

Details emerge of colour wonder 'Micro Drive'

SEGA'S HAND-HELD SET FOR UK LAUNCH

Further details have emerged of Sega's hand-held games machine, plans for which were exclusively revealed in Express 35.

The machine – codenamed Micro Drive – will resemble the kidney-shaped controllers of the Megadrive, but will not incorporate that machine's 16-bit processor technology.

It will feature a 6cm colour screen in the middle with a thumb-controlled joypad and on/off and game selector switches.

Curiously, it is to be launched with the American and European markets in mind. It is based on the ageing technology of the original Sega console – Sega believes that sophisticated Japanese consumers would not tolerate such 'primitive' technology.

Production is to begin in the US within a few months and a UK launch will follow shortly afterwards. Prices have yet to be fixed although it is thought likely that the machine will be cheaper than Atari's colour Lynx, which costs £170.

Current Sega owners will be pleased to learn that the hand-held is 100 per

cent compatible with the original console. It will use the tiny cards which Sega had previously considered scrapping

had previously considered scrapping. No-one at UK distributor Virgin/ Mastertronic was available for comment, although product manager Philip Ley has already described such a machine as "a logical move".





. Chopper: stealing the Pentagon's thunder?

EA's Chopper game gets the jump on the US Air Force

Electronic Arts has released a helicopter simulation game based on the LHX attack chopper – which is yet to fly in real life.

While several contractors are still competing to build the real thing – described as the most flexible and deadly aircraft ever designed – Electronic Arts has somehow managed to design a computer simulation based around it.

LHX Attack Chopper will be released

in March at £39.99 on both 5.25- and 3.5-inch disks in a package that supports all major PC boards, including MCGA and VGA, with the AdLib sound board for extra realism.

This is not the first time that a computer flight simulator has anticipated the aircraft it's based on. MicroProse developed F-19 Stealth Fighter before the real aircraft was even named. It was eventually called the F-117A and was hailed as the world's first radar-invisible aircraft.

Tune in with your stereo PC

If tuning into your favourite stereo radio programme is a nightmare with knobs on, why not let your computer do it?

An American company called Optronics Technology has developed DesktopStereo, a digital FM stereo receiver for IBM PCs and compatibles, that will do just that – and a lot more besides.

While it's being installed DesktopStereo automatically searches the FM band and assigns 10 pre-selections to the stations with the best reception. Through a popup control screen you can change channel, balance, volume, tone, bass, and treble. Signal strength is

monitored on-screen and if it starts to fade the program will switch to mono for better reception.

A half-size circuit board plugs into a standard PC slot to connect aerial and headphones – or speakers. In America the system sells for \$199 (£118). More information on 010 1 503 488 5040. ■

Sea-through graphics

Industrial Light and Magic, film director George Lucas' special effects company, won the supreme prize at Imagina – the European computer graphics festival held in Monte Carlo recently.

Excerpts from Willow, and Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade were also shown, but the greatest praise was reserved for the special effects in The Abyss – in which ILM managed to successfully design a creature that appeared to be made of sea water.

After animating a wire frame model of the creature on screen, another version was prepared with a solid surface, before it was made 'transparent'. This involved giving its surface a continuous ripple effect, together with carefully calculated 'reflections' off its surfaces.

Finally the faces of the actors were programmed in, so the creature could imitate the features of the characters in the film.

No solution for CD firm

Pergamon Compact Solution, the Mirror Group's CD-ROM specialist, has closed down – despite the success of its main project, the Guinness Disk of Records.

The group has decided to concentrate its software publishing on two areas in future. Commercial and professional business will be handled by BRS Software products. Entertainment and small business users will be served by Mirrorsoft.

Mirrorsoft has already outlined its intention to enter the CD fray. Two years ago Pergamon Compact Solution was probably the leading name in CD-ROM developments in the UK.

'Platform for the Nineties' unveiled in London

Next Machine: The All-Black Winner

After a 90-minute launch extravaganza at the London Palladium, the NeXT computer finally made it to the UK last week, some 18 months after its US debut.

The stylish black workstation, aimed at the networking Unix market, is the brainchild of Steve Jobs, the Apple co-founder sensationally sacked five years ago after helping build the company's fortunes to \$2 billion through sales of the Apple II and Macintosh.

His new machine, warmly acclaimed as introducing several innovative features to personal computing, will be exclusively distributed through Businessland which is targeting sales at companies in *The Times* 1,000.


At a base-level system price of £5,745, this will come as no surprise, but the NeXT does represent tremendous value considering its specifications. Described as 'a mainframe on two chips', the NeXT is fitted with 8Mb of RAM and a high-resolution mono display powered by custom chips providing data transfer at a rate of 32Mb per second.

INNOVATIONS

Among the exciting innovations are an optional 256Mb rewriteable optical disk, a graphical user interface, NeXTstep, providing a front-end to the multi-tasking Unix operating system, and a 400DPI laser printer for only an additional £1,995.

At the packed launch, Jobs described the NeXT as "the best desktop platform in the world for the Nineties" and declared his belief in its potential.

"There have been three milestones so far. The Apple II revolutionised the industry, before being followed five years later by the IBM PC and two years after that by Apple's Macintosh. We're trying to make a fourth." With a \$600 million company behind it, NeXT might start off slowly, but long-term success is relatively assured. Later this year, a 32-bit colour

card will be released for the machine which will support Pixar's RenderMan package – arguably the computer graphics industry's leading edge in high-resolution modelling and animation.

Although a limited amount of software is available for the NeXT, Adobe Illustrator and Aldus PageMaker are among the better-known titles in the later stages of conversion. Jobs' claim that, "every major third-party software developer in the US except Microsoft is writing for our computer", would seem to ensure the machine's success. A comparable Macintosh system, based on a 40Mb hard disk and including a laser printer costs around £4,000 more.

Although refusing to be drawn on the machine's sales performance in the US, Jobs declared the NeXT to be selling in groups of 10 to 50, with several large orders in the 100 to 500 unit range.



Experts say flight simulations are educational

COMPUTER GAMES ARE LEARNING TOOLS!

Flight simulators have always been at the top end of the games market, but now experts are recommending them as educational as well as enjoyable.

"Some of these products provide a strong educational basis," says David Oliver, editor of Airforces Monthly magazine. "They even give an excellent insight into the workload and complexities of flying something as sophisticated as the F16 fighter."

F16 Combat Pilot from Digital Integration, is the case in point. The founder of the company, Dave Marshall, commented: "We had over five people working on F16 Combat Pilot solidly for two years. We endeavoured to make the game as realistic as possible and received much praise from pilots including many former RAF pilots. We believe that the popularity of games such as

F16 will increase the number of people whose ambition it is to be a pilot."

In America Falcon AT, developed by Spectrum Holobyte, has been used by the US Air Force as an introduction to trainee pilots and is used to train them in 'pre-merge situational awareness'. In English that means assessing a combat situation before deciding how best to enter it.

Nintendo has long staged a public relations campaign attempting to prove that games are educational and help youngsters act in a positive manner – even if the games are based on violence.

Meanwhile, also in the USA, Broderbund Software Inc has released a new version of its World War II action game, Wings of Fury for IBM PCs and compatibles. In this game the player pilots an F6F Hellcat fighter/bomber through a series of missions in the Pacific. ■

Dragon mania grips Japanese

The latest version of Japan's most popular game, *Dragon Quest IV*, sold 1.3 million Nintendo cartridges on the first day of its release in Japan.

Gamers queued up for hours waiting to get their hands on Japan's hottest new game. In one case four Nintendo owners sustained injuries when they were pushed through the window of a software store.

One shop, Bic Camera in lkebukuto, Tokyo, knocked 30 per cent off the recommended price of 8,500 yen (£35), and attracted 10,000 eager gamesters who queued all night in the pouring rain. Luckily everyone got a copy eventually.

As demand outstripped supply, 60 proud, new owners were robbed by Dragon Quest junkies as they left different shops – there was even a reported case of blackmail.

Previous versions of the game have sold over seven million copies all told.

Enix, distributor of the game, expects to sell three million by this summer and has already asked Nintendo, which manufactures the software, for more supplies.

YOU BITE MY NECK...



Horrorsoft, the label which signed up US cult figure Elvira to launch Personal Nightmare, could be helping to launch the lady's own career on this side of the Atlantic. Its new game, called Elvira, Mistress of the Dark, stars the lady herself.

The game, due to be released in March, is aimed at ST, Amiga, PC and C64 owners and is a totally icon-driven, role-playing horror game requiring no keyboard input. It casts Elvira as the descendant of Queen Emelda, an evil sorceress trying to make a comeback from the grave, with the game player as Elvira's knight in slightly-tarnished armour.

Mike Woodroffe of Horrorsoft commented: "Elvira herself went through the game with us and changed it to fit her character – so it's certainly authentic.

"It didn't matter that she wasn't well known in the UK when we started, she was exactly right for the image we wanted to present. She's since presented Heavy Metal Heaven on BBC2 and is returning soon for some European TV work – by which time maybe the game will have helped to make her famous over here!

"She has a massive following in the States and a lot of people have assumed the game itself is American."

In America Elvira (real name
Cassandra Peterson), has become one of
the most outrageous characters on national
television. She began as a Las Vegas
showgirl before hitting upon the idea of
Elvira. Not surprisingly her TV show,
Elvira's Movie Macabre quickly became a hit
and her fan club currently boasts 35,000
members. There could be a few British
applicants soon.

Can we have our money back now, please?

If you buy a computer and later find that prices have dropped, it's just bad luck. Big business, it seems, is not like that...

Last October it was announced that Groupe Bull was buying Data Systems, the computer subsidiary of US giant Zenith Electronics, for up to \$635m (£387m) – depending on net asset valuations. In December Bull paid \$496m (£302.5m) with the rest to follow.

However it soon became apparent that Data Systems was struggling, and within weeks Zenith announced that it had become a loss maker. Bull promptly demanded a \$49m (£30m) refund – plus interest!

Last week the Financial Times reported Zenith's chairman, Jerry Pearlman, as calling the current relationship between the two companies as: "a difference of opinion of significant magnitude" and "a major dispute" adding "neither we nor our auditors can predict the outcome of discussions, possible arbitration or other action."

Hip help

Surgeons may soon be using 3D computer graphics to provide patients with bespoke replacement hip joints.

The computer design system, which has been developed by Cornell University in America, allows surgeons to match artificial joints to individual patients using data from computerised tomographic scans.

The new system, already being used in five US hospitals, means the surgeon can design and test an artificial implant on a supercomputer, before having the joint manufactured to the correct specifications.

Catch a virus

On the other hand, US publisher slams violence

COMPUTER GAMES JUST GLORIFY WAR!

Flight simulations based on violence do not deserve to be rewarded as software products, because they help to perpetuate real war.

That's the view of a US software developer who has called upon the Software Publishers' Association not to reward any products which "glorify war and violence".

Greg Sanderson, boss of Breakthrough Productions, has written to all members of the influential SPA urging them not to vote for war games in the forthcoming SPA Excellence Awards. He has singled out titles such as Operation Wolf, F16 Strike Eagle and Their Finest Hour, among others.

Sanderson told Express: "My reason for doing this is the premise that by glorifying war you help to perpetuate it. It's wrong to promote a fascination about war and weaponry.

"These simulations where you do things like strafe the Golden Gate are wrong - I just think 'gee guys, come on'.

"It's not a black and white thing. I know games like Dungeons and Dragons are fun, and you are in the realms of fantasy there. But if you've got someone blowing up a tank in a game with realistic sounds, that's just sick.

"Companies should have a sense of moral leadership - other than just taking out copyright lawsuits."

Sanderson's company is responsible for the acclaimed Market Master for the Macintosh - an aid for sales people. He says violent games should not necessarily be banned but should not be rewarded.

Sanderson has sent hundreds of letters out to members of the SPA asking them not to reward any games based on violence - no matter how high the quality

A spokeswoman for the SPA said the body did not want to take an official stand on the matter. The SPA Awards will be announced on March 27.

PC-based robot helps disabled

An American company called Droid Systems has launched a robot which uses an IBM PC-AT as its brain.

Standing just over four feet high and rejoicing in the name of Droid PR1, the robot sells for \$15,000. The PC-AT is based on a 286 processor, has 640K memory and a 20Mb hard disk as well as a floppy drive. There are five auxiliary computers which in turn control its movements, and it has sophisticated voice recognition software as well as responding to keyboard commands.

Droid PR1 can perform 40 different functions from light housework to stocking supermarket shelves and, if used in the home, will remember its way around after just one guided tour. It can't handle the stairs, though.

A spokesman for the company, Robert Daniel, commented: "It would be a great help to someone who is handicapped and that is an important part of our market. We would also expect the robot to appeal to schools and universities interested in research and development - and it could even be used to show people where specific items are stocked in the larger and more complicated supermarkets."

Droid PR1 runs for six hours on fully charged batteries and will even trundle off and plug itself in when it feels its charge is running low.

Listening to the sound of Psions

In a few months, people around Britain will be talking to their Psion portable computers.

By the middle of the year, Psion should be releasing its voice processor which will allow users to store, edit and play back hours of speech in the memory of the recently-launched MC 400.

This is the first attempt to provide digital voice processing for the mass market, as the voice module, when available, will cost £99.

The Psion MC series machines already have provision made for voice input in the software. The processor fits inside the body of the 5lb computer, and with it installed users will be able to add

voice messages to alarms and later to add voice comments to files.

It works in several different modes depending on the amount of compression required. At best, you get CD-quality sound, but it takes 64K of memory per second to store. At the other end of the quality spectrum, you can fit approximately three hours of speech in a megabyte of storage - and by the end of the year they expect to be able to fit the MC computers with 8Mb or more.

The idea behind the introduction of the voice processor is that the Psion will be eventually able to understand as well as record speech, and users will be able to do without a keyboard altogether.

Puzzling Arc

Who ran through the streets of Syracuse, naked, shouting "Eureka"? Trivia nuts and ther brainy types will of course know that it was Archimedes.

By a somewhat creepy co-incidence the old Greek's modern namesake is now to play host to a mass of trivia - thanks to UK software house Domark. The firm is to launch that teaser Trivial Pursuit for Acorn's machine.

The computer version has some cute little extras including visual and audio puzzlers. In all there are 3,000 questions to get through.

Parallel processing on the PC A British firm claims to be

working on a system which can make an ordinary PC act as if it were working at speeds rivaling a Cray.

Taos Systems is working on the project, and has already developed a nonhomogeneous, parallel-processing system offering enormous power gains at very low cost. The bad news is, it isn't compatible with MS-DOS... yet.

It started as a project to create better computer

games systems. One of the partners in Taos Systems, Nik Spicer, told Express: "We have solved the problem of how to simply and easily program power systems of any size and any topology - even when the topology changes."

Taos doesn't have to have a specific chip to operate because it makes every chip in the network pretend to be a standard 32-bit computer called a virtual processor (VP), and then loads each VP with a small program

designed to run Taos.

Operating this way would normally be too slow, but Taos has demonstrated that their routines run faster on an Inmos Transputer than the transputer will run under its own machine code.

Taos has also developed a new chip which it is even more excited about. It's still under wraps, but Spicer insisted: "We'll be introducing it later this year and it will be megabig - a PC will run half as fast as a Cray!"

IBM's huge RAM chip

IBM has successfully fabricated a 16-megabit chip on an existing semiconductor production line.

The announcement came last week at the International Solid State Circuits conference in San Francisco, which was attended by all the world's leading chip makers – most of whom turned up to boast of their four-megabit advances.

The IBM chip is a 16-megabit DRAM (dynamic random-access memory) which can store the equivalent of 800 pages of typewritten text and operates at a speed of 50 nanoseconds (billionths of a second). That means the chip's 16,777,216 bits could be read in just a twenty-fifth of a second.

The chip measures 0.3 inches by 0.75 inches and has circuit patterns 0.5 micrometres (millionths of a metre) wide – or 200 times thinner than the page you are reading right now. IBM expects it to reach the market within two years. ■ (Newsbytes)

Business wakes up to burglary

Britain's businesses are finally coming to realise that computer crime is costing money – and they want action.

According to new research, 80 per cent of computerised companies want new legislation to be introduced. And 58 per cent are ready to admit that their computer systems are open to abuse. A conservative estimate puts the cost of computer crime in UK businesses at £400 million a year.

The research - conducted by Gallup on behalf of the Which Computer? Show also found that 17 per cent of respondents knew they has already been hit by a hacker.

Viruses have moved on from the world of science fiction and into reality. Gallup found that 11 per cent of respondents were resigned to the fact that their systems contained at least one virus.

The argument that companies are ignorant about the risks appears to be ill-founded. Seventy five per cent of British businesses now have an active policy on computer security in relation to technical failure, with 72 per cent having a direct policy for the protection of data.

Organiser of Which? Hugh Keeble has set up a Computer Security Centre at this year's show which will focus on the technology available and the issues involved. The Which Computer? Show will take place from April 24 to 27 at the National Exhibition Centre in Birmingham.

Atari Lynx relieves hospital treatment tedium

GAMES IN BED FOR BORED PATIENTS

Bored hospital patients in the US are to be offered the chance to play computer games in their beds using an Atari Lynx hand-held machine.

Entrepreneur Andy Kluger has bought hundreds of the consoles to be hired out through 150 hospitals around the States. He will be offering them at a reasonable \$7 a day with a selection of games also available. Kluger's company, Medical Entertainment Systems, also hires out books and tapes in hospitals. Kluger expects the scheme to generate revenues of \$7 million this year.

He told on-line news agency Newsbytes that the consoles would be most popular among 18- to 35-year-old males. He will also be offering patients the chance to hire Atari Portfolio business machines.

Medical Entertainment Systems is

Atari's exclusive distributor to the medical community in the US. Kluger said the Lynx is ideal because of its portability. Patients could use them through long treatments such as chemotherapy or kidney dialysis.

Compaq expands

PC manufacturer Compaq has announced that, by the end of the year, 70 per cent of all its machines sold outside the USA will be produced in the UK.

An injection of \$30m (£17.5m) to expand the company's plant in Erskine, Renfrewshire, was announced last week by president of Compaq's non-American operations, Eckhard Pfeiffer.

Last year the plant produced 49 per cent of PC-compatible stocks sold outside North America.

nyone possessing a modicum of sanity must feel a twinge of empathy with Mr Sanderson's beliefs, even if they appear misguided (News, page 5). There is, after all, something daft about the desire to sit in front of a computer screen pretending to control the fate of armies.

Snatches of pompous men with tons of tin soldiers spread over the drawing room floor flash in the mind. Taken in purely logical terms wargaming can easily be ridiculed.

To his credit Sanderson has taken a novel approach and, in his anti-wargames campaign, has ignored the sillier elements of the violence spectrum and concentrated on those which have hitherto gained nothing but respect. Respect from gamers, education authorities, the military and software publishers' bank managers.

HOARY CHESTNUT

Violence and the computer gamer is, as they say, a hoary old chestnut, which is best detailed to the dumper. But to accuse flight simulations of being an aid to perpetuating war and violence is so new as to be refreshing. We've already heard the debate over *International Assassin Simulator III* and its ilk too many times. No-one has yet accused our flight simulations of something so heinous. After all they are played by sensible people — not pimply psychopaths just out of the playground.

There may be an argument to suggest that games involving the mass murder of innocents might have an effect on young impressionable minds. Indeed, there is reams of research undertaken in American schools which suggest that youngsters who while away their leisure hours slaughtering things on television screens have a tendency to be anti-social.

Even then the anti-social behaviour comes to bad sportsmanship and the odd hair-pulling incident.

All that is simply too brittle to stretch to serious war sims. The best require a high degree of dexterity in controlling your own craft and staying in the game for a long period, rather than the ability to go crashing madly into anything that moves.

WORLD WAR

Apart from anything else, it's difficult to imagine your average ST owner initiating the next World War on the basis of a good score in F19 Stealth Fighter.

While violence and its glorification can leave a nasty taste in the mouth, only the sixth-form cynics sincerely believe there is any alternative. Popular entertainment demands nastiness. There can only be restrictions. Let's face it, flight and tank simulations are the least of our worries.

The German Government attempted to clamp down on war simulations a couple of years ago. Understandably, they are especially sensitive to anything which may be seen to glorify war. There was no clampdown on Barbarian type affairs – only games such as Silent Service (a wartime submarine simulation).

Those restrictions came to little because of public demand. Many people want to how it felt to captain a sub or fly a Spitfire over Kent in 1940.

Here is a good opportunity to make one point. That is, the attempts by certain publishers to create stereotypes of what they perceive to be the people 'we' have to fight against.

There's no need to go off on some bonkers tirade about equal opportunities for kamikaze pilots in computer games, but isn't it refreshing when you get the chance to play the other side?



ONE YEAR AGO

The Case of the Whingeing Pommes' got under way as the Beatles' Apple Corps filed suit in the London High Court against Apple Computers, seeking a world-wide ban on the use of the name Apple on equipment used for synthesising music.

The action was said to have been instigated by George Harrison who, ironically, had become something of an expert in copyright law after being accused of plagiarism in the 1970s. A riff in My Sweet Lord was deemed to have been stolen from an early Chiffons' hit, He's So Fine.

The case still drags on and there seems to be no end to the long and winding road...

Poqet Computer International, a new player in the portable PC market, set up business in its world-wide headquarters in Weybridge, Surrey, having been formed two months earlier in Sunnyvale, California.

Rumours of a family of pocketsized MS-DOS PCs were already rife, but Tom Cairns, the company's new chairman and ex-managing director of Zenith, said: "We are keeping details of the machine close to our chests until the launch."

Asked to comment on his appointment he added: "...it is a rare opportunity to be a founder member of one of the most exciting developments I've seen"

Meanwhile Zenith itself announced its first annual profit since 1984 and Clive Taylor, vice president for Western Europe, boldly insisted this was a permanent turn around and the latest results were not just a bright blip that would be wiped out next year. "The trend is there," he added.

Alas! The latest figures are a disaster and even the sell-off of the Data Systems part of Zenith's

business empire to Groupe Bull has come to grief - see news, page 4.

Apple US formally announced the launch later that year of the most prestigious portable to date – a laptop Macintosh. No other information was forthcoming but financial analysts predicted that it would sell for around \$6,000. Not a bad guess as it happened.

The launch had been delayed because of 'problems with the laptop's screen display'. Problems that were clearly solved.

TWO YEARS AGO

Cascade proudly announced that it had won the worldwide licence to market an official Royal Air Force game, provisionally entitled Fighter Pilot – The RAF Simulation, which actually set out to simulate joining the RAF and training, as well as flying a number of aircraft. All of which sounded great, but as far as we can make out, the game never got of the ground.

Cascade has since changed its name to Artronic.

Mandarin's marketing manager, Chris Payne, reckoned that ST games were only "pretty to look at" and "don't play well".

"Upgraders from 8-bit machines are disappointed by the ST," he continued. "The market is still very immature and software houses aren't as critical as they should be. It's a great shame. People are better off with a Spectrum or C64 at the moment."

Payne has since become Mandarin's managing director.

TEN YEARS AGO

The first signs of Japanese supremacy over the Americans in the field of microelectronics appeared at the Solid State Circuits Conference in San Francisco.

At a time when 64K memory chips were only just starting to appear commercially, NEC-Toshiba and NTT stunned the world by unveiling the first 256K chips. Now IBM has announced a chip 64 times the size.





LET'S SPLIT

The fax machine was the quiet revolution of the late 1980s. Three or four years ago, anyone who talked of transmitting data across a telephone line was a comms-freak waiting hours to get files across at 300 baud.

Then quite suddenly the fax machine became the staple medium for interoffice communications and junk-fax became yet another new buzzword. Incidentally, try sending a long and boring fax back to any perpetrator of junk – 20 times. It causes little hassle to you but wastes a goodly amount of the receiving fax's thermal paper.

If you're thinking about installing a fax, but can't afford or don't want an extra phone line, consider the Fax-Line line splitter from Watford Electronics. This compact device connects to a standard BT phone socket and lets you connect a fax machine and an audio handset into sockets in its end.

'Ah ha!' you say 'but what happens when auntie Gertrude calls and gets an earful of carrier tone?' This might actually be quite a good way of discouraging the old bat, but the Fax-Line is designed to

encourage aunties and other callers.

The Fax-Line does this by using a digitised recording which tells the caller to hold on for connection to your handset. If the caller is a fax machine, it doesn't bother with the message, but connects it straight to your fax instead. Jolly clever, don't you think?

If you want to hear the system in action, call WE on 0923 222221 – reproduction on the Fax-Line is much better than the answering machine it connects you to. If, after hearing what it can do, you want to order one, call WE on 0923 37774 or fax the good people on 01-950 8989.

ONE AT A TIME

Multi-tasking is not needed on a singleuser machine. Indeed, there are few occasions when you ever need your PC to do more than one thing at a time, because there's only one of you and you only have one set of hands and eyes (if you have more, please write it and tell me about them). So runs the line I've been putting about for a veritable string of many months now.

It appears that at least one company feels the same. SoftLogic Solutions Inc has been marketing Software Carousel for some while now, but it has only recently come to my attention.

Software Carousel enables you to switch between applications, but holds any you are not currently using in stasis. When you switch back to them, they're in exactly the same state they were when you left. It's a bit like switching between applications in Pipedream on a Z88.

The great advantage of this technique is that the coding of Software Carousel is a lot simpler than for a multi-tasker like Windows or DesqView. The whole program is under 50K long and handles text and graphics programs with ease – though I have to admit to some screen breakup on GEM.

NERD WORDS



If you use your word processor for the odd bit of poesy you'll no doubt be interested in NERD. Newman's Electronic Rhyming Dictionary is an American pop-up program which lets you sweep around different rhyme groups or enter the last word from a line of verse for a suitable set of rhymes.

Rather a good idea/it's clear/and not too dear/at £29.99. That last line needs a bit of work. Contact NA Keylock for further information. You'll find him on 0278 691045.

The other good thing about the program is that it can use expanded and extended memory and supplement it with virtual memory – a section of your hard disk partitioned off to look like more RAM. You can tailor the combination of these three resources to dictate what Software Carousel uses.

Once installed, the program sets up each application you've specified in its

own area of memory. You can switch between them, commendably quickly, by pressing [Alt]+[Shift]. The closest analogy for the way it works is that it makes any program into a pop-up.

The other comforting feature of Software Carousel is that it costs just £68.95 from Software Paradise. Phone 0222 862209 for more.

SMARTEN UP

John Treen of Learnington wrote asking about a system for setting up separate environments which I described in this column some while ago. It is actually the most useful bit of batch file coding I've ever come across, and it has many side benefits – so it's worth running through again.

The basic principle is that you have lots of CONFIG.SYS and AUTOEXEC.BAT files, and that you use a selected pair of them to reconfigure the environment of your PC for a particular application. For instance, I have separate sets with all the necessary setting for Windows, GEM, DesqView, word processing and a 'clean' machine.

The CONFIG and AUTOEXEC files are saved in two separate directories called BATCHES and DEVICES and are given names to show the environment they refer to - CLEAN.BAT and CLEAN.SYS for example - and are called by specially written batch files with names like windows.BAT, DV.BAT and CLEAN.BAT. The CLEAN.BAT file, as an example, looks like this:

Risk is one of those games that you can bring out on a rainy Sunday afternoon and play with the whole family in front of the fire. It may not pose the intellectual challenge of chess or bridge, but it will certainly keep most people absorbed for a few hours. Whether it really needs to be translated to the computer screen is another matter.

Thankfully in Risk, the computer edition, Leisure Genius has produced a worthy successor to Diplomacy, a rather more demanding game of political intrigue and world conquest that was converted to the PC a few years ago.

On an EGA or Hercules machine, for example, Risk

makes excellent use of the display with a very attractive map, drawn in the high resolution 16-colour 640 by 350 mode on EGA. On a CGA or Tandy machine the screen becomes a window on a larger, scrolling map.

It can be played with keyboard or joystick although it is best with the mouse, particularly as play is controlled by a welldesigned system of pulldown menus and dialogue boxes. Unfortunately not all mice work, though. Risk allows up to six players, any of which can be controlled by the computer playing at any of three proficiency levels. It supports either US or UK rules with options for full or short games, and the two player game even provides a neutral computer-controlled player to spice things up.

As a computer version of Risk, this new release would be hard to beat. Indeed, this conversion is nothing short of a must.

This short batch file is a little convoluted, but it does reduce the total number of files needed to get the system running. It first displays a warning to give the user the chance to save any work which would be obliterated by the reset.

WOULD is a short batch utility from PC Plus's SuperDisk 32 which returns an errorlevel for Y or N answers. This and COLDBOOT – which, by the way, caused a minor earth tremor when it was mistaken for the spore of a virus on SuperDisk 41 – are also available under other names in the public domain.

The batch file then copies CLEAN.SYS to CONFIG.SYS and overwrites the contents of the current AUTOEXEC.BAT file with the single line C:\BATCHES\CLEAN RUN. This forces the machine to call the batch file again once it has rebooted (using the Coldboot utility). The RUN parameter, however, forces it to skip the warning and reset section and run the commands after the :cleanzun label instead.

As well as being ideal for setting up environments, this scheme of doing things is very handy if you're testing new software. More and more packages 'self-install' by tromping all over your CONFIG and AUTOEXEC files. Using this system, you can recreate your standard setup by typing something as simple as NORMAL.

US Gold is making determined efforts to slow down on its conversion and licence front and build up a strong line-up of original games instead. The first of these to be whipped out of the hat is E-Motion, a game out of the Assembly Line stable.

Cast a roving eye over the game, and your first thought is going to be that it looks incredibly complex. E-Motion is played with multicoloured balls. When two dissimilarly-coloured balls are knocked together, a third ball of a third colour is generated.

Originally, the third ball starts off as a pod which gives you bonus energy if you can pick it up fast enough. However if you wait too long, it grows into a larger ball. Since the objective is to clear each level of all the balls, this is the last thing you need. To obliterate the balls, you need to knock



two similarly coloured balls together at which point they explode and disappear, leaving you to tackle the remainder.

To move the balls, you control a small ball with an arrow inside it to indicate your direction. Using a typical Oids-style movement, you use the keyboard or joystick to rotate the arrow and hit the thrust button to move forward. The real test of skill in E-Motion is to control this ball quickly and carefully. If you charge around the screen like a demented idiot, you can knock different coloured balls together and make the level almost impossible to complete.

The key to success is to watch your energy levels. Extra energy is picked up by runnning over a new ball before it has time to swell into a larger ball. If you for-

get about the larger balls they become unstable, wobble and then explode. This action wipes out massive amounts of your energy, so you have to stay on top of the game.

E-MOTION

According to the programming team, it is possible to play E-Motion from start to finish in just 17 minutes. But you'll be playing it for much longer than that, getting used to the complications of the different levels and mastering the odd bonus level.

The elements of originality, colourful graphics and playability fuse to make E-Motion one of US Gold's most exciting games to date. If you're not looking for a game with any depth. yet you are looking for it to be addictive, don't look any further than E-Motion.



ALL ADS UP?

If you get a chance, check out the advert from Commodore US in several of the leading American Amiga magazines. The ads consist of seven continuous colour pages, describing the Amiga's use by artists, teachers, musicians, geologists, and so on.

The overall image that the ads are attempting to portray is that the Amiga is a computer for the creative mind, not just a number crunching engine. Now if only Commodore UK would do likewise!

OPERATING BETTER?

Oh dear, Atari certainly does seem to be running into some stick over the release of the new 'Amiga beating' ST - the STE. As you will probably already be aware if you keep your eyes on the Express news pages, software title after software title has died a terrible death at the hands of Atari's new baby.

Even non games software such as First Word Plus has suffered as a result of Atari trying to up the ST standard.

This mess is, unfortunately, almost inevitable with machines as complex as the Amiga and ST. If computer manufacturers wish to keep their devices up to date, changes in both the hardware and operating system are neccessary.

To avoid problems, manufacturers lay down guidelines for software developers that document the 'legal' way of programming the machine. However, as always, many programmers feel held back by such guidelines and in order to create their 'magic', they carry out what could be best described as 'dirty' programming. Although the resultant program might work on the most current release of a particular machine, it is in no way guaranteed to work on any future releases of the same machine.

While Atari in particular has twice suffered from this (once with the release of TOS 1.09, and just recently with the STE and its TOS 1.6), the Amiga has also fallen foul on a number of occasions. With the original release of both 1.2 and 1.3 of the Amiga OS, several software developers were faced with the task of updating their software to make it work.

The Amiga's high level of expandability can also cause a lot of problems for programmers. Although a particular item of software may work on a 512K Amiga 500, it can often fall flat on its face when run on an Amiga equipped with such high-end boards as 68030 processor cards, 32-bit RAM and so on.

Once again, Commodore lays down guidelines to allow developers to produce software that will function without problems on any machine configuration.

Furthermore, the biggest test for Amiga software is yet to come. With the release of 1.4 of the Amiga operating system, you can bet that software will fall over in droves - 1.4 is such a radical change that if software does not follow the guidelines to the letter, it is almost certain to die a terrible death.

Who is to blame for such problems? The machine manufacturers? Most certainly not, as no company would deliberately produce a machine that is incompatible with existing machines, without good reason. If a manufacturer provides guidelines to avoid incompatibility problems, then only the programmers are to blame when software suddenly stops working.

The old argument about it often being neccessary to break a few rules to get that bit more out of the machine, does not really hold when you consider that there are many other programmers producing state-of-the-art products without breaking rules. The lesson for today is simple - stick to standards.

MEDIA SHOW

Multimedia is rapidly becoming one of the big growth areas within the computer industry. Companies such as IBM, Apple, Philips and even Commodore have started pushing their machines as the ideal base for any multimedia system. To further enhance the Amiga's position within this new market, Commodore US has announced the impending release of its very own multimedia toolkit.

The new system is a complete multimedia authoring environment that links all the elements of multimedia under the control of a completely icon-driven user interface. The system utilizes the Amiga's multi-tasking capabilities and advanced A-Rexx message passing to allow multimedia applications to be built up. Further, all this power is constructed upon a relational database that is compatible with the popular PC dBASE database management system.

Actually creating multimedia applications should be simplicity itself. By drawing an icon-based flowchart and then setting up each element within the flowchart using a powerful BASIC-like

programming language - like UltraCard's UltraTalk for example - one can design an application.

These multimedia applications will then be automatically turned into a standalone form, thereby allowing the creation of multimedia applications tailored to the needs of individual users. US sources close to Commodore view the system as

a major advancement in multimedia which will almost certainly help to put the Amiga on the multimedia map.

SAM EXCITEMENT

After an eternity spent bating breath, drooling with anticipation and performing other potentially friend-losing practices, I've finally seen, in all its white and blue brilliance, my first glimpse of Miles Gordon Technology's long-awaited Spectrum-compatible SAM Coupé computer!

The device in question was nestled among the coffee cups and old copies of Sunday Sport in the incredibly plush (ahem) interior of the Your Sinclair office which, as you should know by now, is the new contingent of Speccy insurgents at Future Publishing. Although this isn't the time or place for a review, I'm determined to let you have it with a few excited ramblings.

Amazingly, given its whereabouts, the SAM in question was untainted by stains and looked sleek and unsophisticated – in a friendly way. Basically, ignoring the ginormous powerpack that should be redesigned as soon as possible before some unfortunate punter mistakes it for the office block or something, the device is every bit a Speccy for the 1990s. On screen, things are even more aesthetically pleasing!

The only specific pieces of software available at the moment are the demo tape and Flash!, Bo Jangeborg's art package. However, on the strength of these alone, we're talking about visuals of ST standard and a far cry from the murky old monochrome we, as Spectrum owners, know and have endured. The sound effect potential looks promising as well, with the 'ringing telephone' noise on the demo tape sending countless people (well, OK then, one) grasping for the real phone.

All in all mine was a really encouraging first encounter, but, that said, I think we're going to have to wait for the first few independent Coupé software releases (like US Gold's *Strider*) before we can see what the machine is capable of and what kind of commercial support it can expect.

In the meantime, find out more by reading the five-page-review of the Coupé in the current issue of Your Sinclair, available now at all good newsagents.

ANOTHER ENIGMATIC PLUG

Enigma is the really rather good name for an equally excellent Speccy tapezine that's received its fare share of plugs in this column. In fact it's probably taken up a few other magazines' fair shares as well but, as one of the only Speccy-specific fanzines still dropping through my letter box at roughly regular intervals, each mention has been thoroughly deserved, I assure you.

Anyway, the latest issue (number five) has just reached me hot off the cassette recorder and provides another guaranteed dose of fun for all the family. Well, that is, fun for families of Spectrum fans anyway.

This time the contents have been crammed unceremoniously onto a C90 tape and include features on the Code-Masters CD Games Pack, Computer Shopper Show and, quite exclusively, the SAM Coupé. That's as well as the regular favourites of which the comprehensive reviews must be a firm one. Once you've found a few spare weeks to read all the text there's also a sound-to-picture program, border effect source code and 128K music demo to load up and be entertained by.

As usual, the whole thing is written with the kind of enthusiasm that's sadly lacking from a lot of glossy magazines. And the magnetic medium is made full use of, with some truly stunning special FX introducing each section and no fewer than eight different tunes to listen to when you're reading.

Reset the machine, insert your CP/M disk and type BASIC[RETURN], then, at the OK, insert a disk with the following listing saved on it and type RUN "SORT [RETURN]. Then follow the prompts as they come up.

A new file, a sorted version of TEMP, will be written to the disk. When you get back to LocoScript, create a new file and in it 'Insert text' ([f1] Loco 2, [f7] Loco 1) giving the sorted version of TEMP as the file to insert.

If you've never typed in a BASIC listing before, here's what to do. Reset the PCW, insert the CP/M disk and type BASIC (RETURN).

At the OK just type in each line you see above, ending with [RETURN]. If you make a mistake, type EDIT 50 or whatever the line number is and it reappears; edit it and finish with [RETURN].

Finally, you can save the listing to disk by typing SAVE "SORT[RETURN].

Sharon Lees, of London, is worried about her PCW which has taken to making some files consist entirely of uparrows. It sounds to me like a problem, not with the Red Indians, as Sharon suggests, but with the memory chips – possibly not a very serious one.

This sort of thing can happen with an 8256 which has had extra memory inserted, which I guess to be the case with yours. One of the plug-in chips might have worked loose and just needs pushing back.

Following the instructions you got with the memory upgrade, take the back off the machine and push the extra chips firmly into place if they're loose.

If the problem persists, ferry your machine to your friendly local computer shop, where the good folks will no doubt see to it for you.

A FEW WARES

Last week in this column I mentioned a piece of software called MSX, An Introduction, and that I expected a copy for reivew. Well, sure enough, one day later this and a program called Turf Form, a racing forecaster, arrived, courtesy of Capri Marketing.

When I opened the parcel I was surprised to find that MSX, An introduction was a tape plus a 160-plus page book on how to get the best from your MSX 1 computer. The package was produced by a company called Century Software and was originally priced at £12.99.

It seems that this item had been residing in a warehouse for some time and has only now seen the light of day. The book contains many listings, all designed to show off the power of MSX BASIC and, to save you the time of typing them in, they are all supplied on the enclosed cassette.

The book alone is very, very good, and, and when coupled with the enclosed tape and considering the price Capri Marketing is selling the package for (£4.99), I can't recommend this package enough. Indeed, I suggest you buy now, before Capri realises that it is almost giving the package away.

Further, Turf Form, the horse-racing forecaster by Blue Ribbon, is something slightly different from the usual software titles that pass my way. Most games and utilities cost you money, so it makes a change to see a piece of software that actually tries to help you make money.

Load in the tape and a series of prompts appear on the screen and, using information that can be found in most daily newspapers, the program assists you in selecting the race meeting that you are interested in, all the major courses being listed.

After inputting the number of horses in the race and their names (using the aforementioned data), *Turf Form* gives a speed rating for each horse and the figure that needs to be attained at that course for a horse to stand a chance.

The program is easy to use and even loads on my MSX 2 computer, which is more than can be said for many new titles. Given that the software is only £2.99 and should be seen as a way of having a bit of fun, not as a means of winning a fortune, then any racing fan will find *Turf Form* enjoyable.

If you think you are going to win a fortune using this title then how come the people who wrote it aren't millionaires? Well worth trying though. Both the above titles are available from Capri Marketing, 9 Dean Street, Marlow, Bucks. Telephone 0628 891101.

More to the point, the MSX version of Arkanoid is soon to be re-released on the Hit Squad label, at the budget price of £2.99. So, by the time you read this column, it should be available from your MSX software stockists.

CONSOLE CONFIRMED!

What brilliant news about the CPC! And if you don't know what I'm talking about, take 50 lashes and write 'I must read the news pages in Express before I do anything else' 500 times.

I refer, of course, to the shock news that Amstrad is not only going to launch a console, but that the 464 and 6128 are going to be upgraded as well.

I confess to having mixed feelings still about the console. After all, although the CPC is an excellent home micro, the technology is getting a little long in the tooth for a dedicated games console. It all depends on what hardware enhancements Amstrad make, of course, but the new console's main rival will be the well-established – and extremely proficient – Sega Master Console.

Prices being bandied about for the Amstrad offering are in the region of £100, whereas the Sega currently sells at £70. What Amstrad does have, however, is truly formidable marketing clout. If the CPC console is to be a success, Amstrad is the company to do it.

And the cartridges aren't going to be cheap, either. Prices are expected to be around £30, which will put the games on a par with those for the Sega. The sheer cost of manufacturing cartridges, I'm told, is the main reason for those prices, so I suppose we can't complain.

What I find really exciting, though, is the prospect of enhanced 464s and 6128s. The story is that both will take the new cartridges, which suggests that whatever hardware enhancements the console receives will be incorporated into the micro versions.

If that was not enough, even better is the prospect of new, super-huge games. The cartridges are expected to store in the region of 256-512K, and when you couple that with near-instant loading, well...

Steady on. Amstrad is saying nothing, of course, and we'll have to wait until September to judge the accuracy of all the speculation. One thing occurs to me straight away, though. Now we know why Amstrad only spent £600,000 promoting the CPC over Christmas...

NICE TO A FAULT?

Rainbow Islands almost never happened. Which, if you find its particular brand of cuteness borders on the nauseating, might be no bad thing.

Taito originally sold the Bubble Bobble sequel licence to Telecomsoft. Then Microprose bought Telecomsoft. Then Microprose thought 'let's go ahead with Rainbow Islands'.

Then Taito said it couldn't because the licence was sold specifically to Telecomsoft. Then... yes, well, to cut a long story short (OK, shorter) Ocean got hold of it, and *Rainbow Islands* has just hit the streets under the auspices of the Manchester mob.

So what's all the fuss about? Well Rainbow Islands is really nothing more than a platform collect'em-up, but it is, graphically anyway, quite excellent. The soundtrack is really good as well.

MORE MEDUSA

Some more information about the proposed Medusa QL clone has turned up, courtesy of the QView International Megacorporation - the people behind the Minerva QDOS replacement.

The processor will be either a standard 68008, as used in the original QL, the enhanced 68008FN (it can address up to 4Mb of memory) or the 32-bit 68020, with 512K bytes of 8/16-bit memory and up to 4Mb of 8/32-bit memory. The standard QL custom chips

Options are to include: a floppy disk interface; improved serial port; PC-compatible keyboard; parallel printer port; maths co-processor; and an SCSI harddisk interface.

The operating system will be standard QDOS, Minerva or QJump's new SMS2, that is being developed for the Atari ST's QL emulator.

PIRACY

OJump's latest newsletter has an interesting section about the various OL emulators that are now available, running on the Atari ST and the Amiga. The point is made that they are all illegal and some are more illegal than others, depending on the amount of pirated QJump software they incorporate. The Amiga emulator, for instance, contains QJump's floppy disk drivers.

These emulators could also be considered to infringe Amstrad's copyright, as Amstrad owns the rights to QDOS. However, it appears that Amstrad isn't interested in jumping on individuals who transfer QDOS from the QL to another machine for their own use. This confirms what I said about the Amiga emulator a few issues ago.

To get round any legal problems, QJump is working on a completely legitimate QDOS-compatible operating system called SMS2, for the Atari emulator and for the Medusa project mentioned above. An interim version of the SMS2 device drivers is now available for the Atari emulator, bundled with a new version of Toolkit 2. Contact QJump on 0954 50800 for more details.

Going on very slender evidence, Acorn's Archimedes is meeting, or exceeding, current sales targets. However, one market remains wholly indifferent to its charms, and that is business. Of course, MS-DOS has increased the machine's share of this much-sought after market, but the share still remains low. Strangely enough the Model B sold in the thousands to the business community.

This latter truth was brought home to me when I visited Cambridge. At Anglia college, where I was checking out the DTP facilities, the lecturer reminisced about how he could copy anything done by the college's dedicated typesetting terminals using his BBC at home.

What is more at Quantum Biosystems, a company involved at the sharp end of biotechnology, many BBCs were still in evidence when I visited. The machines were hooked up to measuring instruments. But remember, very strong inducements to buy were on offer in those days, including generous government grants and large discounts to corporate buyers.

Alas, no such inducements were on offer to the likes of you and me, so in the end sales dropped off as the competition closed in. In any case, Acorn made precious little out of the Model B by the time the BBC slice had been extracted.

Furthermore, for all ardent users of the Wordwise Plus programming language, an excellent - if probably out-ofprint - book is Using Worldwise Plus by Paul Beverley. This volume is packed with useful segment programs, but I really don't know where you could acquire a copy.

IN THE WORDS

I must admit to a few giggles when I saw the following job advertisement: "The leading magazine for all users of Acorn computers requires a new editor to continue its successful eighty year history." I think I hear the sound of gunfire over at Redwood Publishing, home of Acorn User magazine.

Back to prosaic matters - and I see that lan Copestake, publisher of Wordpower, has brought out some new printer drivers for Pipedream 3. And on the BBC front, you can now pick up 7 Star LC-10 dot-matrix typefaces for the sum of just £32.

As a brief explanation, a typeface, as opposed to an actual font, is considered to be a single style of one font. For example, Roman Italic and Dutch Italic are single typefaces of the fonts Roman and Dutch respectively.

The distinction may appear trivial at first sight, but when you start describing fonts stored as outlines, such as those provided with PostScript laser printers, then it is crucial. Dot-matrix printers blur the line by their ability to manipulate text in specific ways - so creative possibilities remain wide, although the fonts are few in number. PLAYING WITH WORDS

Since telling you about the SuperScript word processor I've had many letters from 8-bitters wondering just which of the commercially-available word processors is the best.

Probably the most well known of the packages is AtariWriter from Atari. Originally available in cartridge form, the program became popular enough to warrant an updated version to be released, known - not surprisingly - as AtariWriter II.

This updated version features address book and mail merge, 80-column editing (via a 'window' on the document) and spell checking - and it is a comprehensive and easy to use program!

Further, Paperclip was the last, and best, in a long line of 8-bit word processors to be released. Streamlined and powerful, the program offered a number of unique features. Indeed, multi column editing made this word processor the first choice for newsletter and fanzine writers everywhere, and the ability to hold and display two documents at once in seperate windows on screen and edit between them at will was way aheadof the competition.

Paperclip is the most powerful, but it is exceedingly difficult to get hold of and unless you can find a copy second-hand, you probably won't get it.

That said, AtariWriter is still fairly widely available (mail-order), is cheap (under £20) and powerful and it should be your first choice.

ARCHIMEDES

FOLDED 3D

expLAN is a Devon-based company whose current Arc product, the ARCOL design package, is highly regarded in those secondary schools lucky enough to have Arcs. The company's new product is even more innovative, though, as it takes the idea of 3D modelling (now part of the National Curriculum) and turns it into cardboard.

TABS, currently in an advanced stage of development, enables the drawing of most types of model in full 3D shaded views, but with the big bonus of automatically 'unfolding' the object on screen. A multi-window interface, which will be fully RISCOS compatible, shows several views of the object at once, including the flattened one. Once complete, the model can be printed onto card using an A3 plotter or laser printer and assembled.

Files from TABS can also be loaded into ARCOLor Euclid for colour printing or further design work. All expLAN's products can be fully networked, meaning that many students can work on a larger project and combine their resources towards a common goal.

TABS is expected to cost around £100 in single-user version and £250ish for a site licence. It should be available in May, and expLAN can be contacted on 0822 613868.

FORMATTING 360K

If you have an old BBC switchable drive attached to your Arc to run a PC emula-

tor, you may well want to format 360K disks on the 5.25-inch drive. As things stand, any external drive connected to the Arc will be seen by MS-DOS as a 720K 3.5-inch unit. This is fine if you're after high capacity on your 5.25-inch, but the format is non-standard and you won't be able to read the disk easily on a 'real' PC.

To change the drive to a more standard 360K capacity, you have to tell the operating system about it. This changing can only be done when you start up the system, and make use of the CONFIG.SYS file. This system file is automatically read by MS-DOS at start up and normally contains set-up information.

The default file supplied with the Acorn emulator contains the two line files = 20 and buffers = 10. These commands define the memory allocated to file details and the space for buffering information to and from disk. You can increase either for a slightly faster access, but at the expense of memory.

To tell MS-DOS about your 5.25-inch drive, you add the command dri /d:1 /f:0 /h:2 /s:9 /t:40. A lot of abbreviations, but each one tells the system some detail of the drive's configuration - d, for example, is the drive

Confusingly, drives are numbered rather than lettered, using 0 for A:, 1 for B: etc. f is the format number, which is 0 for 360K drives, 1 for 1.2 Mb and 2 for 720K, among others. h is the number of heads; 1 for a single sided drive

and 2 for a double, s is the number of sectors per track, which is 9 for both 360K and 720K drives, t is the number of tracks: 40 for 360K and 80 for 720K.

You'll need to use a text editor or word processor to edit the CONFIG.SYS file, and EDLIN will do the job if you have nothing else. You can use 48 TPI doublesided disks for the 360K format, but you'll need 96TPI for 720K work.



To those of use used to the price of fonts on other machines, this kind of pricing structure seems heaven-sent. If you think of the work involved in defining the curves that form a character, let alone a whole set of them, you start to wonder how they can do it.

Try not to ask for your disk back and if you must have it back than be sure to send a prepaid envelope with it. If you want to find out how your work was received then just make a polite call asking if the disk got there okay.

And most of all make sure we can read your hand-writing, a little time on preparing your work could mean the difference between you having the job or not.

If you follow these simple rules then you will find your application a lot more successful with ourselves and probably other companies as well.



STATE MAKE AND MODEL OF COMPUTER

WHY NOT CALL IN AND SEE US

o far this series has looked mainly at the hardware which makes up a PC system. This is only part of the whole story. One of the old saws of the data processing industry is that any computer system consists of four things: hardware, software, data and people. You provide the last two, but the first two must be bought.

Without software, a computer is a very boring machine. It sits there, whirs and costs money. It is software which translates the computer's inherent ability to do fast sums into the more interesting ability to do something useful. People buy computers because they want to do something better than they currently do it, or because they want to do something which they can't do without a computer.

Software is the element which allows them to do this.

The sections of this series which have dealt with hardware have stressed the importance of standards. It is the high degree of standardisation within the IBM-compatible world which has led to the IBM PC's pre-eminence. This is as true with software as it is with hardware. Hardware compati-

bility means I can plug my printer into your PC. Software compatibility allows you to use the data I have created on my PC, or for you to use one program because it has elements in common with another. In day-to-day use, this is the most useful feature the PC offers.

GPERATING SYSTEMS

The operating system is the interface between the computer's hardware and the application program (the software which actually does something useful). As far as the IBM-compatible PC is concerned, there is one standard operating system – MS-DOS (short for Microsoft Disk Operating System). Others have tried and failed (such as DOS Plus and CPM/86) and others may yet usurp MS-DOS (like OS/2 or Unix) but as things stand. MS-DOS is the standard.

Nearly all PC software assumes you have MS-DOS. If you haven't, make sure your operating system (Digital Research's DR-DOS, say) promises total compatibility with the original.

APPLICATIONS SOFTWARE

This is the software which actually does comprehensible things. It turns your machine into a useful tool rather than a technological toy. The functions an application program can provide are conventionally split into certain key categories. The edges between these categories are becoming somewhat blurred, but they do describe the functional differences quite clearly.

 The software you run on your PC is what makes it useful, so choosing the right product is vital.

WORD PROCESSING

This is probably the single most popular PC application. In simple terms, a word processor is a tool for writing things – an improved version of a typewriter. Unlike a typewriter, a word processor allows you to change a document before committing it to paper: it represents the kiss of death to re-drafting and Tippex.

Modern word processors usually include a spelling checker. This is a program-within-a-program which tells you whether you have mis-spelled a word. Make sure your software includes a UK English (rather than US English) spelling checker, otherwise your colours may end up as colors. The thesaurus is an even more recent innovation, offering synonyms for words when you cannot think of exactly the right word. If a word processor says it has a '50,000-word dictionary' this does not usually mean that it can replace the *Chambers' 20th Century* – definitions are not, as a rule, included – only spellings.

Since the late 1970s, WordStar has been the de facto standard for word processors. Although it is hideously old-fashioned in many ways, WordStar (or one of its clones) is to be found on very many PCs. If your word processor can produce WordStar-format files it is an advantage. Otherwise, the ability both to import and export plain ASCII (see separate panel) is essential.

Other standards which are commonly supported include WordPerfect, DisplayWrite (often referred to as RFT or IBM DCA/DIA) and Microsoft Word. The ability to create or understand files created in these formats can be an advantage in any word processor if you want to exchange disks with other PC users.

If you buy a non-standard word processor do not despair. The *Word for Word* program is available and translates just about anything into anything else.

DATABASES

The database is the electronic equivalent of a card index. Its big advantage is that it allows you to sort your records in any number of ways – so a card index may be arranged alphabetically and is fixed that way, but a PC database can be rearranged in date order within a few seconds.

The two main types of PC database are the 'flat file' and the 'relational'. Flat file databases really are very like manual filing systems. Relational databases, on the other hand, allow links to be set up between different files, allowing all sorts of complex data to be analysed in many ways. Relational databases are more powerful but tend to be harder to use.

There is only one real standard in databases: Ashton-Tate's *dBase*, based on that company's massive (and massively expensive) relational database. Also known as .DBF files (from their MS-DOS filenames), *dBase* files can be created and read by most serious databases. The next level down is the ever-present ASCII (see panel).

SPREADSHEETS

The spreadsheet was the product which really made the home micro. Essentially a grid of 'cells' made up of interconnecting rows and columns (like an old-fashioned ledger book), each of which can hold text, numbers or 'formulae', the spreadsheet is used mainly for calculation. When a spreadsheet is described as handling 'worksheets' up to 1,000 x 256 this refers to the maximum number of rows and columns it can have. The ability to change one figure and let the computer make a whole series of calculations makes the spreadsheet invaluable for 'what if' calculations.

The PC spreadsheet standard is Lotus 1-2-3. If you want to be able to exchange spreadsheet data with other users, your spreadsheet must support 1-2-3-type files (known as .WKS or .WK1 files).

WINDOWS AND GEM

One way out of the mish-mash of PC standards (1-2-3 not being compatible with dBase or WordStar, for example) is to use a standard user interface. This offers common file formats and keystrokes between all types of application, with programmers writing not to MS-DOS but to a 'higher-level' interface which sits between the operating system and the application.

The first such to achieve any success was Digital Research's GEM (Graphical Environment Manager). This provided a 'friendly' interface based on pictures - icons - and the use of a mouse. Its heyday was a couple of years ago when it was provided free with the Amstrad PC1512 and PC1640. Responding to the vast sales of these machines, many software developers wrote lowcost programs which used GEM, targeted directly at the Amstrad users. Very few up-market programs chose GEM as an interface, with Xerox's Ventura Publisher being the striking exception. GEM has now had its day, as a result of insufficient development from DR, and very few

The young pretender is Microsoft's Windows. This also provides a common interface but is supported by many leading software houses (including Microsoft itself). Now, major word processors (Word for Windows and Ami), spreadsheets (Excel), databases (Formbase) and other products (PageMaker and a

host of others) are available for Windows.

It looks as though the future of MS-DOS lies with Windows, as more and more programs come out for it, and it seems safe to say that a Windows application will prove a sound medium-to-long term investment – if you learn one Windows application, most others will be easy to get to grips with.

GRAPHICS

Many spreadsheet programs can plot the numeric data they hold as graphs and charts. Graphics programs are specialists in that area. Many are also able to produce pretty text for titles and the like. The most commonly accepted standard for business graphics programs is *Harvard Business Graphics*.

The most important element of any graphics program, however, is its ability to produce files in a format which can be understood by other programs such as desktop publishing systems. The most common formats are .PIC, .PCX and TIFF. Look for these.

The same formats are produced by drawing and painting programs such as Paintbox, Corel Draw and

ASCII

At the most basic level, the PC stores its information in a format known as ASCII (American Standard Code for Information Interchange). If your program can import and export 'raw' ASCII, you should be able to communicate with most PC programs in some way or another. This is not a very sophisticated way of getting files in and out of software – italics and bold will be lost from word processing files, for example – but it is pretty universal.

Deluxe Paint II. These are programs for artists which allow the PC to be used like a pencil or a palette of paints for producing pictures.

DESKTOP PUBLISHING

The two grand-daddies of desktop publishing (DTP) are *Ventura Publisher* and *PageMaker*. These are programs creating professional-quality publications on the PC, replacing the traditional disciplines of typesetting and page layout with cut-and-paste technology. *Express* is produced using DTP.

When buying a DTP program the standard to aim for will depend on the nature of the final output file. The industry standard is PostScript, which can allow your PC to produce information understandable to commercial typesetting equipment so you can use typesetting bureaux. PostScript printers are pricey and typesetters cost the Earth, but *Freedom of the Press* allow PostScript output to be produced on a standard dotmatrix printer.

COMPUTER AIDED DESIGN

Computer-aided design (CAD) is the generic term used to describe the use of a computer to replace the draughtsman's drawing-board. The standard CAD package is the hugely powerful (and expensive)

BEST OF THE CHEAPIES

Shareware also offers the pick of the budget databases with PC File. Now on version 4 which replaces the

earlier PC-File Plus and PC-File: dB, this is a powerful flat-file database that includes compatibility with dBASE files.

The top mid-range DTP is Timeworks Publisher with Newsmaster taking the laurels at the very bottom end.

Microsoft Works is not too expensive for an integrated package, but the real bargain in this area is The Secretary Bird for £39.95.

If you have Windows, don't forget it comes with a perfectly presentable little word processor in Windows Write and a handy sketching utility in Windows Draw.



SPECIALIST APPLICATIONS


Most of the best-known categories of PC software are relevant to the majority of PC users. There are also applications for specialised jobs, ranging from accountants to hairdressers. The biggest area is accountancy, and here the standard suite of programs is the range from Sage, which offers a lot of function combined with a fierce pricing strategy. At the very top of the market, Pegasus reigns supreme.

Whatever you buy, the message remains the same - make sure your application can work with your







The PC was not designed as a games machine, and will never come close to the Amiga and ST in that category. Indeed it is only recently that the PC has stepped out of the shadow of the 8-bit machines and begun to be a creditable entertainment engine.

A major problem with PC gaming is the hardware it needs.

Colour is essential for gamers; a Hercules board will restrict you to text adventures forget software CGA emulators, they are just not up to the job. CGA graphics are OK for games, but pity the user who wants to do serious work as well. So you are looking at EGA or VGA graphics with the accompanying expensive monitor. Add to that a games board so you can fit a joystick, and the £25-£30 per game, and PC gaming becomes a very expensive hobby.

Before you buy a game, make sure it will run on your system. The hardware requirements in terms of memory, graphics and add-on boards are normally clearly stated on the pack.





IT'S THE BLACKINTOSH

Some 16 months after its launch in the States, Steve Jobs' long-awaited NeXT machine has finally hit our shores. Andy Storer previews the matt black beauty...

escribed by its mentor as a 'university on the desktop' and 'a partner in thought', the NeXT certainly looks like it packs a solid punch. Beneath its highly-stylised exterior lies the desktop status symbol of the Nineties - a personal workstation running a multi-user version of Unix with a graphical interface called NextStep.

Workstations are the fastest growing sector in the computer market. With sales set to quadruple to around £5 billion in Europe alone in the next four years, former Apple founder Jobs clearly wants a piece of the action. With NeXT pitched at around £7,000, it has the both the power and price-point to take on the likes of Sun, DEC and Hewlett-Packard in the big league. Whether NeXT has the clout to attract the major software developers is less clear - Microsoft has already declared the machine a no-go area since it's a direct threat to OS/2. But whatever the machine's future in a blossoming but wary marketplace, its position as a pointer to a new generation of hardware performance is unquestioned.

The base-level configuration consists of a 15-inchhigh black cube containing three 32-bit processors, 8Mb of RAM expandable to 16Mb and a 256Mb rewriteable optical drive. Along with a keyboard, mouse and optional 400DPI laser printer, a free-standing 17-inch high-resolution monochrome monitor completes the picture. So there's no colour supported, no built-in floppy drive and no fast 68040 chip to be seen. Yet. Instead, the one million pixel 'Mega Pixel' display offers extremely good depth and clarity, data can be imported via an Ethernet port and the 32-bit Motorolas hurry along at a respectable 25MHz.

NeXT POWER

Jobs also describes his baby as 'a mainframe on two chips' - a not unreasonable claim since the architecture employed doesn't follow the traditional form of requiring the central processor to manage every task it's called to attend. With mainframes, a host of separate input/output processors each have a direct channel to memory.

So, the NeXT machine has utilised very large scale integration (VLSI) to shrink mainframe architecture onto two chips. One contains 12 input/output processors, the other the circuitry to manage the mass storage. These two custom chips sit on a 11-inch board along with the three 25MHz Motorola chips a 68030 central processing unit, a 68882 floating point unit and, for the first time on a desktop computer, a 56001 full 32-bit chip dedicated to the digital signal processing of CD-quality sound.

Display and printer ports open up the machine to the outside world, along with a Mac-compatible SCSI port for hard-disks and scanners, a couple of Mac-compatible RS422 serial ports for disk drives, and a full 32-bit Ethernet port.

NeXT SYSTEM

A Mach Unix kernel, compatible with Unix 4.3, has been chosen as the operating system to best accommodate the dual demands of networking and multitasking, which are seen as the essential requirements of the modern computer user. But Unix is also pretty well known as being the most demanding system for

users. NeXT's answer is to provide a graphical interface that places Unix's technical obscurity firmly in the

Although a command-line window remains as an option, the interface is essentially a WIMPS environment with all Unix commands accessible through a mouse. The multiple window set-up allows separate applications to run simultaneously in view. Commonly used applications can be consigned to a icon strip known as the 'dock' which remains in view throughout the proceedings. A user can launch or transfer to another application simply by clicking on its ever-pre-

sent icon. The beloved wastebasket has also been updated - it's now a black hole!


NeXT STORAGE

The 3,000 revolutions per minute, rewriteable optical disk drive fitted as standard runs 256Mb removable disks, and as such presents a vision of computing in the future. Gone will be the days of shelves of disks - here

you have just one disk that's likely to hold everything you're ever likely to need. Although NeXT is the first computer to come with an eraseable optical drive built-in, there's still the option of fitting a conventional hard-drive, thus

allowing even greater internal storage of up to one gigabyte.

Obviously these kinds of storage capabilities open up exciting avenues for use. Here the digital signal processor, capable of full 16-bit stereo sampling at 44.1MHz, comes to the fore. High-quality but diskintensive sound samples present no problem. For a start, networked electronic mail or fax could be replaced by voice messaging, documents could be voice-annotated, or database material complemented with ambient sound and special effects. Also, by building the DSP chip into the machine's basic architecture. the way is open for speech recognition software.



Next Applications

Bundled with every machine is *Digital Library*. This suite of software comprises *Webster's Dictionary* and *Thesaurus*, the *Oxford Dictionary of Quotations* and the complete works of that guy who used to live in Stratford. All these are contained on a single optical disk and linked by the cataloging and searching software known as the *Digital Librarian*. This 'agent' also allows you to create your own books by pulling data from other sources and cross-referencing the material via hypertext routines.

Applications bundled with NeXT include the Write Now word-processor, the Sybase SQL database, and C and Lisp languages. In the pipeline are Informix's graphic spreadsheet Wingz, Media Logic's Artisan graphics program, and perhaps most importantly, Cayman Systems' GatorBox — a gateway to link the NeXT to the Mac and vice versa — and DaynaFILE — an external disk drive that can read/write to Unix, IBM and Mac disks. In addition, Ashton-Tate is lining up dBase, Lotus its 1-2-3 and Aldus its PageMaker.

NeXT OUTPUT

The flat screen, 17-inch monitor refreshes at 68Hz and displays 1120 x 832 pixels – which translated to 92 dots per inch. Black, white and two levels of grey are supported, making the resulting images reminiscent of high-quality etchings. The 400DPI laser printer knocks out eight pages per minute and comes with a software-selectable draft mode – 300DPI – the current industry high-resolution standard!

But the real innovation is in the incorporation of Display PostScript. The PostScript language is used by the best laser printers to generate their output, but the computers that drive them do not. What Jobs and his team have done is to put the screen's display in PostScript form, so that what a user sees on the monitor is a more accurate representation of the subsequent print-out.

The difference between a screen display of 92DPI and printer output of 400DPI remains a gulf, but it's better than the standard screen display of a Mac at 72DPI. The NeXT deals with the PostScript language itself, making the printer considerably cheaper than rival models.

NeXT BEST?


There's no denying that the NeXT incorporates some excellent future-proof features. It's also making sure it's firmly geared to the present by bringing in Macintosh and MS-DOS compatibility. But over and above the radical architecture, the graphical Unix front-end and the Display PostScript screen, lies the real key to the system's guaranteed success. The presence of mass storage, networking and multi-tasking combine to position the machine as a powerful self-contained unit that can draw on its innovations to present power-users with a low-cost, high-specification workstation.

Anyone who's used a Mac, or a PC running under Windows, will feel instantly at home – it has all the common features you expect from a friendly interface with all the dream benefits from true multi-tasking and massive storage. With colour capability, NeXT would be an instant hit in the graphics workstation league. In the meantime, it may have to remain content with being taken up by the Unix aficionados of academia rather than the MS-DOS corporates.

Clearly, the quality of the marketing drive estab-

lished by the machine's distributors over here, Businessland, will count for a great deal. But simply on the level of computing style it's leagues ahead – and in the MD's office a certain style goes a lot further than mere functionality.

In the long run though it will be down to Steve Jobs convincing the major league software developers to get behind the machine. He pulled it off with Microsoft in getting the Mac off the ground. This time though, Microsoft's Bill Gates isn't about to play ball. Let's hope someone does — it's a machine that deserves to succeed.





ere is now a commonly-held belief among scientists that there may be as many as 10 dimensions of space, but for most of us the good old-fashioned three is quite enough to be going on with.

Artists who want to make an image of the threedimensional world around us have practised two basic methods for thousands of years: they can either draw or paint a flat representation - a picture - or they can mould a three-dimensional, solid one - a model or sculpture. Sadly, the scientific advances that brought us photography, moving pictures, television and finally computers have failed to produce a credible threedimensional imaging system. It's a choice between holograms or the plain old flat screen.

The motivation of 'realism' is a strong one in computing. So far, a number of very complex mathematical tricks have managed to produce imitations of 3D represented on a flat screen - vector graphics, filled 3D, ray-tracing. Around the world, scientists are beavering away to produce the holographic television displays dreamt of by sci-fi fans. Sooner or later they will succeed, and when they do computer displays will be transformed. But until they do, we have to be content with cheating.

TRICK OF THE LIGHT

The tradition of cheating is a long one, almost as old as photography itself. Back in Victorian times, an age that constantly marvelled at science, the stereoscopic camera was quite a hit. Effectively two cameras bolted together side by side, this gadget produced two almost-identical images of, for example, popular tourist sights. These images could then be put into a binocu-

lar-like viewer, one image for each eye, and since they were slightly offset in exactly the same way our eyes are, a reasonable impression of depth was produced.

The post-war film industry looked to revive its fortunes by wowing audiences with technology and many attempts at 3D movies were made. Generally these were of the most primitive form: black-and white film was shot with two slightly off-set cameras, one version coloured red and the other green, and the one colour was superimposed over the othe. Movie-goers were given glasses, one lens coloured red, the other green. The green lens filtered out the red picture and the red lens filtered out the green, leaving the viewer with the impression of an image for each eye, one slightly offset from the other.

The fairly unimpressive 3D effect that resulted was used to spice up third-rate horror movies, usually by lobbing knives, spiders or other projectiles 'out' of the screen 'towards' the audience. The experiment has been revived many times, most notably for some experimental programming by ITV in the mid-Eighties, when cardboard-and-plastic red-green specs were given away on the cover of the TV Times.

Perhaps the last wave of bespectacled cinema trickery came in the early Eighties, when Jaws 3D made quite an impact on audiences. Rather than using a colour split, this film divided its stereo images with polarised light. Usefully, if you pass light through a polarising lens it will not pass through another polarising lens which has been turned on its side. Jaws 3D viewers were given glasses with one vertical lens and one horizontal and the image projected on screen was composed of two similar polarised images: so again, each eye had its own image and a stereoscopic 3D effect was produced.

TRICKS OF THE TRADE

The computing trade has not forgotten the tricks of its predecessors. Most basic of these is the colour-split, but this has always been a bit of a gimmick. In March 1989 software house Elite produced a bizarre game called Wanderer which, apart from a strange plot involving an interplanetary game of poker in which the stakes were cats, boasted a colour-split 3D effect. Two images, one red and one blue, were slightly offset on screen and a pair of red-blue glasses were supplied. Frankly, the 3D effect was almost worthless and did nothing to make this a memorable game.

In the arcades, meanwhile, a racing game called Continental Circus was trying to make a splash with a different approach to 3D. Bolted to the front of the machine was a large pair of glasses through which the punters peered while attempting to steer a racing car round a circuit. These big shades were an example of the most successful form of stereoscopic vision to date, a form in which Sega has put its faith.

BIG SHADES

The 8-bit Sega Master System has tended to set the pace for the home arcade. Among its many plug-in extras are the 3D glasses, which follow the most modern pattern. Each lens is an LCD crystal which darkens when electricity passes through it.

Again, the aim is to produce an image for each eye, so the signal which is displayed on the screen is split into two, one slightly offset from the other. Every fiftieth of a second the image on screen is replaced with a new one: but with a 3D game, the two off-set images actually take it in turns to be displayed. Without the shades it's a flickering mess: but the LCD shutters in the glasses blind first the right eye and then the left in synchrony with the display, so each eye sees only its own image.

The stereoscopic effect isn't bad and many of the most popular arcade games benefit from enhanced versions: the likes of Zaxxon 3D, Space Harrier 3D and Out Run 3D.

AND MORE BIG SHADES

Whether the 3D craze will continue in the console world is as yet a matter of speculation, but meanwhile big specs are becoming de rigueur with the big boys of the 16-bit world. Tales of LCD flicker-shades for the Atari ST may seem to be apocryphal, but they have been seen in use with Antic's Cyber Studio - more information may be gleaned from Electric Distribution on 0480 496789.

For the Amiga, the recent arrival of X-Specs from the States (supplied in this country by Third Coast on 0257 472444) has made some serious inroads into the potential of 3D-representational displays. Not only do these flicker-shades come with a cracking-good 3D shoot-'em-up game and some impressive demo pictures, they are also compatible with several top graphics programs, most notably DigiPaint 3, C-Light, Page Render 3D and Turbo Silver.

Top games houses are rumoured to be considering crafting games around this 3D system, and American manufacturers Haitex claim the specs are already in professional use for serious 3D imaging purposes ranging from anatomy and architecture to space flight. Is this as far as 3D specs technology can go? Only time will tell...

THE 3D FUTURE

With advances in technology producing smaller and smaller video displays, the logical next step is to stop cheating the eyes into thinking you have two displays and instead to actually give each eye its own monitor. Such a pair of dual-monitor glasses could provide a very convincing stereoscopic image, and work is already in progress America to make a viable production version. If this can be done, dual-

monitor shades may be the first step towards the cyberspace dream as portrayed in the film Tron. Data structures within the computer could be displayed in an imitation of 3D space that only the wearer of the shades would be aware of. The user might navigate around the cyberspace using an advanced form of joystick - a large glove inside which laser beams would pick up movements of the hand.

The stuff of dreams, perhaps, but the technology is there and the application of it is being worked out even at this moment. The key words for the future are 'virtual reality'.

Until computer displays can bypass the human eye altogether, and send visual input directly into the brain, the most convincing prospect for a glimpse into a computercreated world remains a big pair of shades.



Amiga owners have got a great deal to thank NewTek for. Not only was it one of the first developers to jump on the Amiga bandwagon when the machine was first released way back in 1985, but it has stuck with the machine through years in which many others have left the machine in search of more profitable markets. Such devotion deserves acclaim, and NewTek certainly achieved it with their first ever Amiga product, the Digi-View video digitiser.

Although release 4 of Digi-View is new, Digi-View is almost as old as the Amiga itself. Indeed, many of the images grabbed using those early Digi-View units helped sell more Amigas than any advertising campaign Commodore ever came up with. Such is the popularity of NewTek's product, that the company itself claims that Digi-View is not only the top-selling Amiga


peripheral of all time, but is also the best-selling digitiser of all time on any machine.

With a build up such as this, you're probably expecting the Digi-View hardware to be something pretty awesome. Where looks are concerned, this couldn't be further from the truth. The Digi-View unit consists of a small black box, not much bigger than the average cigarette packet, that plugs directly into the parallel port on an Amiga 500 or 2000 (1000 users will require a gender changer). Sticking out of unit is a single phono connector for feeding in a video signal. Apart from this single connector, that is all the Digi-View hardware is – there are no extra little knobs or sliders, just a single phono connector. How could such an innocent-looking gadget be such a competition killer? The secret's in the software.

SOFTLY DOES IT

Digi-View 4 is a software-based upgrade, therefore both new and existing users can benefit from its impressive capabilities. For £150, new users get both the Digi-View hardware and software, but existing users can upgrade to this latest release for just £25. Purchasers of the complete Digi-View system have the added advantage of a free copy of NewTek's excellent HAM paint system, *Digi-Paint*.

Digi-View 4's main claim to fame is NewTek's new

'Dynamic' display system. As well as the usual supported screen modes, this new system provides two new digitising methods – Dynamic HAM and most exiting of all, Dynamic Hi-Res.

Dynamic Hi-Res provides something that has never been seen before – 4,096 colours on screen at the same time in high resolution. This feat is achieved by using the Amiga's Copper co-processor chip to change the values contained within the Amiga hardware colour registers on every scan line. While only 16 colours can be displayed on a single line (which is the limit for high-resolution displays), the overall effect is breathtaking – easily the best images ever seen on an Amiga screen. If you don't believe me, just take a look at the picture accompanying this review and I'm sure your doubts will soon disappear!

Dynamic HAM is very similar to Dynamic Hi-Res, and allows the almost complete elimination of the problems usually associated with hold-and-modify displays.

Grabbing a Dynamic image is a slow process that can take up to 10 minutes before anything resembling the image you require is actually produced – but thanks to multi-tasking, you can carry on using your machine while Digi-View gets on with the complex task of assembling your image.

Unfortunately for 512K Amiga owners, all the extra goodies that Digi-View offers are unavailable unless you've got at least a megabyte of RAM – and at least 2Mb are needed if you wish to grab images in Dynamic Hi-Res mode.

DIGITAL DREAM

Recommended input to Digi-View takes the form of a monochrome composite video signal from a mono video camera such as those produced by Hitachi and Panasonic. Although a colour signal can be used, the results are far less impressive. If you're not the owner of a video camera, but wish to use Digi-View in con-

junction with a video recorder, the video must be paused every time you wish to digitise an image. However, for best results a mono video camera is most definitely recommended.

As mentioned previously, Digi-View does not operate in real time. According to NewTek, the reason for not converting to real time is because Digi-View uses a more accurate successive-approximation type converter in conjunction with a low-noise sample-and-hold amplifier — anyone understand a word of that? Although this system is considerably slower than the four-bit flash converters used by most of the competition, it allows Digi-View to produce sharper images and provide increased control over the picture's attributes.


Because Digi-View is not a true colour digitiser such as Marcam's Frame Grabber and JCL's SuperPic, colour images are grabbed using the now-familiar system of colour filters. For a colour image to be digitised, Digi-View must scan the source image three times using red, green and blue filters (which are provided). Once all three 'separations' are grabbed, Digi-View then combines these into the resulting image.

CONCLUSION

If your Amiga is equipped with enough memory to handle the new screen modes, the results that are obtainable are quite simply astounding. Even in low resolution, the definition of grabs is top notch — in high resolution you will be amazed by the quality.

The only real problem with Digi-View 4 is the amount of hardware required to get the most from it. For starters, you will need at least 2Mb if you wish to use all screen modes. To actually start grabbing anything decent you will also need a mono video camera.

The combination of complete support for all Amiga screen modes, powerful support software and a free copy of *Digi-Paint* makes Digi-View 4 excellent value for money. Highly recommended. ■

■HELP! Disk drive dilemma as the ST crashes

I am writing for advice on a problem that I have with my Atari 520STFM and 0.5Mb disk drive. I purchased an ST about a year and a half ago which worked fine for a couple of months, then went wrong. The only manifestation of this was that the game Dungeon Master would not work. I returned the machine to Dixons who replaced my machine with a brand new one (after ascertaining that the drive was not the problem).

A few months ago, just as the machine's guarantee had expired, the same fault reappeared. Again Dungeon Master would not work, but also Populous would not work and Virus was a bit dubious. It seems that the problem is bound up in the protection methods of these programs. The problem cannot be the drive itself, but could it be the controller?

A great deal of other software works fine on my machine. Can you tell me how I can find out the exact nature of the problem? How can I get

it fixed cheaply? I am toying with the idea of upgrading so I do not want to spend a great deal of money fixing the problem.

I am reluctant to agree with you that the problem lies with the protection methods employed by some software houses. Although that can be a big source of 'compatibility' problems when different specification disk drives are used by Atari, the symptoms show themselves immediately and do not go away. If the drive cannot read the extra track or two required by the protection mechanism then this will be apparent at once.

So just what is the problem? Do you store disk close to some radiation source such as television, telephone or large and prized collection of magnets? If so, then the disks could be corrupted. Do

monitor and you have you recently re-positioned it? The SM124/125 is a notorious source of radiation emissions and can quite seriously affect the operation of disk drives (I realise that you don't use the monitor with games, but you may have it switched on at the same time as a colour display). Ensure that the mono monitor is at least six inches away from the disk drive

Is your ST in a position where it's likely to knocked? It may recently have suffered a bump which could have knocked the drive out of alignment. It would still work with non-extra track protected games but fail with Dungeon Master and the like. To determine whether this latter reason is the source of the problem, take your ST along to a service centre such as Silica Shop in the Tottenham Court Road.

If none of the above prove to be the fault, then maybe it is time to upgrade.

■HELP! Press problems

I have been successfully using the Stop Press desktop publishing package on my CPC6128 with a DMP2000 printer, but have recently upgraded to a Panasonic KXP1124 printer. However when printing out on the Panasonic, I find that an A4 page is elongated to approximately a quarter more than the true length (the width remains correct). What is the cause and can you suggest a solution?

Simple! You're using the wrong printer driver. In order that an application such as a DTP package can send the correct codes to your printer to get it to perform text and graphics functions, an intermediate program (essentially a table) is needed which contains all the codes necessary for the actions you want to perform. Use the wrong printer driver and you get oddly-shaped printouts, strange characters and so on.

It's unlikely that you have access to a driver that directly supports the Panasonic, so you should choose a printer driver that will work with an Epson 24-pin device. This should result in a true representation of what you have created using the program.

Do I need a hard disk drive, two floppy drives or will the built-in disk drive be enough? Do I need to have a laser printer and what do you think of the Atari laser printer?

Finally, can you recommend a good ST-specific desktop publishing book that doesn't assume any knowledge on the part of the reader?

I wouldn't dream of telling you not to buy an Atari machine. The latest version of the ST, the STE, is a powerful and fast tool ideal for desktop publishing at home. Obviously, the more memory your ST has the larger the documents you can create using a DTP program. It follows then, that you should buy the 1040STE if you can afford it. Don't worry if you're limited to the 520 however, it's possible to upgrade the memory of the machine to a full 1Mb at a later stage.

Which software package? It sounds as though you intend to create some fairly expansive publications, and although *Timeworks* is exceptionally popular, easy to use and has many features, *Calamus* is the definitive desktop publishing solution for the ST at the moment. The program has some unique – for ST DTP packages – features such as text rotation, drawing tools and many more. Unfortunately, *Calamus* only runs on STs with at least a megabyte of RAM, so if you're limited to a 520STE, you'll have to buy *Timeworks*.

You don't need a hard drive, but it helps. With hard drive, all your programs will load and run faster and perform better and you won't have to constantly swap floppy disks in order to access the files you want. A hard drive will also enable you to make use of large thesaurus and dictionary utilities which don't work very well from floppies. If you can't afford a hard drive, then you really must have two floppies. DTP on a single drive system will be at best difficult, at worst impossible.

You definitely don't need a laser

printer to produce stunning publications. Some of the better 9-pin Epson-compatible dot matrix machines are capable of quite stunning results. Have a look at the Star LC10 (colour option available) or the Panasonic KXP1081. Both printers can be had for under £150 – £130 if you shop around (grub about in Shopping Express for bargains) and both are among the top selling machines in the UK.

A good introductory ST-specific DTP book? There isn't one! However, HiSoft currently market a dinky little introductory desktop publishing text called *DTP At A Glance...* by Rob Pickering, which is fun to read and very informative, and the price has just been dropped to around £7. Contact HiSoft on 0525 713716 for a copy.

HELP! PC book

Here's an easy one for you. Is there an Amstrad PC1512/PC1640 handbook available? I'm sick to death of the rag that accompanied my 1512. Every time I need a particular piece of information, the damn thing lets me down!

Stephen Morris, published by Heinemann (ISBN 0 434 91376 6) and priced at £19.95. There are chapters detailing GEM, the operating system, desktop menus, disks and files, hard drives and so on, it's fun to read and very informative.

Don't laugh, I am a lady driver with an Amstrad PC1512 single drive with a hard disk fitted. I would like to run *Protext* 4 on it or in it. Q: Will I have any problems? I seem to remember someone at *Express* saying that for optimum results *Protext* 4 needed a double drive and 640K, or it may have been double K and 640 drives. Please help me – I'm very good looking. Ms M Green, Withington, Manchester.

Chivalrous and gallant Uncle TT to the rescue... *Protext* does work better with two disk drives than one, but works best with a floppy and hard drive combination. As this latter configuration is yours, you will have no problems.

An extra 128K of RAM would enable you to create monster documents, definitive first novels and the like, but 512K is fine for everything else. Buy and enjoy *Protext* (Oh, and next time, include a recent photograph with your request for help...)

■HELP! I've bought a cheap PC, but I want to play games

I recently bought, secondhand because I am a student and cannot afford to splash out, a computer system comprising a DTK Corporation XT computer, a Casper GM-1288 amber monitor and Suntouch K2 keyboard. The computer also includes a 20Mb hard drive and a turbo 640 main board. I have been told that the makes are based in the USA, but I would like to know if there is a branch in England and if so, where? Any help or technical information on the computer and background of the company would be greatly appreciated.

I would also be very happy if you would explain to me what 'HARD DISC 1: ST255' and 'ST10 v2.4' mean as I have only a few months' computing experience.

Is it at all possible to get a switch between two graphics cards? As I would like to buy a CGA card and television adapter to use games and keep my Hercules card and amber monitor for word processing. Is this possible? If so, where do I buy the equipment?

One final thing, how do I get turbo mode on the main board? And as I have little technical experience could you please explain it simply? Daren Wheeler, Chesham, Bucks.

Anyone know if there's a branch of DTK Corporation in the UK? If so, phone me. There really isn't much to tell you about the machine that you would find very interesting. Basically you've acquired some bogstandard XT clone that will give you access to most of the available PC software.

ST255 is a code detailing the type of hard

drive in your system. In this instance Seagate (ST) and 20Mb (255), simple, right? The PC world is full of obscure little codes and commands like this. Long time owners will tell you it is because the machine is powerful. Don't believe them! The PC is a hideously out-dated command linedriven hunk of junk silicon that has long since had its day. Unfortunately, due to corporate bulk 'name' buying, it is still enjoying a healthy life.

What this means for you is a huge software base, huge information base, plenty of spares and dealers to sell them, so enjoy your new toy.

Forget this nonsense about adapter card switches, you can have both the CGA card and the Hercules card and drive the same amber monitor from them – you don't need a television. All your games will be displayed in amber but if you can live with this you'll save cash.

Turbo mode means that instead of running the XT's central processor chip at 4.77MHz (the standard speed) it's pushed along at 8 or 10MHz. In order to retain compatibility with very early PC software requiring the machine to be operating at the standard speed, many manufacturers provide a switch so that you can select between the two as and when you wish. However, this is not always the case, so unless your machine has an easilyidentifiable marked 'turbomode' switch on the front, it probably isn't switchable. If the latter holds true, don't worry, 99 per cent of software will run.

Contact cons

I purchase your magazine regularly and feel it is a good way of keeping up with developing technology.

However, there is an issue that is of very great concern to me. OK, piracy is here and neither you nor I are going to get rid of it (just like computers, viruses and logic bombs are here to stay), but you may be able to cut it down in your own little way. At every opportunity you slam pirates, hackers and crackers, which probably scares various people into not doing it, although others might think: 'Where do I get some of this free software?' or: 'How can I get into hacking so I can live on the edge of the law and have a large boost to my ego whenever I find a password?'

Now, this would be all fine except for the fact that Express has a nice little free ads section. Looking through this, as I do when I buy your mag, what do I find but:

- 1 C64 contact wanted
- 10 Atari ST contacts wanted
- · 32 Amiga contacts wanted.

OK, before everyone jumps up on to their soapboxes, I realise that some of these people want to swap shareware, hints, clip-art pics etc, but the majority well, I'll let you guess what they want.

One of the ads was cheeky enough to say: 'Wanted contacts etc, Hi to all at Express,' another wanted a C64 emulator and contacts - I realise that he may want someone to sell him a cheap one. Another person asked for any beginner to contact him, - then I'm sure it wasn't to say 'well done in buying your machine'. Other people greet the groups that are hacking the games, but I'm sure they just wanted to say hello.

Another thing, before I forget - there is nothing wrong with user groups, they are of great benefit to one and all, but look in your user group section of the reader ads and what do you find? Contacts.

So next time you slag off pirates, hackers or crackers, just cast an eye over your own free ads (and they are free so you don't lose out if you pull them out).

I realise that other magazines have classified ad sections, but they don't come out weekly and they don't take such a hard line on pirates.

You don't have to print my letter but at least I've had the opportunity to state an obvious point that you seem to have overlooked. I have tried to show an objective opinion and I apologise if this hasn't shone through.

I have to admit that reading through the free ads has not come very high on the priorities list for my first three months at Express, but I take your point.

A clean-up of the blatant offenders is imminent, and if readers persist in abusing the free ads to run piracy networks, we may reluctantly have to consider restricting the service to buyers and sellers, which would be a great shame for everyone.

The subject of public domain software and the profits the owners of PD libraries are reputed to make is a popular one at the moment (Express passim, to coin a phrase), but I think a serious point is being missed.

There are, of course, two great advantages to PD software when compared with commercial titles. The first is that a vast range of high quality software is available at a price that is cheap - £2-£3 for a program that would normally cost in the range of £10-£15.

Secondly, much of what is in the public domain isn't available commercially at all - so the software is really worth much more.

Personally I don't mind if the PD librarians do make a few pence on each disk (which, let's face it, is all they can be making) - I'm more concerned about the programmer. Is it fair that the library owners make a profit from distributing the disks, when the programmer, who might have spent hours creating the software, gets nothing?

So, let's stop worrying about our pockets - and perhaps the more dishonest PD owners will think of the programmers as well as themselves. Let's keep PD the way it was invented.







Of course, the brainwave modifier is in direct communication with his digital wristwatch. The wristwatch constantly relays the commuter's pulse rate to the modifier which has the power to cut into the Heng Seng Index at any time and further relax the commuter with sounds of 'Meet your inner mate' at critical stress moments.

The lap top is radio-linked to the portable phone, which has a built-in modem. Before alighting from the train and making the critical decision about whether to drive the 200 yards home with the computer display in his left eye or the MC2 in his right, or indeed whether to bother removing either before driving, the cyber-commuter will fax the work done on the train directly to his office.

He will then make a mental note in his computer organiser about playing golf tomorrow, since all tomorrow's work is now done; he needs a day at home – in the golf simulator – to relax from it all.

I have called these devices 'cyber-

netic add-ons,' although I begin to wonder when we will see 'cybernetic add-ins.' At birth we could have our left eye removed and replaced with a multi-use display. We could have tiny speakers implanted in our ears to relay information to us from any number of sources; a world-wide speaking computer which would answer any question we telepathed it, perhaps. (We all know the Soviets have worked on a project which aimed to control machinery or computers by thought.)

Radio receivers and telephones could be built into our breast-bones, also relaying to our speaker implants. Perhaps most worrying of all, especially if you are, as I am, a reader of Larry Niven, would be the fitting of a small electronic socket, hidden by the hair, through the skull, into the pleasure centres or relaxation centres of the brain, into which we plug our Dream Machine, mark II. Everything would be powered by a small power plant implanted in our hip bones.

As a scholar of the history and devel-

opment of science fiction I was, until recently, of the opinion that the technology the sci-fi authors write about was never to appear and that if some of it did, it would only happen in the distant, distant future. For example: organic computers; pictures of Neptune taken from a range of 3,000 miles; genetic manipulation; cloning; detecting neutrinos; optical computers and fibre optics; minimally invasive surgery; optical character recognition; speaking computers; and AIDS.

However, sci-fi is already here. A large proportion of my sci-fi library is already behind the times; it is interesting to note that during the 1940s the state-of-the-art technology was at the same state as the technology in sci-fi stories written in the early 1900s. Now sci-fi authors are hard-pushed to write about something that has not already happened.

I noticed, a few issues back, someone begging for an Atari 2600 column. My French penfriend had one when I went over a couple of years ago, and to demonstrate the power of the control of this under-rated machine, I can honestly say I played several games with the joystick upside down before realising.

Also I take issue with your QL correspondent, John Torofex, for making out that the Sinclair machine is on a par with Acorn's Archimedes. An Amiga can emulate the QL, too. Incidentally, a quantum leap is the smallest possible quantity of anything, so the machine did represent a 'quantum leap,' contrary to what you said in your Amiga PD section.

What has happened to the Humour section of the classified ads? It still appears as a category on the form, but there hasn't been one since about October. Have you just bundled these ads in with the rest on the grounds that no-one reads them anyway, or is the culprit your readers' sense of humour?

As for your Top 60 Games section in Express 62 – for the BBC you reprinted word for word what you put in Express 51, disregarding the comments made by both myself and Rafael Jay in Express 53. Could you, please, alter your text and correct and/or add to what is written, so eventually something reflecting the truth will be printed?

Finally, I was glad to see you stuck your neck out in Express 67 about the Tory government. You may have alienated 37 per cent of the country (latest opinion poll at time of writing) but, as your comments were all reasonable and justifiable, I don't think there will be too many complaints. On the political front, I should first make it clear that I would in fact regard the departure of business readers as a loss. The sheer variety of *Express* readers may make pleasing everyone an impossible task, but it certainly makes the job more interesting.

The magazine is clearly (I hope) apolitical in its news and features, and I think very little of the readership will feel 'alienated' by a personal, single-subject statement made in response to a letter.

Reasonable people will happily disagree with my opinion without feeling the need to cancel their order at the newsagent. Anyone who swears never to buy Express again because its editor has dared to criticize a Government minister must be narrow-minded indeed. On the other hand...

Your reply in Express 67 should alienate all your readers not just half. Not because it was political but because it was daft. Your unsubstantiated jibes about industrialists and party donations told us more about you than the problem.

The Government has not blamed the unemployed. It has blamed unemployment on an uncompetitive economy.

Opportunities to obtain work experience – a different problem – started to diminish as the employment costs – mainly wages – for trainees approached that for trained workers.

Training is not an end in itself. It is not investment that has been lacking but profitable investment that has been lacking. No one invests for fun. If we can compete in design, productivity, reliability, delivery and make a profit there will be investment, jobs and prosperity for all. Eastern Europe tried it the other way. The results are high profile at the moment.

These simple tenets must apply at Future Publishing as much as any place else. Good Luck! Your current frame of mind suggests your company will need it. Pity about the mag ... Ian Hamilton, Dalbeattie, Kirkcudbrightshire

of one printing firm suggested I work for
him for nothing "until the business picks
up" – he said this without blushing while
showing me a machine for which he had
just paid £17,000.)

Then, of course, for the older person there is the: 'You're finished at 40' syndrome (including, presumably, the heads of the companies referred to as Amstrad, IBM, ICI, Nissan, Shell etc.).

Even funnier than the Government's claims that: 'Unemployment has gone down for the 99th successive month' (ie, 'We keep finding new ways of juggling the figures') is the ludicrous idea that the Enterprise Allowance Scheme can help the unemployed by 'employing themselves.' The Government never explains how, if the big boys cannot afford to create extra jobs in depressed areas, the individual can.

By the way, I've tried the 'on your bike' idea as well. I moved to London just after the start of the recession in 1980 but returned no better off after three years – that's not the answer either. As you say, investment and a totally new attitude from those in power are the only long-term solutions.


