> He might have appeared in a number of Dreamcast titles (such as Marvel Vs Capcom 2 and Cannon Spike) but the little robotic chap known as MegaMan hasn't had the opportunity to star in his own game. This strikes us as a bit of a shocker - with so many games under his belt on other consoles, we're surprised that Capcom didn't think to convert at least one of them to SEGA's machine. We've always been fans of MegaMan; despite the fact that his games seem to remain remarkably similar over the years, and are as tough as nuts, we just can't get enough of him. Taking on countless armies of evil robots intent on ruling the world (well, what else would they want?), crossing countless lands of ice, lava, forest and all the other generic settings you can think of and still coming out on top - what a guy. And yet, we can't do any of this on the Dreamcast... still, at least we can comfort ourselves by playing the MegaDrive version of his exploits on our beloved emulators instead



## Strike A Light Virtua Striker 3 – The Verdict

• Let's face it – the Dreamcast • version of Virtua Striker 2

wasn't all that hot. On the other hand, though, in the arcades it was pretty darn spanking... the ultimate arcade football game for many. But it wasn't perfect, nothing ever is, which is where *Virtua Striker 3* comes in to save the day... or not as the case may be.

Running on the all-powerful Naomi 2 board, *Virtua* 

Striker 3 is an

impressive looking game. Thanks to technology, the game can throw about 10 million polygons a second, allowing for incredibly smooth action and immense detail in the players' faces.

It's not just a graphical overhaul that the game's undergone, as Amusement Vision has also fiddled with gameplay mechanics, giving you greater control over such aspects as one-on-one tackling and general teamwork among your players. The game also sees the introduction of the off-side rule (about bloody time too!) and, more importantly, red cards. So, no more foul play from you, Martin.



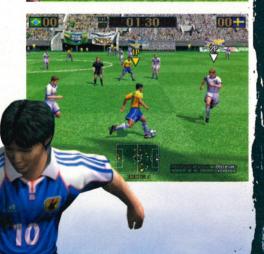


#### Balls

It's not all sweetness and light, though, for all the graphical enhancements that have been made to the game, as well as the little touches to the gameplay, it still suffers from the same fundamental fault that bugged its predecessor – namely sloppy controls. The direct result of this is that it makes the game incredibly difficult to play, let alone score a goal, or even keep the opposition from running riot.

However, that said, *Virtua Striker 3* is still fun to play, especially once you've learnt to tolerate or get used to the controls. Once you're passed that initial stage and you've settled into the pattern of the play there'll be no stopping you plugging the machine with your hard earned cash... even if it is still nigh on impossible to score that elusive goal!

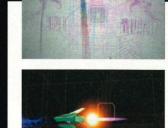
#### **Back To The Roots**

Right, forget all about the whole emotion-evoking thing... let's get down to basics and we'll explain a little more. At the very heart of Rez lies an old-fashioned shoot-'em-up – to be honest, it shares quite a lot in common with that old classic from the MegaDrive (and also the arcade in Shenmue), Space Harrier. You take control of a flying central figure, whizzing over the wireframe landscape taking

out anything that moves with your weapons of destruction; it sounds simple and on the surface, it is. On top of that though, UGA has built up one hell of a story - although only minor details have leaked through so far (the folks at UGA are notoriously tight-lipped when it comes to talking about their games), we know enough to give you a quick run down. Basically, it's all focused on one massive mother computer; despite being the most powerful machine on the planet, she's gone down with a rather nasty virus. It's up to you to hack into the mainframe and take control of your character in an effort to destroy the virus and save the day... so far, so good.

Taking it a step further though, the gameplay within Rez is a bit more complicated

than just pointing and shooting - you need to concentrate not only on what's going on around you, but also upon the beat running beneath the action. Yeah, that sounds stupid but it's the only way to explain how the music ties in with the action of the game; they're linked in a way never seen before in a videogame. Try to get your head around this... pressing the button to lock onto an enemy creates a sound (not a note - a sound). Actually targeting an enemy creates a different sound and then releasing the button to fire a shot at that enemy produces yet another sound. Imagine all this going on repeatedly thanks to the number of enemies on screen - and the fact that you can target up to







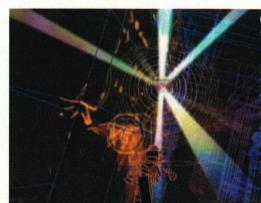
ten enemies at once – then combine that with the ongoing track pounding beats out as you play... this is how the whole Synaesthesia effect comes into play. Still don't understand? Well, don't worry – this really is one of those games that you have to play before you truly 'get it'.

#### The Hills Are Alive...

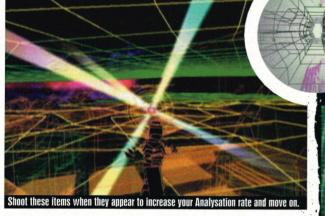
There are six stages to play through in Rez, although you'll only have access to four of them from the start. To unlock the other two, you need to concentrate on something else while playing... yep, that creates even more for your brain to be doing all at once. Each stage has a total of 11 layers within in – to move between stages, you have to shoot data modules as they appear among the enemies. Doing so











evolves the level around you (as well as the music playing) and adds ten per cent to your Analysation rating. The higher your rating, the more chance you have of unlocking those extra stages... although you'll need a good rating across all the stages before it'll happen. You also have to look for the evolution nodes that pop up when you kill a large number of enemies at once; collecting these adds to a meter that, when filled, advances your character to the next stage of creation. It's alot to take in!

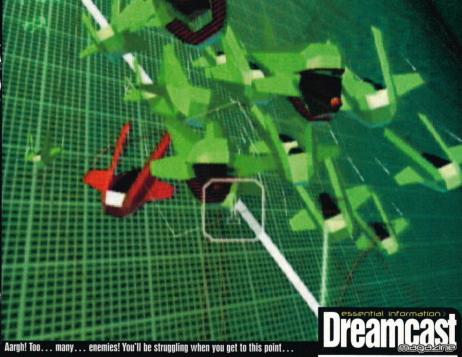
Of course, all this might make you think that Rez is far

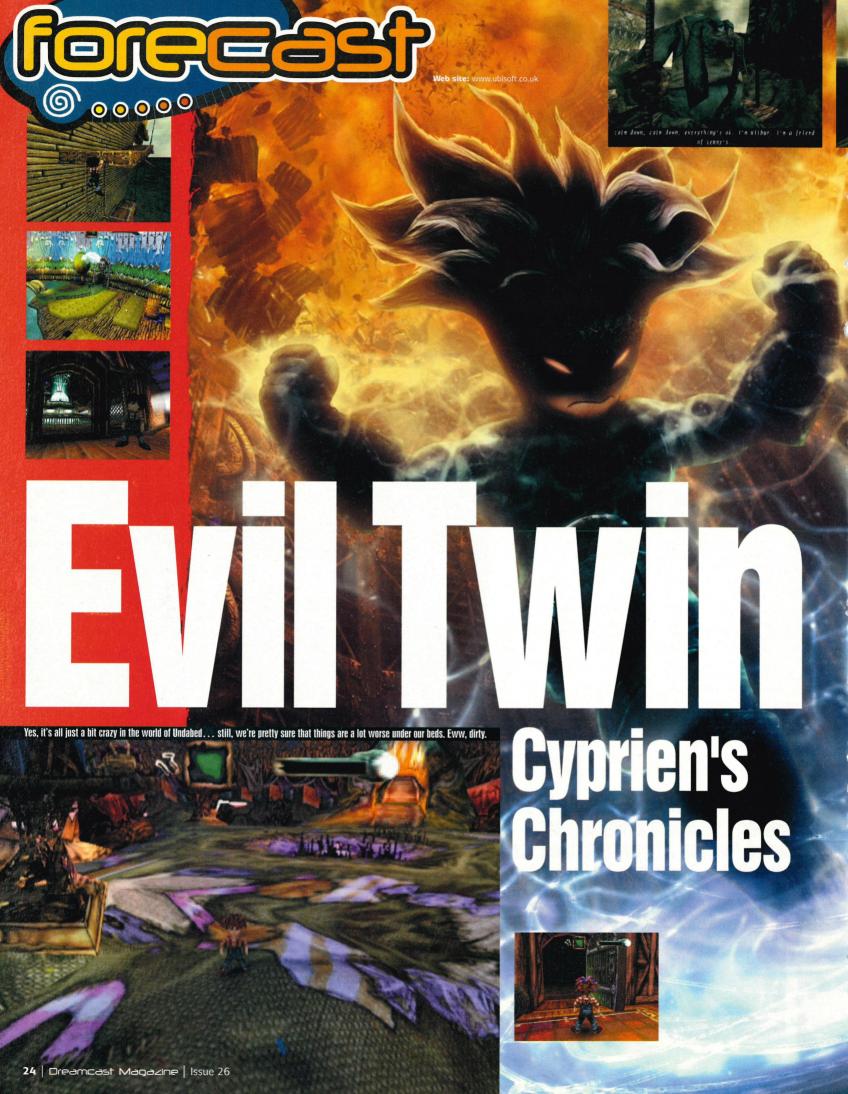




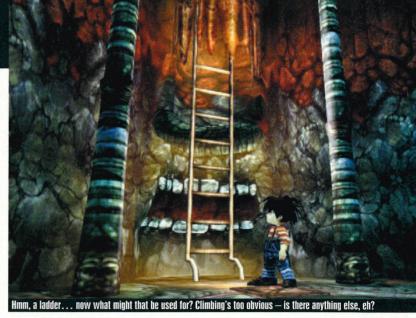

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whose bodies have been cut in two. Secondly, you have 'The People' – these cheeky so and so's live aboard a vessel that drifts around the local waters. Finally, you have 'The Flyers'; a bunch of folk who journey around the place in a flying boat of all things.

#### **Jumping The Gun**

So, that's the background details covered... but how does the game play? Well, a harsh critic might describe Evil Twin as being Rayman 2 on some very hard prescription drugs and to a certain extent the aforementioned critic would be right. However, this looks set to offer a much darker gaming experience and introduces a number of gameplay elements that differentiate it from the adventures of Ubi Soft's limbless hero. Among the most notably of these is the dual personality of the central character... but we'll get to that in a minute. The game's

lusciously detailed (albeit slightly twisted) environments are spread across eight islands, containing a massive total of 76 levels and each area contains a mix of platform, shooting and puzzle elements. Your central task as Cyprien, and his alter ego Super Cyprien, is to locate and destroy the evil force that's been wreaking havoc upon the land. You're not alone on your quest, however, and as you journey around the surreal landscapes, you'll encounter over 100 hundred different characters of which many can be questioned to glean valuable advice and items from.

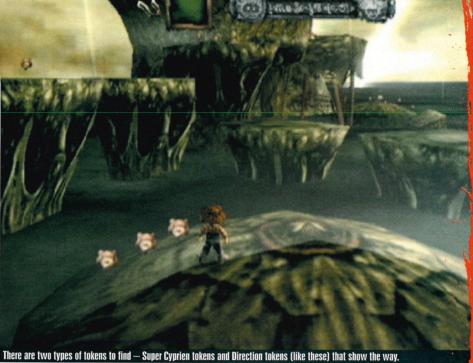

#### Schizophrenic Tendencies

If all this sounds fairly formulaic, let us assure you it isn't. Indeed, when you first see the game moving you'll have to double check that it is actually running on a Dreamcast and not a high-end game's visuals. The beautifully detailed locations and characters borrow heavily from a wealth of sources, with obvious influences being the work of Tim Burton and Lewis Carroll. Consequently, environments in the game range from expansive forests to cluttered city scenes, with each area being laden with platforms and other pitfalls for young Cyprien to negotiate his way across. Unfortunately, the camera angles (which are adjustable) can, at points, make it difficult to determine your jump distance, but hopefully these problems will be rectified by the time the finished game finally makes an appearance. Minor quibbles aside, the game is coming along very nicely with a wealth of ideas that add some much-needed depth to the notoriously formulaic platform genre. For example, our central hero is armed with a catapult - this can be used









to attack the less friendly characters you encounter. Furthermore, it's possible to switch to a first-person perspective (you can't move in this mode, however) which allows for greater precision in aiming. Pinpoint accuracy is needed in certain situations, most notably when you're required to hit certain switches and levers to trigger certain events.

#### **Split Decisions**

Another interesting gameplay mechanic comes in the shape of Cyprien's alter ego. By collecting certain tokens, our hero can transform into Super Cyprien - when in this state you can jump further, run faster and perform more powerful attacks. Sadly you only stay in this condition for a limited period of time, so choosing the correct moment to transform requires very careful consideration.

As he progresses through the game's various locales, Cyprien will encounter a huge

array of weird and wonderful characters, some of which are friendly and others hostile. By talking to these folk you'll discover more about the world of Undabed and also be given certain objectives to carry out. Successfully completing these will see you rewarded with new items to help you along in your adventure. Of course, special mention must go to the various bosses you encounter during the game. In one scene, you come across a massive insect-like enemy that bears more than a passing similarity to the Queen from Aliens... seeing this foe in motion is absolutely breathtaking. Indeed, character design throughout is hugely impressive, with each new individual you meet looking more peculiar than

the last. The surreal dreamlike atmosphere generated by the game is heightened by a suitably odd soundtrack, which acts as a near perfect accompaniment to the strange goings on. Some nice spot effects are also in evidence throughout.

With so many developers jumping ship, it's reassuring to see that there are still some firms developing good quality titles for our beloved console. If the development team at In Utero can iron out the slightly awkward camera problems, Evil Twin should provide Dreamcast owners with a highly enjoyable slice of platforming action. If we can prise the finished game out of Ubi Soft's hands in time, you can expect a full review of the game next issue... we hope.

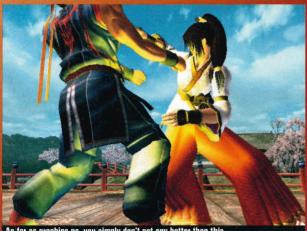

. It was 1993 when Yu . Suzuki, with a little help

from his friends, revolutionised the beat-'emup as we know it. The game? The now seminal Virtua Fighter, of course. Two years earlier Capcom had launched what had previously been the definitive beat-'em-up in the form of Street Fighter II: World Warrior, but that was blown to smithereens and shown for the charlatan it really was, as Virtua Fighter

took the genre into the hereto unexplored dizzy heights of 3D. To say it kicked ass would be an understatement. There was a new king in town and it wasn't going to bow down to anyone... well, that was not until the next instalment came along anyway.

#### 4 Real

Nearly a decade on and it's time for round 4 of SEGA's quintessential beat-'em-up and with it a return to the





because while you're holding down the button you're rendering yourself open and vulnerable to the attacks from your enemy, once again bringing to the fore the value of skill and timing in the game. Other gameplay enhancements include the ability to move your character in eight directions giving you far greater movement and control. The game also offers greater control over throws, so that, depending on how far or near you are to an opponent, the throw that you perform varies... which is pretty neat.

#### **If Looks Could Kill**

However, despite all these gameplay tweaks the most notable advancement of Virtua Fighter 4 is the graphical quality of the game. If you thought that the graphical jump from Virtua Fighter to Virtua Fighter 2 and then from Virtua Fighter 2 to Virtua Fighter 3 was impressive then the graphical chasm between Virtua Fighter 3tb and the latest instalment will have you teetering on the edge of disbelief. Put simply the graphics are mindblowing. Just look at the screenshots scattered (or designed so thoughtfully)

around these pages. Okay, so screenshots don't tell the whole story, but believe it from someone who's actually played the game that it looks every bit as good in motion. Like poetry in motion? You betcha! Quite simply the character animation is as smooth, swift, fluid and beautiful as you'll ever see. Just think how stunning Dead Or Alive 2 (Dreamcast Magazine #08, 92%) was and times that by, say twenty, and you'll be some way to understanding the graphical prowess of this game. The movement of hair, robes, bandanas is all in perfect harmony with that of the character and it's nothing less than a delight to watch, so if you thought you'd seen it all then think again. It really, really doesn't get much better than this.

#### **Virtual Reality**

But it's not just the character models that have undergone this radical case of plastic surgery and bodily enhancement, as so too have the stages. Whereas before the backgrounds were relatively static and uninspirational, now they're just as jaw-droppingly impressive as the rest of the

much we've been told, the fact remains... they just don't mix. 'Interactive movies!', they used to cry while shoving endless full motion video clips in our face -"Look, we have interactive bloody movies so roll up!". The bare faced liars. But, as a slightly crazed Austrian once said, 'The bigger the lie, the more people will believe it'. And so our fascination with the idea of Hollywood and our love of videogames has robbed us of our hardearned cash on many an occasion. There's only so many times you can be had in this way, so it's not surprising that before the words 'interactive movie' even get as far as the part of our brain that decodes language it already sounds a hell of a lot like 'utter crap'. However, way back in 1998 came Metal Gear Solid and suddenly the possibilities of home entertainment took one massive leap towards the silver screen. So massive was its impact that it made the game's designer, Hideo Kojima, the PlayStation equivalent of John Woo. Metal Gear changed the way we looked at games

and everything that followed ended up

drawing comparisons, no matter how tenuous. Check out recent reviews of Infogrames' Sheep Dog 'n' Wolf on the PlayStation... even that had 'Metal Gear elements'. But there's nothing like the real thing and, though much emulated, Metal Gear was never bettered. Of course, here comes the bit when we boldly say... until now!.

#### **Perfecting Perfection**

Metal Gear's association with action movies (both live and Manga) permeates every section of the game. You play Solid Snake, an ex-special forces type who is made to go back into action one last time to take on a group of terrorists that have splintered from Fox Hound, your previous bad ass outfit. To do this you've got to employ stealth tactics, a wide variety of mostly real-world weaponry and a cold, distanced approach to humanity as favoured by Escape from New York's Snake Plisken. In fact, Solid Snake may as well be Plisken... he has the same gravely voice, Eighties hair and even starts off the game being injected with a device that will kill him lest he does what his old boss says. 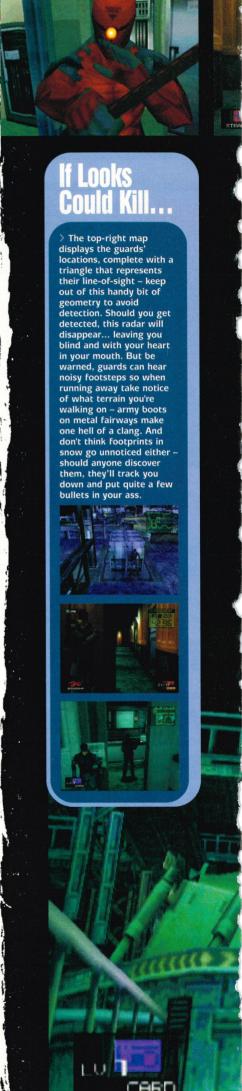

Heavy Metal – the adultorientated magazine, not the music – has been going since it was first published in April 1977.

- It was started by publisher Len Mogel after he got the idea from a French magazine called Metal Hurlant which, literally translated, means Screaming Metal.
- Originally, another game based on the world of Heavy Metal (called FAKK2) was coming to the Dreamcast... but then they canned it. Oh, now there's a great surprise.

a mullet, pull on some skin-tight black leggings and wear your dad's old leather jacket? Then you're the kind of person who'll love Capcom's latest rock-fest...

tr's not often that game developers hit upon a truly winning formula but when they do, you just know it's going to send dollar signs flying through the brains of the people in charge. What's worse is that those dollar signs quickly translate into hastily banged

together follow-ups and sequels that, invariable, aren't much cop... although there are obviously some exceptions to the rule. Most of the time though, the phrase 'money for old rope' comes up far too often – Eidos has *Tomb Raider* (which, after the dreadful movie, should be shot in the head without question), Acclaim has those wonderful wrestling games and even SEGA's own *Crazy Taxi 2* wasn't as good as the original. Capcom though seems to have gone too far and after years of us ignoring the problem, it's finally messed up big time.

Look at the games previous to *Heavy Metal: Geomatrix* coming out and you can see where Capcom got the influence to make it from. When *Power Stone* came out it was heralded as a breakthrough in the beat-'em-up genre thanks to the freedom that the 3D arenas

gave. Power Stone 2 then added much more of a multiplayer slant and brought in more weapons, characters and stages. This was taken one step further in Spawn: In The Demon's Hand by putting the rather shaky camera behind the player and creating a Tomb Raider-meets-Power Stone fighting game, complete with huge guns and tons of blood. Unfortunately though, Capcom has taken that formula (which was good, but not amazing) and twisted it once more to create something new... but, for some unknown reason, it doesn't quite work.

#### **Air Guitars At The Ready**

For all intents and purposes, *Heavy Metal: Geomatrix* is pretty much the same as *Spawn: In The Demon's Hand*. Both games pit you against the computer (or your friends, if you can get them interested) in a series of one-on-one, two-on-one or even three-on-one battles to the death with more explosions and gore than you can shake a bloodied stump at. As you might have guessed from the rather obvious name though,

Heavy Metal takes all of its characters and influences from the adult comic/magazine of the same name. Fans of the magazine will recognise many of the warriors on offer, who hail from one of four factions within the game – the 818 Stompers (leather-clad biker types), the 911 Elite (law-abiding fighters with a taste for justice), the 707 Metal Heads (medieval-obsessed knights) and the 323 Agents (weird, demon-looking nasties). Each team has three characters in it, giving you a decent choice of 12 to choose from... though considering Spawn had 36 on offer, we're feeling disappointed already.

The game itself is split into two distinct sections – the Arcade Mode and a new Dreamcast-exclusive section called Chaosmatrix Mode. As we mentioned before, the Arcade Mode (which includes a rather lacklustre multiplayer mode) sees you taking on a series of characters in various arenas. Seeing as it's a case of win or die trying, weapons pop up all over the place and it's up to you to grab the ones

that take your fancy. The fact that you can hold both swords and guns is incredibly appealing but, sadly, the game itself isn't - rather than being a nailbiting fight to the finish, it seems almost as if each battle is more of a chore. You pick up a weapon, you run up to the enemy (dodging around his fire with ease) and then stab frantically at the Attack button to get some slashes and blasts in... and that's about it. The fights never have any sense of excitement and, as such, become very old, very fast. It's only when you're up against two or more opponents do things get tricky - as you can only target one enemy at a time, the others are left to blow the crap out of you at their leisure and you'll soon be throwing down your pad in total and utter frustration.

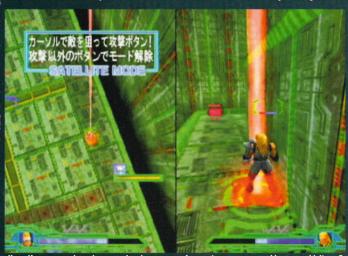

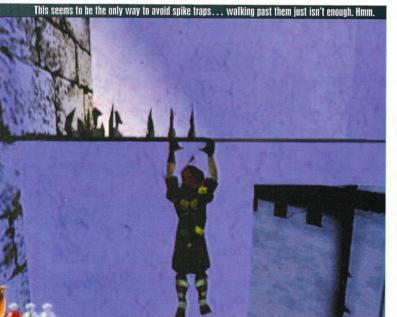

The levels do look quite impressive with nicely textured bricks and exotic architecture. 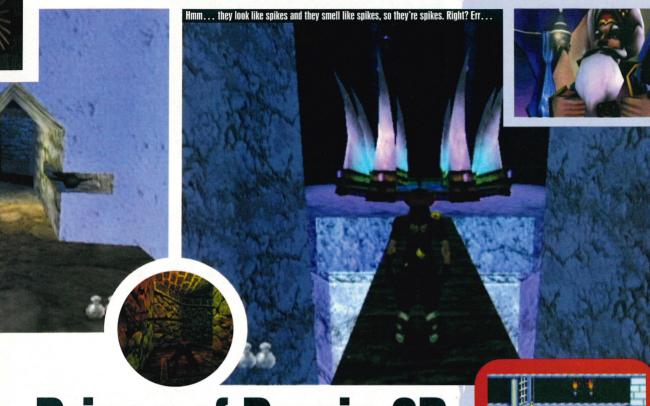

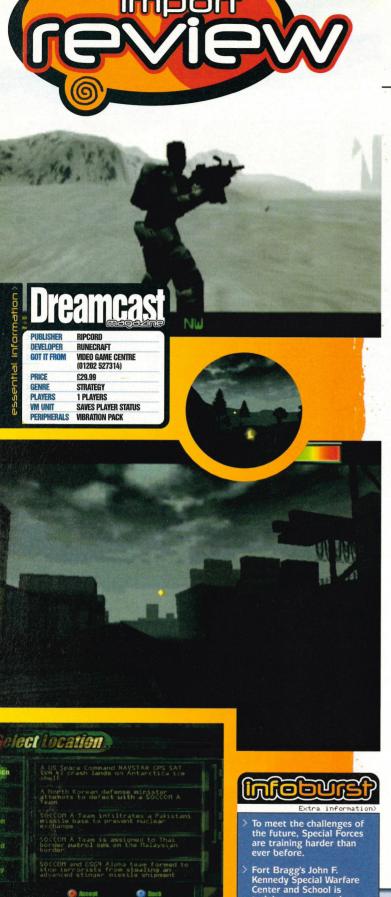

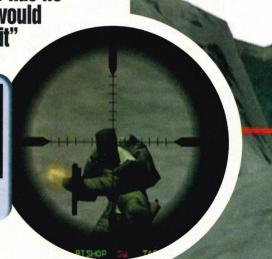

need and this is where the lack of a team really becomes apparent. Then there's the rather pitiful 'kitting out' phase. Your soldier already carries some items by default so it's just a case of picking a weapon and a couple more grenades before starting the mission... but vou'll wish you hadn't bothered when you start to wander around. What's going on with the pop-up scenery? On any mission that doesn't have an unnatural amount of fog the magical disappearing/reappearing hills and mountains are there for all to see. This problem also applies to the enemies while still invisible to you because you're more than five feet away, they're able to shoot at you. This is just the start of the shortcomings this game contains, but unfortunately there just isn't any point in listing them all... it'd be a waste of breath. 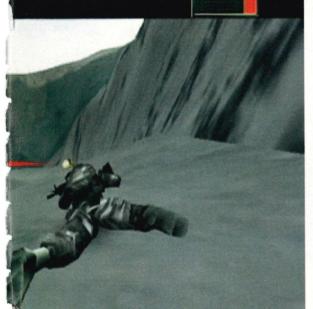

The progress of the mission is entirely dependant on who you choose to send and what you make them do; agents with skills in hacking are essential for missions set in company offices, while stealth and cunning are more important for dealing with guards and traps.

#### **Something Beginning** With 'Arah!'

Of course, all this takes planning and you'll be spending much of your time trying to prepare for what's in store. Before each mission, there's the opportunity to look at the reconnaissance data and decide exactly which areas you need to concentrate your attention on. You can even work out routes through each location and then enact your 'plan'

To do this simply hit the Acceleration button and the Forward Gear button at the same time. If you are travelling forward at the time you will need to release the Acceleration button for a beat and then perform the move.

#### **Crazy Drift**

A highly important move that lets you change direction in a hurry. Definitely needed if you want to go far in this game. To perform this one, let off the acceleration for a beat and then hit the Forward Gear button, followed by the Reverse Gear button and then back on the Acceleration whilst turning to the direction you want to go. A bit of a tricky one, but one worth mastering!

#### Still Crazy Drift

If you need to quickly change position after picking up a customer, then this is the move to get familiar with. Whilst stationary, press the Forward Gear button, back to Reverse, Acceleration and then the direction you wish to go in. Note: Be careful not to spin out by accelerating too much!

#### **Crazy Stop**

Simple. Switch to Reverse and then press brake at the same time. This is very handy if you want a quick stop or if you want to prevent over shooting the target!

#### **Crazy Hop**

Very simple and very effective when you have to clear anything from a building to a traffic problem! All you have to do is press the Y button.

#### **Crazy Drift Hop**

Basically, you must execute a Crazy Hop in the middle of a Crazy Drift. You'll find it won't be used much in the regular game but it comes in handy in a few of the Pyramid games. However, it is a very tricky move to do.

#### 5-1 Crazy Jump

# . The aim of this game is to drive down a ramp and

launch yourself from the edge and clear 250 meters. This game is not all that difficult to do Simply race to the edge and before you leap into oblivion, execute the Hop. This will get you past this challenge, with no problems.

#### 5-2 Crazy Golf

#### Smack a golf . ball from its tee

to clear the necessary distance. Again, another simple task to do. Before racing at the ball, back up a little to give yourself some distance to pick up speed. As you race towards the ball, hop at it before you hit it and this will easily whack the ball far enough!

#### 5-3 Crazy Hurdle

#### · Yet again, this game shouldn't give you any hassle.

The challenge here is to hop over the hurdles as you approach them. There is no real need for any special tricks in this one, just be quick and it's done!

#### 5-4 Crazy 3 Jump

#### . Remember the old hop, skip

and jump? Good, because this is just a variation of that idea. Race towards the white line and then jump across it, and then again two more times before the time runs out. The only real difficult bit is to ensure that you complete each of the jumps before you're all out of time, and the timer doesn't leave room for any mistakes.

#### 5-5 Crazy Balloons

#### . In this game . there are a

number of scattered balloons in an arena that you must race to and burst before the time runs out. This one is a little trickier than the others as it requires a good aim and good handling, Also, the balloons are floating in the air at different heights, but a simple hop will easily reach even the tallest target. If you are sharp enough, this game will be a walk in the park.

#### 4-1 Crazy Ramps

#### . This one is easy. . The game

requires you to drive over the ramps that will help you clear the walls. As you approach the end of the track the ramps become narrower and so be sure to get your aim right as you approach the ramp, and that you correct yourself as you land to aim for the next one.

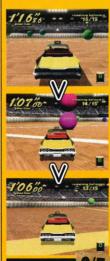

#### 4-3 Crazy Turn

. This task requires you to

hop onto the platforms in front of you and climb them all to the top. This one will be difficult to do unless you can pull off the Crazy Drift Hop (or at least a quickly executed Crazy Drift), as every couple of jumps requires you to switch directions. knowing this move is an advantage!



#### 4-4 Crazy Jam

. The quickest way to do this is by

racing towards the first highway and hop up onto its left-hand side (it crosses the road you are travelling on) and carry on left until you reach the first drop off point. Use the Crazy Drift to quickly spin around to the opposite direction and race towards the opposite end of the road to drop off your second passenger. For the last two passengers. proceed back down to the road that crosses underneath the road you are on now and hop off onto the right hand side! You should effectively be heading north again. Soon another highway will approach you and simply repeat the process as before. If you are quick, this won't be a problem!



#### 3-1Crazy Rush 2

. Again, you have · four passengers to drop off. This time,

you must leap across a series of rooftops. The pattern for these rooftops is actually quite simple, as it's a basic cross with two rooftops to jump to on each side of the central building. You, naturally, start on the central building and then using the Crazy Dash to give you an early boost, leap to the building in front of you. As you arrive at each drop off point, it is important to brake quickly and if possible, spin to face back the way you'd came. For the other three passengers, always return to the central building and then proceed on to the next roof of your choice. Speed is important as the time limit doesn't leave much room for error (especially if you are just a beginner)



#### 3-2 Crazy Drop

. This time. · instead of

climbing, you have to drop down a series of platforms to reach your destination. This is made even harder by the fact that you have to change direction after every drop and that it is also very easy to travel too fast and drop off the sides. The best way to get through this game is to never go too fast and pull off Crazy Drifts as soon as you hit the ground (the arrows on the ground will point you in the right direction)!



#### 3-3 Crazy Stairs

. Another game . that involves

having to aim well and leap onto a higher platform. There is nothing too hard here; it's a simple race in one direction game that also requires jumping off to the left to a slightly higher platform. Obviously, there is a giant fall on either side of you so each leap needs to pretty accurate.

#### 2-1 Crazy ZigZag

. This is a tough one. Imagine

Crazy Turn but with narrower roads and without having walls around you to prevent spinning off. One wrong move here and it's a watery end! The best trick to use is the Drift Hop. Time is against you and it will take a couple of tries to master this, as any mistakes made will land you in the drink!

#### 2-2 Crazy Arches

. This is one of the harder tasks

that is not too dissimilar to the Crazy Stairs task. The difference this time is that instead of a simple, straightforward run, the leaps must be made from the top of one stone arch to another. This makes it harder simply because the timing for each leap needs to be near perfect and that the angle you jump from needs to be equally as spot on as possible!







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> The handy thing about this course is that the passengers you need to pick up and deliver are often in clusters, remaining in a close area. Every so often one passenger will need to go a long distance but once he/she has been dropped off, the next batch of customers are then quite close together.
The map below shows the drop off points, however, you will have certainly needed to pick up a few tricks from the previous tasks in order to be able to complete this game in the allotted time!

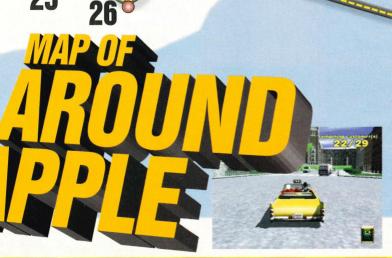

• Learn to keep your sights trained on a particular point, no matter how much you have to move. That way, you'll be able to score hits with higher accuracy than before.

If you're using explosive weapons, remember to think about splash damage – you don't have to score a direct hit on an enemy to do him harm. Watch out though, as splash damage from an explosion can also wind up hurting you in the process!
Get to know your terrain well. If you know exactly where all the armour, special weapons and power-ups are going to be, you'll have a better chance of getting them and coming out on top.

 The ideal situation would be to tailor your own character to your personal playing style. Pick out the weapons that best suit how you play the game – long-distance ones for those who like to hide and highimpact guns for close quarters fighters. Oh, and the colour of your suit makes all the difference as well... really, it does.

#### Say Hello To My Little Friend

Of course, the most important thing about Outtrigger is the weapons – thankfully, there are lots of them and they all do some serious damage. Here's a run down of what's on offer...

#### Rasic Gun

Wielded by Jay, Alain and many of the terrorists, it fires out bullets at an alarming rate. Not too powerful, but handy none the less.

#### **Basic Grenade**

Lob one of these babies into a crowded corridor and watch the fur fly. They're really only good as a last resort though, so watch out!

#### **Rocket Launcher**

The basic rocket launcher carried by most characters – just point and shoot for powerful explosive fun.

#### Lina's

Gun/Grenade/Cannon. Unlike Jay and Alain, Lina has weapons of her own including an Uzi machine gun, wall-hugging proximity mines and an explosive rifle.

#### Talon's Gun/Grenade/Cannon

Talon has his own weapons as well – a rapid-fire gun with rebounding bullets, a basketball-style grenade and a lightning cannon... cool!

#### **Enemy's Bat**

Hmm, a bat... not exactly the greatest weapon around, eh? Still, if you can get close in then your enemies are in for a walloping!

#### Flame Thrower

If you like your terrorists well done, this is the weapon to go for. It's got quite good range, but eats up ammo like there's no tomorrow.

#### **Photon Toroedo**

Ahh, now we're talking. Powerful blasts of photon energy that can bounce off walls! The perfect way to surprise your enemies!

#### **Guided Missile**

They come in two forms, but both can hunt down enemies without the need for aiming. It's not the best weapon ever though...

#### IMP

Fast firing and hard hitting, this powerful machine gun is the ideal replacement for the basic gun when creating your own character.

#### OLCU

The firing rate is a little slow, but the explosive bullets contained within this high-power rifle more than make up for it.

#### PSG-

Sniper rifles are great when you're hidden from the view of the enemy – unfortunately, it's the worst gun ever at all other times!

#### el ezonin

This grenade launcher might look pretty, but it's a bit naff really. A lack of range and speed make it useless in a close-up fire fight.

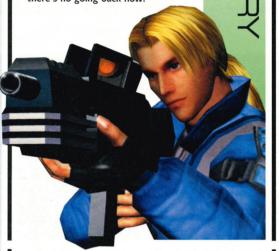
You'd think that a shotgun would be ideal for closecombat fighting but you're wrong. This one's too weak to be of any use to you...

#### EXERCISE #001

ATTACK REFLEX TRAINING

GOAL: KILL 11 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: STOREHOUSE #1

• As you might have guessed, the first exercise is simply to warm you up for what's to come later – you don't even have to move about to win here. Just move your aiming sight quickly (but smoothly... don't overdo it) back and forth between the terrorists that appear, avoiding any hostages that try to get in your way. Shoot the orange/red enemies before they fire back and you'll come away with a clean victory.



#### EXERCISE #002

MOBILE TARGET TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: STOREHOUSE #2

Easy? Of course... you don't even have to move your gun around! Just keep the aiming sight focused on the middle of the screen, pulling the trigger when terrorists run in front of it. You can ignore the green-marked ones, as only the orange/red enemies will actually fire back – these are the main targets to take out. Fire when necessary rather than in a constant stream and you'll come out on top easily.



#### EXERCISE #003

STEALTH ATTACK TRAINING GOAL: COLLECT 24 MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

• There's nothing easier than collecting inanimate • objects that can't fire back, is there? Of course not – that's why you'll be able to complete this stage on your first go. Just follow the line of medals as they appear and run around the level as quickly as possible; if you stick to the walls for the most part, you'll manage to collect every medal without any problems.

ATTACK REFLEX TRAINING GOAL: KILL 14 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: APARTMENT HOUSE

• This exercise is exactly the same as the first one, • only the location has changed – now it's bigger and, as such, harder to keep track of where all the terrorists are coming from. Shoot the orange/red enemies first, as they pose the most threat; keep clear of the hostages that appear and don't be too scared to aim through the crates to get the kill.

STEALTH ATTACK TRAINING GOAL: COLLECT 35 MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: OLD CASTLE

• All you have to do here is follow the trail of • medals that appears as you collect each one – don't worry too much about taking your time, as they're all easy to pick up. The only thing you need to worry about is the final leap from the raised platform onto the pillar above the pond for the last medal; if you don't jump from the very edge of the ledge at full speed, you'll miss it and have to run round all over again!



PREPARATORY COURSE — FINAL COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

• You've only got to bump off ten terrorists here, • so it's not that tricky – however, the enemies come in two different varieties so you still have to be careful. While blue terrorists can be wiped out with one direct hit from a rocket, red ones will take a bit more punishment. Watch who you're fighting against and then react accordingly... you'll thank us in the end. Oh, and make sure you use the radar!



#### EXERCISE #001

QUICK AMBUSH TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

• How easy do you want these levels to be? The • Observatory Level is completely round, so all you have to do is keep running around the central base in an anti-clockwise direction to stay one step ahead of the terrorists. If you move especially quickly and score some direct hits, you'll be able to sneak up on more enemies as they appear and score an easy kill... don't go for the Flame Thrower though or it could all go horribly wrong!



• Another reasonably simple level – the Quiet • Station is quite open, so staying close to the enemies as they move around isn't too tough. All you have to watch out for is when the terrorists jump up onto the high levels on top of the carriages at either end to escape your pursuit. Just wait patiently for them to come back down, then blast them in the face with a rocket! Grab the power-up when it appears and you'll have this one in the bag.





#### **EXERCISE #003**

CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

Moving round the outside of the Colosseum is the best way to keep up with the terrorists, though you'll need to watch for the power-up appearing in the middle of the arena. Dash in and grab it before running away again... you don't want to get caught in the crossfire! Photon Torpedos work especially well here, but be careful not to let any of the terrorists get hold of the Flame Thrower; it's nasty! Remember to keep your distance when firing at the enemies to avoid any incoming attacks.



#### **EXERCISE #004**

CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

There are quite a few tight corners that you can run into around the Asian Ruins, so take care not to accidentally fire off a rocket and damage yourself instead of your target. You'll need to kill all three terrorists in the arena before any more will appear, so keep moving and use the radar to watch where any remaining terrorists are. Thermography goggles are handy, but not essential.



#### **EXERCISE #005**

CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: LIBRARY

Getting all of the terrorists in the Library is a case of using the Photon Torpedoes and powerups to your advantage – by firing against walls, you can take out enemies without them even knowing where you are. The opponents move about a lot and are quite good at evading your fire, so take this into account when aiming and try to fire slightly ahead of them. Be careful when running across the raised walkway; it's entirely open and leaves you completely vulnerable!



#### **EXERCISE #006**

NOVICE COURSE — FINAL COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: OLD CASTLE

• This stage is quite large considering the number of enemies around – there are only four in the arena with you at any one time, so keeping a constant flow of kills going can be tough. The Thermography goggles are important as they allow you to see your opponents from anywhere in the level. Try to intercept enemies on the stairs or in other places where dodging your fire is tricky – you need all the kills you can get, as in this exercise time is of the essence!





#### **EXERCISE #001**

CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: QUIET STATION

• An easy exercise to start you off in the
• Intermediate training... the Quiet Station is a
good level to play, simply because you can't lose
track of your enemies that easily. There aren't that
many places to hide, so using your radar will help
you find them easily. Try to ambush enemies using
obstacles for cover, throwing in a couple of rockets
to kill them before they know what's coming. If
you're good, you can even catch enemies as they
respawn, making your job even easier!

TEAM COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: QUIET STATION

• This is the first exercise where you won't be • alone – there's someone else in the arena who's on your side. You MUST NOT shoot them! If you do, you'll lose five seconds of time from the clock and put your success in jeopardy. The good news though is that any kills made by your team-mate will count towards your final target, so you won't have to do all the work yourself! Grab the power-up and then go crazy with your rocket launcher... it won't take too much to win here.



CLOSE QUARTERS COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

• This mission is pretty much identical to Novice Exercise #004, only now the enemies you're facing are much faster and far more deadly with their weapons. As long as you make good use of your strafing skills to dodge incoming rockets (and be ready to run backwards quickly when the DKs come running towards you), you'll be able to make it through this exercise without too much grief.



## RCISE #006

INTERMEDIATE COURSE - FINAL COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TRAINEES WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: LIBRARY

• This one looks exactly the same as the previous exercise, but there's one slight difference you're now going up against your fellow trainees instead! There's no-one to help you he<mark>re,</mark> so you're going to have to move like crazy and score some direct hits to come out on top. Make good use of the Photon Torpedoes (and the power-up when it appears), as well as grabbing the Flame Thrower simply to stop your opponents getting hold of it. It's not impossible!



#### ERCISE #004

NIGHT COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: DARK ASIAN RUINS

• This exercise is set in the Asian Ruins, much like • the last one; however, it's now dark and you'll have to make good use of the Noctovision goggles if you want to stand any chance of winning. You're up against a group of DKs and Proofers here, so watch for those close-up attacks that they love so much. Use the same tactics as the previous mission on top of these tips and you'll do fine.



#### CISE #00!

COMPREHENSIVE COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: LIBRARY

• Another exercise set in the Library, so you • should know what to expect – concentrate on grabbing the Photon Torpedoes early and then lay siege to the enemies before you. There's a good team-mate here to help out, so make sure you hold your fire when they're in the way - killing them costs you vital time from the clock. Just watch for the DKs and their nasty up-close and personal method of attack...



#### EXERCISE #001

TEAM COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

The first exercise might look easy, but it's not — all the enemies require at least two direct hits to kill and have an annoying habit of dodging your shots. The kills made by your team-mate work in your favour, but that doesn't mean you don't have to do any work; keep moving and grab the power-up whenever it appears. Oh, and make sure you steer clear of picking up the Guided Missiles... they're useless for killing enemies on the level!



#### EXERCISE #002

Close Quarters combat training Goal: Kill 12 Terrorists Within the Time Limit Location: Busy Station

• The fact that you're in the Busy Station means

Another chance for you to try your skill against the other InterForce trainees... and it's not easy. Your enemies have suddenly become a lot faster and accurate with their shots, so be on your guard. The power-up is essential but it's unlikely you'll be able to hold onto it for long. There is one thing to your advantage – your enemies will be trying to kill each other as well as you. Move in on opponents with low energy and finish them off quickly!



#### EXERCISE #004

TEAM COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: LIBRARY

• The enemies here are pretty strong but, because • you've got a team-mate to help you out, you should be able to breeze through this one in no time. Grab the Photon Torpedoes and Armour as soon as you can, then go rampaging through the level and take out anything that moves. This certainly isn't the toughest Advanced level around...



#### EXERCISE #005

COMPREHENSIVE COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 TRAINEES WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: OLD CASTLE

• This is another very tough stage against your • fellow trainees – not only are they very fast and accurate, but the size and complexity of the level makes it difficult to keep up with them. Thermograpy is an absolute must here, so grab it early and often. Make sure you also get hold of the power-up in the middle of the arena – without it, you'll need to score two or three direct hits to down an enemy. Keep moving and remember to stock up on health when you're low.



#### EXERCISE #006

ADVANCED COURSE — FINAL COMBAT TRAINING GOAL: KILL 12 ENEMIES WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

• The main enemies you'll be up against are
• Salamanders. Although it'll only take a few direct hits to down them at the start, they get stronger as the level progresses so watch out.

Occasionally, DKs will turn up so get rid of them as soon as you can! Finally, more and more enemies will start appearing as you come closer to the goal – you'll find yourself up against three Salamanders at once! Just keep your cool and concentrate on getting rid of them one by one to clear the level.

# **Mission** Mode

> The meat and potatoes of the game is the Mission Mode – 45 different missions that will eventually unlock all the hidden secrets in the game. You have to finish a whole row of missions before the next one becomes available, though you can complete each five in any order.



#### MISSION #001

GET ALL MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 30 SECS LOCATION: QUIET STATION

• Having trouble completing this mission? Then • you need to turn this game off quick and try something a bit easier like... well, blinking. There are only three medals to collect and they're all right in front of you - run straight forwards, strafing left slightly to get the second one before moving right again for the last medal. Duh.



#### MISSION #002

GET ALL MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

• Another simple one, especially because there's a • demonstration beforehand showing you what's ahead. All you need to do is run around the centre of the Observatory, collecting the medals as you go - there's no need to stop and look around. They're not evenly spaced out but that doesn't really matter... does it?



#### MISSION #003

KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: APARTMENT HOUSE

• If you've completed the Preparatory section of • the Arcade Mode, you'll recognise this – it's exactly the same as Exercise #004. Terrorists will pop up from behind the crates and you need to shoot them back down. You need to pay special attention to the ones that are marked in either orange or red, as they're close to firing back at you. Just be careful to avoid shooting the white-marked civilians that appear...



#### MISSION #004

DODGE ALL THE ENEMY'S ATTACKS TIME LIMIT: 5 MINS LOCATION: STOREHOUSE #2

• No firing necessary to pass this mission; in fact, • all you need are the left and right strafe buttons. Concentrate on the terrorist in front of you and watch the marker around him turning from green and yellow to orange and finally, red - this means he's about to fire at you. When he launches a rocket, simply step to the side of it to stay clear you only have to avoid a mere 12 shots to complete this mission.



#### MISSION #005

KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITH THE SPECIFIED WEAPONS TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: STOREHOUSE #1

• Although you might think you've done this • before, it's a bit different – now you have to shoot the terrorists that appear with certain weapons. The word Gun, Grenade or Rocket will appear above the heads of each enemy that pops up, so quickly switch to that weapon and let him have it. Remember to watch the markers for when they're about to fire back at you and avoid hitting the hostages that appears (they're the ones with All Weapon written above them).



GET ALL MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

Unlike in the Arcade Mode where the medals appear one after another, you'll see that they're all visible from the start here. This makes grabbing them incredibly easy, though you might miss one if you're not paying attention – use the radar to see if that's the case. The only one you need to be careful of is on the raised platform that is near the stairs at the back of the level... you'll need to jump up to collect it



#### MISSION #007

KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

Although there's a Flame Thrower available here, you're far better off sticking with the Rocket Launcher and scoring one-hit kills on the terrorists. The clocks that they drop are essential for keeping the time limit running out, so grab them as soon as you can. Also, you should take care not to get too close to enemies when firing: if you're not careful you'll take some serious splash damage.



#### MISSION #008

KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

• Only one enemy to deal with here, but that doesn't make it easy – he's got a higher energy bar and better aim than the regular terrorists, so don't let your guard down. By using the Photon Torpedoes to bounce shots off the walls, you can do some serious damage to him quite quickly. Watch out for the rockets he fires back at you... they can be deadly!



#### MISSION #009

DESTROY ALL OF THE BOMBS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: QUIET STATION

→ This is the first level where you can't die – if → your energy runs out, it's game over for you. Destroying the bombs isn't difficult as all you need to do is shoot them once with your gun... however, actually spotting where they are can be tricky. You have to use your radar to the max and check the walls and ceiling carefully; get too close to a bomb and it'll go off in your face. There's only three to deal with here, so make the most of it...



#### MISSION #010

Kill 10 terrorists within the time limit time limit: 1 min Location: White Base

Unfortunately, you're lumbered with having to use the Flame Thrower here—the enemies have them too though, so be careful when getting in close to attack them. Be sure to grab the power-up from the crates near the submarine when it appears and try to keep moving; there are only three enemies at a time, so you'll have to frag all three before any more arrive on the scene.



#### MISSION #011

Highest Point Total at the END of the time limit wins Time limit: 2 mins 40 secs Location: Asian Ruins

• This mission has to be treated as if you're in playing a regular VS game against three computer opponents... it's tough, but certainly not impossible. Be sure to steal medals from under your opponents and try to get some early kills on the board to put you in the lead. It's possible to rack up points very quickly here, so don't get too downhearted if you fall behind. Whatever you do though, don't kill yourself... you lose two points if you do!



continued

DEFEND THE HOSTAGE TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

• You won't be able to move around here but that • doesn't matter – you can see everything you need to see from your vantage point above the Colosseum. The aim here is to prevent the hostage from being killed: terrorists run in from either side and take aim from one of five locations below you. The markers around them will change as before to indicate how close they are to firing... make sure you shoot them as quickly as possible! If they get even one shot off, you lose - it's that simple.





HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: OLD CASTLE

• The Old Castle is a pretty big level, with plenty of raised ledges from which to shoot down. The best tactic for winning is to stick to your Rocket Launcher and try to trap opponents in the narrow areas so that they can't escape... along with keeping a watch for any medals left lying around by the careless computer enemies. Thermography works well here but you don't have to use it if it's not available.



### MISSION #013

TEAM BATTLE TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

• Much like the Team Battles in the Arcade Mode, • you're not allowed to shoot your team-mate – rather costing you time though, you'll now lose a whopping four points instead! Killing yourself costs two points, so make sure you keep your distance and only shoot when you've got the enemy in your sights. You should be able to breeze through this one though as the computer will do most of the work for you!



#### MISSION #014

KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: WHITE BASE

• The White Base has plenty of those annoying pillars around to obscure your view of the lone terrorist here, but that shouldn't be a problem. All you really have to do is try and shepherd him into the corner behind the crates and then blast him constantly with your rockets. That way, you can easily nip in and grab the power-up when it appears without losing sight of him. An easy mission if ever there was one.



#### MISSION #015

KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: DARK ASIAN RUINS

If you've completed all the missions up to now ••• (which you must of done, otherwise this wouldn't be available), this should be a walk in the park for you. The level is exactly the same as the regular Asian Ruins, except that it's dark - well, duh. Unfortunately, this means you won't be able to see the targets around any enemies until you get up close; you'll need to keep picking up the Noctovision goggles to see them properly. Otherwise, just play this as you know best...



Dodge or shoot the guided Missiles and Survive Time Limit: 45 Secs Location: Colosseum

Whatever you do, DON'T shoot the hostage! He might be firing Guided Missiles at you but that doesn't give you the right to blast him to kingdom come now, does it? To stay alive, simply run backwards and strafe right to leg it round the outside of the Colosseum – by doing this, you can shoot the missiles as they come up behind you. Just be careful of the more powerful rockets with purple trails he fires towards the end of the time limit!



#### NISSION #003

KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: DARK BUSY STATION

This can be a real pain, because not only is the level incredibly cramped but it's also in the dark. You'll need to grab the Thermography goggles to see the enemies through the carriages, but be careful not to shoot the white-marked figure... they're on your side! Any kills they make count towards your final score, but don't rely on them or you won't be successful.



#### MISSION #004

DESTROY ALL OF THE BOMBS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 3 MINS LOCATION: ART MUSEUM

Now THIS is fun... and hard. There are tons of bombs here for you to destroy, but the stage is set on two floors – you need to be really careful. If a bomb is set near the ground of the upper floor and you walk beneath it, it might still go off and kill you! Watch the radar to see the bombs; a hollow triangle means that the bomb indicated is either above or below you (depending on where you are). Check the walls and ceiling closely... they could be lurking anywhere!



#### MISSION #005

KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: LIBRARY

This terrorist is something else – he's got quite a large energy bar, a good aim with his Rocket Launcher and has an annoying habit of strafing around your fire. You're in the Library though, so that means you've got access to the Photon Torpedoes... good for you. Get hold of them as soon as possible and make every shot count; after all, he's pretty tough. Still, you're 'ard – you can sort him out no problem...



#### MISSION #006

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: BUSY STATION

The confined spaces of the Busy Station make it difficult to stay on top here, simply because there's plenty of opportunity to blow yourself up by accident. Obviously, the Thermography goggles are a must pick-up for those who want to win but you'll want to make a beeline for the power-up as well in the middle of the arena. If you're feeling daring, you might even try jumping onto the carriages to get a better vantage point.



#### MISSION #007

KILL 8 TERRORISTS WITH CONSECUTIVE COMBO ATTACKS TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

what are consecutive combo attacks? Well, we're not sure ourselves – it's never really explained. The best we can work out is that they're kills made without getting killed yourself... either that, or you have to kill each person in quick succession. Either way, you won't have any troubles here – just grab the power-up when you can and keep running in circles around the Observatory, capping terrorists as they appear.

#### /ISSION #008

DEFEND THE HOSTAGE TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN LOCATION: ASIAN RUINS

• The objective here is exactly the same as Novice • Mission 12, but you're in the Asian Ruins now and the time limit has been extended. This is bad, because the area the terrorists will be running around is a lot bigger and harder to watch. What's more, they'll move around much more than before and have less time to wait before they shoot. Stay on the ball and be ready to shoot at a moment's notice... you can do it!



TEAM BATTLE TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: COLOSSEUM

• Again, this battle shouldn't pose too many problems as you've got someone working with you - however, you're up against your fellow trainees now so don't let your guard slip. Grabbing the Photon Torpedoes would be the smart thing to do, as well as the power-up in the middle of the Colosseum (although this leaves you wide open to attack from all sides). Concentrate on grabbing those medals and get cracking!



KILL 10 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 10 SECS LOCATION: WHITE BASE

• Just one problem here... there's only ten • seconds on the clock! Quick kills and a speedy collection of those extension clocks is the order of the day here, or else you'll find yourself facing game over rather quickly. All the terrorists require two direct hits to kill, so you've got your work cut out here. You'll also need to keep moving in order to get a constant flow of kills going... good luck!



KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: ART MUSEUM SMALL

• The arena is quite a bit smaller compared to the regular Art Museum stage (hence the name, obviously) - you shouldn't have too much trouble keeping up with the terrorist here. The Thermography goggles are a bit out of the way, as is the power-up, but they're both very handy. If you're really good, you can trap the terrorist in one of the narrow alcove areas and then hit him repeatedly with splash damage, without having to even have him in your sights!



KILL 5 TERRORISTS AND RESCUE THE HOSTAGE TIME LIMIT: 3 MINS LOCATION: BUSY STATION

• Hmm, tricky. You need to use the limited ammo
• of the Photon Torpedoes to bounce shots off the walls and carriages in order to take out the terrorists... but NOT to kill the hostage! Grab the Thermography goggles to see where all the enemies are, then take careful aim and shoot them down - if they actually see you, you're dead and it's all over! Once they're all gone, run over to the crouching hostage at the back of the arena in order to complete the mission.



HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: LIBRARY

• The Library is a small level, so you'll almost always have a fellow trainee breathing down your neck. Of course, you'll be able to use the Photon Torpedoes here to full effect so be sure to grab them as soon as they appear. Forcing your opponents into a corner is a good way to pin them down, but watch out for any returning fire coming your way. If you start falling behind, take care - it's not easy to pull it back here!



TEAM BATTLE
TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS
LOCATION: WHITE BASE

• You should have worked out by now that Team
• Battles are quite easy to win – the computer
does a lot of the work for you, so all you have to
worry about is grabbing medals and not shooting
your team-mate. The pillars of the White Base
might make it slightly tricky to keep an eye on
where the enemies are, so just be sure to only
shoot when you see a blue marker and not a white
one... or you'll lose valuable points!



#### MISSION #002

DESTROY ALL OF THE BOMBS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 3 MINS LOCATION: BLAST FURNACE

Unlike the previous mission in the Art Museum, you shouldn't have too much trouble disarming the bombs in the Blast Furnace – the flashing blue and red lights stand out a lot more than before. Try to shoot the bombs from a great distance in order to reduce the chances of you getting hurt; the radar will allow you to pinpoint where they all are. Just make sure you don't fall into the molten metal below you...



#### MISSION #014

KILL 12 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: 0EDO

This Dreamcast exclusive stage is pretty big, so you'll have to do a lot of legwork to keep up with the terrorists. What's more, only 12 terrorists will appear and as that's your target figure, you might find yourself running around in circles trying to get the last few. Thankfully, you can use the Photon Torpedoes to fire across long distances quickly and snipe down from the upper levels.



#### MISSION #015

Shoot 100 Bullets at the enemy within the time limit time limit: 2 mins 40 secs Location: colosseum

This is the experimental weapons test for the "UMP – a high-powered, rapid-fire gun with a lot of potential. To complete the mission, you need to score 100 directs hit on the Salamander before you... unfortunately, he tends to move around quite a lot. The uneven ground also makes it tricky to keep a steady aim as you strafe around, so concentrate on hitting him rather than dodging his fire. You've got plenty of time, so don't worry if you die every so often...



#### MISSION #003

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: 0ED0

• The sheer size of this level makes this tough...
• you can be running around not seeing anyone, yet still wind up in last place because the computer players are killing each other elsewhere! Even worse is the weapon you have to use – the GLG400MM is a really awful weapon, with terrible range and a slow firing rate. Try to get some early kills on the board and then spend the rest of the time grabbing medals from under the noses of your opponents.

GET ALL MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN 45 SECS LOCATION: WATER SANCTUARY

Yep, that's right... if you die here, you fail. But how can you possibly die while collecting harmless medals? Well, they're not all harmless - if you look closely, you'll see that only some of the medals have the words 'Get It!' written above them. The others are actually booby-traps that'll explode if you get too close! Use your gun to destroy the impostor medals and check the radar for the locations of the other 25 you have to collect. The Water Sanctuary is quite big, so don't get lost!



## MISSION #005

KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: BUSY STATION

Lt's a bit enclosed in the Busy Station as you well know, so you're going to have a bit of a fight on your hands. The key to winning is to make sure you get hold of the power-up when it appears - that way, you can deal him some major damage. Try to get the jump on where he's going to be by using the radar and take care not to accidentally blow yourself up by shooting the walls around you... especially when you're super-charged!



#### MISSION #006

TEAM BATTLE TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: OLD CASTLE

• Probably the first (and only) difficult Team Battle, because the layout of the level means you might end up hitting your own team-mate in the midst of shooting the enemies. Sticking to the upper platforms will give you the opportunity to get the drop on your opponents, while remaining relatively protected. Don't get too cocky or you'll find yourself dying more than you're probably used to by now...



#### MISSION #007

KILL 15 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 45 SECS LOCATION: DARK ART MUSEUM

This can be tricky, because the Art Museum is a This can be tricky, because the fittern between the complex level in the daylight... but now it's dark! Noctovision is an absolutely essential item here, or you'll find yourself getting a bit too close to the enemies for comfort. There's an added problem here in that a hostage is running through the level with you - he has a habit of following you around, so you might shoot him by accident. Try not to, or you'll lose time.



#### MISSION #008

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: DARK CASTLE

• It's time for another of those experimental • weapons tests and for once, it's quite a good one. The OICW rifle has explosive bullets, making the opportunities for splash damage quite high. Unfortunately, it's got quite a slow firing rate so take that into consideration when going up against a trainee face to face. Obviously, you'll be needing those Noctovision goggles as well... unless you fancy playing the level blind.



#### MISSION #009

GET ALL MEDALS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 1 MIN 45 SECS LOCATION: BUILDING

• Here's another one of those 'spot the evil medal' • levels... and it's not nice. You certainly won't have too much trouble with it as long as you watch carefully for those rogue medals, but as the building stage seems to have loads of places in which to fall down and die you'll need to watch your footing. You've got plenty of time to grab all 21 medals, so try to use more haste and less speed to come out on top here.



KILL A TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: OBSERVATORY

Considering this mission is towards the end of the Advanced section, it's embarrassingly easy. The DK terrorist you're up against can use his weapon as a Rocket Launcher, but he much prefers to just run at you and smash your face in with it! All you need to do is run backwards, strafing sideways to run around the outside of the Observatory – this way, you can shoot him as he run towards you. Grab the power-up on your way round and your victory is practically assured!



#### MISSION #011

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: DARK CASTLE

• Ooh, another experimental weapons tests...
• what fun. Sadly, the PSG-1 is a real pig of a gun
– because it works as a sniper rifle, you'll have a
real problem getting any decent kills here. The trick
is not to try and perch yourself high up on a ledge
and snipe down; instead, you really need to try and
score quick head shots from up close. Unless you
get the Noctovision goggles, you'll fail miserably
here... be warned!



#### MISSION #012

KILL 4 TERRORISTS AND RESCUE THE HOSTAGE TIME LIMIT: 3 MINS LOCATION: DARK WATER SANCTUARY

• Once again, this mission requires precise use of • the Photon Torpedoes to take out the terrorists without being seen. Grab the Thermography goggles nearby to scope out their locations – there should be one on your right and three on your left. Watch out for the terrorist hidden in the underground passage towards the back of the level, as he can be a pain to get rid of. If you get shot once it's over! Kill the terrorists, then jump across the pillars to the hostage, ending the mission.



### MISSION #013

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL AT THE END OF THE TIME LIMIT WINS TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: LIBRARY

• The final experimental weapons test lets you • have a go at using the SPAS12 – a close-range shotgun that you'd think would be great. Unfortunately, it's not; you'll need a high degree of accuracy to score any decent hits with it and, even then, they won't be effective unless you're incredibly close to your enemy. Thankfully, the Library is quite small so you shouldn't have any problems keeping up with your fellow trainees... just watch out for them firing back at you!



#### MISSION #014

KILL 7 TERRORISTS WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 3 MINS LOCATION: DARK BUILDING

This isn't what you might think – whereas before you've have to chase the enemies around, they're all standing still in various positions around the stage. You'll need to use the Noctovision goggles and your Sniper Rifle to shoot them from a distance without being seen; the closer you get to them, the more chance you'll have of being killed. As always, use the radar and surprise them before they see you to avoid a quick death.



#### MISSION #015

KILL A REINFORCED TERRORIST WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TIME LIMIT: 2 MINS 40 SECS LOCATION: COLOSSE<u>U</u>M

• You've got two enemies to kill and they're both • Salamanders... the second reinforced Salamander has four massive energy bars to get rid of! What's more, he uses some nasty attacks including a jumping smash, which you can dodge and then follow up with a direct rocket blast) and a blast that'll wipe you out in one go. When you see him waving his arms around, get out of the way! Keep hammering him with rockets and grab the power-up when you can to finish him off for good.

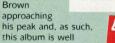

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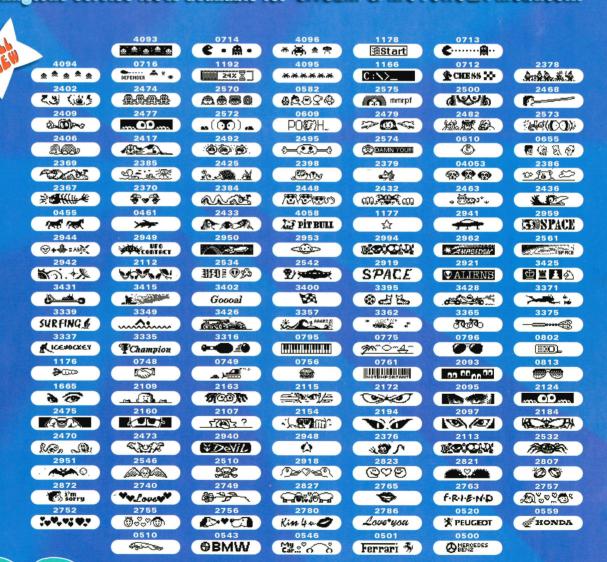
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
