ot news from Atari is news that Sega have purchased an 8% stake in Atari stock worth in excess of \$40 million and must also pay around \$50 million for around 70 Atari hardware patents. This patent legal argument is at the crux of the matter as Atari have suits against numerous companies (including Nintendo) for using their copyrighted hardware

and specialised software algorithms. Sega's main breach of patent is via its use of the 9pin controller socket, which is the same as the original Atari joystick port and a patent controlling the way in which videogame action moves across the screen.

Atari, of course, are well chuffed as this adds much-needed wonga to their coffers in time for their big Christmas marketing push, especially as the company made huge losses last year in the region of \$48 million whereas Sega made a profit in excess of \$400 million. More importantly for Atari, it paves the way forward to enter the juicy Japanese market with its new pal, Sega.

The best news for Atari concerning their new Sega link-up is joint software development, three games are already blue-printed for Atari with major games products like the *Virtua* series, *Daytona* and *Sonic* for the Jaguar whilst hit Jag games like *Tempest 2000* and hit Atari arcade titles will be transferred to the Sega systems.

Sega may not have really wanted to part with their hard earned dosh

ore Design, Derby based software house and game development maestros are certainly moving with the times. Although they won't abandon the Amiga and Mega Drive/Mega-CD platforms from which they have rightly earned their reputation, they are now pushing ahead with Sega Mega Drive 32X, Saturn and Sony PlayStation development. **Games World: The Magazine** was invited up to check out their latest development in their swish Victorian offices.

Tee-Off! will be their first for the next generation of games machines. MORTAL KOMBAT II SHATTERS RECORDS

ortal Kombat II has broken all videogames records with global sales of over \$50 million in its first week. The total surpasses the opening weeks receipts for such summer movie blockbusters as The Mask, True Lies and The Lion King. Of course, it should be remembered that Mortal Kombat II was backed by a huge £7million global marketing spend and a copy of the game costs quite a bit more than a cinema ticket but, nevertheless, it is an impressive statistic.

This is so novel that we wondered what the Core development team were talking about and it's such a brave venture that it needs to be applauded even if the game won't raise its bizarre looking features until Christmas. Christmas next year. This Saturn and PlayStation specific gem is known as the Swag Man and it will take childhood nightmares to another plane of existence.



The Swagman is the Prince of Nightmares who creeps through the dreamworld of the night on liquorice legs, warping good and pleasant thoughts from children's dreams and bringing them visions of monsters, trolls and shadowy corners. Now he's taking all the pleasant dreams away and leaving strange and bitter nightmares for those pesky kids. When asleep you feel yourself awake in a parallel dream universe, your town takes on a strange warped appearance and the Swagman and friends are wandering around performing all kinds of nasty antics.

Very Tim Burton-esque in visual style (which is looking weird already) warping the perspective completely in the background and adding the 40 fully rendered game characters. Core are really pushing this with two programmers and three artists on the project. A role-playing adventure game of sorts with the occasional bit of platform action, this may sound hackneyed but, believe us, this is something completely new. As it is going to be a CD-based game there will be an animated film intro and FMV, which will be integral to the game. Strange stuff, but it looks like this could well be the next generation of game for the next generation of machines.

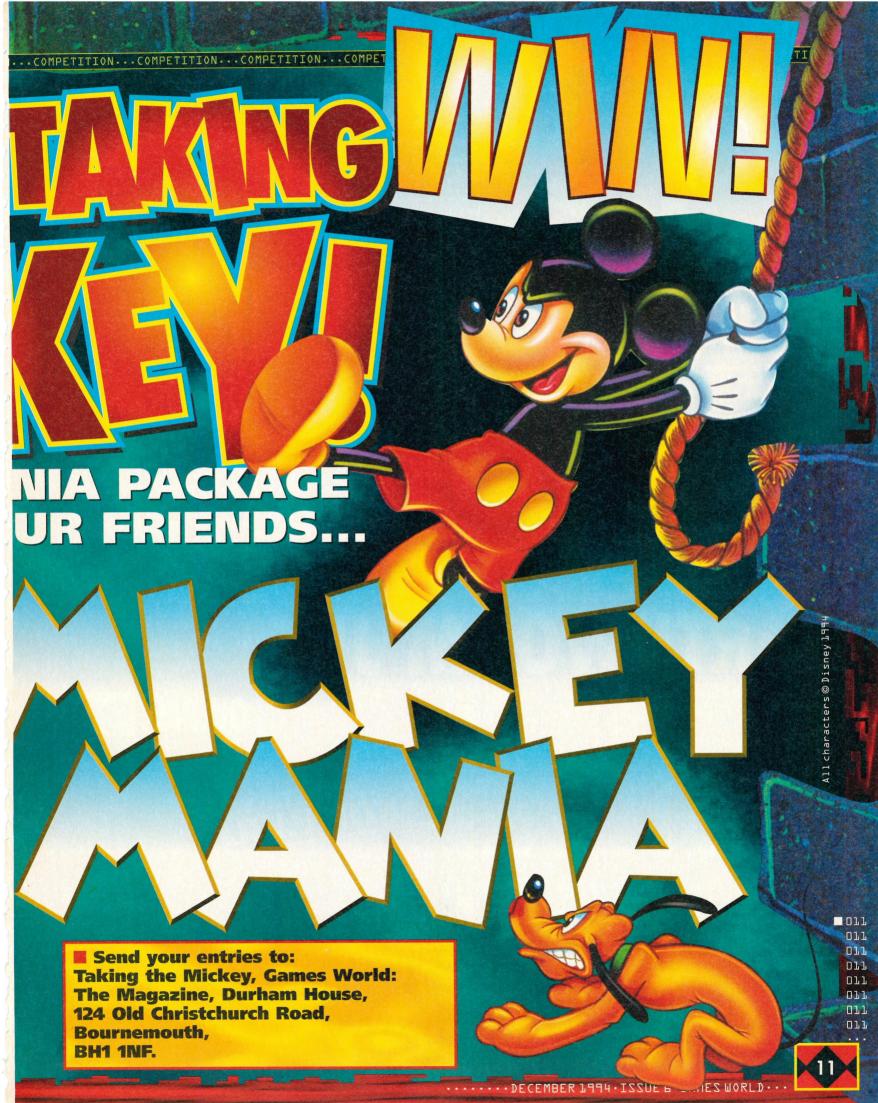
SHORTS

- New lads on the scene, BMG have some very interesting products on the horizon. Forgetting for a moment that they handle such big 3DO titles as Samurai Shodown and Gex, and some of the hottest PC CD-ROM and Mega-CD titles, they also have some strangies for January. Games World:

 The Magazine will leave the titles for you to mull over, get ready for Head Candy and Virtual Graceland. Eeeek!
- The great *Rise of the Robots* roundabout continues with Acclaim, the publishers of *Mortal Kombat II* and *NBA Jam*, jumping on the spinner and grabbing the SNES rights for Europe and intending to publish the game for its December release date. What we want to know is, will the game ever be released or will it simply pass from publisher to publisher?
- JVC are becoming a major force in the computer and videogaming world, with some big products like Ghoul Patrol, Return of the Jedi and Indiana Jones' Greatest Adventures. We just thought you'd like to know that the games will be published by JVC and not LucasArts, who programmed them, or Virgin, who distributes them although they will be published in the UK by Virgin, who aren't... Confused? Well we just thought we'd put the matter straight as we have had a number of calls. Now we're confused.
- Help II, the annual charity game compilation is to be released again in time for Christmas with some major (albeit pretty old) games. The Help II compilations will be a ten title CD-ROM at £39.99, a six game Amiga bundle at £29.99 and, exclusive to Dixons, a Mega Drive triple pack at £29.99. At the time of going to press the exact games for each pack haven't been finalised.
- Whoever says consoles were bad for you had better take it up with the Royal College of Surgeons! They've received ten Super Nintendos after a plea by the Minimal Access Therapy Unit, pioneers of keyhole surgery techniques, as they improve the hand-eye co-ordination required for this surgical method. We think they just wanted to play *Mario* instead of studying anatomy!
- Ocean, one of the few remaining large independent British software houses have had a big chunk of it bought by the massive French multinational conglomerate Chargeurs, whose main interests in cinema, film production and TV (they own a large part of BSkyB). The deal, believed to be worth in excess of \$20 million, will mean a massive increase in Ocean's cash resources to compete with the 'big boys' and super publishers whilst maintaining their independence in favour of selling-out or going public. They will probably have more of an upper hand with film licences too.
- ELSPA, the game industry's governing body has produced a Games Players' Charter, found in a new leaflet 'A Parents' Guide to Computer and Video Games' with two million being distributed towards the peak Christmas selling period. Full of common sense info, addressing the benefits of games, addiction, epilepsy, ratings and whether it will make you violent or not, it's worth a read anyway.
- Philips have started to release Video CD at the same time as sell-through VHS, starting with The Firm last month, they intend to make it a regular commitment. They have also signed up a deal with VCI (Video Collection International) to join other Video-CD licensees Paramount, MGM, UA, Orion and Polygram. The VCI licence will allow Phillips to promote some of the best of British comedy on the CD-i like Mr Bean, Smith and Jones, Have I got news for you and, err, Sooty! Brill.

f you haven't come across the crazy Animaniacs family before you're probably wondering what on earth in going on! What are they? Who are they? And why do they look like puppies?

Well, the trio are fresh from the imagination of the Warner Bros animators and Steven Spielberg. They're hilariously hip and absolutely bonkers and they've got their very own TV show that's screened on Children's ITV every Saturday morning.

The three are inseparable, going everywhere and doing everything together. They've all got their own catch phrases too. They started out as throw-away gags in the cartoon but will soon be seen in the shops adorning all kinds of merchandising to cash in on the cartoon's success.

Let's take a look at these three cuddly toons...

> akko is a born leader and tends to take over from the others whenever he can. He's a fast talker and an ideal big brother, always looking out for the other two. He takes the lead role in one Animaniacs adventure

after another and is the character that you start out with in this barmy game.

Catch phrases Yakko has got landed with are 'I like him, don't you?', 'Time Out!' and the one that he shares with his little bro, 'Hello nurse'. This gets shouted whenever the Warner Bros staff nurse comes along or a pretty girl is in a scene.

There are no major differences between the characters in the game but Yakko is always a handy one to have around, being taller than the other two. When faced with a particularly high platform to reach you can jump into a stack and use Yakko to get that extra bit of height.

The original game had just three tracks and one type of car, but that has been changed to add two new

tracks and two new cars. The tracks that have remained the same are the Big Forest track that is simple and for the beginner driver, the Bay Bridge area that gives a more challenging ride and finally the Acropolis that is a tough challenge even for the pro driver. The two new tracks that have been included to add some extra longevity to the game are Highland and Sand Park. You'll have to put in a fair few laps before you can get to grips with their twisty corners and faster competition. Apart from the Formula One design, there will be a Stock Car (similar to the cars in Daytona Racing) and also a Prototype car that is sleek in design and very quick. Both of these are exclusive to the Mega Drive 32X and won't be found in

any other games.

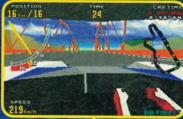

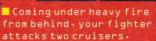

he latest version of Star Wars has you flying an X-Wing through Imperial territory either by yourself, or with the capable assistance of a friend doubling up as your gunner. You're not actually Luke Skywalker or any of his associates, but think yourself lucky that you're on the right side. There are two versions included on the new MD 32X cartridge, one is the

original arcade game and the other is the new and improved MD 32X version that features harder gameplay and more features. Both games feature four levels that are designed to test your reflexes as a pilot as they're full of Imperial TIE fighters ready to blast you into space dust.

If you play the original game then you'll get just that, the arcade version in all its glory. Starting off in your weedy X-Wing with just your lasers and proton torpedoes, you must defeat 20 TIE fighters before your eight shields get depleted, or the time limit expires. The first level will take a while to get used to as TIE fighters aren't weaving in and out in front of you – the sneaky blighters are hovering behind you. You'll have to slow right down using your brakes and let them fly out ahead of you. If you get a lock on them, fire a torpedo, if not just shoot them with your lasers.

Later levels in the game let you fly around the surface of the Death Star while trying to defeat yet more

hovering TIE fighters and shootingup power structures that are dotted around the surface. While playing, you can fly anywhere you like. There are a few sections where there is a predetermined flight-path but you can still fly about to avoid missiles and obstacles. Most of the time you can go wherever you like, so long as you get the job done.

The 32X's movement is just as quick as if you were playing on a high-end PC – and just like the PC, there's loads of blood and guts spilled all over the floor.

There are a couple of differences that set this first console version apart from the PC version, one is the way that the game's laid out. The original has three chapters with 10 levels each, on the 32X the levels flow straight through, one after

another (more like Doom 2 on the PC). You'll also discover that in places the long-distance graphics are not quite as clear as on PC but this adds to the illusion of depth. However, all the familiar sprites are here ready to drain away your energy if you don't blast them with the shotgun first.

Warning: Some people may find this game, not just offensive, but plain old addictive. Could this next generation games machine spawn a whole new generation of *Doomaholics?* Seek help immediately or, alternatively, look forward to some top pump-action action.

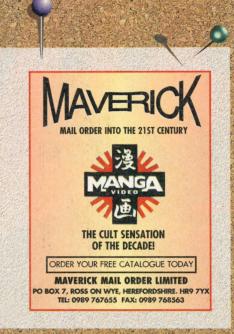

here can't be many fun-loving people out there who haven't at some time or other dreamed about running their own theme park. Buying the rides they would like to ride on, putting up stalls selling their favourite foods and setting the speed and height of the roller-coasters to suit their individual tastes. Well, now it can all come true for console thrill-seekers with the ingenious *Theme Park*.

Starting out with nothing but an empty piece of land and an entrance, everything in the park must be created from scratch. Pathways have to be placed around the land and then trees, bushes, lakes and fences can be put in to split the park area up into different sections – only then can the rides, shops and facilities be selected.

The size and excitement factor of the rides you can put into your park depends on the money that you have at your disposal. On your first game you'll be lucky if you can afford a bouncy castle or two but start making lots of money from these and you can do research into bigger rides and start to really develop your park. As well as being able to put the rides and shops anywhere you like you can also adjust the settings on each. The speed of the pirate ship can be increased, for example, but take care not to go too fast or you'll have people flying out! The sweetness of the ice cream can also be altered, as can the salt in the chips. Watch out though, meddling about with the food usually results in your punters being sick, meaning you'll have to invest in more toilets to cope with the overload!

The game started out life on the PC and was so involving and unique that a console version seemed far from plausible. But with a team of top programmers, artists and developers behind it, this Mega Drive version is looking excellent.

There are of course some differences in the Mega Drive version of the game, good and bad. Unfortunately, you can't save out any of your creations like you can with the home computer versions although you can save to battery back-up the amount of money made from the sale of your parks and the level you have reached in the game, so all is not lost. Features unique to the console versions include even more rides to choose from. There are now 27 in total, four of which are user definable (the roller coaster, car ride, mono rail and water ride). The system of researching into each ride before you can buy it has been simplified so that it's easier to build more ambitious attractions and there are now different landscapes for each of the 24 locations around the world.

Bullfrog have created a game that will make many console gamer's dreams come true. As in the world of *Theme Park*, capture the hearts of the punters and you're well away.

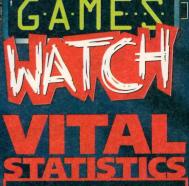

In the normal course of events if you kick the bucket, you're left for a worm feast – but not in Core's Skeleton Krew. A company conspicuously known as DEAD Inc have taken up the business of body reanimation but the by-products of this aren't at all like Casper the ghost – friendly they ain't!

EAD Inc, standing for Deadly Enforcement Aggressive Destruction Incorporated, has taken over an ageing cryogenics plant on the outskirts of Monstro City. Strangely enough, bizarre and horrific cryogenic mutations start appearing in the streets and before long the city finds itself under siege from these creatures known simply as Psykogenix.

Special military teams are dispatched to clean up the mess

but they are all slaughtered by the deadly Psyko Machine. Families are upset, mass panic sets in and drastic measures are called for. But what do you do? Of course, in the year 2062 you can always call upon the services of the Skeleton Krew, a band of morbid mercenaries who believe that they can handle absolutely any death and death situation.

The Skeleton Krew (not renegades from Mortal Kombat) are made up of three diverse characters with their own stats; speed, power level,

constitution, weapon selection and individual specialities. These three Krew members are a vegetarian's nightmare going by the names of Rib, Joint and Spine, they're about as undead as the DEAD Inc minions.

Choosing one or two from the three Krew members, you'll find yourself travelling through six massive levels in locations as diverse as Earth, Venus, Mars and the Psyko Machine-formed Psykogenesis planet. With a severe and well designed difficulty curve, this game certainly won't be a push over, peaking at the end of the sixth level

where you come face to face with the dreaded Psyko Machine itself.

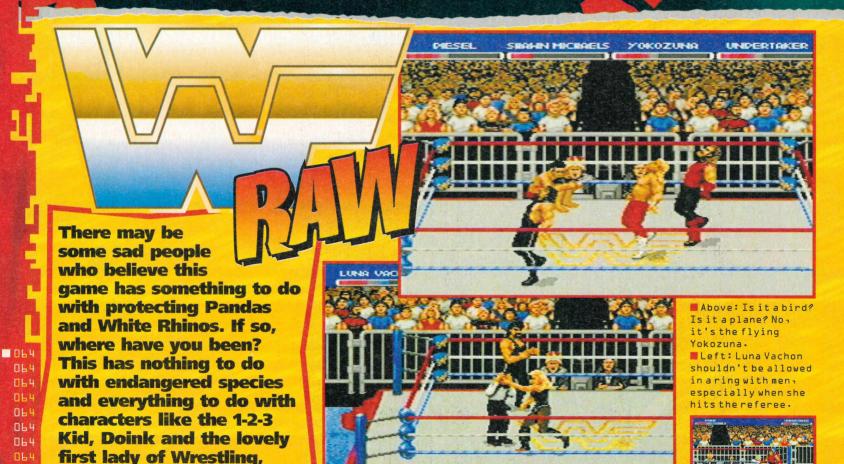

ased on the ever-popular Monday Night Raw series of the World Wrestling Federation TV Shows (which can be seen on Games World's TV channel, Sky One) this no-holds barred wrestling frenzy is on a bigger scale than anything you'll have seen before.

Stuffed onto a 24 Mbit cart, it should offer plenty more space to cram in more moves than any of its previous two award-winning predecessors. It may look very similar but there are some of the newer WWF All-Stars to play like Owen Hart, Diesel, Doink, the 1-2-3 Kid and the lady from 'the other side of darkness', Luna Vachon. There are plenty of new moves added too, like Belly to Belly Suplexes, Overhead Tosses, Crucifixes and Rag

Dolls - not forgetting all the WWF's all-star signature moves

There are far more combat options to choose from when compared to the previous two wrestling games, Royal Rumble and Super Wrestlemania, with the addition of a more extensive tag team theme, like a four-player tag-team tournament, 'gang fighting' mode (where you can attack anyone you like) and a co-operative tag-team event which employs both members of a team.

Now all of the wrestlers are varied with the addition of four attributes; strength, stamina, speed and weight. These all affect the way that the wrestlers feel and act through the joypad – as you are trying to recover from a pin or a splash you get the chance to alter the amount of damage inflicted and avoid the follow-up signature manoeuvres.

The players have more interaction in the ring, outside it and with items around it – like a chair and bucket, you can even slam your opponent's head into the bell! Now you can also climb any of the four turnpikes and execute superhuman 'mega moves' like Blur-Speed Clotheslines, Whips out of the ring and Earthquake Mat-Splashes with a few secret key presses.

There will be no claims of fight fixing in this WWF romp as, just like its TV show namesake, 'anything can happen'. With all the best attributes of the now classic wrestling games kept in along with some additional tasty elements, WWF Raw should keep wrestling junkies happy from Monday to Monday.

You can guarantee he'll smash into the side of your car at the start of a race, putting your steering out of whack before you've even begun!

ven though we gave four pages of extensive coverage to this top banana in issue three of Games World: The Magazine, we felt that Nintendo owners really would want to see more pictures of Nintendo's big release before it goes on sale especially as (to coin an over-used phrase), people have been going 'ape' over Donkey Kong Country since reports from the Chicago CES first filtered over here through games mags. This platformer really is a gorilla thriller and, judging by our own inability to put it down, thankfully seems to have the addictive qualities to back-up some of the best 3D graphics and FX that you will ever experience on your humble Super Nintendo. Add to that over 100 levels of beautifully rendered, treacherous landscapes, containing a vast number of secret rooms and bonus sections and it seems that Donkey Kong Country is really going to liven up Nintendo's Advent as it's being released before Christmas (on November 18th) to steal a month on Sega.

Apart from the one-player mode, you can play as rival, or co-operative two players, switching control between characters to take over whichever sprite will be best at the task in hand (DK is strong whereas Diddy is more agile). If the wasps catch you out there is a save option to stop you having to go all the way back to the beginning. Whatever game you choose to play, you will swing through jungles, ride rhinos, swim with sharks, hitch a lift with a swordfish called En-garde and even take a roller-coaster ride in an old mine cart.

With Walt Disney movie magic sweeping the country this month, you can easily overdose on The Lion King. Now, to add to the hype here comes the videogame - roar!

ave you seen the film yet? Well, in case you haven't, here's the storyline. Set in the mysterious jungles of Africa The Lion King follows the little lion cub Simba as he attempts to regain his rightful place as king of the jungle. His evil uncle Scar banished him into the wilderness where he finds salvation with Pumbaa the warthog and Timon the meerkat.

The console game is split into ten levels, half of which are played as the lion cub and half as the adult Simba. Then, inbetween these levels there are bonuses that let you play as Simba's mates (if you've picked up the correct icons along the way).

Disney Software have gone for quite a tough difficulty curve with this game. Things are certainly not easy at first but once you have sussed out your surroundings and got to know the reactions of the various jungle animals things soon become clear.

The animals not only make the levels look appealing but they also each have their uses. Monkeys hanging from the trees will throw the little cub around, allowing him to reach new sections. Rhinos flip him into the air, hippos have tails that are great for swinging on and giraffes' heads can be jumped on - but watch out because they soon tilt!

As well as a jump move the little Simba has a mini-roar that is enough to send some of the smaller creatures running. Spiky porcupines are impossible to stamp on until you roar to flip them over first. There's plenty of variety in the levels with all kinds of obstacles to get around. The elephants' graveyard has nasty bones that crack when you walk over them and hyenas that attack from all directions. Then there's a stampede with wildebeest trying to trample the poor cub underhoof.

After the success of Aladdin on the SNES, Virgin and Disney have a winning formula for console games which they've used again for The Lion King. With 2000 frames of excellent animation and all

the hit tunes from the film this looks like yet another winner.

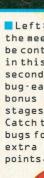


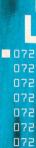

Of course, the general idea is to build up your own theme park from scratch and make it as attractive as possible to the general punter. They've got to be kept happy so that they'll spend their dosh and make you richer. All kinds of crazy attractions and side stalls have been packed into the 8 Mbits of the SNES cart (half the size of the Mega Drive but with the same content). There are 27 dinnerchurning rides, four of which have user definable tracks; the roller coaster, monorail, cars and water rides. You dig your own water courses, lay your own roads and then watch the little people flock from miles around.

All the artificial intelligence of the PC game has been incorporated into the SNES version. When the little people get on a ride they will react in various ways. They sometimes feel sick, get excited or become sad - miserable gits! You can also tell what they're thinking as they walk around your park. Little think bubbles appear above their heads with icons representing hamburgers, drinks, toilets and the exit.

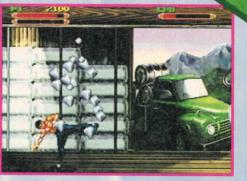

Playing as Bruce Lee, the game starts in Hong Kong and follows the route of the star's rise to fame, riches and glory in Hollywood and, strangely, his final confrontation with an evil spirit called the Phantom that has haunted his ancestors through the ages.

Let's face it, Bruce Lee was one of the hardest

blokes ever to walk the face of this earth (even if he did die after an allergic reaction to aspirin) and in this release he even gets to kick in leggy PVC-clad babes and obnoxious sailor-types – not just the expected Kung-Fu masters.

In fact, Bruce Lee faces over 30 different opponents; chefs with super-sharp meat cleavers and American sailors complete with fists and chains. Many of the foes from the movie are found in the game, with several original characters like

the leather-clad Stick Woman who uses her acrobatic fighting skills to deal out deathly blows.

Brucie has over 40 attack and multiple combination moves at his disposal as he weaves his way through 10 levels of top Kung-Fu action in the story mode. There's action in the story mode. There's also a training level so the players can get to grips with each of the moves and learn Bruce's way of fighting – Jeet Kune Do!

There are in excess of 2000 frames of animation to keep you

enthralled, with absolutely huge sprites, bright and colourful backgrounds, in-game movie sequences directly from the movie and the opportunity to take on more than one opponent at a time. This multiple player option certainly offers you more in the way of gameplay thrills, as two players can battle it out together or against each other and with CPU controlled nasties thrown in there to make things even worse for both Brucie mark one and Brucie mark two.

However, if you blow up a building or two, don't forget to keep your distance from the flying roof.

As you progress from a lowly private 'fodder' you rise through the ranks to the higher echelons of corporal and general. Not only does this make you feel proud for Queen and country, it also improves your overall shooting accuracy and, when and if you die, a position high up in the Boot Hill cemetery is your reward, as you have to wipe away a tear for a faithful comrade in arms.

Cannon Fodder is a true gameplayer's game without needing

to try and be cocky on the graphics front. It harbours no pretensions and is, even at this rather early stage, one of the most addictive romps you'll find on the Jaguar.

t's big, it's deep and it's probably the most in-depth game to appear on the Jaguar to date. In Theme Park you get to build your theme park anywhere in the world, no matter what varied social, economic and climatic factors come into play – but the UK is certainly a good place to start.

There are three types of challenge. Firstly, there's the Sandbox mode, with an on-screen tutorial and the basic aim to build a simple theme park from scratch. Secondly, there is the Simulation mode where you not only have to build the park but also keep the punters safe and happy.

If you really want to go the whole hog then there is the Business Simulation mode. Similar to the Simulation mode but now you have to try to become the world's number one park, negotiate wages, forge contracts and buy and sell shares in rival theme parks – but avoid being bought out or declared

bankrupt yourself.

With 32 purpose-built rides from the trusty bouncy castle to space rides, and six user-created rides (where you decide where and how big and how tall – like the Water Rapids and Big Dippers) you can't fail to turn a few punters' heads (and stomachs). How much research time you devote to each ride will affect its

overall performance as you learn more about adding the thrill and avoiding the vomit factor.

Speaking of sick-inducing rides, there are 16 different shops you can build to raise the extra dosh and here you can adjust the taste of the products to suit your park's needs. Add tons of salt to the chips to make the grunts thirsty, add loads of sugar to ice cream – but ensure they're not too close to spinny rides, or at least

provide enough toilets just in case.

Of course, it's all swings and roundabout (or rollercoaster loops and twists if you prefer) as you can't have fun all of the time. With a reputation to earn, you still have to add trees and ponds for aesthetic effect, hire and fire security guards and childrens' entertainers and basically be a mean business man. You have to juggle making a fast buck and keeping the park's fun reputation.

More than a standard strategy game, Bullfrog have created a management sim par excellence for Ocean – a breath of fresh air for the new system as it shows it can run games that don't simply require lightning reactions.

yndicate has been well received on nearly all of the major formats and it's about to hit the Jaguar in a big way. It all started out on the Amiga, rapidly spread to the PC and will shortly burst onto the Mega Drive and SNES. Can the Jaguar handle the gore?

The aim of Syndicate is to completely take control of the world by using a team of special cyborgs armed to the teeth with all manner of hi-tech weapons and super upgradable body-parts. Using these cyborg agents, you have to infiltrate enemy areas that are shown as countries on the world map and complete specific missions. If you succeed, you will automatically gain control of the country and all of the lovely taxes that go with it. Taxes will help you to research better weaponry and will allow you to deal with later levels that have more enemy agents. If, however, you tax your new territories too much, the population will revolt and you'll lose control and have to deal with them again (so it's no good hiking taxes up to 100% and expecting your citizens to hold a parade in your honour)

One of the touchy subjects that has caused much controversy on other formats is the amount of violence that is portrayed in the game. The fact that the gameplay involves arranging drive-by shootings, killing innocent civilians and police officers with ever more deadly weapons like shotguns, uzis, mini-guns and flame-throwers has enraged almost all do-gooders silly enough to poke their heads into the high intensity line of fire.

As you're playing the game you look down at a 45° angle, with some of the playing area being obscured by various buildings and bits of scenery. There is handheld radar that will show you where all the enemy agents are (as well as civilians and police officers). The radar will also lead you to your next objective. If you are making a simple assassination attempt then you just have to kill the person but, if it's a rescue, you'll have to locate the hostage and escort him or her to a safety point.

The Jaguar version of Syndicate should be just as gory and

bloodthirsty as the Amiga and PC versions while retaining that all important gameplay element. So the next time you see some dodgy geezer with a long brown coat walking towards you, run.

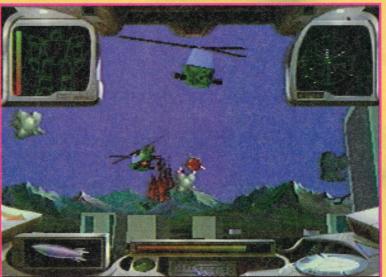

he Iron Soldier itself is a skyscraper-sized mech-warrior mercenary who has been roped in by the world's governments to protect the major cities in times of crisis – ie, now! This may sound sluggish but the explosions and attacks take place at a devastating rate, literally. Metal Gear has a built-in videophone that you can use to make calls to your wife, reply to advertisments and even dial up seedy phone lines... if you have the right numbers.

There are loads of scenes to investigate and plenty of trouble to get yourself into. Snatcher is split up into three sections, rather like chapters of an anime film, and there are so many different avenues of play in this game that if you were to play through as quickly as possible it would still take you well over eight hours to complete. Although it is fairly linear, there are enough varied responses to make the game different each time you play.

Expect decapitated heads and a few choice smatterings of blood being strewn about Snatcher, so don't be surprised if this arrives on console with an 18 certificate. Its anime style and gutsy storyline could make this the Mega-CD's finest eight hours.

Ever since the arrival of Arnold in the film **Terminator**, there have been a plethora of games with cyborgs threatening man's existence. Luckily for us here at Games **World Konami's new** game, Snatcher, should dispel any of our fears about world domination by psychotic metal mainiacs.

Pit Fighter started it all off and then Mortal Kombat came along and showed everyone how it should be done. Now, it seems that digitising people and sticking them in fighting games is all the rage. The World Gamers checked out the latest in a long line of releases wanting to be proclaimed 'Top Bruiser'.

hen a fully armed helicopter swoops menacingly through the night and hovers outside the headquarters of the world's largest criminal organisation and proceeds to destroy the building, you just know that there's a game hidden away under all of this. And so there is. In the attack on the building the head honcho of SHADOW was killed and the hunt is now on for his successor. Seven of his closest lieutenants have assembled to fight to the death and the winner will become the new Shadow.

There are three difficulty levels that greet you when you first start the game; easy, normal and hard. Choose one of these and the game

proper begins. After picking one of the fighters, the computer picks an opponent for you unless you have a chum that's in for the action. When the game begins there are the usual pleasantries exchanged between the fighters, most of which boil down to nothing more than a few insults and gestures. 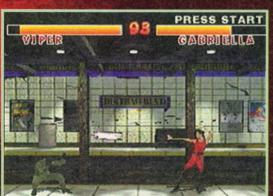

sing the traditional formula of a side-on view, Samurai Shodown has large, colourful graphics and authentic fighting sounds that create the ideal atmosphere for a bit of combat. Each of the twelve fighters has an individual set-up, with different speed, dexterity and power settings. Each combatant is also blessed with a variety of special moves and weapons that are used to defeat the opposition. Only the most experienced warriors who have mastered all of these moves will become the overall champion.

The success of Samurai Shodown in the arcade (it was a spectacular Neo-Geo title) has something to do with the diversity of the characters and the polished gameplay. Most of the twelve characters fight with just their weapons and fists but a few have alternative methods of engaging the enemy. There's Gen-An, who spews forth poison that will burn you and take your damage down, Hanzo is a ninja who throws stars at you and then there's Jubei who has two swords and uses them to maximum slicing effect. All the strategy elements are still there so you could go for the long ball antics of Wimbledon or play the pretty attacking football of Sheffield Wednesday via an option screen that can be called upon at any time. Formation and coverage of the team will also feature heavily.

Of course, for all these features to be contained in one Game Boy cartridge it has to be big, and big it is, weighing in at a whopping 4 Mbits! If the monochrome viewpoint is too much, you also get full Super Game Boy colour compatibility where the game comes into its own with the green pitch and easy to view characters and balls - not forgetting a pretty screen border (although this is still to be implemented).

It's been a longish wait for Game Boy owners who may well have thought that they would never get their eager mitts on it. As we speak, the game is having its final polish before going off to Nintendo for

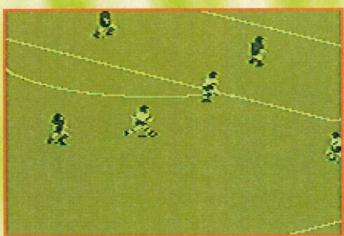

he Pagemaster is an action adventure platform romp based on the Twentieth Century Fox movie starring Macaulay Culkin, Christopher Lloyd and Whoopi Goldberg and this is supposed to be the first time that a game and a film will be released on the same day. This sounds like a good thing as it's about time that we had the games of movies coming

In *Pagemaster* you get to play Macaulay as Richard Tyler, the world's safest kid. A kid who's nervous of a nuclear attack, earthquakes and life in general. On the small screen of the Game Boy he can jump, run, slide, fall and hang to name but a few of his numerous sprite manoeuvres. Macaulay is armed with a diverse selection of weapons as well - like gooey eyeballs for throwing or clashing pirate swords - depending

on which part of the game he finds himself in. Created by developing supremos Probe, The Pagemaster is a truly massive title, basically consisting of three stages from the film, based

on the book genres of Horror, Adventure and Fantasy, with a whopping total of 74 levels in all to get involved in.

The graphics are smart, with real animation from the film - yes, even in this Game Boy version! There are actually more animation cels used in the game than found in that classic

animated spectacular, Aladdin.

Although by nature a platform rompette, there are additional gameplay styles to give the game more depth. These include action and puzzle variants and three 3D flying bonus levels. A nice touch is the unique navigational map that allows you to select the level you wish to play.

One of the best things about the game is the sheer number of hidden bonus levels to discover. Find a hidden bonus token and you get to play a bonus memory or reflex game. Complete a level without losing a life and you can play the secret bonus chamber. You'll be able to find secret exits and enter worlds no one else has seen, or discover the special help books to enter new worlds based on 20,000 Leagues Under The Sea and Alice in Wonderland.

The amount of gameplay crammed into this cart is quite remarkable, especially considering its accuracy to The Pagemaster movie. Tipped by many to be one of the dark horse film hits of the Christmas season, it will be interesting to see how the game jumps on the bandwagon. From what we've seen it should certainly be able to stand up on its own.

f, like the World Gamers, you are a fan of all those trashy Japanese monster movies that pit huge, evil-looking creatures against one another again and again, then it's inevitable that, like the World Gamers, you will very shortly be pumping your hard earned coffers into a certain arcade machine called *Primal Rage*.

Originally conceived as a Tyrannosaurus Rex battle game, its designers quickly realised the overall potential of the concept and set about designing a whole host of non-human combatants (some based on actual dinosaurs, others purely fantastical) to battle it out in a primeval landscape. The result is a ferocious, roaring, screaming game that takes the one-on-one combat genre to a whole new level of brutal intensity. No karate kicks or wrestling moves here, just savage attacks that see the monsters lunging at each other with razor-sharp teeth and huge claws. This is the classic fight to the death that has existed in the animal kingdom since the dawn of time...

Well actually, it's not quite that simple. Each creature has its own set of followers

Well actually, it's not quite that simple. Each creature has its own set of followers that run around its feet as it fights not just to survive, but to gain control of the 'Urth'. Each monster gets strength from these worshippers and, in lapses in the action, it's great fun to reach down and crush, chew or slash a few of them – not just to annoy your opponent but to reduce the amount of mana he gets too. These ape-like humans running about also manage to give the game's central characters a greater feeling of scale and emphasise their mighty size.

scale and emphasise their mighty size.

Never before have prehistoric creatures looked or moved so realistically in a videogame. This is because, for the first time, the animations were created using stopmotion filming, a technique very rarely seen outside of huge budget Hollywood movies. Combined with the stereo sound effects provided by the unit's 'Total Immersion Audio' system, Talon, Blizzard and co really do seem to come to life at your fingertips.

The game itself, apart from all the standard tearing and biting, also involves learning a number of special moves and finishing combinations that will please more hardcore arcade fans. A nice fatality is when the giant ape, Blizzard, knocks his opponent into a daze and then proceeds to hammer him on the cranium until his feet become sunk into the ground so that he can land a truly devastating blow to his head – tearing it clean off and sending its contents spilling all over the place. Oh yes, very satisfying. All the moves are pulled off using a simple four button control system that allows beginners to play easily and more experienced arcade fighters to perfect super-fast combinations and master the 'power' hits that are mapped onto both the top and bottom button combinations. There are also all manner of secret items hidden within the game which must be accessed by reaching certain levels of excellence or simply pulling the right move off at the right time.

Set to appear on most home formats in 1995, *Primal Rage* is already being heralded as the successor to *Mortal Kombat* after the fantastic reaction it has received from gameplayers the world over. Prepare to make the Earth tremble and your opponent's worshippers cower in terror as you roar, stamp and slash your way across the screen. It's just a pity that you can't destroy Tokyo in the process.

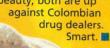
