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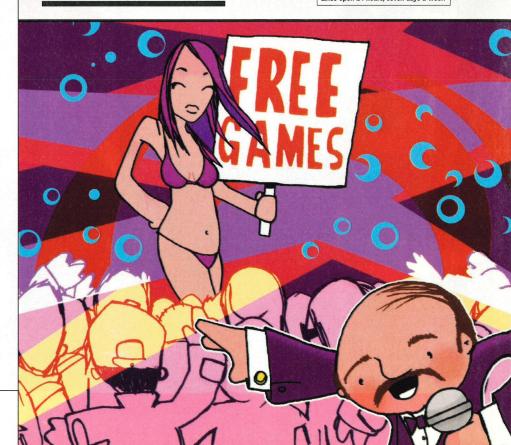
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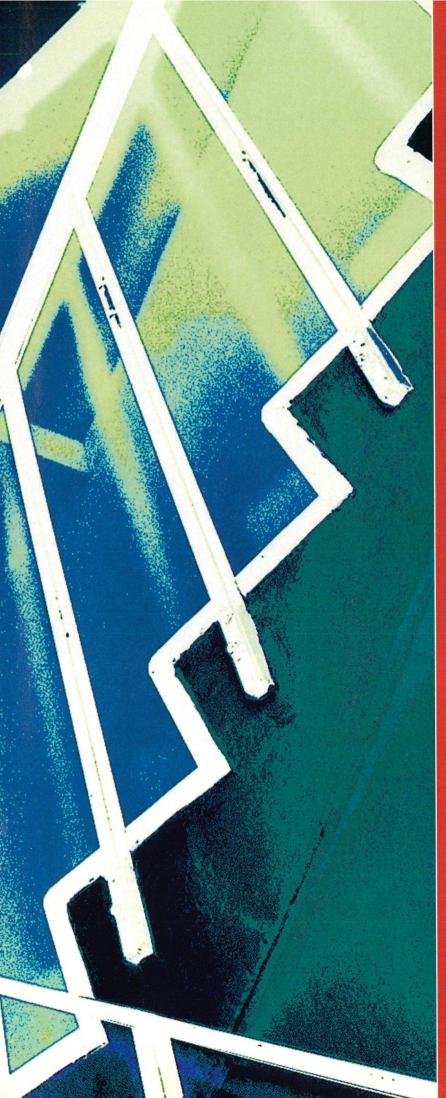
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THE MANAGER SHOOT

This month's greatest gaming moment: doing the splits in **SPLINTER CELL**

Not afraid of the dark are you? Let's hope not, because it's where you will be spending most of your time in *Splinter Cell*. With every risk-dodging, idea-starved developer trying its hand at stealth it's getting increasingly hard to remember why we got excited about sneaking around in the first place. The answer, of course, lies lurking in the shadows.

Once you're over the lighting effects (which are almost absurdly pretty) what really impresses is the sense of being there: behind enemy lines, crouched in the dark and very much on your own. One-man-against-the-world might be the oldest yarn in gaming, but it has never felt as lonely as this. Modestly armed (by modern standards) Sam Fisher must overcome the enemy using a combination of guts and gadgetry, but his most potent weapon is the dark itself.

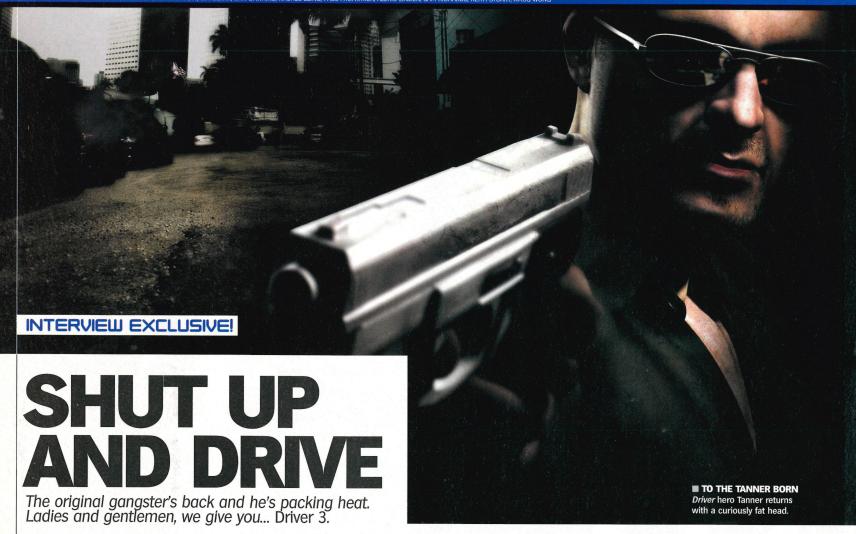
Shoot out the strip lights, flick on your nightvision and the shift in power is palpable. The patrolling guards are rightly nervous, all too aware that something's waiting for them. Of course, little do they know that you're actually perched a few feet overhead, legs straining against the walls, sights hovering over the back of their heads. He's clearly got thigh muscles like a Ukrainian shot-putter, but we'll have to wait until next month's review to find out whether Sam Fisher really is the new Solid Snake. For now, though, you've got to admire his balls.

AT FIRST GLANCE, Driver 3 could be a scene from Michael Caine's classic heist movie *The Italian Job.*Not only does the keenly-anticipated trequel let you rattle around in a vintage mini, you can literally blow the bloody doors off. That's 'hinge technology' for you, and one of the reasons why developer Reflections potential *Getaway*-beater might be the most filmic, effortlessly playable gangster experience on PS2.

The original *Driver* was released in 1999 on PSone and was the first free-roaming driving game set in an

autonomous 3D city. **ALERT!** We've heard The sequel, released verified whispers in 2000, let you that the 'other walk about and game Reflections steal motors as you working on is a sequel to saw fit - arguably Stuntman paving the foundations for GTAIII. Three years on, the legacy reaches fruition.

Reflections has taken the realistic physics of *Stuntman* – its technically impressive PS2 debut – and stuffed them in a bustling 3D

city packed with traffic and chattering pedestrians. Even at this early stage, *OPS2* had great fun just handbraking around sharp bends, whilst marvelling at the independently modelled suspension as the tyres struggled to keep a grip on the road. There are no licensed cars, just nudge-wink tributes – including Lamborghinis, open top Cobras and transit vans.

"The advantage of the physics is that it makes getting involved in car chases realistic and fun even before you start a mission," explains Martin Edmondson, Founder of Reflections, as he demonstrates smashing a car into a crumpled shell, then driving over the detached bumper and sending it clattering in the opposite direction. "One of the famous things about *Driver* was that people would play Take A Ride mode for 10-15 minutes after the pub."

So what's this hinge technology, then? Edmondson presses a button causing the car doors to click open. Reversing sharply, the doors bellow wide, reacting with true independent

physics. Theoretically, you could pop the locks and reverse at speed using the doors as battering rams to knock down unsuspecting pedestrians. This technology is further demonstrated in a mission that involves stealing an articulated lorry, complete with trailer. Edmondson shows the lorry in action, braking hard to compensate for the vehicle's momentum. As he tries not to make it jacknife and flip over, steaming tyre marks are left on the tarmac. Teasingly, it's suggested that you can load the lorry with stolen cars, akin to the movie thriller Gone In Sixty Seconds.

The plot is a secret, but it explores darker themes. Edmondson divulges, "Around 70 percent of your time will be spent in car chases, with the remainder on foot," The plot will be more linear than *Vice City.* "We're striving for a level of emotional involvement that can get lost when there are too many sub plots and side missions." All we know is that main man Tanner returns, moving between Miami, Nice and Istanbul (see Location, Location).

There's a big addition to this game in the form of guns... lots of guns. Tanner can now amass weapons and blow chunks out of the destructible environments. "They're basically fun guns, we're not keeping an eye on every last bullet," Edmondson reveals, "Driver 3 isn't a stealthy game, it's not a sniper game. It's a bit like The Matrix - you walk in there with two Mach 10 machine guns and spray everything with bullets, then you chuck them away and do the same again." The targeting system combines autoaim and manual elements, so you can strafe around like a first-person shooter. "We want it to be like second nature," says Edmondson, "so it's 'bang, he's dead, boomp, he's dead...' you can point the gun without being pin sharp."

At this early stage, *Driver 3* falls between *The Getaway's* gritty realism and *Vice City's* bite-sized anarchy. There's still a lot of development to go, but if the components are stitched together seamlessly, this can be one of 2003's best games.

Mission In Action

What's Tanner up against? We grill Martin Edmondson for first details.
"The mission objectives are fixed, but there will be multiple ways to complete each task. Buildings will have multiple entrances, so you can make the game easy or hard for yourself depending on your approach. Inquisitive gamers will be expected to the first transfer of the second rewarded for finding short cuts, such as ventilation ducts or hidden entrances. For example, in one mission you need to take out a guy living in the Stiltsville area of Miami – a city built entirely on the water. You can either wade in all-gunsblazing, steal an enemy car and drive past the guards unnoticed or swim towards the house from a safe location."





The coastal city was in the original Driver, so Reflections is reclaiming its turf. The level is based on real-life streets, including landmarks like the Beacon Hotel. Tanner should be able to drive through lapping waves and steal boats.



The most advanced level, packed with winding backstreets and steep inclines, in contrast to London's blocky streets. In one mission, you'll take part in a climactic warehouse gun battle, as the city square teems with pedestrians.



The final location, offering a brutal contrast of decadent palaces and crumbling shanty towns Reflections suggests you'll be able to look into glass-fronted buildings at people inside. In each city, you can just sit and watch the world go by. 5PY

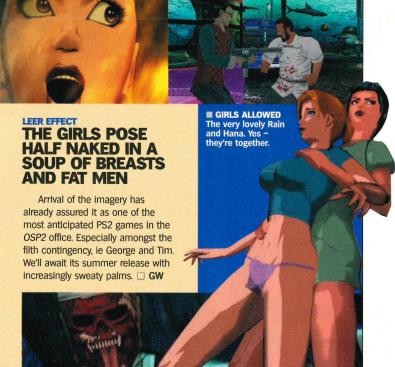
Hotter than the sun! First Fear Effect 3 details.

LADY LOVE IS a subject seldom broached in the world of games. But as games that were once meant for kids becomes more targeted at adults, it was only a matter of time before a PS2 title starred a pair of lipstick lesbians. Before you start shaking your head and tutting (just like we did, of course) hear this: their sapphic desire isn't just for titillation, it's a major motivation of the plot of Fear Effect 3 from Kronos. No, really, it is.

The LA-based developer has already sullied the PSone with explicit gore, violence and sexuality in two previous incarnations of the Fear Effect series – Fear Effect and Fear Effect 2: Retro Helix, a prequel. This latest instalment takes place two years after Fear Effect and

follows the adventures of Rain Quin, Hana Tsu-Vachel, Jacob 'Deke' Dacourt and Royce Glas as they attempt to murder the evil boss of The Triad – Minx – who has threatened to kill Rain if her girlfriend (Hana) stops working for him. That's true love for yau...

As you can see from these early images and screens, the girls have lost none of their allure, happy to pose half-naked in front of a bloody soup of breasts and fat men. Screens show a 2D look for the characters laid over a 3D background, giving a striking visual style. Kronos promises to interweave this with more heart-stopping action and a sophisticated combat system with distinctive combos, finishing moves and grapples.

DEATH AND THE MAIDEN

Clock Tower 3 raises a few eyebrows.

DEVELOPED BY SUNSOFT and published by Capcom, *Clock Tower 3* is sure to rile the censors when it arrives here in the Summer. Set in London, the game features Alyssa Hamilton, a schoolgirl uncovering the dark secrets of her family. Playing like a spooky mixture of *Project ZERO* and *Silent Hill*, a tangible sense of fear is brilliantly conveyed by the haunting soundtrack and dark, moody visuals.

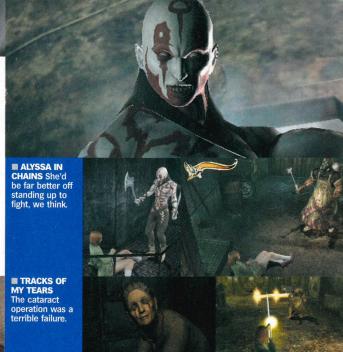
The game's most interesting aspect is in its reliance on wits and evasion instead of confrontation. During a recent playtest for example, Alyssa could duck behind scenery to avoid her ghostly enemies.

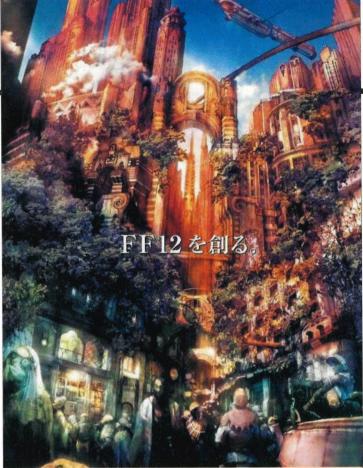
Slightly troubling though, is the casting of a 15-year-old girl in a school uniform as the main protagonist, considering the horrors to which she's exposed. In one explicit scene, a man drags a young girl along by her hair, then smashes her head in with a large hammer. Too distasteful for European palettes? We'll soon see.











FANTASTIC VIEW

Square asks, "Can you guess what it is yet?"

WE ALWAYS KNEW that *Final Fantasy XII* was inevitable – it was just a question of time. While one team at Square is devotedly putting the finishing touches to FFX-2 [the first 'proper' *Final Fantasy* sequel] before starting work on *FFX*-3, another group of Square stalwarts are firing up the dev kits and sharpening their crayons in anticipation of the twelfth episode of the *FF* saga.

So, what has the RPG giant produced so far? One, solitary poster to advertise that the game exists. And it's just like Square to tease us with a cryptic collage of imagery that bears resemblance to everything from the *Star Wars* planet of Naboo to *Blade Runner*, *The Fifth Element*, and an anime called *Metropolis*.

What will the finished game be like? That's like speculating when *Tomb Raider* is coming out − we haven't the foggiest. But we can reveal that a video of *FFXII* may appear on the disc of *FFX-2* when it's released in Japan this March. □ **GW**

What everyone is talking about this month...

THE BIG ISSUE

HOW DO YOU GET A JOB MAKING PS2 GAMES?

Thanks to the soaraway success of PlayStation 2, snagging a cool role in game development is a kudos-rich result. If you want to wheedle your way into one of gaming's more glamorous or just plain jammy jobs, pay attention.

The toe-in-the-door position is games tester. But you'll have to rigorously test every element of the game, often trying boring bits repeatedly to ensure the code doesn't crash. Plenty of gameplaying experience is essential, as is some technical acumen – you'll need to report bugs to the programmers. Tony Ciniglio, a tester at Lionhead says, "The best places to try are the big publishers like EA or Eidos." Many developers also take on people for work experience.

To model 3D graphics, you'll need experience with a 3D

art package. 3D Studio Max is the industry standard, but it's expensive – you can get much cheaper, basic ones on the Net

(www.blender.nl) that are good enough to show your ability. Meanwhile, some studios employ concept artists to design characters and locations on paper, creating the look of the game. For this role, a foundation course in art is useful, as is a bulging portfolio of your work in variety of mediums. Ian Pestridge, Creative Manager at Blitz Games says, "CV sifters would much rather see a design for a Ninja DJ than a render of a bowl of fruit. Build an idea. Put your concepts down on paper – preliminary renders, icons, logos, characters, story – unload your brain onto the page."

Game design is what every gamer thinks they can do, but there's more to it than scribbling a few ideas down. You need to be technically minded and confident enough to communicate your ideas in detail, often in design documents the size of Victorian novels. "Use one of the many level creation tools for PC FPS games, for technical and practical experience," says Katie Lea, a Lead Designer at Studio Cambridge.

ARMY OF DARKNESS

OPS2 goes hands-on with Chaos Legion.

IN ADDITION TO its *DMC*-like Gothic styling and generous helping of enemies, our first hands-on with Capcom's *Chaos Legion* revealed that the Legions – creatures that swordsman Sieg Wahrheit can call upon to assist in battle – add a surprising amount to the fairly simplistic hack 'n' slash gameplay.

Downing enemies allows Sieg to summon seven different types of Legion, each offering extra tactical options. The two we saw were the Archers, who allow for distance attacks, and a giant creature with serious extra brawn. Their actions can be controlled with simple button-presses – a flick of selection switches between offence and defence while selections.

It's still a way off – expected here in the Autumn – but Chaos Legion looks promising. More soon. \square AL



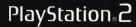

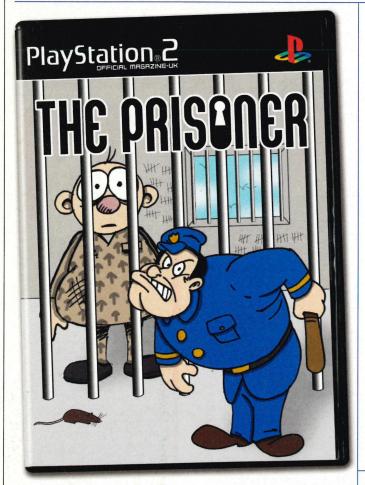

Obviously we'll try to maintain some sense of perspective, but we reckon Namco's weapon-based beat-'em-up is the best fighting game of all time [and of course we'll fight anyone who says otherwise].

Electronic Arts has finally confirmed that it will be bringing the home version of Soul Calibur II to the UK, hopefully to coincide with the US release this August. The PS2 version comes complete with secret character Heihachi Mishima, the 75-year-old psycho who's been whupping asses in Tekken, Namco's other major fight franchise. And get this: Heihachi is so hard, he's not even bothering with a weapon. Take a look at the shots and you'll see him slugging it out bare-fisted against the delectable Ivy (she's the one with the porcelain bum cheeks, in case you were wondering). Oh, and that unsavoury-looking fellow at

the top of the page is Necrid.

Designed by Todd MacFarlane productions (best known for creating *Spawn*) he's the other new character set to make his debut on PS2.

Fight fans will already know that when Soul Calibur made the transition from arcade to DC, Namco created a mammoth suite of extra modes, and you can expect the same thing from the sequel. Arcade, Versus, Team Battle, Time Attack and Survival modes are all present and correct, but the real killer is the inclusion of the Weapon Master mode. This is a reworked version of the brilliant Edge Master mode found in the original Soul Edge on PSone, which enabled players to travel the world, building up an arsenal of different weapons from defeated opponents.

Soul Calibur II hits the shops in Japan at the earlier date of 27 March. You can guarantee we'll be sending our man in Tokyo straight down the local WonderGoo for our own private copies – of course, we'll let you know all about it in Monitor when the time comes.

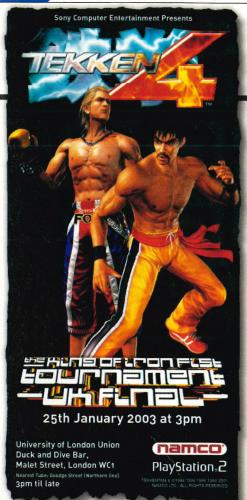

OPS2 cruises for a bruising at the muscle-flexing finals of the UK Tekken 4 Championships.

AFTER A GRUELLING series of regional finals held in Virgin Megastores around the country, 16 contenders for The King Of Iron Fist Tekken 4 UK final emerged. The cream of beat-'em-up talent met at the University Of London Union to battle it out for a £1,000 prize, the right to call themselves UK King Of The Iron Fist and a place in the international final.

In a series of bouts where frank exchanges of opinion were common the 16 hopefuls were reduced to eight for the knockout competition. To the crowd's surprise, last year's champ, Ryan Hart, was disposed of by newcomer Eze Elzundo, despite his arrogant performances in the group stage. Controversy surrounded the eventual finalists Michael O'Hara and Robert Cunningham as they were both late additions to the tournament having being brought in late to replace two no-shows.

The final, fought between Jin (O'Hara) and Heihachi (Cunningham), was first to five. O'Hara was quick to take the initiative capitalising on some slack defence. Despite being level (2-2) at one stage, O'Hara found his stride and from round five there was no turning back - it was over in less than four minutes with three wins back-to-back

The standard of competition was high. These guys proved that to be an expert at Tekken you need to do more than just bash buttons and learn a few combos - that's 10strings and 12-strings and plenty of tactical blocking. So, how did O'Hara feel about being the UK's King Of Iron Fist? "Amazing," he told OPS2, clutching his £1,000 cheque. "I never expected to win." Any messages for the international competitors? Codemasters' pacy racer drives OPS2 loopy.

WHILE SAMPLING THE star-strewn turf of Club Football up at Codemasters' HQ this month, we were also able to take a sneaky peak at one of the company's other titles for the coming year - Indy Racing League. The game is a blisteringly fast take on the popular US motor sport in which up to 33 cars simultaneously take to the looped tracks, often resulting, as we found out, in some spectacular pile-ups.

What initially impressed, apart from the tear-inducing speed, was the crash physics in which shards of carbon fibre bodywork shower the tracks and wheel arches crumple inwards resulting in uncontrollable wheel locks. The graphics are also dazzlingly authentic with intricately-textured track surfaces complete with trackside fence shadowing and no pop-up - although the latter isn't perhaps so impressive given the oval course designs.

Add in some stylish TOCA Race Driver TV-style presentation, tension-building commentary and a multitude of engaging modes, not least the Indy 500 in its gruelling entirety, and Indy Racing League is looking like it could prove a success on both sides of the pond when it is released this Spring.

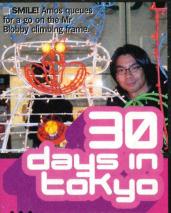

WITH TOKYO'S WINTER temperatures killing any desire for outdoor sports, we check out two games that may help to thwart encroaching extra pounds over the season. In the PS2 corner is Namco's popular Taiko No Tatsujin, a musical percussion game with 24 tracks ranging from J-pop and anime themes to classical genres. Funkily presented with simple and cute graphics, gameplay involves bashing the solidly built Tatacon to the music's beat, as indicated by various icons. We pick Osakana Tengoku (er, Fish Heaven) a hit pop ditty that can also be heard blaring out at the local supermarket promoting the benefits of eating fish. On Easy mode it's a breeze to clear. We madly

GAMING HIGH

Gaming dietary supplements put to the test.

LET'S GET ONE thing straight – drugs are bad. Really bad. And in no way does *OPS2* advocate pill popping unless it's to clear up a nasty headache. But when we found out an American pharmaceuticals company had begun marketing a food supplement that could actually aid your gaming prowess, we had to investigate.

Nevada-based company Mind FX manufactures 'mental performance enhancement supplements' called Maxx Impulse. The pills, looking not unlike large animal droppings, are supposed to 'boost your game to a new level of excellence'. Being responsible types (most of the time) we felt a controlled test was necessary to evaluate the claims of the company to see if the turd-

coloured lozenges had any effect whatsoever on our gaming ability.

Well, we say 'our', what we actually mean is Features Ed Paul (from here in known as Lab Rat). He's the only animal in the building brave/stupid enough to put something in his mouth that came out of a packet with the words 'highgrade Metabromine' written on it.

So, did they make him any good at *Pro Evolution Soccer 2*, a game he has confessed to being rubbish at? Did they improve his lap times in *Burnout 2*, a game he's actually very good at? Did they make him boss-eyed? Did he spew? And, most importantly, did they turn his piss green? All is revealed in our special *OPS2* chemistry test. \square **GW**

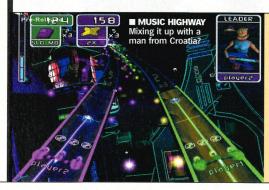

WHEN HARMONIX'S FREQUENCY

was released last year it carved a small but dedicated niche for UK beat freaks starved of rhythm action ever since they got bored with Rez and cashed it in for a dance mat.

SCEA has recently announced a sequel, subtitled *Amplitude*. Early screens show a more chunky and detailed look to the game space and instead of operating from within a rotating tunnel, the music tracks exist on a kind of divided highway that changes direction as you glide through the environments. And, get this: it's online compatible! Either compete to create the cleanest track against three other players or team up with someone to co-remix a tune. We're almost certain that this title will be released after PS2 goes online in Europe.

WITH THE VIDEOGAMES landscape increasingly dominated by large publishers sustained by lucrative franchises. Liverpool-based publisher/ developer Rage Software has had to

call in the receivers, bringing an end to its ten years in the industry.

Ironically, Rage had just notched up a relatively lucrative Christmas period thanks largely to its biggest hit for some time, boxing title Rocky (OPS2#27, 7/10). But this festive lift proved insufficient to counter the damage to the company's bottom line caused by projects like Crashed. David Beckham's Soccer and Twin Caliber, On 15 January The Bank Of Scotland withdrew Rage's banking facilities while accountants from Ernst And Young were brought in with the aim of finding a buyer for the publisher/developer as quickly

as possible. Sadly, this proved impossible in the short term. In part, this is due to potential legal complications surrounding the sale of the very licences that could have produced further Rocky games.

In a press release, Hunter Kelly, a spokesman for Ernst And Young said. "These [complications] were such that not only were they impossible to overcome within the time scale, but there was no guarantee these issues could be resolved to meet the terms of the offers being made, and there was the danger that proposed sales would have resulted in a net loss to the company and its creditors."

And so, with only 17 of its 155 employees retained purely to sell the company's assets, Rage's projects, including inline skating title Rolling (due out in March) are frozen.

And while we're on the subject of realism, we've just about got used to being told that the USA won the war, but are we really supposed believe that the whole American strategy hinged on the combat readiness of one solitary soldier? Thank God Jimmy Patterson didn't get chilblains or we'd all be fully paid up members of the Nazi Party by now.

And there's another thing. What's with game journos saying "The D-Day landing mission in Frontline blah blah, stunning evocation, harrowing combat blah blah?" You know this how exactly? Whatever real warfare is actually like, you can be sure it's more stressful than sitting in front of a TV with the fondant fancies just out of reach.

"But, Mr Butcher. It's a game! It's supposed to be fun!" Too right. So for the love of God, let's dump the hypocritical pretence that these are interactive 'history' lessons and let's have a screaming nu metal soundtrack, genetically engineered chimp armies and experimental plasma weapons. What? Wolfenstein you say?

espite painstakingly exhaustive studies into playing videogames and aggressive behaviour, experts are still yet to prove there is a link between the two.

After the US Surgeon General completed its most extensive US government review on youth and violence it could only conclude, "The impact of videogames on violent behaviour remains to be determined."

Stumped

Elsewhere, the Government of
Australia found a very similar result in
its equivalent research commenting,
"The accumulating evidence –
provided largely by researchers keen
to demonstrate the games' undesirable
effects – indicates that it is very hard to
find such effects and that they are
unlikely to be substantial."

Even UK Minister For Culture Kim Howells, during an attack on what he called the "pornography of violence" in games like GTA: Vice City and The Getaway, was forced to admit, "I don't

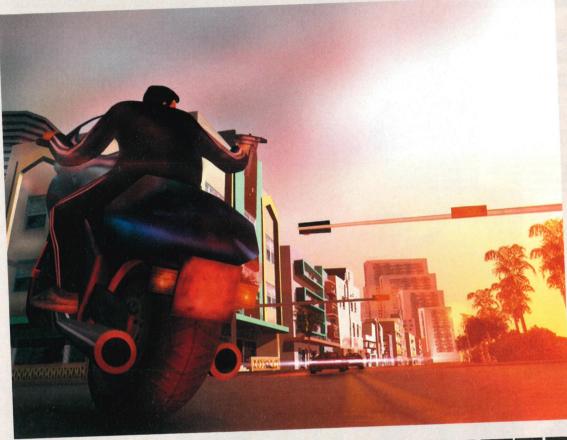
think a child is going to be a killer or more violent as a consequence of playing those games." He admitted that despite such games coming with an 18 classification from the BBFC, he still allowed his children to play them.

Indeed, A-Team hero and 'hardest man in the world', Mr T went on the record saying videogames actually prevented street violence. "If every kid in the hood is playin'," he told *OPS2*, "they won't have time for drive-bys, 'cos you need both hands on the game."

Perhaps this kind of evidence will eventually persuade governments to spend more money on preventing real crime instead of commissioning pointless studies on the supposed detrimental effects of violent videogames on society.





VICE CITY NOMINATED FOR DESIGN AWARD

ockstar's ultra-violent crime sim GTA: Vice City has been nominated for a £25,000 prize in a Designer Of The Year award.

The competition will reward 'The UK designer or design team which made the biggest contribution to design in 2002'. *Vice City* goes up against a series of jewellery designs by Solange Azagury-Partridge, a chandelier created for Swarovski crystal by Tord Boontje and Apple's iPod and iMac designs.

The game will be exhibited at the Design Museum (London) from March, but only in an unplayable DVD form with all the explicit violence removed – odd, considering this was one of the main features that made the game so successful in the first place. Instead, visitors to the exhibition will be invited to read an explanation of the *Grand Theft Auto* design ethos. Other games from Rockstar's back catalogue will, however, be available to play.



Videogames mean more to the UK economy than video rental and the cinema box office, according to a report on the videogame industry by Screen Digest. Furthermore, the value of UK-produced videogame exports has exceeded both British film and television. This is cemented by the news that 2002 saw hardware and videogame sales reaching an all-time high with a value of £2 billion in this country.

This was partly thanks to the phenomenal success of games like GTAIII, GTA: Vice City and The Getaway. Both Grand Thefi Auto titles sold a million copies in the UK, with GTA: Vice City continuing to top the sales charts. SCEE's multi-million pound crime epic The Getaway shifted some 300,000 units in just two weeks.

VIDEOGAMES CAN STIMULATE, SAY SPECIALISTS

overnment education and technology agency BECTA has reported that mainstream videogames have positive learning benefits.

The report stated that, "Teachers found that the use of games could provide motivation, develop skills and encourage collaboration.

"The motivating power of games and their ability to encourage co-operation were felt to support the works of schools in developing, independent but social individuals," it continued.

The report mentioned the life simulation game *The Sims*, recently released for PS2, as helping students develop ICT skills as well as encouraging team work, decision making, creativity and problem solving.

Other organisations currently seeing the positive

benefits of videogames included The National Reading Campaign, which believes games are a good way of persuading young people to read. The group's Manager, Genevieve Clark, commented that, "If children see a film or a videogame that's based on a book, they think about reading it. This has certainly been the case with Tolkien's *The Lord Of The Rings*."

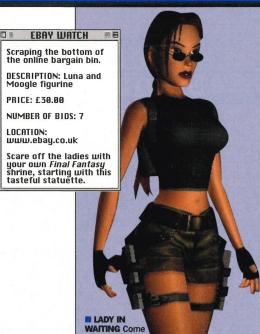

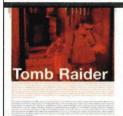

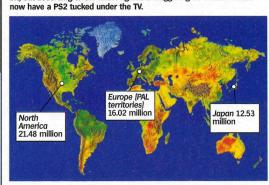

SPEAK YOUR MIND

AS BOB HOSKINS once told the nation with great sincerity, "It's good to talk." Don't worry, we're not trying to sell you a new phone line and we haven't turned into a mobile phone magazine - it's just one phrase that springs to mind when looking at two new game offerings from SCEI released this month in Japan. Operator's Side and DekaVoice both utilise voice recognition technology that allows you to partially control the game with your dulcet tones.

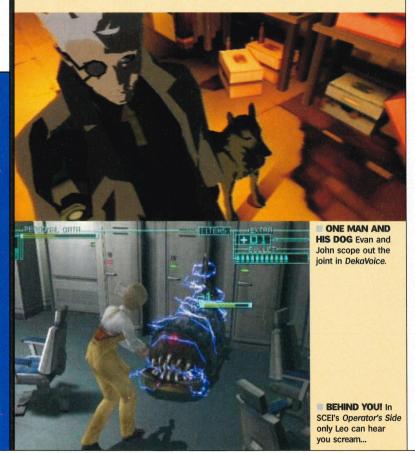
It's not strictly a new concept - SCEA's online SOCOM: US Navy SEALs comes complete with a Logitech headset (think Britney Spears' hands-free microphone) for giving out commands to your SEALs team and communicating in online games. Even Taito's dreadful football sim International League Soccer was packaged with a headset allowing players to shout things like 'pass', 'shoot' and 'not there!' with mixed results.

The difference with Operator's Side and DekaVoice's VR capability is that it's an integral part of the gameplay. In Operator's Side you give instructions to a waitress (Leo) trapped on a spaceship that's been attacked by aliens. By watching her via CCTV cameras you can tell her to shoot, reload and run while investigating the ship, searching for weapons and other items.

In the cel-shaded film noir world of DekaVoice - all soprano sax infused jazz and Dick Tracy comic stylings - players star as a Detective called Evan alongside his wheelchair-bound buddy Raphin, and Eli, his feisty driver. Evan can communicate with them both to help solve the various crimes the game throws at him. Evan also has a dog, John, who he can command vocally. And, for those with £1,200 to spare, if you plug one of Sony's AIBO robo dogs into your PS2 it will respond with various actions.

Currently, Operator's Side is only available in Japan, but DekaVoice was always planned for a UK release, tentatively pencilled in for September 2003. It may be a technology that's slow to gain acceptance but OPS2 reckons talking to your console is destined to become commonplace in many next-generation games.

NAUGHTY BEARD

We ask, "Where the hell did that game get to?" And a developer

Tomb Raider: The Angel Of Darkness No surprises here. Tomb Raider's new, slightly nebulous release date is 'early in the fourth quarter of this financial year'. So think early May. According to Eldos CEO, Mike McGarvey, "The game will benefit substantially from the marketing of the new Lara Croft movie, Tomb Raider: The Cradle of Life." In other words, the game still isn't finished.

MORTAL KOMBAT BLOKE!

BOON

Trading bloody blows with the Producer of Mortal Kombat.

The MK series has built itself on shock factor and grisly fatalities. Is this the main attraction of MK:DA?

Gore and guts isn't such a major factor as it once was. Since the original, there's been more shocking content in other games than that seen in MK. We've tried to focus more on the fighting mechanics. That, and introducing the multiple fighting styles and weapons.

You've introduced new characters, too. How difficult was it to decide who to include in the finished article?

It's always hard because we have nearly forty existing characters. At some point we have to decide who makes the cut and, at the same time, introduce as many new characters as possible. Our big decision was to kill off Liu Kang which, y'know, was like killing off Luke Skywalker!

How closely did you research the different fighting styles?

Very extensively. Two designers on the team - Carl Spacina and Nigel Kacey ordered videos and did a lot of Internet research of over sixty fighting styles. They tried to take the best components of each and distribute them amongst the characters. We wanted to make them as different as possible in order to ensure there was enough variety.

How do you think MK compares to other beat-'em-ups on the market?

Games like Tekken 4 are more like fighting 'simulators' with human movements and human abilities, whereas we lean more towards the supernatural. Plus nobody can bleed as much blood as we have in our games. That separates us and gives us our own kind of niche - we're really trying to go to the extreme.

What weren't you able to include in MK:DA that you'd have liked to?

I personally would want to see damage on whole bodies, torn clothing and more sophisticated presentation - camera cuts. dramatic theatrical staging, maybe even synching the music with the fighting.

Any future plans to put MK online?

The idea of having worldwide tournaments where you can fight online and become

the greatest fighter in the world is very appealing. The only problem is getting a connection that is fast enough because of the sensitivity of the subject matter - it's such a twitch-related game. If there is any lag in a fighting game then you're gonna really feel it.

How surprised are you that the game reached a million sales in the United States so quickly?

We were always pretty positive that the game would eventually sell a respectable number of games, but we never guessed it would pass a million units so fast. Now the question everyone is asking is, "How long before we cross the two million mark?"

So how's the beard coming along?

WHAT THE HELL IS... .HACK?

The skinny on Bandai's perplexing anime crossover hit.

LAUNCHING IN JAPAN simultaneously with a TV anime series, OAV (original animation video) series and comic, the multimedia game project .hack (pronounced 'dot hack') is populated by four different casts and story lines. Set in the near future, a popular online game known as The World serves as the element that unifies them. Here's a brief rundown of key events in the .hack timeline.

■ 2005 The world's Internet is closed down for an hour by a virus called Pluto's Kiss causing general chaos.

■ 2006 The Internet is replaced by a new operating system called ALTMIT that quickly becomes the world's new communications standard. Online gaming is all but banned.

■ 2007 As an exemption by the governing body, a network game known as The World is announced in November 2007. It

becomes an instant hit and eventually attracts 20 million players.

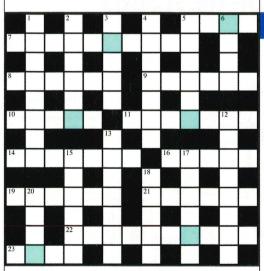
The various stories of the .hack universe occur both in the real world and the game's world. While the casts share a similar appearance thanks to the predetermined character classes, their users and names are different. The TV series .hack//SIGN is primarily set within The World and focuses on a sorcerer, Tsukasa, who finds himself unable to log out of the game. The phenomenon is not an isolated case; investigating the mystery is Bear, an older swordsman who helps new players. Joining Tsukasa in the cast are youngsters such as the independent Mimiru and axe-wielding heroine Subaru.

The four-part game is set after these events. We discover that players are falling into comas and protagonist Kite sets out to uncover the reason. Black Rose, like Bear in .hack//SIGN, helps a friend who cannot log out. Included on a separate disc is the OAV .hack//Luminality, which is set in the real world and depicts the lives of various other players of the game.

Volume three is the latest .hack game on release in Japan. Available since mid December, it has shifted over 133,000 units so far. Last, but not least, the comic .hack//Tasogare No Udewa Densetsu takes place four years after the now legendary events and characters depicted in the PS2 game's story. It features a pair of younger protagonists, Shugo and Rena, who win characters modelled after Kite and Black Rose respectively to use in the game. They log on to The World and go adventuring in the footsteps of their heroes. The comic has in turn spawned an anime spin-off, now airing in Japan.

Paradox's game follows a familiar career-based structure with your character battling a number of real-life personalities including Josh Prohibition, MDogg20 and Karnage in a quest to become the 'King Of Hardcore's

After a cup of coffee and a barrage of Codies-related propaganda from the TV screens in reception, we were ushered into the Hoodoo Office to witness one of Codemasters' most ambitious titles to date.

SO WHAT'S THE, AHEM, PITCH? To release 17 unique versions of Club Football, each licensed to one of Europe's most prestigious football teams. Armed with digital cameras, Hoodoo Studio's scouts got to work recreating the hallowed stadia. Players have also been snapped from all angles to make some of the most lifelike stars ever featured in a footy game (naturally, they're waiting until the eleventh hour to do Beckham's barnet). This data was incorporated into the game to give fans an authentic football spectacle tailor-made for them, with a feel so close to being there that you can almost smell the pies.

BUT SURELY THERE'S MORE TO IT THAN LOOKS?

Absolutely. The main draw, from a fan's point of view, is that one mode allows them to create themselves

in digital form and stroll out onto the pitch alongside their heroes. But the big question is, what's in it for you if you don't support one of the featured teams? You can still play as any team from the top European leagues, but whether or not you'll want to buy the official game of another team will hinge on the quality of the gameplay. And sadly, because the code isn't finished, we couldn't put the game through its paces. But we're confident Club Football will put in a mesmerising performance come match day.

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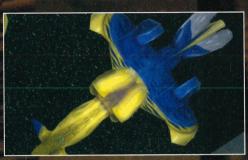




TARCRAFT: GHOST









YOU AND WHOSE... OH One of the largest units in the Zerg armoury is the Ultralisk. It's not the sort of enemy Nova can take out without help.





WHAT THE STARCRAFT? A brief history of the StarCraft universe.

Released on PC in 1998,

StarCraft is a three-way real-time strategy (RTS) game set in the late 25th Century, in a sector of space at the edge of the Milky Way. The races fighting for survival are: the Terrans, descendants of criminals exiled from Earth because of their genetic aberrations; the Zerg, a mixture of ferocious species which harvest the genetic material of creatures they conqueror in order to evolve

into new, nastier forms; and the Protoss, a technically-advanced civilisation with amazing psionic powers and strong ritualistic tendencies.

As with all RTS games, each of the races have mutual strengths and weaknesses, which makes the basic mechanics of StarCraft akin to an elaborate game of paper-scissors-stone. But, apart from this, one of the major selling points of StarCraft is its complex back story, which spans thousands of years and reveals the individual histories and politics of each of the races. This was of StarCraft: Brood War - a mission pack add-on, which focused on renegade Terran Sarah Kerrigan's attempt to take control of the Zerg Brood from their commander, Cerebrates, in her own bid for domination.

What the hell is Official PlayStation 2 Magazine doing drinking in LA? Ironically, considering most of the UK is covered with the white stuff courtesy of a winter storm, we've come to visit the appropriately-named developer Blizzard in a city where it never snows, southern Los Angeles. A brief history of Blizzard just serves to deepen the mystery of why we're

In the words of the Bran Van 3000 song,

here. Renowned for its multi-million-selling PC games (see Island Of The Blizzard King) the company hasn't released a console game since 1994 (Blackthorne, SNES). Its latest project however, StarCraft: Ghost, is about to change all that.

"It's definitely a big deal for Blizzard to go back to consoles. We want to make a huge impression," explains Ghost's Producer John Lagrave. "We want players to go, Wow, Ghost, what a great game. Who made it? Blizzard? Never heard of them. They're new to consoles? Great, I'll look out for more Blizzard titles.' That's our goal."

It's an admirable sentiment of course. The huge global installed base of PlayStation 2 makes it a vital business opportunity for developers, even for those as successful as Blizzard have been with PC games. But the jump to console remains a big risk. Almost everything about PC games is different to console games. Why does Blizzard think it can pull it off?

STARCRAFT: GHOST

HEADS-UP

The user interface for the game is split into four main areas.

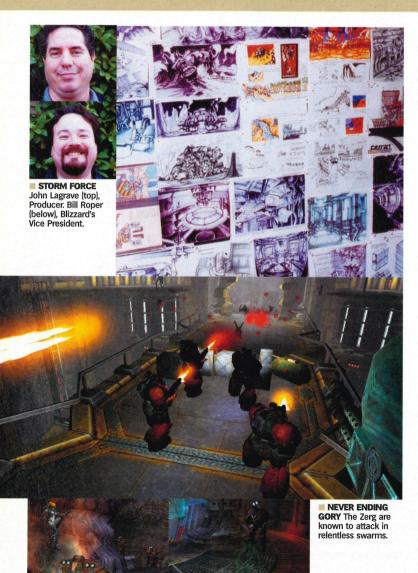
Nova's health bar (green) and psionic power bar (blue).

The large threat locator, which displays the sight zones and alertness states of any enemies in the vicinity. It also gives an indication of the amount of noise Nova is making via concentric rings which emit from her position.

Known for its RTS and RPG titles, Blizzard is one of the top ten PC developers in

staff. It also has a strong studio called Blizzard North, near San Francisco

Its orcs-and-elves series, WarCraft has sold over 10 million units, the Diablo series has sold over six million units. The one thing Blizzard hasn't done is develop console games. It did, however, create games for Nintendo's SNES and Sega's MegaDrive in the early 1990s in its original incarnation, Silicon & Synapse Three of these games. The Lost Vikings, Rock 'N Roll Racing and Blackthorne are currently being ported to Game Boy Advance.

As well as making games, Blizzard also hosts the free online gaming service Battle Net, which it claims is the world's largest.

One ace Blizzard has to play is female lead character Nova, the 'ghost' of the title. She's a supercharged, geneticallyadvanced Terran combat operative; as Lagrave puts it, "an elite unit among elite units." Although Nova's not new to the world of StarCraft (see What The Hell Is StarCraft?) this is the first time she - or any single character - has taken up a lead role as the face of the franchise. A canny move that accompanies the change from a zoomed out, Diablo-style isometric game view to a 3D, third-person perspective - altogether a more personalised point of view for the fickle and historically RTS-shy console masses.

CHAMPION SUPER NOVA

Nova's no shrinking violet either. As well as athletic handto-hand combat moves, she can slip into Stealth mode, becoming transparent in the process, while her infra-red sight allows her to see through walls and hyperspeed senses enable her to move three times as fast as enemies. In addition, she carries an upgradable assault/sniper rifle, 12 different types of grenades, reinforcements and nukes to take out the opposition, plus communications equipment to call in air strikes. What a star! She also has a ponytail, and although no-one at Blizzard mentions Lara, you get the idea that Blizzard's character designers wouldn't necessarily resent the comparison.

For the cynically-minded journalist at least, the comparisons don't end there. As Lagrave demonstrates various Ghost levels to OPS2, a list of familiar game features starts to emerge. How many did you spot in the previous paragraph, for example? For hand-to-hand combat, check Oni; for stealth, check Metal Gear Solid; for infra-red see-through-wall vision, tick Red Faction; hyperspeed is surely Max Payne's 'bullet time' renamed; while call-down strikes were last seen in Conflict: Desert Storm.

Other borrowed elements include a game dynamic which, on occasions, could see Nova fighting her individual battles in the midst of a larger conflict, much like the Dynasty Warrior games, and the ability to use a variety of in-game vehicles - best demonstrated by Halo.

Things are looking so good, in fact, that Blizzard, which is normally very cagey about issuing formal release dates, reckons StarCraft: Ghost will have a simultaneous worldwide release, including nine language versions, by the end of this year.

CRAFT FARE

Aside from the talk of technology and global strategy, the key question is: what will make StarCraft: Ghost stand out from the competition? Sure, it has plenty of extremely cool elements, but what will be the foundation to the game? Drawing on the game's PC roots, Roper reckons the richness and detail of the StarCraft universe will pull in the console crowd.

"There are millions of gamers who already love the characters and stories of StarCraft, and I think they will enjoy exploring it from a third-person perspective," he says. "Obviously, we will be careful not to assume any knowledge that newcomers to StarCraft won't have, and the game will have lots of cinematics explaining what's going on - I think they will be drawn in."

In addition, ghost units are important as they offer a wide range of combat abilities. "When we were thinking about a central unit for this game, it became clear that the ghost was the obvious focus," Roper explains. "They are uniquely qualified to do everything ranging from hand-tohand combat to stealth missions, through to playing a major role in epic battles. This means we are able to engender a level of intimacy with the character when they take out specific targets, while retaining the gigantic StarCraft feel so we can have areas with hundreds of Zergs, Terrans or Protoss attacking."

And perhaps this will be the most crucial element of StarCraft: Ghost for Blizzard to get right. There are plenty of games in which a single character fights their way through seemingly insurmountable odds while using a selection of

Having chosen the moniker of Online Limey, just to let those Yanks know that they're in for something special, we embark. A quick stop in the accessories shop leaves our character frustratingly thrifty in the stats department, but we're sure raw skill will make up for that. Cowboy hat, camo T-shirt, cowskin backpack. Yup, the purists will be livid.

LOOKIN' GOOD And they said purple and camo wouldn't blend.

It's getting late for our American cousins but there are plenty of games to join in on the West Coast. Within minutes we've struck up a conversation with a 'girl' in cut-offs and a bra top called Milwaukee, who wants to exchange email addresses a little too urgently. Ever coy, we suggest less talk and more action – skating action.

A change of location and we watch a Trick Attack (best score in two minutes) tapping away happily on the USB keyboard, letting the skaters know it's our first time and to be gentle. Striking up a conversation with a 'girl' called Kit Angi Q we realise the tremendously worrying potential for flirting with strangers. A quick freeskate and it's our turn to join in. Some of the eight skaters are very good, but a decent player will by no means be outclassed. The worst thing to deal with is the idea that up to seven others are watching, waiting for you stack it doing something simple.

A feeling of community creeps in several rounds later as we discuss where to go next and change locations. A narrow victory for *OPS2* sees us embroiled in a transatlantic slanging match with one of the little whiney online gits. This is great.

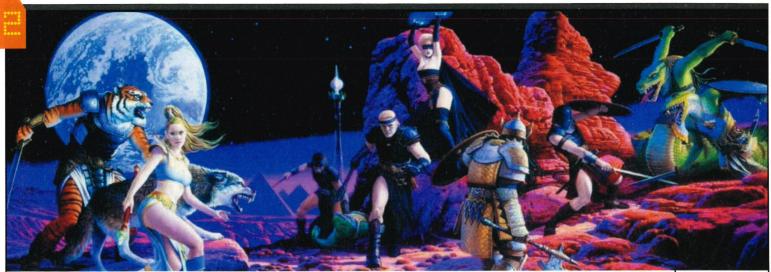


CONCLUSION

WHAT'S THIS THEN?

The PC's blockbuster MMORPG, EverQuest, is a certifiable games industry phenomenon. Some 430,000 subscribers fork out over \$12.95 a month to Sony Online for the pleasure of wandering the world of Norrath via their PCs. EQOA brings the same experience to the PS2 with a persistent world setting, Al-driven NPCs dishing out quests, and rats by the gazillion to slay.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

You get to play alongside hundreds of other real players – decide for yourself whether that's a good thing. Clans, guilds, loose associations and true friendships are formed. Hundreds of players gather

simultaneously on one server, spread throughout the world. Your characters are stored and saved for you to resume your ongoing adventures, seeking out new items, new weapons, adding spells to your arsenal or trading for cash. With a keyboard, chatting with fellow players (and even the NPCs), is simple, but you'll have more limited communication options if you're stuck with the controller defaults.

GETTING SET UP

Know how to set up your Network Adaptor? That's the hardest part of getting hooked up to EQOA. Once you're in the game, character creation can take up to 30 minutes if you're picky about race, class, eye colour or complexion details. Once in the game world, you've got to get to know your way around – and that takes

time. Wandering off by yourself away from safe areas can result in a quick death (and subsequent forced restart at your point of entry).

Ease Of Use: 4/5 – there's a lot to do, but it's pretty straightforward.

THE PLAYTEST

So you're online. In a massively multiplayer game. Opportunities abound. A character runs across your path – it's another real person off to sell junk they looted from the corpses of sword fodder, or returning to an NPC with news of a completed quest. Wherever you start in the world, it feels big. There's a lot to see and do, and a lot to learn about the mechanics.

Quests are simple FedEx-style affairs in the early stages – deliver X to Y and bring Z back to X. But that path from X to Y can lead different ways, and if those

non-scripted adventures are fun, you'll want to pay the subscription price. It's easy to get lost and you can expect to find yourself dead pretty sharpish when you wander somewhere you're not ready to handle. Then you've got the other players. Do you like socialising? Get a keyboard and chat away. Keyboard-less or a loner? Then you've a hardre in hahead

Then you've a harder job ahead.
Emphasis has been placed on quests that require you to group with others. By level seven you'll be looking to make friends to watch your back while you try to secure a quest item from a creature. You'll then be obliged to do the same for them forming a mob, in the parlance of the game world.

However the socials work out, it's all about getting those experience points.

Once you're attached to the development of your character, it's an addictive pastime

No. There's a hefty single-player game too.

WHAT'S THIS THEN?

A PS2-exclusive title developed by Zipper Interactive for SCEA, SOCOM: US Navy SEALs puts you in the shoes of a highly trained special forces operative. It's not dissimilar to the hugely-popular PC network game Counter-Strike, but it's played in the third-person – think TimeSplitters 2 for Metal Gear fans.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

It's the one with the funky headset. Don't get too excited, there'll be no screaming obscenities at Sniperklaus from the Czech Republic. What you can do, though, is trigger preset commands to your online opponents or offline AI team-mates through voice commands. Offline, it's a mission-based tactical military game putting you in voice control of a set of heavily armed

SEALs, not unlike PC games Rainbow Six and Raven Shield. Online, it's Deathmatch, Capture The Flag or Hostage Rescuing – although it generally pans out as two teams battling for supremacy, ignoring the objective entirely. It's broadband only, so lag is non-existent and can support up to 16 players at a time.

GETTING SET UP

From the opening menu you select 'online' then proceed to enter a name (you'll be known by this moniker to other players online, so make sure it's as stupid as possible) and a password that saves to the Memory Card. The next screen flashes up server news. When we were playing, there was notification of server downtime in the States that day. You then pick a country, enter a 'briefing room' and join a game. Here you'll have the chance to select characters and choose your team — SEALs

or Terrorists. It's also the place to chat or trade insults (press ② and insert a text message). After a ten-second load you'll be in the thick of the action. And unless you've played it before, you've probably just been nailed.

THE PLAYTEST

Don't expect to pick this up instantly – some of the US players have had SOCOM since August 2002 and are a dab hand at making you feel painfully inadequate. After about three hours of testing in various maps, against players in Australia (the most balanced), Eastern Europe (the most anarchic) and East Coast US (the most jammy) our best score tally was two kills. Pathetic, really. In our defence we found it quite difficult to ascertain who our enemies were, especially in the thick of a firefight involving six other players and a lot of jungle fog.

Graphically, it's slightly rough around the edges but well forgive it due to maps being large, varied and providing some brilliant hiding places. There's also lighting and weather effects to build atmosphere. Importantly, it makes for compulsive playing. You'll quickly find yourself wanting to master it just to nail that bastard Dirty_old_man and then give him a mouthful in the chat room later.

Unfortunately, the voice recognition feature is sadly lost in the cordite-filled ether of testosterone-fuelled deathmatching. You could always try laying down the gauntlet and issuing a few tactical' commands, but you'll more than likely end up getting shot or being voted off. We reckon this function will come into its own more when you're playing alongside a group of mates instead of complete strangers whose sole objective is to prove themselves as king fragger. Can we go and play it again now?

THE PLAYTEST

Having got a taster of T:AA's controls via the offline training missions, we highlight the single-player Online mode. The first screen takes us through character selection. We opt for a lizard-like BioDerm with heavy armour and a Fusion Mortar. Having christened our scaly baby Hamoki we move on to game selection. It's 3am in the States but even at that ungodly hour there are eight online games in full swing. We choose a 16-player Deathmatch that's just kicked off and within ten seconds

we're on the battlefield and being mortared by a bitch called DyingLight, hovering in one of T:AA's vehicles, the Hammer Bomber.

Thankfully we respawn inside our base and have time to visit an Inventory Station. These equip you with just about any hardware you desire. We desire big f*cking guns and a side order of revenge. Then it's outside to try out our jetpack. There's no lag or slowdown at all as we speed over a huge map. Damn, this is fun. We spot a red triangle in the valley below. Ha! It's DyingLight. He's on foot and at our mercy. Three pops with the Spinfusor weapon and OPS2 notches up its first kill. With a victory roar, courtesy of the D-pad's simple speech buttons, we zoom over the hills and off to the enemy team's base. Decide we'll start a vote to change the map. Why? Because we can! Vote carried. This is awesome...

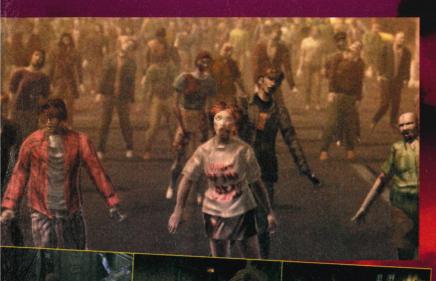
CONCLUSION

You really can't overestimate the thrill of videogame battling against real opponents. Characters emerge. scores get settled and victories taste oh going to love this.

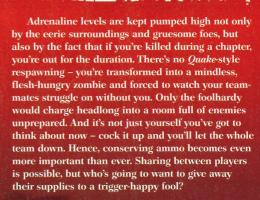


NIGHT OF THE HUNTERS

Gameplay is split into chapters, though exactly how many is still to be decided. When pressed on this troubling issue of longevity, Sudo reveals that he intends additional downloadable content to be made available at a later date, but he won't be drawn on the detail. The action takes place across the whole of Raccoon City and includes some familiar areas, though we're assured there will be many others that are completely new, such as a hospital, underground tunnels, subway station and a forest. Each will be inhabited by the usual assortment of ungodly creations, and many old favourites (such as the Hunters) make a return, plus a plentiful supply of new enemies. Sudo-san is again hesitant to divulge too much detail, but we're tantalisingly told to expect to encounter gigantic mutant bugs as we walk the ruined streets. Each chapter is a story in its own right, with a distinct beginning and end, and while there's a goal to complete in each area, how exactly you achieve this will be largely up to you and your team to work out.

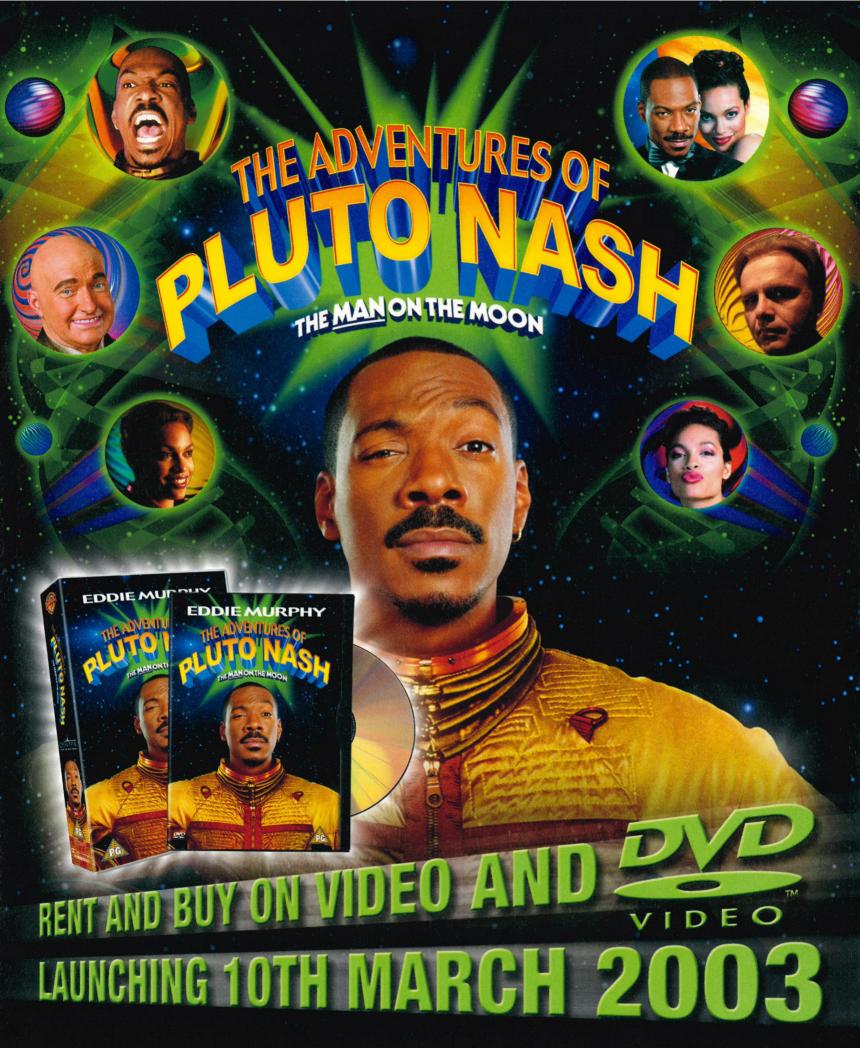

TOGETHER. ALONE

Players will also find themselves starting games in entirely different locations. Alone, isolated and low on ammo, you'll have to work your way to a specified meeting point. You'll be forced to utilise objects found lying around, such as pieces of piping or broom handles to use as makeshift weapons. And what happens if someone doesn't turn up when they're supposed to? Do you send out a search party? Stay put and wait? Or simply leave them to their fate? It's entirely possible to betray your teammates in this way, but whatever you decide to do, you'll have to live with the consequences.

Resident Evil Online looks set to some fascinating gameplay opportunities. Which skills are most useful? Who's likely to endanger the team through their recklessness? Can you really rely on anyone at all? The paranoia begins to creep in just thinking about it. Rather than detract from the suspense created by the isolation of previous Resi games, the fear may well be intensified as a result of the group dynamic. You're relying on each other, which means you're not totally in control. As Sudo himself puts it: "On the Net, you may be playing with friends, you may not. They could well be total strangers, and they may have ulterior motives. That in itself is a scary prospect." Absolutely, mate.

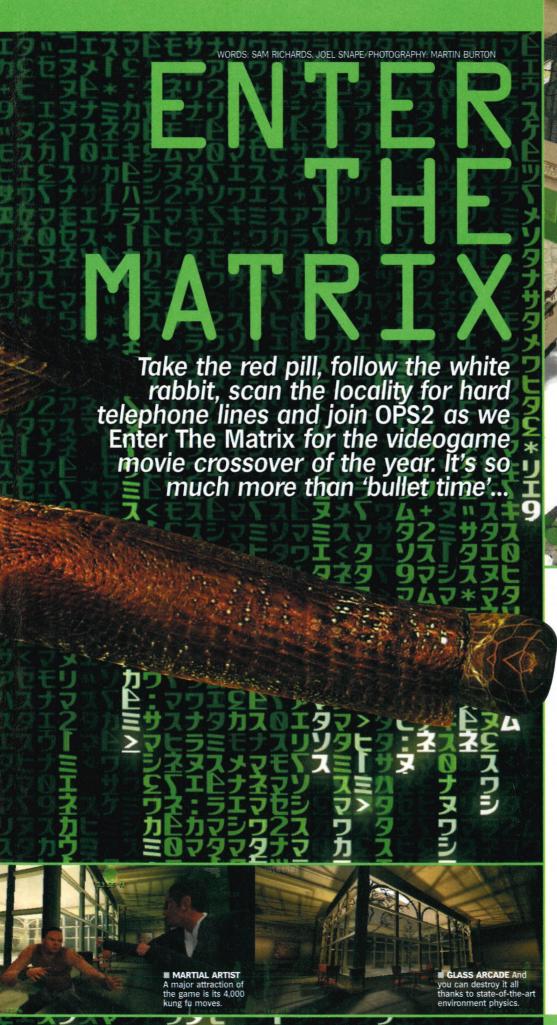

What is *The Matrix?* For a start, it's not just a film; it's a *universe*. When Larry and Andy Wachowski first scripted the original movie back in the mid-Nineties, they already had plans not only for two cinema sequels, but for books, comics, Web sites and, of course,

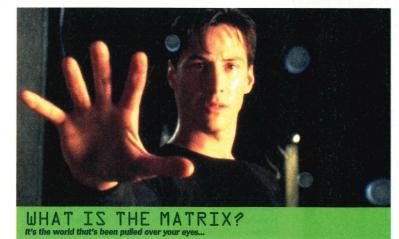
videogames... all maintained by our fascination with the brilliant pseudo philosophical stylish sci-fi vision that unfolded before our eyes when we first willed Keanu to pop the red pill. *The Matrix* is the ultimate expression of techno fetishism, the logical conclusion of FX overload, a modern interpretation of the 'who are we?' conundrum, the perfect fable for the videogame age and, lest we start becoming as pretentious as the philosophy section of whatisthematrix.com, a breathless action romp populated by futuristic ninja renegades in shades and leather coats.

So Enter The Matrix is not your usual movie tie-in videogame. It has always been part of the grand plan. The Wachowskis have written the script, the real actors have provided painstaking motion capture, and amazingly, an hour of exclusive movie footage will link playable sections of the game. Shiny Entertainment (creator of Earthworm Jim, MDK and Messiah) has been working on Enter The Matrix for three years, and members of the development team have been resident on the sets of the two forthcoming Matrix movies. The result is a videogame that will be entirely convincing to students of the Matrix universe, sharing characters, locations and a release date - 15 May - with The Matrix Reloaded, and featuring a plot line that runs parallel, links, weaves and intersects with the movie. "The movie steps into the game; the game steps into the movie," elaborates amiable Shiny Entertainment main man Dave Perry. "They actually change each others' courses, which I think is a unique association."

"Unfortunately, no one can be told what the Matrix is," murmurs Zen-cool freedom fighter Morpheus in the first film. But that turns out to be rubbish – it's just that finding out your entire life has been a lie concocted by a computer is a bit difficult to take. Keanu Reeves plays messianic figure Neo, the resistance's last hope against the machines. That's the intriguing premise that made the first film so successful, although you can't underestimate the importance of, a) making your lead actors train with Jackie Chan choreographer Yuen Wo Ping for six

months and, b) including loads of clever references to *Alice In Wonderland* and Gnostic Christianity. Most important of all was 'bullet time', an invention that needs about fifty cameras set up to take frames at perfect split-second intervals.

The original Matrix took in \$171 million at the box office. More importantly, it was the first DVD to sell over a million copies, taking advantage of the technology with blink-and-you'll-miss-'em moments like the scenes from Night Of The Lepus [featuring – a-ha – white rabbits] in Oracle's apartment.

Now let us introduce you to Niobe. You won't have seen her in the first movie, but you will see her in *Reloaded*, running up walls in a fetching crocodile skin two-piece much like on the previous page. She's an ace hovercraft pilot and driver, and is pretty handy with a pair of pistols and the old slow-mo kung fu, too, as well as being Morpheus's former squeeze. In the film, she's played by the ultra-cool Jada Pinkett Smith (Will Smith's wife).

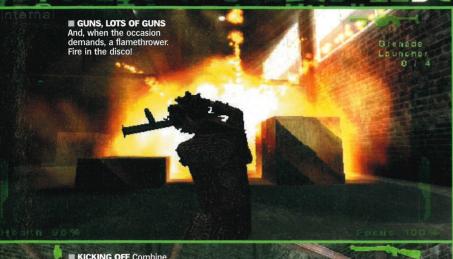
You can either inhabit Niobe or her partner, Ghost, who is played in the film by Hong Kong action veteran Anthony Wong. Described by the Wachowskis as a "Zen Buddhist Apache assassin," he's the weapons and combat expert. Where Niobe drives at lightspeed, Ghost leans out of the window blasting at the tyres of pursuing cars; where Niobe pilots the Logos, Ghost eagerly decimates sentinels with the cannon.

Both characters will be available from the start of the game but you won't be able to switch between them once you've started. This essentially creates two separate adventures in the style of *Resident Evil 2* – the paths will be similar but there are deviations specific to each character, and playing styles for Niobe and Ghost will be significantly different. Shiny estimates that each path will provide around 20 hours of gameplay.

Perry elaborates: "If you choose to play as Ghost, you get to fight Trinity – the story makes no sense for Niobe to fight Trinity. There are sections in the game where both characters are together and sometimes you'll be the infiltrator, sometimes the protector. Your path will also be affected by how well you play." Perry admits that in order to tell the story effectively, each character will follow a linear path. "On the other hand, we try to give you different

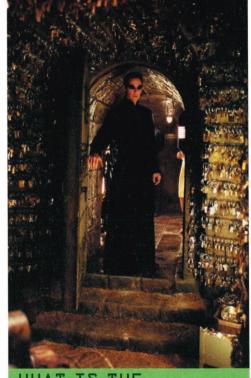

ways to solve each problem. But basically, I don't think you're going to get bored by this story."

Okay, we know what you're thinking. Already four pages in and we haven't mentioned how Neo and Trinity are involved. Both appear in the game as accurately rendered models of Keanu and Carrie-Ann, but neither are playable. So to fend off the inevitable, here's the reasoning of Dave Perry.

"Firstly, we can't run a parallel story to Reloaded if you play as Neo. Secondly, at the end of the first film, Neo becomes a God. He can literally stop bullets, or fly, or jump into an agent and explode him from the inside. Having those powers from the start of the game would take away the fun of the shooting and the dodging and the kung fu, as well as being very difficult to configure on a joypad!"

Instead, Niobe and Ghost must make do with 4,000 martial arts moves, a huge arsenal of real-life and fantasyenhanced weapons and the ability to temporarily slow time in order to dodge bullets and perform extravagant, balletic finishing moves. Bummer, huh?

The primary focus of the game is action, combining gunplay and physical acrobatics in the breathtaking way that is The Matrix's trademark. "There's no stealth in this game!" proclaims Perry triumphantly, before laughing in the face of reloads. "If you finish a clip, you just throw the gun away and grab a new one." We expected nothing less.

The bulk of the combat requires you to engage multiple



The start of all-out war between humans and machines, hitting cinemas on 15 May – the same date as the game. So stop reading now if you want to go in cold. It centres around the machines' discovery of Zion, the last human city on Earth, and the resistance's attempts to find Lock – a man who can open any door in the Matrix and who is the 'key' (see?) to their survival. He's guarded by karateexpert twins Neil and Adrian Rayment, who you might've already seen in, erm, Carol Vorderman's Better Homes. And, even worse, the only way to get him to a hard line is along a busy freeway – packed, of course, with Agents in charge of fuel-injected beasts.

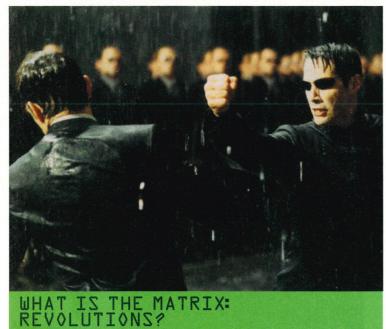
Really stop reading now if you want to go in cold. Reloaded is set to do for car chases what the original did for gun fights, including kung fu battles inside a moving Cadillac and on top of an 18-wheeler, and a wreck count that might even surpass *The Blues Brothers*. The film will also test the limits of Neo's abilities, including scenes where he files at 2.000mph through the Matrix's enormous version of New York, and a

"Reloaded ends," explains Producer Joel Silver, "at a moment of true filmus interruptus." The events of the third film follow immediately, and Revolutions is due for release before Christmas. In contrast to Reloaded, the action is mainly set in Zion and the ruins of the 'real world'. The film apparently climaxes in a 17-minute sequence that cost around \$40 million to film. No more details yet, but expect the next SFX buzzphrase to be 'virtual cinematography', which can film actors with five digital cameras that

are hi-res enough to capture pores and follicles, then recreate them in perfect 3D and manipulate them into any desired position.

Trouble Is, we've already been told that most people trapped in the Matrix aren't ready for the real world – and let's face it, it doesn't look that great – so how will it all end? The only clue is that Reloaded contains the revelation that some machines aren't as evil as others and don't like the fact that they've been surpassed by better technology...

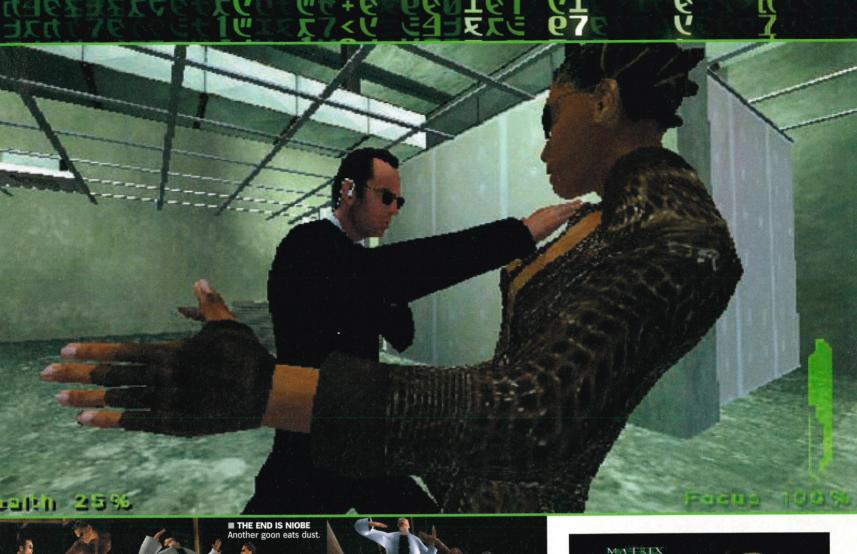
seamlessly switch between shooting and high-kicking, punching and pistol-whipping. At first it seems simple; a frantic button-bashing tirade unleashing an impressive melee of leg sweeps and twin pistol pumps. But when dealing with three SWAT officers simultaneously, it's clear that there's much subtlety to be learned in mastery of 360° combat. On first play, it's difficult to see exactly how the vaunted 4,000 different moves all come into play, but the six months of motion capture work with renowned movie fight choreographer Yuen Wo Ping tell their own story. In the hands of a Shiny rep, Niobe elegantly dispatches all three goons with a couple of perfectly timed roundhouses and some nifty slow-mo.

That'll be the implementation of 'bullet time', then, as seen in every bloody game of 2002 from *Max Payne* to *FreekStyle*. You'd think we'd be sick of gratuitous swirly camera work by now, but cut *The Matrix* some slack – the Wachowskis did invent 'bullet time' after all. And here, it's used more impressively than ever. When your focus bar is filled, the tap of a shoulder button will warp time. Suddenly Niobe and Ghost can leap across gaping chasms, run up walls, cartwheel on the ceiling, dive in every direction while shooting or dodging bullets and unleash all kinds of breathtaking kung fu moves on statuesque enemies. Forget the pale imitators, this is what *The Matrix* is all about.

AGENT UNDER FIRE

■ HOLY GHOST Not much of a Buddhist, is he?

Right now, you're probably wondering what kind of role Agent Smith plays in the game, and why there's a whole posse of Agent Smiths on the cover of our magazine.

The answer is that in *Reloaded*, Agent Smith has cloned himself, forcing Neo to simultaneously fight against a hundred deadly, inscrutable and genetically identical foes. We would kill for a similar scenario in the game, but Shiny is staying tight-lipped on this one, though it promises that Agent Smith will appear.

What we do know is that agents will prove to be your most challenging enemies. Unlike your average SWAT guards, they can slow time to dodge bullets, walk through walls, and transport themselves into the body of any person inside the Matrix. Understandably, when an agent materialises, your best policy is to leg it, sharpish. "Agents are incredibly good fighters and can block pretty much every move you throw at them, as well as being able to dodge bullets. You might be able to delay them for a few seconds in order to make your escape, but it's usually futile to stand and fight. They're strange enemies because they're so aggressive and will pursue you relentlessly." However, as your character gains experience in the ways of the Matrix, you'll get to a point where you can go toe-to-toe with the men in black, just like Neo in the first film.

"There is a slight RPG element to the game, in that your characters' abilities improve over time," says Perry.



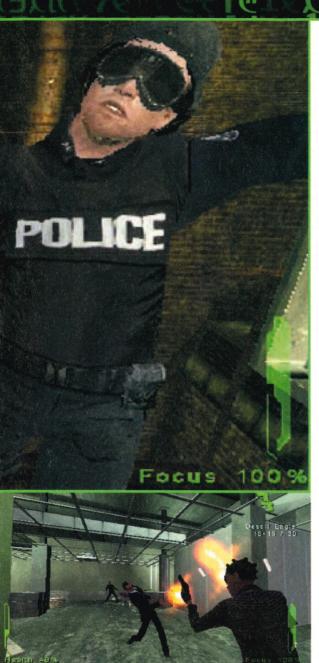


WHATISTHEMATRIX - COM?

Exactly what you'd expect – a gaspingly exhaustive collection of cast interviews, production notes, concept sketches, location shots and teaser stills from the forthcoming films, splurged across a Flash-heavy Web site. It's also the place to find yet more Matrix mythos in the form of short stories and comics by industry glants like Dave Gibbons and Neil Gaiman. For something really cerebral, visit the philosophy section for a list of the film's links to Buddhist scripture, an investigation of how Rene Descartes' classic '1 think, therefore I am' reasoning relates to living in a big jelly shell run by a mad computer, and an explanation of how political thinker Robert Nozick came up with the whole idea of an 'experience machine' like the Matrix in his classic Anarchy, State And Utopia. Finally, when Cartesian philosophy gets a bit much, you can unwind with three arcade games, including a really terrible one involving a tiny 2D Trinity being repeatedly hit by subway trains.

STRANGLER IN THE NIGHT Ghost goes for the throat to finish off his foe. WHO ARE THE WACHOWSKIS? Concrete details are difficult to come by - Warner Bros has granted the directing brothers a near-unprecedented release from doing publicity for either of the forthcoming films. Checking the Internet doesn't help much, either – they only made *one* film before *The Matrix*, lesbian noir heist flick Bound. Partly made to convince studio execs to let them film The Matrix, it's worth a look, especially for classic Wachowski cinematography like the travelling-through-the-toilet interrogation scene. Biographical nuggets? Of the two, we're told that Larry likes philosophy and wine – Andy prefers science fiction and beer. Everything in *The Matrix* is influenced by their interests, which range from Buddhism to kung fu films. HIT AND MYTH

Shiny knows exactly who it's dealing with here. *The Matrix* brand has huge mass appeal, but the Wachowskis have carefully crafted a whole mythology around their creation, enticing the kind of hardcore fans who consider Morpheus to be the greatest philosopher since Socrates. *Enter The Matrix* needs to please everybody, and by creating an instantly appealing action game with added gameplay depth *and* an ultra-nerdy hacking mode, Shiny appears to have succeeded without compromising the essential mystique of the movies.

By May this year, *Matrix* fever will have crescendoed to such a volume that you won't be able to peek from beneath your duvet without being assaulted by images of a leather-clad Keanu turning slow-mo somersaults. But everything we've seen so far suggests that *Reloaded* will easily live up to the hype, and that the *Enter The Matrix* videogame will thoroughly justify its association with the must-see movie of 2003. Prepare to believe the unbelievable. □

As a doctor, his stealth kills have the added bonus of an X-ray which allows you to see exactly what damage you're doing (see The Doctor Will Kill You Now). Turning an opponent's limbs and head the wrong way is a particularly edifying, if slightly disturbing, manoeuvre.

The level of sumptuous detail in the game, including strikingly subtle weather effects, adds a depth of character to an experience that's more about skill and control than unleashing boundless violence. Critically improved Al in enemies means that they'll search for you high and low – if you're spotted, retreat or concealment are really your only options. In fact, the whole game makes equally thorough use of rooftops, interior rooms and underground passages – so if you think you're at a dead end, just look up or down and your escape route may well become apparent.

PLOTTING REVENGE

Wrath Of Heaven has not one but three strong, intricate game plots full of great cut-scenes that draw from the traditions of Japanese cinema, with definite hints of Seven Samurai. In the main plot, that of the Azuma Clan ninjas Rikimaru and Ayame, we discover that Rikimaru emerges from a deep ninja trance after uncovering worryingly familiar stirrings in the peaceful land. Cultists are beginning to advance and with them, evil ninjas, bad spirits and undead warriors come at the command of the evil Lord Tenrai.

The first mission sees you infiltrating a merchant's stronghold to punish the forces of corruption as they attempt to sell village girls into slavery. However, completion of this mission opens the floodgates of a story line that takes the action to nine different locations including a snowy Bamboo Forest, the falling leaves around a Buddha's Temple and eventually to the dank underground lair of Tenrai's Fortress.

Various levels of the game have their own Ronin, martial artists, undead warriors – even dogs and bears – and all are enigmatically lit and filled with atmosphere that complements the tension created by the 'sneak, hide and strike' nature of the gameplay. Each level leads onto a new clue or challenge and stealthy investigative work is

broken up with surprise level boss challenges like the charming Ganda – a massive beast of a man with a big stick. No time for stealth here, just use your acrobatic skills to get behind him. Tenrai will also goad you throughout the game with surprise visits but you won't truly face him down until the very end – your fate depends on various decisions you make along the way. Tragedy is only a footfall away, but then that's half the fun.

Initially, the game's nine levels may seem a little short, and the repetitive stealth element may begin to lose its sparkle. There are a further two layouts of each level to be unlocked, but don't get too excited – the possibilities are not limitless. If you complete the mission to a high enough standard, the next layout becomes available, meaning a different distribution of guards and some

The final battles require you to utilise all of the combat skills you've acquired along the way. Ayame's goal is a variation of Rikimaru's, with the slightly different focus of acquiring the 'Jewels of Power', but Tesshu faces a different climax altogether: a showdown with Jinnai in a thunderstorm in the Ronin Village. It's stirring stuff with an explosive finale that's not to be missed.

A STAB IN THE DARK

In a game as detailed as this, mastery of your ninja arsenal is of paramount importance to completing your missions, and now you have the ability to pick up weaponry from fallen guards along the way. The old favourite grappling hook is back, as are an array of other items including magic spells of invisibility and fire, potions, ninja armour, weapons upgrades and the innovative new sticky bombs which ninjas can frisbee from afar and then detonate using R3 - perfect for taking out larger foes or groups of guards. But be warned, if you eke out all your health potions on a mission and then get slashed to bits, you'll have to start again with none.

of the previous Tenchu games. You have the option to play in Versus or Cooperative mode with split-screen action. Unfortunately, the cooperative play is limited to specially generated levels rather than the plot missions. That said, the challenges set for two are inventive and

Unfortunately, your stealthier skills are useless in this kind of open arena, which detracts slightly from the game's primary ethos.

To say that Wrath Of Heaven moves the Tenchu franchise forward in leaps and bounds would be an overstatement. To say it's a game that creates an immersive atmosphere, boasting challenging gameplay, spectacular effects and a decent life span would be more accurate - and fairer to what it sets out to achieve. It could well take Tenchu from the level of a much-admired, last-gen game and allow it to compete with the PS2's more esteemed, gun-toting, stealth-'em-ups. There's something that just feels specialist about Tenchu, in a good way. Some PS2 owners will want to run out and buy this; at the same time, it will undoubtedly leave other gamers cold. Immediate gratification it is not, but if you crave the kind of satisfaction that can only be derived from achieving hard-earned goals in a wonderfully immersive universe, Wrath Of Heaven will make an honourable addition to your collection.

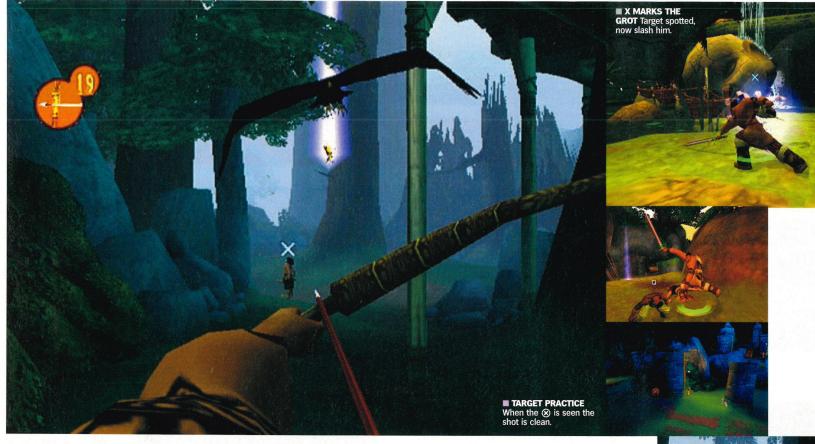

Hailing from one of Sony America's internal US studios, The Mark Of Kri is not a typical fantasy adventure, mixing elements from native South American culture with a helping of Conan The Barbarian Incidentally, it's pronounced 'cree', not 'cry

You've absolutely got to hear the narration in this game. It's rotund, leathery and bombastically subterranean. Surely the reallife chap behind this booming baritone is nine-feet wide, as hairy as a yak and has a mouth like a gymnasium? We may never know. But fans of verbal description in games will rejoice as things kick off with a resonating call to, "Gather round all of you who would listen..." For it is that kind of game - mythic, ancient and painted in a language of thudding spears, thwipping arrows and the clonk of sword against iron trouser.

While its intentions are clear, The Mark Of Kri's visual credentials seem askew. Scenes are set up with static. skilful, Disneyish etchings; the in-game graphics are fun and cartoony; while the characters you meet are stylised to within an inch of their kiddie-friendly lives. All of which would sit nicely were you not to add to the melange some of the most brutal death scenes seen on PS2. 'Tis a confusement to be sure. It looks like an under 12s title, yet plays like kicking-out time in a Hanley boozer.

You are Rau, small of head and hefty of body. You're a barbarian, and indeed many characters address you directly as such - a situation which you could deem offensive were your profession not concerned exclusively with disembowelling people. Early doors, you're holed up in a tavern. You've got a sword. And nothing to do. The unseen bass-throat pipes up again, helpfully pointing out that, "his muscles yearn for action." This may be so, but what are his options? The barman tells Rau of a group of woodland thieves who need a good spanking, before suggesting that if it's too much trouble, Rau could help out in the bar. We attempted to take this latter path with a view to a Conan-style take on Cheers (Where everybody knows your mane') but this option is revealed to be purely cosmetic. Rau must knobble the thieves.

So off he goes, sword in hand and bird on arm. But forget thoughts of loafing through adventures accompanied by an own-brand Xena in a tin bra. This bird actually is a bird - a black raveny, rooky-looking thing and central to the game's most original conceit.

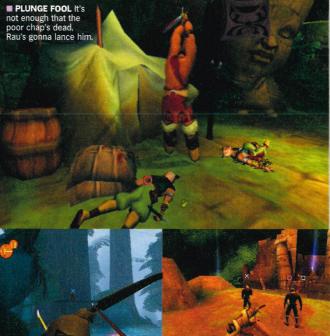

cannot be struck, which leaves you time to re-target groups to issue maximum hurt. Sound confusing? It isn't. It becomes second nature, allowing more adventurous combos to be unleashed.

This hack-heavy human butcher's shop is naturally stapled to a plot which (helped no end by our invisifriend's boulder-dashed intonation) is actually rather riveting. After the initial by-numbers thief annihilation and the following 'help a fat man get his home back' mission, a slender fogey crops up in the tavern (the game's hub) and asks Rau to retrieve a parchment from a tomb guarded by scoundrels. Rau agrees, but little does the dunderhead realise (even though it's telegraphed a mile off) that the codger has foul intent on his mind. The parchment is, in fact, a shaving of human skin with one of the Marks of Kri on it. What the hell are they? Well, collect all six and a demonic spell will raise the dead and kill everyone. Cue some escapades to stop the evil OAP.

BOW SELECTA

While your sword is your main ally through the early missions, a further three weapons become available during play. While this may seem a little miserly, there is much jocularity to be garnered from their use. First up you get a bow, allowing you to take certain enemies down quietly with one brain-stab. If your target's sporting a helmet however, you're going to have to find another way to despatch them. There are other, sneakier ways to use the bow – try shooting the gongs or wild boars and watch as the guards are distracted. Next up, there's a big spear, which causes more favourable woundery than the sword. Then, finally, there's the battle axe, which can cleave people in two at a stroke. Sexy.

The Mark Of Kri is not a huge game – it can be completed in a week of casual play. But there are some pleasing intricacies. For example, your winged chum is not just for checking out the road ahead – send him to the right perch and he's able to activate levers to open doors. Care must be taken not do disturb groups of birds as the fluttering will alert the unwanted attention of guards. You can also stealth kill a pair of guys standing next to each other, although how the second target doesn't hear you beating your sword-hilt on his mate's throat-pipe from two feet away is unexplained.

There are more serious problems, too. Aside from an occasionally inebriated camera, the animations used

during a finishing move (and also as Rau unsheathes his sword when climbing on or off a ladder) can infuriate. You'll find yourself vulnerable and powerless as the preset animation goes about its business. Furthermore, it seems odd that during the middle sections, your tactical grasp of stealth is utterly essential, but come the final mission the game resorts to wild hack 'n' slash, at which point the only real strategic decision to make is when to use health power-ups.

This charming, beautiful-looking game is screaming out to be highly recommended, but it is hamstrung by its inadequate length and some minor design flaws. The soundtrack is inspiringly atmospheric – we particularly like the Turkish-style wailing – while the AI of your adversaries is a far kri (sorry) from the worst we've seen (Blade II anyone?). Meanwhile, the grotesquely macabre baby thieves near the end of the game have got to rank as the most joyously irritating enemies ever, but we simply can't justify a higher score.

If you're considering giving Rau a run out, do remember that contrary to its innocent appearances, this is not a youngster's game. It's a demonic, evil, black, dour nightmare – severed limbs and screaming, skewered men abound. Oh, it's dark, so very, very dark. But don't take our word for it. Witness deep-voice-man's frighteningly portentous introductory spiel: "Dark spells... A world of darkness... The spell, however, was dark and powerful... Denizens of the world of darkness." What seems like an environmentally conscious quest rapidly descends into an procession of ugly violence. Which is how we prefer it anyway.

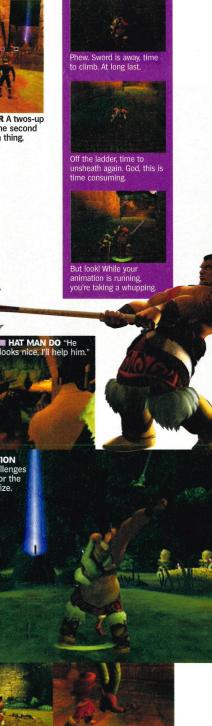

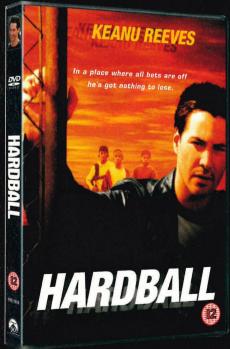

BACK STORY

Surely 'Hell Town, USA needs no introduction? Originally designed to put a more psychological spin on a horror genre dominated by the Hollywood-style hokum of Capcom's Resident Evil saga, the Silent Hill series truly came into its own, deeply disturbing element with the PS2's gloriously grotesque sequel. The Director's Cut is basically a port of the more complete Xbox version. Much has been said about Silent Hill. That town of decay where reality and fantasy cross over each other's threshold to breed hopeless paranoia, confusion, maybe even full-on

insanity and death. That town where the inhabitants seemingly consist of decaying corpses bound to chainlink fences or lashed to rusty hospital beds, and those which are alive and relatively human-looking are as bemused to be there as you are. We've been there on PS2, our frail minds barely survived the ordeal intact, so what possible reason could we have to go back?

Well, that depends entirely on how you perceived the original Silent Hill 2. If you prefer your horror to be direct and to the point (like Resident Evil) and only played Silent Hill 2 because you hoped it would be radically more in-your-face than the original PSone game, which you hated, then there is no reason. But if you prefer your horror to be more in the implication than the starkness, to get under your skin and mess with your mind, then the most psychologically demanding adventure ever devised will beckon you back with those sinister voices that inhabited sleepless nights for weeks after vacating the last time.

Why? Because you love the fact that the beauty of Silent Hill, the true essence, was not the gorgonzola gore and apparent eeriness of it all, but the deep, mysterious story which was very much open to interpretation. Why are the characters there? Why do some behave erratically? Do they see things you don't? If these were your feelings on the game, then the new scenario featured in this package (along with the original Silent Hill 2 game in all its entirety) will be as good a reason as you need to buy it again - for budget price.

In the new scenario (titled 'Born From A Wish') you get to play as Maria, that 'strange' woman who bore a rather striking resemblance to the original

protagonist's dead wife. The purpose of the exercise is to

shed more light on her actions, imply her reason for being in Silent Hill and go some way to explaining her odd behaviour towards James Sanderland in the main game (blaming it on her time of the month would be too convenient an excuse in this case!).

Admittedly, Maria's scenario is short - at least it is if you know exactly what to do, because again, confusion and disorientation can add hours to your playing time and this is perhaps why casual Silent Hill players should be wary about buying this version. However, rather than being action orientated, this mini-game is all about dialogue, and what you can glean from it will go some way to either fuelling or falsifying your own theories on the overall plot.

For true slaves of Silent Hill's intrigue, The Director's Cut is a sound buy that adds more substance to an already tense and gripping tale. In exploring Maria's epilogue you are teased with a quick gaze into a bigger and even more diverse picture, you get to explore new environments (like the Baldwin Mansion), meet a new character called Ernest, brandish a new weapon (a meat cleaver) and get abducted by aliens (see X-Factor). Welcome back. And do enjoy your stay.

GENE STEALER Sampling the DNA of monsters unlocks new morphs

BACK STORY

Midway has been keen to expand its gaming portfolio beyond traditional arcade titles. Dr Muto follows fellow high profile platformer Haven, but disappointing sales of the latter do suggest that maybe these aren't the type of games that the public wants to play..

Imagine a messy one night stand between the cartoon Jimmy Neutron: Boy Genius and Jak And Daxter. It would be a drunken tale of Bacardi Breezers, a cheap hotel, both waking

up in the morning with the horrifying realisation that clothes are missing and they're not alone (and if you haven't experienced anything like this yet, oh, you will). A lovechild born of this wham-bam union would have the gaming DNA of both parents - the bold graphics of Neutron and the orb-collecting ledge-leapery of J&D. Blessed - or should that be cursed - by its parentage, It might look something like Midway's Dr Muto.

The game doesn't actually do anything new. Nor does it capture the imagination with cool characters and breathtaking landscapes. But it does have a certain something. Crazy-haired Dr Muto, the designated platform hopper, is a mad-looking but not necessarily mad scientist - part Emmett Brown from Back To The Future and part Dr Frankenstein with a pinch of Futurama's Professor Farnsworth. It is from his bumbling genius that we get our plot. Having accidentally blown up his planet during the search for a new power source, Dr Muto must build a machine called the Genitor in order to put it back together. Of course, the pieces for this fabulous machine have been scattered across various different worlds.

Guided by a mellow-voiced, 2001-inspired computer

called AL, Dr Muto's sci-fi quest is split across four different planets - Flotos, Totltec, Ageum and Mazon. Each one features several

enemy-infested, puzzle-littered levels across which the heroic doctor must run, jump and double-jump, not to mention blast and zap, climb, swing, swim and flv. But while Dr Muto seems to fit snugly into a familiar platform format, Midway's new game features several tweaks and twists to help cement its appeal with gamers. Right from the start, there's more to Dr Muto than health packs, spinning collectables and end-of-level boss battles.

GENE GENIE

For a platform game to truly stand out it needs to peddle a gimmick. Jak And Daxter featured a beautifully landscaped gameworld and Disney-style animation; Ratchet & Clank popped up on our radar thanks to its multi-planet environment and array of bizarre weaponry. In Dr Muto, the game's designers have given the shockhaired boffin the ability to morph into different creatures to help him overcome the later, trickier levels. In his default human form, the Doc can jump with the aid of rocket-powered boots. He also carries a Splizz gun, a combination of blaster weapon, DNA-extractor and short-range, electromagnetic tractor beam.

By using the Splizz gun's DNA extractor, the daring doc can sample the genetic structure of many of the enemies that he faces. By collecting enough samples from different creatures, various different 'morphs' can be unlocked. The first of these bio-manipulations is the Gerbillius Doctorus, transforming Dr Muto into a small rodent so that he can crawl through small holes to access new and secret areas. Extract DNA from fire ants, roaches and other skittering nasties and you can access Doczilla (half Muto, half ape), Arachnidoc (more 'spider'

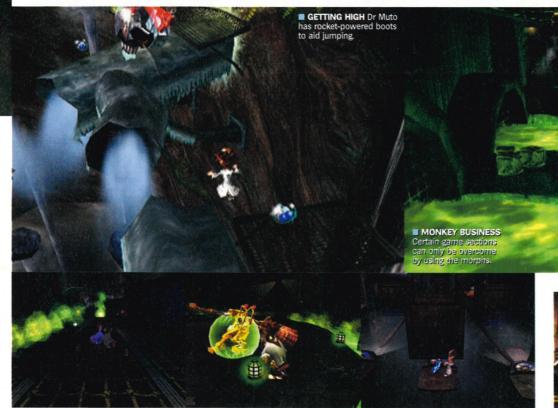

than 'man'), Docfish (do you want chips with that?) and Teradoctyl (less a dino-mutation, more a flying squirrel).

Each mutation brings a new set of skills to the platform party. Doczilla has the ability to use monkey bars and can use its weight to depress large switches. Arachnidoc can fire webbing to swing across obstacles and defecate timed bombs. Docfish is perfect for the deepwater levels of the planet Aquem, while Teradoctyl can take to the air and fire globules of something very deadly and green.

The immediate effect of these mutations is to break up the familiar jump-blast-jump game dynamic. The climbing, swimming and flying are all welcome diversions. They force you to use different skills to clear a level of its crawling/flying nasties and solve the familiar switch-based puzzles. But each level relies on the mutations rather than giving you an alternative way to complete a puzzle. Some key areas can only be accessed in the tiny rodent form, or by climbing webbing that only the spider mutation can cling to. Consequently, your path through the game is obvious, rather than challenging; repetitive rather than innovative.

Midway has tried to spice things up a bit with unlockable gadgetry. For example, by collecting scrap metal power-ups on a level, you can access temporary Invulnerability and Invisibility cloaks, or pick up a Pocket Rocket (for blasting enemies) or Super Boots (for extra high leaping). And where Jak And Daxter challenged you to collect a full set of power cells on each of its levels, Dr Muto features sparkling green collectables known as

Terra. But Dr Muto isn't an instantly likeable hero. Mad scientists are rarely cool - they are typically sidekick characters at best. Poor camera tracking doesn't help matters either and imprecise character control makes gameplay frustratingly difficult at times.

Dr Muto looks good, plays well and boasts an impressive 22 levels of object-collection and nastyblasting. But there's nothing here that you haven't seen before and nothing that we can tell you about with great enthusiasm or emphasise with capital letters. So is it just another platform game? Beyond the nice visual touches and the quirky gimmick, yes. But if a repeat prescription of platform adventure is what the doctor ordered, your next fix is ready for you to pick up. □ Dean Evans

The follow-up to ESPN X Games Skateboarding. Konami's skate franchise has now been given the 'Evolution' tag to capitalise on the popularity of the publisher's Pro Evolution Soccer games. Don't be fooled, though. Silky skills are far from evident here.

EVOLUTION SKATEBOARDING

If this is evolution, we want our tails back.

Don't be fooled by the 'Evolution' tag. Unlike Konami's heralded soccer series, the Evolution here doesn't denote a bold step into the beyond. It's more like the dictionary's lesser known definition of 'Evolution': An exercise carried out in accordance with a set procedure or plan. So more unimaginative skatey tasks set against a freedomobliterating time limit, then!

The game's main Arcade mode is broken down into seven stages. These vary depending on which skater you've selected (there are eight to choose from) and comprise of seven tasks, five of which must be completed before the next stage is unlocked. These tasks involve the standard skate fodder of achieving high scores, pulling off long combos, collecting floaty items and also a challenge which is unique to the stage. However, those hoping to rip straight into this game with the ease of Hawk's efforts will be sorely disappointed by the control system from hell and some bland level design.

Admittedly, the look of the game is mightily enticing with a bold, coin-op sheen that's guaranteed to get it noticed. But stare closer and you'll notice that skaters are heinously out of proportion to their boards, and the amount of texture in the stages varies greatly from level to level, getting noticeably worse as you go on. Like we said, the stages are also poorly

constructed and hard to navigate (probably why the developer included an on-screen map). All too often your skating lines come to an abrupt end leaving you nowhere to go except for dead ends where you must repeatedly bounce off the walls to get back out. Ramps, rails and kickers are also seemingly placed in random locations that hinder your creativity rather than encourage it, posing as useless obstacles to avoid rather than the essential link to obtaining astronomical scores in a combo run.

Not that you'll be bowled over by the points on offer in this game. Varied tricks are in short supply and linking them together is a cumbersome and highly tedious affair - especially given that the controls are so messed-up and unresponsive.

Evolution Skateboardina does get some elements right though - like the way in which you can customise all aspects of your board, right down to the grip tape and underside graphics. The inclusion of boss characters to battle, although not really in keeping with the style of the game, offers welcome variety to the monotony and frustration generated by the standard stages.

Tony Hawk's Pro Skater 4 was always going to be a tough act to follow, but the truth is, this game isn't even as good as the Hawkster's first session on PSone. Committing the cardinal sin of sending the player into a situation where it's inevitable that their skating line will come to an abrupt halt is all the proof you need that Konami, for all its prowess on the football field, clearly knows truck all about skating games.

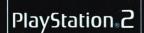

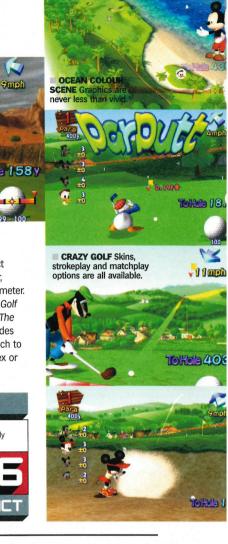

School's out and the crew are ready to spend their summer on the beach, but someone's nicked all the sand. There's a mystery to solve and only freaky-looking kids in safety helmets can solve it in a 3D platformer way.

You begin in the holiday resort of Ocean Shore where you must swap between the four team members and find clues about what to do next. You're often challenged to an extreme sport competition; win, and you get a clue. Otherwise, it's a case of pottering around and shooting robots with hockey pucks. It's as dull as it sounds.

You are given freedom, but this doesn't exactly pepper you with options. Consequently you end up wandering around, waiting for something to happen. Simply getting from A to B is frustrating, despite the fact that you have a choice of transport. Walking around on foot is sluggish zipping about on skateboards or in-line skates would be

preferable, if getting yourself unhooked from the scenery wasn't such trouble.

What the game does do well is incorporate cutscenes with in-game action, providing the feel of an interactive cartoon. In this respect, it shows more appreciation of its source material than any Simpsons game, and should please fans of the show. But if you're looking for decent gameplay, whatever your age, you won't find it in this turkey.

But *Disney Golf* has none of the wackiness associated with the House Of Mouse's classic cartoonery. There are no dancing teacups or flying elephants, no *Zippedy Doo-Dah* or *I'm The King Of The Swingers* (although the latter would have been apt). Instead, it's a surprisingly playable golf game.

Of course, this isn't an entirely *straight* game of golf. There are several recognisable and realistic modes of play – Strokeplay, Matchplay and Skins, plus combination play for a pair of two-player teams, Long Drive or Near Pin contests and a Challenge option where you play against AI characters. Each toon has their own playing style. Donald Duck is a good all-rounder, while Goofy is a power player with a hefty swing. You can set handicaps and view 3D fly-bys of the six available courses, including tropical and mountain landscapes with 18 holes set in

the American desert. Arcade-wise, golfers can select power-ups to enhance play, sending the ball further, negating wind effects and slowing down the swing meter.

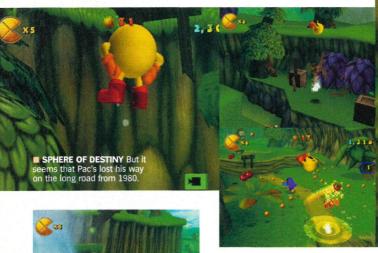

PAC-MAN WORLD 2 The original videogame hero chomps his way onto PS2.

The pill-popping, ghost-munching yellow blob is the most enduring gaming icon of them all. He's old enough to be Lara Croft's grandpa, yet, despite a sickly Disneyfied makeover, he's still turning heads well into his retirement years.

These days he's less concerned with the old 'twitch gaming' that made his original outings a severe test for the most hardcore of players. The Pac-Man of 2003 wants to be Mario, and as such has borrowed just about every 3D platforming trick in the book.

Pac-Man's mission in this seguel to the PSone 20th anniversary game, Pac-Man World, is to recover the golden fruit stolen from the magical tree that grows in Pac-Village, the capital of Pac-Land. Things were a lot simpler back in the days when the fruit just appeared out of nothingness in a maze, but the same bunch of sneaky ghosts are still responsible for the thieving.

So it's platform adventure time for Pac, as he leaves the security of his extended family of arcade relations and learns some of the best moves from the most wellestablished modern stars. He can spin like Sonic the Hedgehog, turn metal like Mario and leap like Klonoa. The familiar dots and power pills are tucked away in

hard-to-reach locations for anyone who wants a 100% rating, although the levels can be completed without having to eat them all. As long as you make it to

your goal, having successfully tackled various pitfalls along the way, the game can be finished very quickly.

There are seven themed worlds to negotiate, each featuring a handful of separate levels, but Pac-Man World 2 isn't

remotely new. All of the usual level clichés are present and correct, from slippy-slidey ice worlds to underwater reefs to Lava Land, and there's usually a new gameplay feature added for good measure in each - trampolines to bounce on, flippers for swimming, ice skates and so on.

Some of the game's levels work a treat, but others do feel like they were tacked on to extend the playing time, while the wobbly camera can be enough to induce motion sickness. However, there is something strangely amusing about watching a beach ball with arms, legs and a face scampering around a cartoon forest, and most of the levels are short enough not to outstay their welcome.

Since the original Pac-Man was a ground-breaking game, it would have been nice to see Namco do something a little more adventurous with him - lop off his limbs and have him rolling around like Marble Madness, perhaps. Instead, there's a retro arcade where various old-skool Pac-Man games can be unlocked. Unfortunately, this only serves as insight into just how many times the original genius idea was diluted before Namco thought, "Stuff this, let's just make a Mario clone."

Pac-Man World 2 is simple and unoriginal stuff, yet the cute character design and colourful worlds do make it mildly diverting. While there may be life left in the old boy yet, we can't help but wonder if those pills have finally gone to his head.

There are 30 in all, which, while fun to play, are offensively short-lived. Up to four players can take control of one of six characters including Shrek, Lord Farquaad, Princess Fiona and Donkey (all of whom are voiceless and have big heads), to compete in contests such as split-screen racing, onion tennis and a daft dragon chase. The victor of the game is the player who's collected the most bugs, which are then pulped into precious juice. Whoever collects the most juice over all 30 games is the winner.

Shrek Super Party is a colourful romp but it lacks the endearing humour and charm that made the movie a success in the first place. The animated flick appealed to people of all ages on several levels; this game will only appeal to the under nines with its 30 all-too-similar levels - by no means 'super' for the money you'll pay. What's more, you fear that the target audience are all too busy playing Harry Potter to care.

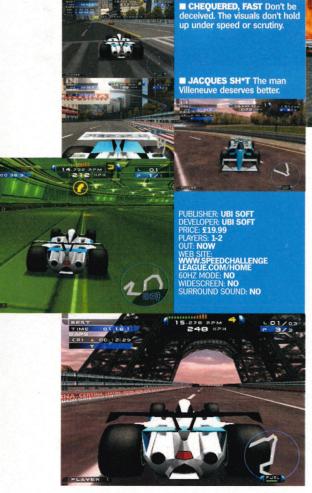

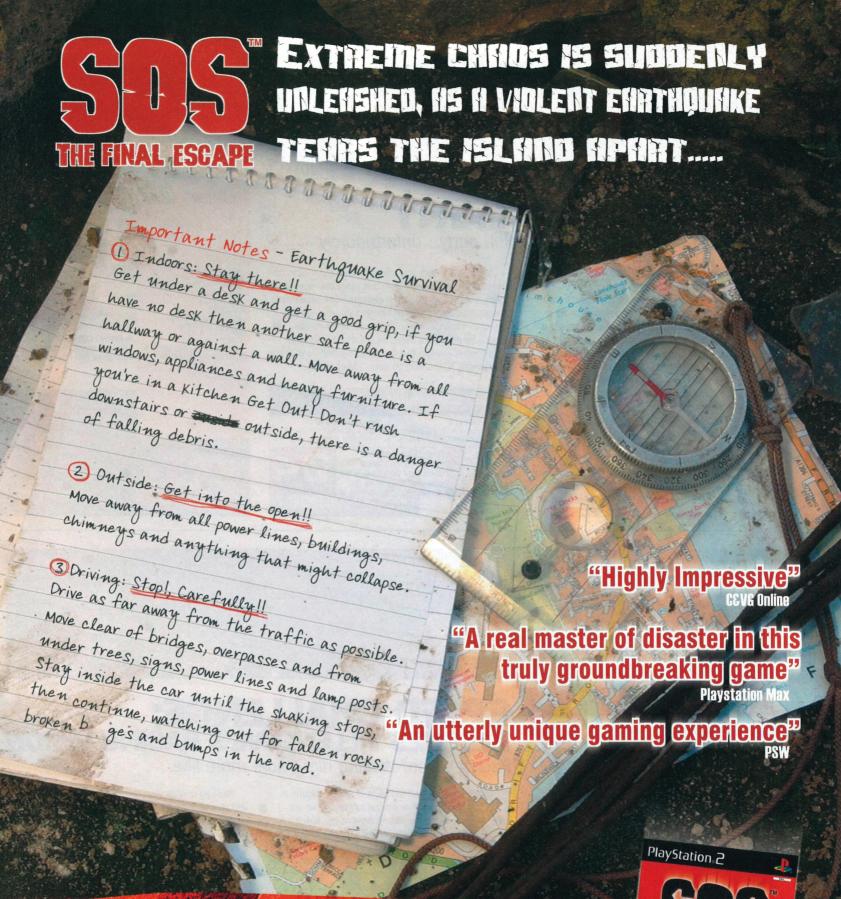
Hang on. Isn't the point of setting a game in 'the future' that you get to improve on our messy and mundane present, not turn it into a lumpen pain in the ass? Despite having F1 driver Villeneuve on board as a technical advisor, Speed Challenge seems to pretty much ignore his actual experience, opting instead to embrace his 'vision'. And so we pop into the year 2027, where competitors race 'remote control' style from virtual pods - which is also how we imagine this title was developed. Load the disc and you get an extensive range of

gameplay modes rendered nigh-on irrelevant by clichéd track design (Paris track with Eiffel Tower, India with Tai Mahal, etc) and frustratingly wayward handling. Select a course with anything other than gentle corners and you'll spend your time intermittently jamming your finger on either the accelerator or the brake. To put it another way, there's no room for skilful finesse at the wheel when the real obstacle to victory is your own vehicle.

You can change your car's setup, alter the weather and choose from a series of themed challenges based on course length, geography and imposed handicaps like oversteer and understeer. But you're unlikely to care. PS2 is blessed with a stack of quality racing games, and when you can pick up a copy of GT3 for the same price as this woeful underachiever, there's no room for Speed Challenge on your shopping list.

Air Ranger Rescue Helicopter is the budget airline of chopper games. It provides a glamour-free but eminently solid experience at a low price. It does what it promises,

doesn't outstay its welcome and, as such, it proves to be a pleasant surprise in an area of the gaming world where 'cut price' often means unremitting tripe.

The idea is simple enough. Spread over four locations (urban, coastal, mountainous, forest) you pilot one of a trio of choppers on missions that require careful control and a steady nerve for success. Land rescue, sea rescue (complete with colleague Bob dangling on a winch), mountain rescue (like land rescue but with rotorknackering trees and high winds), transportation and firefighting missions. Admittedly, the graphics are unlikely to make your PlayStation 2 break out into a sweat, but they're compensated by enjoyably challenging gameplay based around the control of the helicopters themselves. Making fine adjustments to your position while you hover dangerously close to a capsizing cruise ship, for example, is really quite tricky, but for once, that's the

whole point. Put a time limit on each of the missions and you get a game that nudges you into that all important 'one more go' territory.

Sadly, however, there's not nearly enough going on in Air Ranger Rescue Helicopter to warrant more than a few plays. This, more than any other consideration. makes the £15 being asked seem rather steep. Still, if you loved City Crisis and have been gagging for more of the same ever since, this will certainly be worth the

On the other hand, if you don't enjoy handing over £40 for unplayable tosh, you might prefer to give it a miss. It's essentially the ancient Mega Drive title Road Rash on snow, with all the fun and playability surgically removed. As an escapee from some future prison, you've got to slide down a mountain while bashing an endless swarm of pursuers. There's a bundle of pro snowboarders to pick from too - presumably refugees from some other snowboarding title who got lost in development.

The combat is completely hit-and-miss - the most reliable technique is to tap the punch and kick buttons as fast as possible. And having so many bad guys all over the place makes the racing aspect frustrating. Luckily, most of them are not particularly tough - punch them a couple of times and they vanish in a puff of smoke.

The graphics are especially lacklustre. There is a consistently smooth frame rate, but the textures and animations don't look even halfway finished. The lesser characters are badly sculpted blobs, with only the occasional boss looking like the designers have spent any time on him. Quite what Evolution Snowboarding is doing on the same label as MGS2 and Pro Evolution Soccer is anybody's guess.

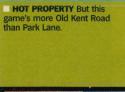

But Extreme Stunts is a new breed of Lego experience which is best described as GTA meets Stuntman meets Tony Hawk's, for kids. Wow!

You take the role of stuntman and Lego Island resident Pepper Roni (get it?). His priority is to complete stunt challenges for a film studio, shooting on various locations around the island. These begin with a standard car pursuit but eventually there are bikes, jet skis and planes for Pepper to show off his dexterity and daring.

Between stunt jobs, Pepper roams the island, chatting to the yellow-headed inhabitants and completing various mini challenges such as acquiring a drivers' licence which lets you to take any car you fancy - like GTA, without the hand gestures and automatic weaponry. Pepper can also grab a skateboard out of his backpack to flip and grind his way through the town.

If that sounds appealing, remember: it is aimed at kids, so the challenges are simple. But this shouldn't detract from the fact that there's a very tight control system, adequate graphics and decent replay value.

This is inoffensive, simple gaming. More importantly, it's playable and doesn't treat the younger gamer like a complete incompetent. So if a little 'un needs something to do during a Sunny Delight comedown, this is definitely worth a look.

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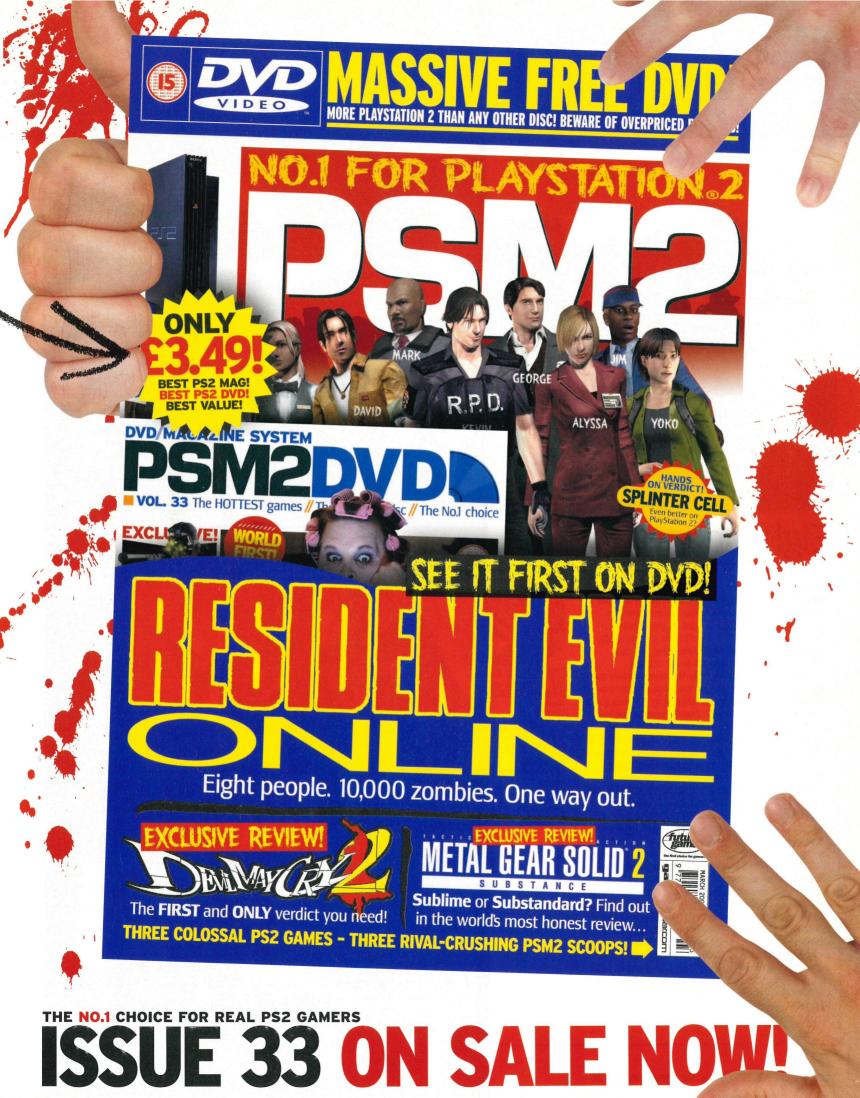

FILM: During the Cold War paranoia of the Fifties, Hollywood was infested with B-movie creature features like *Them!* and *Tarantula*, that have since entered the cramped hall of cult classics. *Eight Legged Freaks* is a nod and a wink to those movies; its tale of toxic waste creating giant spiders in Arizona providing the ideal scenario for cheap and cheerful action comedy.

All the genre staples are here: The small western town on its uppers; The bespectacled kid who's smarter than the adults; The corrupt local businessman; The new guy in town with something to prove (David Arquette); The feisty sheriff (Kari Wuhrer) who rallies the locals against the mutant threat. The only new element thrown into the mix is that model beasties have been replaced by the magic of CGI, resulting in some truly grotesque hairy-legged horrors that'll have arachnophobes in a cold panic.

A surprise summer box office hit, Eight Legged Freaks is fun but flawed. Clearly aiming for the irresistible mix of laughs, thrills and community spirit that made giant mutant worms-fest Tremors such a joy, Eight Legged Freaks rarely comes close. While Tremors triumphed by playing it relatively straight, Freaks often verges on parody. And if the characters are too busy sticking a collective tongue in cheek to seem sufficiently petrified by bloody great web-spinners laying waste to their town, why should the audience be? **5/10**

EXTRAS: The group commentary brings together Kiwi Director Ellory Elkayem, Producer Dean 'Independence Day' Devlin and actors David Arquette and Rick Overton for an enthusiastic chat. 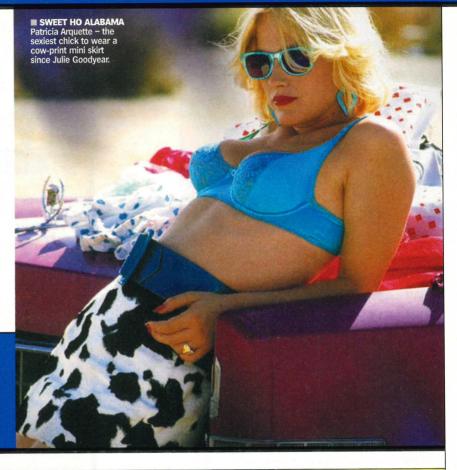

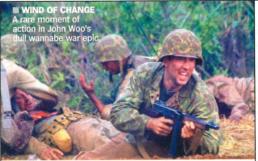

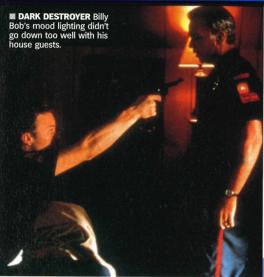

On-screen there was crime everywhere, apart from the chocolate factory - unless you count Veruca Salt's theft of a gobstopper as a heinous felony. Don your bulletproof vests, here come the best spines of 1971.

Before it became a well-known high street clothes shop, THE FRENCH CONNECTION was one of the definitive crime and action films featuring hard-talking Gene Hackman and one of cinema's best ever driving scenes. It's gritty, shocking and well worth your hardearned cash. Talking of gritty, 1971 also saw the birth of a complicated man. SHAFT was blaxploitation's defining moment combining violent action, great hair and smooth tunes. Damn straight.

THE BEATLES SPLIT UP, but ladies started wearing hot

This was also a year that bought us some outstanding hardcases. GET CARTER saw Michael Caine tearing up Newcastle as a vicious, unstoppable London gangster. throwing people off rooftops. Smashing. And going up against him was **DIRTY HARRY** who proved that Clint Eastwood wasn't just a cowboy and that cops could be just as dangerous as robbers.

The human mind of 1971's cinema was a frail thing. STRAW DOGS was the controversial film from Sam Peckinpah in which an American escapes to England but comes face-to-face with extremist locals and ends up in a bloodbath. Also shunned by the censor was Kubrick's dark pantomime future of A CLOCKWORK ORANGE. More baffling than brutal now, but still a cinematic treat.

Back in the US, Clint Eastwood's PLAY MISTY FOR ME was the original Fatal Attraction with a DJ plagued by a beautiful but tragically psychotic fan. But hey, let's retreat from the crime-filled real world and finish in a land of pure imagination. WILLY WONKA AND THE CHOCOLATE **FACTORY**, the strange musical tale of a poor boy's adventure in the greatest factory in the world still looks camp, colourful and marvellous.

"WHEN THERE'S NO more room in hell, the dead will walk the earth." That's the tagline for the second, and best instalment in Romero's seminal Dead trilogy. With the undead apocalypse in

full swing, four survivors hole themselves up in a Pittsburgh mall in an attempt to fend off brain-gobbling zombies and a gang of deranged bikers. Romero replaces the claustrophobia of Night Of The Living Dead with bravura

action sequences and jet-black comedy, delivering a laser guided satire on consumer culture and arguably the best zombie flick ever made. Without Resident Evil.



When I was a child, I was easily scared. I was not terrified by bullies or heights. What scared me were ghosts. Japanese horror samurai films and special effects films, I just could not watch. To quote my parents, I was

"a very sensitive child." After watching horror, I always had nightmares that were continuations of the film. My father forced me to watch such films. He made me sit right in front of the TV. I'd cover my eyes and hide under the table. When I heard what was going on, I covered my ears. But my father always gave me reports of what was taking place. "Hideo, watch!" he always said. The next day, my mother did re-enactments of the film. Growing up in this environment didn't help me get used to horror films.

To remain the movie boy I was, I forced myself to watch a TV programme on horror films. It featured a film that changed my life - Dawn Of The Dead. Scenes from DOTD shown along with footage from the occult film The Omen were different. They were accompanied by disco music, and SWAT teams were hunting zombies in a shopping mall. "What the hell is this!?" I was shocked, as i hit on the head. "Is this horror? No. It can't be! I can handle this!" It got rid of my negative perspective, freeing me of my weakness as a film fan in a pleasant way.

It was the setting that did it. Conventional horror films featured a mansion in the woods at night, but here was a shopping mall in broad daylight! It was a metaphor for 'America the consumer society'. The SWAT teams represented American gun society and the zombies, the blue collar workers. This ironic schema made it more than a horror. It did not feature 'invisible fear' (the occult) but instead 'fear embedded in everyday life'. Anyone could become a zombie. There are nobodies everywhere. This is the philosophical element of zombie films.

DOTD contains all means of scaring people. You see a lot of the 'suddenly appearing in front of the camera' done in most shocker films. You also see the camera fixed, as something approaches steadily. The use of static fear adds to the experience, too - when surrounded by zombies, one of the characters goes through every key to open a door. The zombies come closer. Just before the zombies take a bite, he gets the right key. And limiting the amount of information provided makes the audience use their imagination. Such techniques are orthodox, but they have more taste than grotesque visuals, and became the standard in zombie films that followed.

The gameplay of MGS, involving a closed 3D maze composed of air ducts and elevators, is straight out of DOTD. MGS is DOTD if you replace soldiers with zombies. In the MSX versions of Metal Gear, the player has security card keys 1 through 9. The player had to select the right key for each door every time. Going through a stack of card keys, as if going through a set of keys while being chased by zombies - it was this tension that I wanted to implement. The PSone MGS was supposed to feature this, but my staff told me it was too troublesome. However, I do pay homage to DOTD in MGS. The hole in the wall of the room where the ArmsTech president is kept hostage is cemented over. In DOTD, Peter and the gang build a wall out of wood and block a hallway as disguise.

Those who fear the most are best at creating the most scary films and games. At one time, I considered purchasing the rights to DOTD to create a game that takes place in a mall. But because it is too great a film for me, and because the concept of zombies is too popular in videogames, this has not happened yet.

How can one implement the concept of 'turning the eaten into zombies?' I have an answer: an online zombie game. Players enter a digital world with an objective to eliminate zombies. If you're eaten, you become a zombie. You can no longer control your character. You just roam around in this online world, but you still have to pay. To play again, you must enter as a new character. If this character is eaten, he also becomes a zombie. Now you are two zombies, you have to pay twice the money. If you don't play as another new character and kill your 'zombie selves,' you'll have to keep on paying multiple fees. The number of zombies keeps on increasing. If you can't kill your zombie selves, you can ask your friend to do it for you. It's a zombie scheme instead of a pyramid scheme!

I would love to create such a game. But I don't want to fight zombies, get bitten and become a zombie myself. To borrow the words of Roger from DOTD, "There's a lot to get done before... before you can afford to lose me..."

fantasy', 'I blame the parents' and so on. But such a hackneyed circle of argument can have little practical use. Instead, I'd like to ask what the industry is doing to address this issue? What can be done?

The most interesting game I've seen recently is *The Getaway* because it offers a new level of cinematic quality. The language and violence is brutal and gritty, and shows increasing advances in realism. And, of course, guns are integral. However, other brilliant games of 2002 include *Ico*, *Rez* and *Herdy Gerdy* – not a firearm in sight. Is blatant graphic violence a necessity for a successful videogame? Perhaps not. But will any major publisher take the risk to market a big budget action game that doesn't (allegedly) glorify gun violence?

Regardless of whether it is right or wrong, I believe the videogames industry is uniquely poised to deliver that exact ultimate compromise. Games don't sell purely for their violent content. It's gameplay that matters. We need a game with mass-market appeal to convert the non-digital generation and give videogaming the positive image it so deserves. I don't have an answer, but whoever finds one will no doubt become very, very rich.

Great letter, Richard, and a valuable perspective on the videogame violence debate that has surfaced again recently. While it's always depressing to see politicians, journalists and rent-a-quote moralisers pontificating about videogames without any attempt to even vaguely research the culture they're damning, we're not entirely innocent. When Culture Secretary Kim Howells talks about the "pornography of violence," you can't ignore the fact that games such as The Getaway, Hitman 2 and Mortal Kombat do delight in their brutality, with very little concession to a context of art or morality. We enjoy the guilty pleasures of videogame violence as much as every well-balanced gamer, but maybe it could sometimes be

I would like to know if games such as Resident Evil Online will be made 'online only' – and would this mean that people who are unable to afford online gaming will be left out and left behind?

There will be no sudden shift from offline to online gaming. In reality, less than five percent of games on the 2003 release schedule are touting online options, and in most cases this is only a bonus to a full offline game. Resident Evil Online is an exception, as 'online only', but games have to make this step forward at some point. Take solace in the fact that broadband costs are falling all the time; the advent of online gaming should hasten this trend.

COMPOSE YOURSELF

Since buying a PS2 six months ago, I have spent more time playing MTV Music Generator 2 and eJay Clubworld than anything else. I've made over 20 tracks varying from ambient to techno which I have put onto CD and MiniDisc. Everyone who has heard them says I should send them to record companies but (at risk of sounding a little big headed) I am worried that because I have used MTV and eJay samples, there is nothing I can do to stop a record company using my ideas. Also, once I have sent it off, I have no way of proving the music came from me. Is there anything I can do?

I have used an optical lead from my PS2 to record. The digital quality is so good that friends who are DJs say they want to use my tracks. Please can you advise me whether I would get into trouble if I made copies of my work or if I would be breaking the law in any way?

The samples in MTV Music Generator and eJay Clubworld are copyright free, meaning it's fine for you to press up copies of your tunes and distribute them to friends or even commercially. FREEDOM FOR MY PEOPLE

How long are we going to allow the self-appointed arbitrators of taste within the console industry decide for us that open-ended/freeform games (and to a lesser extent strategy games) are solely the preserve of PCs? This is a self-perpetuating belief: publishers decide that console gamers do not want an involving, complex strategy game, and so they are not published. Console gamers therefore never express an interest in these games and this is taken as validation of the publisher's original belief. It's as ludicrous as saying that paperback readers want different books than hardback readers.

Look at GTA: Vice City. What is its secret? It's a non-linear game, but one which allows traditional console action
