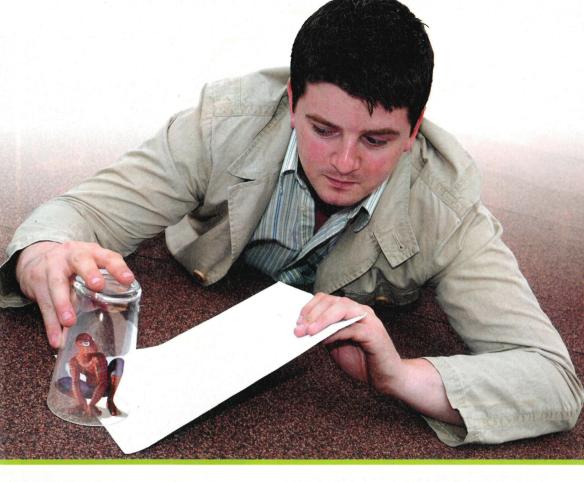

Exquisitely intuitive controls, although requiring skilful timing, and the immediate freedom of an enormous living metropolis make *Spider-Man 2* a game that truly takes responsibility for its powerful licence. Another film licence to watch out for is *Star Wars Battlegrounds*, which will be released this September to coincide with the first DVD release of the (Special Edition) *Star Wars* trilogy. Primarily an online team shooter, but with a solid offline component too, the next *Star Wars* game was a class act at its first multiplayer Xbox outing and our exclusive screens will show you why in the massive feature starting on page 052. Imagine your wildest *Star Wars* fantasy from any of the six films (*Episode III* locations and factions are covered) and it's a fairly safe bet that this encompassing title has got it covered. And the things you can do to Ewoks...

There's more team combat to be had in the sublime *Sudeki*, the Xbox-exclusive fantasy RPG that eschews turn-based battles in favour of real-time action, while maintaining a wide-eyed plot that will draw you deep into its intricately crafted maze. 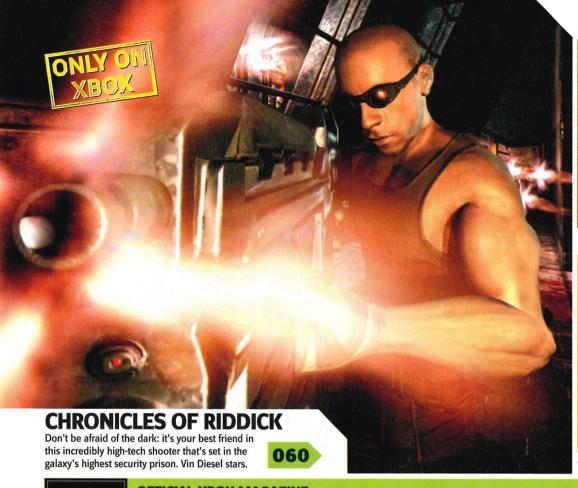
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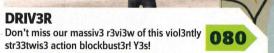


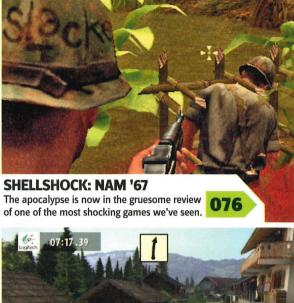

IF YOU VISIT any town centre on a Saturday night, chances are you'll see hordes of hatchbacked hounds lapping up the attention of chav chicks as they tear up and down a strip of tarmac. Aided in no small way by The Fast And The Furious films, street racing is officially cool again. Last year's Need For Speed Underground (Issue 24, 7.0) dropped its handbrake just before Christmas and never looked back, holding a podium position at the top of the charts for several weeks. EA is confident there's plenty more mileage left in the Need For Speed Underground franchise, and this follow-up is looking even meaner and madder than the first title.

The list of all-new features revs off with a completely free-roaming city for petrolheads to explore. Divided into five districts, each environment – including tight city streets and rolling open hills – contains tons of different racing options (see Bright Lights, Big City, top right). Players will encounter fellow suburban superstars while cruising, and there's much more character interaction than in the first title. Due to this unregimented approach to gameplay, races can take

place at any time. The salubrious slicksters will challenge you to race for cash and point you in the direction of the coolest upgrade shops in town.

Tuning the performance of your car is obviously vital for both progression and monetary gain. There are hundreds of upgrades available, from high-tech NOS injection kits to the ability to fine-tune your gear ratios and suspension. However, street racing is all about looking good, and here Need For Speed Underground 2 comes into its own. The sequel is twice the beast its predecessor was, with more than double the number of visual customisations. There are literally millions of different permutations and combos to choose from. Kit your car out in scissor doors, spanky spoilers, skirts, headlights and the like. Of course, all street racers only roll on 20s, so there are loads of different wheel rims on hand, and no hot lad is complete without the customary UV light (of various colours) under your motor.

There's one thing we're more excited about than anything else, though. Need For Speed Underground is a franchise that screams potential for online multiplayer madness, and with the announcement that EA is going to support Live play, we're going to get our chance. Trick your car out in all the latest beautiful bodywork then take it to the mean Live streets against up to seven online opponents over all the different environments on offer. We can't wait to get behind the wheel of this acelooking racer, and Andy is drooling at the chance to live out those Essex-boy fantasies he'll never be able to afford in reality. 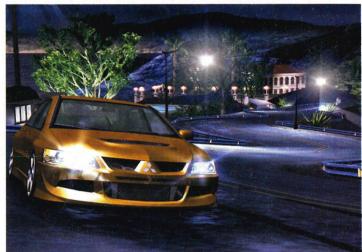

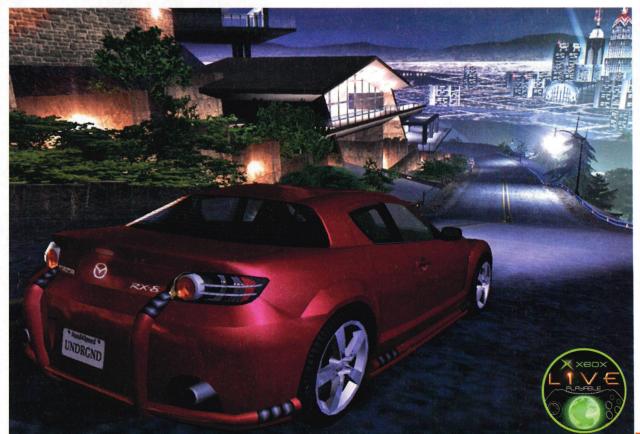

Mind games from the TimeSplitters team

REMEMBER ROALD Dahl's Matilda? Little girl, way too much brainpower, puts it to good use by moving objects and scaring brutal headmistresses. However, having such ability doesn't always make your life easy; just ask Dr John Vattic. Formerly a top research scientist, Vattic is recruited to join a top-secret US army project investigating captured Nazi psychologists, Siberian research stations and a whole lot of illegal human experimentation in Free Radical's great-looking Second Sight.

But let's rewind a bit. Or rather fast forward, because the game kicks off with a bemused Vattic waking up in a highsecurity medical institution. With no recollection of who he is, or how he was miraculously able to escape his restraining bonds, we follow the doc on an unnatural voyage of self-rediscovery. We learn of Vattic's past through a series of playable flashbacks that give gamers the chance to actually change the outcome of the doc's future life. Adding tons of replayability to Second Sight, if you screw up a delicately stealthy mission in the past, the future will hold different repercussions than if you finished it quieter than a church mouse.

Obviously being in the army comes with all the relevant experience like weapons training, so after gradual tutorials Vattic is soon au fait with the 13 featured weapons including pistols, machine-guns and sniper rifles. Aiming is as basic or precise as you want it to be, and players easily pivot around the whole environment, making the most of the makeshift cover.

However, our heretic hero soon learns he has inherited psychic abilities that enable him to escape the facility, and this is where Second Sight separates itself from other action titles out there, apart from Midway's Psi-Ops (see page 018). Kicking off with basic telekinesis, door switches can be remotely flicked or objects elevated to put the willies up loitering guards. This telekinesis eventually evolves into a much more powerful skill, where enemies themselves can be lifted and lobbed around the environments. Healing obviously replenishes your health meter, and the Psi-blast is an ace 'weapon' of sorts that allows Vattic to throw shockwaves towards hapless foes.

Of course, subterfuge and stealth are the real key elements to any successful escape, so the drowsy doc must use these powers to avoid being seen at all costs. The non-linear nature of each mission means there's loads of different ways to accomplish each objective, either by using various psychic powers or taking a different route through a level. Making the most of several unique genres (as well as a brilliant physics engine), Second Sight looks like a very intriguing action title.

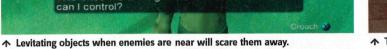

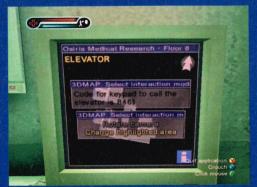

HOW DO YOU kill an enemy you can't see? This was the problem that faced US Special Forces back in 1967. Vietcong: Purple Haze confronts you with the same dilemma as you're dropped off in Nui Pek, balanced precariously on the knife-edge of Vietnam.

The North Vietnamese army is the least of your troubles when you're also a target for the infamous Vietcong. Experts in guerilla warfare, these soldiers can wipe out your entire patrol then disappear like phantoms into the undergrowth.

Conflict doesn't come much more intense, especially because you can die from a single shot. The way you're forced to take your time and protect your squad is similar to Rainbow Six 3 (Issue 23, 9.4), and the VC's intelligence is on a par with all the best squad-based shooters.

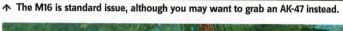
You're in charge of a six-man squad, blasting through 19 missions. Specialist skills make each member invaluable. There's a medic, sniper, scout and radio man, and they all do a good job of

running for cover and fending for themselves when the heat's on. Seeing them rushing around, killing VCs and calling to you for help is entertaining, but nothing compared to six-player Live co-op.

The story-based campaign mode isn't available in multiplayer. Fortunately, the Quick Fight mode where you can play as either six Special Forces or VC troops is better suited to an Xbox Live blast. It's very similar to Terrorist Hunt in Rainbow Six 3. It's the six of you against hundreds, with respawns every 30 seconds. All the specialist skills from Campaign mode also work here, so you can still order the radio man to call in an airstrike to turn the tide of battle. Likewise, the medic can heal you, but unlike Wolfenstein (Issue 16, 9.2), only while you're still mobile.

With nine Quick Fight maps and more available later as downloadable content, this is going to be serious fun online. For those who aren't team players, there's also a variety of 'every man for himself' games like Deathmatch and a King of the Hill-style mode that cater for the maximum 16 players.

Vietcong: Purple Haze was extremely successful on PC and we think it's a game to watch out for. The difficulty level is pretty hardcore, but that's nothing compared to the game's special Vietnam mode where all the heads-up displays are switched off. This is going to take jungle intensity to a whole new level.

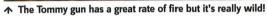


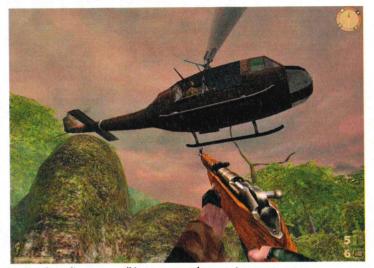

BORN TO KILL

THERE ARE more than 30 weapons to use in the singleplayer mode. Some of them, like the M16, are standard issue for US Special Forces while others have to be taken from defeated Vietcong. The majority of the automatic weapons have two rates of fire. Most famously, the AK-47 is a superb long-range, single shot rifle that can be switched into a wild but reliable machine-gun. Unfortunately, in multiplayer games, you are only allowed to use the weapon you set out with.



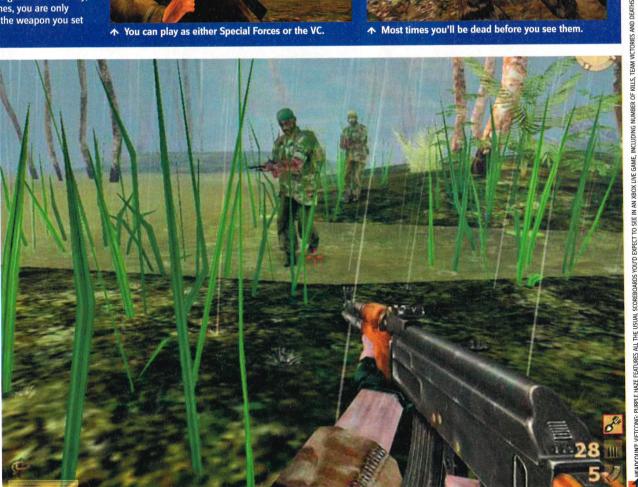

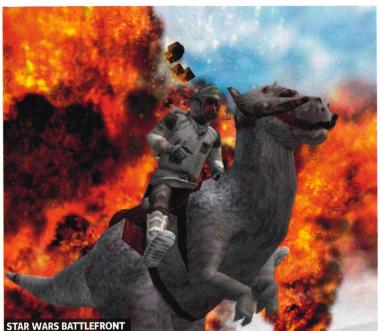

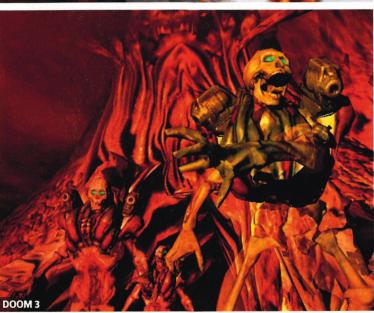

"I BOUGHT AN XBOX a while ago when Halo came out, but since there weren't any other games I fancied, I sold it. That must have been a couple of years ago now and I've recently bought another one.

"I did so not only because I wanted to play Ninja Gaiden, Full Spectrum Warrior, PGR2 and Sudeki but because all games now look best on Xbox. Multiformat developers are really starting to realise that with a little more effort they can get a lot of payback on Xbox. The games just look superior, run faster and therefore play better. I'm now looking forward to Conker, Doom 3 and obviously Halo 2.

'Take a close look at Doom 3, Sudeki and Chronicles of Riddick and ask yourself which other console out there could house those games with those visuals. The answer is, none of them. And that's why I cleared a large space under my TV to accommodate the black behemoth once more. It's the most powerful mass-produced console on Earth and we have more and more great games being developed for it.'

Video Chat to go Live in Japan this year!

AFTER ANNOUNCING its Xbox Video Chat system at E3 back in May, the service was fully unveiled in Japan by general manager of Xbox Japan, Yoshihiro Maruyama. Using a digital video camera, gamers can 'videoconference' online with other Xbox Live subscribers in a number of unique ways. You can spice up your trash-talking sessions with visual effects, musical accompaniment, interface skins and even vibration effects, which Microsoft touts as 'shaking hands'.

The concept was dreamt up by the Japanese Xbox team to take advantage of the broadband infrastructure in Japan. It hopes to offer gamers a fast, well-designed video communications system, with low costs and complexity levels to suit all. Microsoft aims to launch the service this year in Japan for around 7,140 yen (£35). For that tidy price you get the Xbox digital video camera, a Voice Communicator headset, a 12-month Xbox Live subscription and the Video Chat software. Not bad at all, eh? UK plans for the service have yet to be revealed, but you'll read them here first when they are. As always, watch this space.

It's an Oddworld

EA signs up Oddworld Inhabitants' next game

THE FIRST AND only Oddworld game to appear on Xbox was Oddworld: Munch's Oddysee (Issue 01, 8.1) and since then it's all been quiet on the Oddworld front. heated. So, what can you expect? Well, initially the game seems very similar to Rainbow Six 3, in that the feel, control and menu system have remained virtually intact. These are, after all, just additional missions. We've played through them too all seven are just as knuckle-chewingly intense as before, especially as the enemy Al has improved somewhat. We found we had to make our kills quickly and silently for fear of having our target scream for help. Not good when a room can quickly become host to an unwanted firefight. Enemies also have a nasty habit of grabbing and hiding behind hostages, another hurdle you'll need to snipe your way around if you're to succeed. But we're not grumbling, this is just what we want.

Thankfully, when we cracked open a can of System Linkage, it was a pleasant surprise to see the previous multiplayer maps included with a heap of new ones, one of which saw a couple of us demolish a yacht. The next saw a warehouse stacked with tanks being obliterated by handheld grenade launchers. Multiplayer Halo, what?

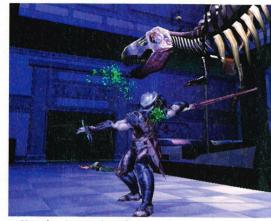
FOR A LAD who's only been in two films and ends up dying at the end of both, the Predator is incredibly popular.

Unlike the demo, in the final game you won't receive all these powers from the beginning. While sneaking through the opening levels, Nick Scryer suffers flashbacks of his days in a psychic training camp. This wasn't spent bending spoons; it was a heavy duty lesson in how to use your powers to solve problems - and kill.

On the third level, Nick is trapped in a gas chamber by a sneaky guard. The best way to escape is to lift up your assailant

using telekinesis and use him as a battering ram to break the glass. When playing through a second time, you can pre-empt the guard, take over his body and force him to walk right into his own trap. It's beautiful.

There's hardly ever a situation where trying a new trick ends in disappointment. Unlike lots of games where special abilities are context-sensitive, Psi-Ops is all about letting you do exactly what you want. At least until you discover you can't put the pad down, no matter how hard you try. We'll have a full review next issue.

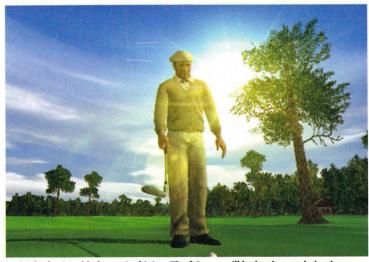
If these guys don't sink your ball, then you'll be glad to hear you can create your own on-screen persona, tweaking more than 100 different attributes for a frighteningly realistic character.

The all-new Tour mode answers the prayers of fans of the previous games by

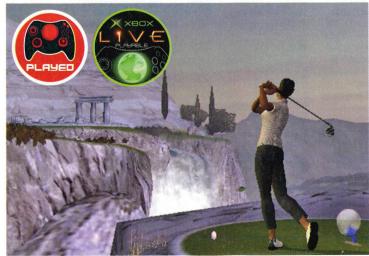

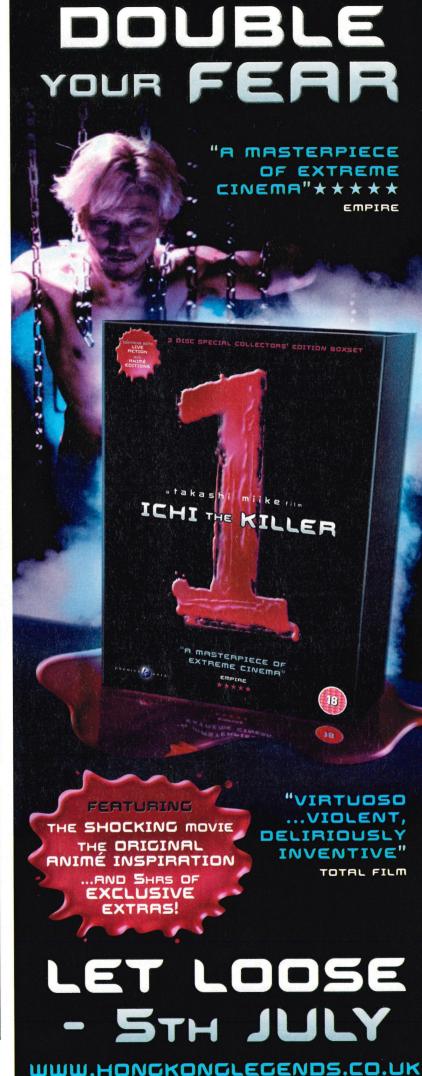

Alive With Worms

Worms is back and more violent than ever...

WE ALL SAID IT, Worms 3D (Issue 22, 7.3) should have been Live-compatible here in the UK but, due to time constraints, the 3D splat-a-thon missed the boat. We had longed for the chance to drop concrete donkeys on each other, and swear in squeaky wormy voices down the headsets, but it wasn't to be. Now, with Worms Forts Under Siege (the fourth wriggling instalment), Live is coming along for the ride.

Forts isn't just Worms 3D with Live tagged on it though: the whole structure of the game has been designed and modified to provide the highest level of Live interaction available. It would have been a laugh to just log on and blast away at an online opponent (don't worry, you can still do that if you choose), but there is a far greater strategic element now involved.

"Whilst the game has visual similarities to 3D, Forts is almost a complete departure in terms of focus and strategy," says Martyn Brown, creative director of developer Team 17. "You spend more time expanding your empire and acquiring weapons, looking for opportunities rather than simply attacking."

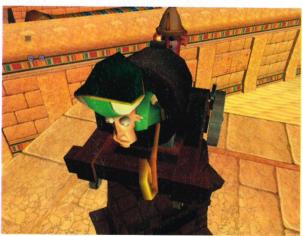
Worms isn't treading dangerous ground by turning into some overly complex RTS: it's simply going to be more brutal and action-packed. The fort-building and selection process will remain simple,

allowing you to concentrate on the more immediate tasks of throwing exploding sheep at each other. "I'm pleased with the fact that you can still do a lot of things strategically in such a short turn time," adds Brown. "The ease in which you can select and build your forts is a boon, then I like launching the bishop and hurling a moose off a trebuchet." As well as the trebuchet (a giant sling), worms will also be able to mount machine-gun turrets and other fixed weapons guaranteed to make Live that little bit edgier.

As far as downloadable weapons and maps are concerned, Team 17 is getting Forts as playable as it can before committing to extra content, although this is still very much an option. "We cut our teeth on the Worms 3D Live version for the US and that helped us ensure that things will be much smoother on our other titles," says Brown. "However, we've got a very diverse range of environments for the multiplayer mode. Worms tournaments would certainly be a possibility, we're fully supporting Live 3.0, and there's a full campaign, challenge and trial modes – enough to keep you occupied for some time – and, as with other Worms games, you can set up multiplayer death matches at will." And it's fair to say, once we get this baby plugged in, that's exactly what we'll be doing.

The inclusion of Live play has been assured, but how the online aspect will be implemented is something of an enigma. There will be various multiplayer modes, either playing through the entire story in co-op mode or going head to head in the four-player Battle modes, and it's in the Battle mode where Live will probably lay. Playing as two teams of two, you can

control the time-shifting cats, or spaceshifting enemy pigs, utilising your abilities to add an extra spin on the usual frag match scenarios. You'll be able to undo kills or change the ground an enemy is stood on, depending which side you play.

Better still, you'll be able to fully customise your characters, changing their faces, body and clothing. Plus, of course,

you'll be able to put into practice a range of new kills and moves, including Bullet Time attack-dodging, although no mention has been made whether the annoying time constraints of the original Blinx have been removed or not. If all these options make it to Xbox Live, we could be looking at a deliciously warped twist to online gaming. We'll have more news soon.

Brothers in Arms

Historian and military consultant John Antal speaks exclusively to OXM

JOHN ANTAL IS a historian, military consultant and the lead writer for Gearbox's World War II shooter, *Brothers in Arms*. We blew the game wide open last issue with a world's first play and now we're back with an exclusive interview with the retired Colonel. Antal advised the developers on everything from story and locations to battlefield tactics and military equipment of the era.

His passion for the game is staggering, and *Brothers in Arms* recently received an endorsement from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Foundation. "The VFW Foundation believes that *Brothers in Arms* will help us reach our goal of increasing awareness about the sacrifices of

veterans," said VFW president, John Senk. "Videogames are the new medium for storytelling and *Brothers in Arms* accurately depicts the contributions made by veterans during World War II." It really is that authentic, and we can't wait to play the finished version.

OXM: Can you tell us about your history with the US Army?

John Antal: I served 30 years in uniform, entering the US Army on July 2, 1973 as a Cadet at West Point. I served 26 years as a tank officer and commanded combat units from platoon to regiment. I am also an Airborne Ranger. I retired on July 31, 2003 as a Colonel.

How did you come to work at Gearbox and on the game?

Well, I've written six books and numerous magazine articles as well as having appeared on the History Channel. Gearbox's Randy Pitchford read one of my books and contacted me. I started by advising on the game in 2002 and then, once I retired in 2003, joined full time as chief of staff, lead writer, historian and military consultant.

Tell us a little about what events the game focuses on.

Brothers in Arms is based on the true story of the paratroopers of the 502d Parachute Infantry Regiment during D-Day and through eight days of hard fighting to secure the Normandy town of Carentan.

How much involvement have you had in the game?

I've been very involved. I trained the Gearbox team in the field on what it is like to be a combat soldier. I've presented them with history and tactics classes to sharpen their awareness of military operations. I've trained them to fire the actual WWII rifles and pistols used in the game and arranged for them to observe up close and personal US Army combined arms live fire training.

In addition to all of that, I'm the lead scriptwriter. All of this work has added up to create a game which is more than the

sum of its parts: a first-person tactical squad shooter that's extremely intense, immersive and tells an authentic story of combat.

What's your favourite part of the game so far?

I think the entire game is the most fun and authentic experience that you will find anywhere. I believe *Brothers in Arms* provides the player with a glimpse of what it must have been like to be a paratrooper on D-Day. If I had to choose one mission, I would choose the defence near Hill 30, which is the climax of the game.

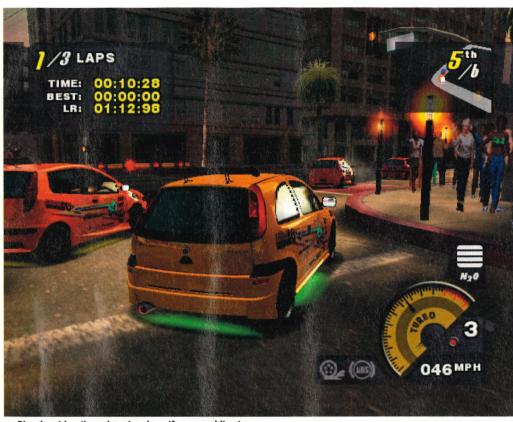

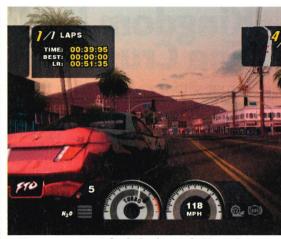

IT MAY HAVE been a long time coming, and may just look like Dynasty Warriors with goblins, but we've played Kingdom Under Fire and can tell you it's like stepping into the Lord of the Rings' Battle of Pelennor Fields. Crunching bone, the screeching of arrows overhead, lumbering ogres walloping their way through leagues of men like they were skittles, and an almost insurmountable challenge all lay in front of us... and we lapped it up.

Although the control system still leaves a little to be desired, we couldn't help but be impressed at the number of on-screen characters, from whole battalions and infantry to archers, cavalry and pikemen. In fact, more than 100 fighting individuals will be on screen during any one battle, all of them intent on making the bloodiest mess they can.

You can choose to play as the humans or take the perspective of the dark forces. Put in its very basic terms, the game

requires you to meet various enemies head on and defeat them. Everything happens in real time (none of that turnbased nonsense here, folks) and, with various arms of a squadron to command and lead, this is not going to be a walk in the park.

Enemy Al saw us being outflanked, ambushed or just pounded into the Earth. If the dark elves and orcs think they're in trouble, they'll quickly do everything they can to even out the odds. Thankfully, once every battle is fought, you will be given the chance to further train your troops, gather supplies such as new armaments, or just take them down the pub (yep, really) to build morale. 100 Bullets

101 bad guys? Hope not

IF YOU'VE EVER been on the London Underground in the height of the summer, you'll know how it feels to want to commit murder. Very few of us actually step over that mark, besides the time that French tourist got pushed in front of a Tube, but we won't delve into that. Rather, clap your eyes on 100 Bullets, a DC Comic adaptation where members of the public are given one chance to kill whoever they like without repercussions or consequences. Helped by the shadowy Agent Graves, who'll provide immunity for your actions, you'll embark on a series of vengeful killing sprees as two characters, Cole Burns and Snow Falls.

There is something of Max Payne 2 (Issue 25, 9.2) and Bad Boys II (Issue 28, 5.8) about 100 Bullets in what we've seen and played, especially with some of the combat elements that will be introduced. Although there's no Bullet Time, we did witness a Ballistic move, only accessible when your Ballistic meter is charged. When you unleash it, you fire out a volley of shots - underarm, over the shoulder, between your legs... virtually any direction an enemy is approaching from. You'll also be able to take human shields, and subdue captives by smashing their heads against walls - although this wasn't implemented when we had the chance to do some 'revenging'.

In fact, there's still quite a bit of work that needs doing if 100 Bullets is going to live up to the potential it so clearly has. It's still a

little generic at the moment, and the Al clearly isn't in place, but once a little spit and polish has been applied, then bring it on. As Quentin Tarantino might say, this is going to be a rip-roaring rollercoaster of retribution and revenge. Hopefully...

We hook up with Colin McRae at Codemasters' HQ as he test-drives the latest instalment of the phenomenally successful series

McRae ahead of the launch of last year's rally game in Germany, he was keen to work closer with Codemasters than ever before. And for Colin McRae Rally 2005, he's done just that. Because he's taken a sabbatical as far as WRC goes, he has more time on his hands to help improve an already nearflawless formula that keeps on pumping out top-notch rally titles other publishers try to match (cough) SCi (cough).

HEN WE CAUGHT up with

You might be wondering just how many more improvements we're likely to see in a Colin McRae game. We certainly were, as the fourth title pretty much covered the sport from top to bottom in mud. But Codemasters has again excelled itself. The main two improvements/ additions here are the new beefed-up Career mode that McRae helped create and, at last, full online play via Xbox Live. And McRae has had a hand in it all, even between practice sessions for the Le Mans 24 race of justice.

"The main two things I'm concentrating on at the moment are Dakar and Le Mans 24," McRae tells us during an exclusive interview. "As a driver, Le Mans is a huge challenge to undertake. The Indy 500 was something that I was thinking about but you need a long time to prepare for something like that. This year's event was too early for me: there's no way you can just jump into that event without preparation. The biggest new additions to the game are online modes and a new Career mode that is bigger than anything we've done in the past."

The Career mode has been developed with ease of play in mind. If you played the awesome RalliSport Challenge 2 (Issue 30, 9.0), then you'll know to expect. It's a branching tree of rallying wonder featuring various competitions for you to quickly jump into for some quality mud-flinging fun. You get to race every kind of car on every kind of track with every kind of weather condition you could imagine. Just about the only thing missing is an earthquake.

You begin at the bottom of the ladder as a privateer. As you take the lead, you'll progress to events featuring more powerful cars, as well as taking part in tests to win further upgrades. There are 23 events to tackle, which serves up a staggering total of more than 300 stages to race at breakneck speeds in 4-wheel drive, 2-wheel drive, 4-wheel Classics, Super 2-wheel, Rear Wheel, Distinctive and 4x4 classics. Now there's value for money! But there's more, including a 4WD Championship, Rally, Stages and of course the second major addition, the online mode.

"When I go home and have half an hour to kill, I like to play a game of *Pro Evo*," says Graham Rigby, *McRae*'s senior game designer. "I don't pick up *Zelda* because it'll take hours to get into a dungeon, let alone get out of one. And I'm sure there are a lot of other like-minded gamers out there who feel the same. For me, the future of rally games is all about creating a game that every kind of gamer can get into as much or as little as they like. A game that reflects

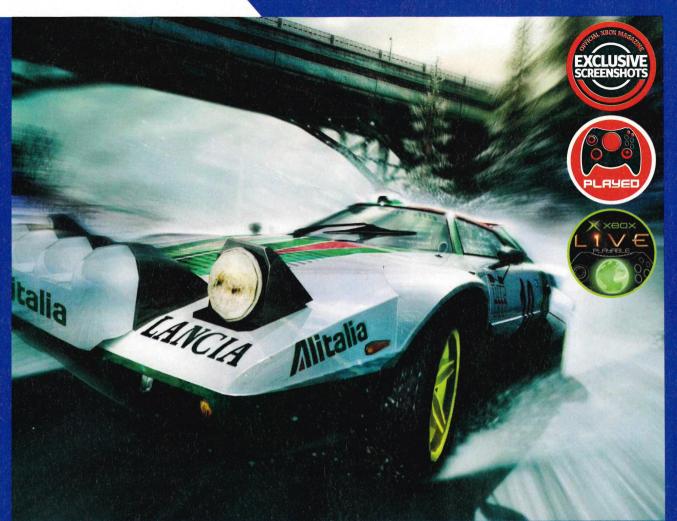

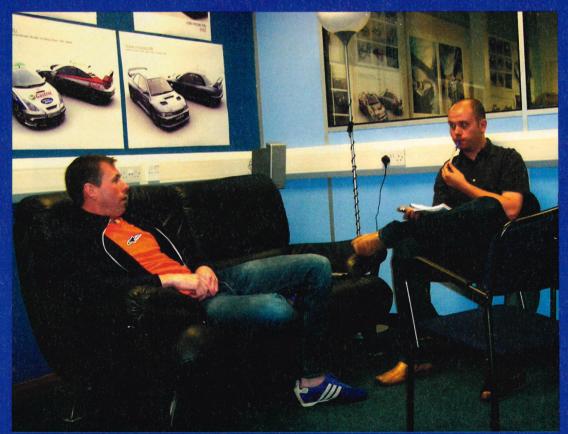

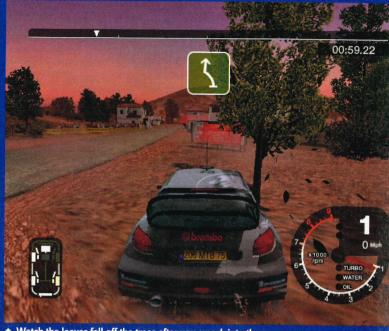

how people play games these days. They don't spend 12 hours a day or a whole weekend playing a game... well, not everybody."

You'll also get to race in Germany for the first time in the series: a rally that is faster than the average one, according to McRae. "Germany is the new location for this one and it's a tarmac surface," he says. "But it's quite different from the usual ones we've seen before, such as Corsica. Instead of the stages being small tarmac roads, the German stages mix in concrete and they're very fast and open.'

With Colin McRae 2005 having pretty much covered all bases, what does McRae think of Richard Burns' entry to the gaming world? McRae has seen it and played it but "wouldn't like to comment." He explains, "The car handling isn't very accessible but I guess it's like driving another car manufacturer's rally car. You need to get used to it first, I guess." Hmm, the words 'fence' and 'sitting' spring to mind. Find out what we thought of Richard Burns Rally on page 084.

Not only were we granted an exclusive interview with McRae, but we also got our hands on the latest preview code. It looks better than 04

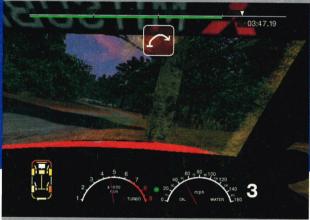
(Issue 21, 9.1), plays better than 04 and is a hell of a lot faster than 04. Did the man himself ever think the series would be this successful when Codemasters approached him about a deal back in the mid-90s? "I never had any idea it would get as big as this," he admits. "Right at the very beginning there were other people who had put their names to games, but that was pretty much it. They didn't have a hand in the development at all. But I didn't want to do that. If I was going to do it, I was going to do it properly. I wanted to make the developers really understand what rallying was all about.'

As Codemasters continues to pump out exquisite rally titles, how much further can the series go? "I see the genre changing more than anything else really," Rigby explains. "The name Colin McRae helps us in that people know what kind of game they're buying. But we're not tied to a specific licence so we can include cars like the super 2-wheel drives and rear-wheel drives. You won't get that in an official WRC title." A demo is in the works for an issue further down the line and you'll only find it with this magazine. Keep 'em peeled.

HIS IS THE game that dreams are made of; the ultimate Star Wars sandbox that will grieve galaxies of game widows and put Gamorian grins on a Clone Army of armchair aficionados across the planet. The Jedi Knight franchise has sated our lust for Jedi powers and lightsaber duels, but this next Star Wars title at last puts us in the assault boots of the Star Wars grunt, the humble soldier at the battlefront of the Republic and the Empire. Be a Stormtrooper, a Rebel, topple AT-ATs in snow speeders, smash AT-STs with log traps and yes, people, laser-fry Ewoks and Gungans with extreme prejudice!

Star Wars Battlefront is evidently and selfadmittedly based upon the proven formula and success of Battlefield 1942, the World War II online team shooter for PC that is on its way to Xbox in the form of Battlefield: Modern Combat now that EA is supporting Xbox Live (see page 106). In a parallel of George Lucas's design directive for the original Star Wars trilogy – to recreate World War II in space (even using WWII footage as placeholders for space battle scenes during production), the online gameplay genius of Battlefield 1942 is now being transferred to that galaxy far, far

transferred to that galaxy far, far away by Pandemic. However, where Battlefield 1942 had little more than a gesture towards a single-player game, Star Wars Battlefront has a far more cohesive and comprehensive package for offline gamers to back up its online thrust. Star Wars Battlefront also uses its own game engine for cutting-edge visuals, advanced Al and seamless Live play.

In addition to Xbox Live modes, Star Wars Battlefront will support splitscreen offline multiplayer for two players and three single-player modes: Instant Action, Galactic Conquest and Historical Campaigns. Pandemic's executive producer Greg Borrud explains: "We are building this game for the multiplayer crowd, but we also realise there are a lot of *Star Wars* fans out there who don't like multiplayer games. They still want the fantasy of fighting in the greatest battles in the galaxy. So we've come up with a number of cool and unique ideas for single-player to make this a truly fun and rewarding experience for those people."

Like Chewwie and R2, you'll receive no medals from Leia for guessing what Instant Action does - lets you jump straight into any of the multiplayer maps with,

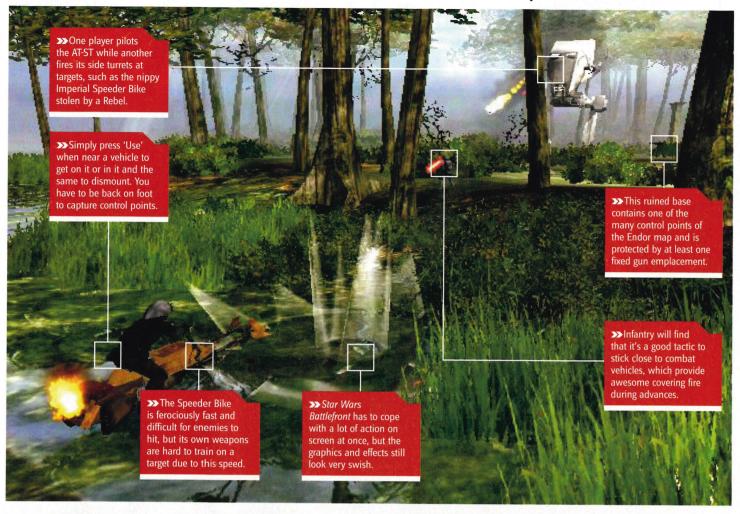
and against,

Conquest is

more complex: you must conquer the Star Wars galaxy planet by planet (all ten game worlds are included). Each subordinated world will give up a special ability for use in upcoming battles. These rewards will include Jedi trump cards including Luke Skywalker and Darth Vader. Play these to call the Force-wielding avatars into action and they will lay waste to your enemy, cutting swathes through his mortal ranks. However, even Jedi can be put upon by enough clustered frepower, and because LucasArts

firepower, and because LucasArts cannot have familiar characters dying

outside of the place and time specified in the *Star Wars* Bible, hard-pressed Jedi will eventually retreat out of the battle.

The third single-player mode spans the Historical Campaigns and the two timelines can be played through chronologically from the perspective of either of the two factions at war in each – Republic Clone Army against Separatist Battle Droids and Rebel Alliance versus Galactic Empire. All 15 of the battles from the ten worlds of Star Wars Battlefront are available here but, unlike Instant Action, they are linked into the closest that this game gets to a story mode and a sense of playing the films as a body of work.

From what we've seen, Star Wars Battlefront will have far more to offer the offline gamer than its gameplay predecessor Battlefield 1942 ever did. This is partly due to the various single-player

game modes, but more credit has to go to the excellent work that has gone into coding the Al at Pandemic. Lead programmer John Northan distinguishes between levels of Al in *Star Wars Battlefront*: "At the highest level, the strategic Al, examples of the types of critical decisions that need to be made are: which command post to attack, which enemy to engage, which weapon is most appropriate, and whether to interrupt a current action because a thrown grenade has just been spotted. At the lower levels, the controller Al, examples of the types of immediate decisions that need to be made are: how fast and in what

direction to move, where to aim a weapon in order to hit a moving target, and whether to alter course in order to avoid a collision."

Al issues are further complicated by the need to support several different classes of soldier for each of the four sides that can be played. Every time you die in battle, you will respawn at one of the several spawn points on each map (you can choose your spawn point, but it must be in your team's possession to be useable). At this time you can choose to change your soldier class from a range of five classes for each of the four sides, whose attributes and weapons vary.

ROCKET MAN Rack up your air miles with the Jet Troopers

THE JET TROOPER character class of the Republic Clone Army and the Galactic Empire is one of the most fun to play, with use of a rechargeable jet pack. Double-tap jump and hold the button to activate the jet and steer with the analogue sticks just as you would while running. Just make sure that you don't run out of rechargeable boost while high enough to break your legs or when hovering over the stormy seas between platforms on Kamino.

The Rebel Alliance, for example, has the Rebel Soldier (fast, no armour), Rebel Vanguard (slow, heavy weapons), Rebel Pilot (light weapons, makes repairs), Rebel Marksman (enemy disguise, sniper skills), and Rebel Smuggler (medium weapons, explosives skills). Although these classes vary slightly between the four sides, each side comprises excellently balanced units that complement one another.

"We have put much time during the development of Battlefront into distinct soldier behaviours," assures Northan, He goes on to describe how success can be measured by seeing in a single-player game: "trooper soldiers directly

engaging the enemy, sniper soldiers staying hidden at the periphery of the battle, assault soldiers attempting to outflank and destroy enemy vehicles, and repair soldiers busy healing the wounded". Emergent AI seeks cover, changes cover when compromised, ranges attacks based upon available weapons, makes fighting retreats, outflanks vehicle assaults, re-supplies ammo and health, and either drives your vehicle while you

fire from it, or controls fire while you pilot. It performs countless tasks simultaneously without making too significant a hit on framerate and results in an extremely convincing living battle that will make Star Wars Battlefront as satisfying in single-player modes as it is brilliant online.

And it is brilliant online. At a recent event we gave the game its first multiplayer test on a 16-player Xbox LAN. Previous LAN events had

demonstrated Star Wars Battlefront only on PS2, but the Xbox version was well worth waiting for, playing absolutely smoothly while those in the PS2 tent complained of significant jerkiness. There is little doubt that Star Wars Battlefront will look better and play better on Xbox and Xbox Live. The LAN event also gave us our first taste of Ewokicide, slaughtering the skanky teddies as they bumbled about the map setting traps for Imperial vehicles. In many of the 15 maps there will be third Al armies contributing to battle, including Ewoks and Gungans. Usually affiliated with one of the player sides, their effect will be balanced by the generally greater firepower of the Imperials or Seperatists.

Multiplayer gameplay centres around the capture and dominance of control point nodes

around the map, sometimes with additional game-winning objectives such as the destruction of control bunkers on Endor. Control points display as white vertical light beams. Stand near one to turn it red or green, depending upon your team affiliation. Find an enemy control point and you must first drain it back to white before filling it again with your team colour. This of course takes nervous time, during which you are very vulnerable to attack. The more team members that gather around a control point, the faster the process, so communication as always is a very good thing. Capture all the control points, or dominate a map with the most team points when a level times out, and victory is yours.

Vehicles played a significant part in all of the maps we played (Endor, Javin IV and

Kamino). On Endor, AT-STs were the most prized assault vehicles, with deadly firepower and impervious to all but the Rebel Vanguards' BlasTech HH-15 Proton Torpedo Launchers and Rebel Smugglers' Merr-Sonn TB-47 Time Bombs. Piloted by one player while another controlled fire, the only other enemy they had to fear was the booby trap and twice we managed to shoot away the supports of log traps to crush the cockpits of advancing walkers and warm our hands on the immensely satisfying fireballs. The Speeder Bike was also available here, and ideal for zooming about the forest moon between objectives. It has to be dismounted to capture control points and is difficult to use offensively with its fixed cannon, but the thrill of tree-dodging and even zooming through fallen hollow trunks is indescribable. Beware collisions though, which will throw you from the seat to your death at high speeds, and suicides take a longer time to respawn.

On Kamino, a city of interconnected landing pads floating above a stormy ocean, the vehicle of choice was the Republic Gunship that could hold five soldiers, many in firing positions. The character class that everyone wanted to play here was the Jet Trooper, a Clone warrior with Boba Fett-style jetpack, a small personal vehicle of limited recharging boost that allows you to fly in bursts around the map, raining down unexpected bolts from above and also hovering to convert control point beams. Playing on the other team you quickly learned to look up! These Jet Troopers' manoeuvrability was neatly balanced by the awesome firepower of the Droideka Destroyer Droid, whose shield and repeating blasters make it a superb defensive character. Although fairly immobile when deployed as a gun turret to defend a control point, the Droideka can move fast between points (without firing) by curling into a wheel and rolling.

There are still many worlds to be demonstrated on Xbox and surely the most popular will be Hoth, the ice planet from The Empire Strikes Back, where teamwork will

provide a vital role for Rebel players in circling AT-ATs (mobile spawn points for the Empire) while a comrade operates the harpoon to entwine its monumental metal legs. Further locations will include Tatooine, Geonosis, Bespin (fly X-Wings), Rhen Var (a new world from one of the Star Wars books) and the Wookie planet from Episode III, Kashyk.

Star Wars Battlefront is shaping up to be the must-have team shooter of the year, but the best surprise has been how well the singleplayer game is shaping up to complement the multiplayer emphasis. Add to the alreadysublime content the promise of Xbox Live Content Downloads in the form of new characters' skins, weapons and vehicles, plus the strong suggestion of retail add-ons that will include new locations such as the Death Star and this game looks like it will become more powerful than we can possibly imagine! Strike it down this September.

OU'VE GOT to hand it to Vivendi Universal Games - it's not shy of the odd summer blockbuster movie tie-in or two. Following on from last year's storming smasher The Hulk (Issue 18, 7.5) comes the darkly dystopian actioner The Chronicles of Riddick. The movie is the sequel to cult sci-fi thriller Pitch Black, but the accompanying game, The Chronicles of Riddick: Escape From Butcher Bay, is a prequel to Pitch Black.

Confused? Well don't be, because there's nothing dubious about this gorgeous-looking shooter. The common denominator to the success of all of these titles is undoubtedly the stellar presence of Vin Diesel, playing the charismatic lead character Richard B Riddick. Providing both dialogue and character modelling for Escape From Butcher Bay, Diesel actually had a lot more to do with the development process than first meets the polished eye.

OXM: How much involvement have you had with the game?

VD: Well, Tigon Studios is my own company, and we've worked closely with VU Games and Starbreeze Studios in all aspects of the game's development. I have been closely involved with the story creation, writing dialogue, cinematic direction and character design.

A fair bit, then! So you're a gamer yourself?

Oh yeah, I've always been an avid gamer. My favourite genre is beat 'em ups, but I play everything from firstperson shooters to extreme sports titles.

Who came up with the idea of putting you in a game?

I'd been formulating my plan to start Tigon Studios for a while, so when work started on *Butcher Bay* it seemed an obvious step to be involved in the game from a character modelling and voiceover standpoint.

What do you think is so endearing about the character of Riddick, both on the big screen and in the virtual world?

Riddick is a lethal, calculated character with his own agenda and his own set of rules. These characteristics, coupled with his special abilities like his eyes

and combat prowess make a great combination for any medium.

So after your success in the movie business, you're trying to repeat this in the videogame industry?

There are a lot of similarities between making a film and a videogame. The trick in either medium is to enrol the most talented people you can find.

Is that what you did with this project? Yep. Across the board I had a terrific opportunity to work with an amazing and committed cast who blew me away every time I watched their performances.

Starbreeze and VU Games are no

exception, and I've had a great experience working on this game.

Who do you think will get the most enjoyment out of the game?
Absolutely everyone. Without a doubt.

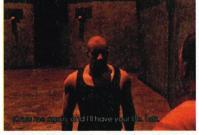

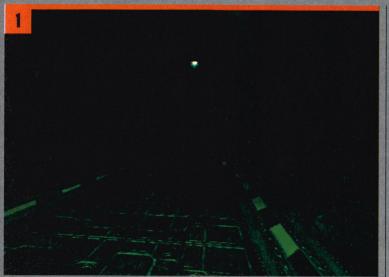

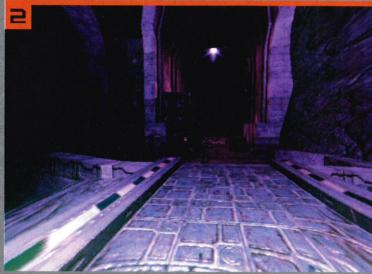

A wanted criminal across the galaxy, an evil bounty hunter brings our beefy bad boy in to collect his paycheque at the brutal, triple-max prison establishment Butcher Bay, and it's now up to Riddick THESPIAN DAME JUDY DENCH ALSO ADD GRAVITAS TO THE FILM.

to pull off the titular escape. Throughout the flashback-style missions, we re-live his battle to flee the facility, gradually discover his superhuman abilities, and learn how Riddick's eyes got that rather fetching sheen that enable our angry anti-hero to see in the dark (see My Eyes! My Beautiful Eyes!, above).

After a slick cinema-style intro (complete with a tension-building follow-cam shot, punctuated by the game credits), it's clear Chronicles is going to be a unique gaming experience. Now we love a party with a happy atmosphere, and whilst Riddick isn't the most cheerful chap out there, the sights and sounds of the Butcher Bay institution are truly astounding, making Chronicles one of the best-looking Xbox games to date. Gorgeous lighting and real-time shadows display the

deceptive beauty of Butcher Bay, each character looks and moves in a startlingly realistic way, and the use of innovative bumpmapping has even drawn comparisons with the upcoming *Doom 3*.

There are three environments throughout the facility, each with its own distinctive look. The smooth, high-tech upper levels of the prison glisten and gleam in the gorgeous dusk hue, whilst the further underground your progressive incarceration takes you, the grittier the surroundings become. We jumped out of our skins at the terrifying sewer stages, where the dark walls drip with stagnant water and horribly disfigured mutants await around every

corner. The handy flashlight on your shotgun becomes invaluable for flushing out those dark corners, but when this expires emergency flares offer a little solace by casting flickering, eerie shadows on the walls.

Due mainly to Vin Diesel's massive involvement with the game (see Interview, page 061), Riddick is picture-perfect, complete with his trademark badass 'tude. Diesel had a dinner plate-sized hand in most of the production process, working on tons of different aspects from character modelling and direction to actually writing lines of dialogue. Stealth is a vital part of the game, with brilliant enemy Al keeping you on your toes at all times, and often zero detection is necessary. Just try and take on a guard and see how long you last when all his gun-toting mates turn up.

Naturally, weapons feature heavily in the game, but are initially DNA-encoded to prison guards. Pick one up and you'll get a sharper shock than walking in on your stiletto-sporting dad reapplying his lippy, though access the mainframe databanks (by carrying out various tasks for inmates) and you'll be wielding more rifles than Rambo in no time. You'll soon discover that some of the meaty weapons (pistols, assault rifles, mini-guns etc) are better suited than others in certain situations. We love the way the brutal shotgun literally blows

EVERY DUNGEON in Sudeki is topped off with an old-skool boss monster you must do battle with. These encounters are easily the dramatic highlight of the game. Krenn the homicidal super-computer is our favourite. At first he looks like a giant ball bearing, but moments later he's become a terrifying mechanical spider. In an ironic twist of fate, Elco is forced to go one on one with the machine that he helped create...

This really annoys Ailish and Buki who don't take sexism lightly. Buki is especially peeved when the two blokes stumble into the trap of Nassaria the siren. Funny moments like this go a long way to making you warm to the four discordant heroes.

Sudeki's plot winds and twists cleverly, making sure that you control all four heroes rather than just sticking to your favourite one. In the opening mission you'll control just Tal, but from there on you'll use different parties.

Learning how to make different heroes work together is bags of fun.

In combat, teamwork is especially important. Battles are real-time and there's a massive difference between the sword-swinging warriors Tal and Buki and the projectile-firing sneaks Ailish and Elco. Melee combat is a lot like *Dynasty Warriors* (Issue 23, 6.5). You tap away at the X and A buttons to hack 'n' slash, and the better your timing, the more damage you do. There are about 20 normal combos to learn.

In comparison, ranged combat is totally wacky! When controlling Ailish and Elco, the game switches into FPS mode, but sadly it's not particularly good. Very little skill is

You only control one character at a time during combat, the others are taken care of by the game's Al. Thankfully, this is very competently done. It's even possible to adjust heroes' individual Al states. You can either make them more aggressive fighters, more defensive, or act as bodyguards for the character you're controlling.

>>> FIND THE KEY Sudeki's sub-quests are a bit of a letdown. Almost every one involves retrieving a quest item and returning it to a certain character or place. Unlike Knights of the Old Republic where new storylines are unlocked for finishing sub-quests, the rewards in Sudeki are less satisfying. It's only worth doing the ones that yield new weapons.

required to point your crosshair in the right direction and hold the trigger down while running backwards. Even the teleporting monsters have trouble catching you. We reckon that melee combat has the edge, but shooting is useful if you want to take the cheap (but energy-preserving) option. One good thing about ranged combat is that some projectiles pass through multiple creatures, adding an element of skill. Tactics also come into play as you choose which

'enchantments' to add to your weapons. These add spice to your attacks, like afflicting the enemy with poison and weaker armour.

If you're an RPG purist balking at the frantic real-time combat, don't give up just yet! Bringing up the quick menu makes everything slow down to quarter-speed, giving you space to choose from a list of Final Fantasy-style 'skill strikes'. These setpieces are a great visual sensation, not to mention extremely

CHARACTER STATS have to be adjusted manually as you gain experience and level up. Although there's no option to do this automatically, there are only four categories to enhance. These are health, skill, power and essence. If you don't want to spend experience points boosting your powers, you can use them to purchase new skill strikes.

FINOTHER DIMENSION Explore new worlds

SUDEKI'S TWO main worlds, Light and Dark, are alternate realities. This means that locations you explore in Light World also appear in Dark World but in twisted, evil forms. Unlike the people of Illumina, Dark World's inhabitants are plagued by poverty, strife and even uglier monsters. Without giving too much away, your party encounter their own alter-egos in Dark World later on. The third, smaller planet known as Shadow World is the hub-level that allows you to teleport between places.

damaging to any enemies foolish enough to be in the vicinity.

Sudeki's monsters look so incredible though, that it seems a shame to slay them. They're an odd mix of killer robots, insectoid sorcerers and Harryhausen-esque mythical beasts. When it comes to monsters, the bigger the better. Sudeki's boss creatures, particularly Krenn and Nassaria (see Krenn Must Die, page 070), are easily the highlight of the game. The animation is superb, their range of attacks always surprising and their Al first-rate. We're always pleased to see monsters working as a team, and Sudeki's magical creatures will usually enchant and heal their kinsman rather than just attacking you. Beating them first will save you a lot of grief.

But it's not just the creatures that look amazing. In *Sudeki* you get three worlds to explore, and they all look absolutely astonishing.

When walking through Transentia for the first time, you really won't believe that this is just a game. Wherever you look, there are incredible details like windmills turning in the distance or legions of mining robots wandering the walkways far below. It's easy to lose yourself, but thankfully you'll never actually become lost.

Although it takes around 15 minutes to walk from Illumina castle to Brightwater on the opposite side of Light World, the HUD game map is so good that you'll never take a wrong turn. This is also partly because the worlds are very linear, but more on that later.

Sudeki's intelligent game camera also helps you enjoy the gorgeous worlds to their fullest. The camera tracks behind your party, switching to cinematic angles when you're doing skill strikes and solving puzzles. Best of all, the camera can always be rotated and zoomed

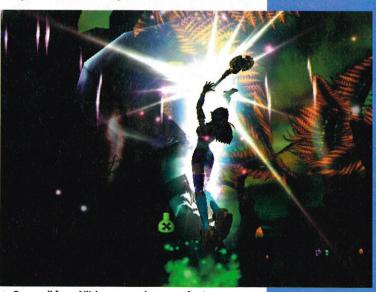

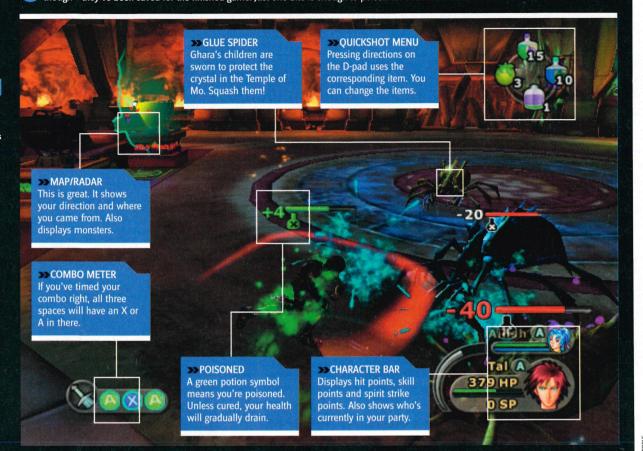

using the Right thumbstick. You'll never miss out on the best view of the action. It's undeniably a very linear game, and the sub-quests don't have enough of a hook (see Find the Key, page 070) to make you want to complete them all. Whether you fall in love with this will really depend on whether you prefer sprawling worlds with little detail, or Sudeki's smaller worlds with mind-blowing quantities of graphical splendour. Personal taste will also

decide how much you like the storyline. It isn't freeform in any way, but it's still enthralling and very well realised.

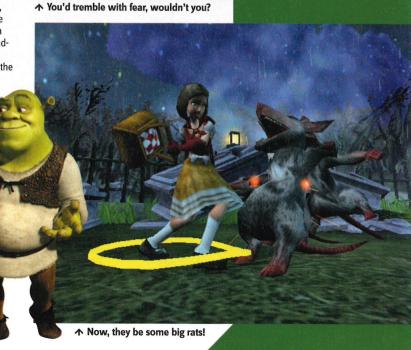

SEE the terrifying Vietnamese war through the eyes of a rookie soldier caught up in the biggest nightmare of his short life. IT'S ALL GOING off in the jungle. A scan of our radar reveals we've got Conflict: Vietnam, Men of Valor and the recently announced Vietcong (see page 012) all due before the end of the year. Iraq and WWII have been done to death and games based on the Vietnam War

are next to don the full metal jacket.

ShellShock is the first wave and its unique take on the genre is its focus on the macabre: torture, suicide, napalm attacks, execution, amputation and other stomach-wrenching war wounds. You even have to gun down female soldiers. It's not a pretty sight and definitely not for the younger gamers among us. This is war.

Coding honours have been handled by Amsterdam-based Guerrilla (formally Lost Boys), the same team working on *Killzone* for PS2. Since the team started on the game for Eidos, Sony swooped in and signed up the studio to work

exclusively on Sony platforms (it's not just Microsoft then). A side effect of this deal was that the game had to be made in the third-person. Don't ask us why and it does suffer a bit for it, but not enough to put us off. After all, we all love the third-person *Conflict* games, don't we?

As you can see from the screens, the game has a very distinctive and gritty style. The jungle environments ooze atmosphere and tension as a Vietcong warrior could be hiding in cover just five feet from your position. And you won't realise until they open fire. As we said, gameplay is fleshed out in a third-person mode and it'll take a few levels to get used to it. It feels like it should have loved it even more if it was. But once you've upped the sensitivity of the controls, you'll be popping heads in no time.

Before you're dumped headfirst into a sweaty Vietnamese nightmare, you get to pick one of three soldiers and initial your dog tags. It doesn't matter who you pick, as the story plays

out the same whoever you choose. The game continues in a mission-based way and you can go back to any level you choose and on any difficulty level to pick up more medals and intelligence info – little extras that unlock some goodies along the way.

At the beginning of each mission you can walk around boot camp and talk to other soldiers. This all

seems a bit pointless in our book and only serves to slow down the action. So find your helicopter, start the mission and get stuck in. Each mission sees you having to achieve a specific objective or two. These range from finding ammo stashes and enemy bases to escorting hostages to safety and taking out Vietnamese generals. It's quite a short game though, about 12 levels in all,

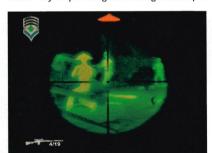

need to use it as you run from cover to cover advancing towards the enemy. You'll be deader than Elvis if you get caught with your pants down in the middle of an open field.

Though you play the game as part of a team, you don't get to control anyone except your character. Your squad will move through the map by your side rather than running off and doing its own thing. The AI just about does its job but members will occasionally get under your feet or in your line of sight. Luckily there's no consequence for friendly fire, but your men will shout at you to cut it out if you accidentally hit them. They drop to the ground and get back up a few moments later and carry on like nothing happened. The enemy AI is also passable, if unspectacular. The soldiers will continue to run at you until there aren't any left. ShellShock is an extremely violent game that

plays on the horrors of war. You'll see people shooting themselves rather than give up valuable info, hostages gutted like fishes, women POWs executed for fun and lots of blood. Cutscenes will shock you, as will the in-game dialogue. It's a videogame nasty in the same vein as Manhunt (Issue 30, 7.5), but take all that with a pinch of salt and you'll find ShellShock is a great shooter, even if it is a little short.

TAKE down a carsmuggling ring and kill loads of people. Smash some cars up while you're at it too.

TANNER IS A cop, a cop who knows how to get results. Tanner shoots first, asks questions later. Tanner knows the streets; this is his neighbourhood. Tanner sleeps with a gun by his side, and likes his woman like his liquor: cheap, Russian, and made from potatoes. Tanner

is all cop... apart from those crustacean genes that make him walk like a crab. Tanner, Tanner. he's our man, if he can't do it, no one can.

Driv3r (pronounced Driv-three-r presumably) is here, and it's trying to scrape its keys down the side of action gaming and steal its fluffy dice.

Tanner, undercover cop and star of previous games such as DrIver and D2iver (sic), has

returned, having, it seems, not learned a thing from the GTA games that have since so deftly swiped the crown from his bonce. Don't worry, we won't repeatedly reference GTA throughout this review. Such comparisons would be wholly unfair, and won't paint a true picture of Driv3r's nature, but it has to be said, with GTA setting such a high new benchmark, you'd at least try and aim for somewhere near it, wouldn't you?

The game begins on dubious ground, with Tanner racing alongside his companions to the scene of a siege. It seems radio communication is down because - and get this - if you don't manage to keep up with the pack of pedestrianharvesting cop cars, you lose the first mission. Why? Is it police policy to try and shake off their colleagues in the hope of losing them on the way to a crime scene? We wouldn't usually pay so much attention to something so trifling so early on in the game, but in this case it acts as a perfect indication of what Driv3r is made of. The game, for all the fun you may or may not have, is a bundle of inconsistencies, illogical missions, dopey Al and irrelevancies.

The actual driving physics, car models, collision detection and vehicle handling are second to none. They really are superb. Like previous Driver games, you can Take A Drive before embarking on a mission, which is a little like taking a sightseeing tour without

plastic cagoules and disposable cameras. You can choose your vehicle and destination, then take to the streets. Pull 180s, smash through stacks of boxes, demolish what you will, because it's deeply satisfying. Try out your weapons by blowing a traffic jam to smithereens or just have a browse around, because once you embark on the missions

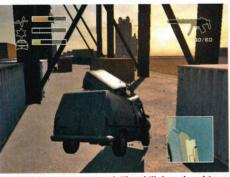
proper, you'll question virtually everything you're asked to do. As a side note, the Take A Drive option begs the question why such vast cities have been created. Pop-up is rife, and seeing as this is the only free-roaming element of the game you'll encounter, you'll wish smaller, tighter gaming areas had been implemented to cut down on the hideous 'an-18-wheeler-has-popped-

up-five-feet-in-front-of-me-and-it's-going-tosquash-me-like-a-bug' scenarios.

Many of *Driv3r*'s missions are now on foot (guess is wouldn't have had so much impact had it been called Stroll3r), and it is in these that *Driv3r* suffers the most. As we mentioned, Tanner scuttles about like a crab, unable to jump the most meagre ledges, yet perfectly at

home sliding to and fro. He doesn't truly understand your commands either, opting sometimes to merely stand and admire a car. rather than jump in and drive it. But maybe it's best to not get in a car at all, because the strolling Tanner seems invisible at points. The Al is set firmly on attacking you, for the most part, when you're behind a wheel. Step out to stretch your legs and the game seems to lose you. One example is the Trapped mission, where you're being chased through a shopping mall complex by a frenzied cop car. If you don't drive like a devil you're as good as smashed to pieces, but there's a simple flaw you can manipulate to your own ends. Get out the car, shoot the policeman who's driving, and then go about your business. So many of these potentially difficult missions rely on nothing more than you stepping out, shooting, then driving off. Hardly 'Driver' is it?

The missions themselves are also too much to believe. You are an undercover cop, yet you have the wholesale slaughter of entire police divisions on your hands. You have to smash, burn, blow up and maim hundreds of policemen throughout your batty missions, but never suffer

the consequences of killing them, besides being greeted with another wave arriving for a similar fate. Their presence is also dubious. Go a nudge over the speed limit and you're set upon with all the hellish force of the law, yet spend minutes at a time blowing up cars and killing people in a very nasty manner and not a single siren will be heard. The level at which you obtain a wanted status isn't incremental. You're either hunted to extinction until they eventually kill you or, simply, you're not.

One of the fundamental rules of a game is that, should you die, it is through your own doing, not because the game is flawed. However, such is the randomness and unpredictability of *Driv3r's* enemy Al, you could die because the game doesn't know in what measure it should react to your actions. And don't get us started on the CPU drivers in the cities.

They'd as happily cross the central

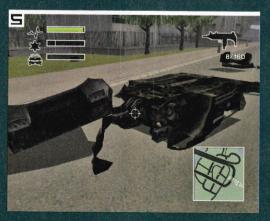

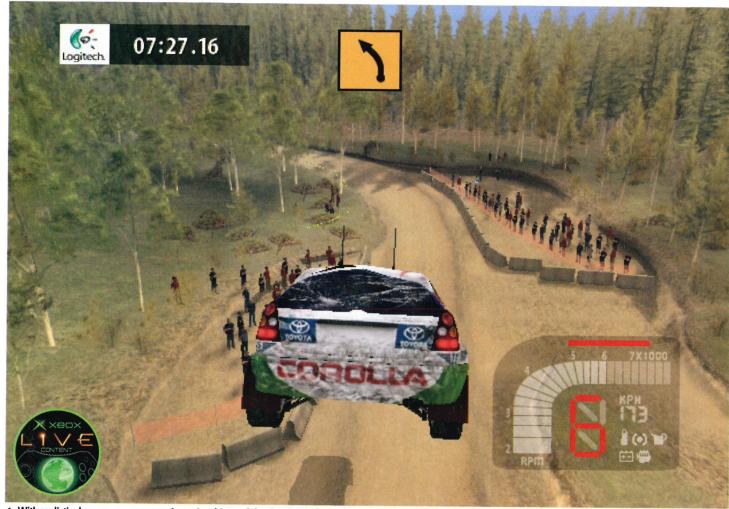

BEFORE YOU'RE let loose in a rally car capable of silly speeds on the country roads, you'd expect to have a take a few lessons in how to handle the beast, if only for insurance reasons. It's a similar deal here: Richard Burns Rally won't let you jump straight into

the meaty career mode unless you've taken and passed the meticulous Driving School, which is a huge challenge in itself.

This sets the tone for a game which SCi positions as a different kind of driving experience compared to the granddaddy of the genre, Colin McRae Rally (see page 042) and the gorgeous RalliSport Challenge 2 (Issue 30, 9.0). Richard Burns Rally is an extremely deep and realistic simulation of the sport, which sounds interesting

on paper, but put it into practice and the reality is an unforgiving game that'll test your patience to the max. If you're prone to abusing your controller (throwing, biting, banging it etc) in sticky situations, then we suggest you bring out the third-party peripherals for this title, just to be on the safe side.

When the game skidded onto our desks, it came with a tip sheet that basically told us not to go too fast: "Watch Your Speed," it screamed at us, adding that just because you can reach speeds in excess of 170mph, it doesn't mean you should. Eh? Of course you should drive that fast if a game lets you – isn't that what racing games are all about? Not in *Richard Burns Rally* apparently, as you have to concentrate more on going slow than going fast. And that's just plain wrong, unless you're an avid fan of *Microsoft Flight Simulator*.

The Driving School teaches you both the basic and advanced skills of driving. Basic tests cover acceleration, braking and car positioning while the advanced techniques look at the handbrake, powerslide, oversteer and something called the Scandinavian Flick (turn the car in the opposite direction to the corner and then turn back into the corner). The school also tells you keep an eye on your speed at all times. Try putting all this advice into practice against the clock and good times quickly go bad.

Each of the lengthy stages is littered with hazards: rocks, ditches, logs, potholes, trees and

your road cambers. And it's like racing on a tightrope - the actual road area of some stages is only as wide as the car, making it even harder to stay on target. This makes concentrating on your driving technique, the stage you're racing, split-times and your speed, all at the same time, tremendously taxing. It's not much fun, and if you have the damage level set to realistic it's all over after a few bumps.

The vehicle's handling didn't convince us either, as the car seems to haphazardly pivot from left to right. If you're driving fast and have to brake suddenly, the wheels lock and the car wobbles from left to right, ending up with you in a tree. The actual racing doesn't feel that fast either, though it does in the first-person view, but then it's even harder to control the car.

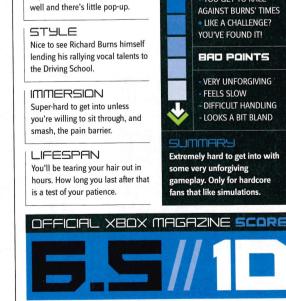

BEFORE THIS game was handed out for a critical slamming, we played Russian roulette. Nobody wanted it. We chucked it round like pass the parcel at an embalmer's birthday party. What gruesome mess would ooze all over the unlucky person left holding the

soggy package when the music stopped? Well, somebody had to be that person, and weirdly enough the resulting game isn't dripping over our shoes at all. We almost daren't say it, but it seems the Army Men franchise might just have hit on something good. Don't misunderstand us, this is no Splinter Cell or Ninja Gaiden, but it's far better than we could ever have hoped.

The best thing perhaps is that, only a level or so in, the entire stupid cast of entirely stupid characters gets utterly obliterated. They're dripping down walls, mangled and twisted, a sacrifice made by the developers no doubt to show that yes, Army Men is dead, long live Army Men. And from there on in it just gets better. Sarge, being the only Green standing, wages a war on the Tans like some mould-injected Arnie, slaughtering, destroying, and melting all who stand in his vengeful Polyurethane wake.

With a range of real-world weaponry at his hands, the damage he inflicts on his foes smarts. Each enemy has several damage parameters, so if you take a headshot, it comes clean off like a melon. They'll then run like chickens around the environment, shooting blindly in the air. Blow off their knee caps and they'll hop about, frantically trying to find somewhere to lean while they take a pop at you, and God forbid you draw attention to yourself because - here's a novelty for an Army Men game - the enemy is intelligent. Better still, the levels are infinitely superior to any of the calamitous nonsense of previous games.

And get this: the whole thing is a budget release. That's just £20 for a game that offers a considerable improvement over anything the series has done before, plus you blow people's heads off. Then of course, as the story (yup, that's better too) progresses, you're plunged into fighting elite Tans with invisibility devices, great thundering tanks, Apache 'copters, bazookawielding maniacs, gun turrets, and a Blofeldinspired fireworks factory where Roman Candles and Catherine Wheels are manufactured for the purpose of total world domination by the Tans.

It's not going to cause massive ripples, that's for sure, and the stigma of all those atrocious Army Men games that once belched themselves upon us still hangs in the air like sick washed from a carpet, but it's...it's... it's... 'good'. There, we said it. Now excuse us while we go scrub our skin with bleach.

He wasn't wrong either; this year's Spider-Man 2 movie will probably break all box office opening records, and as such Activision has

a great responsibility to deliver a worthy videogame accompaniment. Fans of the first film would no doubt have lapped up the ace original game Spider-Man: The Movie (Issue 04, 8.0), yet SM2 takes a much more free-roaming path

through the streets of New York, and we're pleased to say it's all the better for it.

The narrative intro is a bit superfluous if you've any concept of the Spidey phenomenon (and let's face it, who doesn't), though it does give Tobey Maguire and co the chance to earn a bit of extra cash on the side – in fact all the characters from the film are voiced by their respective thesps, adding great authenticity to the game. Spidey's a bit older now so has a bit more freedom to hang out late and pick up girls. More freedom in a literal sense too, because Spidey now has an entire scaled replica of New York City at his sticky fingertips.

All the recognisable landmarks are present, from Staten Island to the Chrysler Building and, of course, *The Daily Bugle*. A full-on, living, breathing, dynamic city is now your potential playground, and Spidey can explore to his heart's content from street level right up to the highest point in the city, the top of the Empire State Building. Spidey can literally climb up and over every single physical object, and the massive free-roaming environment is an absolute joy to explore.

This is complemented by a fantastic new swing technique, aided by a much more natural and satisfying physics system. The

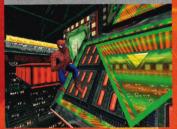

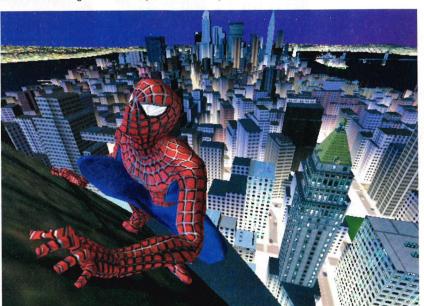

Gone is the invisible ceiling of the original game that saw our arachnid float along between rooftops, now

you'll fall until your cord catches onto something. Holding the Left trigger at the base of your swing gives Spidey extra momentum during his pendulum motion, and releasing at the peak of the swing (A button) catapults the red-suited avenger way up into the stratosphere. It's possible to cover massive distances in one go

using this graceful and fluid technique - vital for some of the tougher timed missions. This is a hugely enjoyable experience on the player's part, and the camera comes into its own by snaking along the streets and rooftops behind the character, really immersing players in Spidey's world and making them feel like

To accompany this free-roaming environment, the gameplay is suitably nonlinear for the most part. As you canter through the huge city, your Spidey sense will tingle and you'll be alerted to a random street crime. These are entirely optional, often cropping up whilst you're en route to a main objective, and you've got the choice of undertaking these missions that include intervening in armed robberies, rescuing a dangling construction worker, or

halting a stolen car. Whether you intervene or keep on moving, combat plays a huge part in Spider-Man 2, and has been significantly tweaked from the original game. A whole wealth of web- and fist-based combos are on offer, through the X and Y buttons, with B providing a rather handy dodge function whenever your Spidey Sense tingles. The complex combat actually requires a bit of thought and strategy, and is tactically more akin to a competent beat 'em up rather than standard actioner button-mashing.

It's important to carry out a certain number of these missions however, because doing your duty to the city results in hero points. They might not mean prizes but they certainly enable Spidey to purchase the numerous upgrades from the Comic Book Store. There's no fat sci-fi geek behind the counter but there is numerous swing, combat and health upgrades that make Spidey that bit stronger, helping on his quest. As well as beefing up the webslinger, these upgrade points play a vital role in unlocking further story missions. Initially fun, they quickly begin to grate, becoming very repetitive, very quickly. Fair enough if there was a separate roaming mode, but you get to the stage where you just want to get on with the story without faffing around earning the required few thousand points first.

And so on to the story then. Peter Parker is feeling the strain of being a superhero; his studies are failing, he's distancing himself from Mary Jane, though through OsCorp he does meet the brilliant Dr Otto Octavius. Like the film, he goes on to become Spidey's main adversary,

though you'll have to fight through a fair number of irksome random missions to get your fix of the Octopussed outlaw.

And, it would be fair to say, that's the only real gripe we've got with Spider-Man 2, but it is a fairly major one. We love the idea of a completely free-roaming environment, but when you just want to hammer the intriguing (especially if you haven't seen the film) story, it's more of a hindrance than a joy. The swing system is fantastic and totally immersive, and it's a real joy to hare round the great-looking cityscape. The random missions, delivered by rather rough-looking generic characters, genuinely detract from the real game, and though paving the way for non-linear gameplay, are a bit much. But try not to get too bogged down in these, and we're left with an incredibly fun and authentic Spidey experience; just master the swing technique and you'll be content to fly around for hours, and the fantastically fast camera adds to the enjoyment. Pull on the mask and take Spider-Man 2 out for a spin - you won't be disappointed.

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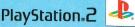
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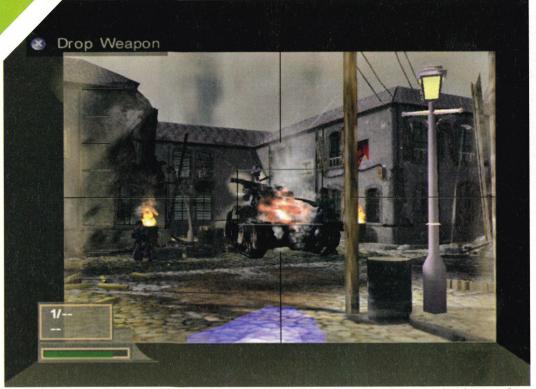

FIGHT them on the beaches and fight them in the fields in this deep and involving RPGa-like World War II shooter. IF YOU READ last month's Brothers In Arms feature (see page 034, too), you'll know WWII shooters are very in vogue on Xbox. Not wanting to be left out in the cold, Battleborne has ingeniously made use of the Snowblind engine that powered the ace RPG actioner Baldur's Gate:

Dark Alliance (Issue 08, 8.5) for Combat Elite. The top-down perspective works surprisingly well for a shooter, allowing an unfettered 360° view of the environment – great for spotting lurking enemies.

Dig a little deeper and you'll also find that combat is governed by a traditional RPG-style hit points system. Every time you fire your weapon, virtual dice are rolled and the hit point effect on your enemy is calculated before the bullet leaves the barrel. Different weapons will obviously have different capabilities, just as an enemy's rank/ positioning/awareness will affect his strength. Sneak up and pop a guard from behind, and chances are he'll go down in one or two shots. However, take on a well-entrenched officer and you'll need tactical thinking to flush him out.

You'll be able to stack the odds in your favour by making use of the brilliant skill points system. Complete all the objectives with minimum health loss or achieve a high shot-accuracy percentage, and you'll be awarded skill points. You can allocate these to beef up various capabilities, and allow characters to specialise in particular weapons. Coupled with three playable characters, this offers tons of replayability and introduces a real strategy element to the shooter.

As we follow our plucky paratrooper along the WWII timeline from Normandy to Operation Market Garden, the game starts to misfire. At first the missions are a nice mix of clearing areas, destroying bridges and rescuing downed pilots. As battles move from open expanses to tight streets and claustrophobic room-to-room fighting, different tactics and weapons capabilities are called for. However, no matter how you dress it up, killing all enemies again and again becomes repetitive and you get the feeling the developer's fuel supplies were cut off towards the end of the game. Level repetition sets in too; when you're on your fourth visit to the sewers, it gets tiresome.

Solace can be found in the great two-player co-op mode. Each player controls a character, and the same skill points system applies. It's great fun, and tactically vital, to build up the two characters with complementing abilities, because in multiplayer the enemies have been tweaked to incorporate tougher abilities and greater Al. And while we're on the subject, taking on the game on the harder difficulty settings requires nerves of titanium and a hardened patience. But give it a chance, and Elite will reward your sweat and tears with a satisfying and involving gaming experience, daring to be first out the plane with an innovative actioner.

GET down and shake your booty to classic tracks and the latest Britpop choons with this dancing diva's dream.

IF YOU'VE ever found yourself drawing the curtains, turning off the lights and shedding your utmost inhibitions, chances are you're one of the 'crowd'. No, not a member of a secret suburban swingers' society, but a gamer who enjoys the joys of jigging

around in front of the TV on a mat controller. Dancing games have been all the rage in arcades over the last few years, and partnering Konami's Dancing Stage Unleashed (Issue 27, 7.2) on Xbox comes Bigben's Dance:UK.

A patriotic title aside, Dance:UK features a wealth of British talent for grooving gamers to get their rocks off to. The Sugarbabes, Liberty X, Mis-Teeq and, erm, 5ive (apparently grateful for all the royalties they can get) all line up against classics from the Sugarhill Gang and Chic. This dancing malarkey is a lot tougher than it looks so, after a Pop Idol-style intro, Training mode familiarises players with a few basic steps. The main game mode takes the form of a determined diva dancing her way through

several auditions to fame. Achieve a high enough score in one round, and you'll receive recalls, second auditions, and so forth.

Snap once said rhythm is a dancer, and you'll need it in spades here if you're to hit each step in time. It's also vital to successfully nail the combo arrows whenever they appear to achieve the big points totals, and this is not an easy task. As far as the sounds go, there's a distinct pop/ R&B flavour running through Dance:UK, though this is in no way a bad thing; we would much rather shake our thang to camp disco classics like Murder on the Dancefloor than obscure techno tracks that act as filler on other dance titles out there.

If the single-player game all seems a bit too much like hard work, then the ace Jukebox mode allows gamers to wiggle their way through any available track in the game, without the pressure of making the grade. However, everybody knows only losers take to the dancefloor alone, and lucky for us Dance:UK features a great head-to-head multiplayer mode. Square up with two mats, or take it in turns to out-dance a mate, and if you're feeling really egotistical, post your top scores on the multitude of Xbox Live Leaderboards to see who's top of the toe-tapping tree.

We really liked Dance: UK. Sure, the dance mat may have been a bit on the small side for adults and players will always yearn for tracks that are more suited to their particular tastes. That said, the selection of tunes on offer was more than adequate to get this snake-hipped Southender in the mood for dancing more than the Nolan Sisters ever could. Dig out your dad's old platforms and see what the fuss was all about...

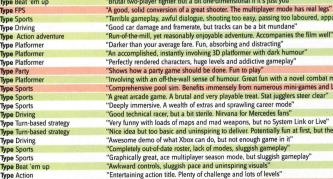

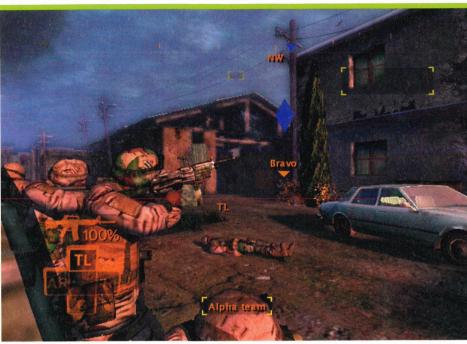

The missions run the same as they do in single-player (apart from tougher, more numerous adversaries), but having two sets of eyes and ears radically enhances the tactical element of the title.

Each player controls a fire team (Alpha or Bravo), and issues commands in much the same way as the offline game. Being able to communicate with your team-mate opens up a whole host of strategic possibilities, and now there's no excuse for not covering each other's every move. Although your team-mates' Al is fantastic in single-player (they'll make sensible decisions on their own), there's no substitute for a human counterpart.

We would've liked to have seen a couple more multiplayer game modes (like Deathmatch, Capture the Flag etc) rather than just a co-op campaign but, to compensate somewhat for this, Pandemic has promised further downloadable content - in the form of new maps and multiplayer missions - to be made available in the near future. A worthy addition to a brilliant title, the Live aspect adds extra depth to this strategy sim. Now, who's with me?



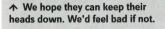

IT'S ALMOST A given that FPSs are better online than they are in single-player. Shadow Ops had such potential: great graphics and plenty of well-designed maps, but it's devastated by laggy play. We've tried it on various broadband connections and even one-on-one games were unplayable. This is surprising considering there are a maximum of eight

players (compared to *Rainbow Six 3*'s 16), but to make things worse there's no option to run a dedicated server.

Loading times are horrendous and games few and far between. Often, by the time you've loaded a map (around 90 seconds), the hosted game has become unavailable. Obviously the host has an advantage, and in some cases they'll have

already captured the flag before you've even loaded the map! There are no scoreboards and the Friends menu is clunky. To see what games your friends are playing, you have to enter a separate menu for each. It's great offline, but the Live mode isn't worth bothering with. Hopefully, the problems can be patched up. We'll let you know if things improve.

IT'S ALWAYS GOING to be hard to find games to join in a niche title like this. There just aren't many being hosted. We suggest scoping out games on Codies' forum http://community.codemasters. com/forum/ because once you're in it's a really refreshing Xbox Live experience.

There are three modes to choose from: Snooker, Championship Snooker

and In My Pocket. Championship Snooker is the only mode with a scoreboard. It's cleverly based on the real-life rankings system: winners take ten per cent of their opponent's ranking points – beating better players reaps bigger rewards. We'd hoped this would prevent the kind of cheating seen in other Live games. Unfortunately, quitting a match rather than 'conceding' it

means that either player's rankings are unaffected. A player who's losing can drop out without being penalised. If you aren't too concerned about being world number one, you'll find WCS2004 highly enjoyable. Play runs smoothly and lagfree and the menus are well designed and easy to use. We'd like to see the option for spectators in next year's game though.

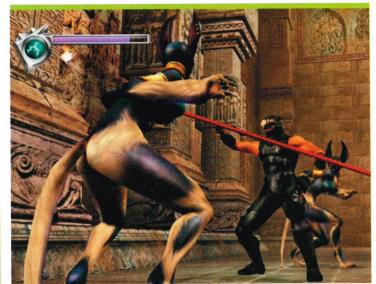

Scoreboards reorganised for Splinter Cell online

HAVE YOU logged into a game of Pandora Tomorrow only to discover your rankings have returned to zero? An auto-update has improved the game and fixed a few bugs, and the range of levels against which you can now gain or lose points has increased: play against two guys of the same level you'll gain or lose between nine and 11 points. Play against two guys ranked five levels less, you'll gain four or five points or lose 15 or 16 points. Play against two guys ranked five levels more, you'll gain 15 or 16 points or lose four or five points. Play against two guys ranked more than ten levels less, you'll gain 0 points or lose 19 or 20 points. 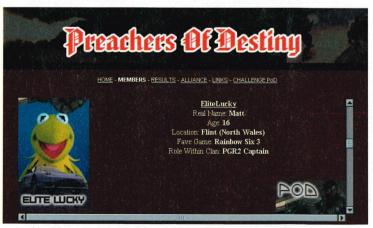

LL GOOD things come to those who wait. Well, we've waited, we've done our part. Now, as the EA Live machine shrugs off the legal ramblings and complications that have bound it in knots, can the developing giant deliver? There are a lot of impatient and sceptical people, a lot of disgruntled mumblings on Internet forums, and many

have the clout and the goods to deliver? The lineup is, undoubtedly, impressive. A broad collection of genres, a range of established brands, sports titles which have begged for Live, and GoldenEye (the golden egg-laying goose)

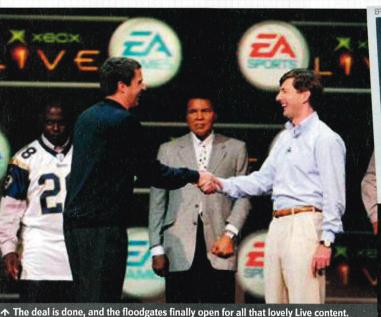
after EA recently snaffled up the rights to produce games based on every 007 outing.

Microsoft is understandably pleased to have EA on board. Current figures show there are 1 million Xbox Live users, but compare this to the number of Xbox units sold, and the figure is piddling: just one in 15. With EA Sports' strong portfolio, European Xbox Live supremo Michel Cassius is sure this will change. "Sports games are fantastic," he told us recently. "They're less intimidating than something like a shooter; they're really open. Teambased games you can play at any level so EA Sports Live will definitely help Xbox Live. There will be more people playing. I think it's very, very positive for customers."

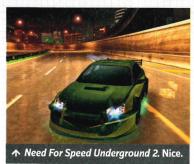
But this is a far cry from EA's stance last year. At a conference to the Bank of America in September 2003, EA chief financial officer Warren Jensen announced: "We're not about to support a model where the content provider does not get paid for the content provided." It seems clear where EA's priorities were. Electronic Arts was clearly unhappy how, considering it was the biggest developer and publisher of games around, it wasn't being paid for its services. So while Don Mattrick, president of EA can now claim: 'The big winners [of EA going Live] are the people who love games", joint first place on the podium has to go to EA itself. Everyone be upstanding for the National EAnthem.

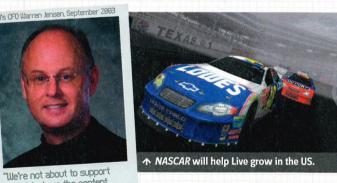
Fair enough, every company has a right to protect its own interests, and as gamers we shouldn't pry too much into the political and financial tussling, just as long as we get our games at the end of the day. Sure enough, the EA Live games are on their way, but at what price to other developers and us gamers in the long run, and is EA too late to join the race anyway?

Codemasters has already produced the first online football game (England International Football - Issue 29, 8.2), there are numerous online shooters, Links 2004 (Issue 24, 8.4) was Live so bye bye Tiger, and just how many more online racing games do we need after PGR2 (Issue 23. 9.3) and RalliSport Challenge 2 (Issue 30,



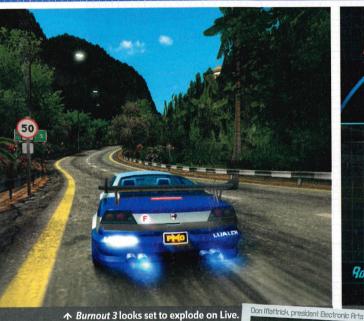

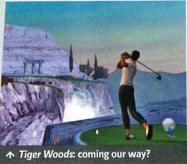

9.0)? The answer it seems, is irrelevant, because as great as those titles are, the EA stamp on a game seems to guarantee sales, whether they're actually better or not.

Madden NFL 2004 (Issue 21, 8.5), not disputing its pedigree, sold over five and a half million copies in the US compared with NFL Fever's (Issue 22, 8.7) 160,000. When comparing EA Sports games with similar brands, the numbers always seem to favour EA. Electronic Arts is the king when it comes to sports games. Chip Lange, vice president of EA's Online Gaming services told us: "We feel that sports gamers deserve top-quality games, and that's what EA Sports works hard at every day, to deliver the best sports simulation games on the market. There are

still choices for the consumer, but we feel EA Sports games are the best available." By choices, Lange certainly doesn't mean XSN, Microsoft's very own online sports series. Just before EA announced its decision to go Live, the XSN series was shelved. With five and half million *Maddens* out there, 500,000 of which were played online with Sony's equivalent to Live, you can see why. "Microsoft's decision to not produce XSN titles this year had nothing to do with EA. It took this decision independently," Lange told us. It seems rather convenient though...

So, with Uncle Bill making way for EA to dominate the online sports market (for now at least), will this move mean a stronger or weaker Live experience for us? Cynics and hardcore gamers will argue that it's their choice what they play, EA developed or not. They'll argue that EA is an everyman developer, applying an EA gloss to everything it produces rather than specialising in a brand that really hits the spot. They're also likely to draw their own conclusions about what Lange called 'Microsoft's decision to evaluate the sports product they were bringing to market', and point fingers at EA's money-making clout. On the other hand of course, applying those EA everyman tactics to Live is precisely what the system needs to get that one in 15 statistic looking healthier.

Thankfully, EA is lining up a series of titles that everyone wants on Live, a lineup so tempting and so established

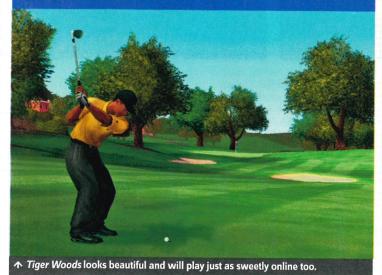
THIS IS THE DADDY - the one everyone has been longing for. Real fans will be able to play each other in real leagues, controlling and commanding their team through genuine championships. Although downloadable content such as different players maybe possible thanks to mid-season transfers, there is no news yet to whether this is set in stone yet, as the yearly updates of *FIFA* often rely on player transfers as a portion of their selling appeal. Multiplayer options, allowing different gamers to control an individual player are also being considered, and will certainly feature more than just a one-on-one option although the exact number of online gamers playing at any one time has yet to be confirmed. New, vastly improved player makers will allow you to upload your players online, and, as expected, *FIFA 2005* will be fully compatible with the headset.

At the moment all the tartan slack action is only slated for release in the US, but hopefully this masterpiece will make its way to our shores. After all, we've not got *Links 2005* on the way, have we? Tsk!

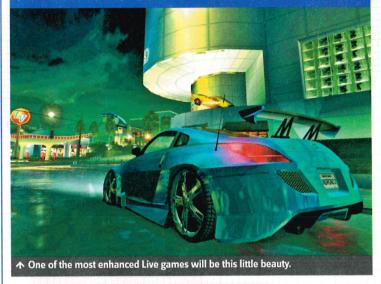

There is also speculation that the Xbox version will enable gamers to play cross-platform, and although this is just a pipe-dream, the possibilities this may bring to gaming, especially EA gaming, would be endless.



as quality brands, XSN might not be missed at all. FIFA seals the deal for many of us but, for those who aren't tempted by the leading footy brand going Live, there are a host of other tasty titbits.

"Our Xbox Live-enabled games will incorporate new innovations including a Live Sports Ticker, online mini-games, as well as full messenger functionality," Lange told us. "EA will bring a huge competitive environment to Xbox Live. As the biggest publisher of Xbox games and with more people playing EA Sports games, the potential for great competitive match-ups on Xbox Live with EA Sports titles is huge."

EA's Live system won't be a separate entity from Xbox Live, rather a sister service. Friends lists will remain the same, invites to join EA game sessions will appear during non-EA games, all games will support an EA Messenger service, voice chat requests, text messages and email messaging too.

And, thankfully, when asked whether we'll have to pay for EA's Live service as well as Xbox Live, Lange told us: "There are no current plans to charge a games player twice to play EA titles on Xbox Live. Players will continue to pay for their normal online service in the normal way."

Understandably, when it comes to downloadable content, EA is taking a lead from Microsoft and considering a small charge per download. "EA will have a rich feature set through Xbox Live. We're evaluating if we will offer additional features and experiences for an incremental cost," says Lange. "If we do, we feel it will be well received because of the increased value in the offering." Microsoft has started handling its online stance considerably differently to how it used to, another aspect that has helped bring EA aboard. Whereas Live is currently a closed network, owned, operated,

spoon-fed, nappy-changed and walked to school by Microsoft, recent changes mean other developers are able to get in on the action. Like EA, anyone has the potential

to run their own servers, control leagues, add online-only games such as the new Xbox Live Arcade service, but crucially, they also have the option to introduce their own pay-to-play functions. Soon, if EA's content succeeds, we could see a flurry of developers and publishers all introducing new content to our favourite Live games.

For all the naysaying and chin-stroking, the proof of whether this is a good move for Xbox comes down to one thing: the wallop each of the games will have, not just in sales charts, but when plugged into your Xbox. And looking at this little lot, we could be cruising for a wallop big enough to leave us seeing stars. As Don Mattrick has said: "I know it took a while for us to get here, but EA is committed to creating great experiences to help [Microsoft] grow the Xbox Live community", and on these pages are the first EA Live games he was talking about...

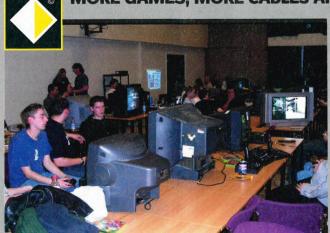

AS THE BEST thief in the City, it's your job to thwart the coming of a new Dark Age, while simultaneously lining your pockets with just about everything you can. Make friends, break alliances, unravel ancient mysteries, slay demons, and save the world in *Thief: Deadly Shadows*, and do so with the aid of this handy guide.

Thief: Deadly Shadows

WHILE IT applies to virtually every stealth-based actioner out there, it bears repeating here: *Deadly Shadows* is a game that requires you to be sneaky, above all else. Garrett is absolutely terrible in a face-to-face fight, so avoid confrontation.

If you must, cosh a few gentlemen, then stow their bodies. If they see you, drop a flashbomb and/or run. It really is that simple.



Mission 1: End of the Bloodline

THE END OF the training mission sees you in a courtyard. As with most of the game's missions, when you're done here, you'll leave via your entry point. Extinguish the lion's-head torch, then wait for one guard to enter the castle. Sneak past the other one, around the edge of his patio, and up onto the battlements. This'll take you into the barracks.

While you're there, take a moment to loot the place. When you are done, head to the bottom of the staircase outside the barracks, where three patrolling guards make life difficult. Toss a noisemaker arrow somewhere else, so

all three guards react to it, then slip up the stairs, and into the zone gate in the rooms at the top.

You will emerge outside the bedchambers in the Inner Quarters. Descend briefly via the lift and loot the kitchen, where you'll find a crucial note. Next, backtrack to the battlements, and prepare for serious sneakiness, as you must evade both Lord Ember and his torch-toting companion. Fortunately, if you can simply cross the room, there's a handy side passage which lets you circumvent them.

Pick the lock on Lord Ember's bedroom door and enter. The wall sconce above his writing desk is the switch you need. For extra wealth and even more plot complications, visit Elizabeth's bedroom, up the spiral stairs near Ember's room.

Go back to the Outer Quarters. The treasure vault is towards the west of the building, in the basement. Acquire the Bloodline Opal, and leave the castle.

The City: Day 1

Visit Heartless Perry, and you'll find Ember's wife Elizabeth at the entrance to the Stonemarket. She will go into a nearby building, which you can sneak into via a hole underneath the attached patio. If you wait, her thugs will come inside to get paid, which lets you get them one at a time.

Now, go to the Plaza and meet Bertha. First sell the Opal, then go meet the Keepers in Terses Courtyard. You'll want plenty of water arrows and flashbombs for your next mission, so now's a good time to raise money via mugging and burglary.

Mission 2: St Edgar's Eve

THERE ARE two thugs loitering outside the cathedral, one of whom has a map of the area on his waist. Steal it from him before you go in.

Hammerites are powerful opponents and can drop Garrett with two to three hits. Do not fight them, even if you're desperate. If one's patrol route takes him past a statue, he'll stop and pray; this is a good time to nail him.

Bop the guy on patrol in the courtyard, then slip in via the front door of the cathedral. Given their ecclesiastical tendencies, evading Hammerites is no great accomplishment. Wait for one to start praying, then slip past him.

Investigate the west side of the temple first. You'll find a bellcord on this

side of the building, overlooking the front courtyard. If you pull this, you will bring the High Priest and his bodyguard over to the altar hall, getting them out of his bedroom so you can steal his possessions. That, however, is a process that requires great timing and precision. There is a better way...

Sneak into the Barracks via the eastern courtyard, and go upstairs to the balcony. Here, you'll find two gas bombs - one's on top of a barrel, while the other's on a workbench. Grab them, then double back to the courtyard and go up the exterior staircase.

Opening the door puts you in the High Priest's bedroom. Before he can react, pitch a gas bomb at him and his guard. This will knock them both out for the duration. Swipe the Holy Symbol off of the desk.

Now, you have to go to the Hammer Factory and acquire a stamped gear. That zone's entrance can be found at the top of the west stairs in the cathedral's front hall, via the side door. You'll need to be clever to get down the stairs without being seen, but a noisemaker arrow will get most of the guards looking the other way. If you really want a distraction, try releasing the two zombies from the cells near the furnace!

The layout of the Hammer Factory is essentially circular, so you shouldn't have much trouble finding your way around. The unstamped gear is inside a storage room on the ground floor, about two rooms away from the Stamping Machine. Stamp the gear, then take it and your Holy Symbol to the Reliquary. Use both items on the large engines, then go back upstairs to clean out the cage. The Chalice is now yours.



Mission 3: Pagan Tunnels

THESE TUNNELS will be your first acquaintance with a particularly annoying underground feature: luminous crystals. These cannot be dimmed or extinguished.

Let the two hapless miners wander for a bit; any pagan they run into is one

less pagan for you to thrash. Of course, they're too belligerent to keep around, so once they've done that for you, bop and stash them

Forge onward by yourself, until you hear two women talking. Wait for their conversation to finish. One of the women will leave, while the other stays behind to patrol. Knock her out, raid their campsite, and follow her friend into the City's sewer system.

The sewers host a strange phenomena common to Pagan territory: will-o'-the-wisps. While these things are around, any shadows you've found may not be there forever, so keep one eye on them. More importantly, there's a huge lizard down here, which cannot be defeated with your blackjack or dagger, so get out of the water as soon as you can.

Once on dry ground, steal some explosive mines from the stack of crates, and knock out the three Pagans who are on guard. Do so quietly and quickly, as if one of them starts raising a fuss, the lizard will come out of the water to back them up. The only man among them is guarding a treasure chest, which contains a valuable map of the Pagan Sanctuary.

Near the chest is a side tunnel that terminates in a ladder leading to a zone gate. In an overgrown ruin, the Pagans are

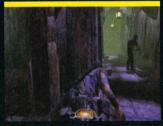

Buy a set of Climbing Gloves at the thieves' market and sneak past the

guards outside the tavern to reach the Abysmal Gale. The ship's small, but full of zombies, which can be dispatched with flashbombs, holy water or fire arrows. Use the holes staved into the floor to reach the lower decks; your target's the cargo manifest, which is inside a room on the second deck. Once you've read that, leave the boat, and steal the rowboat one dock over.

girding for war. You'll need to read the note on the wall right in front of you to get a new Objective, then evade the two Pagans on guard.

Once past them, wait for a shaman to come down the hall, then knock her out (spellcasters in general are too dangerous to leave conscious; if nothing else, you can pickpocket them to steal their wands) and go in the direction she came from. Through the side door, you will find a bunch of Pagans practising with swords; leave them to it, and pick the lock on the closed door. Poke your head through it, put out the torch to your right, and use the wrecked stairs to get up into the rafters.

For fun, you can drop the giant gear onto the practising Pagans, but otherwise, leap across the rafters into the small stone doorway. This'll lead you to a set of stairs, at the top of which is your first special loot item: the Ancient Statuette.

Climb out the window, onto a pipe, and follow it to the moat. When the guardian isn't looking, drop into the moat and climb the ladder. You're above Woodbine, the Pagans' shaman; read the open book on her bed to learn the Ritual of the Root. Leave her room via the hole in the wall and go straight down the hall to the basement stairs. The stairs lead you to a wine cellar, the main hall of which leads you straight to the altar that holds

the Paw. There's a Pagan on patrol down here, with a lizard set to guard the Paw.

Set a mine for the lizard to get it out of your hair, and kill the Pagan. To get the Paw out of the tree, shoot a water arrow at the left-hand symbol, a moss arrow at the right, and finally, drop your dead Pagan on the centre. This'll free the Paw; steal it and make your escape.

The City: Day 3

Visit the Keeper at Terses Courtyard and follow him into their Library. Read all the open books, and find Artemus on the ground floor. You can now see and open Keepers' glyph doors, which'll let you reach the Docks via the South Quarter.



Mission 4: The House of Widow Moira

RIDE THE lift up then sneak past the guard on the tunnel and wait for the game to break up. Wait for the winner to get out of earshot, then distract his buddy with a noisemaker arrow. Leg it upstairs.

Once outside, slip into the darkness and use your Climbing Gloves to scale the side of the house. Now you can infiltrate the Overlook via a secret wall panel. You'll wind up in the head maid's quarters, with only a drunk guy to bar your passage into the Overlook Proper.

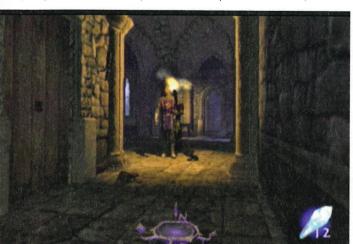

There are a lot of people roaming around inside. Beware the intermittent flashes of lightning, which may spoil your cover, and locate the master bedroom. Pick the lock to get inside, then listen to the phonograph.

To get downstairs, you'll have to put out a few candles, stick to the shadows, and watch the servants' patterns very carefully. To get into Richard's study without a fuss, use the grate to the side of the main stairs. The switch you need is under his desk.

From the study, assuming you do something about the three people in your way, you can run through the dining room, to the kitchen, out into the hallway, and to the gallery (which is through the patio-style doors). The secret door will open next to the bookcase on your right as you enter the room. Go inside, steal the Compendium off the desk, and use

the zone gate. You'll come out right outside the lift that leads to your rowboat.

The City: Day 4

If you're in the Docks, and facing the closed portcullis to the South Quarter, the sewer entrance is to the left. It can be quite hard to find.



Mission 5: The Sunken Citadel

BRING A LOT of water arrows. The layout of the Citadel is very simple, making navigation a snap, but it's full of creatures you really don't want to see you: giant Kurshok fishmen, and the Pagans' beastmen allies. If someone sees you, try

to lead them into another creature's patrol grounds; the Kurshok and the Pagans hate each other more than they hate you.

The Inner Citadel is where things start to get interesting. Sneak past the two Kurshok in the atrium, towards the giant torch-holding statue. In the aftermath of a battle between the Pagans and Kurshok, disable the survivor, then head up the stairs behind the statue. The final resting place of the Keeper Rafe is, fittingly, in the ruins of a library; read his journal, then snag the Glyph Key from under his skeletal hand.

Near the back of the Inner Citadel, you'll find the ruined throne room, where the Kurshok Crown is hovering above the

dias. You'll need to knock out the three Kurshok in the room before you can steal it, but once you do, you're home free. Do yourself a favour, though: do not be tempted to pawn the Crown. It'll save you some work in Mission Nine.

The City: Day 5

The trick is finding the place where you can break into the Clock Tower. Go to Terses Courtyard in Stonemarket Plaza and keep looking up. You should see a pipe marked with a blue Keeper glyph. Use your Climbing Gloves to reach it.

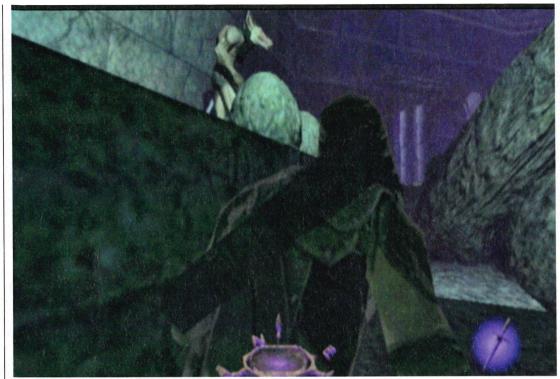


Mission 6: The Clock Tower

DON'T PLAY with the gears; just get through the area and climb down the ladder. The next Hammerite you see is patrolling a small hallway with a writing desk at one end. Pick the lock on the side door and sneak down the side hall. You can come through a window here, into the shadows, to take the mechanical plan off the desk.

There's a barracks at the end of the side hall. Leave via its window and drop onto the wood floor at the top of the stairs below. Your target is the nearly-hidden maintenance ladder in the clockworks, which will take you through a vent and onto the top of a large cylinder. Fortunately, descending isn't as hard as it looks – just use your Climbing Gloves to slide down the wall. There's a zone gate on the ground floor.

The next few floors are easy. Avoid or knock out a couple of guards, then find a lift to get further down. The complication here is that all the hallways are narrow, so hug the wall whenever you can.

Once you reach the basement, things get complicated. All you have to do is adjust the Coal Dispenser and Steam Release on the balcony, and get down the stairs to throw the lever on the Halting Mechanism. That said, there are two guards and a priest on the balcony, and two guards and two workmen on the floor. You could play an intricate game of cat and mouse, slowly whittling away at their numbers until you're the only one left standing, but we always seem to wind up tossing gas bombs around like they're no longer fashionable. Either way you do it, throw that lever.

The City: Day 6

After you visit the Keepers again, you'll wind up in the Old Quarter with all the Keeper glyphs disabled and a pack of Enforcers chasing you. If you're allied with the Hammerites, lead the Enforcers to Fort

Ironwood, where the Builder's boys will take out the trash for you. Otherwise, do not let Enforcers even momentarily entertain the suspicion that you might be in the area, as they attack with supernaturally accurate throwing knives and they're very hard to kill.

Visit your fence in the Old Quarter and read the note on his bookcase. When you get back to Garrett's apartment, drop a gas bomb on the Enforcer who's waiting for you, then read the note on the table in the practice room. This causes a zone gate to open up on one end of Black Alley, which will bring you into Fort Ironwood. (Now do you see why being friends with the Hammerites is important?) Three Keepers will then be nice enough to tell you what the score is.

Return to the Keeper Library; while you can't use the door anymore, you can get in by climbing the wall to the open window above the glyph.

If you haven't burgled the Library already, now's a good time to do it. As swordsmen and guards, the Keepers make great librarians, and you'll probably want to go get the Sanctuary map from the top floor of the Forbidden Library. When you're done with the looting, go to Orland's office and use the glyph on the grate in the corner.

Mission 7: The Keeper Sanctuary

IF YOU WANT, you can sneak upstairs after the two Keepers and eavesdrop on the Council meeting, but aside from one of them mouthing off about you, you won't get much out of it. You're better off working your way around the west side of the building while they're intent upon their business.

The Dormitories is your first destination. Artemus's room is on the ground floor, behind a locked door. Read his journal, then open the chest and get his Keeper Ring (it doesn't gleam like loot does, so just keep hitting A until you get it). You can use this Ring on a pair of nearly-invisible wall outlets, on the balconies above the Dining Hall and

Dormitories, to open the secret door to

Inside, read everything you can, then hit the seal on the wall by the bed with a fire arrow (or grab it and toss it into the fireplace in the Dining Hall). This'll disrupt the binding glyph Orland placed on all the Keeper doors, including the one on the south wall of the library. Go down there.

As you enter the Lower Libraries, you can relax for the moment. Ransack Caduca's chambers, ignoring that sinking feeling in the pit of your stomach, and read the note in the gargoyle's hand. That'll tell you to visit the Hall of Statues, where a special mystery guest will do something deeply unpleasant.

The good news is that animated statues are predictable and fairly stupid. The bad news is that they're very fast and extremely durable. If one sees you, it's pretty much game over unless you get lucky or find a very good hiding place.

When the movie's over, knock out all the torches in the Hall Proper, then sneak across the room to the doorway opposite your starting point. Turn right, go straight, avoid the statue, open the door, go inside, and stop dead. There's another statue on patrol below you. Watch his routine, and run for the shadows when his back's turned. For fun, you can drop a couple of mines in his path, but you may be better

off just mantling up a bookcase and leaping for the balcony above. The glyph in front of you opens the secret passage back to the Old Quarter.

The City: Day 7

From Garrett's new hideout, go visit Auldale via the conventional gate. Drept's place is on the same corner as Auldale's pub; to enter, use the stained-glass Hammerite window. Now you know to go to the Shalebridge Cradle, in the Old Quarter near the Docks gate.



Mission 8: **Shalebridge Cradle**

GO TO THE Attic to get the Generator Fuse you need, and inspect the portrait to meet (the late) Lauryl. Her Blood is in one of the flasks in the storm cellar, down the hall from the generator room. Place the Fuse to reactivate the power and open the emergency portcullis.

To get her nightgown, go to cell No. 5 in the Inner Cradle and check the back wall. Burn it in the morgue furnace. The "toys" Lauryl speaks of are in the various cells, except for the Wax Mask, which is on a chair in the shock treatment lab.

Each "toy" can be used in a specific place in the Inner Cradle to transport Garrett into the past, where you cannot

use items and contact with a guard transports you back to the real world. In the past, grab Lauryl's Diary from one of the beds near the back of the Nursery Tower, and read the note on the podium to learn more about the Hag. Burn the Diary in the past morgue.

Now, steal the Dissolution Serum from the table in the past lobotomy theatre, and go to the past Attic. When you fail to leave the Cradle, visit the cage in the Storm Cellar, then fight your way to the top of the staff tower. There's an open window behind the table - jump out of it.



Follow Lauryl's ghost into the catacombs below Fort Ironwood, then return to the Keeper Library. When prompted, go to Auldale, read the note on the Pump House door, and steal Dyan's Amulet from the altar in the centre of Auldale Park.

Enter the Pump House and drain the canal. Drop down into it via one of the grates (such as the one in Auldale Park); Gamall's Lair is at one end. Once inside, evade several statues and reclaim the Paw and Chalice.

In Gamall's bedroom, there's a row of books on a desk next to the bed. Pull the one on the left to open a secret door

and reach the balcony. After the movie, use the glyph on the wall to upgrade your blackjack.

Leave, resupply, and head towards the museum. There's a grate in the floor of a doorway near the museum's front gate. Drop down to find a note from Carmen, the owner of the thieves' store in the Old Quarter. If you have money to burn, buy replica artifacts from her, as well as a map of the museum, then infiltrate the museum via the tunnel.



Mission 9: Still life with Blackjack

ODDLY, NEITHER Gamall or her statues are here to spoil the party. Instead, it's just you, about 7500 gold worth of loot, and a few dozen guards. In Porter Hall, your best bet is to knock everyone you see unconscious and make your way to the Power Station in the northwest corner. Throwing the breaker switch deactivates the electrical flares around the Crown and Heart Artifacts for about 45 seconds, which, if there are no guards in the way, is just about enough time to reach them.

Tesero Hall is equally simple. Go to the curator's office and throw the switch on the balcony. This will raise the statue

that holds the Eye, and begin its slow rotation. Reach one of the balconies that overlooks its atrium and snatch the Eye as it passes by.

The City: Day 9

Go meet Artemus in Terces Courtyard to begin the rioting. The City will become a madhouse of statues, Gamall, Hammerites, Pagans, City Watchmen, thugs and citizens, all fighting each other, and you have to make your way through it. Use every single sneaky way through the streets you know, like the Old Quarter rooftops or the Canal in Auldale, and place the Artifacts as instructed.

Gamall is goal-tending here, so if you don't know where to go, just look for the fat ogre who wants you dead. While she

cannot be defeated, she can sure as hell be distracted. Noisemaker arrows work; flashbombs and knockout gas don't. Outwitting Gamall and planting all five Artifacts wins you the game!

Special Loot

Almost every mission map in Deadly Shadows contains three special loot items. You have to steal at least one of them to fulfill your objectives, but since they're often the most valuable things on the map, why not get all three?



ission 1: **End of the Bloodline**

Mortimer the Mad: above the front hall, shove a crate out of the way to find a grate. Use it to reach the large painting. Rutherford Medallion: on the mantle of the fireplace in Lord Ember's bedroom. Gilded Helm: inside a locked chest at the foot of Elizabeth's bed.



St Edgar's Eve

Codex of the Admonitions: on the second floor of the church, on a bench in the western chapel.

Precious Comb: this can be found above the child's bed on the floor above Woodbine's bedroom Bronze Beetle: in the locked chest in the Pagans' Sleepsie.

Widow's Mirror: in the garderobe off the master bedroom in the Overlook Proper. Nereid Telescope: on display in the rotunda of the Overlook Proper. Lucky Coin: on the dining room table in the Overlook Grounds.



lission 5: **The Sunken Citadel**

Pagan Battle Horn: in the secret room underneath the Kurshok hatchery. Large Diamond: on the wall behind the two chatty Pagans in the Outer Citadel. Kurshok Tapestry: in the throne room in the Inner Citadel, climb up the throne and jump to the statue, then to the balcony. The Tapestry is on one of the walls of one of the rooms off the throne room balcony.



ission 6: **Killing Time**

Diamond Gear: you know those giant swinging gears near the start of the map? They're in that room, a fair distance up the wall in one of the corners of the room near your entrance point.

Father Debole's Solace: under the same writing desk where you find the mechanical plan. Builder's Ingot: in the Lower Clocktower



lission 7: **Keeper Sanctuary**

Imbris Analects #1: in the dining hall, on the table.

Imbris Analects #2: if the Council voted to move it, it's on the podium in the Scribe Room. If they didn't (if you blackjacked the two Keepers before they could vote), it's on a table in the library. Gold Scales: this is in the library, in an alcove above the glyph-sealed entrance to the Lower Libraries.
