# TOP TIPS

Fighting fires isn't easy, so here are some tips

In the game you are partially immune to the flames, so you can run through patches of fire to get to the survivors. However, red flames will severely damage your health, so avoid them! If you do catch on fire, shake the left stick to put it out.

Your hose has two nozzles; one creates a direct beam of water, the other sprays water everywhere. Stick to using the direct nozzle,

because it's easier and quicker to control. Hit (a) to use the Impulse hose (a quick burst of high-pressure H<sub>2</sub>0) for some extreme firefighting action.

Sometimes the smoke and fire fills the screen so much it'll hypnotise you into thinking no one's there. Wrong! Pay attention to your radar! Survivors are green dots radiating with fear. Hurry!

Last issue, we controversially came out in favour of the censors' decision to ban Manhunt 2. Many of you didn't agree with us. Now veteran games journalist Martin Kitts, one of only a few people who've played the game, offers his own opinion.

Are you capable of choosing your own forms of entertainment? Perhaps you believe you are experienced enough to distinguish between something you will find distasteful and something you will enjoy watching, reading or playing. Perhaps you believe you have the maturity and intelligence to cope with the poorer decisions you may take. Perhaps you believe you are a responsible adult.

But your self-confidence is irrelevant. The BBFC's banning of Manhunt 2 is an unequivocal statement: on this issue, you are incapable of making your own decision. Whether or not you actually wanted to play the game, the ban sets an unwelcome precedent that affects us all, and can only further the demonisation of the art form.

The mainstream media does not yet understand videogames. And when an organisation as well-respected as the BBFC rules that a game is simply too dangerous to play, it only serves to reinforce a stereotype.

The fact that a censor has had to step in and tell us 'enough is enough' means they were right about Grand Theft Auto; they were right about Doom; there really is an industry that trains children to become killers.

In the early 1980s, a number of low-budget horror films were banned as 'video nasties'. The justification for locking them away was much the same as it is now for Manhunt 2.

Being a more mature art form, cinema suffered little long-term harm from that short-lived witch-hunt. Some of those films were re-released uncut and are regarded as classics of their now-legitimate genre.

Those who blanched at Sam Raimi's The Evil Dead would run screaming from today's 15-rated slasher flicks. But has society become so morally bankrupt that images once thought capable of corrupting anyone who saw them are now acceptable entertainment for teenagers? Or were the censors simply wrong?

The Manhunt 2 ban is celebrated by people who do not appreciate that videogames are poised on the threshold of something spectacular, as film was at this stage of its evolution. To say that this fledgling medium can be a menace, rather than educate parents on the importance of age ratings, is sadly misguided.

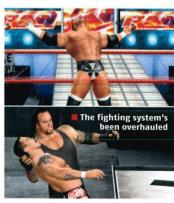

Konami is working to get as many of the next-gen innovations like this into the PS2 version as well. That means a load of new skills and moves should be available, as well as a host of improved tactical options.

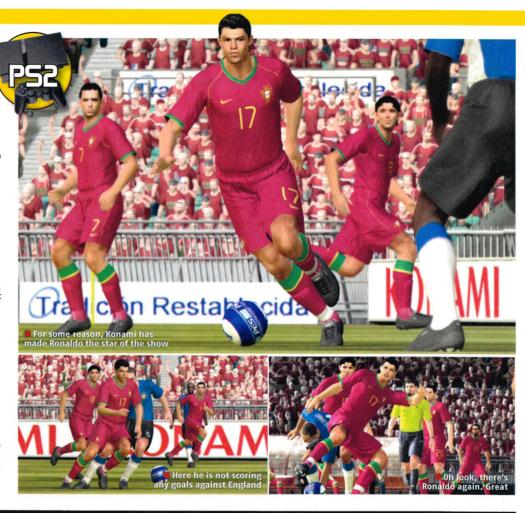

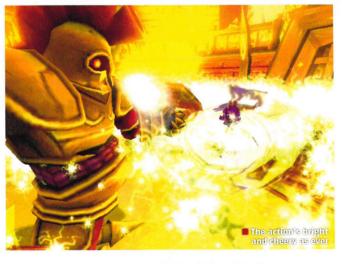

## Sights set for success

E3 was awash with first-person shooters, almost too many to keep track of. However. there was one particular FPS that means a great deal to a lot of folks: Killzone 2.

In 2005, when the PS3 was all speculation and endless potential, the trailer for Killzone 2 was unveiled as a demonstration of just what the new box of tricks would be capable of.

Two years later and the gaming world has evolved massively, but Killzone 2 is still held up as the FPS poster boy for PS3.

It's rare for an E3 game trailer to be placed under really intense scrutiny but the 2007 Killzone footage (which was in-game) was subject to analysis bordering on the forensic: does the lighting look as good as the CG demo? Are the characters as detailed? Can it manage the same graphical effects that we

were promised way back when?
Such investigation seems harsh, but shows how much people want Killzone 2 to be good. And is it? Well, from what we've seen, it

looks fantastic. The ominous setting (if rather typically dark) comes courtesy of your new battleground: the Helghast homeworld, Helghan. This hostile planet will be as much of an adversary for you and your ISA Special





Forces squad as are the Helghast themselves. Which says a lot, considering the sophisticated Al of your enemies.

Killzone 2 promises environments that are not only destructible but respond dynamically to the planet's conditions - something to which your Helghast enemies have adapted so that it now works in their favour.

This huge disadvantage to you makes it all the more satisfying when you fill the red-eyed creeps with lead and watch their bodies dance as the bullets hit.

It's not all uphill, though. A sophisticated cover system lets you hide behind bulletpocked walls and pillars before popping out to shoot at the oncoming hordes.

But don't cower for too long, because from what we've seen the scenery is deformable, so you'll soon find yourself horribly exposed.

There's still plenty of time for other FPS titles potentially to take off some of the shine. But right now, Killzone 2 is rightly anticipated as the hottest shooter for PS3.

For people with disabilities, playing PS2 can be difficult or even impossible. But from adapted controllers to sight and sound mods, the technology is out there to make gaming more accessible



Daniel is crazy about PlayStation. But because he's paralysed from the neck down, he can't use the DualShock controller. His mum, Gillian, says that

after the traffic accident that left Daniel disabled, the only way he could enjoy his favourite games was watching his friends play them.

He's just one of many people with disabilities who find that videogames and consoles simply aren't accessible to them.

That could be because they have coordination or dexterity issues that make it difficult to use a joystick

or small buttons; or it may be that they are partially sighted, blind or deaf and so can't see or hear what's going on in a game.

There are nine million people in the UK aged 16 and over who have disabilities of some kind, and for those who love gaming it's devastating to be unable to join in the fun that everyone else takes for granted.

# demand and dollars

Developers tend to focus on the far bigger market of able-bodied people for financial reasons. "It's not malicious," says Reid Kimball, a game designer who is deaf. "Some may say, 'we can't justify development dollars spent on making our games more accessible' but it's not because they are mean-spirited.

"They're trying to balance greater demand from players for next-generation gameplay, graphics, Al and physics and so on. When push comes to shove, accessibility features, which aren't as sexy as graphics, often get pushed off the schedule."

However, a disability doesn't necessarily mean you have to give up gaming. Hardware and software solutions are available and over the next five pages we'll look at some of them and what they do.

# dexterity

f you have little or no control over your limbs because you're paralysed, for example, or have muscular dystrophy, tasks such as holding a PS2 controller can be impossible, let alone moving the joystick or rapidly pressing the buttons.

However, there is hardware available that adapts the



controller to make it possible to use. The Dream-Gamer is one such device. It's a cap fitted with motion sensors that detect the movements of the wearer's head.

The system was invented by Mark Heath and Dr Michael Taylor for six-year-old Daniel, who is paralysed from the neck down, after they were approached by his mum Gillian last year via the Round Table charity.

# hat's entertainment

It was originally designed for Daniel to use with his radio-controlled car, but after Gillian told the makers how much he loved PlayStation, they adapted it to be used with the PS1 and PS2 in conjunction with their controller pads.

Michael explains: "We take the standard controller and connect four motion sensors to the left joystick. We also make a connection to the 😵 button.

"So far we have mounted the motion sensors into a baseball cap because we originally designed the concept for Daniel, and Daniel could only move his head.

"But other people may have different requirements and, if we are asked to, we will build the control gear



into a glove, or shoe, or anything else the user finds comfortable to use.

"Although Dream-Gamer is an adapted controller, the changes we make do not prevent [the DualShock] from being used as a normal controller by anyone else. •

# switchcraft

Inventor Barrie Ellis has worked with severely disabled people for 10 years. He says it is easy to make videogames more accessible by simply adapting existing hardware to work with 'one-switch interfaces'.

OPS2: How do one-switch interfaces work?
Barrie: If you're unable to hold a standard controller, but can perhaps use your he and feet to play, being able to split controls and put them where you need them makes a big difference. Switch interfaces do this in a versatile way.

It's possible to connect very specialised controls, such as large external switches and movement sensors, to computers and other electrical devices for ease of use.

My switch-adapted Namco Arcade Stick can be used in this way when connected to a PlayStation. It's especially useful to gamers who find a DualShock controller difficult or impossible to play with because it allows them to play in many different ways with different parts of the body.

OPS2: How successfully do they work with PS2 games?
Barrie: Switch interfaces can work brilliantly with videogames for
many gamers, especially those that can deal with quite a few buttons
or are happy to game as a team effort.

A number of games work very well, such as Everybody's Golf,
Destruction Derby and Um Jammer Lammy. There could be many more
with a few extra menu options considered from the initial design.

# OPS2: Is it actually feasible to develop games with one-switch

"Our adapted controller does have limitations. We are not able to duplicate in head movements the complex, multi-button operations demanded by many games. But two individuals can play with the same controller. One, say the person with the disability, could control the up-down/left-right movement and perhaps the fire button.

"At the same time, the able-bodied person could be controlling the more complex button pressing on the same controller to change equipment or whatever. The beauty of this is that two people could play together – both being involved in the experience."

# the lip fantastic

The Quad Controller is a mouth-operated device designed by aerospace engineer Ken Yankelevitz after he was approached by Atari in 1981, and it lets physically disabled gamers to 'be on an equal playing field with their friends', as Ken puts it.

It incorporates sip/puff switches that control all 12 buttons on a PS2 DualShock pad. Mounted on a wheelchair or table, it has one mouthpiece that operates a joystick, which in turn can be toggled to control the directional pad, the left joystick or the right joystick. Lip switches also allow the use of the 'push down on the thumbsticks' functions.

Ken has built more than 400 of these controllers, each designed to meet a person's individual requirements. Feedback for this invention has been incredibly positive, with gamers such as Robert Florio, who's been paralysed since a diving accident aged 14,



heralding the Quad Controller as something that allows gamers to "control almost every aspect of the game".

"Games are extremely important to disabled people," Robert says in an interview on the Washington Post's website, www.washingtonpost.com. "Gaming becomes something you can do by yourself again.

"You feel like you're interacting in a world in a way that you lost interaction in the real world."

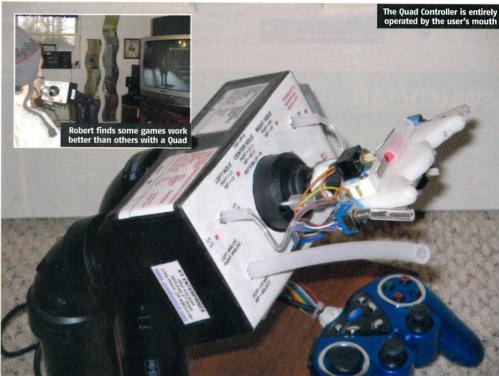

"Accessibility shouldn't be a foreign word," Robert says on his own website, "something to be screeched in the ears of developers who are not physically challenged or impaired in any way, keeping people from playing their favorite games. It certainly isn't stopping me and my friends."

sight to find it challenging. Conditions such as glaucoma or being colour blind can affect gamers, too, making it difficult to solve colour-based puzzles, for example.

### sound stuff

Unfortunately, there aren't many console-based solutions for visually impaired gamers, beyond webgames that have been tailored to focus more on audio features than on visual ones.

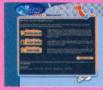
Some games do have extensive auditory feedback that makes them more playable; mostly beat-'em-ups and RPGs. But even then, menus are often lacking in auditory information, which would leave partially sighted gamers struggling to set up a level.

Obviously, the extent of your impairment will determine what games you can play. But hopefully our suggestions, gleaned from information and comments on websites and forums covering this issue, will help.

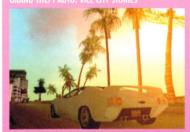

# hearing

eople who don't have hearing difficulties often underestimate just how much we respond to audio cues when we're playing videogames, and how important they are.

In racing games we listen to the changing pitch of the engine to judge our speed. In shooters the sound of bullets zinging over our heads helps us pinpoint where the enemy is. In rhythm-action games it takes a combination of watching onscreen cues and 'feeling' the music to pull off a successful track.

Even when games are captioned, it can be confusing to know who's saying what if the dialogue isn't clearly associated with each speaker.

One solution is the incorporation of closed captions, like the ones you've probably seen on TV. They not only

write out the dialogue, but describe sound effects and music as well.

Half-Life 2 is one iconic game that uses closed captions. After the first instalment was released, Marc Laidlaw of developer Valve Software received complaints from deaf gamers that this much-anticipated game was completely incomprehensible for them.

So Marc used closed captions in the sequel, and found that "the expense was very small and there was no negative aspect".

### if the caption fits

In America, games designer and captioner Reid Kimball creates mods for current games. Reid, who developed severe hearing loss after having spinal meningitis when



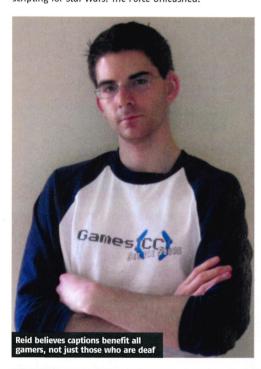


he was a baby, has had most success with a mod for the classic PC game Doom 3 (download the mod for free at gamescc.rbkdesign.com).

It not only provides closed captions for the entire game, but uses a Visual Sound Radar that represents where sounds are coming from in relation to the character you're playing.

Reid is now working with programmers to create middleware software that can be licensed to developers so they can put closed captioning into their games.

All that, and he works full-time for LucasArts, currently designing levels and gameplay systems and scripting for Star Wars: The Force Unleashed.



### OPS2: Are closed captions enough by themselves to help a person with hearing disabilities play a game?

Reid: Yes, closed captioning is the primary accessibility feature that hard of hearing or deaf players need so they can enjoy the games better.

Someone who can't hear misses out on the important sounds - an enemy walking up behind them, for example, a telltale sound that signals the launch of a powerful enemy attack or an NPC giving the player an objective

So long as that information is presented in a visual way, then those who can't hear have access to the information they need.

Other ways to show visually different sounds are icons, comic book-like words or a Visual Sound Radar.

### OPS2: Is it difficult to put closed captions in a game?

Reid: It isn't difficult at all when you think about the usual engineering challenges that programmers tackle in game development.

Problems such as artificial intelligence, graphics rendering or physics simulation often require teams of well-paid programmers working on these problems for at least a year.

With closed captioning, a small investment from a developer – usually one programmer, full-time for a few months - can create a complete closed captioning system that can be used for all future games with little rewrite involved per project, if any at all.

The real trick is the data entry of all the captions for dialogue, sound effects and music.

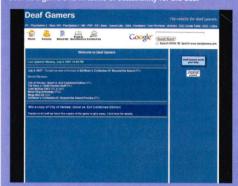
### OPS2: Are there any other methods to help gamers with hearing disabilities?

Reid: Using the rumble functionality of game controllers is better than nothing and I do recommend using both to reinforce and strengthen the presence of sound.

However, rumbling does lose some fidelity. How do you make a vibration feel like a normal footstep approaching from behind, compared with a thunderous footstep from a giant boss monster that's around the

corner? It's also open to interpretation and misunderstanding from the players.

### OPS2: Does the gaming industry cater sufficiently for its customers with disabilities?

Reid: Sadly, no. I also firmly believe that making games more accessible isn't only for the disabled.

People tell me all the time that although they have normal hearing, they still like to use captions in games because sometimes the voice acting is poor and hard to understand, or their children go to bed early and they need to turn the sound off. Accessibility features make games better for everyone.

As developers, we're entertainers and our job is to make an entertaining experience, first and foremost. Not adding accessibility features to our games is completely ignoring our responsibilities as entertainers.

After we ensure that our games are accessible to everyone, then let's go back to trying to push more and more polygons on the screen. After all, why do all that work if someone can't enjoy it? Kim Richards

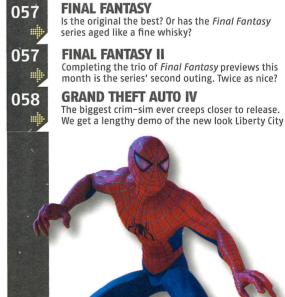

# **NEED FOR SPEED PROSTREET**

THIS YEAR, NEED FOR SPEED IS GOING ROUND IN CIRCLES



The top racing game designers seem to have more spies in each other's paddocks than the average Formula 1 team (allegedly speaking, of course). Let's consider the evidence.

Burnout Paradise has an open-world map like the ones in Need For Speed. Colin McRae DiRT has suddenly turned ol' Colin into a multi-disciplined master. And even that immovable stalwart Gran Turismo is considering making the leap into the 21st Century by implementing crash damage as a downloadable extra.

Take your eye off the grid for a second and you'll need a 15-minute PowerPoint presentation just to remind you which racer is which. So, thank goodness for *Need For Speed*, eh? Good old reliable *Need For Speed*. You know where you are with *Need For Speed*. So much so, in fact, that we decided to write the preview for this game back in October 2006.

"The follow-up to 2006's Need For Speed Carbon," we began, "is an evolution rather than a revolution for the series. A few new gameplay modes and gimmicks can't hide that this is the same solid, if unspectacular, dose of moodylicious street-racing that it's always been. If you thought the previous Need For Speeds were alright, you'll think this is alright!"

But then we played it and we had to start writing all over again. For *ProStreet* couldn't be more different from the last few *Need For Speed* games if its star was a smiling sunflower named Boris (don't worry, it's not).

First, the open-world map has done one. Out in the real world, North American cops have started to take street racing very seriously; in fact, in Canada, it's a felony. The response has been attempts to legitimise the 'sport' in the way skate parks legitimised skateboarding.

Professional racetracks now do open days where the racers meet up, organise their own events and drive like loonies around the closed circuits. *ProStreet*, then, breaks with *NFS* tradition by offering up a worldwide tour of real-world circuits. Mind you, a few 'liberties' have been taken with their layout for gameplay reasons.

### POETRY IN PRO'S

Your goal at these circuits is fairly straightforward and familiar. You compete in multiple events, all of which should be recognisable to *NFS* veterans. Drag races, speed traps, standardised racing: they're all back, but this time the structure's a little different.

You tackle a string of disciplines in any given event, with points accumulating until you overtake a certain points threshold and win the event. Dominate the proceedings and you'll unlock new parts for your car.

Naturally, the police aren't going to follow you out onto the track, but in spite of this, driving is tenser than ever. The reason for our ghostly-white complexions and shaky hands? None other than the addition of something that, apparently, has been *NFS* fans' most-requested feature for years: crash damage.

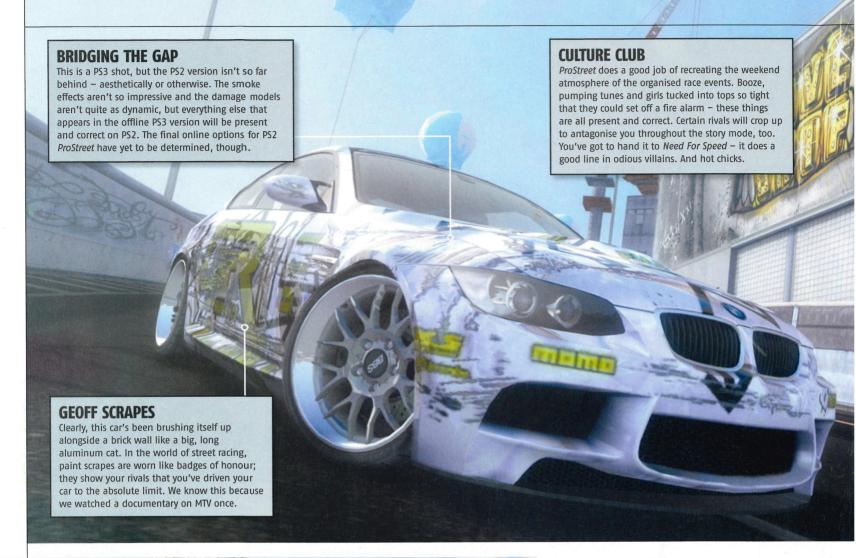
We don't mean a few arbitrary dents when you smack into a roadside cactus. No sirree Bob. We're talking serious carnage.

Smash into a wall at high speed, and that's the end of your race. Indeed, that's it for that particular car, at least for the duration of the racing weekend, so careless

But if you can't tell your ballast from your elbow, then don't panic; there are enough preset options to ensure that you'll be adequately competitive without ever having to tinker with your motor's insides.

Of course, if you do tinker, you'd better do it right, because one of the main areas in which developer EA Black Box has invested its research (and development on *ProStreet* began long before *Carbon* was finished) is ensuring that every little tweak has a tangible effect on the

physics of your car.

Carbon's autosculpting is back, but you might want to resist the temptation to bolt a gigantic spoiler onto the back of your Peugeot 106 this time around because the

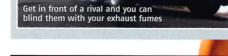


tweaks you make in this mode will be affected by wind resistance. And that means often subtle but sometimes dramatic changes in your car's handling.

The physics have been rewritten from scratch to allow for more variables, you see; it still retains the same loose, eel-on-a-skateboard, slippy-slidey feel, but each modification has very real consequences.

Mention the word 'simulation' to EA Black Box and their faces shrivel up in the way that normally only watermelon-flavoured Jolly Ranchers are able to induce.

They say that it's a dirty word that carries baggage; the likes of *Gran Turismo* are often more toil than play. But it's a comparison you can't help but make when playing *NFS ProStreet*. The difference is that 'playing' is the key word there; at the end of the day, *NFS*'s arcade roots still sparkle brightly enough to prevent *ProStreet* from feeling like hard work. **Alex Dale**

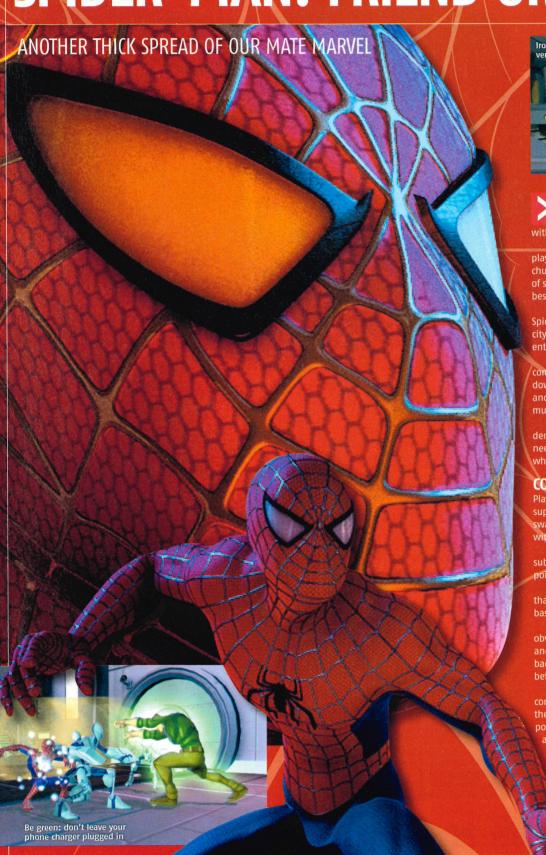

# SPIDER-MAN: FRIEND OR FOE





Spider-Man: you've had the ropey, teen-aimed game based on the last teen-aimed movie. Now here's something far more basic, yet social, and with a refreshingly tight structure.

It's going to be a bit like running around a school playground with your T-shirt pulled up over your head, chucking unravelling balls of wool at a scattering swarm of shrieking infants: what we mean is, it'll be something best not tried as an adult.

No, *Friend or Foe* is all about letting the younger Spider-fans, who'd find the fast combos and sprawling city of the movie-licensed games too tricky, have an entry-level interaction with the franchise.

It's an action-packed arcade brawler with minimal complications. The wee ones aren't going to get beaten down by overly intricate controls or slammed by tenuous and confusing links to an already cumbersome and muddled film. Lucky them.

Instead, publisher Activision scanned society with its demographic-detecting telescope and found that what it needs to provide is a simple, two-player beat-'em-up in which a kiddie-style Spidey fights kiddie-style villains.

### **COMMONSENSES TINGLING**

Players can swap between characters mid-battle and any super-villain defeated joins the available roster of swappable sidekicks. It's kind of like *Lego Star Wars* but with more fighting and less Jedi block shuffling.

You bound from area to area beating enemies to submission with simple combos and co-op slaps, earning points to upgrade moves. Rinse and repeat.

The drop-in, drop-out gameplay is so non-punishing that it can often make progression a given once you start bashing buttons.

That and the cartoony look of the graphics make it obvious that this is a title aimed directly at the young and especially the young who don't want to feel they're bad at videogames. Or, indeed, feel like they have to get better or enjoy the 'Easy' option hidden in a menu.

Activision claims that anyone of any skill level can complete areas of *Friend or Foe* the moment they pick up the pad. Its target market will probably see that as a positive thing, but it'll make things pretty boring for anyone with any more gaming skill.

Thankfully the quality of the cutscenes and inclusion of 13 playable sidekicks should not be ignored by those with a kitsch eye for Marvel's golden boy and a gaming skill higher than zero.

And the story that makes all this friendship and ass-kickery reasonable? Well, it's guaranteed to involve something

forcing him to team up with vanquished villans and equally skilled superheroes (see 'Supporting Cast', right).

### **JUVENILE JUSTICE**

The exact nature of the game's all-explaining narrative is currently sealed by tight lips and tighter non-disclosure agreements, but it has been confirmed that members of SHIELD are involved.

Whatever questions the exact details of the tale may throw up you know that the answer is going to be two small children trying to be first to hit a short sequence of





buttons while laughing at a TV screen. This is a beautiful image, and one we have some faith in because Friend or Foe is being developed by Canada's Next Level Games.

The studio has already made ice hockey acceptably accessible for a wider, and therefore younger, audience with NHL Hitz Pro. It also, more recently, developed Mario Strikers: Charged Football for the Wii (which, we understand, some people might enjoy).

If anyone can make a simple, decent and enjoyable Spider-Man fighting game then Next Level is certainly more suited to the job than most. It's also arguably more worthy of your trust than Treyarch, the team behind the squashed arachnid of a game that was Spider-Man 3.

### KEEP IT IN THE FAMILY

Next Level won't, however, be adding online multiplayer. Ironically, according to Activision, this is to make the game more accessible. That's accessible in a 'fewer options' kind of way rather than a 'far greater number of potential second players and more opportunities to play the game with people who don't live in your house' kind of way, then.

But seeing as PS2 online is a foul mess of passwords and DNAS screens, we're not sad to hear the game won't be going global. In fact, Friend or Foe sounds like a great game all round – if, that is, you can fit into a Spider-Man outfit bought from Woolworths.

### MOVE OVER POTTER, LILLET BLAN'S IN TOWN

It's been a long while since a real-time strategy game has graced the PS2. It's an often-misunderstood genre. But the gorgeous design and quirky Japanese nature of GrimGrimoire could redefine the RTS as we know it.

It's set in a prestigious school for witches and wizards, where star pupil Lillet Blan keeps time-travelling back to the first day of term. She must take control of magical creatures ('familiars') to find out why.

Levels are covered in the Fog of War, and you must quickly build up your defences and troops, as well as amassing Resource Creatures to collect Mana from captured crystals.

If you're a fan of Age of Empires or the Dungeon Keeper series, you'll feel right at home here.

### A KIND OF MAGIC

There are four categories of magic, each of which has its own set of advantages and disadvantages, and each category has three grimoires to unlock.

Grimoires create summoning Runes, which are used to create structures and summon familiars. Level up the Runes, and you'll unlock more powerful creatures or upgrade the ones you have.

The types of magic are Alchemy (mechanical monsters), Glamour (elves and fairies), Sorcery (demons and dragons) and Necromancy (ghosties). From the word go, you have to suss out what grimoire your opponent is using and counter it with opposing magic.

For example, if the enemy is using Necromancy, that involves ghosts, which are immune to physical attacks.

So sending in a bunch of fairies armed with bows and arrows would be pointless. Create a dragon using Sorcery, however, and the ghosts are toast. You can place Runes wherever you want, but it's best to keep them well defended with troops or Guardian structures that fire projectiles at anyone in the vicinity.

### THINKING TACTICAL

Enemy AI is refreshingly intelligent and will take advantage of any weaknesses you have. And the whole thing drips with colour and gorgeous artwork.

The creatures are cute and menacing at the same time, and the battles are incredibly stimulating and engaging.

If minor changes could be made, such as implementing an easier grouping system or a 'jump to' shortcut, it could be a champion of the RTS genre. Kim Richards

### GUESS THEY SHOULD HAVE CALLED THE FIRST GAME 'PENULTIMATE NINJA'

Take a mega-popular anime. Make a game based on it. Make millions. Repeat. It's a formula that rarely lends itself to a final product of sterling quality, due mostly to the easily met expectations of fans.

They want to play as their favourite character, levelling him up a bit along the way but mostly punching people. Naruto: Uzumaki Chronicles, released in July, took the

multi-million-pound franchise along this fairly dull route, with a few roleplaying elements added on to temper the monotony.

Those of us who'd played the previous Naruto game, Ultimate Ninja, felt sorely let down, since it had been an exception to the norm of standardised beat-'em-ups.

Where in Chronicles was the highly explosive, over-the-top jutsu? Where were all the characters? Why did the game feel like a patronising attempt to win new fans for the series? Why couldn't we just have Ultimate Ninja 2 instead?



Well, here it is, released in the UK after being available in Japan since 2004. It doesn't feature the nigh-on 60





latest TV series, but at 32 characters Ultimate Ninja 2 offers a fair bit of choice. The game also has RPG elements, allowing

you to upgrade characters' abilities as you go. However, the best new feature of UN2 has to be Ultimate Road mode. It takes you through a sweeping story comprising pivotal moments from the animated series, then branches off into an original plot unique to the game. In short, if you know nada about Naruto, you

# FINAL FANTASY TACTICS: THE WAR OF THE LIONS

### THE BEST PS1 RPG YOU NEVER PLAYED GETS A PINT-SIZED PORT

If you never played *Final Fantasy Tactics* when it came out on PS1 in 1998 (and given that it was never released in Europe, you're unlikely to have done) you missed out on one of the defining roleplaying games of the past decade. In fact, unless you're an obsessive importer or dabble in a bit of super-illegal PC emulation, you may never have even heard of it.

Well, although it lacks a comforting Roman numeral nailed to its name, *Tactics* is one of the best *Final Fantasy* games ever made.

But dry those tears. Uncle Square Enix is here, and in an act of supreme benevolence (or a cunning cash–grab, depending on your view), has brought *FF Tactics* to PSP as part of the Ivalice Alliance project.

Ivalice? If that name sounds familiar, that's because it was the setting for the most recent PS2 instalment in the series *Final Fantasy XII*. Both games were brought to life care of legendary Square artist Akihiko Yoshida.

Tactics was the first FF to feature Ivalice, although the events take place thousands of years after FFXII's story concludes, with society having regressed from FFXII's techno-savvy culture to a more feudal society.

### TRAIN STORM

The plot behind *Tactics* is rather Shakespearean, and is viewed by some fans as utterly engrossing, by others as horrendously convoluted. Sadly, we don't have an extra 10 pages here to go into full detail, so suffice to say that *Tactics* places you in the shoes of a disgraced knight









called Ramza Beoulve, who is attempting to uncover the dark truths be hind the Lion War that has ravaged Ivalice.

To do this you must amass and train an army of allies and mercenaries, which is *Tactics'* chief joy. Using *FP's* classic Job System, you train troops as Black Mages, Dragoons and Summoners, and unlock more classes as they master existing ones.

Battles are turn-based affairs that take place on a rotatable iso metric battlefield and, as the title implies, require no small degree of strategy.

### THE LION'S SHARE

Of course, it wouldn't be a Square Enix re-release without a slew of new content, and *Final Fantasy Tactics: The War of the Lions* certainly doesn't disappoint in that respect.

There are now two extra classes on top of the original 20: the Onion Knight and Dark Knight, both of which will be extremely powerful in the right hands. There's a new wireless multiplayer mode (co-op and versus), too, which is a dream come true for FF fans.

Add to that some beautiful, cel-shaded anime cutscenes plus a batch of new side quests, items and characters, and it looks like this port of *Final Fantasy Tactics* could very well be the game that every RPG-lovin' PSP owner has been waiting for.

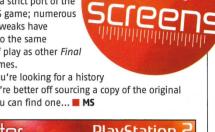

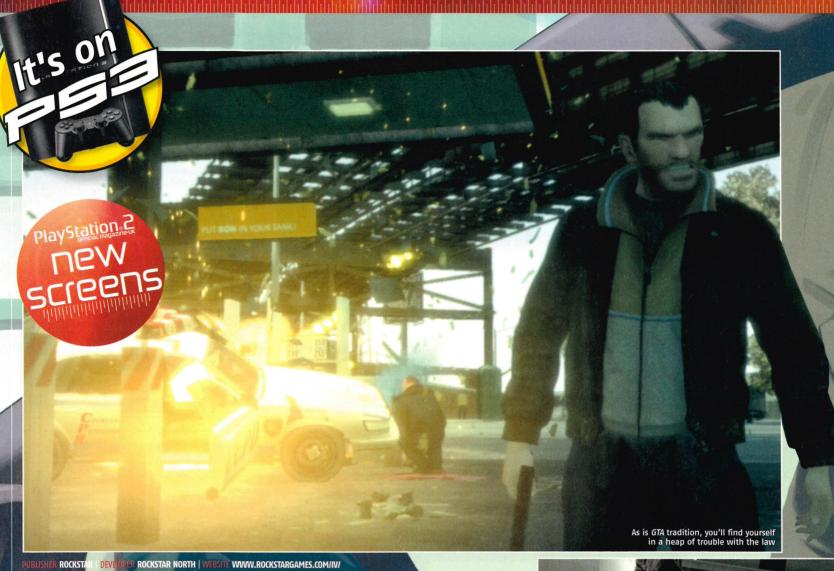

# GRAND THEFT AUTO IV

### WE SPEND AN ACTION-PACKED HOUR WITH NIKO BELLIC

The last demo of *Grand Theft Auto IV* lasted for a matter of minutes. But this time, developer Rockstar has invited us to its London office to see the hotly anticipated game in action for a full hour. So sit back, relax and we'll tell you what we saw.

The demo starts in Liberty City's version of Times Square and you only have to stand on the spot and look around to see the astonishing level of detail in the



game. The myriad signs and adverts, many touched with trademark *GTA* humour, drench the bustling streets in a neon glow.

Pedestrians mill about, coughing, sneezing, smoking, muttering. A vendor pimps his hot dogs nearby. It's not as crowded as the real Times Square, but we fail to spot the same model twice for these non-player characters, and the same goes for the cars that trundle past on roads that are themselves heavily detailed with wear and tear. Liberty City feels alive. Really alive.

### **PISTOL FASHION**

So let's walk through the main mission that we're shown. It's unclear at what point during the game it takes place; the mission timeline has yet to be finalised, but anyway, your man Niko Bellic has somehow managed to get entangled with a dodgy detective called Francis McGeary. McGeary calls Niko on his mobile (see 'The Sim-ple Life', right) and gives him orders to sort out a few sticky situations.

A troublesome lawyer at the firm Goldberg, Ligner & Shyster has some dirt on McGreary, and there's also



a guy holding him to ransom over some incriminating photos. Niko's job? Take 'em both out, of course.

And for that you'll need a piece. But no longer can you nip to the nearest Ammu-Nation; instead you'll have to make underground contacts who'll sell you their wares from the boots of cars or dank basements.

This time, Niko pays a visit to a Jamaican called Little Jacob in an empty back alley, and acquires a pistol. Only a pistol? Well, walking around Liberty City with a rocket launcher slung over your shoulder is going to attract some attention. Throughout the game, bigger weapons will have to be stashed out of sight.

We're warming to Niko Belic, the main protaganist in Rockstar's latest urban crime caper. The heroes of GTA have always had a certain charm, largely down to superior scripting and voice acting, but technology now allows Rockstar North to give their man an even more convincing and arresting personality through a wide variety of facial animations and realistic body language and movement.

Take a look at the screenshots on these pages and you'll see him looking calm, angry, a little concerned and even, occasionally, reflective.

We liked him best during a cutscene (which uses the in-game engine) when his eyes were twinkling and a cheeky grin crossed his face. But hey, we're suckers for a nice smile.



There's a plan to infiltrate the lawyer's office, and that involves Niko going for a job interview at the firm. So Niko's drawn up a fake CV and is going to make his application online.

He hails a cab to take him to the nearest internet café because, as with the carrying of heavy weaponry, breaking into cars every two minutes is likely to attract unwanted attention.

Just like New York City, on which Liberty City is based there are cabs aplenty. But unlike NYC, you can either si back and enjoy the ride or skip right to your destination.

Arriving at the internet café, we discover our first real surprise: IV has its own internet, to which you can get access from any in-game PC.

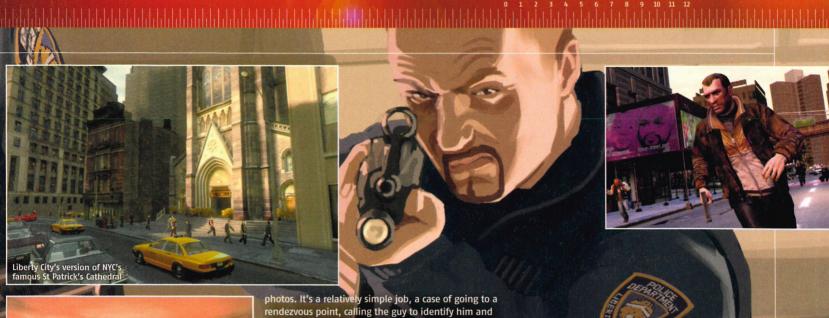

rendezvous point, calling the guy to identify him and then giving him a lead shower.

Naturally this attracts the heat, so it's time to leg it. The familiar system of 'wanted stars' is in place, but getting away from the fuzz actually seems a little easier than in previous GTA games.

When they're after you, a flashing blue and red circle indicating their search area appears on the map. Their locations are also indicated and to escape their attention you must get yourself outside of the search zone.

The search area widens the more stars you clock up, and choppers and SWAT teams are called in eventually, too. But all the same, escape seemed none too tricky, even after a protracted and bloody shootout with cops.

With the first hit completed, Niko has time on his hands to do as he pleases until the lawyers call, and there'll be plenty to occupy him. For the purposes of the demo, though, the call comes straight away and Niko is invited for an interview.

### **INSIDE STORY**

You don't turn up to an interview in jeans and a leather jacket so Niko stops by a clothes shop for suitable togs (see 'Sachs Appeal') before hailing another cab. The wuss. Then, at Goldberg, Ligner & Shyster we get our

first real taste of how GTA IV's interiors are shaping up It's the only interior environment that we see, but on this evidence they're going to be really good. The offices are large with multiple rooms and the jumpy glitchiness that characterises interiors on PS2 titles is largely absent.

Having whacked the lawyer (who just has time to splutter 'Hey, guns don't kill people, videogames kill people') before the trigger is pulled, there's an almighty gun battle with security staff before the police arrive and surround the building.

And this is where we'll leave things, because for all the talk of a new, improved auto-aim mechanic and environment-based cover system, there's no way we can tell how proficient these things are just from viewing the game. We'll wait for our chance to play it.

It may seem like a strange thing to say, but from the evidence so far, IV is very much a GTA game. What we mean is that all the trademark features that made the series such a storming success are present and correct, but even more so than before. The devil, as they say, is in the detail. NE

# 100% SPOOF

In new game **The Simpsons**, America's most famous family are seriously taking the mick...

o the phrases 'Shadow of the Colossal Donut', 'Medal of Homer' or 'Return to Castle Duffenstein' ring any bells? Yep, they're all parodies of videogames.

And they're all in the new Simpsons game, a mick-taking extravaganza with levels, characters and skills based on famous games.

And it doesn't stop there. The Simpsons become aware that they've been licensed to yet another game, and they're not happy about it.

Take typical housewife Marge, for example. She's so disgusted with violence in videogames that she takes to the streets of Springfield to recruit citizens to her cause.

Marge can influence and command people with a megaphone, as in the Nintendo game *Pikmin*; we saw her and her acolytes destroying posters advertising a scandalous bit of software called *Grand Theft Scratchy: Blood Island*.

Homer enters an eating competition called Bite Night which transforms him into a big rolling ball like something out of We V Katamari.

The more food Homer eats the longer he keeps going, and power-ups (the Insanity Pepper among them) turn him into other forms such as a fiery ball or gooey blob.

In a spoof of god sims, Lisa can summon the Hand of Buddha and move things around from an overhead viewpoint. Bart, meanwhile, gets superhero skills by transforming into Bartman.

The game's been designed for two characters and the second player can drop in and out at any time, making it perfect for co-op play.

From what we've seen, the writing is sharp and the references genuinely funny, and there's been plenty of input from the TV team (the cartoon is now showing on Sky 1, by the way).

More than 8000 lines of dialogue have been penned by the TV show's writers and creator Matt Groening even makes an appearance as a boss. He actually went into the studio so that game developer EA could record his groans and exclamations as he's taken apart by his babies.

### **FAMILY OUTING**

Visually the whole thing matches the cartoon series beautifully with a warm, animated feel that's a class above previous Simpsons outings.

There are more than 200 characters in the game, around 100 of these recognisable from the show, including Krusty, Disco Stu, Millhouse and Groundskeeper Willie.

But it's the way *The Simpsons* pokes fun at itself and other franchises that we love best.

### HOMER TRANSFORMS INTO A BIG ROLLING BALL LIKE SOMETHING OUT OF WE ♥ KATAMARI

Already we've spotted 40 or so references, from classics such as *Frogger* (at one point Bart must jump across lily pads) to *Medal of Honor*. Even game clichés such as exploding barrels and hazardous buzzsaws get thoroughly spoofed.

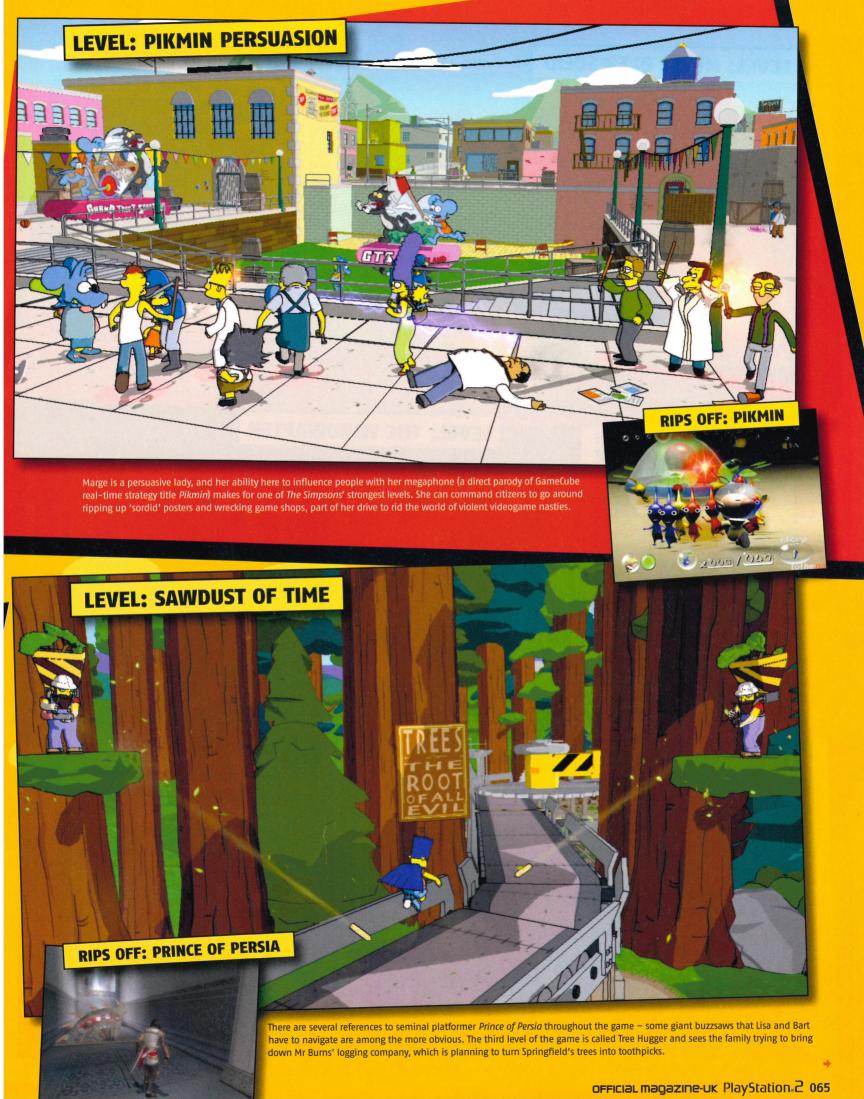


### THE SIMPSONS HIT & RUN (2003)

The Apprentice has, of course, got his lightsaber for melee attacks and will be able to string combos together, but the Force attacks

sound more intriguing. Force Lightning and Force Push will be familiar attacks for seasoned living-room Jedi. But for this game those powers have been greatly amplified (the clue's in the game's title - the Force has been, quite literally, unleashed).

Although the epic moments such as the Star Destroyer crash are 'contextualised' (we take this to mean 'in cut-scenes'), you can see from these screenshots that in-game battles are going to be epic in themselves.

Take, for example, the concept sketch that shows a pack of Rancors being ridden by Jedis. You're not going to be able to dispatch that lot with a blaster.

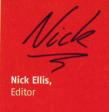

The fifth game in the much respected Syphon Filter series of stealth-'em-ups comes to PS2

Why is it that when Metal Gear Solid (arguably PlayStation's finest, best-wrought and best-written stealth series) makes the transition to PSP it turns out a bit half-cocked, but when Syphon Filter - a game that could only really be described as above average on PS2 - hits the PSP, it's declared one of the handheld's must-buy titles? In short, why did Syphon Filter work on PSP when MGS didn't?

It's that little word that's haunted the PSP since its debut two years ago: control. Metal Gear Solid: Portable Ops controlled like a dog, and

was far too complicated for its own good. But with Syphon Filter: Dark Mirror, Sony Bend managed to tame the PSP's infamous analogue nubbin, not to mention packing in a slew of features and play mechanics that had hitherto been the sole preserve of console titles.

#### **MAYBE GABEY**

Juist about everything that made Dark Mirror such a triumph on PSP is present and correct in the console version. This is a game where v make your own fun. The window dressing

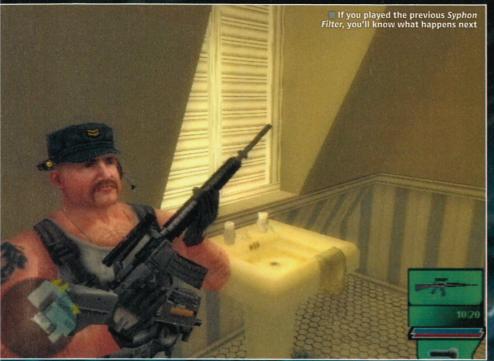

#### **SPY HARD**

You play as Gabe for the greater part of the game, although you also have the chance to take on a few missions as his partner, tactical support agent Lian Xing. They control identically, but it's good to play as the woman on the other

side of the radio for the first time.

Some missions require you to help Lian,
usually by sniping away the enemies threatening her while she completes some menial task such as hacking into a security system. It breaks up the action nicely. Other missions have you protecting an unarmed soldier; for example, one objective requires you to guide him through a

collapsing building using your torch.
As ever, it's Gabe's equipment that's the star of the show. From Tasers to zip-lines to his everfaithful sniper rifle, the guy has a gadget for every conceivable situation. The one you'll be using the most is his set of Splinter Cell-esque

goggles. As you cycle again and again through the vision modes available (see right for a rundown), you will doubtless wonder, as we did, why you have to drop into the full menu in order to do so. Splinter Cell's Sam Fisher only uses one button to cycle through his vision modes, so why can't Gabe Logan?

If, for example, you're sneaking around with your EDSU goggles on when an enemy spots you and opens fire, you surely want to switch to the headshot-friendly thermal vision immediately, rather than fiddle about with menus?

The rest of Gabe's arsenal packs in an interesting variety of arms, though you'll be relying on his fictional high-tech sniper rifle quite a lot. There's some inconsistency, however.

#### **GRENADE TO MEASURE**

Grenades only appear late in the game, after you've asked yo elf for the umpteenth time why you don' iny room-clearing grenades to hand (mind ce they're unlocked you can replay any with them equipped). Plus, you're never told that you can disarm and use enemy trip—mines, only that you should shoot them. Presumably, this stuff is held back to prevent you just exploderising your way through the game, but it's still annoying.

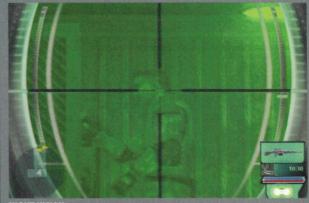

emember mud? Remember when, in years past, you'd play in it, make pies out of it, toss clumps of it at your brother's head? Well, you can't really get away with that kind of behaviour now you're older, for risk of being sectioned. So what can you do to enjoy the brown stuff?

Well, you could buy an all-terrain vehicle, join a group of like-minded mud-heads, and churn some earth around your local dirt farm.

Or you can just play the latest version of PS2's premiere mud-racing game, saving yourself tears, cash and a constantly shattered tibia.

It's not a dramatic overhauling of the series, but ATV Offroad Fury 4 certainly offers a robust amount of new content which marks this out as the best instalment so far.

What's immediately apparent is the inclusion of three vehicle types in addition to the titular



ATV. There's the lean motocross motorcycle, the road-chewing Trophy Truck and the bouncy, slip-sliding dune buggy.

Though nominally divided into two classes – heavy and light – each vehicle's handling feels unique, care of a well-implemented, if somewhat flamboyant, physics system.

#### **FIGHT DIRTY**

When you first start playing, the scoring system for each of the vehicle classes appears unfair. Although on an ATV or motorbike (the 'light' vehicles) you can only rack up points by a succession of highly dangerous stunts, playing with one of the 'heavy' vehicles will net you points just for being there.

Turn a corner: 5000 points. Take a jump: 1500 points. Turn a corner after a jump? Why, that'll be a score multiplier for you, my friend.

But with cash bonuses tied to your final score for each event, you need to spend quite some time with the heavy vehicles simply to earn the capital to upgrade your ATV and bike to a professional standard. So the whole system actually balances out quite nicely.



The AI can be a bit unforgiving in places, and seems to be rather skewed to make the game artificially difficult in its later stages.

For example, although you very rarely see any of the Al riders perform any stunts, they always seem to end each race with a monumental trick score. The muddy sods.

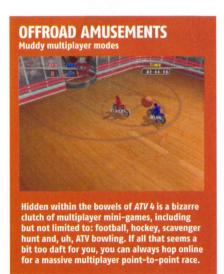

on behind the scenes in offroad racing with the help of a mysterious cabal of former riders. We kid you not.

#### **MUDDY HELL**

You have six events to choose from for each leg of your tour, though you only need complete three to unlock each region's point-to-point race and advance the story.

Considering the difficulty of the trick attack event – which typically requires you to keep a trick-chain going for around two minutes - this setup is ideal, particularly because the point-topoint races are easily the most exciting thing about the game, broken up into three legs and pitting you against dozens of competitors in a range of vehicles.

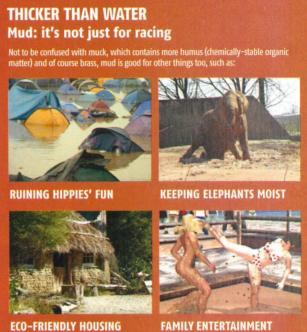

ugby union turned professional more than 10 years ago, but essentially remains the rough diamond of sport. It still seems to be played exclusively by mean-looking blokes with cauliflower ears.

This rough-and-ready feel is carried over into the videogame world where, despite being eminently playable in recent years, the EA Rugby series has never really scaled the heights of its round-balled brethren.

Will the latest instalment change that? No, but it's loads of fun all the same.

Rugby 08 is based around the World Cup format, which is particularly pertinent this time round because the Web Ellis trophy is up for grabs this autumn.

There are the usual Tournament and Play Now modes, plus a Challenge mode that consists of re-enacting encounters of yesteryear with some specific objectives added in.

There are also tutorial and practice modes to teach newbies the basic ideas and controls.

#### **YUMMY SCRUMMY**

The nature of the sport means that designing a simple and intuitive control system is the biggest challenge of any rugby title.

The ball can be thrown, kicked and carried in a variety of ways; couple this with various rucks, malls and scrums, plus the offside rule, and you could easily end up with a baffling mess. But EA has come up with the goods in this respect, and that's the game's biggest strength.

The controls are easy to pick up because each offensive and defensive scenario is clearly delineated. You're never locked in to specific playing strategies and can decide how to move the ball on a play-by-play basis, whether that's recycling the ball through rucks and driving malls, employing the old up-and-under or just running straight through the middle.

Our main criticism is the Al. Sure, it's good not to have the team react in specific preset ways (à la Madden NFL), but a bit more reaction than you do get would be nice.

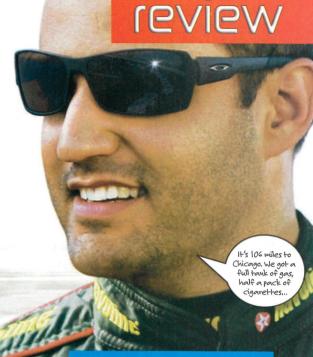

ou don't have to be a fan of the oddly showbiz-drenched world of US sport to see why millions of people love gridiron and hoops. Few games are so deliciously violent as ice hockey, so nail-chewing as baseball, so tactically deep as American Football.

We might not understand them, but most of us can appreciate why the Yanks are so crazy about them and why massively comprehensive games such as Madden NFL are, to their tastes, what Pro Evolution Soccer is to ours.

But then there's Nascar. We've seen the film Days of Thunder and even, on occasion, watched Nascar on TV, so we know it involves: a) being a hugely accomplished driver and b) the knowledge that you're facing extreme danger every time you take to the track.

But the tracks are just ovals. It's not like negotiating your way around Monaco's hairpins in a metal missile, it's like driving down a very long motorway with the steering wheel permenantly locked 20° to the left.

#### **ROUND EFFECT**

And that, sadly, is why no Nascar game will ever work on console unless it's set 100 years into the future, on one of Jupiter's moons, and involves

flying alien spaceships the size of skyscrapers around tracks as twisty-turny as a Lost flashback.

This latest game is undoubtedly extensive, with five different modes (including 'cars of the future', which, er, look just like normal cars), a boatload of tracks, staggering amounts of car tuning, and a Career mode so massive you need an Ordnance Survey map to navigate it.

But it's still cursed with the affliction that 95% of its courses are ovals. You push left on the analog stick... and that's it.

#### **NASCAR BLIMEY**

The long and the short of it is that Nascar, as a game, simply doesn't work. At no point do you ever have any fun. At no point do you feel challenged. At no point are you remotely excited.

Even short races - at an eye-bleering 22 laps - are just a war of attrition. If, like us, you find 22 further laps of qualifying are too much to cope with (coming, of course, with the bonus of no other cars), you'll start at the back of the pack and have to work your way to the front by, er, pressing left on the analog stick.

If you choose to free an Einherjar, you'll be rewarded with a stat-boosting crystal.

Although this provides a great abundance of class types to play with, you'll end up with an alarming amount of characters to sort through.

You see, new Einherjar will be low-levelled, so you'll have to go through hours of tedious grinding to make them more substantial.

In the meantime, you'll have collected more amateur fallen warriors and before you know it, there are 20 people in your party ranging from level 55 to a paltry level 4.

The thing is, though, that despite this convoluted character development system and the unwelcoming battle mechanics, once you master them, battles become a pure joy and provide an overwhelming sense of achievement.

And with entrancing environments and an engaging storyline (there's a cutscene around every corner), VP2:S is a challenging, intelligent and magical game. Kim Richards

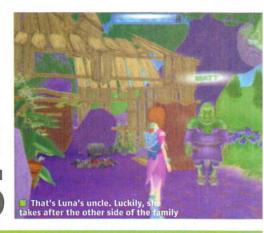

lobal warming. Terrorism. The Spice Girls reuniting. The world is a terrible place. But never fear, Falling Stars is here: a 'feel-good' roleplaying game for children. An ancient spirit has sensed evil forming in a pretty-coloured land called Dazzleon and sent an apprentice spirit to check it out by inhabiting the body of a girl called Luna.

This 'evil presence' is currently inhabiting Luna's Uncle Matt, an inexplicably green, ugly dude who experiments on hapless animals. It could've been the basis for a decent story. But it spins out like a lazy, contradictory piece of work.

For example, when Luna discovers her uncle is a bit nasty, she hides his pet but is still happy to run errands for him such as picking up potions and pickaxes (presumably to be used in his devious experiments). It's patronising.

#### **GIRL'S WORLD**

The game is split into quests and mini-games. The latter tend to be simple archery games or find-the-bunnies-type challenges but the controls are a bit unwieldy and baffling.



One game involves directing someone to drop pillows onto a moving toy train so his kitten can jump to safety. Okay.

But to do so, you must rotate the right analogue stick to change the tracks, while rotating the left stick to charge the train and hit (x) twice to signal pillow droppage. Huh?

#### **FUR FIGHTING**

A furry blue fella called Komi fights for you in battles while Luna acts as a healer. To fight, you choose one of three attacks: fast, strong or mega. When the enemy attacks, you must choose which attack to defend against. Guess correctly and you won't receive damage. Get it wrong, and you will.

So battles are more about chance than strategy. And the absence of magic spells, different attacks or weapons makes it very dull.

The in-battle and map menus are all quite unfriendly, making it difficult to explore your pet's statistics and decide which to improve, or to keep an eye on him during battle.

There is a place for child-targeted RPGs. But the restricted battles and limited geography to explore mixed with inexcusable loading times makes Falling Stars feel underdeveloped.

Kids are young but they're not stupid, as better games such as Ratchet & Clank or Buzz! Junior recognise. Kim Richards

n 1588, with the blessing of the Pope, Spain assembled a massive fleet of warships with the intention of landing in south-east England and overthrowing Queen Elizabeth I.

But upon entering the English Channel, the Spanish Armada found itself beset by unmanned English fireships (abandoned, kamikaze ships laden with gunpower and set alight) and forced to flee northwards.

There it lost a quarter of its number to a nasty combination of severe weather and a jagged coastline. The defeat was so great that some even accused Elizabeth of being a witch.

What does this tale have to do with Final Armada? Nothing. But the story of the Spanish Armada's fateful voyage is infinitely more exciting than this horrible little PS2 game.

Not only can you count the number of ideas in Final Armada on one hand, you can count on the other the number of minutes you spend playing it before regretting your purchase.

#### **STEAMING PILOT**

You play as Lieutenant Zake Anderson, a man who - if the cutscenes are anything to go by suffers from a terrible case of upper-lip paralysis.

You pilot the Aggressor, a puckish little vehicle that can switch between four-wheel drive and a hovercraft mode.

But don't get too excited by this promise of a multi-terrain vehicle: trying to drive over even a hamster-sized rock stops the Aggressor dead.

Inexplicably, switching between the two vehicle modes will also change your primary chain-gun to a pulse laser. And since both weapons overheat very quickly, you must switch often between buggy and hovercraft.

However, this is where the one iota of strategy that Final Armada does stump up comes into play. Your hovercraft can't regenerate its

shields and the Aggressor will melt away faster than a snowman in a sauna should you expose it to several seconds of sustained fire.

So most of the game involves sitting outside your enemies' proximity sensors, locking onto them and firing until they turn into an orange cloud (care of some braindead AI, they don't seem to mind much).

Samurai scrapping gets the tag-team treatment

here's something tantalising, something that captures the imagination about the coming together of much-loved universes. Marvel vs Capcom, Justice League, Secret Wars, Alien vs Predator - all-star games for die-hard fans: each one offering up alliances and confrontations between their favourite heroes and horrors.

So how's this: the heroes of the Dynasty Warriors and Samurai Warriors games joining forces to defeat an evil demon! Mouth-watering and history making? Or a non-event that's as monumental as a fart in a tornado?

If you feel it's the latter you're probably suffering from 'Dynasty Warriors Fatigue', a condition that switches off your brain every time you see a game set in feudal China/Japan that has a brightly coloured swordsman/woman scything through thickets of identical soldiers.



It's a common complaint and the result of pubisher KOEI mining this particular gaming seam to exhaustion. Unfortunately, it's going to deny Warriors Orochi some attention; a shame, because it's a reasonably sparky hack'n'slasher.

#### **SERPENT AT LEISURE**

The premise is that Serpent King Orochi has got bored of kicking in peasants, so he's warped time and space to merge the Sengoku and Sangokushi periods. In doing so he's assembled one hero's fighting the other two are resting and regenerating energy. At a more advanced stage, you'll be called on to use your team's different fighting styles to win battles.

They come in three classes: speed, power and technique, and the combination you use depends on your playing style.

For instance, if you're comfortable with a character capable of speedy attacks or a technical one (nimble but has combos that require sharp timing) you could use them for

most of the donkey work, while having two 'power' characters resting and charging up special powers. Then you can bring those guys in to devastating effect.

But if you struggle with the basic scrapping you might need less magic and more might.

Adding further substance is a Weapon Fusion system in which you gather power from different blades to create an all-conquering hybrid. Throw in character development and levelling up and you get a feisty action game with well-rounded strategic and roleplayer elements.

It's enjoyable, it's interesting and it's enough to disguise the fact that all you're really doing is all you've ever done in Warriors games: mash the action button.

But it can only disguise it for so long. The Warriors titles have always been limited and

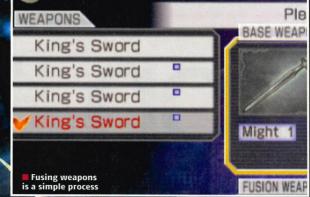

veryone knows the gaffer situation. LMA Manager is the long-standing champ of manager sims on console, having seen off all potential challengers since the PS1 days. It'll take a very special game to break that status quo and Premier Manager 08 is not it.

Similar to the quick-dip spirit of LMA, starting your managerial career couldn't be simpler. With the easily navigated menus you'll be organising the training facilities and playing the transfer market within minutes of loading the game.

The job can be as hands-on or hands-off as you prefer. Coaching, scouting and physio tasks can all be dished out. If you'd rather just concentrate on the glamorous stuff, such as transfers and first-team selection, simply delegate and let your assistants get on with it.

To be honest, the game isn't clever enough to discern any difference between hours spent on the training pitch and turning up on match day with a cigar and a scribbled team sheet.

#### FIELD OF SCREAMS

There are some nice touches: interaction with the press, for example, including a small choice of different responses, and meetings with the chairman. But it doesn't take long to see how shallow and unrealistic the game is.

Transfers are an obvious case in point, All negotiations seem to follow exactly the same routine with little variation in your dialogue with players and clubs.

Authenticity went completely out the window when we managed to snap up Michael

Essien and Petr Cech from Chelsea for £5m each. And in this day and age how can you take a management game seriously when it doesn't involve agents?

The match engine is also heavily flawed. Represented by a 2D pitch with blobs scurrying around, it's impossible to get a clear idea of how the game is panning out - especially since there's no commentary or pertinent stats to help you decipher what the hell's going on and how you should change things around.

Even more annoying is the fact that you can't skip matches or at least jump through big time increments. All you can do is ramp it up to top speed and watch the blobs go crazy.

But the very worst thing about the game? You can choose between a limited range of formations but there's no option to refine individual player positions - moving Ronaldinho into the hole for example, or getting Essien to patrol just in front of the back four. That's basic management and Premier Manager 08 doesn't even bother with it. Lee Hart

ne part roleplaying game and two parts action-adventure, the original Monster Hunter was an instant hit when it was released in 2004. But the seguel, MH2, never saw the light of day in Western climes.

And that's why Monster Hunter Freedom 2 is so mouth-watering: it's a mix of MH2 with 50% brand new, original content.

There's no plot as such, because the aim of the game is straightforward: to achieve the rank of Monster Hunter and become a legend.

Gameplay is split into quests that can be done solo, but the main attraction of MHF2 is the ability to team up with other beastie slayers via the multiplayer option.

Most quests involve hunting down different species, luring them out of hiding and bopping them on the head until they meet their maker.

Weapons, armour and kit can be bought in towns, but you can also harvest monster bits to create even stronger bespoke goods. And one of the great things about MHF2 is that whatever armour or weapon you equip will change your avatar's appearance - an impressive little touch.

You also have to consider real-life elements when equipping yourself. For example, your character starts out in Snowy Mountains, so he or she needs to equip armour with the 'Cold Elimination' ability to avoid freezing. Clever, eh.

#### KITS OUT

There's a generous 11 varieties of pointy death to wield, including bowguns, samurai blades, hammers and lances. Each has a special attack that you must master. Many happy hours can be spent experimenting and deciding which murder method suits you best.

Once you embark on a quest you'll be sent to the battlefield, which consists of several gorgeous landscapes.

You start off at your base camp, which contains chests to store monster bits and a bed to rest and recuperate. Then, once you've equipped your hunter and learned your trade in the helpful training section, it's time to head off and slaughter some critters.

Most monsters will be roaming about and won't attack unless you threaten them, or if you're in their close vicinity. So you can choose to run around, exploring the area, climbing up walls and wandering into caves.

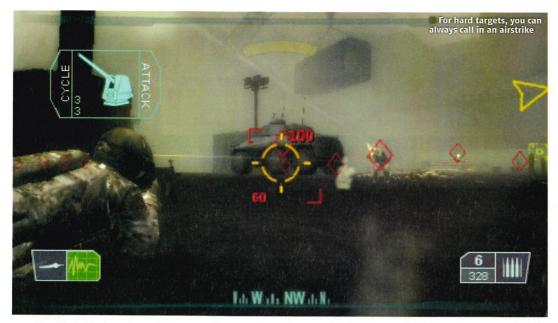

But what happens when, say, a tank comes rolling down the street? You die, that's what, because switching fire modes is a chore, requiring a ludicrous three buttons. Your best option is just to lug around an RPG, which can be accessed with a quick tap of  $\rightarrow$ .

So there's a solution at least. It just leaves you yearning for more buttons. Say, those found on a next-gen controller - the way GRAW 2 was meant to be played. Mike Sterry



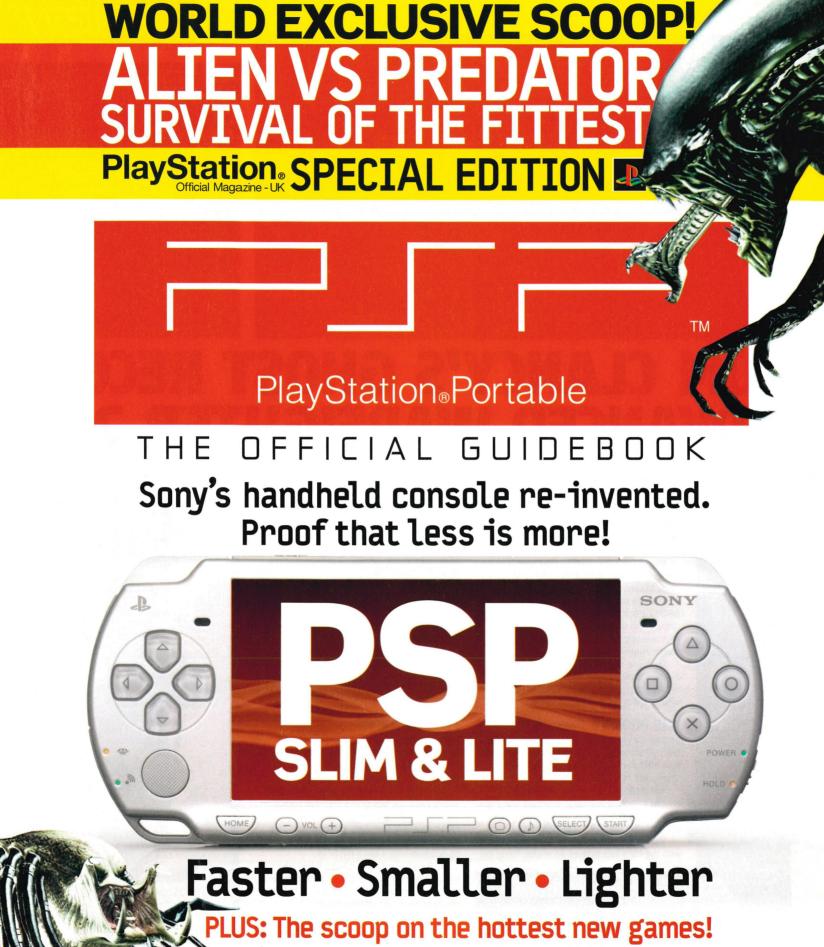

#### All's fare in love and war...

ou may well be thinking that the 'crazy' bit of this game's title is redundant. because plenty of taxi drivers clearly are. You might also wonder why on Earth anyone would base a game on being a cabbie.

But the aim here is not to bore your fares senseless with a stream of mindless drivel and tales of how you've 'done this job for 30 years, man and boy'; no, the aim is merely to drive like a complete hooligan. Maybe it's not so different from real life after all...

Instead of being an entirely new addition to the Crazy Taxi series. Fare Wars is a port of the original Crazy Taxi and its imaginatively named sequel, Crazy Taxi 2, with a new multiplayer mode tacked on.

There are a fair few variations and a handful of mini-games, but the main crux of the action is to get as many passengers as possible from Point A to Point B within an allotted time, while raking in as much cash as you can.

#### **STEER AND LOATHING**

The whole reckless driving concept is very familiar, no matter what platform you favour. As far back as the early days of the PS1, responsive handling was the norm, whether it was

So the Crazy Taxi developers owe us an explanation or two.

#### **HIGHLY SPRUNG**

The taxis handle incredibly erratically and are seemingly indestructible. The control system feels ill thought out, especially for drifting, which is essential to completing some missions.

And whoever came up with the idea that taxis should be able to spontaneously jump deserves kudos for such a quirky concept, but also a swift a kick in the swingers for its shoddy execution. There's not even so much as an animation showing the extension of the highly sprung super-suspension.

The arcade racing genre is pretty saturated, so any game that wants to make a (skid) mark has to go a long way to stand out from the crowd.

Sure, Crazy Taxi has an anarchic premise, some amusing mini-games and falls into the arcade thrills rather than the hyperrealism category, but the finished product just feels lazy.

As Driver 76 showed, it is possible to produce a game of this style that holds its own against

hen the original *WipEout* stole the show at the PS1 launch, its megaspeed anti-grav racing seemed so futuristic, adrenaline pumping, breathless, and *fresh*. But now, twelve years and seven incarnations later, the series is starting to feel a bit, well, dated. Can this second PSP outing reverse the trend?

There's the usual slew of new stuff: 24.

There's the usual slew of new stuff: 24 original tracks, eight teams with two vehicles each, and seven race modes. The game is split into several series of races with set goals that must be achieved to advance to the next level. Race types include time trials, single races, tournaments and speed laps. Incredible!

#### FINGER ON THE PULSE

The tracks will feel overly familiar to WipEout veterans and, frankly, they're all a bit short; a race is often over before you've really got the measure of your surroundings. But WipEout Pulse certainly doesn't disappoint where racing combat is concerned.

Weapons include mines, bombs, homing missiles, machine guns and rockets. There's also



a fancy new Mag-Strip device that will lock opponent ships to the track and prevent you from bumping into the sides.

The Al is pretty vicious and you can get embroiled in some real battles; positions changing every few seconds as ships get blasted into oblivion.

#### FINGER ON THE PULSE

Music has always been a major part of the WipEout culture, with earlier releases in the series including top tracks from the likes of the Prodigy and the Chemical Brothers.

But surprisingly, the tunes in *Pulse* are a bit hit and miss, with fewer big names than we've come to expect and many tracks failing to raise the heartbeat.

Fortunately, you can always add to the soundtrack as *Pulse* is one of the few PSP games that takes full advantage of the portable's online technology. Go online to wipeout.com and you can download tons of new music, ships and tracks. You can also design your own skins for the ships and send them to your PSP.

The standout feature here is undoubtedly the multiplayer action. Get some mates round and you can play with up to eight of them at once via all of the race modes available in singleplayer. It's one of the finest examples of multiplayer gaming yet seen on PSP.



WipEout just wouldn't be the same without a bunch of cool boosts and weapons to chuck at your opponents. Here are some of our faves.



Engage Autopilot mode and sit back as your onboard computer steers you straight into the lead.



The machine gun is capable of either single shots or full bursts, it's a neat way to pick off opponents.

hen Dr Ryuta Kawashima published a book called Train your Brain: 60 Days to a Better Brain in 2003, little did he know that he was giving birth to a whole new gaming genre. Although when his face appeared in Brain Age on the Nintendo DS, he might have had an inkling.

Now 'intelligence' games are popping up everywhere, each boasting their own Japanese boffin to add substance to the brain-expanding claims of these titles. For the PSP's Practical IQ, Professor Masua Koyasu is the resident egghead, introducing a "modular problem-solving game made up of different puzzles".

#### **MIND POWER**

Somehow, measuring your IQ is involved. It's not really clear how; instead of explaining that IQ is a mix of X + Y + Z, all PIQ offers is statistics. Well,

IQ, seemingly plucked at random.

To complete each puzzle you have to make your way across a board to a pillar of light. The boards consist of various levels and obstacles. You can only climb up or down one level at a time, and blocks can be moved and stacked to help you out. Obstacles include lasers, doors and, bizarrely, police officers.

#### **PRACTICAL OR NOTHING**

The main part of the game is the 100 Puzzle mode, where you have five hours to make it through, yes, 100 puzzles.

There's also Quick mode, in which you get a random selection of five of the 100 puzzles, or you can choose from 150 themed tests: single move, traps, reasoning, fewest moves, and advanced. Besides an option to create your own puzzles, that's your lot.

The whole thing feels like a basic puzzle

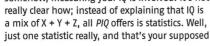

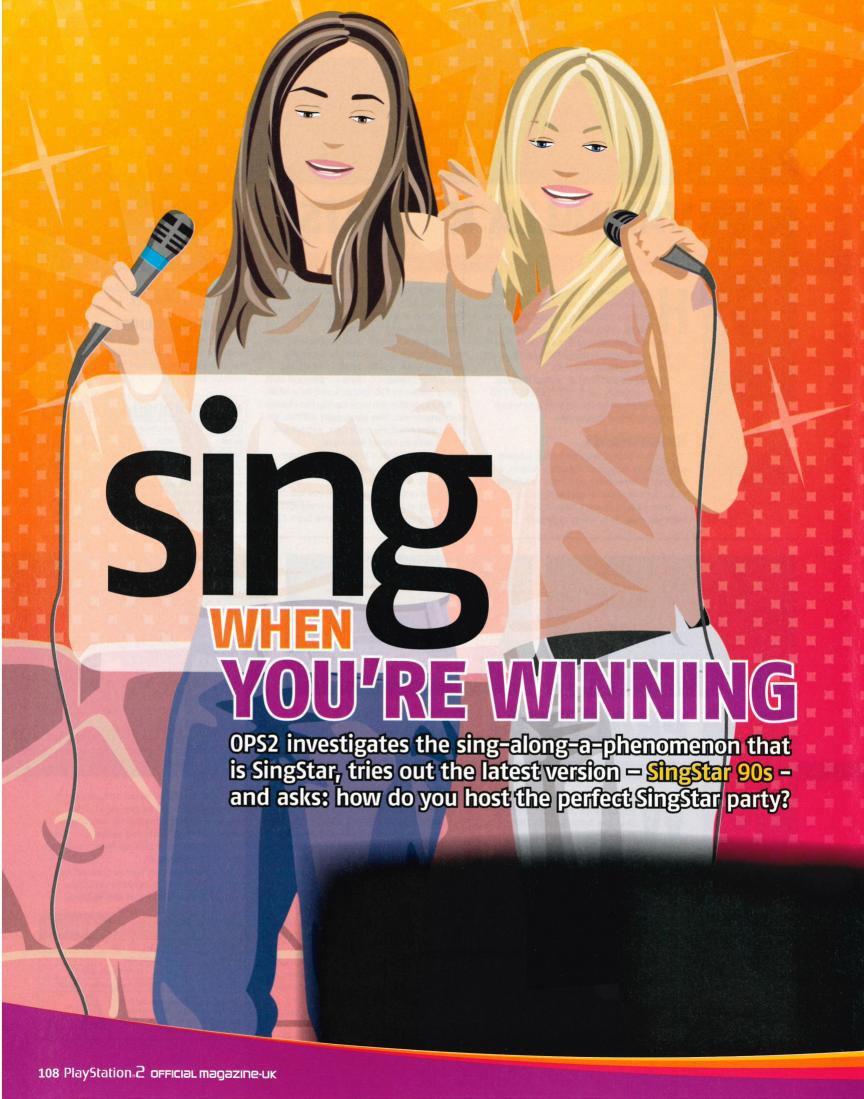

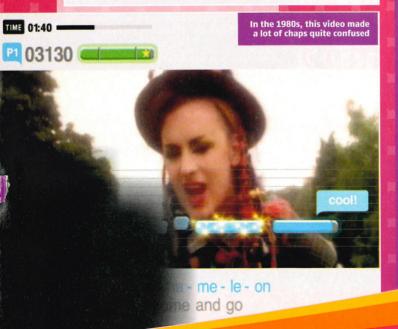

### **SHINE ON**

Whatever genres Sony decides to plunder for the next round, there's no doubt the karaoke series has a bright future.

Taking advantage of the PlayStation Store and the 60GB hard drive, the PS3's first version of SingStar is making the next inevitable step up. As well as a 30-strong tracklist that features some of the hottest tunes from the past few years, you'll be able to download fresh ones from the PS3's online shop.

How much will they be? How many will be available? These questions will be answered next month when the game goes on sale. But it's undoubtedly something to look forward to.

Talking of PS3, there's a potential bump in SingStar's otherwise smooth ride: EA's forthcoming RockBand.

This next-gen game combines guitars, vocals and drums for the complete interactive musical experience, with online co-op and versus multiplayer as well. Will it replace

SingStar as the party game of choice? Unlikely, because the cost of setting it up - buying the next-gen machine, the game and its various peripherals - is likely to be high. Plus it'll require a bit more effort than simply grumbling into a mic after too many bitter-shandies.

Nope, SingStar is very much here to stay. So whether you're a veteran or a newbie, grab a mic, read our indispensable guide to hosting the perfect pop party (below left) and get into the groove. Andy Hartup

### **RAINBOW SIX VEGAS**

What you get: Rainbow Six on WiFi offers nothing more than a couple of multiplayer modes and six maps to run around in.

The only saving grace is that Survival and Team Survival can both be played over a local or online connection, so you don't have to rely your mates buying the game to have human opponents.

We were rather hoping for a co-op mode, even if it was for the Terrorist Hunts you unlock in singleplayer, but sadly this mode is limited to the next-gen versions. What it's like: On a real-life scale of fun things to do, playing Vegas over WiFi sits somewhere between washing dishes and counting sheep from the window

of a broken-down train. Dull, repetitive and unnecessarily laborious, Vegas' PSP multiplayer is a far cry from the spectacular frag-fests of the home console editions.

The dreadful game mechanics inherited from the singleplayer game are further crippled by the fact that you no longer use the left shoulder button to lock onto opponents. It's obvious why this has been done (after all, what would be the point of playing online with an auto-lock? Not much of a test of skill is it?), but that doesn't mean we have to like it. And we don't.

To be fair, the connection is solid enough, even with six players blasting away at once. There's a notable pause after each kill, but this rarely disrupts

the game to a point where it's unplayable. In fact, because the maps are on the large side, most fights will fail to yield many kills; only vawns.

### **PARAPPA** THE RAPPER
