286 and 386sx machines launched at Hanover C-Bit

AMSTRAD UNVEILS A PAIR OF PORTABLES

Amstrad last week launched its long-awaited 'Super PPC' laptops. Both machines mark a stylistic departure from the ugly predecessors.

The ALT-286 and the ALT-386sx were finally unveiled at the C-bit Exhibition in Hanover. Both machines run at 16MHz and feature hard disks and back-lit LCD screens. They are offered at a cost of £1,599 and £1,999, respectively.

Amstrad hopes to move quickly in order to get the attractive machines, which were developed and are being manufactured in Japan, into the UK. The firm aims to have ALT machines in the shops by the beginning of May.

"Amstrad's first portable computer, the 8086-based PPC range, took 25 per cent of the UK portable market and established Amstrad as a brand leader in that sector," said

group sales and marketing director Malcolm Miller. "The new ALT machines are firmly directed towards the professional computer user." Miller wants to see prospective buyers of popular Toshiba portables turning to Amstrad not only for a good price but also for reliable kit.

Both the 286 and 386sx come with 1Mb of RAM on-board, upgradable to either 2Mb or 4Mb. There is a 20Mb hard disk with the cheaper model and 40Mb for buyers of the top-end machine. Screen display measures 223 mm x

169mm in black and white with a maximum resolution of 640 x 480 dots. Up to 256 colour codes can be mapped out on

screen using 32 shades of grey. Furthermore, the machines come with a special battery which is recharged every time the machine is connected to the mains.

There's also an external VGA monitor socket, two serial ports, one parallel port, a 16-bit expansion slot, an on-board co-processor socket and an external floppy disk drive connector.

The launch marks a new campaign by Amstrad to return to its former position as unassailable market leader in home and small business computing. Boss Alan Sugar has already said that there will be a new launch every month until the end of this year.

New products include the CPC console, new CPC machines and the PC3000 range. "The year from July 1 will be a year of making money," he said.

A special bundle for the ALT machines is widely expected with well-placed sources suggesting a

deal with NextBase - publisher of the widely acclaimed computer map program Autoroute.

IBM portable too

Amstrad isn't the only firm launching portables. IBM is soon to ship a cheaper version of the PS/2 portable with 16MHz 386, 2Mb of on-board memory and a VGA gas plasma screen.

The new machine - tagged at \$5,995 - has a full-sized keyboard, serial and parallel ports and a new external storage device port. This feature eliminates the need for adapters to add external drives.

Pope warns against technological idolatory

Pope John Paul II has warned against making technology and computers a new idol.

In a visit to Olivetti's head office in Ivera, Italy, he said the wonder of technology and its rapid advances should not lead people away from more fundamental priorities. He said the dignity of humans "sacrificed to the machine" is at stake.

"It is necessary to resist the temptation to make technology the new idol. Technology and its products are not everything ... How can we forget the polluting effects linked to technological developments?" He added: "Man's pre-eminence over technology must be remembered. Automatons and sophisticated equipment are causing more than a few problems for workers, their families and society".

He also warned decision makers not to opt for technology for the sake of profits, especially if it leads to an unacceptable level of unemployment.

Atari job-cuts

Following bullish predictions for the company's next financial year, Atari's first move has been to lay off 15 per cent of its US staff.

Two weeks ago Atari had been making optimistic noises concerning its world-wide performance. But it says a squeeze in the US consumer market has forced the job-cuts.

Atari in the UK has been keen to distance itself from the redundancies saying that it is a "US situation". It is claimed that Atari's UK sales force will triple over the next few months.

InterNet threatened by mysterious intruder

Security chiefs in the US are showing concern following the emergence of a mysterious hacker into the sensitive InterNet system.

The network links academia to military and governmental computers. In the past it has been infiltrated by hackers who have usually been caught.

This time though the 'on-line police' have discovered traces of a hacker who has been breaking into the system, collecting passwords and then leaving again.

It would appear that this hacker is extremely professional. The authorities belive he has made a large number of break-ins but has usually succeeded in covering his tracks.

The hacker uses a special program, called an intruder worm, to find its way into the network. It then picks up a number of passwords, passes them out and erases itself thus concealing its previous route. The hacker is presumably then using the passwords to move about the network unhindered.

Controllers are refusing to comment on the intrusion but it is understood that the worm had entered computers at the Los Alamos Research Centre – famous for its work on nuclear weapons.

The Internet system was hit by a virus two years ago which affected 6,000 computers and sent shock waves through the computer security community.

Top software in new pack, but Batman Pack survives

AMIGA TAKES OFF ON FLIGHT OF FANTASY

Buyers of Commodore's Amiga are to be offered a new configuration incorporating some of the best software packages available.

The new bundle, called Flight of Fantasy, will not replace the current Batman Pack but will join it on the shelves. Commodore will also continue to offer the Class of the '90s pack launched last September.

Flight of Fantasy comes with Ocean's high profile flight simulation F29 Retaliator which will be launched as a standalone product simultaneously. The F29 is a forward-wing US Air Force fighter which, unlike the simulation, has yet to complete its development. The game features four battle scenarios and is said to feature real-time cockpit displays including 'true radar images'.

Also included in the package are the smash hit Rainbow Islands – currently at number one in Gallup's All Formats Full Price games chart – and Domark's Escape from the Planet of the Robot Monsters. This is another game which has yet to be launched independently,

and has a 1950s sci-fi film/comic feel.

And last, but not least, there is the highly acclaimed paint package Deluxe Paint II from Electronic Arts - widely

regarded as a must for Amiga owners.

The bundle costs £399, which is exactly the same price as The Batman Pack. The educational option Class of the '90s costs £499. All three bundles will be running until next autumn.

The Batman Pack will be re-promoted through an advertisement which runs in the 'trailer' slot on the forthcoming Batman video.

In keeping with the bat theme, viewers will also be invited to solve a series of riddles (one of the Caped Crusader's arch-rivals is The Riddler) in order to win one of ten Batman Packs.

COMMENT

Traditionally, new bundles are brought in to sweep away outdated options, but interestingly Commodore's latest option will run alongside the existing Batman

Commodore is well aware that the video to the movie Batman is to be launched in the near future sparking off a new wave of interest in all things bat-ish.

Like Flight of Fantasy, the Batman pack comes with a flight simulation (F15 interceptor), a top Ocean game (New Zealand Story), an arcade licence (Batman) and Deluxe Paint II.

In this sense, the new bundle represents no radical change. What it does offer is brand new games and gives buyers a choice of software in packages at a single price-point. Arguably, Flight of Fantasy presents a more sophisticated market image of the machine than the Batman Pack and may attract, on average, a slightly older buyer.

Informed opinion sees lit-

tle possibility of Commodore offering a lower priced option, as Atari has done with its £299 STFM Discovery Pack. It is expected that both the present £399 bundles will be superseded in the autumn by another similarly priced pack featuring further new games, almost certainly including a top Ocean Christmas title.

It seems likely that Commodore will consider a further upmarket package in the Class of the '90s price bracket - possibly bundling a MIDI interface and music software, although the company is not yet prepared to comment on the possibility. 'VIRTUAL REALITY' SYSTEM WILL WOW AMIGA GAMERS

A Canadian company, Vivid Effects, is set to transform gaming with an Amiga-based video system enabling a user to fully interact with computer generated and live video images.

The base-level Mandala system features a heavily customised 68000, souped-up maths co-processor and Amiga graphics chips which process incoming video signals from a camera mounted above a monitor.

Utilising 9Mb of RAM, Mandala calculates the position of the user fast enough to be able to re-position graphics code in

accordance with human movement.

In addition, the system is MIDI compatible allowing users to play musical instruments without actually touching them by integrating sound modules, sequencers and synthesisers. One Vivid Effects demo allows you to play drums just by making drumming motions.

Already the system is being used in museums, science centres and theme parks for more interactive information requirements, but Vivid Effects is beginning to introduce more sophisticated variants into Canadian shopping malls and arcades.

They have constructed ten foot by eight foot walk-in environments which contain large screen projections of graphics and moving video, running off laser disks and linked by Amiga genlocks. Video cameras then follow the movements of anyone entering the space so that people can 'wander' for up to an hour through 3D virtual environments, seeing their position on the

screens depicted by a white silhouette.

This forefront technology doesn't come cheap though – a basic installation starts at around £10,000 and can cost ten times that depending on a clients needs.

Some nine years in the planning, Mandala has finally come together with the advent of the Amiga's new graphics handling and multimedia capabilities. Vivid Effects is currently negotiating with top US games houses to produce home versions of interactive sports and action simulations. It seems the video adventure game is just around the corner.

Floppy Zoo drives games



Stone me! New virus attacks Aussie magazine subscribers

In the last couple of weeks, the Marijuana Virus has appeared on the cover discs of two totally different Australian magazines.

The virus which displays the message: "Your computer is now stoned – Legalise Marijuana," was on the cover disc of specialist publication *PC Support Advisor*. And new magazine, Your Computer gave 300 of its new subscribers a surprise when the bonus disc had a bonus that they didn't expect on it.

Although only dangerous if a machine is booted from it, it nonetheless caused concern at the publishing and distribution houses.

ITP which produces *PC Support Advisor* said that on becoming aware of the problem, it promptly despatched a bulletin, virus killer and replacement disc. Many subscribers had already tracked it down by using one of their previously distributed virus detectors.

lan MacKay of Manaccom, the PD Shareware firm responsible for the Your Computer infection, said: "It was one of those freak occurences and we've learned our lesson. On that day someone must have rebooted the PC with an infected floppy."

ITP and Manaccom are both deeply embarrassed by the incidents and have put into place additional security to avoid its reoccurence. British magazine MacPublishing was recently struck by a similar problem when the WDEF virus was sent out on its cover-disks. However, the virus is relatively harmless and simple to erase.

Meanwhile, PC users can look forward to strains of other highly destructive viruses. One to watch out for is the 'Twelve Tricks' virus. This picks one of its tricks at random on boot-up and executes a destructive task such as changing reads to writes. [Newsbytes]

EXCLUSIVE: Miniaturised hand-held for ST owners

POCKET ST PLANNED

Atari is considering launching an ST version of its Portfolio hand-held machine.

At a press conference in Germany last week, Atari's Sam Tramiel said that, as well as a fully PC-compatible Portfolio, there would also be compatible with the ST version.

Clearly, developments are at an early stage. An Atari spokesman told Express that the firm has long been looking at ways to "miniaturise the ST".

It is known that Atari is planning A4 versions of the Portfolio which incorporate 286 technology. However, more versions of the machine are not expected

until sometime next year.

Certainly, within two years, there will be enough professional and serious users of the ST to warrant a small machine

Atari also unveiled a fully fledged 386SX – a UK launch is expected at the Which Computer? Show in a few weeks time. A price has yet to be fixed although Atari says bargain hunters shouldn't hope for too much. "There won't be any rock bottom prices – this isn't a rock bottom product."

The same could be said for Atari's line up of TT machines. As well as the basic machine, which was first shown in public this time last year, there are also two extra models – the TT 030/2 and the TT 030/X

The former, like the original TT, is being pitched as a top-end graphics power workstation, with the 030/X being marketed as a multi-user fileserver. The launch was for the benefit of German journalists and UK prices are yet to be fixed.

The TT machines can run TOS, MS-DOS and Unix and come with a basic 2Mb of RAM and VME bus.

Hanover shows off

Hanover CeBit, Europe's largest computer fair, ran through much of last week and attracted more than 500,000 visitors.

Exhibitors were spread out across 23 buildings – most attendees reckoned it would take the eight days of the show to get around the lot.

They came from 42 nations – the bulk from Western Europe, North America and the Far East but there were also exhibitors from India, North Africa, Israel, Mexico and, for the first time, Eastern Europe.

The number of stands at CeBit rose from 3,214 in 1989 to 4,012. The British presence increased from 129 to 158. ■

PM calls for a Green computer

Mrs Thatcher has called for a computerised European wildlife database to study the effects of global warming.

In a speech at the Royal Society in London she said: "We do not have a comprehensive picture of the position now. This means that in 10 years time, we shall not know how species have reacted to changes in their environment."

While pledging Britain's investment to protect the environment, she echoed the need for scientists to have easy access to data about the changing face of the Earth. She called for a concerted European technological drive in order to build the database.

Commodore means business at Hanover CeBit

Commodore was looking to get down to business at last week's Hanover CeBit. In a shift toward the professional market, the firm spread itself out over three stands. The largest, three times as big as the others, was the PC stand, underpinning CBMs committment to the business user.

The two smaller stands at the show were the Amiga Professional stand and the Commodore Home Computer stand.

On display for the business user were an Amiga 2500/30 and a PC 60/III which sported a 386 chip.

Following in the footsteps of desktop video, last year's main attraction, was this year's buzzword, multimedia, with a plethora of multimedia applications on the Amiga.

A central attraction was Videocomp, a 30 by 50 foot wall of solid video with VCRs, TVs, monitors, transputers and a video editing suite.

Several transputer-reinforced Amigas drove video gadgets and on the software front there were MiraShading and Miranim, a 3D graphic development and 3D graphic animation system. Virtual Motion from Parasensors was a hard/software solution for professional moviemakers. The system is composed of nine motors controlling a camera, and software to drive it all. A studio using the system is currently working on a German sci-fi movie called Astra Saga.

Fun Lab is a joint venture MIDI studio from Commodore/Kawai/Steinberg comprising a synthesiser/MIDI interface and software package to run on an Amiga for 1000DM (about £350).

Under the microscope goes Image Master, a program that takes video input from a microscope and analyses it. It can perform labour intensive counting tasks such as sorting out viruses or counting asbestos fibres and is distributed by Peter Reuchling Marketing Service.

Meanwhile, Commodore's world-wide chief promised "many new and exciting products" over the next few months. But there is still no sign of the

Fastest Mac launched

A top-of-the-range Apple Mac has been launched which runs at twice the speed of any of its Macintosh stable mates.

The llfx zips along at 40MHz and incorporates a 68030 processor. It boasts six slots and is being pitched as an alternative to high-end workstations from the likes of DEC and Sun.

As a personal computer the machine is dear - but as a workstation beater it's something of a low-cost option. An entry level machine with 4Mb of RAM will cost £5,610. With an 80Mb hard disk the price rises to £6,290.

Chernobyl all over again

Games publisher European Electronic Zoo could court controversy with its new games compilation.

The pack, called Top 20 Solid Gold, has 20 games for 15 quid and contain Chernobyl, the game which had W H Smith climbing on to its good-taste soapbox and banning it on its release three years ago.

In a licencing deal with US software house Cosmi, the games pack will be released on the C64 and cost £14.99. Old favourites such as Forbidden Forest and Aztec Challenge lead a

comprehensive cast of original uncut games. It will be out early next week.

Amazing US system years ahead of its time

VOICE OPERATED WP: NOW IT'S A REALITY

The first commercially available voice operated word processor has been launched in the US. It has taken the scientific world unaware.

Only three weeks ago journalists around the world were talking about the possibility of a PC-compatible voice operated machine following a demonstration by the Edinburgh University (Express 71).

The reality comes from Dragon Systems in Massachusetts. It has devised a voice-driven typewriter which can run on a 386 PC. Called DragonDictate, the whole system is made up of an add-on card, software and microphone. Users simply talk into the microphone at a reasonably slow speed.

The program can understand and reproduce 30,000 words of spoken English - just under the capabilities of England's greatest wordsmith William Shakespeare.


The manufacturer recognises that the system is slower than normal typing but points out that it will have many practical uses - especially in industry and among the disabled.

The program can even 'get used' to someone's accent. The introduction of a new accent will cause a loss of vocabulary power but the machine will gradually rebuild that database.

Dragon has also solved the problems of ambiguous spelling in the English language. If an ambiguous word comes up then a drop down menu appears giving the user a number of options. If it's the second word that you want you just say 'get second'. Any mistakes can be rectified by saying 'oops'. The whole thing costs a reasonable \$9,000.

Dragon has now signed an agreement with a Belgian company which will help develop European language versions of the system.

FAST, FASTER, FASTEST...



If you thought that three speed went out with Sturmey Archer, PC hardware specialist Nanotech has a surprise for you in the shape of a £40 add-on to wring the last drop of speed from your ailing PC. The Nanotech GTI board combines an NEC V20 to replace the existing 4.77MHz chip, some software to help it along and a couple of switches and ICs to do the logical bit.

While most systems will run at a full 8MHz, some hardware configurations may go a little creaky and for that reason, Nanotech has made it switchable in three increments between 6.144 and 8MHz. The price is £45.94 plus postage. Further information on 0763 242938.

An Wang dies aged /U

An Wang, the man who created one of the most influential computer manufacturing companies, has died in Boston aged 70.

He had been suffering from cancer for some years, and despite an operation last summer, was re-admitted into hospital earlier this month.

Born in Shanghai in 1920, Wang began his career in electronics making radios for the Chinese Army in the early 1940s. After the Second World War he joined a party of electonics engineers on a trip to the United States. There he helped produce America's first binary computer before setting up his own business.

Wang Laboratories produced standard business computers a desktop calculator and a revolutionary 'thinking typewriter' a word processor. Wang the company continued at the forefront of American computing until the 1980s, when it fell behind its rivals.

Amiga 3000 misses CeBit, but Which? debut a cert

Despite a no-show on the A3000 at last week's CeBit '90 in Hanover, the machine's software is now ready, writes Steve Gold.

Instead of a media blitz at CeBit, Commodore is planning a softly-softly launch at the Which Computer? Show next month.

But why a Which? launch and not Comdex Spring in June? According to one Commodore representative I spoke to at Cebit '90, the A3000 is pitched at the thoughtful user who will think about the applications the machine can be used with. This sounds a bit airy-fairy to me, but Commodore's senior executives don't seem to

think so. They're planning a big splash for the Which Computer? Show.

Wise money is being put on there being two versions of the machine – one which runs at 25MHz and one which zips along at 33MHz. It won't run on the 68040 chip, but upgraders can look forward to add-on boards from third party suppliers.

One of the most intriguing games the industry gossip mongers are indulging in is 'guess the blasted thing's name'. One suggestion is the 'Multimedia Amiga' although, knowing Commodore, it'll probably simply be the

Maxwell gets busy on ST

Maxwell CPU Software in the US has been busy releasing new packages for the Atari ST. Among the latest batch are FractalFantasy and GoGo-ST, as well as Megstender – a keyboard cable extender for the Mega ST series.

Fractal Fantasy, which sells for \$23.95, produces some interesting and colourful designs based on the Mandelbrot set. The package uses the mathematical systems of chaos to produce the designs. Fractal Fantasy is interesting, since its GEM-based options, context-sensitive help files and helpful manual assist even the most novice of ST users in creating fractal patterns without the need for a degree in mathematics.

GoGo-ST, meanwhile, is a GEM-

based program that allows for simplified display and execution of programs. No more searching through desktop windows and folders for that program file, says the program's flyer. The latest version of GoGo-ST (1.3) also has a nice digital clock that can be zoomed and edited for display on-screen. A neat touch for a \$19.95 package.

Maxwell's Megstender is a full keyboard cable extender for the Mega ST that comes with cable lengths of between 6 and 25 feet, and costing from \$11.95 to \$16.95. Pheonix upgrade for A3000

While the industry is talking about what Commodore's next Amiga, the A3000, will look like, there are still a number of A1000 users out there who don't want to go to the expense of upgrading their machines.

While there are a number of upgrade cards around for the A1000 (e.g. DVS Wonder and Rejuvenator), they only tend to offer limited facilities such as RAM extensions and the like. Now from Australia comes news of a new A1000 board called the Phoenix that pushes the A1000's potential performance up to the level of the Amiga 2000.

The board costs A\$480 and upgrades the A1000 to 1Mb of RAM (expandable to 2Mb on the card itself, and up to 10Mb using a plug-in daughterboard), 32 x 32K blitter operations (that's 1,024 times better than on the original A1000) and allows for support

of the Enhanced Chip Set (ECS) that everyone at Commodore is talking about.

The man behind the Phoenix board is Andrew Wilson, the original developer of the Proton memory boards, and responsible for many of the 8Mb expansion cards for the Amiga series. Wilson has been working on the Phoenix board for some time and, in order to cater for all A1000 users, is offering a number of optional extras such as a SCSI port (\$80), B2000 video socket(\$15) and a B2000 expansion slot connector (\$35). The board is actually a drop-in replacement for the existing A1000 Amiga motherboard.

Unlike most of the competition, the board retains the basic layout of the original, so that existing add-in cards for the A1000 – which usually fit on or over the microprocessor's position – can still be used.

Military hardware specialist Penny and Giles has swapped submarines for secretaries in its combined keypad and trackerball called TrackerMouse Plus.

Working from the RS232 port or via infra-red connection, this 2.5-inch wide unit simplifies screen handling and allows the input of macros by a single keypress.

Born from the lack of space in submarines, the concept soon spread to the commercial world and the present version works with IBM PCs and clones.

Software to customise the Tracker-Mouse to industry standard programs is supplied with SuperCalc, Lotus 1-2-3, WordPerfect, and AutoCad to name but several.

Amstrad makes PC transputer breakthrough

In a bid to bolster both City and public perception of it as a forefront technology company, Amstrad has announced production of a transputer add-on card for its 286 and 386 range of PCs. The card, known as the ALMICS 2 will connect via a 37-way endochronic parallel diffuser to the appropriate interface port.

Using a prototype of the transputer linked to highresolution scanning devices, Amstrad's boffins were able to calculate the number of stationary molecules in one cubic metre of warm air in less time than a CRAY X-MP.

This test is at the heart of most modern benchmark trials involving complex calculations and has been developed in response to the needs of real-time monitoring of low-level nuclear processes active in power plants. Conventional map and plot techniques would have taken at least 4.7Mbq per Curie for each significant discrete Collective node equivalent

With the new transputer card, the same calculations took only 1.29 gigasieverts for the completion of the central component and a further 3.9 terraFLOPs for the all important cross-section routines.

IBM is said to be sufficiently impressed with the coprocessor card to have offered Amstrad three of its new RISC 6000 Unix Personal Power Stations for further experimentation.

Sources close to Irving Gould, Chairman of Commodore, have disclosed that the company is close to tying up a technology transfer agreement with Steve Jobs' NeXT Corporation.

The basis of the link up is a hardware configuration allowing Amiga software to run on the NeXT machine and vice versa.

The key to the system is the recently announced Taos operating system developed by a British company, Tao Systems. Processors running under Taos effectively have an imitation computer or virtual processor built into them which have 16 32-bit registers.

What Commodore and NeXT have done is to sign agreements whereby badged Taos processors will be made available for each machine - allowing both to run the operating system of the other. As such, switching between applications running on either machine will be made possible through their respective multi-tasking capabilities. In this way, NeXT software will be able to run in windows alongside multi-tasking Amiga software and vice versa.

The move marks an extraordinary coup for the NeXT as until now it has had no colour capability. With the 4,096 colours of the Amiga at its disposal, the machine will be truly configured for the kind of multimedia applications its built-in optical disk drive is designed for.

On the other hand, Commodore's benefits are more difficult to gauge. One advantage will be the re-positioning of the Amiga as a high-end graphics workstation platform with Unix access, able to make more significant in-roads into Apple Macintosh territory.

Rumours that the Taos system will be the official processor in the Sir Clive Sinclair's new PCG-1 super-chip may ensure that both machines could use ferocious levels of computing power.

Amiga and Next share OS OPTICAL DITHERING AIDS IN VIRUS WAR

Scientists at the Phoenix Institute of Technology are close to a major breakthrough in the fight against computer viruses with a system which uses optical recognition software and hybrid light-andparticle microscopes to detect various forms of 'invader' programs.

PIT, the prestigious science and technology annexe of the University of Arizona, last week announced that it will shortly be opening a commercial virus detection service for the US.

At the heart of AVRIL (Automated Virus Recognition and Identification by Lens) is a revolutionary new microscope which combines standard optical systems with a non-ionising particle scanner - a less detailed but neutral-in-

use version of an electron scan microscope which overcomes the problem of examining magnetic media with electrically active systems.

The genius of the system is that it utilises a 35Hz 'dither' between the

optical display (blurred at these high resolutions) and the sharp but 'flat' image from the scanner. The result is viewed as a 32 greyscale image said to be of 'astonishing' quality.

The image is sent to a computer database which compares the picture with thousands of stored images of known viruses. If a match is found, the computer halts the scan and flashes an outline around the suspect string, which is then checked by human operator.

"AVRIL represents a real breakthrough in the virus war," said PIT's head of Electro-Neutral Microscopy, Professor Jack Poisson. "Already we are in a position to examine both 3.5-inch and 5.25-inch floppies at a scan time of around four seconds per disk."


New realism for footie sim

Deepdale MP Marten Wearer has reacted angrily to early reports on the contents of a new World Cup' computer game and has tabled a House of Commons early day motion intended

The game, Kick-In - Italia '90 from Sensitive Software, is not a soccer simulation at all, but pits gangs of hooligans against each other at a selection of this summer's World Cup venues.

Players can opt to control small units of football fans including West Ham's 'InterCity Firm' and Chelsea's 'Head Hunters' - or take charge of a 'national squad' of over 100 rioting supporters.

Conservative MP Dr Wearer told Express: "England has the worst reputation in the world for football hooliganism, and when the authorities in other countries hear that soccer violence is being glamourized in this manner, it can only ensure that our ban from European football continues."



Pooled resources

Oakland Corporate of California has launched a new micro-based environmental system to control pool, Jaccuzi, and shower fittings.

Based around stripped-down boards from the older 6502 chip based machines like the Commodore 64, Atari 8-bit and BBC, the system utilises the analogue ports normally used for joysticks for full control of temperature and humidity.

An octal channel system takes four channels to control, temperature, pH level, salt and chlorine balance.

which is aimed fairly and squarely at the budding video enthusiast. Amiga Desktop Video documents everything you could ever wish to know about getting started with video on the Amiga.



NOTE PAD PROBLEMS



Readers of Expresssister publication,
Amiga Format, may have encountered
a slight problem with the 'Stand Alone
NotePad' tip in the Workbench section
of that magazine. The problem is easy
to describe – due to presence of several printing errors, the tip doesn't
actually (as such) work.

As many Express readers are also readers of Amiga Format, I thought that this column presents the ideal opportunity to put you all out of your misery by printing the neccessary corrections to that tip.

For those of who who haven't seen the tip (why haven't you bought Amiga Format – you don't know what you're missing), the tip guides you through all the neccessary operations to create a bootable disk that will load the Workbench NotePad utility straight into your machine. Anyway, enough waffling, here's the corrections.

The first printing error cropped up in nearly all the 'copy' commands that

appear at the bottom of the first column. Those of you who know AmigaDOS sufficiently well will probably have spotted it straight away – the exclamation marks should actually be vertical bar symbols ("I").

All you have to do is to substitute every exclamation mark for a vertical bar and you're away. For example, the first line that features this error currently reads

Copy C:Copy!MakeDir!Install!Ed RAM:, this should of course read Copy C:CopyakeDirnstall|Ed RAM:.

The second printing mistake can be found in the line that reads

MakeDir DF0:DEVS:Printers.

Anyone who knows AmigaDOS fairly well will probably have already spotted the mistake – the second colon (':') should actually be a backslash symbol ('/'). The line should now read

MakeDir DF0:DEVS/Printers.

Try the tip again and hopefully it should work (honest guv).

After coming up with the 'football game to end all football games' in the guise of Kick Off, Anco has produced what has to be the definitive Manager game – Player Manager.

Instead of giving the game a fancy soccer-oriented title with no bearing on the game itself, Anco's chosen title actually fits the product perfectly. As an international class player, you have landed the job as manager of a third division club with hopes of reaching the top.

As well as running the club, you can choose to watch the action take place on match days, play on the team yourself or control the whole team during the game. If you don't fancy the thought of actually getting on the pitch, then you can rely on setting the tactics

and letting the team play under its own steam.

All the standard formations have been included, with the extra facility of being able to 'fine tune' the tactics to your own methods. This is done by positioning players from the squad on the pitch and designing running patterns for them to follow. It takes time to get the tactics right of course – so patience is required!

You can buy and sell players to strengthen your team to its maximum capacity, before the board of the club decides that it's time to hang up your boots!

The sheer depth of Player Manager is incredible. Almost every conceivable element of running and playing in a football team has been implemented, including virtually the whole game of Kick Off!

Some elements are lacking, such as the two player option and choice of referees, but this deficiency is more than made up for by the management section, which outshines every other game of the type yet seen.

Indeed, if you've ever got involved with a football manager game, or just enjoyed Kick Off (or even both), then you shouldn't be wasting your time reading this review – you should be in your local software shop buying Player Manager!



At last the STE situation is looking up. There are now a number of games that take advantage of the STE extras. There's an art package that does the same (Microdeal's Canvas), and I hear a music program is on the way that makes the most of the STE's true stereo.

Meanwhile, the Demo Club has got its hands on the French 'Official Atari STE Demo.' I'm not certain how official it might be, though it's certainly French (French scroller – I'm pretty quick like that), and I have to say it's mighty impressive. "At last!" enthuses the Demo Club's John Pass, "It's about time there was something to shut up all the ST owners who bitch about the STE!"

The STE demo costs £2.50, or £1.50 if you supply the disk. Get yours now from The Demo Club, 23 Alma Place, Spilsby, Lincs PE23 5LB.

ONE MILLION GOOD REASONS

There seems to be no end to the number of ST magazines-on-disk appearing. The latest, *Buzzbox*, comes to me fresh from the disk drives of one Mark Stevens. It's a very smoothly put together public domain compilation, and like all such ventures it is totally dependent on you for support and contributions.

The first edition contains a whacking great 1,140,000 bytes – no prizes for guessing that a fair amount of work has gone into archiving that lot! *Invaders*, *Blast*, a virus killer, a pools predictor, a disk formatter, a mono version of *Tetris*, a 2D CAD program, *Daleks...* the list isn't endless, but it sure seems it.

In addition there's an archived 'Goodies' section, containing such items as ACC files to explode and melt your screen, an ST accelerator, several demos (Lostboys, Juggler) and yet more. I never knew, as the man on the TV Times ad said, there was so much in it.

The price, including first class despatch in a padded envelope, is a very reasonable £2. Even better, submit some stuff good enough to appear in *Buzzbox* and you'll get your disk returned with the next issue already on it.

TOS RELOCATES

Incidentally, one or two snippets about the new TOS in the STE. When you're reading a text file, click left for the next page, right to quit. And you can reboot from the keyboard with the Control-Alt-Delete combination (PC compatibles have used that since 934BC).

One interesting effect of the new TOS, which is in a slightly different place from

the old one, is that the Medway Boys bootsector virus detector and others doesn't work. Or rather, they assume your ST must be infected, since they're thrown by the new TOS.

I have been told CRL's Virus Destruction Utility is similarly confused, though I haven't checked that out yet.

POOR TRACK RECORD

The Demo Club's John Pass (see 'STE booster' left) is swift to deliver a slap on the wrist to myself and my dear Express colleague Uncle Techtip ("And His Valuable RAM Memory") for blaming STE incompatibility on drives not reading past track 80 and suggesting that protection routines on tracks above 80 are the things really to blame.

"Cobblers!" protests John, somewhat robustly: "I've seen and used hundreds of 3.5-inch drives from various manufacturers (I used to make drives), and I've never found one that wouldn't read past track 80." As with the bootsector virus decectors, suggests John, it is mostly custom loaders/bootsectors that all the disks fail on.

Sorry all: I sit corrected. Unless, as that woman with the teeth says, you know different...

ATARI GOES MARCHING ON

As Atari announces its last-quarter figures for 1989 (Express, last week), it is good to see that the company is finally getting it right. A loss of \$97 million has been turned around into a profit of some \$45 million – not bad going. And Atari president Sam Tramiel has committed the company to increasing its market share in the personal computer sector, referring specifically to the STE.

Indeed, reading between the lines (always the best bits) of last week's exclusive Express interview with Atari's UK boss Bob Gleadow, it does seem as if the STE's problems were local and temporary. With the anticipated relaunch of the machine, and the £100 differential imposed on it over the standard ST, it would appear that Atari is determined to push the machine as the upgrade option for current ST owners.

Myself, I can't see why anyone who already owns an Atari should be willing to sell an ST secondhand, losing a good amount of money in the deal, and then shell out fan extra £100 to get his or her hands on an STE – especially since it means parting with a quantity of software that won't run on the new machine.

On the other hand, if you know someone thinking of upgrading to an Atari from, say, a Spectrum, Commodore or Amstrad CPC, by all means encourage them to do so soon. There are still STE stocks in the shops selling at the same price as the ST – in effect, £100 less than they'll soon cost.

TEACHING THE TEACHERS

Hard-pressed music teachers wishing to head in the direction of new technology can now take advantage of technology resource kits available from a new music and performing arts consultancy service.

With two new software packages for general classroom use, *Tunemaker* and *Rhythm Kit*, and curriculum materials based on commercial software and hardware, Impac provides all the gear to let classes of up to a maximum of 30 children use computers in composition and performance work.

The Impac Music Education Package contains an ST and monitor, MIDI key-

board, teaching and classroom management software, printer, paper, disks and cables, curriculum materials and optional installation and training.

Tunemaker and Rhythm Kit are available at £20 each, or together at £35 - though both come free with the above-

mentioned package. Alternatively, you can try the £3 demo disk.







THE DIGITASK IN HAND

The latest catalogue from Digitask, the company which supplied my first ever PC (still chugging away under the desk as a Hercules-display/test machine) is full of laptops and other computing goodies. Although the top-of-the-range Axiom 33MHz 4Mb 386 machine looks a bit pricey at £5,475, some other bits and pieces are more interesting.

How about the BIT-PHAXswitch which answers the phone, waits for the caller to say 'FAX' and then transfers the call to the fax machine? Or the Smartshopper which reads bar codes and tells you whether the current shop's price is lower than its previously-recorded 'best buy'?

Or, if that wasn't enough, the Bondwell B-300, an 80286 laptop with 1Mb RAM, 20Mb hard disk and a supertwist LCD screen. It comes complete with an internal V21/V22 modem for £1,349.

EVER DECREASING SPIRALS

Have you ever noticed that reviewers of computer software give bonus marks to products which supply manuals spiral-bound? This is reasonable, as manuals are nearly always laid flat on a desk or propped against a screen while the new owner learns the ins and outs of the software. If the manual is bound as a paper-back, its hard to keep it open at any chosen page.

A spiral binding is not the complete solution, though. Several products I've looked at recently have chosen a binding with diameter too small for the number of pages bound by it. The result is that, when open, the left hand pages and the right hand pages overlap within the binding and get chewed up each time you close the manual.

This isn't the start of another pedant's revolt, in case you're wondering – much of this kind of jostling and the pages start to tear and come adrift at the spine.

For the little extra cost, you'd think a slightly larger binding would more than pay benefits in happy reviewers and – more importantly, of course – in the number of happy customers.

MITSUBISHI RESETS CAD

There's been a lot of talk recently about add-on PostScript cartridges for LaserJet-type printers. While these are without doubt effective, they are usually limited by the speed of the processor in the printer. On fast PCs a PostScript emulator can be a lot quicker, since it uses the power of the computer's pro-

cessor to build up the page image. It can also be a lot cheaper, as there is still something of a price premium on many PostScript cartridges.

Freedom of Press has been around for a year or so now, and has carved quite a niche for itself as just such a PostScript emulator. Furthermore, it has been harnessed to Mitsubishi's G370 thermal printer, which provides 300Dpi output in over 8000 colours. This is a near-photographic quality machine, and at the price of £4,995 it is still cheap for quality print at medium resolution.

The new system will work with any AT or PS/2 machine with 80286, 386 or 486 processor and at least 1.6Mb of memory. It will also work with any of the Macintosh II range with a minimum of 2Mb. If interested, contact Mitsubishi on 0707 278604 for more details, or even a brochure.

PIGGY-BACK FONT CARDS

If you can't run to the Mitsubishi G370, but still want to improve the quality of your laser printer output, you may be interested in Printware's FontShuttle (now, why does that have to be one word?). This is a cunning bit of hardware which lets you plug up to four custommade font cards into each cartridge slot on a LaserJet II-style, Canon-engined laser printer.

The FontShuttle cartridge embodies two slots down either side, each of which can accomodate a memory module. A memory module contains the equivalent of a 'regular' HP font cartridge – the ones labelled A to Z – or an IBM, Wang or DEC font library card.

Using a mix and match technique, Printware claims you can adjust your font set to your exact requirement. However, at £125 per FontShuttle and £95 per module, you're going to need a fair old investment to have enough modules to mix and match. If you insist on cartridges as opposed to soft-fonts, give Printware a ring on 081-665 5650.

INMAC OVERDOES IT

It's always been hip to cock a wry phrase or two at Inmac, purveyors of useful accessories at vastly inflated prices. The company has been known to take offence at these digs, but really, it asks for it. The ever-so-American cover of its latest 'special edition' catalogue supplement sports a heavily-coiffured female model close to orgasm at the sight of a manual printer 'T' switch.

Inside, the company has a wide range of helpful accessories, including colour-coded serial and printer connector hoods. These are the plastic bits which fit over metal 9- or 25- pin 'D' connectors. Colour-coding is a very sensible idea, particularly for networking. Inmac's range of eight colours is attractive and the units are no doubt high-quality. Nonetheless, it's hard to believe they are genuinely worth 79p each.

That doesn't include the connector's guts, you understand; the 25 pins cost an extra £1.99. So for one coloured plug you or your company has to pay £2.78. And 42p VAT, making £3.19.

Lindy, a company also specialising in cables and accessories, offers metal hooded 25-pin D plugs for around 60p each. No colour-coding, but you could buy a lot of coloured sticky labels for the £2.59 difference. Contact your nearest computer dealer for Lindy's or Inmac's wares – take your choice.

DAVRELLE GOES ELECTRIC

A couple of years back, a new 3D presentation package was released by the UK company Soft Image Systems, intended for the corporate business market and priced accordingly. The product represented a departure from other graphics applications under GEM, as it could produce perspective/angled charts with all the facilities of the graphics operating system.

Today it still looks good against the likes of Harvard Graphics and Draw Applause, and it can be used in conjunction with a hardware remote control (the Wand) for fully computerised presentations. The good news is that the product is now to be marketed by Electric Distribution, the marketing arm of GST, which should assure it a wide audience. What's likely to assure it a wider market is that its price has been cut to £148.35. This doesn't include the Wand, which will still be sold by Soft Image at £399.

£148.35 is an extremely competitive price – less than half it's



nearest rival. When you consider that Davrelle graphics can be imported straight into Timeworks Publisher PC and that GST's Typographica fonts can be used with either program, it looks like the start of a cost-effective

product 'team'. The new Davrelle is not trimmed down in any way. In fact, it has a couple of extra bonuses – between 50 and 60 pieces of object-based clip-art and a new tutorial guide. Electric Distribution is on 0480 496666.

PC CAME WEEK

For many PC owners, particularly in the States, computer entertainment is synonymous with Sierra's ever-expanding range of graphic adventures. Sierra is responsible for the well-known King's Quest series, and of course that leading figure of the computer industry – Leisure Suit Larry.

The company's latest title, Code-Name Iceman, was written by Jim Walls, author of the Police Quest series. It follows the exploits of Commander John B Westland, a member of the US Navy SEALS commando team (Sea, Air and Land), as he attempts the rescue of an American ambassador kidnapped by terrorists in a scenario that mixes Ice Station Zebra with James Bond.

The game opens with our Johnny taking a spot of R&R in true leisure suit style on Tahiti island, populated virtually exclusively by



bikini-clad maidens.
However sea, sand and sex are short-lived for our brave hero as he is summoned to Washington and put in charge of the infamous and nuclear-powered submarine, the USS Blackhawk.

Iceman works in much the same way as all Sierra adventures. You enter commands from the keyboard, just as you would with a text adventure, but instead of reams of text you are rewarded with (on EGA or VGA at least) a 16-colour animation of the action drawn to a resolution of 320 by 200 pixels.

If you have one of a wide range of sound cards

you also get a full-blown soundtrack, which is excellent - but, otherwise, you have to put up with the usual chorus of PC beeps.


The parser is not as flexible as an Infocom adventure and the user interface nothing like as sophisticated as in Deja Vu II, reviewed a few weeks ago. However Iceman has a strong plot and does include a reasonably elaborate submarine simulation, a dice game and several action sequences later in the game. It comes on nine 5.25-inch disks (four 3.5inch) too, so there is plenty to keep you busy.



IN THE DUMPS

"I was down in the dumps today," I told my girlfriend, "so I got a copy of New Computer Express to cheer me up". "Ah," she said, "so that's where you get the things".

In fact, dumps are an underrated feature of the PCW. You can produce screen dumps (on an 8512 or 8256, not a 9512). Just press [EXTRA][PTR] any time, in LocoScript, CP/M, BASIC or any program, and you get an image of the screen printed out on the printer.

So what? Well, it's great in LocoScript for producing a list of what's on a disk just get a dump of the disk management screen. The image can be trimmed to fit the disk case. It's also useful if you want to remind yourself of a complicated layout or sequence of codes in LocoScript.

You can include these dumps in the middle of already printed documents, of course, by leaving an appropriate space - the only problem is that the dump starts against the left hand edge of the paper. To get the dump centred is possible, though I'm not sure if it does the printer any good! If you lift off the black top plate and gently push the print head along with your hand, it will move along. When it's at the right place for the left hand edge of the screen dump, press [EXTRAI[PTR] as normal and the image will be printed right there instead of the left hand edge.

After you've finished, reset the printer by pressing [PTR], moving the cursor to 'Reset', and pressing [+]. You can leave with [EXIT].

HEADING FOR SUCCESS

Users of the excellent word processor, Protext, can add large-sized headings to their documents using a new faster, improved version of PS headings. The program lets you insert special codes within a Protext document which print any text you like in characters up to an inch or more high.

They come out perfectly smoothly too - no jagged edges that make it look like the typographer was a Lego fan. You get the option of underlining, proportional spacing and reversed-out (white letters, black background) printing. PS Headings costs £11.95 from Orb Systems on 01-690 8534.

PUZZLE ANSWER

How to split up a 350K file in Protext: load it, insert the commands >WF B:CHUNK.1 then >WF ON at the beginning of the section to be split off, and >WF OFF at the end. Then print to screen with PS. The required section is written to a new file on disc. Repeat for all sections. Easy!

CZECH POINT

We were told by our contacts in Czechoslovakia that satellite TV dishes overtook the Amstrad PCW last year as the in thing in technology. Apparently satellite TV has a very good image over there because it gives much-needed access to hard news from the West.

PORT CALL

If you read Express regularly you will remember that there was an article on exchanging data between computers, which recalled that the most common form of data exchange was by sending ASCII codes via an RS232 interface.

As not many MSX computers were fitted with these interfaces as standard, most users needed to purchase an RS232 that plugged into the cartridge slot. You could then exchange data, or go on-line by adding a Hayes compatible modem to the interface.

Finding an RS232 interface at a reasonable price has been very difficult for the average MSX user, but now salvation is at hand. Knights TV and Computers, of Aberdeen, informs me that it still has some Toshiba cartridge-type RS232 interfaces in stock, and they are priced at a very reasonable £49.00.

If I remember rightly, these interfaces contain all the necessary software for sending and down-loading data, so all you need to purchase is your actual modem, and check that you can afford the enormous telephone bill that you are almost certainly going to get, until you have learned to use the device wisely.

For those MSXers who are considering going on-line, but are worried that they may be the only MSX user taking advantage of computer communications, I can assure you that there are hundreds of MSX owners using the various systems, and, used properly, they can be a great source of fun and information. fighting for sport, not peace, justice, freedom, etc - which comes as a relief.

Oriental Games is rather like the usual multi-event Epyx-type sports sims, in that it's made up of a series of sub-events, each complete in their own right. However, Microprose has zeroed in on martial arts as a popular genre in its own right and as a way of maintaining a common theme throughout the games. And that theme is simply to leap, kick, punch and sweep your way through to the finals in each event – and ultimately, to win the gold medal.

There are four particular disciplines you have to master. Kung Fu is the gymnastic one, where you must defeat your opponent with agility, quick thinking and sheer stamina.

Kendo is next, where have to knock the daylights out of other guy with a walloping great stick, all the while stopping your bathrobe from flying open embarrassingly.

The third event is called Freestyle, and basically consists of all the usual Kung Fu discipline with some rather dirty moves – including head-butts – thrown in.

Last, but by no stretch of the imagination – or waistband – least, is Sumo. Two very fat man try to variously belt, bump or bull-doze their opponents from the ring.

Each event requires you to learn all the players' moves, and to time those offensive strokes to the nanosecond if you want to thrash the other guy, because the computer opponents are pretty tough, even in the first round. And it's going to take a pretty mean fighter to make the final.

Now there's nothing worse than a slow fighting game (What's that? Double Dragon?). Fortunately, Oriental Games isn't slow. The sprite convincing, and react quickly to joystick input.

The whole game is colourful and polished. The fighting moves take a bit of learning, and the computer opponents are tough enough to keep you nailed to the canvas for many a long hour. Combine that deeper-than-usual gameplay with four different events and you've got a fighting game definitely one cut above

THE QL - WORTH HAVING

Although the QL is in its sixth year, I have yet to see a machine with an operating system more user-friendly than QDOS. The QDOS command language is SuperBASIC, which makes it very easy to understand, even for a complete beginner.

SuperBASIC is a comprehensive form of BASIC, ideally suited to structured programming, with lots of nice features in common with Microsoft's Quick BASIC for the PC. Using one of the SuperBASIC compilers, even a novice can write multitasking BASIC programs which run as fast as programs written in C on many other machines.

Reader, Jeremy Benson, recently disagreed with me for: "making out that the Sinclair machine is on a par with Acorn's Archimedes". Although it is not as fast as the Archimedes, the QL has a better BASIC, a better operating system, and

has more serious software available for it. It is also, at about £90, very much more affordable. By the way, if the ARM chip used in the Archimedes is so good, why doesn't anyone apart from Acorn use it?

SINCLAIR QL WORLD

It was recently reported that Focus Magazines Ltd., the publishers of *Sinclair QL World*, had gone into receivership. *QL World*, although it had a circulation of only 12,400, was probably quite profitable; it would be a pity if the magazine disappears.

Therefore, those of you looking to broaden your horizons are well-advised to learn another computer language, but which one? Pascal programs are generally well structured, fast, and easy to convert between machines.

Fortunately, a version of ISO (International Standards Organisation) Pascal from Acornsoft, is widely available for the BBC. There are actually two versions, one which contains two 16K ROMs, conforming to level zero, and the all-singing level one plus extensions version for the 6502 second processor.

The latter, when used with the optional stand-alone code generator (another £30) produces professional results. Most will be satisfied, however, with the cooking version.

As it happens, I have a copy of ISO

BROWN'S QUESTION TIME

Q: Do you know what is the most dangerous thing to an Eprom in the whole universe?

A: You. Pascal, plus reference book, example source files and references to chase up going for...nothing. All you have to do is write to me c/o Express, giving good reasons why you should have it.

LOOKING AT LASERS

As I predicted last year, laser printers have taken the printer market by storm, and they now hold over 50 per cent of the market (source ROMTEC). The release of such machines as the Canon LPBII4 – four pages-per-minute – has really opened the market at the low end, although high-end lasers are high priced.

Furthermore, mid-range machines are being squeezed in price. For example, the Epson GQ5000, which has a wide range of emulations (HP Laserjet2, Epson FX and LQ) plus expansion options, has had its price cut. Look out for deals in this range – they're definitely around for the finding.

COMMS BUG CONT

Which modem should you buy, and what should you look for in a good modem?

First, speeds. All modems offer at least one and usually several data transfer speeds. Obviously, the faster you send and receive data, the quicker your telephone call will be and consequently the smaller the quarterly bill.

The best – affordable – modems offer V21, V22, V23 and V22bis (300/300, 1200/1200, 1200/75 and 2400/2400 respectively) and will enable you to log onto every bulletin board and public information service currently operating in the UK. However, a modem providing these speeds will costs several hundred pounds, so if cash is a little tight, then choose a modem that offers 300/300 and 1200/1200, V21 and V22.

You'll want to get an automatic modem ie, one that performs the dialing and log on sequence automatically under software control, rather than via twiddling knobs on the front panel – most modems on the market are automatic.

And if you're thinking of setting up your own bulletin board, an auto-answer modem is essential. Auto-answer modems pick up the telephone line when another modem calls and enables the caller to log on to your board.

One of the best modems available is the WS4000 from Miracom Itd (0473 233888). This is an auto-dial, auto-answer, Hayes compatible device, priced around £130. Look through the small ads in Shopping Express, there's a good chance you'll find one.

CONFIGURING IT OUT

In the Arc's early days there were a lot of programs that reconfigured the machine for their own use. Most were good enough to set it back to some kind of normality when they'd finished, but a few left it it in a peculiar state.

More recently, RISCOS applications have been much better about trampling on the configuration, mainly because they haven't been written to take over the whole machine. It's therefore annoying when you run an old disk and find it has left your precious Arc 'maladjusted'.

One way to resolve things is to perform an [R] switch on. This resets everything to its default setting, except the number of drives (floppy and hard), the country code (nothing to do with closing gates behind you) any information about expansion cards and, above all, the Econet station number.

DIRECTORY OPEN

A reminder that you can open an application directory – one beginning with a ", by clicking Select while holding down the [Shift] on the keyboard. Clicking Select on its own, of course, simply runs the !Run file within the selected directory.

WANT LIST

I'd be interested to hear readers' ideas on useful programs they would like to see on the Arc. I can then pass on the best of these, or include details of existing products that fit the bill. I'd be equally pleased to hear of products

about which I as yet know nothing, particularly if they'd interest other Arc users. You never know, I might even be able to drum up a few sales.

So for starters, has anyone a good screen grabber which can copy an Arc screen to a disk file, preferably in !Paint format? Not only would this be good for frustrated journos who find it hard to grab screens of products under review, but it might also brighten up this column, as it can then accomodate screen shots. Any takers?

The other request is on a related subject; graphic file transfer. There's a lot of clip-art sitting out there in standard Mac and PC formats, and much of it in the public domain.

Wouldn't it be nice to be able to import graphics files and convert them into !Paint or !Draw formats? The most common source formats are probably Mac Draw, encapsulated PostScript, PCX, IMG and GEM. There's a big market here somewhere for the right product.

QUICK QUERY

What happens when you've installed so many applications and utilities on the icon bar that there's no room left? Or are we to assume there will never be that many applications?

LATEST TEMPEST FORECAST

Clares Micro Supplies has delayed release of its DTP program Tempest until the end of May. Although it will be finished before then, the company has

too much going on for the next month or so to gear up for an earlier launch.

Dave Clare, owner of CMS, claimed today that the program would work happily in 1Mb, would work a lot faster than Acorn's own DTP and would cost £50 less. This seems to be a recipe for success – time alone, of course, will tell.

Acorn DTP struggles to do anything in 1Mb and Impression starts to squeal Where did that memory go?' if you try to multi-task it with anything non-trivial. What it comes down to is cheaper memory upgrades – the Arc needs more than 1Mb for serious applications.

A PROPER LAPSE

Apologies to the Font Foundry for suggesting last week that the fonts might not print properly. It was my fault for having installed the LaserJet driver incorrectly.

The LaserJet was set to a resolution of 150dpi, which accounted for the rather ragged appearance of the fonts when printed. I'm spoilt enough to have almost forgotten what 150dpi text looks like.

Selecting 300dpi from the driver's option window sorted the problem and produced some good looking text. But what a silly default, when virtually all LaserJet type laser printers are capable of 300dpi printing.

For the curious, here's how we worked out the power ratings. 386, 30 points; 286, 20 points; V20/40, 15 points; 86, 10 points; 88, 5 points; serial ports 2 points each parallel ports 2 points each; expansion slots 2 points each; 2.5Mb, 25 points; 2Mb, 20 points; 1Mb, 10 points; 640K, 8 points; 512K, 5 points; hard drive, 15 points; 3.5-inch disk, 10 points; 5.25-inch disk, 5 points: VGA, 20 points; EGA, 10 points; CGA, 5 points.

DESIRABILITY RATING

There's also a desirability rating out of 100 – although the power rating is the most important, this indicates essentially 'how good' the machine is. This takes into account intangibles such as build quality and appearance as well as the perceived 'slickness' of the machine. Anything with single figures you'd be happy to get for Christmas but wouldn't walk down the road to buy. 30s and 40s would be worth a trip out of town to get. Anything over 90 and you'd sell your house and all its contents to buy one.

Finally there is the value for money rating. Measured out of five, the star rating indicates just how much computer you get for your pound.

On the other hand, the Amiga has lots of brilliant public domain art packages, word processors, desk top publishing packages and so on, but as far as I know, the Coupé is bundled with the Flash package.

Sounds to me, Chris, that you really want to buy the Sam Coupé yet cannot quite bring yourself to part with hardearned cash on a machine that might quickly fade from view. Fair enough, but the Coupé is an excellent machine with some quite superior features at a price that leaves all other computers for dead.

Unfortunately, it's based in early '80s 8-bit technology and as such, will be sneered at by those in the industry who drive Porsche cars. wear Gucci shoes and Armani ties - basically those who buy their lifestyle off-the-shelf and like to display their financial wheeling and dealing. These guys will never support a machine such as the Coupé regardless of its ability to 'do the job'.

So. Which machine? If your interest lies with art packages and graphically-orientated programs, then the Amiga is a very good choice. Powerful and well supported by quality software the Amiga is definitely the machine of the moment.

If, however, your main interest is in word processing and playing games (and presumably you already have a collection of these from your Spectrum days), plump for the Coupé. It's never going to break any sales figures, but will probably enjoy moderate success among those who manage to leave the hysteria out of computing.

As for a column devoted to the machine, our policy is very definitely to support all our readers and if enough of those readers own, intend to own, or just want to read about the comings and goings of the Coupé, then we will be glad to provide a column. Indeed, starting next week, Robin Alway will be giving over a portion of his Spectrum column to the Coupé.

HELP! Can't dump!

I have recently bought a Commodore Amiga 500 computer with a Star LC10 printer. I have managed to print text files but cannot get a graphics dump.

Could you please explain roughly how to do this? I also have an older printer – an Olivetti JP101 – and wondered if I could use this with my Amiga computer (for graphics and text, scores from DeLuxe Music Construction Set and pictures from DeLuxe Paint II). If so, what printer driver would I need to use?

You've answered the questions yourself, K, for the Star LC10 needs a printer driver of some description (either an example specifically intended for use with that printer, or one for use with an Epson FX80) and the Olivetti requires a printer driver that will work with an Olivetti JP101.

Facetious? No, simply factual. The Olivetti will work happily with your Amiga, providing any applications which make use of the printer send the correct codes. Two methods exist in order to achieve this state. You can pore over the Olivetti's manual locating the lists of control codes, then type them into the application you want to run - this works but is tedious and means that you must have access to a manual - or you can atempt to locate an existing driver from the public domain. This latter option is probably out of the question in this instance however, as the JP101 is hardly a popular printer and isn't, to my knowledge, compatible with anything.

If you want to look in the public domain, try calling George Thompson Services on 0770 82234. This is one of the best Amiga public domain libraries and may be able to help.

TIP 288 connectivity

Like David M Turvey of Enfield (Express 65), I also find the Z88 an excellent tool for everyday use but often need to transfer files to my static machine at home for enhancement and quality printing. Although the latter system is Amigabased, the same principles apply when connecting the Z88 to other computers.

The Z88's external port presentation is a serial port with a 9-way D-type female connector, and a suitable Z88 serial cable can be purchased by contacting Alpine Software of 21 Girton Road, Northolt, Middlesex (01-864 0408). This cable costs

£9.95 and has a 9-way D-type male connector to 25-way D-type female connector.

While the Z88 has quite sophisticated built-in communications software for modem connection, I find it is much easier to dump files from the Z88 to the host machine via the basic output to printer command <>PO. This even preserves the formatting attributes when the file is loaded to the Scribble! word processor on the Amiga (both this and the Z88's Pipedream are WordStar-like).

May I commend David to the excellent Z88 User's Club at 68 Wellington
Street, Long Eaton, Notts NG10 4NG. Very
good value at £10 per year including 10
issues of Z88 Eprom magazine, which
contains much useful advice. Roy who
runs the club, always advertises for any
'old Sinclair products for private collection' and can help with the problems of
comms software for the Spectrum.

A better alternative to using rechargeable batteries all the time – which are liable to go flat unpredictably – is to keep normal alkaline batteries inside the Z88 for quiescent power and occasional short-term switched on use, and to use rechargeables externally, via the Z88's mains adapter socket.

Those excellent poeple at Maplins (/ agree with you - TT) can supply everything necessary which comprises a coaxial DC power plug and a 6-way AA size battery holder. The sixth battery position should be shorted by soldering a wire across it. The Z88 will work happily with the 6.75V provided by five rechargeables. This gives an economical and mobile alternative to the normal mains adapter.

HELP! Comms

I have a Commodore Amiga 500 computer and I would like to have your advice on which modem is the best value for money and which communications software and books are worth looking at.

Also, can you tell me what speeds V29 and V32 are, and is it worth buying a modem with these speeds?

Several good modems are currently on the market and it used to be that Miracom (formely Miracle Technology) modems ranked among the best available. Now, however – although some stores still stock the range – it appears that something horrid has happened to Miracom, ie it has gone bust, and so it may not be a good idea to buy a

TECH TIPS

Miracom modem. If you want to chance it, go for the WS4000, an auto answer, auto dial, Hayes compatible modem offering a range of speeds including V21, V22 and V23. This device should cost around £120 and is available from advertisers in Shopping Express.

You could, of course, take out a subscription to *Prestel*, and for £129 or thereabouts, you'll receive a 'free' modem and connect time to one of the largest information networks in the world – not a bad deal!

In order to learn all about the world of communications, get hold of the latest copy of Hugo Cornwall's *The Hacker's Handbook*. As well as providing information on how to get into private computers, it also contains a wealth of good stuff about setting up a modem, choosing the right comms software and fitting it all together. *The Hacker's Handbook* (ISBN 0 7126 34541), published by Century costs £9.95 and is available from all good high street book stores.

Don't worry about buying a modern with V29 and V32 – the former is a specialised data interchange method also known as X.25 or packet switching and the latter is simply more of the same. Look for a modern offering 300/300, 1200/1200, 1200/75 and 2400/2400 – V21, V22, V23 and V22bis respectively. These speeds will enable you to log on to any bulletin board or public information service available in the UK.

HELP! Bombed out!

About nine months ago I had my Atari 520STFM upgraded to 1Mb of RAM and had a Cumana double-sided internal disk drive fitted to facilitate desk top publishing work.

Since then, I have been completely unable to load EZ-Score Plus. After startinfg to load I am prompted to insert disk B – interesting, as there isn't one! If I click on continue, I am told that the drive is not responding etc, etc. Then if I re-try, the whole thing crashes about my ears.

Hybrid Arts has been quite helpful and has replaced the master disk, but the new one behaves in exactly the same manner. Could there be a compatibility problem with the new drive? If so, what can I do about it? Have I lost £70 worth of good software? If I could find a single-sided Atari drive would that help?

The problem almost certainly lies with the larger capacity disk drive. Many, many programs experience incompatibility problems when confronted with Atari's 'middle-period' disk drives, and several of the third-party drive upgrades present the same problem.

Perhaps the best course of action would be to ask the good people at Hybrid Arts if they will send you a copy of the program – minus any protection code. They've been helpful supplying you with a new master disk and will realise that you are not a pirate, but a

genuine user who cannot access the software you've paid for. I'm sorry that I can't provide you with a solution, but the problem is out of my hands I'm afraid.

M HELP! Hard card

I recently bought an Amstrad PC2086S and now I have a need to upgrade to a hard drive. Would a hard disk drive be a better buy or would a hard card? I understand that my machine has no controller card so one will have to be fitted with the hard disk drive. Will fitting such a drive invalidate my warranty if I perform the task myself? My electronic abilities are strained putting a plug on!

Would it be safer and in the long run cheaper to fit a hard card? I will need at least 30Mb and have been looking at different models, mainly the Western Digital and the Kyocera models. Which of these

is the most reliable, and is there any type of hard card my Amstrad will not support? Darren John Dean, Worksop, Nottinghamshire

The PC and its compatibles rank among the few machines that you can open and add to without invaildating the guarantee. Likewise your Amstrad PC2086.

Fitting a hard drive and controller card will not prejudice your guarantee in any way. Right, so you can open the case and bung things inside, but what should these 'things' be?

Several years ago, when hard cards first appeared, many computer journalists and PC oriented magazines gave them a thorough drubbing as being unreliable, prone to crashes and not worth a fraction of their price – harsh criticism, some of which was, in my opinion, valid.

Nowadays however, the hard card scene is very different. Like all technology, the hard drive on a card had a shaky start but progressed to the point where today, they're as reliable as any other form of drive.

The hard card also has the advantage of being very simple to fit. Open the computer's case, locate a free slot – granted, a difficult operation in any of Amstrad's PCs – and plug in the card. Re-sealing the case and booting the machine with a hard drive utilities disk supplied, will enable you to have a hard 'un up within the hour. And that is no mean feat.

Both the Western Digital and Kyocera drives are quality devices, reasonably priced. As there's little to choose from in terms of construction, you should look around for the best deal and choose on that basis.

HELP! Pain in the azimuth!



Atari's 8-bit series: tape loading troubles?

I have been the proud owner of an Atari 65XE computer for some two years, but right from the start I have had loading problems from the datacorder supplied. I have already had two replacement datacorders from the shop I originally purchased the computer from, and the latest of these seems to be working most of the time.

I am now thinking over the possibility of adding a disk drive to my system and purchasing one of the tape to disk copier programs regularly advertised in the computer press. This is in order that when a game has loaded once via the datacorder, I can then transfer it to disk, which will also speed up loading times greatly.

I am reluctant to purchase the Atari XF551 as it is far too expensive at present and I have been enquiring as to which alternative drives on the market would be compatible with my computer. I understand that – as it is an 8-bit machine – there are not too many drives which will work with it. Would either the Cumana 1Mb or the NEC 1Mb be compatible?

Furthermore, before I purchase any sort of drive, can you advise as to the reliability of the aforementioned tape-to-disk copier programs, and do you recommend any particular one?

Reliability problems are a re-occurring and annoying feature when using cassette-based storage for programs and data. There are, however, several steps you can take to ensure that you get the best possible service from your datacorder.

Always keep a dust cover over the device to stop dirt accumulating under the cassette lid. Always keep the read/write heads clean by using a Q-tip and a solvent (such as methylated spirits available from

chemists). Dip the one in the other and wipe over the surface of the head.

Always keep the head aligned by ensuring the azimuth angle is correct. This angle is the position of the read/write head relative to the magnetic tape passing by it. The angle should be at 90 degrees, ie a perfect right angle. If this is not the case, then data which recorded perfectly well, will not be accessible.

To adjust the azimuth angle, a small screw is usually visible somewhere above the read/write, occasionally on the outside of the case (I can't be more specific as Atari has several datacorders in the field). Play an ordinary music tape in the datacorder so that it can be heard through your monitor or TV and slowly trun the screw this way and that until you receive the best tone possible - this sounds difficult, but is in fact, surprisingly easy!

Finally, never store your cassettes close to a strong source of radiation such as on top of a television or near a telephone. The strong radiation fields produced by these common household items can totally destroy valuable data.

The XF551 is ridculously expensive. An ancient, 360K 5.25-inch drive retailing at well over £150 is a positive outrage! (The ST's 1Mb 3.5-inch drive can be had for around £70). And even if you had the money, the XF551 is difficult to get hold of.

The best course of action is to place a free ad in Shopping Express asking for someone to sell you their unwanted Atari floppy drive. If you can, buy a 1050 drive. This is a middle-period Atari drive offering 127K storage in dual density format, and it is a reliable device of quality construction. Expect to pay around £50 for a second hand example.

There is also another Atari drive available, although it's now a little long in the tooth. The 810 was the first 5.25-inch disk drive made available for the Atari 8-bit. It is a single-density device providing 90K of storage. It's a hulking great slab of a disk drive, but works fine and can probably be had for around £35/£40.

There are lots of tape to disk copiers available. One of the best is Transdisk IV from Digicom (0735 761444). This is a menudriven, simple-to-use program that is effective and comprehensive. Transdisk IV will copy almost all tape programs even - those which rely on multi-load modules to provide protection. The program costs £14.95 and is available mail-order from Digicom on the above number.

Neither the Cumana nor NEC drives will connect to the Atari 8-bit, because it has non-standard interface ports that were never intended to connect to anything other than peripherals bearing the legend 'Atari'.





If you've got all that, then you're an air traffic controller sitting in front of a radar screen with just your wits and the computer standing between several thousand tragedies and the ten o'clock news. This is TRA-CON, standing for Terminal Radar Approach Control, and it's serious stuff - even if it's just a software package for your PC.

fixes names, flight paths, and the boundary of your control area. Planes are shown as tiny aircraft symbols, each labelled with their flight number, height and speed. Selecting one of these provides further information on the type of plane, its performance and intended flight path. This display can become pretty busy!

As its name suggests, Terminal Radar Approach Control looks after the airspace in a sector containing a number of airports. This means you do not have to handle the actual landing or take-offs as these are taken care of by the Ground Control at each airport. When a plane wants to take off Ground Control lets you know, and only releases the plane on your say so. As soon as the plane is released it becomes your responsibility though, and appears on your display.

Conversely, when a plane is landing in your sector it is your responsibility to get it to the FAF (Final

SKY LARKING

They're always there, but we only think about them when it all goes wrong. Matt Nicholson steps into the shoes of an Air Traffic Controller.

For most of us TRACON is a computer game, although it could be used in anger by a trainee controller to good effect. It was designed in the States by Dr Robert Wesson whose thesis involved applying artificial intelligence to air traffic control; specifically, what are known as 'separation problems'. TRACON derives from the simulation component of this work and additional input from the Federal Aviation Administration and professional controllers.

The program comes on both 3.5- and 5.25-inch disks with an 80-page manual and a cassette tape containing samples of controller/pilot dialogue. Installation simply involves copying the files onto your hard disk or suitable set of floppies.

It is best to start the program with the demo, a pre-programmed scenario covering 15 minutes or so in the Los Angeles sector. This is totally confusing at first as most of the messages are in a shorthand, but on a VGA display it looks quite stunning. TRACON uses the highest resolution 640 by 480 mode in 16 colours to give a very realistic display. Resolution goes down to 640 by 350 on an EGA machine, while on CGA it is displayed in monochrome at 640 by 200 pixels. Hercules is also supported, where it should look quite

Also astounding is that Wesson has managed to get the PC to talk! Not very comprehensible perhaps, but both sides of the conversation between controller and pilot are audible, and apparently sound as good as you get in a real a Cessna. The speech is duplicated on screen and can be turned off - useful because otherwise the program freezes whenever anyone says anything.

The main display shows a radar scan of the area under your control together with a map of the coastline, the airport approach paths and 'fixes' - the navigation points between which planes fly. You can also toggle various overlays showing a compass rose, airport and

Approach Fix) so you can hand it over to Ground Control. This can be quite tricky if the plane entered your sector from the north-west but final approach is from the south!

You do not have to bother about planes after they leave your sector either, although it is your responsibility to 'handoff' to ARTCC (Air Route Traffic Control Centre), who look after planes en route. ARTCC will only accept a plane when it appears on their scope.

With just a few planes in the air, operating TRA-CON is fairly straightforward: the problems start when you've got four or five planes all trying to land at the same airport; a couple of Cessnas crawling across the screen and a load of take-offs scheduled. How difficult it all becomes depends on a number of parameters that you set at the start of a simulation. This principally depends on the number of planes that need handling within a given time, but also on weather conditions and pilot proficiency. In the worst, case you're coping with pilots that don't hear or misinterpret commands and are prone to overshoot runways, coupled with storms gusting to 90 knots.

Thankfully the user interface is relatively sensible. particularly if you have a mouse, although on this reviewer's machine the pointer disappeared behind the menus, which turned selection into a hit or miss affair. The program comes with five sector files covering various locations in the States and it is possible to construct your own.

If all goes well you end up with a clear screen and a reasonably high score. If, however, you let two planes approach within three miles horizontally or 1,000 feet vertically you are warned of a 'separation conflict' and penalised accordingly. If the approach is less than half a mile or 500 feet it's a crash, and you are vividly reminded of how many lives have been lost (which depends on the type of planes involved), and just what sort of pressure air traffic controllers live under every moment of their working lives. TRACON is a real challenge and a superb simulation.







SOFTLY SOFTWARE

No matter how complex that package you've purchased may seem, its underlying principles are relatively straightforward and simple. To introduce a three-part series on the whys and wherefores of word processors, databases and spreadsheets, Tim Smith gets down to BASICS.

If the software which flows from the manufacturers into the retailers and eventually dribbles out to you has one thing in common. Be it LocoScript 2 or Lotus 1-2-3, Pagemaker or PostScript – they all started off as an idea in the head of someone who is now excrutiatingly wealthy. The idea was all well and good: "God I'm hacked off with this word processor/database/spreadsheet, let's have a new one". But then it had to be programmed.

Non-programmers need not run screaming in fear of their social lives. There is more to programming than sitting through the night moving through binary forests with the stealth and style of a wounded warthog. Any piece of software involves at least three stages in its development. Planning, design and programming are the holy trinity, each being as important as the others.

There is simply no use in having a programmer who can speak in hexidecimal figures if the plan of action he or she is given comes on the back of a matchbook and is a stream of consciousness job, filled with inspiration, ideals and no solid basis. So planning and programming are in each other's pockets. Equally you cannot expect a programmer to provide the design of a program. The front-end (the element which the user sees and which they utilise to get to grips with the progam functions) must be constant, unjarring and easy to use. All three roles intermingle and react. Any piece of software is a team effort.

TEAM TALK

The aim of this brief series is to show how three of the mainstay pieces of software are put together. What should you be looking for in a word processor? How does a database magically find the entry for G Hurst among all the other Hursts in a city? What lies behind

the slick grid of a spreadsheet and how does the computer know where cell A1 is in relation to cell X1212?

Having this kind of information to hand is useful on two counts. Once you know a few of the details it might make your next purchase that bit more educated and hence save you heartache in future as well as money in the here-and-now. More interestingly, why bother forking out a couple of hundred notes for a database to keep track of your rare film collection when you (and maybe a few friends) could probably sit down and build your own?

The anatomy of any program is a complex, fascinating thing. Getting away from 'what it does' and moving towards 'why and how it does it' will give you more information about your machine as well as cutting a swathe through the complexities of software buying.

MAKE THE MOST OF IT

Another thought to bear in mind is that nearly every machine you can buy, from the Amiga to the CPC, comes replete with a programming language. All well and good, but many people don't even bother with these freebies. Think about it, if you went out and bought a car with a seventh gear to improve fuel consumption, increase power and make the tea, would you use it? Or would you say, "Well I've only ever used five gears and I'm not about to change now. And anyway I've seen a turbo-thruster add-on pack, which only takes three days installation and it can do the same at a cost of £500."? Maybe not.

Learning to understand a program genre such as a spreadsheet can be as simple and fulfilling as studying a racing form, playing chess or telling Bobby Robson that Paul Gascoigne is not half bad.

All it takes is a little time, some patience and

imagination. And you could get at least another few hundred pounds' worth of value from your PC, ST or possibly even a SAM Coupé.

PLAN A FROM INNER SPACE

The first thing we are going to deal with is the database. Why? because most computers come with one form of BASIC or another, because BASIC is nearly as simple to learn as ordering a cup of coffee in French and finally because most BASICs are really decent file handlers.

We will look at what you would want from a database – and what you wouldn't want, which is equally important, as extraneous functions use up precious memory and slow down access time. After this we will take a glimpse or two at what lines of code you might use to begin programming the beast.

The first thing to realise is that you do not need to have a degree in Applied Mathematics to program. Far from it. Any programming language relies on your ability to grasp form and structure. There is no point in providing yourself with multiple search paths if all you are ever going to look for is first names.

PARTY TRICKS

BASIC, which we will be using, would prefer you to have a grasp of logic than logs. One trick to try out before tackling a program is to sit down with a friend. You then have to tell them to close their eyes, then instruct them to pick a matchbox up from a table, open it, light a match, close the box, blow out the match and put the box back on the table.

The instructions you give your friend, which to you were blindlingly unambiguous, can easily be misinterpreted by a human. This game will give you some idea as to just how stupid a computer can be and how much you could also be in charge.

All you are doing when you program a machine is giving it simple instructions. Every program ever written is at its most simple a list of commands. Forget the maths and the learning of a new language and get on with working out what you want, how you want to see it happen, how much time you are going to spend on it and how much energy you are going to expend on it.










Desktop publishing is one of the major market areas available to the Archimedes, for many of the same reasons it was for the Mac. Both machines started life with graphic operating systems, fast processors with specialised image handling and output to high-quality printing and image-setting devices.

So far, only Acorn DTP fills the DTP slot on the Archimedes, but Impression claims a host more features. The manual – which is well written with a nice touch of wit to lighten the text – outlines them well in three separate sections, with plenty of technical detail in the appendices. A separate booklet DTP at a glance is also supplied with the program – though none was supplied for review.

Impression refers to itself as a document processor. This is meant to imply that you can word process at respectable speed within the application. You can — and text is fully WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get) — thanks to Acorn's outline font manager. The anti-aliased fonts can look a little blurred on a mediumres monitor, but are very readable on a multisync. Text editing facilities include block handling, spell checking (including 'while you type'), automatic abbreviation expansion and search and replace.

Search and replace is particularly advanced as you can include tabs, carriage returns and styles. Impression is strong on styles, maybe too strong, in

fact, as it insists that all typographical changes are made within them.

While the idea of applying a series of changes in one fell swoop is appealing, it's good to have the flexibility to change individual fonts or point sizes 'on the fly' – something *Impression* doesn't allow. In fact styles are only part of a whole Document Description Format within the program, which lets you embed layout control characters and style changes into an imported text file. Supported text formats include *Inter-Word*, 1st Word Plus and Acorn DTP.

The typographical control of kerning can be applied separately in horizontal and vertical directions, and leading can be automatically assigned to 120 per cent of the current point size or set explicitly. These and many other layout functions are controlled from the style editing window, which like most others in *Impression* is a very neat affair with shadowed buttons and indented text windows. The style window has an indented scrolling browser containing all the available

categories of control.

Graphics are well supported and *Impression* can handle both bitmap and vector images. These can be rescaled within their boxes and text can be autowrapped around the box, though not directly around the graphic. A selection of around 60 clips, both vector and bitmap, is supplied with the program. How many uses there are for the included pencil sketch of Dennis Healey, though, is open to question. There are a good few extras within the program that few DTPs enjoy. These include index and table of contents creation and the ability to handle colour.

Impression is a full RISCOS application and can be multi-tasked with other programs on the Desktop, memory permitting. Memory can be a problem on a 1Mb machine. Although the program will run with this amount, there's little room for a second document or to run IDraw. This is rather a blow when so much is made of the multi-tasking.

With a base A3000 you're going to have a slow time with a lot of disk swapping. Add 1Mb of memory and a second floppy and you can afford a decent-sized font cache and stick most of the ancillaries *Impression* will want on the second floppy. Add a hard disk and another 2Mb and you have a very flexible system.

THE KEY TO SUCCESS?

Every copy of Impression is supplied with a software key, or 'dongle'. This is attached to the printer port and is checked by the program at various times during each session. If it doesn't find the key in place, it refuses to start or continue running.

Computer Concepts claims the key has no effect on other software and is transparent in use. It's there, the company says, to protect the two and a half years of development that has gone into the program.

There are two potential problems with the use of this kind of key: It may not be as transparent as the supplier believes and it may prove inconvenient for the legitimate user. The first key supplied by Computer Concepts with the review copy of Impression proved unreliable, causing printing errors under Impression and other programs. Some other users have experienced similar problems, though the supplier puts this down to an early faulty batch of keys. If every major application was to be supplied with a gadget which sticks out of the printer port by a good two inches, there would pretty soon be no way you'd be able to get an Archimedes onto your desk. Even if you had a big desk.

The alternative of swapping dongles with application is also not a solution, particularly on a multi-tasking machine. There are better ways of protecting software, such as typing in passwords from a manual.

CONCLUSION

Impression promises a lot, but to use the program even semi-professionally within Acorn's multi-tasker, you need 2Mb of memory and twin floppies. Indeed, it is much better to have 4Mb and a hard disk.

I hope it was the restricted size of the review machine (A310) which caused the frequent error messages from *Impression* during testing, and not some unresolved bugs. Either way, the program should let you save your files before forcing you to remove it, and all open documents, from memory.







BROADCAST FORECASTS

he favourite British opening subject of conversation has taken an even higher profile recently with our very own hurricanes and overdue concern with the effects of global warming. For PC, ST and Amiga owners with added enthusiasm and some £690 to back it up, long-time comms specialist ICS has just released a geostationary weather satellite receiver to allow you to pick up live images on your monitors.

The kit consists of a receiver and pre-amplifier, a 3 metre antenna with 20 metres of cable, and appropriate software to receive, display and manipulate the images. Though nearly £700 for the set up might sound expensive, ICS, European market leader in data and radio communications – with a turnover of £2m – claims a comparable system would knock you back £5,000 or so.

In Europe and Africa images are taken from the Meteosat satellite positioned some 23,000 miles above the Greenwich meridian and the equator in geostationary orbit. As such it monitors the same view of the globe twenty-four hours a day. It's also possible to download pics from the US GEOS satelllite serving the American continent. These are the main two satellites, but you can also try your luck at two Russian ones

and the NOAA satellite orbiting at only 450 miles, which passes the UK three times a day, taking only 100 minutes to complete an orbit.

The antenna used to collect the images needs to be mounted on the side of a building and pointed in the rough direction and elevation of the satellite you wish to access. A coaxial cable links the mast to the receiver, where fine tuning is enabled, and a lead connects this to the parallel port of your computer. Since the downloads are infra-red images appearing as mono, it's best to view the material in grey scale resolution, but the supplied software offers you the choice of adding your own colours. As such, it is possible to assign varying RGB values to different areas of the image in order to highlight particular features - and as you can see, the ICS's MET-2 is a weather satellite receiver for your PC, ST or Amiga. Andy Storer downloads the data that travels 23,000 miles.

results are rather impressive to say the very least.

Furthermore, with PC software it's possible to select any graphics mode you may have from CGA to VGA though the manufacturers recommend 16 grey level screens as producing the best results. Once read in, the 512K images can be coloured and magnified for close-ups.


It's the same with the ST version, but you'll need a 1Mb machine. Here it's best to view the material as grey scale images and for this reason ICS supplies a separate adapter which allows you to convert your colour monitor to grey scale. Pics can be saved as NEO files for subsequent screening as animations or dumps to printer. On an Amiga with at least 1Mb of RAM, resolutions of up to 600x400 x 16 grey levels in interlace mode are supported with selectable zoom. Images are stored as .ILBM files for easy transfer into paint packages and the *PIXmate* image proessing program. Both the ST and Amiga can continuously capture images as they are broadcast every half-hour — so if you

















have sufficient RAM you can dump them all into memory for subsequent replay.

The resolution of the images generated by Meteosat and GOES is 800 x 800 pixels and this consists of information picked up by infra-red sensors looking at emitted heat values. The images are transmitted to an earth station, either at Darmstadt in West Germany or


Lanion in France, where they are processed and re-broadcast to the satellite for dissemination to anyone with the equipment to capture the signal. At the earth station, the processing involved adds coastal outlines to the map.

The pictures are composed of 2,500 lines, which are broadcast at a rate of two or four a second; thus it takes nearly four minutes for a complete




image to be read on to your monitor. Depending on the machine you're using you can animate the various images – if you have 4Mb of RAM it's possible to store up to 64 frames of data while with a more down-to-earth system offering 640K you can store eight frames or four hours of weather data.

So, if you're an amateur meteorologist, farmer, seafarer, school teacher or guide, you might find MET-2 a bargain. At any rate, for more information give ICS a call on 0903 731101.

READER'S DIGEST

Do you really understand what the computer mags tell you? Rodney Indesit presents a guide to believing what you read

up their facts properly and don't know how to get hard news from the on-line news services, because PCWs don't work very well with modems. Therefore they have to guess most of the news that you read. If they guess wrong nobody minds, but if they guess right, the companies concerned in the item strenuously denies everything. Suppose, for example, journalist X guesses that Comari Corp. is about to launch a £50 32-bit hand-held colour VGA Spectrum-compatible games machine. If this is nonsense the company will let the item pass as it'll just put wind up the opposition, furnish an air of mystique and give it some more publicity. On the other hand, if it's near the mark, it will deny it strenuously, because if its competitors knew what it was up to it might lose its competitive edge.

RULE 2 NEVER BELIEVE ANYTHING UNTIL IT'S CORRECTED

Writers compiling problems pages of technical advice and so on tend to write the first thing that comes into their heads in the morning. (In fact, the first thing that goes into most technical writers' heads is a shot of Bell's and a Gauloise.) Most of what they write is wrong (one technical author was nicknamed Robin Hood because he was always writing wrongs). Lazy types print up tips and pokes and so on that readers have sent in, without checking first that they work. They never do.

Three weeks later someone will try the tip and find that, instead of reformatting the current paragraph as it claims, that short-cut keystroke in fact reformats the hard disk and creates 256 files on the floppy all called ABCDEFGH.123. An apology will be printed with a correction. You can sometimes believe the correction.

RULE 3 NEVER BELIEVE ANYTHING BEFORE IT IS CONTRADICTED

In letters pages and so on people express their views on computers forcibly. Unfortunately these views tend to be like those claimed by seaside boarding houses: drab, uninspiring and obtainable only by sticking your neck out a long way.

And, all too often, they haven't taken into account significant facts – perhaps the mail order company they praise has just gone into liquidation, or the software

they cite as the best buy is in fact unavailable in the country except in pirate copies. So before putting any faith in what they write you have to wait three weeks for someone to find out their error and write in contradicting the first letter. They, in turn, will have missed out some vital fact, meaning you have to wait another three weeks, and so on.

RULE 4 NEVER BELIEVE ANYTHING UNTIL IT'S APOLOGISED FOR

Allegations are often made by news writers about individuals or companies. These allegations are often true, in which case they're what everyone knows anyway but dare not put in writing. On the other hand, if they are wide of the mark, then the industry and the customers will ignore the allegation, because the company's reputation will be secure anyway and making a fuss would just draw unwarranted attention.

If the allegations are true the effect of the printed word will be to confirm what everyone knows anyway. The company concerned can't deny it, or everyone would know the allegations were true (see Rule 1). So they threaten libel, knowing that just because something is well-known doesn't mean it's sound enough to stand up by itself in court (as could be said for most judges). It would be up to the magazine to prove that the gossip was true, which will be impossible, and the magazine would have to pay huge damages. Therefore the magazine will print an apology under the threat of a libel action, and when this happens you know what they originally wrote was true.

When, for example, you see "APOLOGY: Last week there were some unintentional errors in our item about Xsoft. This company is a respectable software house and has provided its customers with an excellent service for many years," you know it means "XSoft is well known as a get-rich-quick outfit run from a garage in Woolwich since May last year and the dompany peddles tawdry pirated software from Taiwan, cashing cheques before sending anything out."

RULE 5 NEVER BELIEVE ANYTHING WRITTEN UNDER A PSEUDONYM

It must be rubbish or they'd use their own name.

here are something like 200 magazines and periodicals devoted to computers, and much, if not all, of what is written is inaccurate.

The basic problem, as I see it, is that any-

one who can write won't waste his or her time with computers (he or she will have a PCW instead). Further, anyone who knows about computers tends to be happier writing in op codes than English – the sort of people whose shopping lists look like this:

Therefore you can't approach a piece of computer journalism as you would a normal piece of literature; after all, would you expect the average piece of business software to be usable without reading the manual, buying a book on it, and attending a six-week intensive training course in London? Of course not. You need some preparation. Here, then, are five of the most vital rules to help you make sense of some of what you read.

RULE 1 NEVER BELIEVE ANYTHING UNTIL IT'S DENIED

Mac attack on prices

Your article on the Macintosh (The Price is Right – Express 71) got me re-thinking my plans. I am setting up a very small specialist teacher-training centre and need a computer for word-processing, simple budgets and accounts, simple database of potential students, and preparing course material. This would need DTP facilities for such things as: one page flyers, multi-column brochures and newsletters and training booklets/manuals up to 100 pages long.

I fancied a Mac for its fun, easy to learn interface, but got put off by the price and the impression from Mac magazines that the hardware and software is increasingly aimed at corporate power users and big publishers, not the small fry like me. So I was gritting my teeth in preparation for a plunge into the rigours of the MS-DOS world, with an occasional flirtatious glance towards the ST or Archimedes, when your usually-realistic, down-to-earth reviewer comes along saying: "Yes, the price is right, and it is the best you can buy."

So, as you've set me thinking again about purchasing a Mac, perhaps you could answer some of the questions this raises for me:

There are rumours that the Plus and perhaps even the SE will soon be dropped. Are they still worth investing in now? (I couldn't afford anything more, even with an educational discount.)

Is working with a 9-inch black and white screen much of a disadvantage compared with, say, 12-inch colour on other machines?

We read in the same issue of Express that Bob Gleadow [Atari's UK managing director] sees the ST as a real alternative to the Mac in DTP. Why isn't it (or the Archimedes with, say, Impression)?

Is that hip collection of HyperCard PD software you refer to, actually available in the UK?

Is the recently-announced, revamped Lisa, from MacSolutions UK, worth a look?

As far as we know Apple has no plans to drop either the Plus or the SE – in fact the rumours are that it intends to bring out colour versions in the near future. As for 9-inch monitors, I've been using one for *Express* since issue 0 and it's fine.




