While flying a Mafia Copter low over East Pyongyang, I failed to notice a large crane swing its magnet-chain towards me until I was stuck to it.

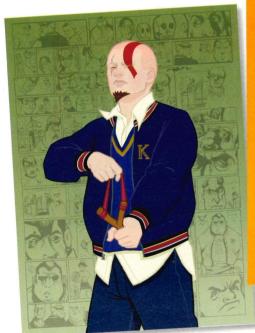

### **ENOUGH IS ENOUGH**

I am a massive Final Fantasy nerd; I've played the lot. From NES to PS2, from Mystic Quest to Tactics to Square spin-offs such as Chrono Trigger and the Seiken Densetsu series.

I'm a completist, too. If there's an ultimate weapon, hidden dungeon or a rare slab of petrified chocobo dung, me and my party of 9999 HP misfits have found it.

So when I say Final Fantasy XII is overrated, undercooked and exceedingly dull, I know what I'm taking about. It's also the first Final Fantasy game I've refused to finish, incidentally.

Gameplay is extended by repetition alone: the torturous process of 'grinding' recycled monster models for experience, items and loot. Because of this, many FF fans are starting to make the mistake that game length must somehow be proportionate to enjoyment.

FFXII's six characters are indistinguishable. Power players will end up filling all their characters' licence boards fairly early in the game, creating identikit characters with no unique abilities aside from looking different.

Add to that a predictable, paper-thin plot, albeit disguised by a beautiful script, and FFXII is hardly the best in the series many folk claim it to be.

That said, though, Balthier is a badass.

Furthermore, the in-depth politics, credible history of each country and interweaving storylines between characters made the conclusion incredibly satisfying.

The non-exclusive Licence board makes the characters unique, because you can personalise them to your own play style and characters aren't restricted to one limited slot.

The option of Headhunting and side quests makes levelling up (something every RPG gamer expects to undertake) less of a repetitive chore and more of an adventure.

But I do agree, Balthier is one cool cat.

It's strange to think that the largest, most apocalyptic game of 2007 is being quietly developed in a small, countryside studio, just outside Knutsford, Cheshire. But that's

where *Transformers* developer Traveller's Tales (best known for *Super Monkey Ball Adventure* and *Lego Star Wars* and recently voted UK development studio of the year) calls home.

Tucked away on a quiet country road between a row of ostentatious footballer mansions, and the local Rolls Royce dealership, it looks like a haven of rural peace from the outside.

Go inside, though, and you enter a dark, cluttered den of wide-eyed programmers, producers and artists



all working flat out to make sure that *Transformers* appears on shop shelves by July and that it's worth playing, too.

As director Michael Bay and executive producer Steven Spielberg painstakingly shape the final cut of the forthcoming film, so the team at Traveller's Tales are making last-minute adjustments to the game.

The good news is that both movie and game are on track to be real scorchers when they arrive.

Traveller's Tales has been given generous access to the film's top-secret content – some have even been treated to a screening of the near-finished product – to make sure *Transformers* on PS2 is a close as possible to the version you'll see in the cinemas.

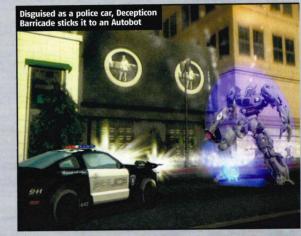
How close? Well, close enough for fans to enjoy, but with enough artistic licence to make this feel like a decent game in its own right.

### **ROBOT WARS**

You can choose to play as either the Autobots or the Decepticons and both factions have their own campaign to play through.

Because the plot of the film will follow the earth-saving exploits of the Autobots, their campaign mirrors the movie.

The majority of the Decepticon missions will have players chasing similar goals, but with different intentions – the overall aim being to win the Transformer war and enslave the earth.



The Autobots are mainly concerned with rescuing, saving, escorting and defending, whereas the

Decepticons are all about wrecking stuff up and making life tough for the 'good guys'.

During our demo we were given a walkthrough of a couple of typical *Transformers* missions. First up was a combat-based objective. Playing as Bumblebee (an Autobot) it was our job to track down and destroy

several waves of Decepticon drones that had started making trouble in the game's Suburbs stage.

That done, we were onto mission two, which required us to race to a spot on the map before a rival Decepticon got there. So, after a swift transform, we were weaving through

So, Transformers has gone all fancy-pants (GI, but fans of the cartoon need not worry that the new-look metal giants will be devoid of all personality. Well, we can't speak for the characters in the film, but the Transformers in the game will be given a healthy dose of soul by familiar voice actors. Both Peter Cullum (voice of Optimus Prime in the cartoon series and original movie) and Frank Welker (the voice of Megatron) have voiced their respective parts in the game. The rumour that Orson Welles has returned from the grave to play the part of Unicron is, sadly, a complete lie.

### **AUTOBOTS**



### BUMBLEBEI

Who? He's the first Transformer you'll get the chance to play as, and the only character in the game to have two different transforms. Why? Apparently Transformers can assume any mechanical form they choose, so in the film, when Spike asks Bumblebee why he chose to mimic a beaten-up 1974 Camaro, Bumblebee responds by changing into a sports car. You'll get to play as both in the game.

### JAZZ

Who? Another of the original characters from the cartoon series, Jazz is a staple from the Transformers universe. In the original animated movie of 1986 Jazz was voiced by the legendary Scatman Crothers, who's appeared in classic films The Shining and One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest. The 1986 Transformers movie was the last movie he did, though, because he died later the same year of lung cancer.

### IRONHIDE

Who? Unofficial second in command of the Autobots (behind Optimus Prime), Ironhide is one of the larger Transformers in the game. Interestingly, he is voiced by Peter Cullen, who also does the vocals of Optimus Prime.

### **OPTIMUS PRIME**

Who? Prime is the leader of the Autobots and the one who dishes out your missions as you romp through the game. At the start of the 1986 movie Prime died and passed leadership to Ultra Magnus, but he's been resurrected for the 2007 film because he's the most well-known Transformer of all time.

### BLACKOUT

Who? A newcomer to the Transformers universe, Blackout is the helicopter/robot you might have spotted wrecking up the military base during the teaser trailer for the film. You'll be able to recreate this scene in the game by devastating the human armies based in Qatar. Before he became Blackout, this Transformer was referred to as either Vortex or Incinerator.

### BARRICADE

Who? Another robot in disguise created for the film. You'll first meet Barricade during one of the early Decepticon missions, where he's fighting with Bumblebee over key character Spike Witwicky.

### SCORPONOK

Who? A scorpion-like machine with the ability to tunnel through the ground and shoot up underneath his enemies. He's smaller than all the other Transformers and, strangely, he can't transform. During the game, you'll take Scorponok on several 'hit and run' missions in the desert.

### STARSCREAM

Who? A long-running character from the TV show, Starscream is the impetuous second in command of the Decepticons. His shrill vocals in the cartoon are provided by Chris Latta, who also lent his talents to cult kids show Action Force in the late 1980s.

### MEGATRON

Who? Leader of the Decepticons and the nemesis of Optimus Prime. During the 1986 movie he faced off against Prime and came off worse. Left for dead, adrift in space, he is resurrected by planet-sized Transformer Unicron. In the new film, Megatron once again faces up to Optimus Prime for an epic robot-on-robot showdown.

the city streets, sliding round corners and blasting drones as we went.

The first Decepticon mission we saw took place in the Oatar level. Taking control of Blackout, the awesome machine from the teaser trailer that changes from robot to Seastallion helicopter, our objective was simple: destroy the human military base.

This meant pulling off our rotor blades and smashing up buildings before transforming into a helicopter and nailing any resisting troops with rockets. Beats the hell out of checkpoint racing and 'protecting' people with Optimus Prime's gang...

### **WORLD PIECES**

In fact, we feel a little sorry for the Autobots, because actually destroying the game world and being a robot menace is one of Transformers' best features.

Each level is a self-contained recreation of key scenes from the movie and every one is littered with buildings, cars, trees, and of course, squashy humans.

Like in Mercenaries, you can choose to take specific missions, hunt for bonus items, or devote your time

and effort to reducing your environment to a dusty wasteland. But unlike Mercenaries (and in fact every other game) you're a mechanical colossus, so you're more than capable of bringing down apartment blocks with a few swift punches, or picking up cars and hurling them into the distance.

And that's not all. After you've broken up entire neighbourhoods, you can use the chunks of rubble as weapons. You can pick up trees and use them to swat away the Transformer drones that are sent against you by your enemies, or you can climb buildings and leap down onto your enemies, leaving massive craters wherever you land.

This really is the most destruction we've ever seen on PS2, and after the endless plodding iterations of

Gundam, Armoured Core and the like, Transformers makes the idea of playing as a giant robot great again.

Of course with either faction, you can choose to just romp around each stage causing havoc and looking for hidden items and events to unlock extras, but you'll need to complete missions to progress.

### **DESTROY ALL HUMANS**

The humans will try to stop you causing too much damage to their cities but, until the later stages when they start to roll out the serious military hardware, their puny firearms don't do much more than tickle your metallic skin.

The real damage comes from fighting other Transformers and battling it out with arch rivals at the 🗼







### SPOILERS IN DISGUISE

The movie's opening sequence takes place in the 1800s, when polar explorer Archibold Witwicky falls down an abyss in the Artic Circle and discovers he's landed on Decepticon leader Megatron, who's been buried in ice for centuries. Trying to get a message to his fellow Decepticons, Megatron burns the location of an ancient energy source called The Allspark into Witwicky's spectacles.

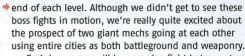

Well, the early 1980s models wouldn't get made today, being heavy, die-cast monstrosities with enough choking hazards to wipe out a primary school. But then, it was never about the build quality; it was about taking a young boy's favourite things — tanks; cars, planes — and giving each one a unique personality

Well, I say 'boy', but the Transformers community I'm part of is 70% female, and there's always a healthy mix at conventions such as Birmingham's Auto Assembly, which is almost exclusively populated by adults.

So what I'm saying to young 'uns enjoying Transformers now for the first time is: enjoy your maturity while it lasts.



Each boss scrap will be a grudge fight between two equally matched Transformers, so expect to see Bumblebee versus Barricade, Ironhide versus Blackout and the ultimate: Optimus Prime against Megatron.

With its careful mix of licensed content and suitably sweet made-up features, *Transformers* has the potential to sit among the best movie tie-ins on PS2.

Publisher Activision is promising some great unlocks for completing specific side missions, so we're expecting more than just artwork and film stills. Right now, though, all it will say is that fans of the original G1 cartoons will be well catered for.

Whatever Traveller's Tales manages to cram onto the disc, the most important thing is that work is on course to reach its explosive climax in July. The robots in disguise are almost ready to reveal their true form and we reckon it'll be very easy on the eye.

## **MANHUNT 2**

#### BLOOD, SWEAT AND FEARS. YES, MANHUNT'S BACK

There's no other game quite like Manhunt. Other titles have outraged the nation's self-appointed moral guardians, but none have matched the unadulterated, undiluted brutality of Manhunt. And if you think that all the media attention it received means its sequel is going to pull any blood-soaked punches, you'd be wrong. So, so wrong.

The plot is prime nightmare material. You take control of Daniel Lamb, a research scientist who falls on hard times and is therefore forced to take work on a shady project under the supervision of a shifty character by the name of Dr Pickman.

When funding for his work gets yanked, Pickman approaches Dan and asks him to put himself forward as a test subject for the project. After a long chat with his wife and kids, Daniel agrees to be Dr Pickman's guinea pig.

Several years later Lamb regains consciousness inside Dixmore Hospital For The Criminally Insane, and his first act is to strangle the nurse who's trying to restrain him. And so the second Manhunt begins.

#### IF LOOKS COULD KILL

The first thing you notice in the new Manhunt is that the visuals are tidier and the animations have been spruced up. Fans of the original Manhunt may baulk at the sequel's less grimy feel so, just for them, there's an option to turn the VCR-style static filter on or off.

The first level is a tutorial, in which Daniel hooks up with fellow inmate Leo in a bid to escape Dixmore and you learn the fundamentals of the game's methods.

The kill system in this sequel works in exactly the same way as the first game. When you're close enough to a victim to strike, Daniel's heart will start pounding inside his ribcage, and the DualShock pad will vibrate.

Holding down on will ready him up for the kill and the longer you hold the button down before releasing it, the more gruesome your butchery will be.

The first weapon Daniel finds is a syringe and even though he's reluctant to use it, he's soon encouraged to jab it into someone's neck and stab away until the victim stops breathing.

The rest of the game sees Daniel hacking, shooting and punching his way through the contracted killers who come after him, all the while trying to piece together what happened to him in the years since he signed up to become a test subject in the project.

To this end, the game incudes several flashback missions, where Lamb relives a snapshot of his past to try and recall what has happened to him.

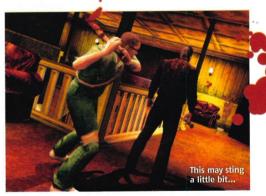
#### **ACE OF CHASE**

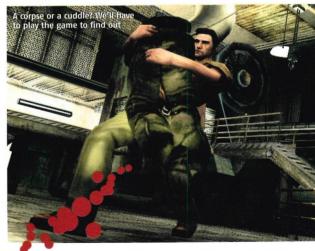
The level we played, Best Friends, was one such flashback mission. Here we were playing as Leo, Danny's chum from Dixmore, and we were hunting down a man called Michael, who'd double-crossed us. Bad mistake.

The first task was to chase Michael down, so we held down the 🕲 button and legged it into an industrial dockside warehouse. Inside, we spot a group of hired guns searching the building: they're looking for Leo. Unarmed, we take to the shadows.

Unlike the first game, Manhunt 2 won't let you get away with murder when it comes to stealth. Squatting in semi-darkness doesn't guarantee safety, because your enemies will actively peer into dark areas when spooked. If they stare right at you, you must quickly press a button sequence to stay hidden, which really keeps you on edge.

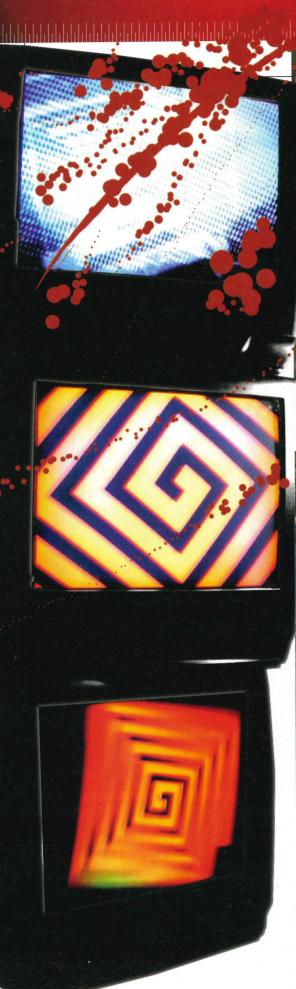
After avoiding detection from a couple of goons, we're itching to kick off the bloodbath, but there's one

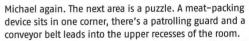


problem: no weapon. Luckily, *Manhunt 2* introduces *Punisher*—style environmental kills, so we flick the switch on a nearby meat–grinding machine and patiently wait for the nearest bad guy to check out the noise.

Once he's in range, we sneak up behind him and feed him into the mechanism, causing blood and body parts to fly everywhere. Thankfully, his buddies remain oblivious to the whole incident, because there's too much background noise in their ears.

#### **HOPE AND GORY**

After grabbing our victim's weapon (a baton) and dispatching his chums with a combination of brute strength and meat-grinder, we're ready to track down



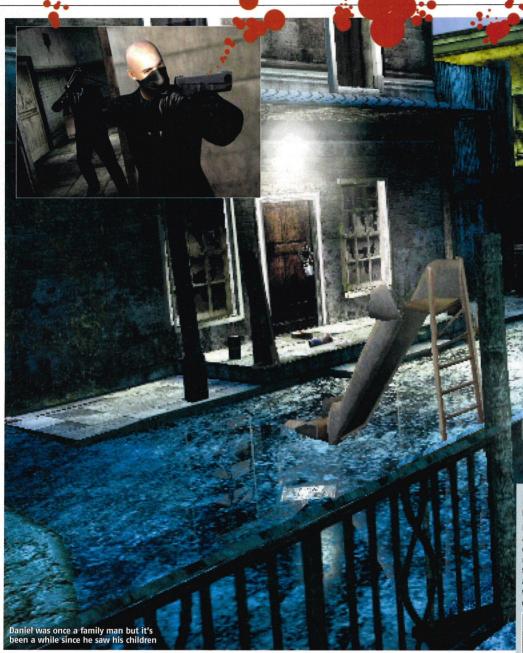
Leo can't walk along the conveyor because the exit is blocked by a mesh gate, so we have to work out how to activate the packing machine. We dispatch the guard with a close-up gun kill (Leo shoves his pistol into the man's mouth and blows off the top half of his head), and approach the machine.

It needs a specific weight on the belt before the machine will activate and what do you know, that weight is roughly the same as a human male, much like the one we recently sent to meet his maker.

So, we pick up the guard's corpse and dump it onto the conveyor belt. He's snatched into the machine and after some sickening tearing and crunching noises, he emerges as a human-box.

Meanwhile, we're free to progress and confront Michael on the warehouse roof. This kind of encounter is what will pass for a boss-fight in *Manhunt 2*. We run

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Our ammo was low. We needed to get creative. First off, a carrier-bag kill on a guard who stepped out from the watchful view of his buddies. Then it was a gun execution on another mercenary and finally a shoot-out with the other two.

By this time, we'd nailed the art of headshots, and with a quick couple of flicks of the right thumbstick we were free to steal the boat and escape the level.

So although the hands-on time we were given with *Manhunt 2* was brief, it was plenty enough to convince us that this is yet another slice of top-quality violence from Rockstar.

Although new devices have been added, such as the environment kills and the ability to create your own shadows by shooting out certain lights, the game sticks to the tried-and-tested *Manhunt* formula.

Most importantly, though, this sequel is as brutal, gruesome and vicious as the original. Faint-hearted gamers, concerned parents and knee-jerk commentators: you have been warned. **AH**

During our time playing Manhunt 2 we had the chance to try out a few of the more unconventional weapons the game has to offer. Right now, we've got mixed emotions about Naruto. Having spent hours of hands-on time with a nearly finished version of *Uzumaki Chronicles*, the latest in this anime mega-series, we've unearthed fistfuls of strengths and weaknesses in equal measure.

On the surface it's a slick, if repetitive, third-person fighter in the vein of *Mortal Kombat: Shaolin Monks*. Punch; kick; lob razor-sharp weapons and so on. But much more than that, it's shaping up to be a goldmine for fans of the TV series on which it's based.

#### **KNOW YOUR NARUTO**

If you're familiar with the cartoon, which has been running on the Jetix channel for almost a year, you'll know that Naruto is a boy training to be a ninja.

His birth is something of a mystery, and he's made even more complex by the fact that an evil nine-tailed fox spirit has been locked inside his body since he was knee-high to a grasshopper.

There's a whole huge history to *Naruto* (it's been around in Japan since 1999) so there's plenty to learn about the series and, therefore, this game.

Fans of the show will be over the moon with the authenticity of the game, and it's this faithfulness that will make *Uzumaki Chronicles* a firm favourite among devotees. The visuals are very much in the style of the TV show, and the game is stuffed to bursting with lovable secondary characters. Kakashi, Sasuke and Neji all make playable appearances.

The main game is mission-based. Playing as Naruto you travel to a village, pick up an assignment then roam

the land trying to complete it. The quests range from dull stuff such as protecting wagons of merchandise to genuinely interesting concepts: advertising shops by beating up bandits using that shop's specific weapons, for example.

During the actual fights, however, *Naruto: Uzumaki Chronicles* has plenty to shout about. As well as regular combos and special attacks, Naruto can unleash his special Nine-Tailed Fox Spirit power, or call in a partner to attack for a short time.

While you're playing as Naruto's buddy, you can use special moves specific to that character and this will help you overcome certain obstacles, or beat specific types of enemies much more quickly.

Sadly, the developer passed on the chance to include a proper cooperative mode, which would have been a real boon. Sure, there will be plenty of content to keep you busy in a singleplayer capacity, including the chance to find

ancient plate pieces and chips to boost Naruto's stats and abilities, but we'd love to have seen some kind of multiplayer action built in.

It would certainly help us muster up a little more enthusiasm for the future of this plucky fighter, because from these first impressions, it doesn't look like Naruto has the legs to be a legendary PS2 ninja. AH

## **TONY HAWK'S DOWNHILL JAM**

#### DROPPING INTO PS2 SOON WITH EXCLUSIVE CONTENT

It may sound like one of those peculiar West Country sports where the objective is to chase after a food item rolling down a cliff, but Downhill Jam is actually Activision's latest reinvention of the Tony Hawk's franchise.

Downhill Jam was previously released on DS and Wii to high acclaim, and now the good old PS2 is yet again the recipient of a publisher's output considered too exuberant and quirky for other consoles. Well, having played it on Wii, we're not complaining.

The long-running series of Tony Hawk's games were groundbreaking at the start but have been getting formulaic, so Downhill Jam's mix of seat-of-the-pants thrills and time-attack scoring is a breath of fresh air.

The focus is entirely on getting from A to B in the quickest time possible, though a number of collectible tokens can also boost your stats and final score.

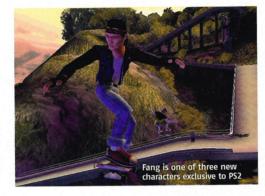
The races take place on some of the steepest hills in the world, from the streets of San Francisco to the rocky terrain of Machu Picchu in Peru. Imagine Sonic The Hedgehog on a skateboard.

#### SKATE EXPECTATIONS

Game modes include Race, Trick Attack and Slalom plus three new, PS2-exclusive modes: Airtime, Mayhem and Yard Sale.

Activision is currently keeping schtum about these new features, but judging by the Wii version and the PS2 screens we've seen, we reckon Mayhem could consist of destroying everything in your path and mowing down as many tourists as possible while Yard Sale is likely to focus on collecting money tokens in difficult-to-reach places.

The formula worked surprisingly well on Wii and the new emphasis on replaying levels to achieve higher



scores and open up new goals certainly gave it a 'one more go' factor that should appeal to PS2 players as much as it did to the Wiimote-wavers.

Just like in SSX, pressing down on the crouch button boosts speed while letting go at the crest of a hill or ramp provides the extra air required for pulling off amazing tricks and stunts. Grinding obstacles is typically satisfying while jostling with rival racers as you bomb down the tracks adds a further frisson of excitement.

#### CHARACTER CLASS

Instead of the usual line-up of real world skaters and Tony's mates there are eight generic characters to choose from: think Goth chick and stoned teenager, and the PS2 gets further bonuses with three extra, exclusive skaters.

Plus the excellent Create-A-Skater feature is present and correct, in which you can design your own avatar.

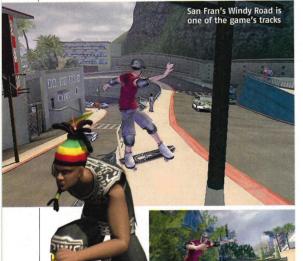
It's looking like a comprehensive package containing more than 100 events across eight environments. And to sweeten the experience even more

there'll be a further 10 exclusive PS2 events and three all-new. split-screen multiplayer modes.

But it wasn't until 2004, when ObsCure hit the PS2, that anyone got a taste of teen survival horror. ObsCure took The Faculty's plot, set it inside Resident Evil's



traditional third-person engine, threw in a bunch of light-shy demons and implemented a two-player system in which your single player's Al buddy could be replaced by another human player at any time.

As you progressed you swapped control to other characters, giving you a game that took the ensemble nature and teen-wit of The Faculty and turned it into a novel take on the aging survival horror formula.

#### SCARE IN THE COMMUNITY

It started promisingly enough as you assumed control of high-school jock Kenny Mathews chasing a thief from the locker rooms and on to his mysterious disappearance But what followed was a veritable check list of

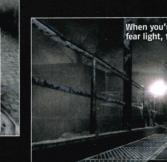

#### 'THE FATE YOU HAVE ACCEPTED'? OOER...

Odin Sphere is the unofficial sequel to Princess
Crown, released in 1997 on the Sega Saturn.
So it's taken a fair while to happen, but its

arrival is a sign that, finally, Japanese companies are listening to the fans and are bringing such beautiful games over to Western shores.

And beautiful this is. Mouth-wateringly delicious. The backgrounds alone could practically be framed in the Louvre, right next to the Mona Lisa. Developer Vanillaware boasts that every individual location and character is painstakingly hand drawn and coloured, and it shows.

Set in a medieval world full of Norse legend, the kingdom of Valentine is destroyed by an ancient artefact, and now war has broken out between humankind and fairies (don't laugh, they have swords) to gain control of said doomsday device.

Enter Demon King Odin, who's intent on obliterating everything that gets in between him and the artefact. But Odin seems to have forgotten about an ancient prophecy foretelling that his actions will lead to Armageddon. Doh!

You experience the action from the eyes of five playable characters, each with their own







tale of tragedy to tell. The main star is
Valkyrie Princess Gwendolyn, Odin's
daughter. Her older sister was recently
killed, so Gwendolyn's out for revenge;
she also hopes that in fighting for her
father, she'll win his love.

#### **FAIRY NUFF**

Backing her up is Velvet (a princess who hid in the forest after her kingdom was annihilated), Cornelius (a prince turned monster who fancies Velvet), Mercedes (not a car, a fairy child queen) and Ozmund (a killer knight who's been trained to murderise everything in sight).

In a break from the modern-day roleplaying norm, OS is a 2D side-scroller with real-time action rather than using turn-based battles. But of course you still have to fight through hordes of enemies and face down gloriously huge bosses.

The game is split into separate acts, and at

the end of each, you get a score on the time you took to get to the end, how many baddies you slaughtered and how good your fighting was. The better the score, the more goodies you can unlock.

To balance up the physical action, there's plenty of magic spells to cast. And, usefully, Gwendolyn's spear can absorb Phozons (the souls of the dead) and use their energy to either charge up your magic gauge or level up the spear.

With sidequests, mini-games and unlockable spells galore, 0S is shaping up to be one lengthy chuck of gorgeous RPG gold. ■ KR

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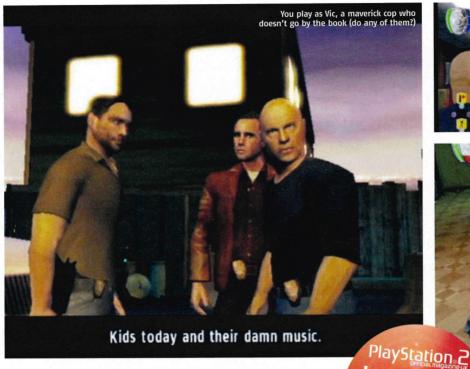

## THE SHIELD

#### GOOD COP? SORRY, NO, IT'S A REAL BAD COP

The folk at Channel Five plainly hate *The Shield*.
Otherwise, why keep putting it out at midnight on a weekday? And we don't understand why they hate it hecause we love it.

We love it so much we've just imported the Season 5 box set from the USA and got genuinely excited when we heard Aspyr was bringing the official game of the show to the PS2, voiced by the entire cast and incorporating a spin-off plot from one of the show's strongest story arcs. But then we played it.

A mix of gunplay, stealth, fighting and, er, running very fast after perps, the formula is what we'd call 'basic' if we were being kind. But we can't be kind. Not even in a preview.

Because we know that the finished game will very likely look exactly the same as this: the same repetitive missions, the same awful camera, the same lethargic voice acting. And, presumably, the same version of The Barn: in case you're not a fan, that's the police station in

the fictional Los Angeles borough of Farmington, where our heroes the Strike Team are based, but here it looks more like a Moroccan souk.

#### COP A FEEL

To be fair to developer Point of View, though, the general vibe is spot-on. The show is a mixture of interrogation, fast on-foot chases and the occasional 'naughty' police tactic (planting evidence, smashing in a suspect's face, nicking drug money, that kind of caper). The game replicates that feel fairly successfully.

And the ideas behind the fighting system (which is a mix of punching, grappling and *Punisher*-style, context-sensitive torture) are sound.

But it's all so shabbily done. The camera glitches as you try to deliver a punch in a cramped space; the levels are just trial and error as you work out what AI quirk cost you your life and then do it again; the script is terrible; and, from a purely cosmetic standpoint, the character models are just terrifying.

We remember Vic quite clearly saying in Season 2 that he didn't step aside, he stepped up. Well, in digital form, he steps in – and we don't like the smell.  $\blacksquare$  **TW**

The Darkness is one of the most brutal, bloody games in development for PS3. It makes the alien gore of Resistance and the war-horror of Call Of Duty look like back-to-back episodes of Barney Joins The Army. And because Starbreeze (famous for making the handsome Chronicles Of Riddick on Xbox) is pushing the console's visuals further than most developers, the violence is super-detailed.

In other words, it's just the kind of stomach-churning horror shooter that we've been waiting for.

Based on the Top Cow comic book series of the same name, *The Darkness* follows the story of Jackie Estacado, a Mafia hitman from a somewhat troubled gene pool.

See, Jackie's family carries a mysterious curse that strikes the males of each generation when they reach their 21st birthdays. What curse? During the game's opening level, after Jackie is double-crossed by his

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## CASTLEVANIA: THE DRACULA X CHRONICLES



IT'S FANGS FOR THE MEMORIES AS PSP PACKAGE INCLUDES RARE CLASSICS



First off, a bit of background. The original Demon Castle Dracula X Rondo of Blood was chronologically the 10th Castlevania game released but was only available for PC in Japan and SNES in the West.

Then in 1997, Rondo of Blood was alluded to in Castlevania: Symphony of the Night, its final showdown with Dracula forming a cameo during the opening level.

Confused? Don't be. All you really need to know is that *Rondo of Blood* has been remade in 3D for *Castlevania: The Dracula X Chronicles*, coming to PSP at the end of 2007.

It's the unreleased tale of the refusal of a member of the Belmont family (the clan around whom the whole series is based) to take lightly Dracula's kidnapping of his girlfriend. And it's called 'Chronicles' because the UMD will have more than one game on it.

The star attraction will be a beautifully rendered incarnation of *Rondo* draped in the finest polygonal details the PSP can muster, and we reckon it looks like the most handsome *Castlevania* game ever released.

There'll also be a version of *Rondo* ripped straight from the original PC Engine for you to discover once you've mastered the remake.

As an extra bonus, you get to unlock Symphony of the Night, too – to put this in perspective, if you tried to buy the Limited Edition version of SON for your PS1 it would cost you upwards of £100. So that's pretty cool.

#### THE MAGIC RONDO-BOUT

Producer Koji Igarashi has been with the series since he assisted the direction of SON. For Rondo's renaissance, he reunites with Symphony character designer Ayami Kojima and Michiru Yamane, the bloke who wrote the





music that was so great that it came on a separate CD with the Limited Edition pack.

Igarashi is a confessed 2D aficionado and hopes to release genuinely new Castlevania titles for PSP, should Chronicles take off in the right way.

The biggest difference between *Chronicles* and recent *Castlevania* iterations is

that it doesn't feature any roleplaying elements.

There's no need to level up your character to learn how to double-jump, or how to change into a wolf to fit through tight gaps in the scenery: you know it all from the very beginning.

#### KING OF THE CASTLE

Chronicles represents Castlevania before the new approach to skills and abilities was put in and this makes for a more direct, accessible game where the most valuable skill is the ability to handle a whip and a sword.

But don't be thinking that the comparative simplicity of this game means it's nothing but a left-to-right hack-and-slash with a few ladders thrown in. Exploration and understanding of the castle are vital with plenty of opportunities to get lost among the constantly spawning enemies.

As is the *Castlevania* way, these enemies will die and leave you with heart tokens that can also be found inside candelabras, for no discernable reason other than game design. These hearts can be used to fuel sub-weapons such as thrown blades, or can be used in a 'Crush' attack where you combine your stockpile of energy into special smart moves that fill the screen with spinning death and discomfort.

There's a definite whiff of gaming history in this package, but it is universally welcoming. On the one hand it has been designed so newcomers can dive

straight in; on the other, it lets toughened players revisit *Rondo's* original 10 levels.

It's also a relief to see the series in 2D again, after the disastrous attempts to turn *Castlevania* into 3D for PS2 had almost exhausted our appetite for vampire-bashing action. Almost. **WJ**

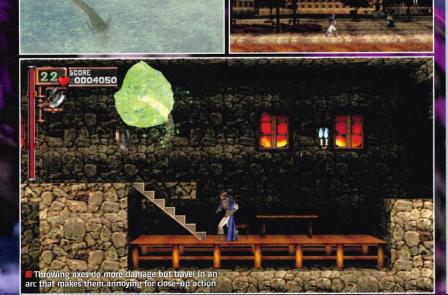

#### **HELLO VAMPERS**

It's the year 1792. Dracula has been revived by a dark priest and decides that because he's evil and has a long-running vendetta against the Belmont family that he best start his new un-life by turning 19-year-old Richter Belmont's village to ashes. Just in case Richter didn't take that personally enough, The Big D kidnaps his girlfriend Annette and her 12-year-old sister Maria. Of course, that means this generation's Belmont must enter the castle and kick some ass. You get to play as Maria, too.



#### **FAT ASS BOSSES**

When we said this was a 3D version of a classic game we weren't kidding. No fancy-schmancy button-press sequences here: you'll have to kill baddies the hard way. Boss fights still conform to the attack patterns of old but now have the extra depth that only three dimensions can afford, so you can expect each enemy's defeat to be far more cinematic than ever before. And in case you hate 3D (why are you here?) you get two 2D classics in the same UMD package, so cheer up, grandad.

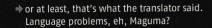


#### **WE ♥ WEAPONS**

Here, Richter is demonstrating the use of weapons. You can see him throwing a gaggle of knives towards a totally non-threatening tree stump. Now, that's just daft behaviour because weapons such as throwing knives and axes use up your heart tokens, which you gain by killing enemies. You can also use them for super-powerful 'Crush' attacks. Silly boy.

Still, it's never been more essential for Yukes and THQ to get the animation right, because this time the rasslers are split into eight categories, instead of four.

Now, unlike in previous years, which category a wrestler is crammed into depends less on their weight than on their wrestling style. Obviously there'll still be the distinction between super heavyweights such as The Great Khali and titches such as Rey Mysterio, but size won't be the only distinguishing factor.

Each grappler will have a secondary characteristic to further differentiate them from one another. So whereas last year if you learned one middleweight you'd learned them all, in 2008, there's an extra layer of depth to a grappler's ring style.

Take Chris Benoit, for example. You'd peg him primarily as a 'technical' wrestler. But then, so is Finlay, and his ring style is pretty different compared to that of 'The Crippler'. So, logically, Benoit will be a 'submission artist' second, and Finlay's gregarious nature will fall under the 'brawler' category, marking a firm distinction between the two. Are you following this, Maguma?

MAGUMA: [Sound of enormous plate of fish being devoured]

OPS2: Well, whatever. We'll explain this new system's other benefits elsewhere on these pages, but there's one other very exciting thing about the animation system that we want

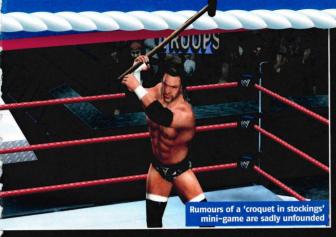

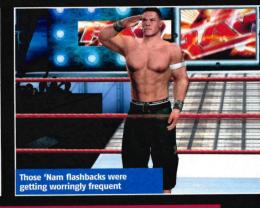

#### YOUR KNOCK-OUT-AND-KEEP GUIDE TO ECW'S MOST NOTORIOUS\*

#### SABL

"This match should be taking place in a zoo" – so said ECW announcer Joey Styles during Sabu's debut match with the Tazmaniac (now Tazz) in 1993.

Billed as an uncontrollable maniac from Bombay, India, Sabu became synonymous with ECW. He portrayed a three-dimensional character that was at once savage (he had to be wheeled into the arena in chains) and at times lovably naïve (his trademark gesture is to point up at the arena lighting, apparently bewildered by their modern-day witchcraft).

Scars criss-cross his body, most of them gained in a brutal Japanese organisation called Frontier Martial Arts Wrestling, famed for encounters such as the Exploding Shark Tank Deathmatch (no exaggeration).

In one such match in 1992, his tag-team partner and uncle The Sheik went into a coma and nearly died, which is one reason why you don't see many no-rope barbedwire fire matches nowadays.



#### SANDMAN



If you consider that the early 1990s was a horrific and utterly incomprehensible era in which the likes of Baywatch and Thunder in Paradise found ample TV airtime, it becomes more understandable how ECW came to recruit a surfer dude in a wetsuit into its ranks at just that very time.

Those carefree early days couldn't have been further removed from the eventual evolution of The Sandman's character. He became a beer-swilling, chain-smoking psychopath. He often drank beer on the way to the ring or even during fights (crushing the cans on his forehead of course).

Famous of his use of weapons including a Singapore Cane (a martial arts weapon used like a sword) the

Sandman found himself in some of the most powerful storylines in wrestling history – including the famous incident where Tommy Dreamer knocked a cigarette into Sandy's eyes.

The 'accident' was reported as legitimate, and The Sandman stayed at home for months while the wrestling press swallowed it hook, line and sinker.

#### TOMMY DREAMER

And here's Tommy Dreamer, the other half of that unforgettable storyline. It ended, of course, with Tommy flat on his back, which summed up his ECW career perfectly in many ways.

In the early days, the notoriously hostile ECW crowd had trouble taking to Dreamer, thanks to his clean-cut appearance. ECW's answer was to get the entire roster to kick him seven

ways to Sunday. First, The Sandman caned him with his trademark Singapore Cane so ferociously that you could see the welts on his back.

Then, Raven appeared on the scene and the two had a storyline that they were childhood enemies.

Dreamer proved unable to gain a win over his grunge-worshipping nemesis for more than two years!

Once able to elect sympathy from the audience, Tommy Dreamer became a mainstay in ECW, sticking around until the original ECW closed doors in early 2001.

He was ECW champion for just 24 minutes in 2000 – mind you, that was 10 minutes longer than The Sandman's title reign on 7 January 2001.



#### **ROB VAN DAM**



Ahh, now, surely we don't have to introduce this guy to you! Although he's now a six-year WWE veteran, the high-flyer from Battle Creek, Michigan made a name for himself in ECW in the late 1990s.

His ECW stay was most notable for his uneasy alliance with tag-team partner Sabu, and a set of blistering battles with Jerry Lynn, which the two would later re-create in WWE in an episode of Heat during Lynn's brief tenure.

Top fact: Shame McMahon's spectacular 'Coast 2 Coast' move, which he debuted at WrestleMania X-Seven, was actually conceived by Van Dam. He debuted the move, then named the Van Terminator, at HeatWave 2000, on poor Scotty Anton.

\* Just so you know, none of these wrestlers are 100% confirmed at this time to appear in Smackdown! Vs Raw 2008, but we do know that the ECW invasion will feature classic faces from the 1990s and anyway, these guys are our favourites

#### **OPS2 VS WRESTLEMANIA**

We spent WrestleMania itself largely drunk (with excitement, you understand), but do remember three blokes pinning down and shaving a 61-year-old man in the name of entertainment. For this, the show gets 9/10. As for the rest of the event...

#### SMACKDOWN! VS RAW SUPERSTAR CHALLENGE

Massive controversy plagued the fifth annual THQ Superstar Challenge, with undefeated, four-time winner Shelton Benjamin nowhere to be seen in the 16-man brackets.

With the favourite out, who would be the ultimate winner? "Ashley keeps on saying she's rubbish," mused Kenny Dykstra. "Those are the ones you've got to watch out for."

Indeed, none of the wrestlers really fancied their chances, leading to an exciting, open tournament – made all the more thrilling when last year's favourite, Johnny Nitro, was

in the first round by Carlito. Miffed at being left out of WrestleMania, Carlito gave an interview with selected media – including OPS2 – which was canned after six minutes when he offered his thoughts on backstage politics and Joey Mercury's recent release from the brand.

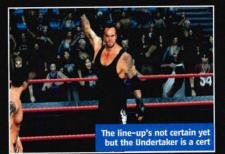

**OPS2:** Only kidding. *Smackdown! Vs Raw 2008* is another strong package, with a roster of more than 50 playable wrestlers. The final selections

are made in mid-summer, fact fans, so keep an eye on who's hot and who's not around the time of the Great American Bash if you want to make an educated guess on who is and isn't going to make it into the game.

And that's about it for Smackdown! Vs Raw 2008 as THQ display the logo on the big screen here... and – hold on a cotton-pickin' minute! That's the ECW logo in the top right corner! What the



hey are those heinous no-good son of a guns doing here? And many other such wrestling commentary clichés!

MAGUMA: Why, I'm glad you asked. You see, now WWE has bought the rights to ECW, launching it as a third brand, THQ has elected to incorporate and present it as the equal to both Smackdown! and Raw in all but the game's name (which is long enough already).

Now, the new ECW, after a slow start, is slowly establishing itself thanks in no small part to an engrossing feud between The New Breed

and the Originals. But THQ wants to differentiate between ECW and the other brands so, to this end, SmackDown! vs Raw's ECW will draw from the original ECW, the Philadelphia-based independent that shook up the wrestling world during its nine-year run from 1992-2001.

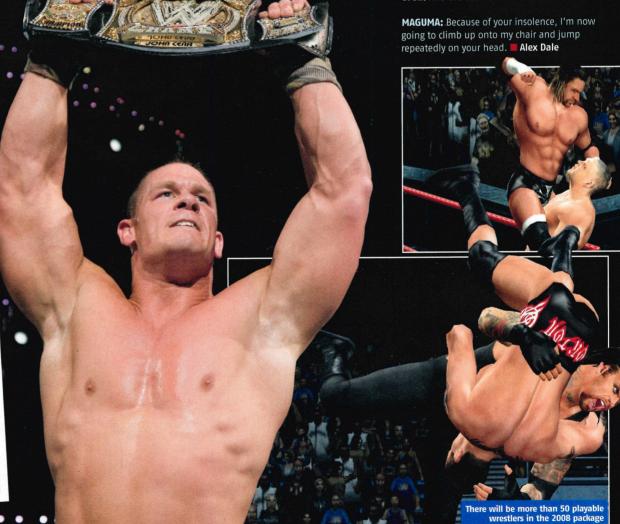

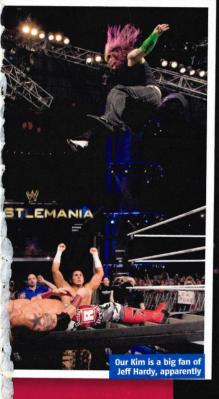
**OPS2:** What? How do you know all this?

From what we've seen, they've accomplished this with aplomb.

Where does the 'golden compass' fit into all this? Well it's the name used for the US release of the original book, because the publishers thought Northern Lights wasn't sexy enough, and weren't going to let the fact that there isn't a golden compass in the book get in their way.

What they seem to be referring to is a brass device, powered by mystical force, called the Alethiometer, which comes into the hands of a young girl called Lyra.

Lyra exists in an alternative vision of our world that has many similarities with early 20th century Europe but just as many differences, the main one being the existence of 'dæmons': physical manifestations of the human soul that appear as animal companions.

#### **COULTER IN THE ACT**

We find Lyra as an orphan looked after by the scholars of Jordan College, Oxford. Her life is



turned upside down when she's whisked away by the mysterious Mrs Coulter who, we learn, is at the heart of a conspiracy to kidnap and experiment on hundreds of innocent children.

The adventure then leaves the latent evil and political intrigue of England for the wilds of the Arctic North as Lyra flees Mrs Coulter and attempts to rescue the lost children. Here Lyra encounters witches, armoured bears and ghastly monsters as she becomes caught up in a cosmic struggle that has apocalyptic consequences.

The series has often been compared to Harry Potter because, well, it's got a child hero and a fantastical setting. But that's where the similarities end, because where JK Rowling's

#### NORTHERN LIGHTS, **CAMERA, ACTION!**

Craig for the ladies, Kidman for the chaps: never mind the kids, it's the date movie of the year

Due out this winter, the screen adaptation of The Golden Compass is one of the most eagerly awaited films of the year purely down to the popularity of the books. That said, it's sure to attract a lot of general interest thanks to the A-List cast including Nicole Kidman, Daniel Craig and his *Casino* Royale Bond girl, Eva Green.

As to who is directing the whole shebang and bringing ip Pullman's magical world to life, well, that's a story in itself. First it was About A Boy director Chris Weitz who rewrote a Tom Stoppard–penned script, but then Weitz quit and was replaced by British director Anand Tucker. But Tucker didn't last long, citing 'creative differences' as the reason for his departure. So it was back to Weitz to see the

Casting the role of Lyra saw more than 10,000 girls turning up for open auditions, but the search was rewarded with the discovery of 12-year-old Dakota Blue Richards from Brighton. Philip Pullman has endorsed the choice, declaring Richards to be "absolutely marvellous, and she looks right – I know Lyra better than anyone."

#### PHOTOGRAMS FROM THE EDGE

Meet the three main human characters from the book, the people who shape the world in which the *Golden Compass* game will take place



LYRA is the main playable character in the game and our heroine in the story. She begins life as an orphan looked after the scholars of Jordan College, Oxford, but is soon caught up in a cosmic conspiracy. Lyra is a livewire of an 11-year-old, interminably curious, resourceful and blessed with huge resources of bravery and courage. In the movie, she's played by Dakota Blue Richards.

LORD ASRIEL is lyra's uncle (or is he?), a respected member of the aristocracy and a celebrated explorer. Unfortunately, his determination and stubbornness mean he's often in conflict with ruling powers so he has many enemies. He has a commanding presence with a face 'to be dominated by, or to fight: never a face to patronise or pity'. He's played by Daniel Craig in the film.





MRS COULTER A beautiful, beguiling woman who employs lyra as her personal assistant and teaches her the ways of being a lady. Her motivation is sinister, though, because she is part of a group responsible for kidnapping hundreds of children. Nicole Kidman plays Mrs Coulter in the film – a personal choice of Pullman, clearly a man of great taste – but has caused controversy among fans because she has blonde hair while the character in the book has jet black.

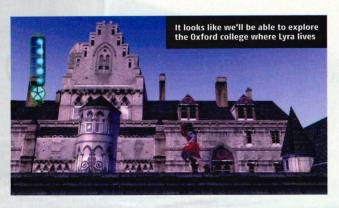
world is often whimsical and woolly, *His Dark Materials* is raw and powerful, unflinching in its handling of heartfelt emotion and savage horror.

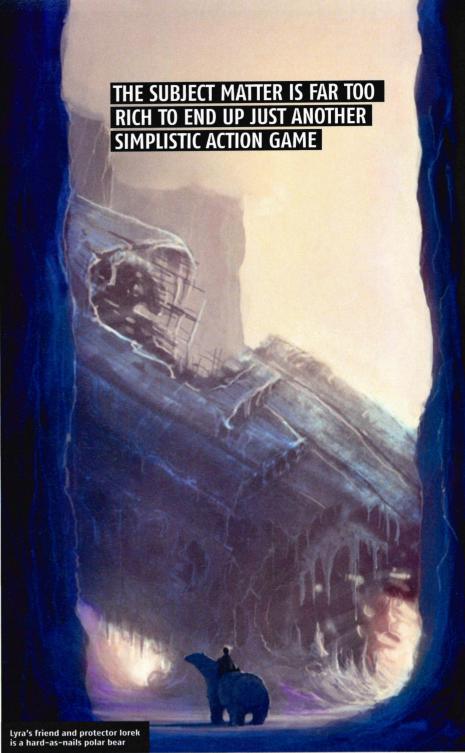
This is just one of the reasons why we think the subject matter is far too rich for *The Golden Compass* to end up just another simplistic action game, no more than a marketing ruse.

#### **WORLD OF OPPORTUNITY**

Lyra combines the vulnerability of a young girl with rare tenacity and intelligence, making her the perfect games character for exploring the *Dark Materials* world. And the situations she faces are sure to make compelling gaming.

For instance, at the start of the book she and her friend Roger treat Jordan College as their private playground, clambering across the roofs and exploring the vast cellars. Then comes Lyra's





escape from the evil Gobblers through the streets of London which would call for stealth and cunning; so, too, her daring rescue of the kids from the Bolvangar experimentation facility.

So it's easy to see cleverly crafted levels of exploration and puzzle-solving, but extra layers could be added by using the Alethiometer.

It's a complex device that's capable of answering any question just as long as the user is skilful enough to translate the signs.

Lyra repeatedly uses it in the book to validate her decisions, so in the game it could provide clues, directions and solutions, as well as being a self-contained puzzle game.

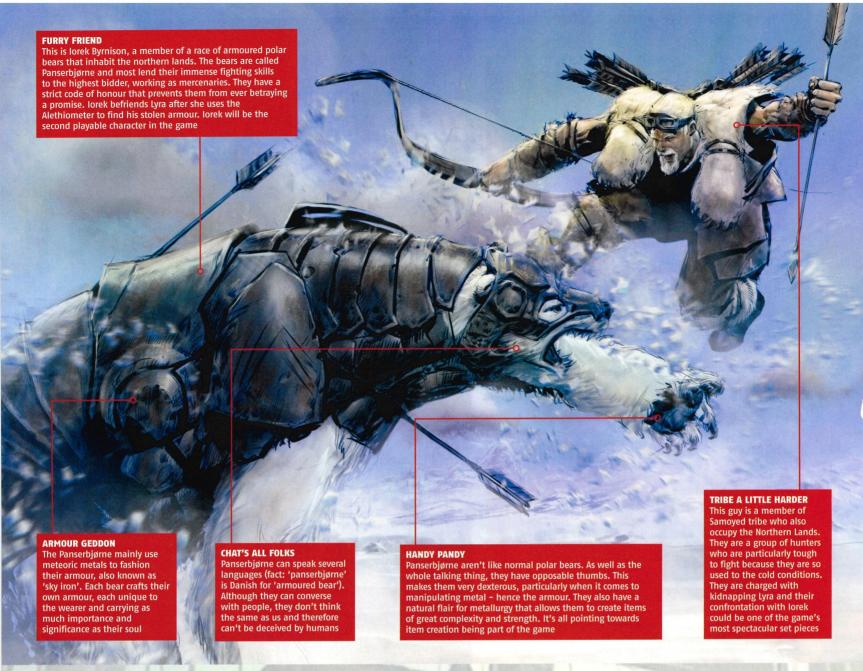
Then there's the role of Pantalaimon, Lyra's dæmon. Because Lyra is a young child her dæmon hasn't got a fixed form (that only happens when a person reaches adulthood) so is capable of turning into almost any type of animal imaginable.

Because the two are spiritually linked they can share thoughts, which comes in very useful when Pantalaimon uses the qualities of the



animal form he has chosen to Lyra's advantage: as a wildcat he can scan dark streets for dangers, he can illuminate dungeons as a firefly, become an ermine to keep Lyra warm or take to the air as an owl and become Lyra's eyes in the sky.

This dæmon-human relationship has huge potential as a gaming device, especially if the gamer could control Pantalaimon's forms, enabling him to become an invaluable source



 of information and protection for Lyra. It could be like Pokémon, but good.

All this is speculation but what has been confirmed is that the second playable character will be lorek Byrnison, a noble, armored polar bear who's sworn to protect Lyra.

#### **BEAR WITH US**

In contrast to Lyra's careful cunning, lorek is a fighting machine who's at the centre of every thunderous battle in the book. This will allow the game to change tone and pace, bursting into all-out action at key moments.

And there are some almighty action set pieces to be replicated, such as lorek's repelling of attacks by Samoyed huntsmen, his assault on the facility where the evil experiments take place and his bloody confrontation with lofur Raknison, the king of the armoured bears.

So we have magic, exploration, platforming, puzzle-solving, stealth and all-out action. Not one of these elements has to be shoe-horned into the game, meaning there's no need for 'spinning attacks', token collecting or any other action game cliché. And this gives Sega a rare opportunity to create its own piece of *Dark Materials* magic. **Dave Harrison** 



#### **KNOW YOUR DARK MATERIALS**

Not read the books? No one need ever know if you gen up with our bluffer's guide

**DEMONS** The physical manifestation of the human soul that takes the shape of an animal and accompanies the human at all times. Dæmons of children can change form into other animals, before settling on one form when the human becomes an adult. The form they choose should reflect the personality of the human. Dæmons can talk, though usually only to their respective human, and are normally the opposite gender.

**GOBBLERS** The nickname for the General Oblation Board which is run by nasty Mrs Coulter. Originally thought to be supernatural bogeymen, it turns out they are an organisation that has been kidnapping children from the poorer sections of society and transporting them to the northern lands for mysterious reasons.

**GYPTIANS** A community of canal barge-dwelling travellers who have suffered most from the Gobblers' nefarious doings. They take Lyra into their community, protecting her from Mrs Coulter, and set out on a journey to rescue their children.

**PANSERBJØRNE** A tribe of armoured, talking polar bears, the king of whom is lofur Raknison who isn't

content with being the leader of his tribe but wants to be seen on the same level as humans and to have his own dæmon. He's voiced by lan 'Lovejoy' McShane in the film.

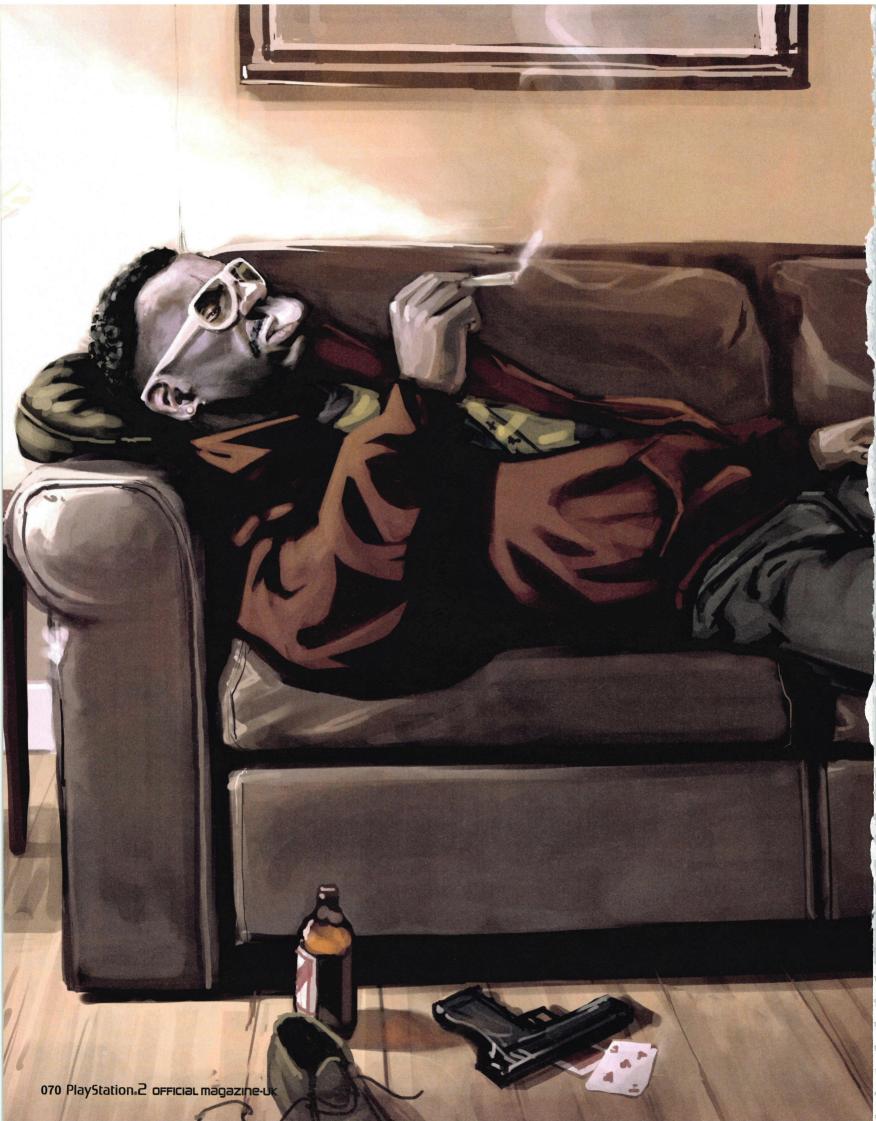
**DUST** A mysterious cloud of light particles, invisible to the human eye but seen in 'photograms' (the *Dark Materials* version of polaroids) using special films. Dust falls from the sky and seems to be attracted to humans and man-made objects.

**ALETHIOMETER** A mystical brass device that looks like a clock or a golden compass (see what they did

there?). It's got a round face with numerous symbols on it and three hands. Its purpose is to tell the truth and it can answer any question; trouble is, it is incredibly hard to read because every symbol has numerous different meanings. Good thing lyra's so skilled at deciphering it, then!

INTERCISION The process of separating an individual from his or her dæmon – a traumatic, crippling process that leaves the victim a hollow shell. Seeing a human without a dæmon is akin to seeing a person without a head or hideously disfigured in our reality. So not a good thing.





# GUNS, TRAFFICKINGADHE AMERICAN DREAM

An illegal alien needs friends to survive. So in **GTA IV**, you'll need to make some – if you can stop looking at the scenery

verything's been leading up to this. A decade ago, the cover photograph on the *Grand Theft Auto* box made us a promise.

Depicting gleaming New York skyscrapers through a fish-eye lens, it was a road map to where the series was heading: a practically photo-realistic rendering of the Big Apple.

Now, 10 years on, that promise has been fulfilled. Finally, you'll be able to stay awake in the city that never sleeps. Welcome to the real Liberty City.

New York has always been the inspiration for the previous incarnations of Liberty City, and while some fans were surprised that the game would go back there, it makes perfect sense. With the PS3's grunt it's finally possible to reconstruct a city with a level of realism that accurately reflects its character. And few cities in the world have as much character as New York.

It's the scrappy prizefighter that refuses to take a dive in the fifth, a cultural melting-pot where people of all colours and nationalities have been thrust together. It's the kind of city that responds to an appalling terrorist attack by rebuilding bigger and better.

Even if you've never been there, you know it through the work of movie directors such as Martin Scorsese, Abel Ferrara, Woody Allen and Spike Lee, and TV shows such as NYPD Blue, Friends or Sex and the City. And the game plays

on this familiarity to great effect. Developer Rockstar has been based in New York for five years or more, and this first-hand experience has been injected into the game.

Standing on the corner of a street in 'Broker', in an area that strongly resembles the notorious Bedford–Stuyvesant area of Brooklyn with its tall Brownstone buildings and numerous pawnshops, you can watch pedestrians go about their business.

#### **CITY-ING PRETTY**

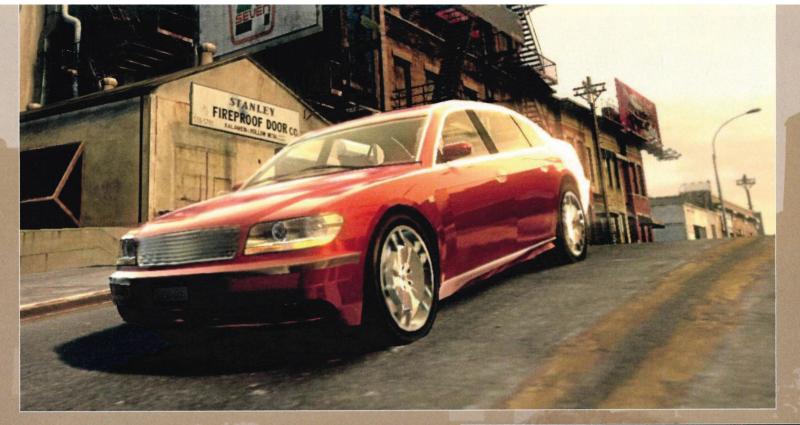
As one man walks by, he smokes a cigarette. He flicks it on the floor as he walks in a thoroughly naturalistic way. It's a small detail, but it's moments like this that make you realise how dedicated Rockstar is to breathing true life into this game.

Crowds ebb and flow according to the time of day. People give you strange looks. Hotdog vendors bark and bums hang out in alleyways, warming their hands on trash burning in oil drums blackened with soot.

The animation of the characters is now entirely based on physics rather than animation: feet actually respond to the ground beneath them, meaning that if you move unevenly halfway up a step, one leg will raise up to meet it while the other stays on the ground, instead of having your character shifting awkwardly up the step with one leg hovering in mid-air. It helps the suspension of disbelief enormously.

The city looks stunning, with weather effects and shadow generation creating a deeply credible environment. Yellow lines are faded,





bollards poke out from the earth at wonky angles and there's rubbish everywhere.
Interiors, too, are much improved. The lounge and kitchen we saw looked suitably lived-in, with cushions strewn casually over the sofa and a grimy-looking, hand-cranked meat

#### **REALLY BIG APPLE**

The level of ambition present in this recreation of the city is ridiculously far ahead of anything that precedes it. In previous *GTA* games, driving longer than 10 or 15 minutes. To get from one side of the new and improved Liberty City to the other will take you at least an hour.

Four of New York's five boroughs have been reimagined through the Rockstar filter. Brooklyn has become Broker, Queens has become Dukes,

renamed Algonquin.
Staten Island hasn't been put into the game, but it doesn't matter because a) GTA III was based there and b) you get a chunk of New Jersey (or 'Aldernay') instead.



But it's far more than just the size that's impressive. There's a full transport infrastructure too, with trains and buses, and beneath the city there's a sprawling subway system.

Within this setting, you engage in an experience that, like the other games in the series, unashamedly borrows its central theme from a movie. What is surprising, however, is that rather than pilfering from a gangster film — Scarface or Boyz N The Hood, maybe – for GTA IV, Rockstar's gone with An American Tail. Just like Fievel Mousekewitz, our protagonist

Niko Bellic is from Eastern Europe, and he's come to Liberty City to make a new life. Unlike Fievel, though, he's no mouse. 'Bellic' means warlike, and Niko's shady past certainly suggests

he's no stranger to conflict. He's arrived in Liberty City to hook up with his cousin Roman, who's been supposedly living the American Dream... but when Niko gets there, he finds that Roman's been a little economical with the truth, his 'big business' turning out to be no more than a nicotine-stained taxi office.

Anyone expecting a John Gotti-style rise to prominence will be disappointed, however, because GTA IV is not another 'rags to riches' storyline. The sense of plot escalation will instead be dictated through your relationships with other characters – think *The Sopranos* 

rather than *King Of New York.* Forming these bonds with people is a key aspect of *IV.* The aim is to free the player from hang out with the characters you like and have the missions evolve organically. You'll certainly need a few friends when your dodgy past starts

to catch up with you later on in the game.
Your mobile phone is now an important tool,

### Feuding in feudal Japan – with added demons!

ames based around military strategy don't often inspire mass fervour among PS2 gamers. So it's always a joy when a game makes an attempt to spice up this (often fairly) maligned genre by taking the more exciting elements and combining them with some good old close-up hacking and slashing action.

To this end, here we have feudal Japan circa 1543 as our backdrop and legions of demons emerging from Lake Suwa to rudely interrupt the civil war that's raging.

The gods send an immortal warrior (this is you) to reunite the warring human factions and save humankind.

#### **IMMORTAL COMBAT**

The word that probably jumped out there is 'immortal' and that's right, you are. Your soldiers aren't, though, so success comes more as a result of your strategic decisions than your fighting prowess.

The controls are simple enough with a handful of often spectacular fighting moves that can also be combo'd, and surprisingly few basic army commands. As well as the Story mode there's a Time Trial mode where you have to slay a certain amount of chaos demons in a given time, and a Free mode wherein you can revisit previous levels.

The action is viewed either from a close-up third-person perspective that puts you slap bang in the middle of the scrapping, or from a bird'seye view so you can direct your army's movements more effectively.

The big selling point, though, is the sheer vastness of the demon hordes that appear on screen. We're told that there can be more than 60,000 visible at any one time.







This all sounds pretty good, but unfortunately in order to incorporate the strategy and the fighting, both elements have been scaled down from what you'd expect from dedicated games in these styles.

The combat moves are few, and the strategies seem to consist of your army either following you or, er, not following you. Granted there are portions where you have to assist or protect other characters from the various factions but they're hardly taxing on the old grey matter.

Plus, the story lacks creativity somewhat and seems to consist solely of 'go to X and help Y, but first, defeat the demons!'

#### **GRAPHIC BLOODSHED**

It's obvious that the graphics is the area that the programmers have concentrated on and it's to the detriment of the gameplay.

## RAW DANGER

#### What? A survival game? With no zombies?!

here's no easy way to say this, so here goes: *Raw Danger* is a terrible game.
Sorry, but it is. Ironically, the game set in a natural disaster zone is, itself, more than a bit of a catastrophe.

Set in 2010, engineers have built the world's first 'ultra-safe' city. But as it turns out, Geo City ain't so safe after all. Although it can hold off a nuclear war, it crumbles in the face of architecture's oldest enemy: rain.

After a month of stormy weather, the Hudson River bursts its banks, and the resulting flood destroys everything in its path. You play as various survivors as they trek across the city to evacuation points.

So, the premise is fine. But the characters are horrendously stereotypical – to the point where it offends. Plus, while *Raw Danger* tries





to paint the perfect portrait of blue-collar America, it ends up feeling creepy and soulless. Everything's just so bland and lifeless.

#### **FLOODY AWFUL**

Every 'personality' in the game is as forgettable as the next, making it impossible to connect with them on a basic level, let alone summon enough empathy to want to help save their stupid lives.

We have a special, personal hatred reserved for the first playable character – blue-eyed, blonde haired Joshua Hartwell – who is utterly useless. His frequent exclamations of 'Huh?', 'Um...' and 'Err...' will make you want to throw him into the nearest raging river just to do mankind a favour.



Are there any redeeming features to Raw Danger? Yes, several. Firstly, the way you interact with the environment with one character will affect the next person's journey, leading to multiple endings, which is a nice touch.

For example, when stuck in an underground station, you can choose to take a dangerous path to get to the other side, or a shorter path that will result in collapsing a section of the building.

So, in theory if you take the shorter one, the next character you play will be forced to take the longer, more perilous route.

However, it appears that the developers forget about this neat little feature once the first couple of chapters were in the bag.

Secondly, there's the 'keeping warm' concept. During your struggle to survive, wet clothing and

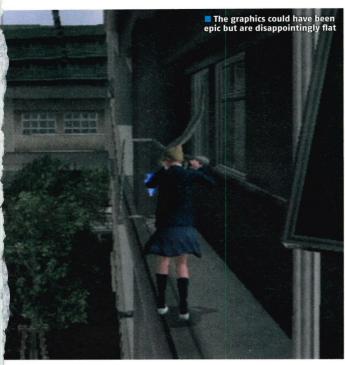

cold temperatures will decrease your body temperature. As you get colder, your character will become more lethargic; if hypothermia sets in, he or she collapses and that's game over.

There are various survival points (heaters, bins on fire, kitchen hobs) dotted around, where you can warm up and cook some nice hot food to sustain your poor little body for a while.

To make things even more realistic, you'll find various items you can take with you, but the amount of stuff you can carry depends on the size of your backpack. While this can be restricting for hoarders, it means you must prioritise what to take.

Plus, interestingly, there are various recycling bins where you can dump stuff you're not using so other characters can pick through them later.

Unfortunately, the inspirational idea of scavenging to survive is marred by the fact that all useful items are highlighted by a big fat blue arrow hovering above them, making the idea of exploration feel irrelevant.

Mind you, we didn't really feel like trekking around the city anyway. The graphics are dire;

buildings are scratchy and jagged; characters are blocky with stodgy animation and after a while everything starts to become one big blur. Or was that just us glazing over?

#### WATER WASTE OF TIME

There's no noticeable attempt to produce a credible 'wrath of Mother Nature' environment: raging water looks like brown wobbly jelly and what could have been the dramatic collapse of a dam looks like a Lego-brick demolition derby.

The cutscenes over-use slow motion action, making it look as if the game just can't keep up with the pace. And, laughably, characters are shot out of frame, so while there could be some deep and meaningful exchanges happening, you really can't tell because, sadly, knees lack the ability to portray emotion.

In fact, we'd have to say that the most frustrating flaw in the game is the diabolical camera. It often sticks itself in an unhelpful position, hindering you from finding where to

go next or seeing what's going on when you're stuck wandering around a godforsaken patch of glitchy flooded road, your character getting colder and colder then you fall off the edge of a cliff into a rushing river for

the 30th time and glare darkly at the screen with the thought 'someone must pay for this'.

Yes, someone must be made to pay for this awful game, but for heaven's sake, don't let it be you. Kim Richards

Frankly, the storyline appears to have been written by someone who's very easily distracted.

Tragically, though, SH:FTNW fails to use the 'real world' setting to its full potential.

Buildings resemble sticklebrick blocks and dungeon levels play like a cut-and-paste exercise. It just really doesn't do the PS2 justice.

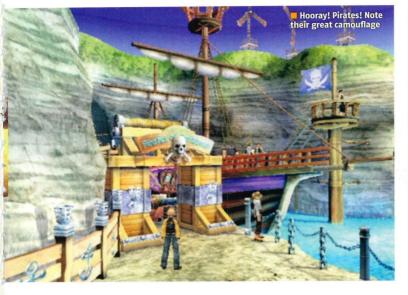

It's not helped by the background tunes, which verge on elevator music and slowly eat into your brain — odd, given that the battle music (a mix of swooping orchestras and pounding heavy metal) is dramatic, emotive and almost hypnotic.

The voice acting is acceptable, but incredibly stereotypical. In normal circumstances that would make the characters seem fake, but it fits in well here, for this RPG is really about a huge cast of caricatures.

#### **ODD COMPANY**

These bizarre characters are the game's real saving grace. Everywhere you go is packed with larger-than-life weirdos who will either make you giggle or raise an eyebrow: ninjas with sushi rolls on their heads; gay bikers; a cyborg cat called the Meowmanator (Meow'll be back!).

Even your own team mates aren't spared by normality (see them for yourself in 'Meet the Team', opposite). There are also a few cameo appearances from old *Shadow Hearts* characters to keep fans happy.

Enemies range from gangsters, hooligans, policemen and robots to monsters who'd send that lot from *Silent Hill* running home to their nannies. They are absolutely gruesome, with

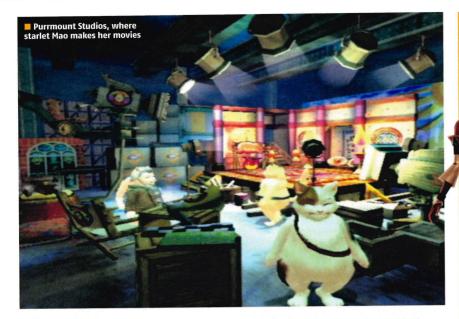

The sheer amount of sidequests and minigames alone means that you could easily (and willingly) spend up to 40 hours of your life unravelling Johnny's mystery.

The inclusion of multiple endings and the option to unlock a different version of the game means that this is a good chunk o' gaming to sink your teeth into.

If bizarre stories and unusual characters are your thing and you don't mind a random plot, this is definitely a game for you. Ekim Richards

ot so much Rome's greatest hits, more a slap in the face with a sweaty Centurion's sandal. Rome had orgies, gladiators, war and togas, but all the gory glory is here reduced to a strategy battle sim with all the excitement of a 1980s schools TV programme.

Great Battles Of Rome is split into campaigns, each with its own goals and terrain. Your first job is to bash the turnips out of some farmers.

You start by putting your units into position on the battlefield. You can see the enemy and check out the terrain (skirmishers are better on the hilly patches, cavalry struggle in the mud) but it hardly counts as an advantage when you can only move your units a few millimetres.

It's enough to drive even the most genius tactician to beating themselves around the head with the DualShock.

#### ROMAN BOREFARE

Once you're ready, hit the fight button. Now you can relax, leave the pad and make a sandwich while the game carries on without you.

You can direct your units during the fight or order a shameful retreat, but your impact as general is minimal, and unarmed farmers aren't exactly a threat.

The view is from overhead, so although you can zoom in, you're not exactly up close and personal. You may as well poke some ants with a stick. And even as Rome expands, your units





increase in size and the campaign pushes on, the battles really don't get any more challenging.

Before every scrap you can recruit new fighters, upgrade abilities and weapons and heal injured parties. Sounds exciting, but the text-heavy presentation makes it as dull as doing your grocery shopping online.

Everything is strung together by cutscenes that look like History Channel leftovers, featuring pompous voiceovers and cheesy acting. Even if you try to appreciate the game purely on educational grounds, any real information is shoehorned into the loading screens, and who actually looks at loading screens, anyway?

At less than 20 quid, Great Battles Of Rome may be tempting to the poverty-stricken gamer, but you'd be better off making a toga out of bed sheets and renting a DVD of Gladiator. It's just no fun playing something your history teacher

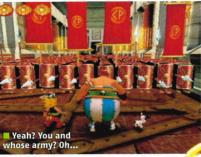

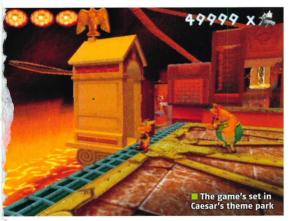

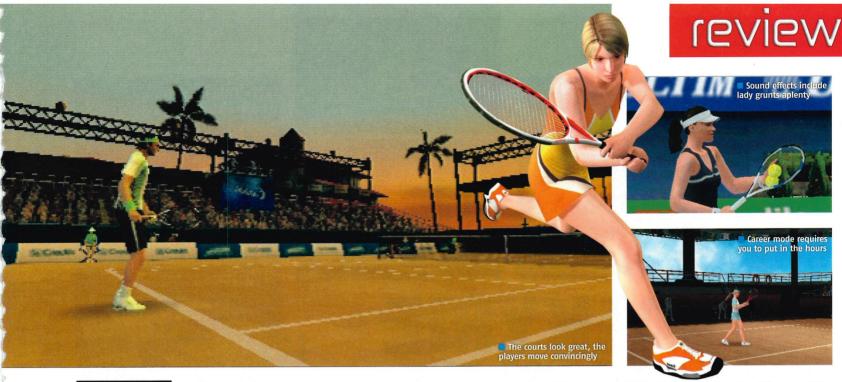

ack in the dim and distant past, Smash Tennis was almost the anti-tennis game: big-headed, doe-eyed players; courts perched on cliff edges or beachfronts and eye-searing special moves that helped to complement a frantic multiplayer mode.

But things have changed, and for the series' first outing on PSP, it's impossible to imagine a tennis game being more realistic than what's on offer in Smash Court 3.

Sega's recent Virtua Tennis 3 offered up real players, real courts and true-to-life shots, but tweaked just enough to allow for huge rallies, glorious cross-court shots and death-defying leaps across the grass to return the unreturnable.

Smash Court, you come to realise within minutes of beginning to play, isn't like that.

#### **HARD COURT**

Returning is hard: at least, it's hard to zing diagonals from one corner to the other. Rallies are long but low on excess. And the Career mode is so super-serious that in order to gain the kind of experience you need to get on, you spend hours aiming shots at a pile of sand.

The piles of sand thing is obviously designed to help you improve accuracy, but it's a measure of what to expect from Smash Court 3.

Deep? Definitely. Lifelike? The players, for one, look and move amazingly, putting Virtua's

army of disturb-o-freaks to shame. A little bit boring? Er, unfortunately, yes to that, too.

It's not that Smash Court doesn't play a good game, or that it hasn't got everything in place to deliver. It's more that on a PSP, designed for short, sharp bursts of fun, this feels too drudgingly realistic. In fact, it can be a dreary experience, at times, painful and repetitive especially to begin with, where rallies involve you and your opponent standing pretty much in the same places because you haven't gained the necessary skill set to mix up your play.

Of course, with practice and experience points - gained through the game's RPG-esque Career mode - matches gradually become more dynamic, but before that you'll just have to put in the hours.

So. Virtua is definitely more fun. But Smash Court does have a lighter side in its minigames, which are thoroughly bizarre.

#### **BALL RIGHT NOW**

They are mostly themed on Namco's classic back catalogue. Pac-Man, Galaga Tennis and Bomb Tennis (see 'Yellow Fever') are a welcome relief from the studious, all-consuming nature of the main game.

They're entirely throwaway, of course, but they're more reminiscent of the values on which the Smash series was first built - values to which Namco should give some thought for next time round. Although Smash Court 3 has all the intelligence of Pete Sampras and the depth of shots to go with it, on balance we'd rather have Virtua's John McEnroe. ITim Weaver

oleplaving games are like Adam Sandler films. Even though you enjoy them, you get to the end wishing that something different had happened - that what you'd just sat through had been something you hadn't seen 100 times before.

It's not hard to see why. You are placed in the role of the goddess Lenneth, who has been put in charge of collecting the souls of fallen warriors and re-training them for an apocalyptic battle in Valhalla. It's way more rewarding than trudging through those countless 'coming of age moments in average RPGs.

#### UNDEATHWISH

Harvesting these undead heroes forms the majority of the game. After a short narrative about the circumstances of their death. Lenneth must toughen up her recently demised recruits and send them 'upstairs' to join the gods.

Negotiating 2D platform maps (hence the 'Profile' in the title) is a refreshing element to the genre, but it's the combat that really shows how the game has stood the test of time.

It's part turn-based, part real-time, and nailing a combo not only for each character but also one that incorporates all four of

your chosen team is satisfying for you and devastating for your opponents in equal measure.

#### IT'S TRAINING MEN

The one frustrating thing is having to dispatch your heroes to Valhalla. You spend hours levelling up characters, only to have to send them away once they're capable and start on the next group of wet-behind-the-ears newbies.

Even so, Lenneth serves up varied, innovative, engaging gameplay that makes us wonder why we've put up with so many other games giving us tired nonsense in the past seven years. Shaun Curnow

n another future, Goku suffered and died of a heart condition, and Earth's strongest defenders fell at the hands of the androids.' Confused? If so, you're not a Dragonball Z fan an essential qualification if you're going to understand anything in this game.

It's set in the future (although there is time travelling to the past) and the main baddie is Buu, whose minions go around destroying cities.

The story splits into numerous different paths depending on whether or not you succeed in a mission. This opens up more exciting battles, but won't shed any light on what's going on. No matter, though, because following the plotline is not essential to enjoying the game.

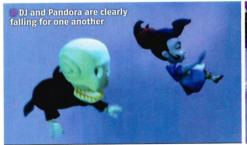

That doesn't matter much, because button bashing guarantees you 95% of victories. But the inclusion of a standard Arcade mode and Z Trials (battles with conditions to win) means you can mash your PSP's controls until your thumbs fall off. Kim Richards

# DEATH JR 2: ROOT OF EVI

#### Death's son is little fun, no bones about it

hen the original Death Jr was released around the dawn of the PSP, it didn't turn out to be the killer-app many had anticipated.

It had all the potential to be a portable Psychonauts; a twisted, laugh-out-loud romp starring the son of the Grim Reaper that was at its core a solid and innovative platformer.

Well, as history tells us, that didn't happen. Instead, it turned out to be a generic platformer beset by control issues and noticeably devoid of the dark humour its Tim Burton-inspired subject matter promised.

Sadly, Death Jr 2: Root of Evil does little to rectify the previous game's mediocre reputation.

There's a paper-thin plot involving the kidnapping of Death Sr by a female, not-so-jolly green giant, and a smattering of sub-Saturday

morning cartoon humour, stitched together by a series of incoherent cutscenes. But little seems to have been done to improve the core gameplay.

#### **GRIM PICKINGS**

The most obvious addition is the option to play as Death Jr's girlfriend, pallid obsessivecompulsive Pandora. Her existence allows for a new wireless co-op mode, but other than that, picking her is merely a cosmetic decision.

And, with no gamesharing option, to play in co-op mode you and your Pandora are going to have to fork out for a second copy.

The control scheme is just as fiddly as ever, something that is no longer acceptable in the era of Ratchet & Clank: Size Matters.

There's an automatic lock-on system, which is new to Death Jr 2 and represents a huge step forward from the previous game's punishing manual lock-on. Of course, nothing in Death Jr is easy, so you still have to flick on 'strafe mode' manually when you whip out one of the game's many weapons.

It's a minor irritation - a phrase that sums up the Root of Evil experience. - Mike Sterry

o on, admit it. You've got one or two hiding away at the back of the shelf. Your little secret. Your budget games. We've all got some. The ones you hide behind your copy of Resident Evil or Grand Theft Auto when your mates come round to play PES...

Maybe they were a present from your gran who knows you like wrestling and didn't see why she should fork out for the latest version of SmackDown! Vs Raw when she could get WWC -World Wrestling Championship for £7.99 instead. Well, it's still burly men grappling, isn't it?

Or perhaps you saw Crabby's Kingdom, Splatter Master and Animal Soccer World in the bargain bin, three for 15 quid, and it was such a good offer you bought them on the chance that you might get a few hours of fun out of them?

Or maybe when you were a kid you really, really liked diggers so when you saw a copy of Battle Construction Vehicles in the supermarket, you bought it and now it's a nostalgic joy?

Whatever the reason, plenty of people buy budget games. And since they invariably involve considerably less investment to make than

upmarket games, it's a profitable sector despite the low cover prices (typically between £4.99 and £14.99, in comparison to £29.99 or more for a brand new upmarket game such as God of War II or Final Fantasy XII).

#### **CHEAP AND CHEERFUL**

It's so profitable, in fact, that while some publishers such as 505 Games produce budget titles alongside their regular output, others such as Dutch company Phoenix Games avoid the upper end of the market entirely and specialise in filling supermarket shelves with the cheap and cheerful.

Blast! Entertainment is one such firm. It specialises in publishing kids' games that sell for £9.99 or less. It would be easy to assume that because they are what the company prefers to call 'value', they're bound to be chod.

But in fact Blast! has negotiated a swathe of high-profile licences including Xena Warrior Princess, Home Alone, Alpha Teens on Machines,

SEAN "Usually below £250,000. The beauty is that by keeping the development costs down we can continue to retail recognisable, branded games aimed at kids and families for £9.99.

"Blast! games aren't huge, multiplatform, cinematic experiences, they're simple games made to appeal to young children, with problem solving, spelling, hand/eye coordination skills or simply addictive, tried-and-tested formulas."

#### OPS2 Who buys them?

SEAN "Apart from Little Britain: The Video Game, which we released with our parent company Mastertronic, the core audience for Blast! games is aged four to eight years old, male and female.

"We target the younger audience with an excellent value range, all with high-profile, instantly recognisable brands that parents are comfortable with.

"For example, our first EyeToy titles, Bob the Builder and Thomas the Tank Engine, will both be available bundled with the hardware and as standalone titles."

OPS2 Little Britain: The Video Game, which had a relatively low RRP of £29.99, was a chart success and outsold many AAA games, despite getting bad reviews in magazines (OPS2#83). Why do you think that was?

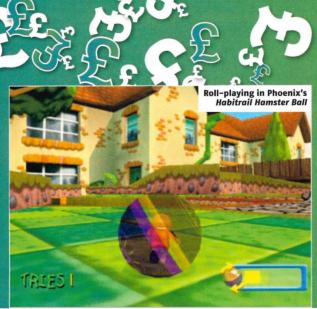
SEAN "It's a popular licence for certain people. 'Clever' journalists liked Little Britain the TV series, until it became too popular or too repetitive. And the game appealed to the casual gamer who likes the series - the same target market who bought the Little Britain Live DVD or the interactive DVD game.

"The game reflected the core values of the series well and included script input and voices from Matt Lucas and David Walliams with narration from Tom Baker. Anything from the Little Britain camp will be bought by fans and the younger audience especially liked this game.

"Serious gamers would never want to play it and it was always destined for bad reviews in the specialist press, but now games are truly

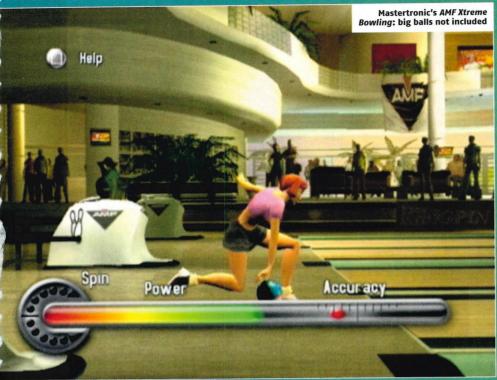

mass market this title goes to show that people who buy games aren't necessarily 'gamers'.

"Little Britain received 10/10 in The Beano when reviewed by readers but was slated in the specialist gaming press, which really isn't a surprise. But the fact is that in this day and age there is a place for casual games that will appeal to fans and games don't all have to be

enormous, immersive, technically brilliant and aimed at serious gamers only... it's the equivalent of comparing sales of Jimi Hendrix to Steps! There's something to suit everyone."

**OPS2** Does it upset yourself and your teams when reviewers pull your games apart?

**SEAN** "We have never had a bad review from our target market; the kids' press love the Blast! games. A lot of those magazines use readers to review games and they've always given Blast! titles glowing reviews and high scores.

"I very much doubt that any of the specialist readers would be interested in reading a review about learning to spell or problem-solve in Charlotte's Web and obviously games aimed at children wouldn't stand up when reviewed next to something like *Lost Planet*. I'd also be very surprised if any specialist press readers were pre-school or pre-junior school age.

"I am never upset about predictable situations, I am more upset that I didn't put a bet on at Ladbrokes about the bad reviews for *Little Britain* in the specialist press.

"Our games are not hardcore. Our research shows what younger kids want from a game and

we provide them with that. We don't write games for 18 to 25-year-olds so can never

satisfy certain magazine reviewers who only favour the style of games they particularly like."

**OPS2** Is there any genre or type of game that doesn't lend itself to the budget treatment?

**SEAN** "Doing an RPG or a massively multiplayer title would be difficult as a budget game."

**OPS2** Do you think you'll make games for PSP and PS3?

**SEAN** "The PS3 will be bought by serious gamers and older

consumers in the first two years of its life so that stands outside our core demographic."

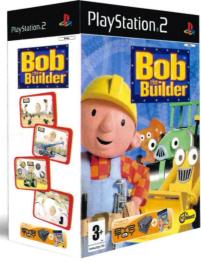

roblem solving? Check. Lateral thinking? Check. Forward planning? Check. Babe has a lot of useful lessons for its target audience of four to eight-year-olds. But is it fun?

It's one of those games where you have to guide something (here, a sheep) that won't stop until it hits an obstacle. The challenge is, of course, to put obstructions in the right places to make the sheep go where you want through a maze. So far, so good.

Sadly, it's all too easy to nudge something a touch too far and get it stuck, so you have to restart. That's typical of this type of maze game, but it's a real issue here because although there are plenty of checkpoints, they each only fire off once, and if you're scouting ahead to find a

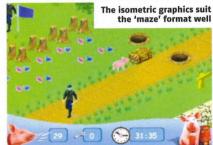
route you'll often set off two or three - so every time you mess up from then on, you must replay three-quarters of the level. Imagine how little patience a six-year-old will have with that.

#### **SWINE TASTING**

The game ties in well with the films by basing its 50 levels (same idea, different settings) around key plot points and the graphics, albeit simple, are fine for the target audience.

It isn't *Tomb Raider* if there isn't a Croft Manor to nose around and *Anniversary* doesn't disappoint. Although the game's a remake, this level is new; in the original, the manor was the training area. Lara finds a note from her butler (whom you can't lock in a freezer this time) saying that the security alarm's gone off, locking various rooms. Here's how to unlock the secrets of Lara's ancestral pile.

# **1 GET YOUR GUNS**

Head straight for the Library and push all the suspicious books back into the bookcases to reveal two hidden cupboards. The bottom one contains a Garden Maze map; the top holds Lara's dual pistols.

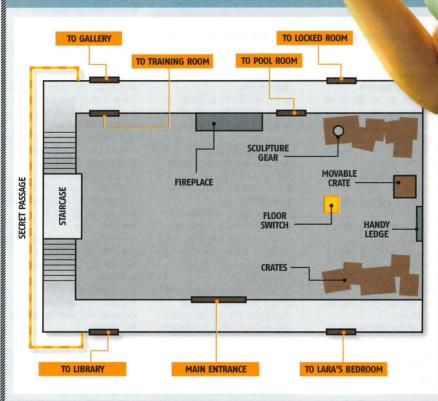




On the top staircase, jump onto the painting of Napoleon to reveal a switch that you need to shoot. Do it quickly, though, because the painting pops back up again. This will open a secret passageway.

# 2 GRAB THE EMPTY BUCKET

Pick up the empty bucket that's in the passageway. Then follow the corridor around and you'll end up in the Gallery.

# **4 GET THE GRAPPLING HOOK**

Head back to the right-hand side of the garden where the water pipes are and use the wrench to turn the water back on. Then go to the nearest fountain and fill the empty bucket with water.





# **5 GET THE WRENCH**

Go to the Training Room. Your aim is to get to the long metallic platform at the top, where you can pick up the wrench. To achieve this you'll need to flick three switches as follows...



There are ramps in here marked with numbers.



Run up ramp '1' and launch Lara onto the movable crossbars.



To get to the second crossbar, swing round and jump onto the ledges on the wall. Make your way to the wall with the green handholds, climb up to the top, then press (8) to jump onto the platform behind.





Hit this switch to raise the four podiums in the room, then go down to floor level again ready for the next section.

# SWITCH 2

To get to the second switch, run up ramp '3', jump onto the wall, and climb round to the left. Jump further up the wall and pull backwards to do a wall run.

# **7 DOUSE THE FIRE**

Go to the manor's Main Hallway where you'll find the pile of crates that Winston mentioned in his note. They are the source of the security system issues.

Search the pile for a smaller one that can be moved onto the floor switch. The back of the fireplace will open up, but the fire is in the way.

Pour the water from the bucket on the fireplace and you can reach in to pick up the arrow.

While you're in the main hallway, go back to the stack of crates and clamber up them to find a sculpture gear.







# **8 DROP THE ARCHER**

Go to the Pool Room, where you need to climb onto three balconies and shoot the pulleys there to drop to statue hanging in the ceiling. You will achieve this thusly...

# **BALCONY 1**

Climb on the crates at the back right, then jump and swing onto the yellow and black pole.



Swing onto the balcony ledge, shimmy round and jump and grab onto the pillar, then pull backwards to land on the scaffolding's wooden platform.



Jump and hang onto the statue's conveniently located chain to pull the spear downwards.



Repeat this process, except you can now swing around the spear to launch yourself onto the balcony. Once there, shoot the pulley on the right to release one rope from the statue.



Jump down and pull the skip out so that it's positioned in between both scaffolding structures.



BALCONY 2

You can now use the skip to perch, then jump onto the left hand side structure.



Turn right and do a wall run to gain access to the second balcony, from where you can shoot the second pulley.



Before you jump down again, head back to the wooden scaffolding and push the crate off the platform. Position it between the central scaffolding structure and the one on which you were just standing.



BALCONY 3

Back on the ground, shoot the pulley on the central scaffolding structure.



Grapple and pull on the right hand hook of the plank, then run to the left side and use the box to climb onto the now-tilting wooden plank so you can use it to spring-vault onto the vertical wooden ledge.



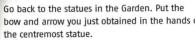
