Sega are claiming that Nights will be bigger than Nintendo's Mario 64. It looks superb, but has it got the muscle to go the distance?

Nights • Saturn • August/September

Night

(responsible for every *Sonic* game you care to imagine) are turning their mighty collective talent to a more challenging machine, the Saturn. Their first title, *Nights* (or *Nights into Dreams* as some are calling it) looks set to do for the Saturn what *Sonic* did for the Mega Drive.

The difference between the two games could not be more obvious. In *Nights*,

you have complete freedom over where you want to go. You can climb over anything, run down hills into

valleys and then climb up the other side to walk along a log bridge. There are 3D sections (like in *Sonic 2*) and some of the most

colourful and original boss design we have ever



seen. The boss of the first level is a giant snake/lizard thing that you fly around and in level two, you confront a round Robotnik-like boss that you have to pick out of the air and throw through walls.

Sega's new brighter, whiter Saturn comes under the spotlight...

Smarting from their initial defeat at the hands of Sony's PlayStation, '96 has seen a revitalised Sega pushing harder and more aggressively than ever before.

Sega are talking with genuine confidence about the next round of Saturn releases and are finally closing in on Sony in terms of machine sales. Sega's universallypraised decision to offer their 32-bit wonder at the price of £250 during April has given it another generous push, and now we have a reengineered Saturn to look forward to. A new colour, a new internal design, and - in Japan at least - a new price. Already launched in the Far East, Sega shipped in incredible 70,000 units in the first four days of release.

A new price in Japan doesn't necessarily change things for the UK, however. Mark Maslowicz at Sega explains: "It costs 20,000 yen in Japan, which is around £125, But you have to remember that in Japan retailers make very little money on hardware. So there's a very small retailer margin, and no VAT — these factors can add thirty or forty percent straight away. Over in the UK we also have to cover import duties and cost of freight."

Sega are keen to play down the importance of the new machine. In the UK, it'll even sport a black case like the original. "The changes are mainly internal," stresses Maslowicz. "The new model is simply much easier to manufacture, and so will enable us to maintain the retail price at £250 beyond April rather than allowing us to lower it any further."

A definite release date has yet to be set, though a September/ October release has been mooted by industry insiders. At the moment, despite calls from high-street retailers, Sony have no plans to revamp their machine or lower the price — opting to stay at £299 and bundle software. But there's no

doubt that a price drop from Sony could force Sega to rethink that £200 price point. Sega are determined not to lose the extra ground that they've gained in the last six months.

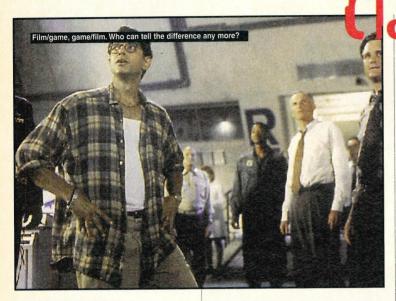
"We know that the tide is turning in our favour" boasts Sega's marketing director Andy Mee. And at the moment, it's hard to doubt him.

Having secured the Olympic licence, US Gold are making the most of it with three games boasting the Atlanta stamp of approval. There are tens of levels of sheer cliffs, pits, crevices, mountains, inaccessible suspended platforms, bubbling lava pools and swamps all impeding the Lemmings in their blind quest to reach safety.

So you have to think how you can best use the Lemming's talents to get you over the daunting hurdles. What do you do when the troops of Lemmings blindly wander off towards a fatal drop? You could either set a Builder in motion to create a stairway to a higher

There are four different cameras to make use of in each of *Lemmings 3D's* challenging levels, all of which can be toggled through quickly and easily. With a clever injection of technology all the cameras hover high above the levels and can move

in all sorts of directions — forwards, backwards, left and right, as well as rotating left and right too. Fortunately you can pause the game and place your cameras in the best positions before the Lemmings kick-start into action.

#### **Camera One**

beat Spain 2-0. England failed to qualify in 1984, and didn't win a game in 1988 or 1992.







Richard Iones, Editor of Total Football magazine, has kindly taken a look at the upcoming Euro Championships this summer, so here's his guide to those teams and games that'll be hot... and those that'll be not.

he European Championships will be the biggest sporting event ever staged in Britain. Bigger than the 1966 World Cup, all the Grand Nationals and Five Nations rugby championships rolled into one. It is going to be IMMENSE.

If you don't like football you will be a gibbering wreck by the time of the Final on June 30. If you do like footy, you'll be in a similar state, such is the overload of round-ball malarkey that

Just about everything you can buy will be Euro '96 branded - burgers, chocolate, crisps, shampoo, beer. If someone hasn't already got the rights to sell Euro '96 toilet paper, I'd be very surprised. And vaguely disappointed

And if one match stands out above all the others in this feast of footy, it's on Saturday, June 15, at Wembley Stadium when, at 3pm, England play Scotland in a match that will probably decide which of the two countries will qualify for the Quarter-Finals. It's probably the biggest match on English soil since England's 1966 World Cup Final victory over West Germany.

The two British teams are in a tough group alongside the much-fancied Dutch - who are built around the nucleus of the fantastic Aiax side - and the Swiss, who performed well in the qualifying groups, but have since lost their English coach Roy Hodgson to Inter Milan.

With Terry Venables' first-choice team still unclear, it's difficult to pick out a star performer for England (other than Gazza) although an inform Paul Ince or Robbie Fowler (if Tel bends to

the mounting pressure to pick him) could be the key to English success. The Scots conceded only three goals in qualifying behind Russia in

Your Chi is the secret to all those lovely Super Combos. The more Chi you earn, the better and stronger your attack will be. You 'get' Chi in four ways. Here they are...

# 1) Hitting your opponent

By far the quickest way of increasing your Super Meter. Attacks that cause damage will increase your Meter faster than attacks that are blocked.

# 2) Performing special moves

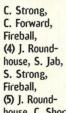

# Fielding



When it's your turn to field, it's imperative that you reset your fielders after every over. The 'off' setup is useful when you want to tempt the batsmen to sling a few into the on side. Assuming you're quick off the mark a catch or run-out is a distinct possibility.



The same applies to most of the other setups. Choose your fielders according to the bowler you're using. If you put in spinners, you're better off tightening the field for the short catch. When you deploy your fast bowlers, you'll want plenty of slip fielders and the rest scattered in the covers and on the boundary.

# **Bowling**



To win a game of cricket you've got to score plenty of runs and take cheap wickets. In Lara '96 this is no easy task. Select a fast bowler and then line the white box against the far stump, or the area

of the wicket which is most clear. Then you must accurately use the power and speed bars – make sure you stop the bar in the red (max) area and then hammer on A to get full speed. Even if you don't take the wicket immediately, the probability is that the batsmen will play a defensive stroke – making it simple to prevent him from scoring runs.

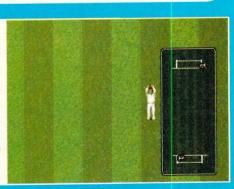

A wide ball costs only one run, and you're only likely to give this away if you place the white box either far left or right. Generally the tighter you play the ball to the stump, the more you chance you have of taking a wicket.

The best way to catch a player out is by bouncing the ball high on a delivery (if you're batting, using B and hitting the ball where the fielders are stood).



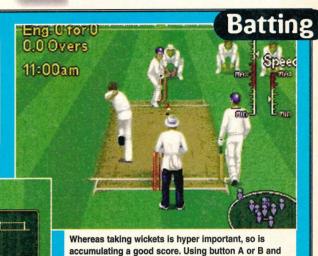
To take wickets you must pitch the ball right at the stumps and get the correct speed and power on the gauges – shown in the screenshot. If you're more than two steps out on the power gauge, don't use loads of speed otherwise they'll hit you for a six.

To take a wicket, pitch the white box right on the edge of the left or right stump. You can change the bowling makes things

easier (and it might confuse the batsman) but make sure you get the speed and power right.



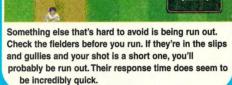
Taking a wicket with a spin bowler is tad more tricky. Bring in the fielders so they're close to the wicket and pitch the ball just in front of the

crease line using appropriate spin or swing. Deploying spin bowlers is a great way to restrict the opposing teams scoring rate. Again, stopping the gauge in the max zone will give you ultimate spin - making the ball more effective.

Fast bowling only works if you're accurate. If not, the opposing team (especially if



it's the computer) will score centuries galore. You also run the risk of bouncing the ball over the batsman's head.



against a fast ball will enable you to play lofted stroke. If there's enough pace on the ball you should be able to get a four or possibly a six. Button A is used mainly for ground and defensive strokes, but assess the power of the incoming ball before attempting any shot. Lara '96 is just like real cricket in that timing is of the absolute essence. Mis-time your shot and you run the danger of being caught or given LBW. As soon as the ball lands on the white box, press button A or B depending on the shot you intend to play.

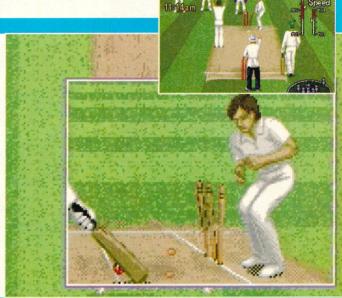

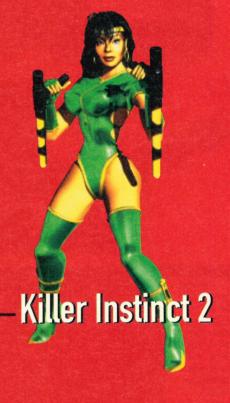

A slip of concentration will still cost you dear, mind. To run after you've hit a shot press A and be as quick as you can. If you don't think you can make more than one run, stay where you are. To often you can be run out for being greedy.

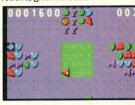

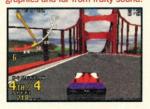

## ...Guide to buying Mail Order

#### TEN STEPS TO SAFETY

When you're buying from any mail order company, it's worth following these Sega Power guidelines:

- BEFORE YOU send any money, ring the supplier to make sure the item you require is in stock. Ask questions about the company's policy on delivery and returns of faulty equipment. Make sure there are no hidden costs such as postage and packaging. Find out when you can realistically expect to receive your goods.
- 2 ALWAYS READ the small print on adverts.
- 3 BEWARE companies that do not include their address on their adverts. Also, avoid companies that do not answer or return your calls.
- 4 BY FAR the best method of payment is by credit card. If ordering goods of more than £100 in total value remember that you are legally entitled to claim compensation from some credit companies if the retailer goes bust. Check your credit card company's policy. You can also try to get extra insurance in advance if you want.
- 6 IF YOU'RE not paying by credit card, pay by cheque. Never send cash and avoid using postal orders.
- 6 KEEP records. If you are buying by credit card, keep a note of the order and ask for an order number. When ordering anything over the telephone, always double-check the price.
- 0 IF YOU are sending a cheque, keep a note of the cheque number, the date and the exact value. Make sure you know the exact name of the mail order company.
- 8 WHEN YOU receive your goods, check them carefully. If anything is missing or faulty, contact the supplier immediately.
- 0 ALWAYS ORDER from the most recent issue of Sega Power.
- 0 IF A PROBLEM does arise, contact the supplier in the first instance. Calmly and politely tell them your problem. Most problems turn out to be minor hitches or misunderstandings that can easily be resolved. If you think you have a genuine grievance, contact your local Trading Standards Officer.
