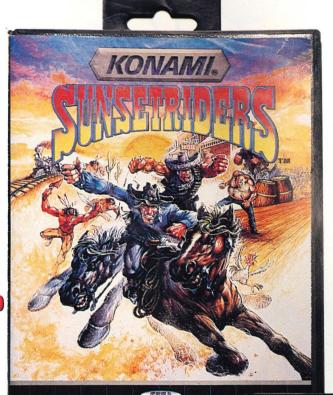

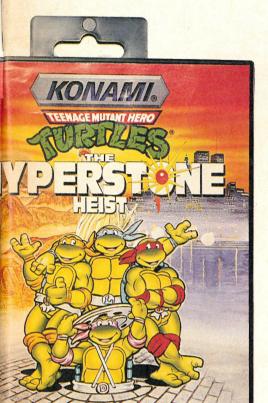

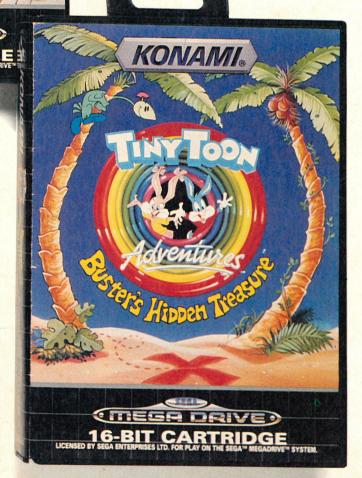

You may remember back in November that we ran a Terminator 2 competition asking you to send in humorous alternatives to Arnie in the role. Anyway we had a stormingly

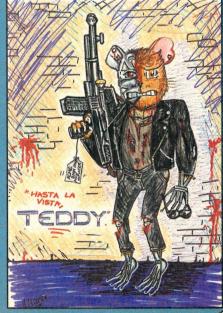
good response and the quality of the pictures was stunning. It's obvious that there are a lot of very talented people knocking about out there.

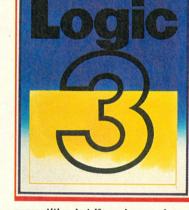

f Nintendo was reserved about its recent performance, it was noticeably tight-lipped about its future plans to face up to a new bunch of 'big boys' vying for supremacy in the playground.

Electronic giants JVC showcased a new console, Sony wet the palate with the promise of an amazing multi-media machine and the likes of Panasonic's 3D0 were as impressive as promised. Add a load of PC-based CD-Rom machines and confusion and apprehension reigned supreme.

Battle-scarred Atari showed it's long but blunted claws with the Jaguar. A cartridge-based console, the Jaguar boasts an almost obscene 64-bit capacity. Will Atari pose a threat? We'll see.

Sega's inimitable, irreverent style boasted an ever-increasing claim of the market over its bitter competitor Nintendo even though independent polls revealed an overall decline in the console/handheld market.

Nevertheless, while Nintendo still shows no interest in exploring CD technology, Sega is pulling out all the stops in a bid to stave off a hitech army of new machines threatening its market.

Sega's principle character, Sonic the Hedgehog, is set to front the crusade, although the bequiffed rodent's image has been softened for kiddy appeal. A Jeckyl to Sega's irreverent 'in-yer-face' Hyde image aimed at the teen market.

One such vitriolic campaign is to rename the American

post vule-tide calendar feature Groundhog Day, (January 6th) as "Hedgehog Day" an annual platform on which to launch the latest Sonic game. Sonic 3, say Sega, is the biggest and boldest adventure ever. Never before seen special stages are promised and you can find out more in the review starting on page 14. Launch date in the U.S. was "Hedgehog Day", of course, Jan 6.

Yet with all this 'new frontiering' much of Sega's show was decidedly retro. The Jurassic park set came out for another airing while existing releases filled a surprising amount of d play monitors. Closer investigati revealed boastful messages and b ing charts of past commercial per mance containing digs at Ninterdo. This just seems to hint that Sega is as much in the dark about the future as everyone else.

Sega's other '94 release are a mixed bag of themes. Asterix and the Great Rescue is one of the more surprising licences, Star Trek the **Next Generation is**

Hulk should be out in the Spring.

With the new generation of machines aiming at an older age group, Sega seems determined to exploit thet most popular of genres interesting these money-laden older consumers, sport.

Planned for '94 is NFL Football 94 endorsed by the great QB Joe Montana. The prestigious Pebble Beach course has licensed its name

for a golf sim that promises to bring proper golf to Sega owners. Pebble Beach Golf Links boasts the kind of features normally associated with top of the range PCs.

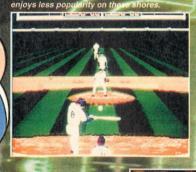

The cars thrust and jolted their occupants to Grand Prix glory or misery. If you turn to page 32 you'll notice the start of our wonderful three-page special preview.

Eager to get on the LA 94 bandwagon Acclaim's World Class Soccer employs all the state of the art tricks. Back Stateside, MBLPA is a spectacular baseball sim featuring TV style presentation which shows close-up action during the game. Also on show, yet another NFL game, succinctly titled NFL Football, which features huge player sprites and exclusive artificial intelligence.

Then, as if further proof was needed that sports game were gonna be big, Accolade showcased a collection of games featuring some of the greatest characters in sport of our time. Signing up revered golf warhorse ck Nicklaus couldn't have been a otter move. "I'm well aware of how lating I am in a match!" says Nicklaus, and Accolade is pouring all its resources into developing a proper simulation of game. Should make a nice change from the usual mindless hackgrounds littering the console market.

There seems to be an epidemic of basketball titles aimed at showing the rule-breaking, dirty-play side of the game and Virgin's Jammit is a typical example of irreverent behaviour on court. Described as a 'no messing' streetwise game with attitude' Jammit allows hoop enthusiasts to play dirty, including such rule infringements as knocking players down, elbowing and yelling to distract penalty shots.

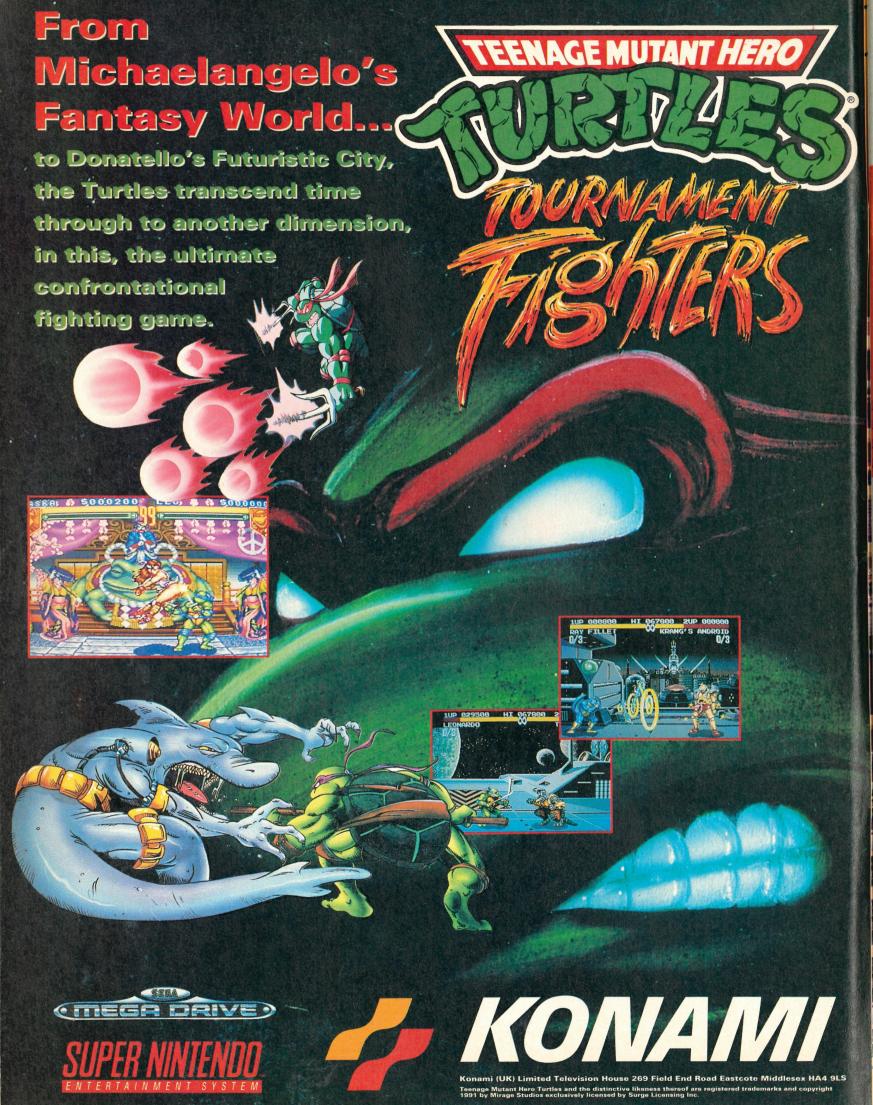

The most eagerly awaited Mega Drive game since Sonic 2 finally arrives with six new levels in the battle against the nasty Robotnik.

umours have it that this will be the final Sonic game for the Mega Drive. If that's to be the case then I guess this third cartridge game in the saga cries out to be something special.

With everything that has gone

With everything that has gone before it, the Sonic character needs no introducing. He is a figurehead worldwide – the most popular video game creation of all time. Sonic sells. Sega knows it, you know it. This game will sell, probably by the million, regardless of what any reviewer says about it. Where spiky blue hedgehogs are concerned, Sonic is simply the best, no competition.

Sonic the Hedgehog 3 is the type of game that will be praised highly and will also receive the odd bit of 'controversial' criticism. When the first game came out a few years back some people said it was too easy. The second was fingered for being similar to the first and, to be honest, the third doesn't move away from the successful formula either! Why should it? People love the formula and surely that's what counts!

So what's been going on then? We've had Sonic CD and Sonic Spinball to take our minds off the lack of an actual new adventure but now it's here is it worth the wait?

Well, yes actually. Sonic 3 is destined to become Sega's biggest success story to date.

If you were smart enough to finish Sonic 2 you'll remember that you'd just defeated Dr. Robotnik and his Death Egg thingie. Anyway, Robotnik has crash landed on a small piece of land known as The Floating

Island which just happens to be suspended in the sky by the power of the Chaos Emeralds.

before jumping straight up Sonic, ready to into his hands where he'll continue the relentless pursuit of his arch enemy, runs into a problem.

Unfortunately, the island's keeper, a strange pink echidna (that's an Australian, spiny ant-eater that is). has been conned by Robotnik into

believing that Sonic is really trying to take over the island. So he's been doing everything in his power to stop you too. As if things weren't tricky enough in the first place! Still, better get on with it.

Instantly noticeable are the graphics. They've been improved and the characters are now slightly bigger and better defined than before. Sonic is still Sonic, Tails is still Tails but for some reason everything looks just that little bit clearer.

There are six levels in the oneplayer game and these are far bigger than in previous games. Along with this come several new features not even seen on the CD before. The most apparent one of these is the ability of a second player to operate little Tails.

Using Tails can come in exceedingly useful when Sonic falls a great distance. Tails can simply be brought

intention of playing Tails as their overall involvement would be a bit limited to say the least.

There have always been moving platforms in the Sonic games but in this third one there are several ways to traverse the zones. Rope slides and pulleys can now be leapt upon in order to avoid some of the trickier



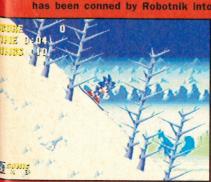

obstacles. Having said that it does require some precision timing to actually get on the damn things at times but it's usually worth it in the end as it can save a lot of hassle.

As usual there are rings dotted all around the levels. Picking these up provides Sonic with a form of immunity against dying, as you probably already know, if Sonic gets hit while carrying rings he simply drops them all. If he gets hit while ringless well that's loss of life time! It is still possible to die by falling off the bottom of the screen or by drowning but this is largely down to stupidity or rushing things rather than anything else.

We've already mentioned that Sonic can get around using slides and so on but there are other, less obvious ways, of interacting with the scenery. For example on the Carnival Nights level there are cannons dotted around the landscape. Sonic can clamber into the barrel and launch himself across the zone to areas he could not otherwise reach.

Sometimes, if Tails is in the area, he joins you in the cannon and the two friends are blasted away. Tails, the silly sod, usually misses the mark and ends up in completely the wrong place but it's worth doing for a laugh anyway.

As you can see from some of the screenshots the characters are as beautifully crafted as ever.

The facial expressions on the pair of them seems just about as cartoonlike as possible.

Perhaps the big question though is whether Sonic 3 is too easy. As mentioned earlier this is certainly a criticism thrown at the earlier games. The threequel is much larger than before but experienced gamers could get through it pretty quickly, although not as quickly as the first two Sonic games.

To really play the game takes a lot more than dashing through the levels avoiding everything. Playing Sonic 3 to its maximum potential takes an awful lot longer than just skipping through to the end, it should provide you with many more hours of enjoyment after you've first completed it.

Collecting the Chaos Emeralds is tricky, a real challenge, but is essential if you intend to play seriously, which after a while you will.

In the previous Sonic games you had to collect a set number of rings and then finish a level in order to get to the special zones. Sonic 3 reduces the frustration factor of los-

ing all your rings seconds before the end. You don't have to collect hundreds to reach the bonus level.

Instead, on your travels you might come across a huge golden, spinning ring, usually hidden away. Jumping through that lets you into the 3D spinning special zone that you've probably already seen pictures of.

Once here, the game objective changes. Now Sonic has to sprint

ANGEL ISLAND

The first zone is Angel Island and it looks a bit like the Green Hill zones on the other games in places. The enemies are better defined though and there are one or two tricks throughout the Acts. It's a perfect introduction to Sonic 3 really. Not too taxing and fun to play.



HYDROCITY

For the most part this is underwater and features an array of mini-windmills that flip Sonic and Tails about like crazy. It's all getting a little trickier by this stage but with a little bit of care it's pretty easy to get through. Good special effects too.



MARBLE GARDEN

Nice, green and stunning. The graphics here are out of this world. This level epitomises what Sonic the Hedgehoop is about with speed, rings and Badniks galore. Lots of steep slopes to build up some real speed. It's getting trickier by this stage mind.

season, compete in the play-offs or When you attempt a shot at just let the computer set the basket, hang around and stay controls up for close just in case you get a the match.

You can also scan another shot time. through the calendarstyle screens which show the schedule of fixtures for your chosen team. With the usual EA extra battery back-up facility available it's worth getting stuck into a full blown Tournament and going for the NBA

Right, that's everything sorted, lets move over to the studio to get the full run down on the chosen teams. If you watch the full commentary, you'll be all clued up on your team and your opponents. The five team members have their mug shots

With four other team members on court the action rarely slows down. They work as a team by moving up and down the court when required and they also block to their best ability. To move them exactly to the right position, for example to get a better shot at basket, just switch players and move them in.

Your team members also latch on to any unmarked players to narrow down the chances of your opponent getting a successful pass off. By pausing the game and selecting the coaching option you can change the positions of your team. If one guy keeps slipping past your defense, then you can modify the players' positions and have someone else marking him.

Even though the action runs very fast from one end of the court to the other, there's more to do than just running about and shooting. With five members to your team, each one can play a different role. Strategy is the name of the game. Utilise all team members, whether they are to act as decoys or dart about trying to make some space ready to receive the ball.

Each of the 27 league teams play a different game. Some hold back in the defensive zone waiting for a good break, while others prefer all out attack. Watch each of the teams in the computer demo first then you'll be able to play a better game against them.

Once you start to recognise certain moves by certain characters, you'll be able to assess how to play the next period of the match. To even out the odds for any new comers, during the selection of the teams, go to the All Star selection.

This allows you to pick and choose from all the players within the NBA. Choose the finest players and perfect their moves and ablities to create the team which most coaches could only dream of.

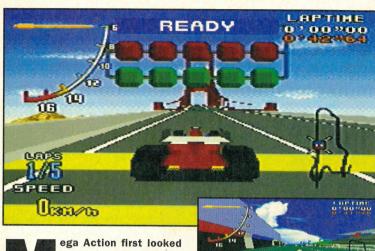

no slowdown, no matter how busy the screen gets, and with an entire grand prix going on around you that is quite a feat.

There are three courses to choose from, they have no names as such. just the labels of Beginner, Medium and Expert. A choice of automatic or manual gearbox is available for each.

To change gear on the console version you simply shift with the D-Pad, moving up and down for respective

gears. Automatic is not as fast, an apparent trend in all racing games but don't let that put you off. With some hard practice you should be able to comfortably cross the line in a good position.

Of course, what makes the arcade version so great are the views which you can change between while racing. The console

version is no different with all three angles retained. Now we were expecting some serious slow-down whenever the views were activated but nothing seemed to glitch at all. Oh well, we tried,

You can drive from inside the cockpit with only the drivers hands visible and the track at a very threatening level or you can select slightly

behind, (or chase as it is known with flight simulators) and then there's the skycam, a view from a couple of hundred feet above.

Each has its attributes but the best seems to be the chase view, the most popular in the arcades, allowing the driver both to see ahead for corners and react in time to other cars. The cockpit view is a test of reactions with little time for smooth driving and more time to weave about uncontrollably. The skycam is handy on free runs for learning track shapes but the view just doesn't allow much for much accuracy during a race.

FIGHTING AGAINST THE FX

SVP stands for Sega Virtua Processor and a variant of this is present in the arcade version of Virtua Racing and more recently the much talked about Virtua Fighting. This is a totally custom chip and has taken Toshiba many years to develop.

Having a custom chip just to handle the polygon manipulation is nothing new, Nintendo have had their FX chip for over a year now though cost has stopped proper development. Sega are currently toying with the problem of how to market the chip.

Rumour has it there are two strategies. First is to simply incorporate the chip into each and every board and just ride the price increase. Nintendo's problems have been noted though, so it seems likely

they'll use a plug-through, a bit like the adapters or cheating devices.

The arcade machine first saw the light of day in this country about a year ago in two versions. There was the stand up unit which had a large screen, accelerator, brake and a steering wheel that shuddered on impact with anything either on or off the track.

The second version is probably the most famous, a cut out full-size cockpit of a shiny red formula one car with hydraulic seats and a pressure sensitive steering wheel. You sat in the unit, adjusted the seat with two buttons then hit the accelerator and you were off.

What made this machine stand out was that any number of players could be linked up to play one large, hectic grand prix. First corners tended to be near total mayhem as furious friends velled at each other to move out of the way.

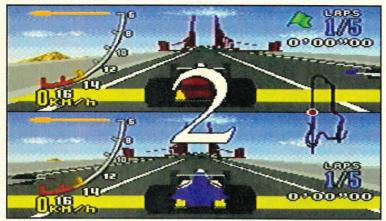

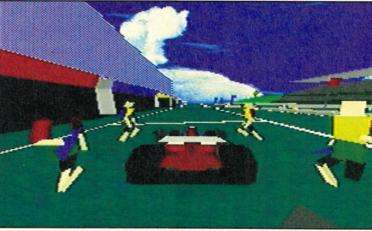

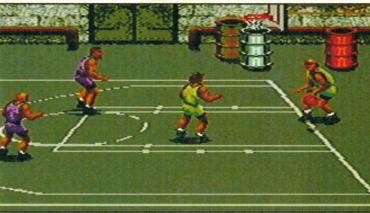

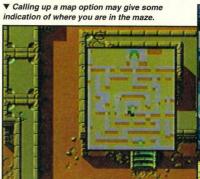

THE JOB

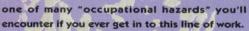

veryone must have heard of the film Cliffhanger. The allaction adventure movie takes place in the snow capped regions of the Rockies. Sylvester Stallone plays the mountain rescue ace, Gabe Walker.

Well now's your chance to step into his snow boots and risk your life on the ice.

For all of you out there who know nothing about the film, here's the story so far... A posse of

fugitives under the command of Qualen, a power crazed madman, have plotted the greatest heist of all time. They plan to hijack a plane in mid flight and steal three metal cases, containing \$100 million in all.

They extract the three cases from the plane and start to pull into them into their own plane via a long piece of cable. Now this is where things start to wrong for Qualen. Due to unforeseen complications dis-

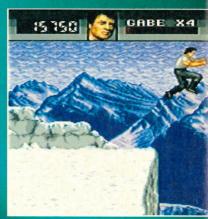

graphics, they look really 'nice' but you expect something a little more on a CD format.

On the first level Gabe soon runs into trouble on the icy ledges. It's a straight beat 'em up, scrolling right to left fighting off Qualen's men. oh yes, you start off unarmed.

This isn't such a big problem as there're plen-

ty of damaging moves you can perform. There are four different types of punches and five types of kicks you can use to floor

the enemy. The super kick is the most effective, but use it sparingly as it drains your energy levels by a sizeable amount.

The moves are fairly simple to perform and things can get a bit easy and predictable when fighting off Qualen's men. By continually pressing the B button, you alternate between high and low kicks and just stand there while they attack you. Easy.

This process works even when your attackers are brandishing knives. There's only one guy to really watch out for. He launches himself at you, with his knives draw. Don't panic though, a simple side step followed by a spinning back kick sorts him out. Grab any knives along the way to even out the odds a little.

Make it through to the end of that section and you come across a small campfire, which Gabe automatically walks over to and warms himself. This warming effect slowly restores

your lost energy, so you're ready to face the next task.

If you're scared of heights, then stop reading. To advance further you must scale the vertical rock face in front of you. Climbing is slow and tedious, and you meet several strategically placed snipers. These aggressive blokes don't want your autograph.

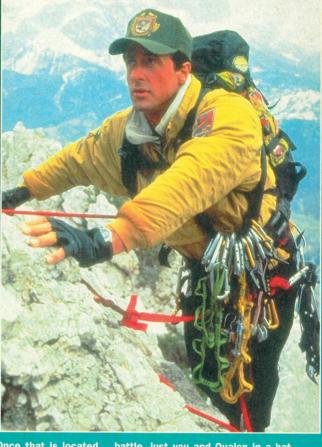

At some point it must have seemed like a good idea to get a load of Americans into impersonate loveable cockneys! Now this is all well and good if the people employed are good at impressions, but tragically in many cases in Dracula Unleashed, this is simply not true.

The carriage drivers, the newspaper sellers and some others all have accents ranging from Pakistani, Irish, American to Welsh in their efforts to sound like Dirty Den!

The particularly bad ones seem quite adept at flicking through more than one in a sentence! It's all very amusing but after you've had your friends in stitches it also becomes tedious. Parts of it can be switched off but for a lot of the time the speech is necessary to progressing in the game.

If it isn't there then you can't make the journey. So forget to enter vital information at your peril!

This journal entering section is the only main interaction there is. The rest of the time you just click away on the few icons available to get anywhere. It's easy to become absorbed

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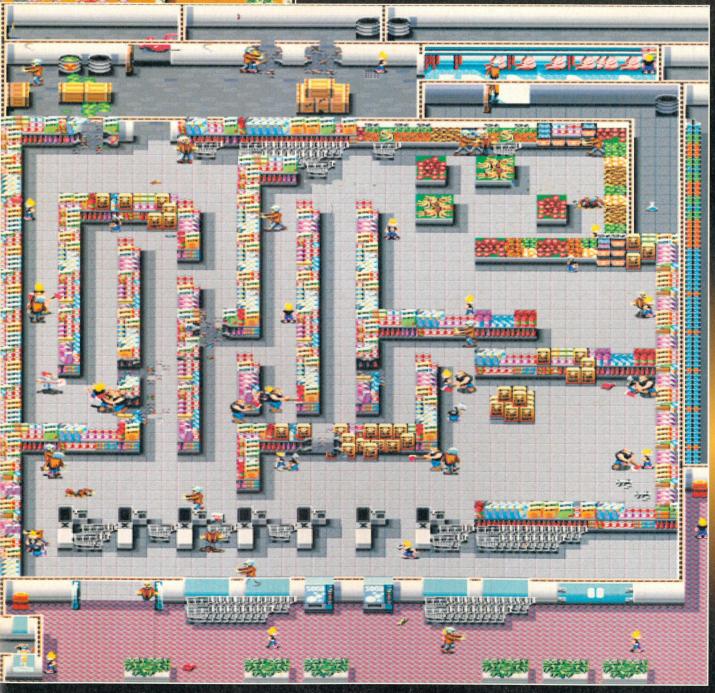


◆LEVEL 9: LANDSCAPE GARDENING

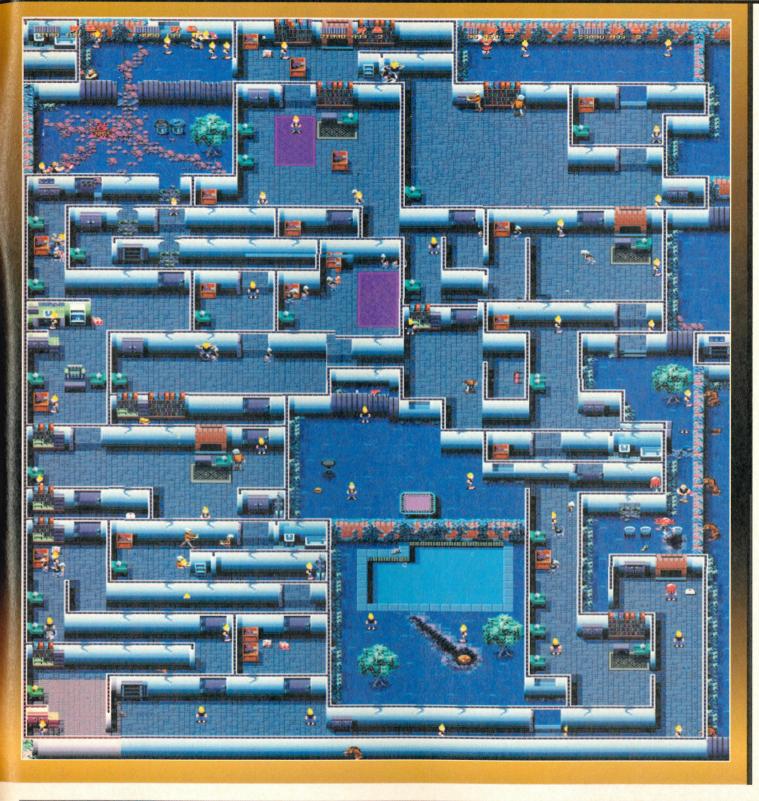
► LEVEL 25: SPOOKY GHOULS

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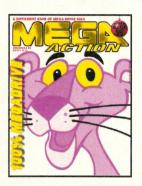
