# RETURN OF THE JAK

Jak's back – older, wiser, angrier and wielding a hefty gun.

JAK AND DAXTER: THE PRECURSOR LEGACY, released in December 2001, was an instant PS2 classic. It proved that Sony could do free-roaming platform adventuring just as well (and just as cute) as Nintendo, by introducing us to the spiky-haired Jak and his wisecracking, ferret-like sidekick Daxter.

Jak and Daxter are set to return this winter in a sequel that will take the adventurous duo to the next level of character action games. Spy brings you the first look at one of the biggest games of the year. Just remember: you won't read this news anywhere else.

#### Jak Chat

One of his claims to fame is appearing in woman's sex bible Cosmopolitan as an 'eligible bachelor'. But never mind the ladies, he's also something of a dab hand at game design. Jason Rubin, Co-President of Naughty Dog, tells OPS2 of his grand plans for the return of Jak And Daxter.

#### What are the two biggest changes you've made to Jak And Daxter?

First, we've moved away from collection as the basic motivator for gameplay and towards story and tasks. The 'pick-up' has been replaced by tasks specifically linked to furthering the plot. No random farmer asks you to collect his cows. Each character is specifically linked to a greater plot and sends you on tasks that move the story forward.

Second, in other character action games, when you're given a new ability or weapon, you can only use it in a particular level. In *J&D2*, when we give you a gun, you can take it anywhere you like and you don't have to give it back. When you get the hoverboard, you can use it

whenever you want. It's very different to putting you in a biplane on level 32, or letting you use magnetic boots on very specific flooring, for example.

#### How has Jak's character changed? Jak is seeking revenge. He's been put in prison and experimented on – his attitude reflects this.

#### So are you saying that J&D2 is more adult in tone?

When has Mario sought revenge?
When did Crash lose a friend? When
did Sonic ever go to prison? You'll
find that important characters (good
and bad) die in the course of the
game – so this isn't your little
brother's character action game.
The locations in Jak And Daxter 2



are, in comparison, darker and bleaker than those in the first game. They range from sewers to towers, strip mines to forests, mountains to underwater ships and graveyards.

#### How does the game begin?

The intro to the game starts right after the end of *The Precursor Legacy*. We find out what was behind the blinding white light at the original's climax, but then within 30 seconds we're teleported far away to an entirely different time and place.



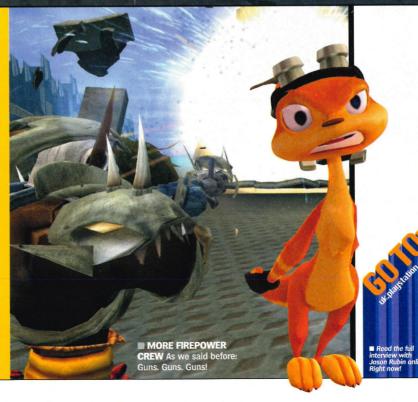
#### What about new gameplay?

Collection has been minimised as a gameplay element. There are no power cells. There are no scout flies. Instead, players will find themselves blowing entrances open, returning water to parched areas of the city, transporting cargo for 'the Underground', and fighting against invading armies of metal heads. There is a reason for everything that the player is asked to do. If the player fails to complete the task, they will understand why the plot cannot move forward.

Is there still a market for a character-driven games like J&D? I don't believe that character action gameplay is dead. It's shown itself to be incredibly addictive and rewarding. With J&D2 we try to satisfy both the character action fanatic as well as target the game for the 2003 audience. We hope that it'll work. It's the game Naughty Dog has wanted to make for eight years.

## **TOUCH OF GLASS**

Hack 'n' slash of a different kind in Capcom's Glass Rose.

**GLASS ROSE MIGHT SOUND** like a rejected name for a teenage goth band, but it's actually the title of Capcom's latest spine-chiller. Announced recently in Japan, you play a reporter named Takahashi who discovers he has the ability to read people's minds and memories.

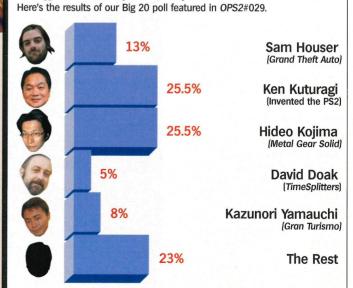
While exploring a house in which a family was murdered many years previously, he finds himself sucked back in time to 1929 – which is presumably when the murders originally occurred. In order to return to the present day, we're guessing he has to solve or, more likely, prevent the crime.

Glass Rose's premise and third-person perspective both suggest survival horror, but we understand that the game will focus more on slow burn psychodrama rather than heart-stopping shocks. While the plot is reminiscent of Shadow Of Memories, Konami's own time-travelling murdermystery, these first shots immediately recall the vivid style and rich environments of Sega's Shenmue. A cerebral shocker certainly sounds intriguing, although Capcom would probably be wise to include a smattering of action, just to keep the kids' bloodlust sated...

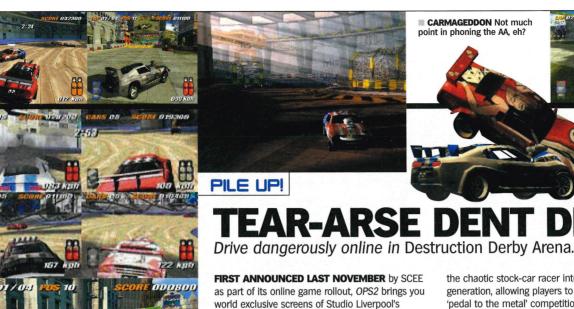

# THE GRUMPY GREEN GIANT

Feel the rage rising in Universal's Hulk.

**SUPERHEROES HAVE BEEN** enjoying something of a renaissance on PS2. Lifted from their 2D comic origins and moulded into 3D playable characters, fans can now actually be their favourite character. Great while you're a superhero, not so great while in the shoes of their socially inadequate alteregos. And none is more of a misfit than troubled scientist Bruce Banner proud owner of seven identical purple suits. What a loser.

Although, he does turn into the Hulk when he gets in a tizz, and it's this physical metamorphism that Radical has taken to form the base of this 30-level action game. You either take the stealthy, brainy option and play as Banner or you unleash the strength and rage of the emerald Hulk. After seeing the trailer for the Ang Lee-directed film (out this summer) we think the Hulk's intense rage and superhuman powers are preferable. That bit when he spins a tank around his head and throws it into the middle distance - now there's something we'd like to try.

With over 25 unique Hulk attacks we'd guess the tank lob is in there somewhere. As this is a Universal-produced game we get voice-overs from the film cast (including Eric Bana as Bruce Banner) and levels that are set in the movie's locations. And don't forget sultry brunette and Banner love interest Betty Ross, played by the rather gorgeous Jennifer Connelly. With Ang Lee at the helm, Hulk is a likely summer blockbuster with the game destined to follow. Not bad for a genetic mutant with anger management issues.  $\square$  GW

EVERY MAJOR PUBLISHER is jumping on the freeroaming platform bandwagon. THQ's latest game is developed by Avalanche, in association with Nickelodeon. Under a bizarre agreement they'll work together to produce games first, and then launch cartoon versions.

In the game you'll take the role of Tak as he belts around a variety of jungle/village platform landscapes solving puzzles and completing tasks to rescue villagers who have been turned into sheep. The platformer has a familiar feel, spiced up with comedy animal devices such as the orang-utan catapult. Highlights so far? The chicken suit that allows little Tak to glide and lay explosive eggs. # **PUPPY LOVE**

Konami's Inu Toasabu Dogstation mounts our leg.

WITH REAL DOGS CLEARLY proving far too much hassle mess and smell for the average Japanese city-dweller, Konami's provided a low maintenance alternative in Inu Toasabu Dogstation. Based on a popular arcade cabinet that came out last year (recognisable by its two keyboards) the PS2 version is an elaborate dog-training game that blends elements of Tamagotchi, bemani, potty training and dog-walking.

After you've chosen from a set of incredibly cute pedigree puppies including Beagles, Bulldogs, Chihuahuas, Shibas and St Bernards - it becomes the player's responsibility to raise the dog, providing for its strange dietary requirements and taking it for walks. Despite the fact you can switch the dog off once you're bored with it drooling on the carpet, yapping incessantly and sniffing your girlfriend's crotch, Dogstation is quite comprehensive in its level of interactivity.

Take Voice mode for example. Here players have to talk to the dog via a USB microphone to discipline their animal. The game understands the tone of your voice so the virtual hound will respond differently depending on whether you are enthusiastically crooning, "Thassaboy!" or screaming,

"Get off the frickin' sofa!" Once your pet has been toilet trained - and if it isn't, it will quite literally (and graphically) splurge the living room carpet - you can groom, stroke and cuddle it as a reward. Much of the training is done through bemani-style button presses entered in a particular sequence through a USB keyboard.

Then there's Coupling mode. Having produced a model example of your chosen breed it's time to continue the family lineage and set it up as a potential mating partner. Players can save their dogs to Memory Card and swap them with friends for this purpose. Although hopefully you have to watch them actually 'doing it'

Due to an excess of actual dogs in the UK it's unlikely Konami will bother to release Dogstation over here, despite its obvious novelty appeal. Of course, if you still want loyal companionship without the slobber you could always get an AIBO.

"OH, THEY SHOULD have done better there." Couldn't agree with you more, Trevor. For once. Konami should've scored a hat trick with Pro Evo 2. It should've given FIFA a drubbing and sent it crying to the Nationwide Conference. Instead, it got overconfident, fielded the reserves and only just scraped a result against the hungrier side.

It's all about believing your own hype. Buoyed up by its review scores, Konami got cocky. Nothing wrong with that. It did an ad campaign that featured Pro Evo as the messiah of kickabouts. Arrogant, but understandable. Then? Then one of the largest games companies in the world released a game with a licence so crap the Dutch team was called the Oranges. For Ferguson's sake, Newcastle are 'The Highlands'. That's a whole different country, Konami, Even International League Soccer had the decency to call its players things like R V Nistelrooy.

And that's only the start of it. Players still make insane stop-and-check decisions, carry on oblivious as a pass ricochets off their heels, and all too often won't even run after a flick-on that's clearly about to be intercepted. Pah.

Then there's Trevor. The commentary in Pro Evo is apparently directly translated from the Japanese version, so no surprise that it isn't too realistic - "A jumping header!" - but come on. Peter Brackley yelps, "He's hit it!" three seconds after you've hoofed the ball over the bar. obsesses over the teams' socks, even interrupts himself when things get hectic. For those 'in the industry', it's a running joke, but when you're trying to get excited in the dying seconds of a 1-1 thriller, it's no laughing matter.

So pay attention, Pro Evo. You might be the closest thing we've got to a footballing prodigy, but even Wayne Rooney is on the training pitch every day. Think it's all over? Not while FIFA carries on improving.

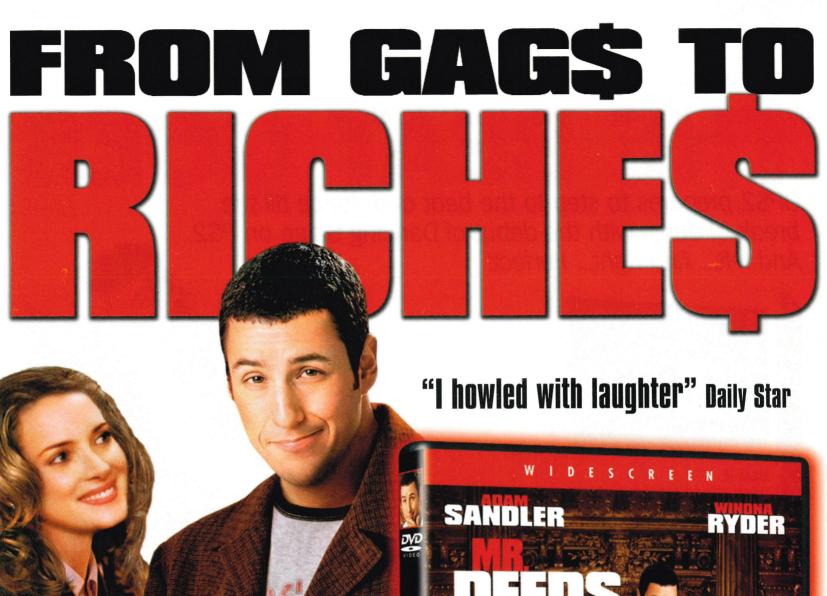

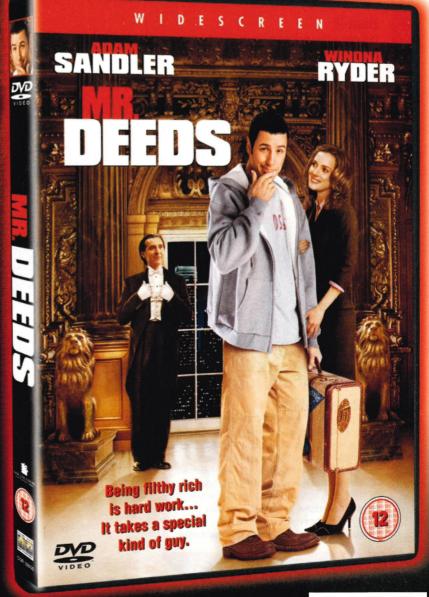

#### Beat It

Derived from the original Konami rhythm action title BeatMania, Dancing Stage is one game where you simply can't avoid getting a hefty bead on. Players dance in time to music on a specially designed dance mat marked with directional arrows. Different combinations of arrows scroll up the screen as the player tries to replicate the patterns with their feet. It's exhilarating and insanely popular – Dancing Stage Euromix for PSone is close to selling a million units in the UK alone.



#### Breakin' Habits

Most home users of dance titles are 'steppers', playing the game with their feet as was traditionally intended. In the arcades, however, dancing game experts buck the trend by freestyling. Sharing similarities with breakdancing, enthusiasts gather wherever there's a machine and bust moves like the Pyramid Spin and the Matrix Walk. #### Work It

The logical extension of dancing games as a means of enjoyment is to make the otherwise monotonous task of exercise slightly more tolerable. In Japan, Konami has not only bought into a large chain of health clubs, it's also released a version of the popular Dance Dance Revolution series for PS2 called Aerobic Revolution. The game actually monitors how many calories are being burned during play and sets up a personal exercise schedule based on the results.



#### Freak Like Me

Dancing Stage Megamix is the first true PS2 dancing game to get a release in the UK (it's due out in May). The game will be worth buying for the tracklist alone, which features the likes of Ms Dynamite, Junkie XL, Sugababes, Christina Milian, Kylie Minogue and, erm, The Cure's Lovecats. OPS2 reckons that the dance mat craze will kick off rather large in 2003, so go put on your gladrags, move the coffee table, invite the girls round and get ready to dance like a greased baboon.

'Size doesn't matter'. A hard sell at the best of times - even more so when you're paying 40 notes for a piece of entertainment. These days almost every game boasts at least 15 hours of gameplay. Not a huge problem when the likes Vice City and Hitman 2 are capable of delivering quantity and quality. But that doesn't mean every game has to be an epic. Sometimes we just want a breathless sprint to the finish rather than another exhausting marathon.

Problem is, there's no outlet for cut-price games you can complete in a weekend. Which is where online distribution comes in. Initially, you're only going to be able to download bonus levels and extra items, but ultimately the hard drive could be used to store entire games. Let's hope some developers will take it as an opportunity to create shorter games, stuffed with ideas and innovation. We want punk, not prog.

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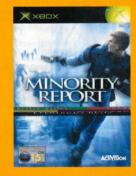

A script has been penned by J Stewart Burns, who won an Emmy for his talents on the TV show, with a story that'll take our unlikely heroes through the sewers of New New York to alien planets, abandoned mines and mysterious temples.

Don't expect anything too innovative on the gameplay front – platform jumping, third-person combat and a smattering of puzzle solving – but the addition of Bender's catchphrases and Dr Zoidberg's disturbing sexual fetishes should more than make up for that. Furthermore, it's keeping the *Futurama* series alive until Fox executives realise that inexplicably killing off the TV show after only the third series is utter insanity.

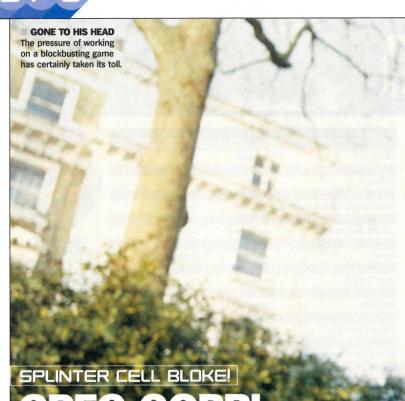

## PlayStation 2 INTERVIEW



Splinter Cell's Creative Director talks stealth, sequels and sharing the credit.

#### How did the initial idea for Splinter **Cell come about?**

We wanted to create a game with tension. We wanted to reproduce the feeling you got when you were a kid, watching TV from behind the sofa. But then we wanted to release that tension with action, too. That's why we have the special moves - they provide the player with an almost physical sensation.

#### Which games influenced you obviously Metal Gear Solid?

We definitely wanted to make a game that would be better than Metal Gear Solid. It was obviously going to be hard though, it takes Konami four years to make a Metal Gear Solid game and they have 80 people. We only had 40 people and two years. It's a brilliant game, of course, but it has plenty of frustrating elements, particularly the lack of control. You can play it just by looking at the head-up display, not the main screen. Our goal was to be more realistic and provide much more control over the camera so players could use the 3D environment to hide. A game that did influence us in that respect was *Thief*.

#### So how did you get access to the Tom

We were working on a shoot-'em-up, but it was set in a game universe that we weren't sure would hook the American market. It would have worked in Europe I think, but maybe it was a bit lateral for the US. Anyway, when Ubi Soft bought Tom Clancy's developer Red Storm, we asked if we could use the licence and Splinter Cell was born.

#### Which other games are you currently involved with?

One big one is the next Prince Of Persion game. It'll be a challenge to rejuvenate the brand because Prince Of Persia 3D was very disappointing. However, we're working with Jordan Mechner, the game's Creator. I'm also overseeing Tom Clancy's Rainbow Six Raven Shield and Myst 4.

#### Pretty damn busy then...

You could say that. My role is to ensure the team have the resources they need. Once we agree on a game's concept, it becomes the team's responsibility to get it done. As Creative Director, I can't say, "This is my game," I have to say, "This is your game." It hurts, but that's how it is.

#### Any news on a sequel for Splinter Cell?

At the moment we're thinking about a multiplayer element. It might be an addon, it might be a sequel. The problem is. our game is based on shadows and being sneaky – if you tried to do a deathmatch, for example, night vision would ruin everything. If I shoot out the lights and hide in the dark, it won't make any difference – you can use your night vision to see me. It's a real design challenge.

#### How's the beard coming along?

Shaving once a week is my personal fifth freedom.

#### **GENEPOOL? IS THAT SOME KIND OF SECRET**

UNDERGROUND LAIR? Not really. Waiting in the company's mansion HQ near Manchester, we sit trying to digest the obscene amounts of Argentinian steak consumed last night courtesy of our hosts. Gastrie difficulties aside, the offices are certainly stately and anticipation is rising as we wait to see the fruits of an exhausted development team's labours as they near their deadline. From what we're about to witness, it's obvious they've been keeping busy.

#### **HOW TRUE IS THE GAME TO THE X-MEN COMICS?**

Most know that Wolverine's adamantium claws and skeleton are not the result of mutation, but his legacy from the sinister Weapon-X program. Unfortunately, the program also infected the hairy, bad-tempered lad with a fail-safe virus intended to kill any escapees Logan has just 48 hours to find a cure. Genepool has woven an impressive plot around this and brought some classic characters from the Wolverine series into the narrative. For example: Sabretooth taunts Logan on his birthday (he does every year), Wolvy gets help from Colossus (the big Russian mutant) and there are also appearances from Juggernaut, Lady Deathstrike, Professor Xavier and less well-known characters like the abominable Wendigo.

#### HOW'S THE FIGHTING SHAPING UP? Obvious

Wolverine is equipped for close combat so this game goes all out for melee fighting, containing a truly staggering array of moves. Genepool says there are over 100 unique animations, and after getting our own hairy mitts on sizeable chunks of the nearly complete code, we believe them. Guards can be pulled by the ankle from under bedsheets before being pinned to the floor, while multiple opponents can be taken out with spectacular choreography. Wolverine's feral ferocity is truly unleashed here, but he also sneaks around using his mutant senses to detect guards and locate devices such as mines. If an enemy can be killed stealthily, a misty ghost effect will show the way.

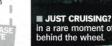

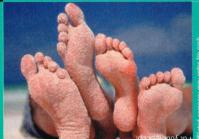

#### IS MCCLANE GETTING TOO OLD FOR THIS SH\*T?

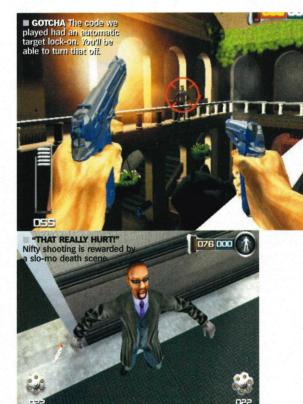

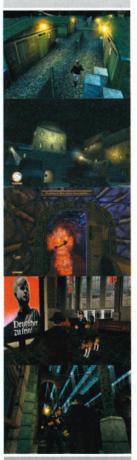

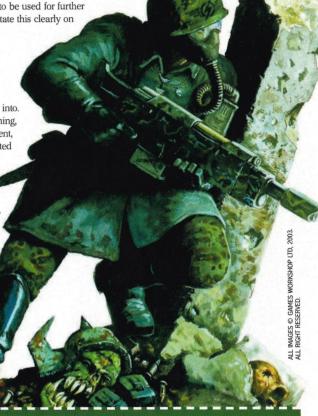

#### A FRESH START IN VIDEOGAMES

Tips on how to get ahead in the games industry from the MD of a company that wants to revolutionise the way games are made.

Start! Games aims to make it easier for fledgling developers with big ideas to get noticed by the suits with the moolah. Start!'s Managing Director, Shahid Ahmad, is a veteran coder himself, so we asked him for pointers on getting into the industry, and found out how his company is set to change the videogames landscape.

Aside from entering our competition to win work experience at Kuju, what advice would you give to gamers who are keen to make a career for themselves in games?

I would say beg, buy or borrow a cheap PC. Then download every free tool you can imagine. Learn how to program the PC. Then start to build little toys – small challenges that help you explore interfaces. Write yourself a Pong or Snake game and move on from there. Eventually vou'll

have built yourself a demo. You can't expect to make a living out of videogames until you've paid your dues. Get on news groups and talk to as many people as you can about art, coding, design, music, producing, whatever. If you're at school, do the appropriate learning there because you'll have access to more facilities.

Read magazines. Buy *OPS2*. It's very important to stay current and understand what people want. PS2 is where the market is now, and that's where it's likely to stay for a long time.

Your background in games goes all the way back to Jet Set Willy on the C64. Would you say Start! Games was trying to reinvent the pioneering spirit of the bedroom coders of the Eighties for the 128-bit generation? In terms of not being afraid to try new things, yes. But it needs to be combined with modern sensibilities. That's hugely important. In the bedroom-coding days you could come up with a simple idea and it was out of the door. But if you come up with a good idea now, you need excellent production values. In the early days, games were five quid – now, they're 40. It's a major investment.

#### How did Start! Games come about?

Start! was set up to bridge the gap between development and publishing by helping developers create prototypes supported by all the documentation and marketing materials they would need to convince a publisher that they are making a good decision.

they are making a good decision.
Look at the current chart situation. You've got six,
maybe seven titles at the top of the charts and they're all
licences or sequels. All by EA. It's staggeringly brilliant
business. They know what they're doing. But they really
do need better competition. Publishers find it very hard to
repeat success. They do everything to avoid making any

mistakes. But in doing so they remove themselves from the risks that brought them success in the first place.

And that's where Start! Games comes in... Tell us about

the projects you're working on.
Since 2001 we've finished six prototypes and fully funded one game. I can't tell you too much about the one I'm most excited about as we're right in the middle of a deal, but it's a game called Overdose by a Danish developer called Deadline Games. It's very exciting. We have helped two companies start up from scratch. One of which was R8 who broke away from SCEE Leeds, and the other I don't think I can mention just yet, but it's extremely exciting. It has broken away from a UK Publisher (the team were in-house developers) and was behind one of the most successful driving franchises of all time.

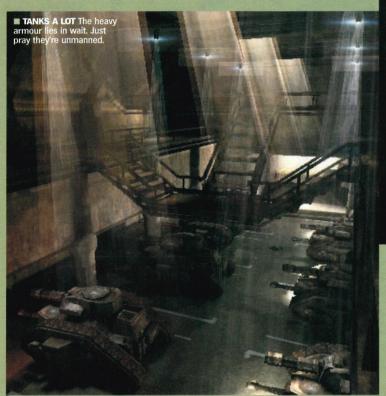
#### What would you like Start! Games to have achieved in five years time?

I would like for Start! to have been part of the movement that changed the way games are delivered to the public. We've got to get to the point where you can get a couple of students doing a *Blair Witch* type thing with games. Right now, if you want to make a game, no matter how simple, it's going to cost you £400,000 to £500,000. That's just absurd! What a barrier to creativity that is!

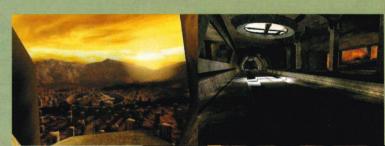

I'm not really the spokesman. I like to think of myself as more of a father figure. Y'know, I keep the bitches in line, I keep the young wrestlers out of trouble, I give them advice when they need it

**How did you get into that?**The producers of the Backyard Wrestling DVD saw the size of my unit and the rest is pretty much history

Yeah, it's called the Triple Tripod. I take my unit and I administer three slaps across the face with it. The first two sort of daze my opponent, but the third's the knockout blow. I once knocked out [Backyard Babe] Tylene Buck's tooth doing that. They airbrush it out of the photos, but that's true.

What would you like to see in the Backyard Wrestling game? Well, I just hope they do justice to the size of my unit.

Right. Finally, any advice for aspiring backyard wrestlers? Sure – remember, kids [descends into unprintable madness] and it'll grow every time.

As we pick up the joypad, the first surprise hits us -Paradox hasn't just ripped off SmackDown's engine and added blood. The team hates button-mashing, so they've implemented a system that minimises it. Each grapple move is reversible via a window of opportunity that is shown by the wrestler flashing. Even pins work like this as your wrestler gets worn down, he'll have less time to react for the kickout. The best way to secure a pin is by getting enough crowd 'props' (shouts of respect) to go for a humiliation move - typically a taunt or a not-too-damaging kick up the arse. The thing is, reversals can go on indefinitely, unless you're on a balcony or roof. This highlights another aspect of modern wrestling which is surprisingly tough to pull off in a game - height. Effectively, in Backyard Wrestling the game, there are three levels you can fling people off, with different throws and aerial attacks available from each. And although you won't be fighting in a ring, movement is simple to get to get to grips with. Just walking into a table, scaffold or even tree instructs your character to clamber up it. Getting down hurts a bit more...

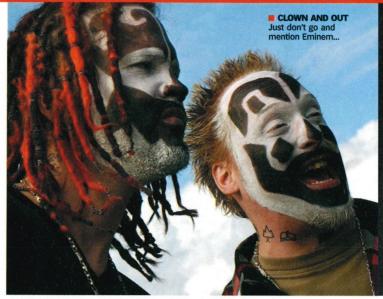
#### PAIN THRESHOLD

"I figured I had about three or four seconds of dead air, and I had to do something," says backyard vet MDogg 20 about his trademark move, The Flying Squirrel. Basically, as he falls he grabs his ankles in midair. We watched him do it off a 25-foot balcony. "It's scary, because you start to tip forwards as you fall," he tells us.

In the game, this move would be good for a lacerated stomach where each virtual wrestler can display three levels of damage on 17 different body parts. Punch someone in the face enough, and you'll bloody up your own knuckles, as well as giving them a black eye. Hit them with a barbed

How long have you been wrestling?
I've been a pro wrestler for 13 years, but I've only been doing the deathmatch stuff for six. I wanted to do something that wasn't as boring as working at KFC or McDonalds, and the normal style just

#### What's the worst injury you've had?

Probably when I caught someone doing a moonsault to the outside. I saw he was going to kill himself – he'd slipped on the ropes, so I got underneath him and he knocked my head onto a big bolt. Feel that... (we do - he's got a hole in his head). I didn't nt to go to hospital, so I just glued the hole shut, except that I didn't get it all, and now the doctors can't get the glue out. Then there's a barefoot thumbtack match I did once.

#### Ouch. Are you pleased with how you come across in Backyard

Wrestling the game?

I haven't seen that much of it, but they've been filming my entrance and my moves to get them right. They've got my likeness pretty detailed in there. It's nice to have something that my three

wire bat, and you'll tear up their T-shirt. Irish Whip them into a speaker stack, throw them off a balcony, hit them with a chair - it all mounts up. In the final game code you'll even be able to set wrestlers on fire.

Brutal, but all in a day's work for people like Rudy 'Rude Boy' Hill - "I do a camel clutch with barbed wire" and Mad Man Pondo. Pondo (Kevin Canady to his mates) is a veteran of the Japanese deathmatch scene, with a huge network of scars across his forehead and the biggest crimson mask in the game. Rudy does PR for the game's unofficial in-house band, the Insane Clown Posse (see Send In The Clowns), finishes half his sentences with "brutha" and has three kids. They're about the nicest blokes you could hope to meet. The game roster is made up of a mixture of pros like these two and ECW's Sabu, alongside famous underground names. MDogg 20's there, along with his tag partner Josh Prohibition - both Backyard video regulars. Also slated to make an appearance is Karnage whose tricks include being powerbombed onto a mat of thumbtacks. No matter how many times you see it, it doesn't look any less painful.

Anyway. Liked the game? Check. Chatted to the wrestlers? Yep. Convinced Backyard Babe Tylene to pose for a photo-op? Oh yes. Now comes the tricky part. The night before OPS2 jetted to LA, we promised the Art Editor

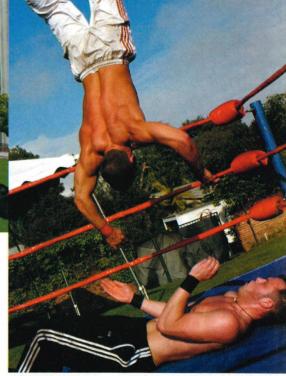

Rudy and Madman have promised us some brutality. Things start off with some tame cheating - a quick boot to the plums and an eye rake. "Yeah, I'm the bad guy. Booo!" shouts Pondo. The crowd is unimpressed. These would be typical heel tactics in the WWE, but everyone knows things are going to get worse. Much worse. The first bit of real pain comes with the light tubes. These are your bog-standard fluorescent lights - yet to make an appearance in SmackDown, but a staple of the backyard scene. Pondo sets three up on a chair in the corner, goes for the Irish whip, gets reversed and dives into the lights headfirst. Ouch. Now Rudy's got the upper hand. "Give me a dollar!" Somebody pulls out their folding money. Rudy grabs it and - kachunk - staples a note to Pondo's forehead. Gnaaaar. Now everyone gets the idea, they're waving paper like it's a lapdancing bar. A really violent, twisted lapdancing bar.

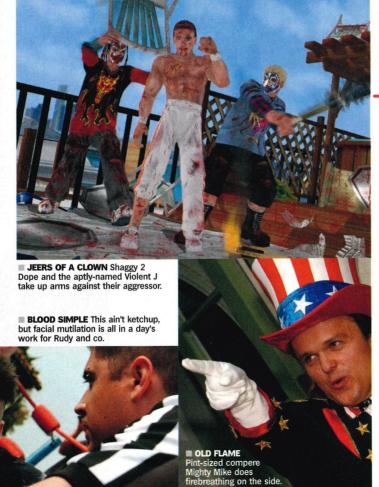
# Backyard Wrestling

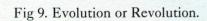

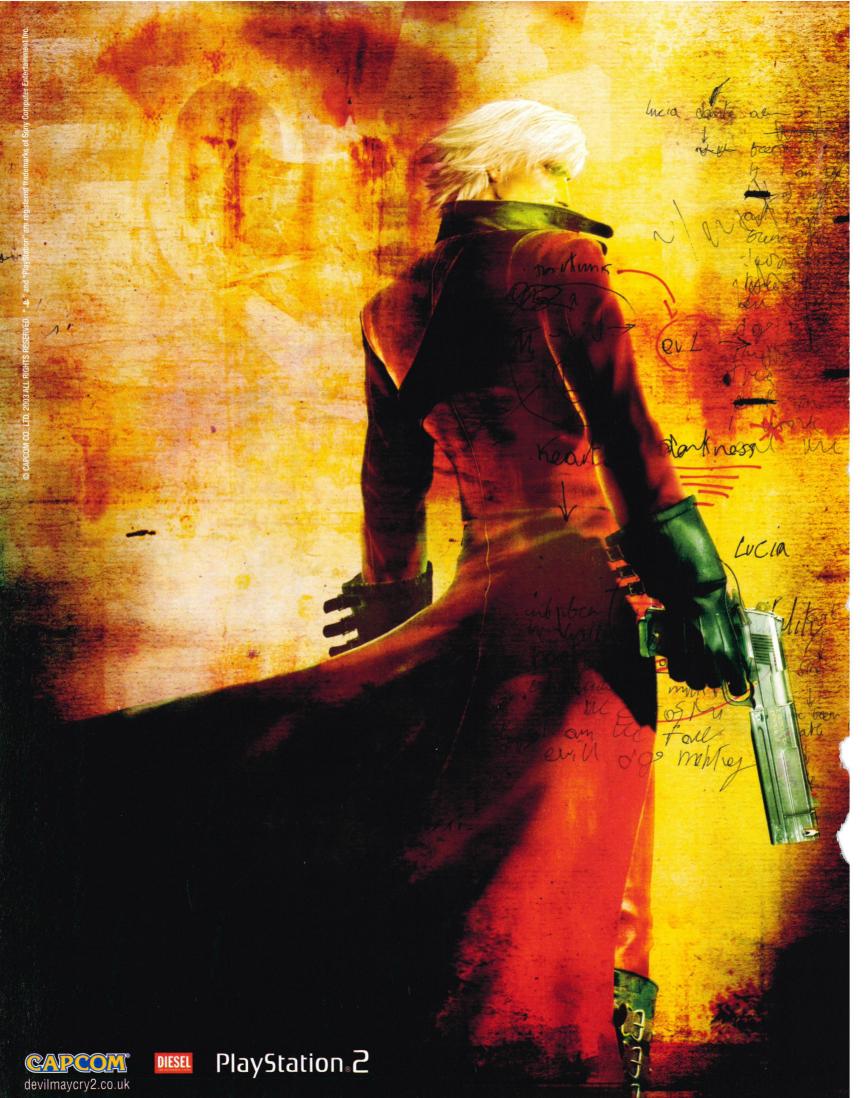

One corner of the computer game universe has always been more shadowy than the rest. Despite the colourful antics of Mario, Sonic, Crash and their cuddly friends, the themes the hardcore crave

have been darker and more complex: Intrigue. conspiracy theories and men in black catsuits darting through the darkness like tooled-up stag beetles. Yes, the coolest games on PlayStation 2 are espionage thrillers - one lone, grizzled anti-hero taking on the bad guys and saving the world, deploying an international conflict's worth of advanced weaponry and gadgets along the way, and outwitting or destroying the foolish legion of enemies standing between him and glorious democracy

And so it is that Metal Gear Solid's Solid Snake and Deus Ex's JC Denton find themselves making room for a new arrival to their secret underground bunker of alpha masculinity and covert gruffness. They probably won't get along, though. Splinter Cell's Sam Fisher is an archetypal special ops man: he works alone, he doesn't trust his boss, he doesn't like cigarettes (Snake, please note) and he doesn't play by the rules. What he does have however, is a requisite selection of guns and gadgets, as well as all the right moves. Wall jumps, door peeks, abseiling, split jump shooting and drop attacks are second nature to this old-time spook. Fisher may be going a bit grey around the temples, but the steel wolf still has a few tricks up his sleeve.

It's Fisher's sheer presence as a game character that demonstrates the best elements of Splinter Cell. From the very start, as you investigate the disappearance of two US spies in Georgia, Fisher is

utterly believable as a highly trained covert operative. His hand-animated movement is super smooth and, yoked to the Dual Shock 2's analogue sensitivity, is convincingly focused – you really feel in control as he sneaks through the buildings and back alleys. The cannily context-sensitive range of special moves, particularly with respect to climbing, means you get to crawl over the old town quarter of Tbilisi, shimmying up drain pipes and over rooftops before zip-lining across the street to infiltrate the police station without once needing to refer to the game's manual. We've only been playing for one minute and already Splinter Cell feels spectacular.

#### WAR ON TERROR

As for the plot, in the light of current events, it's certainly topical. In the fragmenting south of the former Soviet Union, a UN peace-keeping operation goes wrong in Georgia. The president, a nasty piece of

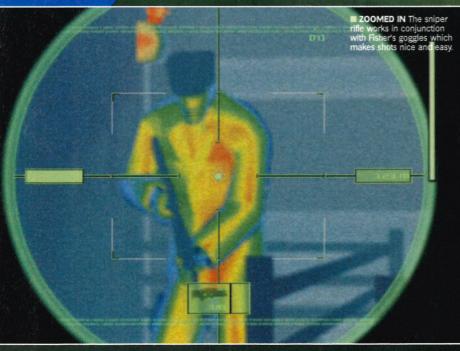
work called Kombayn Nikoladze, launches a virtual terrorist attack on For an encore he plans to build a dirty radioactive bomb, and yes, you

guessed it, it's your job as Fisher to unravel the web of his operations and close them down for good. The action is spread across ten levels, ranging from an oil rig in the Caspian Sea, to a nuclear power station in Russia and the Chinese Embassy in Burma, before climaxing in the Georgian presidential palace back in Tbilisi. Cut-scenes between each level provide commentary on the global repercussions of this tense

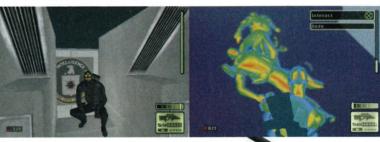

But if Fisher is the star of the show, his best supporting actor has to be the fully controllable 3D camera. Like Fisher himself, it's smooth and reactive, meaning you can always see any approaching guards, of which there are plenty. After all, this is a sneaking game first and foremost, and unlike the relatively cartoon capers of Solid Snake and his, ahem, cardboard box, it's a realistic sneaking game. Step out of the shadows and the guards will shoot you. Get too close to a guard, even in the shadows, and he will shoot you. Make a noise, such as walking rather than creeping, and the guards will come over and investigate, and will then probably shoot you. You get the idea.

And if this doesn't make the game hard enough, Ubi Soft's devotion to realism means whenever Fisher even draws a weapon, the speed of his movement slows to a crawl. If your attack falls to take out guards immediately, they will get revenge by – you guessed it – shooting you. Oh, and by the way, it only takes a couple of well-aimed

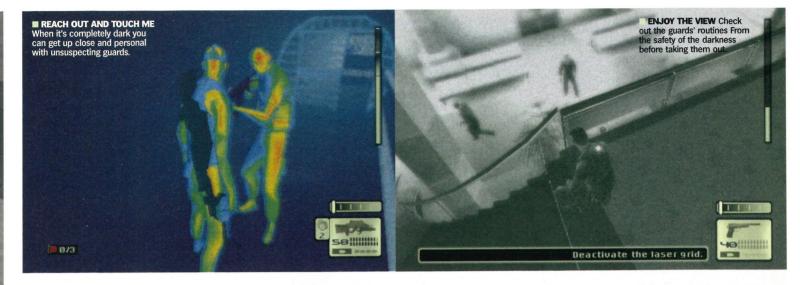


slugs before it's goodnight Tbilisi. Mercifully there are plenty of autosave points. You may want to use these snatched moments to mop up the pools of nervous sweat and (depending on your tolerance for tension) change your underwear.

#### SLOW BURNER

Those who expect *Splinter Cell* to be an all-out action game are in for a rude awakening (and about a kilo of lead in Fisher's chest). Try to enter a room gun blazing and you won't last long – about three seconds. *Splinter Cell* is about moving slowly, considering your strategy and then executing it efficiently and, where possible, without detection. When firepower *is* called for (and don't worry, you won't feel short changed), you'd better go in loud and give the other fella hell.

For all this hiding and seeking to work fluidly, you need to feel confident that when Sam *looks* like he's out of sight, he really *is*. Respect due, then, to Fisher's tools of the trade – in particular, his suit-embedded light meter,



which constantly measures his visibility. If Fisher's light meter reads below one unit, he's practically a ghost, free to crack open his thermos and Marmite sarnies, play solitaire or scratch his ass (quietly) without detection. At five units, he's lit up like a Christmas tree and is probably visible from space let alone from a third floor balcony. It's not long before you come to rely and give thanks for this meter. That's if you can tear your eyes away from the game's often bewitchingly beautiful lighting effects (see Lights, Shadows, Action).

Another vital gizmo is Fisher's green goggles. This dual-purpose headset contains an image intensifier which is used for both seeing in the dark and heat sensitive vision - ideal for picking out guards on patrol. This means you can hide in a naturally dark corner (or create one by shooting out the lights) and then either stun guards with a firm clip around the back of the neck,

creep up and grab them at gunpoint to extract information or simply shoot them from the relative safety of the shadows. The choice of disposal method is usually dictated by the

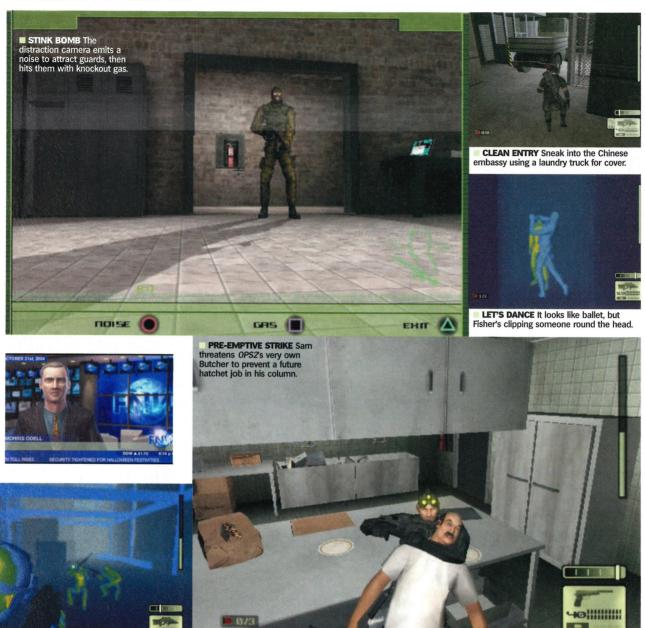








### REVIEU TOM CLANCY'S SPLINTER CELL



HEATSEEKER The thermal imaging mode

As your one man war on terrorism unfolds, you also receive new, spiffier kit. The silenced SC-20K assault rifle has two distinct firing modes – it works as a sniper rifle and also allows Fisher to fire a range of non-lethal ordnance. These include the sticky shocker, which electrifies its target into unconsciousness; the high-impact, zero-penetration ring airfoil projectile; and a variety of controllable cameras which can be fired to check out what's around the corner and under doors (see Pocket Full Of Fun). It's with this arsenal in place that the strategy of sneaking around *Splinter Cell*'s levels, working out the location of guards, security cameras and gun turrets, then taking them out with surgical strikes really comes into its own.

**BUTTON BASHING** Levels are full of keypads. Codes can be found on computers and in guards' bags.



Taking the theme of stealth even further, neutralised guards really can't be left where they fall, so you'll be finding all sorts of inventive places to stash bodies. As well as specific objectives, most missions limit the number of alarms you can trigger before you'll be ordered to abort for fear of causing an international incident. You may be working for the US government but that doesn't mean they want one of their operatives caught with his hand in the enemy's secret cookie jar. There are also certain guarded locations that Fisher can't reach - lookout towers, for example. The decision in such situations is whether to try and get past the guards unnoticed or simply shoot them in the knowledge that it will raise the alert state. It's yet another game design element that makes gung-ho pyrotechnics a direct route to vulnerability.

It's all about changing your gaming mindset. Even if you're a die hard Metal Gear fan you'll find Splinter Cell's take on stealth a refreshing challenge. No-one else has Fisher's abilities and technology, so despite being

outnumbered and outgunned, there's never a situation that's beyond hope. The deciding factor, then, is always your level of skill. Have you got what it takes to win? And *that*'s why you'll

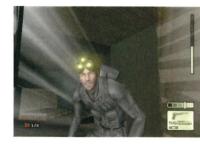

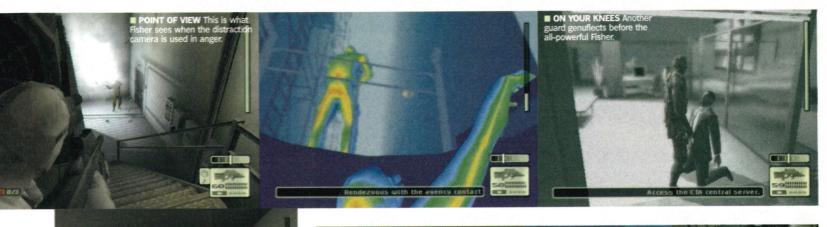

So where's the broken glass on Splinter Cell's floor? The dry twig beneath Fisher's size 11s? For such a well thought out game, the uneven spacing of autosave points is a pity. It's possible to wait 20 tense minutes before one save point and then scarcely over a minute before the next.

You could argue that the level/mission design is overly linear. And, to be fair, there is rarely a choice in your route, even if the methods you use to navigate around/past/through obstacles vary. This said, how often do you think covert operatives in the real world are told, "Well, Brad, we're not sure where you go from here, so have a good old nose around. Hell, go hog wild. Try all the doors. We've got ages"? That's right. Never, Intelligence is power in this line of work. You've got a job to do and the focused gameplay reflects that. The same can be said about the other potential source of regret: Fisher's range of context-sensitive special moves. Some will no doubt be miffed that they can't abseil down any balcony and can only perform that eye-watering split jump in certain corridors. But flowing these into appropriate scenarios merely keeps the gameplay tight and increases your confident control of Fisher. Splinter Cell is challenging enough as it is without having to explore 12 different

possible routes out of an embassy before realising the best way is to walk out of the front door holding a tray of vol-au-vents (and no, that's not a real scenario).

So is Splinter Cell the Metal Gear Solid 2-beater Ubi Soft would like it to be? Well no, because the two games offer surprisingly different gaming experiences. Splinter Cell provides a more realistic sneak-'em-up, but let's face it, MGS2 features sodding great bipedal nuclear tanks, so that's not much of a surprise. No, Splinter Cell stands on its own merits as an intelligent, challenging and beautifully executed addition to the PS2 stealth family, and as such is well worth your attention whether you have MGS2 or not. Frankly, we're looking forward to the return of Fisher already. That's if we see him before he's standing next to us...

#### BACK STORY

Metal Gear Solid 2 is one of the greatest games ever made and we gave it 10/10 back in OPS2#17 MGS2: Substance is a glorified re-release, containing a whole heap of bonus gameplay, plus an accompanying documentary DVD. If you don't own the original, this package represents astounding value. Otherwise, it might depend on just how devoted a Metal Gear fan you are.

You've got to hand it to the man. Hideo Kojima is not only a masterful game designer, he knows how to stir up hype too. What was everyone talking about after the annual E3 games expo in 2001? The *Metal Gear Solid 2* demo – legendary footage of Snake on the tanker shooting up

legendary footage of Snake on the tanker shooting up fire extinguishers and ice buckets. And at E3 2002? The MGS2: Substance video. Snake in a tuxedo, Raiden on a skateboard, 20-foot-tall guards and fluoro-coloured VR missions complete with disintegrating enemies. No-one was really sure what it all meant, but it was sure as hell more diverting than spending ten minutes playing the demo of Robotech: Battlecry.

Nearly a year on, the hype is on its last camotrousered legs and it's time to expose this pseudosequel for what it really is and revel in a little *Substance* abuse. Do we really want more cleverly edited game footage, words prefixed with 'sub', Raiden's naked arse and a surf rock version of the *Metal Gear Solid 2* theme tune? VR missions and skateboarding aside, there is precious little 'new' game in here. No new environments, no new weapons, no new characters. Even the Snake Tales section (which one *OPS2* writer thought might involve our hero, "sneaking up on terrorists in jungles, the arctic and the desert") are a con – they're merely a series of unadventurous 'chapters' set in the all-toofamiliar Big Shell. Whoopy-friggin'-doo.

It's a clever ploy to sell more games off the back of a world-famous name with minimum amount of effort. Think about it. In much the same period of time that elapsed between MGS2 and Substance, GTAIII was transformed into GTA: Vice City – to all extents and purposes, a brand new game. Surely the boys at Konami

could have dressed the Big Shell up as a gothic castle or an LA office complex. Surely?

#### TOP GEAR

Cynicism aside, we can't deny the fact that *Substance* is a really good videogame. It doesn't just extend the shelf life of a particularly luxury product, it reminds you why *Metal Gear* is so important; why it inspired people to crowd around the TV, squawking and bleating like excitable adolescents at the sight of exploding light bulbs and breakable melons. It also proves that no other PS2 action game has such responsive, satisfying controls and why, after some 18 months, *Metal Gear* is still one of the most visually impressive titles to be developed for the console.

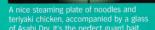
The best new section of *Substance* is a return to the original *Metal Gear's* VR missions. It's the method by which Snake was originally trained in combat, stealth and weapon handling and the perfect opportunity for you to revitalise those special ops skills. In fact, newcomers to the *Metal Gear* universe should complete these first before attempting the full game, which is thoughtfully included on the *Substance* disc. Returning experts will be quick to unlock Variety mode – a series of offbeat 'comedy' missions, special playable characters like naked Raiden, Pliskin Snake and Ninja Raiden, and the inspired Photograph mode which, in Snake's case, mainly involves taking pictures of bikini-clad Japanese glamour models. The filthy dog.

VR missions mirror the skills necessary to be proficient at *Metal Gear* – sneaking and weapon handling – and include a bizarre First-person mode. The sneaking remains the most enjoyable element. There

are ten increasingly complex VR arenas, each with almost infinite scope to complete as you see fit. In some cases you can bundle your way through like a fat man trampling people on a busy tube train. In others, crawling through vents, avoiding noisy sections of gantry, strategically disabling guards with C4 explosives strapped to your back, creating a distraction by tapping on a wall or shooting out security cameras are essential. You'll be using your brain - these are all timed exercises, after all.

#### THIS IS A HOLD-UP

As Metal Gear devotees will know, learning how to use Snake's hold-up skill is important, especially when you're low on ammo. In Substance's Alternative missions there are ten levels where holding up guards is the main aim. It's surprisingly complicated and requires carefully planned routes, eyes that are always pinned to the radar and careful memorisation of guards' movement patterns. In later levels, urgency is introduced through the guards making frequent radio check-ups. Hold up three guards - they'll vapourise right in front of you and they won't check in to HQ, which will alert further unwanted attention.

It is a great feeling to play as Snake or Raiden, pulling the wool over guards' eyes, seeing the little question mark 'dunce hat' appear over their ugly heads, peppering them with trang darts and diverting their attention with carefully-placed jazz mags. The downside

is that when removed from any sense of plot or purpose, it all becomes a little soulless, while the gaudy colour schemes and angular shapes eventually start to feel alienating.

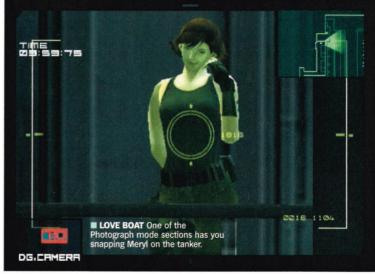

Each weapon has five levels and while practising sniping and machine gun skills is great, lobbing grenades at giant boxes for an hour is not. In fact, it's enough to make you sob uncontrollably. As we struggled with the randomness of the final grenade level, someone next to us was playing Devil May Cry 2. It looked like sweet heaven in comparison to our rotating orange and blue Rubik's cubes. Tears were stifled. At this point, we tried to forget that VR actually stands for virtual reality - what we were playing was really nothing more than a bilecoloured, computer-generated shooting gallery.

No doubt there's 'substance' to the game, with almost 400 missions - however, that figure does include a lot of repetition. All nine VR and Alternative mission sets can be played through with each character of which there are two initially, and five to unlock. Snake gets a comb-over and bow tie and Raiden gets to play with a sword. The missions alter slightly for each character but not enough to provide a new experience each time.

#### LETHAL SUBSTANCE

Let's not forget, Metal Gear Solid 2 is still a benchmark game. For that reason alone we couldn't help but become hooked on Substance, playing it for hours at a time, reattempting failed missions over and over, often walking away wound up like an industrial spring, spitting and shouting in frustration at level six of Snake's hold-up missions. Yet we always returned to it with renewed enthusiasm. It had us involved for a good 20 hours solid, and that's some achievement. The bottom line, though: Are you prepared to buy MGS2 again at full price just for

these 'extras', which could arguably have been included in the original release? We can guess what Otacon's answer would be.

There is, however, an alternative ending to this story. If you don't already own Metal Gear Solid 2, then Substance is an astounding package - a straight ten out of ten. You get the complete original game, all the VR missions, a throwaway Metal Gear skateboarding minigame and a superbly produced 'Making Of DVD. You should go and buy it. Now.

Our last words are for Hideo Kojima: You've had your fun. You've made good money out of us. You've proved you've got a sense of humour and, in part, we fell for it. But it's time pull your finger out, get your head down and make Metal Gear Solid 3. Please.

#### **BACK STORY**

Devil May Cry's super-stylised gameplay was actually the product of early work on Resident Evil 4. Having realised that incessant gunplay didn't quite fit with Resident Evil's creeping claustrophobia, creative supremo Shinji Mikami opted to create a new title altogether. Devil May Cry scored an imperious 9/10 (OPS2#14), redefining the action genre in one fell swoop. Now the sequel arrives amid a whirlwind of hype, but this time it's produced by ex-games journalist, Tsuyoshi Tanaka. Oons.

So Lucifer is kicking back in Hell, torturing the damned and watching over David Gray's career, when a thought occurs to him. "The people are suffering, but not enough for my liking," muses the Dark Lord. "I must destroy something they truly love. Hmm. How about that game starring the chap who dresses like Nick Rhodes and impales himself on swords for fun? Ah, Nick Rhodes... that reminds me..."

Whether you blame Shinji Mikami's defection to GameCube on an *Omen*-style curse or just 'difficult second album' syndrome, the fact remains that *Devil May Cry 2* is a disappointment of unholy proportions. Okay, so following one of the most spectacular games on PS2 was never going to be easy, but not even in our darkest nightmares did we dream that Capcom would deliver a sequel that's inferior to the original in almost every respect. But let's hold the fire and brimstone for a moment because there's an important point that needs to be made: *DMC2* still outclasses most of the third-person fodder wasting shelf space in GAME right now, it's just that we expected – no, demanded – so much more.

So what went wrong? Let's start with the visuals. Gone is the gothic grandeur of the original. The crumbling castles and eerie graveyards have been replaced by environments that often lapse into bland, post-apocalyptic cliche. Sure, there are nice touches – skies full of scudding clouds, an abandoned village and towering brownstone office blocks – but Lucia's underwater missions and the section set in an oil refinery could have been ripped straight out of any action game released in the last 12 months.

#### THE DEVIL MADE ME DO IT

And while the textures might look as crisp as a winter morning in Alaska, the muddy palette leaves everything looking washed-out. Matters aren't helped by patchy enemy design. Yeah, the giant demon goats rule, but the other monsters are pretty anonymous. And let's face it, there are only so many times you can get your rocks off slicing up an amorphous blob. There's nothing in here as gloriously unhinged as the possessed marionettes or scissor-wielding banshees from the original.

All that extra space actually makes it harder to chain combos together, robbing the combat of its frantic claustrophobia

#### BABE. I'M ON FIRE

The whole point of playing Devil May Cry is to make you feel like the coolest cat in Christendom. It's supposed be an adrenaline-gargling orgy that leaves you punching the air, screaming: "Dakka dakka! Suck my hollow points you scumbags!" But the reality is that you're more likely to greet each apologetic gaggle of enemies waiting to be filleted with a shrugged, "Whatever." The problem is, the gameplay just doesn't feel as kinetic this time out. You can be standing there, whacking the absolute granny out of a boss, and although its energy bar is gradually being chipped away, the game doesn't reward you with any other stimuli - visual, aural or otherwise - to suggest that the demon-spawn is taking one hell of a beating. You find yourself just slashing away blindly without ever really savouring the kill.

The situation is compounded by some decidedly shaky camera work (DMC2 uses a mixture of fixed and chase angles) which conspires to flip the movement axes without warning and regularly leaves you fighting assailants that are off-screen altogether. In one particularly aggravating sequence, Dante has to climb the shattered floors of a burning stairwell, while fending off the attentions of a mutant helicopter. It's like trying to jump around one of those Escher drawings with the cockamamie perspective.

Speaking of confusing structures, Tanaka's team has decided to implement an entirely new upgrade system. Dante and Lucia still collect new weapons on their travels but they lack character compared to the Alastor and Ifrit from the last game. Upgrading your arsenal is still a matter of collecting red orbs, but they're no longer used to buy specific attacks. Now you just enhance your

chosen weapon on a level-by-level basis. We assume this enables stronger attacks but, to be honest, the extra impact is negligible.

CH VOLTAGE

aren't standing directly underneath you is like trying to chip a golf ball onto a beer mat. Dante can also aim in opposite directions by firing over one shoulder or adopting a cruciform pose. Again, it looks absolutely mint, but the animation is triggered automatically – it's dependent on how the enemies are placed – so it's hard to incorporate into your showboating. Oh, and the new auto-targeting system has done some serious damage

watered-down version of *Devil May Cry* is still more thrilling than squandering time on licensed dreck like *Blade II*.

#### THE NUMBER OF THE BEAST

There's a 'but' coming now, and it's big one. Technically, *DMC2* is a much larger game than its predecessor, arriving on two discs with 18 missions for Dante and 13 for Lucia. The characters share certain locations but also have their own dedicated areas and bosses, meaning as a package *DMC2* should offer significantly more value than its older sibling. So how does seven hours sound to you? That's how quickly it took us to clock the whole



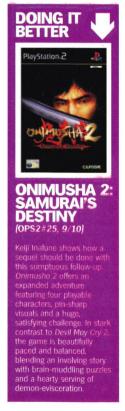
shooting match on the default setting. Capcom has clearly reacted to the criticism that *Devil May Cry* was just too darned tricky for casual players. The answer? Take a butcher's knife to the difficulty level.

We might as well be brutal about this: your mum will be able to complete it. Chances are, so will your dog. Almost every single boss can be beaten without breaking a sweat using no-brainer, fire-and-forget tactics. Heck, stand in a certain spot and a few of 'em can't even hit you. Likewise, slicing and dicing the grunt monsters is little more than a chore – busywork to keep you occupied on the sprint towards the credits. Yes, you can play through again on harder settings – including the Must Die mode where the enemies have their own Devil Trigger abilities and the bosses pack a real punch – but is that really incentive enough?

We've read your letters, we know you don't think seven hours justifies spending 40 quid and that's why we're welling up. The original was, and still is, a startlingly good game. But *Devil May Cry 2* is little more than a pale facsimile and − worse − it's over before it's even begun. Meanwhile, back in Hell, Lucifer sits back, scratches his burning balls and starts to laugh... □ **Tim Clark**

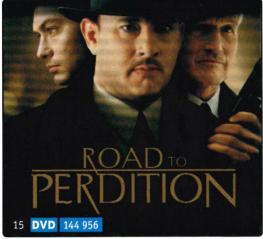

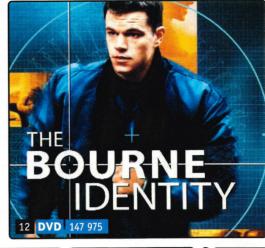

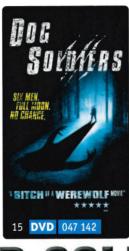


















































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## RAYMAN 3: HOODLUM HAVOC

#### BACK STORY

Ubi Soft's mascot first appeared on consoles such as the Atari Jaguar, Sega Saturn and 3D0, before colonising virtually every other platform in existence. Coded by the French company's own in-house team, Rayman games have always had a reputation for being well-crafted and challenging.

Rayman's back on PlayStation 2! It doesn't exactly sound like party-starting news. But even if the prospect of another Rayman game doesn't make you quiver with anticipation, if

you've ever enjoyed a 3D platformer in the past you owe it to yourself to check out this latest instalment. Crazy, French, and a lot like Rayman 2 it may be, but it's also one of the most enjoyable games of its type.

The plot? Well, it isn't going to make a great deal of sense unless you're a rabid Rayman fan or you're having an intense out-of-body experience. But for the uninitiated, there are these things called Lums which are some sort of positive energy blobs. Rayman eats them to restore his health, as far as we can tell. Whatever they're for, they're plainly of great importance - maybe they're what keeps his hands attached to his body (he starts the game with no mitts, the poor mite). But everything is thrown into chaos when the negative Dark Lums and Hoodlums take control, leaving Rayman's best mate, a giant purple thing called Globox, completely out of his mind on fermented plum juice.

Being a bit of a heroic type, Ray takes matters into his own disembodied hands and embarks on a quest to free the Teensies, which are little talking mice with big noses and crowns. And there are some fairles involved,

too. Got that? Good.

Now cue one seriously odd. psychedelic platform adventure, in which Ray surfs through the sky, explores ramshackle environments that look like primary coloured cartoon sets from the City Of Lost Children movie, and drives around using one of his own shoes as a turbo-charged sports car.

While the basic jumping and fighting mechanism has been done hundreds of times before, Rayman 3's sense of imagination and polished gameplay set it apart from the average 3D platformer. It's so slick, varied and wellpaced that for every derivative sub-game or frustratingly fiddly task that threatens to spoil the experience, there's certain to be something just around the corner that will prove more interesting or, at the very least, wake you up with a cold, hard slap of stunning visual flair.

The game's good looks are less about technical excellence than vivid, evocative artwork. The locations are solid and believable, despite being impossible constructions of scrap wood, bulbous stones and particles of light. The Hoodlums are made of scraps of leather, held together with chunky bootlaces and rivets. Some of the characters, particularly Globox and the Teensies, are less loveable than the game's designers would like you to think, but for the most part, it's one of the better looking games around at the moment.

#### PUNCH DRUNK GLOVE

Key to many of the game's puzzles are Ray's upgradeable gloves. By touching different coloured cans, it's possible to gain super strength for battering down doors or a whirlwind punch for knocking down larger objects to form new platforms. There's also a grappling claw, for swinging between rings suspended over

The special powers have a tight time limit, so whenever you find one it's pretty obvious what you're supposed to do with it. After all, it won't last until the next area, and this being a fairly straightforward, linear sort of game, there's little backtracking required to access parts of earlier rooms.

There's a whole heap of fighting to be done, which can be the most difficult aspect of Rayman 3, particularly when there are several different types of enemy attacking at once. They all have particular weaknesses which must be countered by collecting the right sort of power-up or making nimble use of the controls which allow Ray's fists to be thrown so they curl around corners. Holding the shoulder buttons activates a lock-on targeting system, allowing Ray to dodge projectiles while fighting, and he can throw his boomerang fists two at a time.

Hoodlum Havoc isn't quite as hard as previous Rayman titles, with fewer of the pixel-perfect jumping sections and disappearing platforms that characterised the first two games. But that doesn't mean it's a dumbed-down Rayman for the mass market. Even though you'll probably be able to quickly complete it if you're reasonably good at games, finding all of the bonus goodies and mastering the new score combo system are challenges for the truly dedicated.

Score combos are achieved by collecting items and defeating enemies as quickly as possible. For example, collecting five gems might earn you 50 points, but do it quickly enough and the scores will be combined to award an extra 50 as a bonus. The more you score, the quicker Rayman 3's impressive array of bonus games and video clips will be unlocked.

Hoodlum Havoc will certainly keep you occupied for a good while, especially if you enjoy games with more secret stuff than most people could possibly find. It's more of an old-skool platformer than, say, Ratchet & Clank, but the bottom line is that Rayman 3 is a lot of fun to play and a real treat to look at. What more could you ask for?

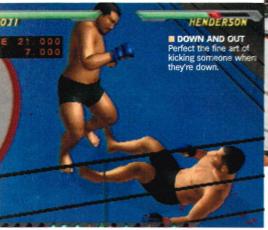

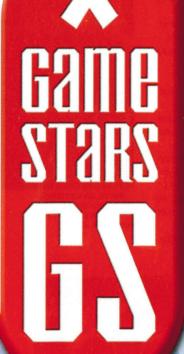






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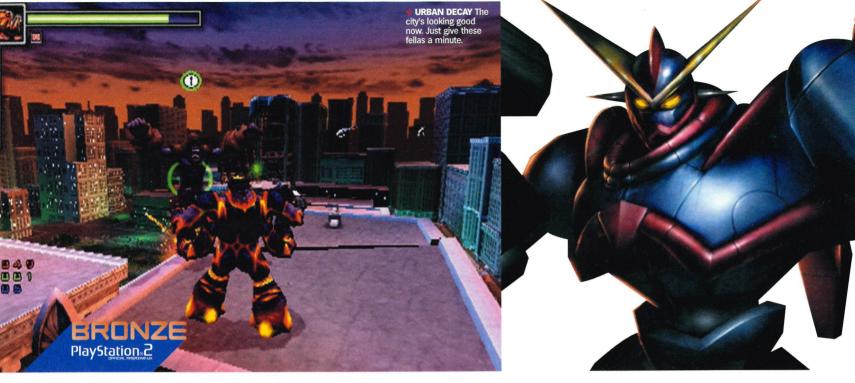

#### BACK STORY

Incog Inc Is the team behind Twisted Metal: Black and the highly anticipated Twisted Metal: Black Online. It was recently bought by SCEE and has taken time out from mashing cars and blowing stuff up to make a game about beating up monsters... and blowing stuff up.

Imagine if, back in the Fifties, the creators of cheapo monster films of the East and West got together to work out which B-movie behemoth would kick the others' humungous arses in a brutal battle to the death. The resulting movie might not have been box-office plutonium but it would have looked a lot like *War Of The Monsters*. All the classic types of monster movie creature are here: giant lizards, giant robots, giant apes, giant statues, giant insects and – of course – giant eyeballs with bodies made out of electricity. Okay, that last one might be pushing things a bit, but you've got to appreciate

Here's where we stand: aliens are trying to invade the Earth and humanity's last, desperate super-weapon has spilled radioactive alien fuel everywhere, creating towering mutant creatures. Rushed scientific projects to build robot defenders mean that huge abominations, each with their own particular set of special skills, now roam the Earth getting into scraps. Up to speed? Good, because that's as complicated as the story gets.

Our pick of the creatures is Congar, a big monkey whose speciality is climbing, jumping and roaring energy at his enemies. Another of our favourites is Ultra-V,

whose forte is laser beams and energy sword action. Fans of big Japanese robots need look no further.

Each giant beast is accessible and fun to control. When Congar hits, he really clubs his enemy with those big monkey mitts; Ultra-V takes more of a kung fu robot approach. These are subtle distinctions but they make all the difference to a game that could potentially suffer from its basic tenet of smashing monsters' faces in. And you'll fight more that just the main characters – aliens, giant ants and mutated plantlife are all on hand to make the shenanigans even more interesting.

So War Of The Monsters does pretty much what you'd expect – it's war, between various monsters – but it does it very, very well. We're not burdened with any motivational back story about why the electrical creature Kinecticlops wants to smash everything around him. Mad with his dad? Inferiority complex? Who cares? If you're desperate to label the game, we suppose you could say that it's a 3D beat-'em-up, but when you can smash your opponent through a skyscraper, use tanks as guns and skewer unsuspecting gargantuans on radio antennae, we suspect that this description might not adequately cover the appeal. In the Adventure mode, for example, the variety of different challenges you face includes dodging

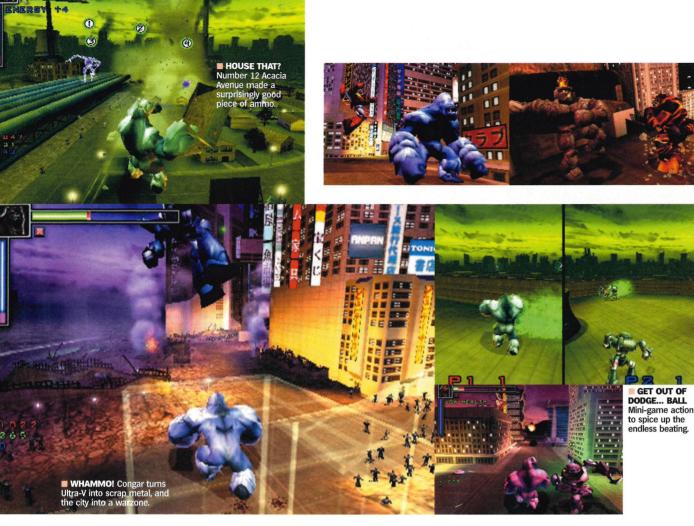

explosive balls before lobbing them back at your robotic adversary, taking on a double-team attack from two dragons at Century Airfield, smashing a robo-Congar over a building, and wading into a massive free-for-all on an alien spacecraft. The game's many elements add real variety to the level-based single-player game and, while each objective is essentially about smacking your opponents around a destructible cityscape, it's a massively enjoyable experience from start to finish.

#### SMASH SOMETHING

The arenas are, for the most part, enclosed areas within high-rise cities filled with screaming crowds to stomp and traffic and buildings to knock to smithereens, with the resulting debris creating plenty of ammunition to lob around. Playing is a hectic experience full of exciting moments - you'll often find yourself flying through the air into a skyscraper or being belted straight into the ocean. In drawn-out battles you can literally lay waste to a whole section of a city, leaving just you and your opponent standing in a wasteland of smouldering building foundations. Players can choose to bring tactics into play or just concentrate on collecting as much radiation as possible and smacking opponents with literally anything within reach. Stuck for something to throw? Just whack the nearest building and pick up the debris. The sense of fun that pervades the game has surprising longevity too. Believe it or not, we're still discovering new ways of scrapping in the big cities.

War Of The Monsters offers a solid, if short, singleplayer game, but it's the two-player mode that makes it a real party. Tokens accumulated at the end of each battle are spent unlocking new characters, costumes or

arena and attempting to lob a big green meteorite at his head. The concept's still simple, but combined with plenty of friends (battling two at a time) it makes for some exemplary monster-smashing fun. There's nothing quite like the first time you play against a mate in a freefor-all with other monsters, watching them marvel at how cool it is to be a gigantic praying mantis while you wait around the street corner to impale them with a bit of twisted metal, or simply belt them clean across Midtown Park with a girder screaming, "You like that, you insect?" You can't put a price on such happiness.

This game is a simple concept that, thanks to its imagination and humour, becomes a singularly satisfying gaming experience. Open the box expecting a convoluted plot with cinematic cut-scenes or challenging twists and turns, and you'll be disappointed. Ultimately, after completing the mission levels, the single-player mode's ceaseless button-bashing might become tiresome, but invite some friends over to play and you'll soon see where that extra money went. You're a monster, you don't get on with other monsters and you're stuck in a fully wreckable B-movie set. What are you going to do? Start smashing things, that's what.

To us, it's just one of Alan Partridge's mortifying catchphrases, but back in 1993. Spielberg's sharp-taloned blockbuster carried a moral message: when man plays God, nature gets prehistoric on his ass. So why it's taken so long for some bright spark to make Jurassic Park into a God sim is anyone's guess.

A full decade on from the original franchise, Jurassic Park: Operation Genesis is finally ready to hatch. In an egg-shell, it's Theme Park with big teeth - but given the relative scarcity of quality God sims on PlayStation 2, this is no had thing

As park manager, you're responsible for constructing your park from the terraformed soil up. The learning curve is steep: OPS2's ill-advised attempt at a free-range park saw customers fleeing from roaming lizards before they got a chance to splash their hard-earned at the burger hut. But the Exercises mode introduces you to a team of experts who will teach you the surprisingly versatile control method and guide you through the creation of a fully-functioning monster paradise.

The most important element of any modern business is the customer. As usual, however, they're a fickle bunch. Some tender souls will be happiest watching mummy and daddy Stegosaurus grazing by a lake from a leisurely safari ride. Others - the thrill-seekers - will only have their dino-lust sated by the sight of shrieking reptilians tearing cows into bloody gobbets from the dubious safety of a viewing dome. It's your job to please everyone, all the time - and then flog them the overpriced souvenirs before they hop on the chopper home.

So far, so familiar: a bunch of beautifully-animated dinosaurs is a good start, but it can't disguise the fact

that this whole genre is well trod. Luckily, innovation runs deep beneath this game's leathery skin. Building scarier monsters isn't just about waving wads of cash. Oh no. Fresh DNA can be unearthed by intrepid archeological teams in around-the-world fossil hunts, then refined into beasts for your hatchery, or flogged on the black market. Meanwhile, you've got a crew of eggheads in the research lab working on everything from disease vaccines to hot air balloon rides, extending the game's life span and providing everything you'll need to build your park into a prehistoric Eden.

In keeping with the film, we will leave on a cautionary note. Right now, the sun is shining, the punters are grinning, and those beasts look awful docile behind those high security fences. But wait – is that a tornado we can see brewing on the horizon? We are going to be okay, aren't we? Aren't we? Louis Pattison

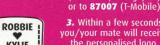

### VEXX

#### Another day, another platformer, But make room, it's got claws...

Any hopes or fears that the traditional platform game genre is on its last legs are unfounded. Vexx is the most recent in a long line of Western-developed hopefuls to

challenge the greats of the genre. The introduction to the game tells the story of young Vexx, a creature intent on avenging his grandfather's murder at the hands of the evil invader Dark Yabu and his shadowraiths.

It's obvious that, as with Sly Raccoon's stealth or Ape Escape's monkey hunting, any new venture into this genre now demands a hook to make it stand out from the crowd. Vexx's special feature is a huge pair of claws which attach themselves permanently to his previously mundane digits. These claws give Vexx some striking offensive moves and provide a legitimate excuse for the platforming staples of wall climbing and ceiling traversing. With good timing it's possible to juggle enemies using the claws, which in turn charges Vexx's power gauge and allows him to unleash more powerful combo attacks. This system works well - it even elevates the combat sections to the par of a beat-'em-up at times. But, unfortunately, enemy design is mainly uninspired, and the same – or very similar – enemies appear in all the different worlds, be they desert, forest or ice-themed. It soon becomes apparent that the innovative combat is very much secondary to more traditional platform fare.

Fortunately, there is a solid platform game beneath all this. There are ten worlds to explore, and within each world there are up to ten shadowraith hearts to be found or won. Refreshingly, these hearts can be collected in a fairly open order. The structure is familiar to any Mario fan: unlock a certain number of shadowraiths and you can open the next world from a central room. Collect 60 shadowraiths and you'll gain access to the final boss, Dark Yabu - and the extra twenty-odd wraiths will keep any completist nice and busy.

The meat of the game is made up of a myriad of platforming elements and tricks that have been seen countless times before. There are as many types of platform as you care to mention (spinning, invisible, seesaw, moving) and, impressively, pretty much everything you can see in the level is reachable, making for some enjoyable head-scratching moments.

It seems Acclaim has thrown everything but the kitchen sink at Vexx in terms of ideas: there's a light and dark theme, upgradable armour, a combo-based fighting engine, non-linear levels and puzzle elements. But all these genre pieces come together to become only slightly more than the sum of their parts and, in most cases, slightly less than the sum of their inspiration.

We have already seen most of Vexx's ideas better executed in other recently released platformers and while this is a good game, it's never great. If you're a platform lover there's much here to attract you, but if you're looking for innovation and genre progression, you'd do best to look elsewhere.

#### BACK STORY

Set in Seattle in the year 2019, the US has become a third-world country after terrorists detonated an electromagnetic-pulse bomb to destroy America's technology. Max (Jessica Albal was one of 12 genetically-enhanced child soldiers who escaped from the Seattle, Bike courier by day, she becomes a PVC-clad motorcycle riding do-gooder by night, helping Logan Cale, a wheelchair bound rebel, to fight agains crime and corruption

Based on the cancelled US TV series of the same name, Dark Angel is a stylistic blend of PS2 games like Buffy The Vampire Slayer and Spider-Man. The show's concept - a genetically

modified girl-soldier escapes an evil corporation to start a new life in Seattle - was part-spun by Terminator and Titanic Director James Cameron, Set in a dystopian future, Dark Angel didn't just offer episodic, superherostyle crime fighting. Serving up more than simple she-fi eye-candy, it weaved its high-kicking action together with a 'who am I?' narrative and a 'will they/won't they' romantic sub-plot between the two lead characters.

Dark Angel on PS2 abandons most of the elements that made the TV show interesting, focusing instead on the thump-'em-up basics. You take control of runaway heroine Max, the product of a hush-hush genetic program that spliced human DNA with animal DNA in pursuit of the ultimate soldier. Blessed - or cursed with cat-like reflexes, super-strength, super-sight and super-memory, Max must work her way through a

series of levels. Guided by hints and pointers from her partner Logan, she can reach the end of a level by either sneaking MGS-style past guards or battling it out in big freeform brawls. Much button-thumping is required.

As you'd expect, Max can kick, punch and jump, and by using these moves in combination, you can perform sweeping kicks, aerial back flips and jaw-busting doublepunches. The more Max fights, the higher her Rage power bar rises. When full, Max can unleash a series of devastating (slow-mo) hits with the bursts of dexterity and gravity-defying acrobatics that will be familiar to fans of the show. In addition, Max can also grapple enemies to throw them around in open combat, or

silently attack from behind. A first-person view (with zoom) and a series of pick-up objects - explosives, health packs, gun ammunition - extend the brawling basics, while Max can also hide behind corners and hang from ceilings.

At first glance, Dark Angel seems to be a faithful (albeit badly rendered) version of the TV show. But what it lacks is depth. Levels are often little more than a series of fights in search of a key that will give you access to the next level. The locations are limited, the background objects are unusable and your freedom of movement is restricted. Sections of the game are constantly loaded and detract from the game experience, while boss battles offer nothing different to a hundred games that have gone before it.

Dark Angel looks realistic, but not even fans of the series will find much to like here.

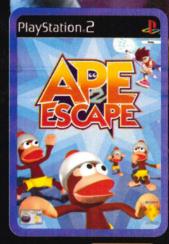

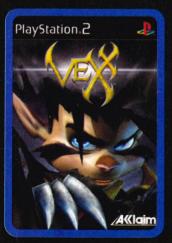

grey, futuristic corridors is your idea of fun, Galerians: Ash is going to rock your world. The developer appears to have extracted the very worst aspects of survival horror and RPG, wrapped them up in a convoluted plot with lazy play mechanics and a painfully inadequate combat system, and stuffed

them incompetently into your emotion engine.

The most original aspect of this game is the fact that it uses the suffix 'Ash' to demonstrate its sequel status instead of a more traditional '2'. The player is first subjected to an immeasurably complicated introductory cut-scene illustrating what happened in the first PSone game. It's like a collision between Ghost In The Shell and War And Peace (ie, confusing and very long) and concerns a self aware mother computer (Dorothy) that revolts against her human creators and spawns her own race of psychic mutants, the Galerians.

You play as Rion, one of Dorothy's genetically modified children, and must destroy the computer's legacy. As soon as the game starts, you can smell the crusty play mechanics. Gameplay is almost exclusively of the go-to-X-and-fetch-Y variety. However, once you actually get to X, you'll soon discover that Y is, in fact, somewhere else. And so begins a wild goose chase that's been implemented in order to avoid actually having to come up with any decent, coherent gameplay.

Frustratingly, there are never any clear signs to indicate what it is you have to do next. This is fine for the first couple of hours, during which you can quickly visit all the locations and easily stumble across the next clue, but as the map expands, anger sets in as you duck into each and every room on the off chance it might trigger the next merciful cut-scene.

Combat is no better. Initially Rion has three psychic attacks available to him. The player must charge each of these attacks for good a few seconds before it can be used, during which time the player is susceptible to attack. If you're hit, your charge meter will reset and you will be forced to start all over again.

Rion also has a shield which only points in one direction, and which he cannot charge while it's in use. This is a real shame because a few simple tweaks could have made Ash's combat system so much better - few things are more frustrating in a game than unwarranted death. Thankfully, the corridors you journey through are so under-populated that you rarely meet enemies, but this merely leaves you to suffer the ever tedious find 'n' fetch gameplay

The game's graphics are no more distinguished. The bland uninspiring levels are inhabited by blocky and awkward character models who talk in Z-list American actor accents. To be honest, pretty much everything about this game grates after prolonged play. Only the most persistent or forgiving of gamers will persevere and see the credits roll.

### **EVERBLUE 2**

This place is a dive, let's just get wrecked.

The original Everblue may have been visually intriguing but it was about as much fun as walking around a field with a metal detector. To its credit, though, the quirky diving sim often looked fantastic and it had some charm.

Everblue 2 offers more of the same aquatic action. Nearly a year has passed since the events in first game. You now find yourself stranded in the Caribbean, broke and only able to afford the most basic diving equipment. The game is split into two distinct sections. Valentir is a series of static locations with people to talk to, tasks to complete and places to visit. To earn money, you must complete the featured tasks and salvage lost trinkets from the Caribbean deep. The more money you earn, the better the equipment you can buy, which in turn enables you to dive deeper in search of better treasure.

Then there are the beautiful 3D dive sequences – dappled lighting, bright coral reefs, darting fish, dolphins and turtles. The longer you swim and salvage, the more

locations become available. But, there are no puzzles. Your brain is rarely tugged, let alone stretched. Instead you follow a speech-bubble story line and perform a series of fetch-and-carry missions. Atmospheric it may be, but *Everblue 2* is often repetitive and tiresome.

There is little challenge here. It amuses but doesn't engage; frustrates rather than delights. How ironic that a game about the ocean has so little depth. 

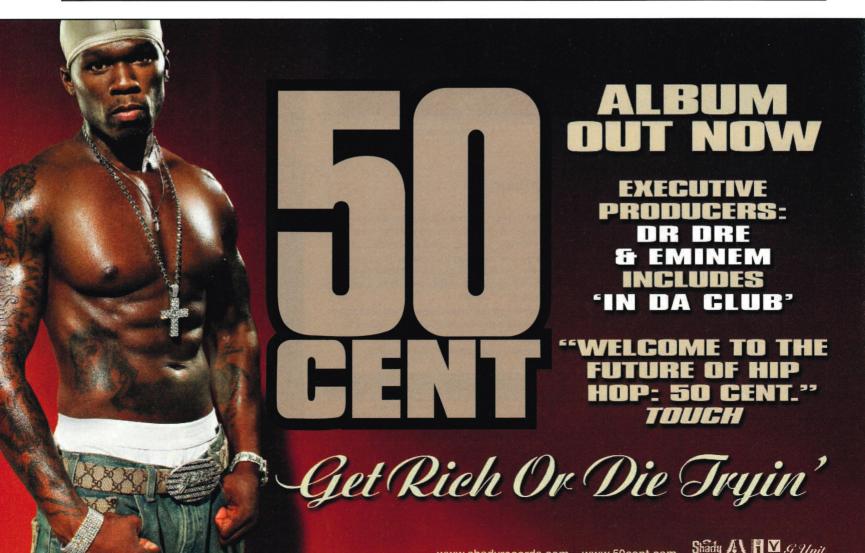

Successful driving and destruction brings rewards in the form of new motors and useful bits of kit, but the game is a write-off when compared to the similar but infinitely superior titles out there. With the original Burnout now enjoying a Platinum run out, this Runabout is far from a bargain.

### **DAKAR 2**

We've been through the desert on a horse of a game.

Ever since Sega invented the 3D rally game in 1995 there has been a steady flow of off-road titles vying for our attention. In the PS2 era, that flow has become a deluge - the

bandwagon careered off track long ago. The better examples of the crowded genre take the realistic fork, but a few lazy developers still choose to opt for 'arcade' (read 'basic') handling.

Dakar 2 feels light and twitchy next to something like Colin McRae's weighty sophistication. Like an arcade racer that hasn't been made by an arcade developer, everything feels wrong. The premise is a real-life race between 4X4 cars, motorbikes or trucks that takes place annually from Paris to the Senegalese capital Dakar. It's kind of like Wacky Races, without Dastardly and Muttley. The game is divided into 12 stages which take the form of different courses or laps on a track.

Locations are as varied as the licence allows, but the difficulty curve is all wrong. By far the toughest races occur halfway through the game where you have to

negotiate the sprawling Sahara, devoid of co-driver support or track indicators. This would be fine (and in keeping with the subject material) but for the fact that the other 100-plus competitors seem to know exactly where they are going at all times.

Dakar 2 won't take long for the competent to complete, with the only replay value provided by unlockable vehicles. With so many other better racers available, what's the point?  $\square$  Simon Parkin

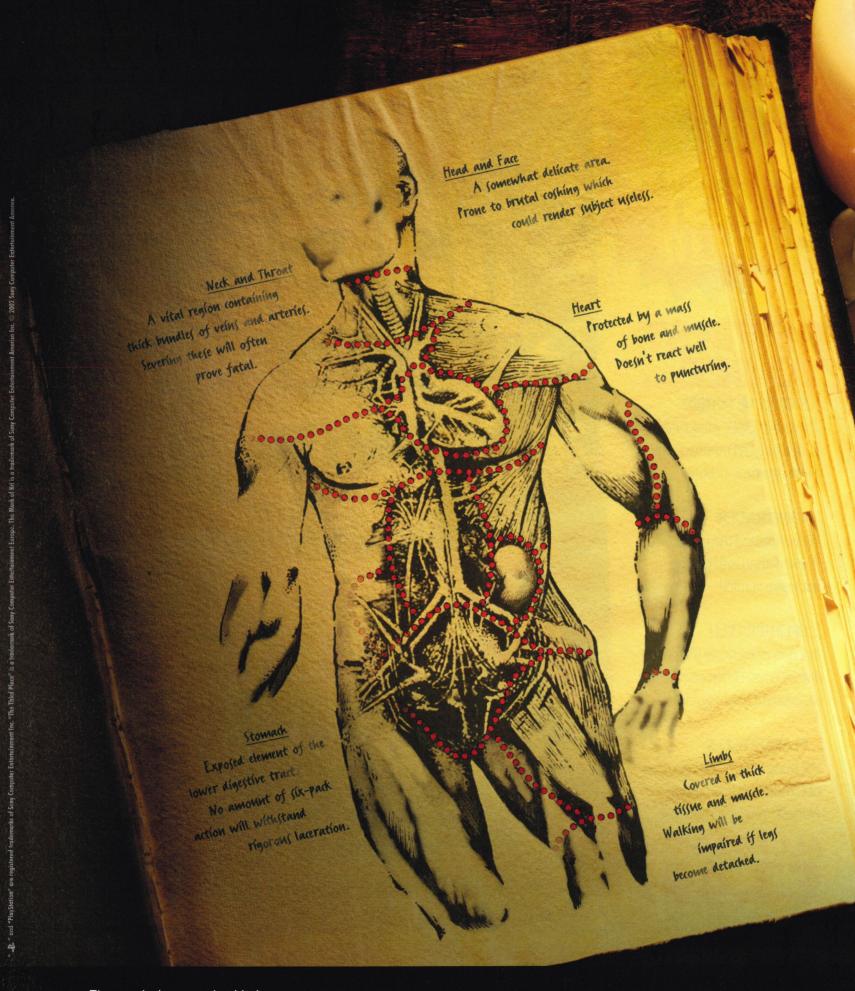

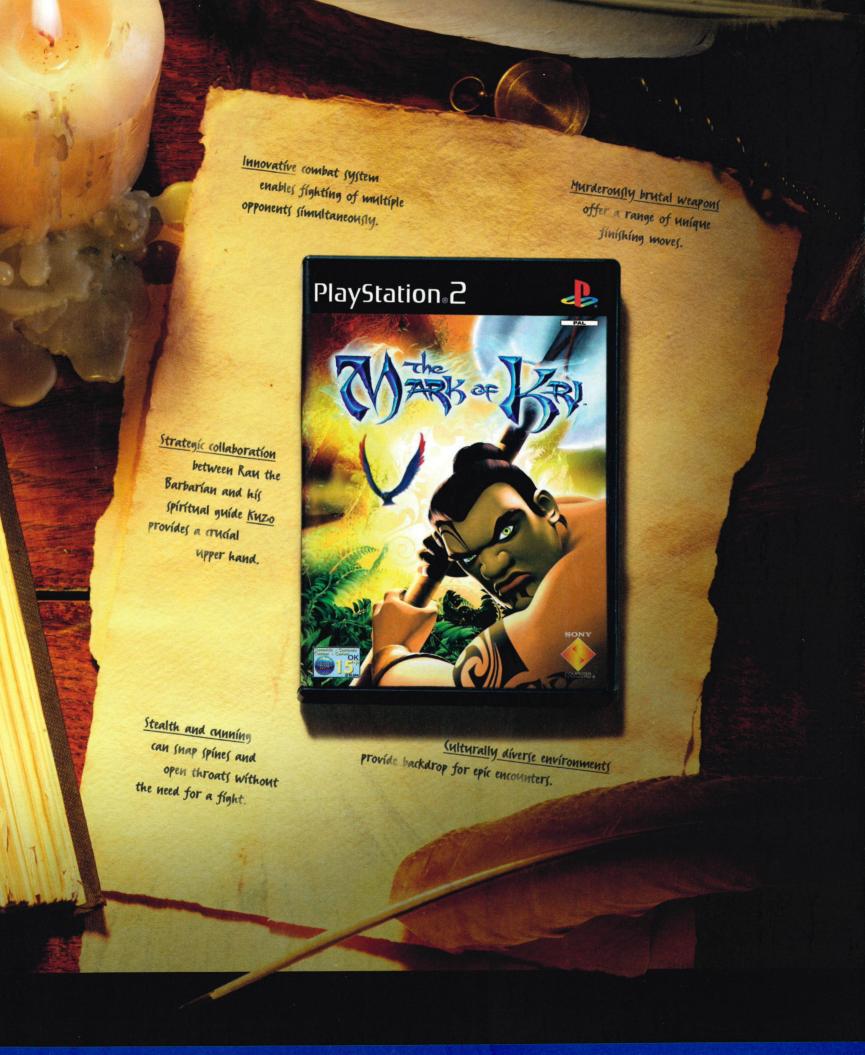

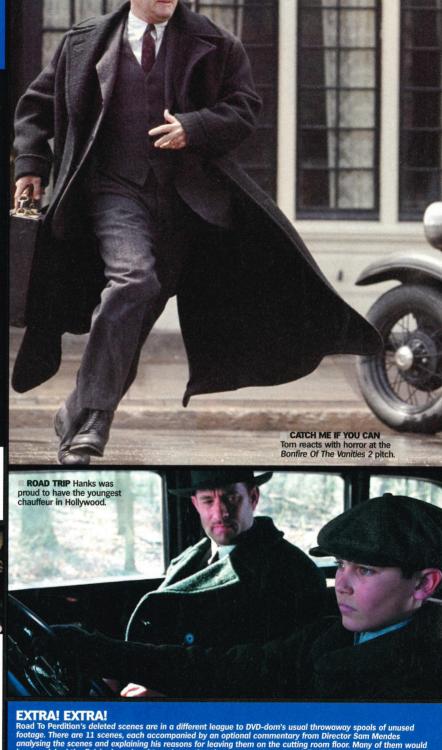

Made in-between his Oscar-laden debut American Beauty and his current project, Getting Off With The Lovely Kate Winslet, Sam Mendes' drama fits snugly alongside the likes of The Untouchables and Miller's Crossing in the second echelon of gangster classics (top dogs? The Godfather and GoodFellas, natch).

The story arc is fairly predictable and Mendes is arguably so intent on making a 'masterpiece' that the movie sometimes wallows in atmosphere at the expense of narrative drive. But thanks to its evocative focus on the relationship between fathers and sons, the uniformly superb performances, and a magnificent visual style, Road To Perdition emerges as a film of rare class. 8/10 **EXTRAS:** A Making Of that takes in the usual mix of talking heads and on-set footage, but benefits from a fascinating bunch of interviewees. 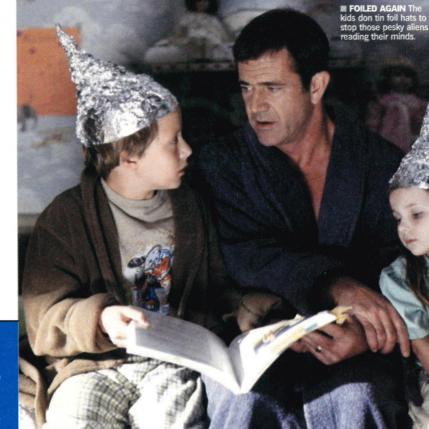

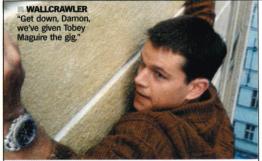

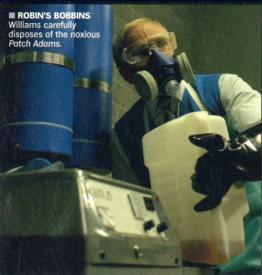

# Hideo Kojima At The Movies

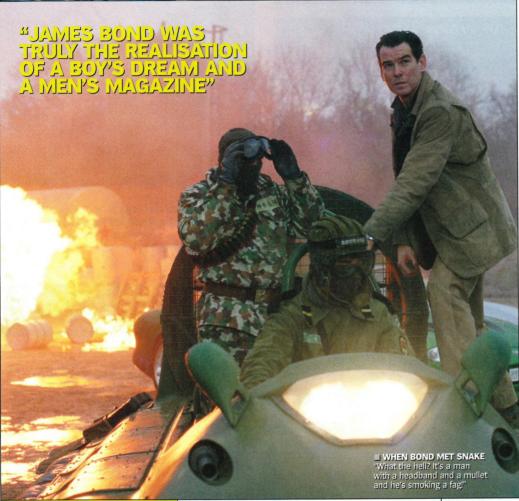

# Kojima's favourite Bond movie?



Spy Who Loved Me

You just can't pin the man down to a single one: "My favourite Bond films are From Russia With Love, Goldfinger and Thunderball. They all turn out to be films from the first Bond boom

with Sean Connery as James Bond. You Only Live Twice is another favourite of mine. I cannot forget the large-scale action towards the end in the secret base. The most memorable film for me is Thunderball, in which Connery wears a bright orange diving suit. I am certainly a fan of From Russia With Love just like most Bond freaks The reason why this one is popular is probably because of the romanticism flowing throughout the film unseen in other Bond films," And that's not mentioning Moonraker or The

In this column I've talked about movies that have influenced MGS – The Great Escape, The Guns Of Navarone, Escape From New York, North By Northwest, Planet Of The Apes and Dawn Of The Dead. There

is no doubt that these films served as nutrients for the human being Hideo Kojima and became the flesh of MGS. This issue I'll talk about the nucleus of MGS – 007. With 22 films from a 40-year period, there's no way I can choose just one, so I'll cover the series as a whole.

Without 007, there would have been no MGS – a secret mission on which hangs the fate of the world, packed with espionage action. I grew up watching Bond. James was every boy's idol. How could a boy or man not respond to the series? Guns, booze, cars, women, villains, secret weapons, stunts, world affairs, famous landmarks, high-tech gadgets, British humour, memorable music, a cool opening and love scenes – this was truly the realisation of a boy's dream and a men's magazine. Bond films were an education of 'the other side.' They taught us how cruel the world is, but they also taught us about Martinis, Dom Perignon and blackjack. I learned how to seduce women. The films were my textbook of fashion and style.

But with the emergence of new wave entertainment films such as *Star Wars*, *Indiana Jones* and *Die Hard*, the style of 007 gradually became outdated. The first *Metal Gear* was born in 1987, but using a spy in a tux was not easy. So I turned the spy into a special forces member, gave him heavy firearms and a realistic world, even though I really wanted to make him more like 007. Bond always saved the world. It had to be one person to save the world, so I introduced the element of stealth. I call such missions 'sneaking missions'.

My understanding of the plot of Bond films is as follows: investigate (fly around the world); discover enemy base: infiltrate; get captured; have a meal with the boss; duel with boss; ally force arrives; base crumbles; escape with Bond girl; have fun with Bond girl; rival arrives; duel. Making something new out of this fixed plot is what makes these films great. This structure is implemented in MGS intentionally. Being caught once and then escaping is a sequence essential to both MGS and 007. Would a villain really not kill a spy, but instead invite him to a meal and reveal his entire plan? But it is this sequence that allows the creator to portray the relationship between the spy and the boss. However, there is one phase that I cannot include in MGS because of hardware limitations. That is the arrival of your ally force and the melee between them and the bad guys. The original plan of MGS2 included such a sequence towards the end on top of Arsenal Gear. But again, the processing speed of the console did not allow this, although I have been able to include something similar in ZOE2. I hope I could do the same in the MGS series someday.

However, the highlight of Bond films is action: skiing down a mountain, fighting in water, stunts on a bobsled, motorboat chasing, parachuting, fighting while sky diving and so on. It is like the Olympics of stuntmen. Also in these films were the latest vehicles and weapons still in development: the rocket pack, underwater vehicles, cars with wings, hang gliders and other vehicles using cutting-edge technology. Every time a new Bond film came out, a new technique was debuted and resulted in action scenes never before seen.

Considering the series has been going for 40 years, it is amazing how it has maintained its freshness. This is down to the staff and cast who have kept and passed on the 007 spirit. Themes, actors and producers have all changed, but 007 remains 007 and delivers dreams to all generations. The grand theme of MGS1 and MGS2 was that of passing on to future generations. I believe I have passed on to my staff not only the story line, message and game property but also the gene of 'videogame creation'. As long as gamers want more, this title must continue. My staff and myself have a life span. Just like parents passing onto their children and masters to their apprentices, the essence of 007 is passed on so that the series continues generating hits, and I want to communicate this in MGS. What will MGS be like 40 years from now, created by those who share the spirit of Team Kojima? I would like to stay alive and experience it myself.

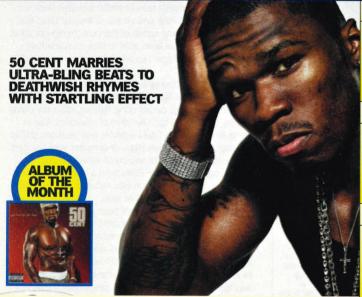

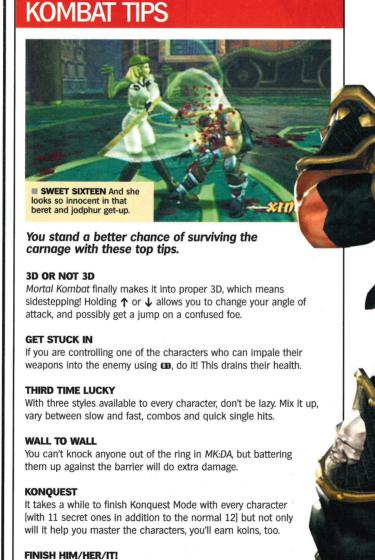

Here's our handy three-point guide to avoiding those hard and fast attacks.

#### 1. MIX AND MATCH

Remember what your fast/slow attacks/styles are, and only use the slower ones when your opponent is stunned, or at a similar disadvantage. It's tempting to memorise a few effective combos in just one of your favourite character's three styles and rely heavily on those for victory. This works fine on Easy difficulty, in Arcade, but a half decent human opponent will spot the pattern and exploit it within a few minutes. Not only will frequent, tactical switches of style force your opponent to re-evaluate their own strategy, but it will ensure that you take advantage of your scrapper's full move list.

#### 2. MORTAL KEBAB

If you can impale, do so, it's the easiest way to win. Make sure you don't rely on weapon combos to win matches, because your sword (or whatever) will be rammed in someone's gut at the time. A good time for an attempted skewering is as they are recovering from being knocked down - as they recover from a slow move flust after you've blocked a missile attack, for example) or simply when they aren't expecting it.

#### 3. CHOOSE YOUR MOMENT

The best route to gory victory is to memorise a particularly long and brutal combo, the Style Branch combos being an excellent start, and use it when they've got little or no chance of blocking. This might be because they are recovering from an attack, because they're in the air, or, best of all, because you've stunned them temporarily. A number of moves do this, both normal (like Shang Tsung's Snake-style moves) and special (like Scorpion's famous Spear). If you try launching into your combo without judging the timing carefully, all a skilled opponent has to do is block, duck or sidestep one of the strikes and you'll be in trouble.

#### **DEFENCE**

You have four main defensive techniques at your disposal - blocking, sidestepping, evading and disrupting. Blocking is by far the easiest - simply hold down and press down if a low attack comes your way. However, you'll still take a small amount of damage, and there's a surprisingly large number of moves that hit low but look as if they are hitting high - Frost's Ground Ice, and Scorpion's Summon Hellfire attacks both need to be blocked low, which isn't obvious and will catch novice players out time and again. Sidestepping is probably the best one to master, since not only will you potentially avoid an attack altogether, but you will consequently find yourself in a much better offensive position. Holding J or  $\uparrow$  circles around your opponent, but depending on the nature of the

easily still connect (ie, if it's a wide, sweeping, side-toside move rather than a forward thrust) so careful judgement is needed. Bear in mind, too, that if you sidestep a long combo they'll probably leave the range of your normal attacks pretty quickly.

Evasion is simple - a quick double tap and you'll scoot backwards, out of the range of all but a scant few attacks. Of course, this won't work if you're cornered, and if you make a habit out of it, expect more than a couple of fireballs flung in your general direction.

Disrupting an attack involves snapping out a fast move while your opponent attempts a combo, and is an inherently risky proposition, best saved for emergency, one-more-hit-and-l'm-dead moments. Only advanced players will be able to choose the precise moment and attack necessary to disrupt a combo in full flow.

## SECRET CHARACTERS

There are actually more secret and bonus characters than initially available characters in the game. If you can't afford them, don't worry. Go into Options, Game Options, then set the difficulty to Easy, two rounds to win, and Mini Games every three rounds. Now just play as long as you can, and rack up the Koins.

#### **MAKING THE GRADE**



When you complete the game and the credits have rolled, you will be assessed on how you have performed. Similar to the *Resident Evil* games, certain factors will be taken into

consideration and you will be given a grade. Here are the categories that are presented on the grading screen and how you can improve your performance in these areas...

#### **PLAY TIME**

Obviously, the quicker the better. Consult the full guide in Official Tips Magazine #09 for the best route and press to pause the game whilst deciding what to do next in each area. This way, time won't pass you by.

SAVES You may be penalised for excessive amounts of saving, so our advice is to only save when you finish a scenario and the game asks you if you would like to save. This may not be a factor the first time you play through as you will naturally want to explore. But when you know the game, you will realise exactly what you need to do to get through it quickly. **GAME OVER** This is the amount of times that you die and have to continue. With a raging earthquake going on around you, it is only natural that you'll die countless times

#### FALLS

This is determined by the amount of times you are knocked off your feet by a tremor or other ground-shaking events (when this happens the screen will flash red and you'll lose a small amount of energy). The guide in *Official PlayStation 2 Tips Magazine #11* tells you every point in which you need to hit the the button to avoid 'falling'. Follow our lead and you'll never lose your footing!

#### **DISTANCE TRAVELLED**

We suspect that this isn't a factor that determines your grade, more a useless bit of information to learn once you have been air-lifted out of the devastation and are nursing some severe foot blisters. However, there may be a bracket in which the definitive distance is gauged (in the sense that there is a minimum distance you must travel in order to fully complete the game) and if you stray too far outside with unnecessary exploring you could well be penalised.

#### WATER CONSUMED

Again, this could be a useless bit of trivia for you, or the game could gauge precisely how much water you have to consume in order to cover the optimum distance needed to finish the game. In which case, only guzzle fluid when your hydration bar is about to expire – so always ensure that you have a supply close to hand in case you are caught needing a drink miles away from the nearest water tap.

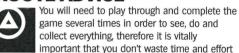
#### **COMPASSES FOUND**

This is a strange one. We're guessing that the hidden compasses which you find in this game are similar to the Fluorites in *Onimusha Warlords* and that finding them all

During the first stage of this boss fight, jump over each of the platforms and the blue beams of energy. Do a Spin Attack on Crunch when you get to him. # CROWD PLEASER EGENDS OF

Don't get battered in the ring - we tell you how.

'Getting heat' is an expression, meaning to be a villain (heel). The more the crowd boos a heel, the more he's doing his job. In the game it's important to get the crowd into the match, working them into a frenzy. With that in mind, focus on these moves:

- Ones that drop your opponent on his head (piledriver coming from a grapple).

  Top-rope manoeuvres (dropkicks, elbow-drops, etc).
- Moves on the outside of the ring (typical moves, just performed out of the ring).
- Apron moves (those performed out of the ring but not off the ring sidel.
- Hitting the opponent with a weapon (which can be got by climbing out the ring and pressing 12).
- Going all out with lots of high-impact moves
   And causing the opponent to bleed.
- You'll also get an audience reaction if you add variety to your moveset and do more than punch and kick your way through matches.
- Running into the referee and knocking him over gets the crowd excited, as does taunting your opponent (performed with the right analogue stick).
- Linking your moves together, and reversing an opponent's offence, is a great way to pop the crowd.
- In a tag-team competition: breaking up a pinfall on your partner is always good.
- Double-teaming an opponent and making a tag all count toward the crowd's reaction to you.
- Use your finisher and win a dramatic match.

Remember, the crowd may love a bad guy, but they'll hate a bad wrestler. Struggling your way through a match to fluke a win won't do you any good at all. You're not out simply for the win, but to entertain the paying crowd. So, with that in mind, avoid doing these and undoing any good work you may do:

- Repeating moves, whether it's a punch or a moonsault, the crowd will soon tire of any move if you use it in quick succession and too many times.
- Stalling by keeping away from your opponent will hore the crowd silly
- Not linking enough moves together is not good.
- Not performing your spectacular moves

#### And, in tag-team competition:

- Ignoring your partner.
   Not saving your partner, or distracting the referee.
- Not double-teaming your opponents enough.
- Ultimately, though, losing the match will affect your popularity more than anything, so at least avoid losing.

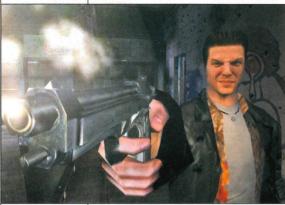


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#### DOCTOR'S ORDERS

PAYNE-FUL The last chapter is a toughie, but we reveal the method.

- 1. The tower in the middle of the roof has wires holding it in place and, because of the high winds, two have snapped off. When you regain control of Payne, whip out your sniper rifle and aim at the first wire in front of you, hitting the weak point to snap it and trigger a cutscene. When you regain control again, switch to the M79 and nail any heavies who try to get near you by positioning yourself just in front of the wall. Then equip your sniper rifle again and hop up onto the little platform in front of the first wire (the one you just shot) and take out the wire to the left of it. Finally, equip your Colt Commando or Dual Berettas, look up at the red tower and shoot off about 20 or 30 rounds to trigger the ending cinematics.
- 1. I have been stuck on Lucre Island in Escape From Monkey Island for ages. I need to find Pegnose Pete's hideout but I don't have a clue how to do it. I've got the chess clock and I know he's in the swamp but I don't know what to do next. Can you tell me how to find him? Struan Atha, Kilmarnock
- 1. A tricky one, this, as the directions for locating Pegnose Pete's hideout tend to be different each time. But here goes: Speak to Dave at the store and spray him with Home-Made Perfume to reveal Pete's code name (this name changes from game to game). Then use the filing system to get the directions to his hideout. Each symbol is a substitute for a part of the alphabet - rabbit (letters A-D), palm tree (E-H), pumpkin (I-M), monkey (N-S) and banana (T-Z). So, for example, if Pete's name is Yahootie P

Everywhere, by taking the three capital letters (Y, P, E) the symbol combination would be banana, monkey, palm tree.

Right, you should now have the directions to Pete's hideout so place the chess clock on the raft and match the time on the clock to your instructions and head off in those directions. 1. There are several ways to try and rectify this common occurrence. First, try cleaning your blue discs with a lint-free cloth land perhaps a dab of rubbina alcohol) by wiping the cloth horizontally from the centre hole to the outside of the disc. No joy? Try switching on your PS2 without a game disc inside and wait until you get to the main menu. Now press (a) to bring up the 'Version' info, highlight 'Console' and press (A) again. Now set the 'Diagnosis' to 'On'. The point of this? Basically, it focuses the laser on the disc so that it has an easier time reading discs.

Still no luck? Okay, try this slightly unorthodox method. Place two one-inchlong strips of sellotape on the face of the disc (the side with the game name, not the delicate underside) on opposite sides as close to the centre hole as possible. The disc will then use the two symmetrical bits of tape to balance itself on the laser, thus making it easier to read. If this tactic doesn't work straight away, try attaching two more one-inch strips of tape to the sides of the disc hole that don't have tape on them, so you end up with a perfectly right-angled box of tape surrounding the centre hole. If you are still having problems, it's safest to call Sony's careline on 08705 998877 before you go doing anything potentially more damaging to your machine!
