#### ■ Why wasn't PES4 online?

we have a version running online in our in there this year is we are waiting for the Sony Online service to pick up. Then we need to set up servers as Sony doesn't provide these.

■ What are your plans for PES5 and PES6?
PES5 will be the last game for PS2. PES6 will be on PS3.

#### ■ What will PS3 technology bring to the game?

The main advantage is the amount of space PS3 will afford us and this will allow us to improve Al and gameplay. We also have lots of online ideas that we couldn't build into PS2 as we're running out of space.

#### ■ What are your plans for PSP?

Resident Evil returns with Outbreak: File #2, and it's all gone a bit Ground Force...



We've just taken delivery of a book - actually, it's more of a manual - called The Zombie Survival Guide: Complete Protection From The Living Dead. As the title implies, every possible scenario

involving an attack by brain-hungry cadavers is fully explored. Not in an ironic stocking-filler way, either. There are no, repeat, no jokes. And the more we read its agonisingly serious pages the more we find ourselves looking forward to the zombie apocalypse. Simply because we'd rather go out fighting the undead than watching Eastenders, alone and senile.

Of significantly less value in End Of The Word preparation terms, though, is Resident Evil Outbreak: File #2. Unshackled from the need to draft a coherent plot, Capcom's designers have gone shouting-at-the-moon mad. As with the first file, gameplay is broken into five easily digestible chunks - two of which we've sampled thanks to the game's recent Japanese release. The whole game appears to be unlocked from the start, so we headed straight for the zoo. Sure enough, it's patrolled by the zombie elephant from the first ever screens

we showed you a few months back. Seeing Nelly in the (rotting) flesh isn't exactly scary, but the fact her stomach's hanging out does look all kinds of unpleasant. Other 'highlights' include zombie hyenas and finding a regular zombie eating the arse out of a dead rhino.

Nice, but more intriguing is the 'flashback' scenario. Set in a woodland area, the survivors (now when you play solo you can choose your two companions) stumble across - can you guess? - a sinister research facility. Inside they're set upon by bizarre organic zombies with flowers on their heads and a half naked man wearing a bag and armed with an enormous axe. Homage to Manhunt? Maybe, but doubtful. Like we said, it's weird - but not unenjoyably so. Generally,

The *Hitman* series has always made it clear its genetically engineered assassin is the best in the business – and therefore able to command premium whacking rates. What hasn't been so clear is what – beyond an entire wardrobe of bespoke suits – he does with the cash. Probably spunks the lot on expensive hair restoration treatments and self-help books for sociopaths.

Hitman: Blood Money, as the name suggests, is all about the Benjamins. Unlike this year's Contracts, which delivered extra graphical sheen but didn't really expand the experience, Blood Money is a full sequel – but this time you'll be paid for each successful assassination. We understand that there are going to be a number of things to spend your kill fees on, although exact specifics are tightly guarded at present. Our guess is that you'll be able to buy new weapons and upgrade your arsenal with scopes and silencers. There's also likely to be more inventive ways to

empty your wallet. Again, this is pure speculation, but how about bribing cops, hushing up witnesses or hiring expensive call girls to numb the pain... the constant pain.

#### SHOT BY BOTH SIDES

But why bother spending when you could just murder everyone, right? Wrong. Blood Money is going back to basics, in the sense that going on a disgruntled IT worker-style rampage will be impossible. The emphasis is back on killing creatively and remaining undetected. In terms of plot, we're told the other operatives working for our hitman's agency are being eliminated, possibly by a rival organisation. When contact with the office is lost entirely, Agent 47 (for that is he) heads for the US and, judging from this exclusive bit of artwork, Las Vegas.

Our source at Eidos reveals that much of the gameplay takes place in the States, but there will also be missions set in Europe. We're also told that the game, running on a new version of lo's impressive Glacier engine, looks sensational. Better still, the suggestion is that *Blood Money* will be a much less linear experience – to some degree, the order you eliminate targets will be flexible, creating separate paths

through the game. Hitman: Blood Money is due out next spring and we'll be paying top dollar for the first official screenshots very soon. ■ TC

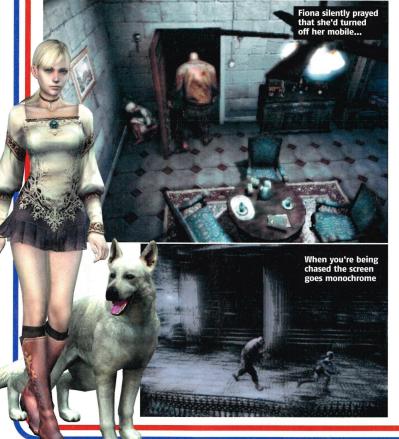

# PS2 GETS SLIMMER, SEXIER

Meet the latest addition to Sony's family. Go on, you can touch...



Imagine if overnight your girlfriend or boyfriend (oh Christ, who are we kidding?) was replaced by a smaller, slimmer and unquestionably sexier model, possibly with a new socket. You would rightly feel a mixture of elation, hope and confusion. Such was the reaction here as Sony

uncurtained the remodelled, smallified version of PS2.

"Everything we know is wrong," typed Frenchy on one of the exclusive forums he frequents. Hours later, Rich returned from London, having witnessed the device being birthed at Sony HQ. "Yeah, it looks pretty nice," he confirmed - arguably the most excited we'd ever seen him.

So what's in the box? Exactly the same stuff that's in your current model, only with the added bonus of an Ethernet adaptor built-in, meaning it's ready for network gaming 'out of the box'. Design-wise, the new PS2 is incredibly similar to the original machine - masculine charcoal black, grooves like a Bang & Olufsen toaster - only with a swanky flip-top disc mechanism, similar to the PSone. The real selling point, though, is the almost absurdly slimline size, made possible thanks to the technological alchemy of older big chips now being replaced by modern little ones.

The new machine - which is on sale now and will set you back around a ton (that's £100) - is 75% smaller than its predecessor and just 2.8cm thick. We've seen it for real and it's smaller than a collection of erotica or a pretty lady's ankle. Now the bad news: although your old joypads and memory cards are compatible, your multitap isn't. The prong is too fat, see? No matter, the new PS2 is still likely to find its way under a lot of decomposing evergreens this Christmas.

#### NIPER ELITE

#### DEEP BREATH... BE THE BULLET.. EXHALE SLOWLY... TAKE THE SHOT

According to the German psychoanalyst Theodore Reik, 'a thought murder a day keeps the psychiatrist away'. Phew. That's a relief, because every night we dream revenge fantasises about blowing away our enemies - so many enemies - with a massive rifle. Perfectly healthy, apparently. Which means we're now looking forward to ventilating brains in Sniper Elite with clear consciences and slicked trigger digits.

Set in 1945, with Berlin falling to the advancing Red Army, you play an elite sniper (the name being the clue here) in the pay of the Americans. But your enemy isn't the retreating Hun, whose war machine at this point is largely composed of small boys and Bavarian pensioners called Helmut. Nope, it would appear that you're sniping the Russians. But aren't they on the same side? Well, yes. And no. Disguised as a Jerry, your lone wolf must stop Ivan from getting his hands on Germany's A-Bomb. Cue the long-distance neurosurgery.

Glance at the screens and you'd be forgiven for thinking it's another Medal Of Honor clone, but admittedly one with surprisingly detailed visuals. Not so. Gameplay involves crawling around Berlin's ruined streets, nervously scanning the shattered skyline for enemies and, very occasionally, firing a round into their unsuspecting faces. Saying it's slow is like saying evolution probably isn't worth waiting around to watch. But this is actually a good thing, an is what separates Sniper Elite from the rest of the WW2 titles.

#### WAITING TO EXHALE

Your marksman is woefully under protected, so run around in the open and, commonly, you're dead in a puddle seconds later. Consequently, the tension's leotard tight as you squat behind cover, desperately trying to spot who's shooting at you. The flipside is when you manage to sneak within range and line up a shot yourself pressing @ makes you exhale, steadying your hand. Other factors to compensate for include gravity, wind and your own heartbeat. Christ, sounds complex eh? But sensibly all these elements can be switched off - and three difficulty levels plus a number of 'use anywhere' saves reduces frustration.

What's particularly satisfying is the feeling of a city under siege, with bombers flying overhead and tanks patrolling the rubble. The atmosphere really is tremendous and also extends to the behaviour of the troops. Injure a soldier and his comrades will try to help him, enabling you to enjoy a two-for-one deal on dead Russians. There's plenty more to talk about, like setting trip wires, hiding among bodies and the potentially superb online mode. More of which soon, but first a question: is it normal when the sniper rifle in your dreams occasionally morphs into a giant nob? ■ TC

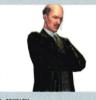

#### **BROTHERS IN ARMS**

#### ..IN WHICH MARK KNOPFLER DEFEATS THE THIRD REICH USING ONLY THE POWER OF ADULT-ORIENTATED ROCK

Sometimes it's tough coming up with the introductory bit of these stories. Particularly when dealing with a genre that's so elbows-inthe-ribs crowded. Occasionally it can take up to ten minutes before the word fairies arrive with something workable. But look: it's done! And that was hardest thing on today's 'to do' list. In marked contrast, grandpa's generation could reasonably expect to be gassed, shot and shelled all in the same day. Christ, imagine dying in France of all bloody places! What the hell did the Germans want with the place anyway? Soft cheese?

Luckily, we can now enjoy the mind-breaking horror of WW2 via the medium of videogame. But for all the bleating about historical accuracy, the likes of Call Of Duty and Medal Of Honor are arcade shooters at heart full of gritty imagery, certainly, but tactically naïve. The difference with Brothers In Arms is that it takes the business of winning the war very seriously indeed. The game places you as Sgt Matt Baker of the 101st Airborne Division. His men have been sprinkled all over Normandy thanks to a botched parachute drop, the place is crawling with Hermans and he forgot to pack any stockings for the French chicks. Merde.

#### **NAZI CHIC**

The first few missions involve rounding up your missing paratroopers, but once that's done you'll be in command of two 'fire' teams. Here lies the crux of Brothers' appeal. To defeat Jerry you must outflank his units. This means using one team to pin the enemy with suppressing fire

while the other sneaks around the side and catches Fritz with his bratwurst out. WHOOP WHOOP. Don't worry, that's just the 'complicated squad-based shooter' klaxon going off. But it's a false alarm. Issuing orders is incredibly simple – just point the cursor where you want the men to go/shoot - and, more importantly, your boys are super bright. Meaning they won't wander around in no-man's land with 'kill me quick' scrawled on their helmets.

Unfortunately the Nazi scum are pretty smart too. But that's no bad thing, because it should make for some ultra-tense skirmishes as you relive the eight days of hell that took place after the D-Day landings. There's also the prospect of online play to consider - with each player taking control of a fire team and then working together to out-strategise the enemy.

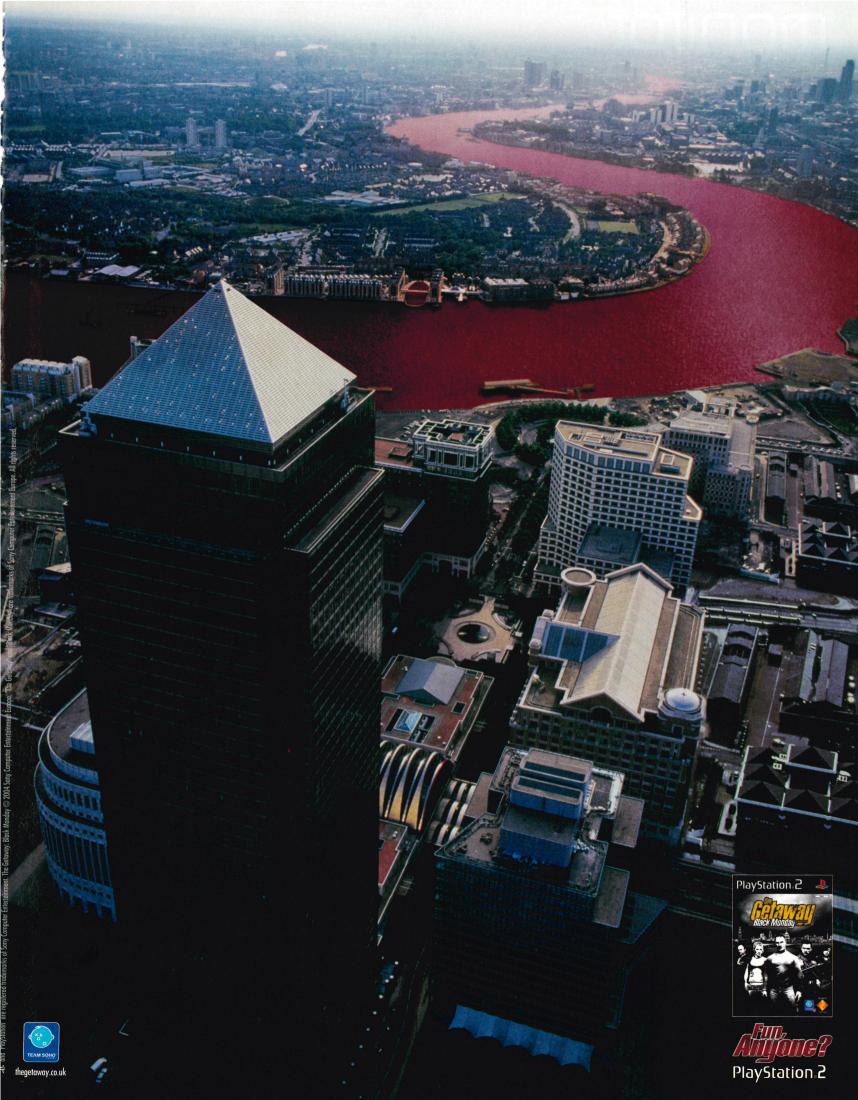
To cut the briefing short, we like the look of Brothers In Arms a lot, especially because it doesn't shirk on the ruined guts front. Example: early in the game a stray German shell hits a nearby field, raining chunks of bloodied cow over the road. War, eh? Brilliant. ■ TC

#### LEGO STAR WARS

Separately, Star Wars and Lego have a lot to answer for. The former helped shape the modern blockbuster-driven Hollywood as we know it, setting the benchmark for the typical special effects-laden movie and merchandising template. Lego, meanwhile, scarred our childhoods with creativity but has recently descended into capitalist hell, with most of its clever ideas replaced with movie tie-ins like Spider-Man and Harry Potter. Putting the two together as a videogame would be a horribly cynical cash-in, right? It was with this fear in mind that we turned to Lego

with this fear in mind that we turned to *Lego*Star Wars. Would it be a wash out? Would the
fact it's being branded as a game 'for

kids' mean that it's juvenile and bland? It was an old, tiny wrinkly green fellow that said that fear was the path to the dark side, and it turns out he was right – a hands-on session quickly dispelled our doubts to prove that Lego Star Wars is in fact a pretty, shining beacon.

Following the three Star
Wars prequels, action is split
- just like the films between character action
sequences and shooty bits
in vehicles. Along with
getting to control ObiWan Kenobi, Yoda and
lots of non-Jedi heroes,

enemy characters such as Jango Fett, Darth Maul and Count Dooku crop up for boss battles and skirmishes. Although the Lego representations of Obi-Wan and

co are, of course, massively disproportionate to what Ewan McGrego: and his thespy friends look like on film, Lego Star Wars does its utmost to replicate everything else from the galaxy far, far away. Famous scenes are reproduced shot for shot, too. For instance, a fight with Darth Maul closes with a scene that shows him killing Qui-Gon before Obi-Wan vengefully returns the favour. The dialogue, music and camera angles have been retained, but everything is rendered in Lego form.

#### **CHARACTER HOPPING**

As the game follows the film's lead with a massive cast of characters, most important to the gameplay is jumping between control of them all. The game is playable for both single-player and two-player co-op – for the latter, just plug in an extra controller at any time to join the action as one of the characters on screen. Whether played solo or with someone else, characters must work together to solve puzzles and search areas to progress – standard stuff, but with a difference: you'll also have to switch between the characters on screen, using their special attributes. In an early section, Jar Jar Binks leads the two Jedi through Naboo with the player utilising Jar Jar's jumping abilities before switching to one of the Jedis, using Force powers to reassemble a mosaic on a wall into a bridge crossing a chasm.

And those Force powers are, from what we've seen, the coup de grace. You may have heard of The Force: it's an energy field that surrounds us, penetrates us and binds us all together. Corny Star Wars quoting aside, it does the same in the game. Yes, psychic powers are on the verge of being passé – Second Sight, Psi-Ops and GoldenEye: Rogue Agent will have done the telekinetic thing to death by the time Lego Star Wars rolls around, but special powers are said to not just amount to lifting objects for giggles. The specifics are a little woolly at best for now, but we're optimistic.

And don't think that just because the game is based around two of the biggest-selling kids' toy lines it will be a walk in the park. The difficulty level is promised to be adaptive, meaning it changes in response to how you play – baddies will become tougher if you're a dab hand with a lightsaber, or they'll

#### ICO 2

#### LOOK AT THE SIZE OF THAT THING! ICO 2'S MASSIVE VISION COMES INTO FOCUS

If you need proof of how much of an engaging mystery Ico 2's development has been, then consider this: about a year ago, when we expected the first details of what was then called Nico, we mentioned it briefly in the pages of this magazine. Just a single word reference on our next month page. But the date of the announcement came and went without a word - this happens with lots of games, with publishers set to tell the world about a new title only to change their minds at the last minute, so we resigned ourselves to the fact there would be no news. Yet the Internet went crazy from our single tease, with obscure message boards based as far away as Japan namechecking us, despite the lack of factage. No details until, that is, last month, when we scooped the first information ahead of more promised details at the pre-Christmas Japanese games show-off event, the Tokyo Game Show.

As we explained in our news burst last month, the new game is a big departure from the slower, gentler pace that dictated the first *Ico*. There's no wandering around elaborate castles this







time, as our new hero must race across the desert plains, battling giants made of flesh, fur and bricks. We knew that combat and puzzle solving has been spliced together for the battles against these mammoths –

meaning you have to attack and climb their bodies – but now we've learnt that your sword is not just for dealing deadly blows, but is also a tool to create extra grip.

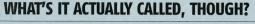
While this is very much a spiritual sequel to the first game, it's clear that what the original did for atmosphere, *Ico 2* does for spectacle. Witness the shots we have here, showing the scale between your adventuring hero and the colossal monsters that roam the massive and detailed landscapes.

Sure, there's a lot of detail in the new visuals, but there's still so much more we want to know. The big question is: how will it all be executed? *Ico*'s control famously forced you to hold hands with damsel-in-distress Yorda by pressing and holding one of the shoulder buttons. *Ico 2* relies on you climbing vast structures — so will a similar technique be used this time out? Perhaps the left and right shoulder buttons are held down when climbing the colossus beasts that ravage the landscapes? And what of *Ico 2*'s massive monsters — are they boss fights or run-of-the-mill enemies? Will it be a mission-based or story-driven game, seeing the young hero charged with hunting down certain monsters in a set order, or will the world



be a *Grand Theft Auto*-style toybox that you're free to explore in the hunting of colossi?

This mystery is all intentional, of course. The developer wants to keep anything remotely related to the plot under close guard so as not to spoil it, so these questions will be slowly answered over the course of the next year as a way to build interest. After all, while the first game was a critical but not commercial trailblazer, it makes sense to slowly lift the lid on this one. It certainly tantalises us and we're expecting a play test very soon, where answers to our many questions should begin to emerge. In the meantime, cast your eyes over our shots and prepare your mind for the wonder that will be *Ico 2*. Or *Wanda And Colossus*. Or...

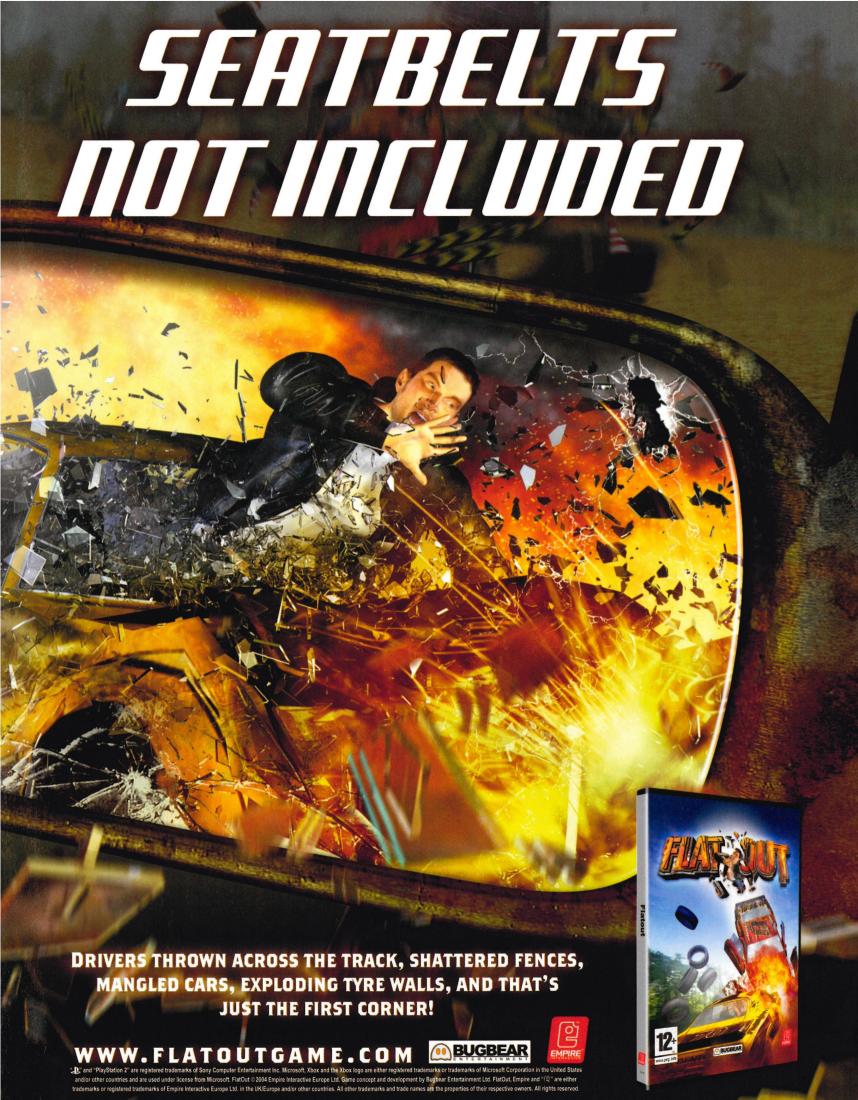

Mercenaries looks incredible, plays better and does for war what GTA did for crime. Are you ready for next year's most explosive game?

o right now you're balls-deep into San Andreas. Then, once all three cities are yours, it's off into space for some galactic slaughter, Killzone style. After that, Gran Turismo 4 will be parked outside, the wind caressing its shiny bodywork and whispering 'play me, play me...' But what then? Where's the next big thing going to come from? What game are you going to spend months lost in, completing twice just for kicks. Our money – the smart money – is on Mercenaries.

Pandemic's ridiculously ambitious actioner first came to our attention in March, when one of the team returned from Skywalker Ranch with wide eyes and talk of a top secret new game with staggering visuals. Obviously we were excited, but naturally cautious, too. Maybe it was the smell of gin, but something was making the office bull detector go crazy. Sensing the cynicism, our man attempted to prove his point: "It's completely freeform... like *Grand Theft Auto* in a warzone." And you know what? He was absolutely right.

#### CASH FOR CORPSES

So many games have been 'inspired' by Rockstar's phenomenal series, that as a point of reference it has

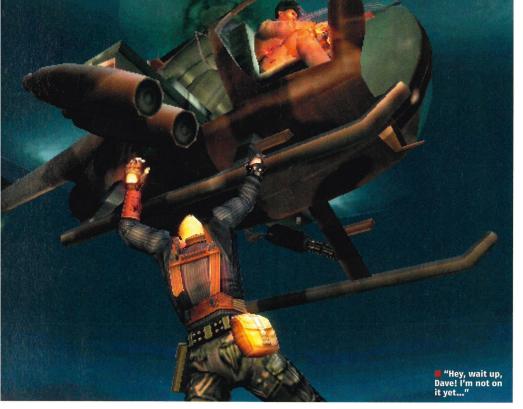
become almost meaningless. But until now, nobody's come close to recreating that signature 'go anywhere, do anything' freedom. But, from what we've seen, Mercenaries nails it. Set in the near future, a military coup has thrown North Korea into

chaos. Five groups are fighting for control – the North and South Koreans, the Russian Mafia, the Chinese Red Army and an allied peacekeeping force that's the UN in all but name. Each faction has a different agenda, but generally it involves blowing the crap out of everyone else. Politically, a nightmare – but, for a mercenary, the ultimate pay day.

Working for Executive Operations — a fictional private military company specialising in 'off the books' work — your first decision is which lone wolf to pick. There's Chris Jacobs, the American ex-soldier whose body armour makes him good for first timers. Or you could go for edgy Swede, Matthias Nilsson, whose work as a Coastal Ranger has made him fast on his feet and a crack shot. Patriotically, though, we select SAS-trained stealth specialist, Jennifer Mui — purely on the grounds that she's British and therefore pronounces the word 'arse' properly. Seconds later, she's being dropped

(that's the DMZ, military acronym fans) in an armoured Hummer. Waiting for Jenny are 52 war criminals, numbered according to a deck of cards

into the demilitarised zone

and each with a corresponding dollar bounty - the ultimate prize being General Song, the Ace Of Spades.

Capturing the different 'cards' has the same function in Mercenaries as story missions in GTA, in that they can be approached in a varying order, but to advance the plot they must all be completed eventually. The four suits - Diamonds, Clubs, Hearts and Spades - comprise four separate chapters split across two vast maps. Seriously, we're talking 15 minutes to walk from one side to the other. During which time, the environment shifts with amazing coherency between cities devastated by guerilla warfare, military outposts perched high in the mountains and remote coastal areas fringed by trees. Mercenaries features one of the most attractive landscapes ever drawn on PS2 - to the point that if you could only ignore the constant shelling and screams of maimed and dying soldiers, the DMZ would make a cracking holiday destination.

Once 'in country' you're advised to avoid walking around unless it's completely necessary. Pandemic's mantra when it comes to the 30-odd vehicles in Mercenaries is: 'If you can drive it, you can steal it.' Press (A) next to a jeep or truck and your merc jumps in. Now hit o to sound the horn and any friendly troops nearby will climb onboard and man the



weapons. Which is fine for doing the school run, but faced with heavy resistance you're going to need something sexier. Why not try hijacking a tank or, for the serious soldier of fortune, an Apache gunship? The choice really is yours and, as you can imagine, provides a near infinite array of fantastic gameplay possibilities.

The voice of your female handler was originally provided by Melissa George (Angel from Home & Away). We thought Mel was ace, but Pandemic didn't and have hired a girl with 'more sass'. The fools!

#### GOTTA CATCH 'EM ALL

Fundamentally, Mercenaries is all about freedom. There are two ways to discover the location of the card characters. It's possible to stumble across lower ranking enemies while exploring, but to get the necessary intel on the face cards -Jack, Queen and King - you're going to need the help of the factions, that operate like the gangs in GTA. Each force has an HQ you can visit to undertake contracts and the missions on offer vary massively (see 'Korea Advice'), but if you're successful you'll be rewarded with cash and, hopefully, information.

Keeping all your paymasters happy is no easy matter, though. For instance, if the Chinese hire you to assassinate a prominent figure in the Russian Mafia, Uncle Ivan isn't going to be too chuffed next time you turn up asking to buy some black market hardware - unless of course you manage to carry out the hit without being seen. Cleverly, regardless of how much you arse off the factions - there's a meter showing how they feel about you, but being shot on sight is fair indication - it's always possible to get back on side by killing rival troops and collecting their dog tags. Think of it like an incredibly violent popularity contest.

#### **GAMBLING MAN**

Given that almost everyone seems to want to kill you, your lone man army needs something to redress the balance the answer, as ever, is capitalism. The money you earn can be spent in the field, either by paying a friendly faction to airlift supplies and vehicles to your location, or by splashing out on the numerous air strikes available. Whereas the A-Team relied on weapons cobbled together using tennis balls, sticky tape and farm machinery, you can call on bunker busters, cluster bombs, gunship support, cruise missiles, artillery barrages... George Bush's Christmas list, essentially. Every single building in the game is destructible (just think about that) and until you've seen a fuel air bomb destroy an entire city block in a flash of searing light and billowing smoke, you haven't really seen what your PS2 is capable of.

The key thing is to weigh up how much a target's worth before spunking the readies on extravagant missiles. Also

RUSSIAN MAFIA Typical mission: The Reds love stolen motors and ask you to bring them some North Korean trucks that are protected by machine gun nests. Complete the job and you're given access to the Mafia's online store: Merchant Of Menace, Now you can order dodgy kit at any time.

Typical mission: The Chinese aren't too keen on the Russians moving in, so they pay you to take out several Mafia bosses. Make sure you use a sniper rifle or C4 charges to remain undetected if you want to avoid upsetting your contacts in The Organizatsiva.



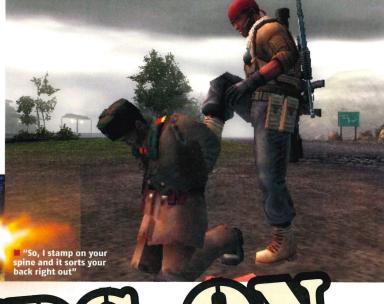
bear in mind that the allies only pay half price for a charred corpse. To get the full bounty, the card has to be alive when you bundle him into the extraction chopper that swoops down, rotors scattering the crimson smoke from your marker flare. Choosing which weapons to use – and when – is unquestionably the coolest thing in *Mercenaries*, and what truly separates it from *GTA*.

Mercenaries is the ultimate game of toy soldiers, and with a few months to go before its February release, it already feels like a breathtaking step forward. Every player will experience the game differently, specialising in different weapons and designing unique tactics. The risk with so much freedom is that Mercenaries could lack focus, but the missions are beautifully structured and well signposted. Crucially, the combat feels chunky, rewarding and dynamic. You can read our hands-on impressions over the page, but this is all you really need to know: Mercenaries' working title was simply 'Have Fun Blowing Shit Up'. It's time to amend your most wanted lists and now would be a good time.









### Join us as we take down the Queen Of Hearts. No, it's nothing to do with Lady D

ur target is Chi-Seong An — a North Korean chemical weapons expert the allies have designated as the Queen Of Hearts. There's a \$35k reward for his capture, but before getting his location the South Koreans want you to dismantle his operation. Playing as Nilsson, we arrive outside a heavily defended base, ringed with high concrete walls and sentry towers. No problem. Fiona, our handler, recommends a cluster bomb, and we're not about to argue.

Pressing ↑ on the D-pad brings up your support items, and having selected the correct ordinance with ⓐ, you then use a satellite guidance system to paint the target. Ker-ching. Money drains from your account as the bombers swoop overhead and pound the front gates with a rolling wave of high explosives. Walls crumble, guard towers explode and the gates are obliterated.

DROP THE BOMB, KILL 'EM ALL

A North Korean jeep suddenly emerges from the smoke, machine gun rattling. You can only carry two primary weapons at once (plus two types of grenade), so we switch from the Carbine to the rocket-propelled grenade and blast the jeep with extreme prejudice – thanks to the Havok physics engine, explosions make vehicles and soldiers hurtle through the air. Inside, the compound is crawling with infantry. The control system is blessedly intuitive, using the left stick to move and the right stick to aim, with just the slightest trace of automation to guide your hand. Initial suspicions that Mercenaries might not

offer anything more than run-'n'-gun action prove misguided. Staying alive is very much a case of using cover and adopting a crouched stance (click L3)

to improve accuracy. Before nuking the main weapons factory, we're ordered to destroy several surface-to-air missile launchers protecting the base. As ever, the method is entirely up to you. We sneak up behind one and plant a C4 charge. Another launcher fireballs after we hijack a tank and blast it from range. Feeling extravagant, we blow the bank on a second cluster bomb – all the time trading fire with troops in the base.

Next to the final launcher we discover a helipad and a 'little bird' chopper with our name on. One of the North Koreans makes a desperate run for it, but we gun him down and get inside. Once airborne, the excitement cranks up a notch as we buzz around mopping up the remaining forces with missiles and chaingun fire. En route to the primary target a plan forms. We land the chopper on the roof of the building nearest to the weapons factory and from here we've got the perfect vantage point for a bunker buster. Nilsson 'paints' the target with a laser and again the flyboys score a bullseye, levelling the structure with one enormous detonation.

With his plans in ruins, the Queen Of Hearts tries to escape, his icon pinging onto the map. Blasting our way through her majesty's bodyguards, we close in and take the Queen out with a swift elbow to the temple. Press and your merc performs a signature take down, knocking the card to the floor and cuffing him like an overzealous cop. Now it's just a case of calling in the extraction chopper and deciding what to spend the blood money on. Daddy needs a new cruise missile...

word in your shell-like. If you're coming to this review with the question 'is Black Monday as good as the original Getaway game?' burning a hole in your frontal lobe, can we settle that one right out of the trap, 'cause we've got bigger fish to fry and there's precious little time to mess around.

So yes. It is. If yes means that everything you loved about The Getaway is suited, booted, and hot to trot, then Black Monday is definitely its predecessor's equal.

The exhaustively mapped, grimy sprawl of yer actual London town that was scarcely credible as a feat of programming first time around is there in all its heavily thumbed A-Z glory once again. And if anything, the big smoke's wounded magnetism has been captured with an even keener eye second time around, with new areas showcased and richer textures throughout. Hammond and DC Carter are videogame history, but in their place you've got a new pair of mismatched thugs from opposite sides of the thin blue line, Sgt Ben Mitchell and Eddie O'Connor. And just like last time, our geezers' stories split the game's 22 chapters in two, but duck and dive around one another like East End boxers, occasionally connecting with a wallop of gamer recognition.

What else rings a Bow Bell or two? You've got a capital city full of real motors to 'alf inch. You also get the familiar lack of any (and we do mean 'any') on-screen furniture during play. And on a 'best till last' tip, you've got your cinematic cut-scenes, which are still packed to the gills with Long Good Friday-strength cockney dialogue and the kind of sudden, dulling violence that screams of anything other than traditional videogame excess. All of which sounds like it's time to get 'em in and have a

celebratory knees up round the ol' Joanna. Sorted. Altogether now! 'My old man's a dustman, he wears a dustman's hat...'

Ah, but wait. Hold your horses, sunshine. There's another question it would pay to ask, especially since we're in sequel territory. Is Black Monday as flawed as The Getaway? If you've played the original game, you'll know exactly what that means. The Getaway was a diamond to be sure, but one hell of a rough diamond in places. While brilliant and worth a hundred times its weight in pie and mash, it was a gem forced to shine through clag in the shape of an infuriatingly spasmodic camera and 'eccentric' auto-aim in the shooting missions. It also had a dedication to the purity of 'no on-screen furniture' that, for those gamers unfamiliar with the Hangar Lane gyratory, bordered on the masochistic. All issues that grated. All wrinkles that could, no, should be ironed out for a sequel. All of which, inexplicably and disappointingly, make their presence felt in Black Monday. Good. Bad. Brilliant. Infuriating. Perhaps a little elaboration would be a good idea...

#### **LOST THE PLOT?**

Plot-wise, Black Monday has set up shop two years on from the events of the original Getaway. The Yardie gangs are still doing a brisk trade in drugs, death and arms and are now making uneasy links with a particularly violent, ludicrously well-funded satellite of the Russian Mafia. As mentioned above, you approach this toe-curling Yardie/Russkie collaboration from different directions, as both amateur boxer/hired

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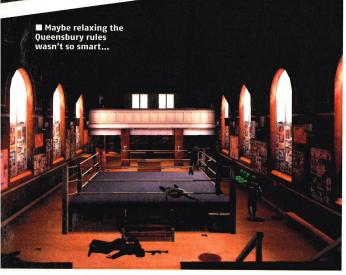

For one thing, unravelling the two-headed narrative is all part of the fun, but there's another reason, too. Much as we suspect the developers at Sony's Team Soho would like to be making movies (and they do a bang-up job of creating a cinematic vibe), Black Monday remains a game. And while a gritty and believably menacing atmosphere is a genuine asset, it's essentially just garnish. The bits between the cut-scenes are the dish itself, and considering it blends only two real ingredients (driving from A to B and shooting people up when you get there), it's there that we need to fix our mince pies.

The good news is that the driving sections are as enjoyable as we'd hoped. Despite congestion charging, London's streets are busier than ever and, as you'd expect, a variety of new models are in circulation. Of course, anything from a Smart For Two or Vauxhall VX Monaro to a double decker or Westminster council refuse van can be jacked, driven and destroyed with a pleasing level of realism (it's still the only franchise outside of TOCA we can think of that accurately conveys how a broken car feels to drive as well as looks). This love affair with 'the

real' also returns in the margues' unique handling - a knackered Renault 5 will have all the rigidity and torque of, well, a 20-year-old

French hatchback, while a box-fresh Lotus Exige will shift like stink and corner on rails. Following Vice City and Driv3r, Black Monday also gets motorbikes and scooters, too. Welcome for sure, and great for weaving through gridlock at dizzying speeds.

#### **ALL MAPPED OUT**

Also new is the welcome addition of a map showing your location and orientation and relative position of objectives. Not that you can actually see the map while you're driving, of course (you've got to pause the game for that). And not that the map shows any useful info like direction of traffic flow. Still, it is better than nothing and makes the now familiar 'navigation by indicator lights' a little easier to master in a crunch. Not actively user friendly, but then again, nobody said driving at full pelt through a congested city was going to be child's play.

Once O'Connor and Mitchell get out of their motors, however, the good news is a little

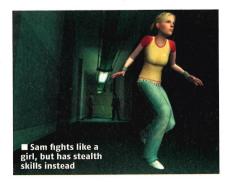

harder to find. The erratic auto-aim feature that plagued combat in the original Getaway feels only marginally improved, and often sees you locking on to a distant goon while another empties a full clip into your left ear at whispering distance. Absolutely infuriating. Particularly so, given that enemy Al seems sharper than ever. Sadly, there's worse to come. In an attempt to free up the rigidly fixed camera from the first outing, Team Soho has created a fixed/flexi hybrid that manages to outdo even its predecessor for howling disorientation. Change direction quickly or wander into an enclosed space (indoors, for example) and the effect on your ability to get your bearings is right up there with drinking a bathful of tequila and going circuit training for an hour. But you can struggle through, and the chances are you will want to, because, despite it all, the gunplay retains the brutality that marked out the first game as a minor classic. That said, you really shouldn't have to struggle at all.

#### ON THE LEVEL

Mercifully though, level design *is* improved which is a genuine reason to be cheerful. Often incorporating roof-top chases, shooter missions tend to flow from exterior to interior and out again with clear paths getting complicated and rerouted mid-mission. There's also a genuine attempt this time around to embrace stealth



with a couple of chapters that cast Sam, O'Connor's teenage hacker sidekick. She can't match her *Splinter Cell* namesake, but does manage to supplement the default wall hug/corner peek manoeuvres with an effective stealth walk. It provides a subtlety of movement the big apes O'Connor and Mitchell sorely lack. For while the former can take hostages and the latter can arrest rather than kill – and both are able to drag and hide bodies – in practice you're unlikely to bother, as the camera blunts finesse and reduces most scenarios to bloody firefights.

■ Riding shotgun takes on a whole new meaning...

As the sun sets over old London town, it's hard not to feel a little disappointed by Black Monday. It's not that the game short-changes you. Nothing else out there does adult and uncompromisingly gritty quite like it, and it still has the power to pick you up by the scruff of the neck and suck you into its seedy world. What's more, if you've never played the original Getaway, this just shades it, if only for a cluster of additional mini-games (See 'Crazy... Black Cab?') But for everyone else? Without the original innovation that seduced gamers first time around, Black Monday feels more like a fullsized expansion pack than an evolution. The good, the bad and the ugly features from The Getaway are all here and, for many, that will still be more than enough to warrant ponying up the readies. That said, when The Getaway 3 rolls around, which it will, we're praying that Team Soho can take its own incredible, virtual London for granted and make gameplay the headlining star. **Paul Fitzpatrick**

## SING WHEN YOU'RE MINGING

Meanwhile, debutantes can expect 30 tracks of gorgeously presented karaoke. (Actually, Sony why at some length, but the logic escapes us and bafflingly eclectic. So you've got Bob Marley

sat awkwardly next to Busted and Duran Duran staring lustily at Destiny's Child. The obvious problem being that catering for the broadest audience possible means most players will HATE at least half a dozen of the artists. Hello, Natasha Bedingfield and Jamiroquai.

Overall, we reckon Party's line-up is slightly weaker than its predecessor's. Personal faves include Take Your Mama Out (terrifyingly, your reviewer's range is almost exactly that of the Sisters' Jake Shears), I Think We're Alone Now and Gold. But, even accounting for taste. some of the choices are inexplicable. Like, why include a scarcely known Elvis track when his back catalogue's groaning with classics? Tutti Frutti simply doesn't work, either. However, where the game succeeds is with the new emphasis on duets.

Any song can be sung as a duet, but the best ones are proper call-and-response tunes like Don't Go Breaking My Heart and A Little Time. You can also insert the original SingStar disc to access its tracks as duets. Still, you can exhaust the entire roster in a single night, and Sony has also failed to iron out creases in the scoring that enable people to mumble through while racking up points. Example: two lads are singing Every Breath You Take, one sounds exactly like Sting, the other like a dying rhino, but at the end only 20 points separate their scores. For that reason we're dropping the mark by a point, but SingStar remains social gaming at its finest.

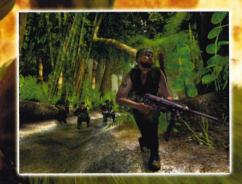

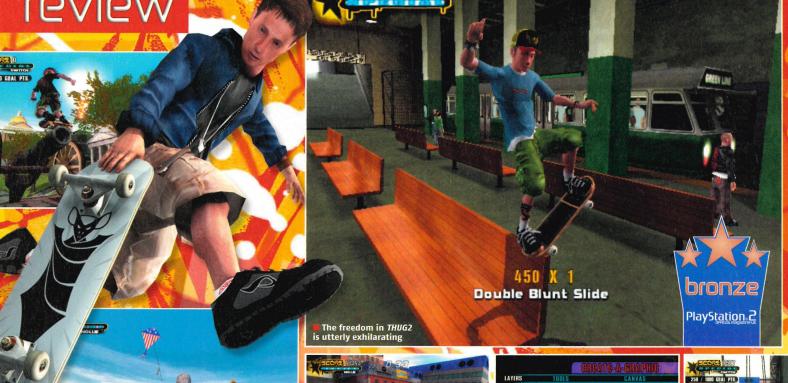

ello buttnugget!" That's the first thing Tony Hawk's new co-star Bam Magera says to you as you embark on their 'world destruction tour'. And in a nutshell, this phrase sums up the game: verbal abuse, faecal mumblings and below-the-belt anatomical discussions. It'll all come clear when you see pro-skater Bob Burnquist catch a tennis ball in the squeakers.

And while all that Jackass jazz is funny for a bit, it's no reason to buy the game. If you need one, then think of it this way: it's a Tony Hawk's game, and as we all know, that's a seal of precision. THUG2's no exception to the rule, and as such, it's an absolute must for fans of past Tony Hawk's games.

Continuing in the vein of its predecessor, THUG2 deals with street-level competition rather than international tournaments (although the old-style THPS is available in classic mode), taking you to cities around the world as you skate off against another team to decide who foots the bill for the tour. Pro-skaters such as Hawk and Rodney Mullen put in an appearance, but the focus is mainly on you, as a gifted young skater learning the ropes and improving your stats as you pull off ever-more-saucy tricks.

However, each level lets you switch between different skaters to achieve different goals. Alongside pro-skaters, there are guest skaters, themed to the cities they appear in, and these are usually downright daft - such as the rodeoriding bull skater in Barcelona. The controls

remain pretty much the same, although they tend to have very specific abilities, such as super-high ollies or superior grinding skills.

But, as ever, the one thing THUG2 really excels at is the deft twinning of fear and exhilaration as you tie together umpteen tricks and try not to bottle it as you go for more. Above and beyond the sticker slap instituted by THUG (and of course, the manual from THPS3), you don't really need any more 'binding' tricks (ie, moves that help you tie a high-scoring line of tricks together) so aside from the new skaters, there's little in the way of evolution except for feeling faster and smoother than ever before.

Add in the 'create-a' modes - in which you can create your own tricks, skaters, parks, pretty much anything, in fact - and there's plenty to keep you playing. But if it's an entirely new experience you're after, then ollie off and look elsewhere. It's hard to shake the feeling that you've done it all before, and that's really because, at the end of the day, you have. Minus the fart jokes, of course. Al Bickham

he crowd looks nice," said three separate people on their first glance at *SmackDown!*. And, yep, it's true: the crowd looks *brilliant*. The camera cuts to them every so often as your ultra-shiny grappler minces down the ramp, and there they are, flapping their arms in glorious 3D. They're probably the best crowd ever.

Sensing a 'but' in all that? You'd be right. Thing is, those sign-toting gawpers are a symptom of the main problem with the SmackDown! series. It's getting better every time, definitely, but it's getting to the point where you have to be a clipboard-waving trainspotter to say exactly why. Champs can pick up their belt and use it as a weapon? Check. Refs signal for a long two-count? Check. Wrestlers kick out 'with authority' - ie, hurling their opponent across the ring if they're still high on health? Check. Heels can dispute the count? Check - as part of a clever system that rewards fighting 'clean' or 'dirty' dependent on your wrestler's rep. A myriad of tiny touches improve the experience, but SmackDown! has been good enough, for long enough, that no single change is enough to fundamentally change the experience.

The trouble is, while this works just fine for Pro Evo — a near-flawless gem that doesn't need any 'fixing' — every year that goes by without SmackDown!'s more basic faults being fixed is like another ham-sized slap to the face. Case in point: it's been four sequels since Table matches were introduced, and the wrestlers *still* skate across the woodwork like Torvill and Dean. The commentary's just glitchy wallpaper, with about two stock phrases for each wrestler and another couple introduced whenever someone cheats – Tazz and Michael Cole make Brackley and Brooking sound like after–dinner speakers. RVD still 'does' the split–legged moonsault off the ladder, even though that's blatantly impossible. Certain wrestlers – and this took a bit of working out – still hold on to invisible ropes as they're stomping someone wedged against the guardrail, because Yuke's has doubled up on the animation.

Most jarringly, the season mode's still predictable like a Big Show/Shannon Moore squash. Sure, for the first few months, you're given the 'option' of whether to play heel or face by your responses to cut-scenes, but the outcome is the same whatever you do. Yes, you get to chat up ladies backstage - which is a nice touch - but it's still fairly limited. Where's the chance to engineer a feud by constantly ambushing another grappler? Or the opportunity to form your own clique via backroom chatting and the occasional mid-match assist? In an entire season of play, we were the victim of one run-in, and even that happened at the start of the match instead of - as is traditional in WWE - near the end. A couple of guest referee slots aside (and, inexplicably, the stripy shirt's been ditched, so you ref in your normal match gear) we never got the chance to interfere in another match.

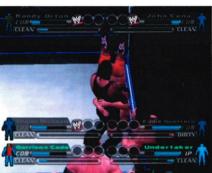

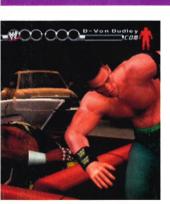

The grappling system itself is similarly confused. The main innovation's the introduction of a golf-style swingometer to determine the outcome of chop battles or shove-offs. Unfortunately, combined with the fact that you need to do a preparatory grapple move before even the most basic powerslam something that doesn't happen much in the WWE - matches tend to be slower. The three types of submission on offer (hammer the button, time the button press, or wait for them to let go) don't help; it's easier to make someone tap out from a side headlock than from the Crippler Crossface, which is clearly insane.

All of which isn't to say that SmackDown! is never fun. When it comes together like a 'proper' wrestling match - when you call on your manager and he squabbles with the ref for just long enough to let you crack Randy Orton with a chair, say - it's almost poetically beautiful. The Clean/Dirty system's genuinely excellent, and the Al actually wrestles 'in-character', which is superb. Bret Hart, long-time enemy of Vinnie Mac, finally makes the cut, so he can get his

revenge on Shawn Michaels, A new belt system lets you create old titles (like the now defunct Hardcore championship), assign them 'value' through defences and swap them between memory cards, which is an excellent touch. And kids who'll be impressed by the real wrestler voices heard during the cut-scenes are probably going to love it. The online situation's less clear - at the time of writing, only singles matches were available, which doesn't exactly offer the exciting league-based prospects we were after.

#### SMACKDOWN! VS DEF JAM

Let's be honest, if you're not a WWE fan there's no way you're going to tolerate SmackDown!'s eccentricities, let alone grow to love them. For casual head-smashery, Def Jam: Fight For New York's got it trumped - just compare the two games' car-wrecking matches to see the difference in collision detection. If you've ever marker-penned your own sign or worn a 'Don't Be An Ass Clown' T-shirt in public, you'll go nuts for it. Just like the crowd. They really are brilliant, by the way. Joel Snape

SEGA SUPERSTARS

Can't choose? Our grudge match will settle the score. Well, sort of...

onfession time: no matter how innovative EyeToy is, no matter how popular it is (over a third of you plucky readers own one) or how many awards it's won (lots), the novelty wore off pretty quickly. Don't get us wrong, we doff our hats to the clever people at Sony London who thought it up, but most games designed for the device have just revolved around the basic principle of whacking things on screen (barring U Move Super Sports, which tried to spice things up a few months ago by introducing a few original touches). So it's no real surprise to find EyeToys sat atop TV sets, tucked into a cosy blanket of dust or, like ours, nestling in a drawer calmly awaiting new games and next year's EyeToy Chat.

With this Christmas' pair of big EyeToy games, we're hoping that someone has looked past the impressive but shallow 'Look, I'm on telly!' buzz that has since been killed by really bad ads for car insurance, to deliver something that is more game than gimmick.

#### **EYE LIKE TO WATCH**

First in for its close-up is EyeToy Play 2. As its forebear was the mould-definer, this should surely be the mould-breaker - and it doesn't disappoint. While the overall mini-game vibe remains, each of the themes has been broken up into rounds and levels, adding depth and longevity. The best of the batch are Secret Agent. Mr Chef and DIY, which give you a series of stealth/culinary/handyman chores to complete. If the first Play's WishiWashi was Mr Myagi's 'wax on, wax off' training (simple and repetitive), then this lot is like training for the SAS - it's tougher, well paced and a decent challenge.

#### **EYE'M SEEING STARS**

Sega Superstars, on the other hand, takes practically every major Sega character you can think of and turns them into an EyeToy game. A newly devised sensor technique minimises the amount of space you take up on the screen for some games, meaning mini-games like Monkey Ball and NiGHTS sense your movement back, forth, up and down, giving you control over 3D environments and putting Play 2's flat designs to shame. Conversely, some of the basics don't work as well as they do when compared to the

Sony ones. The Space Channel 5 game may be great-sounding rhythm action, for instance, but it can be imprecise - and is outshone by Play 2's brilliant Air Guitar. Although, at the same time, Play 2 does have the odd dud game in its stable, such as the dull table tennis.

#### **EYEING THEM UP**

Before we hit the verdict, though, remember this: both discs have a weakness, which is unoriginality. Play 2's Table Tennis and Goal Attack, and Superstars' House Of The Dead and Virtua Striker are retreads of old EyeToy concepts. Play 2 counters this with a playbox full of memorable toy elements, such as bubblewrap and spellcasting. Superstars tries to spice things up with a monster-nurturing element that keeps track of your score, but is ultimately quite forgettable and a little dull.

It's because of this that EyeToy Play 2 wins the fight, but only just. The game you should buy is really dependent on what exactly it is you want. If it's instant fun you're after, go for Play 2. If you want slightly longer-term joy from characters you'll recognise, then Sega Superstars is for you. Of course, in a perfect world the EyeToy faithful might want to consider buying both for a really happy Christmas. Michael French

f there's one major problem with *Under The Skin*, it's finding the right words to describe it — which isn't to say the words don't exist or that we can't find them — just that it sits in a weird place on the spectrum of games we test every month.

Under The Skin is strip kiss-chase, but with weapons instead of kisses – you control Cosmi, an alien who must fulfil his race's rite of passage by travelling to Earth and causing lots of trouble. This is done by stealing the appearance (or skin – hence the name) of civilians to make sure you go unnoticed as you lay traps. If all goes well, the stumbling masses will drop cash and your success is measured by the amount of coinage you collect. If it doesn't go to plan, the panicking masses get mad and notice you causing all the trouble. They'll then run after you, attacking you until your disguise falls off, leaving you to steal another skin and find a safe place to re-cloak yourself, lest you be marred by the mob.

So, it's a rather original idea for a game — and there's nothing we like more than new, shiny clever ideas. However, *Under The Skin* feels like just one single clever idea stretched out tighter than a single roll of cling film across the Grahd Canyon, making for a short-lived adventure. It lacks any major tactical elements, isn't very complicated and even on the harder difficulty levels, can be aced in under two hours.

Meanwhile, a floaty camera undermines proceedings. Oh, what we'd have given to have a fixed or higher viewpoint to help us lay traps, or a lock-on button for weapons deployment. Without these staples the game feels looser and more out of control than it should – which defeats the point when much of your actions rely on quick wits during panicky situations.

But despite the fact that this is a game that's desperately trying to be wacky (and consequently failing to be as off the wall as it wants to be), the madcap mugging is bizarrely captivating. It's not as manic as the mechanic suggests and it's not very challenging – but there are satisfying moments to be found. It's just a shame that although the game is chaotic, this is to its own detriment. Perhaps its shortcomings will be tightened up in, ironically, that most unoriginal thing of all... a sequel. 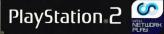

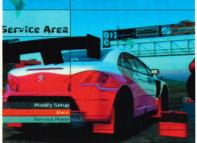

ou probably don't realise just how passionate some game developers are. It's not always easy to tell, especially when licences limit what they can do and how they can present things. But when you meet them, then you know. Talking to WRC 4 developer Evolution Studios, it's crystal: they love cars. That's like, loooooooove cars. And rallying. And they're pretty keen on technology, too. None of this would matter, of course, if they were keen without being capable, like teenage boys with their first handful of flesh.

WRC 4 is lush. Gorgeous. Smooth. If it was a girl, she'd ignore us, but we'd pine for years. The series has always looked good, but detail and draw distances have spiked towards the moon. Some of that extra is dynamic, too – more flying mud and gravel, more billowing dust, more collapsing scenery and sparks. Oh, and more helicopters – it's a driving game, it's got to have stuff in the sky and helicopters are the new hot air balloons. Fact.

Watch a replay and you can't help but be impressed, even if there is a chopper edging backwards into each shot like a local halfwit during a regional news report. But what impresses most is the motion of the car body; the slam and drop of the wheels. It's almost uncannily real. There's very little canny about it. 99% canny free. It's uncanny.

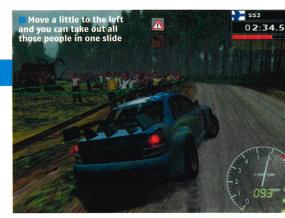

Why? Because the impaled-on-a-cocktail-stick, twiddled-by-a-god style of WRC 3 has been chucked – with a sigh of relief from Evolution, you sense – for a far more realistic creation. The angle, grip and motion of all four wheels matter now, and it requires far greater control from you. With the pad it's a little hard to achieve full finesse (though not hard to drive), but with a wheel it's fantastic. It's testing but not absurd – like Richard Burns Rally, but fun.

Naturally, every country and car of the WRC is available – though there are Group N, Super 1600 and some outrageous prototypes to fondle as well. Yes, but can you take it all online, you ask? Yes, we answer. Oh, you mumble, foolishly. Ghost racing, global ranking and everything else you could demand awaits, and it's engaging indeed. Complaints? We have a few, but then again, too few to mention... oh, go on then. Notes are still too slow (damn them) and we'd prefer a greater sense of acceleration, even though the speed is good. But more than this, use a wheel and you'll spank them all; use the pad and you'll still have fun, though. Quite an achievement, right? ■ Steven Williams

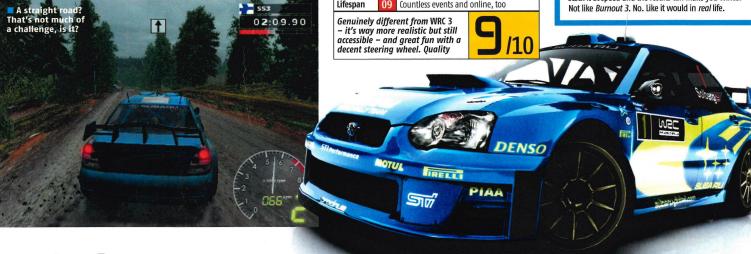

ast year, Need For Speed Underground was the big story. Developer EA took a weak franchise in a difficult genre and added three things that turned NFSU into a blockbuster hit of enormous proportions. 1. Turning NFS into a tuner sim rather than a racing one. Getting into the mod culture was a smart move and not just because the chavvedup party game of turning a two-grand Astra into £12,000 of thick-wheeled, glistening kitted skid machine is pretty popular these days. No, because it meant an almost Gran Turismo-like career mode, where you just had to get the next car or body part before you could turn the thing off. 2. Getting the feel of speed to go along with the name. Racing down a rain-slicked road with neon lights flickering off it, there was a real sense that you were GOING REALLY FAST. 3. Coming out last Christmas when no other big racers were around. Neat trick that.

For Need For Speed Underground 2, the first two factors are now year–old news and the third has been blown out the water by the recent arrival of the monumental Burnout 3: Takedown and the imminent Gran Turismo 4. So for NFSU2 to repeat the success – and the 9/10 it got last year – it needed to offer us something more than last year's game repackaged.

The squeaky new idea for the sequel is to have one big open city, where you drive around to find tuners to razz, hidden stuff and, perhaps,

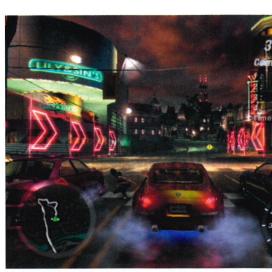
just because you like driving around. We say perhaps, because while it *could* certainly work like that – and the further you get into the game, the more it does – the random 'outrun' races (pull up to a racer

coloured orange on your map and challenge them), hidden challenges (look for the giveaway big purple sign) and shops are only the side offerings to the main game's races. As ever, the meat of the game is you starting off as the new boy in town with a lowly car and having to win cash to improve it. But as it's open city racing, you drive from one race to the next using the map (and a big arrow) to get to the rendezvous. And it's here that the open city stuff doesn't quite work. Why bother driving? It doesn't mean anything and, at the start at least, is irritating because all you want to do get to the start point and make some loot. Also, when you get there, the car lot or shop front is always empty, but the resulting cut-scene has loads of people hanging around whooping. Where did they come from?

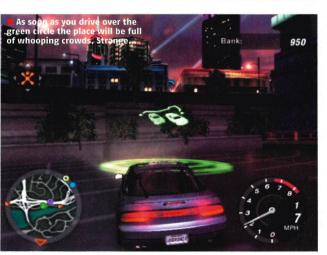

atchet & Clank 3 poses a bit of a problem for us. It's not that we don't like the game (far from it, skip ahead to the score for p<mark>ro</mark>of) or that we don't have anything to say about it – indeed, it was halfway through playing the game that we decided to devote an extra page to it. The problem is pinpointing the exact happy spot in our brain that the game caresses and expressing the resultant joy on paper without a) spoiling the fun for you or b) over-cooking it to the point where you won't agree with us once you've played the game. We could just stop right here and let you ogle the screenshots, but there's a chance you'll turn the page and not come back, unknowingly discarding your chance to be coerced into sampling a slice of excellence. So give us a few minutes to convince you with an explanation behind the object of our desire.

Ratchet & Clank 3 is... the third and best game in the series. Which is possibly the biggest barrier for you, but also the biggest advantage. It's not a series known for topping the charts sure it gets by, but let's be honest here, not enough of you have played ResC, despite our encouragement - and there was a nagging doubt that you'll need to have played the other games to get into this one. But it turns out the latter concern isn't an issue, so now's the chance to redress the balance by buying this instalment. It throws you headlong into the action, doesn't patronise you with a silly training level, keeps the action and the laughs coming and never bores. Levels are neither too short or too long and only occasionally knocked off kilter by moments where the difficulty level skyrockets the minute you go around a corner, only to dip back to baby-talk levels seconds later. The pace is almost perfectly balanced there's always something new to do next, be it completing side quests at locations such as the deathmatch TV show, Annihilation Nation, to



topping up your cash or forging on with the game's plot, which details the life-threatening designs of psychotic robot, Dr Nefarious.

#### **SOARING SUCCESS**

Ratchet & Clank 3 is... every game you've never played. The new Ratchet takes you on a tour of not only its intergalactic setting but also a mix of genres, as it cherry-picks styles for incidental mini-moments that include skydiving into levels (far smoother than the humdrum Spy Fiction we sampled a while back), taking control of vehicles (handled with just as much aplomb as GTA) or paying homage to retro games (a security system needs hacking via a Tempest-like shooting game, while Captain Quark's adventures are immortalised as a jokey side-scrolling platformer). The rest of the action is the usual platforming and shooting fare, but is presented with such style that it's difficult not to love it.

Ratchet & Clank 3 is... powerful enough to win you over. We'll admit that there was initial scepticism within us as the disc booted. We were worried that the series had become a bit stale and impervious for newcomers to access, but in playing the game from start to finish it's clear Rec is as fresh as ever. This is partly down to the arsenal of weaponry you get to play with – some are old favourites from the previous

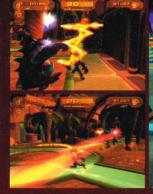

Along with recent releases like *Mashed*, *Pro Evo* 4 and classics like *TimeSplitters* 2, *Ratchet & Clank* 3 gives you another good excuse to purchase a multitap as, making use of its flagrantly OTT gunplay, the new game also propels itself into unchartered territory: multiplayer modes. Both online and offline modes are included, with up to eight players via broadband or four in split-screen mode. The online modes include team games such as capture the flag, or free-for-all deathmatches. There are vehicles to use and a handful of the game's top weapons, plus an in-game friends list and voice chat. Having managed to get in on the beta test, we can report that it's just as explosive and manic as the game proper, if a little shallow. A few maps seem much bigger than they really should be – a criticism we're also prepared to level at our beloved *Splitters* 2 – but overall it's a worthy and worthwhile addition to the game.

games, others are new additions. The Shock Cannon is an early fave, helping clear the way through areas, but you'll soon learn to love the Plasma Whip for close combat and the N60 Storm Gun for more precise firing (used in conjunction with strafing and jumping). The more esoteric options such as a brilliant lava gun that spills hot waxy magma or a mini turbine that slurps enemies in and spits them out as bullets - serve only to spice things up further. The only agonising problem comes when you have to add to your

The rest of the gunplay is well balanced, with the automatic upgrades that boost your chosen weapon after extended use managing to not evolve it to an unwanted point of uselessness – something that at times upset the gameplay in the previous games.

Ratchet & Clank 3 is... like having sex with a box of fireworks. Graphically, the game is a treat, refining and building upon the previous games in the series. Those au fait with the R&C world over the last two titles may find nothing particularly new here, except the tighter designs

and extra sheen, but new eyes will be amazed by the quirky and detailed landscapes and locations on offer. And if it's ever clichéd or predictable, it nevertheless handles things capably because...

Ratchet & Clank 3 is... a game that doesn't take itself too seriously. Tired of snotty stealth games? Pissed off by pompous tactical shooters? Bored of burning rubber, car races or realistic physics? Then this is the perfect popcorn game for you to munch on between epics such as San Andreas or Killzone. RevC3 knows that it's sheer, overblown nonsense, and takes the idea and runs with it, throwing in visual gags, film references and well-scripted banter between the lead characters. Sure, it's shallow and a little repetitive — but who cares when the gunplay is so satisfying, the details are so charming and the overall effect is one of a well put-together piece of pure entertainment.

But unless you're already a prodigiously talented rapper, Get On Da Mic can be an excruciating experience. Even with the better-known tracks, like Ante Up, Get Ur Freak On and Don't Believe The Hype, trying to keep pace with Busta, Missy and Chuck proves impossible. When we handed da mic (which comes included – you can also use da SOCOM headset, but SingStar microphones aren't compatible) to Ms OPS2, she soon gave up and started replacing lyrics with random

swear words. She's filthy like that.

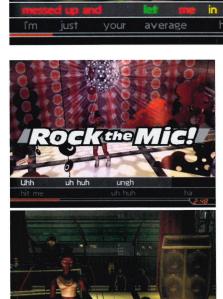
A huge part of the problem is the awkward graphical interface, which makes timing your rambling delivery incredibly hard. Another downer is the fact that some songs are performed by sound-a-likes (and indeed sound-a-nothing-likes), presumably because the originals were too pricey to licence. NWA's Express Yourself is a particularly bad culprit, with the imposters even pretending to be Dre and Eazy-E during the introductory skit. Bizarrely, a lot of tracks don't let you join in with the chorus. Instead you're left mumbling, 'Long Beach, in the house... ugh... yeah... Westside!'

Shame, because Get On Da Mic could've been a contender. The structure of its career mode (which takes you from singing in front of the bathroom mirror right through to eventual superstardom, buying bling, rides and Rocawear along the way) desperately wants to be 8 Mile, and you can sort of see how it could work. But for our Benjamins, the voice recognition technology lacks sophistication and the interface is all kinds of wrong. It's sad to say, but Get On Da Mic is a real playa' hata. Tim Clark

ood news for channel-hopping insomniacs and Yankee ex-pats missing one of their illogical home-grown sports, as the tenth anniversary NBA game's the best simulation of the sport yet. It fits the EA template perfectly - blank-cheque licensing combines with buttery-slick production values for a game that feels more like 'proper' basketball than anything else out there. Shaq dominates on offence. Kobe Bryant hogs the ball and Chinese behemoth Yao Ting slaps down jumpers like a meat-fisted kangaroo, with individual player animations and AI that rivals PES for authenticity. The flow's spot on - it's much tougher to pull off three-pointers and skill moves than in last year's game - and the commentary's probably the best anywhere, ever.

But, and it's a big one - you may have spotted it a few sentences ago, just below that enormous letter 'G' - it's a simulation. And, even once you've switched off the more tedious rules (Goaltending and Back Court Violations? Who thought those up?) it just hasn't got that

bombastic sparkle that makes NBA Ballers and NBA Street such a hoot to play. There is a brilliant Slam Dunk challenge, but it's just a sideshow to the main game, where safe, sensible blocking's the order of the day.

The animation's average, slowdown ruins the baseline cam, and the camera system on the whole is pretty unsatisfying - amazingly, there's no basic side-on view. Fantastic if you understand the intentional fouls rule, but casual 'ballers might want to wait for Street V3, which should be far more playable. Joel Snape

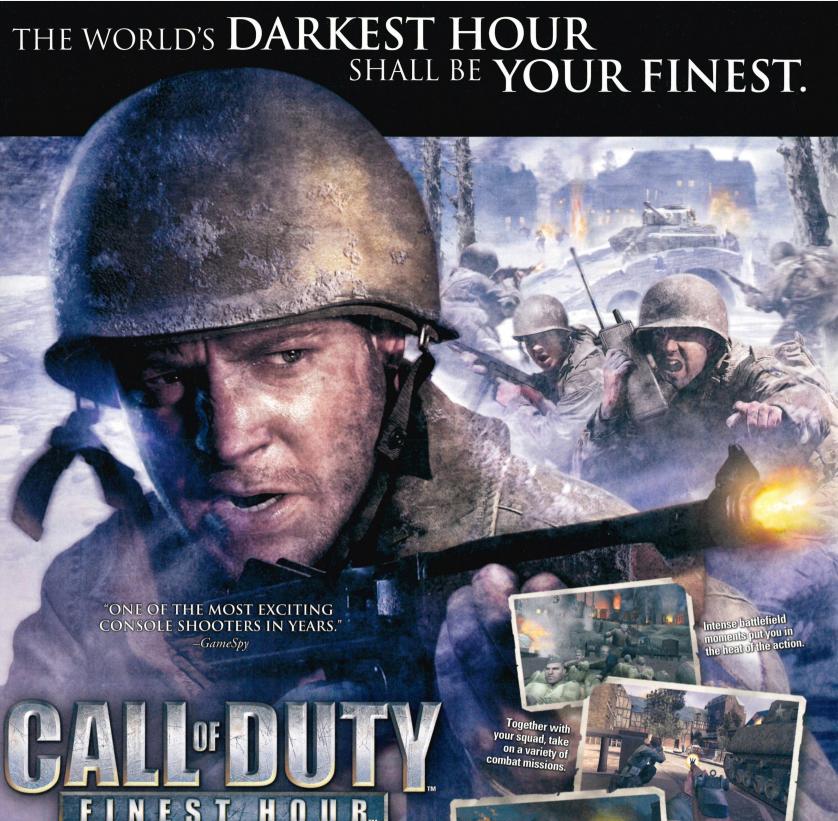

#### AT A GLANCE

Lord Of The Rings goes roleplay. Lead a cosmopolitan band of humans, dwarves and elves against Sauron in Tolkien's imaginary world, collecting stuff from boxes and getting into fights. efore we started playing *The Third Age*, we were feeling a bit Ringed-out. Don't worry, it's not as painful as it sounds. We just mean that after the onslaught of *The Lord Of The Rings* games and films over the last few years, we weren't really up for another Middle-earth adventure. It's over, we thought. Hobbits are, like, so last year.

We shouldn't have been so hasty. *The Third Age* may have missed the peak of *Rings* frenzy, but the possibilities offered by the RPG gameplay are such a good match for Tolkien's detailed imaginary world that it doesn't matter. It's the first PS2 title to attempt anything like a comprehensive treatment of Tolkien's work, incorporating the events of all three films and cramming in background information and history besides.

The Third Age does a fantastic job of absorbing you into the culture, legend and history of The Lord Of The Rings. You play as Berethor, Sean Bean's character from The Fellowship Of The Ring. As you get to grips with the gameplay - basically consisting of exploration punctuated by short bursts of combat - you'll notice that the sights and sounds of the films have been captured perfectly. Everything buzzes with detailed accuracy and the game leads you into the most memorable locations the films have to offer the Mines Of Moria, Helm's Deep, Gondor - all of which retain the scale they had on the big screen. You even create your own Fellowship as you hook up with various companions.

The most involving feature of *The Third Age*, though, is the guidance given to your character by Gandalf during his quest. This takes the form of a huge series of gorgeously cinematic cutscenes, lent some dramatic weight by lan

McKellen's hushed tones. These sequences build up into a grandstanding portrayal of Middleearth's history. Not even the films offered this kind of detail – it sucks you right in.

#### THIRD'S THE WORD

But while use of the RPG gameplay certainly adds depth, it isn't without its problems. *The Third Age* is inevitably much slower than EA's previous *Rings* titles, mainly because of the turn-based combat. Yes, you heard that right – turn-based. We're talking health points, attack points, level-ups; the works. If Middle-earth for you is all about the action, this could be a deal-breaker. That's not to say that the combat doesn't have its moments – it's surprisingly rewarding, once you understand what you're doing – but it's inaccessible at first and incredibly frustrating.

With this in mind, we'd have to say that *The Third Age* falls a little way short of its potential. The ambition, the vision and the scope are all in abundance, but the game lacks something compelling in the gameplay that could have made it a standout title. Not the one game to rule them all, then. In the end it feels like a fairly standard RPG with really nice cut-scenes. A beautiful shame. **Nathan Ditum**

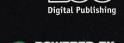

Fights come thick and fast against a huge array of increasingly tough (like, really hard) opponents. Hand–to–hand combat is rudimentary but rewarding, two buttons taking care of the kicky–punchy business, with weapons and special attacks at your disposal should things get heavy.

Hordes of enemies swarm the levels and satisfyingly vicious combos can be built pretty

much from the beginning of the game, bad guys (and pinatas) dropping like flies as your lady spins around the place — not gracefully perhaps, but engagingly nimbly. More than occasionally, though, the fixed camera poses a problem of its own, and the weedy weapons mean return trips to the city for more supplies and, therefore, excess repetition. Were it not for that, this unpretentious 'what you see is what you get' effort would be surprisingly decent. As it is, though, it's just plain good. **Paul Roundell**

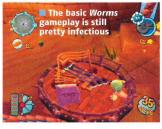

# **WORMS: FORTS UNDER SIEGE**

hen is a worm like a shark? Well, neither of them can ride a bicycle of course, but that's not the thing. No, like the *Jaws* film series, *Worms* endured a tricky transition to 3D, needed a great comeback to restore our faith in what it's all about... and has failed to provide it.

The invertebrate genocide central to previous efforts takes a back seat to the titular concept of laying siege to — broadly speaking — forts. Construction is now just as important as destruction, and it's when your buildings are flattened that the game is now up.

This is no minor change, as it adds a bulging layer of strategy onto what has always been, basically, cartoon carnage. While the bonkers weapons (gotta love the 50-stone canary. No, really) remain, using them to blast bricks and mortar dilutes the fun, and the fact that buildings are, at the end of the day, tougher than worms means games are more drawn out.

Longer games with less fun? You do the math.

The 3D aspect remains awkward, too. Targeting and range finding is too fiddly and the asthmatic camera struggles to keep up with the worms' more athletic moves. There's more here for the single player than in previous efforts, though, and with human opponents, that familiar chucklesome satisfaction is still obtainable; it's just harder to come by. It all feels rather budget-priced, frankly. **Paul Roundell**

e all know what rednecks do in the woods. They make moonshine from twigs and leather, penetrate livestock with banjos and install complex electronic traction control systems on rusted-out clunkers. And they're called Cooter yes, all of them. They do this in special whitepainted, static-free 'clean rooms' in Pappy's pig and cow barn. Yes they do.

No they don't. The bit about the twigs wasn't true, and FlatOut is a mass of contradictions. In it, you race American V8s (mostly, bar the odd 'hilarious' Fiat-style tiny thing) with some serious 1970s horsepower. And they've got traction control. What? The slightest hint of steering causes your driver to audibly lift his foot, despite you remaining crushed on the throttle button. This... [sounds of thesaurus pages fluttering] sucks.

#### RIPSNORTING

Look at those cars. You're thinking wild oversteer, Dukes Of Hazzard drifts, crazy jumps and heavy-contact racing that'll have you laughing pig-like through your nose, like you are your own goddam cousin or something. And FlatOut has all those things. Except it doesn't. No.

It has oversteer, but it doesn't come from too much throttle; it's all done on the steering - you might think you hardly care, but you will. What it means is these cars, despite being powerful Driver-style loonwagons, must be driven like a ten-year-old Micra with two broken spark plugs. Carefully. Calmly. Sensibly. The only time you want to be (slightly) sideways is on the way into a corner, because these cars simply won't accelerate if they're not straight. So forget any dreams of hanging the back out under rooster tails of dirt. Winning in FlatOut is all about conserving momentum, keeping everything neat and tidy and carving smooth lines that stretch grip without breaking it. Which is entertaining. And sucks.

Those are characteristics of a modern World Rally Championship car. Cars with four-wheel drive, three electronic differentials and stateof-the-art suspension. They're not the characteristics of overweight, overpowered, poorly suspended muscle cars that struggle to corner non-fatally on Tarmac, let alone dirt. But okay, once you accept that, you can revel in how well it's been done - it's beautifully smooth and finely judged - and settle back for some carefully driven, but still hectic crash-fests.

No you can't. Crashes look gorgeous, sound utterly devastating and are not here to be enjoyed. Not if you care about the race, anyway. FlatOut's physics are massively impressive - tyre barriers disintegrate into individual pieces,

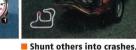

f humans had evolved in the same manner as 2D beat-'em-ups, we'd still be monkeys, except we'd have laser guns. We'd be exactly the same, only with one flashy new upgrade. And so it is with SNK's King Of Fighters series – the Pepsi to the Coke of Capcom's Street Fighter – whose sixth and seventh instalments have been bundled here into one low-cost game hamper. The series may be getting long in the tooth, but this is the first chance for PAL PS2 gamers to sample it. Like. wow!

King Of Fighters 2001 is by far the better of the two games, as it offers a more instant and wide-ranging strategic combat option. From your team of four fighters, up to three of them can be reserved as 'strikers' to be called on for explosive backup when things are tight, but it does mean that you've fewer characters to actively wield in a fight. Both of the games, however, feature the same classical, dynamic mixture of ultra-demanding finger gymnastics, and offer some dizzying depths for anyone

willing to put in the hours needed to tease it out, via a combination of intensely honed reactions and good old-fashioned memory.

You know how when someone tries eating an exotic new animal meat for the first time, and they say it 'tastes like chicken'? Well, King Of Fighters 00/01 plays like chicken. It's familiar two-dimensional fighter territory, refined but not redefined, and you probably already knew before you read this review whether you'd like it or not. Your move. Steven Bailey

any of the cars in Ford Racing 3 are vintage, but the game could be compared to a vintage itself. Not a fine wine though. No, this is vintage like a year-old egg discovered at the back of the fridge - it might look okay, but a taste of it reveals emphatically otherwise.

The cars, for example, are good - faithfullooking recreations of such US and British icons as the Capri, T-Bird, Mustang and Focus. But the physics is appalling: models vary a little in terms of handling, but none feel as if they're actually on the road, and with ultra-bouncy barriers and forgiving walls, rarely is it necessary to use the brake. An early trip through a ford (of the small stream kind, not the car) made not one jot of difference to the handling: there was no sound to indicate passing through water and a similar absence of graphical evidence.

The environments are nice but the tracks that run through them are unimaginative and dull to

race. Night driving proves slightly more exciting, but only because the cars' headlamps fail to light up the road. There's little connection between pressing the accelerator and the noise a vehicle makes, arbitrary revving and skidding sounds being the developers' aural choice. Which is a bit of a shame because with its varied, multibranching main game mode there's the skeleton of a good game here. It's just a shame it grew so much putrid flesh on its bones.

# The kinetic world of superheroes never seemed so slow

elcome to the breathtakingly ordinary peak of formulaic gaming. X-Men: Legends mixes the RPG, exploration and combat gameplay from Baldur's Gate with the brightly-coloured hero types from Marvel Comics to form a game slightly more mundane than either of its constituent inspiration. There are very few original ideas on display here – the game amounts to just a quick fix of repetitive entertainment.

A promising opening drops you straight into the action, but the overall experience is quite simple - roam fixed pathways and knock out a string of samey three or four-button combos but it's fast enough to be initially enjoyable.

After a while, though, it soon feels like a limping pace rather than a breakneck one. The X-Men's School For Mutants serves as a hub for the action, with missions doled out alongside fighting tutorials and character bios. But the mix of combat and RPG elements feels clumsy. X-Men: Legends simply doesn't make its main elements gel well, and key flashback missions

covering the X-Men's heyday serve only as fan fodder, being a bit dull for the rest of us.

Up to four players can play some missions frustratingly this isn't an option open to you from the off - and the points-based, level-up system offers some customisation. But the RPG sections of the game, which really only amounts to a geeky spreadsheet back-end, work out as lengthy tedium breaks in-between the action, rather than giving it depth and variety. Unless you like your comic heroes slow and wordy, X-Men: Legends is not for you. Nathan Ditum

# DEF JAM: FIGHT FOR NEW YORK

'Sup G? Wanna be king of New York? With these winning strategies you'll soon claim the crown

# **ATTACK**

**(X)** 

The beginning of a match is always tricky because any half-decent fighter will have the presence of mind to reverse a grapple or block a strike. Your opponents will behave in

different ways as the bell sounds, from immediately taunting you (run straight at them and attack) to rushing at you (trickier to deal with as you need to block a running strike or disrupt a running grapple – it's best to simply get out of the way if you have a speedy character).

Equally, some fighters block very effectively; some are rubbish at it. Test the waters with a combo or two, but DON'T execute the last hit – it's always slower to recover from and leaves you open to a counter. The quickest way to soften up an opponent is by grabbing a weapon of some kind, usually from the crowd, and battering them. It's unblockable, but they can still reverse it – a very bad thing, because the weapon ends up in their hands. If you're in a venue with climbable scenery (such as The Terror Dome), try getting yourself up there with a weapon and performing a flying weapon attack. Nasty.

Running attacks are a great way of knocking down opponents suddenly – you can use a punch, kick or grapple depending on the strength of your style. It's more likely to take a human opponent by surprise than a computer-controlled one, but still works pretty well. It also works on downed opponents if you want to get in a sneaky hit, but you should always hit them when they're down as a matter of habit.

# DEFENCE



Countering a grapple couldn't be easier... in theory, that is. Simply punch or kick your opponent during their grabbing animation and it will be interrupted. Not only that, but

they will take a moment to recover, which gives you the opportunity to come back at them with a move of

your own. The speed of your character is important when it comes to timing this kind of move – it's important that you get it right, because you won't be able to disrupt their grab if you're dizzy.

Reversing a strike is slightly harder to time, but consists of pressing the block button and pushing towards them just as they try to hit you. You'll end up blocking them and pushing them away, or possibly even knocking them down. If you shove them, they usually end up out of normal punch/kick/grapple range, so use a powerful attack by holding and pressing or a running attack.

Those aren't the only defensive techniques, of course. For the speedier characters, stepping back just out of range is a very useful way of avoiding damage without relying on those tricky button presses. As you play through the game you'll gradually develop a better instinctive feel for the distances various attacks cover, but probably the most satisfying example is ducking just out of range of your opponent's grapple then stepping in and grappling them in return as they struggle to recover.



# STUCK?

Are you hopelessly stuck? Tearing your hair out? Throwing your bling out of the pram? It's possible, even expected, that you will hit a brick wall at some point. For example, it took us ages to get past Trejo the first time! Check the following list and it should help you out of trouble...

- ♣ Are you using the best strategy for your particular style?
- Have you scouted out your opponent's skills? Which particular stat is causing you the most trouble? Strength? Speed?
- Have you spent all your points on upgrades or new and more powerful Blazin' moves?
- Have you tried an easier fight in a different venue just to get more Development Points to maximise your power?
- Have you used every possible aspect of the environment to your advantage?
- Did you pay attention to the in-game tip displayed when you lost to the fighter and didn't ask for a rematch?

Largely, it must be said, because the subject matter is so worthy and there are too many principal actors, none of whom are renowned for taking themselves anything less than seriously. As for the archaeological dig feature – all very well at 5am on Open University if the disco biscuits are firing on all cylinders, but would you really pay good money for this stuff?

# SKIRTING AROUND ISSUES IN ANCIENT GREECE

FILM: As literary adaptations go, choosing to recreate Homer's Illiad on Hollywood's terms must rank up there with taking the Arsenal model and applying it to your five-a-side team. But with Gladiator grossing almost half a billion dollars, the testosterone-heavy historical epic has a fine recent pedigree.

Paris (Orlando Bloom) heads to Sparta with his brother Hector (Eric Bana) on a peace mission from their father King Priam Of Troy. Unfortunately, Paris falls for the king's wife, Helen (Diane Kruger) and the two slope off. King Menelaus does not take this in his stride and recruits his brother, Agamemnon, to wage war on Troy. And he comes hard - with a huge army and the ultimate warrior, Achilles (Brad Pitt), in tow.

Achilles' mum, Thetis (Julie Christie) wisely counsels him that he won't return from battle this time, and so after his love interest is swiped by Agamemnon, he stands idly by as the Greeks' first assault fails. But when his young cousin is butchered by Hector, he finally grows a pair and steps onto the bloody battlefield. 6/10

EXTRAS: Battle featurette, Archaeological History Of Troy featurette, Effects featurette, trailer, Easter Egg. 5/10

VERDICT: Russell Crowe made Gladiator. Sadly, no one character fills in that central role here and as a result the film never comes to life - even given the obviously epic battle scenes. Okay, so the ladies

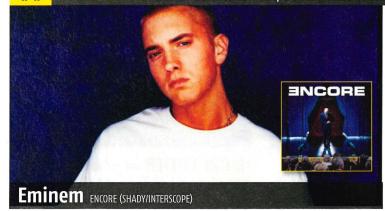

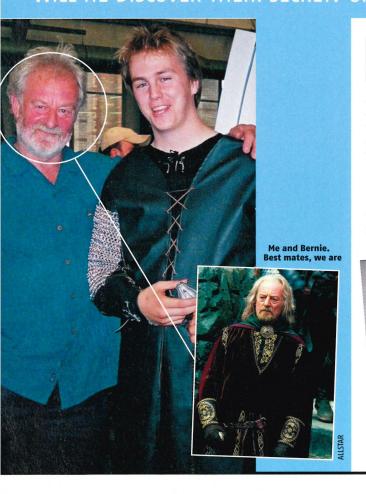

've arrived. Jesus, it's bleak. It's like the end of time and only geeks have survived." The first thing I do when I reach the Festival Of The Fellowship at the Alexandra Palace in London is text Timberlake, essentially in the vague hope that he'll tell me I can turn round and go home. The festival is a Lord Of The Rings convention, an excuse for everyone who really likes the books/ films to get together and revel in a delightful explosion of all things Middle-earth. Problem is, what's actually happening is a handful of lonely, awkward obsessives are shuffling about nervously while a half-arsed array of gaudy, Tolkien-branded tat is shoved in their faces. So can I get out of here?

Not a bit of it. "Sorry dude," Tim replies, "the bleaker the better I'm afraid."

So you're probably wondering the same thing I was as I took my first brave steps out of the disabled toilets dressed from head to toe in leather and chainmail, with a three and a halffoot plastic sword tucked into my belt (fearing arrest, I didn't change 'til I arrived). What the hell am I doing here? The original idea was to send me out to see what makes conventiongoers tick, to uncover the mysterious wonders of their insular world, and to ask them why they dress up like loonies. Ideally, I envisaged myself fitting in seamlessly with the fanboys, drifting inconspicuously among the sea of bodices and

leather jerkins: becoming invisible.

# **LIKE A SORE THUMB**

But now I'm here I've never felt more visible. I arrive on the second day of the three-day event to find the convention verging on deserted. There's hardly anybody here, and

even fewer of them are dressed up. "OK," I text back to Tim, "I see how this thing's gonna work. Car crash journalism, eh? Got the gear on, gonna take some pictures and be out of here in 20."

It's a brave front. In reality, hot, burning shame threatens to physically paralyse me as I begin exploring. Basically, the event is divided into two large rooms. One

With grim determination I find some people to talk to. Having a nice time?" "Yes, thanks. We like your chainmail. Did you make it yourself? "Er, no. What are your names?"

"They're not real names, are they?" "No, they are our roleplaying aliases." Within minutes they attempt to induct me into their online fantasy community, and I quickly move on.

to go now."

By the time I get to meet the biggest star present at the festival, Bernard Hill (king of the horse people himself - he played Theodin, ruler of Rohan in the film), I'm in a bad way. Sweaty, humiliated and broken, I stagger up to him and announce myself, grinning desperately.

"Hi Bernard, my name's Nathan, I work for Official PlayStation 2 Magazine."

"Oh, hello. Nathan, you say?" "That's right."

He clearly hasn't a clue what I'm talking about, but he's very nice all the same. My semi-rabid garble continues.

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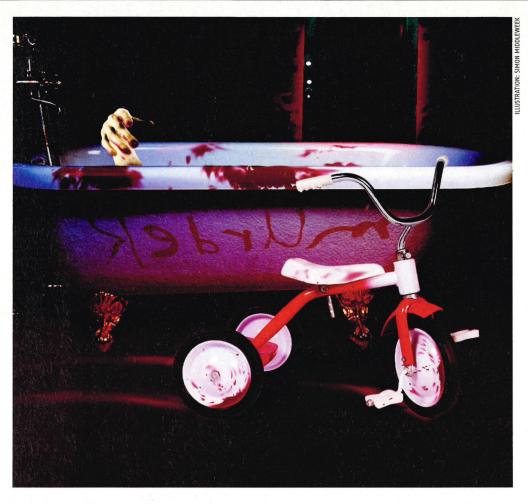




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# MOST OVERLOOKED MOVIE LICENCES

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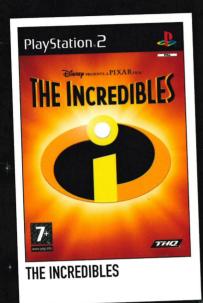
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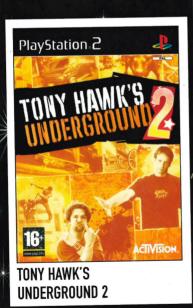
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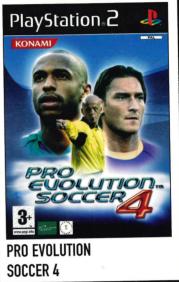
