 machines, suitable for any type operator and for every taste and whim of the player.

Nine large Ball Bowlers came off the production lines, 1 by Bally, 3 by Chicago Dynamics and 4 by United.

The factories continued to ship the popular Shuffle Bowlers. Bally pro-

duced 5, Chicago Dynamics 2, Keeney 1 and United 7.

Bally produced 3 in-line pinball machines during this 12 months.

The most machines in a category manufactured was the pinball machine, with Gottlieb turning out 12 and Williams 7, for a total of 19.

The new idea, Rebound Shuffles, totaled 5, with Chicago Dynamics making 2, Keeney 1, United 1 and Williams 1.

Pool Tables continued to be a popular seller, with 6 new machines coming out, Fischer making 4 and Irving

Kaye 2.

Five Baseball games reached the market, with 1 each by Bally, Chicago Dynamics, Keeney, Williams and United.

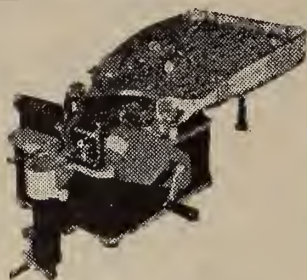
Guns, still a popular item, came to a total of 6. Bally made 2, United 1, and Williams 3.

Uprights were popular, with a total of 8 being produced. Bally manufactured 2, Chicago Dynamics 1, Games 1, and Keeney 4.

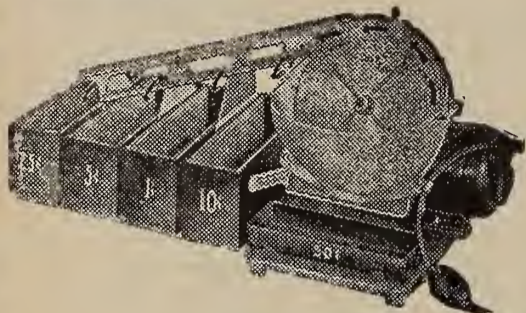
Novelty amusement machines produced totaled 7, Kiddie Rides 4, and long shuffleboard 1.

New Game Idea Could Stimulate Optimistic PR Approach—Robbins

Coinman Expresses Views On Nat'l. PR Program

CHICAGO—On the eve of the coin machine industry's challenge to adverse publicity, Joe Robbins, sales manager of Empire Coin Machine Exchange, this city, asserted last week that the industry seems to have recently donned its "thinking cap" to prepare for the battle of words which is certain to follow.

"Events leading up to this particular period," Robbins declared, "indicate clearly that the coin machine industry is girding itself for a public relations campaign during a crucial period in its existence. In fact, the industry as a whole, has dallied long and time is running out.

"As matters stand now," continued Robbins, "manufacturers, distributors and operators are constantly alarmed by reports they read in local newspapers, and other media which they find difficult to peruse in view of current legislation and other events of the present time.

"Those of us who earn our livelihood in the coin machine industry," he said, "know that there is actually no greater stimulus to reawaken everyone concerned than a new, exciting game. This will tend, naturally, to stimulate our thinking and keep us on an optimistic level now when we need it most.

"Perhaps a new type of game could easily avoid the base connotation associated with the industry with evil influences.

"New ideas in games are actually the backbone of the industry," continued Robbins. "Toward this end manufacturers, distributors and operators must constantly be on the alert for some apparently 'hare-brained' thought coming up which may present a new, fruitful idea rather than one of sense.

"Naturally," he stated, "the present feeling of depression among many in coinbiz these days. However, there is a lot of substantial legal-type coin equipment available. More should be developed, and a healthy public relations program which should go on uninterrupted will certainly spearhead an increase in business and will tend to ultimately wipe away the depressive state of affairs."

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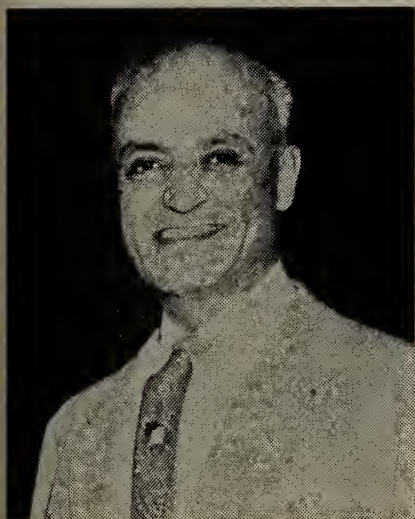

In addition to general meeting discus-

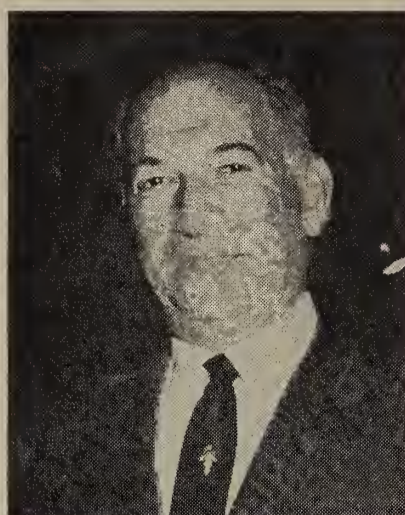

"Jack Wilson, Mrs. McCarthy and I will attend the August 5 meeting in New York City and set up a committee to represent an active program of public relations work in the upstate area to work with the staff selected to handle the New York City program," advised Greco.

Seeburg Enthusiastic Over New Cigarette Vendor Sales Reports

CHICAGO — George Glass, sales manager, cigarette machine division, The Seeburg Corporation, this city, in studying the progress of the firm's new cigarette vendor sales to date, announced that "we are gratified over the enthusiastic reports we have received from the many operators who have placed these vendors on location."

In discussing the new Seeburg cigarette machine, Glass said, "In designing the new Seeburg cigarette vendor, we have had the needs of the operator and his service personnel uppermost in our minds. We feel that this machine will earn more profit for the operator through increased volume of sales and lower cost of operation."

"Our new 22 column vendor will enable the operator to sell more cigarettes by eliminating the lost sales because of inadequate column capacity for fast moving brands. Every operator knows that he can't do business from empty columns. The fact that two or more columns may be devoted to fast moving brands, still does not eliminate the possibility of lost sales because one column is empty, nor does it eliminate the possibility of a service call because the location owner thinks he's out of cigarettes on certain brands."

"Even with Seeburg's huge 825 pack capacity—11 columns holding 55 packs and 11 columns holding 20 packs (one column adaptable for Benson & Hedges type pack)—'doubling up' on one or two brands is necessary in some good locations."

"Seeburg has eliminated the possibility of lost sales or needless service calls by enabling the operator to 'tie in' the doubled up columns so that if one column is empty, the same brand of cigarettes will automatically be delivered from the adjoining column regardless of which of the two buttons is pressed. 110 packs can be sold before the column is empty. This arrangement is adaptable on two sets of 2 columns by the operator merely pushing a switch. If he wants to vend 22 brands, he merely pushes the switch the other way," continued Glass.

"The possibility of selling out on the remaining 7 columns is remote because of the 55 pack capacity," stated Glass.

"The dispensing of matches with every pack of cigarettes is very costly to the operator. There are millions of lighters in use today and millions more are sold or given away each year. Yet, matches are delivered to many smokers who really don't want them."

"The new Seeburg Vendor has a system where only the consumer who wants matches will get them. Here's how it works. The consumer deposits his coins in the machine and selects his brand by pushing the selector button. The cigarettes come out, but no matches are delivered. If the consumer wants his matches, he presses the match release button and the matches are delivered. If the consumer doesn't care about matches, he just picks up his cigarettes and walks away."

"The operator determines how he shall deliver matches. If he wants to give matches with every sale, he merely sets a spring on this match unit one way and if he decides to vend matches by having the consumer press the match release button, he reverses the position of the spring. To make the change takes exactly one second on location. A recent survey indicates that 37% of the operators in the country do not dispense matches. Yet, despite this fact, every cigarette machine has a match unit and these operators must pay for it."

"The new Seeburg Vendor will have an optional match unit. If the operator doesn't need it, he will not get it and of course he'll pay less money for the machine. Should the marketing conditions change in his territory and match units become necessary, they will be available at a nominal charge."

"The ease of servicing and inventoring the new Seeburg Vendor will appeal to the service man. All columns are calibrated. No longer does the service man have to count the inventory. He just reads the inventory."

"We look to a bright future for the new Seeburg cigarette vendor based on our current sales and progress reports," concluded Glass.

Philip Morris Veep Sites Increased Cigarette Sales

ATLANTA, GA.—Ray Jones, vice president, Philip Morris, Inc., in an address to conventioners attending the Southern Wholesale Confectioners & Tobacco Association in this city, predicted that increases in cigarette sales will continue at least thru the 1960's.

Jones said he based this on the nation's continued increase in population.

He told his audience that "in the next few years more of you (tobacco and confectioner wholesalers) will be operating vending equipment. This development is inevitable because automation is here and automatic vending is highly efficient as a form of retailing."

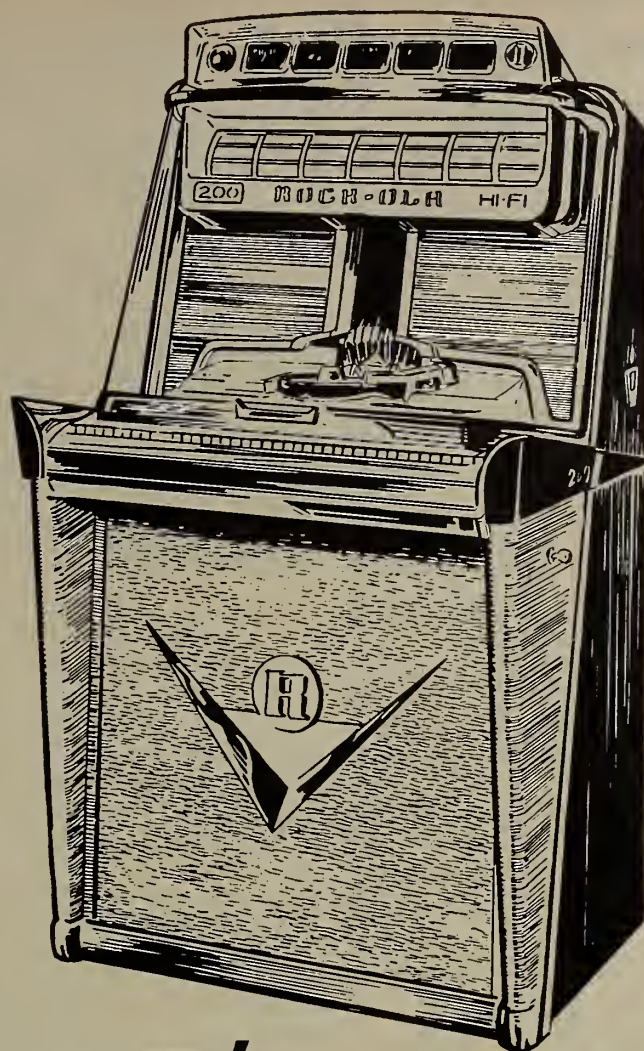

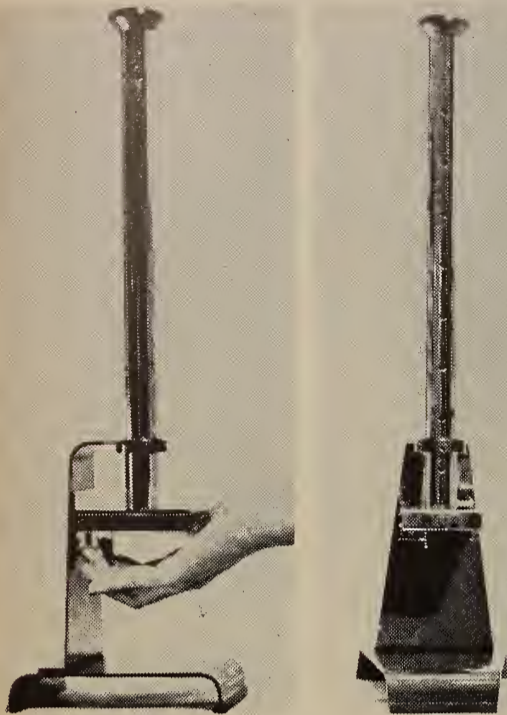

Metropolitan Daily Prints Trade Side Of Coin Story

Parkoff Enlightens Press With The Facts



MEYER PARKOFF

NEW YORK—A newspaper story appearing in the July 9th edition of the *Long Island Daily Press*, could very well be the first breakthrough the coin machine industry has made in this area with its side of the coin machine story, after a tide of sensational headlines appearing daily during the Washington hearings.

Meyer Parkoff, Atlantic New York Corporation, received previous publicity in this same newspaper several months ago when he addressed the senior class at Lawrence High School, Lawrence, New York, on the workings of the music machine business. The article appearing in the July 9th edition, headlined, "Long Island Juke Box Man Fights For 'Legitimate' Operators", was the result of Parkoff's association with this newspaper after spending hours of time briefing the newspaper's correspondent on the actual conditions that exist in his industry. The actual appearance of the article in the daily newspaper, proves a point which should be immediately recognized by all coinmen. That is, education of the people in the communications field will eventually result in the true facts being published to a host of otherwise uninformed readers. Parkoff opened the doors of the industry to the newspaper staff, presenting a factual report on the coin machine industry as such, complementing the report with a clear-cut picture of his own home life. The newspaper representative visited Parkoff's home and was introduced to the Parkoff family. The story which resulted is as follows:

The work of a few hoods has cast a shadow over an entire industry, according to Meyer C. Parkoff of Lawrence, a juke box distributor for more than 25 years. Parkoff, 48, is conducting a campaign to wipe the "racket ridden" brand from legitimate businessmen in the juke box business who have nothing to do with phoney unions and muscle-hoods.

"Most of us in this business work hard to earn our money," said Parkoff, president of the Atlantic New York Corp., distributors of Seeburg juke boxes in New York, New Jersey and Connecticut.

"It's a competitive business. But because of a few hoodlums, we've all been declared guilty."

The juke box probe by the Senate Rackets Committee has concentrated on union activity and operator associations. Though there are only five manufacturers in the country, there are many distributors and numerous operators who buy the boxes and place them in stores, restaurants and

other locations.

"Most of the people in the juke box field are hard-working conscientious businessmen," said Parkoff, "but we all may have been negligent and careless about keeping our business clean.

"But we've always fought attempts by hoods to move in. We've spent hundreds of thousands of dollars in our fight."

The industry fully supports the probes into union racketeering and hopes they will bring "some good legislation", he said. Parkoff, a mild-mannered man, is sedate in dress and precise in his speech. He lives with his wife and three sons in a two-story

home on Donmoor Rd.

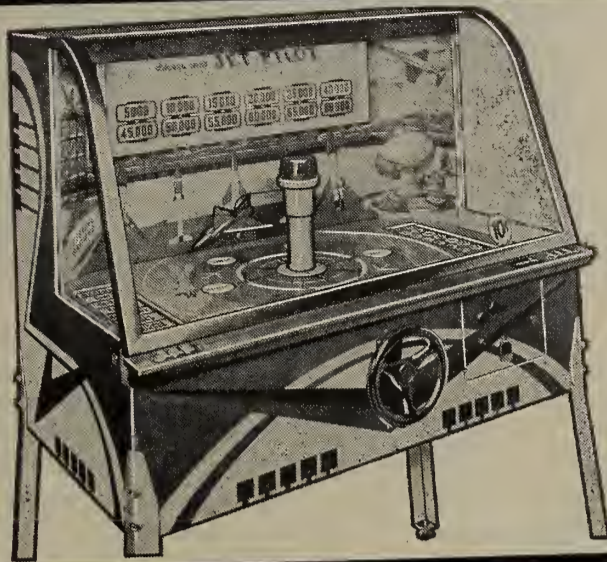
Parkoff is a trustee of Beth Shalom Synagogue and is active in charitable work.

Perhaps the appearance of this article in a newspaper with a circulation of 100,000 could be the start of a regular campaign to educate the public to the true story of the coin machine industry.

Certainly it is a bright note coming at a time when the entire State of New York has organized to ac-

complish this same result—good public relations. The newly formed Public Relations Committee of the New York State Coin Machine Association, Inc., working under the state association charter, was originally conceived by Parkoff at a general meeting of coinmen in New York City several weeks ago. The idea was carried to the point of selection of a committee and staff leading to a definite public relations program currently being carried out under the chairmanship of Albert "Senator" Bodkin, New York City operator. Parkoff is acting in an advisory capacity to the actual committee members who are performing the duties of the new organization.
