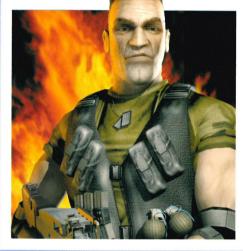

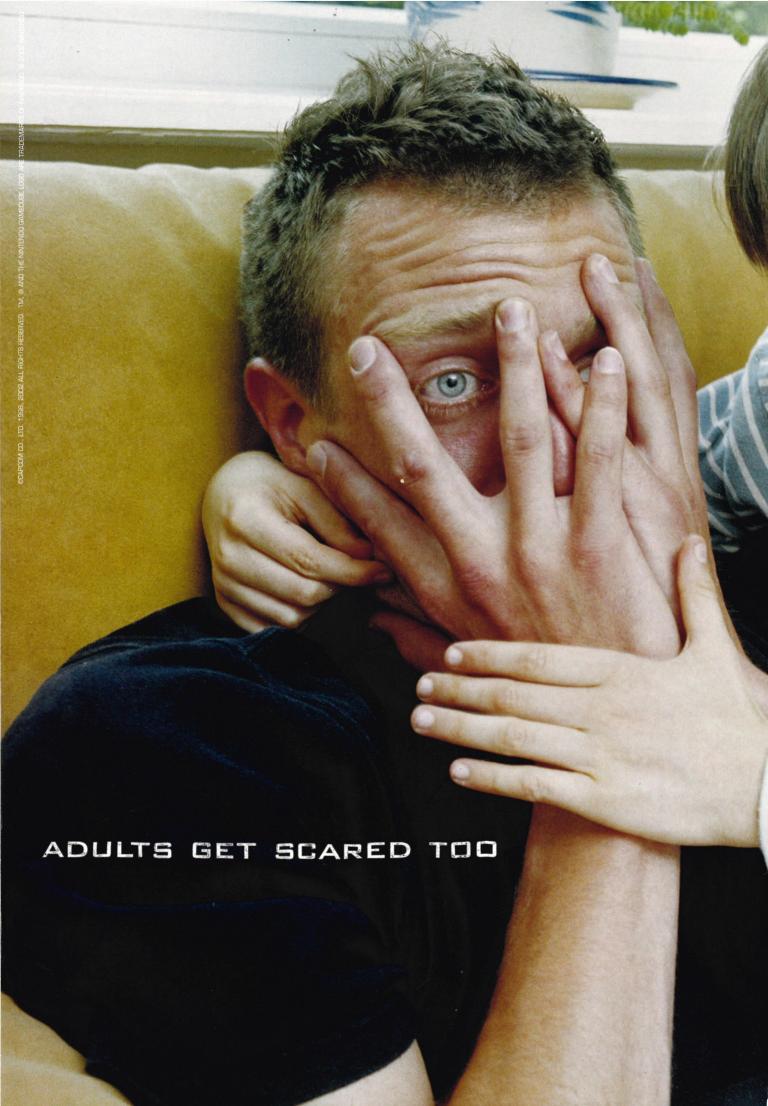

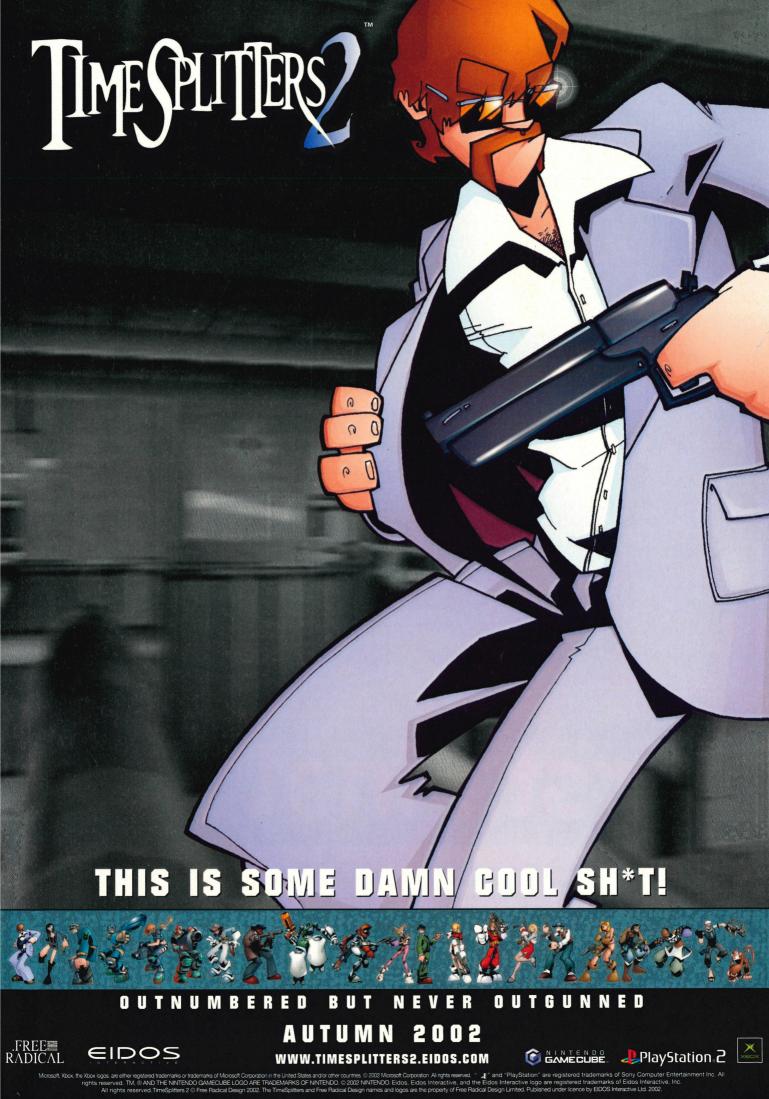

FINAL FANTASY CRYSTAL CHRONICLE ● GAMECUBE ● OUT 2003

SNEAK TEASER REVEALS THE FIRST CONCRETE SHOTS OF NINTENDO GAMECUBE'S FORTHCOMING FINAL FANTASY QUEST.

First Final Fant

intendo recently released a TV advert for the Japanese market which showcased many of the top titles heading to Japan over the next few months including Star Fox Adventures, The Legend of Zelda and Eternal Darkness. But more importantly there was the first visuals from the new Final Fantasy game, now titled Final Fantasy: Crystal Chronicle.

The game is being developed by a group of Square developers, led by Final Fantasy veteran Akitoshi Kawuza, who have split from Square to form a company called the Game Designer's Studio that is funded by Nintendo's Fund Q. You may remember that this was set up by Nintendo of Japan's former president, Hiroshi Yamauchi.

The GameCube title is scheduled for a release in Japan some time before the end of March and it will interact with a separate Game Boy Advance Final Fantasy title that is also being created by the Game Designer's Studio.

Hard gameplay details are still in short supply, but from what we understand Crystal Chronicle will star three characters. From the brief clips we have seen we know that dark dungeons, plenty of sword fighting and magic to cast are firmly on the agenda.

The game is something of an experiment, and a response to Yamauchi's concern that two and three year development cycles on games are bankrupting the industry. By using GameCube's streamlined development tools and expertise the hope is that high quality games can be produced in a third of the time.



FINAL FANTASY NINTENDO HISTORY

While the Final Fantasy series has been housed on Sony's consoles over the last few years, it hasn't always been that way as some of you may remember. The incredible Final Fantasy series actually began life on the NES in 1987 and then progressed onto the Super NES a few years later.

So if you want to know what they are all about, read our potted history below...



1987 Final Fantasy I

The first game was made as a competitor to the then king of console RPGs, Dragon Quest. It incorporated a story that spanned two millennia and characters with very specific abilities.

1988 Final Fantasy II

The second quest never made it out of Japan unfortunately. Apparently the English translation was almost complete before the western release was cancelled. Shame.



1988 Final Fantasy III

Seen as one of the best RPGs of its time the plot told the story of four vouths trusted with bringing balance between light and dark. Again, it wasn't originally released in the west.

1991 Final Fantasy IV

After four years away, western gamers finally got a Final Fantasy game. It followed the exploits of Cecil, a one time bad boy, who championed the causes of good.





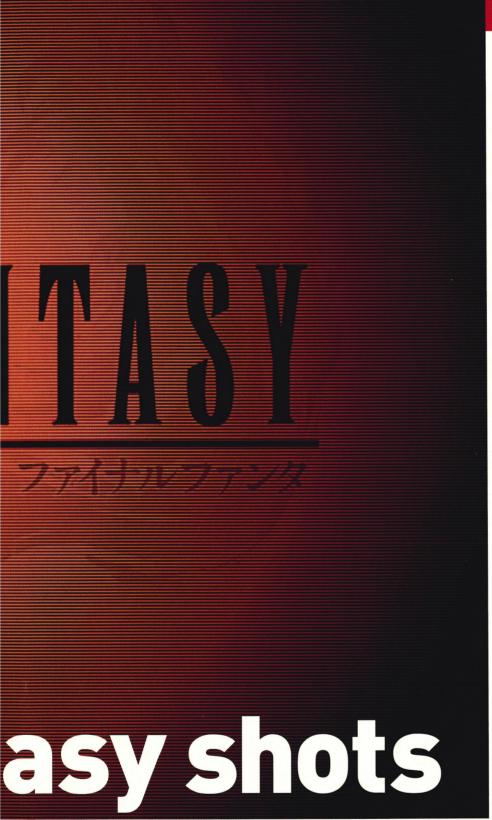
1992 Final Fantasy V

Being one of the finest Super NES RPGs ever made, this game saw a planet under attack from meteors. It was up to a band of adventures to travel the world to defeat Gilgamesh.

1994 Final Fantasy VI

Many cite this as the game in which the series grew up. It deals with heavyweight issues such as suicide and teenage pregnancy in a storyline credited with being deep, funny and profound.

he survival horror onslaught continues with the first shots of Resident Evil 2 and Resident Evil 3, both of which are GameCube bound, with a release looking likely for next summer.

We've also learned that unlike the massively enhanced remake of the original Resident Evil game and the all-new Resident Evil Zero, the GameCube remakes of these two titles will have very little graphical enhancements or added extras, so expect Resident Evil 2 to almost be a carbon copy of the N64 version.

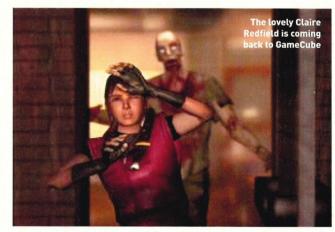
Obviously this is a blow to everyone hoping for two essentially new games, but after contacting Capcom we can confirm they are considering bundling both games together, as a semi-budget title, that will go some way to making up for any fan's disappointment.

Resident Evil 2

☐ Nintendo 64 owners will no doubt remember this game that appeared way back in December 1999 to massive critical acclaim, offering as it did some much needed adult gaming into the diet of Nintendo gamers.

The adventure follows the exploits of Leon Kennedy and Claire Redfield, the sister of Chris, who was last seen pumping lead into zombies in the original Resident Evil.

The two find themselves in Raccoon City, a town overrun by creatures of the night with an ammo supply rapidly running out and an army of zombies to fell. It's up to the duo to halt the spread of Umbrella Corporation's T-Virus and find out what has happened in the city.



Despite reports suggesting this will be a straight port of the PlayStation original and the N64 remake we can't fail to notice a crisper look to this GameCube version. With sharper textures and moodier

lighting, your search through the city streets and the spooky Police Station to try and find the Umbrella Corporation's labs is looking like an excellent gore-packed game. More news on this as it breaks.

Resident Evil 3: Nemesis

☐ If you're a newcomer to the Resident Evil franchise you'd be forgiven for thinking this game takes place after Resident Evil 2, but in fact Nemesis takes place between the original and Resident Evil 2.

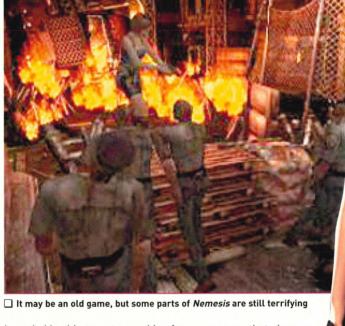
It stars the heroine of the original, Jill Valentine, who, after destroying the Umbrella Corporation's Mansion in the first game, retires from S.T.A.R.S. and heads out of town on the lookout for a normal life.

The poor love soon gets stranded in Raccoon City, where a new posse of zombies is running amok. She's joined by new boy, Carlos Oliviera, a one time Umbrella Corporation security guard who has decided to switch sides and fight the zombie scourge alongside the lovely lady.

What sets this game apart from other Resident Evil games is the introduction of a character called the Nemesis. This hardcore monster is a product of Umbrella's sick experiments, but unlike the generally gormless zombies, it's a clever creature capable of thinking for itself. It can open doors and run as fast as Jill and Carlos and crucially it carries a rocket launcher, which it isn't afraid to use. You'll also be pleased to hear that throughout the game you will be

hounded by this monster, making for a game that is relentless in its pressure.

Another difference from previous games is the introduction of pause

screens that give you the choice of two courses of action. For example, you'll encounter a particularly gruesome mutant and the game will ask you whether you want to stand and fight your ground or high tail it out. Your choices will then dramatically alter the course of the adventure.

So far so good, and seeing as this game never made it to the N64, chances are there's an army of gamers yet to feel the dubious pleasure of running for their lives, whilst ducking incoming rockets.

Meet your Nemesis

Standing eight foot tall and in possession of a rocket launcher, Nemesis is the pinnacle of Umbrella Corporation's warped experiments.

There has been endless speculation as to who he actually is, or more precisely, was. Many claim that Nemesis is the mutated remains of Albert Wesker, last seen being a nutter in the first Resident Evil game, while others claim it's Rebecca Chambers in heavy make-up. The truth is, nobody knows, but by the time you have played this game you'll have fought the mutha over ten times and will be waking up at night in a cold sweat.

■ The e-Reader add-on for the Game Boy Advance, which will allow players to read data from e-cards, gets released in the US on 16 September.

For just \$39.99, you'll get an e-Reader, Donkey Kong Jr.-e or Pinball-e, one Game & Watch Manhole-e, three Pokemon-e and Animal Crossing-e. Classic NES games, including Donkey Kong Jr.-e, Pinball-e, Tennis-e and Excitebike-e, will retail at just \$4.95.

■ Sonic Mega Collection will be released on the GameCube this November in the US. As reported last issue, the disc will include seven games – the first three

Sonic the Hedgehog quests, Dr. Robotnik's Mean Bean Machine, Sonic and Knuckles, Sonic 3D Blast and Sonic Spinball.



■ THQ will release *Phantasy Star Collection* for GB Advance in November.
The cartridge will include the first three *Phantasy Star* games and was expected
to contain enhancements to each title.
However, THQ has stated that the games



will be straight ports of the Sega Master System and Mega Drive games.

■ US marines are getting the chance to

whittle away their time playing games thanks to a donation from the US computer and video games industry.

Showing support for the troops waging their war on terrorism, the marines were given a selection of consoles and games, including Nintendo GameCube. Force Master Chief Donald Kultti said: "We are really working our people hard these days and this sort of thing permits them an escape from the demanding schedule."

■ Nintendo is renowned for breaking hardware and software sales records but it recently made headline news in the US by breaking records of a different kind.

Mario's Spaghetti Plunge, prepared by Buca Di Beppo in San Francisco's Little Italy, saw the world's biggest pasta mountain ever created. The mound of spaghetti weighed in at a mammoth 3,265lbs, easily smashing the previous best of 2,564lbs. Mario fans, dressed as



the man himself, were then invited to dive into the pasta to try and retrieve prizes that included a trip to Hawaii.

apanese gamers who have pre-ordered Resident Evil Zero or bought Resident Evil on GameCube were lucky enough to receive a playable demo of the next instalment in the survival horror series, giving them an unbearable teaser for what looks like being an even better game than the astounding original remake.

Not content to hear the impassioned screams of Japanese gamers going gaga over the forthcoming *Resident Evil Zero*, we managed to play a demo of the game and can confirm yet another GameCube belter is just around the corner.

While the recent *Resident Evil* remake is an enhanced version of the PlayStation classic, *Resident Evil Zero* is as new as freshly fallen snow, with a storyline that fills in the blanks in the series, introducing new

characters and entirely new ways to play.

The two controllable characters are Rebecca Chambers, a S.T.A.R.S. team member, and Billy Coen, an ex-navy S.E.A.L. who both find themselves on a speeding train carrying a deadly assortment of zombies towards an unknown destination.

The sense of movement on the train is superbly observed with swinging lights casting ominous shadows and shuddering carriages that cause the camera to shake. As ever, surviving is the name of the game and within the claustrophobic confines of the train the action feels even more intense than the recent remake, with little room for error and even less room for manoeuvre.

The biggest change to previous games is the way in which players can now switch between Rebecca and Billy at any stage in

the adventure. By doing so one character will fade away while your replacement is transported into the action.

Players can even opt to control both players at the same time. One character is controlled with the 3D Stick and the other via the C-Stick. You can also decide whether to make one character follow the other or order them to split up and take different routes. This often seems to be the way to complete the game's many fiendish puzzles, as while one character performs a task at one end of the train another can be busy

seeing to another job. It's a brilliantly executed idea and you'll find yourself constantly switching characters to make use of their strengths and weaknesses.

Another change to previous Resident Evil games is the ability to drop items on the floor and pick up previously discarded items, doing away with the troublesome storage chests altogether. Players will even be able to swap items between Billy and Rebecca if they're standing close together. All in all this is a brilliant showcase for what will be a must buy game next year.

- Japanese fans of Phantasy Star Online can take their devotion one step further with the upcoming release of the Episode I & II soundtrack on 19 September. Entitled The Sound of Rangol Odyssey it will include 35 tracks on two CDs.
- Renowned Japanese developer Treasure, the makers of Sin and Punishment for the N64, is working on a GameCube version of Ikaruga. Already a hit in the arcades.

Ikaruga is a topdown space-blaster featuring frenetic action and some unfeasibly large



enemies. The game will release on Sega's Dreamcast first, with a GameCube version then being started.

- Capcom has announced that its longawaited prequel to the classic Biohazard series, Biohazard O, will release in Japan on 21 November.
- Nintendo has topped the charts once again by heading up the latest table of best performing games publishers for the first half of 2002.

The chart is based on the number of titles a publisher's had in the Japanese top 100 games. The chart follows with the number of titles in brackets: Nintendo (16), Konami (14), Sega (seven), Bandai (six), Enix (six), and Sony Computer Entertainment (six).

■ Anime fans should take a look at the latest game from Asmik Ace Entertainment called Lupin the



3rd: Lost Treasure from the Sea.

The new GameCube title is a dramatic 2D adventure based around the highly popular Japanese cartoon series, Lupin the 3rd. A release has been hinted for December and the game will feature over 15,000 frames of animation.

he thrill of the open road, the luxurious feel of leather driving gloves, the roar of pumping metal, the sound of chasing sirens and the thud of a flat hedgehog hitting a mud-caked wheel arch. This is the essence of *Hot Pursuit 2*, minus the hedgehog. Possibly.

It's all to do with horses under the bonnet. With up to 630 thoroughbreds under some, giving enough metal muscle to propel 1635kg of supercar from stationary to 60mph in just over three seconds. It may just leave your stomach's contents at the start line.

With power like this you might think this was a game set on specially made racing tracks, complete with safety



marshals and fire-resistant suits. But no, this is an open road thrasher complete with Sunday drivers, stupidly placed environmental objects and motorised bobbies ready to bust your speeding ass.

There are over 20 courses on offer, some of which stretch for over 15 miles, with everything from sudden dust storms to flooded roads to test your skills. There are also some mint cars on offer including the likes of the McLaren F1, Lamborghini Murcielago and Ford's GT40 and you can become a traffic cop and bust the Highway Code violators. There's no doubt this looks the business, but we'll have to wait for a test before we know how it handles.

Every year the biggest names in world rally sport gather on the sunshine island of Grand Canaria to see who's the real offroad daddy. Now Rally Fusion is on the way to bring the action to your GameCube in all its mud-splattered glory.

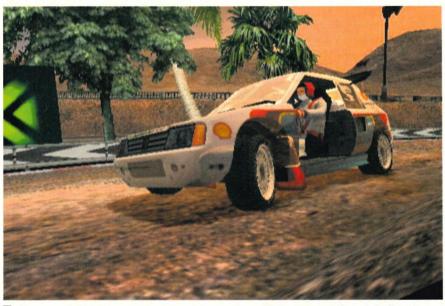
Rally Fusion is, by the maker's admission, a homage to Sega Rally and even we agree it is the greatest arcade rally game ever made. It's all about impossibly extravagant handling and pin sharp track design where the key to success is learning the tracks.

While its roots might be arcade-based its roster of cars and drivers are pulled straight out of the annuls of rally legend, with the likes of Marcus Gronholm, Walter Rohl and Didier Auriol bringing their racetuned chariots to the game.

Each car is resplendent with their reallife sponsors and each road machine boasts real-time damage that can see you driving around minus doors and wheels. Comically, if you drive badly enough your co-driver will even throw his notes out of the window in disgust.

The Grand Canaria course is the only real-life track to be found in the game, but another 20 tracks will be included to test players across a plethora of different environments with deserts, forests and mountain courses to be found.

We're expecting a November release for this title and early reports suggest this will be a solid addition to the GameCube's garage of driving games.

The game aims to do to dirt biking what SSX Tricky did to snowboarding with a formula that mixes tricks sicker than a dose of Deli Belly and tracks more extreme than a Slipknot concert.

We've yet to see whether it can deliver on its claim of white knuckle gameplay. but what it does promise to do is deliver 20 Supercross and Motocross races taking place indoors and out.

What sounds the most deadly are the six indoor Freestyle arenas that claim to some satisfying trickery.

The fighting is said to mix turn-based attacks with real-time action, so what this means is that you can select an attack and affect its strength by using a swinging meter similar to those seen in golf games. There will also be the option to allow the computer to determine the effectiveness of each attack. More news as we get it.

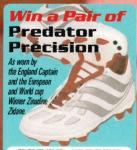

As in *Gauntlet*, each character also has a distinct ability, whether it be with an axe or pistols, and as the game progresses they gain experience points to maximise their attacks and develop better weapons.

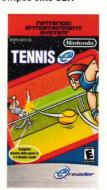

ince we brought you news of the upcoming GameCube off-roader, Smuggler's Run Warzones, we've managed to get our hands on the game to give it some welly and can safely say that it's set to be an exhilarating ride across some insane off-road terrain.

You play as a driver for the Exotic Imports courier service, a clever disguise for an underground smuggling operation doing dirty deeds for shady characters. At the beginning of each level you are set objectives to complete, usually involving collecting cargo and dropping it off at its destination, while always being on the lookout for the fuzz as they hunt you down.

What will amaze you about this game is the sheer scale of the levels, as you can simply go anywhere. The rolling scenery, from the snowy wastes of Russia to the hills of Vietnam, looks superb and the draw-distance of the landscapes is very impressive. You'll also be wowed by the sheer speed that the game runs at as even when there are four players taking part the action doesn't lose any of its pace.

The multiplayer mode also gives you the chance to get first-hand experience of the newly implemented Countermeasures. Each vehicle has specific weapons that can be used at any time, like the vertical jump or speed boost. The best Countermeasure though has to be the Smokescreen as when this is deployed the opposition's screen fills with billowing white smoke that will reduce their view to nothing, giving you the chance to get the jump on them.

We'll have a full review of Smuggler's Run Warzones in next month's issue of Nintendo Official Magazine, but until then, just check out the awesome new screenshots and prepare for what we hope will be a very special title.

o you've finished Lost Kingdoms and your RPG thirst still isn't quenched. What's an adventurer to do? How about consoling yourself with the news that Eternal Arcadia Legend is heading to the UK next year, bringing with it an adventure that promises to be as captivating as any Golden Sun or Lost Kingdoms game.

Eternal Arcadia Legend isn't an entirely new game, having done the business on Dreamcast a couple of years back when it went by the name, Skies of Arcadia.

That said Sega promise to make this distinctly different to its Dreamcast cousin. although the Japanese publisher is remaining tight-lipped on specifics, except to say that the original's swearing, drinking and smoking will be removed. This is possibly a blow to hard drinking, smoking and swearing Nintendo gamers, but we don't think this change will be too detrimental if it captures the level of playability that made the original so popular.

The game is set centuries ago on a planet called Arcadia. This land has been bombarded by Moon Stones that over time formed to create giant floating continents on which the planet's inhabitants settled. Some of the Moon Stones harbour tremendous power and a group called the Elders have harnessed the power to create malevolent

monsters called Gigas.

Playing as a young sky pirate called Vyse, you must find the Moon Stones that give the Gigas their power before other less peaceful groups. To do this you must work alongside your feisty female partner, Aika, and undertake a series of adventures spanning the many floating lands, many of which are awe-inspiring in size.

Through the course of the quest we're promised beautifully animated characters, excellently acted dialogue, many battles and huge towns and quaint villages just waiting to be explored.

In fact, many cite the Dreamcast version of this game as the prettiest title ever to grace Sega's doomed console so we can only hope that Sega up the quality a further notch by utilising the power of GameCube. Again we're left wanting a truly new RPG but we're confident that role playing nuts will lap this up alongside The Legend of Zelda when it's released over here next year.

NO BLOODY HELL

Before you start a petition against censorship in video games we should point out that this is nothing new. The history of gaming is littered with titles that had to have their act cleaned up.

One of the most high profile cases was the removal of blood from Mortal Kombat on the Super NES after the free-flowing claret on the arcade game. Players take charge of Rhama as he searches around the island for clues to help him solve the eerie vessel's puzzles, but he soon finds that his benefactor is not





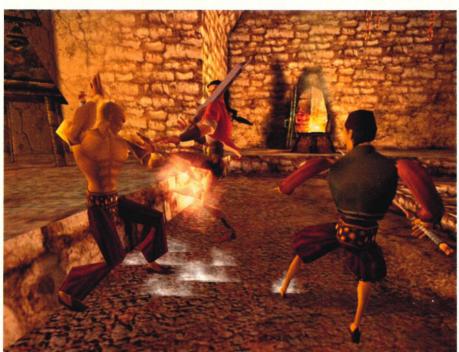

artefacts and clues to find that will help you to solve the game's puzzles.

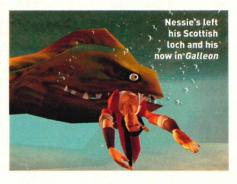

There's no word yet on whether Audley Harrison is also on the roster, but we do know that the real-life bruisers will be joined by 20 fictitious fighters.

While Knockout Kings has never had a reputation for out-and-out simulation, this edition will stray even further from the roots of boxing and towards the world of WWE. The makers, Electronic Arts, promises to deliver pumping hip-hop entrance music, a bout system that can be tweaked to high heaven, the chance to remove timed bouts and whether a number of knockdowns or knockouts decides the winner.

One idea we really liked is the heartbeat rumble that lets you know whether you're on your last legs, giving you the option to ease off or go for the win. There's said to be character specific taunts and A.I. developed by boxing encyclopedia, Bert Sugar, and commentary from two blokes we take to be American, and thus unknown over here.

The Career aspect sees points awarded for the number of knockouts, blocks, punches thrown and knockdowns, and allows you to use these points to build up the attributes of the preloaded boxers and those made in the Create-A-Player mode.

It all sounds like a boxing blast but through painful experience we know boxing games can be slow and clunky, lacking the agility and responsiveness needed to rival the likes of beat 'em ups like Soul Calibur and Super Smash Bros. Melee. Only a thorough playtest will convince us this is no different, so expect a review in a forthcoming issue of NOM.

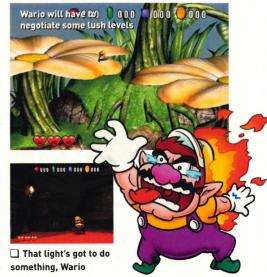

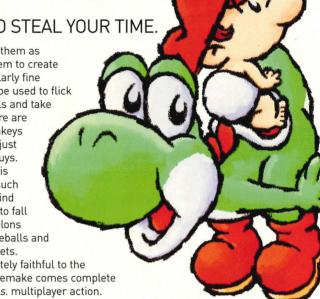

Older gamers will no doubt remember Yoshi's prodigious talents for snaring enemies with his

tongue and either hurling them as projectiles or digesting them to create eggs, which make particularly fine missiles. These eggs can be used to flick switches, break down walls and take out enemies, of which there are many, with Shy Guys, monkeys and Piranha Plants being just some of the game's bad guys.

Super Mario Advance 3 is packed with clever ideas such as having ten seconds to find Baby Mario if he happens to fall off Yoshi's back. Magic melons even provide Yoshi with fireballs and rapid-fire melon seed bullets.

It's all good and completely faithful to the original, except this GBA remake comes complete with even more Mario Bros. multiplayer action.

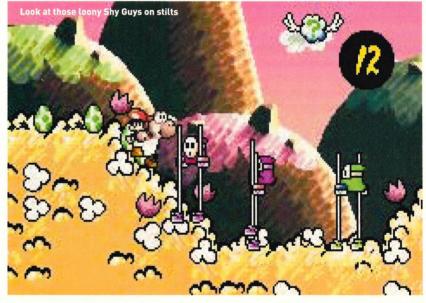

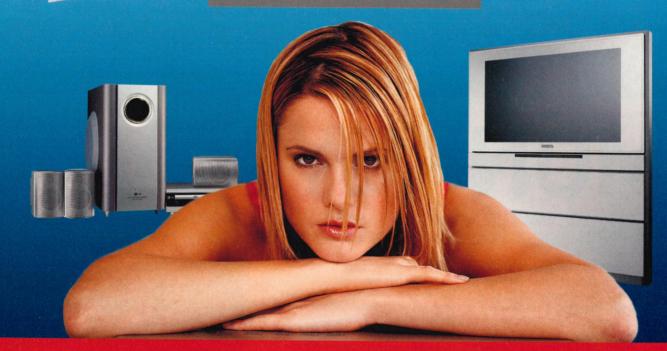

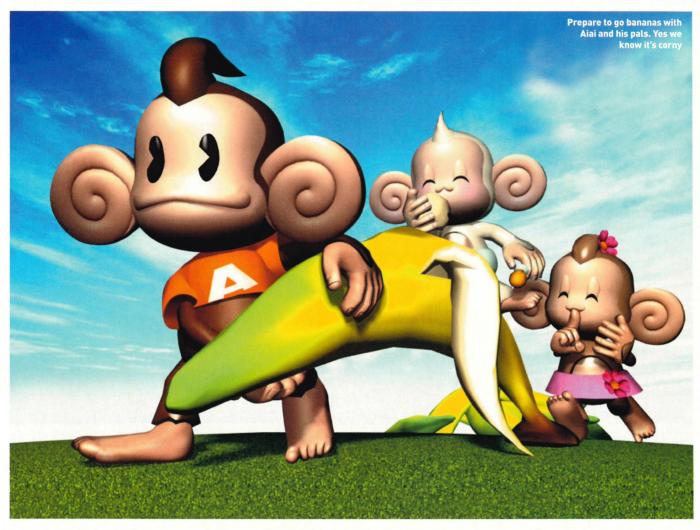

ny self-respecting games player has got to have Super Monkey Ball 2 near the top of their Most Wanted list. The original has been a surprise smash on GameCube this year, combining simplistic gameplay with fiendish level design and topping it all off with sublime multiplayer games.

The sequel ups the ante with more one-player levels, over 150 in fact, and more multiplayer modes than you can probably handle. But before the game hits the shops later this year, we've got our hands on a copy of the game to let you know what you can expect.

Of course, the single-player game is back with two options that are bigger and badder than before. Like the original, Challenge mode has Beginner, Advanced and Expert stages spread across 90 levels with added bonus

floors. You can also opt for the Story mode that sees you battling through Dr. Bad-Boon's labyrinth to rescue the bananas stolen from Jungle Island. Players follow Dr. Bad-Boon across various Jungle Island locations and these different settings provide the scenery for the various stages. You'll get to go around Jungle Island itself, underwater and even inside the belly of a giant whale. Each set of ten stages gets increasingly harder as you play and they're all joined together by some extremely cute cut-scenes.

The new levels provide a stiff test for even veteran monkey ballers requiring quick thinking and an expert sense of timing. Thankfully the Story mode gives you infinite continues so you can keep trying the levels again and again if you've got the patience.

What made the original such a hoot though were the multiplayer games and they return with a vengeance making Super Monkey Ball 2 the must-have party title.

The six original Party games are all included and unlocked as soon as you turn on the game. Monkey Target, Race, Bowling, Billiards, Fight and Golf should satisfy your monkey thirst for a short while and each favourite has even had a slight revamp with new modes added. Monkey Target, for example, now allows you to control five monkeys at a time in formation and guide them to massive scores out on the targets. Monkey Bowling also includes a Special mode with some crazy lanes that bend and bounce the ball toward the pins. If this dirty half-dozen isn't enough, just take a look at the six new Party games below that are fighting for your precious time...



BOAT

Brave the gushing white water as you grab your paddle and charge through the raging torrent. Players paddle by alternately pressing the and abuttons to gain speed and you'll have to tap just one of the shoulder buttons to get round the bends. It's incredibly tough to get into at first and even after practice it provides a stern test.



SOCCER

Primate five-a-side action with very simple controls: (A) is used to tackle or shoot and B passes the ball around. The action is very fast and the size of each monkey's ball leaves little room for manoeuvre so it's intense end-to-end stuff. The game is two-player only and if you're a real footy fan you can tinker with the tactics to give your side an offensive or defensive style.



This is quite a departure from the usual Party games because Monkey Shot is a Virtua Cop-style on-rails shooter where you control a target. Look out for the fielders too as they're always ready to pounce on the ball.



Take to the skies with your flying monkey and try to knock the other three from their perch. Machine guns and missiles are at your disposal and there's even a target lock-on facility that allows you to be ultraaccurate with your fire. Various fruitshaped power-ups are littered about the arena to give you a health boost.



Grass, clay and hard tennis courts are all available for budding pros in this new Party mode. There are singles and doubles matches and players have a selection of shots including a lob, smash, forehand and backhand and you can also take advantage of a power-up system where the player must stand inside a star that appears on court to add strength to their shots.

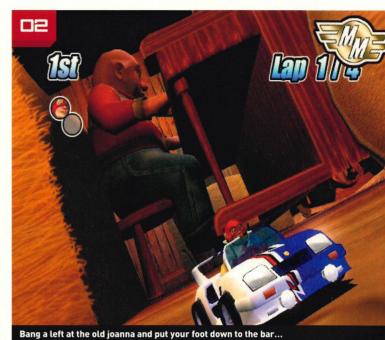

f you've ever fancied rigging up a Nintendo GameCube to the family car but were too frightened to ask, just pour your eyes over the future of in-car entertainment and see what can be done with just £20,000 in your back pocket.

A joint project between Max Power, Nintendo Official Magazine and Nintendo UK, the GameCube car does 0-60 in just eight seconds and started life as a white Citroen Saxo VTS. New bumpers, a roof spoiler and sidetrims were added before they were doused in purple paint to create the authentic GameCube look.

But the team didn't just finish the job there because what will impress Nintendo gamers is what's inside this beast. The back seats have been ripped out to make way for Alpine speakers and amps so that the sound effects and music from each game will blow you away. Sitting pride of place on top of

everything is the GameCube itself while below it sits a giant screen on which to view the action when the car is parked up.

The Nintendo fun doesn't end there though as another GameCube sits behind the gearstick and allows the gamer in the front seat to play along, too.



MAKING REALITY

So you think game developers sit in comfy offices twiddling knobs and drinking tea? Wrong! They're out risking life and limb so you can enjoy games that look lifelike.

n these days of 128-bit technology it's easy to take realism in games for granted, but making titles based on real locations requires an almost superhuman effort involving upwards of 30 people working tirelessly for over a year.

With that in mind we hooked up with Peter Hickman, the producer for the forthcoming SCi GameCube rally title, Rally Championship. Due for release in November the game will be the first rally title for GameCube and it promises to be a mix of real locations and arcade style racing.

Peter explained the extraordinary lengths developers go to in order to

bring realism to our gaming diet, and in particular how they recreated Rally USA, the premier North American rally that takes place in Nevada every December and is one of six rallies found in the game.

Risking frostbite from the sub-zero conditions, the team spent early mornings crashing four-wheel drive jee ps in order to document every conceivable part of the rally, from ancient rock formations to the myriad of different kinds of mud found on the track. One of them even lost a finger. Okay, that last bit was made up but they assure us this was no holiday as you will soon find out.

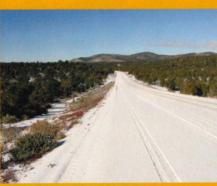
STEP ONE:

Photograph everything

Armed with a high-end digital camera, Peter and his team took to the course

to take incredibly accurate shots of the tracks, ensuring the course layout is









STEP TWO:

Get modelling

Back in the confines of the development studio the real work starts with the laborious job of cataloguing the 3000 photographs and video footage.

Once this is done it's time for the map modellers to sift through Ordnance Survey maps, satellite images and photos to start building up the course using millions of polygons.

Whilst the layout of the track is painstakingly created another set of artists starts to create a Data Set. This is a collection of textures and objects that will eventually be put on the course to bring the game to life. It's at this stage that the masses of photographs come into their own as the artists use them to recreate what they saw in the US, making everything from boulders to snow.

Once textures and objects are made they're then given to the map makers who piece together the various elements like a giant Lego set, only this one is tons more complicated.









STEP THREE:

Make it dynamic

At this stage the track looks just like the real thing, but this doesn't mean the course acts like its real-life counterpart.

To make that happen data has to be placed on the track to act like a series of electronic triggers. This means that game code is written that can tell the car to lose traction if it passes through a puddle, or to slow down if it hits a muddy bank. The code is designed to change over time, with mud getting worse if it's constantly driven through and puddles that grown in size should it start to rain heavily.

Everything on the track has a code attached to it so players instantly feel the difference when they move from one surface to another, or if a crash has altered the car's handling. Once this process is complete it's time to add the cars and start testing their handling, looking for bugs and optimising each car's performance so that the game you play puts you in the driving seat of a real rally car, driving a real rally course.

t's taken a while to finish – small mammals live and die in the time it's taken to make this game – but the final layer of polish has now been applied, readying Star Fox Adventures for a European launch on 22 November, a date Nintendo tell us is written in stone. Prehistoric stone.

This is Rare's first GameCube offering, intriguingly made in partnership with Nintendo of Japan. So what do two of the biggest names in games working together mean for a cherished Nintendo character? Well, from what we've gleaned from seeing and playing the game it's a mix of Nintendo of Japan's dedication to control and gameplay (think Super Mario Sunshine) and Rare's trademark humour and attention to character (likewise, Donkey Kong 64).

The game doesn't begin with Fox and the team, but a blue-furred feline called Krystal after she receives a distress signal from Dinosaur Planet.

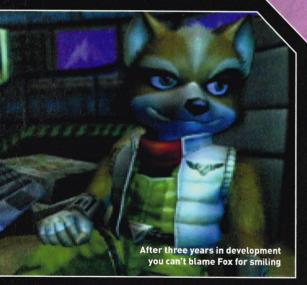

Fox and the rest of the team also receive the unfortunate message that tells how the peaceful dinosaurs who roam Dinosaur Planet are under threat from General Scales and his army of Sharp Claw croping.

SharpClaw cronies.

The feisty madam's first encounter with General Scales occurs onboard his flying ship in the middle of a brewing thunderstorm. After being given a stern talking to Krystal is thrown overboard, to what Scales thinks is her imminent death. Luckily Krystal is saved by a winged friend, only to be captured later, as females often do in Nintendo games.

A situation like this calls for a hero, and they don't come any hairier than Fox McCloud. This is just the kind of mission Fox and the team have been looking for following the defeat of Andross eight years ago, in which time they've drifted around the Lylat System looking for fruitful labour.

In this time things have changed with the departure of Falco Lombardi and

the changing roles of Slippy Toad and Peppy Hare, both of whom have hung up their flying wings in favour of backroom support roles. And with that in mind, Fox decides to explore the lands of Dinosaur Planet...

Fox's jet bike looks a bit like a *Star Wars* snowspeeder

Fox's Arwing lands in an area called Thorn Tail Hollow, a lush area named after the friendly Thorn Tail dinosaurs found grazing the land. It's from here that players access the game's many areas and buy items from the Thorn Tail Store using the planet's currency, Scarabs. These can be found littering the planet in a variety of cunningly hiding places and the shopkeeper has an impressive line-up of products with maps, bombs, lanterns and even a Scope Visor that allows Fox to zoom in on far off enemies and locals. It's also here that Fox meets the Warp Stone, the giant Scottish stone statue that plays an integral role in getting Fox McCloud about the planet.

Early on Fox finds the magical staff

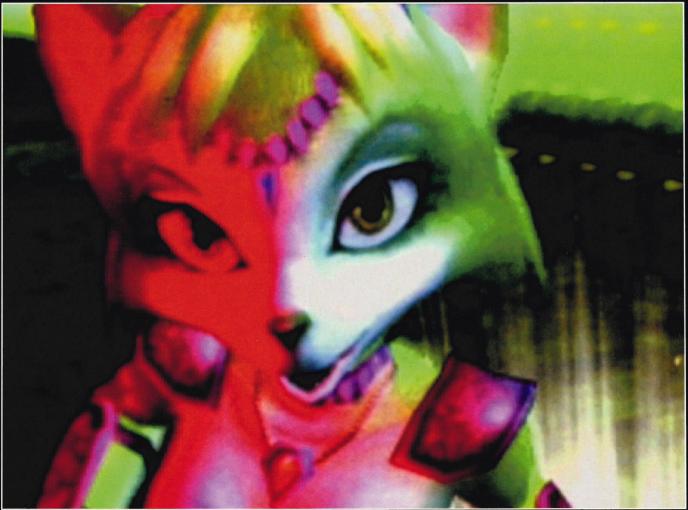

that plays a central role in his quest. The staff belongs to Krystal, who dropped it during her run-in with General Scales, and so far we've learned that it can levitate rocks to find hidden items, unleash attack combos, and as the game progresses, utilise its creative and more powerful abilities.

One of the upgrades allows Fox to fire high-powered energy balls at enemies and switches. Another gives Fox the ability to fire himself up onto ledges and another even emits a blast of icy mist that later plays an instrumental role in solving one of Star Fox Adventures' many tough puzzles.

You'll also be pleased to note that special staff moves can be assigned to the GameCube controller's ① button so a lifesaving move shouldn't be more that a button press away. Alternatively the menu of moves are accessed via the C-Stick.

It's immediately obvious that a lot of time's gone into making the combat system as frustration free as possible and we'd have to say it seems to work well. The biggest help is the target lock-on system that works similarly to *The Legend of Zelda: Ocarina of Time.* As soon as the staff is drawn near an

enemy the camera automatically locks onto Fox's prey, instantly blurring the background to focus on the enemy you're fighting, making it easy to connect the many attacks our furry friend can unleash.

our furry friend can unleash.

Once Fox is up to speed with his new control and combat system it's on to meet the Queen of the Thorn Tails who wants Fox to find her son, Prince Tricky. This cute looking dino has been kidnapped – most probably by General Scales – and so Fox sets off in his trusted Arwing to Ice Mountain on a mission to find the fellow-me-lad.

This moment heralds the first Arwing flying level and just like Lylat Wars the level challenges players to guide Fox's craft through a sky full of asteroids, air mines and swarming enemies, all the while ensuring the Arwing flies through a series of rings.

Later in the game Fox will also have access to a jet-powered bike, that later gives rise to toboggan-style races, and makes for a quick way to traverse the

game's massive levels. Fox will also ride on the back of a flying beast. Aside from these, Fox can also ride on the back of Prince Tricky, but only if he's in the mood.

After a little exploration Fox finds the stricken dino-teen, and what a little horror he is. Think Jar Jar Binks meets Donkey from Shrek and you'll have some idea of exactly what we're talking about.

At first Prince Tricky does little but complain about his empty stomach, but once fed he becomes more useful, capable of digging up hidden items, carrying Fox and eventually breathing fire.

And then it's on to explore the rest of the game's genuinely stunning locations that from what we've seen will trump anything so far seen running on GameCube. One area is a vast icy mountain range covered in mist, leading to an area dominated by lava-filled lakes that warp the air with incredible heat haze effects. Another area we've explored is the foreboding confines of Krazoa Palace, a maze of torchlit passages and huge hallways populated by Scales' army of bloodthirsty guards.

If the small portion we've seen is any indication this should be just the sort of game that fans of sweeping quests will like, with epic landscapes set in the backdrop of a prehistoric age. It's the best of Rare and the best of Nintendo, just in time for Christmas. **Rich Marsh**

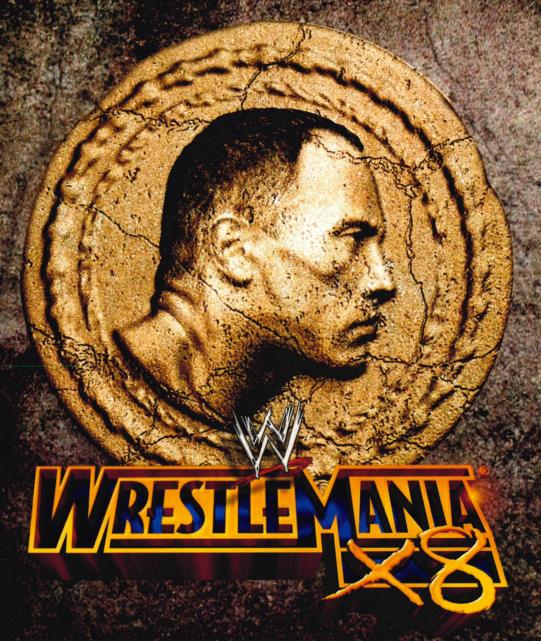

We got an exclusive play of the first four levels in this thinking-man's first person GameCube shooter. Read on to get the skinny...

> hen news was announced of a GameCube title in development based on the Die Hard movie trilogy, the obvious question was why? The thought of a first person shooter based around a 14 year-old action movie franchise wasn't one that filled us with anticipation. But then we saw the game in action and our opinion quickly changed. It looked awesome. Now we've managed to snag an exclusive play of a near-finished version to let you know what you can expect when the game is released in November.

The story is set five years after the end of Die Hard with a Vengeance and revolves around police officer John McClane. Whilst following a routine investigation John stumbles across a gang who seem better organised and equipped than your average band of street punks. From here the story explodes with action involving art theft, international terrorism and the kidnapping

of John's daughter, Lucy.

The developers at Bits Studios point out that they tried to create the game for all ages but after numerous tests they decided that this approach didn't fit in with the Die Hard ethos. So expect plenty of blood, a very adult sense of humour and a probable age rating when the game's released.

The game begins with three difficulty levels for you to try; Die Hard, Die Harder and Die Hardest. These will affect the amount of damage inflicted and the way in which enemies react to your attacks. Your foes aren't just a gang of stupid thugs, these guys have got brains, so if you run down a hallway with all guns blazing then they will hide and wait for the right moment to attack.

The version we played also included the Shadow meter for the first time. This sits in the top right of the screen and takes the shape of a circle split into four quarters. When there is no enemy activity in the area the meter remains grey, but should an enemy be close by the meter will change to purple. The meter also detects when you have been spotted and will turn from yellow to red depending on how much danger you are in. If you come under attack the Shadow meter flashes in one particular direction to alert you to the threat.

The object of the game may be to stop terrorists but it's worth remembering that John McClane is a human being and can only take a finite amount of damage. For this reason it's important not to fly around the levels firing aimlessly. Many situations require you to sneak past your enemies and

use more covert methods to take them out. To help with this, *Die Hard Vendetta* allows you to switch between two different game modes, Stealth and Action. When in Stealth mode the enemies won't pay too much attention to you allowing you to sneak about uppoticed.

One stage where you can do this is on the Prison level. The stage finds John locked in a cell with no means of escape when the building is stormed by a gang of terrorists who order all of the cells to be opened. They threaten to kill anybody found outside their cell and your objectives state that you can't kill any thugs so you must put any weapons away. Using a combination of sneaking and running, John must make his way out of his cell, set up a decoy and hide whilst the furore dies down, only then will he have the chance to get out alive.

Other levels we got our hands on included the Chinese Cinema with an incredibly cool booby trap in the opening sequence and the most camp theatre usher you are ever likely to see in a game. It also had a very tense atmosphere and a great mix of sneaking,

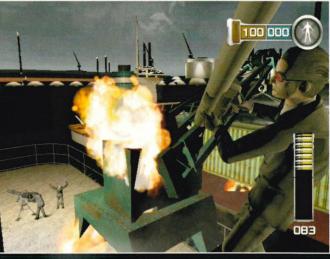

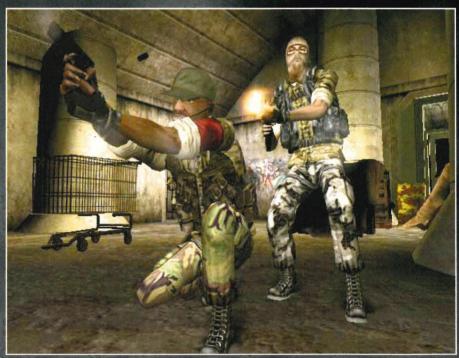

blasting and puzzle solving.

We also got a chance to try and stop the raid on the Police Station with some well hidden proximity mines to keep an eye out for and a section involving roving reporter Dick Thornburg, the bane of John McClane's life. All you've got to do on this stage is to establish a computer link with the outside world in order to call for more back up

Finally, we took a look at a new section of the Subway level that demonstrated the auto-jump feature to good effect and also showed how John must interact with civilians in order to find out clues and get help in solving the game's puzzles.

Although our time with Die Hard Vendetta was all too short and the version was some way from completion, the quality of the title is shining through. It looks superb and each of the levels has a distinct style and atmosphere. The balance between sneaking and shooting seems well thought out, adding variety and originality to Vendetta, requiring quick decisions and a degree of lateral thinking to progress. The controls allow for an easy transition between the Action and Stealth modes and the three controller configurations should mean that



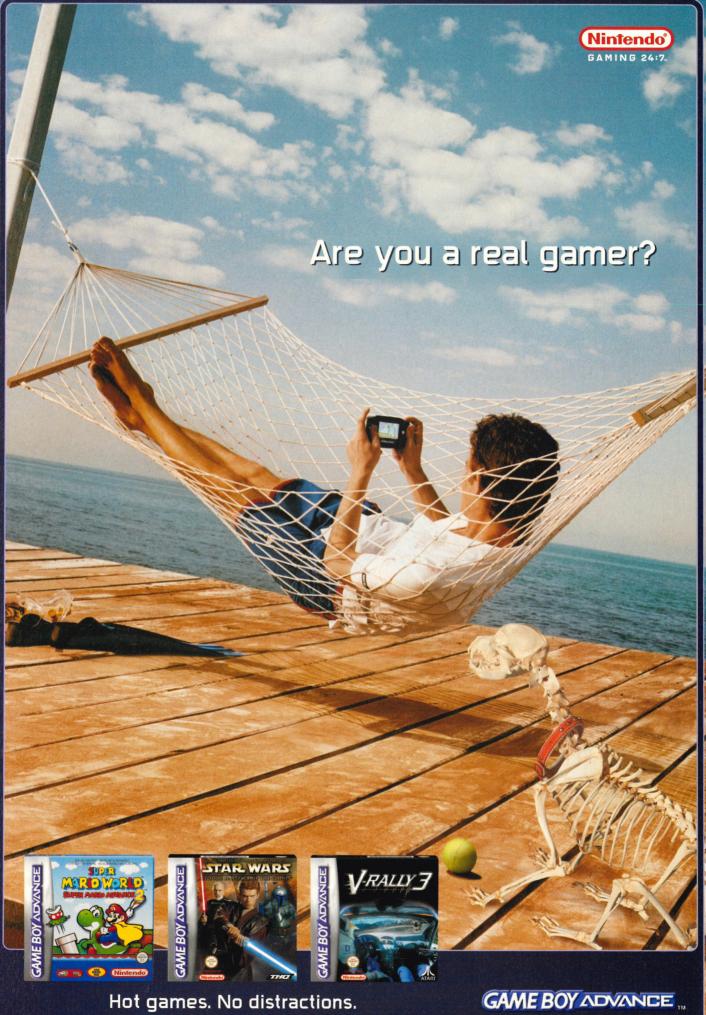

there's one to suit any kind of player.

In the mean time though, Die Hard Vendetta will certainly have a go at staving off its shoot 'em up rivals and the game's unique combination of brains and brawn could be enough to make it a winner. 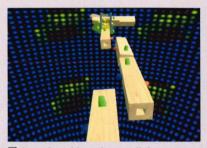

FIENDISH BLOCKS

Whilst much of Super Mario Sunshine involves romping around in the sunshine and collecting Coins, you'll sometimes find yourself plunged into one of the game's many obstacle courses.

These consist of moving puzzle blocks, suspended in thin air with a tantalising Shine waiting at the end. They are incredibly difficult to get across because one false move will send you plunging down into the darkness, losing a life and returning to the start. Thankfully, there are usually two 1-Up Mushrooms hidden amongst the blocks to help compensate for any frustration.

Including the central hub of the island's town there are seven resorts on Isle Delfino for Mario to visit. Every location is divided up into eight Stories, and they are all very different from each other. At the end of each story our hero can collect a Shine, although each world contains several secret Shines to discover as well.

Some of Mario's moves will be familiar to fans of previous games. The butt-stomp is still very much alive, as is the game's spinjump and sideways-jump.

The main point of difference this time around though is the FLUDD Mario uses to clean all the muck his impostor is spreading around. There are several different ways of using the FLUDD, but the contraption is a talkative fellow and will help you to get used to the control system.

The controls do feel a little weird to begin with but you'll soon be spraying around like a natural. By pressing Y you can zoom in for a close-up view that works well when trying to clear graffiti off the walls. Pressing & toggles between the hover pack that enables Mario to float across the sky for short distances and the normal hose mode.

Later in the game you'll get to unlock two more special attachments for your FLUDD, a jet pack that allows you to soar into the heavens and a propeller that enables Mario to turn into a veritable human torpedo.

As ever with Mario games, looks and challenges are everything. Mario and his friends are animated with far more detail than ever before and at first glance the locations of Isle Delfino are teeming with

There's also a lot of voice acting at the start of the game, but it does tail off as you progress. Most of the creatures you meet rely on text to communicate, and although you may think the FLUDD is turning into the Jar Jar Binks of Super Mario Sunshine, NOM reckons it sounds a little like a mischievous Bart Simpson.

Any guibbles there might be with Super Mario Sunshine are far outweighed by the overall quality of the package. Quite simply, you will find nothing better currently on GameCube. Some of the time you have to swing the camera around using the C-Stick, but this is just a very minor gripe and it soon becomes second nature.

It's also worth noting that the game's difficulty setting might be another problem for some. The obstacle courses are incredibly difficult at times and will have you pulling your hair out in clumps. But that's what makes a Mario game great and you'll keep returning until this beast is licked.

Whilst Super Mario Sunshine could never duplicate the huge leap from 2D to 3D made when Super Mario World was followed by Super Mario 64, it once again reaffirms Nintendo's position as purveyors of the most unique and magical video games that have ever been created.

It's almost impossible to put into words what Super Mario Sunshine has about it that holds you spellbound. Not only does it star one of the most-loved characters of all time, but this epic adventure is just a joy to play. Quite simply, it's golden. Maura Sutton 🔤

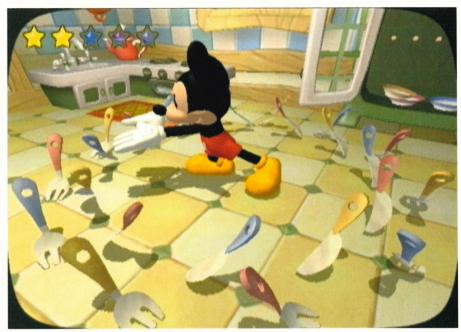

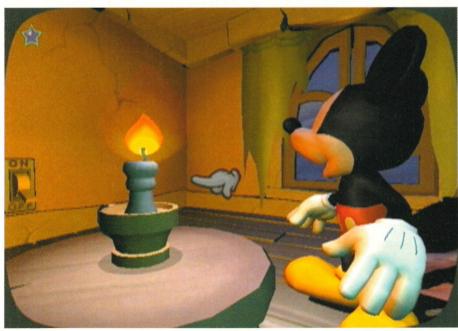

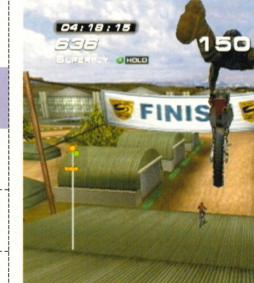
jumps in the mud is a recipe for fun, so MX Superfly is onto a good thing straight away. There's a history of classic motocross games on Nintendo consoles with Excitebike 64 on N64, and this month we've got new contenders: this, the realistic one, and EA's mental Freekstyle.

It doesn't start well for MX Superfly. 125cc bikes amble around in the mud so slowly you almost fall asleep. You get caught in bits of scenery and it's annoying as hell. But as the bikes get quicker, it gets far more interesting. Taking corners well becomes as critical as getting the right amount of spring off a jump. It's tough to win by a massive margin, so there are always bikes buzzing around behind you giving the gameplay a bit of edge.

But Freekstyle manages mind-

jarring excitement from the off by translating tricks into speed. In Career mode any Nac Nac Lookbacks you pull off are for show only, and you might not risk it as one fall can easily screw up your race. Freestyle mode also rewards your mad skills in a series of trick arenas, but the racing and stunt elements feel like separate games.

What saves this from being just average are the mini games. Each bit of success in the Career mode unlocks crazy one-off events like Moto-Golf and Pizza Delivery. Each one of these is a wicked laugh,

The main chunk of the game is found in the Circuit mode. This sees you choose a rider from the eight on offer and take them to championship glory across six different courses. There are three rounds to each course and you must first qualify for the main event by finishing third or higher in two heats.

You can treat this game as an out-and-out racer where you thrash your bike from point A to point B in the fastest time possible, but the secret to winning lies

in building up your boost and the only way to do this is to perform tricks. The courses are littered with jumps that allow you to pull off tricks from a selection of over 100 that are on offer. To gain enough boost you'll need to fill up the Freek Meter and then you can perform an unfeasible four-button special combo for major points. It's definitely worth persevering as winning races and scoring big points will unlock new riders, bikes, costumes and skills. If you decide you don't want to race then you should head for the Freestyle mode where your objective is to score as many points as you possibly can.

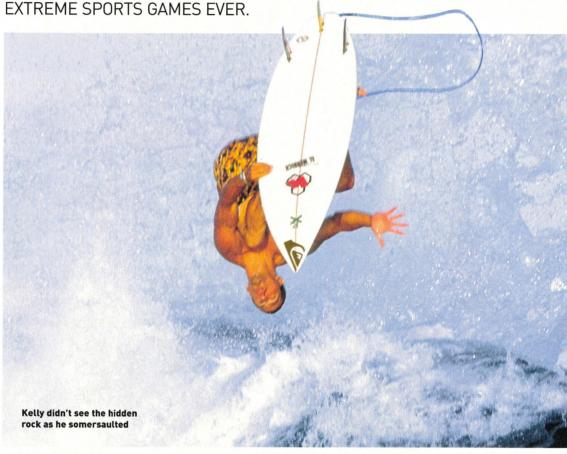

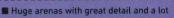

t's been years since Gauntlet first hit the arcades, but despite its transition to Nintendo's next generation machine and more four-player fighting the game hasn't changed one bit.

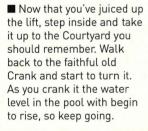
ENTER THE CATACOMBS



■ You're about to leave the creepy Mansion now as you make your way outside to the Courtyard. Make sure that you take a strong weapon, such as the Assault Shotgun, with you as well as the Battery and Crank because you never know who you might bump into in this skin-crawling place.



■ Go through the Courtyard double gates, across the drained pool, past the snakes and back down to the lower Courtyard in the cylindrical lift. Now head to the south east corner and place the Battery in the space provided for you.







■ Take the lift back down to the lower Courtyard and lo and behold you'll see that a tunnel has appeared just where the waterfall used to be. Walk through the dank old tunnel and climb down the ladder that appears until you reach Courtyard B1. If you thought the game was scary, just you wait and see...

ENRICO AND THE CRANK

The Mansion is crawling with scares in each room, but they are nothing compared to what you're about to face down in this stinking part of the game.

Welcome to the Catacombs, the hideout for Umbrella's most evil experiments and vile enemies.



If you've suffered a battering from the zombie dogs on your way to the Catacombs there's a Typewriter and Item Box just prepared to carry on with your quest, go through the door next to the ladder to delve deeper into the Catacombs.



■ There are some sheer terrors lurking deep in the dank Catacombs and you'll soon find out what they are. Take the Dock. Note the Shaft in the power unit, but leave it for now.



■ Carry on through the south door, through more dripping Enrico. After a dramatic cut-scene get the Hexagonal Crank from Enrico and head back to the Save Point. Just be sure to watch out for Hunters as you follow your old footsteps.

ROLLING ROCKS



■ Continue along the tunnel and use the Hexagonal Crank in the hole that's beyond the Typewriter to turn the tunnel round and walk through. Go through the next door and pick up the Flamethrower from the wall.

■ You'll find the third M.O. Disc on the bookshelf by the door in the Imaging Room. Collect the other goodies and files before using the Slide Filter on the projector. Watch the Umbrella Slide show and you will learn a new passcode, 8462.



■ Enter the passcode on the keypad that's situated on the wall to unlock the door to the video suite where you can watch the video nasty of Kenneth's death at the hands of the zombie. Before you leave, don't forget to pick up the Power Room Key because you're going to need it later.



■ Making sure that you have the two remaining M.O. Discs safely in your back pocket, head back to the main corridor on floor B3. Follow the dim corridor round and unlock the Medical Storage Room that's on your left. You've probably hardened yourself to squeamish sights, but the next one's sick.

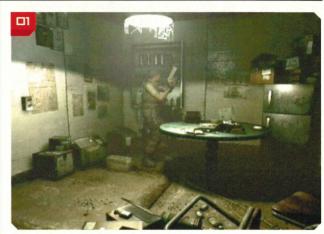

FINAL ESCAPE



■ In the Lab Save Room go up the ladder and through the Emergency Escape door. Run round and listen to the radio message from Brad. You've got one last chance to escape!



■ Use the Fuse Unit that's on the floor to start the lift. With Jill and Rebecca gone, go to the Helipad and use Signal Rockets to alert Brad.

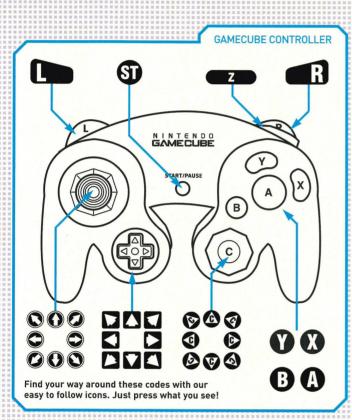

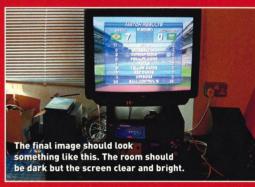

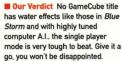

This is not a bad GameCube controller, but it feels half-finished and the garish Spider-Man design will also limit its appeal. Go with the official one instead. 6/10

Verdict: After a year of wanting, a GBA TV attachment finally comes to the market. The TV tuner offers up to 99 channels and also has an RF input so you can attach DVD players or home consoles. It fits nicely onto the back of your machine, although it is rather bulky. The unit requires four AA batteries and life is estimated at a disappointing two hours, but a mains adapter is included. The instruction manual also warns that it may be difficult to receive a TV signal in a car, near an airport, on a train or indeed anywhere that doesn't have a strong TV signal which takes away some of the mobility of the unit. Picture quality is good, but at £69.99 you may consider buying a dedicated mini TV that offers better features. 5/10

Verdict: This powerful fluorescent light attaches to your Game Boy Advance to try and alleviate any problems with a dark screen. The unit offers good, even light distribution and it can be tilted for optimum performance. It does add a lot of weight to your GB Advance and it can be tough to get the Fto-Light tilted so you don't get glare on the screen, but this is definitely one of the best lights on the market. 8/10

RGB SCART Cable JOYTECH

Verdict: If the standard GameCube SCART doesn't offer the picture quality you'd like then you might consider this JOYTECH cable. It displays true RGB output and will display at 60Hz if the software supports it. It also comes with a gold-plated SCART connector for enhanced signal transfer. It certainly makes a subtle difference to picture quality, sharpening edges and making text more legible. For the money, this is definitely worth a look. 7/10

Verdict: Coming in either 4Mb or 8Mb versions (and soon to be available in 16Mb and 32Mb varieties), JOYTECH's memory cards offer game storage at a discount price. After numerous saves however, we found that game save files became damaged, especially with Super Monkey Ball. While this may be a one off, it does call into question the reliability of these unofficial cards. Buy the official Nintendo one instead. 5/10
