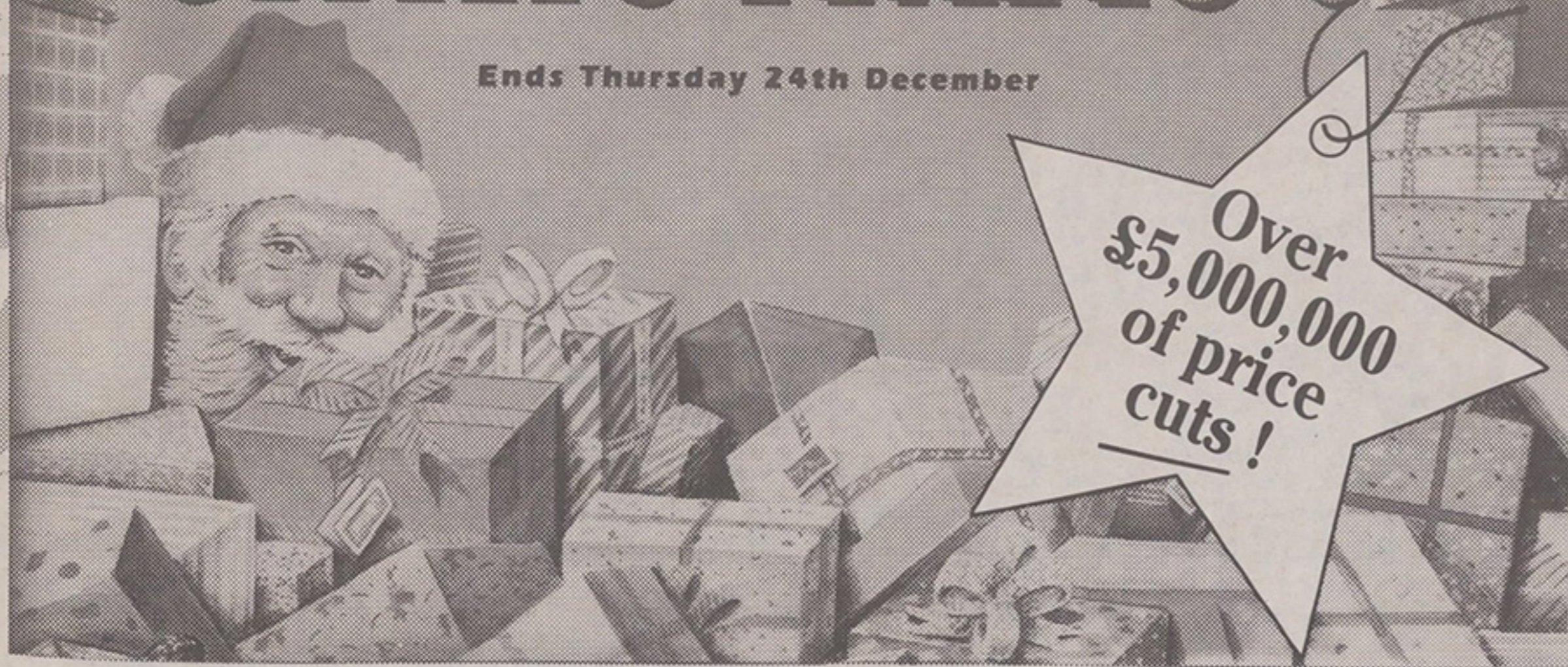

MEGA POWER UP!

Super Sonic

Party time for the video game that's smashing records

SUPER Sonic has claimed a record for the fastest-selling video game of all time.

The tiny hedgehog was still celebrating nearly a week after the launch of Sonic 2 as shops around the country were frantically phoning distributors for more stocks.

The manager of one top London store said: "The game has more than lived up to the hype because it's brilliant to play. It's flying off the shelves. We ordered hundreds of copies of Sonic 2 as long ago as last August and they went in two days."

"Now we need more to cope with the demand that will continue to build until Christmas Day. There is no doubt this is the biggest-selling video game ever released."

Sega initially earmarked 800,000 copies of the game for the UK but are now revising that figure to nearer a million.

And Sonic is still nursing a hangover from a launch party where he played host to some of Britain's top stars.

The basement of the world's most famous toy shop - Hamley's in London's Regent Street - was turned into a space-age amusement arcade as celebrities such as pop singer Cathy Dennis got to grips with Sonic's latest adventure.

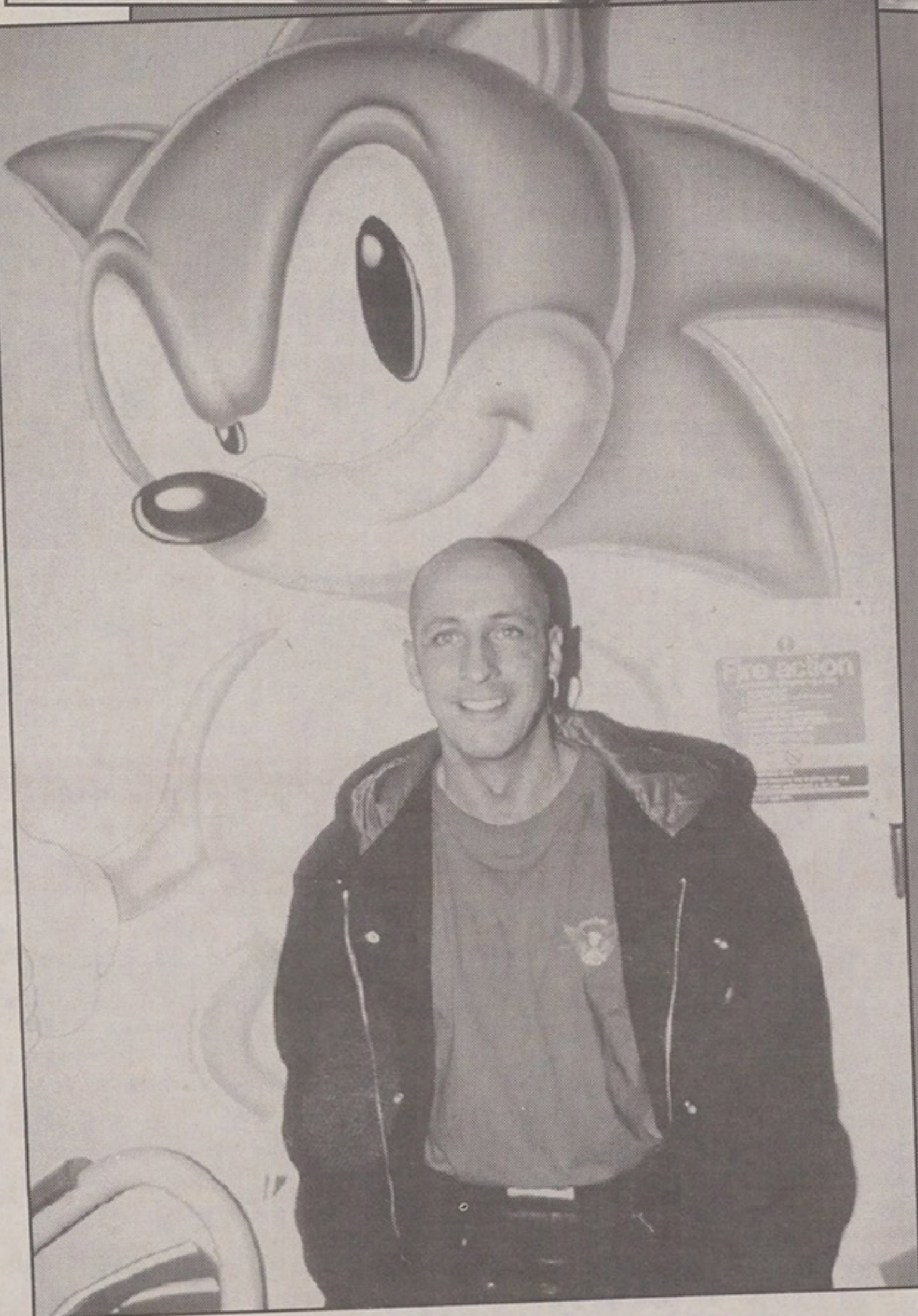
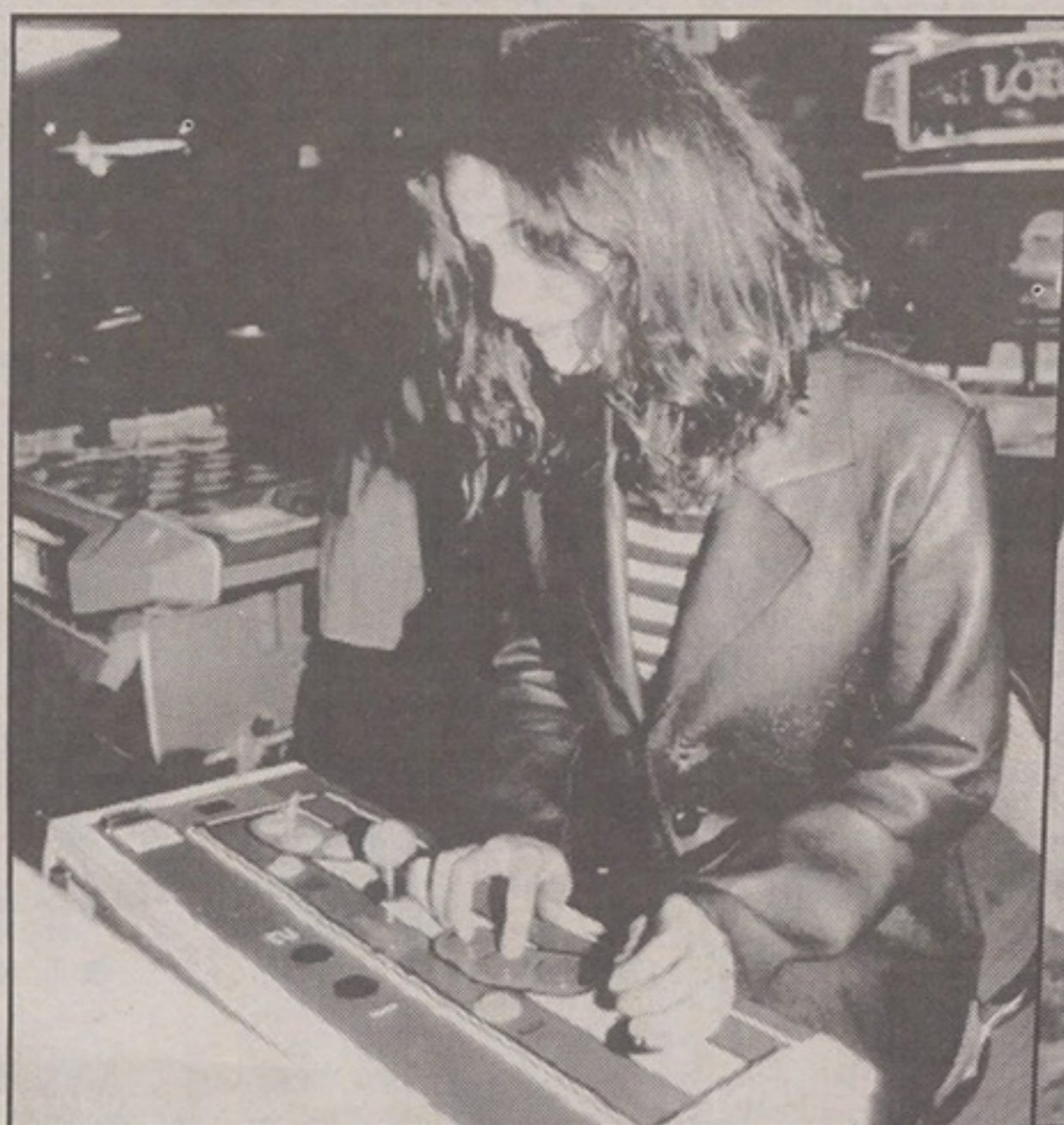
CATHY, whose hits include *Irresistible* and *Touch Me*, was clutching copies of both Sonic *The Hedgehog* and *Sonic 2*. "I'm a complete games nut," Britain's brightest new singing star said as she rushed to a vacant console.

Cabaret DJs The Kleavage Sisters - Timna Woollard and Katrine Boorman - descended on *Gamesmaster* presenter Dominik Diamond, who hosted a Golden Joystick contest.

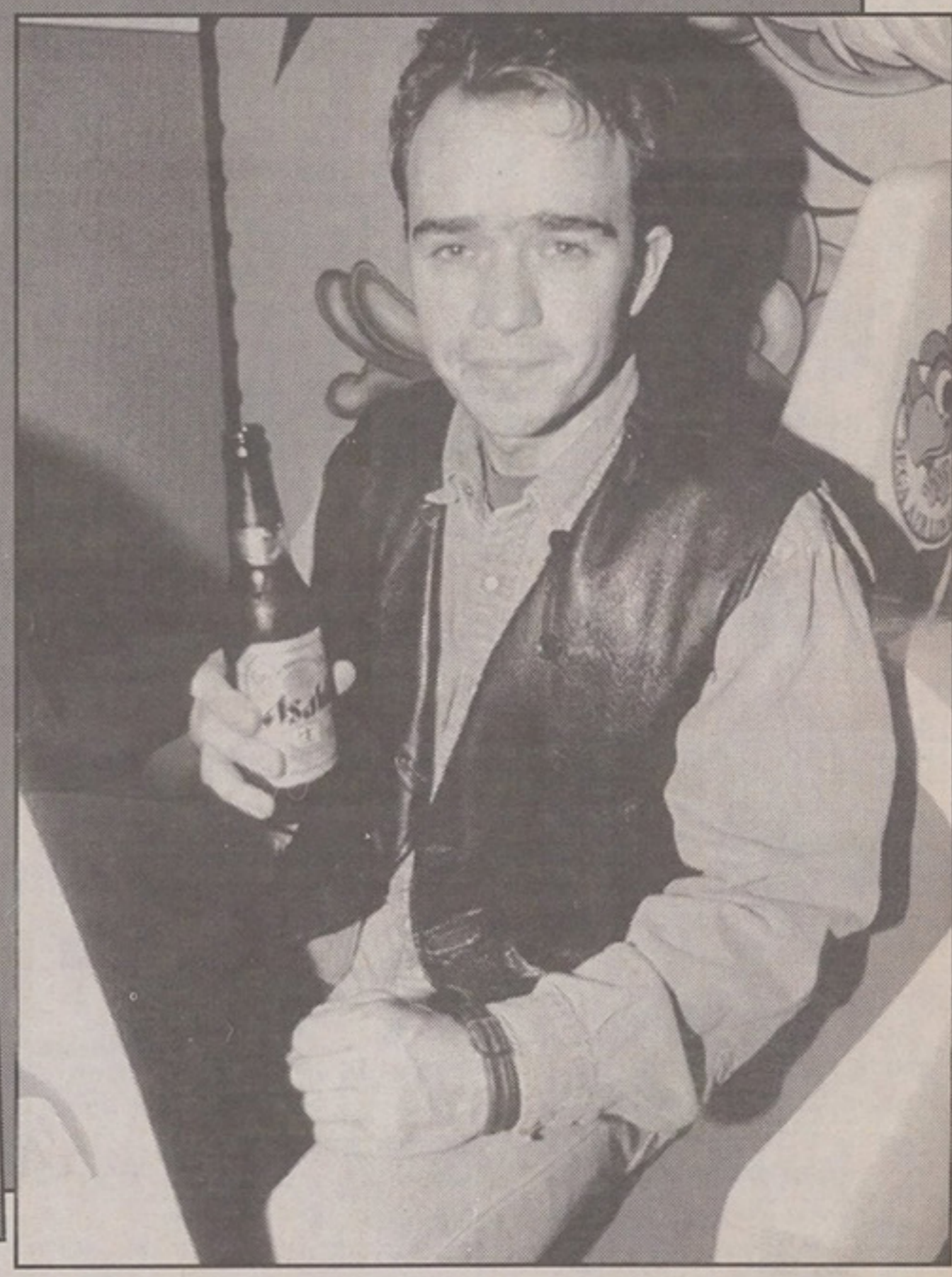
And *EastEnders* star Todd Carty, who plays Mark Fowler in the hit soap, nursed a joystick of his own - specially imported designer Japanese beer.

Fred Fairbrass from pop group Right Said Fred and rugby star Rory Underwood queued up for a go on Sega's R360 coin-op, which simulates a rolling aerial battle.

And the £50,000 bash, which was filmed for television, signalled the launch of a Sonic boom that is set to echo around the country for the rest of the year.



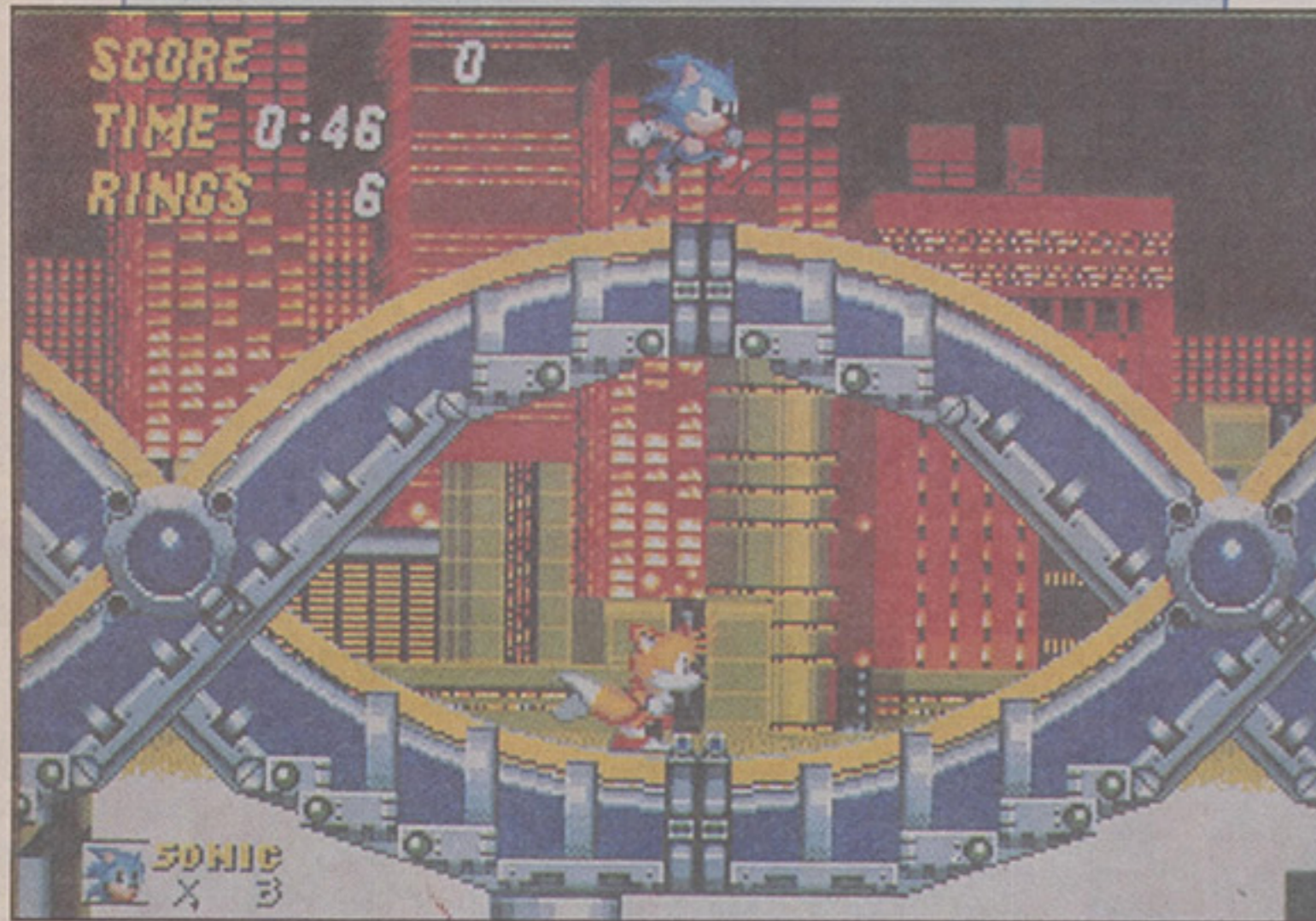
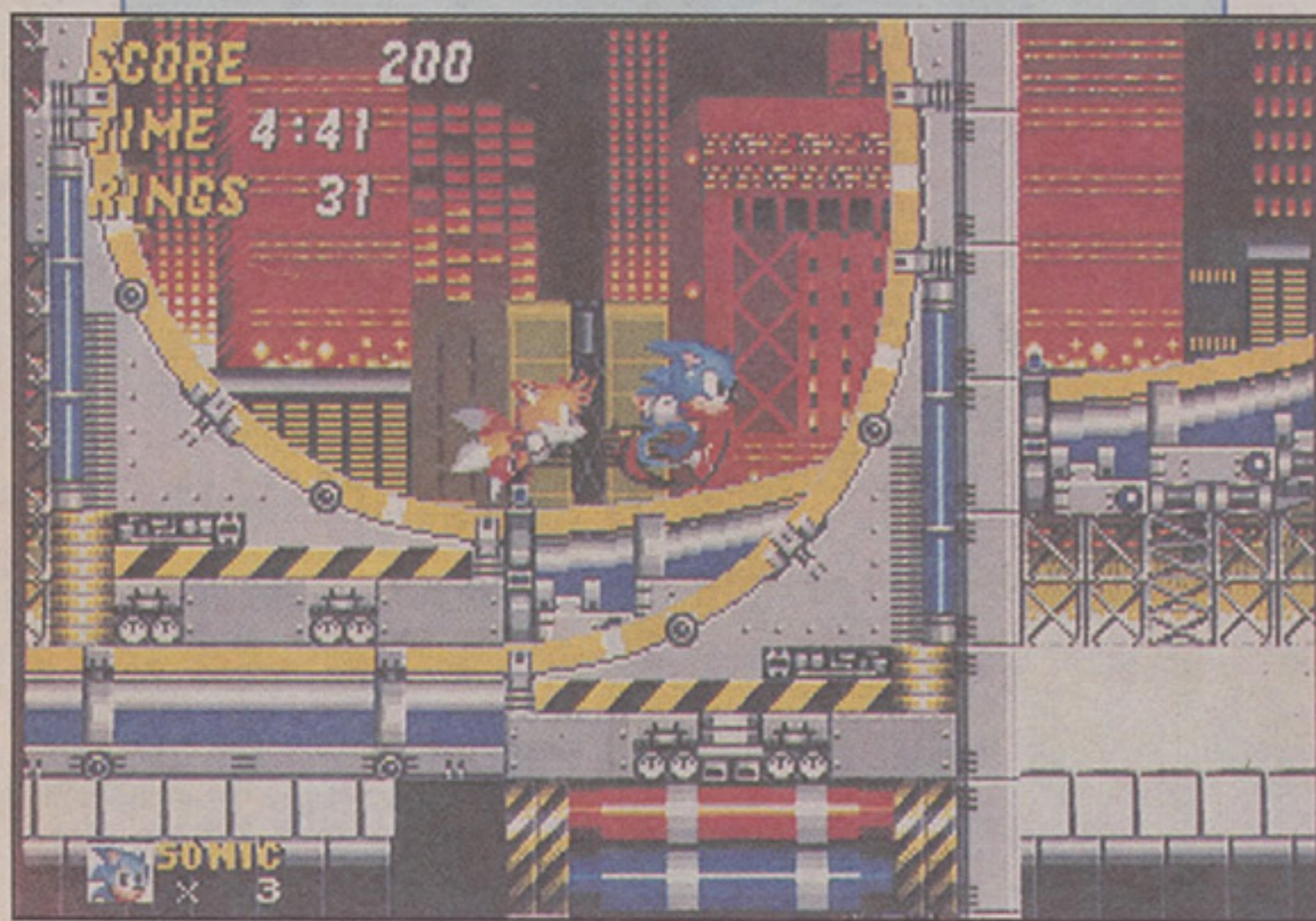

MEGA POWER UP!

All the lowdown on Sonic



IN LITTLE more than a year a bright blue hedgehog, who zooms along faster than Speedy Gonzales, has stolen the hearts of games players all over Britain.

The full-throttle creature is so popular he has made Madonna look like an also-ran and his latest platform game, Sonic 2, has set records for advanced orders not seen since the days of the Beatles.

Yet Sonic would never have been born had it not been for rival games character Mario.

In America Nintendo has always had the lion's share of the games market - thanks to the exploits of Mario and his brother Luigi.

Sega were determined to dethrone the pesky Brooklyn plumber with a planned and concerted campaign.

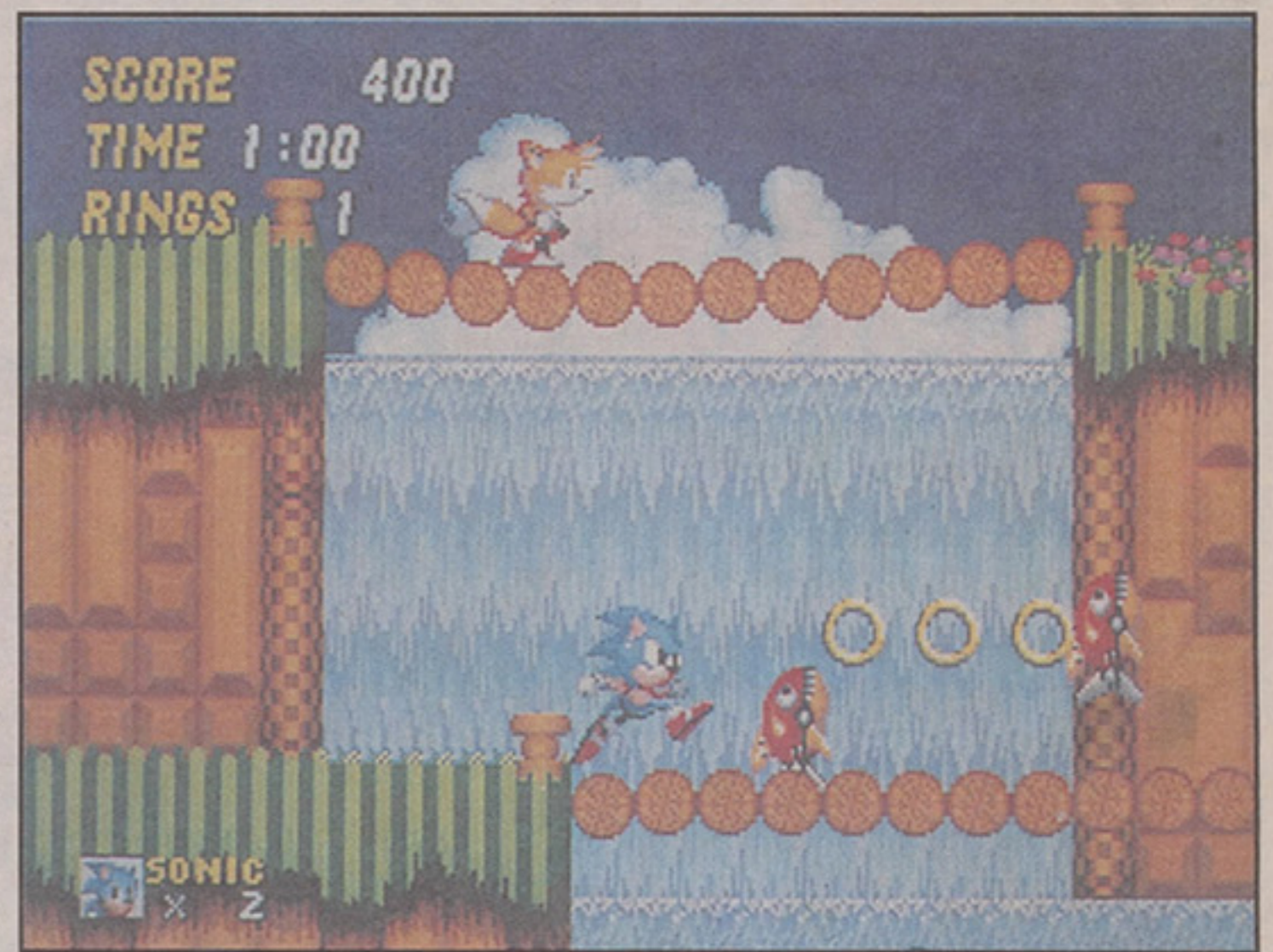
In 1988 they started an in-house competition to find the answer to Mario.

Minoru Kanari, head of the Sonic project, chose the rapid hedgehog because "he was everything Mario wasn't."

EXPLAINS Kanari: "Mario is very slow - Sonic had to be fast. Mario is a human - Sonic had to be an animal.

"We also wanted him to have a universal appeal in much the same way as a Disney character, so we made a study of the cartoon characters who are popular in Japan and throughout the world.

"We incorporated many of their features into Sonic. He has a wider appeal than Mario because he combines elements that appeal to both men and women. "He's cute and cuddly

He appeals to both men and women

but he also has a cheeky attitude and is not afraid to flout authority."

Sega refuse to name the "father" of Sonic except to say he is a 28-year-old unmarried games programmer.

To reveal his identity would leave them open to him being poached by a rival Japanese company.

IN THE land of the rising sun, games-playing is very serious big business. All the family play, and one hit game can earn a fortune.

The first Sonic game sold more than four million copies worldwide. Sonic 2 looks set to double that figure with ease. But it

doesn't end there. The spiky guy has also become one of the best known figures on the "rave" scene after setting up his own nightclub.

Sega were quick to spot that ravers wanted something to do when they were chilling out after a long session.

The answer was to set up video games rooms at any club that wanted a Sonic night.

"It has been a tremendous success," says a spokesman for the company.

"We have moved games machines into nightclubs up and down the country as well as supplying Sonic hats and bags.

"And we are still getting a tremendous response. If clubs get in

touch with us we can provide a chill-out area that will amaze them." The areas are packed with Mega Drives and Game Gears as well as state-of-the-art video walls and game projections."

Sonic's first club started on Friday nights at Ormond Yard, off Duke of York Street in London's St. James's.

AND it has led the bristling little chap to inspire a rave record himself, called *Supersonic*, which is released this week.

Performed by H.W.A. - Hedgehog With Attitude - it is in fact the brainchild of former Haysi Fantaysee star Jeremy Healy.

Jeremy fell in love with the idea of Sonic when he started doing some DJ work at a Sonic rave night.

Now, with the help of speedy Sonic, the record looks set to dash straight up the charts.

Hedgehog that'll blow your mind

SONIC THE HEDGEHOG 2 (£39.99 Mega Drive; £29.99 Master; £27.99 Game Gear).

With larger and bigger levels than in the original platform game this feels and handles like a better value cart.

The two-player split-screen mode introducing Tails The Fox is a major innovation, although on first playing the screen seems rather cramped.

But both characters make up for it by having a new move. When they stand still press

DOWN and any button and they'll spin. Let go and they'll shoot off in any direction.

And they are great fun in the 3-D special zone shooting down a slope faster than the Cresta Run and grabbing as many rings as possible.

The graphics throughout are once again superb - just wait until you start speeding round the Chemical Plant Zone - and there are new tunes as well as the soundtrack from the original game. There is no battery back-

up or password system because the game is not that difficult to complete unless you are a novice player.

But it does have a steady difficulty curve with the evil end-of-level Dr. Robotnik getting meaner and meaner.

Sega have wisely realised that for many younger players the brilliance of Sonic lies in the fact that if you press your finger down to the floor he zooms along faster than anything seen in any game.

As a result they have had to

keep the baddies to the end of the levels to stop them getting in the way, which makes it less of a challenge for top-notch players.

But for every player the game's real beauty lies in the fact there is no set way through any of the levels, so no two games have to be the same.

If you have never played Sonic before, this will blow your mind. If you have, then this is even more impressive than the first time.

● RATING: 92 per cent.

Here are some hints to get you started on Sonic the Hedgehog 2.

★ EMERALD HILL ZONE: Easy peasy. Get to the end of the Second Act and stand still in the middle of the screen.

As Dr. Robotnik comes along bounce on top of his car. Do this a few times and that's the end of him.

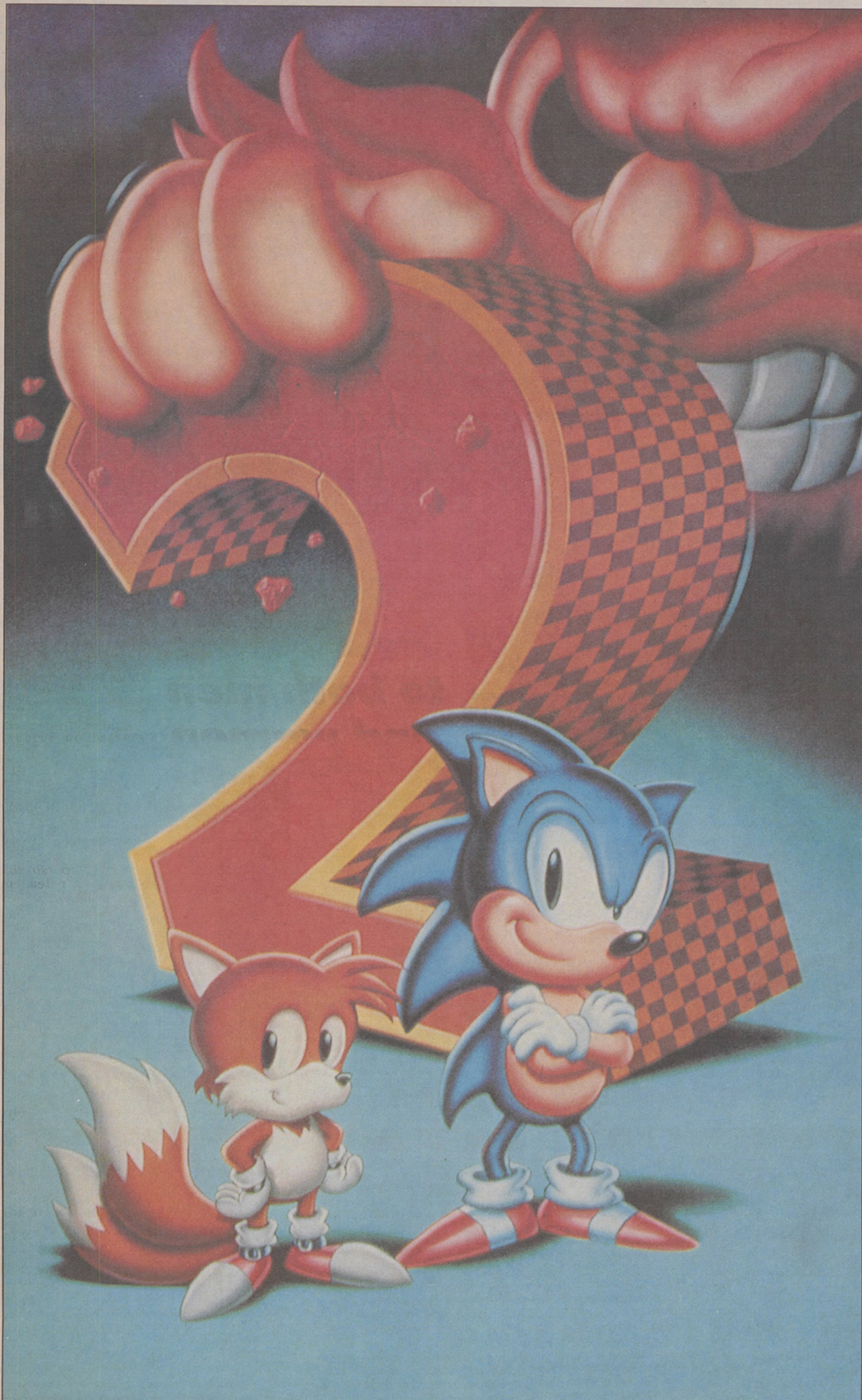
★ AQUATIC RUIN ZONE: Tough one but you can avoid the nasty bits by staying at the top

of the screen and not going near the water.

★ CASINO NIGHT ZONE: Pinball with plenty of flippers and fruit machines are the order of the day here. Things get difficult but remember Sonic's new move. You're going to need it.

★ OIL OCEAN ZONE: Really tough. The best advice on this one is to take it easy and forget you're a supersonic hedgehog. And watch out for Robotnik's tail.

IT'S THE sexiest piece of kit yet – set to revolutionise the games-playing world. Sega's Mega-CD is still under wraps and won't be released in Britain until the end of March.

But we managed to get a sneak look at the top-secret add-on, which will sell for less than £200, and it is even better than anyone imagined.

Instead of on-screen graphics it uses real film for the games. And instead of plinky-plonk noises it has true CD sound and real voices. It's simply stunning and will change the face of electronic games.

Here's how it all works. The sleek-looking piece of kit fits snugly under your Sega Mega Drive and provides a Compact Disc drawer.

As well as playing the special CD games, it also acts as an ordinary audio CD and plays music CDs when hooked up to an amplifier and speakers.

Inside there are two 16-bit processors, which make it twice as powerful as the Mega Drive.

But the secret is in the CD. Whereas a cartridge usually has about eight mega bytes capacity, a CD can store an astonishing 500MB, making the games limitless.

It also means that 60 minutes of real film can be put on one disc and that does away with the need for blocky graphics.

A SEGA spokesman says: "The Mega CD will turn the Mega Drive into an all-in-one entertainment system.

"It is the ultimate peripheral and means that when you bought your Mega Drive you bought a passport to the future of games playing."

The Mega CD will be launched with around 30 games, including one CD that will be a compilation of five or six classic Mega Drive cartridge games.

And although CD games will be light years ahead of what you see now, Sega say they will cost about the same – between £20 and £40.

The Mega CD was first released in Japan in December, 1991, but we have had to wait so long because the games market is different in Europe.

In Japan everybody plays games – it's not just confined to teenagers – and they love the very deep and involved role-playing titles, such as the Phantasy Star series and Dragon's Quest.

Here the market is still growing and players tend to be much younger. They like to concentrate on shoot-em-ups – the Thunderforce series or platform romps like Sonic.

As a consequence a whole new range of games has had to be developed especially for Europe.

Here are just a few of the first CD games to look forward to:

● **MAKE YOUR OWN POP VIDEO:** The game is entirely shot on real film and you choose from chart acts such as INXS, Kriss Kross, C&C Music Factory and Marky Mark.

On the screen there are three different images – the video, live concert footage and tape of the pop stars shot specifically for Sega.

You pick the image you want, chop and change it, turn it upside down, change the colours, add special effects and blow up certain segments.

As well as games such as these, programmers have

been feverishly working on Sonic for the CD, planned to be called Super Sonic for release in Britain in May or June.

Not all games will be made entirely of film.

Many will interleave film with graphics but are keen to release film straight away so you can see the potential of the Mega CD.

The future for gamers looks decidedly bright but it doesn't stop there.

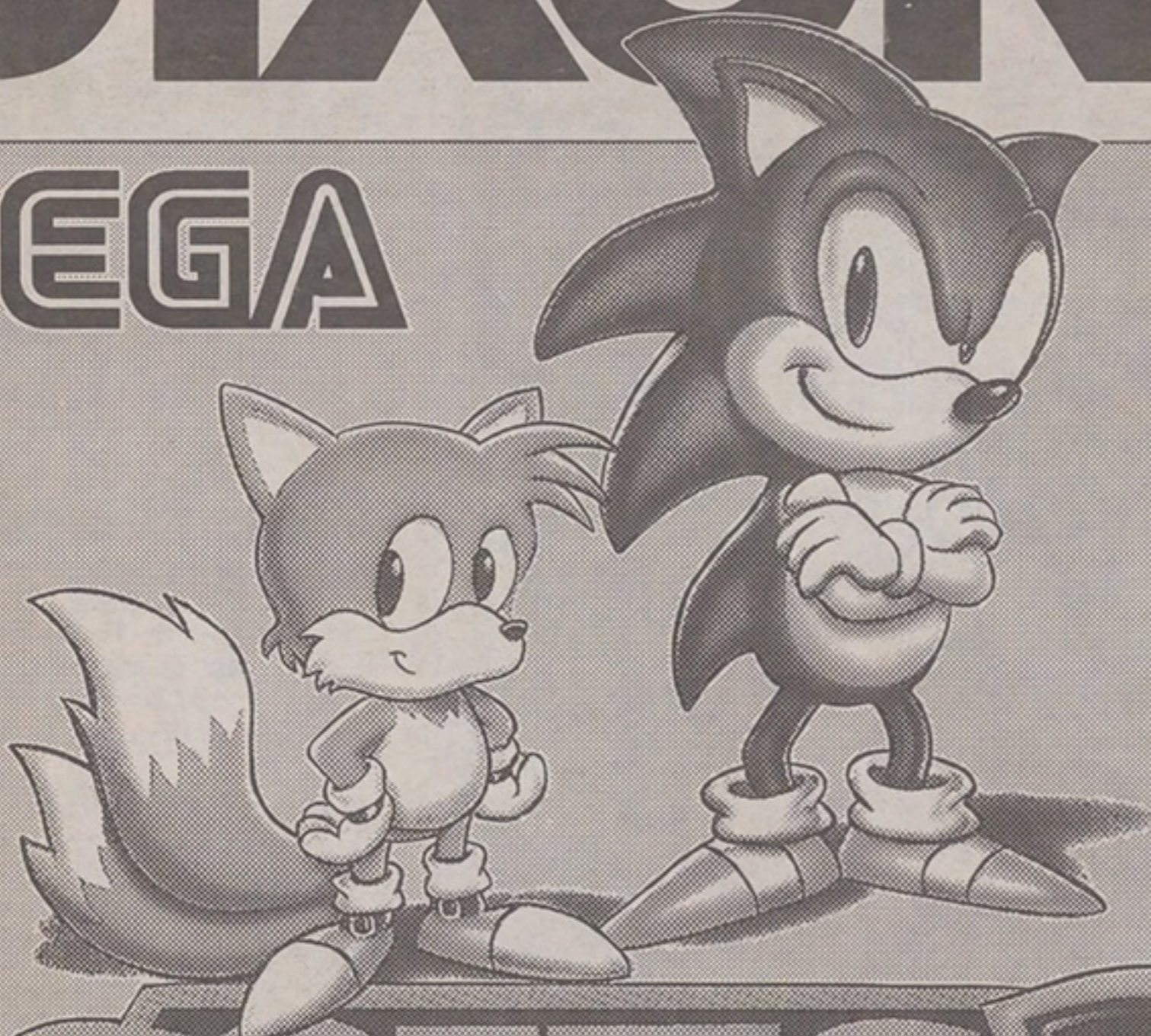
Sega boffins are working on the ultimate – Reality for the home.

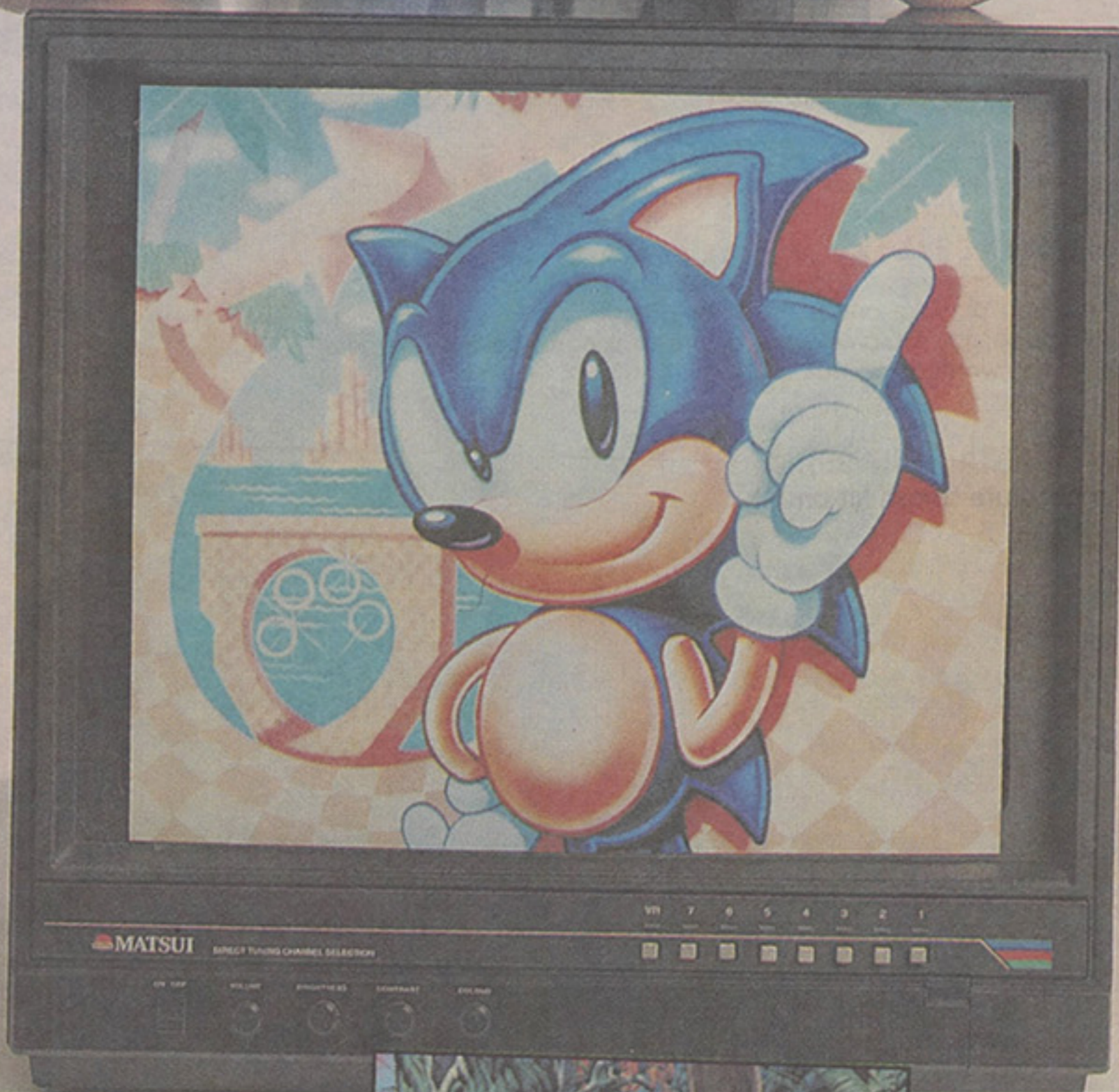

There are more games for the Mega Drive than its rival 16-bit console. And here we reveal some of those worth checking out.



★ **DESERT STRIKE** (£39.99): This came out after the Gulf War and some shops banned it.

But for great gameplay and brilliant graphics you can't beat this special forces campaign against an evil dictator.

There are five detailed missions as you try to blast enemy units with your chopper and rescue troops and civilians. Highly addictive.

★ **TOKI** (£34.99): A fun platformer for the younger members of the family who will love Toki the monkey.

It's not that difficult to complete, which is why there are no save options and the animation and antics are excellent. Try before you buy.

★ **SUPER HANG ON** (£34.99): For pure high-speed motor bike racing you can't get better than this.

It is almost as good as the top-rated arcade coin-op that spawned it. It looks great and

plays gracefully. But if it's racing with violence you're after check out its wicked cousin Road Rash.

★ **GYNOUG** (£39.99): A great big blast-'em-up with some huge and superbly detailed sprites.

It's a horizontal scroller and you must remember to always stay at the back as you blow the aliens to smithereens.

You are the winged battle master Wor and you've got to have

your finger on the trigger for this one.

★ **KID CHAMELEON** (£34.99): A really neat-looking platform game in which the Kid changes into different creatures.

There are 103 levels but no level codes so be prepared to start the game all over when you die. But there are lots of different levels and weapons and it's great fun to play.

★ **QUACKSHOT** (£39.99): A platform romp almost on

a par with the great Sonic. This Disney licence which is similar to Mickey Mouse's Castle Of Illusion looks and sounds fantastic with big bold sprites and startling colours. There's plenty of action and it's no pushover.

★ **DRAGON'S FURY** (£39.99): The finest pinball simulation on any console. The graphics are in awesome 3-D and the response of the six flippers is super smooth.

There are plenty of bonus stages to get stuck into and a



password system to take you to higher things.

Better and cheaper than having a real pinball machine in the house.

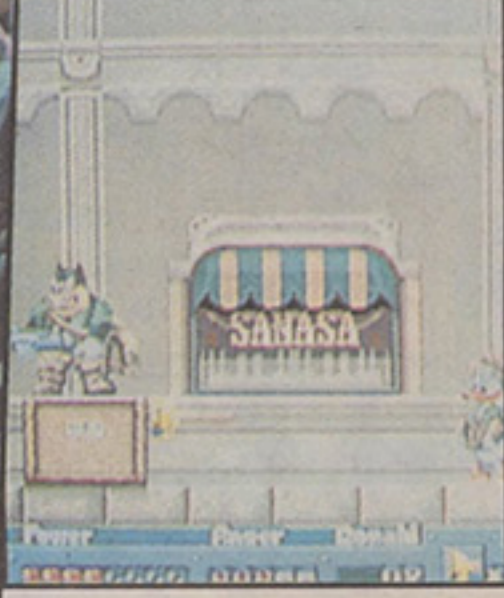
★ **NHLPA HOCKEY '93** (£39.99): This follow-up to E.A. Hockey has plenty of violent action and a two-player mode that is superb.

It is fast and furious and easy to get to grips with – just zoom across the ice and try and get the ice hockey puck in the net.

But watch out when the gloves come off – that's when the fighting starts.

★ **ALIENS 3** (£39.99): One of the classiest little platform shoot-'em-ups ever devised as you try to kill the aliens and rescue the prisoners in this movie spin-off.

The attention to detail in the graphics and the brilliant sound effects – especially the gunfire and explosions – mark this out of the ordinary.

- IT'S not merely the world's best-selling colour portable games machine it is also the heart of a complete hi-tech viewing system. It is the great Game Gear.
- WHEN it was launched last year few people gave the Game Gear much of a chance because Nintendo's black and white Game Boy dominated the hand-held market.
- BUT now more than 300,000 have been sold in Britain and it is the system everyone wants. The Game Gear costs £99.99 and is bundled with excellent puzzle game Columns.
- BUT the thing that changed everybody's mind was the Game Gear's versatility. When you're exhausted after blasting aliens for hours, click into place the TV tuner and it turns into a telly.
- IN fact there are more add-ons for the Game Gear system than any other machine.
- THERE'S an AC adaptor to run it off the mains; a Wide Gear to magnify the screen; a cable for connecting to another Game Gear for head-to-head playing, and even a car adaptor for playing on long journeys. If you've got a Game Gear or are thinking of getting one here are some games worth trying out:

★ **TAZMANIA (£27.99):** An absolute smash hit on the Mega Drive this recently released conversion is an hilarious platform romp with beautiful graphics.

It's perfect for kids because it is not too demanding and is very cartoon-like as you play the part of the Devil from Down Under.

★ **THE LUCKY DIME CAPER (£24.99):** Possibly the best cart ever released for the Game Gear as Donald Duck sets out to save his nephews and get the dimes in a brilliant platformer. Don't be fooled by the Disney connections this is one of the hardest and most addictive games around. Highly recommended.

★ **STREETS OF RAGE (£24.99):** Released this week is another Mega Drive beat-'em-up classic with plenty of baddies and a sprite with more combat moves than the Desert Rats.

Excellent graphics and startlingly good animation make this the best of it's type on the Gear.



★ **WORLD CLASS LEADERBOARD (£24.99):** An excellent golf sim that has four courses and 72 holes. You can do just about everything from choosing your own clubs to re-playing holes. You must adjust your play for wind speed and direction and watch out for hazards. A hit at the 19th hole.

★ **SUPER KICK OFF (£27.99):** Wonderful graphics and plenty of options make this the best football sim for the Gear.

It is a perfect conversion of the Master System classic with overhead views and really intelligent gameplay. You can't put a foot wrong with this one.

★ **SPIDER-MAN (£24.99):** Breathtaking animation as Spider-Man swings through New York trying to clear his name after getting framed.

There are five levels of platform action and three skill options in a game with tough level bosses and a great soundtrack. Brilliant.

★ **THE CHESSMASTER (£24.99):** It might seem a touch obvious to release a chess game but this one is out of the ordinary with excellent graphics and even a touch of

speech. It doesn't matter how experienced a player you are there is everything here from a teching to Grand Master mode. Check it out, mate.

★ **CRYSTAL WARRIORS (£29.99):** Not content with being the best Role Playing Game for the Game Gear it is also a tactical map-based war sim. The graphics are

good, especially the battle sequences, but be warned it is not for beginners. You need plenty of grey matter to master this one.

★ **SLIDER (£24.99):** Immensely enjoyable puzzle game with 99 levels of slithering fun as you try to clear up the screen and dodge the monsters. There are lots of bonus-

es and a plenty of password options to keep you going forward. And with flowing gameplay and plenty of surprises it is a great game.

★ **SUPER OFF-ROAD RACER (£24.99):** Overhead-view truck racing in this near-perfect coin-op conversion. It has some of the best graphics ever seen on the Game Gear with great detail and smooth animation.

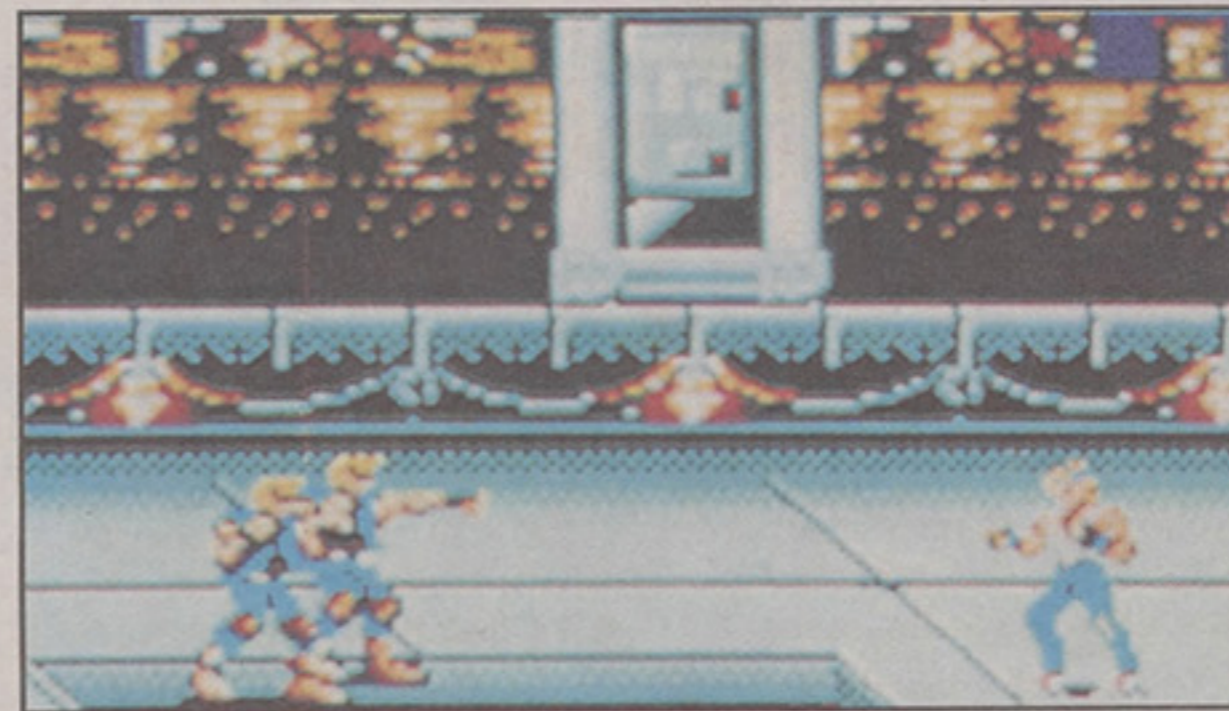
It is very fast and really comes to life in the two-player Gear-to-Gear mode.

★ **DEVILISH (£24.99):** A very hip paddle game that's a cross between Breakout and a pinball sim. The graphics are a revelation; the sound is almost arcade standard and the obstacles include ball catchers and warp zones.

There are seven levels and you can play against the clock to improve speed.

THE Master System was dealt a major blow when the Mega Drive was launched and written off when the Game Gear was introduced.

But it is still Sega's biggest-selling games machine with more than one million in this country. No wonder they call it the Super System.

It first appeared in the UK in 1989 and by today's standards the eight-bit processor is "old" technology. But that hasn't stopped a wealth of brilliant games being released for it - and with a price of just £49.99 it represents real value for money.

It is ideal as an entry into video games-playing for younger family members and not out of reach of kids who want to help pay by saving up pocket-money.

After a recent facelift to make it look more appealing, the current model is Master System II.

Check it out and you'll be in for a pleasant surprise. And try out games like these at the same time to get the very best from the Master.

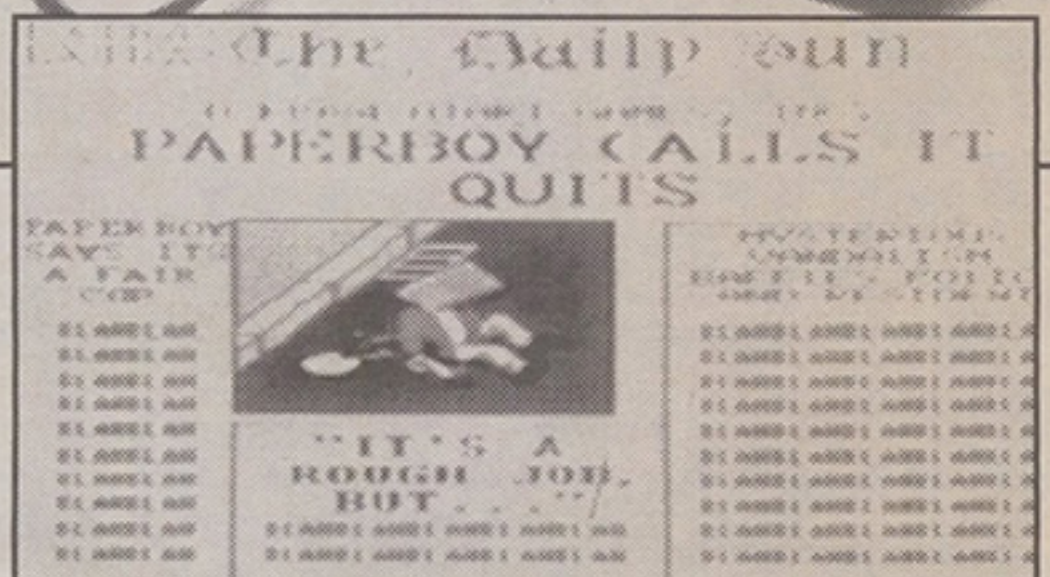

★ **ROCKY (£29.99):** Unlike wrestling sims, boxing games are usually dire but this one stands out because you train the boxer before fighting for the title. Essentially a

two-player game, it has some excellent animation. It's knockout.

★ **CHUCK ROCK (£29.99):** In this excellent platform romp, Stone Age Chuck has one hell of a beer-belly which he uses to good effect as he tries to rescue his wife from the evil Gary Gritter. Good graphics and a sense of humour make this highly playable.

★ **PRINCE OF PERSIA (£29.99):** Undoubtedly the finest animation ever seen on an eight-bit game.

In real time the Prince has to escape from the dungeon and see off the Grand Vizier, who has nicked his girl. Plenty of puzzles and truly awesome use of the Master System graphics. A classic.

★ **R-TYPE (£29.99):** The very best blast-'em-up you can get for this system. If you like blowing away aliens and standing up to some huge sprites, this is the one. You'll need quick reactions and plenty of power to overcome some of these bad-dies.

★ **CALIFORNIA GAMES (£29.99):** A series of West Coast "sports", such as frisbee, skateboarding, BMX riding and surfing, are brilliantly brought to life because of the fine graphics. Will appeal to the tanned beach bum in everyone and about the only injury you get is a sore thumb.

★ **ASTERIX (£29.99):** After Sonic's 1 and 2, this is probably the best platform adventure you can get as Asterix and Obelix set off to tackle the Romans and rescue a druid. Cute characters and imaginative gameplay mark this out from the herd. Not as easy as you might think.

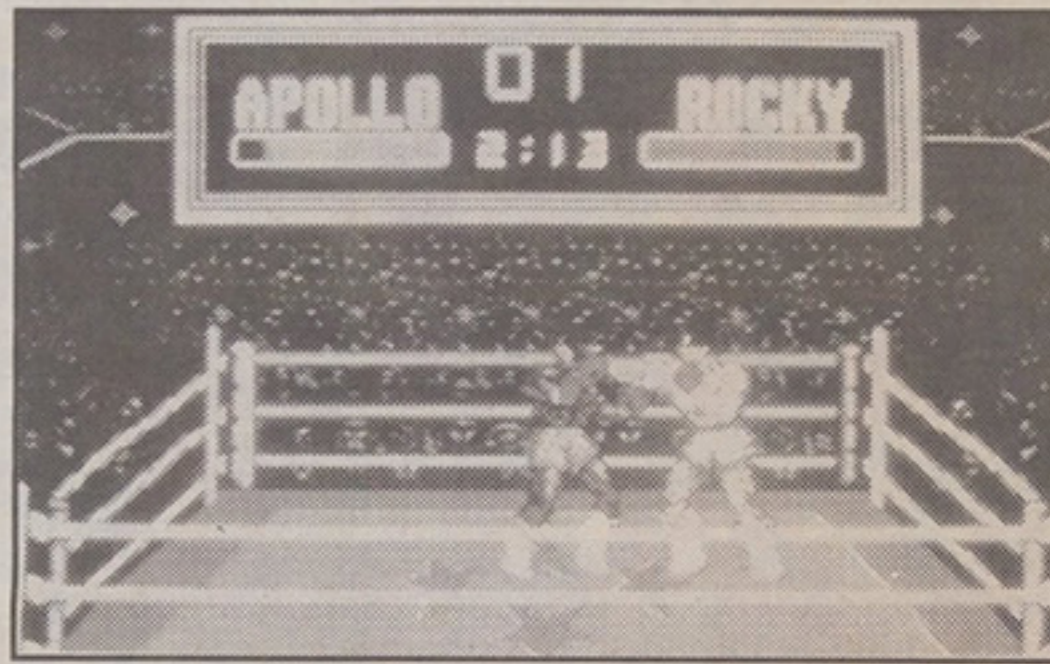
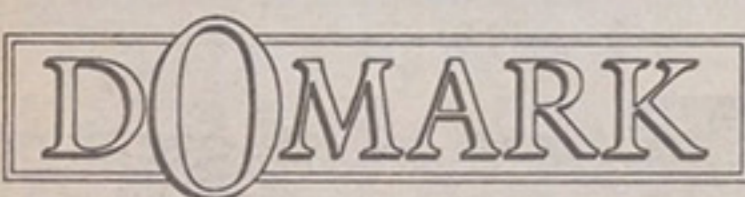

THE world's greatest beat-'em-up game Street Fighter II is set to be released on the Mega Drive by March next year.

Sega are in secret talks to finalise a deal even though arch-rivals Nintendo claim they have exclusive rights to the game.

A Sega marketing executive admitted last night: "It is being rumoured that Street Fighter will be released by us. I am not confirming or denying it."

But spies in Japan say the game will be called Street Fighter II Champion Edition and will have all the features of the world's biggest-selling coin-op.

Ecco

Plus you will be able to play each of the four bosses and there will be extra moves for the main characters.

The only console for which the game is currently available is the Super NES and it is Nintendo's main selling point this Christmas.

In January Sega are planning to release a brand new games character called Ecco the dolphin on the Mega Drive.

"It is an environmental game in which you play the part of the dolphin and have to collect crystals and lots of other New Age stuff," explains a Sega spokesman.

"Then you have to make sure that mankind gets its come-uppance for allowing the world to get into such a sorry state.

"We expect Ecco to become a major character and if he proves to be a success then there will no doubt be follow-up games later."

Another character being released in the first weeks of the New Year is Chakan.

In most games you have to try and keep your character alive against dreadful odds.

Not this time. Chakan is practically invincible and the idea is to try and kill him!

In 1992 Sega released more than 100 different games in Britain and next year they expect it to be more.

Some of them will be re-vamped old favourites such as Streets Of Rage II. The original was one of Sega's best-sellers.

Now the classic beat-'em-up has got tougher, with better backdrops and more sophisticated weapons.

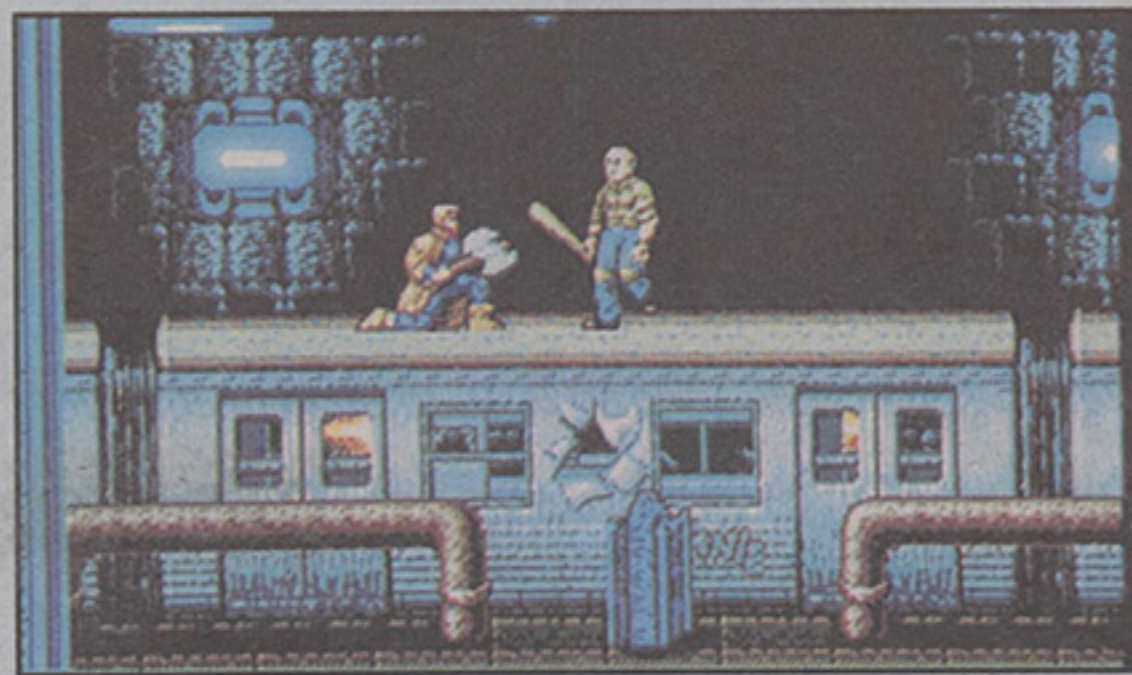
Says Sega's marketing man: "It is not simply a question of cashing in on a game that we already know is a provable hit. We are improving it for a new generation of players.

"Our 16-bit Mega Drive system is a highly advanced piece of technology.

"And the more the programmers get used to writing for it the more they can get out of

Other carts include the pool game Side Pocket as well as the strangely named Two Crude Dudes.

You'll just have to wait to find out what that one's all about.
