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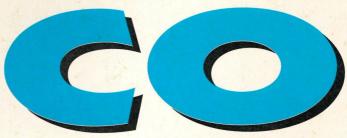
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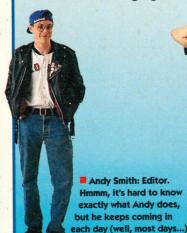

Both companies have been fiddling around with the idea for months, but now they are ready to take the plunge and go console full-time. HMV are giving the green light to a foot-dipping exercise they first started

It's a far cry from the old days when console games (and computer games) were viewed as just another flash in the pan fad. Now, instead of coming home and sticking Prince on their stereos, people are actually coming home and plugging straight into their Sega instead! Well, if you can't beat 'em, join 'em...

Now what does this hold? A packet of crisps? A couple of spam sarnies? Perhaps a carton of milk? (Hmmm, what about a doorstop?)



SEGA BEAT NINTENDO

EGA ARE TROUNCING Nintendo in every department, and that's official. New figures from CTW (the computer industry's trade newspaper) show the console leaders whipping the white luncheon boxes on every format – in other words, with both the 8 and 16-bit machines.

For the record, the nationwide survey showed that 88% of computer dealers stocked Sega Mega Drive titles, while the SNES was left trailing behind miserably at a mere 57%. And before that Nintendo lover in the corner – yes, you, the one in the tank top – starts yelling about the SNES only being out since March this year, consider the 8-bit evidence:

84% of dealers carry Master System software; only 64% support the NES. Nuff said?

Now I'm not one to stir up vitriolic feelings between two parties, but Nintendo owners? Boys, you're not even in the same league...

Oh, here's another one.

Now what can we say about this? Well, it doesn't look like a lunchbox, so that's a good start... but, oh dear, it's not that much better, is it?



SMALL TALK .

EFORE EVERYONE EXPLODES into a panic about Sega's new security chip which has been designed to stop import carts running on domestic Mega Drives, it's worth noting that when we stuffed a UK version of Ayrton Senna's Super Monaco G.P. 2 into a Jap Mega Drive, it worked fine.

Could Sega be using scare tactics? Or are their "new" chips totally duff? We'll keep you informed.

ICROPROSE, THE FLIGHT simulation experts, will be releasing the famous F-16 on the Mega Drive – the only question being when. Sega are currently giving it the full test treatment, but Microprose are unwilling to give a release date.

They're talking about a February '93 release (although word on the streets is for something earlier).

Microprose and the new Mega CD? A marriage made in heaven, surely?

EQUELS: E.A. ARE CURRENTLY working on the second instalments to *Road Rash* (due out at Christmas) and the brilliant *Desert Strike* (due out next March).

Although they're still "writing the stories," according to their marketing boss Simon Jeffery, E.A. are now working hard and fast on the new projects.

We'll be previewing the games as soon as we can.

EGA HAVE JUST BEEN STUNG for a cool \$40 million, courtesy of a few high-flying suits who thought they knew better than the rest of the console industry.

The legal fight was with an inventor who created and patented a different and very technical method of creating graphics. Nintendo and Atari both paid up, but Sega fought and lost in a very, very spectacular manner. Ouch.

HE MEGA CD WILL BE released with three CDs and an 8 Megabit cartridge, so new buyers will now be able to get into their little pride and joy virtually straightaway.

Unfortunately, the main CD disk will not be the sequel to *Sonic* as originally thought, but *Sherlock Holmes* – a huge role-playing game normally seen on PCs and computers of that ilk.

The game should make good use of the Mega CD's capabilities though.

OMARK ARE SET TO DO FAB things in the next couple of months. *MiG 29*, for example, is already set for a November release. It's an *After Burner-esque* chase-and-destroy kinda game (but hopefully a lot better).

Then there's *Steel Talons* and *Road Riot 4WD*, both out in the States under the Tengen banner. They could reach the UK in the spring of '93.

AMSTRAD PLAY HOST TO SEGA

EGA ARE EXPANDING YET AGAIN – but this time they're joining forces with Amstrad to produce a hybrid PC/console computer called the Mega PC. Scheduled for release in the autumn at £900, the dual-chip machine will run 16-bit carts, Mega CD discs (when they start arriving) and regular 3.5 inch diskettes.

Hmmmm... And all this following Sega's last disastrous attempt with the Teradrive – another cross-breed device.

Despite the backing of two market leaders (IBM and Sega), the machine's £1,000 asking price obviously put a lot of people off – it's understandable too.

Sega Europe's boss, Nick Alexander, however, reckons this brand new project will "build up the Mega Drive base in homes that have PCs."

We rang Amstrad's marketing department to find out what they thought, and they told us: "We don't know any-

thing about it." Er, all very strange really.

Either their marketing bods are sharper than acid drops, or there has never been a better excuse for getting your parents to buy you a home computer.

Well, you heard it here first, don't forget...

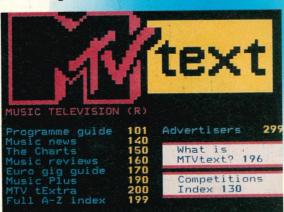

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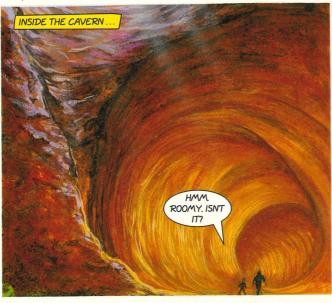












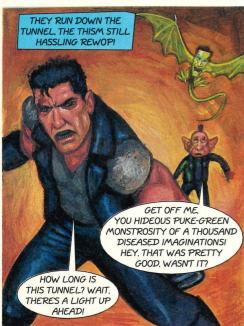




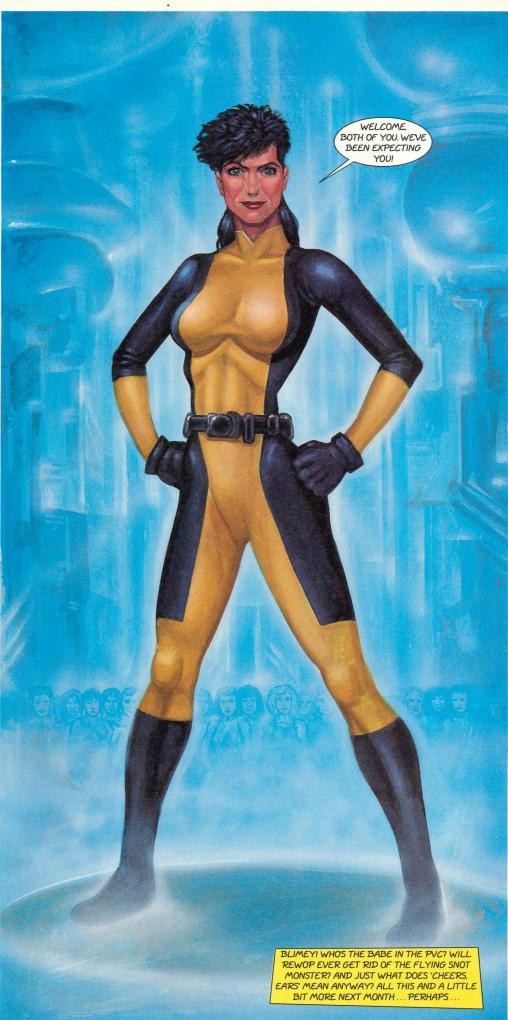












RE DOES YOU

best things in life are free.

Boolah! Whoever said that was either some sort of pinko hippy relic from the '60s or just, erm, plain mental. Odds on he never paid £35 for a brand new Sega game. What a sponger! Ronnie Dungan splits his cart up into loads of useless segments and tells you where your readies go...

KAY, IT'S TRUE. THERE ARE. compared to Sega, plenty of cheaper things you can do with your time - trainspotting or stamp collecting, for example - but these are strictly for sadists. And, unlike Sonic, trains and stamps look crap on T-Shirts.

Yes, there's a price to pay if you want to make the most out of your Sega, and, as you may have noticed, it's very very expensive one.

Even though compact discs are vastly overpriced - they only cost around ten pence to make - you can still buy three good ones (or three crap ones) for the price of one Sega cartridge.

So who's to blame? Well, the finger of suspicion points firmly at Sega.

There's not a lot of room for doubt. There they are, smoking pistol in hand, standing over the body. Bang to rights, as they say...

A RIP-OFF!

It seems like just another classic example of THE MAN ripping off THE KIDS. The who? THE MAN! You know who he is, don't you? THE MAN appears in our

lives many times and in many forms too many forms to be exact - and it's his job to stop you and everyone else enjoying themselves.

He pretends he's on your side, but really he's just there to put you down.

He'll tempt you with promises of a good time, but then snatch away the candy at the last moment. Git!

He releases crap records - and then

puts their price up. He flaunts designer labels in front of your face - and then flaunts another once you've bought it. Rather sick, isn't it?

HIS WORST CRIME

Perhaps THE MAN's most heinous crime to date has been with video games. That's video games in general, because, for once at least, Sega and Nintendo players are united in sharing one common grievance.

Once again, THE MAN dangles the prospect of a good time in THE KIDS' faces by bombarding them with bright, colourful adverts and fantastic looking games - and once again he says (in a creepy Vincent Price kinda voice): "£35 a throw please. Ha, ha, ha, you fools!"

But what can you do? If you want to play Sega games you have to pay hard earned wodges for cartridges. Sadly, THE MAN is all too aware of this.

Never give a sucker an even break. That's his motto.

A RED HERRING

But whoa there, Lesley! Can this really be right? Are those lovely people at Sega really in league with THE MAN? Is Sonic hanging out with the wrong kind of people? Nah, 'course not.

So release that hedgehog. Sonic is innocent... Okay, okay, so Sonic doesn't actually run Sega - blue hedgehogs don't tend to occupy high power execu-

tive positions - but I can dream, can't I?... Believe me. I was as shocked as the next man when I found out. Er, if I've burst anyone's

bubble then please forgive me. At least Santa Claus is real, Elvis lives and the Easter Bunny isn't make-believe.

So will you stand up Nick Alexander, top banana at Sega Europe, and be honest - aren't Sega cartridges just a teeny weeny bit expensive?

"It's all a bit of a red herring actually." says Nick. "When you get down to comparing our selling price and the US selling price, there's only about a five to ten percent difference.

'We pay more duty, there's a 17.5% sales tax and US dealers work on an average margin of 15% - compared to an average retailer margin here of between 25% and 30%.

"So as regards the manufacturer's selling price, the difference is not that great. You can get the odd product for a budget price over in the US (because it hasn't sold well) while it's full price over here, but that's fairly rare."

MORE MONEY!

And what does all that mean? Well, basically, what Nick Alexander's saying is that it costs a lot more for Sega to actually get the cartridges into the UK and sell them here - compared to the same process in the US.

There's also the fact that the British shopkeeper always takes a bigger cut anyway (he probably doesn't sell as many carts as a US dealer, ya see).

So everyone gets a slice and a lot of people are making a lot of money somewhere along the line.

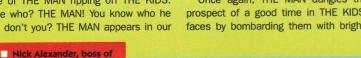
OTHER COSTS...

There are also other things to take into account. The microchips that go inside the games don't come cheap, remember, and you can bet the manufacturers which supply 'em to Sega are making a healthy living out of it.

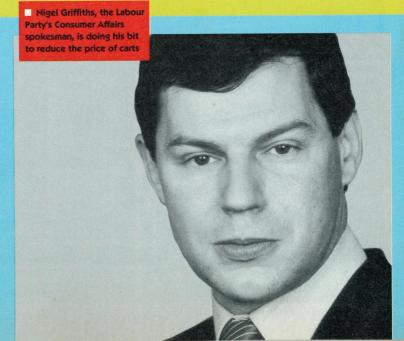
Each chip also has to have a security device to prevent nasty pirate chappies going around ripping people off left, right and centre. Surprise surprise, this too costs money...

In fact, manufacturing costs in general are going up all the time. A lot of games are no longer on tiny 2 Megabit carts, for instance - they're 4 Megabit or even 8 Megabit affairs.

As a rough rule of thumb, you may have already noticed that the bigger the

game, the bigger the price-tag. Sadly, this rule doesn't affect the quality of new titles. If you buy a turkey it won't cost any less. You pays your money and you takes your choice.

Sega do their best to control cart quality, but not everyone's gonna be a winner and the same manufacturing, shipping duties and royalties still have to be paid, don't forget.

NO CHANGE

So it looks very much as though prices are going to remain the same for some time to come. They're certainly in no hurry to review their pricing policy.

The problem is, Sega are a very big company. Big with a capital B. I. G. You don't mess with guys as big as these because it could end up costing you a lot of money. Many of the people in "the

biz" are keeping shtum – even if they do think cartridges are too expensive – particularly those companies that publish games for Sega.

But help may well be at hand. Riding in from the sun (well, Edinburgh to be exact) is the Labour Party's Consumer Affairs spokesman, Nigel Griffiths.

TARZAN HELPS

He recently spearheaded a campaign to investigate the price of music CDs in the UK – an equally prickly problem which is currently being looked into by both The Office Of Fair Trading and the British Government.

And now he's about to do the same with video game cartridge prices too. He's even gone so far as to bring the matter to the attention of The Trade and Industry Secretary, Michael Heseltine.

That's right – the man they like to call Tarzan (we can see why too...).

"I'd certainly be interested in pursuing cartridge prices," says Griffiths, "and I will be able to take it up with the Minister – Michael Heseltine – and The Office Of Fair Trading. So we'll be firing with both barrels.

"I will ask the Director General of the Office Of Fair Trading whether the high prices are justifiable and whether or not a monopoly exists here.

"Michael Heseltine has extensive powers. He can order price reductions if he wishes – and he doesn't even have to hold a hearing." brought to enough people's attention, and that's exactly what Nigel Griffiths hopes will happen, it may cause Sega enough discomfort and embarrassment to make them change their prices – if that's at all possible.

But as the old saying goes, you can never trust a politician. To Michael Heseltine, £35 for a game is probably not big money. After all, not so long ago, his blue-suited boys spent millions on the Gulf War – and that wasn't just a huge video game, was it? So just forget that dodgy Robotnik geezer, *Sonic.* It's Tarzan you should be

worrying about now.

WATCH OUT!

It may come to nothing, but on the other hand, an investigation into cartridge prices may well be less complex and prove to be more fruitful than the CD debate. The less firms that are involved, you see, the easier it is for the politicians to argue that Sega and Nintendo are exercising monopolistic control.

And talking of CDs (bearing in mind how cheap they are to produce), it will be interesting to see if Sega's new CD games will be any cheaper when they start to arrive in the UK next year.

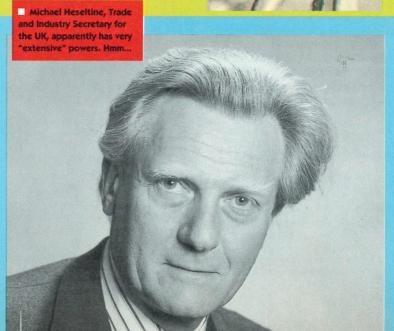

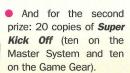

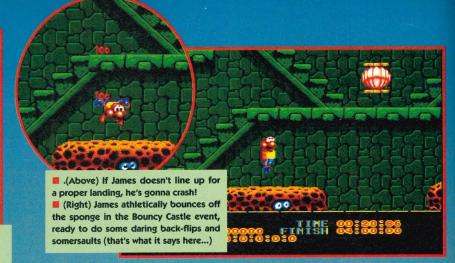

It's her job to protect her dozing chums from tourists' beach balls. Basically, Ceceelia just has to bop the balls out of harm's way with her nose.

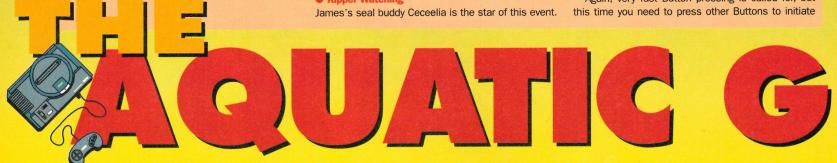
If a ball hits a seal he wakes up, and if the same seal gets hit again, he'll leave. The event is over when two seals have left.

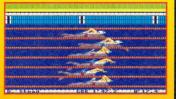

Now this is tough! Pond has to jump up and down on sponges and perform a set number of twists, turns and somersaults before the time limit runs out.

Feeding Time

Freddy Starfish is the main man here. You must keep his fishy pals full of sweets so that they don't get tempted by the goodies on the end of the fishermen's lines. If two fish get caught, the event finishes.

Like Kipper Watching, this one's a timed event and things really start to get frantic as the game develops - with Freddy rushing around like a mad thing, feeding his chums and trying to keep his bag of sweets stocked up (using the sweet dispensers on either side of the screen).

Shell Shooting

This is probably the second hardest event after the Bouncy Castle. James must jump onto the edge of limpets that scuttle along the ground, force them into the air and then catch 'em.

Anyone who really fancies a laff...

Now all he has to do is move left or right and pop the large balloons that hang over his head using the limpets he's just caught.

Of course, it's nowhere near as easy as that though, 'cos James still has to keep jumping around to avoid the poisonous limpets that scuttle about his finny feet. Again, you must complete the task within the given time limit.

Tour De Grass

Now this event is just plain silly. You're in control of Mark The Shark and must guide him over a course - on his shark unicycle. (Now get him to the finish line as quickly as possible!)

To keep Mark's speed up, you must move the joypad around in a clockwise direction (using a fast - but steady rhythm). And watch out for the crabs they can put a shark off, you know!

Leap Frog

Yup, F-fortesque Frog's back, but now the amphibian has to run a course similar to the 100m Splash (see above).

This time, however, old frogface has electric eel hurdles to jump (touch 'em and Frog loses speed and leaps into the air - very offputting). He's also got puddles to hop over.

All of these things tend to slow him down should you be a bit tardy on the jump Button. Good fun again, but the gameplay isn't very taxing.

Bonus Stages

Do well in a few events and you then get the chance to trade in some of your hard earned points for a shot at a cou-

ple of bonus events. The first involves PJ Penguin as he juggles balls in the air for a few minutes, and the second involves F-fortesque Frog as he highjumps his very distinctive green way towards yet more points.

So now you know what the individual games are like, how does the whole thing shape up? Well, ultimately, The Aquatic Games breaks no new ground.

The graphics are superb and there's tons of humour built-in (you actually discover more things about each event the more you play), but even though playing with a few friends is fun, the excitement wears off sooner than you think.

Love 'em or hate 'em, pinball machines are enjoying a new lease of life at the moment – what with *Dragon's Fury (Sega Power* 34: 90%) in the last ish 'n' all. We let loose our resident pinball wizard Dean Mortlock on this latest offering from E.A.



O INTO ANY POORLY LIT arcade hall and you'll usually find a couple of pinball machines lurking in the corner. They're an institution, part of British life, and we all love them (er, don't we?).

Pinball games on the screen, however, have mostly been a mixed bag. with most of them failing in some way or other to capture the "feel" of the real thing. Twisted Flipper is a good attempt, but it doesn't really compare with that other major pinball title – Dragon's Fury.

The game starts off very well, with a tumping version of "Dr Feelgood" by the Motley Crue (okay, not to everyone's taste, true, but a good soundtrack for this kind of game) accompanying the action and setting the scene (there's different music for each level).

Up to four players can take part and once you've made your decision you can then get into the meat of the game itself. The table is three screens high, with a set of flippers in each section.

To move onto the next level, you must complete a series of events and then flick the ball around the volume dial at the top of the table.

Performing a different set of tasks, however, will send you to a new bonus stage. This has you bouncing a steel ball into an army of rapidly approaching skeletons (very *Arkanoid-like*, but side-

During October 1989, these amazing things happened...

● The East German people's freedom to travel to Czechoslovakia was reinstated. ● The EC parliament voted to increase aid to Poland and Hungary. Pakistan formally re-acceded to the Commonwealth and became its 49th member state. S - The Sega Mag appeared in the UK for the first time (the title later became Sega Power and went on to become Britain's best-selling Sega magazine).

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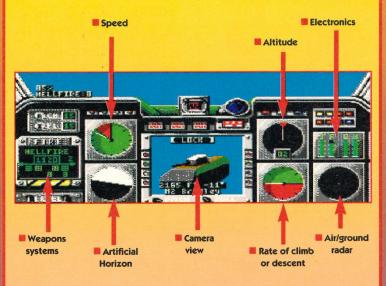

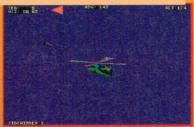

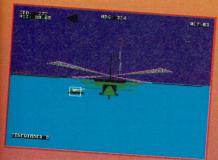

or out-run. Sure, there are plenty of nasties around, but the combat isn't as exciting as you'd think.

If they're proving a pest, swing round, chop the speed and wait for the hit percentages to get high enough for you to fire a missile. It's not particularly hectic.

On later levels though, you get aircraft after you as well, and then things do hot up nicely. Confusion reigns, and you can easily end up twisting round, firing missiles and shells blindly at things. Wasteful, but fun - at least, until you get hit. You don't go down instantly, but the more damage you take, the more unreliable your equipment becomes with things soon failing left, right and centre. It's not very pleasant.

On the graphical side of things, there are loads of views you can call up from the map screen. O IT'S TENNIS. GOOD GRIEF what can you say about tennis, eh? Well, you could say that it was a "sport" (originally devised by the Aztecs in the 16th century) that doubled as a form of ritualistic torture, but that wouldn't be true really, would it?

Why not forget all about tennis then and talk about something more interesting - like, say, what a crap programme "Eldorado" is? "Eldorado," eh? What a load of old nob. Well, that's that. Might

as well get back to tennis, I suppose. Anyway, Wimbledon, unfortunately, is a simulation of the famous "strawberries 'n' cream" tennis tournament.

I say "unfortunately" because (a) it's one of my favourite words, and (b) the Wimbledon tournament finished months ago and everyone's much more interested in the Olympics now, but there you go (hang on, Stuart - the Olympics finished yonks ago... - Andy).

Luckily though, that's nearly the only unfortunate thing about Wimbledon, 'cos it's a spiffingly playable game. You can pick this one up and be having fun inside 30 seconds.

And let's face it, in these get-up-andgo MTV-generation times the last thing you want to be doing is hanging around reading pages of fiddly little instructions

Wimbledon is immediately easy to play because there are only really two kinds of shot you can play: high or low. Okay, you can also spin the ball with the aid of the joypad (as your skill points

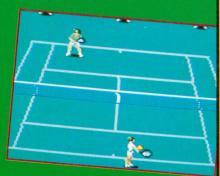

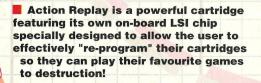

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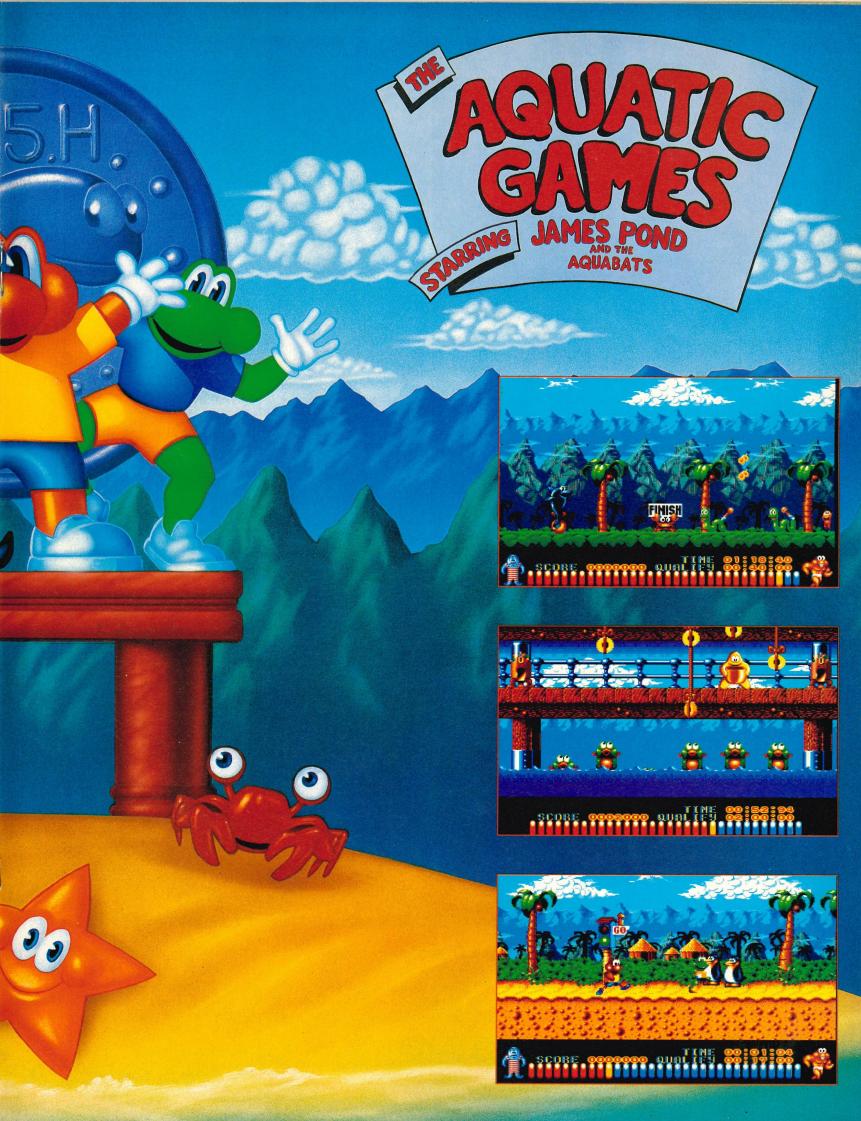

EL CTR NIC ARTS

Cart rental is a controversial topic at the moment. Sega Power fight through all the crap and find out what's going on

Sonic The Hedgehog is driving video dealers to distraction – but not because they're failing to get past Robotnik on Act 3 of the Labyrinth Zone. Oh no. The problem is, they want to rent out the little fella (well, all carts, in fact) and Sega won't let them! But the man from Sega, he finally say yes. Don't think your problems are over quite yet though... Our Tim Green jumps into the debate with all guns blazing...

VER THE PAST YEAR, THE issue of games rental has raged like Taz after a plate of chillies. While video dealers have all but bashed down Sega's front door for permission to rent, Sega have simply ummed and aahed. And it all comes down, predictably enough, to cash.

At the back of Sega's mind is: if we let kids rent games for £2.50 a time, who's gonna buy them for £40?

And if no-one buys our games, our profits will plunge... And then what will our Japanese shareholders say?

Even so, Sega have recognised the key role video shops could play in spreading the Sega craze.

After all, they stay open later than the high-street shops and because they're common in residential areas they're more accessible too.

Most importantly, Sega see the kind of person who rents, say, "The Terminator" on video (18 year olds and over only, of course... ahem) as just the kind of person who'd be interested in the game of the film too.

THE HOUSE RULES

Sega knew very well that its "target market" could be found browsing video library shelves. That's why, after much wrangling, they carved out a deal. Here are the points which affect you:

- Only 114 games will be available in the first batch of titles (but this will be added to later).
- Rental cartridges are only legal if they have been marked with a special "polaproofed" security sticker.
- No third party publishers' carts will be included (not yet, anyway).

Of the 114 carts available, 68 are for the Master (Joe Montana Football and Spider-Man, for instance), 38 for the Mega (including Sonic, Toki, Spider-Man and Revenge Of Shinobi) and eight for the Gear (Columns and Pengo stand out from the rest).

So you've been warned. Unless your dealer is breaking the law, the video shop is not, for the moment anyway, the place to go for new carts.

FAR TOO OLD?

Reading between the lines, you could say that Sega are using rental to get rid of old games they can't flog. That's a tad premature though, because

newer stuff may well appear in the future if the scheme turns out to be successful.

Sega's boss, Nick Alexander, says he knows rental will kill off crappy carts but he's hoping it will send sales of the very best titles soaring

through his office roof. You can see the logic. Who'd be happy to play *Sonic The Hedgehog* for just one night and then never go back to it?

If you want to be able to rent, you have to keep buying – that's obviously the message here.

That means rental may not, in fact, last forever. But for an idea of why it's such a scolding hot potato, you have to realise just how important games rental is to video shop owners.

VERY IMPORTANT

In the last couple of years, video rental has suffered a lot. The recession hasn't helped, and the sort of greasy cavemen

RENTAL

Video dealers, like everyone else, saw the potential of video games, but it still hasn't been easy. In fact, it's been a nightmare – for everyone.

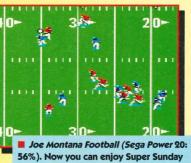
GAME OVER...

Here's why. About two years ago, Sega said yes – go ahead and rent, video dudes. Not many people did though because, back in those dark, dingy and depressing days, consoles weren't very popular (yes, hard to believe, I know,

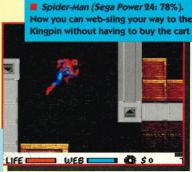
but it's true). Soon, of course, everybody wanted them and Sega had high-street customers like Dixons, Virgin and Woolies coughing up millions to stock up on the new gear.

Now if you're Mr. F.W. Woolworth and you're selling thousands of games a month at £40 a throw, you don't want old Fivebellies round the corner offering the same titles at just £2.50 – even if it is only for one night.

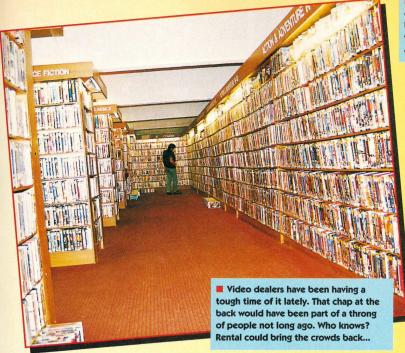
Sega looked at its books, saw that only one hundred or so libraries were involved in their scheme and promptly said it's game over time, dudes. They

then threatened to nick anyone they caught subsequently renting.

HOPPING MAD

Video dealers were furious and badgered for a U-turn. They didn't get one. Instead, they got a brand new deal. The dealers' response? An enormous wet raspberry. The reason? Sega said:

Pay us £400 a year (per shop) for a licence, join the Video Trade Association (£125 a shop, plus £25 for any further shops you own), pay £5 extra for carts – and then buy a minimum of 100 titles (but Sega didn't

specify exactly which ones). A hard-up video shop now had to pay roughly £1,000 to do something it was doing more or less for free before!

It wasn't just the money. They didn't want to have to join the VTA (a voluntary body) just to rent carts. Brian Eveliegh of Stylers Video Centre in Somerset summed up the feeling at the time. Why should I be made to join a body I don't want to join?" he said, "and why should I have to pay a licence fee?"

CHANGE OF HEART

This was back in April. Sega hoped to have the scheme in place for the

summer holidays, but by June, nothing more had happened. No list of games, no licence forms, nothing at all. People began to wonder if the applications even went into double figures.

Then Sega had a change of heart.
The VTA bit was dropped, the maximum order was binned and the £400 fee was now, er, £440. Sega's head honcho Nick Alexander's attitude was:
"If you can't afford it, you shouldn't be

And that's how it stands now. Some dealers are happier, even if they're not overjoyed. Colin Watt of Video World in Aberdeen used to rent out carts, but stopped when it became illegal. Now he just sells them.

in the business."

He says he'll get a rental licence eventually, but he'll wait until the last possible moment before forking out the

dosh. "Paying the rental licence is fair enough, I suppose." he said. "A lot of us have complained, but businessmen are always like that. You have to try and get the best deal you can I'll

try and get the best deal you can. I'll still wait until September before I get one though – because Sega keep on changing the rules."

He should be joined by Blockbuster Video, Britain's biggest chain of video shops – with around 850 outlets. They've always said they will rent out carts when it's okay to do so.

FULL OF HOLES!

Like many, Colin still thinks the deal is full of holes. The list of legal games is heavily weighted towards the Master – and then there's the third party publishers. Video shops will have a job to explain why you can rent out *Streets Of Rage* but not *Desert Strike*.

Electronic Arts, like most of the other third party people, have said they'll wait and see what happens. If the scheme works (in other words, if the cash from the sales keeps on rolling in) they'll join.

Most video dealers will offer carts for about the same rental charge as the latest films, probably between £1.50 and £3.50 – although don't be surprised if some try to charge you a fiver.

AGAINST THE LAW

Of course, there have been hundreds of video dealers out there who have stuck their tongues out at Sega and rented away happily for years.

One, who obviously didn't wish to be named, said "I've been renting since the console boom started and my customers are used to being able to hire carts out. There's no way I'll fork out so

many hundred quid now. If I'm unlucky enough to get caught, I'll probably get a warning before being taken to court. Then I'll stop. But that might never ever happen anyway..."

TOTALLY RENTAL

There are literally hundreds, maybe thousands, more like this fella. Illegal rentals are so widespread that few outsiders actually realise they are illegal.

Just check out the Daily Mirror on Saturdays, for example. It's been listing "good places to rent" for ages.

So far, Sega have not prosecuted anyone for renting out carts. Obviously, once the official scheme is up and running, things will change.

Sega will have allies in the law abiding dealers who are bound to inform on local rivals who are renting without licences (it'll be easy to tell – the carts won't have the tell-tale stickers).

LEGAL LOOPHOLES

Mind you, there are already some interesting loopholes. Swap shops, for example, are already springing up. The Scottish based exchangers Master Player, for instance, are planning to become a nationwide chain.

They claim their charges are not a rental fee but a handling fee. It's a bit of a grey area.

Speaking of which, grey importers may have spotted another loophole.

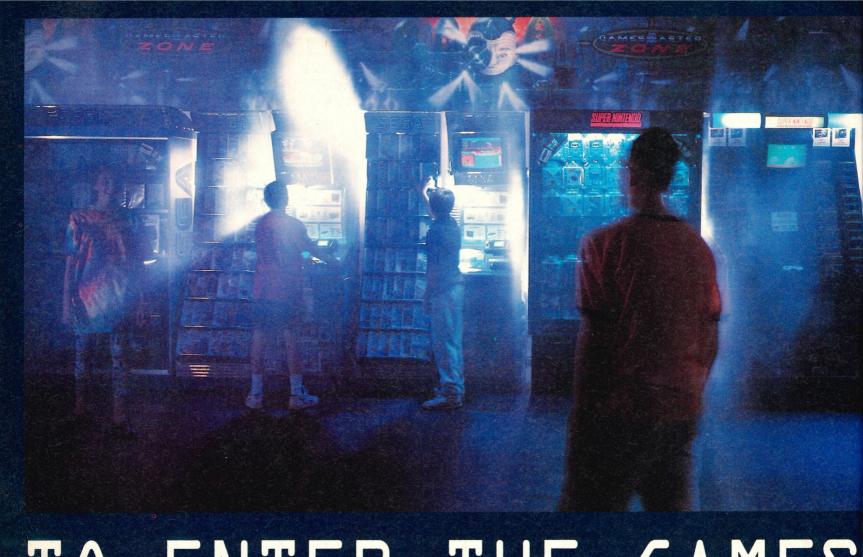
In America, you see, rental is completely legal. Grey importers therefore say that renting US games, wherever you are in the world, must be legal too. Another minefield.

And then there's Ballistics... In the past, Accolade (who produced Ballistics' carts) always told video dealers to go ahead and rent as much as they liked because they were never officially licensed to Sega.

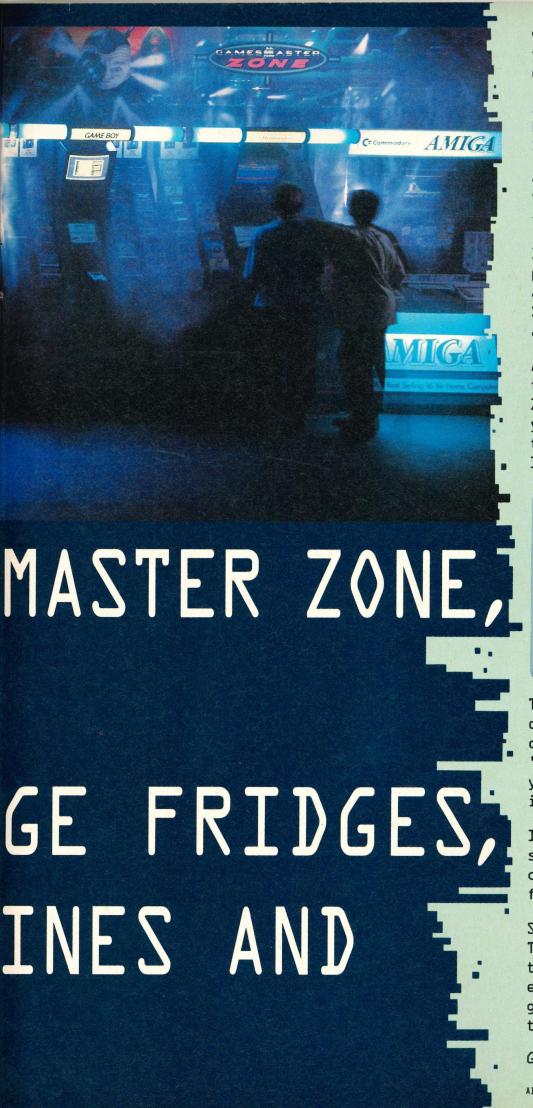
THE FUTURE?

For the moment, how all this affects you depends on where you live. If your local library is renting games illegally, you may soon be deprived of a very handy local service. If your locals are law abiding, however, you're soon gonna see official "rent carts now!" signs up for the very first time.

Still, if you were with the other lot (y'know, begins with N, ends with O?) you'd have no chance. Not only do they make it hard for video shops to actually stock their games, they always give the same answer to the rental question. And that's a very short word which also begins with N and ends with O. Funny, innit?
