Jobs on NOM don't come around very often, so you need to stand out against the rest of the Mario maniacs. Being a great gamer will help, but there's much more to it than that.

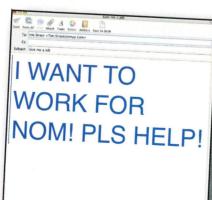
You need hard work and dedication. Get some work experience, write for your school or college newspaper, start honing your writing and don't make speling misteaks.

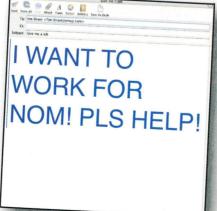
Work experience can seem dull at the time and you'll probably be forced to make cups of tea all day, but you'll get to see how a mag is put together and may have a go at writing.

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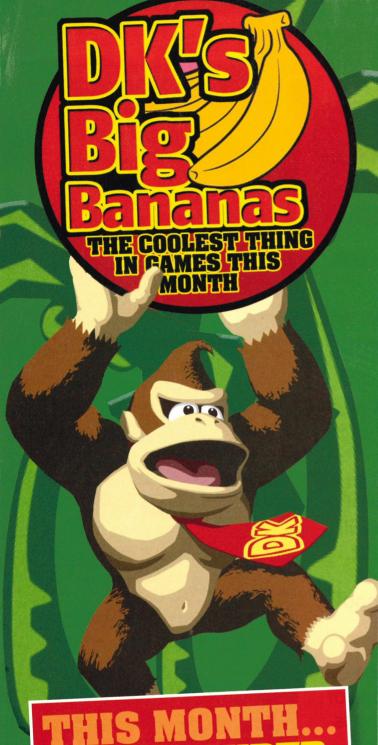










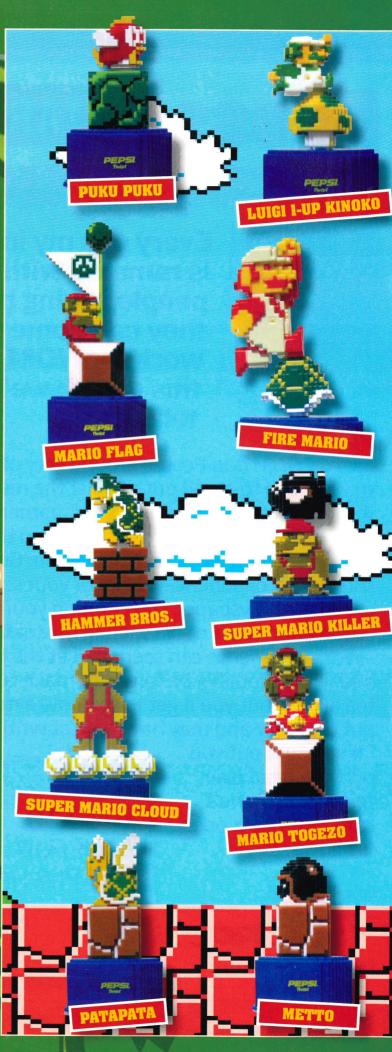


# THIS MONTH... ALL 30 SUPER MARIO PEPSI BOTTLE CAPS!

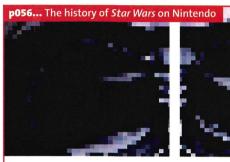

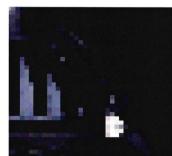

So out you go again into the grubby gardens of Suburbia You find the odd

gardens of Suburbia. You find the odd worm to chew on, but you're gasping for a drink. Surely some kindly human will have left out a dish of water? You used to drink from ponds until you found your careless mate floating dead on the surface. And

MILK?! What the hell? And BREAD? That's basically poison to hedgehogs. Bloody humans. Don't you wish you could shed this righteous hero streak? Be a maverick, loose-cannon of a hedgehog, mowing the humans down in a hail of Uzi fire before napalming their pathetic mock Tudor abodes?

That's where Shadow the Hedgehog comes in. He's a hedgehog who doesn't play by the rules. You're going to like him as much as he likes blowing stuff up. And that's A LOT.

**)))** Shadow is a very different hedgehog to Sonic. He's not just the same guy, with some colours changed so he's black instead of blue. If you've played Sonic Adventure 2, you'll know a little bit about him already. He was billed as the 'evil Sonic' in that game, but that was okay because he had better trainers. His own game fleshes out his mysterious backstory further.

Created as the ultimate life form by the mysterious Professor Gerald, Shadow is tormented by a dark past and is struggling to unveil his true identity. Was he created to save humankind, or to do the evil bidding of the dark side? The only way he can find out is by uncovering his own dark, suppressed memories. And he'll need seven Chaos Emeralds to make that happen.

That's where you come in and you've got somé serious choices

to make. How Shadow's destiny unfolds is completely down to you. Familiar faces like Sonic, Tails, Knuckles and Dr. Eggman all appear, and you basically get to choose who you want for an enemy. Are you with Sonic or against him? Sonic better

not hope you're against him, because Shadow doesn't mess about. Look at the screenshots: he's one destructive little mammal. Guns, grenades, the works.

There's another potential enemy force in the game too, called the G.U.N. Army. Little is known about those guys yet, but they don't sound all that devoted to peace, do they?

Sonic fans don't need to worry though. Your favourite series isn't going GTA on you. We've played the new game, and the classic hedgehog DNA shines through very brightly. The levels are set up similarly to the Sonic Adventure games. Your new black hero grinds along rails,

pings off walls and legs it along walkways at a fairly astonishing rate. It has already got Sonic Heroes licked for raw pace, and it's nowhere near finished yet. You may need to have a special pair of robot eyes fitted

to keep up by the time Sonic Team's done. As the game's

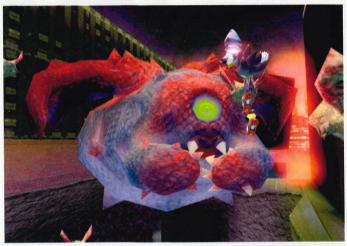

through machine guns to rocket launchers that will actually bring the buildings in the level crashing down. There could be as many as 30 weapons in the finished game, which should satisfy even the most psychotic of you.

Then there are the alien weapons. At some point in our lives we've all wished we could leap at someone with a giant laser sword and Shadow delivers the dream. We know aliens are all about lasers instead of bullets, so you get to loose off all manner of laser pistols and cannons, too. In

addition to all that, Shadow can attack by swinging from poles and use debris from the environments as projectile weapons. We've also seen Shadow surfing along on flying discs, hurling boulders around and hitching a ride on the back of rockets as they power through the sky.

Cleverly, Sonic purists don't have to use the new weapons if they don't want to. The game is set up to give the player as much choice as possible. Some enemies are going to go down more quickly with a laser blast, but you can also use familiar

attacks like the spin jump if you wish and watch Shadow home in on them and bring his shadowy force raining down on their faces. Masses of Sonic fans cried foul when the first shots appeared of a black hedgehog with a gun, but they can stop crying now. You can play the game your

own way. lizuka's vehicles comment is interesting, too. We initially assumed he was talking about riding on flying platforms and

stuff, but whispers around Sega suggest it's going to be a fair amount cooler than that. What about Shadow the Hedgehog razzing about in a 4x4? Yes. actually driving a CAR. He's probably only too aware of the irony of a hedgehog being behind the wheel of a

car rather than under them. )))



))) Imagine if he ran a hedgehog down, though. How could he live with himself? The issues games deal with these days are really deep, man.

Being the 'ultimate life form' Shadow's got a couple of neat moves built in as standard. His Chaos Blast special attack causes a world of pain for whatever is aggressive and within range. He freezes in the air and explodes a sphere of violence that fills the screen with colour. The guns come out, stuff explodes, everyone dies. Predictably enough, you have to earn the right do to that. If the

whole game was special moves, it'd be slightly turd.

The second Chaos move is the Chaos Control, which affects how quickly Shadow moves. It's an amazing sight seeing Shadow glowing red and blitzing round massive loops. It's like when Sonic used to become Super Sonic, which was one of the finest sights in video games. Sega itself refers

to these abilities as the "ultimate powers of speed and destruction" which, for a company



that practically invented speed in games, is pretty

tough talk.
The way Shadow moves is cool, too. He can reach stupid speeds using a roller-skating type motion, and at top speed he's practically flying. We suspect this is down to the Chaos powers again, but Sega were understandably reluctant to spill all the details on those at this early stage. Damn them and their hedgehog secrecy!

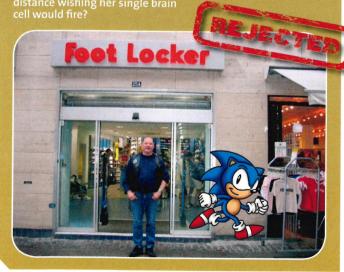

To reflect the more adult theme of this game, the mood of Shadow is a whole lot darker. The twisty rails that weave precariously over yawning chasms leave you in no doubt that you're in the Sonic universe, but the colour scheme is more menacing. The enemies you come across aren't cute anymore, they're downright menacing. Bat-like alien cyclops creatures fill the air and terrorize gritty urban environments. Giant spiky plant enemies fill the screen in the Jungle stages and you can do without mutant bats lunging at you in mid-air. )))

# A star is born The first time we saw Shadow we fell in love.

Shadow T. Hedgehog made his debut video game appearance in 2001 in Sonic Adventure 2 on Dreamcast (later Sonic Adventure 2 on Dreamcast (later reworked as a GameCube launch title) and he immediately started causing chaos for Sonic and pals. The mysterious black hedgehog was created by Dr. Eggman's grandfather – Gerald Robotnik – and obviously joined team evil in the fight against good.

The minute he was introduced he was roughly 34% cooler than Sonic. For a start he wasn't blue, which is a

bit of a daft colour for a hedgehog and he was moodier. In fact he was like a super-fast goth with spikes. Shadow could do everything that Sonic could do, but with more style and flair. He could zip down rails, bounce off springs and run like the wind itself — even Sonic comments about his arch rival's super speed. Shadow also has the ability to zap between rows of rings by using his special Air Shoes.

Although Shadow may seem like he's got a tough exterior, underneath his

brash bravado he had a soft spot for Maria Robotnik – Eggman's cousin. He is haunted by images of Maria's death and launches himself into a mission to exact revenge on the people who killed her. Cue lots of face offs with Sonic and loads of running dead fast.

Shadow's had a crazy life. The new game will flesh this out further, while reducing the available funds in your bank account by thirty-nine pounds and ninety-nine pence. An impressive double in anyone's book. brash bravado he had a soft spot for

We've seen some fantastic level locations. Imagine flying in towards a giant airborne battleship, riding on some weird mutant bird thing, or soaring

through the air in giant ivy-clad temples. "The goal is to match the graphical world design with the dark mysteries that surround Shadow", explains director lizuka and we think

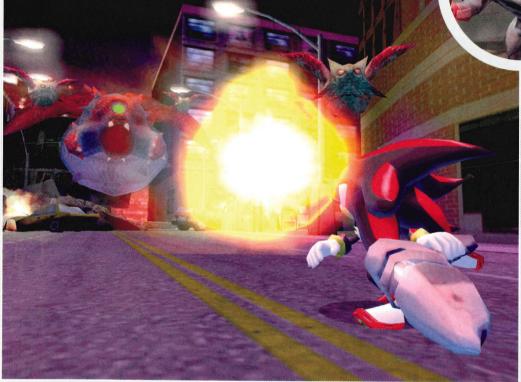
Sonic Team's on the right tracks. The Earth levels are especially bleak: The buildings are crumbling, cars lay smashed up in the streets and you're the one who has to repel the invading aliens filling the sky. Even as you're blitzing through at 100 miles

an hour it all looks great. Seeing paths spiralling off into the distance is still a thrill after all these years, and the vertigo of grinding along thin airborne wires is as savage as ever.

At this stage, Shadow the Hedgehog looks like a return to form. Sonic Heroes was great in places, but you got the sense that Sonic Team was running out of ideas. How else can you explain the inclusion of Team Chaotix? A Sonic game where you get to play as a bee and a

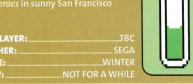

# TAKASHI IIZUKA



# **Director** Takashi lizuka shines a light on the new game.

When you think Sonic, you probably think Yuji Naka. Well, you're wrong. Just as Eiji Aonuma is now the force behind Zelda, taking over from Mr Miyamoto, Takashi lizuka is Sonic's real daddy. Since cutting his teeth as a Senior Game Designer on the Mega Drive's

Sonic 3. Iizuka has directed Sonic Adventure 1 and 2. His CV also features NiGHTS and Chu Chu Rocket. lizuka-san now heads the US branch of Sonic Team and takes the stewardship of the Blue One very seriously, as we found when our jokey first question fell flat...

NOM: Where did Sega get the idea from that hedgehogs are fast? We have loads of them here in the UK and they don't move all that quickly...

lizuka: Sonic was originally designed as a one-button, action platformer game. When he jumped to attack, he turned into the famed "blue spinning" Sonic. From that the idea expanded into his trademark highspeed action dash.

NOM: Actually that was a... never mind. What new gameplay opportunities open up having Shadow as the star of the game rather than Sonic?

lizuka: Shadow has a completely different personality to Sonic, which allows me the ability to do things that are just as cool as Sonic while giving me the freedom to do things that are completely outside of Sonic's world.

NOM: Give us an overview of the new game... lizuka: Shadow the Hedgehog represents the first of its kind in the Sonic franchise blending the best of our past titles' gameplay with some new elements. This fusion of old and new gives a variety of action, including gunplay, without losing the features that have made the Sonic series such a success. We built the levels around this central concept and have been able to merge different mission objectives as the

story line unfolds depending on how the player decides to complete each level, this enhances the overall variety of gameplay.

NOM: What is your goal in making Shadow the Hedgehog?

lizuka: We want to offer something completely different to gamers and at the same time, want to expand the traditional platform genre with new and unexpected fun with Shadow the Hedgehog. Being here in the US has helped our team think globally about our game designs to create games that have worldwide appeal.

NOM: What sort of locations is the game set in? Is it all one world, or does each stage have a different theme?

lizuka: As the first debut adventure for Shadow, this game offers a deep and involving story line that unfolds with various paths and endings that you choose to determine the true fate of Shadow. The adventure and gameplay revolves around our star, Shadow and will take you on a journey through a variety of action stages only imaginable in the Sonic world.

NOM: Is this a one-off, or is the idea to spin off Shadow into a regular franchise of his own? lizuka: Sega is always interested in exploring new directions and it's our goal to continue to push the envelope creatively as well as

technologically for the Sonic franchise. And we are dedicated to provide Sonic franchise titles for all groups of consumers. Shadow the Hedgehog is just one of them and hopefully one that you will all enjoy!

NOM: What does Yuji Naka think of the game? lizuka: We constantly update Mr Naka with the progress of our game and he has been a great supporter of our efforts, visiting us here on campus and getting involved in every aspect of the game's development.

NOM: Will there be any platform-specific content in the GameCube version? Like a cameo from Mario or something?

lizuka: It's really difficult to comment on Mario making a cameo appearance... but our ultimate goal is to create a seamless game experience with Shadow the Hedgehog for all consumers no matter what platform they own.

NOM: You're taking care of Shadow, but what's in the pipeline regarding a new Sonic game?

lizuka: Sega is always looking into new directions as we continue to push our creative boundaries for the Sonic franchise. Shadow the Hedgehog is one example of this creative endeavour. This year, we will be highlighting many new Sonic titles that we hope will appeal to all types of Sonic fans!

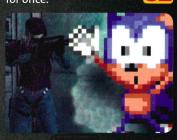

# Nintendo's main man drip feeds more next-gen goodness and keeps us going until the E3 banquet.

Easy online for all and the possibility of new-look controllers was the tantalising Revolution news from Mr Satoru Iwata, just days after delighting us with first details of Revolution's hardware in his keynote speech at the Gamer Developers Conference.

In an interview with Japan's leading financial weekly *Nikkei Business*, Mr Iwata once again stated that online gaming will play an important role on Nintendo's next home console. Talking to the prestigious Japanese publication he said:



■ It's going to be an amazing few months for Nintendo fans

"The next-generation console will follow along the same lines as the DS". He added: "The ideal is for users to be able to connect to the internet without having to think about it." With backwards compatibility to GameCube already confirmed for Nintendo's next piece of kit the future is already looking bright.

The Revolution news didn't stop there, with Mr Iwata declaring that games have grown overcomplex in recent years, putting off potential gamers: "Our goal with Revolution is to expand the market for games. The current consoles are constantly getting more complicated."

Console controllers was one area that Mr Iwata highlighted as being a main area of consideration during development: "The number of buttons on joypads has been increasing steadily in recent years. Hardcore players can still manage, but for inexperienced people the degree of complexity is too big a barrier." He continued:

"For Revolution we plan to introduce a friendly user interface so that a mother who's watching her child playing a game might say 'Oh I'd like to try that too'."

say 'Oh, I'd like to try that, too'."
So far, Revolution appears
to have had a positive reaction
among developers, due in no
small part to Nintendo's plans
to keep development costs low
by using the same application
interface used in GameCube.

Mr Iwata's words will be ringing in our ears right up until the start of E3 in just a few days' time. All eyes now turn to sunny LA to see what Nintendo has in store for current consoles and what, if anything, will be shown of Revolution. Nintendo is certainly going to have to go some to top last year's Zelda overload and crowd-stopping speech from Reggie Fils-Aime, but rest assured the NOM team will be there to deliver the first news from the Nintendo press conference, scheduled for the day before E3 opens its doors on May 18th.

#### Sega working on GBA update of classic shooter.

One of the Mega Drive's most beloved games is making a comeback. Sega trademarked a name at the US Patent and Trademark Office on March 10th for a game called Gunstar Super Heroes to be used with "handheld game machines". Treasure's classic 1993 shooter is a firm favourite with hardcore gamers, so we went sniffing for details.

Our moles in Japan tell us that Treasure is back on board for the game, which will be an all-new adventure rather than a remake. Since

# Exclusive! NOM goes hands-on with Mario Kart Arcade GP.

We couldn't believe our ears. The first public showing anywhere in the world outside of a Japanese coin-op show of Mario Kart Arcade GP would be in... Sheffield? Dean and Rob zoomed faster than Toad with a Golden Mushroom to try it out at the Meadowhall shopping centre, wearing comical expressions of disbelief all the way there.

And there it was in the Namco Wonderpark. It wasn't all some elaborate joke. The newest addition to the series featured 11 characters to choose from: Mario, Luigi, Yoshi, Princess Peach, Toad, Wario, Bowser, Donkey Kong, Pac-Man, Ms. Pac-Man and Blinky the ghost.

An awesome digital camera function takes a snap of your face before the race, and makes you into that character with a Mario nose or Toad helmet, or whatever. Before Lakitu's even hovered over with the starting lights you're having an ace time.

The multiplayer mode didn't feature any other cars in this early version. The final version could support up to six human players, but there were only two machines at Meadowhall. Grand Prix is the single-player game, where you advance through courses as long as you can keep beating the five Al cars. Time Trial is a lonely experience, but you'll find the letters NOM at the top of the online high score table.

There were six tracks available in the three different Cups; Mario Cup, DK Cup and Bowser Cup, but the final version will have 24 courses. The karts resemble *Super Mario Kart* ones, but handle like a combination of *Double Dash* and the original. Sliding is done automatically and zipping round corners is pretty easy. You can jump by pressing the accelerator and the brake together, which lets you power slide round corners sharply. It can be quite tricky and needs some practice to perfect.

The biggest change in *GP* was the amount of items available. When finished there will be around 100 to use, but we only got to sample about 30. During a race you can only use three

items that are randomly selected at the beginning, then you collect them by passing through '?' boxes as normal.

Unleashing your weapons of mass destruction is a simple case of smashing the item button in the centre of the steering wheel once you've got your opponent in your sights. Some items are able to lock-on to other racers, whereas others must fire straight forward.

Old favourites like bananas and green shells are available, along with brand-new ones, including a Boo that makes your steering heavy, a black shell that explodes and a pie that can be thrown in racers' faces. There's even a metal basin that bashes you on the noggin. Sweet.

# MARIO BEACH (Easy)

#### Wario almost got banned after he told Peach it was a nudist beach.

Mario Beach was by far the most colourful track on display. There are loads of Nintendo characters stood by the edges of the track and hanging around on bridges, cheering you on as you whip around the course. Luckily they seem to be supporting everyone,

not just the good guys, so Bowser doesn't get jealous. There are six laps to blast your way through at Mario Beach and there's plenty of chance to build up your speed here, because sharp turns are kept to a minimum.

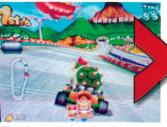

This is the simplest circuit of all the ones we played on the day, because it's basically just an oval shape like an American speedway course. Unfortunately this also means it's really hard to get in front of the pack and you can often find yourself

fighting it out with the other racers lap after lap. The side of the track is home to about a million Piranha Plants, but luckily – and unlike *Double Dash* – they don't try and eat you as you rocket past. At least, not when we were playing...

# BOWSER'S CASTLE (Hard)

#### The King's in the house. Show your respect by leaving skid marks on the carpet.

Throughout *Mario Kart*'s long and triumphant history, Bowser's tracks have usually been among the hardest. *Mario Kart Arcade GP* is no exception to the Koopa King's reign of tarmac terror. Some of the very steep bends that crop up all the way through

the course will have you crashing into the barriers a lot more than you'd like. Although there were only three laps on this course, it was definitely the longest of the lot – and the only one that Rob managed to beat Dean on.



■ See that big horrible mouth... that's where you've got to drive. Be prepared for the worst



■ The walls are lined with pics of Bowser and Bowser Jnr. Hammer it down the straights



■ If you've mastered the jump and slide, now's the time to use it on these tight turns

# **ROB's verdict**

"Mario Kart is easily one of my favourite multiplayer games and a new Mario racer always gets my blood pumping. Mario Kart Arcade GP didn't disappoint and although I got ruined by Dean five races to one – he kept overtaking me on the finish line – it was still great fun.

"I enjoyed the fact there was so much going on with the different tracks. The game really screams Nintendo. Obviously I would have liked to play more courses, but those on offer were a solid, if somewhat simple, example of what's to come.



"At the start I was worried that, with so many items, the whole racing element may get a bit confusing. But I think the random item selection at the start works really well. Plus the items you can get are great fun, particularly the square tyre weapon that makes your wheel shake like a pneumatic drill.

"The only thing that would make this better is if Nintendo brought it to 'Cube. Come on guys, do the right thing."

# **DEAN's verdict**

Put £20 of his cash into the machine, then went to the bank to get more.



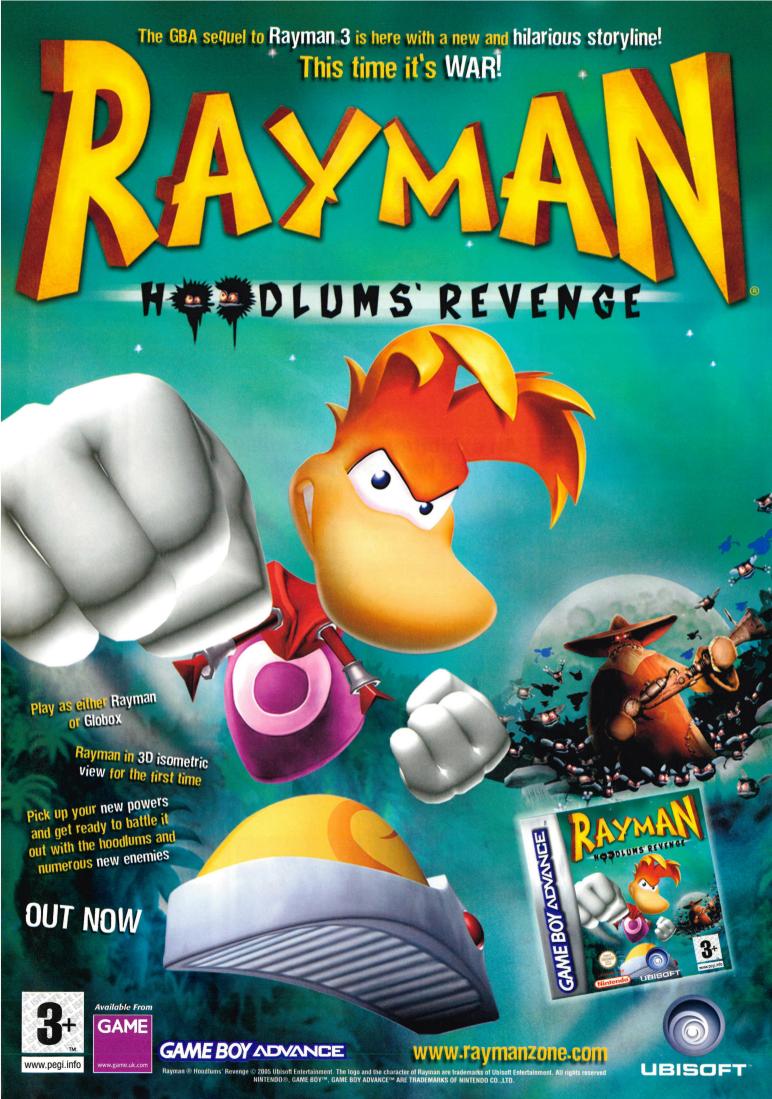
"I'd rather eat a box of my own hair than play *Double Dash*, but something about the early *Mario Kart Arcade GP* screens got me excited. The tight corners on Bowser Castle remind me of Super NES *Mario Kart* as does collecting Coins to go faster.

"Having the item button in the centre of the steering wheel means you're best to drive one-handed and that makes you feel more like a man. The new attacks are cool, especially the pie attack that covers your rival's screen in drippy... pie stuff. This being an arcade game, the losing player gets a speed boost to keep



things close. Despite this Rob kept getting caned, but this isn't really how racing games should be. If you're awesome, you should win by miles.

The jumping is hard to master. You're leaping on the gas and brake pedals at exactly the same time and it looks like you're trying to vandalise the machine. I love the face-scanning feature and I'm dying to see how this evolves into the finished article in the coming months."











An exhibition you'd actually like has just opened in California.



"Give him 20 years, and Mario will surpass the Mona Lisa as a cultural image", says Jon Gibson, curator of the I Am 8-Bit art exhibition in LA. It beats the hell out of a school trip to The Louvre any day of the week, with 2D gaming heroes on the canvas instead, replacing fat naked chicks and flowers.

"Nowadays, jackasses like Jak & Daxter are designed by committee and marketed by gunfire – they are created to serve the very silly purpose of being a mascot", rages Gibson. "Folks like Mega Man had to earn their reputation". And the 100-plus artists on show share that passion for games, with Nintendo characters packing the walls at Gallery 1988 in Los Angeles.

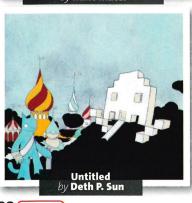

It was raw, and that's what made Nintendo games that much more intense, enthralling,

exhilarating, intoxicating and just plain amazing."

If you're planning on taking your DS on a trip across the country, then this is the pack for you. It includes earphones, a charger which you can plug into the USB port of your computer, GBA cart cases, DS cart cases, an in-car adapter and a bag to carry it all in. Unfortunately this does make the package a bit big and the internal pocket design doesn't work well - the cart cases only just fit and it can be fiddly getting the console in. There's also a screen protector, which can be a bit tricky to fit on correctly and may leave a mark when you remove it. The main letdown here is the cost and there's nothing really to justify the price tag.

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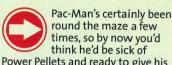

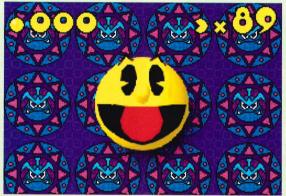

Here's a money making scheme for you... grab a copy of Electroplankton, book a room in an art gallery then dress in black and wear a beret. Now stuff your DS in a cabinet and let people experience an art-music transcendence of the boundaries of touch and sound. Or, in other words, let them play Electroplankton.

This isn't a game, nor is it a music package. In fact, we're not really sure what the hell *Electroplankton* is. There are ten different modes to "experience" rather than actually play and they range from simple voice changing tools to crazy NES music mixers.

Each Electroplankton has a different look and name. The first one is sadly titled Tracy, but others have cooler names like Lumiloop and Nanocarp. In Tracy there are six different plankton you can make travel along a path you've drawn, making a musical note as they go. The noise they create depends upon how fast and where you draw the line. Other plankton bounce on leaves which make different notes and even line up in different formations, depending upon how you clan

different formations, depending upon how you clap.

Perhaps the coolest plankton is the one called Beatnes. In this mode you can select a classic NES backing beat, like the music from Super Mario, then add sound effects to create tracks. Unfortunately your input only lasts for a few seconds, so your ability to make awesome old-skool music is limited.

The weirdest plankton is Rec-Rec, which lets you record your voice and add it to a beat. So, if you wanted, you could record "NOM is my god" and then mix it to a wicked beat. Or you could try and record something that sounds vaguely musical and add it to the drums. The only real letdown is that you can't save any songs you create — even if they are the best thing your ears have ever heard.

# Play-Yan

You have a problem. iPods went from being cool to being incredibly lame in the blink of an eye. If you're rocking a pair of white headphones these days everyone thinks you're an idiot. If only there was some way your ever-cool NES GBA SP could be made to play Queens of the Stone Age, you'd be laughing.

Get ready to laugh. We've had a Play-Yan in from Japan and

once we'd wrestled with making the stupid memory card work we had a GBA full of rock. It's easy enough: you copy the files to an SD Card using a PC and slam it into the Play-Yan. A little hummingbird appears on the GBA screen and you select one of two Japanese options. The bottom one is tunes.

The navigation is ace. Your albums are listed on some steps and you select them by running a little guy up and down the steps. Once he gets to the top of the stairs, he hops into a little bath and gets sucked to the bottom again. It's absolutely charming. Once you've got your guitar music whirring away, stars flutter across the screen in time with the music. A little flashing dot crawls along a line to show how far through the track you are. Compare that with an iPod. Touch wheels are OVER. It feels like a game.

The top Japanese option on the intro screen IS games. Brilliantly, Nintendo has been offering a new Play-Yan game up for download each week. For FREE. But you don't get much for free these days, so what you actually get is a basic game that plays in an area about the size of a postage stamp.

In Avoid you're a bat trying to avoid falling white balls. In Fire you control a little cannon shooting down diamonds. Fish has you guiding a finned friend through watery chasms without hitting sides. 'Nose' reprises the classic fingers/nose Wario Ware game, but this time you're the nose shooting bogeys at the fingers. Twelve micro-games will be available in time and the fact that each one records a score is enough to get you hooked. We can't get the movie playback to work yet (too much Japanese), but that's probably for the best. There are some horrible mpegs going round on email...







We get thousands – alright hundreds – of requests asking how to get into the world of games journalism. Okay, listen up...

In previous NOMs we've shown you some of the jobs you can do within the video games industry, but now here's the one you've all been waiting for – games journalism.

So, what does a games journalist do? 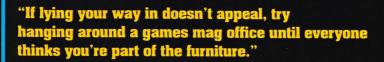


#### GAME START /

Pat Garratt, publisher of Eurogamer.net and GamesIndustry.biz, returned from travelling the globe, penniless and halfway through writing a book. He had always loved video games, but to avoid starvation Pat took a job as a trainee chef. Unfortunately he found the hours and proximity to foreigners more than he could stomach.

#### POWER UP

Chancing on an advert for a "video games staff writer" in the *Manchester Evening News*, Pat ended up pocketing minimum wage in a Derbyshire bedroom, working on a site called FGN Online. "I lied massively during the interview and actually got knocked back at first, but the person they hired got fired and I eventually got the job". A year later he was News Editor on CVG.com, proving it's not where you start that counts.



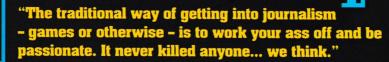


#### GAME START!

NOM's very own Mike Jackson has been a self-confessed Nintendo fanatic since hatching from some kind of Yoshi egg in 1983. Rumours that his first words were "It's-a me!" have been discredited, but we do know his early years saw him obsessively collecting issues of NOM and getting into ACTUAL FIGHTS over which was better, the N64 or PSone. These punch-ups rarely had a winner, even when the hardest kid in school waded in for N64, screaming "it's got more BIT."

#### POWER UP!

At 15, Mike managed to get work experience at NOM and begged to come back again and again. He wrote for free, but demanded criticism so he could learn how to write sentences other than "da PSone iz rubbish". Leaving school, he took a Media course at college and helped out as a Tips Master two days a week, racking up over two and a half years' experience before becoming NOM's Tips Editor and then Staff Writer. Mike loves his job, but says "if you want to be rich, do something else."





#### GAME START /

NOM's Editor, Tim Street had been reading games mags since the days of Mean Machines and loved writing, even starting his own fanzine called The Games Experience: "It only lasted one issue when the ink ribbon ran out on my brother's word processor". Dep Ed Dean Scott missed hundreds of lectures playing GoldenEye 007 and had to spend a year writing in business magazines about "the residual value of fleet cars" as punishment.

#### POWER HID?

After uni, Tim applied for an "IT vacancy", but it turned out to be a writer's job at Official Nintendo Magazine. A month later he was previewing GoldenEye 007. Dean's year of purgatory ended when he landed a job as Senior Writer on C+VG. To get hired he says "you have to prove you know your stuff and can write brilliantly". Both agree that budding writers should "get as much work experience as they can and treat it seriously".





#### GAME START /

Cube-europe.com's Tim Symons and Conor Smyth both knew they wanted to write about video games. Tim, the site's founder and director, admits to "starting out at the bottom of the games journalism food chain". Back in 1997, his plan was to "spread the word of N64", so he learnt HTML and built a site, "Back then there was no proper European Nintendo website. My mission was to fill the gap". Conor "penned poorly-written reviews of N64 games" and started his own website which got him noticed.

#### DOMED HD

Conor joined Tim at Cube-europe.com: "I rose through the site and right now I'm in charge of all its content and making sure the editorial side runs smoothly". According to Tim, "the industry is dynamic and growing, which makes it great to work in". He says setting up the site helped him get other writing jobs and "network with developers and publishers", leading to more opportunities. "A lot of our staff use the site to gain experience then move on to a variety of roles in the industry."

She applied with examples of work published in the music press and "sample reviews of my favourite games, like Syndicate Wars".

"C+VG gave me sample reviews to do before finally giving me real games to write about!" Since then Maura has reviewed games for loads of mags, including NOM. Her advice to budding writers is "to know the subject inside and out, read as much as possible and try and develop

read as much as possible and try and develop your own style. Editors appreciate you sticking to deadlines. If they can count on you, they're more inclined to use you."

To girls thinking of following her she says, "being a female games journalist can work to your advantage. It's a bit of a novelty. Know your stuff and you'll be taken seriously. Plus, whipping a bigot's ass on Mario Kart is all the more fun."

#### Motivation

KEEP YOUR EYES ON THE PRIZE.

Most people in journalism – not just games journalism - start at the bottom, so stay focused on your goal. Conor of Cube-europe says: "You may feel undervalued and underpaid at the start, but it's all worth it in the end".

But it's not just beginners who have their faith shaken. NOM's Dean says, "only 20% of my work time is spent playing games and 50% of the games we get in are rubbish. You do the maths." It's that 97%-er on the horizon that keeps most people going. When your moment comes, grab it with both hands and don't let go.



If you want to succeed in the world of games journalism you'll need all of the following things...

#### Knowledge

KNOW MORE THAN THE NEXT GUY.

Playgrounds up and down the country are full of kids who know about Prince of Persia or FIFA 2026. But to write about games you'll need more. What are the Japanese kids playing? What was the last game on N64? What's the final level of *Super Mario World* called?

If you're right for the job it will feel like an extension of your hobby. Get on the internet for info and import games. Live the dream. Mike Jackson says, "I did two ears work experience at NOM before getting a job, but ve been playing games since I was three".

#### Experience it's not what you know...

Everyone agrees that work experience is vital if you want to get into the business. Time invested writing for free will pay off when you go for a first proper job on a mag or website. And getting yourself known to people in the industry is a great help.

Cube-europe's Tim Symons says, "networking, even via email, is very important". Editors are busy people though, so make an effort to get noticed, and if you do get a chance "make sure you're determined, resourceful and always do more than you're asked to do – that way you'll go far", according to OPS2's ex-editor Richard Keith.

THE THREE P'S. PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE.

The most important skill is being able to write, but not all English and Journalism graduates can do that. "The ability to take your thoughts and put them on paper in a way that other people with find entertaining, interesting and valuable is not as easy as people think. Just read some websites and you'll see", says Richard Keith, exeditor of Official PlayStation 2.

A great command of English is essential, so read as much as you can and not just games mags. The most important thing is practice. You'll get nowhere without it.

# Luck It's not a four-letter word.

You might think Shigeru Miyamoto is the luckiest man alive, but it's safe to say he didn't get where he is today by staring at his bedroom ceiling and doodling Yoshis in his history books. Luck is about being in the right place at the right time and that takes effort.

NOM's Dean says: "Get a work experience placement and show how brilliant you are. The next job that comes up will be yours. Hopefully." Tim Symons of Cube-europe agrees: "It's not easy getting a job, but the people who hang in there will start getting noticed after a while."

# Qualifications JUST A PIECE OF PAPER?

Do all journalists have a string of certificates as long as Mrs Incredible's arm? Sure enough, publishers like to see good things on your CV, but it's not always the most important thing. Cube-europe's Conor says: "All I have is a love of video games and a good grasp of English. That'll get you started". Take courses in English, Media or Journalism, but make sure you write outside the curriculum on student papers and websites.

You can get loads of info at nctj.com, the National Council for the Training of Journalists. And check out ucas.ac.uk for a full list of university and college courses.

#### The Checklist

- Find the right English, Media or Journalism course - one with an emphasis on vocational skills.
- Get work experience through your college or off your own back.
- Read everything to do with video games. And play games no-one else has heard of. Go for it! Start a website, or a blog, or
- a fanzine so your voice gets heard by the gaming community.
- ... and never, ever give up.

It's a visual nightmare, in a good way

Capcom must have had its wacky cap on throughout Killer 7's development. It's messed up. The graphics, the controls, the plot and the characters... nothing is remotely normal. It's hard to decide what's good and what's bad about Killer 7. One thing's for sure - it's a unique experience. For a few minutes, open your mind to accept anything you read on these pages.

You know about Harman Smith, the loony in the wheelchair. He's a professional assassin and is hired by the government for his elite talent to make people dead.

This is crazier than monkeys in balls and flying raccoon-tailed plumbers.

But the crap hits the fan when he's hired to take on the Heaven Smiles — a group of alien-like dudes that explode. They sound rubbish, but Harman will need every one of his seven super killer personalities to take them on.

Usually, a personality accounts for a person's mental character. But Harman's personalities change his physical appearance and abilities. The screen fades out and when the picture fizzes

back into focus a new figure is standing there, gun in hand. The wheelchair is gone. There's nothing wrong with Smith's legs now. He can run about and pop off bullets like Vin Diesel.

Each of his personalities has unique attributes — different weaponry, strength and speed. They each have special talents, too. For example, Con Smith says the word "dangerous" and then sprints around like a hyper

cheetah after a pint of Red Bull. Kaede Smith slits her wrists to bleed droplets of blood which form a girl who gets rid of barriers with her finger — crazy magic barriers that look like walls.

You can't just use one character to blast through the game because their unique abilities are needed for different obstacles and puzzles. Some are simple. If you need to jump to a roof – use Coyote Smith's super

jumping skill. Then there are screwy puzzles.

You'll get a Fire Ring from a talking spirit who's trapped in a washing machine by turning the machine off. You go to the toilets. You get the option to flush the toilet, but it has no water. With the Fire Ring equipped, you look at the sprinklers. "The Fire Ring Howls" says the game. The sprinkler activates. Somehow, this gives the toilet water. Now you flush it. You hear a clink. In another corridor you passed through earlier, a pipe is broken. It must be drainage for the toilet because that clink was the sound of a small object falling out of that pipe when you flushed the loo. That object plugs into a control panel to open a path

Our logical thinking got us nowhere with that puzzle. It was only when we realised that the map lends a serious helping hand, that we made any kind of progress. It marks up areas that contain points of interest relevant to your progress. It identifies objects and puzzles with exclamation marks and it even shows you where a special ability needs to be used and which character needs to do it.

That's not the only help you get. Whenever you approach an area where you need to use a special power you'll hear a sound. This'll cue you to look at the map

to see whose power you'll need to use. And if you still can't figure it out,



through the library.

NOM: Where did you get your inspiration to make a game like Killer 7? HK: There are so many personalities and aspects of Killer 7, I can't put it down to one thing. Mr Suda (Killer 7 director) is a huge fan of wrestling so one of the characters was born from his passion (MASK De Smith). Some of the characters were inspired by Hollywood movies and some by movies on the Japanese Yakuza — mafia groups. It's a fusion of many different influences.

NOM: It goes without saying, Killer 7 is very confusing. Without giving away any major plot details, will players understand the story totally, like why a wheelchair-bound bloke has seven killer personalities?

HK: When you finish the game, all of your questions will be answered. As you go, you'll also find out a lot of background information on the characters like why Kaede's clothes are stained with blood. I'm sure you will find the ending quite shocking, too.

# Kobayashi speaks...

We had a chat with *Killer 7*'s producer, Hiroyuki Kobayashi. Here's what he had to say...

NOM: The game has a lot of blood and gore, and bad language. How difficult is it to get this kind of explicit content approved by Nintendo?

HK: Before we started making *Resident Evil 4*, we had discussed with Nintendo if it was okay with the blood and the violence. We were about to make some extremely violent games so had to make sure we had permission to do it. Basically Nintendo was fine with all of our projects, including *Viewtiful Joe* and *Killer 7*.

Also, Nintendo wants to change its image – it wants to make more games for a mature audience, so obviously that would mean games like *Killer 7* and games that include extreme violence can be done.

NOM: So, do you know any more about how Nintendo plans to approach mature content in games in the future?

HK: I don't think Nintendo is just trying to switch over to an older market. I think it wants to expand to the older market. Part of Nintendo's strategy is to appeal more to 18+ year-olds. Being as we were making games targeted to this age of gamer, our plans fitted perfectly with Nintendo's.

there's a strange ghost bloke called Yoon-Hyun who holds a mask. Shoot the mask and it'll take some of your blood. That's blood you get from killing enemies, by the way. Then it'll give you a generous hint that pretty much spells out the puzzle solution for you.

That's weird — a game that basically solves the puzzles for you. What's the point? The point

is that Killer 7 isn't really a puzzle game. It's not an exploration game. It's essentially intended to be a story. Think of it as an interactive movie. You wouldn't like it if your DVD player kept pausing

during Chitty Chitty Bang Bang and posing you riddles that had to be solved to un-pause the damn thing. Killer 7 leads you through the game and pushes you on whenever necessary, to keep your progress through the bizarre plot going smoothly.

That's the whole point of the weird on-rails controls. You don't move the characters freely. They are stuck on set paths. You just hold **(a)** to make them run. Each time you reach a choice of paths the options appear on screen and you simply select one. You can still wander back and forth through corridors and into rooms as you please. You can still turn round and go back where you came from.

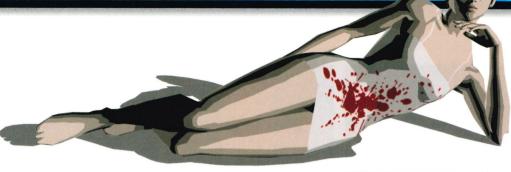


# Kobayashi speaks...

NOM: Killer 7 was announced at the same time as Viewtiful Joe, which has now reached the second in the series. Why has Killer 7 taken so long? HK: Shinji Mikami (producer) is a very strong character as a creator and Suda-san is the same, so they had different perspectives. Mikami-san would expect one thing and Suda-san would come up with something completely different. So it was a case of trial and error to build a foundation for the project and a relationship between the two creators.

Suda-san came up with many brilliant ideas – very original. If we had just left him to go ahead and run with whatever, we may have seen Killer 7 finish a lot sooner but I don't think it would be as good as it is now.

NOM: The seven assassin characters were actually created before the main concepts of the game itself. Where did they come from? HK: The designers had already created seven characters for Mikami-san's and Suda-san's project. They decided to use all seven characters to make a game. But just having those wasn't original enough, so they came up with Harman Smith – a wheelchair-bound guy, whose split personalities they are. We knew that would really be something different.



))) Without full 360° control, you needn't think about exploration or getting lost. You just hold 🚯 and push your character through the story. The only thing you need to worry about is enemy attacks.

Your main foes in the game are the Heaven Smiles. They're not heavenly and they don't smile. But they do try to hug you. Then explode in your face. That hurts so you need to blast them to bits before they get near and it takes multiple shots to down 'em. Most of the Heaven Smiles have a weak spot, indicated by some yellow bubbles. Shoot that with super aiming skills and they'll explode into a million little blood droplets in one shot.

The satisfaction of a good shot is celebrated with a comment from your character. "You're f\*\*\*\*\*d", says Coyote, in his glee. Yes, the 'F' word in a GameCube game. Little Jonny's mum's ears would bleed if she heard it. She'd threaten to clean your GameCube's filthy sound chip with washing up liquid. But you know you think it's cool, even if it's a little unnecessary.

If you're a good shot your TV will be cussing like an angry street drinker. But hitting the sweet spots earns you more blood for your claret-collecting machine thingy. Blood is like the rupees of *Killer 7*. You'll need it to upgrade your characters' stats, like speed and strength. It's also fuel for your special moves, and can be used to

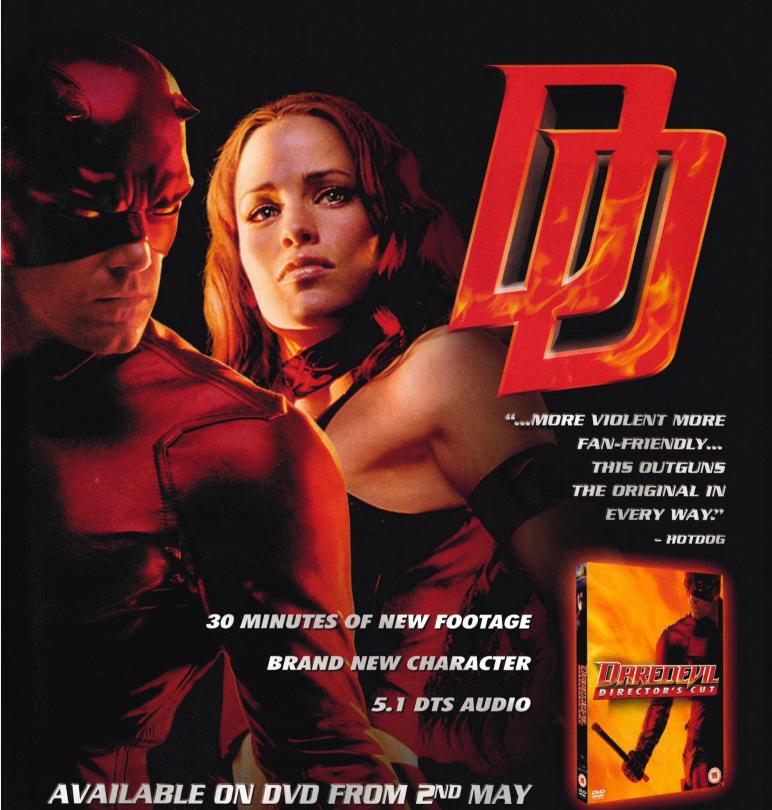

You are rewarded with treats and a pat on the head. Still, DK2 does have some more polish on it than the last game, which is nice to see.

For starters, you'll notice that the menu screens have been reworked. No more difficult-to-navigate endless loops of boxes. This time, you can see all the options on screen at once and rotate

them around like a ring by tapping the bongos. And after you're finished playing a song, you don't have to beat the drum repeatedly just to get through the high-score tally. That was a yarn.

The mini-games are also a lot more fun than before. In Rhythm Keeper, you're shown (and can practise) a pattern of bongo whacking, and you then have to repeat it with no visual guidance a set number of times. This tells you if you actually have rhythm or if you're just whacking the drums like, um, a monkey. In Barrel Race, different bongo icons drop from the top of the screen like

Tetris blocks. You have to hit them in order and do it faster than your opponent (which can be either the computer or a pal).

Another new mode is called Freestyle Plaza. A song will play in the background and you'll just get to jam to it whichever way you please. As you hit the bongos and clap, different images from the Donkey Kong games will randomly pop up on the screen in time with your beats.

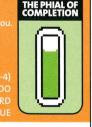

# **Another Code: Twin Memories**

#### Visit an island steeped in mystery and solve paranormal puzzles by the power of touch. Urgh! Dirty, dirty ectoplasm.

Ashley's parents died when she was aged three. That's what she believed, anyway, until she turned 14, and got a mysterious message from her father. Apparently, Dad is alive and well, and living on the supposedly deserted Blood Edward Island. So Ashley sets off for the island with her aunt Jessica. But soon Jessica disappears and Ashley is left to explore on her own.

Thus begins the story of Another Code: Twin Memories, billed by Nintendo as a "touchable detective story". It's a throwback to the old days of point-and-click puzzle adventures. You guide Ashley through a mysterious mansion on the

island and its grounds, picking up items and solving puzzles. Along the way, she'll meet a ghost named D and they'll work together to recover its lost memories.

Another Code makes excellent use of the dual screens. Down below you'll walk Ashley and D around the island and, as they reach important landmarks, 2D images of them will flash up on the top screen. Pressing the Investigate button on the lower screen will bring a 2D image up and you'll be able to poke at various parts of it to find secrets. The entire game is playable with the stylus, but you can also use the D-pad.

At times, you'll have to solve a puzzle

using the touch screen. Some are quite straightforward – unscramble a picture, or rub a sheet of paper to find the message underneath. Some, though, are real head-scratchers that will send you running to the internet for the answer. But in many cases, this is just because the touchscreen segments aren't sensitive enough – you can spend minutes tapping the correct area, but it won't register unless you're hitting exactly the right pixel.

Another Code has a sort of identity crisis. It doesn't know whether it wants to be stupidly easy or brick-wall difficult. Sometimes it won't let you pick up a necessary item until you've already tried and failed to solve the puzzle it is used for.

Other times it will give no hints as to how to proceed, leaving you to run around the island clicking, tapping and blowing on everything hoping for a miracle. Why does this happen? This genre was perfected a décade ago in games like Monkey Island. Were Another Code's designers even paying attention? Chris Kohler



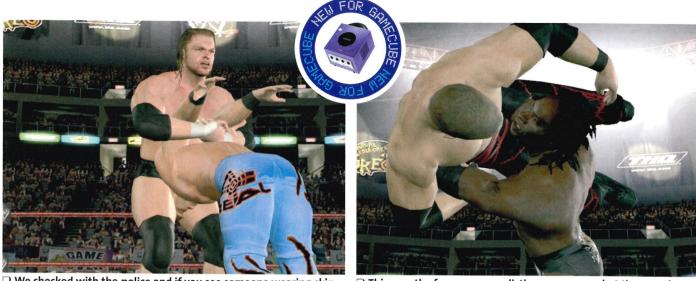

Assuming he's right, we're confident in saying that WWE Day of Reckoning 2 is pretty awesome. The designers at THQ have started from scratch to make this GameCube-exclusive wrestlefest a quantum leap over the last one.

You can see the new visual style in these first-ever pics. If your memory needs refreshing you can look at the panel for a comparison with the first game. The character models are as detailed as we've ever seen them on any console. And from what we watched and played, the animation is going to be awesome. THQ promises a 25% increase in the number of polygons for each character and you can see the difference.

Each superstar's flashy ring entrance is one of the most important parts of his or her character, and *DoR2* works even harder to recreate the spectacle. There are more dramatic camera angles and more life-like and realistic facial expressions. And the audience you'll see cheering is now in full 3D, although from what we saw there are still too many duplicate characters in the audience (the same crazylooking woman appears in the

front row three times). They've got a lot of time to fix stuff like that, though.

DoR2 is also the first story line sequel ever attempted within the franchise. Last year's Story mode started you off as a rookie and you had to work your way up through the rankings of the WWE, finally getting a shot at the World Championship. Rather than start you out at the bottom again as some other rookie, DoR2 puts you in the same role one year later - right after losing your belt. This time you've got to climb back up the ranks to the heights you once enjoyed.

Another aspect of battles occurs when the titular Egg Monsters are drawn into the action. Then, instead of relying on troops, the Egg Monster makes a special attack. A three-by-three grid appears on the touch screen and, depending on which square you tap, the Egg Monster will perform any of nine different special moves. This is a really nifty system which means that you don't have to enter menu screens of any sort; perhaps future RPGs will make similar use of the touch screen.

It's not going to change the world of RPGs, but Egg Monster Hero is quirky and likable. Its graphics have an old-skool, hand-drawn charm and the game's soundtrack is overflowing with catchy tunes let's hope someone brings it to the UK before we start crying. Jonti Davies

Sam Fisher sounds like the name of a character from Emmerdale. Yet you won't see him with his hand up a cow's bum. Not unless it's a terrorist cow that's hiding some important intel in its brown cavern.

Despite the crap name, Sam's become the most lethal stealth assassin in the games world. He's not about crap stories. He doesn't

even seem to have emotions. Sam's a relentless killer, taking out terrorist soldiers with a swift but silent snap of the neck, slash of the throat or plain and simple bullet to the brain.

Forget Metal Gear. You don't need lengthy cut-scenes and irrelevant conversations on love affairs and childhood memories. You don't need square levels built on grids like GBA Pokémon games. Solid Snake is the past. Sam Fisher is the future.

Some people say: "What's with this sneaking bullcrap? I just want to run, shoot and blow stuff up". Splinter Cell is not for those people. Splinter Cell is hardcore stealth. It's not a pretend stealth game, where you sneak through it the first time you play, then you learn the levels well enough to Rambo through it without a problem. That's not possible.

In every level, you are forced to creep slowly from shadow to

shadow, taking out unsuspecting guards like a phantom killer. In this game, bullets hurt. You don't want to be seen and shot at. A guard can take out your entire health bar with one spray of his rifle. You can't carry around half a dozen cop-out health pick-ups either med kits are attached to the wall. You'll be a corpse before you get halfway there. It's not an easy game.



))) Chaos Theory is easier than the previous game in the series, Pandora Tomorrow. There were two main problems with PT's level design: being too linear and occasionally throwing up scenarios that made it impossible to be stealthy. There'd be multiple guards with fat AKs in a room with unbreakable lights, infrared cameras, lasers and a noisy wooden floor. Flippin' hell! Sam

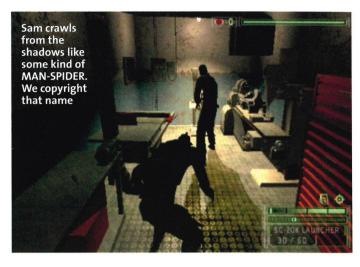
might as well run in there naked with bells dangling from his boy bits because you've got no chance of getting past those guys unnoticed.

Both issues seem to have been addressed, and CT's levels are far better designed. To begin with, there's almost always one alternative route to an objective. In some infiltration levels you can go in the front of a building, sneak around the back or even come in from the roof – it's your choice. Missions have been opened up, so you won't just be following one set path from start to finish; you'll have complete freedom in huge buildings where you'll need to explore and backtrack to previous areas to complete missions.

The environments are also better laid out for stealth. With patience, strategy and

an eye for good hiding spots, you can actually get through the earlier levels without dying - a near impossible feat in Pandora Tomorrow. That doesn't mean Chaos Theory is too easy - it's still a decent challenge. But with the

difficult situations come logical solutions and it's rewarding to figure them out.



You'll need to observe your surroundings. Are there security cameras? Where are the lights? Can they be shot out safely? Use your heat vision to check for lasers. Clear? Then you think about the guards. Will you sneak past them? You can throw a stone or bottle to distract them while you zip by. Or

will you take them out? You could whistle them into a dark area and strangle them. It's risky, but works. You could gas them with a Sticky Camera or simply shoot them with a silenced shot, but then you have to think about who might see.

It's not just sight that's a factor. The biggest innovation in CT is the

Most Co-op modes are simply two-player versions of the single-player adventure. But not the new Co-op mode in Chaos Theory it's a separate outing with entirely new levels specifically built for two agents. And it's not just about covering fire and all that

garbage. You can combine to scale high walls, boosting and using each other as human ladders, flick each other over large gaps or lower your partner into a room by a rope.

The missions in the Co-op mode take full advantage of these moves and once you

get into the Co-op way of thinking, you'll be swinging around the place like Siamese ninjas. It's not a game of equal proportion to the single-player mode – the missions are short, some only taking a minute or two, but it's cool while it lasts.

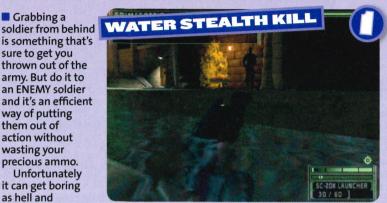

## Get over 'ere

is something that's sure to get you thrown out of the army. But do it to an ENEMY soldier and it's an efficient way of putting them out of action without wasting your precious ammo.

Unfortunately it can get boring as hell and sometimes all you want to do is ease the blood lust in your itchy trigger finger. When we get bogged down by all the sneaking around, we try and deal with the goons in proper style. Here's how to make a drama out of someone else's crisis.

Sound Meter. It gives a reading of ambient noise in your local area and monitors any sounds made by Sam. There could be a car engine, or machinery chugging away nearby. Or you could be outside in a rumbling thunderstorm. The volumes of all these environmental sounds are indicated by a little square slider on the Sound Meter. As long as your noise stays below the slider, nearby guards won't hear you.

In places like an engine room where the ambient noise is high, you can stride around merrily, completely unheard. This adds a whole new level of strategy to the game and another layer of

realism to the guards' behaviour. We can't imagine playing a SC game without it now. The sound and light bars are what separate SC games from every other stealthem-up. Those two simple bars enforce the stealth law - keep them low or get screwed badly.

But those bars are also your comfort. As long as they're down you know you can't be seen or heard. You're basically invisible. The cone-shaped vision of the soldiers shown on the radar in Metal Gear just makes the whole game feel fake. But CT feels real. And that's what makes it so damn tense - the unparalleled realism. Not just in the gameplay, but visually too.

We know forum geeks will be ranting well into the next millennium about gameplay being more important than graphics, but Chao's Theory wouldn't be the same experience if it didn't look this cool. The detail in every environment is wicked, especially in building interiors. Every last ray of light in the game has a source - a light bulb, a fire or a computer screen for example. Not even Metroid Prime 2's lighting is this advanced. It's impressive technology for the GameCube.

And Ubisoft have used the technology to great effect. The levels are so well laid out in Chaos Theory, you can actually

get through the entire game without killing anyone – again, near impossible in PT. This is now possible thanks to the new toys CT brings into the equation.

Now you don't have to shoot out lights – it's noisy and makes the guards suspicious. The SC Pistol has a new secondary fire function (the OCP) that's like an electronic scrambler. It temporarily deactivates many electrical objects: lights, cameras, lasers, computers and more. The best thing is it's completely silent – the guards will wonder why the light goes out, but they won't suspect foul play. They go on their way unaware of your crafty doings. >>>



))) Not all lights are affected by your SC Pistol's OCP, however. So, to identify what devices will be affected you have an EMF Visor that allows you to see electrical fields. It's not the most handy of visors – we hardly ever use it. We'd have preferred an X-ray visor that allowed you to see though walls (and ladies clothing). The Night and Heat visors have returned, which you'll use almost constantly. You'll find plenty of use for Sam's shiny new knife, too.

In fact, skilled players will use the knife more than the SC-20K, Sam's big gun. He's lethal with the blade - no more sissy punching.



If a guard gets close you tap a button and Sam will plunge the knife straight into the poor bloke's guts, or slash his throat. Just watching him shoving the blade in is shockingly brutal. So brutal we almost feel sorry for the geezer - he could have a family. His name could be Alan. Who cares? Sam doesn't. Ooh, hello Alan! SLICE... goodbye Alan.

The knife can also be used to cut through fabric or plastic, opening up alternative routes to an objective, like cutting in through the back of a tent, rather than coming in via the front and hoping the enemy will invite you in for tea and cakes. They won't - they'll shoot new holes into your face.

The way guards respond to your presence has been improved. Ín the first game, they were too robotic. They'd see you clearly, but forget if you ran off and stayed in another room for a set time. In Pandora Tomorrow they were too edgy, blasting off crazy shots

at the slightest sniff of trouble. They also developed the ability to see in the dark the moment they were alerted to your presence. No matter where you went, they found you.

Now they're much more realistic. They scope out suspicious sounds in a set routine, rather than telepathically telling where you are. If they see you they don't just sprint towards you shooting. Well, some do, but those idiots end up dead. Most will pop a few shots, then retreat to a better vantage point and wait for you to stick your head out. When possible, they'll even run through a series of other rooms to come at you from behind. Clever buggers.

It's not perfect, however, because they still don't seem to feel pain or sustain injury. Cap a guy in the foot in a mad shoot-out and he barely flinches. Not even a limp. He can still sprint

about like Michael Johnson, So when you get seen make sure you kill them or get the hell out of there fast because there's no slowing the blighters down. But if things get out of hand and you need to start blasting,

Sam is better equipped than ever. He has got new shotgun and sniper attachments for his SC-20K. The sniper attachment shoots powerful bullets that can pierce hard surfaces, so you can still serve it to guards

trying to hide behind stuff like wooden crates. And one devastating blast of the shotgun attachment will send a guy flying through the air. He won't get up unless he's Superman (P.S. – he's not). It's the tool of choice to get yourself out of trouble if you expose yourself.

Thankfully, you're not overly punished for making small mistakes. Pandora Tomorrow's harsh alarm system saw guards strap on body armour and widen patrol routes if you're seen just once. That made the rest of the level impossible. Thankfully, Chaos Theory isn't as ruthless. The alarms are still in some missions, but they only draw in nearby soldiers and patrols are only toughened after numerous alerts, not just one. That means you won't be spending most of your time staring at the Continue screen and restarting from checkpoints. Checkpoints won't haunt Splinter Cell

fans in their sleep anymore because Chaos Theory has the answer to the nightmare – a perfect save function. You can pause and save at any time and you will start off from that EXACT spot next time you die. You can save after every room if you want. In a Splinter Cell game, this truly is a gift from the heavens. It's like a hole in your life has been filled.

Even without the Versus mode, this is well worth a purchase for Splinter Cell fans. Where Pandora Tomorrow was too similar to the original, Chaos Theory is a clear step forward for the Sam.



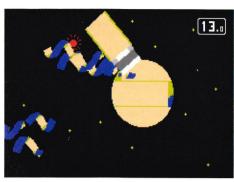

# Maybe someone should revoke Mario's right to party.

Parties usually involve people having fun. There may be jelly and ice cream, but there should definitely be people and laughter. Sitting in your bedroom playing your GBA is not a party. And you won't laugh much playing Mario Party Advance.

Not content with having six versions of his wacky parties

on N64 and 'Cube, Mario's now making an assault on your GBA, but he must be a bit partied out because his latest shindig falls flat.

Right from the start this feels more like a plodding RPG than a riotous party. Firstly you need to create a character, which means choosing what you look like, a name and even entering your fave hobby. But this is irrelevant because during play you're never called by your real name and don't even see your character. The RPG stylings

The RPG stylings continue as you start playing. Although the setting of a board is in keeping with the Mario Party series, the normally quick-fire pace of the minigames is almost non-existent. That's because everyone babbles on for ages as you travel round the board unlocking games. Some characters even send you on quests which involve trawling round the board to meet the person they fancy or finding some coal for a train. These are dull chores in a game that should be all about mini-games.

It should be gaming action distilled into its purest form, but suffers from too much chatter. One involves you reading a dolphin's lame jokes and pressing (1) to laugh in the right places. If we

wanted to listen to crap punch lines, we'd go to a Joe Pasquale show. Other text-based games involve you solving mysteries and even finishing Bowser's

gags for him. But reading really isn't a party activity and feels out of place.

Some games are genuinely enjoyable, like Koopa Krush which is a block-based puzzle game that sees you lining up blocks while getting hampered by Koopa

shells. Outside of *Mario Party* and with a bit more thought, this could be a decent little puzzler. Apart from that, fun mini-games are few and far between.

Many are just plain tedious. In Scratch 'Em all you do is rub the panels of a lottery type scratch card in the vain hope you'll get symbols that match. There are no tactics to it and you won't want to play it more than once. In Bunny Belt you just repeat the same pattern of buttons again and again.

The reason you're playing through these dubious mini-games is to unlock Gaddgets - obscure tools and micro-games invented by Professor E. Gadd. Although there are 60 to collect, they range wildly in quality - rather like the mini-games. Some are totally pointless, like Snooze Ewes, featuring sheep that jump over a fence in an attempt to make you fall asleep. Mario Party Advance often has this effect anyway.

Some Gaddgets offer multiplayer gaming, but rather than some mad action with four GBAs, they require you and your mates to cram around just one machine. There are a few which are reasonably fun like Attack Frog, a variation on the board game Hungry Hungry Hippos, but others like Mini-Soccer are just plain painful.

Unlike its 'Cube and N64 brethren, Mario Party Advance doesn't even pick up in multiplayer. The element of moving around the board is missing and many of the games don't even offer a proper multiplayer experience. Instead you're meant to pass your GBA between your friends in an attempt to set the highest score. You can have up to 100 players, but good luck finding anyone who actually wants to play.

After Mario Party 6 we were convinced new life had been breathed into the series, but that was before we'd played this. Although the game tries to be engaging in one-player, it never hits the right note and is continually dragged down by dodgy dialogue, dull mini-games and the fact there's only one board.

progress through the different Episodes you get to play as several familiar faces, including Anakin, Obi-Wan and even Yoda. Although you start most levels on your own, others soon join your party. Each character has different abilities needed to complete the levels. Jar Jar (shudder) can jump high, Artoo can hack into computers and the Jedi can use the Force. You swap between

characters by pressing **SELECT** which makes them collapse into blocks and then reform into the new character – which is wicked. by the way.

These character changes are implemented well and, although you'll play most of the levels as one of the Jedi, it's pretty clear which person/robot/Gungan you need to beat certain sections.

The puzzles wouldn't tax a mentally challenged

monkey and normally involve pressing switches in a certain order or using the Force on a glittering switch, but at least it means progress isn't too stilted.

As well as solving puzzles there's a lot of

fighting. We nearly always played as a Jedi because they're total bad-asses. You can deflect laser blasts with your lightsaber and get bonuses for how many you repel, but most of the fighting boils down to hammering **B**. Tactics only come into play during boss battles.

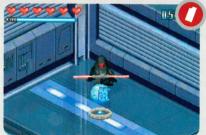

Although you can use the Force during fights, it's unlikely you'll ever really need to. Anakin's power of lobbing his lightsaber at enemies is more irritating than useful because it leaves you defenceless. Force powers are mainly used to find secret stashes of Lego blocks and solve puzzles. It's a shame that the Force isn't used more because making platforms by floating Lego bricks together looks cool and should bring a smile to any Star Wars fan's pasty face.

Looking cool is something Lego Star Wars does a lot of — it's probably one of the tastiest GBA games to date. Although all the characters are made of Lego they have loads of charm. The game is played from an isometric view that, for the majority of the game works well. Unfortunately if you play as Padme, who is armed with a laser blaster, it can make aiming slightly difficult. But surely no-one wants to play as her anyway, so that shouldn't be a problem.

Although there are a few problems with Lego Star Wars, like the repetitive combat and simple puzzles, it's infused with such a sense of fun that you won't care. The characters and locations have a lot to do with the fun level, but the gameplay deserves credit, too. The only thing that really lets it down is its length. In one afternoon we'd completed the main game and were only left with going back through to find more credits and characters.

It's short, but undeniably fun. In fact, after finishing it we immediately started playing it again as one of the new characters. That's testimony to what a guilty pleasure playing Lego Star Wars is. Yes it might be aimed at kids and it's certainly not hard, but you find yourself enjoying it nonetheless. The only thing that would have made it better would have been to base the game around Episodes IV to VI, rather than the first three. Here's hoping they get the message...

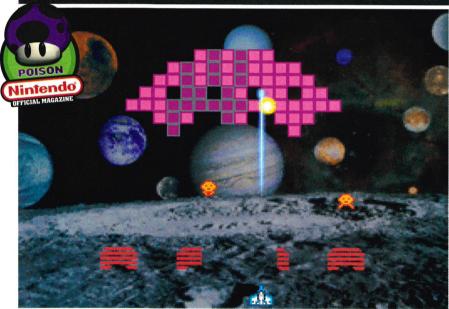

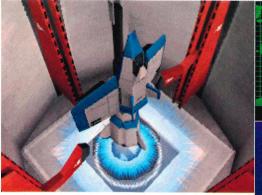

#### **CHAPTER 4-1**



Grab Ashley and head back to last chapter's Garrador cage. Watch out for monks on the way.



Have Ashley climb into the fountain window. Get the Broken Butterfly gun, but don't use it yet.



In the room where you met Ashley, head north. Use the machine to cross the lava pit.



Snipe the monk riding the giant flamethrower. Make sure you go for the head shot.



▲ Jump through the revolving cage. Do the same on the other side, then watch out for monks.



There are more flamethrowers and monks here. Use the walls as cover and collect any treasure.



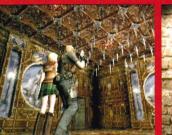
use the tram near the typewriter. When you arrive in the new area, use the ornaments on the large mural to open up a new room.



▲ You need two keys to progress. First upgrade the Broken Butterfly at the merchant's, then go west.



Place the statues on the pads. Put Ashley on the third pad, with Leon on the final one.



Shoot four red targets on the spiky ceiling to stop it from lowering. Once it stops just carry on forward.



To save Ashley from the grinder, snipe the two drivers of the machine. You can do it without the rifle, but it's tougher.





Go east and dodge the falling knights. Grab the King's Grail and the knights will attack you. Leave Ashley near the exit and shoot the knights' heads off with the shotgun, then deal with the Los Plagas.



Head to the central area and walk forward. Monks will be waiting for you. Snipe them from a distance, then use the two grails on the door. In the next hall jump through the window.



You'll now reach a huge hive. If you want, keep shooting the nest until it explodes to collect a load of treasure. Head down and Ashley will get grabbed by insects (you can't avoid this).



Kill the flying insects with the riot gun. Head to the lever and pull it. Now shoot the chains on the bridge so that it can lower. Cross the bridge, picking up any treasure the insects have dropped.



In the next area you'll come under attack from catapults and monks. Just keep running forward and head for a door on the second floor. The catapults will target doors so watch out.



Once inside the clock tower, use the handgun on the wooden pegs blocking the mechanism. Two are near the entrance, the third is up two ladders. After using the lever monks will attack.



After using the lower exit you'll come to a bridge. Shielded monks will attack. Try and take out the monk with the rocket launcher as quickly as possible then deal with the rest.



Next come monks and Garradors. If you've got a rocket launcher, aim at the door between the Garradors to kill them instantly. If not, take out the monks then deal with the Garradors.



Keep your fingers on the dodge buttons during the cut-scene. Once you fall, collect all the items and speak to the merchant. Now head through the sewer, checking the pipes for spinels.



Keep heading forward and have your fingers on the dodge buttons because you will be attacked. Eventually you'll come to a room with a lever inside. Switch the lift on and prepare yourself for a very nasty boss.

■ Before you start this fight, just remember that you don't actually have to kill this dude. Instead you have to wait until the lift is ready to use. There'll be a lot of dodging during this fight, so be prepared. The way to slow the boss down is to knock over the nitrogen canisters dotted about. Don't use the canisters all at once. Eventually the lift will arrive and you can escape this level.



#### CHAPTER 4-2



Upgrade any weapons with the merchant and check the area for items. There's a shooting range if you fancy target practice. If not, head through the left door.



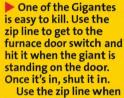
▲ Creep through the mine. Kill the villagers and then search the area for items. Once you've done that, reload your weapons and continue forward.



After a gang of villagers you'll come to a switch. Pull it and a mine cart will emerge, but get stuck. Head in the opposite direction to flip another switch.



▲ A chainsaw lunatic will attack. Take him out with the shotgun, along with any other villagers. Grab the dynamite from the cart and use it on the nearby boulder.



the second one gets too close. Use the handgun to take it out, because you've got plenty of time and space here.



▲ In the next room, press two switches - one on the right, one on the left. Shotgun the insects only once you've hit the switches.



▲ After the switches you'll get to a corridor with blocks smashing down. Trigger the switch to ease your passage.



Visit the merchant and upgrade your weapons, particularly the Broken Butterfly gun. Check around for items then move forward. There are a number of villagers to kill before pulling the crank in the north corner of this area.



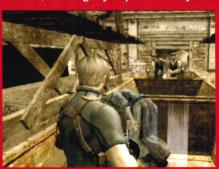
Head down the ladder and you'll be confronted by lots of villagers. Take them out, then try and snipe the chainsaw nutter in the cave-like area to your left. After killing him make your way to the door near the cave, avoiding any traps on the way.



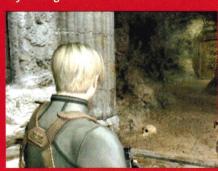
Through the door will be another chainsaw-wielding villager, so equip the riot gun and take him out. Other villagers will also attack, so be on your guard. Once they're dead, head upstairs and grab the key. Then go to the locked door.



Through the door there's another ceiling trap and some Plagas. Use a flash grenade to kill them, then shoot the ceiling targets. Alternatively, shoot two targets, then the Plagas, before destroying the others.



At the mine cart, jump in and shoot the switch to the left. Stay in the rear cart when it moves. After some villagers you'll be attacked by another crazy with a chainsaw. Watch out for obstacles, too.



A chainsaw villager will attack, kill him and dodge obstacles. Once finished, you'll have to jump across a chasm using the dodge keys, then climb a cliff by pressing (A). Use the Stone of Sacrifice on the door.

#### **CHAPTER 4-4**



Head for the mechanical statue. You need to press the two switches. Use its moving arms to make your way across and up, but watch out for monks.



After pulling the switches, the statue comes to life. Press 🗛 to run and use and to dodge. Slash the locked door with your knife and run through.



Check this area for items then head upstairs. Watch for falling barrels and head for the wooden bridge. Climb the ladder and pull the lever to stop the barrels.



Monks will try and stop you, including some with dynamite. There's also a red monk on the ground floor who'll drop loads of treasure if you kill him.



Use the lift, but watch out for monks as you rise. Blast them with the riot gun. Speak to the merchant and save.

Ramon turns into a huge, tentacled monster. His main attack will be to try and hit you with his tentacles, so keep your fingers on the dodge keys. If you get hit he'll throw you onto the lower floor where some Plagas are waiting to attack you. He may also try to eat you, so if you see him opening his mouth, get out its way fast. Shoot the eye with your shotgun to open his weak point.

When Salazar appears from inside, use the Broken Butterfly or the shotgun. Don't go onto the lower level during this fight, stay up top

and keep dodging his attacks.





Now you'll arrive on an island. Here you'll encounter some even tougher villagers who take a lot more ammo to kill and are much quicker than the last lot, so be on your guard.



Sneak forward until you reach a spotlight. Use your sniper rifle to take it out, otherwise you'll get attacked if it shines on you. Jump across the gap and use the sniper rifle on the bad guy.



Head forward until this machine gunner attacks you. Use the riot gun when he is reloading. You'll lose a lot of energy if hit. Watch out for other villagers attacking.



Head towards the large door and press the left button to activate a laser. Now use the mirrors on top of two nearby buildings to shine a beam onto the door. This will open it up.



Head forward and take out a couple of villagers who are lying in wait for you. Whatever you do, don't let them get too close with their stun guns. Head up the ladder and then turn right to find an emerald. Another villager will be lurking here, so be careful.



Jump across the gap and you'll be attacked by more villagers, some of whom have crossbows. Take them out quickly, otherwise they'll keep taking pot shots at you. Then deal with the villagers armed with stun guns.



After killing them, head into the caves until you reach a tunnel with a red barrel at the end. Stand well back and shoot the barrel. The explosion will open a further cave and inside is a Golden Lynx, which you can sell for a high price.



Head out of the cave and make your way forward until you run into a load of villagers. One will be armed with a rocket launcher. If you're running low on heath or herbs, just make your way to the large door, killing any that get in your way.



#### CHAPTER 5-1 (CONTINUED)



Now you'll be in a kitchen. Grab any items and move forward. Blast the flaming fiend quickly or you'll be in trouble.



Use the riot gun on the axeman. Try and take out his legs first then aim for his head. Next deal with the crossbow guys.



▲ After killing everyone in the area, check downstairs for treasure and then head back up the stairs, taking the left door.



At the shutter, villagers will attack with dynamite. Blow them away and the shutter will close.

Leave Ashley where you found her and take out the villagers. After this you'll be ambushed. Leave her in a corner while you attack. Now press the switch. More villagers will attack. Kill them and move on.



Once you're in the waste disposal area, use the switch. A spiky Regenerator will attack you. Hide Ashley in the dumpster, then use another switch to cage the beast so you can easily take it out.



Once the Regenerator is dead, get Ashley out of the dumpster. Push the crate into the water to make a bridge. Cross and another spiky Regenerator will appear. Use the same method as before to take it out.



Head forwards and you'll come across a bunch of villagers, including one brandishing a large axe. Use the riot gun to take them down and be careful that Ashley doesn't get attacked.



Leon must hit a button to swing the wrecking ball and open an exit. Do it three times. Each time you press it, villagers will attack, so run around the pit after pressing the button to avoid them.



Go through the exit and you'll reach an area with a Regenerator. Kill it, then head towards the shutters. Another Regenerator will be waiting behind them, so keep your sniper rifle at the ready.



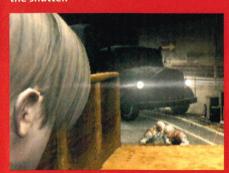
When you reach an area with two paths, follow the left one. Grab the items inside and press the red button. Now head back out and get Ashley to slide herself under the shutter.



In the next room will be two switches. Have Ashley stand by one then get Leon to pull the other. Only operate them when the red beacon in the middle of the doors lights up.



There'll be a big bulldozer in the next room that Ashley knows how to drive. Jump on board and reload your riot gun. Try and stand at the back of the truck because things are about to get dangerous.



As you drive, villagers will jump onto the truck and attack. Dispatch them with a blast of the riot gun. When a large truck heads your way, shoot a couple of riot gun shells into its engine to blow it up.



▲ When the bulldozer stops, quickly head up the ladder on your right. Shoot any villagers and then press the switch. Get back to the truck quickly otherwise the villagers will begin attacking Ashley.



In the next driving section, keep blasting the bad guys at the rear. When you hear a truck horn turn around because this time the truck will be heading straight for you. Shoot its engine to blow it up.

#### FR 5-3



Check the room for any items, then head upstairs. In the next room there'll be tons of bad guys to take out, so equip your riot gun and show no mercy.



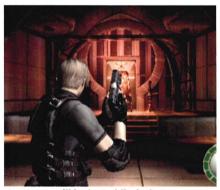
At the end of the hall is a room on your right. Kick in the door to surprise the enemy. Collect the items, including a grenade, then head out of this area.



Next is a dangerous knife fight. While Leon speaks to Krauser keep your fingers on the dodge buttons because you'll be avoiding his blade a helluva lot.



After all that dodging, there's still more to go. Some lasers you can walk between, but others you can't. To get through these lasers you'll have to press the dodge buttons – normally and .



Now you'll be in Saddler's throne room. Check around for any items, including the Elegant Head Dress above the entrance, then leave via the exit behind the throne. Now use the elevator and head downwards.

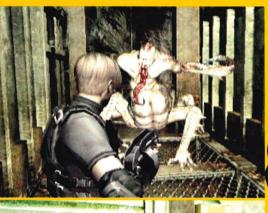


Grab the items from underneath the stairs and then head onwards. Speak to the merchant and upgrade any weapons, particularly the Broken Butterfly gun because you're about to need it.

#### IT (part one)

For this part of the boss battle you've basically got to play hide and seek with IT whilst also trying to escape the crate maze. When IT gets too close give it a couple of blasts to the head with the riot gun and it'll run away for a while. Also make sure you're prepared to dodge during this section. To make your way out of the crates you must shoot green switches which open doors to red switches, providing your escape route.

In the first crate the switches are located on the north-west and eastern sides. Both green switches are to be found near the red door switches. In the second crate they are located in the southern area and the second one is on the ceiling in the central area. In the final crate the first switch is near the entrance. To trigger the second green switch go through the central path, it'll open a red switch panel near the entrance, so make your way back once you've pressed it.







## <mark>:055: IT</mark> (part two)

This battle shouldn't be too hard, as long as you keep running around the central pillar and keep a good distance between you and IT. To give you some help there's an explosive barrel near the pillar which you can shoot once IT comes close. IT's attacks will be similar to those you've already seen, so keep your fingers on the dodge buttons.

Use the Broken Butterfly gun to deal some serious damage. At one point the beast will pretend to be dead, but don't be fooled - only get close after the death cut-scene.







After the boss fight, head through the only exit and you'll come to a lift. Use it to cross a chasm and grab the nearby herb. Once you've finished, exit via the ladder.



You'll come to a campsite with plenty of villagers, but most leg it. Shoot the red barrel to take a few out then kill the rest. Head through the tunnel in the tent.



Head through the mine and speak to the merchant. Upgrade the capacity of the Broken Butterfly gun – it refills at the same time. Check for items in the tunnels.



You'll be attacked by Krauser, but you can't kill him. Keep going through the wrecked houses and look for two parts of a key. Don't use the Broken Butterfly during this fight, instead try and use the riot gun.



Krauser will keep attacking you. Dodge his knife and keep shooting him until he lobs a flash grenade. This means he's about to run, giving you some breathing space to grab items and the first half of the key.



Eventually you'll come to a section with a statue. Keep shooting Krauser and avoiding his grenades until he runs off. Push the statue on top of the nearby floor panel. Pull the switch and head down.



Next, robots attack. They only take one riot gun shot, but get too close and they'll explode as you shoot them. Climb up the tower and grab the second half of the key.



Krauser is very powerful. Remember he can block all attacks to his upper body, so firs you should aim for his legs. Use the riot gun to bring him down and then switch to the Broken Butterfly to cause damage. Don't let him get too close because he can cause a lot of damage.

Most of his attacks can be dodged, but bear in mind this fight is against the clock, so don't mess around. Once the fight is over the clock is still ticking, so head down the ladder and use the three pieces of the key on the locked door.



#### **CHAPTER 5-4**



You'll come to a camp full of bad guys. A helicopter will blast a few for you including a couple of deadly gun turrets.



Avoid being shot by dodging and use objects as cover. The helicopter clears a path for you, but watch out for rogue villagers.



Enter the tower through the left-hand door. Run upstairs and use the zip line to surprise the guy with the machine gun.



Pull the switch and go through. The copter will deal with the turrets. Hit the switches either side of the gate.



Make your way up the steps. Check for pick ups, including a handy first aid spray and some treasure. Then head forward.

Upstairs, head past the cells. In the next area, shoot the barrels to take out the bad guys. A machine gun dude comes next.

Through the first door you'll find the room where Ashley was held captive. Check for items then find the operating room.

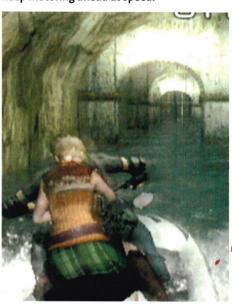
#### **CHAPTER 6-1**



This chapter is one long boss fight, so make sure you buy anything you might need from the merchant at the start of this level. Lord Saddler mutates into a big spider beast. His weak points are the funny looking 'eyes' on his knees. Shoot them with the TMP or riot gun. When he falls to the floor quickly equip the Broken Butterfly gun and blast him in the eye. There are also explosive barrels dotted about, so use them wisely. Keep moving throughout the fight.

You can make it to the other side of the platforms by using the bridges. But watch out because they fall down as you near the other side, so be prepared to jump. Lord Saddler is quick, so keep away. Eventually Ada Wong will arrive and drop a rocket launcher on the second set of platforms. Use it on Lord Saddler, but make sure you hit him otherwise you're dead.

After the boss battle there is a water skiing section. But this isn't particularly hard. Just make sure you avoid any falling debris and keep motoring ahead at speed.



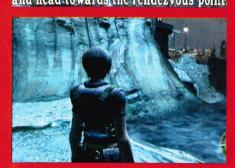

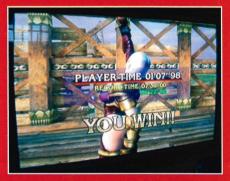
# How to take a pic...
