Ghost Recon 2: Summit Strike

The definitive mission pack. Or summit like that



IF THE original Ghost Recon 2 (Issue 36, 7.4) was a slight crease in the normally pristine uniform of the Ghost Recon series, then Summit Strike looks set to give the franchise a kick up the arse like a psycho Drill Sergeant. The game is touted as a standalone mission disc (not bad for £20), but is an accomplished title in its own right.

Another international crisis occupies the single-player mode - the Kazakh president has been offed by a greedy local warlord, and once again it's down to the Ghosts to restore order. This is really just an excuse for sneaking through mountainous forest and urban environments over 11 typically hard missions, blowing the crap out of anything that moves. But it's not an all-out blast-fest - as before, you need tactical savvy to manoeuvre your squad through each task, again using the new and improved squad command system.

A staggering 24 multiplayer modes are available, playable over an impressive 24 maps, some covering new ground, some retreading the same turf as *GR2*. The developer has again given a

huge amount of consideration to offline multiplayer, and System Link again allows 16 players to fight it out over Squad, Team or Solo games – variants on the familiar Firefight, Domination and Recon modes. Assassination involves your squad taking out/defending a VIP, and the co-op Garrison mode is a truly epic battle to defend your base for 30 minutes from a relentless onslaught of enemies. Lone Wolf is back too, though the expansive terrain makes this one for the suicidal/hardened battle vet.

Two of the more fun additions are Heli Hunt, a David vs Goliath battle where your Ghosts down waves of choppers with a tasty shoulder-mounted rocket launcher, and a new multiplayer mode called Armour Strike, where the tantalising prospect of destroying more enemy vehicles than the opposition with your fearsome air support should get the Live servers rocking. To battle your way through these are an additional 15 weapons like the Special Forces Assault Rifle, a compromise between an accurate rifle and a heavy machine gun.

Much like Island Thunder (Issue 21, 8.5) did for the first Ghost Recon, Summit Strike looks set to issue a fresh set of boots and rations to the battleweary GR2. This mission disc drops a whole supply crate full of single and multiplayer goodness, all for £20. Check out the full review next issue.

SUITS YOU SIR

Once you've created a profile you can decide on the appearance of your soldier. A whole wardrobe full of character skins, including all variations of enemy uniforms from the original, plus Snow camo and international specialist garb are now in your locker. However, because Kazakhstan isn't exactly your average exotic holiday destination, Summit Strike showcases some of its more extreme weather conditions, such as snow blizzards and sandstorms. As a result, players are often kitted out in the standard kit for certain missions, which is an improvement on the drab greens of GR2.





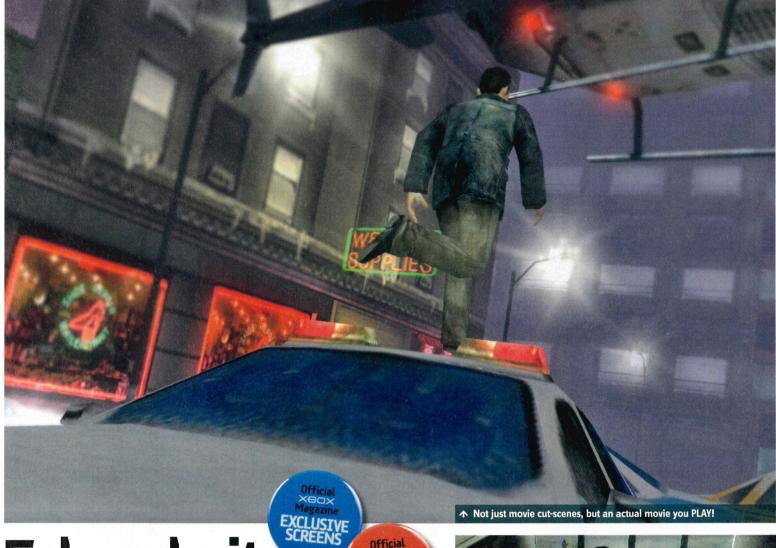

Fahrenheit

About as grown up as videogaming gets

IT'S BEEN A long, rocky road for Fahrenheit. Four years in development and already on its second publisher (having finally settled with Atari, by way of Vivendi), it's fair to say it hasn't had the smoothest transition from clever concept into fully realised videogame, but in this case the wait has most definitely been worth it. Because not only has it morphed into one of the most compelling, mature titles you'll ever find on Xbox, let alone any console, this could actually be the Holy Grail gamers have been waiting for since the birth of Space Invaders. Not just a game, Fahrenheit could very well be the first truly interactive movie.

Sure, you've heard that one before. Plenty of games offer cinema-style storylines and cut-scenes, but any sense of taking part in a movie collapses the moment the game reverts back to its core gameplay mechanics, be that first-person shooter or third-person action adventure. *Fahrenheit* is different. Not only does it boast a deep, multi-faceted plot that wouldn't look out of place in the next Dan Brown potboiler (murder, mystery

and an ancient Mayan cult are all thrown into the mix), but it features such a clever, intuitive interface that it really is impossible to differentiate the cutscenes from the actual gameplay.

Okay, so you'd be right in thinking this is basically an advance on the old PC graphic

adventure genre at heart, but Fahrenheit isn't just a PC game with a joypad interface tacked onto the front. Instead, everything you do is performed by moving the analogue sticks in certain ways at specific points in the environment. Opening a door might involve pulling back or

forwards on the stick for instance. It sounds simple, but it feels so natural you're not even aware you're doing it.

Throw in masses of timesensitive puzzles, branching storylines, the best use of 24-style split screen effects we've ever seen, great voice work, snappy dialogue, multiple characters that can be switched between in an instant and you've got one of the most interesting games you'll ever play. It's unique, novel, clever, grown up, different and very, very exciting. Let's hope

Quantic Dreams can hold it all together between now and September.

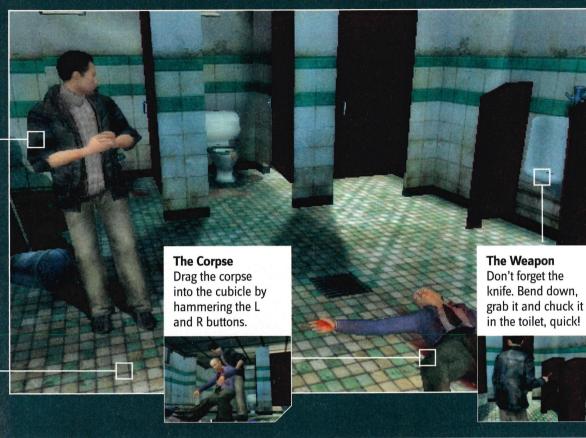

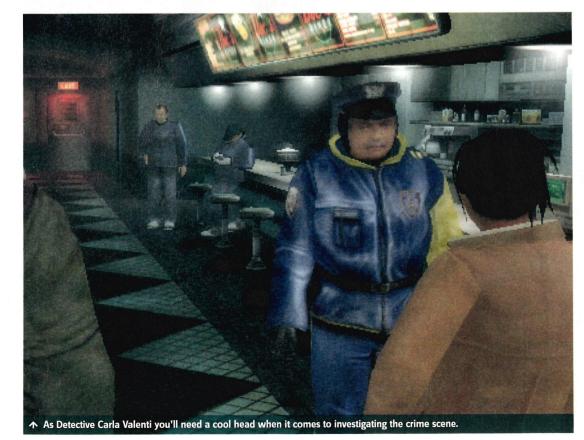

F YOU'VE READ our Exclusive Access feature on Criterion's Black (page 046), you'd be forgiven for thinking that it couldn't possibly be an Xbox title. Stunning graphics and completely destructible scenery make this incredible game an FPS tour de force. But even developer Alex Ward, himself a keen advocate of utilising hardware to its full potential, is ready to admit the game only uses 90 per cent of Xbox's capability, and the fact is that up until now most developers haven't even been anywhere close to that. If you thought Xbox games looked good now, wind your neck back in, because as studios become more familiar with development tools and fully realise the potential of its hard drive, things are set to get a whole lot better.

Microsoft has already pledged it will continue to manufacture Xbox consoles for a long time yet. Every third-party publisher still has a huge catalogue of titles stretching into the back end of next year, and the prospect of these exploiting the full capabilities of the Xbox is a mouth-watering one. Already Call of Duty 2: Big Red One and Ghost Recon 3 are shaping up to bring a completely new meaning to the term 'immersive experience'. Incredible visuals, frantic battlefield chaos and super-smart enemy Al will set a new benchmark for shooters on this generation of consoles.

Sports titles haven't been overlooked either, with the new incarnations of FIFA Football and Madden NFL looking incredibly lifelike and play like a real-life game you'd watch on TV. And if you thought Burnout 3 was impressive, the jawdropping physics and mind-blowing aerial takedowns, the retina-scorching sense of speed in

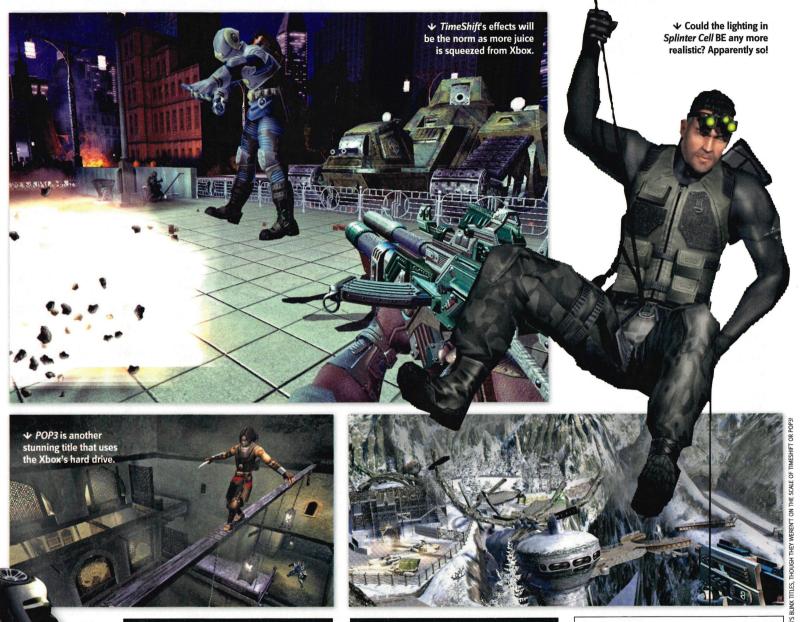

Alex Garland handed over the first draft of his Halo: The Movie screen play to Microsoft this month, but forget the jiffy bag, this guy did it in style. To create as much pomp and ceremony as possible, Garland had a fully-armoured Master Chief arrive at Microsoft with the script tucked on his person. Apparently the script 'covers all the bases' given to Garland by Bungie, so hopefully with the script on paper, we could be seeing Ridley Scott on board as director.

Traumatic Times

Swedish developer DICE (the guys responsible for the award winning Battlefield and RalliSport series) has shut up shop at its New York offices. The US division, known as Trauma, was bought by DICE only nine months ago, and was responsible for the free Battlefield mod, Desert Combat. Thankfully, the Trauma staff have been offered other jobs, and the forthcoming Battlefield game for Xbox is unaffected.

Save The Rich!

This month saw Hollywood stars saved from the brink of having to downsize to modest 12-bedroom apartments, when the likes of Samuel L Jackson, Dennis Hopper and Burt Reynolds secured a 36 per cent pay-rise for voice work. Unfortunately for the multi-millionaires, their demands for more cash were stopped short of being paid royalties every time a game is sold. Charitable donations are welcome, and can be sent via *OXM* – we'll pass on the cash to the starving thespians.

It's unclear how developer Egosoft will cram all that space onto Xbox, or whether X3 will be Live-compatible (swap spaceships!) but we'll find out soon when we get our mitts on the preview.

Going Psycho

Cult US platformer to be released in UK

WE'VE BEEN on at Majesco this month about its Stateside smash, *Psychonauts*, and the possibility of a UK release. The warped adventures of Raz at 'Psychic Summer Camp' and his attempts to protect childrens' brains from a mysterious mindstealer have already secured high praise across the board in the US. It's about time we had it, and Majesco told us arrangements were being made.

"We're working on *Psychonauts* right now", our Majesco source told us. "The game is being localised too, but it will be a while before release. It's a big title with a ton of dialogue so it takes some time to do all of the voice work involved. Hopefully we'll have a definitive announcement within the next month or so regarding the European release."

You have to guide Raz through summer camp, earning merit badges and honing mind-bending skills such as clairvoyance, pyrokinesis, and telekinesis, all the while avoiding the bizarre Tim Burton-esque mind demons and other freaks inhabiting the dreams of the children whose brains you're, er, living in. Intriguing, no? Described by US reviewers as "Unbelievably funny", "Easily one of the most enjoyable games of the year", and "Wildly surreal", *OXM* will be watching this like a demon.

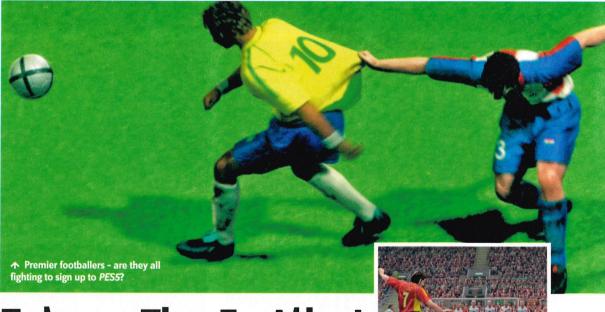

John Terry confirmed as face of Pro Evo 5!

CHELSEA CAPTAIN and England player John Terry signed on the dotted line this month to be the poster boy for Konami's forthcoming *Pro Evolution Soccer 5.* Just one of the famous faces to be lined up for the fifth incarnation of Konami's smash footy game, Terry reportedly signed after admitting to taking *Pro Evo* on tour with him. We're sure the cash incentive helped too though.

Terry says he's looking forward to playing 'advanced' versions of *Pro*

Evolution, which are currently on their way - although it's unclear what 'advanced versions' actually means. We contacted Konami to see whether this referred to Pro Evolution 5 itself, or merely an enhanced version of Pro Evolution 4. We got the ubiquitous "No comment", but, that said, PES4 was so good anyway we can't see how it could be tweaked any further. Let's hope they mean PES5, which should be warming up for a release towards the end of the year.

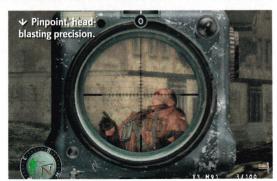

TAKE ANOTHER look at the title. If we could sum this game up in two simple words, they would indeed be 'ultimate' and 'destruction'. Sure, there may be an underlying story and a wealth of objective-based missions under this mass of rubble and twisted metal, but the real fun to be had in this fantastic-looking sequel lies in smashing the crap out of anything that moves, and obliterating everything that doesn't for good measure.

Since the sort-of-stealthy Banner missions of the original Hulk (Issue 18, 7.5) have been axed, players are left to freely indulge in a complete orgy of wanton destruction. And boy, is it better than any sex we've ever had. Pretty much everything in the game is destructible, though it's sometime much more beneficial to thoughtfully use lampposts, various vehicles and any unfortunate persons who come to hand as projectile weapons. Earn enough Smash points (no prizes for guessing how) and you can also create makeshift weapons from vehicles and unlock up to 150 different fighting moves.

The Hulk's every action has a brilliantly destructive consequence - every footprint leaves a

crater on the ground, and sprinting down the street scatters everything in your path. Combat is still pleasingly simple; two- and three-button combos are the way forward, and pretty much as complex as it gets. Moves can be charged up for even wider devastation, though this leaves you open to attack.

This destruction feels amazingly brutal, and with the terrifying (and earsplittingly loud) explosions and sounds of grating metal, this is a genuine assault on the ears. We were convinced our TV was going to shatter at any second, such was the ferocity of each gutwrenching attack.

The impressive cityscape is a huge,

Burnout: Revenge

Putting the rush back into rush hour...



REMEMBER ALL those hot summer nights playing Burnout 3? As temperatures soared, your sweat-soaked brow creased in concentration as you itched for just one more takedown. If you're anything like us, you wouldn't be able to sleep for hours afterward, with cars rushing through your brain like it was the LA freeway.

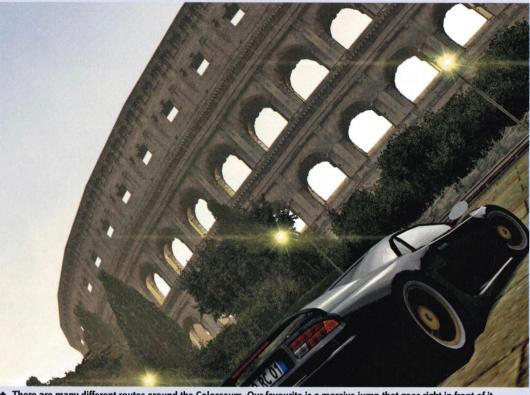
Get ready for those days again, because this autumn sees the release of Burnout: Revenge from Criterion Games. This awe-striking sequel aims to satisfy all adrenaline junkies by tuning up the takedown system, making it more aggressive than ever. True to the title, you're now going for takedowns with a vengeance.

"In Burnout 3, you could be very successful just by driving skilfully and by avoiding confrontation," says Criterion Games' creative manager Alex Ward.
But now things are different... "Our Revenge ranking system and the new-style circuits give you no choice but to fight." Burnout 3 was to a boxing ring what Revenge is to an Ultimate Fighting Championship cage. Take down an enemy and they're instantly 'marked for revenge', relentlessly pursuing you until you're slammed onto the scrapheap.

If they're successful, you become marked for revenge yourself, and so it goes. Revenge takedowns are much more valuable than the standard bonuses for aggressive driving too. "You'll unlock bonuses such as new cars much more quickly if you achieve a high Revenge ranking," says producer Emily Newton Dunn.

The concept of payback filters into most of the other game modes, especially the new Traffic Attack mode. "It's everything you ever wanted to do when you were stuck in a rush hour jam", Ward exclaims.

Traffic Attack is a hybrid of Crash and Road Rage modes. You have to tear around a circuit, wrecking as many civilian cars as you can along the way. There are 99 seconds on the clock to start with, and the first 79 are a warm-up for the main event. During the final 20 seconds, you have to keep the time topped up by creating a chain of

and improved Crash mode. The inspiration for the game's bespoke crash junctions actually comes from, erm, golf courses. In this case, the green is the perfect route through crossing traffic, the rough is a stretch of very hazardous road, and the hole is a moving 'target' car.

At the start of the junction, you'll see a Tiger Woods-style swingometer to determine how much boost you get from the 'tee'. You'll even find your car being shifted by forceful winds if you boost over a really high jump.

Your objective is still the same - to wreck as many cars as possible within the time limit. However, the inclusion of a target car to replace the static multiplier bonuses from Burnout 3 makes it

crashes with only short gaps between each one. Leave it too long and the time will deplete, ending the round. But if you're a car-crushing maniac, you'll be able to keep the clock running and the points going through the roof. Each lap completed adds a multiplier bonus as added incentive.

As you've probably guessed, hitting civilian cars is no longer a disaster, it's absolutely essential. So long as the traffic is heading in the same direction as you, you'll be able to 'check' it like Wayne Gretsky into oncoming lanes or the other racers behind. That doesn't include big rigs, buses or crossing and oncoming traffic, so there's still a huge element of risk if you're going to check traffic.

While that concept obviously comes from the NHL, a very different sport inspired Revenge's new

worth a huge cash injection, but it also improves your chances of getting a Crashbreaker bonus. For newcomers to the Burnout series, this lets you explode your car on demand, sending it flying in the direction of your choice in slow motion. Thankfully it's now possible to rotate the camera so you can spot the best place to land and cause maximum carnage.

But we're missing one really important factor here - just where does all this destruction happen? Each new circuit and crash junction in *Revenge* is based in a real city - Detroit, Tokyo, Hong Kong or Rome. We're not talking *Project Gotham* authenticity here, though - as *Revenge* is a very different kind of racer, the tracks have been tailored for car combat and also feature some surprising twists.

"We had to make sure that the racing circuits maintained those core *Burnout* qualities, like great corners to drift around and cool areas to battle in, but we needed to add something new like jumps and escape routes", says

Emily Newton Dunn. "You'll often be hammering down a section and get slammed off-course onto a new route you never new existed."

The Rome circuit looks gorgeous, and includes a sprawling combination of alternate routes. Some are quite obvious, but breakable fences or crates that you can smash through sneakily conceal the others. Because there's no ingame map either, practice, exploration and chasing down rival cars will be the only way to find all the escape routes.

We're really excited about *Burnout: Revenge.* It takes all the pure aggression from *Burnout 3* and ramps it up to the next level, with loads of new features and the unbelievably fun Traffic Attack mode. *Revenge* also benefits from a darker attitude, thanks to grittier and more realistic graphics. Those sweaty, sleepless nights are on their way back. To be honest, we can't wait.



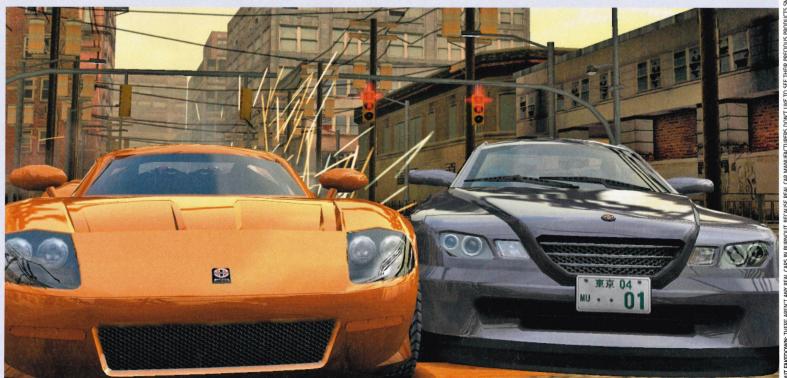

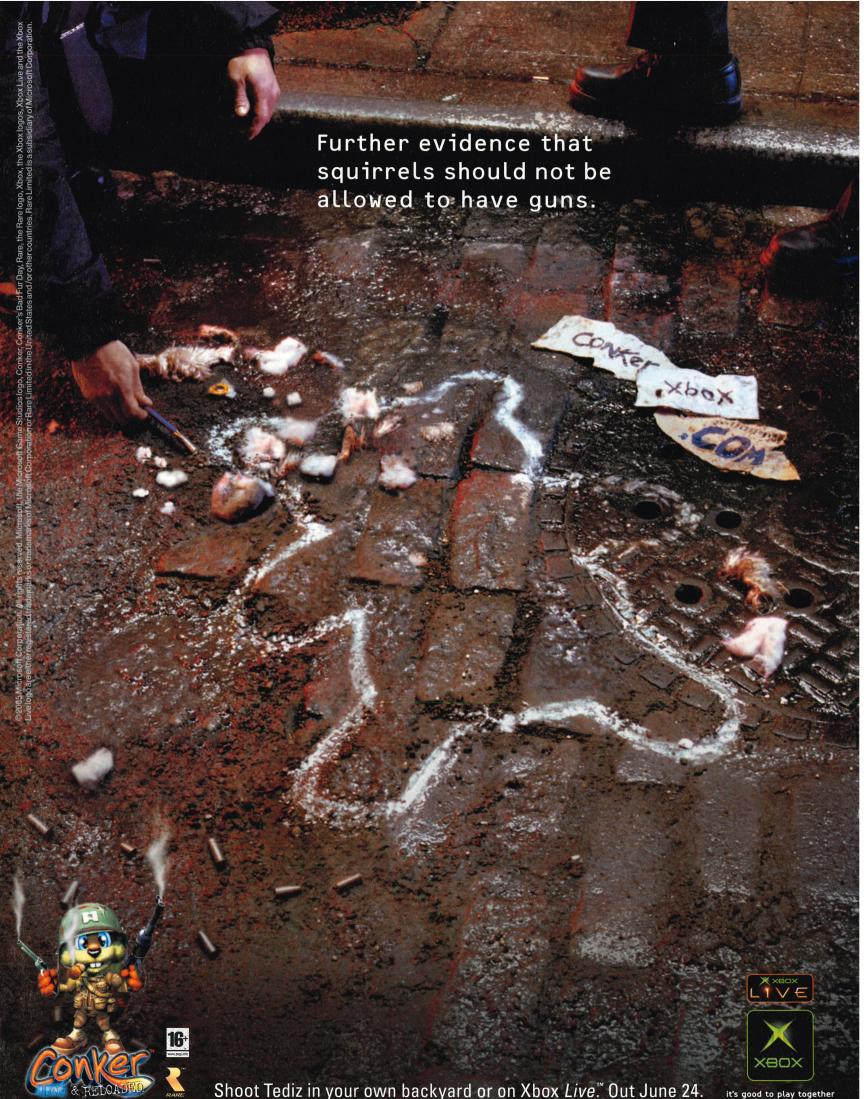

You can jump straight into the instant action, or start the extensive Campaign mode - the action is just as visceral. Plane controls are simple and intuitive to get to grips with, and definitely on the arcadey side of the stick. Throughout each of the 26 missions there are a wide range of objectives throughout the Japanese theatre of war, allowing players to choose between fighters, dive bombers, and torpedo specialists. Battles are hectic, hellish affairs, and with over 150 planes in the sky at any one time, this is one of the most frantic shooters we've ever played.

A neat feature of Heroes of the Pacific is the ability to control up to four wingmen at any one time, thanks to another handy menu system - and boy does it help in the middle of these missions. Multiplayer is on offer in both two-player split screen form, and thankfully Xbox Live, where up to eight players can dogfight to the death, like real men. There's no word yet on whether bots will be available online, but the sheer ferocity of the offline campaign should compensate for this. Check out the full review next issue.

Darkwatch

Taking a monster bite out of the FPS market



AFTER MOSEYING through the ghost town of publishing limbo for the last couple of months, the stunning-looking western/vampire/ zombie-blaster Darkwatch is almost ready to finally get off its horse and drink its blood this Autumn. Players don the rotting chaps of Jericho Cross, a train robber turned half-bloodsucker by a bite from an ancient vampire lord. After a wave of evil is unleashed on the now even wilder west, Jericho teams up with the mysterious Darkwatch cult to combat the teeming prairies of undead all baying for his blood.

It's not just the unique storyline that makes Darkwatch stand out from the crowd, however, although the intriguing blend of genres certainly helps. Gameplay is split between frantic on-foot action and rollicking horse-mounted gunplay, something we haven't seen enough of since last year's Red Dead Revolver (Issue 30, 8.5). Greatlooking Havok physics mean your awesome arsenal of dual pistols, crossbows and rocket launchers quite literally blow the seemingly endless waves of undead to pieces. These brilliantly fun physics are apparent when Jericho must use the environment to his advantage too. Expect bell towers, saloon doors and any other wild west cliche to be destroyed by your smoking guns. Players can also use their inherent vampire skills to momentarily improve their killing ability, by gaining access to special powers and using weapon-specific melee attacks - the possibilities of which are blood-drippingly brutal.

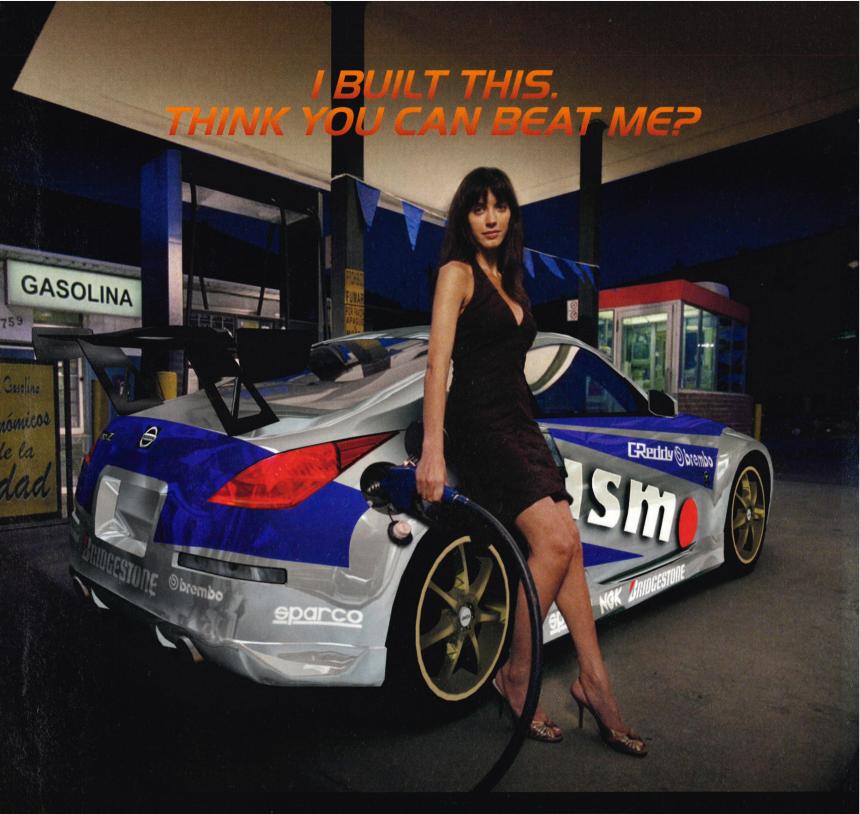

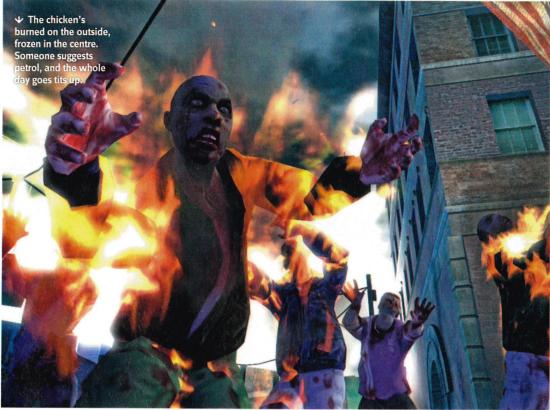


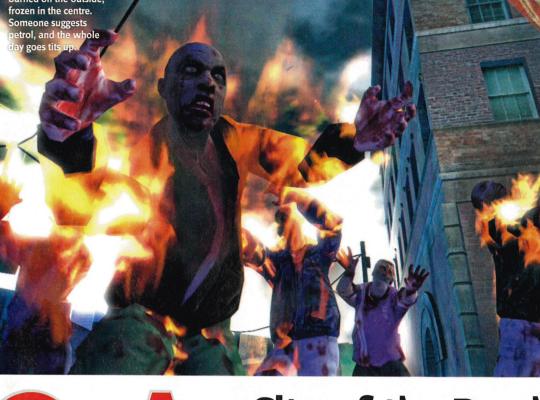

City of the Dead We munch on the brains of Alex Trowers,

lead designer of this gruesome, festering and carnivorous beauty...



Hey guys! We're really pleased to see City of the Dead, but tell us - why now, and why zombies? Zombies are fun. You can do all sorts of terrible things to them with fewer moral consequences than if you were to attempt this stuff on regular humans.

Has George Romero had much say in the game's development, or is he just lending his name to it? George has full approval over the story. There are George-based titbits in the game, but I'm going to let his fans find them out for themselves.

Tell us a little about the game and what we will be expected to do?

The game itself is a complete action experience. It's all about killing zombies in interesting ways, racking up huge combos and high scores, and, above all, having fun. It's very bold, brash and in your face. It's one of the goriest games made!

Will the zombies be slow and shuffling, or fast and speeding?

We know what zombie fans are like - many prefer their undead a little less athletic. For the most part, the zombies are your classic can't-outrun-a-snail type. Some concessions have been made for the sake of gameplay, however, and we've introduced one or two variations that are able to close the gap on the player and provide him with a little more threat. None of them run though.

Will we only be able to kill zombies with the classic 'head shot', then?

Yeah, zombies only die if their brain is destroyed. For the most part this means head shots, but the use of Havok physics enables us to use anything as a weapon. A zombie can be killed if he hits his head on the wall or if a piece of debris strikes his head. As far as weapons go, we have pistols (dualwield of course), shotguns (manual pump-action and semi-automatic), machine guns, sniper rifles, spearguns, riot guns and you can even bolt on a shovel for use as an impromptu melee weapon.

At first glance, COTD looks like a cousin of

the House of the Dead and Resident

Evil games. Is it going to be completely different? I'd say we'd be considerably closer to House of the Dead. But that's where the similarities end. Our nonscripted gameplay ensures that the game is different every time. The player's progress is determined by his acquired skill rather than simply remembering attack patterns.

We've read that the multiplayer games will see human versus zombie fights. How will the game be affected when

we're playing as a zombie? And also, when we're playing as a zombie, do we get the chance to infect other players?

Most definitely. The fun part comes just after the bite itself when the newly-infected player has to convince his team-mates that it was, in fact, just a scratch and he'll be fine in a minute so that they don't blow his head off. His movement eventually changes to that of a zombie - slow and shuffling - and his ability to use his weapon is almost entirely hampered. His focus becomes one of feeding on his former team-mates and his bite infects others.

Will we be able to blast zombies' legs off and still have them crawl towards us? Please say yes, please say yes!

Yes. COTD features a full dismemberment system. Heads, arms, and legs can all be blasted off with different results. Removing the legs of a zombie drops it to the floor and reduces it to a crawling pace. These crawlers are not to be ignored as every bite is lethal.

Rainbow Six: Lockdown You'll know when you've been tangoed...

IT'S BEEN a long time since we last got hands-on with Ding Chavez and company, but it's been worth the wait.

For the first time, the Rainbow Six series branches out into three different styles of game play. The first two make up the new campaign mode. Ding Chavez's missions will be most familiar to Clancy fans. You control a squad of up to three members of the Rainbow Six team using quick menu or voice commands in an attempt to infiltrate enemy territory or neutralise hostage sieges.

The biggest revolution here is the new HUD. It looks like a special-ops visor with projected indicators for ammo, health, grenades and even visibility. There's also a battery-powered heartbeat detector that will highlight nearby enemies for a limited time. While the visor is less intrusive than in previous builds, there's still something a bit Robocop about it, especially on Easy mode where square targets appear around enemies. At least this can be turned off and all the information is well presented.

Ding's team has also had a makeover. Following a tough recruitment drive, Rainbow Six has grown to 12 members! You don't get to choose who you take with you on each mission, but Ding and Dieter Weber are always in play.

Dieter's missions are the second gameplay style in Lockdown. You'll often jump into the German sniper's army boots and use your high tech WT2000 rifle to protect the rest of the team from an isolated position. You can't leave the area and usually have a very tight time limit to protect everyone.



The third gameplay style is easily the most radical. Titled 'Persistent Elite Creation', this online mode lets you create a unique counter-terrorist and tool him up with everything from weapons and armour to new uniforms and team insignia. Earn enough experience by winning battles and you'll also be able to train your Elite with various skills.

Having a character that improves the more you play on Xbox Live is a fantastic incentive. It's especially good because there are so many options, which means you can create a totally unique individual that suits your play style.

Rainbow Six: Lockdown is going to be huge on Live, but with 14 campaign missions it should also offer great entertainment for lone guns.

HIGH **MAINTENANCE** Fighting terror ain't cheap

KEEPING YOUR created Elite tooled up and ready for action can be quite expensive. Thankfully, you don't have to pay for ammo, but grenades will make a serious hole in your bank balance as well as your enemies.

'Realism' has been shoved aside in favour of true arcade racing, over-the-top jumps and the sort of drift cornering fans of Sega Rally wet themselves over. As generic a racer as LA Rush might be in some respects (free-roaming city, car-modding, the endless quest to earn 'respect'...), there's still a freshness and energy here we haven't seen since the likes of Burnout 3: Takedown (Issue 34, 9.4).

The other thing we like about LA Rush is its trashy storyline - 30 cars from your private collection have been stolen by a rival gang, and

SEVEN SORROWS, the Xbox Live update of classic arcade smash Gauntlet, continues to make pleasing progress, resulting in a game that should put the fan back into fantasy hack-and-slash come its release this winter.

The concept is simple - convoluted plot about homicidal emperors and ancient prophecies aside take six fantasy staples (Wizard! Warrior! Valkyrie! Elf! Plus two as-yet-undisclosed characters!) and let them hack, slash, lightning-bolt and potion-sup their way through a beautifully constructed fantasy world full of skeletons, trolls and other assorted nasties.

Add a clever skill concept known as the 'Junction' system, that lets different characters combine their powers for new, even more devastating attacks, and make the whole thing play co-operatively with up to four players at a time over Live. So, all the fun of the arcade original then, only at home, on your Xbox, on Live.

Better still, Gauntlet: Seven Sorrows plans to foster a whole online community of adventurers, where likeminded individuals can band together, fight monsters and trades treasures and special items between themselves, creating an almost massively multiplayer online RPG feel to the game. We're not exactly sure how it's going to work yet, but it's a much needed (and much overdue) concept for Xbox Live games in general.

And just to round things off, the man behind it all is none other than John Romero, the legendary creator of Doom, so if that's not enough to twinge your sword arm into a reflexive swipe, we don't know what is. Look out for more slashhappy info in future issues of OXM.

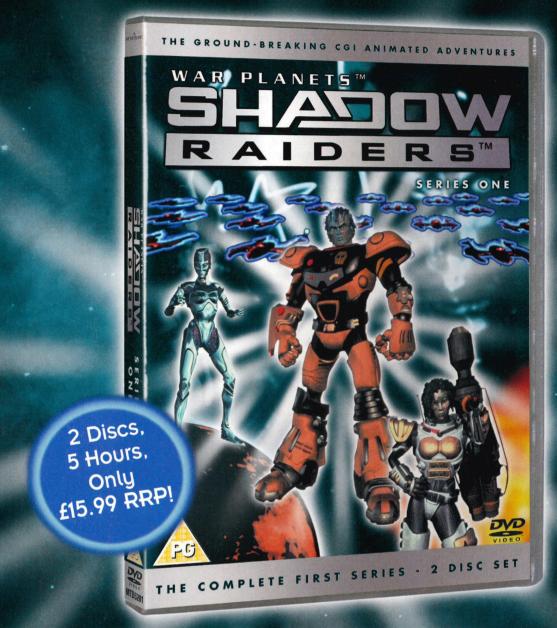




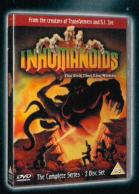

The Suffering: Ties That Bind

No longer suffering in silence...



SOME PEOPLE have it tough in life. Torque, star of the first instalment of the excellent The Suffering (Issue 29, 8.0), hasn't been blessed with the most fortunate of lives. As if being wrongly imprisoned wasn't bad enough, seeing his family die at the end of the last game was just the impetus to push him right over the edge. Relentlessly pursuing the grand manipulator (Caleb Blackmore) responsible for their fate, Torque once again comes up against a whole host of twisted characters and corpses in this sadistic shooter that's definitely not for the faint-hearted.

Atmospheric flashbacks give us disturbing glimpses of Torque's past, and when coupled with the dark, dank prison and slum environments of a dystopian Baltimore, are enough to have anyone reaching for the Prozac. Once again, players have certain morality choices to make throughout their quest, which in turn have a defining effect on events later on in the game. See that junkie lying in the gutter? Leave him be and feel good about yourself, or blow his brains out and live with the torment it's up to you. These alter Torque's flashbacks, which in turn then affect his current mental state, and thus how he deals with certain scenarios. Quite a bit deeper than your average shooter, eh?

As a direct result, Torque has multiple levels of sanity. Get him chicken oriental enough and he'll unleash his 'inner demon', a fearsome and massively destructive creature that acts as a smart-bomb game mechanic. Players can alter the

bloodthirstiness of this demon by ramping up Torque's insanity levels (achieved through being completely merciless and sadistic to enemies and innocents alike). though they'll then have to live with the consequences. Again, this level of choice and gameplay variation isn't found in a lot of straight first-person shooters, but it looks like a refreshing break from the norm.

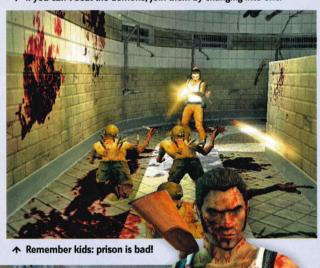
Far from being a straight sequel, The Suffering: Ties That Bind has really just tweaked the gameplay of the original. Your inventory has been streamlined and is more intuitive, and Torque now moves a lot more smoothly. He's packing a much bigger arsenal of weapons too, which is definitely a good thing, because enemy AI is tougher and smarter than a Royal Marine with a PhD in astrophysics. We enjoyed the innovative gameplay and brazen gore of the first Suffering title, so it's a fairly safe bet that we're going to love this top-looking blaster too. Book that appointment with your therapist for the game's release in September.

Kingdom Under Fire: Heroes

WE'VE SLAIN Orcs with a giant warhammer. We've rained death from above with our squads of skilled archers. We've cast down giant scorpions with fireballs from our fingertips. We're visibly shaken by the experience, dripping with sweat and almost tasting the elf-blood splattered on our faces. As players progress they'll earn XP to learn additional fighting moves and recruit more than 35 types of unit. Co-ordinating huge battles remains simple, but you'll need nerves of steel to effectively switch between units and assign them targets in the heat of battle. New, improved environments and terrain mean battles are more than just an eyes-closed button-mash - moving dragons, positioning your archers in elevated positions, flanking with your cavalry, charging with your infantry and healing everyone with your magical units are all considerations that are much more important this time round.

The impressive scale of the first title is carried over, with over 3,000 units in some of the larger

time, all impressively animated, scrapping away. The larger units are awesome, and for a game still a fair way off completion it's shaping up to be a corker. Multiplayer has been given its fair share of attention too, catering for up to six players online. Troop Battle is an all out troop-based tear up, Hero Battle is the same deal but with only one General per player, and Invasion modes are more objective based games. It's here the original four players from Crusaders join the new characters, bringing the amount of playable Generals to 11 online.

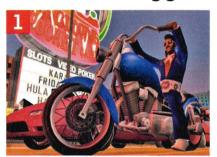

WORST, REVIEW, EVERRRR...

When I originally saw the score you gave Halo 2 in OXM 36 I was sceptical to say the least was a game so 'perfect' that it deserved a 10/10? It was after reading the review and some of the negative comments you made about the game, that I realised you had rose-tinted glasses on - ANY negatives in a game would surely mean that it does not deserve the 10/10 mark?

◆ Don't be a sinner, be a

winner!

"It is not originality and certainly not the plot... that makes Halo 2 great", and "In terms of plot, it doesn't fare so well". Does lack of originality and a rubbish plot not deserve to have a few marks knocked off? If not, why is Project: Snowblind (OXM 40) criticised for its old-fashioned mission objectives and convoluted plot? Or were these not contributing factors to its score of 8.4? If not, then only the lack of ammo leads to a drop in 2.6 points.

"Technically it's nearly flawless, despite some odd occasions where the textures are noticeably mapped on while the scene is already in progress" - So, small though they are, technical deficiencies are also not considerations for a reduction in score. You could argue that the review is subjective and is only the opinions of the reviewer, except for this statement: "One thing I am not at all happy about is the removal of the pistol" - so subjective criticism also does not warrant a loss of score.

Is there anything that does result in losing points? It appears not, in light of the review for Unreal Championship 2: The Liandri Conflict in OXM 40. I have failed to find a negative comment in this review and yet it scores only 9.2 (I say 'only' relative to the Halo 2 score). We are given no clue at all as to the reason for this 0.8 drop in score. May I suggest a return to the +/- comments box at the end of the review? This may encourage the reviewer to think about these points.

>>> mean it's over for the original Xbox. The version we played was only around 50 per cent complete, but the exercise in mass destruction is already looking mighty impressive. "We wanted to make a game that was like the no-nonsense action movies of the 1980s", explains Ward. "We're a little sad that films like *True Lies* or *Die Hard* aren't being made any more, and wanted to create a game that was all about explosive action and demolishing stuff." And from the jaw-dropping mayhem we've already seen, Criterion has done just that.

Forget multiplayer, online and co-op game modes. All that jiggery-pokery would have distracted Ward's team from the only focus of the game - which is blowing up everything around you with ferocious firepower. Before we got stuck in, Mr Ward subjected us to one of the best rants we've heard in a long time about first person shooters. He's not happy with the way things have been or are going. At all. He's bored with stealth, bored with endless menus having to be brought up during gameplay, rubbish weapons and the same old game modes. He's not a fan of Pariah (Issue 42, 8.9). Or Halo 2 (Issue 36, 10.0) either. Or the Rainbow Six series, for that matter. He does like Ghost Recon, but thinks it's a little too hard. And he thinks Black is going to set the

genre straight and get things back on track.

Our first experience of Black was in a demo room housed at the top of Criterion's offices in Guildford. The curtains were drawn and the volume cranked up to 11. Not long after, the mayhem began. We started things off in an empty room, armed with a medium-sized machine gun pointing out of a window, looking down on the quiet street below. Nothing unusual about that, you might think. "Go on, shoot something," we were told. "Okay then!" we said, squeezing the Right trigger. For the next minute after that the only thing we could hear was the GODALMIGHTY SOUND OF THE ENTIRE ROOM CRASHING DOWN AROUND OUR EARS. Imagine firing that massive chain gun out of Predator in your bedroom. Imagine the sheer damage it would cause. This was way louder, and it didn't even stop when we eased off the trigger. Glass continued to shatter as shards fell from the window frames onto the wooden floor, chunks of brickwork cracked the floorboards after they'd been ripped out of the wall, sparks were flying everywhere from a thousand ricocheting bullets... It was intense.

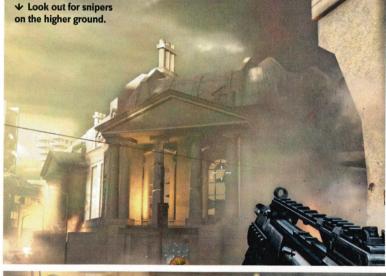
Where *Black* sets itself apart from other shooters is the sheer feeling of power you get from holding a gun in your hands. A lot of time has been spent on the animation

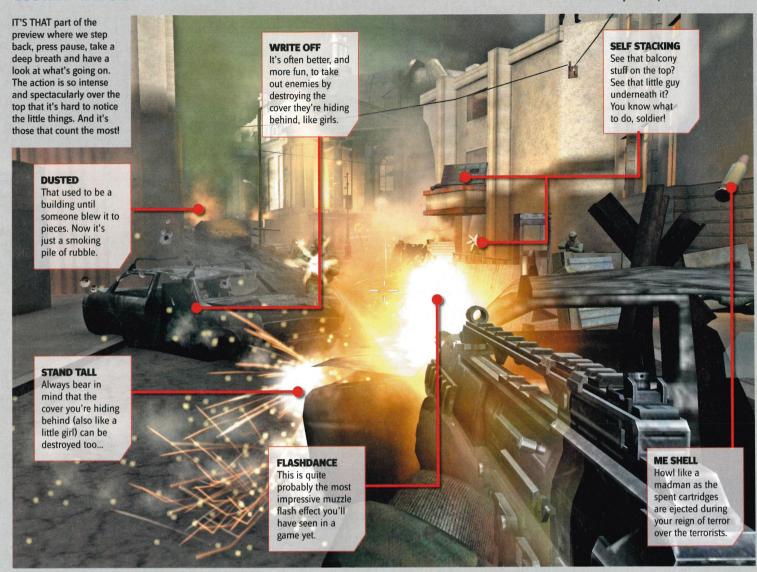

>>> of reloading and spent shells being ejected from the gun's chamber. Almost everything you see, from enemies to cars, signposts and phone booths, brick walls or public monuments can be blasted to tiny little pieces. Every texture becomes riddled with bullet holes and clouds of dust swell among the debris.

Many of today's first-person shooters rely on the physics of the Havok engine to accurately scatter objects around the environment during gameplay, but *Black*

uses Criterion's own Renderware technology to get the job done just as slickly. But blowing all this stuff up isn't just for show however – it has side effects that will kill enemies caught in the downpour of destruction. These special scripted kills are known as 'Black Ops' moments, and judging from the portion of the game we saw in action, you'll be getting a lot of Black Ops kills throughout. You'll come across them without even trying too hard either. One of the most potent examples of a Black Ops

It's hardly the most important feature in a game, but it's a good example of the attention to detail Criterion is lavishing on *Black*.









» kill can be found by lobbing a grenade at some stone pillars in front of a museum. The explosion causes the pillars to crumble, sending chunks of rock hurtling onto the enemies below.

Another simple but highly effective kill results from shooting a car that the terrorists are using for cover. Sparks fly everywhere, pieces fall off, bullet holes rattle over every surface, the windscreen shatters and the car eventually explodes in a huge fireball, annihilating everyone in range. It's highly satisfying, even more so because the destruction happens in real time and is different each time you pull the trigger.

Other Black Ops kills aren't so obvious, but are just as fun whether you're experimenting or just discovering them completely by accident. Lob a grenade through an office window and every pane of glass on the building will shatter in a lethal cascade as the explosion rips out the windows. Likewise, blast the letters on a

cinema billboard and they'll topple onto unsuspecting foes beneath.

There is a point to all this mayhem, though. At the end of each mission, you'll be awarded a special rating for your Black Ops kill combos. Perhaps unsurprisingly, it's a bit like the Traffic Attack chain system in Criterion's other big title, *Burnout: Revenge* (see page 024). It's an excellent way of encouraging you to blow the crap out of everything you see on every level, and not just the bad guys. It's almost as if the buildings and scenery are your enemies too!

Like any good Al-controlled terrorist, they're not going to take this abuse from you lying down. If a piece of debris misses them by inches, or they can see a car is about to explode, they'll run for cover. There's still a lot of work to be done on the Al from the demo we played, but Criterion Games is definitely on the case. The story involves terrorists, and you having to take them out, and that's about as deep as it goes.

>> Further adding to the chaos is one of the most important elements of any FPS - the weapons. Black's arsenal is based on realworld weapons, and feels remarkably just as powerful as the real thing. Guns such as the riot shotgun, sub machinegun, hand cannon and RPG look highly authentic, but more importantly sound amazingly formidable in your hands.

So is there any downside at all to Black? We were surprised to hear that no multiplayer modes at all are planned, especially after witnessing the frantic nature of the game. Wouldn't the hyper-realistic carnage of Black have made the perfect setting for the ultimate deathmatch frag-fest? Ward says that the team didn't just want to include deathmatch and capture the flag modes just for the sake of it, because every other game has it. He's adamant, though,

that when Black does go online, it'll have something very special up its sleeve. Expect that in the sequel, or even in the rumoured next-generation version that's yet to be confirmed. But did any lack of multiplayer really hurt Half-Life 2 or The Chronicles of Riddick: Escape From Butcher Bay? Another standard feature seen in most of today's shooters are controllable vehicles, but this isn't Burnout or Battlefield: Modern Combat.

Black has a very individual style and Criterion is going to do what it wants, not what publishers want, or what we, or even you think you want. It's a bold statement to make on Criterion's part, but one that we think will work a treat. A playable demo is in the pipeline, which should hit our coverdisc around review time early next year. Don't fret though - we'll have plenty more on this intriguing shooter in the meantime.

Killing Time

And so it ends. The sands have run dry, the world is forever changed, and the story comes full circle. Prince of Persia Kindred Blades prepares to reveal the Prince's true destiny...

HAT HAS gone before must be resolved, what is to come must be spectacular - those are the rules of a trilogy's last chapter. You have to pull out the killer ace, you have to sucker-punch the player, and you have to make damned sure that you do it in style. Enter the Prince, then, as he embarks on the

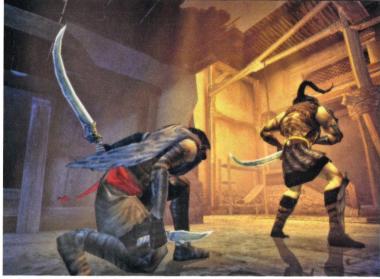
last stage of his quest to right the wrongs of so many years ago. Blood will spill, flesh will burn, but finally, the curse of the Sands of Time will be washed clean.

"The idea was always there to produce a *Prince of Persia* trilogy", Ben Mattes, producer of *Kindred Blades* tells us. "There was always plenty of subject matter, but the story was always longer than what could be told in a single game. The growth of the

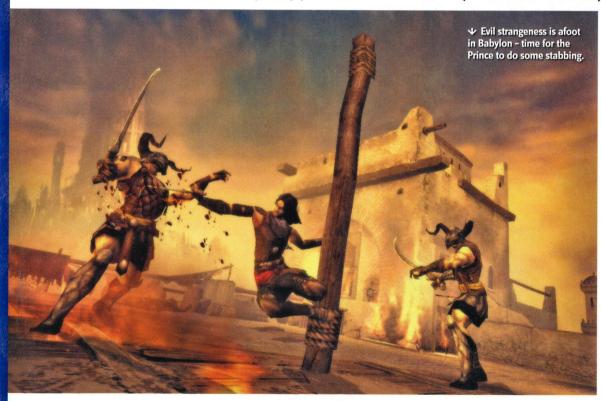

The key words here are 'hunted' and 'haunted'. The Prince is living through a waking hell, returning to Babylon to find it thick with mysterious occupying forces, all with a single intent - to kill the Prince. It's one man versus an army, a near-impossible challenge. But time is a strange master. Just as it can change the fabric of a city and alter the fate of nations, it can offer up the most unexpected, though hardly conventional ally. Kindred Blades' second playable character is, in fact, the Prince himself. It's a "buddy movie from Babylon" says creative director Jean-Christophe Guyot.

"Gameplay will play off the dichotomy of the Prince and the Sand Prince, a manifestation of the Prince which emerges when you become infected by the Sands of Time. The duality of these two princes is a

major driving force for *POP3*. The 'light' Prince is one of learning. He's becoming more noble and selfless, while the Sand Prince is the physical embodiment of the Prince's weakest personality traits – all the selfishness, recklessness and masochism we saw in *Warrior Within*.

"Because the Sand Prince is essentially an infection, he can be let loose any time like a fit of coughing. The Prince has no control over it - it's an infection that spreads through his body, and this alter ego, this Mr Hyde figure, grows and devours him. When he emerges he brings an entirely new set of manoeuvres, styles, and modes of killing."

Ubisoft certainly hasn't slacked off when it comes to the hacking off of heads or severing of limbs - there's a five-storey ideas factory in Montreal packed with passionate POP-ites to make sure of that. It must have

been tempting to just reintroduce the kills from the previous games, but several new methods of slaughter have been introduced. The Sand Prince packs a devastating chainwhip that serves just as well for swinging across rooftops as it does for using as a brutal makeshift noose on unsuspecting enemies. One yank and he's off his feet; a further yank and his head comes clean off.

Use the chain as a means to negotiate levels and perform stealth kills is important too. After all, Princey is hunted with terrible efficiency by a sinister army. If you thought the Dahaka was bad, wait till you meet Kindred Blades' elite squad of specially trained, super intelligent trackers.

"We're reworking the AI system from the ground up", Mattes tells us. "The actionadventure genre isn't really renowned for its use of AI and intelligent enemies, so we

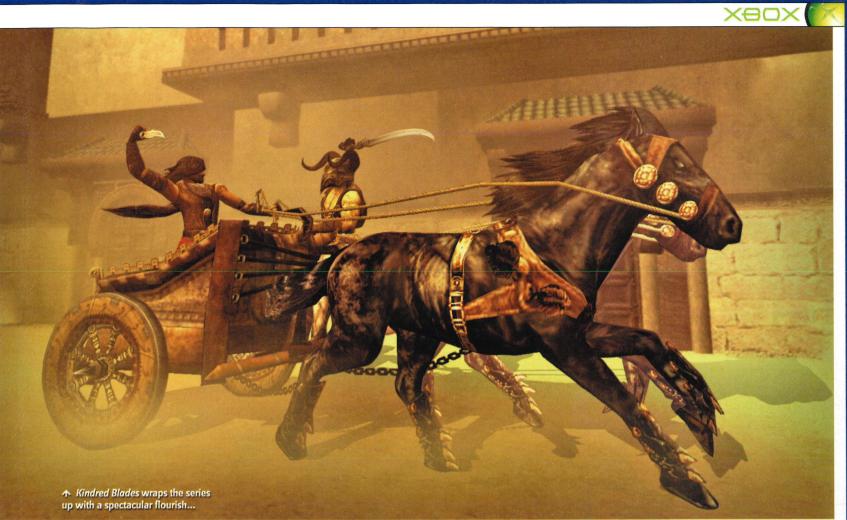

really want to change that this time around. The Al system is much more observant. Jump on a balcony containing pigeons, and the enemy will be aware of the startled birds. They can call for reinforcements or brace themselves for attack. This is not the course of action you particularly want to encourage, especially with so many enemies hunting you. That's why we've introduced the 'speed kill' system. POP3 isn't about sneaking and hiding, it's about thinking fast and identifying windows of opportunity in order to succeed. Act fast, use the Prince's acrobatic skills to turn the tide in his favour, and hopefully, by the slimmest of margins the player will be able to scrape through another potentially fatal encounter."

Given the world-exclusive first ever play of Kindred Blades, we tackle an astounding segment of combat high on the rooftops of Babylon. During a wall-run, Prince makes a diagonal leap to a balcony on which stand two heavily armed guards. Whipping out the chain mid-jump, we lasso it around the first guard's neck and use him as a improvised pole with which to swing around and boot the other guard off the balcony. When we land on our feet, the chain retracts, severing the guard's head. Our first speed kill!

You can also extend wall-runs with new 'dagger-placing' techniques. If you're coming to the end of a run, you can plant your dagger in the wall, compose yourself>>>

>>> for a second, then leap onwards. You can also make leaps across chasms and awkward spots, or descend a rope upsidedown to garotte enemies from above.

It's a spectacular show of skill, both in the Prince's new abilities and in Ubisoft's

commitment and ability to understand what gamers want from the final chapter. And that includes a proper pay-off, too. We won't see any loose ends or ambiguous epilogues.

"We want people to feel like they've accomplished something and come to a real

conclusion," Guyot says. "We've seen from other games how people don't appreciate being left hanging in the air. To complete a game is your reward. You play the game, and you're going to get something in return. In the case of *Kindred Blades*, those who



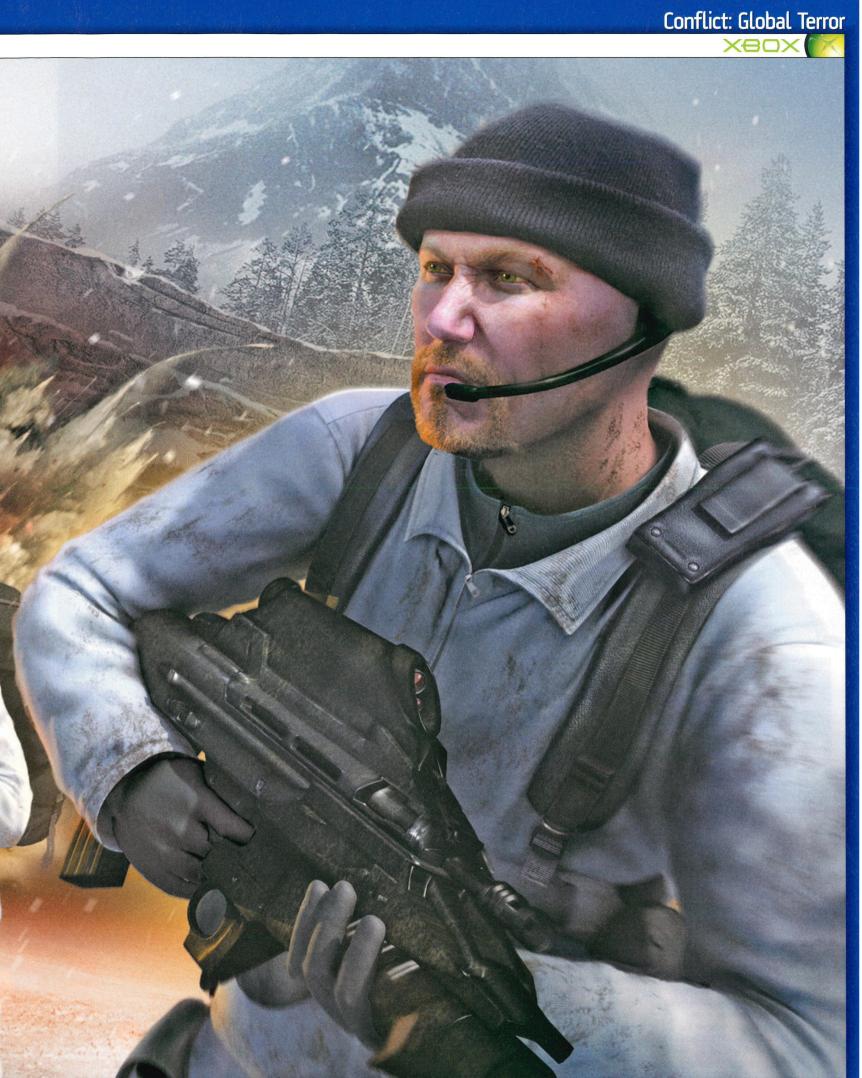
have scrutinised the series thoroughly enough will get their reward through vindication. When the final reveal takes place, and when the true puppet master behind Babylon's occupation is unmasked, the player will have a feeling of revelation, that 'Oh my God, of course!' moment. The clues are there - they always have been."

But *Prince of Persia* isn't about to jump the shark. We won't be getting a 'No, Prince, I am your father!' moment. The introduction of this new element so late in the series has been well prepared for.

'What's really cool about the Sand Prince is that he's new," Guyot tells us. "But there's something familiar about him - he's not a totally new character - so it works. They have the same history and background, but one is more given to certain types of behaviour than the other. And that's something we talked about with regards to other characters in the game. We went back and forth, weighing the pros and cons of introducing characters this late on. We're bringing back secondary characters like the old man and Kaileena. The old man lives in Babylon so it would make sense to encounter him when the Prince comes to Babylon. Nobody's just back for fun; everyone is there for a very specific reason."

Of course, Ubisoft has worked too hard and too long on this spectacular series to give us any easy answers. But there's a palpable sense of excitement from the developers. The pay-off is mere months away, this chapter of *Prince of Persia* history is soon to be closed, but before the final grain of sand falls, we're promised one of the most incredible adventures yet seen on Xbox. So if you thought the third part of a trilogy was always the weakest, prepare to think again...

The first thing we noticed about *Global Terror* was the visual improvement. Every character now boasts an incredible amount of detail, from startlingly realistic facial expressions to individual eye movements and lovingly applied creases in the uniforms. The entire game engine has been rebuilt, and the results are massively detailed, dual-layered textures on every object in the game world. Character

animation has been completely revamped as well, with a new IK (inverse kinetics) system ensuring your squad can go from running at full pace to crawling prone in one smooth and fluid movement.

And no longer will two-foot-high walls restrict this crack bunch of soldiers, as all your men have now gone through months of special training, and can now vault over railings, through windows and down ladders. "One thing that we, and countless other games, were guilty of was limiting gameplay by ridiculously silly barriers, like a small group of crates" muses Bambra. "Of course, any mobile person could easily

annoying auto-aim of Conflict: Vietnam is now replaced by an oh-so-subtle aiming assist that makes you really concentrate on your accuracy. Ordering your squad around is easier than ever, and the new quick menu system (L trigger) automatically selects all team members in one go – something the developers became aware most people were doing. Another top new feature is the Delayed Command option. Much like calling orders on Zulu a la Rainbow Six 3 (Issue 23, 9.4), this is best used in room-storming scenarios and the like. Players can simply select a pair of squad members and give them a command, before taking the

remaining soldier along then executing the context-sensitive command. Positioning them around the game world is easier, with a simple point-and-click mechanic. Players can adjust which direction their squad will face as well, which is obviously a godsend when you need a certain corner covered.

Level design is another important area that's been given a good hard scrub. "The introduction of height and verticality in each environment was a very important one," continues Bambra. "Now your squad will face fire from rooftop snipers and enemies rappelling from helicopters - something players must also take into consideration

when positioning their team." Hugely accurate ragdoll physics come into their own here too, as every object has a tangible weight and enemies, when shot, will slowly slump forwards before tumbling spectacularly to the ground.

The massively improved AI of both your team and the terrorists has come on in leaps and bounds, and in fact is some of the most astute, (and therefore punishingly

tough) we've ever seen in an Xbox title. Your squad will always assume intelligent firing positions dependent on the environment, whilst your opponents are truly something to behold. Again, they'll use any available object in the game world as cover, and are accutely aware of how much damage they can take. Finding strength in numbers, if they comfortably outnumber your team they'll storm your position, while one or

>>> two of them may lay down covering fire and run for reinforcements. They're not shy with grenades either - if your squad are clustered together they'll start raining them down on your position, and will often use smoke grenades to cover their retreat. Pivotal really wanted to simulate the experience of playing against other real-life players, and the Al displays typically human traits such as circle-strafing. Impressive.

It's no secret that sharpshooter Foley is lost early on in the game, and instead replaced with a new recruit; sassy sniper Carrie Sherman. She comes equipped with a lethal sniper rifle, and a very tasty silenced machine gun for close-quarters battle. In fact, the entire squad is packing a seriously impressive arsenal. Because of the nearfuture setting, each team member has the ability to carry two different types of rifle/heavy machine gun, all with much bigger

ammo capacities. Plenty of ammo is available, as is the ability to use enemy weapons when your own run dry. This makes for a more liberating, arcadey experience, though doesn't detract from the core strategy feel of the series. Obviously each team member retains his or her own unique skills and attributes, and using these is a key part of the game. In Bambra's words, "Connors is the guy you want

handling heavy weapons, but he's crap with a sniper rifle. And when your men go down, the TLC of Sherman is the quickest way to get them back on their feet".

A much larger selection of grenades is available, and can be cycled through with the streamlined inventory. Throwing them on the fly is easier than ever too – just tap the black button and it drops precisely where the target reticule is pointing. Your >>>>

Again, context-sensitive commands allow you to instantly heal a fallen comrade, instead of the rigmarole of pulling up your inventory, selecting an item then applying it. Healing yourself is just as quick - select a Medipac and pull the R trigger for an instant health boost, while your character automatically reverts to his default weapon.

The biggest addition to the series, however, and the one that's got us very excited, is the much-improved multiplayer. Sure, the four-way split screen returns, with each player controlling a single member. What's much more fun, however, are the new System Link and Xbox Live co-op

modes. Up to four players are catered for on each of the 14 missions from the offline campaign. But this was no easy task. "We had to make sure the game logic, scripts and Al were shared and updated as soon as any changes occurred – a very tough job."

We found two-player co-op - what fans of the series have been screaming about for

ages - to be the most fun. With each player controlling two squad members, it's a top mix of strategic co-ordination that still retains squad-based elements. Another bonus feature of the new, improved multiplayer is that you can load any of your offline games from Career mode and then continue them as a team with a friend. In essence, this means other players can jump into your single-player game at any time.

We were mightily impressed with Conflict: Global Terror. Players may be wary of the shift from open environments to more claustrophobic, urban scenarios, but thanks to some severe tweaking and streamlining of the entire game, from the interface through to the actual squad control, this never looks like becoming an issue.

Factor in the fantastic multiplayer, and Ding Chavez and co better watch their sixes as *Global Terror* looks set to storm the squad-shooter genre. We asked Bambra where the series could possibly go after this instalment. "Well, there's still loads of places we haven't been to - Africa and the Arctic, for example - so the *Conflict* team has plenty of new ground to discover yet." Let's just hope that's true.

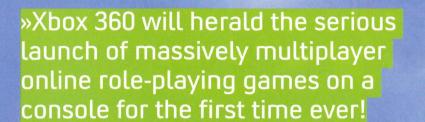

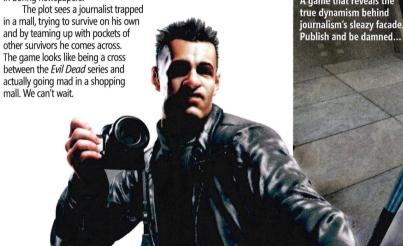

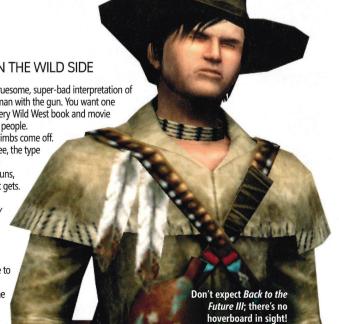

Celebrities have been paid; Maria Sharapova, Venus Williams, Andy Roddick, Lleyton Hewitt and Roger Federer have all had their people contacted by the developer's people and agreed to their likenesses being incorporated. You will be in the game too, only you're not being paid. A 'Digital Identity' gives you greater power to create an actual version of you to put in the game (only fitter and much better at tennis).

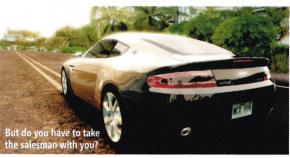
With better support for tournaments built into Xbox 360 and replacing the semi-lame XSN Sports network, this could well live up to the boast of being the greatest tennis game of all. There's no official release date for *Top Spin 2*, but expect it early in 2006. Although that's just an educated guess.

Xbox 360 Final Fantasy XI is unique. When the game arrives, you will play alongside people that have been living, breathing and attempting to breed in its online world for three years. This is thanks to the Xbox 360 game being compatible with the PlayStation 2 and PC versions of the huge role-play epic. It's going to be like walking into a small village pub where everyone knows each other. You'll be the weird outsider wearing the pink T-shirt and yellow wristband that's going to worry about getting beaten up on the way home.

Earning the respect of the hardened, existing *Final Fantasy* community will be tough, but with *FFXI* you're encouraged – and sometimes even forced – to play cooperatively to get to know your new friends. The Chains of Promethia missions – a massive downloadable extra that's going to be included in the Xbox 360 version – changed the balance of the game, and introduced more team quests, forcing players to work together and choose in-game careers that made them genuinely valuable team players instead of just wild lone frontiersmen.

Change is an ongoing theme in the FFXI universe, with regular updates eliminating cheats, adding what is technically known as 'new stuff', and opening up more areas to battle in and explore. There are 15 main jobs to take on. You can be a Monk, a Beastmaster, a popular Warrior type, or a magic-based Mage, opting to play solo or taking the easier route up through the ranks by attaching yourself to a team for mutual protection as you develop.

Techniques known as Skill Chains rely on players fighting together to defeat enemies, with sequential attacks of the same variety linking together for super damage. But we can only scratch the surface of what's on offer in *Final Fantasy XI*, for it is without doubt the biggest, most detailed and in-depth adventure game on the Xbox 360 horizon.

Finally, it's strongly rumoured that a beta test — a limited trial to make sure everything works before the game's official release — will start for Xbox 360 Final Fantasy XI alongside the console's launch. Which means you could be playing FFXI as soon as November 2005. Stay tuned for more details on the beta test and this massively-multiplayer monster.

SELECT SCREENSHOT...

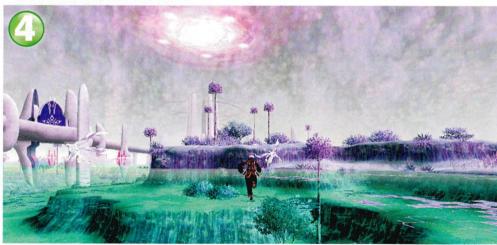

IT'S A SLIGHTLY slower-paced psychological thriller, this one, and it's already outraging the media thanks to its use of sticks with nails in. As well as that, you'll be needing forensic skills to get through *Condemned*, as you — playing the role of Serial Crime Unit agent Ethan Thomas — set about hunting down serial killers.

Maker Monolith wants the game to be disturbing and nasty. To record the horror so you can send it to *The Daily Mail*, *Condemned* gives you a digital camera, video camera and PDA — all of which are used to communicate clues back to your research assistant at HQ. Your assistant — let's call her Scully — then sends back information and plot updates based on your findings.

There are puzzles to solve, things to examine and places to explore, slowing the pace of the game and making it more of a thoughtful affair than the all-out slasher these images suggest. Oh, and you go slightly mad. Mr Thomas gradually unravels mentally as you play, leading to all sorts of insanity and perception problems.

The weaponry is... everything. You can rip lumps of scenery off to use, lift up floorboards for makeshift clubs, or grab pipes and tear planks off wooden benches to use during the non-psychological fighting bits. You can fight with your hands, too, tearing away at the killers to stay alive. It's going to be nasty and probably quite good. *Condemned* should appear alongside Xbox 360 on launch day.

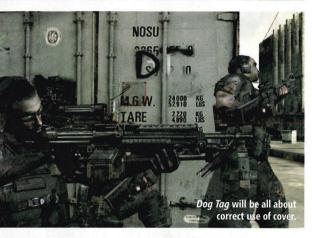

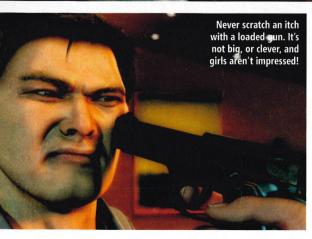

Batman Begins

The movie tie-in that's set to rewrite movie tie-in rules - by actually being good

HERE'S NO MESSING about with reasons, motivations or boring old character development at the start of *Batman Begins* – within seconds of starting you're kicking in heads and flying around a dirty mental asylum. It's an impressive opening, one which lets you know

the most important thing about *Batman Begins* - it's easy to play. It's an action game you can play with only one button, it's a stealth game you never get frustrated playing and it's a driving game that's *Burmout 3*. More on that later.

A brief training mission comes after this bombastic opening, with Bruce Wayne flashing back a year and relocating to the Himalayas to train at the hands of his double-crossing ninja masters. And then – just like in the film – the action flashes back to modern-day Gotham City and starts letting Batman bust heads with his new-found skills.

So yes. It's quite a lot like the film, and the between-level clips of the movie ruin the plot if you

haven't already seen it. What the game also does is add more stuff to pad it out. In the film, Batman just sort of appears at the docks for the drugs bust bit – but in the game you see him get there, mess about behind the scenes beating people up, play a whole mission not featured in the film at all, and then head off down into the sewers for another original bit – before it all ties in again with the movie and a few more video clips.

A lot of the fun players are going to have here is pointing at the screen and saying "Oh yes, it's that bit from the film", then seeing what new stuff has been shoehorned in. Sadly, though, this *Batman* game has been through the Electronic Arts homogeniser, resulting in the most disgraceful addition to the Bat-franchise since Arnie's turn in *Batman & Robin* – a 'Respect' meter.

Yes, as in every other EA production, Batman Begins issues troublesome-youth-friendly 'Respect' points for pulling off spectacular moves. But in fact, what it's really doing is just saying you've got some 'Respect' for completing a part of the game you'd have to complete anyway, Respect meter or not. We hate these meters and the last thing we need to see after dispatching a room full of grunts in a cool, cape-swirling Batman style is the message "Respect Increased" popping up on the screen. It cheapens the mighty Batman mythology!

Bonus info

AND THEN I...

The plot is told via you overhearing the bad guys chatting away. Sometimes you look under doors with your optic cable, listen in for



a bit, then run off to hide in the shadows when the enemy says he's off out for a walk. Paying attention to the dialogue is essential and interesting, too.

The idea behind the Respect gauge is a little flimsy anyway. This and each level's Fear meter are supposed to reflect how scared the bad guys are of Batman, with panicky dudes more susceptible to Batman's attacks than calm ones. In practice, it makes little difference, with the idea behind each mission being (a) disable the blokes with the guns, then (b) beat up the unarmed others.

It's also a little odd - pull a switch to release some crates and the bad guys get so scared they all drop their guns so you can fight them. If you were one of those bad guys and were shitting yourself that some dark, mysterious monster was coming to get you, wouldn't you be holding onto your AK47 a bit tighter when the scary stuff goes down, rather than just dropping it on the floor when Batman knocks over some barrels?

Once you've disarmed the goons, the fighting action is just about acceptable. It's a poor man's Ninja Gaiden, with constant holding down of the block button – which NG-lovers will be infuriated to find switched to the Right trigger – combined with the counter attacking X button getting you through most fights unscathed.

If you are knocked down, the B button does a spinning-leg getting up attack, which also comes in handy against blocking enemies – a slower attack can be pulled off to break their guard and let you start hammering punches and kicks again until they fade from view in an unsatisfactory manner. It's not a demanding or complicated combat system. The Himalayan training section highlights this extremely well, declaring you a Master Ninja after all you've done is climb along a pipe for a bit and press X to beat three ninjas.

But that's okay, because *Batman Begins* is more about stealth than action. Clicking the left stick puts you in the familiar crouching pose, with any nearby enemies popping up on a little radar, so you can see which direction they're looking and if they have a gun. If they do, your next task is to sneak up behind them and press B to knock them out. If they're gun-less, you can run in and press X to knock them out in an action style.

Occasionally, you come across a room full of three enemies all carrying guns - your cue to climb a ladder and go through the other door. It's a stealth game, but it's a very, very simple one.

BURNOUTMOBILE

We couldn't quite believe what we were seeing when we played the Batmobile driving section for the first time – it's an incredibly shameless copy of Burnout 3. You have a nitro button, you ram enemy cars off the road – complete with slowmo replays. It even racks up a score at the end. It is Burnout 3!

BLOCK TACTICS

The Right trigger button is your block button. As with the mighty *Ninja Gaiden*, you can hold



this down and press a direction to roll out of danger, and there's one innovation as well – pressing X while blocking does a counter attack. A clever idea, but one that makes the game's fighting sections ludicrously easy.

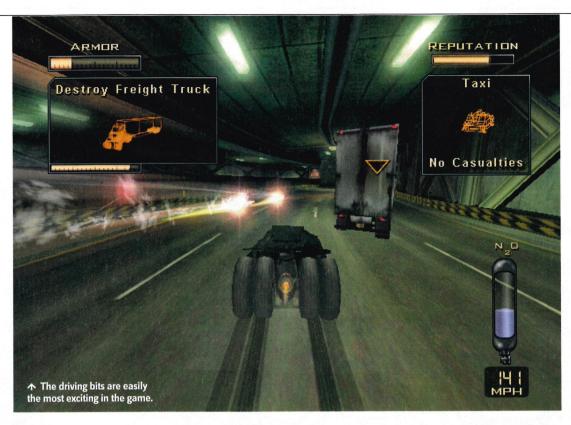

Like most big-budget, extremely important videogames, there's very little wrong with Batman Begins. It looks quite okay, the way it plays is extremely simple and you won't ever get lost, or confused, or angry thanks to the big, obvious arrows that point where to go all the time.

Our main whinge is that it's a little too full of familiar themes. You sneak up behind people, you ram cars off the road in the obviously copiedoff-Burnout 3 driving bit that even racks up the

value of the cars you've wrecked, you solve puzzles and climb over crates - it's quite a shameless assault of gaming clichés.

But we still like it. It's polished. If you jump up to get a ledge, you will land on it. Nothing goes wrong, the game's kind to you. There are no awkward glitchy bits, you can rattle through it really quickly and it feels like the shiny, well-produced and inoffensive product that it needs to be.

It's good. Clichéd nonsense, but good. Think of this as a kind of slightly worse Ninja Gaiden with stealth bits, or as a user-friendly introduction to the world of stealth games, and you'll get a good few hours of fun out of Batman Begins.

Worms 4: Mayhem

The new benchmark in 3D Worms games is here

F YOU CUT a worm in two it most certainly does not grow into new worms. It'll spurt its greyish guts everywhere, convulse a little, ooze out a strange dark-green substance, then die. We know, we tried it when we were kids. Andy Davidson was having much more fun when he was a kid, though. He was creating Worms between sitting exams, just so he could destroy them in more inventive ways. Who'd have thought we'd be sitting here all these years on with Worms 4: Mayhem on our lap, experiencing the closest a current-gen console has ever come to creating the thrill of the original Worms?

Much has changed along the way. If the worms weren't dressing up as Vikings, they were building forts. All the construction and fancy dress stuff was in danger of overshadowing the point -Worms isn't about building, it's about demolition, and that's precisely what you get with Mayhem.

The basic premise of Mayhem is virtually the same as every other Xbox Worms title - tit for tat

turn-based violence using household implements and members of the clergy as weaponry. Banana bombs are so passé, darling! Actually, as well as the usual suspects (banana bombs included), the range of weapons on offer is the biggest yet seen in a Worms game. They aren't varieties of similar weapons dressed in different guises either, but distinctly new ways of offing the enemy, such as the inflatable Scouser. Send the moustachioed menace ambling towards a worm and once he makes contact with them, he'll stick to them, inflate, and the whole permed caboodle will ascend high into the clouds. If you need to make sure you know where your enemy is at all times, just ram rusted masonry nails through their tails. They wouldn't be able to move even if there was a five-year-old stood over them with Mum's best cutlery. And if the default weapons aren't your bag, you can always make your own. See 'Da Bomb' for full building instructions and blueprints!

The customisation aspect of Worms 4: Mayhem doesn't stop there either - it's fun to create bouncing eyeball bombs packed with explosive pork-chops, but there's so much more tinkering to be done. You can now alter your team's physical appearance, adding hairstyles, hats, glasses, and a veritable whore's handbag of other knick-knacks and accessories. Want to see a pissed-up Scottish >>>

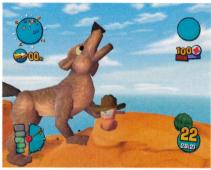

We recommend the sniper rifle or new poison arrow, both of which are precise in their purpose and far more effective at killing than, say, a 200 pound comedy cow.

At its core, Mayhem is a leaner, less confusing entry to the Worms universe than Forts Under Siege, returning the series to a time when wormkilling was simple and death came in the form of an exploding sheep. With Live as standard these days, it's what Worms 3D should have been a couple of years ago. It's just a shame it's taken so long to get here.

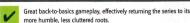

Capcom Fighting Jam

Not as fresh or as fruity as it once was

NE WAY OR another, we're all trying to recapture our youth. We haven't hit midlife crisis and bought a Porsche just yet, but playing videogames for a living? Guilty as charged. Playing the Xbox versions of coin-ops of yesteryear? Yep, that too.

Capcom Fighting Jam brings together five different groups of fighters from five very different Capcom coin-ops. Unlike a cringe-inducing family wedding however, these distant relations provide a much more appealing flock to get scrappy with.

Characters from Street Fighter II, III, Alpha, Darkstalkers and the weird creatures of Red Earth are on offer. Each group of fighters has their own array of special moves unique to their particular era, though this is a double-edged sword. The original SF II characters go without these generic match-winners, instead relying on their super combo moves, executable once their combo meter is full after landing a string of successful blows, or they themselves receive a battering. These obviously involve complex button sequences, though the devastating results, unique to each character, are well worth learning, although the huge downside is that fighters from the later titles have a discernible advantage over the (seemingly simpler and therefore weaker) SF II characters.

Arcade and Versus mode are where you'll be spending most of your time (well, all of it actually, seeing as these are the disappointingly scant game modes on offer), where players take part in two-vstwo matches against another player or CPU

opponents. You select two different fighters, but you don't get to see the opposition beforehand. It pays to pick two contrasting styles to protect against any eventuality, encouraging players to experiment with the whole complement of fighters.

But although Capcom has provided a decent array of characters, the inherent imbalance of ability between them means you may well end up furiously learning up a couple of characters from Red Earth, and that's it. The pixellated sprite animations are pleasingly faithful, but look painfully out of place among today's games, as does the often frustratingly slow pace of the game.

Live is included as part of the deal, and further downloadable characters, stages and moves are promised. Which will make the purists squeal, though they may be the only parties really interested in this blast of rose-tinted nostalgia.

2 Multiplayer Map Pack marks the first time we've truly reviewed a sole expansion pack like this one. Gamers with Xbox Live have had access to four of these maps (two free, two as Premium Content, but currently also free) for the last few

months, but MS has now released a retail version of the pack for players who are lovin' the LAN (the five new maps are available to download on their own over Live for £7.99 if you already have the other four). Obviously, any game type and conceivable weapon set apply to virtually every map, though when reviewing each one we played the modes we thought the most suited to that map.

A bastard child of the Longest map in the first Halo, only with two conveyor belts moving along each corridor in opposite directions. These carry a series of cargo crates, which make excellent portable cover. It's dead easy to hop onto a crate then up

onto the ledges above, making scrambling for cover dead easy. Get caught out in the corridors below though, and it's like sprouting fins and being shot at in a wooden liquid container. Although the moving crates do offer some degree of cover, they can often get in the way when you're trying to dash into one of the numerous alcoves littered either side.

Backwash

Probably the most atmospheric and unbelievably tense map, this is set in Halo's swamp environment. A two-tiered compound forms the centre of a cruelly claustrophobic, dark and dingy bowl. Gnarly trees and rotting trunks scattered around offer some degree of cover, though we found the best way to play was to charge round in a blind rage, always keeping on the move.

Because of all the mist, visibility is severely limited - if you're holding the Plasma Sword you'll dominate this map, though that doesn't come without consequence; the glow of the blade will give away your position to >>

>> others from a fair distance away. This accentuated sense of atmosphere really works, and the fine balance of the pros and cons of using the sword add a significant amount to the mix.

Floating above the Covenant planet High Charity, this is a truly gorgeous map. Another tight and claustrophobic experience, a large open area in the centre of the map makes this excellent for fast and frantic games of Slayer. It can be frustrating to spawn on the outside of the structure, particularly when you can hear the kill-tastic slaughtering going on inside, but quick access via a multitude of doors and ramps get players right back in there. The sword will spawn right in the centre of the middle tree - again, the fine balance of risk versus reward for retrieving it is adequately addressed.

An absolutely beautiful game environment, this brings back memories of Ivory Tower. Tranquil areas of beach and sea surround a large structure in the centre of the map, and the generous amount of terrain happily accommodates vehicles. Crashed ships provide plenty of ammo and weapons too, so you're never caught short on the beach. Particularly suited to Team Slayer with snipers, a floating



lookout platform is a great vantage point, though it's far too easy to be picked off by anyone else with a sniper rifle, no matter where their location on the map. Playing CTF could be something of an issue here as well, as there are far too many quick and easy routes around the outside of the main structure.

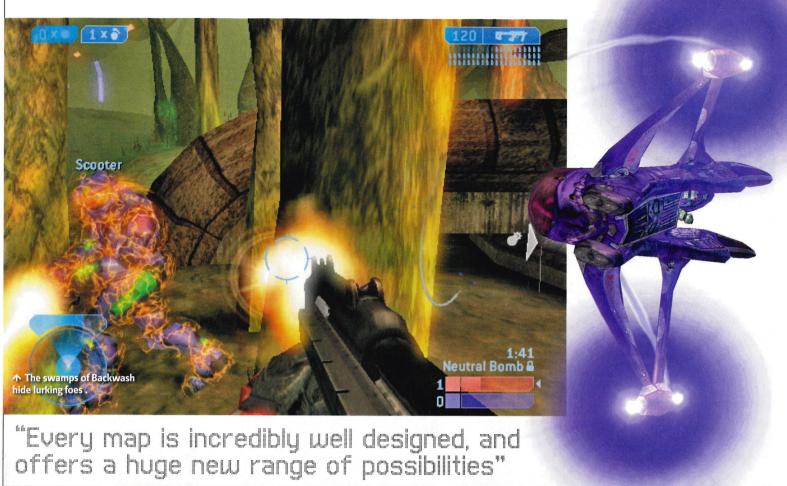

An isolated area of debris and cargo crates provides the focal point of the combat – Team Slayer matches, with motion trackers off, was a tense yet fast-paced affair.

Sanctuary

Another one of our favourites, this gargantuan arena is set among another gorgeously lit backdrop, and features some seriously sweet water effects. Ancient

ruins house two identical bases, linked by a series of walkways. The symmetrical nature of the map makes it perfect for Capture the Flag games, and there's enough rubble and objects littered all over the entire map to use as cover points, as well as loads of fantastic camping spots. An outstanding map, and one that deserves to be up there with the best of them.

Containment

Taking a bite out of Sidewinder's pie, this epic, icebound arena is an amazingly impressive bout of vehicle-based destruction. Because of its size, any vehicle can be accommodated, and the map provides a real challenge for objective-based gameplay like CTF. Incredibly good fun, but anything under the full complement of 16 players and things can get boring and laborious.

Warlock

Already one of the most played maps on Live, this indoor map is based on the original Wizard environment from *Halo*. Not overly huge, it's best suited to small, quick games like Slayer or Oddball, thanks to the multitude of platforms and cover.

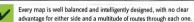

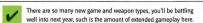

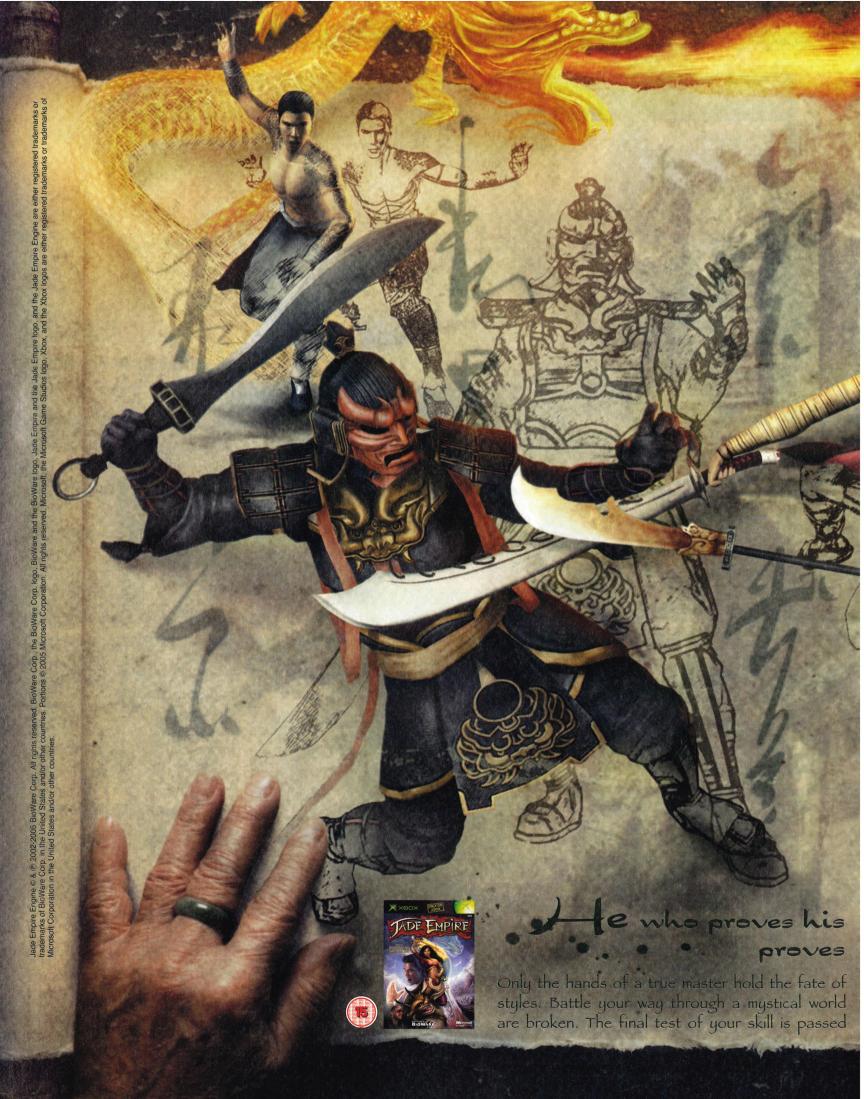

King of Fighters: **Maximum Impact Maniax**

King of Fighters in 3D? It's the FUTURE!

T'S TAKEN LONG enough, but full marks to SNK for finally dragging its venerable twodimensional King of Fighters series kicking and screaming (literally) into the 21st century. In a world where mobile phones are rapidly approaching the size of grains of rice and plans are being drawn up for holiday parks on the moon, King of Fighters has finally seen fit to enter the futuristic world of 'three-dee' images

Not that everybody will be happy about it. Hardcore KOF fans won't like it - to them it'll be nothing short of newfangled witchcraftery - but for the rest of the world, a world already wallowing in the accumulated love drizzle of both Soul Calibur II (Issue 21, 9.1) and Dead or Alive Ultimate (Issue 39, 8.8), this is exactly what the doctor ordered.

Mai Shiranui's heaving bosom redesigned to fully utilise the immense funbag recreating power of Xbox? Lead on, good sir, lead on.

Admittedly, there are problems, number one of which is the fact that Maximum Impact looks distinctly rough around the edges - prop it up against the stunningly beautiful DOA Ultimate and

it looks positively sketchy in comparison - but let's not be put off too much. Like all good fighting games it's the fisticuffs that's important here and KOF: MIM boasts a decent combat system. Mixing fast chain combos with more traditional 2D fighting game techniques (Street Fighter fans take note, we're talking quarter circle fireball moves here) it feels both familiar and different. Better yet, it's very fast (far more so than DOA Ultimate) and refreshingly easy to pick up, making it ideally suited for the button-mashing, fighting game novices.

It's also fully Live playable as well, which, as we've seen from the DOA Ultimate phenomena, is a massive lifespan extender for any one-on-one fighter these days. But beyond the multiplayer, the single player arcade mode, a perilously brief mission mode and a few multiplayer tweaks, there's very little else to Maximum Impact, and that's its biggest failing. Without a ridiculously long list of unlocks to pick through or endless Soul Calibur II-style quest modes to hack away at, the game ends up with very little to differentiate itself from all the other one-on-one fighters out there.

Battles are buzzy, entertaining affairs, full of energy and outrageous special moves, but as a complete package this falls way short of what we'd expect, especially when for the same money (thirty quid) you could probably pick up DOA Ultimate or Soul Calibur II. Or both even. Entertaining then, but by no means essential.

O, THERE'S not been a mistake. You've not stumbled onto a retro arcade feature or a reader's own game submission page by accident. The screenshots you see here are from an actual, real, brand new Xbox title and this isn't a joke.

King of Fighters 2002 might have gone down a storm with the 2D fighting masters when it was first released in Japanese arcades four years ago, but even with the bonus of Live support this is not the sort of game we expect to see on the Xbox in 2005.

"Ah, but it's a really deep, technical fighting game!", the fans might argue. And yes, from a certain point of view that's true. If there's one thing history's taught us, it's that 2002 is probably the

high point of the longrunning 2D *King of Fighters* series. So yes, providing

you've got the thumb dexterity of a double-jointed, ambidextrous, Yugoslavian thumb wrestler, you have the mental capacity to reel off 50-odd button-press combinations from memory and you don't mind graphics that look like they're one step removed from Ceefax circa 1985, you'll probably eke some kind of fun from this. But in this post DOA Ultimate (Issue 39, 8.8) era, who but a handful of dedicated retro fans are going to have the time or enthusiasm to really appreciate that depth, let alone pay good money for a game they've probably got on some other system already anyway? Not us, certainly.

Perhaps if Ignition had been good enough to release KOF 2002 as part of a retrospective compilation pack then we would have thought differently. King of Fighters 2000-2005 perhaps, with a flashy front end and a couple of KOF anime DVDs thrown in for good measure. Instead we get a handful of dull, text-based menu screens and 90s throwback gameplay that seems to think it can parade around on the back of a reputation built up over years of arcade hammerings. Sorry to burst your bubble King of Fighters, but not even Capcom could manage that with its significantly more psychedelic Capcom Fighting Jam (see page 083).

We're not questioning the worth or the technical quality of 2D fighters here. Just the sense in releasing a game that's four years old, looks much older and has no relevance to the majority of today's gamers for what is the comparatively expensive price of £20. Even hardcore King of Fighters fans would have trouble building a viable argument against that.

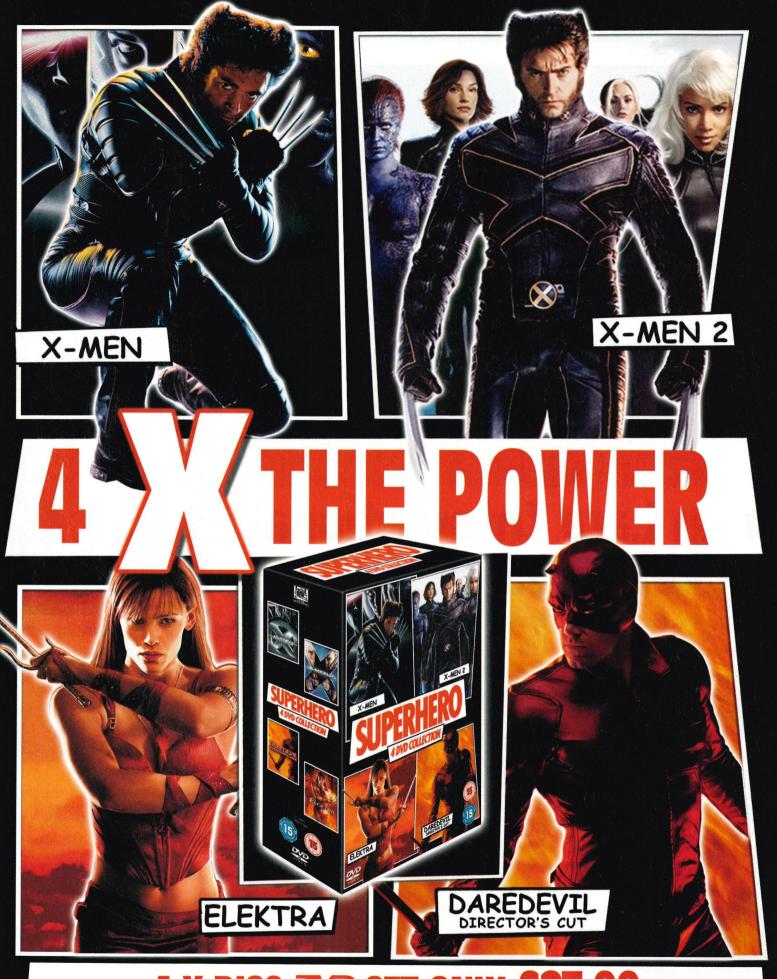

Brian Lara International Cricket 2005

Lara's back! No, the other one! Step aside, EA Cricket...

F YOU'RE A fan of cricket - and we're assuming that since you've been good enough to put aside five minutes of your time just to read about an Xbox game based on the love it/loathe it summer sport, then you must be a fan - there's probably only one question you're asking. To wit; which is better: EA's Cricket 2005 (Issue 44, 6.7) or this, Codemasters' Brian Lara International Cricket 2005. And while a quick glance at the respective scores might suggest an open and shut case in Brian's favour, it's actually a good deal more complicated.

The thing is - brace yourself - Electronic Arts' Cricket 2005 is actually the better game. It looks better, it features more teams and competitions, it has greater depth, and the general all-round presentation is superior. And yet Brian Lara still scores higher. Why? Because while Cricket 2005 insists on alienating newcomers with its frustratingly difficult to master batting system, Brian Lara is perfectly tailored for those looking to pick up and play a few overs with friends. With a simplified set of controls and a perfectly tweaked playing mechanic based on nearly ten years of previous Lara games, anybody with half a mind to grab the willow will soon be knocking out the sixes or bowling the perfect yorker. To put it another way, Brian Lara is simply the more fun of the two.

It makes a big difference. Instead of thrashing frantically about in front of the stumps, desperately wrestling with the controls in an effort to squeeze out more than 20 runs in a single innings (as was the case with *Cricket 2005*), *Brian Lara* lets you rack

up an actual cricket score, while still offering plenty of challenge on the higher difficulty levels. If we worked in PR, we might even call it "the best Cricket game on Xbox... ever!"

And if all you're after is a simple cricket effort to knock about with until the football season kicks off again, *Brian Lara* is ideal. But if you're after the complete cricket package, one that offers a truly broad range of clubs, competitions and options then it's a game you'll probably find a little on the lightweight side.

In its favour, Codemasters has managed to bag the official ICC rights to the Cricket World Cup and Champions trophy, including all the official teams, venues and player names (although, bizarrely, if you're not playing in these specific tournaments all the player names revert to rubbish rip-offs, like M Triscathack and A Flantiff). Beyond that there's a fantasy World XI Challenge in which you have to beat a Planet Earth team using progressively rubbish Test sides, Double Wicket – essentially ultra-quick, two-over matches – and the option to set up a user-defined Tour or League. And with only 14 national sides to choose from and no club

True, you could argue that once you've finally mastered the controls of Cricket 2005, its deeper batting and bowling systems will provide a far lengthier challenge than Brian Lara, but who's got the inclination to put that much effort into EA's title? And besides, when was the last time anybody at EA scored more than 500 runs in a single first-class cricket innings.

A bit clunky in the visual department, a bit limited with regards to content and potentially a bit too simplified to keep your interest for more than a few months at best, but in terms of sheer gameplay appeal Brian Lara is the winner.

Rapala Pro Fishing

Is your rod strong or your fingers fishy enough?

SK ANYONE who's spent the night shivering on a riverbank in the name of enjoyment and they'll tell you it's not catching the fish that really matters, but the time spent doing it. Yeah, whatever. After a few hours spent reeling 'em in on *Rapala Pro Fishing*, it's all about the fish. Luckily for netting novices like us, the game makes bagging a trout, salmon or all manner of native American fish a piece of pish thanks to very arcadey gameplay.

Players simply select either Free Fishing mode (akin to a casual Sunday afternoon on the lake) or Tournament mode, where various sets of gear, rods and lures are unlocked. It would have been nice to actually know what we had to do during each castoff to satisfy each of the criteria, but hey. To bag that bigmouth bass, simply select a lake to fish on, then zoom to a suitable location in your boat, though clumsy controls mean you'll be beaching on the bank a fair few times. As a rule, areas with vegetation are the most fruitful, though each lake is suitably large in scale to find your own patch.

Casting is a bit trickier, involving a careful right analogue/L trigger timed-release affair, but once

mastered is eyes-closed easy. Simply reel in your lure or leave it drifting for a passing fish, wait for a bite, then yank in the slack and reel her in. Different lures will have an effect on your success (depending on the environment and type of fish you're catching), though as far as gameplay variation goes, that's it. The lakes and fish may vary, but this measured approach and relatively low skill level of the gameplay doesn't. Which is precisely where *Rapala Pro Fishing* flounders; it's fun while the novelty hasn't worn off, but very repetitive and dull soon afterwards.

F, LIKE US, you wasted countless hours on the furiously addictive 2D Flash game that provided the inspiration for this £19.99 Xbox title, it may come as a bit of a shock that this is truly, truly abominable.

On the plus side, at least this Xbox version won't get you fired for wasting your company's time (in this PC-crazy world isn't that classed as 'stealing' nowadays?). On the downside, the regular Flash version was much more fun. Seriously. Surprisingly long load times (for what exactly? The visuals are more reminiscent of a PlayStation 1 title) punctuate not only each different game, but the length of time between each go is also annoyingly large. At least the PC version allowed instant flipper-twatting fun.

Single player mode involves familiar sub games such as Penguin Baseball, Penguin Golf, Penguin Darts (you can sense a theme developing here), Halfpipe Race and Seagull Drop. The controls for these feel clumsy, and the switch from 2D to 3D feels shoddy and contrived. One difference is that your projectile can now be controlled, both in the air and while skidding along the ground. Bonus icons that can be collected for increased points/ speed/time that add a little more playability to the

otherwise woeful proceedings, but not enough to really save it from the plunging into the icy depths of monotony.

Up to eight players can battle it out through Tournament mode, but you have to take it in turns to play one at a time, on the same screen. And after you've sat through the third round of Penguin Darts for the sixth time, the novelty and 'party' atmosphere of this really starts to wear off. Very quickly. Xbox Live scoreboards are on offer, but who wants to compare points totals when playing against each other would have been a lot more fun? This is sure to instantly melt away in this hot summer of blockbusters.

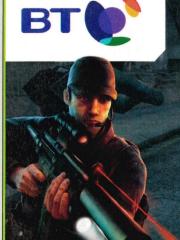

LIKE ANY soldier, if you want to survive you have to go through the rigours of MOUT training. There's a lot to learn, but these five bite-sized missions make lobbing grenades and flanking enemies seem like a walk in the park, albeit one littered with anti-personnel mines.

Try to get your teams heading the same way, but always on opposite sides of the street. With one team always watching the other team's back, enemies should never be able to flank you and pick you off.

One superb tactic is to make Alpha team lay down suppressive fire while Bravo creeps into grenade-throwing range. Smoke grenades will also keep the enemy in a state of confusion. Team Casualties can't be left behind to die you have to carry them to the nearest medical station before they bleed to death. This will slow the team down considerably, so don't stray into the firing line too often!

STEP BACK IN time for some classic racing action! You get a quick race around the Tornado Pass with five other racers to heat. There are two cars to choose from: the Renault 5 Turbo II '85, and the sexy Subaru Impreza WRX '01.

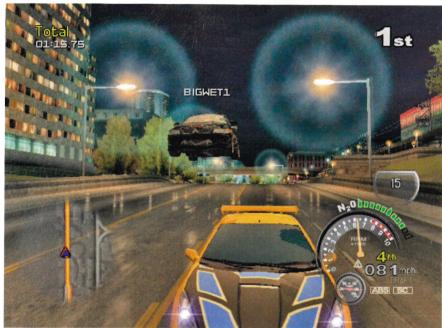

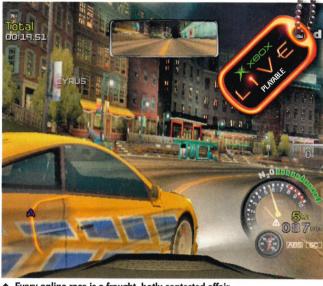
IT REALLY HAS been like driving in the rush hour over the past few months, as we Xbox owners have been positively spoiled by a glut of top online-enabled racers. And although it comes squealing out of the Xbox Live garage at the same time as the excellent Juiced (page 112), and boasts the same neon lover's paradise as far as visuals are concerned, unfortunately, Street Racing Syndicate can't touch THQ's racer for dust online. Really, it's nowhere near as sweet to play.

That's not to say SRS isn't a solid Live title, because it actually plays fine. Rather well, if we're being honest. A decent amount of game modes are on offer, like the customary Quick Race, along with the fun Collection Race modes, where players race to pick up more than 50 per cent of the relevant icons dotted around the city. The fabled pink slip races, similar to those in Juiced, are present here too. Race any of your cars from your offline career mode against a fellow driver, and brilliantly/

frustratingly (depending on the result), the winner gets to keep the loser's car. Forever.

Team versions of each of these races are available, and would have been a really great touch, especially a manic Team Collection dash around the mean streets of Philly. Unfortunately, the fundamental setback SRS suffers from, in that only four players can race at any one time, hinders this. Maybe we've been spoiled recently, but we really expect at least eight players to be able to line up in any driving title. Collisions can be switched off, which is a godsend thanks to the banana-skins-on-ice handling of the cars - leave it on and newbie racers will incur the wrath of more experienced, serious drivers. There's also the option to eliminate Nitrous use, to stop spawny drivers nicking that win at the last second after taking you out on the previous corner.

There's nothing radically wrong with SRS, aside from the disappointing lack of players. But considering the competition, this can't muster the horsepower to keep up with the pack. Sure all the pretty bodywork and countless track combos are here, but it ultimately lacks the playability of Juiced, MC3 et al to really blow us away.

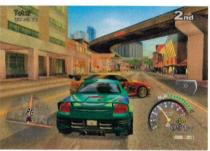

WITH THE EXCEPTION of Halo 2 (Issue 36, 10.0), no other game has produced so much frenzied argument and debate on the OXM forums as WWE Wrestlemania 21. Delayed time after time after time, WWE fans have had a rough ride of it over the past few months, and the worst of it is, after all that patient waiting, the end result is a game that barely manages to be adequate. It's like waking up after the sexiest dream ever, only to find Rikishi squatting over you instead. Grim.

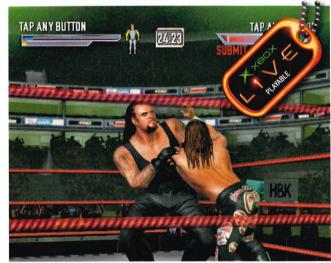
The problem here is that all the technical flaws of the main game - the glitchy combat, the suspect collision detection, the tendency to get stuck on the mat and end up never being able to get up as other wrestlers continually rain blows down on you - are just as present in the online game. If you could put up with these problems offline, fair enough, If you're already sick of endless glitches, Live Wrestlemania isn't going to swing your opinion.

In fact, start scraping through the thick, greasy surface of Wrestlemania's Live game and you'll begin to see even more embarrassing flaws. Like the fact that Wrestlemania suffers from more than its

fair share of lag. It isn't horrendous, but it's enough to start questioning the quality of programming behind it. Especially since, like in DOA Ultimate, perfect timing is needed for the counter moves. It's fine when there are just two of you on screen, but chuck in a load of wrestlers and you can say goodbye to reaction-based counters. And secondly, given this is still one of the biggest-selling Xbox games around at the moment, we had a hell of a job trying to find somebody to play. Perhaps everybody got sick of the offline game and decided not to bother with the Live mode either?

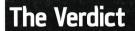

Area 51

This area contains few signs of intelligent lifeforms...



IN THE GREAT intergalactic scheme of things, Area 51 is somewhere up there with the Apollo 9 space crew. Remember intrepid astronauts James McDivitt or Russell L Schweickart? Exactly. We doubt they even remember each other. Well, come a few months, by which time we imagine Area 51 will have quietly slipped from the charts (at the time of writing, it was holding on for dear life), we suspect its Live activity will be as devoid of life as space itself. Space is hardly a hive of activity, in case you didn't know.

There are five game modes, all themes on the usual suspects, but interesting nonetheless. Deathmatch and team deathmatch are exactly as you'd imagine, as is capture the flag. Then there's 'Capture and Hold', a variation on *Halo 2*'s (Issue 36, 10.0) Oddball, but the most interesting is 'Infection'. One player takes the role of an alien imbued with extraterrestrial strength, who must pass on an infection before he's hunted down and killed by everyone else. Having the alien infection is a little like being a goldfish trying to run the London Marathon for all the good it does, but for the uninfected it makes for good target practice.

Actually getting to the stage where you're running about as an alien or anything else for that matter is partly down to luck. Choosing an Optimatch can plonk you indiscriminately in games that are on the brink of ending, or with people with such a vast lead there's little point in struggling on. There's no choice to which game you join either. A hub displaying all the matches taking place so you could pick and choose would have been handy, but there's no such thing. You just get dropped in and have to deal with it. Charming.

Creating an Optimatch is easy enough, but we found it particularly hard to then entice someone to join us. We like to think it was our fearsome reputation that kept people at bay, but we suspect otherwise. There just weren't enough people playing. When, at last, a match does get underway, the level designs are lifted from sections of the actual game, just with portions cordoned off to form a jury-rigged 'arena'. It's no Halo, that's for sure. We can't imagine Master Chief running around casing havoc between an office full of filing cabinets. In fact, much like the game itself, the Live section only covers the necessary bases without ever exceeding itself - a pity when you consider just how long it took Midway to bring Area 51 to our consoles. It's not that it's particularly bad, but haven't we seen all this so many times before? More creativity next time, please.



GO INTO THE LIGHT, CAROL-ANNE!

Many of the weapons you'll find in Area 51 are hidden in dark places. Why? Because they're hard to find. However, one weapon (the unusual BFG-type gun) is sitting slap bang in the middle of a beam of light. If you enter it, you'll be spotted straight away so make sure the room is clear before venturing over to nab it.

The only way that NovaLogic can cram in so much action and still avoid lag is by running its own dedicated servers. It definitely deserves credit for stumping up the extra cash to make Black Hawk Down a worthwhile experience. We played numerous 50-player games with little lag whatsoever, a remarkable achievement.

Another thing that makes Delta Force very special indeed is the focus on community and team games. Taking a leaf out of Halo 2 (Issue 36, 10.0) and Rainbow Six 3's (Issue 23, 9.4) book, it's easy to set up a squad, create a great-looking logo, a motto and URL, and watch the game track

everyones' stats in immense detail. Delta Force's stat-tracking is highly impressive, taking account of every aspect of play, from individual experience, headshots, knife kills, suicides, base captures, double kills and so on.

While Delta Force's game types are hardly original, they do play very solidly and are helped by the well-balanced map design. You can choose to play deathmatch, team deathmatch, team king of the hill, Search and Destroy, Attack and Defend (like Halo 2's Assault). Flag Ball is especially fun because there's only one flag at the centre of the map. Watching 49 other players trying to get their hands on it is something special. All of the game modes are made even spicier because there are four character classes to choose from. Like Conker: Live and Reloaded (Issue 44, 9.0) and Return to Castle Wolfenstein (Issue 16, 9.2), you'll want to ensure your team has the right balance of snipers, medics, special ops and heavy gunners. Their strengths and weaknesses are finely balanced so that if everyone decides to play as a heavy gunner, you'll probably lose.

Delta Force is an exciting experience, mostly because of the huge number of players. While it isn't as slick as Unreal Championship 2 (Issue 40, 9.2) or Halo 2, it has enough community-based features to put it up there with the big boys.

AFTER FINALLY being picked up by the THQ crew, the re-release of *Juiced* back in Issue 42 squeezed every last drop of quality from its original incarnation and delivered a very respectable racer, scoring 8.0. Of course, online play is a given with any street racer worth its salt these days, and thankfully *Juiced* delivers satisfaction like a chilled glass of OJ on a hot day. Tasty.

All the cars from the offline version are present and available to race from the off, brilliantly saving you from desperately trawling through the single-

player game (not that that's a bad thing, but this is a Live review) to unlock that souped-up beast that everyone else seems to have. You can only race one class of car at any one time, but as long as they fit the bill, you can – brilliantly – race cars from your Career mode online for that personal touch.

Levelling the playing field, however, is the excellent Auto-Mod feature. You can choose between Standard and Prototype mods to instantly transform a regular car into a tarmac-chewing, BHP-barking, nitrous-spewing beast that's up there with the best of them. And for free too! The top sense of speed is carried over to Live, with the cars handling just as smoothly as in the single-player game.

Game modes are your standard straight-up races, with tons of options to exclude certain mods, and collision options (something we like to see in online driving titles). Another great touch is that you can enter pink slip races online with the cars you collect in the offline career mode – Live one-on-one showdowns where the winner walks away with the loser's car keys!

We would have liked to have seen more players online (if the developer managed six, then surely eight wasn't that hard?), and a greater emphasis on the whole crew/clan aspect carried over from the offline game, but for a solid Live racer *Juiced* is definitely the right flavour.

No stranger to community events, this was the fourth time Lisa Bidder, Bristol-based administrator of www.xboxgamezone.co.uk had come along to preview a Ubisoft game. "I think it's very important that Xbox fansites get to come to these events", she

said, "It gives everyone a chance to see if the game lives up to the hype"

Before the end of the event, there was a chance for everyone to prove themselves as the ultimate Rainbow Six: Lockdown team. Ben T put aside his rivalries and formed an unlikely dream team with Andy Hartup of XBM and Duncan Leigh from Xbox World. Several teams of webmasters also formed their own clans, and fought hard to make it to the finals. After some stunning play from the team (Duncan in particular), the games journalists made it to the final, only to be knocked out in a sudden death 41-42 showdown with 'Team C'. Although they wouldn't win any prizes for an imaginative team name, the victors showed great sportsmanship, and each won an advance copy of the game. Well done, you lot!

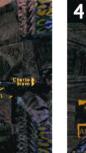

CRACK HEADS: See those dealers hanging out on street corners? They're carrying more green and white than even Ken Rosenbaum can get through in a month. Kill them all and get a big reward, not to mention getting drugs off the streets.



TRICK MY WHIP: Modding is expensive, but there's plenty of opportunity to do it. There are garages in Temple, Playa Del Seville (Los Santos), Doherty, Ocean Flats (San Fierro) and at Come-A-Lot (Las Venturas). You can modify Low-Riders, Street Racers, GT Cars and even regular cars.



TOO SWEET: Make it halfway with any of your girlfriends and they'll give you a token of their affection. Denise gives you her car keys so you can drive the motor in front of her place. At 100 per cent progress, she'll lavish you with a pimp suit.



FAMILY GET-TOGETHER: Earn 100 per cent respect and you'll be able to run a ten-man gang! Target any gangbanger with green threads and press up on the D-Pad to recruit him. You'll be hard to kill with ten gun-toting homies at your side.

SHARPSHOOTER: Playing through San Andreas, there'll be times you'll wish there was some way of capturing an event for posterity. Take the camera from CJ's crib on Grove Street and you'll be able to snap anything that happens.



GRASSHOPPER: The Cobra Martial Arts centre in Garcia, San Fierro is home to a Kung Fu master. Listen to Sifu's advice, then give him a kicking to learn some martial arts techniques. If you prefer boxing, pay a visit to the gym in Idlewood.



LEAP OF FAITH: Base jumping is one of the funniest things to try in the game. Head over to the circular skyscraper in downtown Los Santos and look for the yellow arrow by the front door. This'll give you access to the roof and a parachute.



REAP WHAT YOU SEW: Although the mission 'Body Harvest' lets you drive the combine harvester very briefly, you can always return to the farm in Flint County later on to get another one. We highly recommend a pedestrian-chopping rampage through Los Santos.



AMERICAN WASTELAND: Once you've racked up around 25 per cent bike skill, you'll be able to try out the BMX trial in Glenn Park, Los Santos. See if you can beat our best time of 02:32. Each ring collected gives you an extra ten seconds.



BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE: The fire extinguisher is far from just a gimmick - it actually works! It's worthwhile carrying one around just in case your Low Rider catches fire. If you're quick enough, you can stop it exploding.



SUPER SIZE ME: Although there aren't any real advantages to getting fat, we recommend giving it a go for comedy value. Eat as many super size meals as you can to put on pounds of blubber in just a few days.

Making sense of the maelstrom that is Destroy All Humans!

It still hasn't managed to prevent us from spending large amounts of time sitting down

So, we've compiled our top ten tips to help you successfully navigate your way through the game, or just to put some of the ace Havok physics to comical effect. Happy incinerating!



BRAINIAC: CITIZEN ABUSE: Gathering DNA is an integral part of *Destroy All Humans!* There are plenty of NPCs wandering around to harvest fresh brains from – hold the L trigger to lock on to them, then hammer B to extract the goods. The brainier the human, the more DNA extracted.



ALL IN THE MIND: A great way of sneaking past groups of guards or soldiers on stealth missions is to hypnotise one of them to cause a distraction, commonly by performing a comical jig. Yee-haw boy, dance!



EXPLODING AMOOOO: Cows are a great source of reusable ammo, but radioactive bovines are the best. Exposure to illegal government experiments has left them with an unnatural glow, and they'll explode on impact.



TIN CAN ALLEY: Often the best weapons in the game are staring you right in the face. As soon as an army truck or a tank turns up, lock on to it and use your PK powers to pinball it into other vehicles, setting off a huge explosion.



JUST A THOUGHT: Assume the disguise of a human by targeting them in your reticule and tapping B. This Holobob effect drains your PK however, so top it up by continually reading the hilarious thoughts of others (target them and hit A).



BRAINS ON THE SIDE: Once you've clocked a mission, have a play around with all the side quests on offer. These include timed slaughtering and checkpoint races, and the rewards yield considerable hauls of DNA for upgrades.



AUTOMOBILE AIRBALL: An early mission sees Crypto disrupting a drive-in cinema. Forget watching Plan 9 From Outer Space (you can do that from the menu), just see how many cars you can toss through the screen with your PK.



PUPPETS ON A STRING: Your ship houses several awesomely powerful weapons, one of which is the Abducto beam. Use it to pick up people or vehicles, and then use centrifugal force to fling them into advancing enemies miles away.



PROBE-ONO: Can't be, erm, 'arsed' to manually extract brains from live humans? Charge up your anal probe and fire it off, and the human's brains will pop out! Majesco agents are a good bet, being smart and in plentiful supply.



MUTANT MADNESS: The government has developed a strain of mutants with alien DNA - they're far more dangerous than Majesco agents. Once they've finished their levitating act, hammer them with your (hopefully upgraded) Destructo Ray.

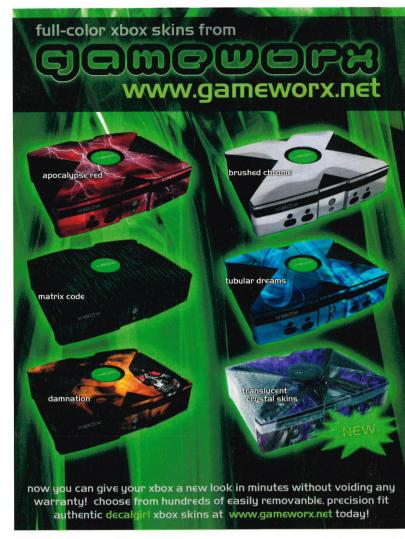

Masterclass: Conker: Live and Reloaded

His life revolves around birds, booze and bucks, and the ensemble of unhinged misfits he encounters can out-cuss Ramsey in the potty-mouth stakes - prepare to embark on an anarchic adventure...

ALL HE wanted was a good night and somehow ended up king of the land. How did this happen to a boozing, puking rodent with a grubby vocabulary? Play on to latch, flea-like, onto Conker's 'Bad Fur Day'...

ALL YOU NEED to know in order to get cracking is that Conker can jump (B), hover (hold down B once you have jumped), crawl (hold the right trigger), jump higher (hold the right trigger to crawl before jumping) and crack skulls with a nail-encrusted baseball bat. Other than that, look out for 'context sensitive' pads which, once stood upon, will give Conker new abilities and weapons. Also, chocolate is a squirrel's best friend - Conker can store six chunks in his furry cheeks - a chunk will be lost every time he takes a hit from an enemy or falls a great distance. New chunks are scattered everywhere and will respawn after you've grabbed them (after a few minutes). This guide starts at the second chapter because the first is just a training level and, well, any old !@*\$ can do it, right? Anything we think of, we'll slip it into the guide but for now, onwards...



Now that Conker is suitably sober and ready for a real challenge, this picturesque hamlet forms the hub for many sub-chapters and challenges, some of which involve bouncing on a plant's inflated jugs, or pushing around balls of excrement. You'll soon realise just how strange this game is...

Mrs Bee

You need to retrieve her hive, so head up the left slope and kill the two Tediz creatures to make your journey back, when laden down with the hive, much easier. Pick up the hive in front of the wasp nest and then dash back to Mrs Bee. If the wasps catch up with you, simply rotate with the hive to fend off their attacks. Complete this task and Mrs Bee will reward you with money.

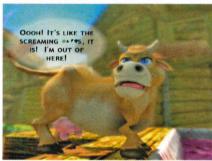
Go over the footbridge and stand on the context-sensitive pad, and use the catapult to pick off the beetles on sentry duty further up the hill. Hit them once and they'll take off and swoop down to attack, so shoot them again before they get too close. You can now choose a path – if you take the left path, read on, if you take the right path, skip to Chapter 4: Barn Boys.

Poo Cabin

The cabin is straight ahead when you enter the Stinky Zone – go inside and drop through the hatch. Negotiate the ropes and platforms (either dodging the Tediz or killing them) – if you fall to the bottom, simply jump into the hole to be warped back upstairs. Continue upwards until a passage leads you through to a bullring.

Pruned

Walk to the left of the doorway and you should see a stack of barrels – use these to hop onto the roof of the cabin, and then jump over the rolling balls of dung that hurtle down in sequence. When you've worked out the sequence, avoid the poo and jump up to the giant tap. You should see an arrow on top – run in the direction it points to, turn the tap on, and deposit a stream of prune juice into the trough down below.

Yeehaa!

Go back down to the bull-ring and then stand in front of the target, prompting the bull to charge into it (you do know you should jump out of the way at the last minute, right?) A new door will open and a cow will trot down into the ring. Make the bull charge at the second target and then jump onto its back. You can now steer the bull towards the cow and press B to charge. The cow will drink the prune juice and then start crapping furiously through the

grate in the centre of the bull-ring – coax the bull to hit the target again, jump onto its back and steer it into the cow once more. This time the cow will shatter in a mass of fleshy chunks – time to bring in a new cow. Repeat the whole process again for a couple more cows and you should have sufficiently flooded the cabin with cow crap.

Sewage Sucks

Swim through the sewage and hop onto the contextsensitive pad to consume some Confidence Pills. These beauties will give Conker the confidence to dive down into deep water. Swim out into the main area and through the passage you originally entered by. If you surface along here you'll see a hidden room with a wad of money inside.

Great Balls of Poo

When you leave the cabin, you will be given the ball of excrement you were promised, so push it up the high path. Another ball of pong will be served up from the cabin, so go and collect that too, but this time push it up the lower slope. Stop the ball short of pushing it into the cave and then use it to hop up onto the roof of the cave to get some money. When you have done that, push the ball into the cave and you'll open the entrance down at the foot of the hill. To find out what lies inside, skip to Chapter 5: Sloprano.

CHAPTER 3 Bats Tower

Time to grab another poo ball. This time, roll it straight up the main track - at the top you should see a sign saying "No Poo Balls!' - a sure indication that you need to push a poo ball off of the edge! Do so and jump onto the switch to drain the nearby lake. Swim out to the doorway and head through.

Barry's Mate

Swim down and head through the underwater opening near the Bullfish. When you emerge, talk to the abusive cogs and jump onto the moving platform. Kill the Tediz and then edge your way across the beam. When you reach the context-sensitive pad, wait a second or two before

>>> pressing the B button to flame the incoming bat. Keep scaling the tower and eventually you'll come to a beam leading out towards a lever. Jump across and pull it to open a gate down below, then scale the tower again and jump across the battlements at the top to get some money.

Cog's Revenge

Head back down to the bottom of the tower, club the cog, then insert it onto the position to the farleft of the row. Now jump back into the water and dive down to the left - you should see the gate you opened. Head through and you'll come to an underwater passage populated by two swimming baddies. Swim high along the passage to avoid them and then grab the next two cogs from this area. If you get hit when carrying one back through the tunnel, the cog will revert back to its original position. Once all the cogs are neatly lined up, jump onto the large cog in the centre of the room and run around it in the direction of the arrow to wind in the Bullfish.

The Combination

Swim back to the jetty and guide the Catfish to the Bullfish (you must dive when you get near the Bullfish to trigger the next cut-scene).

Blast Doors

Stand on the pad that slides out and look at the rotating wheel on the far wall. Above it is an arrow sequence – if you watch the wheel rotate, you'll see arrows revealed at certain points inside the circular window. Use your catapult to shoot each of the four arrows in sequence and you'll open the doors that the cash plummeted through.

Clang's Lair

As you swim down, be sure to paddle into the bubble cages to replenish your oxygen reserves before diving deeper. Head through the luminous

Bullfish's Revenge

Dive underwater (you swim faster this way) and swim back to the jetty with the Bullfish in tow. Swim next to each of the Catfish to slow the Bullfish

down - when you reach dry land, jump onto the Bullfish to reach the money in the tower.

CHAPTER 4 Barn Boys

You can do Chapter 5 before leaving the Pongy Zone, although in the interests of continuity, we'll cover Chapter 4 - which is the right-hand path when back in Windy - first.

Marvin

Go and see the stacked crates straight ahead to learn that you need cheese to get rid of Marvin the mouse. Go to the cheese pen and bring chunks back for Marvin, forcing him to eat so much that he explodes. You can now jump on the crates, so use them to reach the roof of the barn (make sure you jump onto the pipes and head clockwise around the outer ledge first though to get to a squirrel tail). Up there you'll find some money and a pressure pad to open the main door down below.

Mad Pitchfork

Approach the shelf with the paint and brush on

Sunny Days

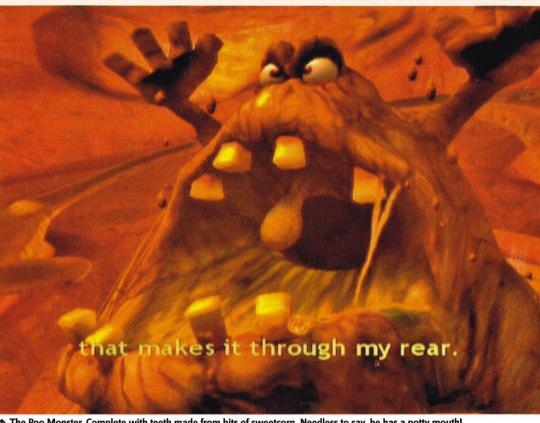
Go outside and speak to Mr Bee, who in turn will alert you to the Sun Flower across the way. Go and speak to the flirty flower before stopping at the area in between Mr Bee and the Sun Flower to speak to the Tickly Bees. Lead these to the Sun Flower. You will need to lead five groups of Tickly Bees to the Sun Flower before Mr Bee can finally get his kicks and she'll even offer you a bunk-up! Stand in front of the Sun Flower and then perform a super-jump to land on her breasts, which will then catapult you skywards, thus enabling you to reach some more lovely money.

Ruff You

Use the bouncing crate in front of the barn to reach the upper entrance and the teeter along the beam inside, flaming the bats along the way. When you reach the context-sensitive pad, aim high and cut the pitchfork's noose. Hop down onto the shelf and then mount the pitchfork on the ground. Get behind the rampaging haystack and then use the pitchfork to lance it. If you get knocked off there are chocolate chunks in the corners of the barn. After several hits on the haystack, the floor will give way.

Frying Tonight

Brown trouser time! The water is rising and you must sever the electrical cables before they can touch the rising water, thus turning the whole area into one giant frying pan! Head to the pillar straight ahead and then climb the ladder behind it. Hop onto the context-sensitive pad at the top and look for the electrical wires. There are three you can

After that you have to drop down into the pan and navigate the treacherous U-bend.



Uga Buga

When you step into the Prehistoric Zone, use the doors in the temple to get onto the roof and grab the money, all the while avoiding having your heels snapped by the raptors.

Drunken Gits

Take the passage to the right of the stone dino head and then hop onto the giant egg. When it hatches, lead the baby raptor to the worshipping room, stopping to allow it to gobble up all the cavemen along the way.

Sacrifice

Lead your prehistoric pal across to the sacrificial pad facing the dino head, and then stand on the context-sensitive pad. Up to the right is an upwardsfacing arrow on the wall - hit this with your catapult to raise the stone slab, and then lure your dino chum onto the platform. Once he's standing on it, quickly run and stand on the pad again, and this time fire your catapult at the downwards-facing arrow on the opposite side to send the slab crashing down on the dino.

Stand on the stone tablet of the monk that walks out of the stone dinosaur's mouth to be catapulted up on top of its head. Grab the wad of money and then examine the dino's nostrils. When the green smoke isn't coming out, hop into each nostril and sprinkle pepper. One almighty sneeze later and you can go inside the head.

Worship

Head right through the body to gain the caveman's headdress, then go back out and lead the worshippers to the Rock Solid club. Start hitting one of the stone creatures outside and your new mates will bundle in and start helping out. When all of the stone creatures have been reduced to rubble, go and speak to the bouncer to gain entry to the club.

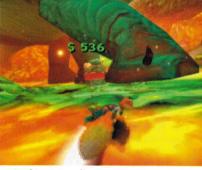
Rock Solid

Go down behind the bar and roll the comatose caveman up the ramp towards the entrance and dump him on the pressure pad. Now go behind the bar and drink from the keg to get tanked up, then stand in front of the caveman dancing in front of the door you just opened and blast him through it with a jet of steaming urine. Take the tonic from the Feel Good station to sober up, then use the platforms to reach the high ledge and roll the piss-stained caveman along to the other pressure pad. Get tanked again and pressure-pee another dancing caveman through one of the new doors to break Berri's cage, then get up there to grab the money.

When you get close, press B or the right trigger to swipe them with your club - don't worry, the collision detection is very forgiving here so if you get close and swipe you should more often than not take them down and retrieve part of your money. Once you have bashed two of the muggers, the course will alter slightly, so watch for the major change. When you've bashed the lot, head up the ramp and grab the money.

Raptor Food

Avoid the raptor's attacks by doing some well-timed jumping and hovering moves, and make your way to the context-sensitive pad in the middle of the arena. From here you will hypnotise the dumb dino and proceed to use him as a weapon to savage the caveman hordes.

Wasps' Revenge

Back at Windy, talk to Mrs Bee again and go and retrieve her nest, again! The creature guarding the main entrance to the wasp's nest has now disappeared, enabling you to go inside. Kill all the enemies on the walkway (this will make your escape infinitely easier) and use the hive-gun to take down the wasps.

Mr Barrel

Now that you have the \$2,110 to give to Mr Barrel, head up to the windmill and steer him back down the slope to clear a route to the next area.

Wade into the blood lake and head left into the tunnel. Pull the lever and then swim across to speak to Gregg the Reaper, who'll give you a gun. Head through the gates and you'll meet a bunch of undead, so try out your new shotgun, which just so happens to be a laser-sighted one!

Count Batula

Count Batula will reveal your ancestry and turn you into a bat. Assist him at feeding time by collecting the villagers and dumping them in the grinder. There are villagers in the hallway, library and gardens, and the key to capturing them is to keep moving to avoid their projectiles while showering the ground with stinking bat guano. When you hear them squeak, swoop down, pick them up and take them to their doom.

Zombies

You need three keys to open the front door. The first is in the ceiling in the dining room - get there via the library (hop onto the middle shelf and shoot down the bats). The second key is in the centre of the garden (only accessible after you've placed the first key in the door), once you have placed that, head upstairs and go left into the grinding room. Climb the ladder and jump up to the lever, which will open a passage under the stairs - head through it to reach the final key.

Mr Barrel

Steer the barrel down the slope to the graveyard and stay on until you're able to use it to ride upstream in the blood lake and reach the cave. Head in, grab the money and then take a leap of faith to wind up back at Hungover.

CHAPTER 8 It's War

As the cutscene so forcefully states, it's war! If you look closely at the front page of the newspaper you'll see references to Mr Bee's 'love triangle' and 'Uggas Die in Boulder Tragedy'! Also, fans of the original N64 version may notice that the electric eel element of restoring power to the base has been

Power's Off

Head to the army base in Windy - once you're there, go right and use the ladder to get down onto the beach to pull the power lever. When you reach the large doors, head down to the water and jump into the dingy, then, using your bazooka, blast each of the four orange locks on the door. You

The Vault

The alien has three forms of attack - a jumping tail-swipe (most common), a lunging bite, and a full-on charge attack. The best tactic is to stay close by, forcing the beast to do either the tailspin or the lunging bite attacks. To defend against either, simply tap the B button to hit your jets and hover to evade them. When you land, get in close and keep tapping the right trigger to perform a punch combo. Provided you get in enough hits in quick succession, the alien will soon fall to the ground stunned.
