

Dotted around the stages are different coloured Bat logos, each of which has a different use. The blue logos give Batman points, while the yellow ones increase his energy bar. The white Bat-sign, on the other hand, gives Mr Wayne extra Batarangs (he starts the game with twenty) and they're ultra-handy for wiping out enemies from a distance!

Why waste Batarangs on the bikers when you can just let 'em drive idly by? Because they'll come back and kill you, that's why!



- 2. Here you will see the crystals required along the top in each of the tree houses. To get to the right-hand crystal you must climb the tree by jumping upwards in the branches. For the other two crystals, use the floating acorn. Stand on the post to the right and jump upwards to land on an acorn, which will take you round close to the crystals. You will have to jump from the acorn and land on the tree platform, then jump back onto the acorns to get the next crystal and make it to the left side of the screen. Exit down the hole on the left-hand side.
- 3. On this screen is a similar arrangement with birds. Jump onto the birds and these will take you round to get to the two lower crystals. For the upper crystals, jump upwards and land on the cones. These will not kill you instantly but will kill you if you stand on them for too long, so jump off, back onto another bird as soon as possible. Exit the screen to the right.
- 4. The first crystal on this screen is at the bottom-left corner, under the sign.

Stand underneath the sign next to the spikes and, when the hare comes close, jump onto it. This will take you across to the crystal. Jump upwards to get the crystal and land on the sign.

The other crystals are in the air and you must use the rotating arrows to get to these. Stand on the right edge of the sign and jump upwards onto an arrow. When you get near a crystal, jump off to reach it. Repeat this for all the crystals, then move right to exit.


5. Here are another set of arrows and you use the same technique as before to get these crystals.

There is also another crystal on the spikes and as before, jump onto the hare to get at this. You can reach the hare by standing on the mound above the spikes and stepping off onto it.

6. To get to the right of this screen you must first use the floating arrow moving left to right. To get onto this, climb up the tree on the left-hand side, then jump

upwards onto the arrow. Jump off again at the other side. Climb down on the right-hand side and jump onto the mining cart. This will start to move and take you into the mine. Here, there are many crystals above the track. To get to these, jump upwards and forwards, collect the crystal then land back on the cart. Do not land on the track or it will kill you. If you miss any crystals, do not worry; as soon as the cart comes to the end of the track it will return back along the same route and all remaining crystals can be collected on the return journey.

- 7. When you get to the end of the track, jump off before the cart starts to move backwards and be sure to avoid the large spike, moving up and down, then walk right along the bottom to the next screen.
- 8 At the bottom-left corner of this screen, you can see some flowers rotating around a crystal. You must use the flowers to get the crystal as with the birds earlier on. To get onto a flower, stand to the immediate


hen Psygnosis released Shadow Of The Beast on the Amiga some four years ago, it probably did more for sales of Commodore's machine than Commodore themselves! Superlative graphics, multi-layer parallax scrolling and unbelievable sound and music showed exactly what the Amiga could do - and now the game is at long last coming to the Lynx!


The plot revolves around The Beast. That's the character you'll control, except he didn't start life as a beast. He used to be a normal bloke, until he dared to cross swords with The Dark Lord.
