This is the point where I have to 'chill out', so to speak. To lose control of my enthusiasm and blurt out all of the game's biggest surprises would be downright irresponsible. Particularly so, because one of the best cards in Bungie's hand is to play on the expectations set by the first game and throw them back in your face in a new and startling way. Like the prequel, *Halo 2* doesn't try to revolutionise the FPS (see *Riddick* - Issue 33, 9.0 - for that). Instead, it takes all the features the fans loved and gives them a fresh and crowd-pleasing upgrade.

It's not originality and certainly not the plot (although Bungie's marketing people would have us believe otherwise) that makes *Halo 2* great. It's all down to the excellence of execution; the exquisitely balanced weapons, the staggeringly brilliant Al and the simply unbelievable art direction.

Although there's not much of the story we can talk about that won't ruin the surprises, the first

chapter is almost a carbon copy of the original game's opening level, The Pillar of Autumn. This time, the fleet defending Earth comes under attack. Master Chief and Sergeant Johnson must reclaim their space-bound manor from the Covenant. Earth itself is also very much under threat, for the next two levels at least. The immense concrete metropolis of New Mombassa is the staging ground for some insane street-to-street fighting – like Stalingrad with seven-foot tall alien Nazis.

Despite the Battlestar Galactica premise, we have a far more complex and conspiratorial tale than it at first seems. At the heart of it all is the Covenant's religious fanaticism pitted against the humans' adulation of hardware, technology and the man himself, Master Chief. Hearing the Covenant describe MC as 'The Demon' while the Marines boast "I've got a SPARTAN killing machine – what have you got?" are just two examples of inspired

THE FALL OF REACH

in-game speech that drives the story and characters forward.

Halo 2 is one of the very few FPSs confident enough to place multiple

HARD BOILED Why two weapons make you twice as heroic!

DUAL WIELDING takes a little getting used to. Press Y while walking over any single-handed weapon to use it alongside the gun you're already holding. Now you've got twice as much firepower but can't throw grenades. If you use a melee attack while dual wielding, you automatically discard your second weapon. It's a tricky business.



Rating: *** Two sub-machine guns pack a severe shield-draining punch but take an absolute age to reload. You're vulnerable for a good four seconds while they do.



Rating: ** It's tricky to use a plasma pistol and rifle together. The rifle tends to overheat while you're charging the pistol up. Can work well if you land a fully charged shot first.



Rating: $\star\star\star\star\star$ The daddy of dual wielding, two plasma rifles stop anything dead in its tracks. It's essential to make sure they don't both overheat though.



Rating: ***** Two needlers - loads of ammo, extremely fast reload and explosive homing projectiles! Pump two clips into any foe and they'll explode in a purple haze.

>>> non-player characters at your side. Despite being expendable in terms of the mission, these gun-crazy Marines make the total war experience believable. They sweep the area and take cover when the Covenant is attacking in force. They even jump into vehicles and let rip with homing rockets, all the time hollering with vitriolic put-downs and macho boasts (of which Sergeant Johnson is the

undisputed king). On the other hand, when the chips are down, they'll scream for help and sulk just so you know that Master Chief should pull his big green finger out.

The high-pitched shrieking of Covenant grunts never fails to raise a smile. Elites have also expanded their vocabulary way beyond "wort, wort, wort". They now have human voices and we

UNSOCIAL CLIMBER

Elites and Grunts are happy to climb up onto debris to get a vantage point over you. They'll also jump over huge obstacles with their evil alien bloodlust. ➤ even heard one eloquently shriek "Retreat and regroup!" as he ran away into a cave. The in-game dialogue is witty, intelligent and varied. You rarely hear the same line twice. Enemy Al is just as sharp as their ugly forked jaws. Elites are way more ferocious than in the original *Halo*, and they are just as unpredictable. Almost all of them now carry plasma swords as their secondary weapons. They've become a new definition of pain on Legendary mode.

The Al is extremely sophisticated. It's almost as much fun watching two groups of enemies fight each other as it is taking part in the genocidal royal rumble. Three-way battles are so unpredictable that

each play through is a totally unique experience. You can experiment with different weapons and survival strategies each time through.

Lengthy non-interactive cutscenes (of around four-eight minutes) are superbly created with in-game graphics and really give you an idea of how talented Bungie's artists are. Technically, it's nearly flawless despite some odd occasions where the textures are noticeably mapped on while the scene is already in progress. In terms of plot, it doesn't fare so well, deliberately asking more convoluted questions without answering any from the first game. Instead, it prefers to set the stage for the inevitable Halo 3.

MOST-VALUED SLAYER A bonanza of multiplayer possibilities revealed

THERE ARE THREE new multiplayer game modes and a whole stack of new variants for the old ones. Assault is a Counter-Striketype demolition game where the mission is to plant a bomb in your enemies' base. Juggernaut pits one over-shielded player against all the others and Territories asks you to control different parts of the map.



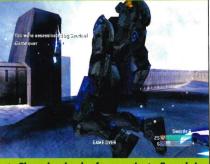
Crazy King is a variant of King of the Hill. The 'hill' you're trying to occupy jumps around the map every 60 seconds.

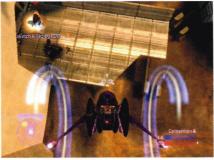

But there's plenty of Halo 2 to get through before we start thinking about the next one. Fifteen massive levels to be exact - five more than the original. Okay, so none of the levels are as lengthy as Assault on the Control Room, but that's a good thing in

my book. Most take 60-90 minutes to complete on Heroic and there's no repetition or backtracking at all, from start to finish - an awesome achievement considering the immense size of the game and the attention to detail that's gone into each level.

Hard disk caching means you'll never have to watch a loading screen mid-level. Automatic checkpoints also prevent your enjoyment of the game being interrupted. Checkpoints are fairly frequent and paced intuitively after every major battle. You always know that you just have to survive a little longer to make progress but don't have to worry about being penalised too heavily if you die.

THIS IS FOR FIGHTING, THIS IS FOR FUN Go ballistic with our weapons guide

CHICKS DIG BIG GUNS! Well, at least according to Sergeant Johnson they do. *Halo 2* has no shortage of new blasters from both the humans' and Covenant weapons lockers. The old pistol and assault rifle are dead but there are some suitable replacements. This is by no means the complete list of weapons – we couldn't show a lot of the new ones because they'd reveal too much about the story. Here's a quick guide to the ones we used the most...



The SMG looks more at home in *Rainbow Six 3* than on board a spaceship, but thankfully it works just as well on Covenant as it does on terrorists. Has a massive clip.



Replacing the assault rifle, this extremely powerful weapon has an awesome scope and superb long-range accuracy. Very lethal at close range too. A versatile gun.



Feels a little weak and weedy compared to the original game's pistol. Packing two of these babies at once and going on a John Woo-style rampage is fun, though.



Easily the most lethal of the automatic weapons, turrets must be mounted as if they were a vehicle. You can kill a Hunter fairly quickly but you're vulnerable to attack.



The plasma rifle has been toned down a little. It no longer has such a devastating freezing effect when you're hitting a foe. Use two at once for a killer strike.



No longer a pathetic weedy weapon, the needler causes a lot more damage than it used to. It's the Grunts' weapon of choice so there's always plenty of ammo.



The sniper rifle is pretty much identical. It still needs reloading after just four shots. You can now see the world in the scope window. How cool is that!



The rocket launcher has a homing option. Just point it over a vehicle or turret for a few seconds until the crosshair turns red. You literally can't miss!



Every Elite carries a plasma sword but so can you! Wait until the crosshair turns red, then press the L trigger to execute a tasty one-hit kill.

The entire Campaign mode is paced as beautifully as one of Martin O'Donnell's hypnotic symphonies. Halo 2 sneakily lays down moments of peace and tranquillity amidst scenes of outright chaos. At one moment you can quite happily be walking through a forest, admiring the sun's rays glistening through the rustling leaves, or watching a fish dart playfully through a babbling brook. It's just enough breathing space to appreciate just how much the graphics have improved. Old Xbox bedfellows: bump-mapping and anti-aliasing are joined by newer graphical tricks including softshadows and per-pixel shading. But beauty can be deceptive. In the very next instant a Covenant mothership blocks out the sun completely and an entire battalion of Grunts, Elites and Hunters are raining down from the sky. This slow, quick, quick, slow approach to level design creates peaks and troughs of deafening silence followed by jaw-

dropping action. The way I like to see it is if you have time to admire the scenery, it's time to be very afraid (and reload your gun).

Of course, there are a lot more reasons to be afraid this time. New species have joined the

CARNAGE REPORT

WARP NINE

GONE IN 60 SECONDS How to steal the vehicle of your dreams

EVERY VEHICLE can be hijacked if you can get close enough. Simply press and hold the X button to rip the pilot out of his seat and take the wheel. The tanks are a little more difficult because you have to melee attack the hatch before you can get to the driver. Once the door is open, you can beat the driver around the head or lob a few grenades in his direction. The objective is to take the vehicle without causing too much damage to it first.

>>> burgeoning alien congregation, most noticeably the Prophets and Brutes. The latter are extraterrestrial gorillas that even Dian Fossey wouldn't get on with. They're slower but more durable than Elites. Ammo and accuracy are at a premium if you don't want to get your head ripped off by their devastating melee attacks. Twice as bad and three times more ugly, the Mekon-esque Prophets are the

leaders of Covenant society. To make things worse, some of the nebulous marauders, particularly Elites and Jackals, have access to new weapons like the Covenant Carbine and Beam Rifle (a new version of the sniper rifle).

If you think that sounds bad, imagine coming up against four Wraith tanks at once! Thankfully, the new hijacking feature makes things a little more



>>> even-handed. Getting close and pressing X can capture any vehicle in the game, from mortar-launching Wraiths to flying Banshees. With the tougher vehicles like the Scorpions, you have to batter the hatch to get it open, and then press the L trigger to throw in a grenade or two. Hijacking is a double-edged plasma sword, though. Elites and Brutes will return the favour and remove you from your vehicle given the slightest opportunity.

Far more than just a gimmick, this simple trick also fine-tunes the multiplayer portion of *Halo 2*, making it a lot more balanced. No longer can one player go on a ten-minute rampage in a Scorpion – they simply won't last that long. This is crucial because over half of the 11 multiplayer maps are packed with fully destructible vehicles.

Considerably bigger than those from the first game, these maps are also a leaf out of the *Unreal Championship* book. They're multi-tiered, labyrinthine and there are always several different routes to a single all-important location. Brilliantly, the best weapons are placed in the most exposed positions, creating satisfying risk/reward scenarios. He who dares wins!

Another feature that alters the nature of multiplayer games is dual wielding. It's as simple as

walking over any of the single-handed weapons you can find and pressing the Y button. It's a little confusing at first because you can only swap your primary weapon in the traditional way (pressing the X button) and your secondary weapon must be discarded before you can pick up a new one. Once you've figured it out though, the possibilities are endless. Despite playing it for hours and hours, we've yet to discover the ultimate weapon combo... but it's only a matter of time.

One thing I'm not at all happy about is the removal of the pistol. The new magnum just doesn't cut it for accuracy and stopping power. That weapon was so brutally refined: it makes no

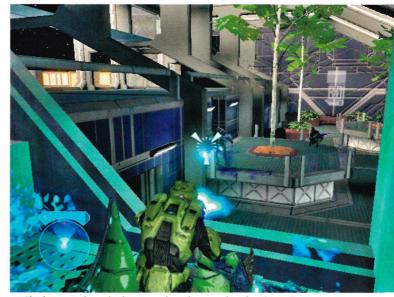

STAY HEALTHY

You might have noticed that there isn't a health meter under the shield bar. Each time your shield is depleted you can take around four-five hits (depending on the weapon) before you die. This fixes the problem in the original Halo where you'd often pass a checkpoint with critical health and would be unable to progress further.

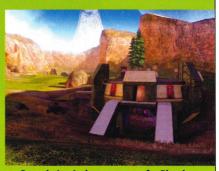

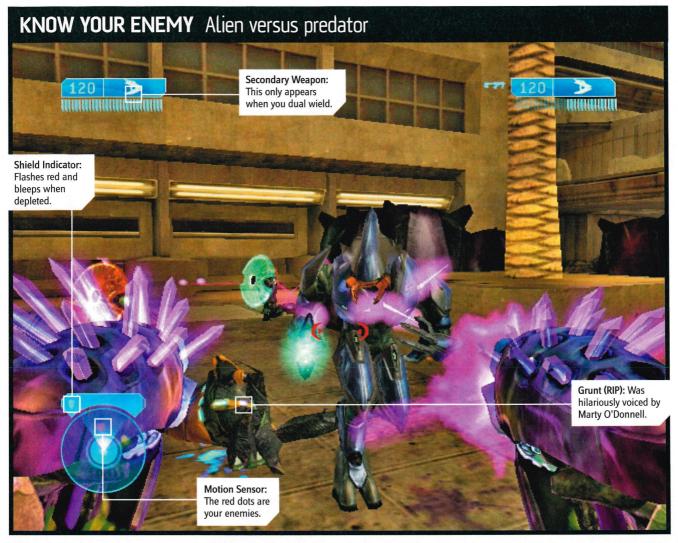

>> sense at all why it should have been taken out (apart from to make things easier for newbies). Despite this, you couldn't accuse Halo 2 of dumbing down. Every new feature the fans asked for - from being able to play as the Elites to detailed postmatch statistics - are included.

Perhaps most significant of all is the brand new ability to field up to eight different teams in a single battle. This won't work in obvious two-team game modes like Capture the Flag and Assault, but give it a try in Oddball or King of the Hill and you will discover how it requires completely different strategies to succeed.

Excitingly, it's still possible to play two-player co-op split-screen. I'll be the first to admit I'm certainly not brave enough to try to beat the game

on Legendary difficulty without another veteran *Halo* player at my side.

Above all else, Marcus Lehto's art direction is what astounds us the most. Sharp graphics don't mean a thing if the enemies and environments are clichéd or silly. There's certainly no danger of that happening here. Halo 2 has real elegance in its design, from the architecture of the alien buildings to the Covenant's curvaceous and insect-like motherships. Apart from the Silent Hill series and Ninja Gaiden (Issue 29, 9.2), I've never played a game with so much visual integrity. It's all down to creating a world apart, something completely unique that you could never find in your standard generic FPS.

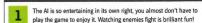
The trailers said 'Earth will never be the same.' Now that I've played and finished *Halo 2*, I realise what they meant. It could be years before we see another FPS of this unbelievable standard. Three days ago I could never have imagined a game could be so intense, so polished and so eager to give the fans everything they asked for. A full-metal assault on the senses, *Halo 2* is an astounding game that will never be forgotten by those who play it.

Dub be good to me. Racing gets a makeover





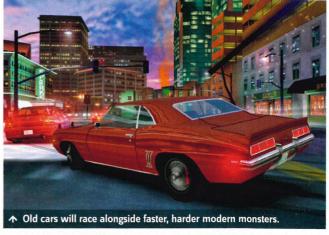
DUB? WHAT the hell is DUB? Well, it's the name given to those massive alloy wheels that stretch beyond 20 inches and make your car look like a toy. Only the DUB in question with Midnight Club 3 (shouldn't that be Midnight Dub?) refers to DUB Magazine, a fan's wet dream of car modification that actually kickstarted the whole bling adaptations of cars. With DUB Magazine's sponsorship aboard we could be looking at official licences and modifications unlike anything before.

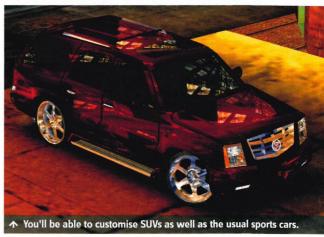
Not only does Midnight Club 3 boast the kind of vehicle jiggery-pokery we've only dreamed of, but there are touches of Burnout 3 (Issue 34, 9.4) in there to keep us happy too. If you want to try your hand at leaping a row of 12-storey buildings, word has it that you can. Racing through urban areas such as backstreets, highways, even malls, Midnight Club 3 is promising plenty of free-ended missions like in the previous games. There will be dozens of alternative routes and, the more powerful the car, the better we'll be at finding them. Some routes will reportedly take place across the tops of buildings and there will also be chances to drive straight through walls and windows, literally

carving a course as you go. It seems there's freeroaming and then there's Midnight Club 3.

To honour all things petrol-powered, levels include the great US automotive cities including Atlanta, Detroit and San Diego. But, with all these cities no doubt subject to a little congestion, there's also the inclusion of new motorbikes such as the Aprilla Mille Sports Bike. These too will prove to be fully modifiable or, like we said, we'll be able to just jump straight over the top of it all in a 4x4.

Cadillac, Chevy, Chrysler, Dodge, Lexus, Lotus, Mercedes and VW are all present, as are Ducati, Hotmatch and Kawasaki, with 50 vehicles in total, plus hundreds of variations from the various mod kit available. And what better way to celebrate your nice new car than by seeing it smashed to pieces? For the first time there'll be real-time damage and, while the new particle physics, lighting and bumps will no doubt appeal to our sadistic side, we hear Rockstar is going one step further. Car developers are notoriously strict when it comes to seeing images of their vehicles dented or bruised, but words such as 'twisted burning inferno' have been uttered. That, combined with two previous games to build on, Live play for up to eight players including modes such as Chase the Flag and Detonate, and a better race track editor, has us wondering just how long Burnout 3 can hold on to the mantle of 'best arcade racer'. Spring 2005 will tell.

PAINT JOB

Not only will we be able to give our cars a spray job, but Midnight Club 3 will enable us to place paint layers on top of each other. Up to five layers of paint can be sprayed on, giving different hues to the car depending at which angle you view it.

SPIN CYCLE

You know those spinning hub-caps you see in your local high street? The car stops and they continue spinning? Well, Midnight Club 3 will feature these too and we'll be able to customise them to the shape you require.

LEATHER INTERIOR

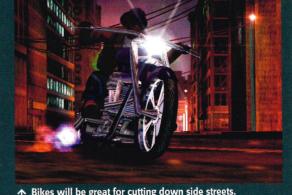
Rumour has it that not only will we be able to design the complete exterior of our car, but we'll be able to design everything inside it too, from the gearstick to the upholstery.

We can't wait to get our hands on this!

Commandos Strike Force

Crawling through rubble for the good of all





COMMANDOS 2: Men of Courage (Issue 05, 7.9) was a stunning, if thoroughly unforgiving game. A top-down strategy that was as much about patience and endurance as it was about killing Nazis, it had a huge following on PC, and an equally committed (if somewhat smaller) fanbase on Xbox. Maybe that's why the next in the series, Commandos Strike Force, has taken the more familiar path of first-person shooter and chosen to disregard the top-down perspective. We suspect though, despite its new appearance, Commandos Strike Force is going to be hard – it won't just be about blasting your way to victory.

In the war-torn ravages of France, Russia, and Norway you'll command a small group of elite fighters, each with unique skills vital to the Allied movement (see Super Troopers, right, for a full debrief). As their leader the Green Beret, you make the decision on who to use, depending on what their skills are and the varied situations that come up in missions.

Each mission will allow full freedom of movement and execution like in the original games, just so long as you get the job done and your men extracted in one piece. Levels will be completely free-roaming, often having multiple paths – the only question is how you choose to use the environment

around you. The use of the first-person perspective won't mean a complete diversion from the stealth and subterfuge elements that made the originals so unique. Instead, it has been implemented in such a way as to suck us right into the action, rather than having us acting like chess piece-shuffling gods.

The missions will be just as broad, deep and fraught with danger as before, ranging from prison breaks to the destruction of a Nazi fighter ship. You'll interact with the underground resistance movement from each country who'll offer you help and advice, plus you'll also have to ambush enemy lines, preventing them from reaching the battlefields of Europe.

For the first time too, *Commandos* will be going Live. A variety of modes will be available from Deathmatch to Capture the Flag, but the more interesting option will be to play co-operatively. With real soldiers working together with a range of skills, we could find ourselves leading whole leagues of highly trained soldiers and, if we're not up to commanding, there may be potential rebellion within the ranks.

Ignacio Perez, the CEO of developer Pyro Studios, told us this was the company's most ambitious project to date. "By combining the tactical approach of the previous Commandos games with the intense action of an FPS, we hope Commandos Strike Force will provide a more cerebral approach to the war game genre. We believe that we're going to set a new benchmark for World War II videogames."







PLAY DEAD

Commandos Strike Force may now be in first-person perspective but that won't mean you'll be able to play it like Quake. You'll need brains as well as brawn so here's a lowdown of your squad.



The Green Beret

This chap is a stern-faced American son of a gun. Handy with heavy weaponry as well as silent close combat, he's not one to be messed with.



The Sniper

With a combination of expert marksmanship and deadly accuracy throwing a knife, you'll be dead without even knowing you've been hit. Ouch.



The Spy
A traitor and defector. This high-ranking German is now adept at interrogation and infiltration. Could walk into German HQ without them even knowing.

ON **XBOX** 2...

The web is running wild with Xbox 2 speculation

ALL MANNER OF rumblings and rumour have been spewing out of the big green Xbox 2 factory this month, and we've been standing outside with our ears pressed to the wall.

Now, although everything at this stage is pure speculation, and Microsoft is doing the famous tight-lipped routine, there are a few things creeping out of the woodwork worth mentioning.

First up, it seems the name Xenon is becoming increasingly popular with the bods at Xbox headquarters. A job post was seen on the Xbox website recently which began, 'Want to help create a new feature for Xenon not available on any platform?' And while the mere mention of the name Xenon is exciting, the new feature looks to be even more exciting.

Apparently – and again this is speculation so don't get too excited – the new feature is called Xbox TV. The idea is that gamers will be able to watch and record gaming sessions in progress just as they would a TV programme. There's also talk of a tickertape that would run across the bottom of the screen with constant updates featuring high scores, game highlights, tournament positions and tradable trophies. If true, this means that you'll be able to spy on other gamers and learn their skills, secrets and tactics before challenging them online.

Toshiba has also been hinting at its willingness to get involved with Xbox 2. At a recent technology exhibition in Japan, Toshiba president Tadashi Okamura mentioned the development of the new HD-DVD format which can carry massive amounts of information compared to the standard DVD. When asked whether he'd like Xbox to use the format in the forthcoming console, he said, "Of course we would like Microsoft to use it." Question is though, will it?

Meanwhile Microsoft corporate VP Peter Moore has been quoted as saying Xbox "won't lose with the next-generation system". He said they have "no intention of losing". He hinted codename Xenon will be far smaller than the current Xbox, mainly because the Japanese market didn't take to Xbox because of its size.

He also hinted to a Japanese newspaper that Xbox 2 will concentrate far more on online gaming than its predecessor. It will apparently offer broadband-based gaming from launch, as well as incorporating established voice-based communication and every other Xbox Live feature currently in place.

Blood Money

A LucasArts bounty hunter with a difference

THINK LUCASARTS, think bounty hunters, and you think Boba Fett. But, strangely, the latest bounty hunter title to come from the land o'Skywalker has nothing to do with clone troopers and certainly won't spend a thousand years being slowly digested in the gut of a Sarlaac. *Mercenaries* is a *GTA* of warfare that is as much about earning a buck as it is bringing down tyrants with huge guns.

We played *Mercenaries* recently and, compared to the early code we saw in 2003, the title is coming along in leaps. We hate to draw comparisons to Rockstar's classic series, especially as so many wannabes fall on their arse, but this, dare we say it, has the very real potential to be *GTA* in camo gear.

With 52 missions based on the 'deck of cards' of terrorists, plus 40 incidental missions, it's shaping up to be massive. And these don't even include non-essential missions! Then of course there's the whole 'sandbox' environment that allows you to snipe pilots and watch them crash to the ground if you're in the mood, or track down 100 blueprints and 100 listening posts, hunt for the 100 hidden treasures, or destroy 100 enemy monuments. Want to carpet bomb a single soldier? You can, just as you can mount an assault against an airfield in nothing but a Lada and, presumably, soiled pants.

The heavy weaponry is great too. Once you've called in your first Bunker Buster and watched it through a scope levelling buildings and hangars,

you'll be asking why Tommy Vercetti never did it. As Chris Susan, product marketing on *Mercenaries* told us, "No matter how big something is, you can destroy it. The only thing we're friendly to are trees." Aircraft (15 of those), tanks, jeeps, cars, SUVs, oil pumps, bunkers, skyscrapers, pill-boxes, look-out posts... anything with bricks and mortar or moving parts can be utterly, thoroughly and wonderfully obliterated. It will make even the staunchest antiwar protester smile, it really is looking that good.

BIZARRE Weird goings-on from the world of Xbox

Ground Zero

When looking for inspiration, developers often draw upon a myriad of influences. However, none will be more controversial this year than the development of *Survivor*. The game will feature some of the century's worst disasters and place you in the heart of

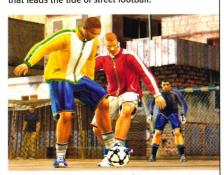

Going Commando

Bridging the gap between movies then blowing it apart

EPISODE III is creeping ever closer and the tidal wave of Revenge of the Sith themed games is almost upon us. Leading the surge is the incredible-looking Star Wars: Republic Commando, a tactical first-person shooter with devastating gameplay. Think The Chronicles of Riddick (Issue 33, 9.0) but then some – that's the vibe we're getting at the moment.

At a recent hands-on we saw for the first time the true implementation of AI and multiplayer options - two vital aspects of this seriously delicious-looking game. First up is your squad Al, a truly superior piece of programming if the game continues in the way it's currently headed. You lead a squad of three commandos known as Sev, Fixer and Scorch, each with their own abilities, but most importantly they actually think for themselves. They won't stand in your line of fire, they'll cover you without being asked, they'll find cover themselves, help heal each other, and work in movements that actually strengthen the team. As producer Chris Williams told us, "The greatest weapon in Republic Commandos is the squad itself. It's a living, breathing weapon you'll need to master in order to win." But, of course, being an FPS there's the little question of Live to deal with too.

Up to 16 fully customisable characters (clan logos and colours can be applied to your troops) will be able to battle over 12 arenas. We saw various locations from Attack of the Clones, including the Geonosian arena which was now little more than rubble covered in mounted cannons. The Wookiee planet Kasyyyk also features, and we've learned an exclusive piece of news about player choices too. Officially announced multiplayer battles were only between Droids and Commandos but we've learned that Wookiees will also join the fray, with the possibility of flying Geonosians being included too.

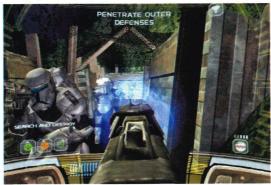
Game modes will include Last Man Standing, Capture The Flag, Squad Battles, and Assault modes where you'll lead an Al squad against another gamer with an Al squad. Downloadable content will be included, featuring new weapons, characters and arenas. During deathmatches we'll also be able to take out specific weak points on an enemy. If there's a droid with a mounted gun built into his arm, you'll be able to snipe it off at the shoulder. Or, if you're a Wookiee you'll be able to fire a new Wookiee rocket launcher at him and do it the easy way. If you're really feeling tough we even hear you can learn finishing moves that see you ripping things apart with your bare hands.

Spoiler alert!

Don't read if you don't want to know!

GENERAL Grievous will also appear in Republic Commando, as will his henchmen. These hoods will be cyborgs and carry electronic plasma swords which they'll use like pole vaults enabling them to spin out of harm's way, or to whirl at you as they scream in for an attack. Be warned: they're going to be very hard indeed.

Versus mode confirmed for a third Cell outing

BACK IN ISSUE 33, we visited the Montreal development home of Sam Fisher to check out the third game in the phenomenally successful Splinter Cell series. It was all going so well before we learnt that Pandora Tomorrow's excellent online multiplayer mode (where mercenaries take on spies) wouldn't be included. We couldn't believe it. Sure, co-op Live play is a great addition, but dropping head-to-head play altogether was a sacrilege to the series.

Thankfully, Ubisoft has listened to the gamers that have made Fisher the success he is today, and Versus is back in. Players work as teams as either the stealthy (third-person) Shadow Net Spies, with specific objectives against the heavily armed (firstperson) Argus Mercenaries charged with protecting their bases. You'll get several new levels, new co-operative manoeuvres, gadgets, weapons, handto-hand moves and taunts across two game modes - Scenario and Disk Hunt. We're also told that the climate will directly impact gameplay too.

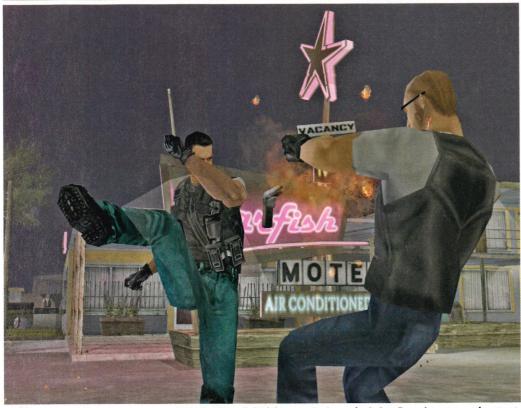

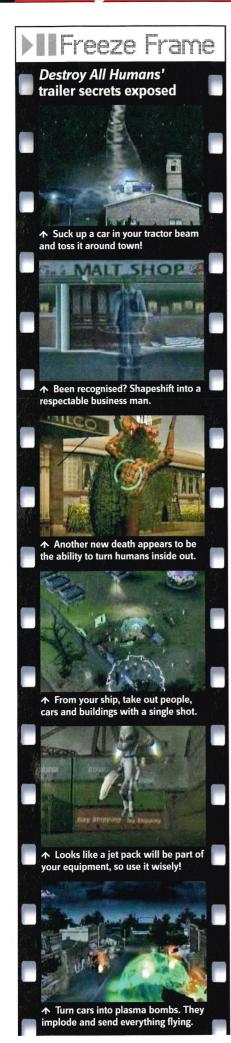

WHAT'S WORSE, making a mistake or making it twice? For many Xbox owners, missing out on the original *Otogi: Myth of Demons* (Issue 21, 8.0) was one of the biggest mistakes ever. Not only is it one of the best-looking Xbox titles (especially the awesome end-of-level bosses), but also one of the most beautiful-sounding. And this sequel, *Otogi 2: Immortal Warriors*, trumps it.

Undead warrior Raikoh returns with a team of five controllable demon-slayers at his side. Kintoki is an axe-wielding rebel leader, Tsuna a wolfman sword master and Sadamitsu a scythe-swinging vampire. Princess Seimei, who played a central role in the original, also makes a comeback, and the clan is rounded off with Suetake, the weird halfman half-tree who uses the Buddhist wheel of life as a lethal projectile.

There's something strangely masochistic about playing Otogi 2. Every level is surging with graphical beauty, but all you want to do is destroy everything. As before, the scenery is completely destructible and explodes with an incredible ferocity when you hit it. We've yet to find something more ass-kicking than pulverising a monster through a Japanese temple.

A greater emphasis on role-playing elements and upgrading abilities should help to introduce depth and tactical play to the mayhem. Although it's possible to choose any character on most levels, some require you to use a specific one. Depending on how well you perform, different mission paths will become available and the outcome of the game will alter. Achieving a good ranking on each mission unlocks 18 bonus games, which in turn reward you with advanced weapons and magic. From Software's *Otogi 2* is looking to be an absolute stunner. Don't miss it when it's out in February.

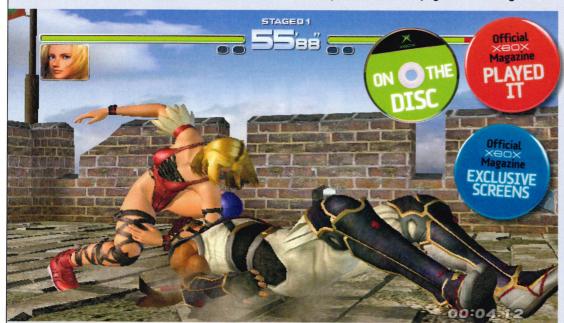

Call of Duty: Finest Hour

On Her Majesty's skullsplitting service



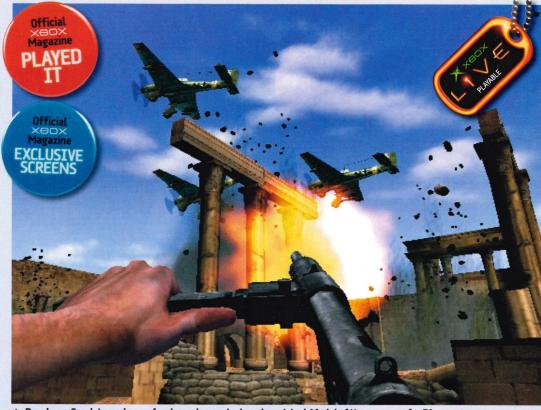
"THIS ISN'T ABOUT medals or honour, kid!" screams an officer as Stalingrad collapses around your ears. "It's about bringing those Nazi pigs down and freeing the motherland! For Russia, for our comrades, for freedom!" He soon gets a bullet in the skull and you're thrown into the most ferocious WWII battle on Xbox. Developer Spark Unlimited, a contingent made up of developers from the original MOH series and real-world WWII veterans, knows what it's saying when 'medals' and 'honour' are so readily dismissed. It may be a sly kick to the other WWII series, but it's a declaration that Call Of Duty is ready for one hell of a scrap.

Playing it is intense and utterly frightening from the start. The assault on Stalingrad makes MOH Frontline's (Issue 11, 5.7) infamous Normandy landing look as bad as getting sand in your sarnies. The number of on-screen soliders, and the rate at which they're literally scythed apart mid-stride, is astonishing. And, unlike MOH, you play several characters throughout the game, each of whom tells their own story. The Brit is voiced, of all people, by AC/DC's Brian Johnson. Moving on...

Whether you're a Russian female sniper charged with protecting a sapper as he lays mines in front of a tank column, or one of Monty's desert rats laying explosives deep in the freezing desert night, the scope of tasks you're asked to do is going to be immense. At one point we were bringing up the rear on a platoon of tanks, desperately trying to bring down enemy planes before they took off,

whilst being fired at from every level and direction. Believe us, when you're up to your ears in Dolby 5.1 and shells are rattling into your tank, the experience will leave you flinching, not to mention sweating. Once we'd been thoroughly obliterated (look out for those pesky Nazis - the Al is smarter than the real thing) we were onto a suicide run up a hill where a pillbox spewed bullets at our every move. Frontline looks no longer to be deserving of the title, for Call Of Duty is as frontline as we've yet seen in a game.

The music is also shaping up nicely, with rousing orchestral scores accompanying every move you make. The MOH score was awesome, but it looks to be surpassed by this new contender.

Spark Unlimited has taken all that made the MOH series so exciting (way back when it was exciting!) and updated it. It may not have Jimmy Paterson, it may not be steeped in subterfuge and snooping around, but *Call of Duty* looks to blow a crater in WWII gaming that will leave rivals shellshocked. Expect very good things.

Constantine's animation and controls are fluid and smooth, and for the first time we actually experienced some of John Constantine's other-worldly abilities.

The gift of true-sight is a tremendous help in your quest to rid the Earth of demons because it shows the evil beggars for what they are. We walked into a room where a policeman was consoling a tearful woman. Turn on true-sight and you see it's not a woman he's hugging but a twisted demon with a distorted face and fangs Pull out your crucifix shotgun and you can nail her to the wall. Simple.



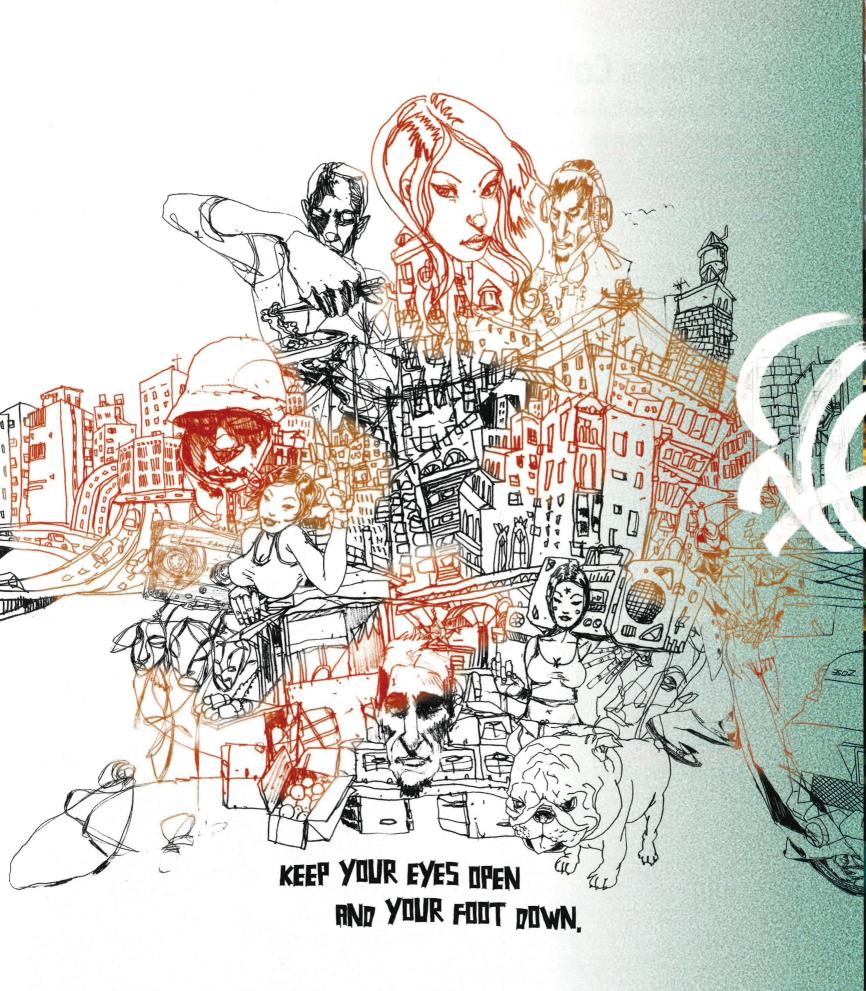

We also saw for the first time (and got eaten by) giant demons capable of hammering down walls and throwing you across rooms. Only with a blast of your flame thrower can you illuminate the area, and even then you could still be in trouble because

some demons happily walk through flames to get at you. Ironically, the only way to escape such attacks is to find a portal into hell, and once you shift into that realm the action really cranks up. If you're not shooting demons screeching down from above to kill you, you're ducking for cover as buses, cars, and buildings whiz over your head. Attack Of The Clone?

Worried KOTOR II will be nothing more than a cash-in? Don't fret. We've seen it - it's going to blow us away all over again...

HROUDED IN San Franciscan fog, deep in the aptly named Lucas Valley, sits Skywalker Ranch. An unassuming place – a few Wookiees here, an old colonial building there... it's quite sweet. You'd never know that inside a low-set building nestled under shady willow trees the last Jedi was fighting a bitter struggle for

survival against staggering odds. You'd never know that the entire cast of KOTOR (Issue 20, 9.5) had been slaughtered save for a single malfunctioning droid. And you'd never know the Sith had swept across the galaxy in a way that Vader could only dream of 4,000 years later. KOTOR II is in development and, almost as expected, The Sith Lords is The Empire Strikes Back of the KOTOR universe. It's going to get very, very dark...

Exclusive Access: KOTOR II Interview

Mike Gallo, producer for LucasArts, starts by running us through a few of the finer, darker points of The Sith Lords. "You begin KOTOR II in a very bad way," he tells us with a smile. "There is this sense of doom as you play through the game. You're being hunted, there's never a let-up - you're forever watching your back all the while trying to reconcile your relationship with the Force. You're aboard the Ebon Hawk [for reasons he assures us we'll find out later]. drifting through space and surrounded by dead bodies. The Sith are hunting you on the assumption that you're the last of the Jedi order, and the planet you are drifting towards has been blown apart. The core is exposed, huge chunks of the planet are missing, and this is the very first area you're expected to survive." Note the word 'survive'. There'll be none of that wandering around playing Pazaak when invisible Sith assassins are tracking your every move. It makes the original's Tarris opening level look achingly dull in comparison.

As do the other planets. There are seven in total, but within that there are up to 70 different levels and modules. The shattered planet requires you to take part in space walks (no more heavy spacesuits, don't worry!), explore the mining facility, then storm a mysterious ship that docks shortly after you do. The rest of the game isn't shaping up too badly either - an especially important point considering the temptation there must have been to simply use BioWare's original engine and build what could have been little more than a £40 expansion pack. "The hard part about

gelling Sith Lords with the original is the dual endings," Gallo tells us, "but there are crucial dialogue choices you'll be asked to make at the beginning of KOTOR II that will affect how the game pans out. It may sound like that means you'll miss out whole sections of the game, but in reality it's a little like making the decision of whether to be male or female. People simply react differently to you and subquests will alter slightly. It's

then up to you to pursue the path and deviate from it to either side as you see fit."

This time though, such deviations will have massive repercussions. Your whole party will feel the influence of your choices, turning either to the dark or light sides as you do. Could this mean they're all Forcesensitive? Could they all be Jedi with the same affliction as you? Could they actually be undercover Sith trying to repatriate you with the dark side for some diabolical scheme? Gallo shrugs. "As much as I want to tell you, as passionate as I am about KOTOR II, I can't. We've worked so hard on this, the story is so central to giving fans

more than just a sequel, if we were to say anything about the plot it would spoil it. We're aware we're using the [BioWare] engine, so our strength must come from the story. We'd be tipping our hand if we did that." We wave a hand in front of his face,

suggesting in magelike tones that 'these are not the answers we're looking at he's having none of it.

for' but he's having none of it.
"Let me show you the new
lightsabers," he says. We're
suckered and take a peek.

Red is bad, blue and green are good, purple is badass and only available to *Pulp Fiction* stars. But silver? We like. We also like the new blazing white saber with the pale blue aura, as well as a saber so dark green in colour it's almost black. And, as 'this season' as these are, new crystals and crystal slots mean far bigger options when it comes to assembling the Jedi weapon. You can now assign special droid crystals that cut through metal better. There are melee

crystals that improve close combat, and there are special new deflector crystals that send blaster fire back at a greater ferocity than originally fired at you. You can also bring out your new weapons at a far quicker rate thanks to the new dual assignment system. Rather than going into the inventory to change weapons like the original, you now do it at the press of the button on screen. Very handy when you consider the name of the game. There's an 's' on the end of Lord – you're no longer up against one master and his apprentice as before. We're talking a whole bag of Sith.

There are some dark side spoilers in these next two paragraphs so, if you don't want to know, skip down to the paragraph that begins with the words NERF HERDER in caps. Crusty saber-waver Darth Sion makes an early appearance in the game and, as you may know by now, he's basically cracked to pieces. Only the will of the dark side keeps his body from falling apart, but this makes him a deadly opponent. He can contort his body into shapes that allow attacks to seemingly pass right through him. It also turns out that he's the old apprentice of Kreia, the blind Obi-Wan-style Jedi who wakes you from stasis early in the game. Whether he was the one responsible for her blindness has yet to be revealed.

Also revealed is the name of the strange, ghost-faced Darth lord that's been

plastered all over the internet. OXM can exclusively reveal that this strange apparition with an attitude is Darth Nihlus the most mysterious Sith lord of the game. But, as Yoda might say, there is another. We only glimpsed her before the screen was changed as quickly as the conversation, but she was a human Sith. Dressed head to toe in a crimson cloak and hood, she looked pretty normal except for a tight black patterned shawl wrapped over her nose and mouth. We didn't know whether we wanted to kill her or kiss her. And of course, there's always the question of whether three Siths is enough Sith to sate the appetite of KOTOR fans. "All I'll say," Gallo smiles again, "is that the game is call The Sith Lords - beyond that I can't tell you. Suffice to say though, that the galaxy is pretty much in the hands of the Sith." He's not kidding either.

NERF HERDER. The Sith Lord's mastery of all things nasty and choky now ranges from new Force powers to the ability to train and master huge creatures and beasts. When they're not using these beasts to shatter Force-fields apart and rampaging through broken cities, they're pointing them in your direction. Good job you've learned a few new tricks then, isn't it? From Vader's favourite, the Force Choke, to Force Crush and Force Scream, these new powers will see you through the hardest battles, even though most of them seem to be dark-side affiliated. Some more of that 'doom' Gallo was talking about.

"As well as the story, we are also very interested in changing and improving the gameplay," says Gallo. "We felt that with the original KOTOR your attack patterns never really changed. Whether you were a level zero non-Jedi or a fully levelled-up Jedi Master, your attacks always looked the same. We needed to rethink those levels and now we've come up with appropriate animations to reward your skill." Cue what Gallo tells us is the 'Master Power' - an elusive slice of aerial acrobatics coupled with a firework display. Like Darth Maul's intergalactic Cossack dancing, you do the same. Only you do it while blue and white incandescent flames jet from your body and you backflip over people's heads. It's one of the hardest skills to obtain and there are over 60 new ones, ranging from Force awareness that can help you attack enemies with the moves they're most susceptible to, to the deadly acrobatics themselves.

But it's not all add this, add that, and cameos from beyond the grave (you'll have

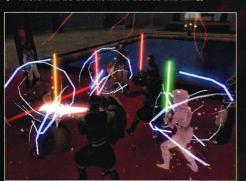

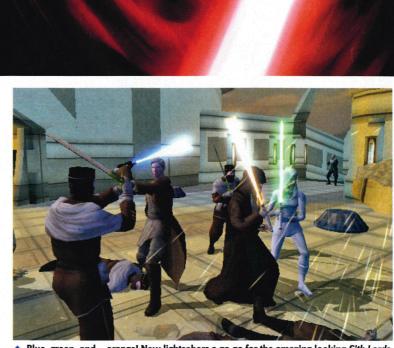

>> to play it to find out - we're not giving anything away), because just as eager as Obsidian is to build upon the hugely successful first title, it is also just as eager to snip away unnecessary pieces of gameplay.

"We thought long and hard about Live content for The Sith Lords and we spent a lot of time looking at the first game, but it's one of those things we didn't see as a huge pay-off for us," explains Gallo. "It was very difficult to weave [downloadable content] into the story and make it feel like it was part of the game rather than just attached to it. Really, all our efforts are on making The Sith Lords the very best follow-up to KOTOR it can be. We've employed a very skilled team with a lot of passion for the first game. We have artists of all disciplines working on this title, and we're crafting it to make sure it does the original proud. We're not about to churn out a sequel for the hell of it, and if a potentially problematic decision has to be

reached about X, Y or Z, if it's for the good of the game and for the benefit of the KOTOR experience, then so be it. Honestly, you won't even miss content downloads once you see what we have planned."

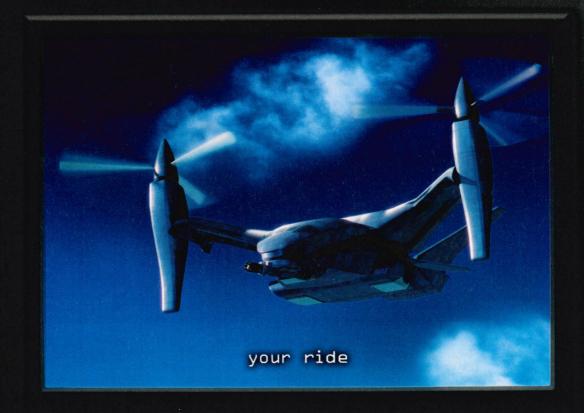
With further revelations thin on the ground, apart from the inclusion of another party member called Bao Dur - a member of Darth Maul's species with a remote droid which, if this were a pirate movie, would be a wise-cracking parrot - The Sith Lords glimpse comes to an end. And our first impressions? 'Tantalising' would be one word to describe it. 'Very dark' would be another two. Most importantly though, words such as 'cheap cash-in' and 'poor follow-up' are nowhere to be seen. In fact, if you'll excuse the pun, they're far, far away. Knights of the Old Republic II: The Sith Lords is in very safe hands with Obsidian. Fans get ready to rejoice - there's not so much as a ripple of disturbance in the Force.

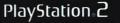






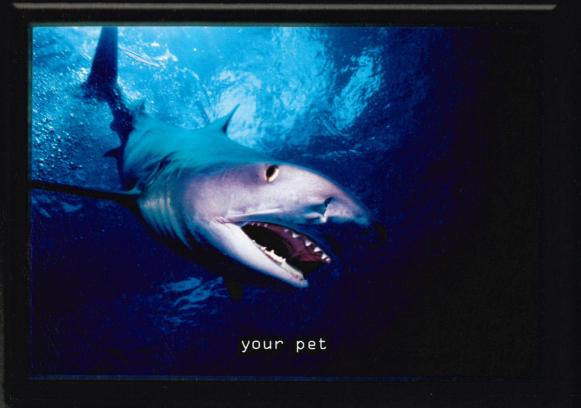

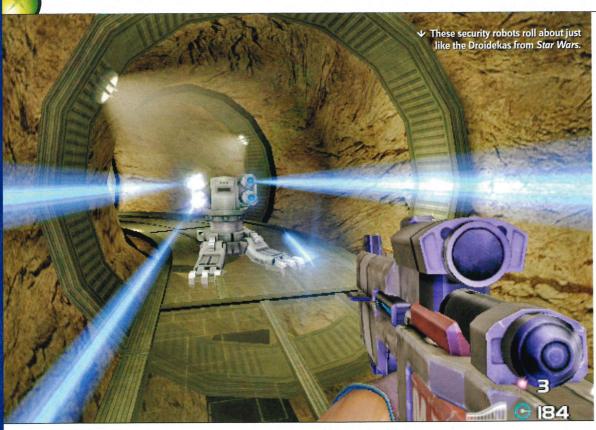

OR ANYONE who played GoldenEye, meeting David Doak, Free Radical's MD, is a very surreal experience. Appearing in the N64's legendary FPS as the enigmatic Dr Doak, he was never in the right place at the right time to give you that all-important key card.

We won't hold that against him, though – we're much too absorbed in seeing him demo the latest build of *TimeSplitters:* Future Perfect. About 60 members of staff have been plugging away in Free Radical's Nottingham Studio for the past two years, hoping to build on the critical success of *TimeSplitters 2* (Issue 09, 9.3).

The story's almost a direct continuation. Epoch-jumping commando Cortez is once

again in pursuit of the alien 'Splitters'. He's discovered that the distant future holds a grim fate for humanity: total extinction at the end of a nuclear war. There's no way to win that battle, so the only way to prevent Armageddon is to stop the Splitters from ever existing. There's a conspiratorial twist, as we discover that a human, Jacob Crow, is responsible for genetically engineering the freaky-faced creatures and is incubating thousands of them in a heavily fortified space station.

Cortez's ability to travel through the centuries gives *TimeSplitters: Future Perfect* far more creative possibilities than the average FPS. The game begins in 1914 at the start of the first World War and continues all the way through to the 1960s and on to the dying embers of the third millennium.

SEE, IT'S NOT just *Halo 2* that features giant robots that want to stomp all over you. This giant metal badass guards the force field generator surrounding Jacob Crow's TimeSplitter incubation chambers. Fortunately, the new assault rifle also fires sticky plasma grenades. Ammo also respawns after a brief time so you'll never get stuck without a round in the chamber.

British humour and extremely charismatic heroes are just as important. "Rather than possessing the bodies of characters like Harry Tipper and Hank Nova, this time you're playing alongside them under Al-control," explains Graeme Norgate, producer of Future Perfect's excellent muzakstyle music and sound.

In the 1960s mission, Cortez and international man of mystery Harry Tipper are breaking into Khallos's evil lair. Playing as Cortez, you have to take up a sniper position on the watchtower and protect your accomplice as he runs between the henchmen's cabins. It's a tense challenge, comparable to protecting Natalya in GoldenEye, particularly because the mission ends if Harry dies. If you're a crack shot though, he'll eventually recover two handy disguises that will allow you to progress deep inside the enemy hideout. Despite his handlebar moustache, Harry surprisingly gets away with wearing the female hench(wo)man's outfit and is even chatted up by a horny Russian security guard. It must be down to his sprightly walk.

However, it's not just the supporting characters that need your assistance. The time-travelling premise means that Cortez often bumps into separate versions of himself from different times.

In the 1970s Cortez chases Khallos through the cabins of a speeding locomotive. The situation looks grim when snipers and a missile-launching Apache helicopter attack you. Fortunately, another Al-controlled Cortez from the near future comes to the rescue, riding on another train running alongside. He'll help you escape the ambush by firing rockets at the chopper. Later on in the mission, you actually catch up with the time loop and find yourself shooting the rockets, protecting the past Cortez from the chopper. Confused? It helps to think of it as an extreme case of time-hopping self-defence.

If you're uneasy about putting your life in the hands of an Al-controlled alter ego, why not try the two-player co-operative mode instead? The mission objectives are the same but there are almost twice as many enemies to deal with. Anyone who's clocked Halo (Issue 01, 9.7) will tell you that one of the best moments in co-op play comes from jumping in a jeep together, with one player driving and the other riding shotgun. "Vehicles were one of the fans' biggest requests," reveals Doak while demonstrating how to drive a 1914 lorry as his accomplice mows down bi-planes from a mounted gun turret. There are a ton of vehicles in TimeSplitters: Future Perfect, from quad bikes to army jeeps, as well as a bevy of futuristic motors that are still well and truly under wraps.

DRIVING THE JEEP in the 1960s mission is not the way to play stealthily. The noisy motor will alert the henchmen, who'll pour out of their barracks. Thankfully, it's possible to charge through them, killing three or four in one handbrake turn. Ragdoll physics means that they'll occasionally get stuck across the bonnet. Not the kind of hood ornament you want.



Malthough we're a little disappointed that they're all indestructible, it's still an important addition, especially in multiplayer. And multiplayer is where the *TimeSplitters* series has always excelled most. True to form, *Future Perfect* combines distinctive, fast and frenetic gameplay with an arsenal of unusual weapons and an immense variety pack of game modes.

Capture the Flag returns with other favourites like Virus, a tag game where 'infected' players must catch and pass the disease onto the others. There's also the unique monkey-assist where the player in last place is aided by an army of gun-toting primates. Bricks has to be our favourite of all, though. In this great mode, red brick projectiles replace the usual plasma cannons and machine-guns.

This time, the whole caboodle is Xbox Live-enabled too. Up to 16 players can compete online or via System Link and it's going to be brilliant fun. The map designs are easily the best out to date and they even poke fun at other games in the crowded first-

person shooter market (the Vietnam level is especially gorgeous).

If you ever get bored of the maps and game modes (which seems unlikely), it's always possible to create your own. One thing that hopefully won't go unappreciated this time is the awesome map-building utility. "We've always been determined that the map editor should be included, but it's been one of our biggest challenges," explains Doak. "The one that came packaged with TimeSplitters 2 was a little too complicated for most people, so we've made it easier to use but still added a lot more features."

At first glance, the map editor looks identical. However, the entire system of sticking tiles together makes much more sense thanks to an isometric view that lets you see how the map is shaping up as you build it. Just as crucial is the new ability to stack tiles on top of each other. This lets you build spiral staircases, balconies and holes to jump through between levels. Vehicles can be added, although it's only likely to be the smaller ones like the quad bike.

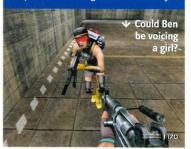

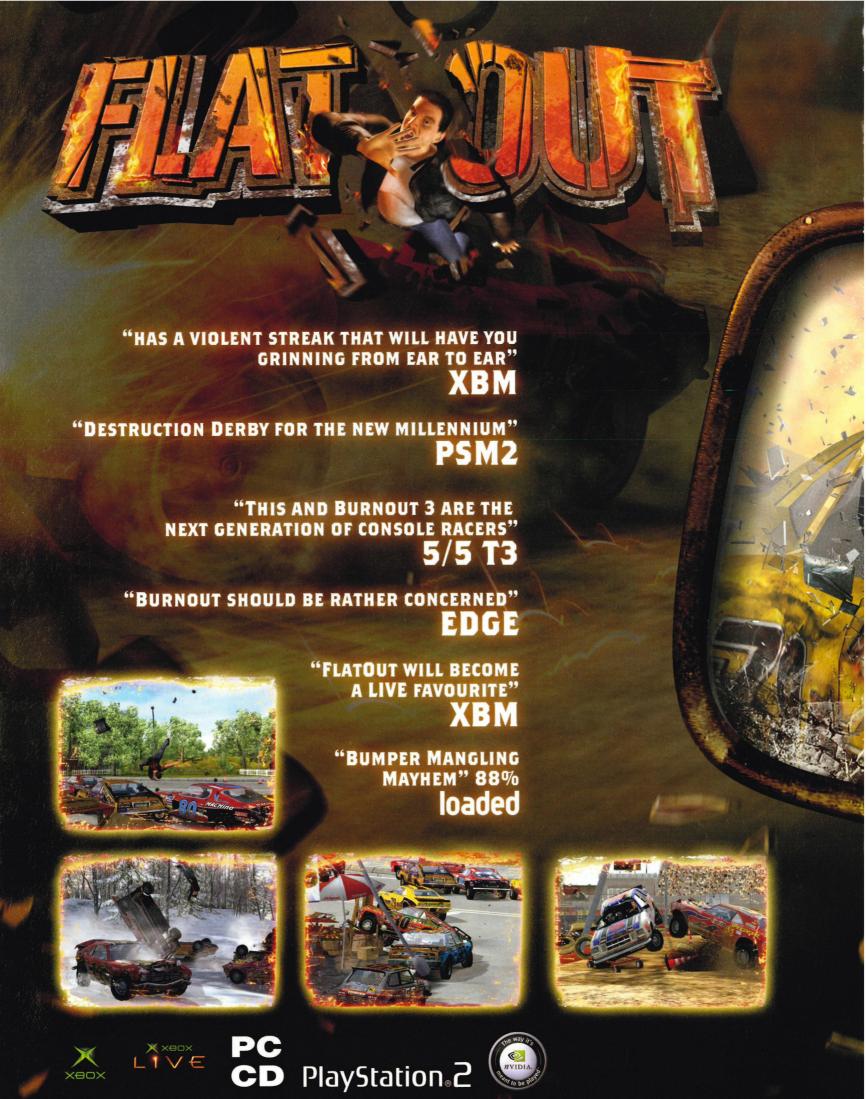

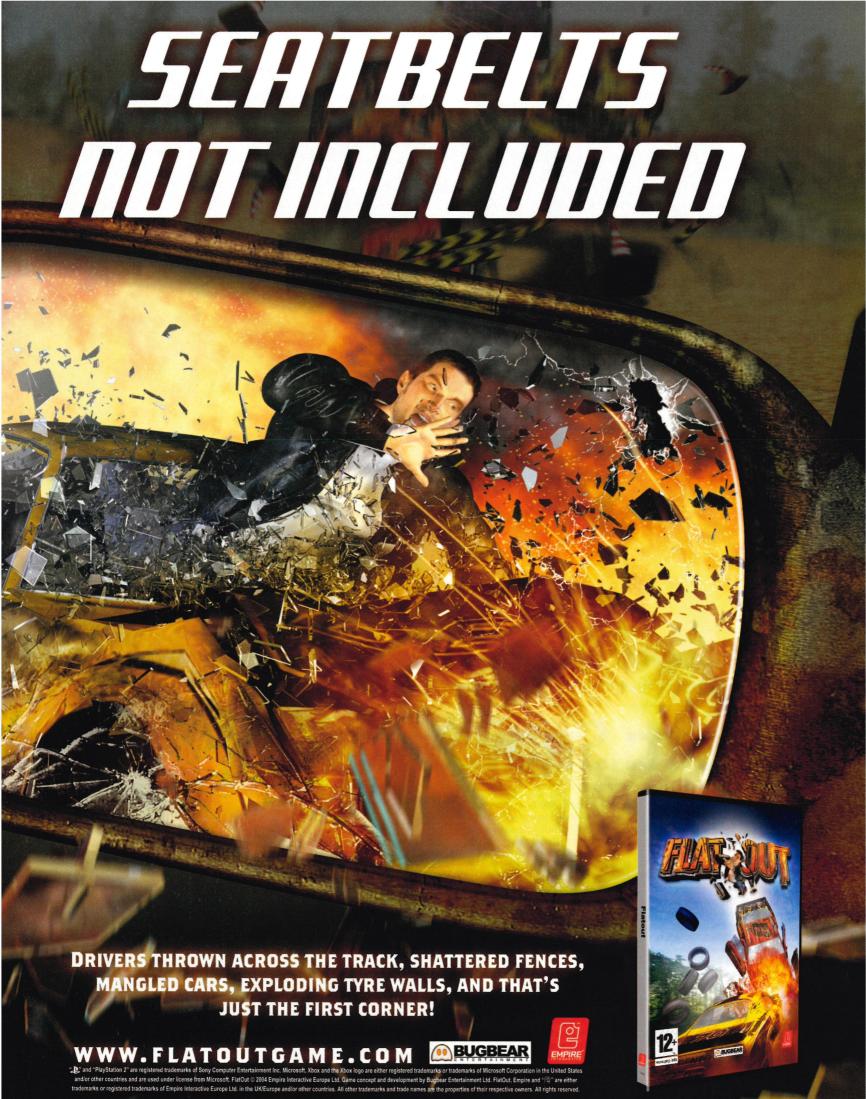

Above all else, it's bursting with headless zombies, evil clowns, burning monkeys and bricks. It makes us wonder what they put in the water up in Nottingham. We want some.

HEN WAS THE last time you were genuinely blown away by a game? The first time you experienced Halo's Assault On The Control Room? Or how about recently when you first did a triple Takedown in Burnout 3? We see many excellent Xbox titles in our line of work, but we're rarely as gobsmacked as we were when we first clapped eyes on Project: Snowblind. We'd seen a fleeting glimpse of Eidos's intriguing new shooter at E3, so when we were invited to an exclusive presentation of the game in San Francisco, we jumped at the chance. Taking place in the Dolby Centre's top

showcase cinema, we were treated to a stunning demo and several hours of handson play before cornering John Chowanec, lead producer on the upcoming blaster.

Project: Snowblind is developer Crystal Dynamics' first foray into first-person shooters, but it's clear this is a well-researched, extremely daring project that superbly blinds us to this fact. "We wanted to ensure all the fundamentals were just right before embarking on the project, so we spent a lot of time playing other FPSs and trying to pinpoint exactly what was good and bad about them," explains Chowanec.

Project: Snowblind is set in the near future, though unlike the miserable, dystopian visions of numerous clichéd futuristic follies, it shuns a grey and drab palette for a far more colourful setting. "We're really proud of the whole bright and vibrant feel of the game," enthuses Chowanec. "We feel it really adds to the dynamic environment."

The gameplay possibilities of this are endless; we loved the way Frost remotely took over an idle robotic walker, and then proceeded to use it to plough through waves of enemy soldiers, radically reducing their numbers before it was ultimately destroyed.

Grenades are an entity to themselves as well, and a few of the more alternative peripherals are both wildly imaginative and infinitely useful. Pinned down behind a wall of ever-decreasing cover? No problem. Simply toss out a Riot Wall – a fantastic portable device that provides a temporary energy shield to fire from when the heat gets too much to take.

Frost's brilliant Nano powers take this already-humongous shooter to unchartered depths. All upgradeable, players can decide to focus on a particular area of extraordinary expertise. "We wanted to introduce some new ideas to the already tried and tested, generic powers included in other games,' continues Chowanec. "Sure there's a variation of bullet time (Reflex Enhancer). but other Nano abilities are really pushing the limits of FPS games." Electrical Storm, however, takes the biscuit in our book. Unleash a destructive bolt of lightning and watch it zip round the environment and fry any enemies on screen. Completely unscripted, this brainy beam of energy has its own Al that determines its unique behaviour dependent on the surroundings.

But it's not just *Project: Snowblind*'s weapons that sat up and paid attention in class; the human contingent isn't too stupid either. Your Al squad mates think and act independently and try their best to keep you standing. "In a lot of shooters your team is there just to take fire until all of them are dead," says Chowanec. "We wanted to create a backup team you can have faith in, and as such will endeavour to keep alive."

Underestimating your enemies is a fatal schoolboy error waiting to be made. Jump >>>

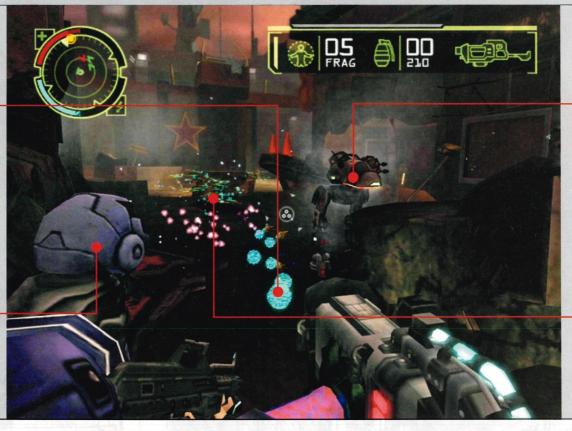

another walker is standing idly by, they'll commandeer that one too to hunt you down. Chowanec is particularly proud of his little soldiers. He explains: "Take out a gunner at a fixed gun emplacement, and his team-mate will lay down covering fire before moving to take up position behind the gun. If they sense you're destroying them with your ace Nano abilities, they'll waste no time in tossing an EMP grenade into that mix that momentarily renders you

powerless, or 'snowblind'." Brilliant. Project: Snowblind runs unbelievably smoothly and fast for such an ambitiously action-packed title - it would put Paula Radcliffe to shame. So much stuff is going on at any one time, yet the relentless pace never falters or lets up for a second. The Xbox version we saw running was faultless, and one marketing suit attending the cinematic presentation even remarked the game "looks incredible for a PC game". His eyes nearly bulged out of his head when he discovered the code was an Xbox one!

The developers have implemented a fantastic physics engine that enhances the action no end. Debris-showering explosions, bullets ricocheting around the screen and bodies flying everywhere all add up to a brilliantly exhilarating experience.

Shared body heat is the best way of keeping warm, and *Snowblind* provides just that opportunity in its seriously mental multiplayer. Up to 16 players can duke it out over System Link or Xbox Live. The frenetic gameplay continues over all the usual Capture the Flag, Deathmatch and other multiplayer modes. You choose your allegiance between the Coalition and Hostile forces, and then pick a preferred class from Scout, Agent, Berserker and Heavy. The class war is still obvious in this near future, because different ranks of soldier have different weapons and Nano

powers at their disposal, so making the right choice is critical. The intelligently designed maps are obviously suited to one particular game type or another, with tons of different spots all perfect for sniping and setting up cunning ambushes. Fixed gun posts are dotted throughout the maps and really mix up the gameplay, as do the cars, tanks and other assorted vehicles.

We are very excited by *Project:*Snowblind. In a market inundated with FPS titles, it's not often a unique game like this comes along and completely blows us away. Looking the absolute bomb, and providing a massively deep experience for a straightforward shooter, Snowblind could not only pleasantly surprise fans of the genre, but looks set to give all the more established titles a serious run for their money.

NCIENT CHINESE thinking dictates that where there is yin, there's yang. Light and dark, good and evil - a balance. So back in the early '90s, when Streetfighter 2 ruled the cutting-edge podium of 2D fighters, a balance was needed. Enter Mortal Kombat - a 2D scrapper that incorporated great visuals, sinister characters and buckets of gore. Rather than balance the Chi, Mortal Kombat blew the competition clear out of the water.

Mortal Kombat: Deadly Alliance (Issue 13, 7.8) introduced new characters and fighting styles to a relatively Kombat-starved Xbox audience. Deception picks up the blood-soaked baton and continues the series in fine fashion, and beats its little brother into submission with the addition of several great new features. We join the story where Deadly Alliance left off - Raiden is defeated, Shang Tseung and Quan Chi have turned on each other, and Onaga, fearsome Dragon King of the Outworld, has returned to claim power. In short, bad news all round.

At the heart of the title is the classic Kombat mode. Here you fight various opponents, new and old, on your way to facing off with Onaga, who's filling in as the Goro-esque embodiment of evil. The game engine is buffer than ever, with movement faster and smoother than in Alliance. Controls

>>> feel more responsive too, resulting in easier, quicker combos. Also, the analogue stick can now be used during combat, which translates into a much more intuitive, less stilted experience. There's a definite graphical improvement over *Alliance* too - the characters look crisper and move smoother.

The great interaction of combat styles returns, with each character boasting two hand-to-hand methods and a proficiency in one weapons-based discipline. Each style has more distinct advantages than ever, and this plays a huge strategical role in defeating opponents. A quick pull of the Left trigger lets you switch styles. It's immensely satisfying to execute style-branching combos, where kicks and punches are mixed with swipes and slashes in one fatal flurry. These aren't unstoppable however, because *Deception* is more weighted to defensive play than other *MK* games, thanks to the great new combo Breakers (see Breaker Breaker, page 083).

All of these elements combine to produce a much more thoughtful and tactical *Mortal* matchup than ever before and really go some way to making this one of the most complete scrappers yet. Giving blood may be an honourable activity, but this series has always loved taunting the peaceloving hand-holders, and these fighters could fill an entire hospital's blood quota in one go, letting more claret than a Victorian leech.

The Al opponents are yet again wise to players who simply perform one or two moves and repeat them to death, so it's vital to learn as many different combos as possible. This'll also stand you in good stead for multiplayer, which is obviously where the action's at in *Deception*. Brilliantly, Midway has seen fit to include Live play this time round. We'll be reviewing the online side of the game in a future issue, but if it's anything like the normal Versus game, we can expect smooth, responsive bloodletting of the highest calibre.

Another much-trumpeted feature of *Deception* is Konquest mode. Essentially a massively expanded training mode, players assume the role of a young Shujinko. We follow his quest to retrieve the six kamidogu from the Chaos, Nether, Earth and

Wearing the rather shoddy-looking costume of a free-roaming RPG, Konquest mode has nowhere near the visual quality of the main game, with bland environments limited by seemingly endless invisible walls and poor draw distances. What it does offer though, is the chance to take part in a wealth of sub-quests. Recovering the kamidogu doesn't affect the gameplay; it's the numerous hidden items, subquests and training that really reward your efforts.

But it's not just a free-roaming adventure that bolsters the main Arcade mode. Puzzle Kombat is an entertaining, colourful Columns/Tetris hybrid featuring two baby brawlers scrapping it out at the bottom of the screen, with the outcome of the duelling dwarves dependent on your block-dropping feats. Successfully defeat your CPU/human adversary, and your pixellated pygmy will comically 'Finish Them' in a hilariously horrible way.

Chess Kombat puts a spine-crushing spin on the board game, where players pick a team from all the usual Arcade mode characters and assign them to pieces such as Grunts (pawns) and Sorcerers (Bishops). Movement is a bit different from the norm, and the board features certain power-up squares. Fate is firmly in your hands, however, when it comes to taking pieces. The action switches

to the more familiar fighting perspective and you must fight, Arcade style, to take/retain your piece. The addition of these two games actually adds significant entertainment value as opposed to being merely superfluous mini-games. Played against a friend or over Xbox Live (complete with Optimatch and customisable options), they're brilliant fun.

But let's make no bones about it (although Scorpion would have something to say about that) -Deception is a blood-soaked, gritty fighter through and through. More tactical than its older buttonbashing brethren, Midway has produced one of the most complete, technical and accomplished fighting titles ever. A fine addition to the series, and one with more than enough gore-filled gameplay to splatter both lounge and Live arenas for a long while yet. Finish him? You'll be playing this till you do.

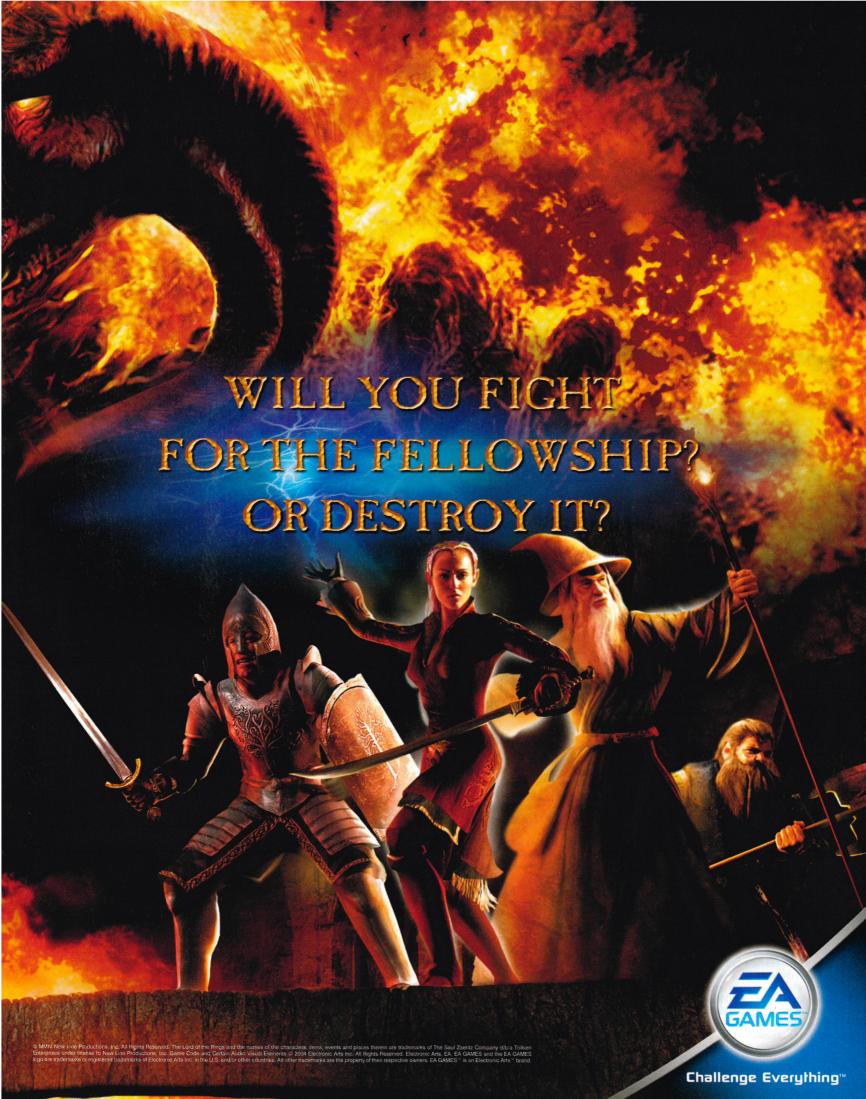

X-Men: Legends

Simon Cowell would love all the X-Factor on offer here

OR ALL the sexily sleek styling of the two recent (and undoubtedly ace) movies, the X-Men have actually been knocking around for quite a while. 1963 saw their inked entrance, and it's a testament to the imagination of creator Stan Lee and the endearingly human side of the characters that they've managed to percolate their way into our consciousness so successfully.

We've had a couple of mutated meetings with the X-Men on Xbox, with X-Men 2: Wolverine's Revenge (Issue 17, 7.4) being the best of the two. But Raven Software has flown in this time around, and the end result is refreshingly different from your average beat 'em up. For a start, it's mixed with brilliantly accessible RPG elements.

Following the exploits of troubled teen Alison Crestmere (who later becomes hottie Magma), players get the chance to play through numerous story missions with a group of up to four spandexed superheroes. As Alison explores the Xavier Institute and encounters more mutants, they too become available for the next mission.

RPG elements are evident in more ways than picking a merry band of mutants, though. Combat is determined by hit points, but because of the real-time nature, this feels more like a frantic beat 'em up. Each character has a wealth of melee combos at his/her disposal, and you can make use of their fantastic special attacks. Holding the Right trigger brings up a menu of available powers (depending on experience and energy in your Special bar), and enables you to choose a unique attack.

Each enemy defeated results in your characters amassing the staple of every RPG – XP (experience points). After set totals are amassed, players can

allocate Level Up points to certain attributes of each character. Brilliantly, this can be done at any point during the game (even during a manic fight), keeping the gameplay fresh and involving.

Although this may sound more complex than Cerebro's blueprints, the intuitive controls ensure that, even during a pitched battle, players can instantly flick between characters with the D-Pad and inflict all manner of bashings. Combos are hugely satisfyingly double acts performed when two or more characters unleash complementing attacks on an enemy, and result in multiplied XP. Worrying about your charges isn't a problem though, because your team-mates' Al is really spot-on. Every time you execute a special attack, one of the other three characters will perform a complementing attack at the same time.

There's a hefty strategic undercurrent running throughout the game too. X-traction points are dotted around levels that, as well as acting as handy save points, allow players to interchange characters in and out of their team as the situation may necessitate. Encountered a chasm with no viable way across? Simply enrol the help of Ice Man, and the silver surfer will conjure up a polar platform for the team to cross. Some enemies can resist certain attacks too, so when Wolverine's claws have little impact on bad guys resistant to Physical Force, swap him out for the likes of Cyclops and Jean Gray who'll destroy the enemies with alternative powers.

We haven't really got too much to find fault with in X-Men: Legends. The cel-shaded graphics are an obvious choice for a comic book adaptation and, although lacking detail, work surprisingly well. The combat, despite being based on HP, is as fast and frantic as any beat 'em up out there, and the four-way multiplayer is an absolute blast. We could gripe about the occasional scarcity of save points, forcing players to replay large chunks of levels time and time again, but this is a forgivable niggle when you consider the involving gameplay and massive amount of character customisation and replayability. Suit up for one of the best superhero romps on Xbox, believers.

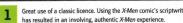

FlatOut

You'd better pray that's just tyres squealing in this dirrty demolition fest

VER SINCE watching Deliverance we've had a real aversion to anything from the American Deep South. Banjos, fried chicken... hell, we can't even wear our Von Dutch trucker caps without wincing at the thought of poor Ned Beatty up against that tree. Empire's FlatOut has done little to abate these fears. Crunching metal, squealing wheels (squeal, piggy, squeal!) and yee-hawing Yanks - this is dusty, dirty, yet undeniably dazzling racing fun. And worryingly, we like it.

The hopeful hicks start their car-crushing career by picking a tasty motor from the dealership. Customising your car is a major part of FlatOut, and players have tons of modding options. Buy a cheap car and tweak the hell out of it, or purchase a more upmarket model that requires little modification. Like Blind Date, the decision is yours. Sixteen classes of cars are on offer (in shiny star-spangled colours), and you can visit your friendly, ball-scratching, beer-swigging mechanic to upgrade its specs. Beef up the engine, tighten the drivetrain, toughen your bodywork and change the tyres, amongst other things, to gain the upper six-fingered hand.

If you're only into serious driving sims, stop reading right now. Technical cornering is flung straight out of the window (as is your driver - more of that later) in favour of pure balls-out, edge-ofyour-seat, unbridled mayhem. Aiding this experience, and enabling FlatOut to stand out from its contemporaries, is the fantastic physics engine Bugbear has implemented. All the cars are completely destructible, as is the surrounding

environment, and display brilliantly accurate gradual degradation.

Minor bumps result in the odd windscreen shatter or bonnet crumple and, due to the violent nature of the game, frequently occur before the green start light has even gone out. Bigger gutwrenching shunts and slams (race-ending in other driving games, but quickly the norm in FlatOut) result in bonnets flying up, doors falling off, and cars catching fire, all in a disconcertingly enjoyable way. Causing damage to your opponents is a blast, as is knocking over the multitude of tyres, barrels and other assorted roadside objects. These will brilliantly remain on the track throughout the race, so players can effectively litter the road at a narrow chicane or bottleneck to scupper opponents behind them, and send them spiralling off the road.

This violent behaviour isn't merely a result of too much moonshine however - FlatOut's fenderbending gameplay positively encourages it. For every smash and shunt you get involved in, your Nitro bar will gradually fill up, enabling you to boost your way back on track at warp speed. But this great feature is something of a double-edged sword. Sure, it encourages demonic driving and is

If you're in a nasty crash and flung from vour vehicle, make sure it's away from the track. If you spill out onto the road, chances are you'll get hit by overtaking opponents, sending you ragdolling further down the road than before. Ouch!

undeniably liberating, but it negates the purpose of thoughtfully driving round the track. What's the point of braking for a corner when you know you can just smash into it, fill your Nitro meter, then boost right to the head of the pack again?

But try to strike a happy medium between wreckless abandon and, well, controlled wrecking, and everyone's a winner. There's plenty for you hot-headed hillbillies to get your remaining teeth into. You can hop right in for a Quick race or tear round the Time Trial challenges, using any track and car you've thus far unlocked. However, Career mode is where the real money's to be made. Compete against seven Al opponents over several laps and, if you finish in the top three, you'll unlock the next race. The car handling feels suitably responsive, and getting the back out round most of the corners is a real joy. It all seems fairly simple, doesn't it? Well, it's not when each and every Al car drives with the aggression of a pre-menstrual Jerry Springer guest who's just lost Billy Bob to her sister. They'll prove to be both formidable allies and the source of massive frustration, as you'll struggle to recover from a nasty smash only to

A comical consequence of the superb physics engine is the ability your driver has to be catapulted out of his vehicle and sent sprawling over the roadside, ragdolling around until he slows down to a stop. Making use of this are the fantastic Bonus games, which are both valuable for earning extra cash, and immensely fun (see Game of Life and Death, above). And while we're on the subject of fun, FlatOut caters for the whole family too. Up to four players can battle it out via split-screen (being suspiciously inbred, that should be enough to cover

mum, dad, aunts, uncles, kids and cousins, shouldn't it?). For those with extended family, or if Peggy Sue starts showing again, up to eight players can duke it out over System Link or Xbox Live. Look out for the full Live review next month, but we're sure the game will provide just as much dirt-kicking devilry as the brilliant System Link games do.

So there we go. You could say FlatOut is a bit like your favourite page three girl. Great to look at, boasting accentuated physical attributes that sometimes defy gravity, yet underneath is a filthy minx who loves to get dirty with a group of mates. Fun, enjoyable and instantly playable.

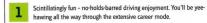

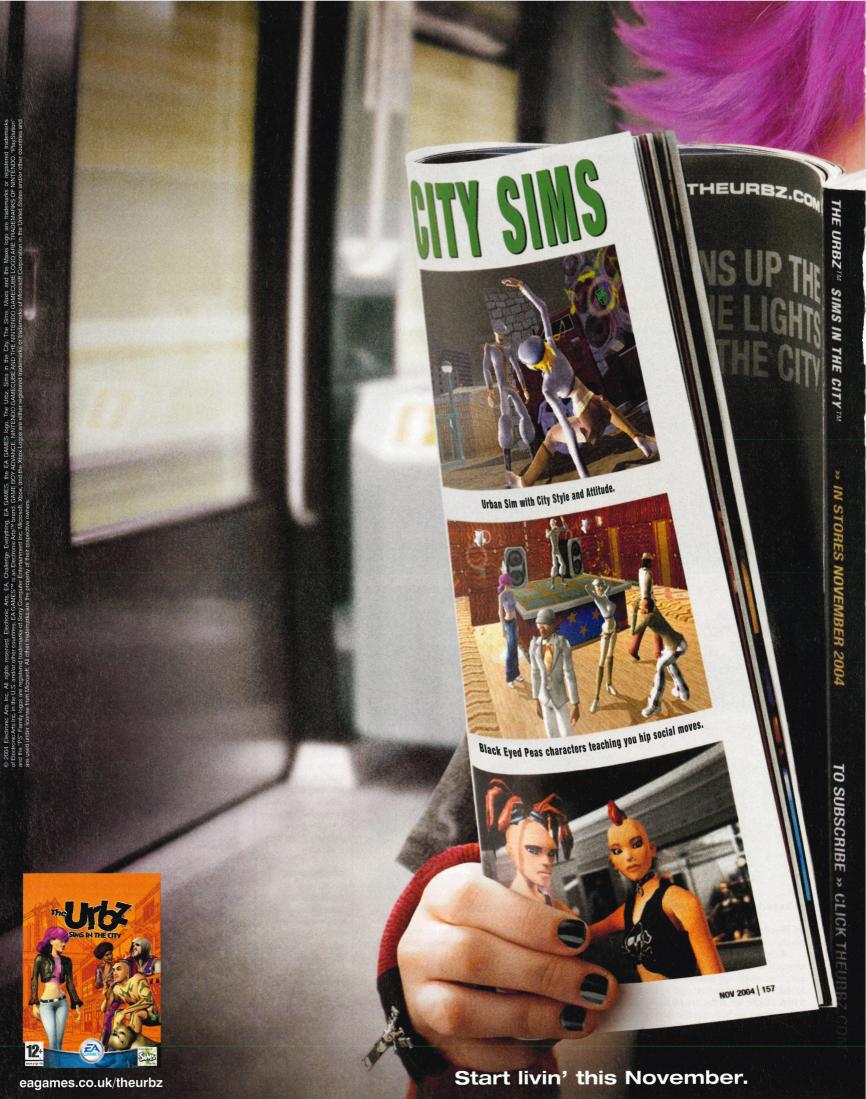

HERE'S USUALLY something fishy going on when games are sent to us after they've been released; more often than not they turn out to be complete pap. Activision needn't have worried however, because the quality and top-notch presentation apparent in all of Pixar's cinematic releases has been applied to this accompanying videogame.

Aimed squarely at the film's target audience, Shark Tale consists of 25 fun-filled chapters, or mini-games, loosely linking together the plot of the animated flick. Nothing more, nothing less. And seeing as most young kids these days have the attention span of an anorexic gnat, this is only a good thing (glass houses, Andy – ed).

Grabbing lead character Oscar by the gills, players work through mini-games such as evading pursuing sharks and recovering precious pearls from tentacled bank robbers. Frantically dash through crowded underwater environments on the back of tropical taxis, fight giant conga eels and, erm, dance your way to fame on live TV - all in a day's work for a cocksure cod. These levels are actually very entertaining, and far from being simple kids' tasks, will still challenge gamers of all ages.

The latter mini-game in particular, where Oscar must dance his way to infamy, is particularly tricky. Compatible with both of the two dance mats currently available for Xbox, the frantic pace of the steps will have little Johnny bouncing round the living room in no time, without the aid of Sunny D

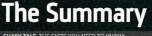

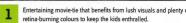
and Smarties. Us? We were knackered within two minutes of aquatic aerobics, and had to resort to the humble controller to get funky with the fishes.

Spyro: A Hero's Tail

The dextrous dragon returns with more than a mere sting in the tail

ERE BE DRAGONS. Not nasty fire-breathing ones that'll munch several fair maidens for breakfast mind you, but cute, fluffy purple ones that, aside from having a mean line in comic asides and a badass 'tude, are pretty adept at saving the world. Vivendi's long-running Spyro franchise debuts on Xbox, boasting bigger levels, bigger baddies and a whole host of new friends for our loveable lizard to play with.

The typically convoluted storyline details how the Red Dragon (an evil Elder Dragon, not a disfigured, family-slaughtering serial killer) has scattered Dark Gems throughout the realm. The result? The entire realm has turned evil mwaaa-ha-ha! It's up to Spyro to explore the large, expansive environments, smashing the Dark Gems along the way, and restoring good to the land. In a neat touch, every time one of the evil stones is smashed, the environment dynamically changes before players' eyes. So it was worth that tenminute jumping marathon to reach the top of that nearby mountain then...

Collecting gems is the staple of any generic platformer, and Spyro has the chance to amass more bling than J-Lo. Use these in exchange for items at the wily Moneybag's shop, and you can purchase all manner of different items such as Lockpicks, Teleport tokens and various attack upgrades to aid your overall quest to bring light back into the world.

Salubrious shopkeepers aren't the only creatures you'll meet along your travels, however. Spyro: A Hero's Tail features tons of different colourful characters to interact with. In a brilliant touch, players can assume control of several of these, each with radically different abilities to Spyro. New guy Blink the Mole and the brilliantly funny, stiff upper-lipped Sgt Byrd line up with old pals like Hunter the Cheetah. Use your funky friends over specific levels and mini-games to earn more bartering items (Dragon Eggs and Light Gems). These sub-levels are just as much fun, in some cases better than the main game itself and provide a great variation in both pace and gameplay. We loved the spectacular flying levels in particular, where a jetpacking Sgt Byrd takes to the skies and players have to complete certain challenges, like shooting down a flock of vultures in a given time limit.

As for Spyro himself, the game sticks firmly to the tried and tested format of the previous titles. Explore the environment (in his prancing, cutesy camp way) and once each realm is clear, engage in a not particularly challenging boss battle. Only this time round, the benevolent beastie has loads of new powers available, as each level necessitates. All-new Electric Breath destroys robots, whilst Ice Breath (he obviously had his Wrigley's Extra this morning) is great for cooling things down when the heat gets too much. Although character and level detail are fairly bland, the animation is decent enough, though Spyro has a nasty habit of skidding around like his claws were made of Teflon - this can be very annoying when precision jumping is frequently called for.

A Hero's Tail is actually fairly hefty, with enormous levels to explore. Obviously a younger gamer's title, plenty of colourful visuals and the addition of so many replayable mini-games should keep the kiddies enthralled (and guiet) for hours at a time. Which is surely the sign of a decent kids' game, right?

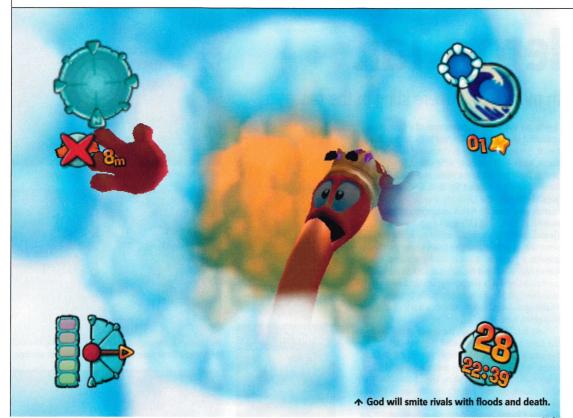

As well as weapons crates, keep an eye open for building crates too. They'll give you upgrades and repairs which you'll need if you're to win.

INGWORMS, roundworms, tapeworms and hookworms... fish 'em out and fire 'em up because Team T's wriggling warmongering classic is back. A call to arms for everything without a spine, Forts: Under Siege is Worms 3D (Issue 22, 7.3) but with a more devious repertoire, a brand new strategic angle, and 50-stone canaries.

As you have no doubt guessed from the title, this is *Worms* with fortifications. Where the aim of the game was once to survive the longest, you're now required to beat back the enemy and indulge in a little Barrett Homes building at the same time. Think of it as *Worms* gone *Populous*. There's even wrath of god weapons this time too.

By expanding your encampment into enemy territory and building on map hot spots known as Victory Locations, you earn bigger building structures. These can then be mounted with vast weapons capable of obliterating an enemy in one fell swoop. Developing the best buildings in the best place is obviously the key to success, as is firing off the excellent Rhino weapon now and again. The more Victory Locations you secure, the greater the range of building until, if you're lucky, you'll have hospitals and weapons factories spewing out worms and ammo faster than you can use them.

If you think the inclusion of forts is a gimmick you're sorely mistaken. It's a dynamic move that adds a layer of depth and intricacy to gameplay that feels just a little bit naughty. You know *Worms* should be nothing more than tit-for-tat retaliation, but with brains it's so much better.

Then of course, there's the Xbox Live play. Our collective gasps of shock when we all found out

Worms 3D would not be playable online were obviously heard. You can play against your friends, you can communicate tactics and taunts, and you can undertake vast campaigns against intelligent opponents who'll do everything to employ craftier tactics than you. To say Live play adds life to this title is an understatement.

But, surprisingly, the biggest shock to the system is the wealth of new weapons. Want to trundle around with a massive explosive canary held above your head? Of course you do. What about firing off a giant hippo with dynamite strapped to its back? Be our guest. How about smothering your enemy in flaming hot Chilli Con Carnage? Go grab a spoon and do your worst.

These weapons, plus around 50 others (look out for the fridge bomb which opens up to scatter its explosive contents everywhere) are complemented by the environments this time too. Not to mention the destruction you can rain down on them... Real-world locations have replaced the trippy, otherworldly arenas of *Worms 3D* and lend themselves brilliantly to the slimy retelling of history's finest moments. Whether you're rescuing Helen of Troy or setting sail across the seven seas only to be attacked by pirate worms, it makes for a far more engrossing experience than any alien worm attack ever did.

It's not without its faults though. Time limits on some levels end up being the biggest opponent and where you'd like to employ flanking manoeuvres and explore your surroundings, you're forced to do otherwise. Slight scenery glitches see the camera sometimes swallowed up by the occasional wall, and the failure-to-success ratio will infuriate some players. But, if you still consider turn-based games a valid concept, and don't mind that you find enjoyment in such a simple game (albeit with a god-sim twist), you'll be in your element. Forts is probably not for everyone, but those of us with hearts as squishy as the loveable mud-chewers themselves will be in seventh heaven.

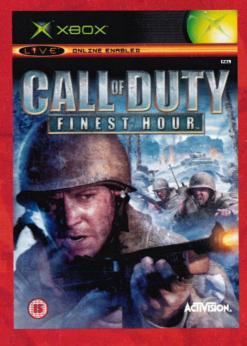

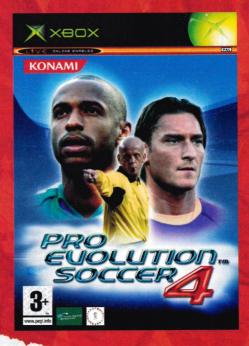

Crash Twinsanity

S GOOD AS Crash Bandicoot used to be, and as much as he zipped around the screen like a whirling orange dervish, his series was still essentially a side-scrolling platformer. Sure, it was all done in polygons rather than pixels, but you worked your way through levels by following what were essentially rails. But boy, how things have changed.

Crash has gone free-roaming and along for the ride is his nemesis, Dr Cortex. The reasoning behind this bizarre partnership is long, but centres around the invasion of Crash's planet by two extra-terrestrial parrots. They eat fast food and they like obliterating the living, and when Cortex goes head to head with hem to stop the attacks, they suck his brains out. Cue an unlikely partnership with Crash, and a quest to save the world.

Great thought has been given to this new dimension of gameplay, and the pairing of Crash and Cortex has had every last drop of invention squeezed from it. If you're not using Cortex as a hammer to smash obstacles, you're fighting with him. In a flurry of fists and feet, the two of you roll around in the path of danger and you have to steer the brawl from one point to another like some kind of organic *Marble Madness*. Then there are times when he'll be stumbling around with a beehive lodged on his head and you have to demolish traps before he stumbles into them.

There are moments when Crash goes it alone though, namely when traversing the nastier parts of a level, such as stealthily moving through a village of insane spear-chuckers. The last thing you need

here is a mad professor screeching around with brains dripping from his ears.

Thankfully *Crash* loses nothing making the transition from rails to sprawling platformer. If anything, the humour and story have been upped considerably. Very few games can manage genuine laughs, but this is one of them, and it's all the better for it. The relationship between Crash and Cortex is reminiscent of classic Hollywood comedy duos and this, combined with the open-ended mission structure, makes *Crash Twinsanity* something of a doozy.

There are moments of pure frustration thrown into the pot as well, though. If a level isn't frying your eyes out, you've got to be careful of your step. Some perspectives when block-jumping can be pretty deceptive, forcing you to repeatedly shift the camera to a top-down view so you can see just how far you need to leap. Then there are the levels themselves. We saw glimmering jewels way below us and decided to hurtle down the mountain to fetch them. Only when we reached the bottom did we realise we'd just inadvertently returned to the beginning of the level, and had to replay the whole thing. It allowed us to reap another bunch of wumpa fruit, but it took us an hour. While wumpa fruit mean extra lives if collected in abundance, a measly extra life really isn't compensation enough for the hassle.

The new Cortex weapon (for that's all he really is) adds great variety to play. And whether you're dodging the vicious laser eyes of the giant Mecha-Bandicoot, or being blasted with the vice-versa reverser device from the tenth dimension, you'll forget the orange marsupial ever had dubious dalliances, such as that whole karting craze a few years back. It's not in the same league as the infamous plumber, and the partner/weapon gimmick isn't new (Whiplash - Issue 27, 8.1 - did it before), but it's a sturdy exercise in comic gaming. We'll even forgive the fact it's ginger.

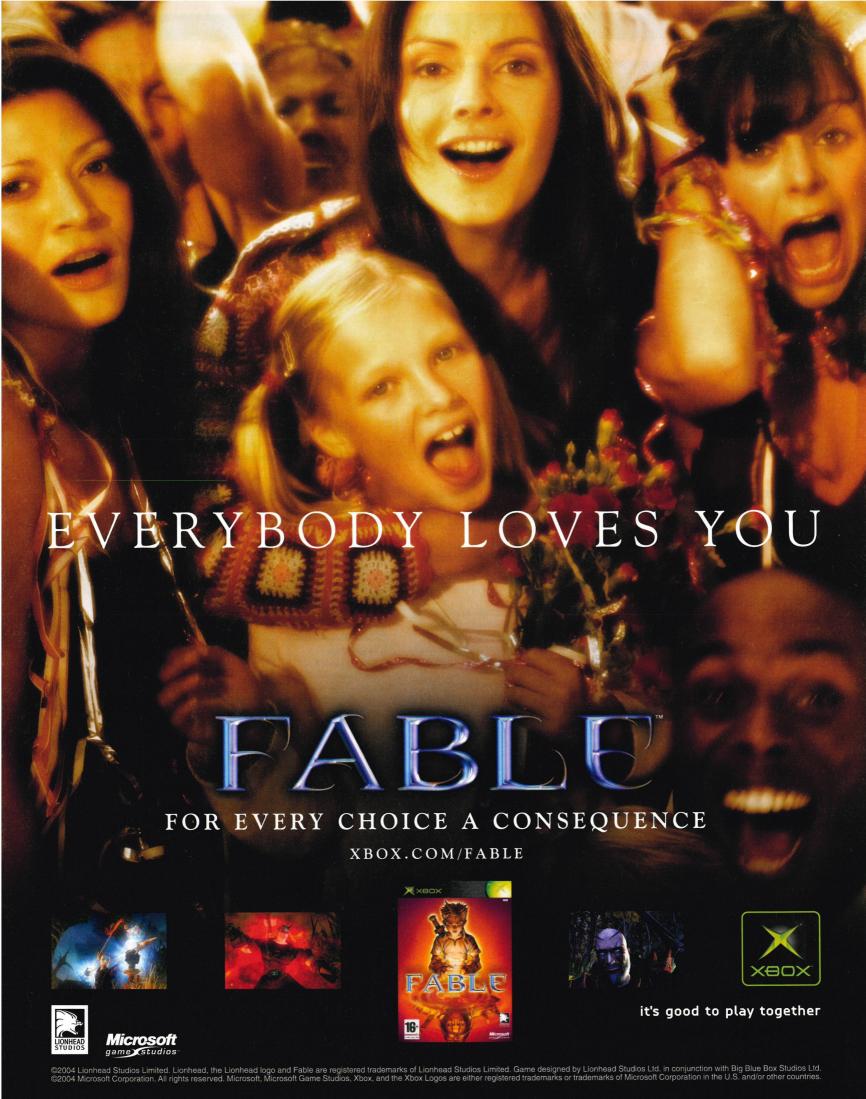


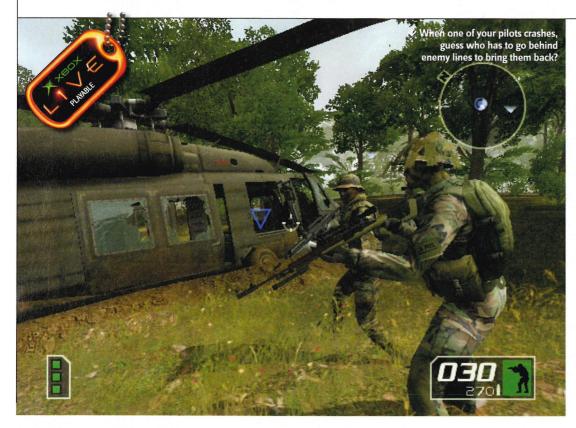

ROUCHING ON our knees in dark corners while flanked by three uniformed men isn't usually the kind of thing we go in for here at Official Xbox Magazine. But, in the case of the Tom Clancy tactical shooter series, we're willing to make an exception.

Set during a fictional conflict between a mad North Korean general and the West, *Ghost Recon 2* signifies something of a departure from the slow-paced, tactical gameplay we have come to expect from these games. For starters, you can play from an all-new third-person perspective (though you can still play in first-person if you prefer), while the faster, more arcade-orientated action is caught somewhere in limbo between the gritty realism of its predecessor (Issue 21, 8.5) and the *Rainbow Six* series, and the more forgiving and frenetic skirmishes of *Conflict: Vietnam* (Issue 34, 8.5).

But does it work? Well, yes and no. While this new direction may well appeal to a wider audience, its execution is more suspect than a convicted murderer called Bill the Butcher standing over a corpse with a bloody knife crying, "The bastard had it comin!"

Typically, there are three different types of missions on offer in the campaign. First off are the squad-based infiltration levels, where you and your team must enter enemy-held territory and either blow up key targets or rescue captured/crashed comrades.

Things start well enough as you creep silently through the crumbling, smoke-spewing (though graphically unimpressive) cities of Korea, or its rural

locales, your eyes straining in their sockets as you seek to identify the slightest hint of enemy presence in your grainy surroundings.

However, as soon as you take down a couple of enemies, things really start to kick off, as countless more enemies flock towards you and begin raining down a maelstrom of lead on your position, barking orders and warnings to each other as they try to pin you down.

You fight back, taking down enemies with precision shots and watching them slump realistically to the ground, while issuing orders to your squad on the fly with the excellent new context-sensitive command system (see By My Command, far right), or via voice commands with a headset. The battle swings violently back and forth as your men and the enemy intelligently seek out cover and lay down suppressing fire. What's more, if one of your soldiers gets injured you can now heal them on the battlefield.

Before you wade into the fray, make sure you learn and practise the skills of the covert ops soldier by having a go on the assault course and rifle range. Remember your training and you will make it back in one piece. Maybe.

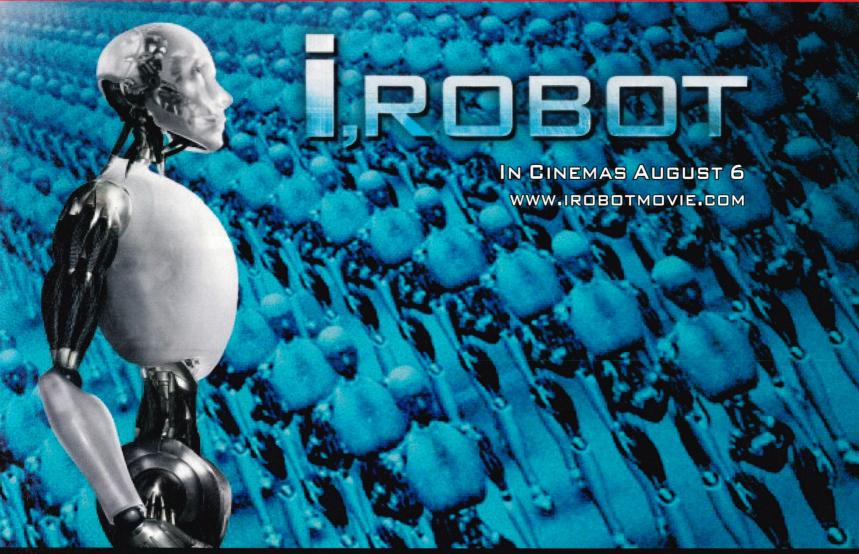
Sut suddenly, without warning, your entire squad is wiped out by an unseen attacker. You reload. It happens again. And again. Then it dawns on you. You've stumbled upon a spawn point. Enemies materialise out of thin air, behind you, in front of you, giving you no time to react. Of course this would be bearable if the game's damage model reflected its new frenetic approach. Sadly, neither you nor your men can take more than a handful of shots before you drop, making moments like these utterly infuriating. It also totally negates any carefully planned tactics you may have employed.

Solo infiltration missions are just like the squad-based ones, only even harder (because you have no backup, obviously). In order to level the playing field a little, you're kitted out with the

revolutionary Integrated Warrior System (IWS), replete with a machine-gun that lets you fire round corners without exposing yourself and kickass grenade launcher. It also proffers you with the added bonus of being able to call in airstrikes.

These missions are the highlights of Ghost Recon 2, oozing tension like a ruptured dam and testing your reflexes, tactical awareness and shot accuracy to the max. With no backup to rely on, you're forced to think about every move and its consequence and, when faced with multiple enemies, a keen understanding of your surroundings will prove invaluable. Especially if you don't want some Korean conscript's niece using your intestines as a skipping rope before the day is out.

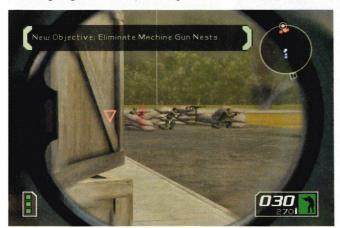

Conversely though, the shortcomings of the squad-based missions are amplified here, necessitating constant reloads as seemingly endless waves of enemies charge at you, even when you're well hidden. But the enemy AI isn't consistently this good, oh no, no. Sometimes it doesn't see you at all. Even if you're standing right in front of it. Waving a red flag. Dancing the Macarena.

Last and definitely least are the defensive missions. Brainless to the extreme, these task you and your squad to defend a base by moving from one trench to the next while gunning down endless droves of advancing enemies and immobilising the odd tank and APC. It's the kind of archaic, bynumbers, lazy level design that would leave a lobotomised chimp feeling patronised.

Of course if you don't fancy trawling through the campaign, you can embark on single missions in a variety of game modes including Lone Wolf (you're on your own but have access to the best weaponry) and Firefight (kill every enemy in the entire level). But regardless of which one you choose, the same problems still abound.

Fortunately, the rather patchy single-player game is redeemed somewhat by its diverse and entertaining multiplayer options. Cram yourself and up to three mates in front of your TV or link up with up to 15 other players over Xbox Live and revel in the joys of co-operative or competitive play, shouting abuse or praise at each other through your headsets. Ah, the joys of modern technology.

Ghost Recon 2 is a game with a severe identity crisis, clearly trying to appeal to the action-loving masses while attempting not to alienate fans of the slow-paced gameplay of yore. Problem is, it's unlikely to truly grip either group, and may well estrange many core fans. Suddenly, the idea of being stuck in those dark corners protecting our rears simply isn't as appealing as it used to be.

Ford Racing 3

Budget arcade racer hits Xbox. Get your fluffy dice ready!

HILE FORD doesn't quite have the desirability factor of Mercedes or the upper-class refinement of Rolls-Royce, it is a company with plenty of history, tradition and classic cars to its name. Ford Racing 3 draws on that history with a wealth of motors to unlock, and it'll help you learn the difference between a '55 Thunderbird and a '68 Mustang. If that doesn't excite you, it's worth noting that you'll also get the chance to race around in one of the coolest cars ever made - the legendary Ford Capri.

This, the third game in the Ford Racing series (duh - ed), adds substantially to the content of the generally well-received second game (Issue 23, 6.4). There's more of everything, with a total of 56 cars, 12 reversible courses and two dedicated racing circuits waiting to be unlocked. Progress is fairly swift, mind, and we'd estimate that good drivers will be able to unlock everything in about ten to 15 dedicated hours. But in addition to the single-player game, you can also take your favourite cars online via Xbox Live to race against other Ford fanatics.

There are three main game modes to keep you busy. Two of these provide the meat and veg of the single-player game where cars and courses are unlocked, while the third is basically a 'build your own race' mode. The Ford Competition takes you through a progression of themed races, getting progressively harder as the rewards become more substantial. Its companion - The Ford Challenge offers yet more unlockables through a series of 11 themed race types including old favourites like

Drafting and Time Attack alongside new additions Boost, Relay and Overtake. Once you've unlocked everything you can then create your own tailormade race in Ford Competition mode.

Car handling is very much old-skool arcade; point, shoot and bounce off the sides. It's basic, but easy to pick up. There's no damage modelling, so no matter how many times you stack your ride headfirst into the walls it'll never go out of shape. You can choose to drive in automatic or manual mode, but apart from that the only skill you really need to master is how to slide around corners.

There's a lot of differentiation between the various cars, and even the worst driver in the world would be hard-pushed not to notice the difference between a '49 Coupe and a '92 RS Cosworth. While the physics are sound enough most of the time, it can often feel - especially with the faster cars - like they are pivoting around from the centre, rather than turning on their wheels, which makes fast cornering all the more tricky. Opposing Al-controlled cars, while often unpredictable, certainly aren't slow and will keep up with you, even when you're in a supposedly faster car.

Graphically, Ford Racing 3 looks okay, if not exactly stunning; expect the usual assortment of trackside clichés, overblown sunbursts, giant Buddha statues and so on. The actual racing's fluid enough, and there are no framerate issues to speak of. Track design is pretty good too, with plenty of hills and a good mix of straights, corners and chicanes to negotiate. Sadly, the background music is all widdly '80s cock rock-style instrumental and thoroughly dreadful.

Ford Racing 3 offers lots of cars to unlock, and plenty of challenges and game types to keep you amused - it's not by any means the worst driving game ever made, and it's a snip at £20. But, much like the Ford brand itself, there isn't really much in the way of glitz or glamour to it either.

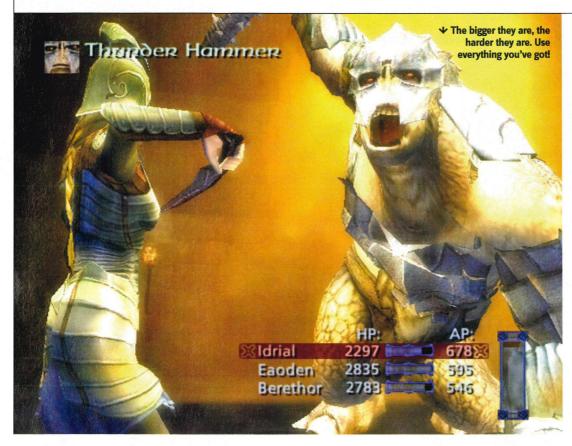

The Lord of the Rings: The Third Age

Tolkien's epic finally gets a decent role-playing game

FTER STRIKING licensing gold with *The Two Towers* (Issue 14, 8.0) and *Return of the King* (Issue 23, 8.5), EA is going for an assault on the charts with an RPG based around the events of the movie trilogy. Previous games allowed you to play as members of the Fellowship, but *The Third Age* takes a slightly different path to the orcinfested wastelands of Mordor.

Although you don't get to play as the famed Fellowship members, they do pop up in very important battles (The Balrog, Helm's Deep, Pelennor Fields) to lend an axe, staff or bow to your party. Instead, you play the role of Gondor warrior Berethor, who sets out to locate Boromir. Along the way, elves, rangers, dwarves, Rohan warriors and many more will join your quest. Gandalf actor Sir lan McKellen has provided an excellent narrative that keeps you updated on where in the story you are. But if you're familiar with the movies or the books, you'll have heard it all before.

The Third Age is essentially an adventure within an adventure. While Frodo and co are off dealing with matters of the ring, Berethor is chasing the Fellowship through Middle-earth, mopping up what the Fellowship leaves behind. There are lots of orcs to clear out of villages, lots of soldiers to round up for the Helm's Deep battle and lots of Uruk-hai to waste in Osgiliath. At one point or another you'll see just about every foe Tolkien wrote about and Peter Jackson filmed. There are a few twists and turns in the story – some that may well have the beards up in arms – but it'd be rude to give them away here.

With around 40 hours of gameplay to wade though, you'll spend some of your 'precious' time wandering the land, but mostly you'll be involved in turn-based battles. If you're familiar with the *Final Fantasy* style of turn-based combat then you'll know what to expect here. You take a turn to attack enemies or heal a member of your party, and then they do. And then you do. And then they do. It might not sound much on paper, but with the dizzying effects and cracking score taken from the films, it all adds up to a very enjoyable experience.

The Third Age feels as though it's been knocked together quite quickly. Many areas will be familiar to those who have played EA's previous titles, though the main characters don't look or sound themselves here. And because it's an RPG, there are loads of power-ups, spells, items and melee attacks to master. Your main inventory screen

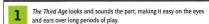

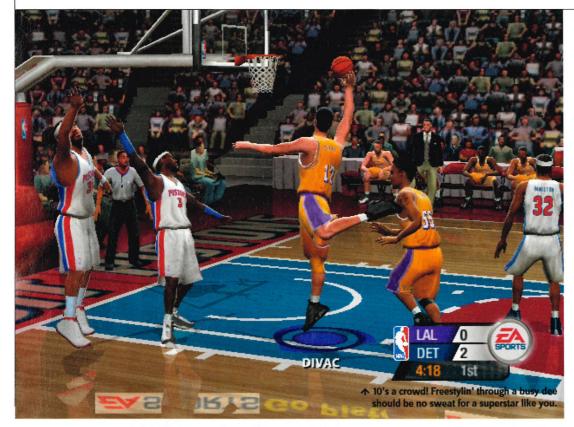

EA's perennial b-ball sim still fails to live up to its name. NBA Live ain't Live

ASKETBALL: to us Brits, a repetitive venture of gangly types running backwards and forwards across a squeaky wooden court. To describe the sport as 'cult' in the UK would be like calling Wayne Rooney 'a little bit chubby' (i.e. a bit of an understatement). No surprises, then, that EA has once again opted to deprive its European NBA Live series of, um, Live play. Still, at least the offline experience is consistently good.

Most of the strengths and weaknesses of last year's outing (Issue 23, 7.3) apply here. Its intuitive, simple-to-master but deep controls mechanism means that it's kind to complete novices, whilst also complex enough to appeal to the most ardent of tacticians. The *NBA Live* series has been a master at straddling the gulf between arcade immediacy and

sim-like authenticity, and *NBA Live 2005* continues to perfect the art amiably.

However, that's not to say that there have been no noticeable adjustments to the gameplay. The pace definitely appears to have picked up a gear, with the detailed players manoeuvring with greater mobility. By tinkering with the Right thumbstick, you can perform all manner of cunning wriggles, jinks and weaves, which are slightly easier to execute than in last year's game.

Also, of a far more advanced nature is the implementation of Freestyle Air. This essentially rewards your lank-bodied athletes the power of mid-air trickery, giving you opportunities to perform naughty stuff like forcing fouls and changing shots. Add in tweaked AI, harder-to-nail three-pointers, better animations and well, okay, *NBA Live* has improved somewhat. But to be honest, unless you're a hardcore basketball freak, the changes are so subtle that it's quite unlikely you'll notice them.

At least there are several new game modes featured, including the surprisingly addictive (and bloody hard) slam dunk challenges. The revamped 25-year Dynasty mode extends to such tactical depths that it should come with a government health warning. And the customary All Star matchup is always a sure-hitter – even if your knowledge borders on the non-existent, it's impossible not to appreciate the unique manner in which every superstar jiggles and dunks.

Along with the Live-enabled ESPN NBA Basketball (Issue 23, 7.6), this is probably the best realistic, and most engrossing, basketball sim around. It's just a huge shame that EA Sports has kept the franchise offline, as the whole thrill of videogames sports is surely competing against fellow gamers across the globe. Perhaps the Yanks are still nursing their wounds after their humiliating defeat by Argentina at the Olympic Games (you gotta laugh)... Good stuff but not enough to recommend if you already own NBA Live 2004.

C FANS MIGHT have got themselves The Sims 2, but Maxis hasn't forgotten about the consolers and it's created a brand new franchise especially for us in the shape of The Urbz: Sims in the City. Doesn't it make you feel all warm and fuzzy inside?

So you've taken the big step and moved out of the comfort and regular laundry washing of your parental home, and now it's time to face city life. Once you've created your basic Urb you get to take them into one of nine areas in the city which are all controlled by different gangs. These include the punks that inhabit the seedy Central Station, stuffing themselves with chips and pounding each other in their own personal Fight Club. Then there are the skaters that live in Kicktail Park and like nothing better than skating their hearts out and then stopping off at Floaters, the local party bar, where

they inhale helium until they sound like Alvin and his merry band of Chipmunks.

But Urbz is all about gaining a reputation with each of these cliques as well as keeping your own five needs in check (food, entertainment, sleep, bowel movement and hygiene). That means you'll have to socialise and work out what makes them tick, which will allow you access to new areas and social moves. More importantly you'll have to buy clothes to blend in so you don't go into the J-Pop and sushi-filled streets of Neon East wearing one of Marilyn Manson's cast-offs.

Ás well as being a social butterfly, you'll have to find some way of paying the rent on your new apartment and buying furniture to impress your new-found friends. Every area has its own job opportunities. For example, you can make body piercings, sculptures or try your hand as a sushi chef, and all these jobs will require you to complete some basic button-bashing mini-games.

The Urbz is certainly a big departure from the traditional Sims gameplay and it's all the better for it. It's extremely accessible - although the longish loading times are a bit of a pain - and a hoot to play, with a constant stream of details that'll keep you smiling.

Ty The Tasmanian Tiger 2: Bush Rescue

O SNIGGERING at the back! Bush Rescue is a GTA-style kiddies' romp starring the entire catalogue of Australian animals. And despite the dubious name, you won't see a beaver anywhere.

On initial contact with Ty The Tasmanian Tiger 2: Bush Rescue, you'll roll your eyes and mutter something about 'bloody platform games', or 'generic ballsy rodent game character rip-off sequel'. Both would be correct - this is a platform game with another not-quite-as-cool-as-it-thinks-it-is leading character, and there are gems to scramble around collecting, but it's the GTA-style mission structures that give some breadth to the otherwise paint-by-numbers gaming, just as it did the original.

You'll be bombing around on the back of a Yute, diving through billabongs and interacting with all manner of Aussie inhabitants, just like in the first Ty title (Issue 10, 7.6), but this time the action has been cranked up a notch. Ty can now leap into the cockpit of giant clunking mechs or behind the turret of a mounted mortar gun in an attempt to broaden the scope of gameplay. And although it does so, the whole thing still feels as though you've played it in its entirety before.

The sub-missions which see you walloping stray crocs in the sewers or testing out battle arenas for your mad professor friend are fine distractions,

but nothing other than distractions. They're certainly not awe-inspiring slices of innovation.

Where Ty 2 does push back the borders of banality, it does so with small touches and incidental things. Many levels are filled with beautiful blink-and-you'll-miss-them moments such as the Koala RAC going about their business hauling a car to safety after plunging from a bridge, or old inhabitants of towns stopping for a chat with their friends. It may not actually add anything to the game, but its endearing nonetheless.

Ty's rack of boomerangs is back and fired up too, ranging from the standard 'rang' to the kaboomarang (guess what that does), the infrarang, x-rang, and the megarang. Each has its own attribute, be it the ability to destroy metal crates or, in the case of the x-rang, be able to spot bad guys in disguise who'd seek to sabotage your do-gooding.

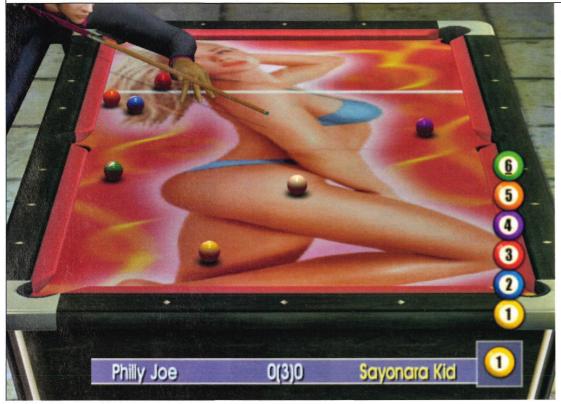

Pool Shark 2

A cash-hungry predator in a sea of baize

ONTRARY TO WHAT I thought as a young boy, a pool shark is not a type of fish that lurks in leisure centres. Instead, it's the kind of person who drifts between seedy bars and can't quite decide what's more important - the winning or the money.

Whereas World Championship Snooker 2004 (Issue 31, 8.8) was all about conquering tournaments, Blade Interactive's follow-up concentrates on conning other pool sharks out of their ill-gotten gains.

Matches start with paltry bets of around \$50 -\$80. Fortunately, an experienced hustler can double or even triple the wager mid-game. It's a stirring idea but one that falls a little flat in single-player mode. There's no real incentive to play deliberately badly to trick your opponent. Just play normally and your opponent will inevitably up the stakes themselves. Hustling should also have been worked into the game with more visual conviction. There's no interaction between the great-looking characters, just a basic 'hustle' option in the pause menu.

There's no trifling when it comes to Xbox Live though. When playing online, hustling another player is hugely satisfying because you get to keep their (virtual) cash if you win. Nine different game types are included, from 8-Ball and 9-Ball to the more unusual 3-Ball and Rotation Pool. Our two favourites are 10 Pin Pool, a game cleverly based on tenpin bowling, and Showboat Pool, where only trick shots count towards the final score.

If you've played Blade's World Championship Snooker or World Championship Pool series, you'll

know what to expect from the gameplay. Pool Shark 2 uses the same brilliantly intuitive cueing system. Potting or missing depends on setting the power meter, cue contact point and cueing angle precisely. Crucially, the physics engine is so rigorous that there simply is no better pool simulation out there today.

Graphically, it's also very well defined. Quality motion capture makes the cueing believable and the 11 locations look very crisp. These fictional settings are also packed with funny incidental details, like the writhing pole dancers in Philly Joe's club.

Understandably, there aren't any world-famous pool sharks (we're not talking professionals here), so Blade has created 20 comical, suitably seedy drink-house desperados. In appearance, they're full of fun and in the same vein as the Outlaw Golf/ Volleyball series. Unfortunately, their voiceovers are more Paul Daniels than Paul Newman, and lack real attitude and, well, 'va-va-voom'. The absence of commentary (especially when attempting the ten trick shots) is also sorely noticeable.

Pool Shark 2 is a diamond in the rough. It's a hugely authentic and engaging pool sim with a few presentational issues, most notably the voiceovers. A laudable variety of modes, characters and settings make it sufficiently different from Blade's other titles and well worth it for fans of the sport.

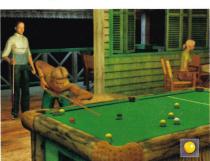

Godzilla: Save The Earth is Godzilla: Destroy All Monsters Melee (Issue 17, 6.1) with a modest story mode known as the Action mode and online options attached. The Action mode, or ACTION MODU! if you're a hardcore 'Zilla fan, is little more than a series of brawls interspersed with sub-quests such as saving buildings from aliens or shooting ships. Think Street Fighter's car-bashing sub-games, only a lot taller and with the whiff of rubber. Still though, the crux of Godzilla is the beat 'em up aspect.

To be fair, the scuffles are impressively destructive. Buildings topple, itsy-bitsy cars plough into your great clumping hooves and fizz into oblivion, and dinky aircraft buzz past your ears. The only problem though, is the other rubber gonk opposite you wanting to kick your hind. It's like being trapped in an episode of Power Rangers. For all the cheek puffing and bravado between the two beasts, the combat is atrocious. When you're not wrestling someone in a comedy lizard suit, you're tip-toeing through buildings or rolling around the floor. The collision detection will happily allow you to punch through an enemy, just as it will allow them to pick you up and throw you without so much as touching a hair on your head. Bleurgh!

Special powers are pretty natty even if the combat isn't, enabling you to unleash a blast of halitosis on everything. But when bouts alternate between punch, kick, breathe, punch, kick, breathe, the appeal bombs. Four-man melees are just as bad, only there are more of you slugging it out. More, in this case, does not mean merrier.

Still, if you're a hardcore GODZIRRA FANU!, you'll be pleased to see a complete back catalogue of enemies ready for a pummelling. All the monsters are here and its a nice touch allowing a choice between 90s 'Zilla and 'Zilla 2000, but for the untrained eye that's like choosing between a glove puppet and a glove puppet with boggly eyes.

As if to compound the misery, there seems to be some kind of gremlin at work within the code. Pause for any length of time and the game sees fit to cut into a rolling demo and you have to start all over again. We advise not drinking any quantity of liquid before playing, and pulling out all the phone cables too. Then again, if you do that, how are you going to play it on Live? Gosh, what a darned shame. Best bin it just to be safe.

HIS 'DON'T TRY it at home' thing is all getting a bit out of hand. Rocket-airing off the church roof may require some form of precautionary warning, sure, but wheelchairing up an air vent while wearing a leg cast, spinning a 720 chair-flip and acid-dropping onto a Berlin art gallery from a height of 40 feet? Come on, only a fully trained kamikaze airhead would be ready to commit himself to that one. But then, that is exactly what this game is all about.

If anything, the new *Tony Hawk's* game has taken things to the next level of extremity. Rather than restricting control to your custom-created skate punk, the main Story mode lets you alternate between recognisable pros (Rodney Mullen, Chad Muska et al) and mystery guest stars. These range from go-kart riding Aussie natives to *Jackass* mentalists on mechanised bulls (see A Load Of Bull, next page). It all makes for a game that is marginally more fun and out-there than previous entries.

The quest begins with Tony Hawk and loud-mouthed Bam Margera leading two teams of upcoming pros (some fictional, some real, some from *Jackass*) on a World Destruction Tour, with the losers forking out for the entire competition. Gulp! You'll start off in Boston, before flying off to sample

the delights of Barcelona, Sydney, Berlin and more. This makes for the familiar gameplay of skating around the city, nailing fixed goals (grinding specific routes, setting cops' heads on fire etc), picking up extra challenges and unlocking goodies.

The twist comes in the additional ability to control both your pro team-mates and a bevy of new characters, with less obvious extreme sports vehicles offering alternative handling but similar stunt capabilities. The best - the wheelchair-bound maniac Paulie (whose voice is very suspiciously Cartman-like) - zips along at such an unbelievably fast rate, you'll be bouncing, spinning and grinding across rooftops like a pigeon with its backside on fire. It certainly ramps up the series' humour, whilst also milking its Jackass connection for all its worth.

But the new *Tony Hawk's Underground* (*THUG*) experience doesn't end there - Neversoft has generously complemented the new levels with a Classic mode. This revisits the time-limited gameplay of the *Pro Skater* games, giving you two

minutes to complete a number of much-adulated tasks like collecting S-K-A-T-E, smashing sick scores and finding the hidden video tape. Crack the early levels and you'll unlock environments from *Pro Skater* games *I-3* too, such as the legendary warehouse. With the addition of all your new tricks (like jumping off your board) and the improved grinding skills, beating Classic mode is considerably easier than it used to be. Still, you're essentially getting two games for the price of one.

So something for everyone, then. However, in spite of the gratifying additions, you can't help but feel *THUG2*, even in Story mode, still plays very much like its predecessors. The controls are

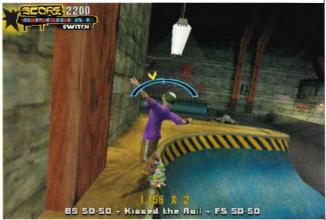

>> virtually identical (if it ain't broke, don't fix it), the skaters perform mightily similar manoeuvres (even aboard a lawnmower) and, stylistically, it's an unnoticeably touched-up affair. In fact, for all its free-roaming environments and Jackass-style humour, at the core remains an experience as close to Pro Skater 2 and 3 as you can possibly get without risk of passing infection. Which is, to be fair, great. Unless you're bored rigid of the greatest extreme sports series known to man, of course.

There are some minor downsides too. The city settings could certainly be larger and more varied. Some feel noticeably restricted in size, while others appear as lacklustre extensions of the previous

ones, sporting similar buildings, landmarks and vehicles to trick off. A day and night rotational cycle simply annoys because the lighting is predominately basic (compare it to the forthcoming *Midnight Club 3*, which is stunning), and the split-screen multiplayer (there's no Live support) is horribly claustrophobic on anything other than a huge TV set. Fortunately, the rest of the game is typical *Tony* brilliance.

With the reintroduction of the old-skool game, this is certainly the most complete *Tony Hawk*'s offering yet. It may be more cartoon-like than its predecessors, but provided you haven't grown tired of all those boomerangs, kick-flips and boardslides, it is certainly the one to get.

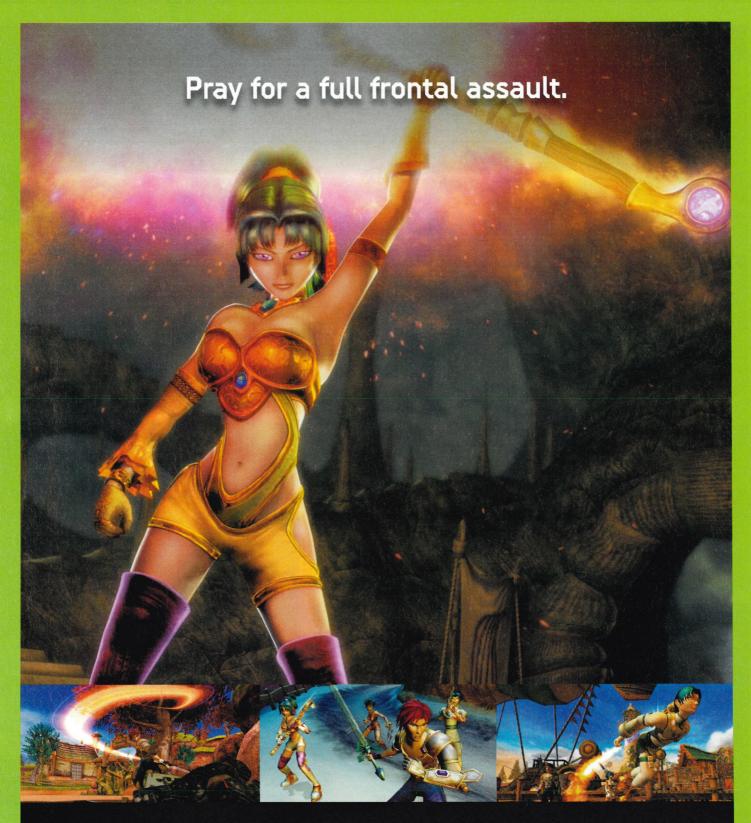

Backyard Wrestling 2: There Goes The Neighbourhood

Seriously, don't try this at home...

O MATTER how hard you hit someone over the head with a plank of wood, you can never hammer much sense into them. It seems the developer of *BW2* suffers the same predicament. The first game (Issue 23, 3.3) was a lacklustre wrestling title (of sorts) that failed to deliver any impact. Sadly, the sequel walks straight into the same clothesline and is knocked unceremoniously to the floor. And stamped on. Hard.

Grappling the Career mode, players must create a wrestler to take through the suburban settings. The crude creation options pale in comparison to the detail of *THUG 2* (see page 112). This terrible visual quality and awful collision detection is carried over into the main game, with jagged characters clashing into scenery and each other. Custom moves can be allocated to your fighter, but it's little compensation.

The actual combat, although satisfyingly brutal, is shoddily executed, with a winning combo seemingly dependent on continually kicking an opponent in the head when they're down. Weapons are obviously fair game, though again, grab a barbed club, and a tasty bit of wielding will see you progress to the next round without losing an ounce

of health. Blocking has been introduced; it's just a pity the AI enemies don't use it more frequently.

This limited combat means the career mode gets very repetitive, very quickly. Grapple moves break up the punch/kick/punch combos, though chances are your opponent will reverse their way straight out of the opening headlock. With only two way multiplayer returning, this really was a missed opportunity to improve upon a disappointing franchise. As it stands, BW2 gets the smack put down on it by virtually every other fighter out there.

EMEMBER HOW captivated you were by He-Man and Transformers in your youth? Twenty years later, we know they were a marketing masterstroke, aired to sell huge quantities of merchandise. So we've a touch of trepidation when we see the Bandai logo appear during the loading screens. Merchandising alert!

Fresh from wowing wide-eyed kids on prime TV spots, the Digimon have evolved onto Xbox for another round of digitised beastie-bashing. But first let us reassure you – you have not had something slipped in your drink; the banging trance music and psychedelic visuals are just the menu screen...

First, pick a fluffy character and get stuck into the single-player Career mode. Facing off with one, two or three opponents, players must fight to the death over tons of environments, or Rumble arenas. These multi-tiered environments are highly detailed and filled with platforms, pitfalls and power-ups. Use these to your advantage and knock opponents into the lava/water/steam hazard to reduce their health.

Characters have a limited repertoire of moves, and there's not much scope for impressive combos, but this simplified gameplay is instantly accessible for younger gamers. By landing enough hits and collecting DigiUp tokens, players fill their Digimeters and can then Digivolve. Your cute creature

metamorphoses into a not-quite-so-cute monster with more powerful attacks. Fill it again, and you'll Digivolve into a Digimon – a robotic version of the beast, with an array of meatier, satisfying moves.

Add a wealth of more unlockable characters, engaging visuals and in particular the riotous fourway multiplayer, and *Digimon* is actually a reasonably entertaining kids' scrapper. The action is frenetic and there's an immensely satisfying feeling of fun battering the hell out of a cute little creature. Catering solely for younger gamers, but definitely a shift in the right direction for a more universal Xbox appeal, *Digimon* will finally give your little brother good reason to hog the controller for a while.

Alternatively, a standard tag attack can be executed by pressing towards on the D-pad and the Black button. It's only possible to perform a tag if both characters are still conscious. When your health is low, tag out to let the other fighter take over. The weakened character's health will slowly increase when they're away from the action.

Of the four combatants, Bass and Tina (father and daughter) are both wrestlers, specialising in grapple moves while Jan Lee and Lei Fang are adept in the breakneck art of kung fu. 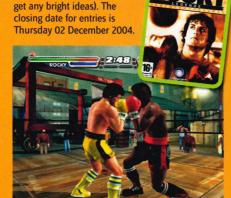

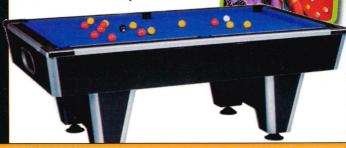

Star Wars Battlefront

Unleash the true power of the dark side on Live





WE KNEW FROM the off we were going to love Star Wars Battlefront. The game was primarily designed with online multiplayer in mind, and this is where the title shines. Up to 24 players can fight it out over every map available in the single-player game, and of course the multitude of AI bots that turned the offline single-player game into an intergalactic frag-fest are also present.

The same basic gameplay premise is still evident online. The objectives clearly state you must capture the Command Post, yet games ultimately descend into 200-a-side deathmatches, with the first team to lose all their members declared losers. Players align themselves to either good (Rebel Alliance, Clone Army) or evil (Galactic Empire, Separatist Droids) forces, relative to the era the match is set in (classic Trilogy or Clone Wars). Each different class of character (various snipers, grenadiers, riflemen, all in the time-relevant garb) has their different uses, and as such it's vital to team up with your fellow team-mates to really be effective. By providing the opportunity to

communicate with each other to form mixed squads of soldiers, LucasArts gives us the most immersive Star Wars experience since you got your girlfriend to dress up as Leia.

The lush forests of Endor, the open plains of Naboo and swirling heights of Bespin are here in all their galactic glory, and each involves radically different gameplay tactics. Certain close-quarter battles, like the rainy platforms of Kimano, are best suited to teaming up in groups of two or three, gradually working your way along the gangways and taking each spawn point in turn. The larger maps, like the treacherous Dune Sea and of course the icy wastelands of Hoth, feature tons of different vehicles. It's a bit more of a free-for-all here, as players become caught up in epic battles where your average life expectancy is shorter than Darth Vader's temper.

Battlefront excels in giving a fantastic Star Wars gaming experience and, catering for up to 24 players at a time, is one of the most ambitious Live titles to date. We perhaps would've appreciated a few more different game modes to bolster Battlefront's lasting appeal, but where else can you hop into an AT-AT and crush underfoot that annoying little shite who's just trampled you to death on a Tauntaun? Class.



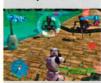

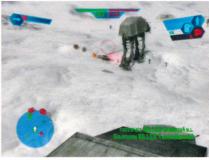

MUCH HAS BEEN made of Sega's revival of its classic OutRun franchise, about how we get all nostalgic remembering how we used to pump 10p pieces into the original. A lot has also rightly been made of the fact it's a gorgeous-looking, exhilarating racing title that truly deserved the accolades heaped upon it. We certainly love it. The playable Xbox Live component went some way towards garnering this praise, but now it's up and running, how does it compare to other racers out there? Well, bloody great in our book.

Up to eight players can tear it up online in classic OutRun mode. A simple race, start to finish, using any car available to you, over any track the host has unlocked from the main game. Every race runs at the characteristic pace of the offline mode, and when there's seven other cars powersliding round a corner all at once, it's a ferociously fun battle of every man for himself. Unfortunately, questionable collision detection rears its head

(you'll frequently trade paint with an opponent, only for them to disappear, then magically appear 10m down the road ahead of you). However, being an unavoidable curse of the majority of online racers, ignore this and revel in the brilliance of both OutRun's sunshine and slick gameplay.

Given the disappointment and frustration of getting a decent game of Burnout 3 thanks to EA's faltering servers, this slick street smoker looks to be doing the rounds for a fair while yet.

THE RALLY SERIES goes from strength to strength, with 2005's edition featuring, for the first time, full online play. Of sorts...

Players have a choice of two main game modes; Rally (normal race) or Stages (over sections of unlocked tracks). Colin McRae Rally 2005 ensures drivers use the same due care and attention as in the offline game, and the interactive scenery features (leaves falling onto your car as you plough into a tree) are present. Set your fastest time and enter it into the Live leaderboards to prove your mettle, or upload the ghost of your fastest lap for others to try and beat.

It's when racing against other opponents that the game takes a turn for the worse. As opposed to competing with actual cars, fellow online drivers are represented as ghosts as well. Collisions aren't an option, as get too close to another car and they will disappear and reappear on a clearer section of

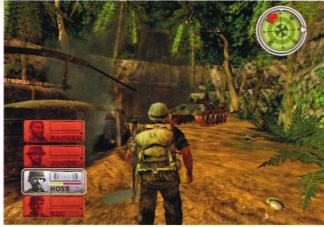

CAT STAYS IN THE BAG: EVEN THOUGH

Masterclass: Conflict: Vietnam

Welcome to the jungle, we've got fun and games. We got everything you want, honey we know the names (of all the characters, missions, locations and secrets that you need to complete the game - ed)

THE EXCELLENT Conflict series follows the gaming trend and ends up in the jungles of Vietnam. It's up to you to lead the squad - Junior, Cherry (later known as Doc), Ragman and Hoss - through the whole messy affair and out the other side... preferably with all their bits still in the right places.

RUMBLE IN THE JUNGLE

When your team gets to the crater, send Cherry and Junior left and your other two men into the right-hand tunnel. Watching out for hostiles, trace the stream with Hoss and Ragman and take out the enemies as they appear. You'll soon stumble across a boggy mound to your right, near to which you'll find some med kits and a bazooka.

Keep following the stream, taking out the VC, till you reach the cleft. Jump back to Junior and Cherry and follow the path. At the end, jump to your other team and link them up with Junior and Cherry. Face them all towards the rut on the far side.

Complete your bonus objective by going to the village and killing the VC - don't hurt any villagers! The easiest way of doing this is by placing Junior and Hoss at the open door found in the centre of the village, then jumping to your second team and moving them past the second hut on the right. Let Ragman blast away at the VC and get Cherry to charge through the right hand door and kill the enemies within. Now send Ragman and Cherry through the door on the left and to the far side of the building. This is the perfect spot to take down the advancing enemy troops. Kill all the enemies to complete both the main and bonus objectives.

In the second hut on the right, you'll find a hatch that's worth checking out. Shoot it from a distance to safely take out its contents. Check under all the baskets and pots in the village and you'll find four more hatches. Blow them all up the same way as before, except for the one containing the prisoner, then leave the village by the back door.

Traverse the bridge but watch out for an ambush. On the other side is a tunnel with a tripwire. Head down the path you find, take out the VC then enter the ruins that are teeming with enemies. Order Junior and Hoss to stand in the right-hand corner of the ruins and face diagonally right, then shelter Ragman and Cherry behind the crumbling pillars. Systematically work your way through the ruins, always making sure you cover every angle. Head for the helicopter to complete the mission.

TET OFFENSIVE

Get your men into the bunker and take down the VC with the mounted machine-gun. As you fall back, grab all the ammo you can find. Run through the trenches and behind the bunker, then take out the enemies there. At the compound, use the T-34 tank as cover to safely reach the closest trench. Head down the trench and eliminate the enemies, making sure your men cover each other at all times. The two paratroopers give you a bonus objective. Order Hoss to take point and use him to hack down the advancing enemy troops, while taking the rest of your men down the left-hand path. When you reach two other US grunts, cover them and call Hoss to join you so that he can lay down cover while the rest of your team heads through the trench that's left of the tent. Use Ragman to grab rocket launchers from the objective marker, then pick up some bazookas and smoke grenades from the nearby hill and arrange your men defensively on the knoll.

The VC will now attack from certain trenches, so chuck some smoke grenades at them then watch the fireworks as the Air Force fries them. Now for the tank. Your best bet here is to flank it and send a rocket up its tailpipe. Throw smoke grenades into the two remaining trenches, then wait for the cavalry to arrive in order to complete the mission.

BAD MOON

Point Hoss in the direction of the chopper so he can mow down the enemies nearby. Stick Junior behind Hoss then send Ragman out on his own along the right-hand path - look out for the sniper on the ledge behind you. Move up the rest of your

FRIENDLY NATIVES

For Rumble in the Jungle's bonus objective, get through the mission without any villagers getting killed - by you or the VCI

RICH PICKINGS

Always have a good look around the surrounding area after a firefight. There's often plenty of handy ammo and other weapons lying around for the taking. Look in clearings, behind huts... everywhere!

EASY DOES IT

When faced with a particularly nasty obstacle - like a tank - it's often better to move your men one at a time It may sound tedious, but that way you ensure every man's covered and they stay alive.

men to join Ragman, keeping them covered at all times. The path that leads to the clearing is rife with booby traps, so take your time and disarm them as you go. Walk down the path then go right till you get to a junction. Go right to find some ammo and a dog tag on the soldier. Keep following the paths and picking up any dog tags you find on dead soldiers. Head right at every opportunity. You'll come across a horde of enemies, so be ready to eliminate them.

When you reach the statues, send Junior and Ragman down the path. You'll find some men round a campfire. Kill them and grab the dog tag from the dead US soldier nearby. You'll find more dog tags just past the ruin too. Now head down the tunnel to make sure there are no VC left nearby in order to complete a bonus objective. You'll also find more dog tags here. Once you've grabbed them, walk down the path and go right near the goats, then right again down a narrow path that runs between a cluster of rocks. If you position Junior on top of these, he'll be perfectly placed to take out any snipers that appear. Follow the path that slopes downwards and pick up another dog tag.

Now take Junior and Cherry up the path. You'll soon reach a mounted machine-gun, ideal for taking out nearby hostiles. Once they're dead, bring up the rest of your men to join them. In the cave, pick up the rocket launchers. In the next cave take out the mounted machine-gun by first running across the gap into the cave, then blowing up the mounted machine-gun with a grenade after its operator has taken out the POW (there are always casualties in war). Head out of the cave and into the clearing. keeping every angle covered. Once you're sure there are no enemies left, head to the end of the level.

Trace the stream and take out the guards. Lead your team to the first objective marker. Take cover behind the rocks as you move your men up the hill. At the summit, you'll find the path branches off, so send two men along each path. When they reach the complex of trenches, cover the ramps. Select Ragman and, with shotgun at the ready, take him through the trenches and kill all of the enemies.

Kit up your squad with the weaponry you find in the trenches. Give Cherry the Type-56 Assault Rifle, then move through the cave to reach the far side of the trenches. Again, the path will branch, so take Junior and Ragman left towards the enemy base, then position them in the upper-left corner next to the path that encircles the base. Now take Hoss and Cherry down the right-hand tunel, then follow the track and take out any hostiles you find, before following the stream which will let you get under the fence and into the base. You'll now be given two extra objectives to complete. Take out the AA guns to your left. Ensconce Hoss and Cherry into the closest building, then look for enemy intel.

Take Junior and Ragman to the other side of the base by following the path. In the first two huts you'll find some vital information. Link these two up with Hoss and Cherry. There's some extra ammo in the left-hand hut, where you can also complete a bonus objective. Near the last hut in the base you'll find an AA gun. Take it out with a well-placed grenade then scarper out of the back gate and head to the crashed helicopter to end this mission.

INTO THE FIRE

Run up the track and let your men fire at will. When the VC are dead, wait till the Air Force blows up the base before heading into the area. Kill the remnants of the enemy resistance inside then move into the main area. Run to the far side before the bombers drop their loads again. Should one of your men catch fire, make them hit the deck and roll.

Head out the back exit and follow the path to a bridge. Take out the gunner with Hoss. Watch out for booby traps on the bridge. Instead of trying to charge the enemy, hide behind the sandbags near the mortar and eliminate the machine-gunners and snipers from there. Once it's safe, use one of your

MOVING ON FOOT Watch out for those punjees Shoot rockets up tanks' bums - they don't like it one little bit. Keep an eye on your squad's health bars and heal them before they cop it. This is good place to be near a tank-enemy or friendly.

SHORT COOK

To 'cook off' a grenade and give the VC less time to react when you chuck it at 'em, just select grenades from the inventory and hold down the Right trigger. Keep it held down, watch the timer, and then release the trigger.

men to disarm the booby traps on the bridge, before taking your whole squad across.

To your right you'll find a path that leads to a temple complex. Resist the temptation to take a cruise and head straight into the complex, taking down enemies as you go. On the left you'll find an opening where you'll be given a bonus objective.

Go down the left-hand path and search the first covered area for clues. Guide your team through the arch, then take Cherry and Junior through one of the temple's right-hand entrances. Here you'll find some more enemies and rooftop snipers. Now follow the booby-trapped path on the far right-hand side till you get to a clearing. Jump back to your other team and bring them up their path so that they are at the opposite end of the clearing to Cherry and Junior. Chop down the enemies in the clearing, then lead your team up the rear incline, through the arch and down the first right-hand track, looking out for booby traps. Shoot the distant enemies at the bottom, then keep walking, again wary of any traps. You should find that the right-hand side of the path is the worst for these, so stay left. With Junior bringing up the

rear, inch your team forward, then secure the dugout (just after the pit trap) with Cherry. If you use these cautious tactics till the end of the level, you'll be fine.

CHARLIE'S POINT

Use Ragman's auto-aim function to take out the targets. Make sure you avoid shooting civilians. Once the boats appear, switch to first-person mode and destroy the lead boat. Watch for mines near the first encampment. Destroying these is easiest in first-person mode. When your boat stalls, hold off the enemies while the driver sorts out the engine. Once you're back on the move you'll see trucks dotted around the shore. Your best bet is to switch to first-person mode again and blow up the lead truck, which will stop the other trucks in their tracks. You should be able to take all of the vehicles out easily now but, if you miss any, simply switch to another character and use them to finish the job instead.

At the town, you'll see trucks traversing a bridge. Destroy them all to complete a bonus objective. The boat will stop just before it enters another minefield. Take out the ammo boxes to fulfill another bonus

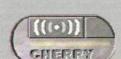

>> objective. When the tank appears, let rip with everything you've got till a chopper comes down to help you out. After this, keep the VC around the boat busy while another helicopter removes the blockade from the canal. The boat will start to move again, but keep firing at the enemy in front of you. Eliminate the remaining foot soldiers and boats at the end of the level. Mission accomplished.

THE SACRED STATUE

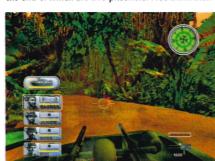
Once you're done chatting to the people in the hut, go outside and talk to the old woman, who'll hand over a crossbow. Head behind the big hut and you'll get some ammo for it. Speak to the old woman at the gate, then follow her. She'll show you some traps, so disarm them before moving on.

She'll ask you to scout ahead. Take Ragman left and knife the guard in the back. Use this stealthy tactic on all of the guards to avoid sustaining injuries. Once all the guards are dead, converge your men on the northern path, and your guide will take you to a ruined temple. As soon as the gate opens, get ready for some serious skirmishing.

Once you've dispatched the first wave of VC, move inside and head left down the passage, two by two. When you reach the courtyard, spread out, then take one of your soldiers left and blow up the ammo dump. Take your team up the stairs. There's ammo in the side room. Once you've stocked up, go in and take out the guards. In the upper-right side of the building is a small room where the VC spawn. Through the central opening are two prisoners to free. Once they're untied, go into the next area in twos, making sure each group covers the other as you work your way through the enemies nearby. Head through the right-hand gate and disarm the booby traps protecting the arms cache.

Go back to the main area and into the next passage that leads to the temple hall. You'll come under heavy attack, so take up defensive positions. While three of your men hold them off, take one soldier to the upper-right side of the main hall and blow up the ammo dump behind the entrance. Grab the statue in the hall and leave via the hall's exit.

You should now be in a complex of tunnels, at the end of which are two prisoners. Free them then

JEWEL THIEF

In the Bad Moon mission, always check fallen enemy soldiers for ammo and collect their dog tags.

ROLL IN THE HAY

If your men catch fire, make them go prone and roll around on the ground, thereby extinguishing the flames. There's no need to panic!

QUICK TOSS

Hit the Black button to throw a grenade quickly and without accessing the inventory. As with the normal method (see Short Cook, page 135), you can still hold the button to 'cook off' the grenade and release to throw

head for the next courtyard. Keeping your men spread out while covering the courtyard is your best bet. Keep Doc hugging the right side and Ragman the left till they reach the VC spawn point at the exit. Now use the same tactics in the next courtyard. You'll find the last fuel dump in the upper-right corner and the last prisoner in the centre of the courtyard, hidden by a large statue. Obliterate the ammo dump and rescue the hostage, then head back into the jungle via the track. Return to the village, keeping an eye out for the odd hostile or two, then chat to the elderly woman to win the day.

Talk to the soldier by the bunker and then scour the compound for supplies. A path will lead you to the outskirts of the camp, where you'll find ammo. Now put Hoss in the middle-left firing position and Ragman and Junior into the middleright one, while Doc speaks with the Major. Once they're done chatting, put Doc with Hoss.

Stand Doc up and make sure no NVA soldiers can throw a grenade, keeping an eye on his health bar. When he's low, switch to another soldier and heal Doc. Repeat this procedure till all the enemies are taken down. It's important to keep at least two of your men alive and kicking at each firing position, as there's a hell of a lot of enemies to deal with here. After much bloodshed, follow the Major to the camp. Inside you'll find the NVA waiting for you.

Lob a grenade into the middle of their ranks, then head right. Round the corner you'll find a mounted machine-gun. Position Ragman and Junior on it, Hoss in the adjacent bunker and Doc at the rear. These positions will keep your men out of range of the numerous explosions and allow you to cover all angles as the enemy attacks.

If for some reason you can't get this tactic to work, then try this instead: place your men in the

ammo bunker, then cover each of the openings between the rocks from which the enemy attacks. There's also a mortar on the hill that's very useful if you can get two of your men to it. If you make sure you cover every angle and keep your men spaced out to avoid group damage from all of the explosions, you should be able to win the day.

RUSSIAN ROULETTE

Tough one, this. At the start of the mission, crouch and hold still. Take control of Doc and pick up the rifle on the floor. Controlling Ragman, head round the back and get the crossbow and ammo. In the rear room you'll find more useful items. Quietly head out of the hut and kill the two guards from behind with a knife. Now jump to the captured soldiers and engage the guards in conversation, then jump to Doc and Ragman and take out the guard by the nearest cell with the crossbow.

Use Hoss to watch the guard in the tower. When the coast is clear, use Ragman's crossbow to kill the guard. When the patrolling guard comes Ragman's way, use the bow again. Find and talk to the caged men, then take the supplies from the nearby hut.

Hug the hut walls and move silently to the next hut. Take the health and grenades. There are more arrows nearby too. Head straight until you see more cages and kill the guard from behind with a knife.

Move to the next area, watching for the patrol. Wait till he turns then take him out with a crossbow bolt. At the edge of the next hut, sneak up behind the guard and knife him. With the guards taken care of, you're now free to search all the huts and track down the keys you need to free the hostages.

When you've released them, look in all the huts and take all the weaponry you can find as well as the spanner, which can be used for repairing your vehicle later on in the mission. Now, steal the jeep from the camp and follow the track, knocking over any enemies that appear.

At the gun emplacement, get out of the jeep and eliminate the gunner, then get back in and drive to the next corner. Get out again and head up the road on foot, disarming mines as you go. Now (you guessed it) get back in the jeep and speed off past the ambush. Round the next corner you'll find more mines, so deactivate them. There'll be more of these dotted along your route so keep an eye on the road.

SOLO SNIPE

Sure, it's a squad game, but sometimes it pays to go it alone When faced with snipers, or other enemy behind solid cover, order your team to hold and press forward to snipe them all out yourself. Saves a load of hassle - and bloodshed!

SLICE O' PIE

Dust off your Rainbow Six skills and 'slice the pie' when clearing huts and other rooms for a better chance of flushing them out and keeping vour team alive

At the hut, get out of the jeep again and pilfer the supplies from the hut, before blowing up the three nearby trucks (hint: there's one behind the hut).

Using the jeep's mounted gun to lay down covering fire, hurtle down the track till you get to a small hill. Get out of the jeep and run up the side of the hill in order to flank the enemies positioned there. Behind the hill is a path you need to follow, and you'll soon stumble across an Australian soldier. Follow him through the river, but get your troops ready for a fight on the other side. If you manage to take out the enemies before all of the SAS soldiers are killed, you'll complete the mission successfully.

TUNNEL RATS

Up ahead is an enemy patrol. Wipe it out then follow the stream. When you see the rocket launcher-packing VC, shoot him with Junior's sniper rifle, then take down the other enemies with the rest of your team. Use Junior's sniper skills again to eliminate the machine-gunner on the hill and then follow the path, watching for flanking enemies. Take the items from the small cave to the left of the swamp, then go into the water, keeping bazookacarrying enemies at bay with Junior's sniper rifle.

Keep following the stream until you get to dry land. Keeping everyone covered, move forward slowly. When you go back into the water, snipe the guard in the tower round the corner. Further up the river, do the same again. When the guard is dead, take the rocket launchers from beneath his tower.

Head round the next corner and stay left as you g creep past the tank and machine-gun nests. When you're close enough to the tank, take it out with a well-placed rocket, while Junior snipes the machinegunners. When all the enemies are dead, secure the tunnel complex entrance. Go inside and when you get to the branching path, take a right, making sure you cover your squad's rear. Along the way, secure each alcove and pick up the health packs in the room. Now go left. You'll soon come to a side-tunnel filled with enemies - eliminate them and leave one of your team here to deal with spawning enemies.

When you reach the field hospital, move inside and pick up health and vital enemy intel. With one soldier, shoot the enemy manning the gun down a nearby tunnel. Return him to the team then take the left-hand tunnel found just in front of the hospital room. There's another enemy spawn point in the room across the bridge, so positioning a soldier here will save you a lot of work. You should now have two soldiers at your disposal. Guide them through the central maze of tunnels and gather the intel from the large command room and the side room.

Now go back to the tunnels and walk across the small bridges found on the left-hand side of the complex. Here you'll find an armoury and more enemy intelligence. Once you've stocked up on equipment, plant explosives in the room by the generator and back at the command room (you >>> >> need to go back across the bridges to do this) and in the storeroom next to the command room.

Return to the field hospital and put some C4 in there. This completes your main mission objective. If you follow the main tunnel and put some explosives in the storage area you come across, you will complete a bonus objective as well. To end the mission, head outside and chat to the ASAS soldier.

BLOODY HUE

Head up the street, setting your men to Fire At Will. When the tank appears, nail it with a rocket, then hug the side of the street and cautiously move up it, making sure you check out all of the buildings as you go. You'll find an ammo cache in the final building on the left-hand side. In the far corner is an alley. Follow it and hook up with the US soldiers. Help them out in their firefight. Putting some men in the alleys will prove a good tactic as there are plenty of enemies to take down here.

Once the enemies are all dead, have a chat with the commander. Before you head off, check the wrecked building nearby for supplies, then saddle up and head off down the street in the tank. Take control of the main gun and be quick to eliminate any enemy tanks you encounter along the way. At the first corner, get ready for the first wave of enemy attacks. A single shell should sort them out. After the corner, go down the hill and destroy the crumbling building at the base of the slope.

Turn the next corner and you'll come face to face with an enemy tank. Face your turret to the

right and head forward. Using auto-aim will help you deal with the enemy armour with relative ease. Once it's a smoking wreck, head past it and go left under the crumbling building where another enemy tank lies in wait for you. Again, point your turret right and, if you're quick, you can destroy it before it even spots you. Head right, left and left again, then turn the turret so it's facing right again in order to quickly eliminate a squad of enemies armed with rocket launchers.

Now get out of the tank and look in the lefthand building where you'll find some equipment and vital info. Hop back into your vehicle, face the turret left and head towards the next corner where another tank lies in wait. Use auto-aim again to destroy it without too much fuss. Now go straight, making sure you take out the hidden enemy in the building as you go round the left-hand corner. When you see the cluster of enemies, make short work of them with a blast from your main turret. Get out of the tank and head for the survivors, before rounding the corner and entering the red smoke.

AIR-MOBILE

A good tip for this mission is to keep your sights fixed on your targets and fire in short, controlled bursts until you destroy whatever it is you're aiming at.

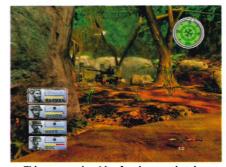
You're in a helicopter. From a first-person view take out the missile batteries (with the men on the left-hand side of the chopper) at the first enemy camp you get to. Now blow up the radar trailers

You get to drive this tank. Pack a spanner in case it takes too many hits.

ONE SHOT

In more confined areas, keep your men spread out. If you bunch 'em up, it only takes a single skilfully thrown grenade or RPG hit to take your whole team out in one fell swoop.

PATCH UP

Make sure you switch characters whenever anyone's health goes below half and heal them. You can't rely on them to help themselves!

LEAD IS DOWN!

With convoys, hit the lead vehicle first and the ensuing wreckage will stop all the others in their tracks. Easy pickings

(with the men on the right-hand side of the chopper) on the cliff ledge and road.

Your next target is a collection of trucks in a valley. Let the rest of your team gun down the enemy soldiers while you concentrate your fire on the vehicles emerging from the caves. Make sure you destroy the truck at the front of the convoy first, as this will halt all the other ones and make them

Next up are some SAM sites (three to be precise) and some more radar trailers, which you'll find in the next valley. Once you have dealt with these, the helicopter will take you to the next waypoint. To complete the mission, simply destroy all of the remaining targets as and when they're presented to you. Easy!

THE CITADEL

Lead all your men to the tank and keep on its right, then head down the right-hand path before it spots you. Ensure your team are out of the tank's line of fire, then take Doc back to the tank. Be sure to keep him close so he can't be fired upon. Rush him into the hut nearest the tank and use the RPG you find there to flank the tank and take it down just make sure the turret isn't facing you and that you're not too close when you let the RPG fly.

With all your men, go to the strange-looking tank, picking up the spanner on your way in. Head down the track and hack down any enemies you come across. Get out at the village, then snipe the machine-gun nest before moving to the first corner.

While Junior and Hoss cover the street, take Ragman and Doc into the side room. Secure each room you come to, then check outside where you should see a tank guarding a gate. Take Doc and Ragman back to your tank and drive it round to the gate and take out the enemy tank. A nearby room holds some useful items, so have a look there before moving to the gate. Watch out for snipers and, when you see them, use Junior to give them a taste of their own medicine.

Go into the courtyard (through the small door) and take out the enemies within. In the room to your right is some important enemy intelligence. Take your squad upstairs and clear the rooms to get some more info.

In the small building adjacent to the mounted machine-gun is yet more enemy intel (check the first and back rooms). To the left of this building is another smaller room with even more Intel, but you'll have to take out the defenders hiding there before you can get your hands on it.

Head back outside and follow the path that leads to some steps. Climb the steps and stop at the courtyard door. You'll see an enemy tank, so take one of your men, armed with an RPG, along

the upper path, which is next to the low wall. Remember, keep low and out of sight. Get round the back of the tank and let fly with the RPG.

Now take your men up behind the tank and arrange them into a defensive formation, then use one of your men to get the attention of the enemies situated in the neighbouring courtyard. When they start charging, rejoin your squad and take the NVA out. Once you've stemmed the flow, go into the courtyard where the enemies came from and mop up the remnants of the resistance there. Go into the yellow building and chuck a grenade into the room on the left, then head in and grab the intel. Finally, go upstairs and throw a grenade into the uppermost room, and if there are still any hostiles breathing, bust a cap in their sorry asses. Congratulations - that's Conflict: Vietnam complete.

Vehicles

M113A1 APC

Capable of amphibious operations in lakes and streams, extended cross country travel over rough terrain, and high-speed operation on roads, the M113A1 APC was a key asset in the Vietnam jungles. Able to transport up to ten men behind its protective armour, and armed well enough to be considered an offensive weapon, it's no wonder that this tracked transport has been in production longer than any other armoured vehicle.

MKII PBR RIVER BOAT

From the start of the war it was clear that whatever side controlled the 3,000 miles of rivers, canals and streams of South Vietnam would have a huge advantage. The MKII PBR (Patrol Boat, River) was developed during the Vietnam War due to the need for a fast, maneuverable water craft. Requiring only two feet of water and packing a heavy punch with its bow-mounted .50 caliber machine-guns, a group of MKII PBRs could rule any waterway they were stationed on.

'GAZ' 69 IEEP

One of the very first Russian-made off-road vehicles, the GAZ Jeep has been modified many times since its 1938 inception. Used by VC forces in the Vietnam War, the GAZ had capable handling in harsh conditions but suffered from regular breakdowns and poor gas mileage. Weapons were often mounted on the back to give it offensive capabilities.

US M48 PATTON TANK

Developed from the M47, the M48 Patton Tank suffered many small problems at first, but constant modification eventually made it the mainstay of the US Army and Marines in Vietnam. The M48 proved to be highly effective at defence and offence, thanks to its thick hull, 105mm cannon, and topmounted .50 caliber machine gun.

UH-1 'HUEY' TRANSPORT HELICOPTER

The most widely used military helicopter in history, Hueys first saw action in Vietnam in 1963. By the war's end, more than 5,000 were put to use for medical evacuations, troop transport, air assault, and as gunships. Particularly noisy when in forward flight due to the advancing rotor blade breaking the sound barrier, the Vietcong at first feared this helicopter's arrival. However, once it was discovered that Hueys could be brought down with small arms fire, the VC's dread quickly disappeared, and the aircraft's usage had to be re-evaluated by the US military.

M50 US ONTOS RECOILLESS RIFLE

Appropriately named (Ontos is Greek for 'thing'), this unusual vehicle has six recoilless rifles mounted in pyramid fashion on a central turret. A disaster in design, the Ontos required the crew to exit the vehicle to reload, which unfortunately wasn't much safer than being in the vehicle thanks to its thin armour. Good mobility was this vehicle's only redeeming feature.
