pistol ahead and begin a long, languid odyssey of cruel, lingering brutality...







I tried to open a big blue door, but, no matter how much I cussed, swore and stamped my feet, it just wouldn't budge.



Each of the original characters was made up from a total of 2,000 polygons. 

Don't be fooled by the hype. Both Mortal Kombat 2 and Street Fighter 2 are better. The Saturn's going to have versions of Mortal Kombat (probably MK 3), Street Fighter and Dark Stalkers (yeeeesss!!), so Virtua Fighter falls down when compared with those three.

Remember, the arcade game's about a year old now, and a year's a long time in computer games – or so my dear sweet grandmother always used to say.

When it boils down to it, there's bound to be a lot worse games around for the Saturn, all I ask is that while some mags will try to convince you that it's the best thing since real life, try to remember how you felt after you actually played the game. Another point: when was the last time you saw Virtua Fighter in the arcades?

Your first act at the start of the level is to launch this cow into space. Why? Apparently all will be revealed later - it makes a brief appearance in the next level. To launch the cow, whip the fridge while you're standing below it.
