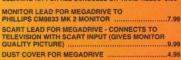

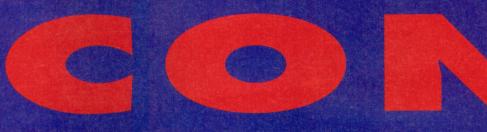

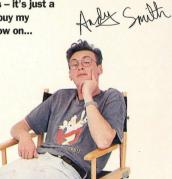

INTRODUCING THE SEGA LD...

UESTION: HOW can Sega improve on the already immensely powerful Mega CD before it's even been released? Answer: announce plans for the Sega LD – yet again the latest in computer games technology – literally years before it's due to hit the streets.

The Mega CD has already made its mark over in the States – Sega are talking of 200,000 units being shifted since last November – so now they obviously need a vehicle to reassure people that new technology is still in the pipelines.

Just as E.A. have teamed up with Panasonic to produce the 3-DO (see this issue's Snippets), and Sega with JVC to develop the Wondermega, so Pioneer have teamed up with Sega for the Sega LD – and it's their technology, coupled with Sega's well spanky design, that makes the new multimedia system so powerful.

"It's not aimed exclusively at the game-player" says Pioneer's UK press officer Jason Doran. "It's an entertainment unit, offering something to everyone in the family."

What this essentially means is that not only does it play Mega Drive cartridges, it also runs Mega CD titles like the incredible *Night Trap*, pumps

out music CDs at extreme volume and will even, if asked nicely, play the forthcoming high-quality laser disc games and movie titles.

The system should be compatible with three interchangeable packs – one that enables you to use Sega software, one that plays Turbo Graphix titles – and, lastly, a Laser Karaoke pack (urgh).

You want to talk about power? Try a 504 Megabyte instant-access RAM area with separate laser disc analogue and FM audio storage. Put simply, this means that separate chips handle the sound and graphics routines, while the main memory can then get on with the serious business of gameplay.

This means faster games, no delay times and massively huge and powerful titles. Good, innit?

At the moment, only Sega and NEC (Turbo Graphix) have licences to produce carts and CDs for the Laser Active (as the Sega LD is also known), although sub-licences will become available for third party bods in the future. Neither Pioneer or Sega have given a price for the Sega LD as yet, but don't expect this sort of system to come for under £400. We'll bring you more info soon...

Tedible Night Trap, pumps more into soort...

The Sega LD or Laser Active from Pioneer is a machine at the very forefront of computer technology. It's a CD, cartridge, laser disc player and video games machine all in one unit. Powerful stuff – especially if it comes in at a reasonable price we can all afford...

VIRTUALLY HERE!

IRTUAL REALITY is obviously a squirrel down the front of Sega's boxers at the mo. Virtual, virtual, virtual... Only minutes after announcing the Virtual Reality peripheral for the 16-bit (see News on page 9), they start squealing on about a Virtual VCR for the Mega CD.

VVCR (as it's called), enables you to run – via the Mega CD – short films, music videos and cartoons. You can even splice up the footage and create your very own videos if you want.

So, no - VVCR isn't a gaming aid as such. Sega are currently marketing it as a novel way of fiddling around with CDs. It's the first commercially available system of its kind, but the main downer is that it only works with specific Mega CD Virtual VCR discs.

You can't run your own CDs through the system, save them to the memory, then recall and re-use them as you so desire. A definite bummer – especially when the music titles available are limited to Kross Krap, Clivelés and Cole (mind you, anyone behind the 1992 dance anthem of "Deeper Love" has got to be all right).

Prince devotees will find themselves catered for too, with a VCR disc featuring clips, videos and even music from the "Diamonds And Pearls" long player. And, apparently, Sega have also just signed a deal with U2 for a future CD

release (the visuals from their Zoo TV tour should be pretty schmart).

On a different tack, there's also "March Of Time" coming – featuring excerpts of the real world from the American *Time* magazine. It's more of an educational title than anything else, but there you go.

The best news about VVCR is that it requires no new hardware, other than the Mega CD itself. The menus, cursors and options all come from the software (which'll cost somewhere in the region of £27), so all you need now is the launch of the official CD system itself (how does March sound?).

Virtual VCR is to be released in the States in April and officially in the UK later on in the year.

The American version of the Mega CD is called, cryptically enough, the Sega CD, and all software produced for this sucker is extremely unlikely to work on the (as yet unreleased) official UK model, so there!



FINAL FIGHT - CD LATEST

HE MEGA CD version of Final Fight promises to be something pretty damn fine – as you can see from the screenshots above. The game is well old in the arcades and is a kinda cross between Streets Of Rage 2 and Street Fighter 2, with you desperately trying to rescue Guy's girlfriend from the heinous clutches of a group of loons.

There's also a dearth of special moves available – hence the *Street Fighter 2* comparison – and something

the Super NES version never had: a two-player mode.

Quite why the lunchbox version was unable to incorporate this simple addition is unclear, but it's been put back in for the Sega game, thankfully.

Obviously, 'cos it's on the Mega CD, you can boot up each stage from disc as you play (there are seven in total). And the backdrops, music and animation are, without doubt, the best we've seen on any beat-'em-up for an aeon. In fact, they're every bit as good as the

original arcade version, if not a damn sight better. No kidding.

There's nothing startlingly new in the gameplay – you walk right, pick up knives and pipes and beat all hell out of anyone who comes near – but it's the manner in which it's executed that makes this disc a cut above the rest.

Expect to see import copies of Final Fight floating into the shops sometime around May or June, but beware of imported copies working on a UK Mega CD – they won't... If you're a smart

cookie you'll wait and save yourself the hassle until the proper version hits the streets later in the year.

Sadly, Sega UK couldn't comment on when an official version of the game would be released over here, but it'll be well after Street Fighter 2 on the Mega Drive (still scheduled for April...).

However, like Street Fighter 2, Final Fight will require a six-Button joypad for the execution of special moves and suchlike. The import version will set you back £45.

KILLER PHONEBILLS FROM OUTER SPACE!

TRAIGHT FROM the States, a new and brilliant method to pump up your living costs to an unparalleled degree. It's called the Teleplay System and it enables two players to get on the line and play Mega Drive games down the phone.

Only Terran Wars, Battle Storm and Combat Aces are currently available, but the real trick up the system's sleeve is that it also enables you to play games together on different consoles formats... You can have a friend

on one end of the line playing *Battle Storm* on his Mega Drive, for example, while his mate across town is playing the same game on an NES.

Until now, only PCs, Amigas and STs have been able to effectively talk to each other via a modem – but even some of these have been astoundingly slow. The lag between input and response at the other end of the line, for instance, often leaves a lot to be desired – especially if you're playing a game that depends on quick timing.

Baton Technologies, the company behind Teleplay, however, claim that their system is very fast – operating on a 2,400 baud (in other words, very big 'n' powerful) modem and having a connection system that ensures the most direct line possible.

Just slip the modem into the top of the Mega Drive (as you would a cart), stick the game in on top of that, dial your mate's phone number and the electronics take care of the rest.

You can also use any IBM-compatible keyboard and printer to connect yourself to Public Domain services such as CompuServe, though they take a little more accessing than a

cross-block game of, say, Star Control. The games currently available for the system are kinda crude and clunky, though it's early days yet and Baton claim they have a whole batch of releases planned for launch before the end of the year.

Currently scheduled for a Stateside release at the US equivalent of around £70, Baton's Teleplay system is com-

ing out this Spring, though there's no reason why import modems shouldn't work over here (at least, no reason I can think of, anyway...).

What everyone fails to mention, of course, is the cost to you in phonebill terms. Playing a game of *Star Control* across the lines may sound fun – until you get your phone disconnected when you fail to pay your bill, that is...

While we're on the subject of Ecco, it's interesting to note that the slippery cetacean has zipped straight to the number one slot in the 16-bit top ten. Could be that the public are getting just a little bit tired of supersonic platform heroes, especially when you consider Ecco's unique gameplay.

Did you know, for instance, that this game is the first of its kind to feature Sega's Dynamic Play Adjustment facility (which monitors how you're doing and changes the gameplay accordingly)? Also, according to Sega's marketing bod David Joseph, "girls are

more drawn to a game like Ecco because it's non-violent and it deals with the environment." Right, Sega, right...

The digitised piccy of the real thing is just as much fun to play with. In he cute!



SNIPPETS

A.'S NEW 32-bit machine is called the 3-D0 – and it's fairly awesome. Unveiled for the first time at the Las Vegas Consumer Electronics Show, the multi-media console is around 50 times more powerful than a Mega Drive. It was showcased alongside a 486 PC (a pretty powerful piece of kit, which was running through all types of graphic and speed demonstrations) – and the 3-D0 was streets ahead.

There are now plans – thanks to the 3-DO – to bring "Jurassic Park" (Steven Spielberg's up-coming monster movie) and major flight simulations to life as never before.

The system plays music CDs, VHS video tapes – you can also plug it into a satellitle system (among other add-ons). The price of all this decadence is estimated to be around the £600 mark.

First, when it came to Sega's own awards ceremony, Virgin received best Mega Drive game of the year with Mick And Mack – Global Gladiators, and then, to top it all, received Best Handheld Game Of The Year for their Super Off-Road Racer on the Game Gear. Hmm.

Soon after, Sega ask Virgin if they can have the licence to *Cool Spot* (a highly funky scroller Virgin have been quietly developing for yonks) and, good grief, don'tcha know it? Virgin give it to 'em!

I mean, they've only been telling us how amazing this game is for months now, and then they give it to someone else (doubtless for a sizeable royalty). That's hardcore business for you.

AVING RECEIVED rave reviews in nearly every Sega magazine known to man (and child), Micro Machines from Codemasters has had an injunction slapped on it by Sega to prevent it from going on sale in March.

It's all part of Sega's licensing and release laws – no game can go on sale from a third party software house without Sega's consent – and, as such, they're not prepared to let anyone, no matter how good the game, publish titles for the Mega Drive without healthy royalties flying overhead. The court case continues.

EGA'S CLASSICS Range is about to be extended to incorporate some pretty decent titles. For just £19.99, for example, you can grab such Mega Drive carts as Golden Axe or Revenge Of Shinobi. Okay, they may not be that cheap, but for the price of an old Master System title?

The new games will be available at the new price sometime in late Spring, so get your coffers swelling...

MORE DOSH, BRIAN?

UST WHEN you thought that Sega's annual marketing budget had been exhausted, the billion-dollar firm announce plans to sponsor the battle for the FA Cup on the BSkyB satellite channel.

Sega and world-class football are no strangers to each other. Sega's sponsorship of the European Football Championship back in June was a great success, remember.

So now they've got the rights to plaster their name all over the ads during BSkyB's coverage of the qualifying rounds for the 1994 World Cup and during all the run-up matches to the FA Cup this year.

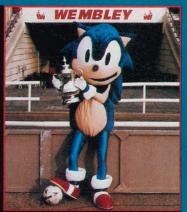
And while their earlier sponsorship deals included a "What happened next?" malarkey at the beginning and

end of each ad break, this new deal will instead feature a selection of "England's finest football jokes!"

The sequences promise to be a "footballing first," affirms Sega's Euro Marketing Director Phillip Ley.

The complete sponsorship deal – rumoured to be worth around £30 million – will be shared by four main backers, and Sega may well be the largest of the four. The deal covers all aspects of the FA Cup – the Charity Shield, FA Trophy, FA Vase and, of course, the FA Cup itself.

No one sponsor has ever supported the Cup as intensely as Sega intend to over the next four years. It should establish the company as one of *the* major brand-recognition names across the UK.

16-BIT VIRTUAL REALITY!

LIMEY! AND I THOUGHT it was all a joke. Apparently not, as the latest news from the USA has an autumn launch pencilled in for **Virtua Sega**, a Virtual Reality peripheral for the smelly old Mega Drive. Quite how they're going to recreate subliminal worlds on just 16 Megabits is beyond us, but the peripheral plugs into the Mega Drive – as any current add-on does – through the joystick and exterior control ports.

The system uses technology that, until now, has only been available to NASA and the military (it says here...). Although it also boasts relations with the 32-bit arcade racing title "Virtua Racing," the Formula One game with wraparound screens and 3D perspective (see our arcade feature on page 20 for more gen).

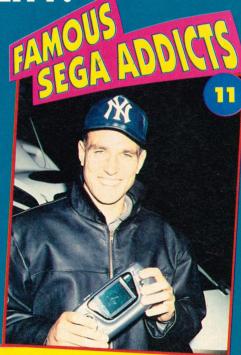
So how the hell will they re-create that on one standard telly with one standard Mega Drive? Well, sources point to a vision helmet as used in the arcades, though the price for that sort of lux-ury isn't going to be cheap.

"Virtua Sega delivers a feeling of total immersion into a completely realistic 360 degree gaming world, by utilizing three-dimensional, stereo-optic vision and depth perception" says the press release. The only way we know of getting that sort of effect on a home console is by using some sort of helmet/goggle device.

Virtua Sega is going to be released with just one game – but at this stage it's unknown exactly what it'll be. There are plans, however, to release at least four VR titles by Christmas 1994. Segawere, however, keeping quiet about what these tiles would be...

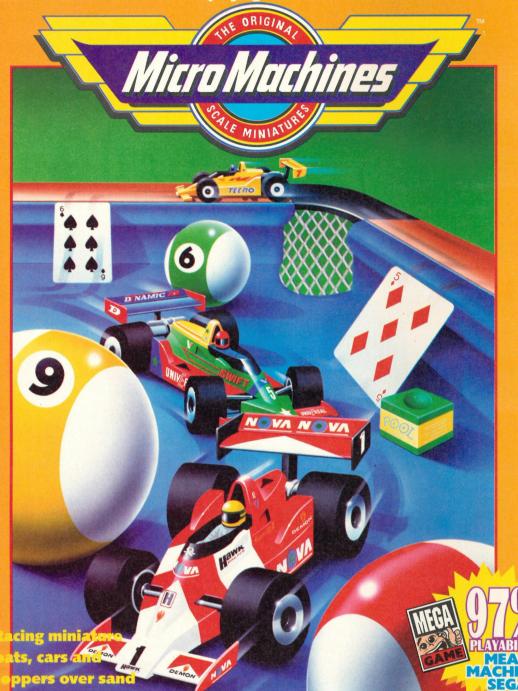

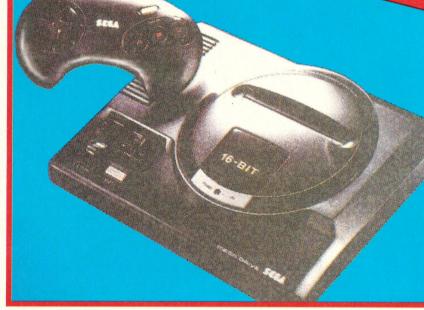

DOMARK'S SHAKEN BUT NOT STIRRED... OUT ON BOTH THE 8-BITS!

OT QUITE AS SPECTACULAR as *MiG 29* (see pages 14-15), but still an important title for 8-bit owners, *James Bond – The Duel* is now fully converted and ready to roll on both the Master System and the Game Gear.

JAMES BOND THE DUEL

It's more of the same jump, grab and shoot action that made the Mega Drive version a fair romp to play – but this time it's different (and better).

You're still Bond, of course, on the prowl through four levels of pretty standard platforming fare, but this time the four levels are split up into three sublevels, with a boss sequence to cap the end of each section. On my abacus that makes 16 full-size stages. Not bad especially when you compare it to the Mega Drive's five.

The graphics, animation and gameplay are gobsmacking – nearly every bit as good as the 16-bit version. Even the little touches are all in there. Bond bangs fresh clips into his automatic, flips it from left to right, and even crosses his arms and taps his toes in the Bond pose if you leave him lying around for too long.

It's characterisations like this that saved the Mega Drive Bond from death by mediocrity, and when you've got near as dammit the same game, only harder and longer, on the Master System, then the quality's got to be good.

There's next to no sound, of course, but since you nearly always end up turning the sound completely off for extended bouts of console abuse anyway that's no great loss.

Some more convincing gun sounds would've been nice but, as a whole, the action and speed of animation blend together perfectly. There's a real sense of getting into the challenge as you scamper around killing things.

The reason behind all the death is one Professor Greypen, who slots neatly into the Bond portfolio of arch rivals by being insane and having a fiendish scheme to take over the world.

Along the way you'll meet Jaws, OddJob, Bones (!) and, finally ,the mad professor himself.

You'll be hard pushed to get the whole way in one hit though. Domark have listened to the cries of "Too easy,

babes!" and turned the heat up in no uncertain manner

Talking of babes, it's got those too. Not as many as the Mega Drive version, sure, but curvacious babes nonetheless. To release 'em you must blast away the steel doors they're imprisoned behind.with your gun. Alternatively, (and this is something the 16-bit version never had) press pause on the console, select your missile launcher – and zap away with that instead!

The addition of more weapons, more continues and more missions in *James Bond* demonstrates that Domark seem to have the knack of producing top quality 8-bit titles.

This, of course, bodes extremely well for what might well be the most impor-

tant conversion yet to hit the Master System or the Game Gear – Desert Strike. Time will reveal all, but in the meantime check out the full Bond review in next month's Sega Power.

LECTRONIC ARTS HAVE BEEN shut away for the last six months secretly producing what will undoubtedly be the absolute mother of all action games: Desert Strike 2 – Jungle Strike.

JUNGLE STRIKE

The project's been surrounded by a fair degree of controversy. A few months back, E.A. Europe were even claiming the whole game had been scrapped (See Sega Power 36 – Snippets). But now it's back on for sure – and we've got the screenshots to prove it.

Currently entitled *Jungle Strike*, the game follows more or less the same format as the original but with a truckload of added twists.

For a start, you're not just limited to the Comanché Attack Helicopter you kick off with (technology has moved on since the Apaché gunship ruled the skies). Nope, now there's a whole wild arsenal of Special Forces hardware for you to fly, drive, ride - and crash. There's the assault hovercraft, the rocket-firing motorcycle, and to finish up with, a full-Monty ass-kicking Stealth Fighter, complete with invisible radar skin and funky black cockpit.

You're going to need everything you've got too because, according to E.A.'s Dave Wilson, "Everything's much faster: the scrolling, the action and the enemies' responses. The helicopters are considerably more vicious and pursue you all over the place. The night time missions are kinda wild too."

MORE, MORE!

What that means is that instead of the bluey-purple splotch that passed as night time in the original *Desert Strike*, what we have now is an extremely black, shady, dark *night time* night time. Incoming tracers glow as they streak

towards you, the lights of buildings are visible in the distance – and explosions are all the more vivid when you die.

STORY TIME

The general gist of the story is that Kilbaba's son, enraged after the brutal murder of his father by an elite

strike force back in the Iranian Gulf, is now looking for revenge. The action begins with him on the rampage in the good of USA.

You are hauled out of an early, happy retirement as the only crack commando with the skill and experience to tackle and destroy this new threat to home territory.

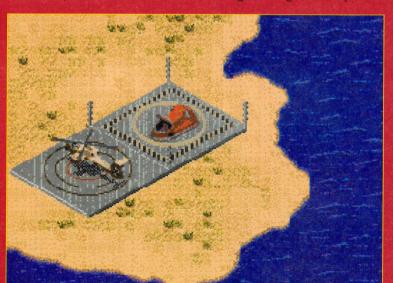
The action starts in Washington DC, on the very steps of the Whitehouse itself, and progresses through a whole nine new campaigns (as opposed to the four in the original *Desert Strike*)— from the centre of political America right

through to Columbia and the dangerous jungle territories of the world's foulest drug barons.

The attack craft changes are handled smoothly and logically. You land on a helipad at the end of the Washington mission, for example, and are then transferred into the hovercraft which you need for your next objective.

Kilbaba's son (who hasn't got a name yet) eventually gets holed up in some kinda super fortress in deepest Peru, where the only way of getting good penetration is with a multi-billion dollar Stealth Fighter. Pretty exciting stuff, eh? Especially with the promised digitised speech and sound effects being programmed in right now.

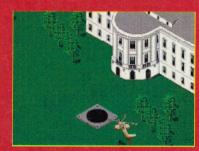
Jungle Strike is a whopping 16 Megabyte cart – and that means it ain't gonna be cheap. How does around the £45 to £50 mark sound? Expensive, we know, but, if this game lives up to the picture E.A. are creating, it'll be worth every single penny.

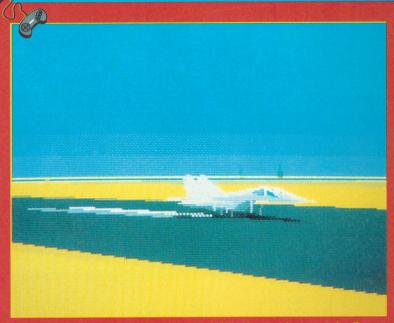

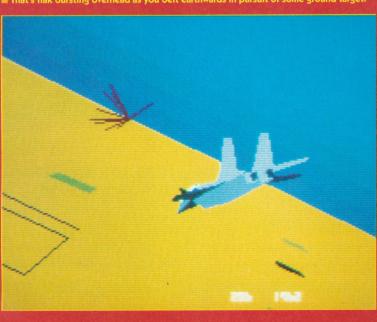

FTER RECENTLY RELEASING what is arguably the best flight sim of all time – AV-8B Harrier Assault – on the IBM PC systems, Domark are now all set to storm the Mega Drive with their 1.6-bit version of MiG 29...

E.A. have had a couple of stabs at the simulation side of things with F22 Interceptor (Sega Power 26: 68%) and LHX Attack Chopper (Sega Power 35: 73%), but now with Domark's brand new release (and sim veterans Microprose's

own Sega project about to roll) times couldn't be better for impatient would-be flightsters.

MiG 29 Fulcrum is certainly not anything new – it first appeared on the PC over three years ago – but as a first time, full-on simulation for the Mega Drive, it's perfect.

When we first heard about the conversion, we were a bit doubtful whether Domark could successfully translate all of the original's high-speed animation and polygonal graphics onto the Sega system. But translate it they have. And very slickly too – the only gripe being a slight sacrifice in smoothness when the action gets really frenetic.

But as the very first "proper" flight-'n'-fight title for the Mega Drive, *MiG 29* is looking good.

"The plan was to make it a more playable and less complicated simulator" says *MiG 29's* graphic programmer Alan Tompkin.

All the fiddly bits are in there for the more technically minded, however, so the purists among you will still be able to fly it like the real thing.

There's still a load more graphic detailing to go into the finished cart, but even at this level it's already looking pretty polished.

IN CONTROL!

Like any plane, the MiG 29's got more than its share of controls, but Domark

have got over the "look, no keyboard!" problem by using pull-down menus to access the air brakes, wing flaps and so on.

There are also plenty of exterior views to choose from. You can see back over your wings to scope what's behind you, view your own aircraft from a number of strategic viewpoints (especially useful when coming in to land or when refuelling in mid-air with the converted KC-135 gas tankers) - even see yourself from the enemy's vantage point (just so you know what not to do!).

There's a real sense of being there. and the action, which all takes place in frenzied, stomach churning real time, alternates madly between steady transit flight and insane dogfighting.

THE REAL THINGS

Apart from having a load more yellow (which passes as desert) and a slightly cruder graphical engine, the Sega version really isn't that much different to the PC original.

In fact, amazing as it may seem, the Mega Drive conversion features vastly superior introductory and digitised graphic screens - and, get this, far, far superior sound too (something that the

IBM copy, for all it's extra memory capacity, fell horribly short on).

THE STORY ...

The scenario is thus... Tyrannical dictator General Hasouz (no relation to madas-a-sausage-baguette General Kilbaba) is doing foul things in the Middle East.

He already controls 25% of the world's total oil, so it's up to the Commonwealth and the Soviet States forces to kill all his children and kick him out of, er, wherever...

So while the plot is nothing new, the action that follows most certainly is.

The resounding boom as you charge through the sound barrier, the ricochet of canon shells off your fuselage, the howl of Maverick AA missiles as they streak away from their wing pods - it's all kinda a first on the Mega Drive.

STICK PROBS

One irritating problem Domark encountered while converting the game onto the Mega Drive was with the digital joystick ports.

Other computers use analogue sticks, y'see, which are ideal for flight sims because they react progressively to input - the more you tug on 'em, the

harder you bank to the left or whatever. Sega's joypads, on the other hand, are either on or off. Fortunately, Domark got over this pretty simply by using a delay technique on the pads.

Believe us, the gameplay doesn't suffer at all for it (although an upright joystick is really still a must for this kinda game, pulling back on a pad just isn't the same, now is it?).

WHAT'S IT LIKE?

It's weird that it's taken so long for games of this sort to come through onto the Mega Drive. Hopefully, the advent of the CD-ROM system should open up something of a floodgate.

If you're looking for a way-out, techno trip of a flight simulator, with every single weenie control and ism you could imagine, you won't be finding it in MiG 29 from what we've seen.

But as a heck of a fun game with intense bouts of dogfighting and ground attack action, MiG 29 is certainly a groundbreaker on the Mega Drive.

It's going to appeal to everyone and it's going to be a big hit too. Check our exclusive review in next month's ish for the complete lowdown. Remember you heard about it here first.

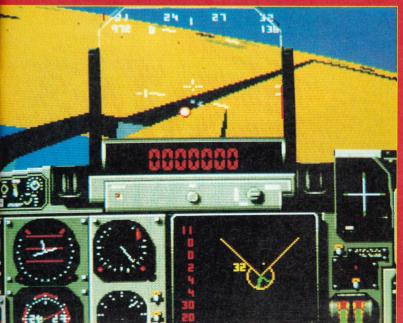

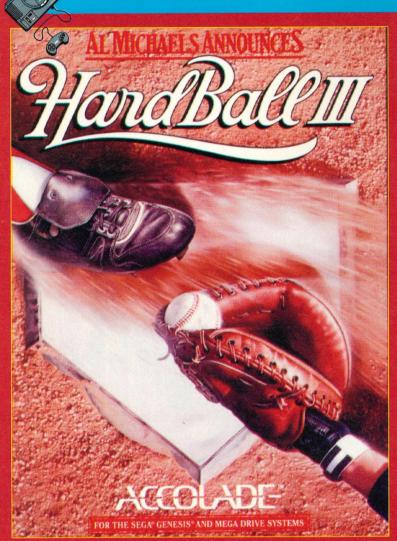

CCOLADE ARE BEGINNING to make a few rumbles in the Sega world. They've had more than their fair share of hassles, but what with the 16 Megabyte platformer *Bubsy* (previewed in issue 39) set for a big release, and now a dearth of what appear to be top-quality sporting sims in the offing, are the London-based company finally getting on the right track?

JACK NICKLAUS POWER CHALLENGE GOLF

Like so many new titles on the Mega Drive, it's a straight conversion from an original PC game. It was damn fine then, but will it work just as well on the Sega 16-bit?

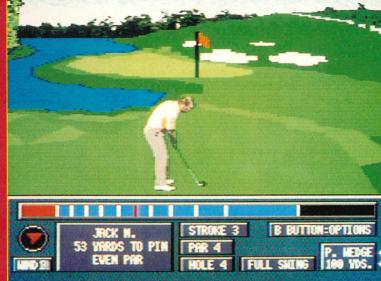
Accolade claim that two of the courses in the game were designed by Nicklaus himself and that the digitised graphics of the golfers were based on the real thing. Certainly, the stills we've seen are very impressive, but whether they move as good as they look remains to be seen.

Individual players have their stats updated every round, and the courses feature well varied terrain. The control method is, apparently, real easy to pick up. There's multi-play options, various types of matchesand a practice mode.

You can customise your computercontrolled opponents for skill, strength and other golfing variables. There are also "fully digitised" sound FX of the ball landing on the green or in the water, and the spectators get in on the sound act too.

The best golfing game to date is E.A's PGA Tour Golf 2, but I found the

There are a whopping 162 league teams included in *Hardball 3*, each one with specific players with their own strengths and weaknesses. You can either face-off against a mate or the Mega Drive, go for an exhibition match – or go the whole distance and battle your way through a 162 game season.

The cartridge comes complete with a battery-backed memory, so you can save individual games, a full season in progress or customised teams. Useful.

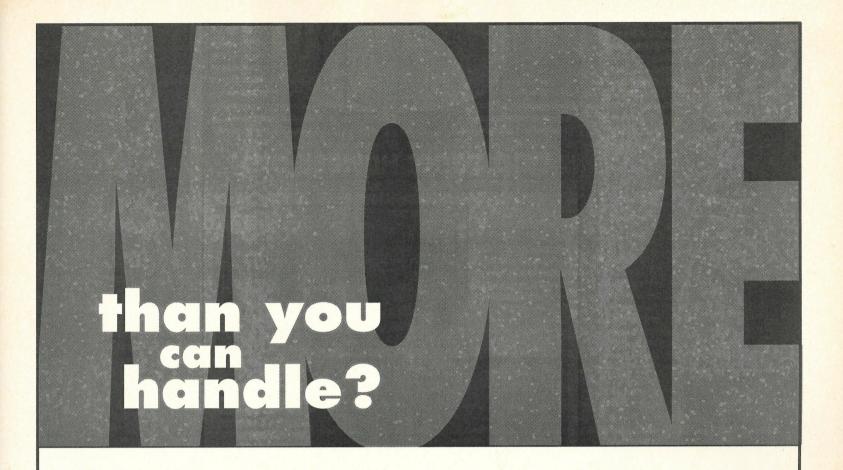
Another very funky feature is the savable Instant Replay function – just like the one available in *John Madden American Football*, only with this one you can save the best and relive all those great moments wherever you like.

In fact, Hardball 3's got so many options you won't know where to begin. The ballparks have been accurately recreated, for a start, but then you can also change your team's logo, their uniform, their cap colours – even the way individual players look.

The Amusement Trades Exhibition Internation (ATEI) Show takes place in London every year - and it's always a veritable hotbed of ideas for new and exciting coin-op conversions! Sega Power sent Jeff Davy off to see what new goodies Sega had on show... Let the games begin!

■ Plumes of smoke pour out of the giant skull's mouth in the new arcade version of Golden Axe. Mind those zombies now...

OW WOULD YOU FANCY going into a hall packed with the very latest in Sega video game machines? A game-player's paradise? Well, no, not quite. This Show's basically an excuse for lots of serious, besuited business people to wander around and play arcade games all day claiming, naturally, that they're simply researching the "market," testing profitability and so on (ahem).

Whatever the reason, you can bet your bottom dollar that a Sega arcade game one week is going to be a Sega Mega Drive game the next.

Have a rummage through the cracking games here and you could be looking at the next 16-bit title to upset Sonic The Hedgehog 2 and Ecco!

GET IN THERE!

Ignoring the rows of pinball machines, water-shooting extravaganzas, remotecontrolled trucks and highly embarrassing mole-hitting machines on display, I headed straight for the Sega stand.

Of course, it was packed with Sonic coin-ops, Sonic "grabbing" machines (those things with the hooks that always manage to drop what they've picked up before getting to the chute).

Sonic posters... At long last, though, I found some real arcade machines!

merely a standard two-player beat-'emup with a bit of Kung Fu and boxing thrown in for good measure.

The display is very nice, but I'm still not gonna pump my 50ps into the slot when there are other new games of the same genre available.

Namely, the excellent Mortal Kombat (a descendent of the smashing Pit-Fighter coin-op), which easily blows Holosseum into a cocked hat...

Mortal Kombat, you'll be excited to hear, features two finely digitised human characters who must smack, punch and kick their way out of trouble to the fine accompaniment of nasty crunching sound effects and huge plumes of blood (yum). Sega may well

get most of it right, but Holosseum isn't one of 'em! Time to move on, methinks...

GOLDEN

Fully subtitled The Revenge Of Death Adder, this classic coin-op was here on display in one of Sega's new "futuristic" swing arcade cabinets (which featured four sets of controls and a completely new space-age look).

After I'd got over the (admittedly daft) idea that this might be based on a certain very successful comedy series starring Rowan Atkinson, Tony Robinson and Miranda

Richardson (among others), I then realised, in fact, what it actually was a brand new all-singing, all-carnage addition to the Golden Axe saga.

Four characters are charged with the task of liberating the land from the evil

will of nasty Death Adder. This fiend has imprisoned villagers and, er, well, done lots of terrible things.

- Sternblade is, apparently, "a young man with a suppressed combative spirit who uses his trusty sword to defeat the enemy." In other words, he's a large and muscular barbarian with an unfeasibly large and pointy weapon.
- O Dora, however, is "a female Centaur tribe fighter who has an extremely powerful kicking technique." Basically, she's half-woman, half-horse who can, indeed, deliver a good kicking. She's also got a "Gladiators"-style stick with knobs at both ends with which to inflict damage on the baddies.
- O Goah is "a giant tribe warrior who engages in battle with Gilius on his back." Gilius, you'll remember, is the dwarf from the original Golden Axe game. Goah's got a big axe himself and it's not too wise to get in his way when he's angry.
- Finally, Little Trix (did something get lost in the translation of these names. or what?) has "a three pronged fork weapon" and "moves in an agile manner to destroy the opposing forces."

A fork weapon? Are the opposing forces fish fingers or something?

PLAYING IT

The screen scrolls, not unusually, from left to right, with you dealing the agents of Death Adder instant death courtesy of some sharp weapon-work.

Rescue the prisoners in the villages, pick up potions for some smart magic and mount spooky-looking insect things to get an advantage over the enemy.

Golden Axe has, funnily enough, also pinched a couple of ideas from Out Run. You can choose which way to go at certain junctions, for example, so you can vary what you encounter every time you play the game. Pretty neat.

things Land Of Illusion happens to be, you simply can't help but enjoy the game immensely. The original Castle Of Illusion was noted for its superb graphics, but Land Of Illusion is remarkably even better.

The animation on Mickey, and indeed all of the sprites, is very impressive, especially when you consider the limitations of the Master System. What's more, the background visuals are truly excellent, evoking the exactly the right atmosphere for the game, and giving the impression that somebody has been putting real effort into producing a class cart.

The sonics don't disappoint either. We all know that the ol' 8-bit has trouble cutting the mustard when it comes to sound, but the simple and effective tunes plus the

adequate spot FX fit the bill just fine for this kind of game.

Of course, as you might have gathered by this time, there's not a great deal that will shock you as far as the title's gameplay is concerned. Land Of Illusion is a platform romp much like Castle Of Illusion, with a similar

mix of running around dodging things, bouncing your bum on bizarre creatures' heads and solving fairly simple puzzles. It is, in short, an excellent game - but there's nothing new here.

There are a few taxing sequences in the game. In one level, for example, you must race through a maze of platforms while being chased by a squat little being made of fire who ignites everything in his path. Slow down and you're toast, literally.

Another pulse raising section has you leaping down a whole series of pits while something like barbed wire rushes around sectioning areas off, you have to try and make your escape before you are completely fenced in, this is not as easy as it sounds, believe me. What

Overall, certainly nothing new or particularly staggering on the gameplay front, but if you liked the first game this will probably be right up your street.

So, is there really enough here to make it worth buying if you have the original game? Well, in this case, the answer's got to be yes.

While it's obviously pretty much more of the same, Land Of Illusion has more features and a more arcade adventurey feel to it. It's just altogether far classier and more involving.

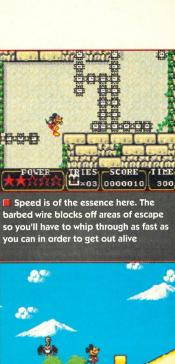

As the Royal Commissioner for the Pigskin matches and captain of the king's team, it's your job to ensure that this anarchic sport lives up to its dirty (and deadly) reputation. And, boy, what a job you're going to have!

There are no rules, for a start, and weapons are littered across the playing field. Yep, this has the potential to be one of the best sports games ever. Just imagine it – running down the centrefield, you see the opposition comin' toward you. Their biggest defender is about to tackle, so you draw your sword out of your belt and gently shove it straight into his guts.

And then there are other weapons – like nooses, knives and razor blades – scattered about the pitch for you to pick up and maim someone with too. What potential, eh?

Add to all this the natural hazards liberally plonked around the playing field: trap doors, acid pools, heavy slabs of concrete, tables, benches and trees. And you can't help but think this is gonna be great...

...but, and this is a big but, there's a problem. How can I be subtle about this – I'm sorry, I can't. Pigskin Footbrawl is complete rubbish.

It takes a fair amount of talent to cock up something this badly so just how it was achieved obviously deserves closer inspection. Follow me...

As far as I've been able to work out the recipe for a disastrous game like this is as follows: first, take one brilliant idea, then add a programmer (who obviously has very little time for

the project). Put in some nice gameplay touches and a few okay bone-crunching cound effects.

Now make sure that there is only ever one player under control at any one time. Also ensure you can always win the game easily by simply pressing one Button repeatedly.

For extra flavouring make it feel as though you're never really in control of the action and that the game is ludicrously easy with no long-term interest whatsoever. This obviously includes having no League or Cup tournaments.

You should now have a title where you play one match – and then have to

begin all over again. Finally, mix it all together and leave it in a dark cupboard to develop for several months.

Once completed, lightly decorate with an excessive price tag – and there you have it. A genuinely bad game at a very genuine high price.

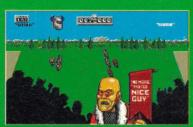

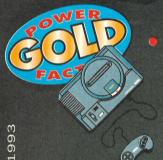

OT MUCH, I'M AFRAID. IT looks nice, it plays well and the sound FX and extra extras are just fine, but underneath it all, this game's as grey as Bognor in February. It's one of those titles that when you first pick it up, you think "Ooh, this is a fun little game." And then, 20 minutes later, it dawns on you that you are, in fact, utterly bored and can't bring yourself to play it again.

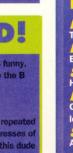

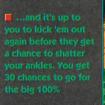

It weighs 63 tons, it has a whopping 1,500 horsepower engine and it can fire five-inch shells over a distance of two-and-a-half miles! So what's the problem? Well, appearances can be deceptive, says Desirée Cousteau...

T FIRST GLANCE, Super Battletank looks like a seriously heavyweight strategy game in the style of Abrams M-1 Battle Tank.

You must guide your tank (which boasts six different weapons, lots of dials and lights, a short-range radar and a long-range map) through ten different missions, destroying Iraqi T-72s, Hinds, minefields, chemical dumps and fortified strongholds as you go. And before

each sojourn you're briefed by a guy who bears a striking resemblance to Stormin' Norman...

It's about halfway through the first mission that you begin to think something might be wrong.

For a start, that large-scale map makes you think your battlefield covers most of the Middle East. Not so. Try driving across it flat out (42mph according to the specs) and you cross it in no time (it wraps round when you reach the

And then there's the combat itself. You aim by rotating the turret and swinging the gun up and down. In theory, you should have to raise it to maximum elevation to hit a ground-based enemy in the distance (say a T-72 tank) and then lower it when you close in. Mmm, possibly. It doesn't seem to make a lot of difference in practice. And neither do any of the other tactics you might try.

About the most successful ploy is just to steam in there shooting. Unless you're seriously crap, you can easily

blow the enemy tanks to bits before they do the same to you.

The name of a processing chip in a family of similar chips. These range (in order of power) from the 80286, the 80386SX, the 80386DX, the 80486SX through to the 80486DX. All modem PCs use these chips

The type of processing chip you'll find in the Mega Drive.

A soundboard which processes sound information provided by PC software and turns it into music and FX.

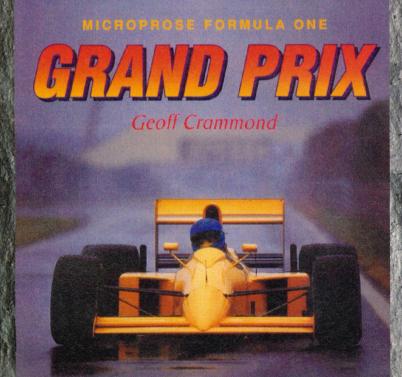

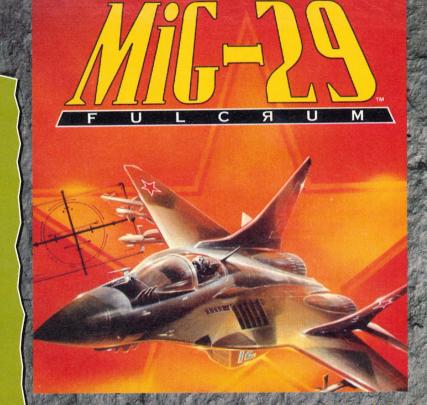

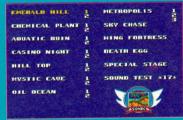

Give me, Dean Mortlock, a ring on ∞ (0225) 442244 pronto – before the rest of the greedy team spend your well-earned mooley down the pub!

WORLD ONE

Level One (Right)

This is a really easy level. Start off going left until you come to a very large grey mountain. Climb halfway up this and then head right to reach the cave. At the far end you'll find the "object" of your travels. The swinging ball is easy to navigate.

Once you've got your prize, leg it out and head for the top-right corner of the level (where you'll find the exit).



Let the horse take you to the furthest point to the right. Now start climbing. Wait on the second platform up – and watch out for those boulders. Destroy four of 'em to stop the avalanche. Now you can climb the rest of the way in safety.

When you get to the very top, jump to the left. You'll find the crown here on a platform. In the top righthand corner of the cave to your left, you'll find the exit gate. If you go up to the top-left corner of this level and then drop down, however, you'll find another juicy extra life!



You'll need to get onto the back of this horse and cart in level two to finish the level

Level Four (Right)

Now you're getting into the game, it's time to find yourself a decent weapon. Just drop down through one of the holes in the bridge to locate the weapons shop (the exit, by the way, is just to the left of this shop). Once you've bought your Acme Killer-Machine, head right and up to find the entrance to the caves in the cliffface. You'll have no problems finding the bow... Once you've got it, go for the exit.



This level five guy can be tricky. Don't attempt to kill him. Just try to avoid the barrels he launches at you. Pleasant types like this abound in Galahad, but you get used to it...



Level one in the first world: this is where you'll find the first object in your quest. Easy, eh?



You can only attack these ugly and green level three muthas from behind, so wait for them to turn before letting 'em have it with whatever weapon you've got to hand

Level Three (Above)

There are tons of 1-Ups here. The first one is easy enough to find – it's on the diagonally-moving platform by the goblin's house at the start of the level. The next one is given to you when you kill the dragon. There's also a 1-Up in the wall of the dragon's pit (if you're brave enough!).

To get the final life, enter the caves, go to the right and then fall down to the very bottom. A large spider lives here. Kill him to nab the 1-Up.

You'll find the egg in the caves. The exit is located at the bottom-left of the level.



Agile fellow, this Galahad – even if he is weighed down by his armour. Always look before you leap though, 'cos you never know what you may land on. Antics from level four

Level Five (Left)

Jump a little to the right and down – then kill the guard for a 1-Up. The ring is in the cave on the far right of the level. Go through this cave, drop down and you'll find a guard on a platform.

Kill him and he'll leave you the key. If you then go all the way to the left of the level and start climbing, you'll find the exit (it's at the top of one of the buildings).

Make your way through the upper areas of this level by jumping across the gaps in the sacks. Leap across the spikes. You'll see the exit just above you. Now all you need is the dragon's tooth to finish things off...

After the spikes, you should see a small gap – just big enough to slip through. Squeeze through here and you'll eventually come to the cave.

In the top-left corner of this cave you'll find a dragon. Kill him and he'll leave behind the sought after tooth.

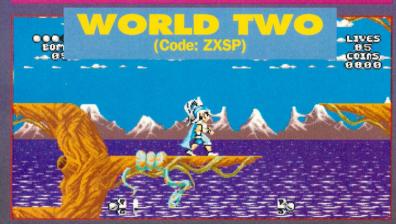


"There I was, 'appily minding my own business, ossifer, when this guy comes up to me wiv this bleedin' pike 'n' all. Well, self-defence, wunnit?" (An excerpt from level six...)

Level One (Below)

Try to keep in the trees, 'cos there are plenty of bonuses to be had here. The wasps and snakes provide easy pickings too. When you get to the dragon, stay at a fair distance – until he strikes – then go in and keep hitting him. When his head lowers for the second time, move back (out of headshot) and repeat the process.

There's an extra life in the caves – at the bit just before you drop down to get the platform that takes you through the skulls. At the end of the skull section, go up, get the prize and head for the exit (at the bottom of the trees in a corridor).



Snakes are unpleasant things at the best of times. Unfortunately, these ones from level one are real swines to get rid of, so you're best off avoiding them from the outset really

Level Three (Below)

A pretty large level which will probably give you some headaches the first few times you try to complete it. The object you're searching for is located in the extreme top righthand corner. The entrance to the caves, however, is hidden from view.

At the top of the level you'll find three large statues. If you hit the middle one with your sword, it moves across to reveal the cave entrance!



■ The entrance to this level three cave is a mystery to man and beast. Good job I'm here then to give you the answer, isn't it? (Okay, thank Mr No Name if you really have to...)



Oh God! It's more of those troublesome bug things from level seven. On occasions, you'll get these pesky creatures coming at you from all angles. Don't panic, Galahad!

Level Seven (Above)

Don't go into the cave straightaway. Instead, go to the left and just drop off the edge. If you keep to the right you should be able to slip into one of the corridors. In the top one, you'll find an extra life, a load of dosh and the shop.

It's now a good idea to get yourself a decent sword – if you haven't already. A good one to go for is the **Force Blade**. Don't go for the **Tempest Sword**, 'cos it's useless against the spider. In the lower corridor you'll find a couple of jewels and other extra goodies.

Make your way back up to the top. Now head for the cave. The spider is located on the far righthand side. It's best to shoot out the head first – and then go for the eye in the middle. It's not a difficult guardian, but it still takes some time to defeat. The exit is on the lefthand side of the cave.

Level Two (Above

At the start, go left to find a chest containing an extra life. Continue left to enter the maze. There's a three-way junction here. If you go straight up you'll come to a shop. If you go to the left, down and then to the right, you'll find another extra life. If you go down and then to the left, you'll find an entrance to the caves.



Graceful birds, eagles – big but graceful. Shame they're such evil gets though. You'll need a fairly powerful weapon to get through these level four guys unscathed

Level Four (Above

Clamber across the waterfalls – and then move up 'n' across. If you then go down and to the left, you'll arrive at the entrance to the cave.

If you drop straight down from here you'll find an extra life (use the three small, moving platforms to reach it).

If you now head right and down, you'll come across a giant cobra who will reveal the prize. Leave the cave and then go right and up to find the exit.

Level Five (Below)

Make your way up the running waterfall (while avoiding the dragonflies) and aim for the corridor located at the bottom-right of the level. There's a cave entrance here.

You can simply walk through the wall to the left – this saves time and lives!

Leave the cave and then head left. Climb the disappearing platforms, and head up and left to find the exit.



Level five: I'd like to see the portion of chips you get with this killer fish here (!?!)

Level Seven (Below)

At last, a nice and simple level! First, drop down to the volcano and collect as much money as you want. When you've got enough, drop down the waterfall to the second ledge. You should see a row of chests here.

They all contain money, but seeing as you should have enough of that anyway, ignore 'em and go to the shop at the end.

Buy the **Lion Sword**, which will be very helpful in destroying the large otter (which, let's be honest here, looks nothing at all like an otter). Level Six (Above)

Head left and enter the cave. Drop off to the right and you'll find the statue. Head up to the left – watching out for the skulls – and then grab the juicy bonuses inside the two chests before you leave... Now make for the exit.

Continue to the left. Clear the spikes and go up on the moving platforms to the ledge above you. Carry along to the right and kill the dragon (you shouldn't find it too difficult). Now jump up the boulders to the top of the waterfall. You'll find two rock platforms here.

Lives

I've found two extra lives on the Emerald Hill Zone. The first is hidden in a secret wall corridor halfway through Act 1.

If you go through the two loops you should come to a set of angled springs. Ignore these and just take off using the curve in the ground.

You'll go "through" the wall and land inside an invisible corridor. Travel along to the end of this to snatch the first extra life.

The second life is located at the end of Act 2. To get it, you'll have to travel across the very top of the level. It's not an easy one to reach but persistence pays off, believe me.

First, get the power-up boots and pelt with much gusto towards the end of the level. Here you'll find a loop with a spring on its side. Hit the spring as fast as possible and you should land on the platform with the extra life nearby.

AST MONTH, WE GAVE YOU ALL THE advice you could ever need to effectively deal with the bosses in the Mega Drive version of *Sonic 2 (Sega Power* 37: 89% Sega £34.99). This month, we've given you the long awaited level select cheat and Super Sonic cheat (see *Power* Tips – starting on page 54 – if you missed 'em). So what more d'you want?

"Well, a level-by-level guide to help me avoid the enemies and find those extra lives would be a tad useful, Dean" I hear you say. Okay, you asked for it. Here comes part one!

EMERALD HILL ZONE

Emerald Cheat

Most of you now know that to turn into Super Sonic, you have to get all the Chaos Emeralds during the bonus stages. But did you realise that you can still get all the jewels without having to search for rings in the later levels?

Collect 50 rings on the very first level. Now go into the bonus stage and nab the Emerald. When you get back into the game, reset and go to options. You don't have to select a different character here, but you do have to make sure that the game registers you've entered the options screen.

Restart the game, collect 50 rings again and pick up the next Emerald. You should now notice that the first Emerald you collected – before you reset the machine – is still with you.

This means you can collect all the Emeralds without having to leave the security of the very easy first level.

Of course, you can always just use the Super Sonic cheat and stuff all this Emerald lark, but that's not so much of a challenge, is it?

Enemies

The enemies to watch out for on this level are the fish and the monkeys.

The fish have a very irritating habit of popping up when you least expect it, so the best way to avoid damage is to always use your spin-attack when you're crossing the bridges.

The monkeys are a lot easier to avoid, but harder to spot. Trying to spin-attack them won't do you any good, 'cos you'll just get hit by their bombs. The best policy is just to pelt along the ground and leave them be.

Enemies

The adversaries on this level are quite annoying - with the arrow-launching pillars being particularly troublesome. The arrows themselves aren't difficult to avoid, but when you're flying along

between so many levels of luscious parallax scrolling, it can be a touch difficult at times to spot them.

The metallic things with the spikes for noses are a pain too. They have a habit of bursting through walls when you least expect it.

This only happens in a couple of places, luckily, but keep your eyes peeled anyway.

Lives

Well, I found nothing in the way of lives here. That's not to say there aren't any, of course. I just couldn't find any...

Don't panic if you do fall into the water. There's always a handy air supply nearby

Er, what enemies? You might bump into two or three during Act 1 (they look like hermit crabs with stars painted on their shells), but that's likely to be your lot. Your best bet is to avoid 'em like the proverbial plague and get on with this frantic ringcollecting business.

Lives

There are two more lives up for grabs in this Zone, one in each Act. The first is located on one of the pinball tables in Act 1.

In one of the first "bowls," you'll be able to zoom up the righthand side of the play area and enter a secret passage halfway up the wall. Go along to the end of this to find the extra life.

The second is located halfway through Act 2 - right at the bottom of the level. Now work your way around the two large blue pulsating squares and then TURN grab the life while you've got the chance.

Always simpler when you know how, isn't it?
