ISNEY CHARACTERS rarely fail to impress on Sega systems, and Mickey himself has had a pretty good time of it to date. The aptly-titled *Mickey Mouse*, together with *Land of Illusion*, both clocked up 90+ percentages on all formats. And what's more, the Mouse looks set to shine again as this latest offering reaches the Mega Drive.

The Magical Quest Starring Mickey Mouse was released to much acclaim on the SNES just over a year ago and possessed the qualities we've come to expect from Disney platformers. It was beautifully drawn, brilliantly animated and imaginatively packed with

secret levels, but it was also a tad easy. Now according to Capcom bigwig Joseph Morici we can experience, "All

very similar conversion. It's a one or two-player game, in which you follow the Hollywood rodent as he

embarks on his quest to rescue Pluto from the evil Emperor Pete, the mystical Ruler of the World. Six massive levels take you through the Dark Forest, Pete's Peak, Snowy Valley and finally on to Pete's Castle.

From what we've seen, it's

an excellent conversion with superbly detailed graphics, both in terms of sprites and backgrounds, and the highly-animated gameplay looks wonderful. Once again the "too easy" shouts will be heard but, after all, the platformer with the blue spiky mammal isn't particularly taxing either, and that's never lacked popularity. It's the ability to explore and attempt the game in different ways that provides real longevity.

Prepare yourself the most accurate sports simulation ever is coming to the Mega Drive. If you think snooker is a sport for beery old men then think again, Jimmy White's Whirlwind Snooker has already transformed the world of Amiga games, and now programmer-**Archer Maclean is** about to repeat the trick on the Mega Drive. And they said it couldn't be done. Mark Ramshaw paid Archer a visit, chalked up and potted a few questions in his direction.







Maclean has proved it – the Mega Drive can deal with 3D polygons.

EMEMBER THE MYTH of the lone computer programmer, working away in the backroom for months on end until - lo - a classic computer game was produced? Well, that myth is alive and well, and living in tiny Ladbroke, Warwickshire. And the myth's name is Archer Maclean. But don't go thinking Archer is an anorak-wearing wizz-kid. Oh, no. Now in his early 30s, Archer has dabbled in electronics, has a degree in cybernetics, and traded

begin converting it to the 16bit Mega Drive?

I actually started it a year ago, but because of other projects, I've only really begun to concentrate on it in the last six months. To pull it off, I've had to totally rewrite the game engine. It's not just the graphics which have caused problems. It isn't just a case of porting it from one machine to another – I wouldn't do it if it was.

Doing a fast-action 3D snooker game is a bit of an unusual choice — how did the idea come about?

Back in 1988 I was mucking about with a video grabber while

snooker was being shown on TV. Looking at a frozen image of the table reminded me of thoughts I'd had back in 1981 about a 3D snooker game. I eventually got some stuff together and showed a publisher, who didn't really believe it was possible to do. So,

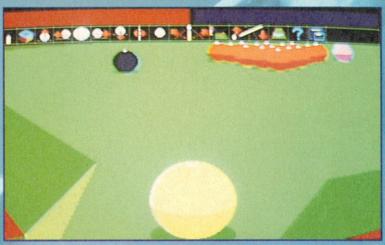

something, I just have to prove them wrong. Even my first commercial game, Dropzone, was the product of a £1,000 bet. I boasted to another programmer that I could write a game as good as any of the current crop of arcade games.

Getting technical for a moment,

what exactly is the problem with

the Mega Drive and 3D games?

With the Mega Drive hardware

processor cannot access the graphics area directly - it all has to go through a port, and that happens whenever you want to update every single bit of the screen. What it means at the end of the day is that the Mega Drive is about four times slower than, say, the Amiga for polygon games. For sprite-based games the Mega Drive is absolutely fantastic - it's definitely the superior machine - but if you want to write 3D polygons directly to the screen, then you can just about forget it.

But you've got the game running about as fast and smooth as Virtua Racing - all without the aid of extra hardware. How? For Jimmy White's I've come up with a method which only updates the areas of the screen which have changed visually - so at any one time, maybe only a quarter of the screen would need changing. The result is that, on average, the Mega Drive version of the game runs faster than the Amiga original. It does depend on what's on screen, but it can run up to 17 frames per second - and that's on a machine which supposedly can't do 3D graphics. You wouldn't believe how hard it's been to achieve.

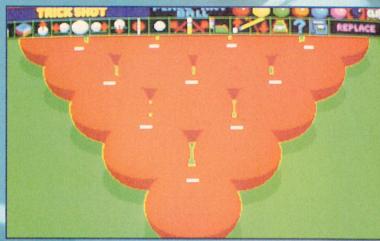

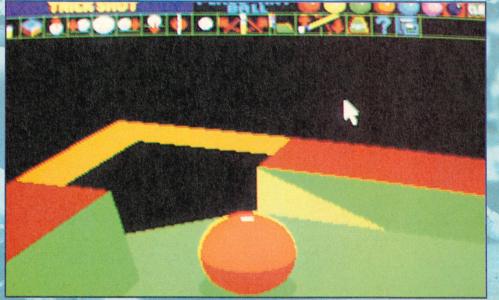

When the master of computer footie, Dino Dini, announces he's doing a Mega Drive football game, it's certainly worth investigating. Dean Mortlock went to visit Dino in deepest Cambridgeshire to get the facts.

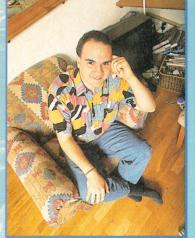

What made you get up one morning and decide to design a football game that was radically different?

I'm not really sure, it just happened that way. My

I always try to get 50 frames of animation per second. When Kick Off originally came out the graphics weren't considered to be up to much. They were functional. but that was about it. To me, graphics weren't of major importance in a sports game. Speed and playability were.

Is the Mega Drive version a straight port-over from the Amiga one?

It's not direct. All the menu presentations are different. It took about six months of development and most of that time was spent working out all the routines for the Mega Drive. As you can see from the game, the player's able to zoom in and out of the pitch. That was done by shrinking all the graphics.

So the same graphics were used for both views?

Yeah. Everything that appears on the large view is there in the smaller one. Even the kit designs for the players, it's just that they're too small for you to see them. [Laughs.]

How did you find programming on the Mega Drive after working on Amigas and the like?

It was actually very nice doing something like Goal because the

Mega Drive is much more suited to the task than the Amiga was because of the way it handles sprites. The machine's faster and the whole sprite routines are very easy to use.

Have Virgin left you to it with the development of Goal?

When I signed up with Virgin the game was pretty much designed already on the Amiga, and I have had to enhance certain features of the game for the Mega Drive version, but it's pretty much the same game.

Why are you doing Goal and not Kick Off 3?

My previous publisher was a company called Anco and I felt it necessary to move away from them to another publisher. Anco had the rights to the Kick Off name, so I had to think of something new.

From conception to completion. how long did the original version of Goal take?

At the start of the World Cup each area will play qualifying games until four teams go through to the final. Don't worry, though, vou can cheat and put England in if you really want to.





MOVING ON UP

One criticism directed at the Kick Off games was that it was too difficult to control the ball while running. Dino reckons he has the solution, "In Goal we've added a more realistic movement to the players. It takes a few seconds for the players to run at full speed and a few seconds for them to slow down as well. That way you won't be able to run full pelt with the ball, but when you move slower, you have a lot more control over the ball, much like in the real game.

Is it simply an excuse to raise the price level of games in general? It's a bone of contention and only time will tell whether or not this is their intention. For now, I'll gush about the game and you can decide whether to club together with your mates to buy it.

Just like Rob Pegley, you too could be Nigel Mansell. All you need is this top new racing game, a dead rat under your nose and an annoying voice. One out of three will have to do.

ESPITE BEING A polished racing game, it's difficult to see the relevance of Mansell's World Championship in the general scheme of things. For a start it's based around Nigel Mansell's triumphant 1992 season, which for all its glory is something of a fading memory, with Damon Hill

taking the mantle of Britain's Formula One golden boy.

Then of course, there's the fact that Nigel 'boring' Mansell has legged it off to the States to drive Indy Cars for Paul Newman. So, perhaps this is aimed at the Americans - after all, this is a US import. That being the case, why pitch it at them in a format they've never really accepted, that of the Formula One World Championship? On the other hand, even if Gametek had got the licence for Nigel Mansell's Indy Car successes, it would only have improved the concept, not the game itself.

Then there is the dilemma of where this fits into the already heavily-populated world of racing games. It's certainly not as good as Domark's F1 for a start, but matches up to most others. The presentation is very professional, and the track replication and

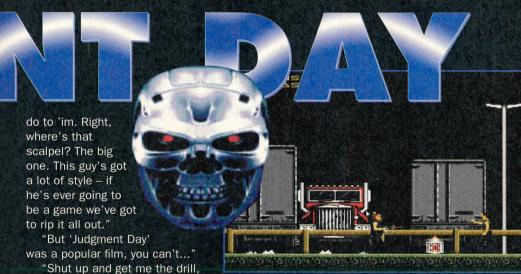

alk about misleading titles. I jumped at the chance to review this game, expecting an allaction blaster set some time in a future Earth embroiled in nuclear destruction. Instead, I find that the idea is to avert Third World War. and concentrate on world peace with a little domination thrown in for good measure. But that's cool, I can be a pacifist as much as the next marine. And there's still that megalomaniacal edge to things, which sure keeps me as happy

as a sandboy.

The thing is, Third World War is a far heavier proposition than any Sega owner might expect. If I were to bombard you with a whole load of eco-socio politico buzzwords like national moral, level of law and order, budget available, gross national product, troop deployment, super

weapons development, air strikes, foreign investment, aid to terrorists or governments, nonaggression pacts, cover operations, industry development, media manipulation, tax audits, forces comparisons - then you'd probably go a funny shade of grey and start mumbling, "Leave me alone." But they're all part and parcel of Third Word War, so if you do intend to delve into the

shadowy area of world domination then be well prepared.

I guess this is something of a breath of fresh air in a world of platform games and rushed Mega CD titles. And it's all very worthy, and pretty well programmed. 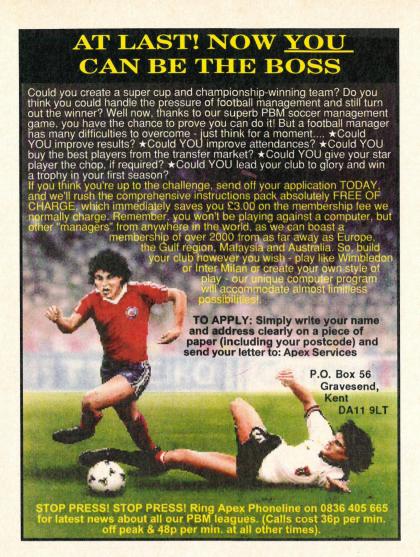

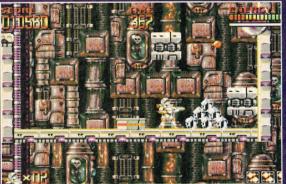

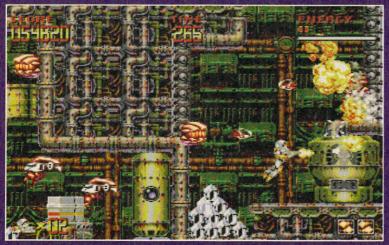

blaster-platform department. All three systems have been supported by the excellent Contra range of games, and if you've ever played any of those games, then you'll be pleased to know that Mega Turrican plays very much along those lines.

There's nothing much here that you won't have seen before: power-ups a plenty, tons of enemies, secret rooms containing bags of extra lives and huge, wellanimated guardians. But the presentation and design of the levels mean that you'll never

explore all the game in the first couple of days play.

Weapons are better than average, too. The power-ups that are mentioned before are impressive, with bits of laser fire flying all over the shop. On top of that, you also have two extra weapons as standard. One is a Smart bomb affair that'll destroy everything on screen, while the other turns Turrican into a ball and allows you to drop bombs everywhere - pretty explosive stuff. On the subject of extras, you also get a grappling-rope

option. While this is a luxury in some parts of the game, it's also a necessity in others.

When playing the game on the Easy level, there are only two levels, and although they're quite tricky, they can easily be completed after a couple of hours. Then go on to the Medium level and you'll go through the same two levels as before, but with a couple of harder ones bolted on the end.

This, I feel, is better than just having the same levels - only harder - on a tougher skill level. Having said that, I believe that with a couple of days hard play the game should be completed. Then it all boils down to personal preference.

With platform games ten-apenny, only the best should, and will, sell. There are far too many sub-standard efforts out there. So when one comes along that looks good and plays well, it's worth shouting about. Mega Turrican manages to get all the ingredients in the right amounts and if you don't mind buying a game that you'll probably complete in a few days, but have a lot of fun doing it, then this is the game S = 3/4 for you.

craft around a number of levels. Not entirely difficult in itself, but throw in some gravity and a little inertia, and then things start to sound a tad trickier. The inertia

basically means the faster you go, the longer it takes you to slow down. When you see the layout of

the levels with their narrow tunnels and craggy rocklines, you'll understand why it gets tricky. When you finally mention that you've also got to collect fuel pods scattered around in order to stay up in the air, then things start sounding pretty difficult.

Every level has it's own mission, with a set order in which to complete your tasks before you'll be able to use the exit to take you to the next one. This way of doing things keeps the gameplay fresh - you never know exactly what is coming along.



Watching the demo is ideal to get an idea of the controls. The small joypad in the corner of the screen will show you the controls as the demo rolls.

(Well, apart from when you start again.) As enjoyable as I found playing Sub-Terrania, I still find a fault in the age-old problem of the game's longevity. There's a total of nine levels, and after a few hours play, I was on the seventh. No matter how good a game looks, and even if the presentation makes your palms sweat for a bit, how long are you

going to be playing a game once you've completed it? The main difference between this and Thrust, is that Thrust took hours of hair-removing tension to get anywhere. Sub-Terrania is more likely to be collecting dust on your shelf after just SÉGA POWER a couple of weeks.

JURASSIC PARK

The CD version of Jurassic Park (Sega Power 52: 86%) is a tricky affair. It wasn't too hard for Ben O'Reilly from Reigate, though. He sent us the complete solution to the game and managed to bag himself 50 smackers. Anyway, because it's so long and rather complicated, we've split the solution up over several issues. And yes, this is part one. Many thanks to everyone at Dream Machines for the loan of the CD.



T THE START OF YOUR ADVENTURE, you're facing your crashed helicopter (1). Place the cursor over the door of the wrecked vehicle, and press the button to open the door and reveal a stun gun lying on the seat. After picking it up, scroll the screen a bit to the left and you'll notice a small rock. Pick it up. Now scroll to the left a bit more, and you'll notice a large tunnel. Enter the tunnel and you'll go through to a clearing containing the Brachiosaurus enclosure.

Scroll right and you'll come across a Compy video terminal, and next to this there's a shallow pit. Examine the pit, and you'll find a security card (2). Pick this up and scroll back to where you started, then 'travel' along the road in front of you – you'll end up at the main

Jurassic Park gates. Continue going forward and enter the Visitors' Centre (3).

INSIDE THE VISITORS' CENTRE

Check out the red container to your left and pick up the pliers. Now leave the Centre and head back to the main gates.

Find the security clearance box by the gates and nick the next security card from it by using the pliers. Now scroll right until you're facing the path that leads to the pens with the Dilos and Gallimimus in them. Stroll down this path and you'll

confront two of the Gallimimi (4). Fire your stun gun, that'll scare them away, leaving you free to take their eggs and a nearby rock. (Although I'm not sure why they should be so protective over a lump of stone.) Now scroll right, and go down the first path you come across.

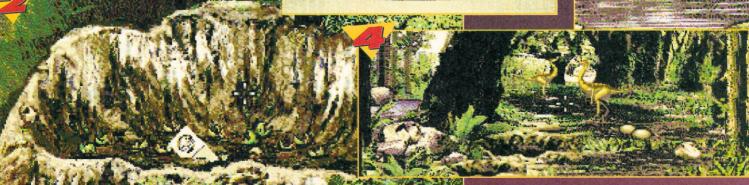
You'll come across two more Gallimimi, but this time, you have to place the cursor over a tree to the left of them. When it changes to a hand, repeatedly press the button until you push the tree over. When they run off, steal their eggs and go forward along the path that the escaping dinosaurs make.

The course of fate will send you to a clearing with a shallow

pit in the middle of it. Examine the pit and you'll find some more eggs. Now scroll left until you come across a Gallimimus on the other side of a river. To move it, shoot the frog on your side of the river bank (5). This will startle the frog and cause it to jump over the river and straight into the mouth of the waiting Gallimimus. Happy with his lot, the Gallimimus will then leave the screen enabling you to go across the river.

The next screen you come to contains two more Gallimimi at a watering hole, as well as some eggs. Stun the dinos – you'll have to charge the gun to maximum by holding down the button for a few seconds – and then 'acquire' their eggs. Scroll to the left until you get to the storm drain and place the cursor over the roll of chicken wire in front of it. Click on the wire to roll it away and reveal a







pair of bolt cutters. Pick them up and use them on the drain cover. Then go into the drain.

INSIDE THE DRAIN

Once inside, use the bolt cutters again to remove the four bolts on the cover at the other end of the drain. When you go through the other end, you'll recognise it as the place where you scared off the dinosaurs by felling the tree. Quickly stun the Gallimimus that's kicking rocks at you and grab the eggs it was guarding. Now use the bolt cutters on the rope to the righthand side of the screen to bring down the blue sack. A wrench will fall out of the sack which. naturally, you should pick up.

Scroll right until you reach the path that you originally came in on, and go down it. When you get to the next location, scroll around and stop when you get to the river. Use one of your rocks to steady the log in the river and then go across. Now you'll find yourself in a clearing filled with Dilophosauri.

The Dilos can be picked off with your stun gun on maximum power, but you've got to be quick or they'll take off a fair chunk of your energy. Then scroll to an abandoned jeep, open the door, and pick up the gas can that falls out. In front of the jeep is another shallow pit. Examine it and whip out the Compy eggs and T Rex CD you'll find there.

UP THE RIVER

Now locate the dingy (6) (it's moored near the jeep) and use the gas can on the motor. Click on the dingy and it'll take you up the river. Back on dry land you're once again attacked by Dilos in the bushes. Use the tried and tested stun gun to knock them all out, and then look around the area for a medikit, which should be very close to where the Dilos were. You should also be able to find some Dilo eggs next to the kit.

You should have a pretty good collection of eggs by now (7), so

the next step is to get to the Visitors' Centre ASAP. Once in the Centre, go up

the stairs, and using the security key, open the middle door. Then go straight through the first room you enter and you'll be in the incubator room (8). Use the card to activate the incubator and then simply click on 'Load eggs' to store them safely.

Investigating the cupboard will supply you with a tranquilliser gun and some cartridges for it (9). (There's also a medi-pack in the room next to the cupboard.) Leave the room, and when you arrive back at the top of the stairs, go into the first room you come across.

You're now in the control room and you'll do well to check any messages left on the

computer by your contact, Emily – you are also given the option to save your game position here. Leave the room and examine the tall box to your right (10). Using the bolt cutters, cut the straps holding the box together, and inside you'll find a scanner. Now head downstairs and,

Manga have gone for a 'Blade Runner', 'Aliens'-esque romp featuring human-like robots and warmachine-like humans in this release. The plot is typically thin, with a handful of



humans and one 'Gunhed' robot going up against an entire island packed with rebellious machines, including Chiron 5 – a power-crazed super computer. This obviously means that there are over 100 minutes of crossfire and battles between super machines, all in swanky blue-and-black-o-vision. If you're familiar with Ridley Scott's habit of giving every scene moody lighting, then you'll know what to expect here. The performances are pretty functional, but that doesn't really matter – it's the effects which count here. And for the most part, they do the job more than adequately. But, like so many science fiction movies which place the visuals above the script, 'Gunhed' is a film which is more of a cult status symbol than a piece of entertainment. If gun fetishism is your thing though, you should try to catch it on its run of UK cinemas throughout April and May.

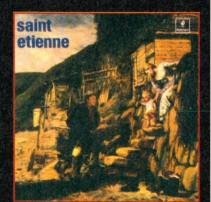

And the record's all the better for it, with lines such as, "He sewed his eyes shut because he is afraid to see," rising up from the seething aural mass. With the incessant, rhythmic elatter of metal on metal providing the backing for distorted almost robotic – vocals, this is the sound of cyberpunk.
