interactive entertainment's new world standard with 3DO Magazine. Due out on the shelves at the beginning of December, if you're looking for a magazine that deals solely with this system then it will be well worth a look The magazine will have all of the goodies you can expect in the standard game news plus the latest info on MPEG Movies, Modems, 3DO PC Upgrades, Lightguns, Portable 3DO's, 3D Goggles and heck, a whole lot more.

he PR for the launch of Doom 2, Doomsday, didn't go as

he Doom merry-go-round continues with the announcement that the gorefest game is already being worked on for the Nintendo Ultra 64 system. Developed by Williams Entertainment, the home software subsidiary of WMS Industries (the makers of arcade classics like Mortal Kombat and NBA Jam), together with the help of Id Software, Nintendo have hopes of this being one of the first titles to show off the real potential of the system. To us, it seems slightly strange that they should select an old game for such a reason, but no doubt it will be absolutely stunning with (so we're assured) spectacular graphics effects rendered by Silicon Graphics Indigo workstations, Crikey

intendo's Ultra 64 system has been getting all of the attention recently, but our sources suggest that Nintendo's other project will open a few eyes when it's finally released. This is the Nintendo 32bit Virtual Reality system. Apparently, this won't come with the expected bulky headset but a system that uses technology tested by the military in the Gulf War and in jet pilot's HUD's. Apparently, the system will utilise different coloured LED lights flicked up by rotating mirrors to project an image in front of the viewer's eyes as a column of light - one for each eye to give a true 3D virtually real effect. Although information is scarce at the moment and the technical details are being closely guarded, it has been suggested that there are already a number of licensees working on

age Software and Software Creations, both highly respected UK development houses, have been acquired by the conglomerate BGE, makers of snooker, arcade and leisure items – this is their first move into the lucrative software entertainment business. By buying a huge slice of Rage and Software Creations, they get publishing rights but also give the development teams more scope and cash for increasing game development. Rage, formed in 1992, are the creators of the Striker range and recently, Powerdrive. Software Creations, founded in 1991, has created such big-selling games as Major League Baseball and Solstice on the Super Nintendo.

VIRTUAL JAGUAR

tari have joined forces with Virtuality, the leaders in VR arcade machines, to create a VR headset for the Jaguar at an affordable price. According to the agreement, Virtuality will finalise development of its VR headset that Atari will manufacture and market for use with the Jaguar. Due for release by Christmas 1995 at a targeted price of under \$200. Jon Walden, the CEO of Virtuality, stated the reasoning behind selecting the Jaguar: "The Atari Jaguar platform is the only 64bit system currently on the market and is ideally suited for immersive, virtual reality games." Fans of our many hit arcade titles soon will be able to play their favourite virtual reality games at home." What games these are likely to be is still under wraps at the moment, but at least Atari are looking forward to the future with the Jaguar VR system.

s we have stated Sega claim Sony are the most serious threat way back in issue three and now the rumblings we heard four issues ago have gone one step further with the worry about the future machine developers coming from none other than Sega's president, Hayo Nakayama, who stated: "there will be chaos and sometimes we will win, sometimes others will win. For certain, we will survive. Whether as number one or number two, I don't know. For certain, Sony is a stronger company than another I cannot name." The company with no name is probably Nintendo and Sega are more than a trifle concerned about Sony who have so much more experience in the consumer market.

HOLES FOUND IN NET

damning report about the future of the on-line networks in Europe has been making the rounds stating that the much-touted information super highway isn't about to happen in Europe – at least, not until the next millennium – and the organisations currently pumping million into it to support it and new services are likely to lose their money in the short term.

Well, that's not good news, but the research study published by Inteco, aims to replace the speculation and hype surrounding multi media with hard information. It's not all doom and gloom though, although Sega and Nintendo don't fare well and there's a mystery over the CD-based consoles, PC's are expected to be in 50% of households by the turn of the century – their prospects are brighter than previously thought.

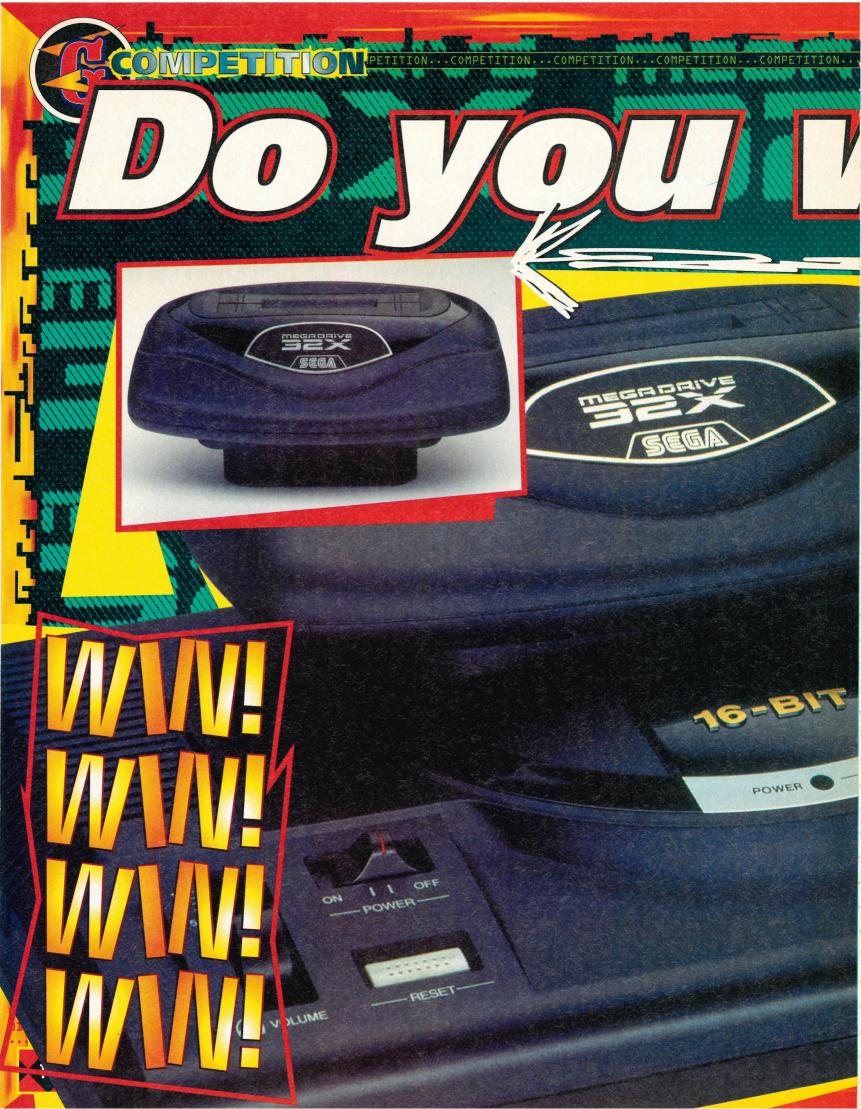

- Panasonic has finally been joined by Korean giants Goldstar in producing its 3DO system that has just been released in the States. With exactly the same guts as the Panasonic FZ-1, it features a slicker control Sega-like joypad with seven butters and three free CD's including *Shockwave* and *Putt Putt*, they are all set to join the Panasonic officially in the UK with a PAL version in the spring.
- Core Design, who gave Games World: The Magazine exclusive details of future game plans on the 32X, Saturn and PlayStation systems, have recently been acquired by CentreGold for over £5 million pounds which, Core tell us, will allow them to expand and create more in-depth development teams and spend more of their time creating games for the future wonder machines.
- With the launch of the Sega Saturn recently in Japan it's interesting to note that one of the Saturn technology licensees is all set to jump on the bandwagon with the JVC Saturn set to appear in the stores in Japan towards Christmas. JVC have been keen to get in the software entertainment industry for quite a while now, even snatching the rights to LucasArts console titles, but this is their first move into the hardware arena. A JVC spokesman in the UK stated that there are no plans for an immediate release in the UK, but they are considering introducing the JVC Saturn in the UK towards the end of next year, market permitting.
- With the release of the Sony PlayStation now scheduled for December, a total of twenty games will be available by the end of the year including *Ridge Racer*, *Ultimate Parodius* and *Motor Toon GP*. These will be produced on black CD's to distinguish them from standard audio CD's and, as there are around 250 software developer licensees around the world, this launch total of games is apparently only going to be a trickle of what's going to be a real tidal wave. Sony have things sewn up in Japan with distribution and specialist magazines all set up, it's just a shame Sony are standing by their September European launch.
- Californian developers Strategic Simulations Inc, makers of highly acclaimed wargames and role playing games including the AD&D line, have been bought by Mindscape. SSI, whose European Distribution has long been handled by US Gold and recently Electronic Arts will now be distributed solely by Mindscape beginning with the release of their latest title, AD&D Dark Sun.

Mindscape, themselves recently acquired by the massive Pearson group, see the move as a tremendous opportunity for both companies, especially strengthening their hand in the area of Strategy, War and RPG simulations.

- Elite, the brightest software company in the West Midlands, has announced that it is to abandon the production of console products for the SNES and Mega Drive. A sad day, as they have produced some classics including the best selling *Striker* on the SNES. With the polishing off of their existing console games, *Power Slide* and *Dirt Racer*, Elite won't be abandoning the games front. Heck no. They have plans to improve their position in the future by developing solely for the 3DO, Saturn, PlayStation and PC CD-ROM.
- For the fourth year in succession Nintendo is on top of the annual awards which rank 'excellent companies' in Japan by a combination of the profits to turnover ratio, potential growth, popularity and market share. Sony Music Entertainment came second followed by Fuji snapping at their heels. However, it must be noted that both Sega and Panasonic slipped to 13th and 21st respectively.
- ELSPA Crime Unit have announced the success of another raid, netting over 7,000 pirated computer disks and closing 14 stalls at Cross Green car boot sale in Killingbeck in Leeds. The software seized in the raids had a street value in excess of £100,000 and is currently being examined for content, with special concern shown over the use of pornography. This raid follows a similar one earlier in the year after a tip-off about the worsening situation. If you have any information that could stamp out the scourge of piracy, call the ELSPA Crime Unit on (0386) 833810.
- Virtual World, the people behind the largest location-based entertainment units in the world, with 16 Virtual World centres in the States and Japan with 10 more to come world wide, have made a massive order from Bristol based Division (the world's largest virtual reality group), for its special image generator the VPX. Division's VPX uses advanced state of the art graphics hardware based on the licensed Pixel-Planes technology and this \$2,000,000 order will ensure that the Virtual World centres offer the fastest, smoothest and most realistic VR experience to date.
- Bullfrog have certainly been keeping busy recently with their smash titles *Theme Park* and *Syndicate*, converting them onto most formats out there. One machine often overlooked, the Mega-CD, is going to get the Bullfrog star treatment with both *Theme Park* and *Syndicate* to be distributed by Domark, for a release in the Spring of 1995.

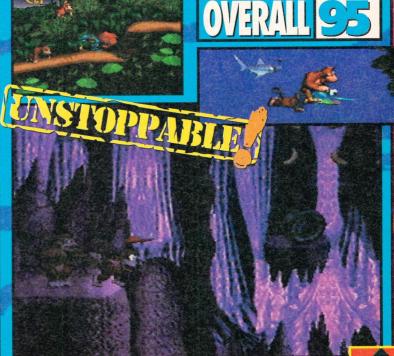
DONKEY KONG COUNTRY

- Sometimes games feel as if they've appeared months before they should have, like Wolverine. Graphically, it's excellent, with the main sprite cartoon-perfect, but the gameplay is terribly flawed. Wolverine has so many moves that controlling him becomes a chore and he often stands on thin air due to poor programming. Could've been good, but should have been playtested more. DAVE
- Rushed. That's my verdict on Wolverine on the Mega Drive. There's a distinct salty tang of someone in the programming team not pulling their weight in and it shows. The game and the character had so much potential, it seems a shame to release a platformer of this twiddly and awkward nature—it's horrid to control. - The Mega Drive 32X is a great idea. This, however, is not a great game. More than a little monotonous, there isn't much variety and the graphics are nowhere near as impressive as I'd been led to believe. Even the two-player mode, where one of you controls the ship and the other shoots, fails to work on this version. This is not worth buying a new piece of hardware for.
- Seen the film, read the book, played the arcade? Well now it's time you tried it with the new fangled 32X thing. Accurate to the arcade smash and almost as fast and graphically impressive, it sounds great but some of the intro sequences seem a bit ropy in places, rushed even. A good blast nevertheless. If you're getting a 32X then this game will attract loadsa mates to your house.
- Just as the title suggests this game is virtually arcade perfect! The polygon graphic techniques first seen in *Virtua Racing* look amazing as TIE fighters zip past you and you fly towards the Death Star. Sampled speech crackles over the intercom and even R2-D2 saying a few 'words' adds to that Star Wars experience. Sega have certainly got a winner on their hands with the MD 32X and some excellent software.
- In the arcades, this was a good game that you could shove in a couple of quid and play for five minutes. But on the 32X it just seems a bit thin as there are only four levels and most of the action is the same. Admittedly you can fly anywhere you want around the lovely 3D graphical Star Wars world, but that's it. Think carefully before buying as the thrill of the Death Star may not last.

WRITE RACING DELUXE

This is more like it. Unlike Star Wars Arcade, Virtua Racing actually makes a commendable effort to bring arcade quality onto console. This version does just about everything the coin-op did and more with two more tracks, three different cars to drive, a championship and even a choice of game goals. The original MD version was over-priced but VR Deluxe is worth every penny.

he basis for the game is simple Darwin – the survival of the fittest. Choose to play against the computer or challenge a friend, selecting one of the soldiers from the spacebarge or one of the fugitives. As a soldier, you can choose between two different kinds of battle armour for different effects and aesthetic appeal, or select one of the fugitives and rely upon your natural abilities.

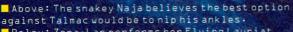

Beat'em-up

If you came face to face with Simon Phoenix what would you do with him? Probably smash his face in! That's exactly why so many beat'em-up sections crop up throughout *Demolition Man*.

A Full Motion Video sequence sets the scene with Sly chasing Snipes around San Angeles. When he finally catches up with him it's time to master those hand to hand combat moves or you'll be back to the start of the scene again.

The first encounter is inside the disused warehouse. Unknown to Spartan the place is full of hostages and Phoenix sets fire to the pools of oil making a massive explosion. The beat'em-up section here sees Spartan and Phoenix fighting it out behind a screen of flames. Oil drums litter the floor and you've got to knock the bounder over enough times to wipe out his energy meter at the bottom of the screen. High kicks, punches, slides and jumps must be used to combat his moves and get out of the building before it blows.

Later on in the game the two meet again in a mock- up of the streets of 1996 Los Angeles, outside the pawn shop in the LA Riots exhibit inside the museum. It's fisticuffs time again with the moves accessed in the same way as before (knocking Phoenix over with a good uppercut seems to be the best path to success).

Just as you think you must be nearing the end of the game, up pops your nemesis once more. After a speedy car chase scene Spartan jumps onto the roof of his red car (Lenina is driving) while Phoenix jumps up onto the police car he's stolen as it drives on auto, another battle commences the likes of which you've never seen before in a computer game. With the two fighters stood on cars they sway left and right and must steal kicks and punches when they come close enough.

Knock down his energy bar again to see the evil Phoenix fall from the car and hit the road.





Spartan is prematurely removed from the CryoPrison to face his arch enemy once again.

In this new world Spartan is a complete stranger. He's seen as a barbaric savage who shoots, swears and violates the taboo against personal contact. He has no family left, no friends and, to make matters worse, the mental programming Phoenix received in prison has made this psycho even more dangerous than he ever was back in his own century!

As Spartan races after Phoenix he soon learns what lies behind his enemy's astounding new abilities and what secrets the gentle San Angelenos hide beneath the surface of their shining new city. He's got another chance to face his nemesis but is the future big enough for both of them?

The game begins with Spartan bungee jumping out of a helicopter onto the roof of the abandoned warehouse. Simon Phoenix and his gang are inside and they're not too happy to receive visitors. Three shooting gallery

sections are encountered on the roof tops. Gang members pop-up from behind crates or run along the screen and they must all be shot before Spartan can move on to the next. Between each gallery section Full Motion Video clips show Stallone running and aiming These have been created by using original footage from the movie combined with new scenes shot especially for the 3DO. Stallone came back into the studio to record his movements in front of a blue screen. Computer generated scenes were then cut into the background to create these new scenes.







hen Simon Phoenix jumps into a police car and whisks himself away there's only one thing for it. You've just got to follow. In a snazzy red GTO sports car. From the underground sector of the city Spartan and Lenina, the 2032 cop, speed through the streets of San Angeles dodging the traffic with guns at the ready.

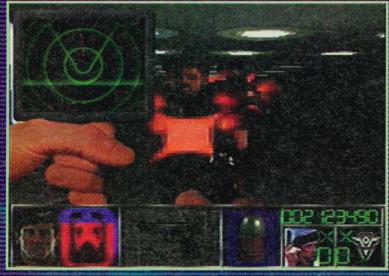
As the moon shines down in the background you've got to keep yourself topped up with ammo and guns to blast away at the car while it shoots off into the distance. There are people standing on street corners to avoid and tunnels to zip through before you can catch up with the futuristic cop car.

To stop Spartan catching up, Phoenix can drop oil slicks from his car along with mines that'll blow him off the road. He can also fire his machine gun and lob grenades to make matters worse.

Shooting the civilians' cars make them swerve and creates a hazard so this is best avoided, instead you must keep your bullets heading in the direction of the cop car. When enough damage has been caused the car will slow down and the GTO will be able to catch up for the next scene.

This is all displayed in 3D with the buildings smoothly scrolling by The status panel shows the two cars and they change when damage has been caused. The cop car slowly repairs itself when not hit but, unfortunately, the GTO has no such facility. There are also status bars showing fuel, score, lives and continues.

The roads are strangely straight throughout this section of the game, but you'll have your work cut out just dodging between the crazy cars while keeping up with the super-fast stolen police car.



One of the most impressive levels is the underground tunnels sectionin the Wastelands. Spartan moves around shooting the cryo cons Doom style while searching for his nemesis, Phoenix

Back in the year 1996 he had a family and friends but when he is thawed out in the year 2032 he becomes a stranger, all alone in a new world. The people of 2032 think he is a barbaric savage who swears, shoots and violates the ultimate taboo of invading personal space

After being defrosted, Spartan gets a second chance to finally nail his arch-enemy, Phoenix.

After shooting all the gang members Spartan comes face to face with Phoenix for a hand to hand combat section in his office. Phoenix has set fire to the floor and he must be knocked out three times before the flames ignite barrels of C4 explosive. A knockout is achieved by landing five successive blows as the background moves around behind the characters.

After scenes of the cryogenic freezing and thawing, the action then moves on to the museum of 2032. It's a one-on-one battle between Phoenix and Spartan Phoenix is in the museum to pick up weapons for his crime spree and it's up to Spartan to stop him from leaving the building. He hides behind one of the exhibits throwing



grenades and firing at you whenever he can. The idea is to flush him out with continuous firing and then destroy the weapons he's managed to collect so far. Assault vests can be shot to pick up more ammo, flak jackets give extra health and fire aid kits restore all your health. After two other shooting gallery scenes inside the museum the game moves on to the LA Riots exhibit for a hand to hand combat scene.

Both characters now have access to a special weapon which will inflict even more damage.

After fighting it out in the mock up of the old LA streets the game moves on to The Wastelands and a new mode of play. Spartan is on the look out for Phoenix once again and to help him out this time he has the use of a hand held Strategic Apprehension Computer (SAC). This gives a radar display of the surrounding area and shows all the cryo-con sentries who are out to kill you on Phoenix's orders.

This stage is played in Doom style with the 3D maze of tunnels created in real time. The sentries come at

you from all directions and must be shot dead before you can continue. Keys must be collected to open the doors and there are rat burgers and beer to pick up that the sentries have left behind. Beer doesn't do much for your targeting though and rat burgers will make you sick!



After another shooting gallery section a red GTO car is brought into the scene for a car chase through the streets of San Angeles. Phoenix has stolen a futuristic cop car and Spartan, along with Lenina, must give chase and ram the car enough times to reduce its offensive

here are various status displays throughout the game, but the one that crops up more than the others is on the shooting gallery stages. Here's an explanation of what's what



MAIN GAME SCREEN - Here's where all the action takes place. You'll see gang members pop up here ready to be shot.

ENERGY BAR - This slowly fills up with red as Spartan is shot by the gang and Phoenix. When it gets to the top you lose a life.

CURRENT WEAPON - There are lots of weapons to collect and the current one is shown here. When collected keys show up too.

AMMUNITION - You must collect ammunition as you go or the gun will easily run out and then you'll be in trouble!

SCORE - This one's self explanatory. You get points for killing people and completing each scene, you can lose points by picking up bad things like beer.

LIVES - The number of lives you have remaining. This is a tricky one to understand.

CONTINUES – You start out with a set number of continues but more can be earned along the way.

ow here is a game style that you should all recognise When Simon Phoenix disappears into the Wastelands the game swaps to a Doom viewpoint with the gun pointing out at the bottom of the screen and the option to have a Strategic Apprehension Computer or SAC radar in the other hand showing the whereabouts of all the people in the level. Phoenix has defrosted lots of prisoners from the CryoPrison to help him get rid of Spartan, there are eighty on the move and they've all got guns.

Phoenix shows up as a yellow blip, the cryo-con sentries are red and Spartan's position is shown in blue. The radar can be turned on or off as it does obscure some of your view of the tunnels as you walk around.

There are swarms of armed kamikaze sentries marching around the tunnels and they can jump out at you just when you're least expecting it. The movement around the tunnels is perfectly smooth with a realistic walking effect as you go and keys can be picked up and used to open locked doors.

Blasting the troops away is easy once you find them and their bodies stay where they fall, littering the place so that you can easily tell where you've been by the blood-stained remains. First aid kits can be found to recharge your energy and you'll need it with all these nutters on your trail, you can also steal the food left behind by the sentries.

Hiding away amongst all this chaos is Phoenix with a large gun and ready to shoot when you come into view. He'll take a bit more of a pounding before he legs it this time so make sure that he doesn't get off lightly.

Later on into the game there's another tunnel section to play, this time inside the CryoPrison. The prison is an impressive building with circular halls and Spartan must find his way to the bottom of the central rotunda where Phoenix is defrosting more cryo-cons. There's a dramatic rotating view of the middle level rotunda in this stage which is closely followed by the final showdown with Phoenix.

he release of Demolition Man on the 3DO sets a new standard for movie tie-in console games. The programmers and game designers have made good use of the original footage from the movie as between level sequences. These set the scene for the next section in a way that no SNES or Mega Drive could ever immitate.

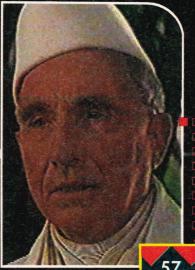

WILD WEAPONS

oth Spartan and Phoenix have an Impressive collection of weapons to use against each other. Most of them were found in the museum of 2032 as the people in this futuristic place no longer have to worry about crime or violence. Here's a brief explanation and breakdown of which are the most powerful weapons for both characters.

- **Stun baton:** This weapon creates a sphere of electrical discharge when fired. It looks like a plasma ball.
- Scretta: A fast weapon with an infinite range and ammunition what more could you want?
- **Shotgun:** Its blast widens as it travels across any distance and each pellet will inflict a small amount of damage.
- **Machine gun:** This gives a rapid fire when the trigger is held down or small sourts if you twitch.
- Flame-thrower: Holding the trigger causes flame to shoot out and letting go sucks it back in again. Victims stay on fire once they've been blasted.
- **Rocket Launcher:** This inflicts a truly massive amount of damage on its target but it has a slow fire rate.

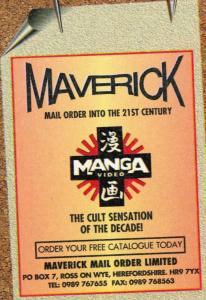

ack in 1987 the arcades were buzzing with the new range of arcade machines from Sega. Superb games like Outrun, Enduro Racer and Hang-On were instant hits. Then there came a fantastic game in a special hydraulic cabinet for ultimate airborne realism.

After Burner took arcade shoot'em-ups to another dimension with state of the art graphics and a huge sense of achievement when the enemy is blasted out of the sky. The advanced graphics chips and processors in the new Sega Mega Drive 32X can now create arcade perfect conversions of all the old Sega coin-ops and After Burner is the first one to be released.

The game is a fast and frantic shoot'em-up where the player takes control of a wicked air combat plane. The opening sequences show the plane taking off from the Sega carrier and blasting out into the open skies. It's not long before a barrage of planes zoom into view and, armed with machine guns and missiles, there's lots of blasting to be done.

There are many zones to fly through and clear of enemies, each with different terrain to fly over and many obstacles to dodge. A trip through the grand canyon needs pin-point flying if you're to survive and there are electricity pylons to weave around later on in the game.

To make a break from the action sequences you must also dock with a refuelling plane to fill your tanks and stock up on ammunition. There's also an air strip where the plane will automatically land. Keep an eye out for the *Outrun* car and *Hang-On* motorbike whizzing past as your plane lands on the tarmac.

Games players who know their stuff will remember the excitement of the arcade machine back in 1987 and should be thrilled by the chance to play a perfect conversion in

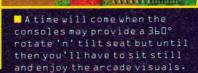

efore you shout out 'but it's just a golf game, innit?' Tee-Off! may just change your mind. It has been designed as a golf videogame, not a golf simulation and, with a friendly and simple control system, it's got all the 'pick up and play' appeal of those popular coin-op golf games.

Split into two parts, Amateur and Professional, *Tee-Off!* is made up of four courses of eighteen holes (two amateur and two professional courses). The game defaults to two Amateur courses and it isn't possible to access the Professional courses at the start of the game - like in a standard coin-op you must complete a game level successfully to progress to

Although it is in the arcade mould, Core have still given you the opportunity to load a saved game in one of six slots in the Mega Drive 32X version and, with a simultaneous fourplayer option, it's also got more interaction than you'll find in your average arcade game.

Visually, everything is there for the player on-screen so he/she won't have to keep on popping to options screens or special screens to select the direction, club or check out the

position of the green as the main game screen features an overhead map and a text message (which is also spoken). There's also a flag icon showing where the hole is, an arrow showing where you're aiming, a wind speed indicator, a circular power bar and 'play' icons. These icons give you plenty of information about such things as the lie of the ball, your club choice, the caddie's advice, the player who is currently selected and the distance to the flag.

Each course is modelled and rendered in full 3D with remarkable speed and smoothness and they are shown from three specific camera angles during play depending on whether you're driving, chipping or putting. At the tee-off the camera is behind the player, when chipping the camera is angled above the player sprite and when putting it floats directly above, panning along the ball, and zooming in on the cup before the ball drops. If you find this 3D landscape a trifle flat, players will be able to choose the height, surface they wish to play on out of flat, normal, hills or 'just plain crazy'. Each hole starts with the usual smart FMV fly-through, showing the on-screen player sprite driving a ball into the hole.

The number of options on offer are quite varied, you can even adjust the driving, chipping and putting statistics of each of the four player sprites to your own preferences. You can practice, indulge in either a tournament, skins match or match play and you can even try your luck with three special options; the Derby Scramble, a Shoot Out or the ingenious Core challenge.

The Tournament is played over 72 holes (four rounds of 18) on the normal courses with 60 computergenerated golfers and up to four of your friends. At the end of the first round the top 48 golfers go through to the next stage. Skins is played over an 18 hole course with two to four players competing for the prize money designated for each hole. To win the money, you need to win the hole outright by getting a lower score than every one of the other players. If it's a tie, the money is carried over to the next hole.

Match play involves four groups of two players competing against each other over three rounds. After each round the losers are eliminated. In Derby Scramble the four players are split into two teams of two and play one round of 18

holes. From the tee the player whose ball has travelled the furthest must let his team-mate hit the ball (with the players in the opposing team also swapping balls). These ball swapping antics continue until the hole is won, with the first team to hole their balls being victorious.

In a Shoot Out, four players compete against each other over three holes, with one player being eliminated at the end of each hole until there are only two players left at the third and final hole. In the event of a tie, a single-shot tie-breaker is played between the players with the equal highest scores and the player furthest from the hole is eliminated. The game also features a Core Challenge which should allow you to win a prize by filling in a card with the game, putting on a password, and waiting to see if you win the yet to-be disclosed prize. **2** 0P3

Due for release early in 1995, Tee-Off! is looking like a real romper stomper of a golf game and, with Sony PlayStation and Sega Saturn versions on the way prepare for some very tasty ball bashing action.

ollowing the incredible success of Road Rash on the 3DO, Electronic Arts are going international with the latest instalment in their high-powered motor bike saga, Road Rash III: World Warriors. Featuring the same high quality digitised video graphic technology as its CD cousin and using the EA ASIC chip for the first time, Rash fans can look forward to the third game in the series being the

most realistic racing experience yet.

This time out, players get to race against the meanest Rashers from all over the world. Throttle back up the German autobahns, punch and kick your way over slippery Kenyan dirt tracks and trash your opponents on Japanese highways. The seven new locations may mean that the scenarios are different but the basic rules of the game remain the same.. there are none. Only a display of gutsy riding and speedy punching will ensure that you cross that

finishing line first.

Electronic Arts have also ensured that Road Rash III is not just the most realistic version of the title to date but it's also the meanest. If an opposing rider has been knocked off his bike, the player now has the option of stealing his machine whilst he rolls incapacitated on the floor. Even better, if it is you who has had the misfortune of being trashed, you no longer have to run helplessly back to your bike whilst

everyone else zips past. You can 'clothesline' rival bikers a la WWF and tug them onto the concrete - that'll teach 'em for taking advantage of your misfortune! Even going broke doesn't stop your brutal fun this time around, Road Rash III features a handy 'Snitch' option. You can 'grass up' rival bikers to the local law enforcement officers to help them catch some of the most wanted racers. This will get you that much needed dosh, but it's sure to annoy your fellow Rashers.

But don't be fooled into thinking you'll get everything your own way. Enemy bikers now have their own individual and variable aggression factors and the police don't just roll up on their bikes for you to cosh. They now employ helicopters to chase Rashers and try to knock them off and have even set up road blocks that can only be passed by jumping, Evil Kneivel style.

Despite utilising many of the techniques perfected in the 3DO version, and even keeping some of the animated and reactive roadside objects, Road Rash III has been careful to keep the impressive two-player split-screen mode that allows for simultaneous headto-head racing. A new option even allows the players to challenge each other to race for 'pinks', just like in 'Grease' (for people who didn't see that movie, 'pinks' are motor vehicle ownership papers, so the winner gets to keep the loser's bike)

Road Rash III: World Warriors is a big hunk of brutal biking action that takes high speed combat off the mean streets and puts it back on console.

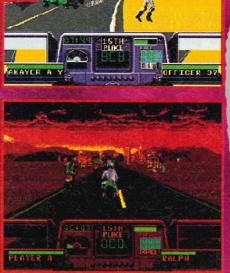

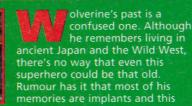

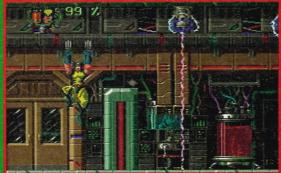

orget that runt Scrappy, this is the real McCoy. Team up Scooby with Shaggy and bring in the Mystery Machine gang of Velma, Freddy and Daphne. This is a platformer with a difference, a platformer with more puzzle features than you can shake a scary monster costume at.

You take control of Shaggy and Scooby together. Although they don't function independently they certainly look different – Scooby skulking about and Shaggy ambling around with his customary lurch. The other members of the

gang aren't controlled but can be consulted by the scaredy duo about different aspects of the game.

Velma, Freddy and Daphne appear to wander about randomly but they have set tasks to perform. Velma is the brains of the outfit and the player must find her to verify objects as clues and as Scoobs and Shaggy can only carry three items you will have to visit her frequently. However, she doesn't have any info on what items will keep the nasties at bay.

Freddy is generally seen as the leader. This suave, cravat-wearing golden boy splits up the team and shows them maps of the area. You'll also need his help to set up traps for the assailants which are created step-

by-step in *The Incredible Machine* fashion. Daphne, bless her, is monster fodder – just like in the original cartoon – there only to provide Scooby Snacks to ease the frightometer and follow the duo aimlessly until she encounters a monster or falls foul of a trap.

All the members of the Scooby gang make their first appearance during the introduction to each of the four episode-like levels. These intros are a short sequence of animations that set the scene bolstered later on with text dialogue (once you are familiar with the episode you can skip the intro).

The four different levels start off in

a Haunted House. Next stop is the scary swamp in prime fishing country, where Shaggy and Scoob talk about tasty fish dishes until they come across a swamp beast dripping with black slime. Then there's the Haunted Fun Fair that's haunted by a ghost clown, or is it? There's even a Pirate Ship episode set in an area notorious for ship wrecks where a spectral pirate ship roams near a sunken galleon packed with treasure.

Traps are also spread around, varying from the ghostly hand from behind the curtain to a trap door or a falling chandelier. There are plenty of monsters who can cause Frightometer damage and have to

sing the Super Nintendo's FX chip and an updated version of the 3D system used in games like Starfox, FX Fighter is the working title for the new combat game from American publishers GTE Interactive that's being developed at the moment in London by Argonaut, the people behind Sony's Vortex.

Set in the far-off future, man has developed space travel to the point where he now populates a number of planets. He has also finally realised that he is not alone, in fact there are a large number of intelligent life-forms living all over the galaxy. This is most evident in the Aycul System, where each planet has its own dominant species. But when humans arrived and introduced inter-planetary travel the races did not mix well. To avoid nasty conflicts between them, a cultural and trading agreement was reached known as the Accord. Part of the agreement stated that no competitions between the planets should be promoted, as these might bring the racial tensions between them to the surface once again.

Surprise, surprise, an underground contest developed between the planets and, despite attempts by the authorities to stamp it out, nothing could stop the fighters from competing to find out just who is the ultimate warrior. After five years of the competition being funded by a criminal cartel, a group of renegade scientists known as the Cadre took the sport by storm with their Mk0 cyborg, Kwondo. As controllers of the supreme champion, the Cadre now run the whole event from their base on the system's third planet, Anarchis. Relaxing all the contest's rules, fatalities have become a commonplace occurrence with the organisers claiming the fallen fighters' bodies. However, the contest thrives as the victor will now be given all of the Cadre's impressive scientific resources to use for their own gain. The offer of such power draws a regular flow of fighters to Anarchis to try to earn the right to fight against Kwondo, and that's where you come in..

The game itself contains 13 fighters, one for each planet, although you can only choose to play as one of twelve. The thirteenth fighter is Kwondo, the ultimate boss.

The action is very reminiscent of Virtua Fighter, with camera angles swooping in and out and the perspective constantly changing to follow the action. A team of three animators are working around the clock with motion capture packages to ensure that all of the fighters' moves are realistic and as fluid as possible and, although it is still early days yet, it is hoped that each combatant will have between 20 and 30 individual special moves. They also each have their own rendered arena that reflects their planet of origin.

The fighters are a weird bunch of alien beings and range from Magnon, a bulky lava dwelling lifeform, to Terak the lizard man who appears to be a large crocodile stood on his hind legs. There are also more humanoid fighters like Jake, an ex-bodyguard and Kiko, a female warrior, but Argonaut are still not sure exactly which characters will be appearing in the final game and at the moment are having new artists' impressions made of many of the warriors.

FX Fighter features all the usual fight game options (like versus and tournament modes) and, at the moment the developers are even looking into the possibility of producing a revolutionary new league championship, so that multiple players can compete against each other over a number of fights to determine just who really is the champion.

We should also see FX Fighter appearing on the PC, Sony PlayStation and Ultra 64 in the not 71 too distant future and will of course endeavour to keep you informed as and when they appear. You will have to wait until the second quarter of 1995 before you can get your hands on the SNES version, but until it appears here is a selection of pictures that should give you a good idea of the amazing graphics that

you can look forward to.



Crazy Chase is, as you might expect, a chase that's, well, a bit unhinged. The six levels are viewed from a 45° angle and, starting at the top of the screen, you must run down the path trying to overtake a burning fuse while avoiding the various traps and bombs that will damage you. At the bottom of the level is a bridge that is the only way to reach the next level. Being cunning as well as evil, Blackjack has planted a bomb on the bridge that will explode if you don't kick it away from the end of the fuse in time. If you thought that this was the only challenge then you'd be wrong as you have to collect a specimen of each of the four suits found on playing cards (a diamond, a heart, a spade and a club). If you get to the end and haven't collected all four then you'll have to do the entire level again. The four suit icons are found in balloons scattered throughout each level. Some balloons contain coins and health power-ups while others have nasty bombs that blow you up, or booby-trapped weights that fall on your head and squash you.

As you run down the hill to halt the imminent explosion, you also have to contend with logs that fall behind you and other obstacles like walls and hurdles that are designed to slow you down. On the town level there are pedestrian crossings with cars hurtling across them (collisions are not only harmful but they also waste precious time). On the Ice level there are blocks of ice that come smashing through walls to knock you off the slippery walkway. Stopping on this level is tough as you tend to slide all over the place.

Not only are there the six normal levels that get progressively harder, but there are a few bonus games to add extra fun. That old classic *Mole Chase* is here but, instead of moles, Blackjack's head popular ready to be bashed into the ground – very satisfying! There's also an air-puck game where you have to shoot a puck into the computer's goal as well as a level where you're falling and have to collect coins and extra time icons on the way down.

Crazy Chase is only available on import at the moment but should be released over here by Nintendo early next year. Until then you're just going to have to wait, maybe you too could learn to

juggle, just like we at Games World have.

uper Punch Out!! is basically an old arcade game that had you punching the living daylights out of various soft, hard and psychotic opponents. It's a step up from earlier games like Frank Bruno's Boxing, which had you there only in wireframe form.

Super Punch Out!! is part of the recent trend towards revamping games and giving them plush new graphics, Punch Out has had a SNES facelift and been turned into Super Punch Out!! Like so many of Nintendo's games, SPO!! has a set path leading into each game. After entering your name and then choosing your own array of keys – three are needed, one for left and right punch and then one for your special attack – you choose your mode. To begin with you can only enter the Minor championship, but after beating the four fighters (three contenders and a champion) you get to go to progress onto the Major championship and then, if your jaw holds out, the World championships.

Fighting them is easy, beating them is a different matter. There are a few moves that you can do to evade punches including stepping to the left and right and also ducking below on-coming punches. If you're going

to win then you will need to have mastered all of these moves as well as coming up with some nifty combinations of your own.

The first few fighters on the Minor circuit shouldn't pose too much of a problem for you but once you've graduated to the Major tour, things start getting rougher as the fighters become nastier and have all sorts of vicious moves. Dragon Chan, one of the later fighters, uses kicks as well as punches to take you down and proves a very troublesome opponent.

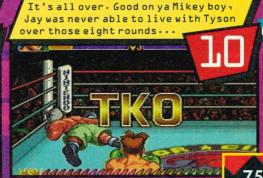

hose of you who are familiar with Mean Bean Machine have already experienced the intense frustration as you frantically twist endless pairs of beans pouring onto the screen. 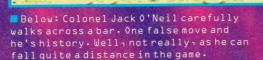

Essentially, the player gets a limited number of laps in qualifying where variables like the wing set-up, fuel load, gear box ratios and overall engine power can be changed. Things like gearbox ratios are quite important as you'll need different acceleration and straight-line speed on different tracks. There will also be an open practice if you're still not too sure about qualifying. Pitstops have yet to be implemented at present but in these you'll be able to change such things as dry to wet tyres and damaged nose cones.

The program should be just about finished by the end of the year but Teque aren't resting on their laurels, as they already have a Jag-CD version planned for release by Easter featuring such specials as cinepak graphics, FMV, and fully rendered sequences of the circuits using the same track data found in the game and not some top-down perspective of something drawn beforehand that may not capture

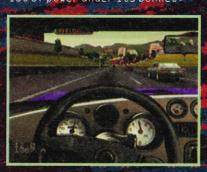

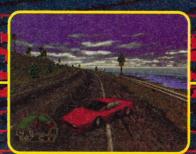

The Need For Speed is the latest game from EA that gives you high-octane action (like Road Rash which was released earlier this year), letting you race high performance cars against other drivers and the cops around some scenic towns and valleys. this game it often does, as you collide with other cars causing massive pile-ups as yet more on coming drivers run straight into you.

Being on the 3DO there's the potential to show lovely FMV clips of these highly polished, throbbing beasts being put through their paces around countryside and skid-pan track-

believe us, there are loads of these gratuitous scenes everywhere you look.

You can choose any car you like out of the eight sleek super cars on display, then decide to race them around one of three different tracks. If you think that a car doesn't have the right HP (horsepower to those in the know), listen to the beautifully worded appraisal of the car. A salesman-type guy tells you all about the machine of your choice – he could make a clapped out Capri sound like a Jag. If you also want to see the car being put through its paces then press the C button, sit back and take in the sight of a real, live FMV Lamborghini Diablo going flat out between a line of nicely placed orange road cones.

The actual game itself is similar to Road Rash and uses the same sort of graphics to create the road and backgrounds. While not having the lightning-quick acceleration of your average motorbike, the cars gradually run up through the gears until you reach top peed. However, the tracks aren't all straight lines and the curves and on coming traffic will surely have something to say when it comes to clocking-up the best times, so some nifty driving is called for when racing against the clock or the CPU.

With the recent praise that Road Rash has received, The Need for Speed looks likely to become one of those original games that really do show off the 3DO's abilities. It certainly makes a change from drooling all over the shiny windows down at your local Ferrari garage

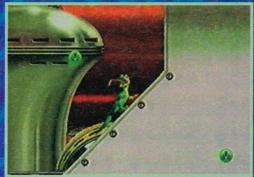

onsidered by many to be the most playable soccer game on the SNES, its imminent arrival on the 3DO will be seen as a blessing. But this is no direct port over from the SNES version, it has been rebagged from scratch especially to use the power of the 3DO – and redesigned completely over the past 12 months by Rage in Birmingham with all-new intelligence routines and a fancy graphics engine.

Striker 3DO will contain two game types, arcade and simulation. Arcade is more of the straightforward fast arcade action of the SNES game, but the simulation game is where this version comes into its own. The simulation game attempts to be the first footy game where realism

is paramount. Offering more control, more realistic kicks and passes, a wider choice of headers, a one-touch pass feature and a new volley that makes the ball fly like a streak of lightning. It's designed so that spectacular goals come from hard work rather than understanding goalie routines. In Simulation mode collision detection is on all the time so that you can barge while racing for the ball and elbow somebody in an off-the-ball incident – it also allows for dinking around the opposition properly.

One of the most innovative aspects of this realism is the control of the goal keepers. Unlike other soccer games the goalie can run out in one-on-one situations and try to narrow the angle. He'll also come out for corners and set-pieces to

punch or parry the ball away.

Off-the-ball intelligence is also massively revamped as CPU players usually mark the attacking team man for man. Both the CPU and your CPU controlled team mates run into space and call for the ball (they actually shout) and, like the real thing, full backs overlap and come up forward so that you need to learn where they are before they befuddle your defence. Striker will even have a full contingent of referees and linesmen and the linesmen will keep up with the last defender on the screen - yes, you will be able to play that annoying off-side trap if you really want to! But beware, all of the FIFA directives will be implemented.

Unlike FIFA, there is one in-game viewpoint from above and down the

pitch although the camera does comes up behind the play. For instance, in the event of a throw-in or free kick the camera comes down behind the character involved in the play. There are also four camera viewpoints for action replays. One is set high above the stadium in a Blimp, one is a TV-like panning camera that centres on the goal and the fun one is the view from right behind the scorer's shoulder.

Each of the team's 24 players have individual strengths and weaknesses (a total of twenty five abilities per character) so each players has stats for the speed of their tackles, sprints, foul and tackle recovery, shooting strength and even their height and weight (which could well affect how high they jump and shrug off tackles). The stats also

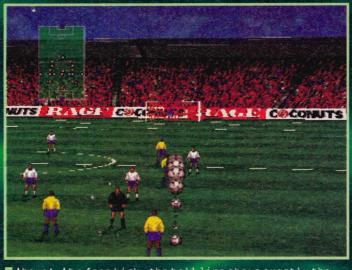

include each player's skin and hair colour – a total of over 35,000 pieces of information – as accurate as they can cram onto the CD!

The stadia are all different and you will be able to play on five or six types of pitch and different grass types, mostly rendered along with the flags and scoreboard for that professional feel. The pitch too is graded and even the weather conditions also have a part to play in the gameplay with the actual ground and air resistance being taken into account.

There are in excess of 1500 different frames of animations in *Striker 3DO*, boiling down to the running action involving 12 animations and even a simple throw-in using 14! All of the sprites are digitised images from actual

players. The intro sequences are worked on a Silicon Graphics set of the stadium selected, and you get cinepack routines with menus over the top with different animations depending on the stadium.

Even stats aficionado's should be kept happy as *Striker* 3DO will feature a full and remarkably indepth match analysis after the fact, including percentages on the headers attempted and how many were successful.

Although there is, as yet, no publisher for *Striker 3DO* in Europe, Coconuts are handling it in the United States and Japan, for release early in 1995. It will feature 64 teams, including all of the World cups teams, plus a few additions ones like England and Japan. It looks simply marvellous.

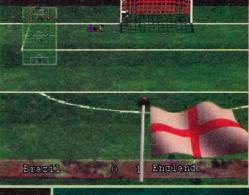
