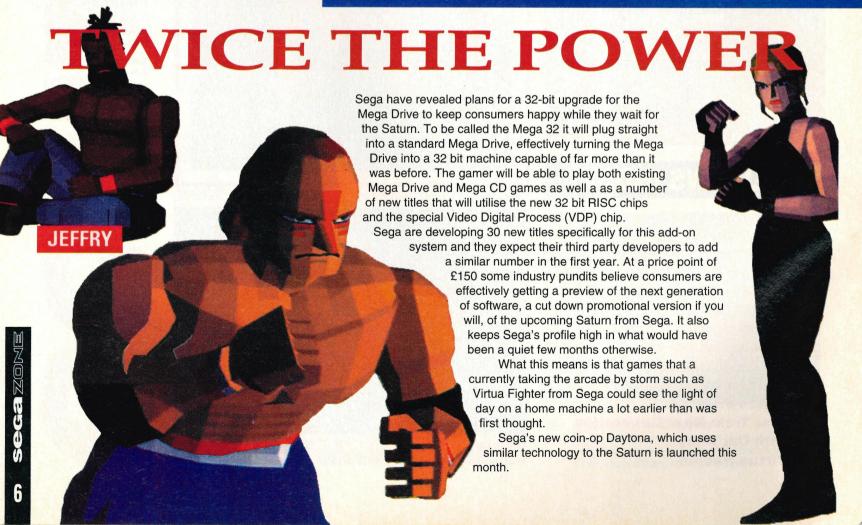
# BIG CD CONF

### No, they're still the same size, silly

Two of the year's biggest CD titles are currently stuck in limbo as no-one is quite sure when, if or by whom the games will be released. The games in question are Rebel Assault and Flashback CD, both of which are eagerly awaited by the gaming community. Rebel Assault has been signed by JVC in the states but there is currently a problem over whether Sega themselves or an as yet unnamed third party publisher will do the honours in Europe. Negotiations are underway but the way things are going it seems unlikely the game will get a release before the summer.

Flashback CD does have a publisher, Sony, but they are currently getting the jitters about releasing it in the near future as another Delphine developed game, Another World 2 is to be released in the next two months. Sony don't want a clash and the hope is they will simply put the game back, but unconfirmed rumours suggest they may scrap the game all together. Sony were unavailable for comment as we went to press.

### A DEGREE OF **IMAGINATION**



The hallowed halls of higher education will soon be echoing to the stereophonic sound effects of videogames when a new one year Masters degree begins at Middlesex University this autumn. Training students in all aspects of video games design and production the hope is that this will encourage a whole new generation of talented programmers to rush forth and drown software houses with more quality games than they could wave a cheque-book at. The Masters in Design and Production of Interactive Games is actually just the vanquard for a full three year bachelors degree of the same name which will start in the

A number of software companies have supported the initiative but chief amongst them is, somewhat worryingly, Domark. Development manager Russell Ferrier has been instrumental in getting this course off the ground and has been applauded from all sides. He believes the games industry was "in danger of becoming stale and tired". We can only agree, just look at games like James Bond: The Duel and Marko's Magic Football from the last year. Now who was it who published those games again?

In the reality the prevalence of the console in recent years has been blamed for the drop in standards, no longer can young talent experiment in programming as they could o the Amiga or ST, the Mega Drive

In the short term a course like may produce clones who program in a very similar style but once other universities catch up and start their own courses that can only be a good thing in the long run. We're just not sure if allowing the company responsible for Skull and Crossbones on the Amiga should be so closely involved in the training of new programmers

Time Warner, that remarkably huge media conglomerate, is to merge its three division involved in producing video games into one new company.

Time Warner Interactive Group, Atari Games Corp and Tengen Inc. will all be merged into a group known as Time Warner Interactive.

The company believe that this will give them an edge in a market starting to attract some very big players as they devlop and market products on nearly every format.

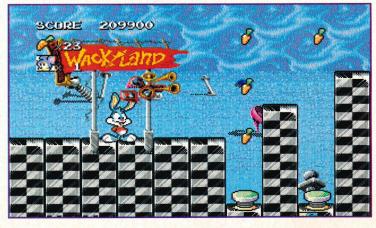

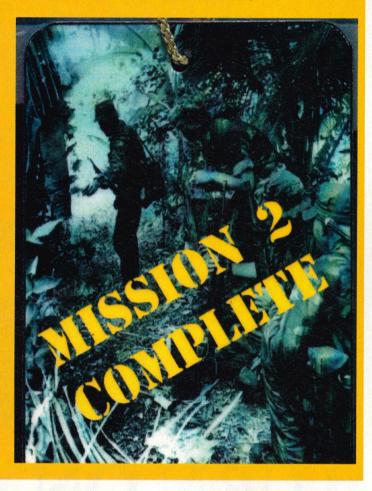
but there are several odd little sub-games thrown in for good measure, not unlike the original when you think about it.

The game is currently scheduled for a November release, no doubt EA are hoping to get the Christmas number one two years on the trot after their success with FIFA last vear.



### ASSAULT & BATTERY

Domark's PC hit, AV8 Harrier Assault is on its way to the Mega CD in an all-action consolised version. Claiming it to be the fastest console flight sim ever Domark have included bitmapped 3D graphics as well as the now compulsory CD quality music. One nice touch aside from the game is a history of the Harrier's development and its deployment around the world.

The game features plenty of the usual flight sim stuff, loads of weapons, over a hundred different objects, vehicles and the like, plenty of video footage and some artificial intelligence stuff that allows your squadron to do its thang while you get down to some fighting and stuff.

AV8B Harrier Assault should be available for the Mega CD in July, as yet there is no word on a price.

A new game from Sega, featuring a doll with a wayward but useful head is on the way, complete with politically correct undertones. Dynamite Headdy is the star but the real selling point of the game may turn out to be the fact he is a doll and his head can perform all sorts of wonderful little tricks, some funny, some lethal.

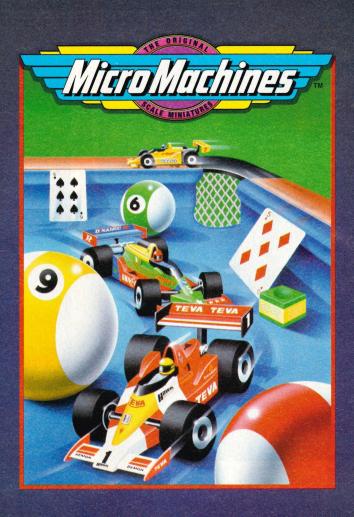
Dynamite Headdy has been banished from

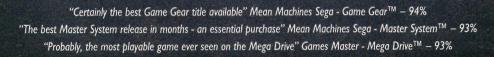

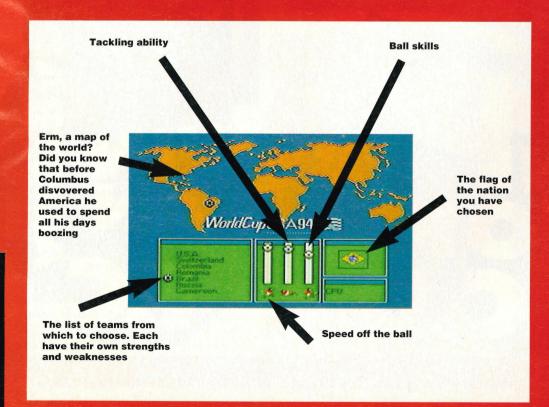

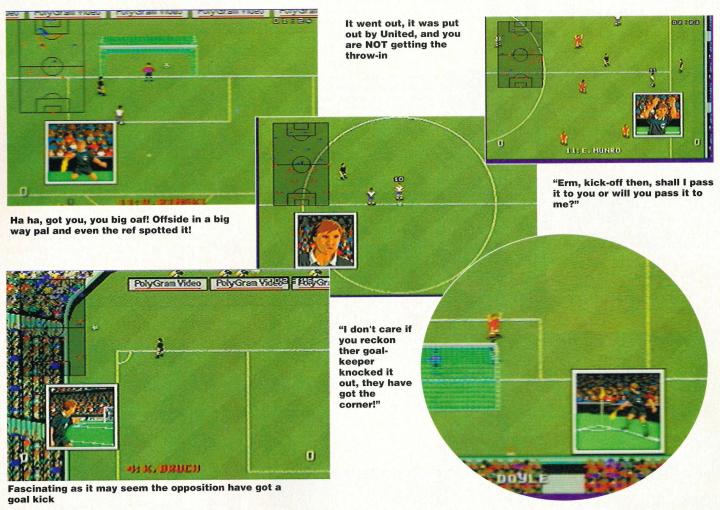

customise, adjust, interfere with or generally muck about with in this game. Formation on the pitch can be adjusted to such a degree that you feel like a manager at a training session, with one of those blackboards lots of little lines and stuff. The speed of the game can be altered as can the amount of "glue" there is on the ball. This "glue" determines how well the ball sticks to the player, the less skilful you are the more glue you will need. My favourite has to be the way you can turn off that appalling back-pass rule. All the other nonsense like player names, kit designs and shoe size (probably) can be fiddled with but that's really only for the anally retentive.

So, the football itself. Well you've got friendlies or you've got a World Cup. In the World Cup all the teams that are actually competing in the real thing are the default settings complete with the right groups. All the other teams who failed to qualify are hanging around waiting for you to substitute them. You could easily get rid of Germany and replace them with England should you so desire and play your own little fantasy World Cup. Each countries abilities are roughly comparable to the real thing, in relative terms at least (whatever that means), so you can see how well England, or whoever, would have performed in the World Cup under your management.

The gameplay itself is, from what we've seen so far, fast moving and exciting. There is a one touch pass system where you indicate the general direction you want the ball to go in and if there is a player near by then they'll run on to it. This will make for really very fast and simple play that should offer plenty of fun. of course to keep up with all this fast moving pay you can't just rely on players running on to a pass. If there isn't a player nearby an elegant move could just fall apart before your eyes. This is where the radar comes in. You've seen it before on Kick Off and all sorts of other footie games and it's here now but it has to be said that not having it would have been a disaster.

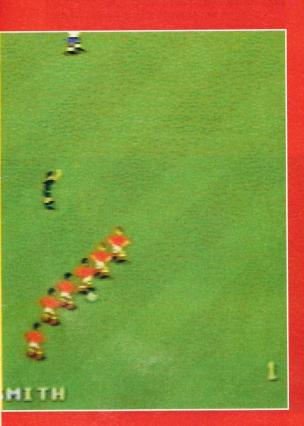

tar Trek: The Next Generation is without doubt the best science fiction series ever. No questions asked, this is definitely the bee's knees when it comes to quality entertainment. 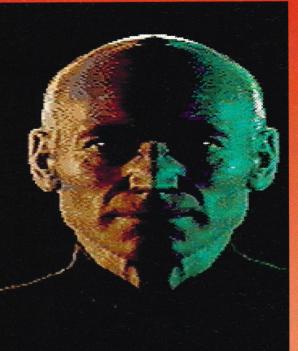

In some ways this game is a little like being on work experience, you get to try everything and make your own decisions but big boss man is right behind you to give advice and/or the occasional telling off. You see you don't actually play Jean-Luc Picard, he is on hand to offer hints or reprimands, nor do you actually play any of the other characters, you just kind of float between their workstations on the bridge, doing what they would do.

The game, intriguingly, makes no mention of an actual plot, which means that when decisions need to be made there is no way of making your decision based on what you think the game wants, all you can do is remember that you are very near the neutral zone, the Romulans are trying to

provoke you all the time and your duty is to preserve life within the Federation. Certainly the game follows the same pattern, and could even be divided into levels, but as you play through only gradually do you realise what you are actually up to, which I think is a cracking idea.

Each level will ostensibly be a mission from Starfleet command which will involve a visit to some distant planet. Nine times out of ten something else will come along to interrupt the seemingly harmless mission, thus providing the real juice for the level. It could be an unrecognised abandoned ship or it could be interference from the Cardassians. Then again it could be even worse than that, the Borg might make an appearance.

Space combat with an enemy vessel certainly isn't anything to write home about resembling the two player bit of Asteroids where you could shoot each other. Still it is good fun I suppose. The real fun comes when you send an away team down to a planet or to board a ship. You select four of the ship's crew, including of course the two security

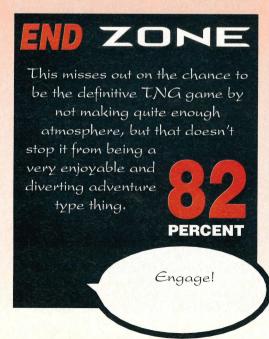

officers as cannon fodder, and away you go. Also the feeling of trepidation as you eventually materialise sends a tingle down the spine.

Presentation isn't superb, but you know that you are in a Star Trek game right from the word go, and the little bits of background info that stack the computer can make very interesting, and useful, reading on the long journeys between planets. Ever wondered how Warp drives actually work? Well here's your chance to find out.

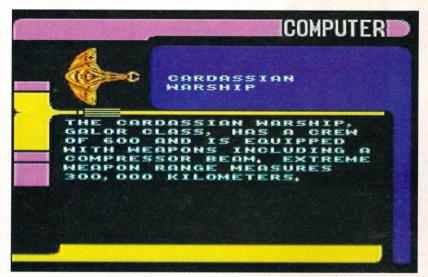
Star Trek: The Next Generation certainly isn't as well put together as it could be and it doesn't make enough use of the relationships between the characters which, lets be honest, make the TV programme what it is. 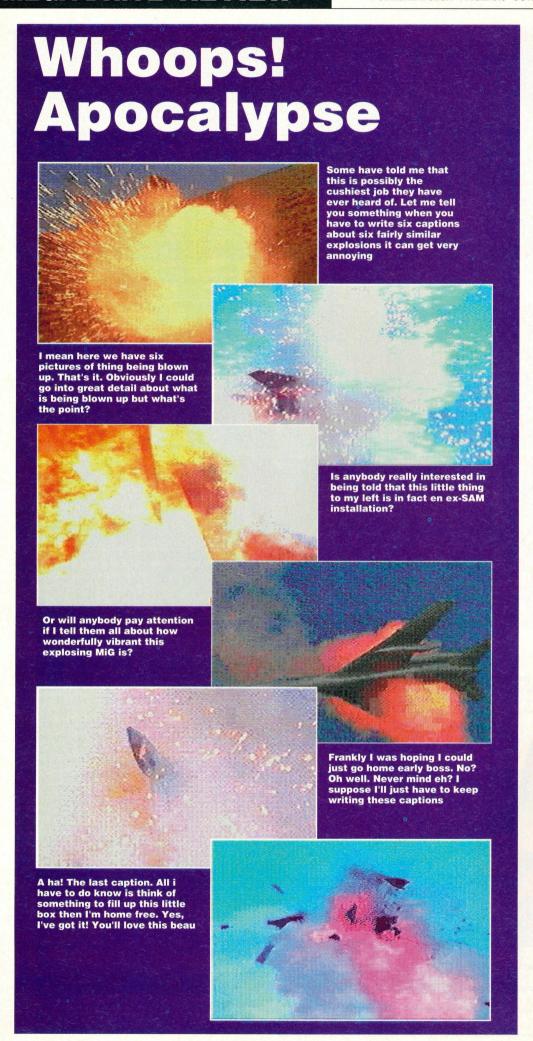


magine being a navy flyer. Wouldn't it be just bloody marvellous? Well folks, Tom Cat Alley could be your only chance.

This is the latest in a number of games that take simple gameplay, usually a shoot'em-up type thang, and dress it up with loads of footage of real actors with real voices to make you think it is some kind of interactive movie. Now nobody falls for that interactive movie crap, everybody knows it is nothing more than the same old stuff with a bit of atmosphere thrown in for good measure. The best so far has to be Sony's Ground Zero Texas. It came on two CD's but that had some of the best production values I have ever seen on a video game and while the gameplay was simple the way it came at you so fast you didn't really have a great deal of time to notice.

Tom Cat Alley (TCA) goes the same way, plenty of action and lots of footage in between all that to try and make you believe that this really is real-life and you are actually there. No, really, they do think that. In this case you are Shadow five, drafted in to beef up the terribly top secret





installation NASTI with your pilot Dakota. Don't worry these B-movie games are always full of some really naff names. You are but a mere navigator/weapons officer in charge of everything apart from actually flying the thing. This is actually quite good because you don't have to worry about all that awkward stuff like throttle and gear and flaps and widgets and things, all you have to do is make sure the weapons hit their targets.

As W/O it is up to you to make the most of the lock on a target that the aircraft will automatically get. Here you'll use the joy pad to follow the target plane until you get a red lock (known as target solution) at which point you fire the missile. This isn't as easy as it sounds because once a target has been initially locked then it bucks and bounces like a rabbit on heat, getting solution isn't easy. If you fail then the chances are the target will pull a neat manoeuvre and end up behind you, at which point it is time to reach for the chaff because you can rest assured that it wont be long before an eight-foot long Mach 5 death warrant is tearing through your plane.

Dogfights make up the biggest part of the game, and they certainly are fun. With the footage of the ground racing past at three hundred MPH as your plane rolls and dives it is surprisingly convincing. Dogfights aren't what this game is all about, they are just the preliminaries so that you can carry out your mission objective in peace.

Before each mission there is a briefing, this is where the actors come in. As is now traditional in these vignettes in all this style of game it is here that the cheesy dialogue and flimsy attempts at characterisation. The sad part is that these guys are so stereo-typed that there is more character development in your average Jim Davison routine, the acting so wooden that it makes BA Barracus look as though he deserves an Oscar for his work on the A-Team.

Without all this though the game wouldn't be the same, and it would be revealed for the competent, but ultimately fairly average shoot'emup that it is. Even with all the cut-aways during play - missiles heading for the target, Airfix models being blown up in an attempt to convince us that they have used real MiGs, shots of pilots looking vexed as you cock up again - it still comes down to nothing more than a reasonably well presented shoot'em-up which kept a few actors of the streets for week or two. No bad thing in itself but not enough to make me want to rush out and buy Tom Cat Alley. It coul d have been so different as well.

cliché of a detective in any adventure game these days.

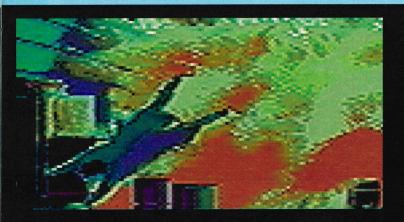

The game now falls into a pattern. Using leads given by the Mayor, a couple of names, your first stop will be the Pleasuredome, to ask a few questions. In most conversations there will be three responses, pick the wrong one and your subject will clam up on you. You really do have to think carefully what is the right answer, or the whole game could fall apart right in front of your eyes. If you do really well they may give you something, maybe an ID card for someone's flat or a bullet-proof vest, whatever it is you should always be on the lookout for opportunities to use

Object usage is a major part of the game play. None of the scenes you will see actually move around, the trick is to flick into your inventory, pull out the right object and place it the area of the screen where you think it will be most useful, for example an ID card over a lock. 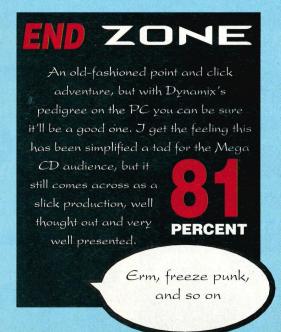

Rise of the Dragon drips atmosphere, as the plot picks up speed and more and more sinister angles are revealed to you the more riveting it becomes. And like all the best adventure games, the further you get in the more places you find to go and do things. The arcade sections toward the end are laughable they are so crap, but they don't take up much room and are only a minor distraction from the real work of puzzle solving and investigation. 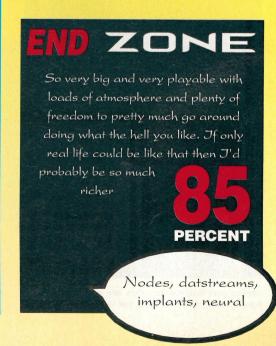
This is a data-store. If you can get in here and relieve the system of a few files you could easily make some cash get hold of better pieces of kit and better pieces of information. The only jobs going in the urban sprawl of Seattle, where your brother bought the farm are black-economy errand running tasks, or Shadowrunning. These jobs will be anything from delivering a package from one nice neighbourhood to another, to jacking into the Matrix and trying to access data from some of the better protected places in cyberspace.

I've lost you haven't I? The Matrixt is cyberspace. Cyberspace is the electronic netherworld of communication networks that computers use to talk and swap information. Imagine if you are having a telephone conversation with a friend, the conversation doesn't actually take place at one end or the other but somewhere in between, in cyberspace. Computer systems, while accessible from the net may not want you to get in that easily, they'll probably be protected by something called ICE. You have a number of countermeasures available to either fool, or break down the ICE. This is essentially the arcade section of the game as you whiz through cyberspace taking on the defences of all sorts of systems. If you aren't careful though you'll get killed, the more aggressively defended systems are more than capable of frying your brain at a moments notice.

Why take the risk? Because you need the money, initially to buy your brother's gear off the miserly motel owner, but later on to equip yourself for life in the very tough world of Seattle.

The game follows this pattern all the way through, you find a contractor who'll give you work, you haggle a bit over the price, take on the job, do the job and try and pick up loads of information on the way. That probably wasn't the best description you'll ever hear to be honest. Shadowrun is far more atmospheric, compelling and damned fascinating than the futuristic bob-a-job it may seem like at first glance, the cyberpunk feel is certainly there, purely because of the little details in the game, not because of anything in the presentation. The graphics aren't really up to much and the sound is definitely a missed opportunity, all beeps and boinks and no imagination.

For RPG fans though this a dream, top quality gameplay, oozing atmosphere and presenting a real challenge. Once jacked in, you wont be able to pull out, however hard you try. There is so much to do in this game before you even get close to the real reason behind everything you'll probably have forgotten exactly why it was you started risking your life todo other people's dirty work. Excellent.

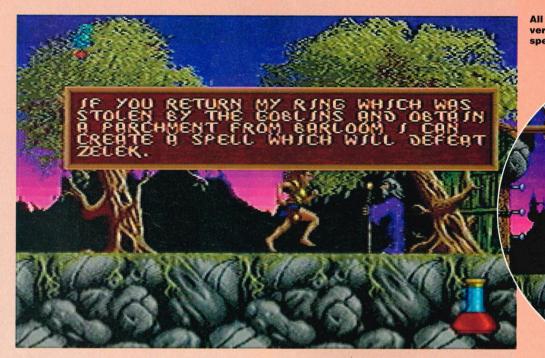
# SHADOW O BEAST BEAST I BEAST

his is a bit of an odd game. I'm not sure if it is a hack'em-up with puzzle elements or a puzzle game with hack'em-up elements. You see the hero has to go and rescue the baby that was nicked during the intro. To do this he has to perform a series of interconnected, and remarkably dangerous courier jobs. difficult, it is just getting to them is almost impossible. I don't mind a hard game if it has got a good control system, but this is an easy game with a lousy control system to make it seem tricky. I've seen it completed and it isn't even that big.

ow is the time ladies and gentlemen to chuck out those poll tax bills, abandon those VAT worries, forget about those vet bills and bring in the jelly and ice-cream, 'cos this game is for the kids! On the face of it what you have then is a fast, playable racing game which, because it is polygon based can be viewed from any one of four angles. There are plenty of enemies on screen with no slowdown occurring, but as the game plays at a ridiculously slow pace to begin with this is little compensation. The bosses are quite easily dispatched with a few hits with a powered weapon, but reaching them through the densely packed screens is an effort. At certain points in the game you can choose which path to take next adding a little (for little read 'very little') variation to the game.

The two player game if more fun, and you can either play as a team, or compete to win the affection of the women, with the player who hits the boss most receiving the life-restoring kiss at the end of the level. Players can also interact, and jump from each other to perform higher jumps, which helps in attacking the bosses. As a two-player game it is far more fun, and a far better game, but the previous flaws still exist, and so even then it isn't much better.

I do not mind arcade conversions one bit, as long as they are of good quality, both the original game and the conversion of it. Only one of the two will not do, and here we have an excellent conversion of a poor original game.
