


Computer game may spawn TV show

Software producer Audiogenic has come up with the novel idea of trying to turn a computer game into a television show.

Emlyn Hughes Arcade Quiz Game – due out before Christmas – is being considered by TV companies as the basis for a TV show hosted by the man himself. The game itself uses an approach not yet tapped by television and broadcasting mandarins are looking at the software house's ideas.

"It's completely different from anything before," offered an enthusiastic

spokeswoman. "We're looking at television possibilities and we may be turning it into a pub arcade game as well." She stressed though that negotiations for both deals are at a very tentative stage. The game itself is not restricted to football or sports.

Meanwhile, ST and Amiga versions of the hugely successful Emlyn Hughes International Soccer are due out in less than a month. Audiogenic claims the game has been bought by some 70,000 eight-bit soccer fans in the past year. A PC version is under development and should be out just after Christmas.

Company challenges hackers to break in

Top brass at the gigantic Nippon Telegraph and Telephone company in Tokyo seem to be pretty impressed with their own data security system.

In fact they're so pleased with it that hackers are being dared to break in. Anyone who succeeds within the next two years will win one

million yen (at present exchange rates about £4,500).

The company handles much of Japan's telecommunications data and is the equivalent to British Telecom. UK hackers will probably realise that telephone bills will break the £4,000 mark before they even get close.

Atari's ST replacements arrive

THE NEXT GENERATION

Atari has unveiled the successors to the massively popular ST range.


As first predicted in Express (Issue 33) the firm has launched an upgraded version of the ST called the STE (E for enhanced). This is a replacement for its 1040 machine, and should arrive early next year at £499. A 512K version will also be making its way here "in due course".

But more interest was aroused by a new high-power machine which was revealed along with the STE at the Atari Show in Dusseldorf. The machine, named the TT, uses Motorola's superfast 68030 processor with 2Mb of memory and comes with a high-resolution colour monitor and a 30Mb hard drive. It will be compatible with existing ST software. This will cost just under £2,000 when it arrives in the UK – comparable systems such as the Macintosh IICX or a souped-up Amiga 2000 would cost over a thousand pounds more.

Also being planned is the TT/X which, like the TT, runs the ST-compatible TOS 030, but also handles Unix. The TT/X will include 4Mb of RAM and a huge 60Mb hard drive. Cost is likely to be in the region of £3,500 to £4,000.

Both these machines are being viewed as low cost business micros which will challenge not only high-end PC clones but also the Apple Mac.

Atari has taken this opportunity to resolve some of the problems of the original ST, and both the TT and the STE have dramatically improved graphics and sound facilities.

The STE boasts an built-in blitter which will speed up graphics considerably; in the past users have had to fit blitters as an optional extra. There's also a larger palette of colours – up from 512 to 4,096. Unfortunately no changes have been made to the number of colours you can display on screen at one time.

New hardware has also provided vertical and horizontal scrolling. Programmers have previously had to implement all kinds of trickery in order to wrench vertical scrolling out of the ST. The new hardware will allow the central processor to get on with other jobs, thus speeding the machine up considerably.

The poor quality of the ST's sound chip has been one of its major faults – it is no better than that in the Spectrum. Now it will come with a stereo eight-bit pulse code modulator chip which can play real sampled sounds like its rival the Amiga.

It will also come with two extra joystick ports at the back. These are non standard 15 pin connectors which will need an adapter to use standard sticks. However each will take two joysticks so users can play with six joysticks at once. The ports will also take a light gun or pen.

The TT has all the ports of the STE as well as an SCSI ('scuzzy') and ASCII port for connecting extra, high capacity storage systems, or for hooking into a network.

Physically the STE looks exactly like the 1040 while the TT has an Mega ST keyboard attached to a uniquely styled plinth.

Atari says that 30 software houses have already pledged to begin writing programs which will take advantage of the STE's new-found talents. But buyers will have to wait until the new year until they can pick up any of these machines and possibly until next autumn until they can buy software which exploits the hardware.

A spokesman offered: "These machines, as well as our RISC based ST, are the future for Atari. This is just a process of improving and upgrading our machines."

ST tunes in to TV

Atari ST owners can now access all the latest in news, sports, gossip and reviews by tapping into teletext.

A new adapter has been produced by Microtext which already manufactures such gadgets for mainstream eight-bit machines and the Amiga. The advantage of computer interfacing with teletext is the ability to download pages to disk. Arty users can even save illustrations for later use with paint packages. There's also a print out option.

Unfortunately the BBC recently stopped thair free software downloading service, but the rest of Ceefax is still available.

50 per cent more micros bought in Europe

Europeans are buying more and more computers - the personal computer market grew by 52 per cent during 1988 according to leading market research firm Dataquest. It's predicting another increase of 38 per cent this year.

· Home use is increasing faster than business use that sector grew by 58 per

· Norway has the highest penetration of computers amongst white collar workers - 23.8 per cent. That's mainly due to tax concessions for computer buyers. Micro mad Holland is catching up though, that has a 21 per cent penetration which is expected to rise to an incredible 60.7 per cent in 1992.

· Britain has a penetration of 15.9 per cent. Lower than France but higher than West Germany. However, it's predicted that British penetration will only be 38.1 per cent in 1992 - lower than most of the major Western European nations.


 West Germany proved itself to be Europe's biggest country in computing terms.

Last year 1,031,200 personal computers were sold there. France has also come good with 794,000 whilst Britain has lagged with 778,000.


• The 8088/86 machines are still the biggest but 286 is catching up. Last year 1,729,000 8088/86 were bought compared to 1,634,000 286s. Fast 386s are making an impact. 296,000 of them were bought compared to 49,000 in 1987. This year will see an enormous increase on that. Sub \$2,000 non IBM compatible machines such as the Amiga and ST sold 606,000

· US giant IBM still has the biggest share of sales in Europe with 16.1 per cent (down from 19 per cent). Britain's Amstrad was second with 11 per cent in 1987 that's slipped to 6.8 per cent behind Olivetti (7.6 per cent), Atari (8.2 per cent) and Commodore (8.4 per cent). Apple has 4.6 per cent.

· The total value of the European personal computer market in 1988 was a massive \$15.1 billion (£9 billion).

Is the STE's biggest threat the ST?

Atari's new machines address two clear markets. The TT is a low-cost business machine, at under two grand a colour 68030 based machine. The Apple Mac, Amiga 2000 and DOS compatibles will have a serious rival on their hands.

But for most of us the STE - essentially a souped-up 1040ST - is the more interesting of the new pair. It looks little different on the outside, apart from the 'E' appended awkardly to the badge; and it still uses the 68000 Motorola processor.

But Atari have recognised that many buyers have been wooed by the superior sound and graphics of the Amiga and have tried hard to regain the advantage. After all, the ST is still a very good buy, but with so many good deals being offered on the Amiga and PCs tumbling in price all the time, perhaps its days are

The extras that clearly take after the Amiga - stereo sound, four- to six-joystick capability, genlock support and extra scrolling facilities from hardware - should give programmers scope for inspiration. But with over a million STs already sold, it's going to be tempting for most of them to write straight ST games as usual, and address the larger market. Perhaps the very success of the low-priced ST will be the biggest stumbling block to that of its successor.

However, the new machine will - when it appears - certainly inject new life into the eternal ST vs. Amiga debate. And that can only be good for sales of both machines.

GAMES TAKE

Electronics group Plessey last week launched its long awaited in-flight entertainment centre for air passengers. Talks are being held with six leading airlines.

The system will provide bored travellers with access to a wide range of entertainment and communications facilities including top games ranging from shoot-'em-ups for youngsters to high brow

The system consists of a monitor fitted into the back of the chair in front of the passenger along with a keyboard and a headset.

Not only will passengers have access to a database of games, there's also a choice of movies, an audio tape

library and the ability to order duty-free gifts from your seat - they'll then be presented to passengers on arrival. There's also a fax machine or telephone option which allows travellers to communicate with the ground. A one minute telephone call would cost about seven pounds.

Other games likely to be used are poker and fruit machine simulators with users playing with real money. Payment is through a normal credit card which slips into the back of the system.

Australian firm Aristocrat is working on software for the system. All the games will be single user affairs.

Five years ago Virgin Atlantic worked on a similar project but scrapped it In-flight gaming a reality

because of logistical problems. Plessey appears to have overcome these.

The firm expects airlines to be fitting the systems as a matter of course by 1991.

Taking on Tosh

Fledgling London PC manufacturer Flowline Computers reckons it's got a laptop to beat the likes of Toshiba and Compaq.

The top end model boasts a power specification including a 40 Mb hard disk, 1Mb of RAM and 1Mb expansion memory. The 286 LT3500 also has a 12MHz clock speed and an EGA gas plasma display.

But at £2100 it's a tad expensive. The firm's Barry Walsh explained: "With a technical specification like that you have to expect those sort of prices. but when you compare it with, say Toshiba, then it's extremely competitive.

Flowline has a cheaper model, the LT 3200, which sports 640K of RAM expandable to 2.6Mb. That costs £1750. More on 01 207

Visitors to the forthcoming PC Show are to be given the chance to dabble in the world of shareware.

Folio Shareware is giving away programs to anyone passing its stand. With shareware anyone taking a shareware program is welcome to try it out for free. However, if they like it they are then supposed to send cash to the supplier.

The main flaw in this arrangement is that it relies on honesty - curiously, shareware works in the US (although doesn't do so well here). A special starter pack will be on offer for £2 which includes a dozen full PC programs, utilities and games.■

E-mail split ends in tears

Yet another infantile row has broken out between electronic mail giants Microlink and Telecom Gold as their well publicised parting of ways looms.

In an official press release Microlink has accused Gold of issuing "junk mail" through its Email system urging Microlink members to leave that board and join Telecom Gold. As of October 1st Telecom Gold will no longer host the Microlink board - that has jumped ship to new concern Istel Inet.

Gold is clearly miffed that it will lose thousands of members. Although Microlink is the hobbyist section of the Gold network its members can tap into Gold's ser-

Microlink has responded to Gold's alleged activities by contacting its solicitors and complaining to OFTEL (the telecommunications watchdog).

"These are Big Brother tactics in a most reprehensible form," said Microlink chairman Derek Meakin. "BT is using its privileged position to contact people who are on our confidential list of subscribers. All of them have contracted directly with us and not BT."

Telecom Gold quickly pointed out that it did not send E-mail messages per se but telex messages to private numbers which are attached to Microlink - not Microlink numbers. "They've got it all wrong," offered a spokesperson. "They are trying to give the impression that Telecom Gold is sending out thousands of E-mail junk messages. In fact it's just a few thousand simple telex messages."

Meakin later admitted this is the case but denied that any attempts had been made to mislead. "They're still using E-mail to send the telexes," he said.

A bemused OFTEL spokesman commented: "There's nothing we can do about it. It's up to

Italian computer giant Olivetti's profits dipped by 40 per cent for the first half of this year to L102.6bn (£46.6m).

The company which manufactures the £399 PC1 is blaming the poor result on the turbulence of the PC market as well as an internal restructuring.■

Members of the Darlington Country club are using the first Bull EEPROM card in an experiment to see how people get on without cash.

The program – sponsored by Bull and Barclays Bank – has been going on for the last few months and, apparently, has gone down extremely well. More than 2,000 members have been using the cards

The show's organiser is expecting a veritable flood of Amstradians to pour through the doors of Alexander Palace (November 24th to 26th) and is promising a circus atmosphere with clowns, stiltwalkers and even a baby elephant turning up. It is understood that Mr Alan Sugar won't be acting as ring master.

Companies share flats

IBM and Toshiba have set up a 50-50 company in order to manufacture large LCD screens.

These are generally considered to be the future of visual display since they are thin, cheap, use hardly any power and look good. Zenith has already begun working on such

a product and Phillips launched one earlier this yea to considerable acclaim.

Toshiba and IBM Japan have formed Display Technologies to make the screens for the two firm's own products − 10 inch flat monitors should emerge from the new factory in Japan in April 1991.

Computer students make the grade

More than 80,000 youngsters sat the new computer studies GCSE exam last term with 37.5 per cent of the reaching grade C or over.

Nearly seven per cent of the students gained a grade A while 9.4 per cent flopped with a grade G. Applicants were down from 1988 when 100,329 student sat the course. But the standard was higher this year with more youngsters wining higher grades.

Computer studies is still one of the lesser subjects at school with only German and Business Studies of the mainstream subjects attracting fewer applicants.


NEW GAME BEATS ELITE

MicroProse's top programmers in the UK have been given the task of writing the most comprehensive space game yet.

The young programmers have been told to top David Braben's six year old classic *Elite* as the number one in space strategy and trading games. Micro-Prose's founder Bill Stealey last week flew into the UK to make sure everything was running smoothly.

The game – as yet unnamed – should be out on 16-bit machines early next year. Designers are still trying to work out if the massive game can be fitted onto eight-bit machines.

MicroProse has been steering itself away from its old image as a military simulation company over the past few years. When it set up here three years ago the company's main products were submarine and fighter pilot simulations. Now it is seeking to become one of the world's leading forces in computer game publishing and has diverted resources in order to accomplish that aim.

This is its most ambitious project in the home computer sector to date. "We really don't want to draw comparisons with Elite because this will be so much bigger and better," said the firm's Peter Jones. "It will be the ultimate space game. In fact it will be the game of the decade," he claimed. "We've been working on this for some time but it's such a big project that we've had to keep it all under wraps."

Despite its age Elite is still regarded as the best space

strategy game. To date it has sold 600,000 copies.

Meanwhile, MicroProse UK's boss Stewart Bell has left the firm in a shock move. A triumvirate of key personnel including Jones will take over the company's affairs here although it is understood that more power will be transferred to its American headquarters.

MicroProse says that Bell left on good terms although his future plans are, as yet, unknown.

Here they come again...

Yet another PC manufacturer is preparing itself for a full attack on the low end sector with high spec machines.

Hi–Grade plans to launch what is being touted as "the cheapest 386 machine" at a price busting tag £1,225. Also on the way is an ultra low cost 286 priced at £775. And there'll be a 20 Mb hard disk version costing £895.

Tech specs have yet to be announced although Hi-Grade is promising that potential buyers won't be disappointed. A spokesman said: "Nearly 90 per cent of each machine is manufactured in Japan. These machines are cheap but they're not horrible."

When asked if he were worried about stiff competition from such as Amstrad he said: "Anyone can compete with Amstrad, the trouble they're having".

Meanwhile, any buyers of Hi–Grade kit can pick up £775 worth of free software including Ashton-Tate's Framework II, Microsoft Windows and MS-DOS 4. More on 01 482 4042.■

APPLE SLASHES MACS

In a shock move Apple has slashed up to 25 per cent off the prices of its Macintosh Plus and SE machines.

For the first time buyers can pick up the Mac Plus for less than £1,000. That machine has been cut from £1,355 to £999. When it was launched in 1986 it retailed at over £3,000.

The Macintosh faster SE twin floppy has come down from £2,165 to £1,735, and the more useable hard disk versions have been similarly reduced.

Apple says these new prices are more in line with American levels where the machine is extremely popular.

Significantly, Apple is also using the words "personal

user" for the first time. In the past the firm has acknowledged that its pricing is way out of reach of most home users.

Last week Apple's Frank O'Mahony told Express: "In the States about half our sales go to corporate users with the rest going to small businesses and home users. We expect to see small businesses picking it up here as well as a lot more personal users."

He added: "We've brought the prices down because we want to extend the Macintosh range. There are a lot of people who are extremely price sensitive and who will be considering the Mac for the first time."

Apple is hoping to woo those

people who might be considering an IBM compatible machine.

The Mac's universal popularity is mainly due to its ingeniously simple user interface. Most regard it as the simplest computer to get to grips with.

Meanwhile, Apple has fired a warning shot across the bows of those companies manufacturing Mac emulators for other machines. O'Mahony said: "We're looking at this closely and if anything infringes our copyrights then we'll take action. But the ones I've seen don't come close to the Mac. We'll start getting nervous if that happens."





OVERVIEW

MULTIMEDIA MAG

herever there's innovation, Apple is never far behind. Indeed, it's usually responsible. Multimedia is perhaps the most singularly exciting development in recent computing and Apple's at the forefront of its future. It's a term used to denote applications that mix text, graphics, sound and moving video to transform presentation - it takes in desktop video and goes beyond.


It all started with HyperCard on the Mac in late '87 - a multi-purpose application with endless possibilities that set the style of software to come. HyperCard provided an even friendlier interface than the Mac desktop - a busy little 'home' card acting as the centre of operations for everything from appointment diaries to spreadsheets to animation. Icons and buttons battled it out for control over a bewildering variety of databases known as 'stacks'; each stack containing cards of information ranging from clip art and cartoons to page designs and phone books. You could build your own stacks and navigate between them by linking areas with clickable buttons - you could even load in all your favourite applications from within HyperCard and return back to base when you'd finished. The potential was enormous - bright, moving graphics could live side by side with dull, stolid business. Even cynics had to admit it represented something of a revolution.



THE FIRST MULTIMEDIA



Several diverse developers have already begun exploring the potential of multimedia applications. Most prominent among them is the BBC with its Mediamaker package.

Mediamaker is a software application based on the HyperCard clone, Supercard, and developed by the BBC's Interactive TV Unit and Apple. It's described by its authors as a "word processor for multimedia" and is a visually-based editing system that can sequence still and moving pictures and synchronise them with sounds. Thus, material from videodisc, Video 8 and compact disc can be combined with Mac graphics packages to produce stand-alone sequences which can be 'printed' to videotape. To assemble a sequence, source materials are broken down into picture icons or 'picons' which can be played and edited to length. Picons are then dragged into the 'track' window below the main display which has separate channels for video and audio output. With a minimum of 4Mb of RAM it's possib to create and view sequences of up to 10 minutes duration. To accompany Mediamaker, the Beeb are also producing the Mediabank series of Video 8 tapes - collections of clip video culled from various broadcast pro-

fostered multimedia? The secret lies in its Hypertalk command language. Such is its simplicity that you can roam HyperCard all day without ever needing to use it. But behind the ease lies the expertise. Hypertalk is a powerful object-oriented language designed from the outset to be totally interactive. With its built-in routines and procedures it's not only possible for Hypertalk to activate other devices such as sound sources and video clips but call in other software to assist as and when needed.

Combine this flexibility with the emergence of the new CD ROM and video disc mass storage devices and it's perfectly feasible to have a desktop system able to merge with other forms of media. In theory, midi-music interfaces, scanners, digitizers and genlocks can all be used in conjunction and with ease, but to date developers have had to use their own custom interfaces. However, last month's Macworld Expo '89 in Boston, saw Apple stepping in to help matters by announcing its Apple Media Control Architec-

Printing to video

The AMCA will provide a framework for all applications to access videodisc players, CD-audio players, videotape recorders and other media devices via a standard interface code. As such, it'll be possible to integrate video clips with CD audio sound, manipulate the two elements and 'print' the outcome to videotape. The nineties will see a predominance of video-based presentations because of videotape's low-cost read/write capabilities and wide availability.

MULTIMEDIA FOR YOU?

Is there any reason why multimedia should be confined to a Macintosh environment? The answer is a qualified no. Although machine architectures and I/O are sufficiently similar to support interfaces for the range of media devices in question, what's crucial is the operating environment on hand. Top priority must go to the amount of RAM you have on board plus the requisite masses of hard disk space. A 10 second video sequence can eat up 2Mb in

no time at all. And then there's the question of control of all that diverse data through some flexible front-end. The Mac's always been streets ahead in terms of the way it provides a virtually idiot-proof environment. It's fast, reliable and, above all, ridiculously easy to run any number of the packages released for it. They all conform to the same menu operations. With the PC, ST and Amiga the situation is less straightforward. Although windowing environments exist for all three, software doesn't always run under them. In addition, icon control is less flexible and screen-handling, with the exception of the Amiga, less precise. But despite these inadequacies, there are plans on the horizon to bring multimedia to other 16-bit machines. After all it's development support that's the key here - at the end of the day, the chips in Macs, STs and Amigas are identical - all that's needed is the will to plot the way ahead.

THE TOP MULTIMEDIA MICROS



1. ARCHIMEDES

Tecnation's Bit Bopper system can arguably claim to be the only real multimedia system to run on any home micro other than a Mac. It's two Archies, 600Mb erasable optical disc storage, custom video/audio digitisers and ultra-fast screen handling routines, make it an ideal configuration. Although it's been designed with entertainment in mind, there's no reason why it couldn't be used for more serious applications. What's more, versions for 16bit machines are planned - even eight-bit outings are in the

2. AMIGA

American company Intuitive Technologies plans to release a HyperCard clone, Ultracard, later this year. Since the Amiga is well catered for in terms of digitsers, genlocks and sound handling, this will undoubtedly open up the field of multimedia applications for Amiga owners. The machine is already being used for desktop video and interactive training so the ground work has already been prepared. The Amiga 2000's open architecture and high RAM capacity makes it the ideal contender.


3. ST

Because of its built in MIDI interface the ST's always been well supported in the sound department, with professional sequencing and sampling packages just queueing up for your readies. In the video field it has a lot of catching up to do, despite a few genlocks here and there, although Rombo's real time digitser stands as a pointer for things to come. For multimedia you'd really need a Mega ST2 or 4 though to get things going. So there are no applications on the market at present although the ST's Cyber range of software is already being used for desktop video - though mainly in custom development areas like low-level television titling and the like.

With the high-resolution VGA graphics standard rapidly picking up popularity in the PC stakes, PC owners have at last a screen resolution capable of displaying the kind of hi-res images that effective multimedia depends on. The innovative PC-Album package from Freehand (full review soon) utilises its improved screen display to provide a full colour image database capable of displaying 32,000 colours on screen simultaneously, with video camera, colour scanner and optical WORM drive options. The database handling features, while not as easy as HyperCard, certainly go a long way to support the tremendous picture quality. On the sound side, the PC is, as always, limited, but at least Data Liberation's soon-to-bereleased Games Blaster plug-in stereo board looks set to beef up the machine's sound capabilities. Whilst hypertext front-ends are coming into the fore - witness HyperPad and Knowledge Pro, there's still a long way to go in the hardware department.

ABSOLUTE BEGINNERS

t's one thing deciding that a computer is just what you need, but quite another choosing which of the many models in the shops fits the bill. In order to decide which is the best machine for each individual, let's take a few hypothetical examples.

Jimmy Dawes is a hyperactive 14-year-old who spends too much money down at the arcades and not enough time doing his homework. His parents want to get him a computer partly to keep him off the streets, and partly because he's been nagging them for one for six months.

· Lady Eleanor Ponsonby-Smythe sits on the village church committee, edits the parish newsletter and also fancies writing her memoirs.

 Tracy Wilkes is a self-employed hairdresser who's fed up of trying to organise her accounts in exercise books, and who takes half an hour to produce a single mistake-free letter on her old typewriter.

Steve Smooth wants to play the most up-to-date and good-looking computer games, but also wants a machine capable of word processing, desktop publishing and anything else he might need to tackle.


 Damien LeClerc is a graphic designer working for an advertising agency and wants to move into the field of computerised imagery and animation.

Now you might imagine that one computer would be very much like another, and could therefore follow the same sets of instructions and use the same programs. Unfortunately, this isn't the case. Microprocessors - the "brains" of computers - apart from being made by a number of different manufacturers are constantly being developed, upgraded and replaced by new, more powerful generations of chips. Different microprocessors - if they're to work at their peak efficiency - need to be given their instructions in different ways. This directly affects how computer programs are written. Manufacturers wanting to steal a march on their competitors will frequently embrace the newest microprocessors for their new range of machines, even if it means none of the old software will work. Even machines which use the same processor may not be able to use the same software, since there are a whole host of other design considerations that govern the way hardware manufacturers will build their computers.

Choice remarks

Despite the huge numbers of different-looking machines currently on the market, there are in fact only a few principal models. These break down into two main families - the eight-bits and the 16-bits. (See the technobabble box for an

explanation of the difference.) The eight-bit machines tend to be sold as packages consisting of the machine, a monitor, half a dozen games, joystick etc, so it's difficult to make distinctions on price. Broadly, with the exception of the PCW, they all cost around £140 in basic form. These eight-bit machines are:

Sinclair Spectrum This machine was first launched in 1982, and has gone on to sell nearly a million units. The Spectrum remains the archetypical enthusiast-on-a-budget's microcomputer, though in performance terms it's now getting very long in the tooth. Graphics are crude and garishly-coloured, while the sound is confined to bleeps. It's great for amateur programmers and kids who can only afford budget games, but serious programs are almost non-existent.

- Commodore 64 Launched in 1982 the same year as the Spectrum - the Commodore 64 has gone on to sell 10 million units worldwide. It's altogether a more polished machine than the Spectrum, with better graphics and a much wider range of software. It's still principally a games machine, but those prepared to look around could find quite a lot of serious programs too.
- · Amstrad CPC This machine, introduced in 1984, has never quite taken off like it should. Partly to blame must be Amstrad's reluctance from the start to lower prices to a level where the CPC could compete with the Spectrum and Commodore 64. The machine actually boasts very nice, detailed graphics, and a good range of both games and serious software. Definitely worth considering.
- Amstrad PCW An unusual range of machines which first saw the light of day in 1985. The PCW was received with some scorn because it was a dedicated word processing machine which, at the time, did nothing else. It sold as a package of computer, monitor and printer for £399 + VAT, and much to everyone's surprise - even Amstrad's, probably - sold like hot cakes. Prices have come down slightly, new models have been added to the range, and there is now quite a lot of software available for the machine - including games.

However, the eight-bit computers above, while perfectly competent in their own way, are yesterday's technology. The last few years have seen the introduction of machines with much more powerful 16-bit processors, which give much better graphics and sound, and work much faster. They include:

· PC-compatibles Easily confused with PCWs, PCs are a different kettle of fish entirely. Designed primarily as serious business machines, they have access to a huge array of software -

THE PC PHENOMENON

It's possible for the unwary to confuse the term "PC" with personal computers in general. In fact, PC (or, strictly, PC-compatible) is used to describe a machine which uses the MS-DOS operating system pioneered by computer giant IBM. An operating system is, if you like, a set of "rules" under which a computer works, and if two machines have the same operating system then they are broadly compatible - i.e. they will run the same programs without alteration.

IBM was the company that

gave birth to the original PC. but since then a whole host of other manufacturers have taken turer - while still being able to up the manufacture of PC-com- use their old soft patibles. All these machines can use the same software, because although they are often designed quite differently, with different internal components and processors, they nevertheless work to the standard set of rules that forms the MS-DOS operating system.

This means that many users can start off with a budget PC when cash is tight, and upgrade later on to a more powerful and

even from a different manufacthey probably know off by heart. It also means that more software exists for the PC than - arguably - for every other machine put together. This is simply because the market is so huge. PCs are the industry standard machines for office use, partly because this huge range of software exists for them, and partly because everyone knows them. It's a chicken and egg situation.

sophisticated model - maybe

which is increasingly coming to include games too. A PC will set you back anywhere from £500 to £5,000 for a comprehensive system, depending on how much money you want to spend and how much power and sophistication you need. It's the nearest thing you can get to a "standard" computer, since many manufacturers produce them.

- Atari ST Arriving on the market in 1986, the Atari ST has since proved itself highly competent. Seen originally as a games machine, its popularity and versatility has led to many software companies producing serious programs - to the extent that the ST competes increasingly with the PC for many business applications. Like the eight-bit machines, the Atari ST tends to be "bundled" with sundry other goodies, making price comparisons difficult, but the basic unit costs approximately £300.
- Commodore Amiga Finally becoming available in 1987, a year later than the Atari ST, the Commodore Amiga is a broadly similar machine which boasts, however, better graphics and sound. Technically more accomplished though it is, the Amiga has not taken off in the same way as the ST. It costs roughly £100 more at around £400, and only now are software houses writing programs for it in anything like the quantity they are for the ST.

All of the above machines are available in several guises. The brief descriptions apply to the base models, but do hold true for all the others in

The also rans

In addition to the machines described above, you may well come across some other names. The BBC micro is an eight-bit computer that was well-specified when it first came out in the early eighties, and is even now used widely in schools. But by modern standards it's a sluggish, uninteresting relic. Don't buy one unless you can get it cheap or are intent on using only educational software. The Sinclair QL is a technical oddity that never caught on. Don't buy one unless you want to have to write all your own programs. The MSX is actually a standard format just like the PC. Originating in Japan in the early-mid eighties, it never captured the computing public's imagination over here. It entered the market like a damp squib, and fizzles weakly to this day.

Odd machine out in this catalogue of has-beens is the Acorn Archimedes. Not so much a hasbeen as a hasn't-been-yet. Fantastically powerful and fast, it's also quite expensive and as yet only a limited range of software is available. A machine that deserves to do well but can't really be recommended.

The bottom line

So having looked briefly at the main computing contenders, which will be most suitable for the hypothetical characters we looked at right at the beginning?

Jimmy Dawes, the hyperactive fourteen-yearold arcade fan, would be best off with one of the eight-bit computers - either the Sinclair Spectrum, Commodore 64 or Amstrad CPC (not the PCW). Any one of those machines will be cheap enough (just) for a Christmas or birthday present, will play a multitude of low-priced games, and perhaps teach him a little about computers in general too.

Lady Eleanor Ponsonby-Smythe would be best off buying a PCW. She would have no time for the fancy colour displays of other computers and would appreciate getting everything she needs in one simple, easy-to-use package that's also designed specifically for the needs of people like

Tracy Wilkes, the self-employed hairdresser, should buy a PC. She could start of with a word processing program for doing her business letters, and then move onto computerising her accounts and customer details with one of the many purpose-designed software packages available for the PC.

Steve Smooth will find the Atari ST exciting. It's a fast, powerful machine which is also remains at the forefront of state-of-the-art home computing. Whatever new projects or ventures he gets involved in, from publishing to video presentations to games designing, he'll find the machine more than a match for the job.

Damien LeClerc will fall in love with the Commodore Amiga. It's more expensive than the basically similar Atari ST, but is much better at producing computer-generated art due to its additional features and a wide range of very good art and animation programs. It is also a very good machine for games.

TECHNOBABBLE

Graphics: The general term used to describe a computer's display, which could consist of text, drawings, pictures or even animated cartoons. Graphics can be "crude", "blocky", "high-definition", "smooth" etc

Sound: Most computers emits sounds, from simple "bleeps" to indicate you've done something wrong, to high-quality soundtracks

Eight-bit: Generic term for computers using eight-bit microprocessors - chips which can process eight "bits" of information simultane-

16-bit: Describes processors which can handle 16 bits of information simultaneously. Actually, not twice as fast as eight-bit processors but 64 times faster

Software: Universally used jargon for computer programs

Power: Fashionable term with a vague meaning encompassing processor speed, memory, storage capacity etc

If a club can not supply a program that is ordered it should offer a suitable replacement or a refund instead of fobbing the customer off with faulty goods.

Also I think someone should define what profit is. Wages of employees and the owner are included in the costs and profit is anything left over after this. This means that any owner of a PD club can take as high a wage as they like and still claim that the club makes no profit.

Finally, if PD clubs don't make a profit, why are they treated as trade by publications such as yours? You are by no means the only one to do this. PD clubs are more of a hobby than an occupation. This should allow them to advertise as private owners. I understand that you have costs to cover but the cost of advertising for PD clubs having to ply for trade is enormous. Your publishing company must make a profit out of trade adverts (or why would it bother?) so technically you're making profit out of PD. Think about it.

GETS MY BACKUP

I recently ordered two games for my Spectrum +3 only to be informed by the mail order company that these are only available on tape for 128/+2 Spectrums. The protection built into these programs will be far too complicated for me to break and I must buy a £44 device if I want to be able to store and play these games on disc.

The software industry in general is a shambles and would not run smoothly if it was mounted on ball bearings and oiled every day. Here am I with cash to spend on software that someone refuses to market on disc whilst trying to stop me buying the device that will enable me to use the software to my best advantage. Basically it all boils down to why I have to consider buying the device in the first place – over-protection. An outlay of £70 to play two games on a Spectrum is ludicrous.

Game software companies need look no further than their own doorstep to find those responsible for the fall in software sales. Their introduction of high prices and absurd damaging protection routines created the market in the first place for the devices they aione now wish to ban. Furthermore these companies insinuate that software is overpriced because of piracy. If they are unable to reduce this practice, which I doubt, will they then reduce the prices accordingly? I think not!

 Your points seem quite valid to me, so long as the backup devices are the sort that will only run backed up software while they are hooked up to the machine, preventing pirate copies from being distributed.

PROTECTION RACKET

As viruses spread so do virus killers. Stuart Anderton looks at a 'complete solution' for Amiga owners

iruses have become rife on every popular home micro, and the Amiga is no exception. Indeed because of Commodore's decision to rely heavily on disk rather than build Workbench into ROM, the Amiga is more susceptible than most.

As viruses spread, so do virus killing programs – some cynical souls even suggest the same people might be writing both! Most viruses sit in the disk's boot block and virus killers to tackle them come in two common varieties. One is a fully fledged checker which you run and then put the disks you want to check in one by one. The other kind works as a memory-resident background task, checking each disk you insert as you work.

Abacus' Amiga Virus Protection Toolbox is a suite of programs which includes a checker of the latter type. The program loads itself into the Amiga's memory and watches the boot block of every disk you insert. If it finds anything untoward it lets you know and gives you the option to kill it.

A common problem with this kind of boot block checker is that many pieces of commercial soft-

ware, particularly games, have a peculiar boot block as part of their copy protection. It is all too easy to wipe out your favourite game by sleepily pressing the wrong mouse button. The *Toolkit* gets around this by giving you the chance to save a copy of the dodgy sector and allowing you to restore it if it was in fact OK. You can use this facility to keep backups of all your games' boot sectors in case they ever develop an infection.

The boot sector checker is easy to use and can simply be incorporated into your startup_sequence file. Another program on the disk is considerably more technical.

This program searches out the newer and more deadly overwriting and appending viruses. These charming characters don't bother with the obvi-

ous boot sector, they physically tag themselves onto data files and programs, being activated when they are run. Some software now checks itself to see if it has been infected but the only way to protect all your files is to keep a record of their sizes and creation dates and to monitor them for unforeseen changes. That is what the Toolbox program does

Regrettably it is anything but user friendly. It must be launched from the CLI and can take a host of optional parameters. Checking for these insidious program killers is an immensely time-consuming process and really only practical or useful with a hard disk drive. It still takes upwards of 20 minutes to check a disk even then.

The most unusual, and frankly worrying, part of this package is the manual. Here the treatment of "what is a virus?" goes well beyond what is necessary to use the programs or kill the viruses. It amounts to almost a programmer's guide to virus writing, with dissassemblies of three leading viruses included. The authors have even thoughtfully corrected a 'programming error' in one of them. This sort of detailed description of viruses can only make the amateur writer's task easier and verges on the irresponsible.

Conclusion

All in all then the *Toolkit* provides all the programs you need to protect yourself against viruses, but be warned that complete protection takes a lot of time and effort. There is no easy way to protection bar keeping your computer isolated from the outside world.

STARTLING FACTS

After months of speculation, Atari has finally revealed the specifications of its so-called Amiga-beating STE and ST-compatible workstation. Adrion McHeriot reveals all.

Atari 1040STE

As far as Atari is concerned the STE is its top-end entertainment system. Doubtless you'll agree when you've read what it offers. The STE replaces the current 1040 and, like the 1040, comes with 1Mb of memory, a double-sided drive and a £499 price tag.

Externally the new Atari is identical to all exist-

ing 520 and 1040 STs, although two new game controller ports can be found at the back of the machine.

The two new 15-pin non-standard game controllers can each look after two joysticks. This means a total of six sticks can be plugged into the computer – remember the ST already has two joystick sockets underneath the machine. Forget

the family outings, it'll be six-player Gauntlet III from now on! The 15-pin controller ports can't accept standard Atari joystick connectors; an adaptor is necessary. Someone somewhere is going to make a fortune...

As well as joysticks, a set of paddles can be plugged into each controller. And one of the ports also accommodates a light gun or light pen.

The operating system used by the STE is the much touted but little seen TOS 1.4.

Internally the STE is very similar to the ST; everything inside the ST can also be found in the STE. Virtually 100% software compatibility is thus assured. Of course, the STE does have extra sound and graphics hardware.

Graphics first. A blitter processor is supplied as standard. Although all current STs can have a blitter attached, only the Megas come with them fitted. Essentially the blitter speeds up window redrawing and other block data manipulations.

The palette has been increased from 512 to 4,096 colours. However, no changes have been made to the resolutions or the number of colours that can be displayed on screen.

Three new hardware registers are provided for horizontal and vertical scrolling, and split-screen displays.

Lost in music

In addition to the pathetic YM2149 noise generator, the STE comes with a stereo 8-bit PMC (pulse code modulation) chip. Essentially the DAC (digital to analogue converter) plays sampled sound at one of several constant rates: 6.25, 12.5, 25 or 50kHz. The output of the DAC is sent first to a four-pole low-pass filter, which performs antialiasing (smoothing) on the sound data, and then on to a two-pole fixed frequency (16kHz) low-pass filter. After its cleaning the sound data is sent to a National LMC1992 chip. This slab of silicon enables tone and volume changes to be applied to the sound. Output is through the monitor/TV speaker or a stereo RCA-style jack at the back of the computer.

Interestingly enough, the stereo PCM sound can be mixed with the output from the YM2149 chip. In total there are five voices of sound plus one of noise. Not bad!

Amiga beater?

Fast omni-directional scrolling shoot-'em-ups with digitised ditties simply aren't possible on the ST as it currently stands. There's no way the processor can look after software scrolling, hordes of sprites and sampled sound. Psygnosis' Blood Money is probably pushing the ST as far as it will go.

Because of the hardware scrolling and DMA (direct memory access) sound, the STE's 68000 processor can get on with other tasks. Hardware scrolling is ridiculously fast – identical to the Amiga – and requires very little processor attention. DMA sound doesn't involve the processor at all – apart from some setting up to begin with – so digitised sound can be played in parallel to the 68000 doing other jobs.

While the STE's sound capabilities are damn good, they're not quite up to the Amiga's.

NEW TO THE ST?

The technical specifications for the standard 520/1040 ST

- Ports: DMA (direct memory access), serial, parallel, modulator, colour/mono monitor, second floppy disk, MIDI In/Out, cartridge, mouse, joystick.
- Memory: 520, 512K; 1040, 1Mb.
- Processor: Motorola 68000 rated at 8MHz.
- Storage: One double-sided 3.5-inch floppy.
- Sound: Yamaha YM2149 programmable sound generator.
 Capable of three voices of square-wave sound plus a noise channel. Mono output.
- Resolution/colour: Three modes; 320 by 200 pixels with a maximum of 16 colours on screen, 640 by 200 with four colours on screen and 640 by 400 in monochrome. All colours are chosen from a 512-colour palette. Optional bitter.

PREVIEW

The Amiga has four channels of stereo sound – and, by using some clever tricks, more channels are possible (the trade off is sound quality).

The ST's processor is clocked slightly faster than the Amiga's so 3D games which require heavy maths calculations will always be faster on the Atari machine – Starglider II is proof enough.

As far as colours go the Amiga wins hands down. While many of the modes on the ST and Amiga are similar, the Amiga can usefully display 32 colours on screen – and up to 64 colours using a slightly fudged mode known as halfbrite. The colour palettes of both machines are identical, but the ST can only display 16 colours normally. That said, the STE's extra sound and scrolling hardware mean that the processor can get on with things like displaying extra colours.

After all the hype, the STE fails to be Amigabeating. While the upgraded ST is undoubtedly a better machine than its predecessors it still hasn't overtaken the Commodore machine. Many of the STE's features are on a par with the Amiga's, but most fall a little short.

What to expect

Why should programmers bother writing for the STE? The market will be tiny to begin with. Exactly the same situation occurred when Atari fitted all 520s with double-sided drives. So many ST owners had single-sided drives that software houses couldn't use the second side for fear that too many users would complain. That situation hasn't changed yet, although some games do have extra features stored on the second side of the disk. How long will it before the STE is accepted as the standard? Probably never.

The only thing you can hope for is that programmers will write two versions of a software package. The top half of the disk could contain the standard ST version while the bottom half could contain the STE re-write. Let's hope that happens.

WHEN?

Both the STE and TT will be displayed by Atari at the PC Show held late in September. The machines aren't expected to be available until November.

DEEP INTO THE STE'S FIRMWARE

The ST and STE can accept an external sync supplied via a genlock so that synchronisation of the machine's video signal is possible with an external source. In order to do this reliably the system clock has to be phase-locked; no way of doing this is provided on the ST. The STE, however, allows this to be done by grounding pin three on the monitor connector and supplying the clock onto pin four (mono detect).

Registers between FF9200 and FF9202 can be used by the 68000 to read the status of the four new joystick ports. FF9210 to FF9216 look after paddles while FF9220 to FF9222 handles the light gun and light pen.

The video address counter (FF8204 to FF8208) is now read/write in the STE. This means that the video refresh address can be altered during a frame. FF820C allows positioning of the screen on word boundaries (vertical scrolling is thus possible).

A fourth bit has been added to each of the colour registers (starts at FF8240 and ends at FF825E), however, not in the location expected. The least significant bit is added above the most significant bit of the original palette registers. In this way colour will always be the same on the ST and STE.

Horizontal bit-wise scrolling is implemented by register FF8264.

A frame, or group of samples, can be played once or looped, the sample rate can be determined, and either stereo or mono output can be selected. The registers that provide this control start at FF8900.

Access to the LMC1992, which handles tone and volume, is possible via registers FF8922 to FF8924. The sort of thing the volume/tone control chip can do is set the master volume, set left and right channels individually, define treble and bass levels and mix the YM2149 and eight-bit DAC output.

Atari TT030-2

A very strange looking beast indeed. You either love it or loathe it. No UK price for the TT (standing for thirty-two thirty-two) has been finalised yet, but the German machine costs 5700DM. At today's exchange rates that's around £1900.

You're getting a fantastic deal when you realise what's involved: a Motorola 68030-based machine with some fancy graphics and sound hardware, 2Mb of memory, 30Mb hard drive and a high resolution colour monitor. Atari seems to have adopted Amstrad's all-in-one philosophy. And that's no bad thing.

The TT has all the ST ports – DMA, MIDI, cartridge, serial, parallel, mouse and joystick – together with some extras. There's a SCSI and ASCII port for attaching just about any type of high-capacity storage system, an Ethernet socket for hooking into a network and an internal VME bus for connecting virtual memory devices (like a hard drive).

The keyboard and mouse are identical to those offered on the Mega ST.

Atari's TT runs an upgraded version of the ST's operating system, TOS 030. The new OS is necessary because the '030 can access four gigabytes (although the TT can only have 26Mb maximum on board) and there are minor instruction differences between the '030 and the 68000.

Because the TT contains virtually all the hardware present in the ST and STE (see panel), almost 100% software compatibility is assured.

Another version of the TT (the TT/X) is due for release early next year and will come with 4Mb of system RAM, a 60-80Mb hard drive and both Unix V and TOS 030 operating systems. Price hasn't been decided yet, but is expected to fall between £3500 and £4000. Another bolt-on OS, MS-DOS, is due in the middle of next year.

For the price there is no beating the TT; an '030 machine with sophisticated sound and graphics technology for under £2000 is really something. The question who is going to use it, and for what. You can run ST software on the thing, but that

seems wasteful. Judging by the specifications, it is meant to compete with the Mac II market − but with no high performance software to back it up, just what is going to happen to it? The TT/X will obviously become a low-cost Unix workstation while the TT could − in a few years time − turn out to be a neat games machine. Surely not! ●

PROCESSORS

The most vital piece of computer software for most serious users is the word processor - many use their micro for nothing else. Here is Express' verdict on the best you can find

Probably the most important 'serious' use of your micro is word processing. Anything from a letter to a novel is better prepared on a micro than on a typewriter: editing is easier and you can keep making those final adjustments right up to when you decide to print.

All word processors allow you to create, edit and print simple documents, and of course store them on disk or tape to enable future use. All let you move, copy or delete blocks of text, and use a variety of type styles. And you can set up different layouts - change margins and tab settings in a document and so on. Many packages allow you to write 'macros' - you give a series of commands which you can subsequently issue with a single command or keystroke (for example, copying all the chapters of your book from one disk to another for backup just by the one command DO BACKUP or suchlike). Fine for letters or doing the odd bit of writing.

What you pay for on the more expensive word processors will be spell checking facilities, word counters, the ability to display effects like bold and italic and different sizes on screen ('what you see is what you get' or WYSIWYG) and mail merge (send letters to each of various names in a list with each person's details automatically included in a letter - the 'Reader's Digest Prize Draw' letter we've all received some time). 'Serious' use - for writing or business will demand a program like this.

Really advanced programs let you include graphics in a document, work on several documents at once each in a separate 'window' on screen, automatically generate footnotes and indexes and bibliographies and so on. This is for the professional - the large-scale business user, academic or writer.

Here's the Express guide to the best word processors for each machine. A brief description and the highlights and drawbacks of each are included. In 'Value for Money' five stars is the maximum

TIP Seeing the light





Programming houses pander to the applications areas in which they can make money i.e. games, business software etc. There are some very good teaching programs available, you just have to find them. One of the best packages on the market is from Database Educational Software and is a series of programs covering many themes under the title Fun School. The software covers all primary school ages

and includes the traditional subjects presented in a new, novel and effective way (the programs even managed to oust games programs from the 'best seller' charts for a while). AMIGA BLIT

1.4 Latest

After a period of deadly silence, a unbelievable large amount of information is finally starting to flood through to the ears of the average user concerning the next major operating system update, version 1.4 of Kickstart and Workbench.

At the recent Developers' Conference held in San Francisco, Commodore unveiled its plans concerning its most ambitious upgrade yet. Already alpha test versions of the new OS are in the hands of several major UK software developers, and from what I've already seen of the new OS, 1.4 is going to revolutionise your Amiga.

The first, and most major difference between 1.4 and other releases will be immediately apparent as soon as you boot you Amiga. According to sources close to Commodore in the States, the company have hired an artist to totally redesign the look of the Workbench to give it a more professional look.

Commodore seem to have learnt a lot of lessons from the success of the Macintosh windowing environment, as many enhancements give the Amiga Workbench a more Mac-like feel. Firstly, no longer will files be hidden from Workbench users just because they don't have icons, with 1.4 you'll also be able to view the complete contents of a disk as a list of filenames in a text window.

Also just like the Mac, 1.4 will include standardised system requesters for carrying out such tasks as file i/o, which should help to make the Amiga easier to master for beginners. Check out next week's column for even more juicy info about 1.4!

Uridium To Reach The Amiga?

Anyone who owned a Commodore 64 before upgrading to an Amiga will instantly recognise the name of Andrew Braybrook. Andrew was responsible for a string of hits on the 64 such as Gribbly's Day Out (remember that one!), Paradroid and of course the infamous Uridium.

Andrew is currently in the process of putting the finishing

touches to his conversion of the Taito coinop, Rainbow Islands, but he has still found time to start work on ST and Amiga versions of one of my favourite 64 games, Paradroid. For those of you who have not played the game, you basically control a small remote droid that has to destroy a large space ship by destroying the crew of robots. The game is played from a bird's eye view and features some very effective bass relief graphics.

The conversation soon got around to the question that Andrew has probably been asked a million times before – 'Will there be an Amiga version of *Uridium?'*. Well, I'm glad to report that the game is in the pipeline but Andrew himself will not be working on it. 'If I was to write *Uridium*, I would upgrade to to true 16 bit standard. It would probably only run on an Amiga.' Andrew replied.

Whether Uridium ever reaches the streets very much depends on the success of Paradroid. If Paradroid sells well (which I hope it does – it's a fine game), then Uridium is more than a distinct possibility.

Yet another Abacus book!

It seems that not a single week passes us by without that prolific publisher of Amiga specific book, Abacus, releasing yet another title for our beloved machine.

The latest addition to their already bulging catalogue is Amiga Graphics Inside & Out, which provides a complete insight into the workings of the Amiga's powerful graphics system. The book covers such areas as View structures, ViewPorts, RastPorts, screens, windows and a lot more besides.

Whether you're an AmigaBASIC hacker or an assembler mastermind, Amiga Graphics Inside & Out includes a section for your particular language. Areas covered include HAM mode (including source to access it from BASIC), Super Bitmaps, blitter objects and Copper programming.

Yet another digitiser!

It must have been the hot weather! For some unknown reason, the Amiga video digitiser market has suddenly be flooded with a large number of new releases.

First there was Vidi, now from Power Computing comes Videon, a full colour digitiser. Videon is a powerful software/hard-ware combination that allows you to digitise images from any colour video source without having to purchase a separate RGB splitter. Videon employs digital filtering to allow the most detailed grabs possible.

Using a special bypass system, Videon allows you to view both the source video signal and the final grab on screen simultaneously, therefore avoiding the need for constant swapping of leads. Screen resolutions supported include high, medium and low in both standard or overscan mode.

Arnor take on database market

Yet more power

This week FAST Technology announced the release of a new accelerator board for the ST. This is just weeks after Hypercache, Third Coast's own speed-up board, came onto the market

The Turbo 16 incorporates a 16MHz CMOS 68000 CPU just like the Hypercache but the big difference between the two is Turbo's 32K memory cache.

Hypercache only included 8K of memory which meant that just 8K of instructions could be loaded into the cache at once. Consequently, if a program loop or subroutine was more than 8K in length then the entire routine could not be loaded into the cache so the full benefits of a 16MHz expansion could not be realised. Turbo's 32K buffer will mean that four times more space can accommodate instructions and the 16MHz chip will be used more efficiently. This would make speed increases of up to 100% far more likely although FAST say that increases from 60% up are typical.

The Turbo 16 will fit all STs by removing the CPU and replacing it with Turbo 16 which then connects directly to the internal 16MHz clock. The Turbo 16 will cost £299 – twice the price of Hypercache.

Upgrades don't fit

For some time now Third Coast having been making a song and dance about the way that their new RAM upgrades will fit any ST without difficulty. The instruction manual which comes with the upgrade unit even reiterates this fact. However, this week I tried fitting a 1Mb expansion into a 520 ST as described in the manual only to find that certain 520s will not accept the upgrade board.

The RAMs are supposed to fit into the memory management unit (MMU) with the pins from the board slotting down the sides of those in the MMU. However, certain 520's contain surface-mounted MMU's which have been soldered directly into the main board so there is no space to accomodate the RAM upgrade.

Third Coast now admit that certain 520s cannot be upgraded but they're promising a full refund for anyone unable to fit the board.

Headline news

ST font packages are fairly thin on the ground and designing your own might be remedy to the problem but coming up the entire range of upper and lower case characters is not exactly appealing. Gate Seven Computers have tried to resolve the problem by releasing Headline – a piece of software which works like Letraset in that it allows you to load up to four fonts into memory at once and paste them down onto a blank screen. The result can then be saved onto disk in a variety of formats and loaded into art or DTP packages so that a wide variety of headlines can be created.

Having spent a while playing with Headline, I can see that it could hold enormous possibilities for anyone interested in producing letterheads or other special text effects. There are lots of fonts contained on the Headline disk and these give you access to a vast range of interesting styles which I've never seen in any ST DTP package.

To use Headline you first choose which fonts you want to load into memory and then you're presented with a blank screen. Typing on this screen produces text in the selected font, alternatively you can import ASCII files and convert them to different fonts. All the fonts provided have very large point-sizes so that they may be reduced from within other packages without losing quality, or printed at 100% for perfect headlines.

The program is particularly suited for use with Signum 2 since it displays text rulers using the same parameters as Signum and it formats text to fit directly into Signum documents using any user-defined magnification.

Headline is a German package, distributed in the UK by Gate Seven Computers. There are six fonts provided in the basic package which costs £49.95 while another 50 fonts are available on two DS disks at £20 each

SoftKick off

Anyone using Ventura Publisher and spending all their time scrolling round the screen with the scroll bars, will notice the difference in speed and ease of use SoftKicker provides. This is a nifty little program which fools Ventura into thinking it is working with an ultrahigh resolution monitor of 1024 x 1024 pixels. This is the kind of resolution provided by the full A3 DTP monitors which can cost up to

What SoftKicker does is to map an area of the high resolution 'screen' onto an EGA or VGA monitor. As you move your pointer to the edges of the Ventura screen so the screen scrolls to another part of the page. The scroll bars are a thing of the past on a VGA screen and only occasionally needed on EGA. As a bonus, you can switch from an actual size view to a full page view. In this mode a small magnifying box appears on the left-hand side of the screen and follows the pointer to show whatever you're looking at at full resolution. The product costs £69.95 plus VAT and can be had from the Ctrl Alt Deli (0908) 662759.

Canon printer

While on about DTP, a subject I find it hard to leave for long (I've noticed - Ed), Canon are about to release a new laser printer onto the market. Nothing remarkable in that, from the company that makes 80% of all the laser engines in the world. No, but it's obviously necessary to revamp the standard 300DPI, eight page per minute laser printer that they've been selling for the last n years. They could increase the resolution, they could increase the speed, but both these option

Instead they've taken the software approach, which may or may not prove a winner. The new Canon LBP-8 Mark III printer offers the same speed and resolution as previous models, but comes as standard with 1.5Mb of memory and rescalable fonts a la PostScript, but fast. What is odd, though, or perhaps not when you think of the economics, is the hard disks attached to this kit. It's not widely known that yer average Centronics parallel printer port actually has the ability to receive data as well as to send it. I'm led to believe this is something to do with the remains of an old mainframe communications protocol. The outcome is that connected to two parallel printer ports, Fast-Lynx can transfer data at up to 500,000 baud and that's shifting. It's so fast that it's been known to display the message 'Waiting for hard disk write' when transferring files.

Also included with FastLynx is a utility to let you run a slave PC's disks from a host machine. This has been done before with a program called Brooklyn Bridge, but not through a printer cable, and not at 500,000 baud! £125 plus VAT for this one.

Psion laptop

A recent report in the trade journal Micro-Scope pulled some interesting facts out of the hat about Psion's rumoured new range of laptops. It appears the company is to release a range of A4 machines, some compatible with their existing Organiser hand-held micros, and others running MS-DOS. The screens don't seem to be a highlight of the design, but the portables are intended to have battery life of several months and to have storage in 'flash' EPROM.

Flash EPROM takes the form of memory chips which can be written to like any other Programmable Read Only Memory. Unlike these chips, however, it can be erased with electrical signals rather than having to be exposed to ultra-violet light for several minutes. This in effect removes the need for battery-backed storage or disk drives in the Psion machine, which should drastically

> reduce its power needs. The machines are due for volume production in the autumn, which presumably means a launch at the PC Show in Septem-



A way with words?

Two new utilities for the CPC both aim to assist you with your letters, in one way or another.

Have you ever found yourself lost for words, unable quite to summon the exact one you have on the tip of your tongue? Me too. So I was very interested to see that Siren Software has brought out Keyword, described as "a dynamic word finder for home and business use." It is said to have been written by a professional journalist for his own use, "and therefore has been designed to be as simple to use in the shortest time possible" (rather a slur on the intelligence of journos if you ask me - but perhaps justified!).

You install Keyword as an RSX which you can call up at any time simply by typing IKW. Then you enter a word similar to the one you think you're looking for, and you're into a kind of instant access thesaurus. Think of it as looking at the index of a book thesaurus, but without then having to search for "461n."

The problem with the program as it currently stands is that it contains 10,000 words. Now that may sound a lot, but believe me it's far fewer than even the cheapest of paperback thesauruses (thesauri?). Although you have to think up three or four words which have entries for every one which doesn't, I feel that's still an unacceptably high failure rate. And at £29.95 it's an expensive word finder compared with the perhaps slower but certainly more comprehensive traditional book method.

"It seems as if a fault on the +3's board has meant that it just can't cope with what the AY-3-8912 sound chip ask of it, especially if three channel sound is played. The way the +3's hardware mixes and outputs the sound from the AY chip is slightly wrong and as a result the overall sound output often seems saturated and sound modulation occurs which causes the distortion and fuzziness. Even though according to Amstrad, there is no fault with the +3's sound, they still managed to try and fix the non-existent fault, and as a result, version 4.1 +3s contain a botch on the sound chip hardware which, not unlike the old Sinclair botches, doesn't completely fix the problem but makes it a bit more acceptable"

GAMEPLAY • The scenario of APB is simple; clear the streets of bad guys and make the town safe for decent citizens to get on with their daily lives! You take the part of the over-hassled cop, Officer Bob, equipped only with his police car to take on the might of the underworld...

This is, of course, a conversion from the highly popular and successful Tengen arcade game. Naturally, the car can be supercharged with guns, extra speed, brakes, acceleration and all the other things you'd expect.

On every third level, an APB is issued; when this happens it means there's an extra tough criminal on the loose, who must be captured, and then returned to the station for "questioning". Beat up the suspect by waggling the joystick, but make sure you've finished by the time the chief comes in.

Messing anything up, from failing to bring in an offender to wrecking the car, clocks you another demerit point. Too many of these, and it's bye bye to the Police Force.

GRAPHICS AND SOUND • Even with the obvious limitations on colour, the graphics on the Spectrum version of APB are excellent. The scrolling is smooth and the sprites are all clear;

the only problem is the monochrome, but there's really no way around that. Sound is equally impressive; the music is as good as you're likely to hear on a Spectrum, it's catchy and really adds another element of playability to a game which doesn't really need it!

OTHER VERSIONS • We've seen the 64 version of this, and frankly, it's

not as impressive; still a worthwhile buy, but it's not quite as much of an achievement as the Spectrum version.

VERDICT

Brilliant! It's not all that often that Spectrum owners are treated to a conversion as accurate and enjoyable as this one (OK, so New Zealand Story was great as well) Got a Spectrum? Go out and buy it now!

NAME BEHIND THE GAME

Walking Circles, the company behind the programming of APB, is also responsible for another of Domark's recent releases -The Living Daylights, the film of the Bond movie (as if anyone didn't know!). Other than that, its name isn't one which would exactly make the corridors of software history shake. Unlike, say, Design Design, and, yes, Walking Circles and Design Design (and an even older company called Crystal Computing) are one and the same. Way, way back in the proverbial mists of time, there was a Spectrum game called Halls of the Things, a sort of mazes and monsters game, with really

awful graphics, but

the most terrific playability. It was a game which would hardly merit a second glance from many people these days, but back then, six or so years ago, it was something really special.


Crystal are one of the few companies who can really take the credit (or the blame, depending on how you look at it) for making the Spectrum "happen". Then, in the mid-eighties, Crystal relaunched themselves as Design Design. They wrote such classics (you can tell I like these guys, can't you!) as Dark Star, Forbidden Planet, and 2112 A.D.. One more relaunch later, it became Walking Circles (well, most of it did; I know one of

the old Design Design team has sold out to respectability and become an Apple dealer in Shrewsbury!), and here we have APB. It's been working on it since January; it wasn't easy, but at last it materialised, and a very pleasing game it is

Things like the sprites and the train caused particular problems for the programmers, but obviously things turned out OK in the end. The cheat mode however, is a no-go, at least on the Commodore; actually fitting the game into the memory space available was no mean feat, and a cheat mode might be a bit much to ask in the two bytes that they had left at the end!





It couldn't have been much better; I'm afraid I couldn't visualise Gemini Wing making a successful conversion onto the Spectrum.

Hot news on the U.S. Gold front; Indiana Jones; The Graphic Adventure should be on release at the end of September, on the ST, Amiga, and PC, at £24.99 on the first two and £29.99 on the PC.

Loricel's self-explanatory (I hope!) Pinball Simulator and Tank Simulator are both expected sometime in October.

• Fans of the classic Epyx Games series will be glad to see the launch of *The Games*; Summer Edition on the ST and Amiga, at the end of September. ST owners don't even have to wait that long; California Games should be out on their machines by the middle of September. Also from Epyx is Pools of Radiance; this will be out on ST and Amiga towards the end of October.

Lucasfilm is promising an adventure called Maniac Mansion for the end of October. Apparently featuring everything from love and lust to world domination, it might be one to watch; look out for it on C64, ST, Amiga and PCs.

PC owners who have seen the Spectrum version of Microprose's Soccer have their very own version to look forward to, on September 8th, at £24.95.

Help save the world (though a little more seriously than usual!) with Rainbow Warrior, named after the famous Greenpeace ship, out on (wait for it...) Spectrum, CPC, C64, ST and Amiga in early September.

Again due for the first week in September, is Mr Heli on (here we go again) Spectrum, CPC, C64, ST and Amiga.

Good news and bad news for CPC owners, the first is that Carrier Command should be out very soon on disk for £14.99. The bad news is that there's not going to be a cassette version; apparently, there's too much data to fit on the tape.



Sheet faced

Amstrad's sheet feeder is now out for the 9512. Mail order company RSC of Watford used to do one so Amstrad's effort is not the first, but it seems a very good piece of kit.

For £99 plus VAT you get a device that clips on to the 9512 printer and feeds single sheets of A4 repeatedly for mail merge runs. This means you can avoid using continuous paper for those mailouts and put them on your letterheaded paper instead. You get two new systems disks with it, LocoScript 2.29 and CP/M 2.29 which both have sheet feeder options in printer setup.

It works fine from LocoScript but not from CP/M, so Protext and Mini Office users may as well forget it. A5 paper won't fit but anything around A4 will, and most acoustic hoods won't take the unit; maybe they ought to supply a pair of ear plugs with the sheet

For Filofax sake

You can use standard continuous paper as Filofax inserts. Just keep your page lengths less than 39 lines and your margins at about 8 and 56 (17 pitch). When you print out, the Filofax rings will fit into the holes at the side of the continuous paper (you cut out the paper around the middle ring in each group).

Killer Bs

One thing I find increasingly annoying about the PCW 8512 is the way it keeps thinking the B drive isn't there. If, on booting up, you put the B disk in just between the last bar appearing and the opening titles in LocoScript or CP/M, the B drive is completely ignored. The solution is, of course, a simple restart with both disks in the drive - but why on earth should it happen in the first place?

Sod's Law states that the disk that gets corrupted is always the one you didn't back up that happens to have all your customer records on, your life's work thesis, your collected names and addresses, and the secret recipe for Coca Cola.





Buying a printer

If you are thinking of getting a printer for your OL, I might be able to save you some money!

One of the shortcomings of the QL is the lack of a Centronic or parallel printer port. Printers with parallel interfaces are somewhat cheaper than serial printers. Moreover, they also tend to be much easier to get working, as the Centronics interface is more of a universal standard than that using the RS-232 system.

One of Miracle Systems' Centronics adaptors is the answer. This little unit has two leads, one is plugged into the QL SER1 or SER2 port, and the other plugs into the printer. Using a parallel printer with your QL means that if you subsequently downgrade to a PC, Amiga or ST, you can still use your parallel printer on the new machine, leaving the serial port free for a modem.

Stewart Honeyball of Miracle tells me he has sold something like 15,000 of these adaptors, which probably makes it the best-selling QL add-on. A similar adaptor is also available for the Psion Organiser.

The adaptor costs £29. Miracle is on (0904) 423986.

String functions




