

The Sega Saturn is in the shops now! Following the example of Sega of America, Sega Europe launched their new wonder machine a full two months ahead of schedule on July 8th, leaving Sony's PlayStation back stage and too scared to show its face!

This is no limited release either, it's a fully blown assault on the high street with machines available from all the major retail outlets. The price? Well, a console with one joypad and a copy of the new improved *Virtua Fighter* will set you back £399.99, but expect the price slashing retail wars to start very soon.

Games available at launch are Daytona USA for £49.99, Clockwork Knight for £39.99 and Sega International Victory Goal for £44.99. Following these hot releases up in August will be Panzer Dragoon and Bug.


Namco's Director

Research and Development Craig Erickson commented, "It is our goal to develop both original product and to enhance exiting arcade products for Sega Saturn", he continued, "Cybersled will be the first of many titles we create for this breakthrough platform".

President and CEO of Namco Hometek Yoshi Homma added, "Namco has an extensive library of top arcade titles which we plan to unveil on consumer platforms this year. The Sega Saturn is a natural platform for these highly advanced and sophisticated titles".

So does this mean a version of Ridge Racer for the Saturn? It's certainly one of Namco's leading arcade machines along with Tekken and did follow up the release of Cybersled on Sony's PlayStation (spit). The Saturn version of their arena combat simulation is a much enhanced game over the PlayStation with improved graphics and speed and even new characters and stages.

A Saturn version of Ridge Racer would benefit from the Sega machine's enhanced graphic chips and would certainly give Daytona USA a run for its money with a fast and slick racing game. SegaPro predict you will be playing the game on the Saturn in the not so distant future. Worth the wait? Of course it is!

# Rave with the Mega-CD!


All those sceptics who think the Mega-CD has had its day can think again. It's been given a whole new lease of life and started going to raves with a little help from a gadget called Flux!

From record and technology company EXP, Flux is a cartridge that plugs into the Mega Drive port and translates all music coming from the Mega-CD into visuals. A bank of built-in graphic effects can be user controlled through the joypad or left to randomly create pulsating light shows that throb, colour-cycle and animate in time to the music.

This amazing new technology was showcased at the Glastonbury

festival this year where it provided visuals for the giant video screen on the Pyramid stage.







gameplay. smooth Fortunately these have now been sorted out and Virtua Fighter Remix is appearing as a Saturn pack-in for a limited period only. It's doubtful that we'll ever see it in this country but check your local

# **Word on the Street**

The movie may have been a mega-buck flop and there's no sign of Street Fighter 3 yet but Capcom's legendary fighting series is far from over. As reported in last issue the Japanese software giant is busy preparing not one but three new games. First up there's the arcade game based on the poorly received motion picture. Street Fighter: The Movie features digitised footage of the film's stars coupled with all the action we've come to expect from the world's biggest beat-'em-up. As with Mortal Kombat, actors were filmed performing their moves against a blue screen. With the exception of Dhalsim, all of the movies characters have been included in the new arcade game (Blanka and Dee-Jay were going to be dropped due to memory restrictions) as well as two new characters, Blade and Captain Sawada.

The big news for Saturn owners is that the home version is due for a September release and is looking identical to its coin-op cousin.

Capcom's other big hitter is *Street Fighter Zero* (or *Legends* as it will be known over here). As you probably already know, this is a prequel game that only features a few of the existing fighters along with a bunch of newcomers. The animation is reminiscent of Night warriors (also heading to the Saturn) and the gameplay is said to be spot on.

Characters to select from include old favourites such as Ryu, Ken, Chun-Li, Sagat and M. Bison as well as fresh-faced fighters Gouki, Birdie, Adon, Sodom, Guy, Rose and Charlie (Guile's best mate).

Both games are due to hit the arcades this summer so start saving your pennies now!

Finally, footage from the animated Street Fighter movie (only released in Japan so far) will appear in a special interactive Saturn game due later this year. More info on this as we get it.





All the animation is out of this world, having been created with the the help of Jim Davis' team of professional artists. The fat cat has different frames for each level too, sporting a sharp pair of sabre teeth in one and wearing a variety of hats.

The selling point of the game isn't really the gameplay, after all it's got all the usual platform tomfoolery we've seen many times before, it's the sheer size of the adventure. Platform game fans will wow at the size of each level and all the tricky leaps and manoeuvres to make along the way.

There's also help at hand in the shape of his pet rat, Roadkill. This toothy rodent can help out with problems such as opening doors, tackling the bad guys and even basic spelling!


The game is seen from a side-on perspective with all the action set on a comic book page and battles fought panel by panel. Handy objects to collect include weapons, extra health and objects to enable you to exit certain levels.

As with any comic book, all the dialogue in the game is presented in word balloons which also fill the player in on the plot as the game progresses. This feature and other neat touches, such as leaping over from one panel to another after a fight, are intended to make Comix Zone a truly interactive adventure. Whether it succeeds or not, you'll have to wait and see in our forthcoming review.

Ithough not as big a hit as it's TV cousin, Star Trek The Next Generation, Deep Space Nine is still going strong in the States and is well into its third season. The Mega Drive game has been in production for yonks and has now been snapped up by those friendly folk at Playmates.

Set on an ex-Cardassian space

station of the same name, Deep Space Nine is a familiar platform game mixes that elements of the TV show with the gameplay of MD such classics as

DS9 has all the elements of a classic platform game

Flashback and Another World.

As with the TV series DS9 features a strong political storyline with a fair sprinkling of action/adventure which is usually sadly missing from the show itself. Players begin the game as Commander Sisko and eventually progress to utilising four of the show's main characters each of whom has their own unique skills and talents. The main mission is to discover who has been planting bombs on the station and supplying weapons to a group of Bajoran terrorists. Along the way players encounter Cardassians, battle a Borg and travel through a wormhole to the mysterious Gamma Quadrant.

So far DS9 has all the elements of a classic platform game: a variety of characters, tricky puzzlesolving and a unique atmosphere. Fans of the TV show will be glad to hear that the programmers have included many familiar faces as well as settings from top The characters episodes. themselves look a lot like their TV counterparts but for some reason they all seem to be incredibly athletic (Sisko could give Daley Thompson a run for his money!).

Expect to see Star Trek: Deep Space Nine beaming into the shops in September and we should have a full review for you next issue.

Kira is the official liaison for Bajor and her views and outspoken opinions often bring her into conflict with Commander Sisko.

## 3. Dr Julian Bashir

Top of his class at Starfleet Academy, Dr Bashir could have had the pick of any starship in the fleet. He chose DS9 considering it to be a perfect place to practice 'frontier medicine'. Although considered young and reckless, his crewmates realise that Bashir has a passion for his work and saving lives is what he does best.

## 4. Chief Security Officer Odo

A shape-changer who's true origin is something of a mystery. Rumoured to hail from the Gamma Quadrant, Odo is desperate to find out the truth about himself and whether any of his race still exist. He and Kira are close friends and she was instrumental in him receiving his position as Chief Security Officer aboard DS9.

kick with some after-touch on it has a much better chance of scoring than a normal, straight shot. Always try Ato be inventive when you go for goal, or else you'll just end up wasting your chances, and inevitably losing the match. The mid-air change of direction on after-touch kicks will confuse the keeper and get you that goal.











# Throw-ins

ou should move the marker around the pitch as much as you can before throwing it. This will not only find your receiver some space, but hopefully you'll loose the defender while you're at it.





# Goalies

or most of the game, the goalies are automatically computer controlled, but when it comes to saving penalties, you'll find that you can move him around the net. Just before the oppositions player kicks the ball, press the D-pad in the direction of the cursor, and with any luck, he should dive that way and make the save. Occasionally, the ball will be kicked straight at your keeper – if this is the case, then do nothing and he'll automatically save it!









# Corners

When taking a corner, the best results will always come from playing it short and then curling the ball into the far top corner of the net.

There is a good chance of kicking it long and blasting or heading the ball into the back of the net, but if the goalie manages to get a garb at the ball, the chances are that he'll steal it away from your striker.





# **lackling**

Sliding tackles are always a bit dodgy – half the time you'll accidentally end up failing the opposition! A much better tactic is to run into the player and hopefully you'll come away with the ball in your possession.







# The Champion

here are four tournaments to battle through and you should be able to get through the first three with no problems at all if you've chosen a strong team. After you've conquered Europe, you'll then have to battle the All-Star team - made up entirely of star players! he hot sun and green plains of Italy should offer no real problem to a hardened rasher. The track itself isn't particularly difficult, but the people who cram along the road side are! The Police shouldn't give you too much hassle.


### **Using weapons**

nce you have a weapon, there's nothing to stop you from dealing out some serious punishment to the other riders. Beware, though, as unarmed drivers can easily nick back your weapon! The best weapons to have are the chain and club as these cause the most damage. So there.



### **Punching**

ttacking the other riders is a tricky thing. When you first begin the game, you'll only have your fists to protect you with, so try not to get into any scraps too early on. Hitting another driver who already has a weapon is your only chance of arming yourself, so time your punch so that you swing out just when he attacks you. On all other occasions, you should resort to punches only to stop other drivers overtaking you.



### **Getting off to a** good start

old down on button B as soon as the race begins. When the flag is waved, you'll automatically start to zoom off. Starting from the back of the grid, it's possible to pass many of the tail-enders if you drive straight through the middle of them. By doing this you should end up from 15th to 8th. Try not to get into any fights at the beginning, but remember to punch any riders who try to overtake you.



Passing other bikes
After you pass the tail-enders, your next
Approblem is getting past the front runners. As
these guys will inevitably be armed with clubs and chains, you should always try to steer as far away from them as possible. When this isn't possible, go right up next to them as you overtake and steer your bike into them while you punch. If you've done everything right, you should manage to come away with a weapon!



hen you crash your bike, a frequent occurrence as you'll find out, you'll probably end up far, far away from the actual accident spot itself as you get thrown. When this happens, don't panic! Your rider will automatically run (or should that be limp?) back to his bike as quickly as he can. The problem comes when he has to cross the road, as the other riders and road users won't give two hoots about avoiding him as they race along. Keep an eye in your rear-view mirror for any signs of trouble.





### The Police

he local constabulary have it in for you, you know. I mean, they never arrest any of the other rashers, do they? I don't know... Anyway, the best way of avoiding any trouble is to keep out of their way. Whenever you hear the familiar sound of a siren or helicopter blades, ride as carefully as you can and don't, whatever you do, crash. As soon as the danger has passed, you can then ride hell for leather again.





# **Monster mash!**

**Dodgy stop**motion monsters? **Digitised fighters** and scaling backgrounds? The Saturn gets it's second beat-'em-up but haven't we seen this all

ith Virtua Fighter reigning supreme as the top Saturn fighting game any new beat-'em-up hoping to snatch the combat crown is going to have to be pretty stunning. So does Battle Monsters stand a chance? Hmm... let's take a look at the evidence.

before?

The action takes place in a mystical realm populated with all manner of strange creatures. Battle Monsters utilises the digitising techniques featured in Mortal Kombat II and combines it with stop motion animated beasts. There are 12 fighters to choose from and each one is armed with either ancient weapons, mystical attacks or a combination of both.

Combatants face each other in a variety of locations with each backdrop featuring plenty of busy animation. Clever touches include collapsing floors, some impressive special moves and battles taking place on various platforms. As with most Neo-Geo fighters, the screen scales in and out the further the players are away from each other. This graphical feature is smooth enough but the badly pixelated main sprites give the game a slightly cheap feel. The CD quality sound is barely up to scratch with a muffled announcer's voice and lack

of any real character speech although the ingame music is moody enough.

Possibly the strangest aspect of the game is the control set up. The top three buttons on the Saturn pad are used for jumping and there is only one kick and punch. By combining these attacks,

players are able to perform a few other moves though.

As fighting games go, Battle

Monsters leaves a lot to be desired. controls. Poor average visuals and yawnsome gameplay make you wonder where all the decent Saturn games are hiding. With titles like this, and Gran Chaser,

the Next Level isn't looking too hot just yet!



ith each new generation of console comes a standard range of genre games to accompany it. You've got platformers, beat-'em-ups and of course the good old shoot-'em-up. Dating right back to the prehistoric days of Space Invaders, there's always been a game to cater for

people who like taking on the might of huge alien empires singlehanded. Now here's a new 32X blaster.


Motherbase makes the player the last surviving human being left in the universe. Not a happy thought but it's a situation that could soon be rectified if the many extraterrestrials encountered have anything to do with it. As in the huge Neo-Geo hit, Viewpoint, this is an isometric polygon shoot-'em-up. The small, but swift, craft tackles twenty enemy-packed stages in order to save the galaxy and just generally kick as much alien butt as possible.

Starting out with only the most basic of weapons there's the unique ability to latch onto enemy craft, take control of them and use their weapons and abilities against their own kind. This enables the ship to be powered up to almost ridiculous levels so the toughest foes can be taken on.

At first glance, *Motherbase* may seem impressive. Plenty of polygons to show off the 32X abilities, massive bosses to fill up the screen and frantic fingerblistering joypad action may all be very well but the game's also slow and very frustrating. No extra lives to collect means that each level has to be completed very carefully and when the screen fills with enemies, the action drops to a snail's pace. The less said about the two-player mode the better!

If it's polygon-based blasting action you're after I'd still opt for Star Wars Arcade on the 32X. It may not be arcade perfect but at least it's fast and fun.





rom Spielberg's Amblin Entertainment company, SeaQuest DSV is one of those TV programmes that I've never actually bothered to watch. It's surely nothing more than an underwater Star Trek - more than a little tacky if you ask me.

Playing the part of a rookie sub captain, the basic gist of the game involves you

piloting your vessel around maze-like levels (viewed from above) and blowing up enemy craft. Every so often you'll come across a 'secret' cavern filled with buried treasure, or a lost city that hasn't seen civilisation for billions

of years. When this happens, the action transfers to another craft (usually either the Crab or Darwin the super-intelligent dolphin) and you'll be treated to a side-on screen viewpoint with you controlling said craft.

There are six special vehicles to select whilst in the launch bay and they all have unique features which will aid you on certain missions. For example, the Stinger is great for swift attacks, whilst the Sea Truck is

The actual SeaQuest sub is the main runabout which you'll be using for the majority of the game, but it makes a nice change to be able to continually swap between vehicles. There's always something happening, and in terms of things to do and missions to complete, this must be one of

your only sensible choice of transportation.

the more involving games that I've played in the past few months.

But don't get your hopes up too high just yet. One of the most annoying things about this game is the dodgy collision detection. Trying to

aim your missiles at an enemy sub, weaving your way around a tricky rock formation or, most frustrating, avoiding an opponent's incoming bullets — all will inevitably lead to hair being pulled out.

Not only is Virtua Fighter 2 coming out on Saturn but Virtua Fighter 3 is already in production. You'd better start saving quick!




