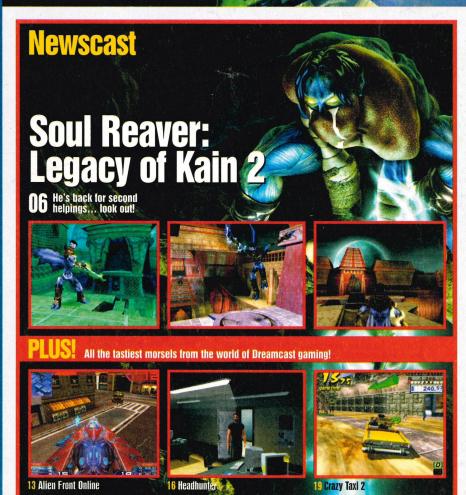

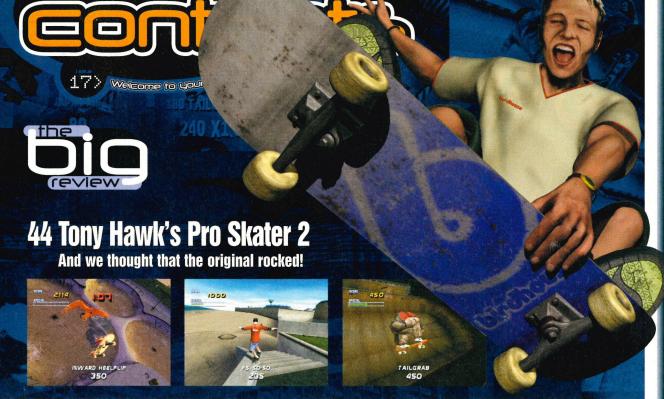


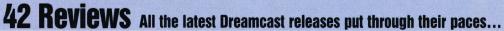

## **The Seventh Element**

Considering the title, you should have noticed by now that the main highlight of the game is the Soul Reaver - Raziel's soul-based weapon that can slice and dice any vampires in its way, while being totally dishwasher safe... err, probably. In any case, this latest adventure in the Legacy Of Kain series takes the powers of the Soul Reaver one step further by introducing the seven elements (those being Fire, Air, Water, Earth, Light, Dark and Spirit) and can imbue the Soul Reaver with new powers that help you conquer the obstacles blocking your path through Nosgoth to where Kain waits. Hmm, sounds intriguing...











Are you sick of those cute platform adventure games where fluffy bunnies and cuddly-wuddly teddies roam the land? Need something a bit darker, nastier and down-right evil in your gaming life? Well, don't panic - it might have been nearly a year since the last time you had the chance to get vampiric on someone's arse but with the welcome return of Raziel to the Dreamcast, the mood is about to change...

Much to the relief of people hanging on to the immense cliff-hanger that occurred at the very end of the original Soul Reaver, Legacy Of Kain: Soul Reaver 2 picks up the tale where the first game left off - in case you never made it to the end though, here's a look at the story so far. As you might have guessed, you're still

Raziel, an ex-lieutenant of the evil vampire council led by the monstrous Kain. After being cast into the Lake Of The Dead by Kain for growing wings (hey, it happens to the best of us) and chasing him through the land of Nosgoth in the pursuit of revenge, the whole thing ended with Kain jumping through the Chronoplast time portal and you flying in after him... and so it continues.

## **Stay On The Scene** (Get On Up)

The action may seem slightly familiar (so that fans of the previous game know what they're doing) but believe us when we say there's an entirely new game underneath. This time around, you'll be chasing Kain back through time and space as well as around Nosgoth -

people familiar with the Legacy Of Kain series will be happy to hear that the game takes place before, during and after the events of both the original Soul Reaver and Raziel's first adventure Legacy Of Kain: Blood Omen. This means that there's plenty of opportunity to visit familiar locations and catch up with old friends... before you slice them in two and drain their souls. Lovely.

In keeping with the nature of sequels, everything in Soul Reaver 2 has been kicked up a notch – while elements such as Raziel's abilities to phase between the spiritual and material realm remain, the methods of doing so and the puzzles that present themselves because of it have been vastly enhanced. There's also an entirely new cast of enemies and allies to encounter, as well as plenty



of rich and varied locations to explore such as the Forest of Nosgoth, the lost swamps and even the mighty citadel that stood fallen in the previous Soul Reaver. There's still a fair deal of work to be done on the game before its release in late March next year but if what we've seen so far is anything to go by, it's guaranteed to be just that little bit special.

games already under its belt in the form of Hydro Thunder and 4Wheel Thunder, Midway is reportedly working on a third game to add to the series in the form of Arctic Thunder, where the vehicles of choice are snowmobiles. We've had no confirmation on this from Midway yet but as soon as we do, you'll be the first to know.

### Skies The Limit?

With Sega holding another Business Strategy Conference this month, rumours emerged of a sequel to the muchtouted *Skies Of Arcadia*. Although nothing's been confirmed yet, it is a definite possibility for the future.

### **Veronica Lives Again**

According to one of our sources in Japan, Capcom is planning to re-release Resident Evil Code: Veronica under the title of Resident Evil: Code Veronica Complete on 22 March to mark the fifth anniversary of the series. Apparently, the game will have some new levels concerning Wesker, as well as some other updates.

### VFX Crosses Over

Reports filtering in from Japan this month suggest that Virtua Fighter X, which is currently in development for the Naomi 2 hardware, will be the first cross-platform game for Sega, appearing on all major consoles.

### **New Shenmue Details**

New details regarding Shenmue 2 emerged from Sega this month including the rumour that the game will span a whopping six GD-ROMs, three more than the first instalment. Apparently, the textures of certain characters are one of the main things being addressed, and the game will also feature more QTEs and free battles than before. Most importantly, the game has now been given a release date for Q3 2001... we can hardly wait.

When it comes to producing games at a meteoric rate there's no one that gets remotely close to Capcom. In just over a year, it has already produced 16 games for the Dreamcast, which is one hell of a lot really. Granted they might not all be great but for every crap game it's produced, there's always a great one right behind. So what can we expect from the latest offering from the gates of Capcom, retro shoot-'em-up Cannon Spike?

## Cannon And Ball

Following an obligatory story line of 'terrorist robots causing havoc', you've been appointed as a member of the Anti Robot Special Forces by the World Peace Alliance to stop them before they destroy the world. Scary stuff indeed... well, maybe not. Following in the steps of arcade classic Smash TV the gameplay of Cannon Spike looks to be nothing less than chaotic in good old shoot-'em-up style. With weapons and attacks galore there's going and attacks gate there's going to be a whole lot of killing going on and with two of you at it, there'll be no stopping you... until you finish it, of course. With only eight levels and big fat bosses to shoot your way through it's not really going to last the distance, but then for a quick arcade blast it should do the business.

Part six of our exclusive diary looks at the village and world simulation aspect of the game. Pete Hawley, Lionhead's Producer, guides us through the process of converting from PC to DC.

Last month I explained about the changes you can make to your world and the areas of influence you work within as a god. - d) Throw an enormous rock at the woman's house and retrieve the

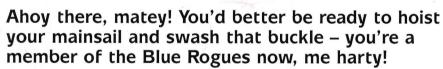

### Dreamcast £150

For the princely sum of £150, you could be enjoying some of the best games ever made, as well as getting online and checking out all the latest Dreamcast news, previews and reviews - plus anything else that might take your fancy via the DreamArena portal. You can even stay in touch via the email system, although we advise you get a keyboard for that. You can get your hands on a DVD player and Dreamcast package for just £300 too, thanks to Sega's latest cheeky marketing ploy. Oh, and you get a free game too. Now you can't argue with that.

## PlayStation2 £300

At £300 the PS2 is not a cheap investment, and when you consider that you'll have to shell out another £40 for games, £20 for a second controller and another £30 for a DVD or two, you're not going to have much change from £400. But then, if you've got money to burn... The fact that you'll have to hire your own private dick to find one for you doesn't help either, as a paltry 80,000 have so far managed to get past customs. Still, more should be arriving in the next few months and the price tag should come down pretty sharpish, fingers crossed.

Wanna punch some golden oldies?

### Dreamcast

Bleemcast: In combat with the PS2's backward compatibility, the Dreamcast will soon be able to play its very own catalogue of PlayStation games thanks to Bleemcast. Bleemcast will initially allow you to play 400 games (four Bleem Paks of 100 games each), but even better is the fact that the system will play the games at a higher resolution than the PS2 is able to, which means that thev'll look even better on the Dreamcast! If nothing else, it should stir the market up even more, with some potentially interesting results. Better still is the



downloadable Sintendo emulator, allowing you to play SNES games on your Dreamcast. What more could you want?

### PlayStation2

Backwards Compatibility: One of the PS2's greatest assets is that it will allow users to play all of their old PlayStation games at a greater resolution, which means that the need for top quality games at launch isn't a real priority for Sony. Of course you'll also be able to play all the new PlayStation games too, something Dreamcast owners won't be able to do until Bleem make a compatible Bleem Pak for those games.

## What Does It All Mean?

> To most of us this is all just incomprehensible jargon, but what it actually means is that the PlayStation2 graphics and overall capabilities are greater than those of the Dreamcast, despite the fact that both are 128bit machines. However, what it also means is that the PlayStation2 is a far harder machine to programme games for than the Dreamcast. The inclusion of the Windows **CE Operating System on the Dreamcast** allows developers to port PC games to the system with relative ease and the fact that the Videologic PowerVR2 is very similar to the Naomi chip used in arcade machines means that arcade conversions are also relatively simple.

## Dreamcast – Online Capabilities

Undoubtedly the biggest advantage that the Dreamcast has over the PS2 is the fact that it is the world's first fully online games console. Although rather slow in getting online titles out into the market, the release of Chu Chu Rocket! last year resulted in a big push for online games over the last few months. With the likes of Quake III Arena, Speed Devils Online, 4x4 Evolution, Toy Racer, Star Lancer and the Planet Ring project all on the



shelves, online gaming has never looked more healthy. And we haven't even mentioned Sonic Team's stellar RPG Phantasy Star Online which is due out at the end of January.



## PlayStation2 – DVD Player

There's no doubt that half the people buying PlayStation2s are purchasing them for the DVD-playing abilities just as much as they are for the games. In fact, over in Japan PS2 software sales haven't even exceeded hardware sales while DVD sales and rentals have rocketed, proving that buyers are getting the system not for the games but the DVD usage. Read into that what you like, but our guess is that things are going to go the same way over here. However, there's one thorn in its side at the moment, as you can't play DVDs through a scart lead, which means that the picture quality leaves a whole lot to be desired.

## What Does It All Mean?

The fact that both consoles have different quality extra features means that each will appeal to a different audience. If you want a console that is a games console above all else, then the Dreamcast is the one for you, and coupled with its online functions it's a system that appeals to a younger audience. In contrast the PS2, with its DVD player, is more of a lifestyle accessory than the Dreamcast. What also needs to be taken into account is that the PS2 will be receiving a hard drive add-on and modem at some stage in the future, thus rivalling the Dreamcast's online capabilities. At the end of the day it all depends on what you want out of an 'entertainment system' - games and the Internet or games and DVDs. The decision is yours...

The game, not surprisingly, was *Tony Hawk's Pro Skater 2* – the sequel to the much-praised *Tony Hawk's Skateboarding*. Don't ask us why they changed the name – considering the original was called *Tony Hawk's Pro Skater* in America, we're at a bit of a loss. Still, that's not to say that we're at a loss for what to say about *THPS2*... mainly because it's possibly one of the most playable games we've ever seen. And yes, we know we said that last month about *M-SR*, but this time we really, REALLY mean it. Okay?

## **Bump And Grind**

Now, if you didn't play the original *Tony Hawk's Skateboarding* (or played it but didn't enjoy it) then there's obviously something not quite right about you. Demonstrating that not all PlayStation-to-Dreamcast conversions have to be pretty

bog-standard rehashes, the first *Tony Hawk* game truly was a sight to behold, both in terms of looks and sheer playability. And now, after much waiting and gnashing of teeth, the sequel has finally arrived on the Dreamcast. Hoorah and huzzah indeed. Rather than trying to do something entirely different with the game in order to create a new experience, Neversoft has instead taken the original concept and honed it to near-perfection.

All the things that were so great about the first *Tony Hawk* game are back – the large selection of tracks and skaters, the huge amounts of playability and the ease of getting to grips with the controls and tricks – but this time around, there's even more of everything. More skaters (sixteen pros to choose from, three of them secret

ones plus the option to create your own skater), more parks (ten entirely original locations plus 50 pre-created Park Editors' ones... see the Park Life boxout for more details) and most importantly, more objectives – while the whole of the first game could be completed in a few hours, each level now has ten objectives to achieve and believe us, they aren't easy. There's no more automatic upgrading of stats and abilities... oh no. Where's the multiplayer mode guys, surely a must for any racing game in the current gaming climate? How about a little variation in the track? Okay, so there's four times as much road to rev your engine around, but there's only the same, albeit gorgeous, views of Tokyo and its highway network over and over, which begins to get monotonous after hours of racing. And that's not fun.

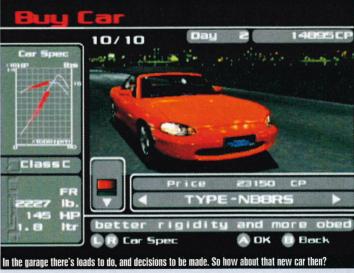

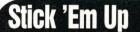

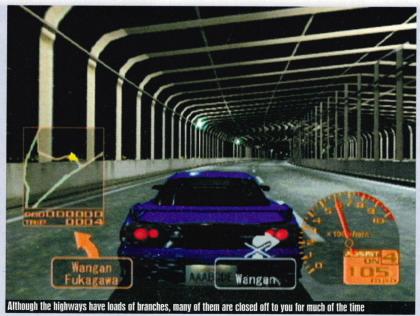


Visually the game is, for the majority of the time, like a bed of roses. Unfortunately, like roses, there are plenty of thorns to make it more than a little uncomfortable. Take, for the example, the frame rate - a silky smooth 60fps 98% of the time, but every now and then for some totally inexplicable reason, it not only drops well below 30fps but is joined by its ever-faithful partner in crime, Mr Slowdown. At other times, even more bizarrely, it stops momentarily altogether. Why? Well your guess is as good as ours.

However, these graphical problems aside, there's no denying that this is a genuinely good-looking game, even if the whole thing is set in the dead of night. The Tokyo highways are particularly fetching, illuminated as they are by impressive light sourcing, although the overall graphical effect is let down by the rather too boxy car models that pass along their tarmac paths. Shame about the repetitive beats of the music, which are enough to give you road rage by itself. So where exactly does all this leave

Tokyo Highway Challenge - stuck in the middle of the road or speeding off into the distance? Well while there's no doubt that there are some really good touches to the game, and it is a marked improvement on the original, it has too many annoying little nuances to make it anything more than solid. That, and the fact that it doesn't have a great deal of substance compared to say M-SR, means that you're better off sticking elsewhere... unless you're Japanese of course.

• Going by the current crop of games making their jaunty way to the Dreamcast, it would seem that

the Dreamcast, it would seem that transforming big budget Hollywood films into games is the fad of the times. First there was *Dinosaur*, now it's this, and with versions of *The Grinch* and *The Mummy* in the pipeline too, the Hollywood invasion is building up. Invariably, though, movie-based games are never a patch on the film, which just about sums up *102 Dalmatians* Dreamcast-styley.

## **Spotted Dick**

For those yet to see the film (if not, why not?) the plot of the game is hardly the most complex. Facing financial ruin, Cruella De Vil has created her own range of toys (nasty of course) which, unsurprisingly, fail to sell. Cruella, being the bitter and twisted witch that she is, blames it on all the animals in the country forcing her into the drastic action of kidnapping every pet in the land, including all the Dalmatians... again. But then she didn't count on Domino and Oddball, two thrill-seeking pups, ruining her plans.

What we have here, then, is an adventure viewed from the wide-eyed perspective of a couple of pups as they set about rescuing their brothers and sisters from the clutches of Cruella and her equally evil, albeit stupid, henchman. Although the bulk of the game involves having to roam around

the 16 levels and sniffing out all the kidnapped pups, there are other objectives and missions, not least of which is collecting all the bones and stickers from each level. But that's not all, as mixed in with all the adventuresome gameplay and missions are some cool little mini-games which, when you tire of running around on all fours, will add a little light relief to proceedings. This really is just as well, otherwise the gameplay might have become a little too mind-numbing for intelligent beings. Sure it's good, clean, harmless fun, but it's hardly inspirational or taxing stuff, is it?

## **Barking Mad**

Visually the game is a kaleidoscope of colours that'll have you thinking you've been transported back to the flower power days of the Sixties. Unfortunately though, this is the only real visual treat in store as the game's graphics are generally blocky and essentially basic in their design

 they're not bad, just not great. Likewise, the overall charm of the game is hardly helped by some of the worst camera angles we've seen which, to top it all off, are as jerky as hell.

However, the real problem that befalls 102 Dalmatians is that it's just so limited - not so much in gameplay but rather in appeal. As a kids' Dreamcast game it's actually pretty good (if you're under ten, that is) but in all fairness its appeal is ridiculously limited. Sure it's incredibly cute and there are some great little touches here and there, but it's hardly pushing the boundaries of the Dreamcast, or gamers' grey matter for that matter. The result of all this is a game which, though relatively enjoyable to play, is far from being an entirely satisfying or fulfilling experience, which is a shame because if cuteness counted for anything, this would be a clear winner. As it is, it's just another nondescript pup in the Dreamcast litter.

. When it comes to making a film · tie-in game, there are two golden rules. Firstly, no matter what your subject matter is, it is totally suited to becoming a platform game - even if this means inventing sections never seen by moviegoers. Secondly, no matter what actually happened in the film, the player must end up collecting items. This is fun. It always has been, and God knows it always will be. Well, rules (much like wishbones) are just begging to be broken. Come on in, Chicken Run and show us how things should be done. No really, please. Well, okay... just give it your best shot, huh?

## Chicken Dippers

Not surprisingly, a fair shot and a near miss this is. The set-up is simple; in real life, chickens don't enjoy being cooped up and then eaten. Add to this truism some 'escape movie' clichés, ninety kilos of modelling clay and some of that good old oh-so-fashionable eccentric British humour that big Hollywood stars love to 'get in on' and you have Chicken Run the movie. Take away the majority of visual gags, borrow some of that oh-sopopular stealth action that game developers can't wait to 'get in on', add

some sub-standard sub-games and you have Chicken Run - the game. On paper, it seems like such a creamy idea and on a basic level, it works well. You play the film's main characters - Ginger the hen, Rocky the cock (voiced by Mel Gibson) and Nick and Fetcher, a pair of rats. It's up to you to utilise their skills and make good your escape from inevitable, yet damned tasty, death. However, it's a shame that the best laid plans of mice and poultry are prone to cocking up. Thus what initially seems like a perfect film-to-game transition quickly devolves into sneaking around a farmyard, picking up required objects (hail rule number two!) and taking them back to a central location where they're fashioned into escape equipment. Oh, and occasionally you get to play a simple game based on a scene from the film.

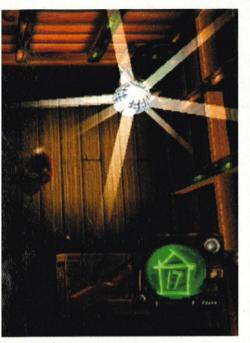

Occasionally though, it works out fine. Gauntlet Legends was pretty damn great and now we've got Frogger 2... and well, that's not half bad either.

Of course, the reason that Frogger 2 isn't actually as terrible as you might think is that it's not exactly an update of the original game – it's more of a total overhaul than anything else. The story behind it all couldn't be more basic if it was written by a five-year-old – after years of being jumped upon by Frogger, Swampy the Crocodile (no, we've never heard of him either) decides to kidnap all the baby Froggers and put them into a sack... and that's it. Basically, it's your job as Frogger (or his girlfriend Lillie) to hop through ten chapters of platform-jumping stages and rescue them all. Not exactly inspired, is it?

## **Toad In The Hole**

The game itself is pretty simplistic, but it does have enough of that 'just one more go' appeal to keep you coming back to try and get just that little bit further. There's a fair bit of variation in the challenges spread over the different levels, so you'll always find a new surprise just around the corner. The fact that it's easy to get to grips with the controls also means that there's no need to mess about learning how to play - and considering it's a game aimed at the kids, that's probably just as well.

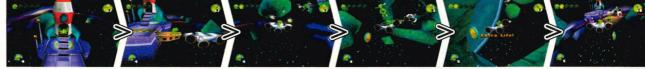

problem that stands out with Frogger 2 - it's far too easy. Unless you're totally bereft of gaming skills (in which case, you really should take up a more productive hobby) you'll have no troubles whizzing through the whole Story mode of Frogger 2 in less than a few hours. The huge amount of extra lives that can be earned, along with the rather obvious 'dodge the enemies, jump over the holes' gameplay meant that we finished the whole thing AND unlocked all but two of the multiplayer levels in an hour and a half. If the game costs £40, that works out at just under 50p per minute of playing - not what we'd call value for money.

It's a shame really, because we quite enjoyed what there was of Frogger 2. Okay, so it's not exactly going to be flying off the shelves, but we've certainly played worse games over the last few months. Unfortunately, we'd have to recommend it as a rental title rather than forking out a wad of cash to play it. (G)

On the face of it, the game looks as if it might well be a worthy competitor to the reigning Tony Hawks Pro Skater 2, if not an entirely better proposition. After all, there are a mammoth ten different modes of play to the game (six oneplayer, four multiplayer), plenty of characters, 30+ stages and a multiplayer option catering for up to four players. So yeah, on the face of it MTV Skateboarding looks as if it's the business but (and it's a

big but) as soon as you plump your arse down and start playing the game, it'll slowly dawn on you that it's not quite as rosy on the other side of the fence as you might have hoped.

## I (Don't) Want My MTV

The first thing you'll notice as the music kicks in and your chosen skater starts about the business at hand is how painfully slow the frame rate and subsequent action is. But before you've got over the shock of the snail-like pace you'll be stunned to an equal extent by how frustratingly unreceptive the control is. The two combined is an evil portent in disguise as they burden the gameplay to such an extent, they drag it down to the depths of Hades along with all the other burning souls. Any pleasure of skating around the parks and performing killer stunts is instantly revoked because as soon as you try to perform that first Benihana or Tailgrab, you'll realise that without any fluidity, the fun is sucked right out. You want

fast, frantic, thrilling gameplay? Well, you're not going to find it here.

The game doesn't really help itself either, when you consider that you can't perform the kind of gravity-defying tricks and ridiculously over-the-top combos that we've hereto been spoilt with. Some might say that this is all part of the learning curve and that the game sticks more to the realms of reality, but in a gamer's reality, it virtually kills it off in one. Gamers don't want boring normality, they want outlandish and excessively huge tricks to perform at high speed and MTV Skateboarding simply doesn't offer that. Yeah, it looks good for the most part but that simply isn't enough any more because without the gameplay to match, it's nothing more than a worthless accessory.

Maybe in a parallel universe where Tony Hawk's didn't exist this would be regarded as a genuinely original and good game, but as it stands, it cowers in the shadow of the altogether mightier Tony Hawk's. Sure, it has some really good aspects to it, but when it's inextricably joined at the hip with what can only be described as soul-destroying gameplay, it just doesn't make the grade.

## **Resident Evil 3: Nemesis**

Oh look - Capcom has converted yet another old PlayStation game to the Dreamcast. Three strikes and you're out, old chap...

Right, so let's get this straight from the off – despite being called Resident Evil 3 (and thus presenting itself as the third in the series). RE3: Nemesis actually takes place before Resident Evil 2 but after the original Resident Evil... hmm. Seems to us that someone at Capcom doesn't understand the whole thing about telling a coherent story – of course, when's that ever stopped them? In a nutshell, you're the girl that was only in the first Resident Evil for five minutes trying to get out of the hellhole that is Raccoon City... yadda yadda yadda. Do we really have to spell it out for you? Solve puzzles, kill zombies, escape alive. Pretty straightforward if you ask us...

Of course, as far as adventure games go (and certainly in comparison to the other games in the Resident Evil series) RE3: Nemesis is pretty by-the-book. Wandering zombie hordes... check. Wide variety of locked doors with keys placed conveniently around the corner... check. Big guns... you're damn right check. To cap it all off, Capcom has even nicked ideas from Resident Evil 2 and brought back the 'hulking brute intent on ripping your head off' in the form of the Nemesis. Of course, avoiding him at all costs is the best method of action but if you stand and fight (which you're given the option of doing) you'll probably get something nice... or die. Most likely the latter.

## **Been There. Splattered That**

As those who have noticed that Virgin has been bashing out a vast majority of its Capcom back-catalogue recently will know, RE3: Nemesis is another PlayStation-to-PC-to-Dreamcast conversion just like Dino Crisis and Resident Evil 2. It's not surprising, then, that there's been very little improvement between the PC and Dreamcast versions,

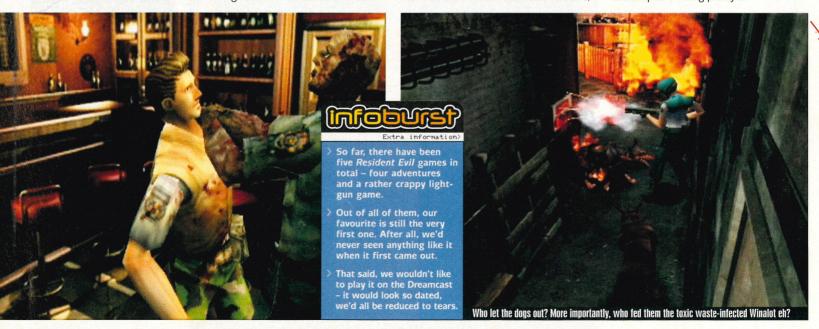
aside from the secret mini-game available from the start and the option to choose what costume Jill wears... oh, joy. In fact, RE3: Nemesis actually looks slightly worse for wear compared to the previous titles, with all sorts of dodgy visual glitches flying everywhere. We would make a big fuss about how the Dreamcast can do so much more and that this sort of thing just isn't acceptable, but we've said it many times recently and... well, quite frankly we're bored with the whole thing.

After all, what kind of person dreams up the idea of a tantrumthrowing duck with no pants and a speech impediment, who has a thing about screaming blue murder at anyone that annoys him? Still, that's obviously not enough to prevent Ubi Soft from giving him the starring role in their latest Disney game, Donald Duck - Quack Attack... do you think we should be worried? Nah, probably not.

Everything about Quack Attack is packed with true Disney style, right down to the twee story line. It goes like this... while reporting live from the Imaginary Kingdom, Daisy Duck is kidnapped by the evil Merlock the Magician (looking suspiciously like Goofy's neighbour Pete, only with slightly more stubble and a cape). Who's going to save her? Why, Donald Duck of course! No surprises there then. What this actually breaks down to in game terms, however, is 24 levels of platformjumping, star-collecting, occasional bossthumping action through the stalwart worlds of games like this - namely Forest, City, Night time and Egyptian. In truth, though, it's actually quite a nice

little game. Decent graphics, and not that bad to play either... even though it's easier than our boy Will on a bottle of Spanish Fly. It's for the kids though, so that's only to be expected.

# **Ouack My Bitch Up**

Take away the sheen of a rather well known Disney character though, and things start to go a bit pear-shaped for Quack Attack. What you'll find underneath could be referred to as the generic blueprint for every cute platform game on the planet. If you lined up Kao The Kangeroo, Quack Attack and the ageold PlayStation game Crash Bandicoot next to one another, you probably couldn't tell them apart... aside from the

considering that it's a game aimed at kids, but when you look at it from the viewpoint of people who have to pay for their games, it's just a Disney-related platform game that's exactly like the one that came out last week.

### **Wing Three**

### **Wing Four**

On the outside ramp in the second room, just by the glass. It's high above the ramp which is opposite where the letter T was found.

### Wing Five

### **Goal Seven** Nosegrind Over The Pipe Reward - \$150

# **Grinds, Slides and Manuals**

Grinds, slides and manual rolls can add that little bit extra to your trick combo and increase the points dramatically if landed properly. Also, grinds can help to build up your speed, especially if accompanied by a fliptrick and/or on a



downward slope. Remember: while sliding, grinding or manual rolling, you must keep your skater's balance. With grinding and sliding, you'll need to press Left or Right to stay upright. With manuals, you'll need to press Up or Down to stay balanced. The higher your skater's manuals and rail balance stats, the less you have to worry about balancing yourself.

### Grinds

50-50: Press Y when you're parallel to the object you want to grind.

Nosegrind: Press Up + Y.

5-0: Press Down +Y

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} \textbf{Smith/Feeble:} Depending on the way you approach the rail, \\ press Down-Left or Down-Right + Y. \end{tabular}$ 

Crooked/Overcrooked: Depending on the way you approach, press Up-Left or Up-Right + Y.

### Slides

Boardslide/Lipslide: Turn the board so that it's facing the rail at a right angle and press Y.

Noseslide/Tailslide: Depending on the direction of approach, press Left or Right + Y.

Bluntslide: Press Down, Down +Y. NoseBluntslide: Press Up, Up + Y.

### Manual Rolls

Manual rolls can be used to extend any trick combo to add extra points. Simply perform a trick onto a flat surface and, before you land, press either...

Manual: Up, Down.

Nose Manual: Down, Up.

Then keep your balance with Up or Down and do a trick off the end for extra points.

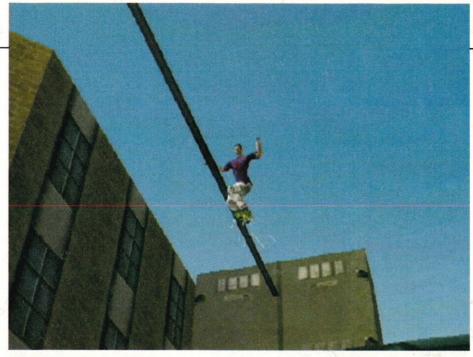

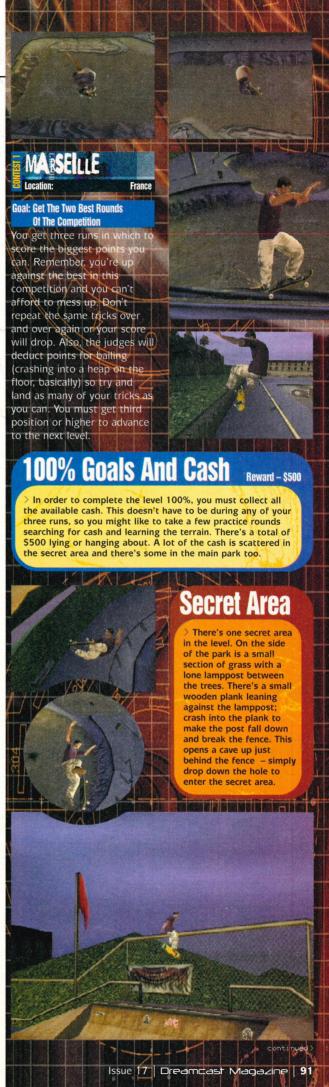

Grind or slide the left rail located on the bridge to the right of the fountain.

### **Token Three**

After grabbing the second token on the bridge, head towards the street opposite and then grind the railings on the left.

### **Token Four**

Just after collecting the third token, get some phat air off the ramp on the other side of the street.

### **Token Five**

Immediately after collecting

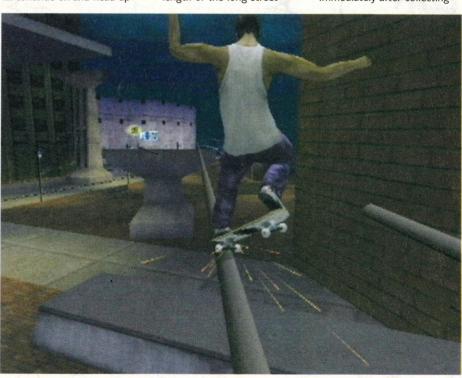

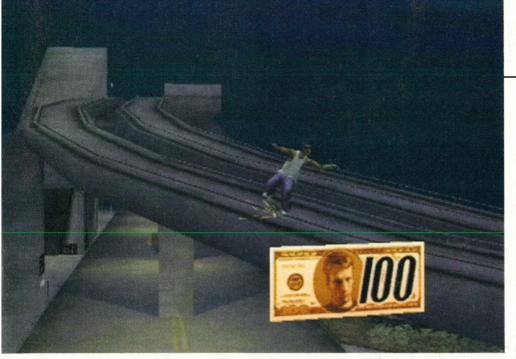

the fourth token, launch off the ramp directly opposite you. The last token is hanging in the air over the grass.

### Goal Seven 50-50 Joey's Sculpture Reward – \$900

You need to approach this from the very top to do this properly. In the centre of the level there is an oddshaped metal sculpture it's in the shopping area at the lowest section of the level. To grind down the metalwork, run up the ramps on either side and onto the street. Turn around at the top and aim for the direction of the sculpture. Now ollie off the edge of the wall and press Y to 50-50 grind down.

### Goal Eight Grind The Subway Rails Reward – \$1100

Head straight from the start until you pass the two small ramps facing each other in the street. Go past a little and turn around. On the left you should see an escalator going up. Head up the escalator and ollie over the tracks to the concrete platform on the other side. Now turn around and grind either track until you get the transfer bonus. You'll need quite a bit of speed and very good balance to get all the way. Watch out for the trains, by the way.

### Goal Nine Find The Secret Tape Reward – \$1,200

Enter the secret area at the end of the street and head up

the curved ramp on the left. Get some speed up and stay on the right-hand side. On the right are two rails: grind the left one and, when you see the bar on the far left (with a \$50 note on it), jump for it and grind along. The tape is at the end of this rail.

### Goal Ten 100% Goals And Cash Reward – \$500

There's a whopping \$1,000 in loose notes scattered around the level. Grab 'em all. There's some on the subway rails, some in the secret area and some high above ramps and railings. Only when all goals have been met, and all stray cash has been grabbed, will you get the extra bonus money.

# **Secret Areas**

> There's only one secret area in the New York level. Head straight from the start until you come to the low wall facing you at the very end of that street. The aim is to wallride high up the wall and grind the top, so that you can enter the secret area behind. Also, the easier way to get into the secret area is to ride the subway tracks. Now you can drop down into the area if you travel the whole length of the rails high above the street.





# Nollies, Switching And Fakies

### **Nollies**

These are basically ollies but performed from the nose of the skateboard. Doing high-scoring tricks from the front rather than the standard ollie position can increase your score by loads. To get into the nollie position, you must be skating forwards (not fakie or switch) and then press the L Button to switch the skater's feet position to the front. Now pop a trick and see the results.

### **Switching**

Switching is great for adding extra points onto a trick. Switching is basically turning the skater's foot position from regular stance to goofy-footed. This allows tricks to be performed from a different position, which makes them harder to do and higher-scoring. To switch, simply press the R Button while skating.

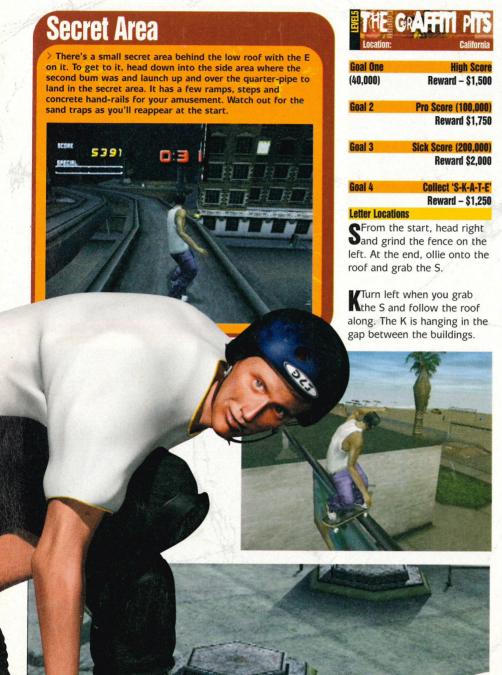
### **Fakie**

For those who didn't know, fakie is the skateboarding term for going backwards. Tricks performed in the fakie position are much, much harder to do (in real life, that is) and increase your score tremendously. To go fakie, you must be in the switch position (notice the yellow switch logo at the top-right of the screen) and then press the L Button to switch feet positions.

Head for the quarter-pipe outside the side area where the second tramp lies and push Up to head onto the roof. Grab the A by the skylights.

**T**From the same roof as the A, turn left and launch over (using the handy ramp) to the next roof and air off the vent ramp to get the letter.

From the tallest roof (with Ethe T on) drop down to the lower roof behind - there's a triangular rail set up on it, so you'll easily recognise it. Now get some huge air off the small quarter-pipe sides and grab the last letter.

Ollie The Magic **Goal Five Bum Five Times Reward - \$1,500** 

### **Bum One**

From the start, head straight down the steps and across the main area. Dead ahead there will be a small side area (with lots of graffiti on the walls). In here, ollie over the sleeping tramp and exit back into the main area.

### **Bum Two**

Follow the wall on the right, head past the quarter-pipe and turn right at the wall at the end. Grind down the rail to grab a quick \$100 and then ollie the bum against the wall. Now jump into the sand

trap so you're whisked back to the start.

Follow the pavement by the fence in front of you that runs to the right. The third bum will be along the path.

### **Bum Four**

Now immediately head left around the building and left again into the area where the flags are. Ollie the sleeping bum here.

### **Bum Five**

Now head back to the starting position and ollie the last bum. He's sleeping just behind the start, against the wire fence

**Goal Six Collect Five Spray Cans Reward - \$1,250** 

### Can One

The first can is on the benches on the other side of the fence that you face from the starting position.

### Can Two

Directly right from the start there is a quarter-pipe against the far wall. Grab the can that hangs above it.

### **Can Three**

Head left from the start and go down the steps. Grab the spray can that you can see above the ramp ahead of you.

### **Can Four**

Head right from the start and turn left near the position of the fourth bum and you





should see the can hanging high between two ramps ahead. Simply transfer from ramp to ramp to get it.

### **Can Five**

Head down the steps to where you ollied the second bum and get some air off the quarter-pipe there. If you go high enough you'll grab the can.

### Goal Seven Tailslide Venice Ledge Reward – \$1,000

Head across the main table area to the quarter-pipe that's outside the area where you ollied the second bum. Now launch over this ramp (with A) and tailslide the ledge that runs down the left side of the steps (facing down). To do a tailslide, press Right + Y.

# Goal Eight Hit Four VB Transfers Reward \$1,500

### **Transfer One**

Head to the side area where the first bum was and ride the two quarter-pipes to get some speed up. Now transfer from the ramp nearest the bum to the ramp on the other side of the way (away from the sleeping tramp).

### **Transfer Two**

Head right from the start and then left, past where the fourth bum was, and skate up to the far end. Get some speed up on the large quarter-pipe on the left and head up the ramp immediately facing it. Jump right to transfer over to the ramp on the other side of the roof.

### **Transfer Three**

Head right from the start of the run and down to the end of the area. There are three ramps in succession along the wall – two large ramps and a thin quarter-pipe in the middle. Now transfer from one of the large quarter-pipes over the thin one and land on the ramp on the other side – you'll need plenty of speed to be able to make this.

### **Transfer Four**

Head towards the Venice Ledge where the second bum is, and head up the ramp and into the secret area. Now transfer from the quarterpipe on the right, up and over the wall to the ramp on the other side.

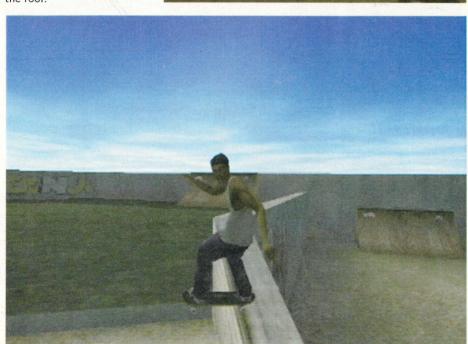
# Goal Nine Find the Secret Tape Reward \$1,250

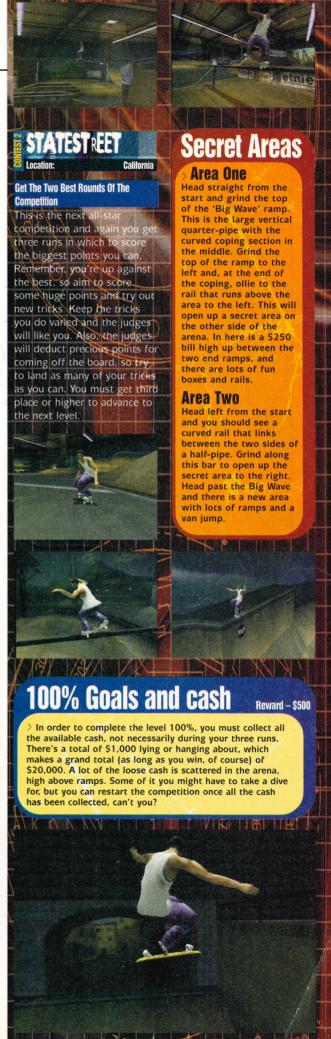
You can see the tape floating in the air above the main table area. Ride up to the long quarter-pipe near the second bum location and go over onto the roof (press A). On the roof, go right and then turn around to get a run-up. Now launch off the vent ramp at the other end to land on the taller roof. Use the quarter-pipe that the T was on to gain speed and launch off the small ramp nearest to the tape. If you get enough speed and air, you'll grab it.

### Goal Ten 100% Goals And Cash Reward – \$500

There's tons of cash to grab all around the level. Some of it's on the outside railings and there's even three \$250 notes to grab – these are up high above statues, ramps and poles. There's a total of \$1,400 in spare change, so look hard. Once all cash and goals have been collected and completed, you'll get more cash and complete the level 100%.

# **Secret Areas**

> There are actually two secret areas as such, but the second is small with no extras. To open up the skatepark that's found along the left side of the level (in relation to the starting position) you'll need to build up some speed. On the far side of the level to the start, head left and grind up the balcony railings and onto the telephone wire that's attached. You need to grind up the wire until it snaps, sending the telegraph poles crashing through the fences next to the road. Enter the gaps into the skatepark

### **Letter Locations**

SHead to the right of the start and ride along the large ledge to the right of the fountain. Grind along the low wall on the left and ollie out of the end to grab the S.

The K is on the blue Nawning near the third bell. Get some good speed up and grind/slide the awning in order to get the letter.

From the start, head Atowards the fountain round the left side. In front of you will be a raised grass section. There you'll see the A just in front of it.

The T is hanging just out from the walkway that you ride up to open the skatepark. It's on the left of the level. Get some speed up on the quarterpipe opposite the fountain ramp and turn



right. Head up the walkway and jump the railings.

The E is in mid-air to the right of the fourth bell. Roll down the pavement and ollie onto the last section of grass. From here, ollie out into the road to grab the last letter.

### **Goal Five Drain The Fountain Reward \$2,500**

Now this is a very tough one. From the start you won't have enough speed to make the jump, so do a quick heel/kickflip grind on the rail to the right and then quickly do another grind - make sure all the grinds are preceded with a flip trick like a heelflip. Once off the bar, you should have enough momentum to make the gap. Launch over the green ramps (the world's most obvious gap) where the first bell was. Then, immediately after, grind down the handrail, down the steps and (using a Boneless: Up, Up + A) launch from the small



planter at the bottom. Hopefully you'll fly over the railings and land on the balcony above. Here, hit the valve to drain the fountain.

### **Goal Six Collect Five Bells Reward \$2,000**

Head directly right from the start and use the green launch ramp to grab the first bell.

### **Bell Two**

After grabbing the first bell, head down the large, wide steps and head left. The bell is hanging against the white wall, but if you ollie you can grab it.

### **Bell Three**

There's a bell hanging near the awning that the K is on. Use one of the bumps to reach it.

### **Bell Four**

Head slightly left at the start and launch over the ramp set-up. Continue down the pavement and slide/grind the wall to the left and grab the bell on the wall.





This is to the right of the fourth bell. Head over the ramp as you did for the fourth Bell, but ollie onto the raised grass section on the right of the pavement. The bell is at the far end on the right.

### **Bluntslide The Awning** Goal Seven **Reward - \$2,000**

The awning in question is the large blue awning at the back of the level - it had the letter K on it. Get as much speed up as you can and head for the little bump ramp that you used to get the K and the third bell. When you reach the awning, providing you've got enough speed up, press Down, Down +Y to bluntslide.

### **Goal Eight** Liptrick 4 Skatepark Lips Reward - \$2,500

Once the skatepark is open (see the Secret Areas box) head inside and perform a liptrick on the bowl closest to the street. Try any direction



and Y to liptrick the top. Remember though, you must approach the bowl/ramp dead straight otherwise you'll grind. Do a liptrick on the bowl at the opposite end of the skatepark, the bowl with the \$250 hanging above it, and the half-pipe behind that near the blue humps.

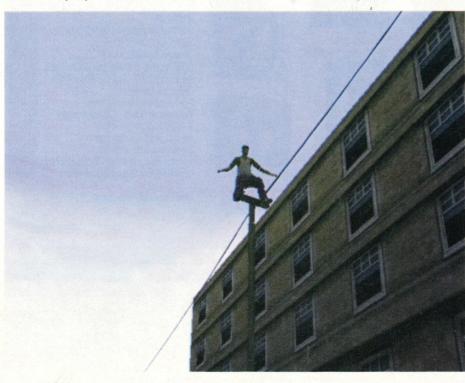
### **Find The Secret Tape Goal Nine Reward \$2,000**

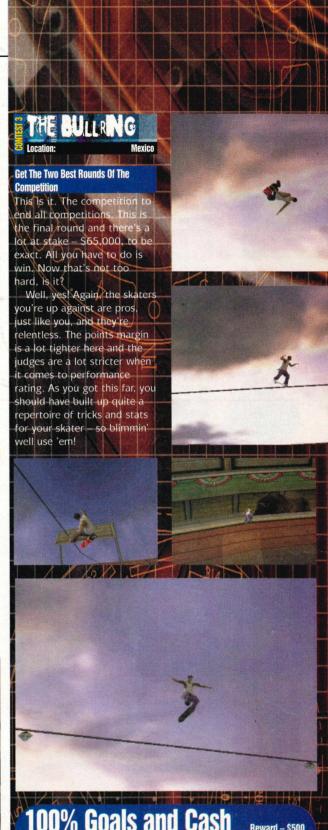
The Secret Tape is on a long, long line that runs across the level from left to right. You can't ride down the line and let gravity take control - oh no! Instead you'll need a huge boost of speed. The planter in front of the line, which is very near to the fourth bell and

runs up to the valve balcony, can be used to get some speed up. Grind it and, while on the line, continue to ollie or heelflip and grind to maintain momentum up the slope.

### 100% Goals And Cash Reward - \$500

There's a whopping \$2,000 in loose notes to snatch here. There's loads on the line that you need to travel up for the tape. Grab all the dosh in the skatepark, plus the money in and around the main precinct. Once all the cash has been collected and all goals met, you can then have another \$500 for your troubles - and the thought that Philadelphia is all done.





In order to complete the level 100%, you must collect all the available cash during (or not during) your three runs. It might be an idea to practise a few times. This will let you get to grips with the terrain and learn where all the ramps, rails, bowls and bumps are. Also, you'll be able to go for the cash that's littered about without worrying about winning the competition.

There's a total of \$2,500 lying (or hanging) about in hard and papery currency, just for you. Check out the rail that runs above the whole arena. There's loads of cash on the ramps too. Once this and all the other goals in all the other levels are done, you can then sit back, relax and start playing all over again! You'll also open up one of the game's many secrets, depending on how many times you've completed the game already.

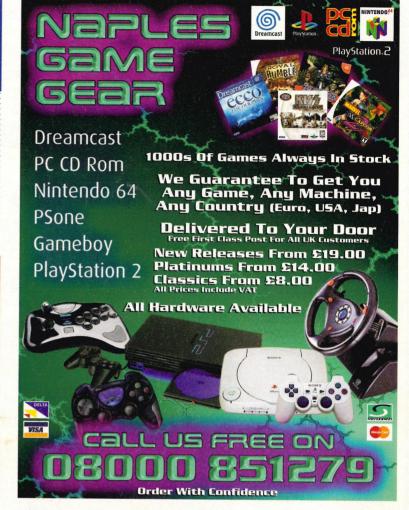

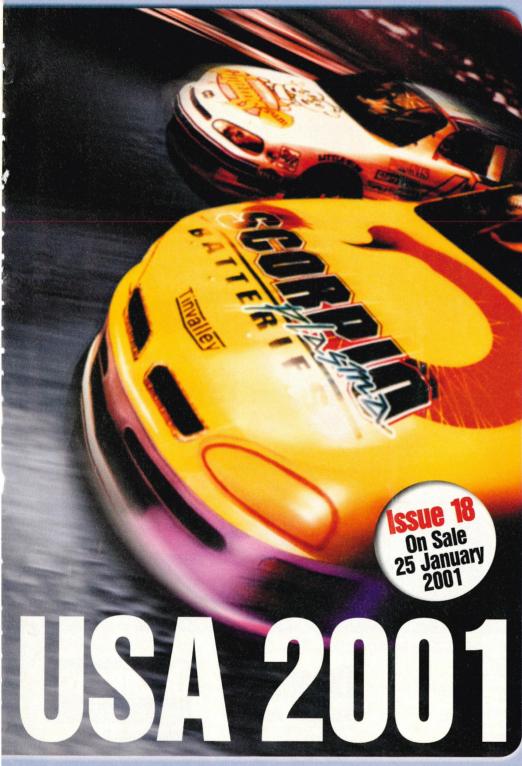
