
WHOLE-TRAIN FEVER

Paris workbums have been freezing their butt all winter long... Their mission: to buff whole trains despite of the temperature, falled far below zero... At least 10 whole trains got done



"WARSAW WARRIORS"

Eastern Europe, since we saw stuff getting done in such cities as Prague in Czechoslovakia or Zagreb in Croatia. For a long time, we've been hearing rumours about a strong graff scene growing up in Poland... now we've got evidences.



In Warsaw, the capital city of Poland, the first writers showed up around 1991; but the culture really started to develop in 1994, that's when the first trains got painted... Today, crews like SD (SIR, DJMB...), B3S (DER, DASK...), DOT (CHACE...), DNS, NSO are getting busy on the Warsaw hall of fame near the central station, but also on those fresh orange S-trains. Until now it seems that normal people like graffiti, and the police is angry about tags but still doesn't care about the pieces, so the yards are easy and the trains don't get buffed! Of course the usual flow of addicted interailers is growing up: VTO crew from Zürich, writers from Vienna, Prague, and many Berliners like KOBOLT, STEAK, BIRNE, ASID, KADEH, FISH, RCB crew who pay regular visits and now have the most pieces running. The next summer is coming, we'll see if destruction time has come!








"Barcelona Psykopath"

OM, HIS, VINO ... Whatever the name may be, he's one of the busiest psycopath in the city of Barcelona, Spain. He's telling us why he choosed to devote his life to graffiti.



•When did you start writing?

As in the rest of Europe, graffiti came to Spain together with the breakdance fashion, in the beginning of the 80's. But things really started around 1991-1992, with the rising of rap music. Hundreds of youngsters started writing their name on the insides of subway cars and on the walls of the city... many of them got caught when the TMB decided to put security guards in the subway I Then some guys started doing train pieces, that's when I got interested in graffiti... Even if at the beginning I was only doing characters !

How do you explain that despite of the difficulty and the short running time, most of Barcelona writers are painting strictly trains?

That's right, trains don't run longer than a couple of days, and the subways just run for a few hours... but it's not a problem, we're just gonna do more I There are a few guys like PIE who bomb a lot in the city itself, tags and throw-ups, that's what he really likes... but the train scene is the most important, we have about ten big crews like OTP, TSK, BTS, REDS who do a lot every week. The wall scene is dying slowly, I guess because Barcelona writers need more emotions than just painting under the sun I The feeling in the yard is like a drug for me, so I guess it's the same for the other writers out there... We need the risk I

·You've got many types of trains in Spain, which ones do you paint?

All of them I but some are more difficult than the others. The subway system is the hardest to bomb, we have 4 different lines which are almost totally underground; but only a few writers like NINJA, OBES, MEOT and me dare to paint them. Then we do all kinds of things like the «Cercanias» (mirror trains), the «Cataluña exprés» (long distance), and many different stuff in the yards around Cataluña, Valencia, Zaragoza, and even in Portugal and the south of France, near the border.

Are you travelling a lot to paint trains?

I went to many different cities in Spain, it's cool to go down the south of Spain cause it's really easy there, you can spend a whole night in the yard if you want! Last summer I've also been travelling in Europe together with OVES, RIMA and KRASH; we went to France, Belgium, Germany, Denmark... When we arrived in Copenhagen everybody was telling us it was too hard to do S-trains... so we went on our own, and everything was OK I We also had a good time in Paris together with OPAK, FIZZ, DESER; it's a crazy city for doing graffiti, I did things there that I never did in Barcelona before... at first it seemed easy to paint trains and subways, but then I realized it would have been totally dif-

ferent if we'd have gone on our own. I also brought back home a nice souvenir from Paris : I was making a whole car on a subway train, and I had to climb between two subway cars to reach the top; I finally felt down over the 3rd rail... When I went off in the street I realized

my ass was really fucked up I But travelling for graff is a good experience, I learned you can make really good friends.

Back to your local scene... I heard Barcelona was divided in 2, with the «hip hop» writers on one hand, and the «red skin» writers on another, is that true ?

I don't think there are two opposite groups... I have communist ideas and I'd rather lesson to ska music, nevertheless I don't feel like belonging to any of these classifications. Everyone has



his own musical tastes and political points of view, but we have one common point in our lives: graffiti, and that's what counts to me.

Does it influence Barcelona styles?

Everything that happens in your life influences you, style is something you have deep into yourself but for me it's in a constant changing process... PIE taught me two important things : firstly, regardless to style the quantity is always very important. Secondly, a simple style doesn't mean an easy style... I think it's much harder to be original with a simple style than with a complicated wild style! That's why I prefer simple styles coming from France or Northern Europe.

Some people see graffiti like a nice thing, but I don't wanna talk about art, because you can buy art but you will never buy graffiti, cause real graffiti is illegal. All those guys who do legal graff and commissions are not writers to me, just

fucking artists, graff remains a game where the most intelligent is the winner, and it's also a way to show this society that we're able to do big creative things. So I'll try to paint as long as possible, my life is my girlfriend and graffiti and I can't think my life without that.

Your last words?

Say hello to my crew TSK «the Sickopats» (VINO, RIMA, BLUE 101, SIAN, DAPH, VIT) and «Stay Rude» with NINJA and OBES...a few more hellos to SOS, HELS, HOVE, SNAT, KAZE, PAKO, SOE, MEOT, BTS, FIZZ, DESER, SDK, PIE, SODA, JAKO, KR2, CEX, PME, MATH, AIZE, FM-FTC... and special kiss to my mother, my brothers and of course my girlfriend RIMA who supports me everyday!






