Hi There! This is Kev and Weavsie's FIFA half hour. We've turned our attention away from the Welsh F.A. for a week to show you all how to get the most out of this great game.





Firstly, you're going to have to choose a formation and stick with it. For Wales, we want the flat back 10 formation, but those 'qualified managers' just won't have it.

### 4-4-2

This is your typical football strategy, which gives you safety in defence, two wingers and two strikers down the front to get a long, hopeful ball. Mike Smith tried this and we lost 5-0 to Georgia.



### 4-2-4

Once again, you've got a safe defence, and a multitude of attackers up front to get the ball to. However, most of the time will be spent kicking the ball up field and hoping for a lucky break.

### 4-3-3

If you've got a team which has three quality strikers in it, such as, ooh, Arsenal (!?!), then this is the formation for you. Pass the ball down the wings and then play a 1-2 with your strikers to get a chance to score.

### 3-5-2

A dangerous option this, as even though it is one of the most powerful attack formations, allowing runs straight through the middle of the field, it can leave you exposed to a long ball sailing into your weak defence.

### **Sweeper System**

This one is Wales' best option, and no mistake. If you've got a weak defence with slow players, fill it with as many players as possible and tackle all the time. Once you've got the ball, kick it up to your wingers to release to the strikers.









Okay, hopefully you'll have picked yourself a favourite out of those combos, which you should now stick with. Practice makes perfect as they say. Now, we'll show you how to score against those vicious FIFA style keepers.



# **The Kanchelskis**

If you've got a quality winger, run all the way down the field with the ball, dribble it past a couple of defenders until your strikers arrive near the goal, and then lob the ball into the six yard box.



# The Hughesey

When you've got a top striker on your team, you know that the finishing is going to be tops. Even the most hopeful ball can be headed, volleyed or indeed bicycle kicked into the net by your man. So be patient and practise that aerial shot.





Now you've chosen a formation, you can fine tune it to your own personal strategy for scoring those all-important goals.

# **Long Ball**

Simple strategy, best combined with the sweeper system. Basically, your strikers hang around in the 18 yard box, having a fag or something, and then wait for your defenders to belt the ball up to them.



# **Mid Field Crisis**

Cruel this, but it works when you've conveniently forgotten to turn the simulation mode on... If your playing with a 4-4-2 or a 3-5-2 formation, adjust the midfield coverage so it runs from your goal to the opponents. Now you've got a bolstered attack and defence. Gear!

# **All Out Attack**

This is Spurs' favourite tactic. Well, it was when Ossie Ardiles was in charge anyway. Put your midfield and attack coverage so that it runs from halfway to your opponent's goal line. Now when you're attacking, you'll be spoilt for choice. Beware, as a simple Long Ball can see you in big trouble.

## Midfield on Rve

If you've got one of those gits who dribbles the ball around and pretends he's Ryan Giggs, reduce your forward midfield coverage to a minimum to give yourself an effective 7 man defence, which can frustrate those runs down the wing. Problem is, you might not ever score a goal yourself.

# **All Out Defence**

Close enough to the tactic above, only as well as dropping your midfield to a minimum, you drop your defence to a minimum as well. The net result is that your midfielders become your defence, while your defence now act like an extra four goalies in the six yard box.





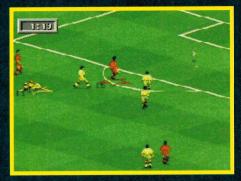






# The Giggsv

If you've got a great winger on your team. (check out Manchester United for this). Dribble the ball and run by tapping the B button. Cut diagonally towards goal and continue tapping B to run through the defence before taking your shot.



# The Barnesey

This is one of the great tactics for your central midfielders. Once you've got the ball, run at the defence by tapping the B button. Wait for a mistimed tackle and then tap the C button from 20-25 yards out. Apply aftertouch and a goal could easily be yours.

# The Le Souxey

If you've got a classy defender with a bit of pace, try running him up the wing with your midfielder. This effectively gives you an extra man to play with and it's a great time to start practising your 1-2 tactic.



### **The Koemanev**

Defenders, hey? Salt of the Earth some of them. When you've got a really good central defender, just whack the ball up field with the C button, or go for a long lob by holding the A button. With practice, you can land the ball on your striker's head and into the net.

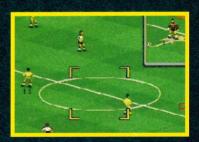

# Enough European,

The attackers are tossing a coin to see who scores. If you should lose your cool and save, you may throw the ball back out in your self induced panic. Calm down and use the target box to get the ball back upfield.



# The Mcmanamanev

Should you run down the wing with your midfield, and it seems unlikely your cross is going to work, run across towards the goal, and when you near the six yard box, shoot at goal, while giving it all the aftertouch you can for a top close range goal.



# The Schmeichelelly

Even though I'm a fan, it has to be said that certain goalies tend to flap a bit when the ball is shot at them from 20 yards out. This can result in it bouncing back into play from a forced save. Always be alert and ready to FINISH IT. (Sorry, lost myself there for a moment.)

# The Wrightey

Another great penalty/six yard box tactic, is to play the ball across the floor with a short pass 'to feet'. This can really upset the goalie allowing your other striker to slide in and tap the ball home, easily.



### **The Cantona**

This is a gamebuster of a tactic, so only read on if you're not doing at all well. Run down the wing until you get to the corner of the 18 yard box. You'll notice a square of turf just outside it. Run into this square and tap the shoot button while still holding the D-pad diagonally, and seven times out of ten you'll chip the goalie.

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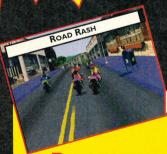
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#### COMPLAINTS CORNER

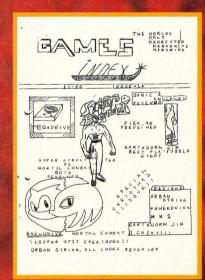

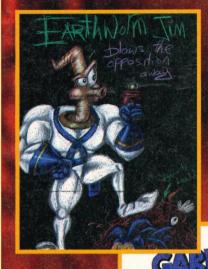

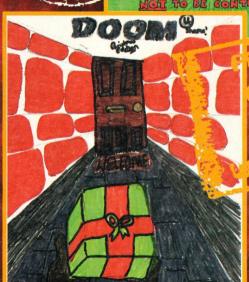
