

#### Primarily Merely A Surname

Registration on the Principal Register was refused grounds that the mark is primarily merely a surname. as is evident from the enclosed substitute specimens, the term VEGA as used by applicant refers not to any surname but to the star Vega (a star of the first magnitude that is the brightest in the constellation Lyra). The substitute specimens, which have been in use in commerce since at least as early as the filing date of the application, give an outer space presentation in which VEGA is displayed next to the phrase "The Bright Star Of The Internet" and also as nort of the physics "Mosa Universes"

The mark is used in another outer space presentation in the original specimens (see specimen sheet 3), and the reference to the star is made explicit in the displayed phrase "Rocket Coaster To Star Vega's Entertainment Stations".

The primary significance of the mark to the purchasing public would therefore not be a surname, but rather as a reference to an outer space theme based upon the star Vega.

## Recitation of Services

The recitation of services was found to be unacceptable as

indefinite. In response, kindly amend the description of services to the following:

A'gb

"Entertainment and educational services, namely providing information in the field of video and arcade games and providing a computer game, all of which may be accessed network-wide by network users".

This conforms to the Examiner's suggestion for a new description of services.

### Specimens

New specimens are enclosed which show the use of the mark VEGA as it appears in the drawing page. In these specimens the mark is highlighted by itself, with the trademark symbol "TM" appearing immediately next to it. The accompanying phrase "The Bright Star Of The Internet" is spaced from the mark, which is clearly emphasized as a separate trademark. The new specimens are accompanied by the declaration of applicant's president, which states that the specimens were in use in commerce at least as early as the filing date of the application.

### Translation

VEGA does not have any significance in the relevant trade, and no geographical significance other than the star Vega. Applicant is not aware of VEGA having any meaning in a foreign language.

All of the objections raised in the Office Action are now

Deficiency to be satisfied, and passage of the application to publication is respectfully requested.
