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Play your cards right, but beware brutal bonuses

DESPITE EXISTING under a cloak of +4 invisibility for a decade, Magic: The Gathering is a very big deal. Six million players worldwide regularly indulge their paper-based habit, and the market's valued higher than that Christmas favourite, Monopoly. Adapting such a wide niche property - on its tenth anniversary no less - into a video game poses a problem: how can you capture the essence of a turn-based card game with a massive, rabid fanbase, yet take advantage of the possibilities of silicon space? The answer: build a real-time beat 'em up.

It's a very clever solution. Two wizards face off across a tennis court battlefield, with orbs of magic power dripped from a higher place every ten seconds. Your powers are limited to summoning a monster from a load of creatures, and direct action spells, limited to a ten-card playbook. Get your monsters to deal damage - last one standing wins.

Spells are limited to five 'colours of magic', each with their own distinct

personality. Black is, of course, the shade of death, and implies sacrifice. Creatures summoned from the dark side may deal masses of damage, but in the process steal health from their Necromancer. It's facets like these that lead to the emergence of stratagems and tactics on the fly.

For those not interested in developing their play, Battlegrounds still holds some button-mashing appeal. Within seconds of picking up the controller, even cackhanded wizards can use the slick, context-sensitive interface to dish out rudimentary punishment - savage hordes and simple fireballs are a mere double-X away.

It's perfect for twitch online play. A single-player campaign is included, but it's primarily designed to ease a novice into the intricacies of battle - when to unleash your raging goblins, where to position your horned turtles, that kind of thing. On Xbox Live, these kinds of decisions will be a matter of life or death. Full support is planned for the Live service, including the usual array of head-to-head matches. Of most interest is the ability to check through an opponent's card collection to consider what plays he might be using and consider how best to circumvent them.

Such ambitions hold universal appeal - fans of the card game and newcomers alike will find something to enjoy here. The game is nearly finished, so look out for a playable demo very soon, exclusive to our official disc.

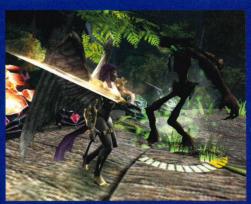

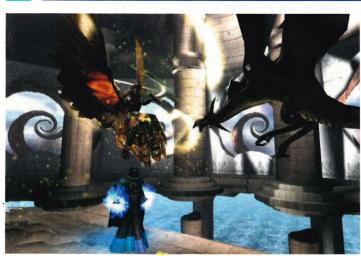
IF MAGIC: The Gathering is a beat 'em up, then it's one where special moves are carried out not by your avatar, but by summoned creatures. When they're released they head in a direct line towards the enemy wizard, unless stopped in their tracks by a rival. That's where the tactics come into play - how you circumvent your opponent's defences. Do you release a swarm of hell pigeons to flock over towers, or do you just batter your way through, with a horde of ravenous tree folk? These kinds of snap decisions are the essence of Magic's play.



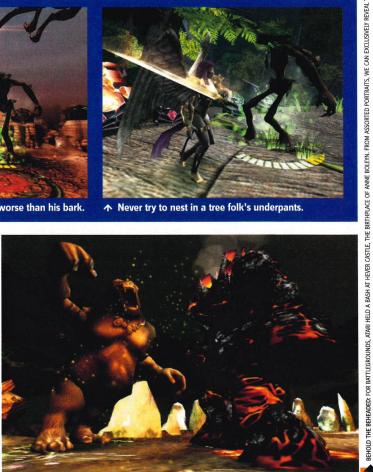

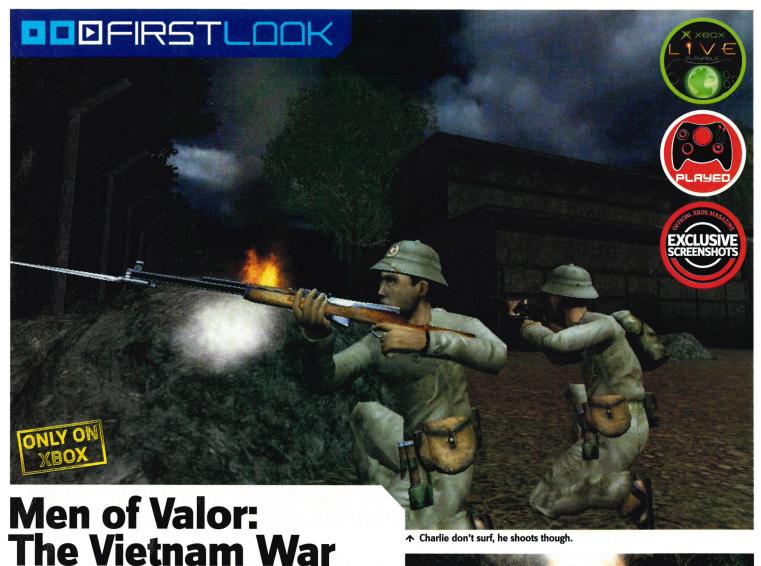

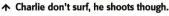
AFTER A strange 24-hour journey (involving cowboys and lightning storms) all the way to Tulsa, we finally arrived at the building that is home to 2015. Blue, shiny and modern, it looks a bit odd surrounded by trailer parks. But here is where Men of Valor is in development, so it's worth the weird trip. John Whitmore, director of development at 2015, took us through the story so far.

We were first to see five of the 16 levels promised for the final version. One level began as a peaceful ride in a convoy with the marines joking around. Suddenly a cow blocks the route, and all hell breaks loose as an ambush ensues. The Al seemed accurate and reminiscent of Vietnam films, with the dense jungle used as fantastic cover. We're watching Whitmore playing and even he's getting outsmarted by the Vietnamese once in a while. As he gives chase, he loses them in the undergrowth, only for them to reappear behind him and shoot him to pieces.

In another mission, enemies are dug deep in 'spider holes' and have to be rooted out. Whitmore is eager to demonstrate how the terrain dictates how you and the enemies behave. We're shown all sorts of environments, not just jungle. There are villages, ancient ruins and a bombed-out city (currently slated as the final mission).

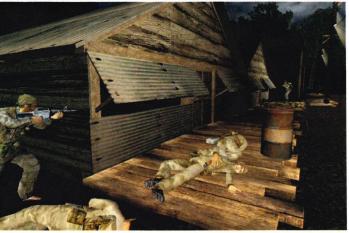
Vietnam is a popular topic for a war game at the moment, but 2015 assures us that it began work on this before everyone else, and, of course, this one will be the best. It seems the team's approaching Allies differently from previous games. "If you send a team-mate out to be shot, we want you to feel bad about doing that," Whitmore says as he rocks on his chair. "They're more human, the first thing they'll think about is their own skins." It's easy to see what he means. When we pick the game up, allied NPCs use cover well and swear profusely at each other.

After the success of Allied Assault, the attention to detail has not been lost. In fact it's stronger than ever. All the missions are based on true stories, the Viet Cong's battle strategies have been researched extensively and 2015 even has the right foliage growing in the right places. "I'm really getting sick of looking at trees and plants," John confesses. With all that research and experience, Men of Valor is shaping up to be a very real 'Nam flashback.

IT'S NO secret that the PC version of *Unreal II: The Awakening* didn't live up to the expectations of its hardcore following, but the Xbox game is shaping up to be a different story. Under the watchful eye of original developer Legend Entertainment, Atari-owned Tantalus has spent months modifying, tweaking and honing the title for precision gameplay only Xbox can deliver. Add to that a new online multiplayer element and oh, we've just wet ourselves. It's going to be good.

Unlike the multiplayer-focused *Unreal Championship* (Issue 10, 9.2), *Unreal II*'s big draw is an engrossing single-player game that pumps out well over ten hours of relentless space-based mayhem. Don't worry if you've never played the original the story's set in the same universe and continues the war against alien race, the Skaarj, but that's where the similarities end. And it was released so long ago, you

wouldn't remember much anyway. This time you come face to face with new races, dubbed the Drakk and the Izarians.

Awakening kicks off with a full-scale riot that plonks you in the boots of a lawman charged with holding off an onslaught of bizarre-looking aliens and gum-chewing enemy troops. Your ultimate goal is to be the first to collect the artefacts and stop the rise of an ancient power. It might sound like something from an Indiana Jones movie, but Indy never had access to pulse rifles, grenade launchers, assault rifles, flame throwers and spiders! That's right - you get to fire hordes of spiders at your enemies that'll chase them down and eat them. All weapons will also have an alternate fire. The spider weapon, for example, allows you lay traps for unsuspecting aliens to walk into. Cunning.

Powering the space-age shooter is the latest edition of Epic Games' Unreal engine. The PC game certainly looked the business and an advanced particle system will bring with it blazing fire, drifting smoke and frighteningly realistic weather effects. The Al system is also said to have been beefed up with enemies now running for cover when they know their time's up. They'll also react accordingly based on the size of the weapon you're pointing at them. Don't know about you, but if someone points a rocket launcher at us, we run like girls. Works every time.

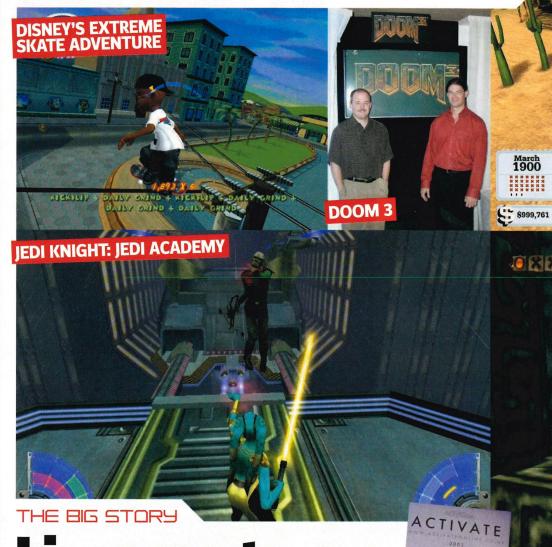

Licences to Thrill Unveiled

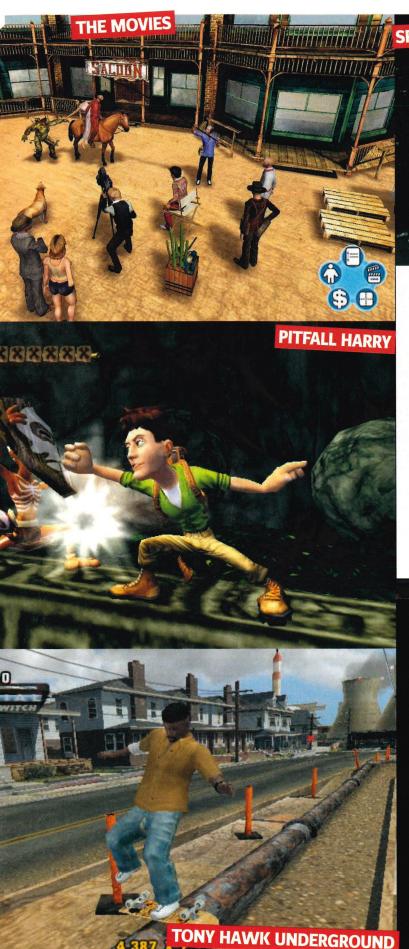
Activision has all the games, but do you have all the cash?

THIS TIME OF year heralds a season of gaming events, overseas trips and huge publicity blitzes as we head into the build-up to the feeding frenzy that is Christmas. Last month, OXM travelled to rainy but lovely Edinburgh to see what delights Activision has to tease your Chrimbo money out of your wallets. And it's a long list, so take a deep breath and come on in, the water's lovely...

The keyword for Activision's line-up would appear to be 'licence', as the company exerts its considerable financial muscle and marketing know-how to deliver a truckload of games based on well-known movie franchises, media personalities and sequels. THUG (Tony Hawk Underground), Jedi Knight: Jedi Academy, Spider-Man 2, Shrek 2, Disney's Extreme Skate Adventure (see page 092), and Doom 3 were among the titles on display.

Boasting a seven per cent market share in the UK, it was clear Activision wanted to make darlings of its expensive brand-led licensees. Mary Bihr, VP global publishing LucasArts Entertainment Company, made a gung-ho speech about "introducing new concepts and ideas", describing her company as one filled with "trailblazers and risk takers", then promptly announced it would "continue to develop games based on *Indiana Jones* and *Star Wars*". Sequels, then.

But it's not all sequels and licences. Activision's huge push behind *True Crime: Streets of L.A.* demonstrates a willingness to commit to more adventurous development. It's also taken the truly inspirational *The Movies* from Lionhead Studios under its wing, proof if it were needed that the company dares to dream. It looks like there's lots to look forward to from Activision.

Summer's been great for Xbox, but it's nothing compared to what's on the horizon for Christmas...

ONE THING YOU'VE got to remember is that normally I'm stuck behind a computer, and really only get to meet the press and retailers in large numbers at E3. So you can imagine my nervousness at showing off The Movies in the company of games that I respect and am looking forward to, such as Doom 3 and Call of Duty. But because I was in a room doing back to back demos myself, I unfortunately never had the chance to check out any of these games and had to rely on feedback from

journalists. Based on this and my own gaming preference, my personal pick of the Activate line-up would be Doom 3 (which I can hardly wait to play), Call of Duty (which looked really stunning at E3) and Rome: Total War which is right up there with the best.

I think it's to Activision's credit that they are broadening their portfolio. The passion and conviction that they display for games like The Movies and Call of Duty proves that they have a line-up that is both varied and very broad spectrum.

IT WAS WEIRD to see Molyneux's team sitting quietly amidst all the bombastic pronouncements and talk about licences and brands from Activision. But in a good way. Activate was, as always, very well organised and there's no doubt that they've got a very strong line-up heading towards Christmas. But if you don't live and breathe Star Wars and think skaters should go and get proper jobs (er, not that we're ones to talk there), the pickings get decidedly slimmer for Xbox owners. When you're a huge multinational publisher, it makes sense to develop for all platforms - the financial argument alone is persuasive enough. But that very often means that

all the versions end up exactly the same, with no effort made to exploit the power of the Xbox. Great news for owners of the lesser PS2 machine, but bad news for us. And, to be fair, Activision has recently made more of an attempt to make Xbox games at least Livecompatible. But nearly every developer at this event claimed 'all versions are identical', almost with a sense of pride. So Molyneux's demonstration of The Movies, while maybe over-ambitious and possibly not coming in our lifetimes, injected a sense of risk, danger and excitement into the proceedings. It may be a long time coming, but it allows us to dream of what games might be.

EA TALKS NEXT-GEN CONSOLES

So if they start showing up in the fall of this year, then we can pretty confidently predict it's 2005. If we don't start to get them until '04 then it's probably an '06 launch." With that in mind, he added that he expects to know within the next four to six months.

Due to be published by the Japanese giant Namco (famed for Ridge Racer and Tekken), I-Ninja looks to be a quality little platform game. Set on a tiny Earth-like planet called The World, I-Ninja must follow his Sensei to recover lost Rage Stones and free the little people locked up by Master O-Dor's evil army of robotic Ranx. It's not all jumping on boxes and collecting apples, though. I-Ninja can run on walls, shred rails, fly via the 'sword copter spin' and swing from chains. We'll have more information on the nippy little bugger next issue.

Tenchu makes its online debut only on Xbox

IT MIGHT SOUND like a wet sneeze, but the Xbox exclusive version of *Tenchu* (bless you) is shaping up to do things Jackie Chan and Jet Li could only do if they were immortalised in an Xbox Live game (don't rule it out).

Tenchu: Return from Darkness features an online co-op mode allowing multiple Sakura killers (you and your mates) to slice and dice enemies simultaneously. If that doesn't make you want to run up the bedroom wall, leap out of the skylight and glide across the rooftops then you must be mad.

We're promised updated design, technical enhancements, new maps and Xbox Live support - which is a first for the series. Online gamers will see two-player co-op missions through all six multiplayer levels as well as sneaky voice chat features. Expect authentic ninja action next spring.

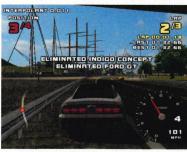

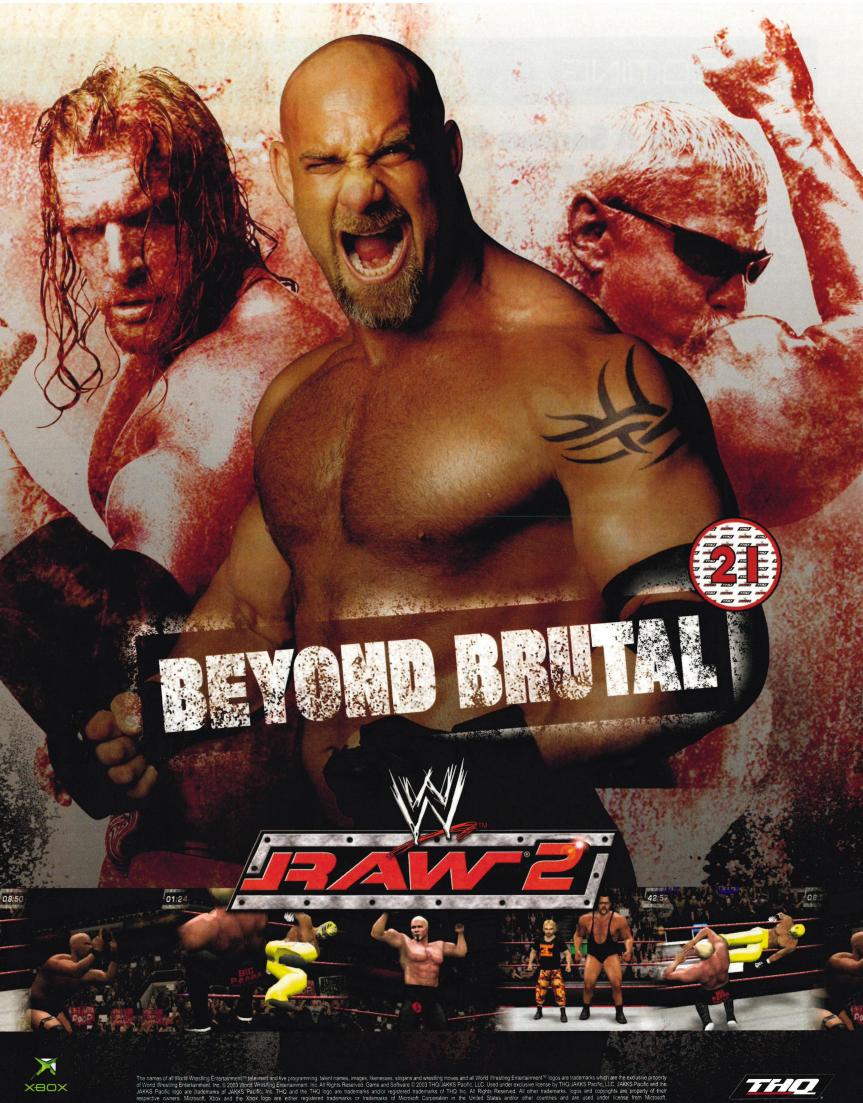
Budget price forces focus on Ford racer

So is Ubi Soft overdoing the whole Tom Clancy franchise? The French publisher doesn't seem to think so. "We think this is a strong and durable brand," it told us. "In fact, we're already working on Tom Clancy's Listen Guys I'm Out of Town For a Fortnight - Buzz You When I Get Back Cell."

Croteam eyes Xbox Live for Serious Sam follow-up

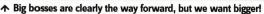

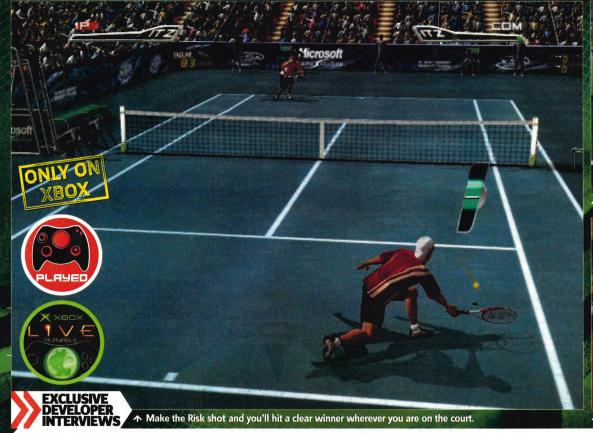

Top Spin

Stephane Dupas serves up the latest on the best tennis game ever

"THE BEST TENNIS game ever?" we hear you scream, "but what about Virtua Tennis?" Well, after visiting Top Spin's French developer, PAM, and playing the game to near-death, we were left in no doubt that it is the most detailed and playable tennis game we'd ever seen. And yes, that includes Virtua Tennis.

Every element of the game has been worked on and toned to perfection. If Tiger Tim worked as hard as PAM, we'd have a number one player. Top Spin is easy for everyone to pick up and get into (just hit A to return every shot), while at

the same time offering enough depth for advanced players to spend months mastering (every other button and trigger offer a huge array of shots). And with the addition of full Xbox Live support, the cries of "You can't be serious" will be ringing round the phone lines in truly global style. We got the latest details from Stephane Dupas, director of production.

Official Xbox Magazine: You've been working on the game now for around two years. Why has this particular tennis game taken so long to create?

Stephane Dupas: We invested a lot of that time in the online side of the game to make sure *Top Spin* would be the best tennis experience possible. We wanted to shoot at realism in terms of visuals and we developed a lot of technology to make sure Sampras looked like Sampras. It was important to us that this looked and felt like a real tennis game.

Despite the fact that it looks realistic, we never wanted to create a very complicated simulation of tennis because we always wanted it be accessible to an audience larger then just tennis fans.



what do you think of other tennis titles that have been around in recent years? Well we felt a lot of frustration with the recent tennis games, and of course I'm talking about Virtua Tennis. It's a brilliant game, very easy to pick up and play, gorgeous graphics for the Dreamcast and nice animations. It's good. But after five hours we got really bored and wondered why. We believe it had a serious lack of depth, which we concentrated on for Top Spin. The actions you can do in Virtua Tennis are too limited. Tennis is all about surprising your opponent,

performing a shot that is not expected. In *Top Spin*, all the buttons are used for different shots.

What other areas of the game have you looked to improve on compared with others?

The second thing we've improved on is the game modes. We have six in *Top Spin* that vary from quick games, training, tournaments, grand slams and online modes. We also have a very detailed create-a-player mode that allows you to make a character look as close to you as possible. That's why it's taken us two years to make.

Looks and modes aside, the true test of a tennis game is in the gameplay. What can we expect from *Top Spin?* There are many different levels of depth, depending on how you want to play. For the first five minutes you'll be using the Left thumbstick and the A button. With these you can perform all the shots: serve, volley, smash, drop shot, forehand and backhand. The second level, once you know the game a bit better, is to begin using all the buttons and triggers for a wide variety of shots.

The X button performs backspin that allows you to slow the ball's pace down and approach the net. The B button is for top spin and that's very useful in finding better angles. You can use this to push a player back or keep them pinned down to the baseline. The Y button is the lob – press it once for a quick lob or hold it down for a long lob that gives you time to get back into position.

The Left trigger is a drop shot that can be used whenever the player feels like it and the Right trigger is used for what we call 'risk shots'. At some stage during the point, you'll want to make the difference and hit the ball as hard as you can to win. If you think you're going to lose the point, then you hit and hope. You see this on TV a lot. The player can do this whenever they want. We also have an In The Zone meter that basically means the better you play, the better you play. Take too many risks when you're in the zone and you'll lose your edge.

Tell us about the animations that players can perform after a point.
Using the Black and White buttons, you

Using the Black and White buttons, you can perform combos to express an emotion after a point. For example, hit the White button twice and you'll applaud your opponent's shot. Once you know the combos for the others, you can tease your opponent or show you're angry with the way they are

playing. This will be a really good feature in online play.

Are there any options you decided against using?

We used to have an option that allowed you to argue with the linesman or umpire but we took it out as it wouldn't be much fun if you're playing someone online who argues the call of every point.

Sum up Top Spin in 34 words exactly.

Top Spin is an online tennis game. It looks incredibly realistic but it doesn't play like a simulation. We've addressed all the frustrations people have had with lack of depth in other tennis titles.

Amped 2

Slip and slide down the slopes from the comfort of your couch

DESIGNED TO appeal to snowboarding aficionados, the original *Amped* was a surprise hit that also found an audience with the more casual gamer. Focused on freestyling rather than racing, the upcoming sequel adds a few new tricks to stay competitive.

The biggest change is the addition of the new 'Butter' trick system. Similar to the manual found in the *Tony Hawk* games, the butter move allows players to easily link tricks together into complex combos. A separate scoring system also rewards players for boarding with style. A simple yet perfectly executed trick will score more style points than a complex but sloppy stunt.

Full integration with XSN Sports and Live allows players to compete competitively or co-operatively with friends online. And this is going to be huge. Competitive modes range from pickup sessions, to full season stat tracking to find the best overall rider.

Visually, *Amped 2* is an improvement over the original, featuring more detail in the character models and environments. If the course selection is decent, *SSX 3* will find itself with some pretty cool competition this winter.

SNOWSKATING is exactly what it sounds like - a combination of skateboarding and snowboarding. Place a single short ski underneath a skateboard and then ride it down a mountain. 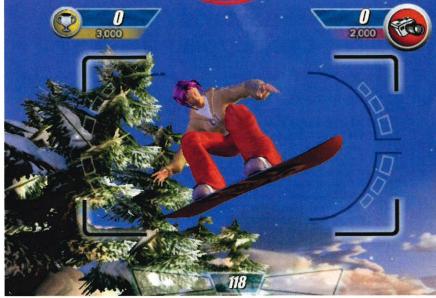

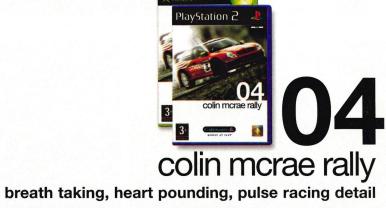

Links 2004

The PC classic swings onto Xbox with full Live play

WELL KNOWN among the PC gaming fairway, the Links series is widely considered to be the crème de la crème of golfing games. Moving it to Xbox is something of a risky move for Microsoft, but it appears to be paying off nicely.

Links 2004 puts the analog stick to good use by mapping it to the club for swing control (like in Tiger Woods). Pull back on the stick for the upswing and push forward for the downswing. If you want to slice the ball, simply move the stick left or right while on the downswing. Just like real golf, timing is everything.

Mixing things up a bit is the Challenge mode, which presents the player with a

number of skill shots to complete. Deceptively simple, the Challenge mode is in fact a lot trickier than it looks, and lives up to its name.

Courses in Links 2004 have been recreated with extreme attention to detail if it exists in real life, it's 'in the game' as EA would say. Designed to be upgradeable, Microsoft is planning to make expansion courses available via Live.

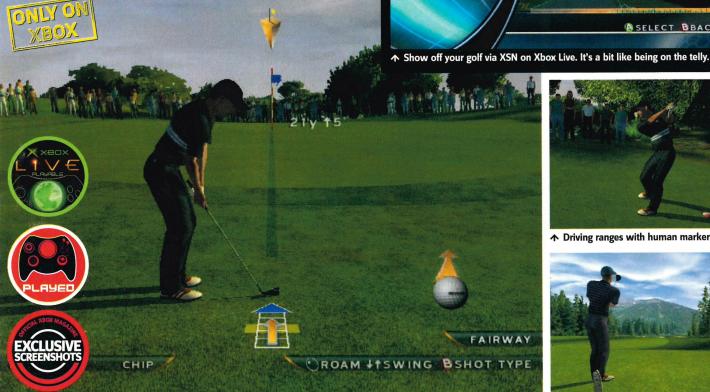

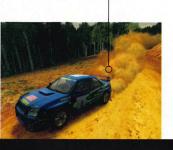

BioWare speaks exclusively about KOTOR's success, sequels and a top-secret game...

BIOWARE IS THE famed Canadian developer behind Star Wars: Knights of the Old Republic (Issue 20, 9.5), the first true Xbox RPG that's already enjoyed massive success Stateside. More than 240,000 copies have flown off the shelves within its first few weeks of release! With a UK launch due later this month, there's no stopping our Xbox-exclusive stunner. BioWare has created a monster! But what's next for the RPG specialist? To find out, we caught up with BioWare founders and co-producers Dr Ray Muzyka and Dr Greg Zeschuk.

Official Xbox Magazine: Looking back over the development of KOTOR, what were the highlights of creating the world's first Star Wars RPG?

Dr Ray Muzyka: The biggest highlight was right at the start, with an email Greg and I received in October 1999 from Simon Jeffery [president of LucasArts]. He was a fan of Baldur's Gate [Issue 08, 8.5] and offered us the chance to develop the first Star Wars RPG. Naturally, we were very excited by this and gladly accepted the opportunity. One highlight from that relationship was being able to visit Skywalker Ranch during the development cycle. It's a very, very cool place to visit for anyone who likes Star Wars, Indiana Jones, or any other George Lucas films.

How did you find Xbox to work with? What did it allow you to do that other consoles didn't?

Dr Greg Zeschuk: BioWare has experience on both Dreamcast and PlayStation 2 (MDK2 and MDK2 Armageddon), and we found Xbox to be an absolute dream. When we tried to do something new it almost always worked as we expected. We didn't spend much time delving through secret routines or support message boards to find out answers to our questions. We generally took a shot and it worked.

The game has received incredibly high scores across the board. Is this the reaction you expected?

Dr Ray Muzyka: We don't really expect anything (critical or commercial success) per se - rather, we try to strive to make the best possible games, each one better than the last. Everyone tries their best when they're up to bat (to put it in baseball - er, I mean cricket - terms). Certainly, with KOTOR we tried our best to improve on all of our past efforts and the quality of the game is a real credit to the hard work of everyone at BioWare. Now we have to look to the future and ensure that all of our games are even better.

Did anything not make the cut that you would have liked to have seen in the finished game?

Dr Greg Zeschuk: There was almost nothing missing from the final game that we missed. Stepping back and looking at the game today, there are probably a few tiny things that could be added, but none of them are key features that would make the game substantially better. We think there's already a fair amount of innovation in Knights of the Old Republic and you can only go so far in creating something new.

Can you give us any information on what we might expect from the downloadable content side of things?

Dr Ray Muzyka: We've got lots of ideas for downloadable content. The possibilities are quite broad. We're tossing around ideas for additional quests in certain areas, cool new items, applying new effects on items when the entire set has been found and possibly even a small new area or two. We can't promise anything quite yet and we'll definitely let everyone know when we have some more specifics planned.

Would you like to create a sequel to Knights of the Old Republic or are you moving on to an original new title? Something beginning with 'Jade' for instance...?

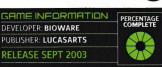
Dr Greg Zeschuk: We haven't said anything publicly about a sequel yet but it would seem likely that you'll hear some news on that front eventually from us and LucasArts.

We are certainly working on an Xbox-exclusive title to be published by Microsoft, but no specific project details have been released at this point. Sooner or later (I'd bet on maybe sooner, rather than later... maybe even later this year) people will learn what we're making and we suspect they'll be as excited as we are when they find out what it is. It's a project Ray and I have personally wanted to make for several years.

Dr Ray Muzyka: It's extremely innovative and very polished. What we have said thus far is that it's a role-playing game on the Xbox and we're definitely going to be applying everything we've learned from the development of KOTOR to make our next game epic in storyline and gorgeous in graphics.

Our goal is to make the marketleading RPGs on all platforms we develop on and this next one will be no exception... but more on that later. With regards to this mysterious 'Jade' you speak of, all we can say about that is that it sure sounds intriguing...

We can tell there's a decent game hiding underneath the swarm of 'known issues', and we'll hopefully get a nearcomplete version next month.

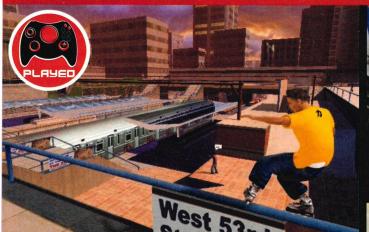

We get our hands on the sequel to the best street racer on Xbox - and play it until our eyes bleed

SEE IT ON THE DISC HEN YOU'RE invited to get beneath the (dust)sheets with your choice of the sexiest, sleekest and most expensive models that have ever purred for your pleasure, it takes a strong man to say no. Luckily for you, we're weak, weak, weak and jumped at the chance to whip the covers off the beauties that fill the *PGR2* Garage and floor them with screaming rides through the exclusively revealed, exotic new locations of Sydney, Stockholm and Yokohama.

While the Garage cars remain coyly sheeted until you can afford to buy their modesty with the tokens earned through racing events, nip over to the plush *PGR2* Showroom and you

can take any of the 100-plus models out for a quickie on the test track, including the superb Enzo Ferrari, flashy Porsche Carrera GT and classic Mercedes-Benz 300 SI Gullwing. Now you can even jump into a newly revealed first-person walkabout mode to get a great close-up view of the goods before hitting the road. Of course, the test track won't wow your ride on a first date and you'll need to earn greater kudos with more exotic locales. Luckily, both Kudos and thrilling locations are never more than a powerslide away in *PGR2*. Xbox UK marketing manager Murray Pannell was our pit boss for the day and talked us through the new features of the Xbox-exclusive street racer as we played.

Pannell first explains how Bizarre Creations' sequel to Project Gotham Racing (which was one of the Xbox launch titles, leading the field in the racing genre) will be even more polished by the chamois leather of experience. "Obviously it's a sequel, so they haven't done too much in terms of changing the game mechanics," he says, "but what they have done is rebuilt it from the ground up." This includes a full roster of totally new cities, instead of borrowing locations from previous titles, as the original did from Metropolis Street Racer. Chicago, Florence, Barcelona, Edinburgh, Sydney, Stockholm, Hong Kong, Yokohama and Moscow is the current line-up. "They realised that the code that they built [for Project Gotham Racing] was good for a launch game," continues Pannell, "but in order to get the quality of the graphics and things like the Xbox Live functionality that they wanted, they pretty much started again."

And with Arcade, Multiplayer and Kudos World Series (including 14 Series, each sub-divided into several categories) there has been plenty for Bizarre Creations to get

its hands dirty with under the *PGR2* bonnet. While the innovative Kudos system returns largely unchanged from the original game in concept, it's been greatly expanded in its methods of achievement. "The Kudos World Series is the single-player urban progression chart, where you start with Series 1 and go up to Series 14," Pannell divulges. "The series are all sub-divided into different categories, so you've got essentially different categories of car." But now it's not just

slides that signal Kudos point accumulation, accompanied by that intensely satisfying and familiar ratchet sound. "You get Kudos for drafting (slip-streaming), going on two wheels, getting air, for overtaking... There are various ways of getting Kudos," explains Pannell.

PGR2 is also a little more forgiving when

PGR2 is also a little more forgiving when stealing Kudos back from drivers. Previously you only had to brush another car's paintwork with the force of a moth slapping a butterfly and you could blow your Kudos out your twin

exhaust, but now there are far more appropriate gradations of Kudos loss, adjusted to suit the particular racing challenge. Pannell tells us that Bizarre Creations has "also tweaked it slightly so that now you only lose multiplier Kudos when you hit other cars, not the whole lot. There's also much more leeway given". Before a race you may be told, for instance, that in this particular event Kudos will not be lost for minor crashes. This makes PGR2 a far fairer foray into the world of

CONEY ISLAND BABY

THE KUDOS WORLD Series Challenge is supported by a wide selection of challenges that include the familiar cone challenges (pass between awkwardly positioned cone pairs without knocking them over), positional challenges (finish within the top three, or better on higher difficulty settings), overtaking challenges (pass six cars within an allotted timeframe) and speed attacks (race solo against the clock). The variety breaks up the game brilliantly, never allowing you to get too bogged down with one aspect of racing and also works as an invisible tutorial system.

high-performance street racing and you'll now leave frustration stalled at the lights. Further flexibility features in the new difficulty setting, which ranges through Novice, Easy, Medium and Hard to Expert. It was missing from the original, which Pannell agrees, "was arguably a little bit steep on the learning curve, particularly towards the end". This may initially seem a fairly standard addition, but its introduction heralds sweeping changes in available tactics. Tougher difficulties pay off with extra Kudos for your slides, good racing lines, 360s, drafting and so forth, but if a challenge proves more than you or your current car is up

to, you may choose to drop a difficulty. "If it's a cone challenge and you're bad at those, you might go Easy," says Pannell, "while if it's an all-out speed attack and you have a Ferrari you might choose Expert or Hard. You get more Kudos the more difficult it gets, so you could take a risk or, if you just need 2,000 Kudos for your next car, you might take Medium."

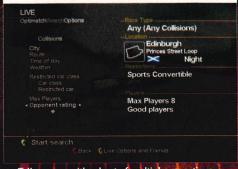
As with the powerful driving experience itself, adjusting the difficulty level for any particular stage is all about finding the right line, judging the Kudos payoff that you can afford to make against the tasks you need to achieve and the cities you're dying to unlock. It also means

that *PGR2* is better suited to all abilities and there's always a good reason to keep races challenging without events becoming prohibitively hard, as they eventually did towards the end of the original game.

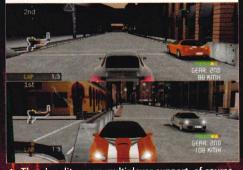
The circuits revealed exclusively to us by Pannell include the previously embargoed Sydney and Yokohama circuits. Sydney provides a great example of the ambient urban detail, with circuits taking in impressive 3D models of the Opera House and Harbour Bridge. But then, all buildings look great in full 3D now, with photorealistic textures for every storefront that would grace the circuit-side in the

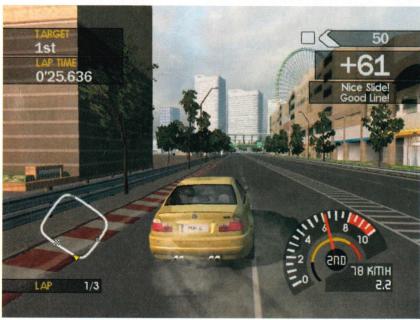

actual location. Pannell grins, "They've been round each city taking photos of them all. They take blueprints of the city structure and re-map from that." He even goes so far as to claim that, "I would say they are 90 per cent accurate as real cities, if not more". And for the ones we've actually visited, we'd have to agree.

Blazing sunshine highlights tarmac textures that are so real you could press your face to the screen and sit back with road rash, and sound



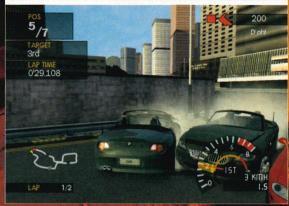

effects roar with pride, perfectly authentic vehicle noise complemented by the further realistic touch of localised radio station recordings. Up to four actual stations provide the soundtrack for each of the ten cities, with 200 tracks from 175 artists. If that's not eclectic enough for you, or you just don't like Goth(am) music, rip CDs to the Xbox hard drive and select your own soundtrack. The animated driver model can even be seen fiddling with the radio as you manually change stations, particularly in the convertible car models.

But it's not just the detail that impresses as you progress through the super-realistic tracks of PGR2. It's the constant variety of events and the near-perfect weighting of the adjustable challenges that are the real hooks. Where the original game left a long streak of Xbox-exclusive rubber spread indelibly across the racing genre, the Live-enabled Project Gotham Racing 2 (see Pannell Beater, page 045) laps its team-mate with aplomb and burns a 'doughnut disturb' sign across the grid for all its rivals to gawp at in humble awe.

PULL UP TO THE BUMPER, BABY

PGR2 PLAYS from a variety of perspectives - the default view that trails the visible car model and two forward views at bonnet and bumper heights. The latter two give a hackle-raising sense of bucket-seat-filling velocity and also bring up a useful rear-view mirror. There are no dashboard views as Bizarre Creations wanted to keep *PGR2* well away from being a simulation, despite accurate car physics that makes each model a very distinct drive. After all, it's supposed to be fun all the way...

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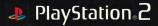

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World-class rally driver

McRae races OXM round PlanetKart in Germany and talks us through the fourth instalment of his game

rally fan or just take a passing interest, you'll have heard of Scotland's Colin McRae. Even if you've never seen a rally programme in your life, you'll still have heard of McRae thanks to the success of his video games. Colin McRae is the world's most successful rally driver and Codemasters' Colin McRae Rally series is the world's most successful rally game franchise. Coincidence? Not a chance. The UK developer works as closely with McRae as he does with his co-driver, Derek Ringer. It's a winning formula that's gone on to sell more than six million copies since it launched on PSone in 1998.

HETHER YOU'RE a die-hard

"Right from the beginning I've done an awful lot with Codemasters," McRae tells us during the launch event for Colin McRae Rally 04 in Mannheim, Germany. "I try and make the guys understand how the car works and make sure the handling's right. Back in the beginning I played a lot of the early versions and would work with the programmers to make the right alterations. It's a bit like a test in a real car because I'm always asking them to change this and that, or telling them that the car should be accelerating a bit quicker here or braking harder there. As the games have progressed I've not had as much input in that

side of it because Codemasters now has a very good understanding of how the car works."

But what made the rally star want to become involved in games back in 1996? "Curiosity really," he explains, "and to see how just close to the real sport the games could get. I think as far as rally games go, though, they're pretty much the best going. I'd never have believed they'd be anywhere near as successful as they have become. It's incredible really. Gaming was never big stuff where I was growing up but I do enjoy it now. I'm just setting up a new room at home with a big TV and chair so I'll be able to get all the boys round and have a few beers while playing the games."

With more than six million sales of the series already to his name, McRae has introduced rally driving to a new crowd. "I think it's certainly brought the sport to a new and younger audience," he says. "There are obviously a lot of teenagers and younger gamers who play the game who otherwise wouldn't know an awful lot about rallying. From that point of view, it's worked very well."

After 25 World Rally wins, McRae really knows his stuff. But what aspects of rallying does he think the game captures best? "Everything," he grins. "If you look at the fourth game, the attention to detail is amazing, the handling is great and the pace notes work perfectly. Once you know how the cars work you can cut through the corners just like you can in a real car. I was recently playing the Group B cars and they're great. They shift in a straight line but are really difficult to turn, just like they are in real life. We've kept building and fine-tuning the game, just like my team would the car in real life, to improve what we have. What always surprises me with the new games is that there's a definite difference from the previous ones.'

McRae and Derek Ringer test-drive each stage of the game as they're being developed. They both offer feedback to Codemasters who then tries to find the perfect balance. In the real world, McRae enjoys the Swedish snow and ice stages, which are also his favourite in the

> game. "In real life, the snow bank gives you a bit of a security that allows you to bounce off it and get away with things, and it's the same in the game. If you hit the bank you can stay on the road." Once you get used to flying along

country lanes no wider than the car you're in, you'd think a game would pale in comparison when trying to emulate that feeling of pure terror. Not so, says McRae. "I suppose when going along a quick bit. When I know I'm going straight off the

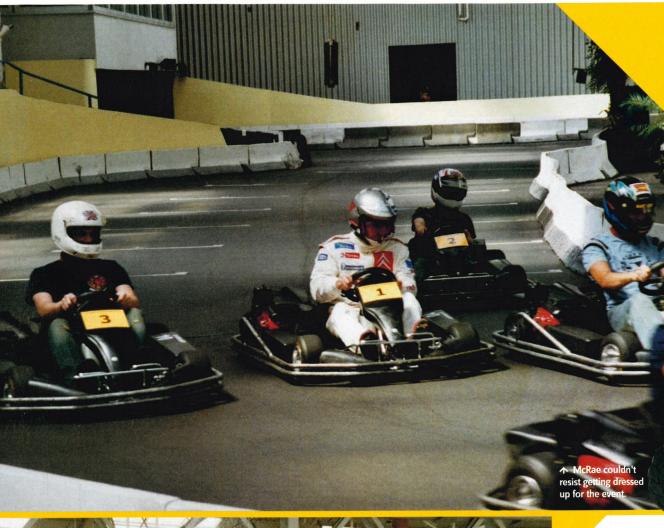
COLIN MCRAE

The man behind the wheel

BORN IN LANARK, Scotland in 1968, Colin McRae first entered the rally arena in 1986 and he didn't have to wait long for his first win. In 1987, he took the honours in the Swedish Rally and has since won no fewer than 25 world rallies. Away from the mud, McRae enjoys jet skiing, white water rafting, mountain biking and helicopter flying. Oh, and playing Colin McRae Rally games, of course.

road, I brace myself ready for impact and sit back in my chair. It's a natural reaction when flying towards a tree.

With Colin McRae Rally 04 due for release in September (check out the exclusive review that starts on page 056), where else does McRae think the games can go? Is 04 as good as it gets? "Well you could have said the same about the third game but now look at the fourth!" he laughs. "There are always new ideas that Codemasters gets from its experience and it's already trying new things. I think that will always be the case going forward."

A great new feature of 04 is its Extreme mode that locks players into cockpit view, comes with manual gears as standard and full damage. So how does the WRC champion fair at the hardest mode in the game? You'll be relieved to hear, it's not too well... "I don't play much of that one because it's too hard. It's very realistic and good for gamers who want to take it that far. If you make a mistake, that's it, you're out. And that's what it's like in real life.

Away from the rally course though, McRae doesn't spend a lot of time behind the wheel. "I don't actually drive that much on the road," he says. "I do a lot more mileage in rally cars than I do on the road. The roads are regulated so well these days with cameras that you can't have as much fun anymore. When I go back to Scotland, it's fun on the country roads.

Real-life rally rival Richard Burns has also put his name to an upcoming game from SCi, but McRae isn't worried, "They've all tried it but none of them are any good!" he grins. And if you're looking to improve your times on the game, McRae served up this top tip: "Go faster because it doesn't hurt when you crash." Wise words indeed. 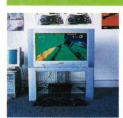

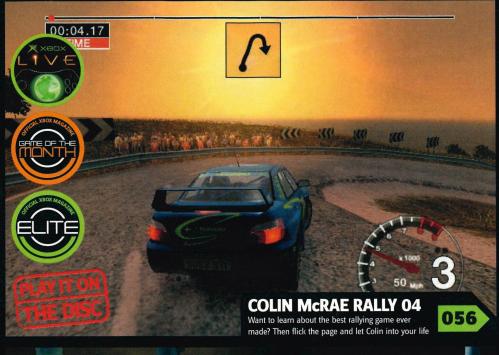

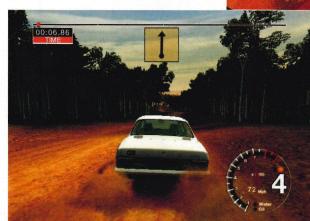

It's hard to beat a good rally game. There's not much better you can get in this world. We thought about maybe having deckchairs shaped like a naked lady. Or maybe having a fridge that liked you. Or maybe having a remote-controlled car shaped like a naked lady. You get the picture. But, no - you really can't beat a good rally game. Much like Tiger Woods PGA Tour 2003 (Issue 11, 8.5) and World Championship Snooker 2003 (Issue 18, 8.4), Codemasters has taken the sport and moulded it into a fantastic lump of video game for you to play with. It's taken the skills of a world-class rally driver, mapped them onto an Xbox joypad and handed it over to you to command and fiddle with at your will.

Yep, it's hard to beat a good rally game. But it's even harder to beat the McRae series and its immovable tendency to be all-conquering in

terms of quality. Colin McRae 3 (Issue 10, 8.9) growled its way onto Xbox in a tsunami of mud and a veil of choking tyre smoke, to universal acclaim and the occasional accusation of below-par visuals (upheld).

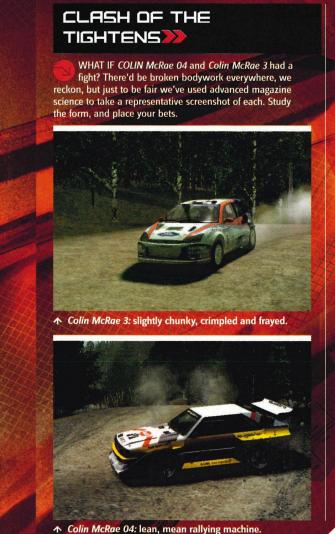
Now number 04 touches down with all the weight and noise of a Citroen Xsara crashing expensively to the dust track after a 'Caution -Big Jump' in the Greek foothills. It's only been nine months - like Colin McRae 04 is someone's baby or something - since the last one, so how come this could get any better than its predecessor in such a short space of time? Did one of the lead programmers have a soak in the bath before having a manic "EUREKA!" moment where he suddenly thought "Maybe we should make it look tons prettier and make it handle in a far more tangible and frankly brilliant manner?" before running naked through

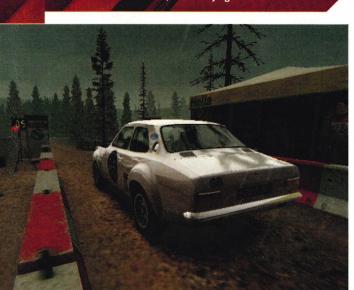


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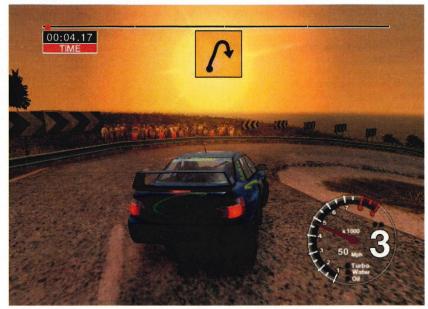

the streets? Well, that would explain it, so we'll happily accept that as the reason for this being the greatest rally game yet.

So, there you have it – CMO4's two trump cards are that it looks blinding and handles with an unprecedented degree of weight and momentum. Really, it's so tactile you can almost hug it, and so good looking that you'll happily let your hands wander during said clinch. Sorry if it sounds like we're trying to turn you on. It's all just sub-conscious love, honest. So we'd better justify our praise, or else risk looking like word pervs writing Erotic Official Xbox Magazine...

See these screenshots dotted around the place? Those should be evidence enough (or see Clash Of The Tightens, top left, for more convincing) of *Colin*'s beauty, but it just won't hit home until you see it in the fifth gear of motion. Screenshots are, after all, just postcards from us to you, and to see the good grace of this thing moving is completely lovely. The character and conditions of each country have been captured with a knockout punch of detail, making each rally feel all the more individual. The cracked and

scorch-dry roads of Spain are pocked with fine detail, making it all the more tempting for your slick Tarmac tyres to lick along them at the neck-breaking speeds that dust-free roads invite. Japan is dark, dowdy and threatening; the intense downpour of rain and sudden hairpins will grind you down if the gloomy, spooky architecture doesn't. The USA's dust tracks are fat and open, given you a nice introduction to the hardships ahead, and the UK is filled with claustrophobic country lanes and muddy excursions through fields and woodland, coaxing an X-man level of concentration out of the player. And Sweden is home to mounds of driven snow and glimmering roads packed together from solid ice – tricky stuff.

And this all feels like so much joy to play because of the way it handles. Thing is, car handling in video games usually defaults to one of two extremes - either the tight-assed prim 'n' proper realism of Sega GT 2002 (Issue 10, 8.5), or the slapdash slack of arcade abandon that you get in games like Burnout 2 (Issue 17, 9.0). It's hard to get the balance right, but Codemasters has managed it.

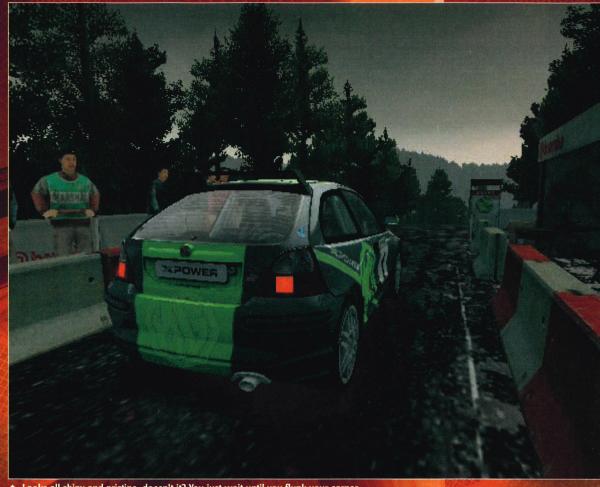

Another minor grumble levelled at Colin McRae 3 was that the car handled a bit too much like a flight of fantasy, as if you were simply spinning it around a pole that spiked through the centre of the car like a carousel horse. CM04 addresses this, and in fine fettle - Codies has struck that brilliant chord between fiction and plausibility with a handling model that feels superb. Though it's not precisely realistic (it wouldn't be any fun if it was), there's an incredible feeling of weight, heft, engine power and, well, a super-powerful vehicle in your hands. It's like being a millipede but without having to worry about any of the footwork, as it were.

It's the handling, really, that makes rallying a type of game that's so hard to beat. It's a serious racing game without being too serious, meaning that you can play it for months on end to refine and tweak and nip your scores to world-class levels, but you won't have to spend days at a time learning the basics of cornering and applying the brakes all properly. In fact, you can play CM04 however the hell you like; it's the kind of game where you can throw your arse around the corners

EA HAS somehow managed to beef up Madden NFL 2004 beyond belief. There are more game modes, statistics, plays, customisable options, training sessions, settings, challenges and player cards than you would have thought

possible. You couldn't ask for more, except for a little online play maybe...

Core gameplay remains pretty much the same as last year's release (Issue 08, 8.9), but there's nothing wrong with that as EA's take on the Gridiron action is unrivalled. A few new tweaks and touches make the gameplay truly unstoppable for 2004 while new depth to the Franchise mode takes the game to a new level. You can even go behind the scenes with the super-deep Owner mode that puts you in charge of the business behind the team. Here you can tinker around with everything from entry prices and toilet facilities to player salaries and hot dog suppliers. We're not joking when we say it's like a game in itself. Theme Park anyone?

Back on the field and another new addition to the formula is the Playmaker. This allows you to change the play at any point while you're on the field. Once you've seen what type of defence your opponent's selected - and realise your receivers will be locked down within seconds of the snap - you can change your play instantly, forcing a receiver to break off from his predesignated route to find a wide-open space. You can also create your own plays if you want to see how deep the rabbit hole really goes. But if you'd rather stick with the plays your chosen team already has, you'll never be short of a quality move. Players act out your commands to the letter making you feel in total control.

Newcomers to the game might find it all a bit overwhelming to begin with, but stick with it and you'll quickly pick up the basics. And you don't have to know the game inside out to score a touchdown. Several practice modes are there to help you along, too. During a game you can also 'Ask Madden' who'll dish up a friendly piece of advice which he thinks suits the situation in hand. Oh, and the commentary offered during games is nothing short of unbelievable. This is as real as it gets.

VIOLENCE IN team sports is always a video game winner, which is probably why ice hockey games have carved out a cult following in a country less inclined towards the cry baby tactics of football. Pad yourself up, skate across agoraphobia-friendly arenas and ram

your opponents through the surrounding glass. Much more fun than feigning injury on a waterlogged pitch in Stamford Bridge, right?

If you're a veteran of EA's super-glamorised ice hockey series, the question you'll want answering is whether this latest outing's enhancements merit a purchase. Well, it certainly looks a tad nicer, has up-to-date statistics, but it doesn't play especially different. It all depends on how hardcore you are, really...

The breakaway one-on-one cam used for honing in on goal has been removed in favour of more sim-like adjustments. Now you can pull off advanced tricks like faking shots with ease, or guide the direction and strength of a pass with

greater sophistication. There are two types of pass - the standard 'flat' pass, effective for dominating possession, and the elaborate 'saucer' pass which, when mastered, can be used to dunk the puck into specific areas of the rink. The bone-crunching 'dekeing' system has also received a slight overhaul with three motion-captured players reportedly injured during a rigorous filming process. As for coaching intervention, the D-pad invites you to tamper with the playing style of your team during matches, be it protecting the net, or softening your offence to defend a lead. Stir into the broth grappling-oriented player punch-ups and you've got a game with considerable scope for learning. It's a shame that the easy difficulty levels mean that many of the advanced features are redundant since you can win without them.

As for gameplay options, there's more meat here than on a butcher's counter. International tournaments, NHL seasons, four-player multiplayer games and player customisations combine with the gruelling Dynasty mode, where finances, legal matters, travel arrangements, scouting and team facilities play as big a role as actually battling on the ice. Did you know that constructing a tasty locker room improves team morale? You do now.

Without doubt, this is a game so deep you could drown in it. What you've got is a polished, super-fluid affair with realistic animation, sweet graphics and a decent managerial aspect. Unfortunately, despite the modifications, it's still firmly rooted in a familiar template. If you love sports games, this is more recommended than boycotting a West Ham season ticket – but only if you don't own the previous instalment, that is.

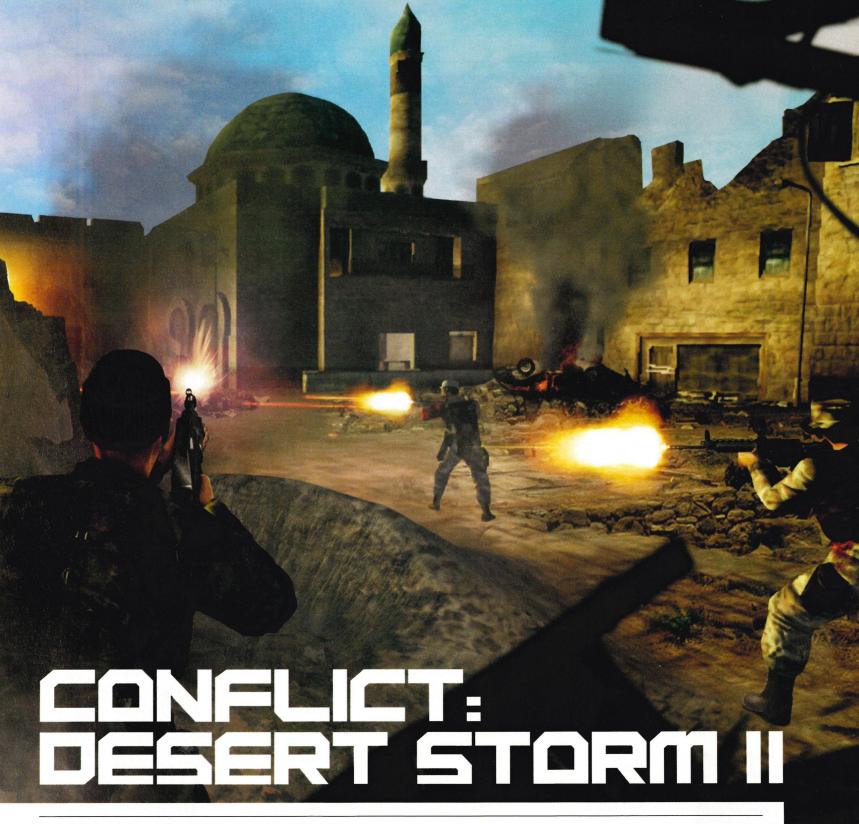

o, what are you up to tonight?" says the Cockney to the Northerner.

"Well, not a lot really," says the Northerner. "Just planting a little C4 on that

fuel dump over there, providing some covering fire while my mate disables a chemical warhead and then legging it to the rendezvous where we expect to see you revved up in an APC waiting to get us to the extraction point in double-quick time."

'Quiet night, then," says the Cockney. The phrases 'boring job' and 'SAS' are as

unlikely bedfellows as our own Ben Talbot and the Iuscious Angelina Jolie (her loss - Ben).

Hereford's finest are the original action heroes storming embassies and doing the important stuff behind enemy lines has made them the stuff of legends. Game designers couldn't dream up better characters if they ate a mountain of cheese before bedtime.

The combination of special forces and a Gulf War scenario means this game's hotter than a Baghdad summer, which was certainly the case with the first Conflict: Desert Storm (Issue 07, 8.1). It shifted enough copies to make it one of the best sellers of 2002 - which was quite a feat considering it wasn't released until September of that year. And now a Desert Storm has been stirred up again. A true sign of the times...

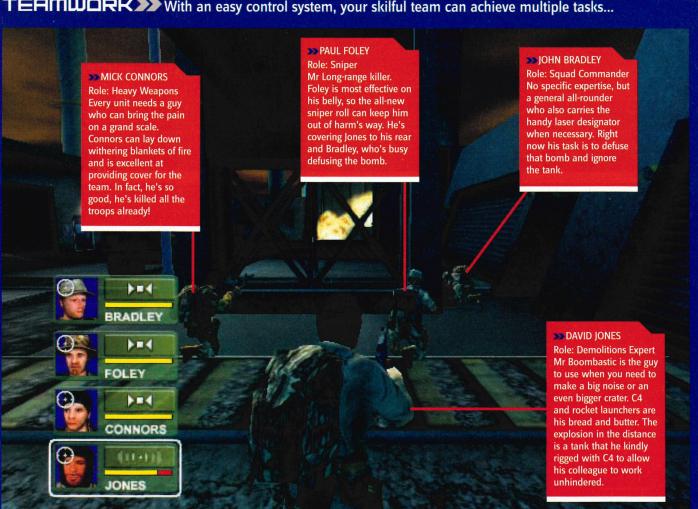
Those clambering for the moral high ground and wanting to denounce this game as a crass attempt to cash in on the current Iraq conflict should remove their Mary Whitehouse masks and get back to reading the Daily Mail because, like its predecessor, Conflict Desert Storm II focuses solely on the events of the 1991 war - 12 years before Uncle Sam and the British Bulldog went for another stroll in bandit country. So there'll be no

storming Baghdad and certainly no tracking down members of a deposed regime, some would say more's the pity...

Instead, the developer has built the sequel on the same timeline as the first offering - an understandable game design considering the brevity of the initial war. For those who have played the original Conflict: Desert Storm, this follow-up is very familiar territory. We're talking

third-person (with a first-person option), four-man squad-based combat, fulfilling similar objectives to the first game – search and destroy, rescue and reconnaissance... the general meat and potatoes of military operations.

Your original team also returns to the fray (with comical regional English accents) and, just like before, each team member has strengths in certain areas - whether it's sniping, heavy weapons or explosives.

As the game progresses, your ability to pick the right

man for each task becomes vital if you want to get the job done quickly and, most importantly, effectively.

This is an arcade squad shooter, so any armchair generals out there need not apply. There's no map option, so you can't issue movement commands any further than your line of sight. Think *Brute Force* (Issue 18, 8.5), without the big lizard or the nifty invisibility option. The control system is identical to the first game – a simple combination of holding the Left trigger and activating one of the four pad buttons will issue basic but functional commands to your troops while you can still engage in real-time combat.

So, you've got the same team, the same controls, and the same plot line. Where's the new stuff? Good question, because in many ways the game plays like a standalone mission disc rather than a

sluggish as he did the first time around and, with the addition of a neat new sniper move, he can now crawl and roll along the dirt whilst dodging enemy gunfire.

Possibly the biggest gameplay development is the new requirement to finish a mission with all four members. There'll be times when an artillery shell wipes out three of your team and badly wounds the fourth member, which means you'll have to cover and heal yourself before running out in the open to try and give first aid to your fallen comrades. It encourages you to be clever with resources – you can't heal if you don't have first aid left, so the need to switch inventory items among your crew is important. It adds a decent twist to the run and gun action and is a worthy addition.

But squad control is only as good as the AI, and this is where *Conflict: Desert*

real revolution to the *C:DS* franchise. Not that this is an altogether bad thing, as fans of the first game will feel that this title is a refinement over the last, thanks to many subtle improvements.

For a start, very little of this game actually incorporates desert combat. Rather than the many anonymous sand dunes of the first title, you've now got towns to patrol through, weapons facilities to sabotage and generally a lot more urban warfare to keep you entertained. You'll still travel through sandy wasteland but now your objectives will often involve tarmac and brickwork too. This keeps the combat close and unpredictable, with snipers vectoring in from ledges and dreaded tanks bursting through civilian buildings.

Visually, it's a step in the right direction from the last offering, with more environmental detail, better character modelling and much better character movement. Your soldier doesn't feel as Storm II, like its predecessor, shines like a beacon for other developers to steer towards. Your boys are smart - very smart. Give them the order to fire at will and they're ruthlessly efficient, even telling you when they're changing magazines. Tell them to follow you and they'll be jogging at your heels faster than a sheepdog. And they'll need to be, because the enemy Al is often of an equal calibre, although there are random moments of inconsistency, such as a machine-gunner staying in position after you've driven past, got out of the vehicle, and stood behind him.

Conflict: Desert Storm II is an evolution rather than a revolution. It's got better graphics, tweaked gameplay, a lot more vehicles to play with, a snazzier front end including better cinematics - and the lofty promise of downloadable content thanks to Xbox Live. But what it doesn't have is heaps of longevity as there are only a paltry ten missions - none of

which are particularly big. Playing on Easy difficulty is a mistake - you'll walk through the game in little more than six or seven hours. Medium and Hard offer considerably more challenge but the difficulty is based on inflicted damage and stricter aiming parameters rather than more, or harder, mission objectives. And whatever way you look at it, you're still playing the same maps.

Solo missions aside, C:DS II has a great multiplayer co-op mode that allows you to play through the whole game with up to three friends and is genuinely fun - especially in two-player

vertical split-screen, where you each control a playable character and an NPC. Running to offer first aid to your bullet-ridden mate doesn't get boring and, needless to say, offers great gloating opportunities.

Conflict: Desert Storm II offers an immersive and enjoyable gaming experience. The tweaks, polish and improvements make the sequel a stronger game than the first. However, after the rather abrupt ending, we were left wanting more. But isn't that the same feeling you always get when you reach the end of something you've really enjoyed?

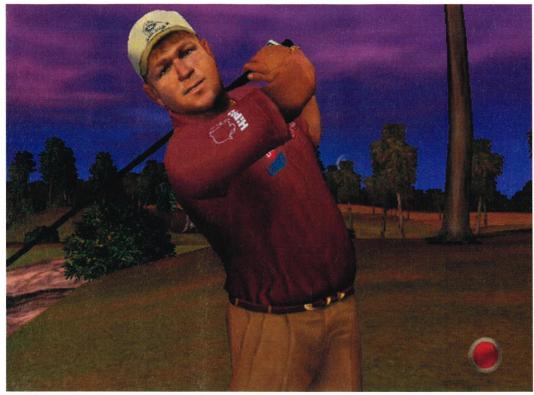

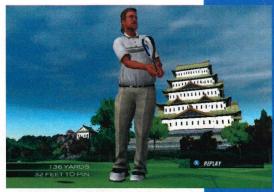

LIKE THE GAME of golf itself, we have a love/hate relationship with the *Tiger Woods* franchise that fades and draws between intense satisfaction and immense frustration. It's the best golf experience currently available, but a few serious problems hacked

great ugly divots out of its lush 2003 fairway - divots rudely not replaced for this 2004 Tour.

The mid-flight spin system for instance, is a fantastic concept. It maximises steady involvement by making sure that you're still to some extent in control of events beyond twonking the ball off the tee. Tapping the Black button while the ball splits the blue accelerates spin, with rotation controlled by the Left stick. In theory this allows you to rein over-zealous hacks with hard backspin, or roll gently pin-ward on

touchdown should the head or side-wind be stronger than you judged.

All good stuff. But nothing has been learned from the detrimental camera angles of the 2003 version that still plague actual implementation of spinning in 2004. Too often you still cut to a facial close-up of your Pringled avatar as he/she watches the ball disappear with a mildly concerned expression. What you actually want to see at this point is your ball's flight over the fairway or green, so that your ability to correct with spin is meaningful, not blind guess-timation.

Even when you are granted ball-cam, the pursuit angle can be excessively oblique, especially when hanging over the green, and denies all but the roughest idea of where the ball will drop. Whether this is a deliberate temperance of the spin feature to stop it becoming too easy (spin is one of the attributes you can add skill points to), or just laziness to correct a basic flaw, it's a frustrating lack that might have easily been addressed.

Even more negligent is the total failure to improve the putting in this year's edition. *Tiger Woods* again eschews any form of target measurement system, with no fixed grid overlay or quantifiable aiming distances for greens. There's only a wide grid system that moves with your chipping/putting cursor and is supposed to lend a little more interpretation to gradient – something that the greens' texture maps alone still fail miserably to provide, even with fly-by.

It wouldn't even be so hard to judge putts if the camera remained a fixed distance - at least you'd have the single reference point

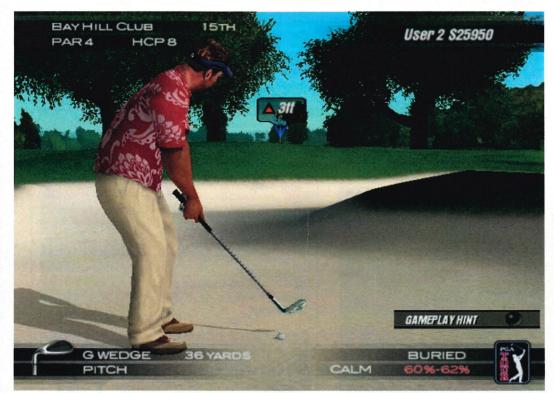

of the hole's diameter to extrapolate. But the further you drag the putting cursor, the higher the camera climbs to accommodate, bending all scale round its knee and throwing it petulantly into the gasping crowd. Add wildly inaccurate caddy advice to this tantrum-inducing experience and a good walk can indeed be spoiled into a grumpy stomp. At least the superb animations lend a little wry humour to your golfer's exasperation.

So those are the essential gripes. The faults of Tiger Woods PGA Tour 2003 have just been raked over in their bunker for its annual update. Camera angles and putting remain bugbears in the Woods, the tutorial is identical, the engine is the same so there's no appreciable graphical advancement. Award screens still appear for just too long and can't be skipped, neither can the other players' shots in Tournament modes (you can again accelerate time slightly). Often invisible crowds cheer improbably and teeing off is still just a little on the moronic

But despite all this, Tiger Woods PGA Tour 2004 is still a joy to play. It's accessible to a fault, the commentators (David Feherty and Gary McCord) are delightfully gentle in their lilting sarcasm, the steady accumulation of skill points to raise your various sporting attributes is perfectly paced, with a far more extensive Tour Shop allowing total customisation of clubs and couture. The seven new courses are beautifully

arranged and varied and you can create your own custom course from any of the unlocked holes. The character creation (see Freaky Realistic, page 073) is great fun (if little more than a Sims 2-inspired gimmick), and there are many new play modes including World Tour, more Traditional Games and an inspired Battle Golf feature where you play for each other's clubs.

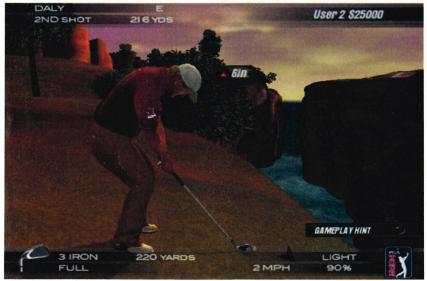
It's just that at the end of the round, you'll be sipping a G&T at the 19th hole and wondering why you spent £40 on what is basically an

A DEEP but intuitive freestyle motocross game, with a seemingly unlimited range of tricks. FALLING SOMEWHERE between listening to Eminem and playing knockdown ginger at the Glitter residence, motocross is one of those pastimes that parents almost universally discourage. It is, after all, the godfather of extreme sports, a fact that the

makers of *Freestyle MetalX* are always keen to remind you. The game offers death-defying leaps, a bewildering number of tricks and some gruesomely animated crashes to push the point that this is a sport that really hurts. It also lets you travel much faster than its gaming rivals on their boards, blades and BMXs but, thankfully, *MetalX* grants you ample room to manoeuvre in its eight well-crafted levels.

You have a choice of 16 riders including nine top pros from the sport. The meat of the game rests in the Career option, and there are novel features such as track editors, big air challenges and free ride scenarios. Freestyle mode requires you to pull off enough tricks to beat the competition and unlock more goodies

with sub-games such as the self-explanatory Bus-Jumping, Wall of Death and the Tunnel of Fire. Challenge mode involves you executing tricks and tasks offered by 'infochicks' dotted around the maps - bikini-clad, knee-high boot-wearing ladies that wait for gullible bikers to pull up, just like killer hitchhikers.

Graphically, the game is a curious mix of styles. The bright, cartoon-like locations and characters clash somewhat with the blood-fest that accompanies even the smallest crash. Despite this, it's all solidly animated and the levels are impressively varied. The visual high note rests on the bike animation at low speeds. You can almost feel the weight of your machine as you lug it into position before a big jump, and wheelspins and doughnuts really do emphasise the throbbing engine between your legs.

The game is also highlighted by a killer metal soundtrack. The *Bill and Ted*-style guitar jingle that accompanies every trick does grate after a while though, as do the repetitive self-congratulatory squeals of the riders. After hearing one scream "I'm insane!" for the 100th time, we were starting to believe the condition was infectious. The only other major gripe is the lack of a simultaneous multiplayer option, although there is a turn-based mode for up to nine players.

In spite of these grumbles, Freestyle MetalX still compares favourably with the best of its extreme sports rivals. It combines the freedom and scope you need to explore and set your own challenges with a solid Career mode, giving you plenty to unlock. The bright, appealing graphics draw you in, the control method mixes realism with arcade ease in an intuitive fashion, and the gore helps remind you that this is a sport best played from the sofa.

But let's warn you now; after the 500th failed attempt to storm a ship, your appreciation of these finer aspects may be clouded. Those with attention spans shorter than it takes an 'Ooh Aarr me buckos" cliché to be wheeled out in a pirate-related video game review, disembark now. Thankfully, we at *OXM* are a persistent lot and those who share this quality might find some of the treasures the box promises.

POTC is a trade-based RPG centred on the Archipelago Islands in the 18th century. You must play as one Nathaniel Hawk, an anachronistically goateed man who soon gets entangled in wider political relationships and dodgy supernatural goings on. Spaniards, British and French all vie for your allegiance and attack your ship should you be seen to be playing for the other side.

Being an 18th-century pirate took a kind of patience we're not used to. Besides the fact your hulking ship took months to sail between islands you also had to pore over sea charts, monitor trade and smuggling prices, keep a beady patched eye on international relations, all the while in constant danger of having the ship kicked out of you by another pirate.

Developer Akella has built a world in which you can enjoy all these features. If you want to navigate the sea charts in real time and run endlessly between trade posts, back and forth to amass more money for ships and supplies, you can. But, problematically, we live in the 21st century, time is precious, so you won't.

That's why the developers have included a warp system. You need never learn the layout of any town, never speak to inane, wandering NPCs and never look at a compass. Just moor your ship and teleport to the tavern for recruiting, then the shop for trading, then the shipyard for repairs and finally the manor house for plot.

Hell, you can even warp right next to the pirate ship you're attacking during the sea fights. The upshot is much of the beautiful

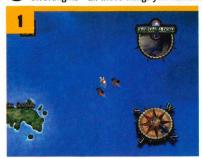

world the team's created need not have even been there. Frequently you'll be looking at loading screens more than luscious sea vistas. Why take the long route when you can teleport and make money at a much faster rate? Capitalism has a lot to answer for.

Dialogue is short and sweet with characterisation low on the agenda, so it takes a conscious decision to stick with the game in the hope that the other myriad elements will grab you. Which, in part, they do. The main action in your first hours will focus not on advancing the plot but on trying to earn some money.

This is done in a number of ways. Firstly there's a bustling trade going on between the islands, and a quick look at the current trade charts will soon show you that buying low from one island and selling high, legally or contraband, to another will quickly reap rewards. If you can't be bothered with the stock market then just get strong and storm other ships looting and killing your way to wealth.

But there are elementary gameplay problems: the camera is at best unwieldy and the tough difficulty ensures saving regularly becomes annoyingly second

nature. The game is harsh to the novice player and, even with sailing aids and a crew to back you, you'll die easily, frequently necessitating the dreaded restarts. Many players just won't bother.

However, the game is fit to burst with features boasting plentiful side stories and even competent dungeon-crawling elements. It sometimes feels rushed and the teleport cheating, while understandable, often undermines the feeling of world coherency. Nonetheless, fans of the genre and subject matter just might get hooked.

SLAP ON some sunblock and whup your opponent at volleyball. Or beat them up. EVERYONE LIKES to do it their own way when it comes to beach volleyball. On one side of the court is DOAXBV (Issue 14, 8.0), the blue-eyed babe who plays fair and enjoys caring and sharing. At the opposite end is Outlaw Volleyball, a sexy vixen who plays, and talks, dirty.

Both games are a perving paradise but that's where the similarities end. *Outlaw's* gameplay is more sophisticated, with a power bar and crosshair system for aiming your spikes. You can play a variety of shots including spikes, dinks and volleys to whack the ball out of reach. It's also possible to execute turbo spikes if you've got enough power in reserve. That's all down to how well your players are performing and how much momentum they have.

Gameplay-wise, everything is fast and fluid. Most importantly for a multiplayer game, it's also extremely easy to pick up and play. Four players can compete on one console or over Xbox Live in a number of different match types. Our favourite speciality match is Hot Potato,

where the ball is set to explode after a time limit expires. Get caught in the explosion and you lose the point - it's a devilishly fun little game.

The opponents' Al and a lengthy tournament mode will satisfy lone players. If anything, the single-player game is a bit too long and it takes ages to unlock new characters. There should at least have been more than four players unlocked at the start. But ultimately, whether you like *Outlaw Volleyball* will depend on whether you're into the raunchy humour and kinky characters. The in-game commentary is genuinely funny at times, but it does become slightly repetitious. Although it's a bit of a freak show, the players also have bags of charisma and plenty of cheesy one-liners to boot.

The players and stadiums are all extremely detailed, but they lack the graphical splendour that made *DOAXBV* such a mouth-watering experience. But who are they kidding? That title was never really about the volleyball. *Outlaw*, on the other hand, is an excellent representation of the sport with first-rate playability. Plug in a couple of extra controllers or log in to Xbox Live and prepare for big laughs and big flapping boobies. Just remember to shake the sand out of your shoes afterwards.

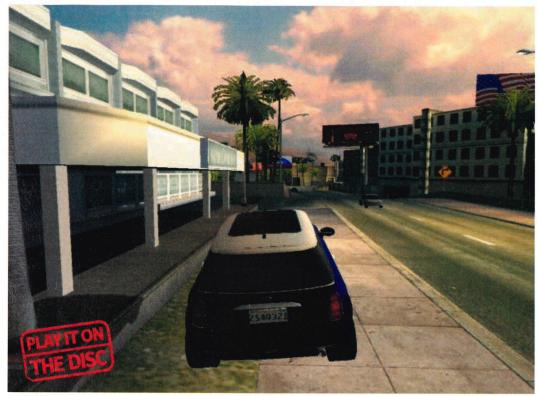

IS NOTHING sacred? The British institution that is The Italian lob gets an American reworking, with the streets of Rome transformed into the urban sprawl of L.A. and the enigmatic Michael Caine substituted for Mark Wahlberg - most famous for having a long schlong in

Boogie Nights. We'll have to reserve judgement and climb down from our cinematic soapbox because we haven't seen the film, but if the movie mirrors the quality of this game then we won't be booking front row seats any time soon.

Any notion of playing a suspense-laden heist-inspired driving caper needs to filed away until the likes of Driver appears next year. What you get here is an identikit arcade racer that leans more towards Midtown Madness 3 (Issue 18, 7.3) than any crime-ridden spree. But while Midtown succeeds through imaginative maps,

humorous characters and the excellent Xbox Live functionality, Italian Job just doesn't deliver.

Story mode involves numerous missions that replicate the movie narrative - in so much as you get treated to a budget cutscene prior to engaging in the very typical racing objectives. The action is pretty much all against the clock, getting from A to B before the time runs out while trying to work out where the hell you need to go on a very basic radar that promotes trial and error rather than any confident navigational skills. It's a shame that GPS doesn't come as standard.

The bland racing action could be forgiven if the game didn't look so bloody basic. There's no atmosphere to the environment. It doesn't feel like L.A. - it feels like Milton Keynes with palm trees and, fair enough, we know that nobody walks anywhere in the City of Angels, but we could at least see a few pedestrians to make it feel like it's a populated city. The traffic is just as bad, with little vehicle variation and collisions that a) produce no noticeable car damage and b) always generate the same type of generic rubble on impact. No windscreens smashing, no bumpers hanging precariously from the car, no dents in the bodywork. Just a puff of smoke occasionally emitting from the engine. Big deal.

Story mode is supported by a circuit race that can cater for two players and a mildly diverting stunt section that's reminiscent of the tower challenges in ATV Quad Power Racing 2 (Issue 13, 7.7) but overall, this is another example of a film licence that's got great potential yet fails to really deliver. An Italian Job that isn't particularly worth applying for.

SO WHAT DO you get if you take the excellent light-cycles from the classic Disney movie *Tron* and mix it with the stomach-churning maps of *WipEout?* The answer is *XGRA* – a game that's been saddled with such a clumsy name that it doesn't so much roll off the

tongue as crawl clumsily out of the mouth.

Think Quantum Redshift (Issue 09, 8.0) without quite so much graphical splendour, level variation and general coolness. In fact, think of any futuristic racer you've ever played and you'll get a taste of the brew that XGRA is serving up. Except Pulse Racer (Issue 15, 1.9) – don't think about that at all, please. Official Xbox Magazine will not be held accountable for any homicidal tendencies...

The silly name is actually short for Extreme G Racing Association - which has been the cornerstone for a series of games that's had many an incarnation over a number of different consoles before finally getting a place on the

Xbox starting grid. It's got all the necessary ingredients, breakneck speeds, multiple weapons, tracks that make your guts feel like they're on a Blackpool big dipper and the obligatory kick-ass dance soundtrack to reinforce the feeling that yes, you really are playing in the future. But in this case, it doesn't all add up to a good game.

For a start, it's difficult to get any real momentum going because you'll often be too busy ricocheting from side to side like a psychotic pinball on wheels. Airbrakes are in effect, and you can even manage braking severity through a workshop option, but the handling is still too light. There'd probably be more control if the vehicle was a ship rather than a bike, giving you more opportunity to bank instead of brake, but that's not the case.

Then there's the weaponry – it's not a simple case of collecting weapon-specific power-ups. Instead you have to collect a series of orbs that then increase what weapons you can use – so without looking out for these power-ups you're not going to be getting any righteous firepower... not very useful when trying to navigate an unpredictable course at warp factor nine.

To its credit, XGRA does try hard. It generally looks good, especially when you're tearing through a tunnel while following a colourful array of light trails from opponents' bikes. There's certainly enough mission variety to keep the action interesting too, as your success is not always based on coming first, but rather on fulfilling contracts - for example, beating a certain opponent or killing a set number of your fellow racers.

But repeatedly bouncing off walls whilst negotiating snaking tracks that make even Graham Norton look straight will only take you so far and, as a result, XGRA offers a diversion rather than a compulsion. One that perhaps will only be truly appreciated by the lightspeed freaks out there.

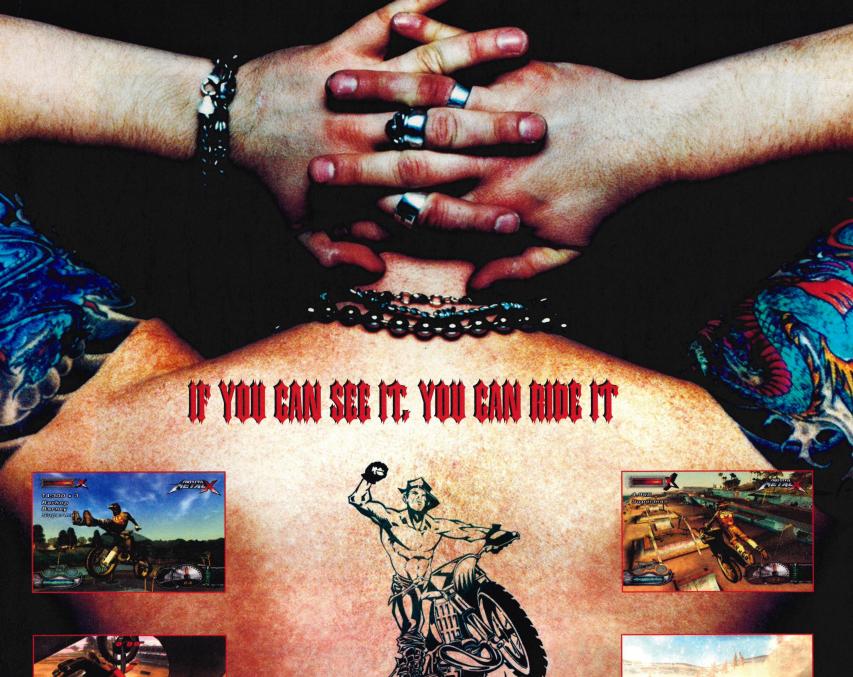

In 2006 Castro smoked one too many cigars and turned his toes up; since then a succession of thugs have been in charge but now democracy has started to take its first few tentative steps, and with a full-blown election around the corner your job is to ensure the people have the right to be heard without gunfire drowning out their freedom of speech.

For any of you unlucky enough not to be familiar with the first title, here's a quick overview. *Ghost Recon* is a first-person

This means if you have split objectives to the east and west of the playfield, you can command one team yourself while sending the other squad to clear out the trouble on the other side. The mix of strategy and action works extremely well as you won't be spending any longer than a couple of moments in the map screen before resuming your role as a first-person killing machine.

Island Thunder provides an eight-mission single-player campaign where you'll travel between

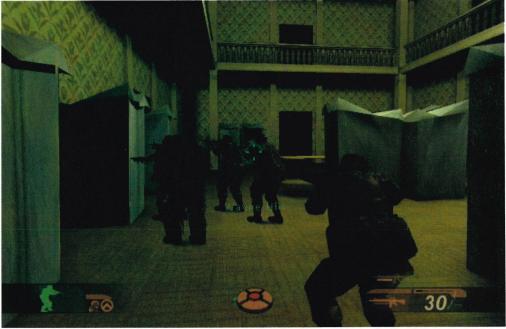

the jungle, the beaches and the city during your Cuban tour of duty. The multiple mission objectives are the same as the first title, as is the gameplay - go there, kill bad guys, grab an item or secure an area and skidaddle, sharpish. But it's not always a meal for one. You can also play split-screen, System Link and ultimately Xbox Live - where this title is transformed from a solid off the shelf release into an insanely addictive online experience. Many of the new additions are tailored towards online play, including eight new multiplayer maps and four favourites from the original title - so you won't be missing out on the most popular maps if you don't have the first game. We'll have more to say on online play when the game hits the high street and we can really get in the thick of it.

This mission disc does what it says on the tin. It's the same game with some promising online bells and whistles. But if the original left you cold, so will this. The graphics are pretty much the same with slightly better character detail and a bit more colour, but the playfield textures still lack the level of polish we expect to see at this level. But thanks to fantastically atmospheric sound effects the illusion of tense combat is never broken. It's a testament to the excellent gameplay that the visuals are really an afterthought when wrapped up in the whole combat experience. And the punchline? It's 20 quid - half the price of many games that are only half as good. Go buy it.

IN THE RED corner, weighing in at over 1000lbs (minus the egg sack), the beast with acid for blood and a family of face huggers - Alien. And in the blue corner, weighing 280lbs (if you can see him), the extraterrestrial with more weaponry than Smith &

Wesson and a penchant for headhunting -Predator. And in the middle, a bunch of guntoting humans with little clue and even less hope - the Marines. Now that's a celebrity deathmatch we'd pay to see.

But rather than being engaged in a standard beat 'em up or FPS bullet-fest, this is the first RTS outing on Xbox - a point-and-click battle for domination where you can play through a seven-mission campaign as each of the species. There are 21 missions in total - not bad for the budget price of 20 quid.

Each race brings its own unique style of play to the party. The Aliens are all about strength in numbers and as such, their gameplay is based on population - the Queen being able to lay enough eggs and your face huggers able to find enough hosts to impregnate and transform into a growing army. Predators prefer quality not quantity, practising stealth attacks and high-tech kills due to their advanced weaponry and cloaking devices. Marines focus on ranged projectile attacks and strategic troop positioning - due to the inclusion of valuable yet fragile medics.

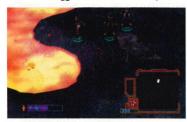
Reinforcements and upgrades are available for each species, with the economy largely based on kills. Predators clock up credits by taking heads, the Marines fix generators for cash and the Aliens infest as much as they can. It's a smart way of getting past the typical 'mine or harvest' scenario. And as cash can provide you with new units (of which there are between eight and ten per species), it's important to stay on top of your game.

But there are problems. Visually it looks poor, with limited character detail and barren, mundane maps. There are issues with pathing and Al. Selecting a large number of units and directing them to a position will result in part of your group just ignoring your route and going a completely different way, often headfirst into an untimely demise - never good when trying to accumulate numbers for a big push.

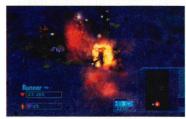
AVP offers a beginner's guide to the RTS genre. With no base building or real resource management issues you're not going to need a Grandmaster's forward-planning skills to achieve your goals. But with decent variation in gameplay styles and the attraction of playing a new genre on Xbox, there's enough here to keep both old fans and RTS newbies entertained - at least for the short term.

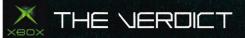

FUTURISTIC, high-speed racing and shooting thrills based on the recent Lego toy range. ONCE UPON A time, Lego was all about building cheery cul-de-sac houses and waving little plastic smiling people. These days, the Danish toy manufacturer churns out action-packed goodies aimed squarely at boys.

Lego Drome Racers (based on last year's toy

range of the same name) is of such an ilk and, being all about dangerously high-speed driving, is a *WipEout* clone geared towards the younger gamer, i.e. it's not as fast, deep or exciting as its more revered cousins. You get to star as Max Axel, a Tom Cruise-alike for the year 2015, who is keen to make a name for himself on the dog-eat-dog circuit of futuristic dragster racing.

Controlling your souped-up vehicle is pretty simple - taking corners at insane speeds won't throw you off course, but being nudged (over which you have little control) will. However, the major worry your blue-eyed racer faces is being zapped from behind by your weapon-totin' competitors. Thankfully, you too can utilise cheeky tools to your advantage. Pick up a red object (there are loads of 'em about) and you'll be rewarded with a random weapon designed to make toast of the opposition. These range from blinding Flares and car-battering Disruptor shields to the devastating Hatchet missile.

Although Arcade races and a Battle mode can be unlocked, the main focus of this game is the Career mode. You must rise through the ranks on the Drome Racer circuit, winning championships and fending off one-on-one challenges from a series of mean-spirited rival road nuts. Success earns you cash, which can be spent on upgrading your vehicle. In fact, you might even get to build your own car, although a wealth of already constructed dragsters are available for you to drive, all with daft names like Burner Desert and Raptor Stunt.

And that's about it. There's a fit lady who doubles up as your mechanic, some picturesque courses which, bizarrely, all feel rather similar, and split-screen racing for two players. The racing's not slow, but it hardly threatens the sound barrier either. This is just another dreaded karting game masquerading as a futuristic racer. It's playable but will probably prove too frustrating for the very young audience it's aimed at, while being far too easy for everyone else. Unless you suffer from an unhealthy Lego obsession, we can't see why you would want to play this over other racers such as *Ouantum Redshift* (Issue 09, 8.0).

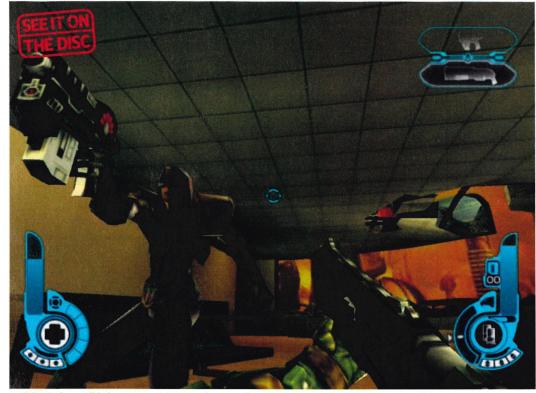

A Dredd-full state, or sex in the Mega-City?

RID MEGA-City One of Judge Death's zombie minions in this futuristic shooter. You are the Law.

REBELLION, the developer of this futuristic shooter, liked the Dredd licence so much that it bought his comic book vehicle, 2000AD. It's strange and disappointing then, that the new owners fell so short in doing their favourite son the justice that he should deserve, and as

the universe's harshest Judge, would *demand* from the barrel of his Lawgiver pistol.

Actually Judge Dredd is not the harshest Judge in the universe. That draconian award would have to go to Judge Death, whose policy on life being a crime punishable by death lies just a dead cat's whisker short of Thatcherite. And dead cats feature significantly in this game's story. Yes they do. With Death escaped from his Iso-Cube after a system failure and riot, a death cult has sprung up who are using Pet Re-gen (a dodgy vet's treatment that revives recently departed fluffies) to populate Mega-City One with Death-serving vampires and zombie horrors.

'Populate', unfortunately, is a very big word in this instance. While the game engine succeeds brilliantly in portraying the neon wonders, glass shields, walkways, skyways, haloed heights and decrepit depths of the sprawling metropolis, it's patently unable to fill the urban spaces with a convincing throng. By mistake this is emphasised right from the opening scene, asking Dredd to disperse/arrest protesters on the steps of the Justice Department. The sight is thoroughly underwhelming, with less than a dozen feebly chanting perps – and the problem persists through the game.

On top of this there's some appalling AI to the city's natives, with pedestrians frequently stuck on and walking directly into walls, and enemies often taking your gunishment with stoic refusal to move an inch from the path of your lead justice. Which all makes for a totally unconvincing living environment, not aided by repetitive dialogue and physics for dead bodies that Dredd should punish for crimes against the laws of gravity. Like incompetent caretaker gods, Rebellion has fashioned a beautiful world from its game code clay, but the spark of life stutters and is extinguished almost before it's had a chance to catch. Glitches with pedestrians sticking on walls extend to Dredd too, and on at least two occasions during this review, gameending bugs occurred after getting lodged in a lift wall and a sewer duct necessitated a suicide restart. A few missing skybox textures also failed to impress this Judge.

Level design is equally disappointing, with undisguised linearity and tired conceits that no longer cut it in the modern shooter. It's just no fun to hide mission objectives in

obscure rooms and have you search for them by recovering every inch of a mostly empty level. While Halo-style pointers direct you to the more linear objectives that you'd find anyway, there's no radar to help find the two objective-dependent perps, for example, who have been deliberately hidden away in a boxroom. There's also the nightmare relay of switch A opens area B, reveals switch B opens area C, repeat until quickly bored. On the journey, meet enemy groups more agile than yourself (varieties are woefully limited,

mainly vampires and zombies) and back out through doorways dispatching from a distance as you retreat. It's been done to Death and fills us with Dredd. Later, you do get to battle Judges leading up to a final confrontation with Death, but the arcade arenas are poorly balanced and one of them again contains a potentially game-ending bug.

Levels do gradually improve and occasionally allow the unique 2000AD humour to shine through - the zombie disco is not to be missed. The comic book style is captured

perfectly by the engine, with decent lighting, smoke, flame and outstanding rain effects splashes for every raindrop and droplets on your visor if you angle skywards. But that's not enough, especially from a developer that proved its mettle with the outstandingly atmospheric PC shooter Aliens Versus Predator. In the language of Mega-City One, we're afraid that while not total Stomm, Dredd Versus Death is verging on Drokk and this FutsiePerson will Grud on a Greenie if it's not more of a Jimp than a Helmet.

PLAY AS some of the leading characters from recent Disney films in this skateboarding game. THERE ARE many unwritten rules in video games. Platform titles will always have secret areas, beat 'em ups must feature scantily clad ladies and kids' titles are nearly always crap. The younger end of the market has long been patronised by games

that fail to make the grade and offer scarcely more than the little uns' favourite characters locked inside hollow gameplay and shoddy presentation. But they're kids, what do they know about production values? Well, we're about to find out because *Disney's Extreme* Skate Adventure turns the rulebook on its head and grinds all over it like a staircase handrail.

The idea is simple. Grab the *Tony Hawk's Pro Skater 4* engine and replace the likes of Hawk and co with Buzz Lightyear, Simba, Tarzan and friends from *Toy Story 2*, *The Lion King* and *Tarzan*. But rather than just being a blatant marketing cash-in, this game shines thanks to great attention to detail combined with a brilliant gameplay balancing act that makes the experience highly playable, yet not technically difficult, for younger gamers.

The animation is superb. Each character can perform many of the same tricks but the movement is very different - with soundbites and mannerisms to match. Grind a wall using Pumbaa the warthog, and his little meerkat pal Timon will hang off his tail. Do the same with Lightyear and he'll stand smugly with his hands on his hips, wearing a cheesy grin. Woody acts as disjointed as a puppet should, Simba the lion cub claws and fidgets away on his board and Tantor the elephant (our fave) executes a grind by jumping up on his back legs while waggling his trunk victoriously. The characterisation brings the action to life and you'll often find yourself watching the player movement rather than making sure you land that 1080° perfectly.

Many of these objectives are offered by characters dotted around the maps that need to be interacted with (similar in style to Freestyle

MetalX, reviewed on page 076) which is better than simply having a checklist of tasks to tick your way through.

The maps are equally varied, with everything from oversized bedrooms to jungle levels and futuristic pizza restaurants. And with two-player options that offer three different games, including King of The Hill providing a split-screen version of tag, the action never gets dull.

The difficulty has been scaled down from the Hawk games, with the balance requirements for manoeuvres, such as hand plants and manuals, relaxed. Hardcore skater fans will be able to keep their feet until the cows come home, while little Johnny will be happy to land his first combo. But that's not to say there's isn't any depth - a huge array of challenges and the ability to still string high-scoring combos together makes sure you'll always have something to aim for, and the huge number of unlockables means your efforts will always be rewarded.

There are occasional collision detection issues where your character may suddenly go face-first into what should be a solid background. and the camera sometimes gets stuck behind objects, but it's infrequent and forgivable because, like a classic Disney movie, this game truly represents fun for all ages - and, most importantly, the kids finally get a game they deserve. Good work, Walt!

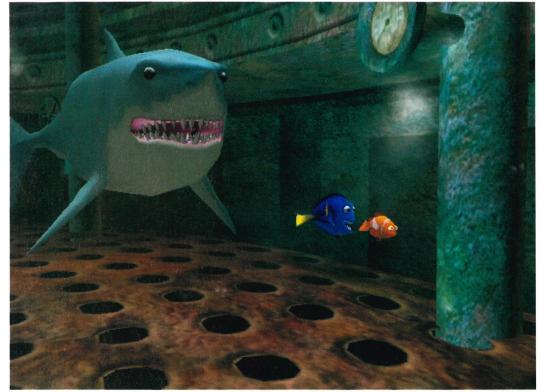

PIXAR'S NEW animated movie becomes deepsea adventure in this charming cartoon romp. IN NAME ALONE, the clownfish evokes images of underwater jokers inclined to throw custard pies at passing haddock. So imagine our surprise when we discovered that the two main stars of Finding Nemo shun chucklesome slapstick

banter in favour of swimming gracefully through dense waters and looking pretty. Clownfish indeed... When was the last time you giggled at a circus aquarium?

Based on Pixar's new film – a heartwarming tale about a kid clownfish (Nemo) gone AWOL – Finding Nemo is a delightful underwater odyssey that's ten times more thrilling than staring at your neighbour's goldfish bowl. You star as several of the movie's colourful characters, but mostly as Nemo, who finds himself imprisoned in a fish tank (he's abducted by a deep-sea diver, you see), and his pa Marlin as he embarks on a quest to save his unfortunate son. Spot the similarities with Toy Story 2? We certainly did.

As with all of Pixar's movies, this is a definite kiddie's product on the surface, but with

a fair degree of adult appeal stored below. You don't have to be under 12 years old to enjoy the *Toy Story* flicks; in fact you need to be older to fully appreciate the clever references. This game is much the same – sweeter than a bowl of cherries, yet tougher than a pair of your grandad's old marching boots.

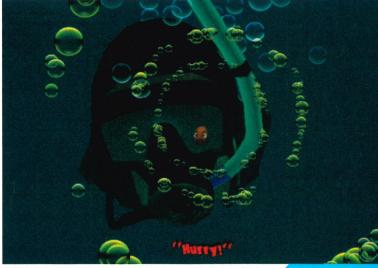
Gameplay-wise, it plays a bit like Rayman 3 but without the combat and set in the ocean depths. It's piled high on the cuteness factor too - Nemo and co sure look cuddly for slimy fish. Each section is split into several levels. The challenges are varied, ranging from 3D chases and head-scratching tile puzzles to sideways platform action in the classic Mario mould. This game rarely throws up a dull moment. The chases/races are simple, addictive, and strangely therapeutic. Your fishy either has to keep up with a leader (such as the forgetful Dory) or escape a ravenous predator (sharks and anglerfish, for example). Swimming through rings enables you to maintain the pace, but unfortunately mines, squids, oil leaks and electric eels are all there to hamper your

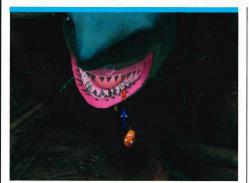

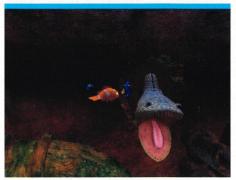

progress, while the sea current often drags you off course. The sense of moving through water is astonishingly convincing, and the way that flailing tentacles emerge in the distance can be eerily unnerving.

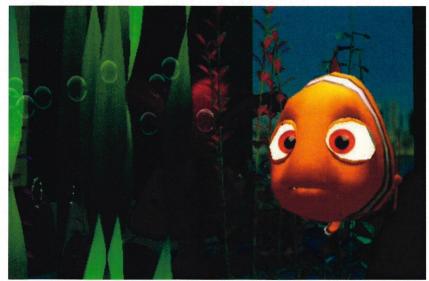
More conventionally, the platform action is retro fun updated for the deep-sea diving generation; all evading hazards, collecting treasures, trapping crabs in bubbles and solving tricky puzzles. The only difference is that instead of jumping, you kind of well... swim, which is great, because there are no narrow ledges to keep tumbling off. Bonus

objectives, such as dropping coloured gems on pedestals, offer added challenge, although with so much horror lurking in the underwater underworld, you'll find your time best devoted to evading the Captain's Table. Fish pie? Good old-fashioned steak and kidney was always the tastier option, anyway...

One of the most important things with games like this is recreating the look of the movie, and on such grounds Finding Nemo rarely puts a fin wrong. As well as employing its original voice actors, the numerous cutscenes are enormously cinematic in their

own right. There'll be no need to skip through these ones - you'll be well and truly hooked, like a cod on a fisherman's line.

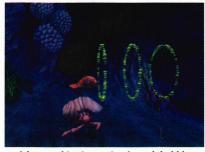
Okay, so we know that this is geared towards a younger market (ages 4-14 primarily), but that doesn't stop it from being any good, does it? In fact, it's nightmarishly difficult in places. STRANGE NAME, good game. If you're a regular reader, you'll already be familiar with Otogi from the playable demo on last month's disc. And if you managed to drag yourself away from the gun-toting carnage of Island Thunder you'll know that this slightly obscure Japanese

action title is certainly worthy of your attention.

It's been a long time since a game with a simple objective of destroying everything in your path has been presented in such an original and engaging fashion. You play a character called Raikoh whose aim is to revive the great seal, which has been the protector of Man for a millennium. This is achieved by seeking out four essences which, when fully restored, means mankind will return to hand-holding harmony and no doubt want to teach the world to sing.

The fun (and plenty of it) is served in three hearty portions - character control, combat and environment interaction. Raikoh has the moves of a gymnast, the sword-wielding skills of Highlander and more hocus pocus than the Magic Circle. Aerial combat is a speciality. By repeatedly tapping the jump button you'll often be fighting like a Crouching Tiger stunt double against a whole array of imaginatively designed demons. Fighting is generally as fluid as movement, with basic moves that can be easily strung into big-digit combos - including subtle manoeuvres that aren't immediately obvious, like timing a strike to repel a projectile attack.

And all of this great action is wrapped up in some truly gorgeous levels that are soaked to the skin in a moody, spooky oriental atmosphere. The game world benefits from rich detail with huge amounts of interactive scenery - meaning if you can strike it you can pretty much destroy it. Bridges will crumble, dwellings will be demolished - often from the inside - and, as the game progresses, the addition of magic unleashes some heavy-duty special effects.

Style over substance? Not really - the hack

and slash nature means that repetition will inevitably rear its ugly head and the camera can get stuck occasionally. But Otogi doesn't pretend to be anything other than a polished action title - and a highly playable one with thoughtful presentation. Don't let the lack of a mega-bucks licence or a billboard marketing campaign stop you from enjoying one of the genuine surprises of the year.

early four years have passed since Namco released the original Soul Calibur on Sega's Dreamcast, a shining knight of a game in terms of graphics, playability and style.

Together with Virtua Tennis, it contributed to keeping Sega's console on life support but couldn't save it from the plug eventually being pulled. Back to the present and, while the blue swirl has long since been replaced by a green X, have we as discerning games players also really changed with the times?

The answer, although many of us would like to think we've grown up and become able to define the wheat from the chaff is, in reality, no. We still like the same type of games - we just like to see continual developments and improvements. But one genre that hasn't really moved with the times is the beat 'em up. It should have soared into the stratosphere three years ago, but it didn't.

Sure, Mortal Kombat: Deadly Alliance (Issue 13, 7.8) and Tao Feng: Fist of the Lotus

(Issue 16, 8.2) are fine games, but are you still playing them now? Chances are, probably not. Dead or Alive 3 (Issue 01, 8.5), did wonders to showcase the graphical prowess of Xbox but still highlighted some fiddly control issues as the combat just didn't seem to flow the way it should. It seems the beat 'em up genre has been racing two steps forward and one step back with no real signs of bucking the trend... that is, until now. Soul Calibur II has arrived.

It's set amongst the incidental backdrop of travelling various lands to retrieve Soul Edge a huge cyclopic sword containing more evil than all the Exorcist movies put together. The twopart (Normal and Extra stages) saga follows a mystically daft plot, which attempts to feel like Fist of the North Star but reads like a bad translation of Homer's Iliad. But forget the story - it's all about the gameplay.

The 20 fighters (five of which are hidden) take in the broadest of influences, from the original denizen of pirate evil

Cervantes and his successor, the Soul Edge-slashing Nightmare, to newbies such as Necrid (a fiendishly brilliant creation capable of dynamically morphing his weapon into those of others) and Todd McFarlane's axe-spinning ex-CIA agent Spawn as the exclusive Xbox bonus. You are not simply limited to a collection of ninjas or the usual out-world-roaming freaks - the fighters are as diverse as they are plentiful.

Strictly speaking, all the characters are unique although some heavy hitters like Nightmare and Astaroth (imagine Street Fighter's Zangief has eaten Eddie Honda, choked to death and returned from hell with a blue tinge and a bloody great big axe) can carry even the most novice player through the early stages of all modes. The learning curve soon hots up though, no more so than in Weapon Master mode (the story mode) when you're faced with specific tasks, such as low gravity fights (where you can only harm your opponent in the midst of a flying combo) or facing a ridiculously short time limit (the only chance of winning the bout being a speedy ring out).

DUNGEON LEVELS OF

MASTER WEAPON mode has boobytrapped Dungeon sub-levels where you must choose a path through in the least number of moves in order to defeat the boss.

Graphically, the developer has really gone to town with the character art. Three different costumes for each character, tiny details like hair movement, Astaroth's beating heart pounding through his chest and neon light trails begin where DOA3 left off, only this time with a fluidity of movement that sets a new standard.

Character playability is second to none. Each fighter has different speeds and attacking range coupled with a multitude of special

weapons techniques. You can use fakes to throw your opponent off the scent of a routine attack and conjure up endless freeform combos that succeed through perfectly responsive character dynamics.

Using the horizontal, vertical and circular strike system, both with and without weapons, makes getting into a basic fighting rhythm easy. It also provides a graduated jump onto advanced techniques such as parries, throws and powered-up moves, accessed by holding down the Right trigger. Causing harm to your opponent in later levels of the Weapon Master mode could be limited to a particular attack or defensive technique - some characters even take on invisibility. Similarly, your fighter could be handicapped by diminishing health or having an ineffective guard for the opponent's chosen weapon. Combat offers great sophistication, but wraps it in an intuitive and highly responsive control system.

As for your surroundings, backgrounds and arenas are exceptionally detailed with running water, stunning atmospheric lighting and great shadows. While nowhere near as interactive as the multi-level street battles of DOA3, Soul Calibur II's environments are plentiful and beautifully drawn. Dungeon levels harbour landmines, lava rings or quicksand and, with the inclusion of a number of fully walled arenas, Namco has made sure that

progression through the game is down to lightning-fast brain power not just muscle-bound brawn or the size of your weapon (although that certainly helps).

Enemy AI is fairly challenging on certain levels, but once you've given Soul Calibur II a week of solid play, any difficulty bar Extra Hard shows repetitive cracks as you can spot attacks coming from routine stances a mile off. Minor gripe over, the title more than makes up for this slight lapse by its constant expansion in Extra Arcade, Survival, Time Attack and Versus modes,

where you can use weapons gleaned in the Master mode to inflict all manner of pain on your prey. It is in Extra Versus mode where the longevity of Soul Calibur II really lies, as fighting another human opponent throws in the element of surprise, making this without doubt the most in-depth and satisfying two-player beat 'em up the Xbox has ever seen.

If you like fighting but prefer to sustain virtual injuries rather than painful broken bones, then buy this game. It's the new benchmark beat 'em up on Xbox.

Top Tips

Tanks are every infantryman's worst nightmare. Thankfully, there are several ways of turning these tin brutes into twisted metal. Sometimes you'll have the opportunity to summon an air strike. Use Bradley's lock-on device to achieve this. Jones is also pretty handy with anti-tank mines, so drop them on the road and enjoy the show.

Anything Else

You can't afford to let any of your team die (and that includes the stranded soldiers of Delta Two). If any of your primary soldiers are incapacitated, run up to them and use a medikit for a swift revival. If you leave them bleeding in the road, they'll soon be going home in a bag that zips from the outside.

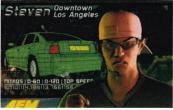

After the tunnel, look for the big building with tinted windows. Drive through these for a shortcut and follow the arrow to victory.

Race 2: Knock the riders off their bikes to gain the upper hand in this heated race. Go straight after Checkpoint 3 and you'll spot an alley with wire fencing. Cut down here, swing right as soon as you exit and then take the first left. Use the nitrous between Checkpoints 9 and 10, which is a very long straight and ideal for shooting ahead. Make 'em eat your dust!

Race 3: This is a basic time trial with the bike. Master the weight transfer with the Left trigger and you'll be sorted.

Race 4: A straightforward race in terms of layout but tricky to win. You should be able to get by using your arrow and map (there are no noticeable shortcuts as such). Try to take an early lead by taking advantage of your bike's nimbleness and weaving in between the heavy traffic.

Race 1: Use either the Emu or, if you have obtained it, the 1971 Bestia (both are quite

nippy) for this long blast on the freeway. Attempt to stay ahead for its entire duration. About three-quarters in (after you drive down a slope for a second time), a lorry will dart across in front of you. If you time it correctly, you can shoot underneath it. However, depending on how far ahead you are, it might be wise to just slow down and let it pass. When you finally leave the freeway for good, look out for a very sharp left turn (tap the Right trigger to avoid ending up as a pile of scrap metal). Also, avoid the petrol tanker just before the finish line otherwise you'll blow up.

Race 2: A simple race. Follow the arrow and get a good start. After Checkpoint 4, look for a shortcut through a glowing alley marked 'P'. Use the nitrous on a large straight about two-thirds of the way into the race to put distance between you and the pack. Also, keep your eyes peeled for a shortcut through the construction site (you need to drive through a fence) towards the end of the course.

Race 1: A difficult race where the checkpoints can be collected in any order. Learn the route of Angel and the other

pacesetter, making sure you turn right at Checkpoint 6 and take the first left. Go left after Checkpoint 7 and then left again. Use your little map to navigate yourself after this (the road to Checkpoint 8 isn't very visible from your car view). There's a little parking lot/alley you can cut through towards the finish. Use the nitrous boost here.

Race 2: Now you must race against Angel's rich dad. Use the handbrake start as he demonstrates. Hit the nitrous as you drive down into the empty canal duct to snatch a lead and attempt to maintain it for the rest of the race. Watch the arrow carefully and cut right as soon as possible towards the finish.

Race 3: Follow Angel round the first three bends, then lose him on the second bridge (after Checkpoint 3) by turning right and zipping through the alley/parking lot marked 'P'. Ignore the steps Angel likes to leap off - they're utterly useless! Follow the arrow. When you have taken the checkpoint that requires you to perform a sharp U-turn (Checkpoint 6), use a nitrous to shoot ahead (you'll be facing a long straight, so it can't go wrong). Drive through the first building

with tinted windows and take the checkpoint. Then crash through the tinted windows of a pink building soon after. Pay close attention to your map and arrow to remain in pole position and cruise to victory.

Race 1: This is just a simple case of losing the cops. Drive towards the finish line in the most jagged and fluent way possible (avoid going round in circles). You'll soon manage to shake 'em off.

Race 2: Here, there are four groups of three checkpoints that can be taken in any order. Go straight ahead, turn left and take the first group. Now use the arrow to lead you to the next nearest group, and so on. For the final lot, you'll need to leap across a huge bridge. Use a nitrous as soon as you hit the home straight. Luckily this race is far more straightforward than it looks.

Race 3: There are a couple of tiny shortcuts during this race that can gain you vital seconds. After Checkpoint 3, head left, drive across the grassy bit and sneak in to the right-hand side of the strange sculpture. Next, keep an eye out for a shop with a '9C' marking a few metres along. Take a diagonal right up here. After Checkpoint 4, make sure you take the first left to avoid a long route round. Use a nitrous after Checkpoint 11 to boost through the underground tunnel and leap towards the finish.

Race 1: Use the slipstream acceleration method to get a headstart over your rivals. Continue as necessary before performing a sharp handbrake turn onto the highway. Follow the path. Look out for the orange signs on your left (this is considerably later). Here, you must leap off the edge of the highway and into the construction site. Collect the checkpoint and drive through the grill fence to get the next one. After the construction site, follow the arrows to two more checkpoints. There'll be a building to the left with tinted windows. Drive through this, and then go up the tall concrete stairs as you exit (not too fast though, or you'll crash!). Leap off the ledge to collect the checkpoint and follow the arrows to the next one. Next, throw an immediate right towards a building. You'll be taken through a series of underpasses and a couple of glass windows. Don't veer off! Carry straight on along a ledge and through more glass windows. This will lead you to a massive jump onto a large

bridge. This shortcut is essential and will reward you with considerable ground. After this, follow the arrows for the rest of the race (watch out for a very sharp left as you come off the highway for a second time). After collecting the last checkpoints on the roofless underpass (a great place to use your nitrous), drive up the steep wall and perform a very sharp turn up an alley to achieve victory.

Race 2: This is a huge race that covers every inch of L.A. It's a case of knowing the area well, as the checkpoints are spread out. The best route to take at the beginning is by following the pack down the second turning, leaping off the steps and driving straight ahead through the windows. Follow the arrow to Checkpoint 1, then double back to get the checkpoint next to the winding road that runs alongside the park. Save the nitrous for the end, which is needed to launch yourself up and off the large mechanical thing in the construction site (this leads to the finish line).

Race 1: Easy peasy - this one is generally a case of following the arrows and your map to the checkpoints. Drive on the grass where possible to avoid traffic (Checkpoint 5 is a good example). Cut through a building underpass immediately after taking Checkpoint 8. This leads you up a bridge, which involves a huge leap at the end. Use the finish (make sure you have the correct line to go through the arch otherwise you'll crash and blow up).

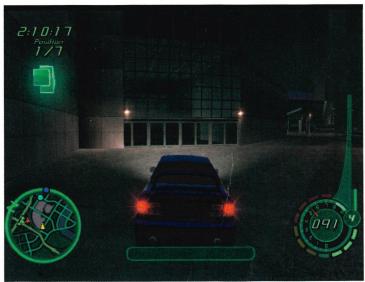
Race 2: This is a great race and possibly the most exhilarating one in the city. Take the immediate left after Checkpoint 2 through the grill of the parking lot. Use a nitrous off the tip of the bridge after Checkpoint 3 (you'll soar through the air). When attempting to take Checkpoint 12, make sure you have enough speed to leap off the roof (or you'll fall short of your target and crash). An essential shortcut can be found immediately after Checkpoint 13 - take a very sharp turn down the alley to get Checkpoint 14. You can then take two routes from here both entail a similar distance, although we recommend the left-side path beneath the buildings and through the

parking lots, as opposed to the subways. After Checkpoint 15 you will encounter another immediate and very sharp shortcut down an alley. Finally, following Checkpoint 20, nip through a small arch and turn right to nail Checkpoint 21.

Race 1: You'll need to follow your main arrow religiously, making a mad and direct dash to the nearest checkpoint indicated. We recommend slowing down slightly after each checkpoint in case the arrow flicks suddenly in an unexpected direction (one false move could cost you the race). Begin by taking the second left off the roundabout. Watch out for the construction blockade at the end of the alley (you'll need to go directly through the middle to avoid crashing). As soon as you hit the straight, use a nitrous. Also, at the end, resist using the ramp before the finish line, and zip through the open door on the ground level to win.

Race 2: Checkpoint 3 in this race is particularly awkward – after taking the second one, take the wide right round the first bend, go right down a small road, left down an alley and immediate right down another alley. Take the checkpoint, go straight, take a right at the end and throw an immediate left. Also, use a nitrous as you approach the stairs to a certain famous church, but stay far right otherwise you'll crash into the building.

Race 1: This is by far the best route for winning this race – stick to it and you'll be laughing. First of all go straight, then turn left at Checkpoint 2. Go left again (before heading onto a bridge) and take the first right onto the next bridge instead. Go left to take the next checkpoint and immediately drive down the slope onto the river front. Follow this route in its entirety to collect numerous checkpoints. Keep an eye on your arrow as two of the earlier checkpoints are situated right out on the front. Also, watch out for the slope

that threatens to take you off the river front prematurely. Once you've collected all accessible checkpoints, take a slope up onto the main road, and do a sharp left onto the bridge. You'll soon need to briefly return to the river front to collect another checkpoint - don't miss the turning! Swing round and take the first slope back up, go left and cut through a parking lot (an alley marked 'P') to finish.

Race 2: This is generally straightforward and requires you to collect the checkpoints in the correct order. Take your arrow literally (even if it means suddenly doing a U-turn, or crashing through a small railing). Keep an eye ahead to see what ground level the checkpoints are situated, as you sometimes need to take the immediate slope up onto the bridges rather than remain on the river front.

leap through the windows (this will give you an early lead as your rivals tend to go beneath the arches). As soon as you land, head right and take the first left, followed by first right. Carry on as normal. For Checkpoint 4, cut through the alley/ parking lot straight ahead marked 'P', turn right and right again. The rest of the race is straightforward, although there will be another ramp through a building for eagle-eyed racers. We recommend using a nitrous as you leap towards the Eiffel Tower. Watch out for a sharp 180° turn as you take a slope off the river front underpass. Also, keep an eye out for the arches that you need to cut through. Use a nitrous as you jump the large glass roof to secure victory.

Race 2: There are two shortcuts at the beginning. Take the second right and go diagonally right to leap off the ramp and drive through the windows. Go round the glass roof as you land and nip through the alley (ignore the ramp). Follow the arrow to the next two checkpoints. Before Checkpoint 3, you will have to leap on

and off a large boat. To avoid a soaking, use a nitrous. Use your last nitrous on the final straight through the alley. Note: ram the bikers whenever you can - they fall off their bikes with ease.

Race 3: An incredibly simple race. Begin by ramming the bikers off their vehicles. After Checkpoint 2, you can take a shortcut through the two glowing alleys marked 'P'. After the petrol station on the river front underpass, take the first slope back up to higher ground. Also, following the last checkpoint, continue in the direction you are heading before cutting through the arch marked 'P' to victory.

Race 1: The Bryanston V is a good car for this race. The checkpoints (which can be collected in any order) are located on roundabouts in small clusters of three. Keep taking the group nearest to you at all times. The best way to learn a good route is to stay tightly on Stephane's tail. However, make sure you save a nitrous for the end.

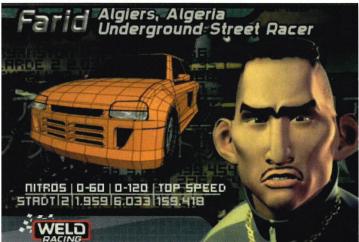

Race 2: Consider using a nitrous on the empty straight after Checkpoint 3 (make sure you don't crash into the police barricade, though). Take the right-hand route after Checkpoint 4 to collect the 5th. Immediately turn right here, head through the grill and into the catacombs. After this section, launch yourself off the glass roof and over the building to get the next checkpoint (use a nitrous – it looks spectacular). This should give you an enviable lead. The rest of the race can be navigated pretty easily with your arrow and map.

Race 1: Make sure you choose a vehicle with good handling, as the catacombs are tight and twisting. When you first emerge above ground, turn right and crash through the brown wooden door to

When you return above ground for the final time, drive through the church, get the checkpoint, do a U-turn and use a nitrous to launch onto the big boat and off again. You should win the race with ease.

Race 2: To first lose the cops, simply launch yourself off the ramp and drive through the windows of the building then zip away as quickly as possible. If they find you again, clever driving will soon have them scratching their heads in bewilderment (be wary of your time

limit, though!). Drive up the hill alongside the Sacré Coeur and cut right towards the finish point on your map.

Race 3: Here you'll be faced off against a British agent who keeps referring to you as 'old boy'. Technical skills are the name of the game as there aren't too many shortcuts and '00whatever' is a tricky opponent. You'll need to crash through a grill fence to get to the finish point, but apart from that, our best advice is to follow the arrow and master the art of handbrake turns, powersliding and slipstreaming. Note: Get a good lead by burning up the steps, veering towards the right and cruising through the archway.

>>> Parfait

Race 1: Follow the pack straight ahead to Checkpoint 1 (some of your rivals use nitrous here, which is optional for your good self). Turn right, then left onto the bridge to get Checkpoint 2, and immediately cut right through the alley marked 'P'. This takes you out to Notre Dame. Make sure you go round the right-hand side of the cathedral to get Checkpoint 3, otherwise you'll end up facing the wrong way. Crash through the iron fences and jump onto the boat and off. Take the left-hand side to arrive at the next checkpoint. The rest of the race can

be completed using your arrow, although there are a few minor shortcuts through alleys and parking lots. Save a nitrous for a second leap off a boat and maybe use the last one to leap off the hill with the finish line glowing in the distance.

Race 2: This is an obscenely difficult race simply because of the power of your opponents' cars and the traffic congestion. Select the Stadt as it handles well against oncoming traffic. Attempt to stay with the pack for much of the race, saving your nitrous for the end. Follow Parfait for the best route, sticking to her like glue. When you reach the checkpoint by the fountain (some way into the race), take a right and go straight on (but veering slightly to the right). You will discover an entrance to the checkpoint next to the Ferris wheel. Take this, go diagonally left, get the next checkpoint (use a nitrous if you want), head left and jump for the final checkpoint. It's tough, but you should nail it with practice.

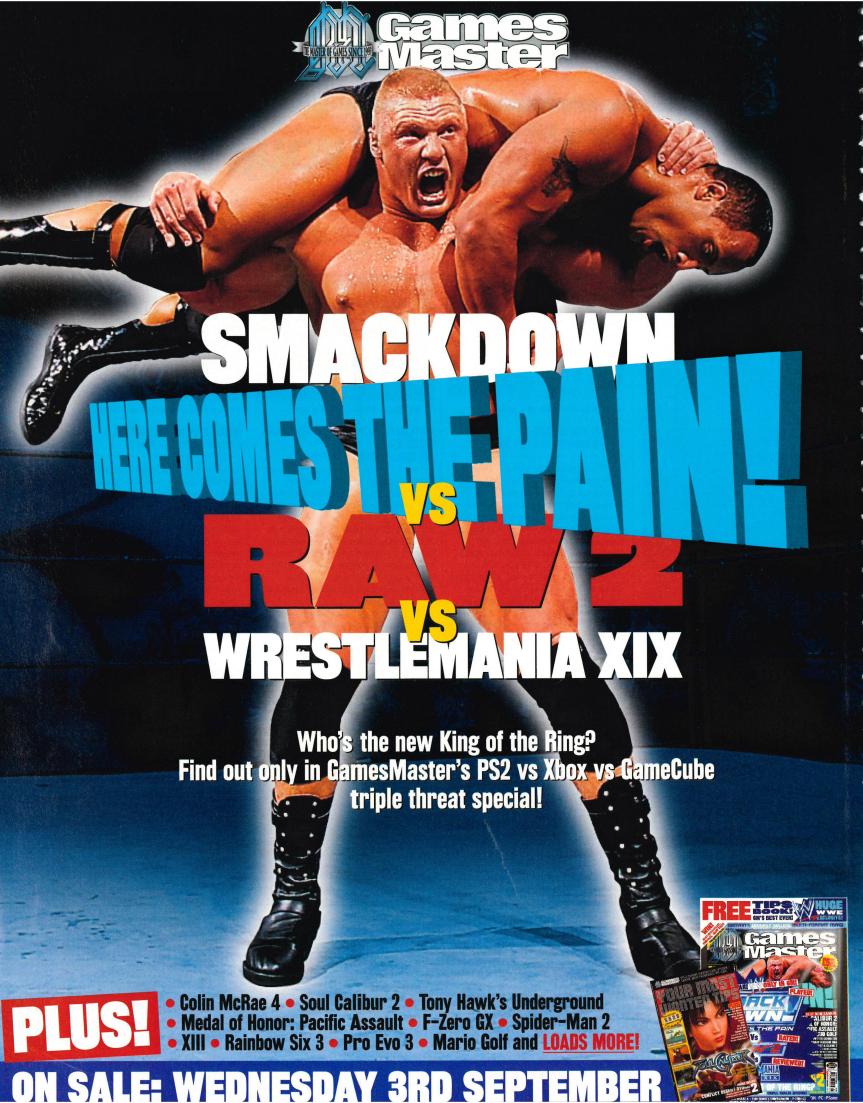

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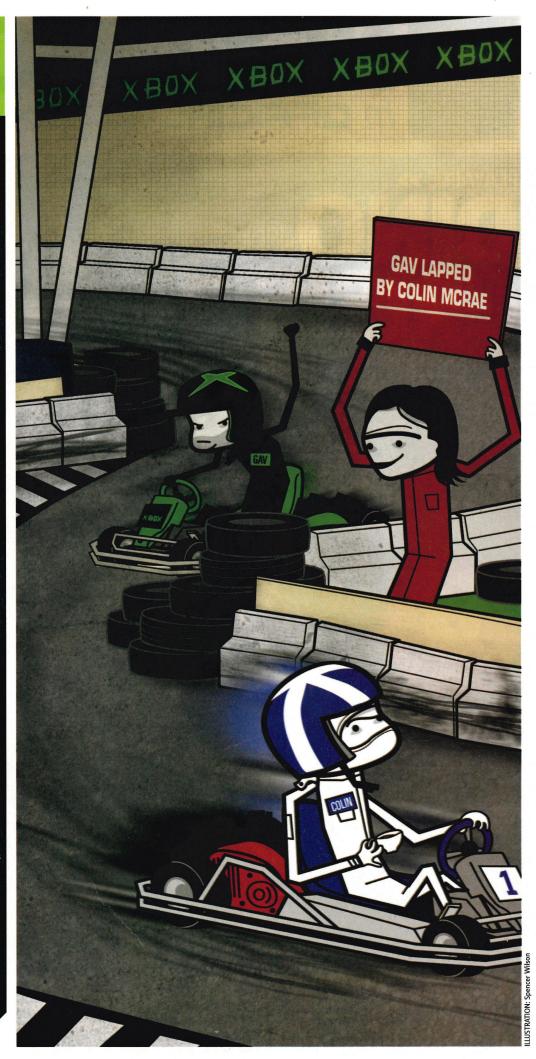
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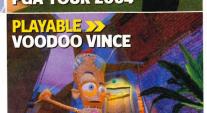


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
