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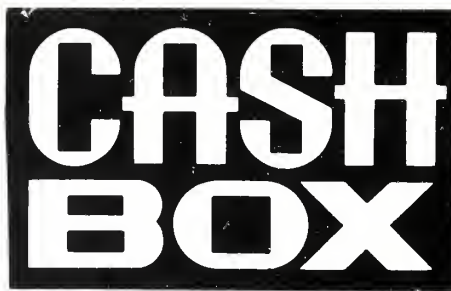

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BMG GRABS PRIVATE: The Bertelsmann Music Group (BMG) has acquired Private Music, it was announced jointly by Private Music president and CEO Ron Goldstein, BMG chairman and CEO Michael Dornemann and Private Music founder Peter Baumann.

Goldstein, who has served as Private's president/CEO for the past seven years described the acquisition as "a natural evolution of growth and a major boost" for the highly successful independent record label. Goldstein commented that "the deal preserves Private Music's steady role as a significant 'niche' record company in the adult marketplace—a profile that will expand in vision and direction. We welcome the vigorous confidence of BMG, expressed through its spirit of entrepreneurialism, in the continued autonomy of our artist signings, marketing strategies and daily operations."

The label was founded eight years ago by musician/producer Peter Baumann, an early member of the innovative electronic band, *Tangerine Dream*. Baumann, who will act as a creative consultant to the label, sold 50% of his interest in Private Music to BMG in 1992.

PASSING: Stanley Adams, the lyricist who served as president of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) for a total of 24 years, died recently at North Shore Hospital in Manhasset, New York, at the age of 86 after a short illness. An energetic and dedicated leader of the Society, Adams provided strong guidance for ASCAP through two significant decades of its history. He oversaw the opening of ASCAP's first Nashville Membership office, establishing ASCAP as a major force in country music. He was also a leader in the successful effort in 1976 to have Congress revise the U.S. Copyright Law of 1909 which, among other provisions, put an end to the decades-long exemption from the Copyright Law enjoyed by jukebox operators. As a songwriter, Adams, who scored a major success with "What A Diff'rence A Day Made," also contributed lyrics to melodies by America's most popular composers.

Mr. Adams, who resided in Great Neck, N.Y., is survived by his wife Berenice, a grandson, Adam Hammil of Boston, and two stepsons, John Levin of Myrtle Beach, S.C., and Andrew Levin of Great Neck. Funeral services will be private, with a public memorial program to be announced in the near future.

5 FORM 24: EMI Music, PolyGram Holding Inc., Sony Software Corp., Ticketmaster Corp. and Warner Music Group announced plans to form a partnership that will operate an advertiser-supported, 24-hour video music channel to be offered as a basic cable service in the United States and Puerto Rico.

The channel will seek additional partners, including cable television operators, in the new venture.

The partners' U.S. affiliates engaged in the recorded music business will license music videos to the channel and will continue to license their music videos to other entities. The channel plans to license music videos from all available sources. Launch of the channel is anticipated for the fourth quarter of 1994.

SONY QUAKES WITH RELIEF: In an effort to speed the healing and recovery process of its Los Angeles-area employees in the wake of the January 17 disaster, Sony Music Entertainment (SME) has established an Earthquake Relief Grant Fund to take effect immediately.

"Our thoughts have been with our West Coast co-workers in the days that have followed the earthquake," the staff was told in a letter sent this week by Thomas D. Mottola, president & COO, SME. We understand the emotional stress many of you are experiencing, and the personal hardship this crisis has created. We are with you every step of the way, and ready to help at these most trying times."

To launch the Fund, SME has donated \$25,000. Sony Corporation of America is matching the amount with \$25,000, which brings the initial total to \$50,000. The Sony Music Human Resources Department at the company's Santa Monica headquarters will begin processing grant applications in amounts up to \$1,500 for each employee.

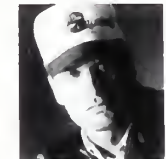

Taj Mahal!

LET ME BEGIN BY SAYING I don't believe I've ever seen anybody work a crowd with as much ease and skill as **Taj Mahal** at the Bottom Line on Monday. No kidding! A turn of the head and they'd be singing along, clapping their hands, whatever. Perhaps it's Mahal's obvious comfort with himself, something in the way he struts onto the stage, something that gives you the sneaky suspicion that he's about to *get down*. He began with "Blues With A Feeling," singing, "How can you love me so cold?" with a voice that was as nimble and melodic as it was gritty

and genuine. His keyboard style mixed a rollicking, chunky bassline with articulate, right-hand blues lines, filling in the gaps on his gleeful "Big-leg Mammias Are Back In Style Again" (Kate Moss and company be damned).

He's as diverse as any solo performer might hope to be, conjuring different tones out of both his voice and accompanying instruments. He switched to the guitar for his arrangement of "Corina, Corina" and "Dust My Broom," employing a finger-picking country blues style, feeding the sound through an effects device. "I never understood that one," he explained. "'Believe I'll dust my broom'? Uh, right, whatever you say. Turns out the guy who wrote it meant 'Dust my room,' I was told. 'Alright, I said, I'll buy that.'" His humor gave way to a look inside, the plaintive sound of him singing, "My baby knows I'm in New York City/But she don't know where I am."

Recently, Mahal has been involved with resurrecting a Langston Hughes musical overseas entitled *Mudbone*, and he performed an unnamed tune from that, which displayed his ability to apply his vocal approach to a less-blues-oriented melody, although a lot of his songs display other influences as it is. He's got a new record out with a band, *Dancing The Blues* (Private Music) and he's planning a summer tour with a similar group.

"**OH, I LOVE TAJ'S SINGING** and playing," says Al Kooper. "He's so versatile." I caught up with Kooper the next chilly morning to find out what has inspired him over the years, and what has resulted in his new *ReKooperation* (MM, distributed by BMG). "MM is a jazz label, and they came to me wanting me to record. 'I'm not going to make a jazz album,' I explained, and they said 'Fine, do whatever you want.'" What he wanted was a collection of renditions of his favorite soul instrumentals, with players like alto saxophonist **Hank Crawford**, guitarist **Jimmy Vivino** and drummer **Anton Fig**. "But the album is on the top five on the charts or something as a jazz album," he laughs. (Hey, if there's hardly any singing and no orchestra or synthesizers, it must be jazz, right?)

Kooper has been all over the history of rock, with *Blood Sweat and Tears*, jamming with **Hendrix**, **The Rolling Stones**, **Michael Bloomfield**, producing **Lynyrd Skynyrd**, **Nils Lofgren** and **The Tubes**. "One band I'd love to work with is **King's X**," citing the mixture of elements in their music.

"But a lot of new stuff in R&B I can't get excited about. There's a lot of singing that's really quite good, but the tracks are machine-music...I miss real guys playing spontaneous licks, and now it doesn't mix together the same. I also feel like a lot of the art form has gone from the lyrics many times." Kooper is excited about the new possibilities of computer-assisted production, saying he was thrilled with the digital mastering of *ReKooperation*, and he spends a lot of time fussing with computers in his studio.

He'll also be spending some time at The Bottom Line this weekend, where he'll be corralling a host of players for a three-day extravaganza of blues, soul and funk.

I Mother Earth

TROUBADOUR, WEST HOLLYWOOD, CA—Give Toronto's I Mother Earth credit for one thing: the band is ambitious. Mixing standard heavy metal riffs, smatterings of jazz and funk stylings, soaring, Janes Addiction-inspired vocals and lots of unexpected polyrhythms, the quartet went to great lengths, with the assistance of famed metal producer Mike (Guns N' Roses, Megadeth) Clink, to create an album that stands out from most of its contemporaries. But where I Mother Earth scored on its Capitol debut, *Dig*, it fails in the live setting.

The quartet, in its haste to create an original and exciting sound, instead seems overwhelmed by its zeal, lost in a wave of metallic noise that's ultimately no more satisfying than any number of forgotten heavy bands that were washed away at the end of the '80s. Apparently using early Santana Band fusions as a guide, I Mother Earth lacks that group's soul and instinct for dynamic, leaving much of its stage effort sounding limp and unfocused.

The packed Troubadour did respond to many of the band's songs, in particular "Not Quite Sonic," the group's new single, and "Rain Will Fall," a headknocking cut that spent two months at the top of many metal radio airplay charts last autumn. But as the 70-minute show wore on, it was clear that, in spite of lofty intentions, I Mother Earth has not yet developed an understanding of concert dynamics or the musical subtleties necessary to pull off its intended style.

ROXY, WEST HOLLYWOOD, CA—It's always fun to watch up-and-coming artists perform while still relatively unknown. The raw energy and enthusiasm, which often fade when the performers become jaded "stars," are what initially make those performers so appealing to begin with.

Such was the case at the Roxy last Tuesday night when Bill Grisolia and the Attachments played their rollicking set to a highly appreciative and vocal crowd. And, guess what? Many in the audience actually left their seats and (gulp!) DANCED!! Were we still in blasé L.A. or did the quake stir them up enough to make their feet move before the ground did? Either way, it was refreshing to see so many people enjoying themselves and reacting so enthusiastically to Grisolia's catchy pop/rock ditties.

The Roadapple recording artists opened the show with their single, "Judgement Day," then proceeded to captivate the hearts and feet of the audience with "Food Chain," "Heart Of America," "Big House" and a showstopping "Rosarita." The material, written by Grisolia, has a Billy Joel/early Springsteen sound and feel to it, with strong, hooky melodies in abundance. Grisolia stood centerstage playing keyboards and singing lead. He was ably assisted by bandmembers David Goldman on guitar, Scott Duncan on bass and Nigel Godden on drums.

Singles



■ **FREDDY GUTIERREZ: "Si Estuvieras Tu"** (EMI-Latin H2Y27189)

This single from his most recent album: *Rumores* is an original composition by Freddy Gutierrez. This particular tune contains an assortment of rhythmic Salsa blends, like a simmering, home-brewed sauce on a low flame. The longer it cooks, the better it gets. Freddy supplies a strong lead vocal which is complemented with an outstanding choral background. All of this is embraced by resounding percussion and brass arrangements that pull you into the core of the song. This one is definitely a "grab your honey and hit the dance floor" type of tune. Not a surprise that it's getting a considerable amount of airplay.

Albums

■ **BATIMCO: *Batimco*** (J&N Jazz-1001)

Batimco is a composite acronym whose three syllables stand for *bata*, *timbal* and *conga*, all traditional Afro-Caribbean percussion instruments. Marti Cuevas and Jorge Sylvester team up their reeds in a flawless production cooperative. "Zabaleta" starts off with an Afro-Cuban intro supported by rich diminished chords from staccato-like keyboards. There is also the perfect fusion of alto, soprano, tenor sax and flute articulated masterfully by both Cuevas and Sylvester. "One For Ahmad," co-written by Pearson & Sylvester, showcase the talent of Glenn Pearson as a premier pianist/composer. Joining in on the fun are Brian Kirk (drums), Rob Holland (bass) and David Frazier (percussion). Collectively, they homogenize their talents to produce one of the best structured Latin-Jazz album in the market today. A musical potpourri that will satisfy all your desires for imaginative music. This one should sell well into the summer. Thanks to Gloria Figueroa, J&N Records/NYC for the turn-on.

■ **PATATO: *Master Piece*** (Messidor 15827-2)

You say "POTATO," I say "PATATO." In any language it translates into the one and only Carlos "Patato" Valdes. The man with the golden hands. No other percussionist in the history of Afro-Cuban music has been more influential than Patato who, among many other outstanding achievements, invented the tuned conga drum. Even the famed percussion manufacturer L.P. Percussion, has a Patato series in their catalogue. At 67, he's well on his 56th year in the business of making music. His career has extended into Cuba, U.S. and Europe, and he has performed with such musical notables as: La Sonora Matancera, Machito, Tito Puente, Dizzy Gillespie, Art Blakey and Quincy Jones to name a few. Oddly enough Patato has recorded only two solo albums in his illustrious career. His latest in 1984 was arranged and co-produced by the late Jorge Dalto. Unfortunately Dalto, the Argentine pianist who mastered both Cuban and Jazz, was already terminally ill. After Dalto's death in 1987, his widow, Adela Dalto, gave the masters to Messidor. The company completed the album with Patato, and the rest is history. This masterpiece hits you from all musical sides with a tropical blend of Tango, Bolero, Rumba, Bat'a and Latin Jazz. Now with the resurging force of Latin Jazz, this deep Afro-Cuban, multi-stylistic context has arrived at the right time signature of life. Ladies and gentlemen, there isn't one weak cut on this album. It slams from beginning to end. Ten cuts of pure musical energy, the way it should be. Check out "Cute" and "El Montuno de Patato," which truly demonstrate this man's prowess on the skins. He can still slap them hard and fast. This is my definitive choice for "Pick Of The Week."

Gloria Estefan: Waxworks

GLORIA ESTEFAN...Just before Christmas Gloria Estefan was immortalized by being included in London's premier waxworks exhibition of Madame Tussaud. Gloria herself unveiled a unique wax portrait which was the latest exhibition to join 50 Rock and Pop legends in the company's *Rock Circus*.

The portrait was created by sculptor Paul Bainbridge and Gloria described the likeness as "truly spooky." What made the exhibition even more lifelike is the fact that Gloria herself supplied the costumes, shoes and jewelry. The outfit was the one she wore in the "Get On Your Feet" video and tour.

The *Rock Circus* portrait is a once-in-a-lifetime honor to celebrate her music and global success of selling 50 Platinum albums worldwide and having 17 Top Ten hits. And it cost in excess of \$37,000 to create.

STILL ON THE MOVE...The merry-go-round of top spots in British record companies is still going on with the announcement that PolyGram UK chairman Roger Ames has moved A&M MD Howard Berman to the top spot at Phonogram. Berman has been with the company for 11 years.

International VP and former Mute general manager Osman Eralp takes over as acting MD of A&M in Berman's place.

MCA also had changes last week with both product and artist liaison managers leaving. Neither will be replaced in the short term.

VH-1 ON HOLD...The UK launch of MTV's adult music channel VH-1 has been put back until later in the year. The new station was due to target the 25-50 age group and a date of May 1 had initially been floated at the beginning of this year. I understand that this has been set back even further while "advertising and production staff are recruited and the concept is fine tuned." MTV programming director says: "We never officially set the start of VH-1 in May and want to be very careful in our approach and will be working on it over the coming months."

PUBLISHING...EMI Music Publishing and Warner Chappell both lost market share during the last quarter of 1993 and the other side of

the coin was the improved performances by both Carlin Music and MCA Music.

Carlin scored with Meat Loaf's "I'd Do Anything For Love" and the quirky "Mr Blobby" and these two hits helped raise the company from 3.2% the previous quarter to 10%.

MCA scored 8% thanks mainly to Capella's "U Got 2 Let The Music" and Eternal's version of "Stay." This was more than double their market share for the same quarter in 1992.

EMI combined share at 21.2% was more than 8% down on their 1992 figures and Warner Chappell at 16.9% were down about the same amount.

Other publishing companies that gained were Zomba who had 4.8% thanks to Bryan Adams and Jazzy Jeff & Fresh Prince and Phil Collins helped Hit & Run make 2.5%

DISTRIBUTION...EMI already looks on course to make even more gains this year as it finished 1993 as the UK's biggest albums distributor in the final quarter of 1993. It is four years since it held that position. Its 29.4% share is the biggest in distribution since surveys began in 1988 and leaves PolyGram on 20.7% trailing by nearly nine points.

The year-on increase for EMI was even more impressive at 76% and much of this must go to the current success of Virgin. Amongst the individual labels Virgin accounted for around 10%—its highest share yet and when you add 9.4% of the singles market it has to be the best performance by any label since CBS got 10.1% for singles and 11.5% for albums during the first quarter of 1985.

PolyGram, however, still dominated the singles market with a massive 26.8% about a third up on the same period in 1992 and more than double Sony's share.

LIVE...More than 250 companies from the live music industry exhibited at the *Outdoor Event '94* and *Live Music Production Exhibition* at London's Wembley and around 5,000 people attended over the three days.

CHARTS...Basically it has been a fairly sluggish week as far as Top Ten is concerned. Dream's "Things Can Only Get Better" still holds the top spot with sales about the same as the second and third successes—Bryan Adams' "All For Love" and K7's "Come Baby Come"—put together.

Highest new entry of the 14 making their debut this week is Enigma and "Return To Innocence" at #9 but "Cornflake Girl" by Tori Amos and "Breathe Again" by Toni Braxton are still rising and possibly the biggest surprise of the week is country star Garth Brooks going from #22 to #13 with "The Red Strokes."

Music is getting really international with Germany having an even bigger say in our charts and currently Culture Beat, Haddaway and Enigma are all in our singles Top Ten.

As far as Enigma is concerned we really are talking international with a Romanian (Michael Cretu) his German wife, Sandra, who actually record on the Spanish island of Ibiza.

In the Dance singles Dream is obviously top but two newcomers take the second and third spot with "Get Off Your Horse" by Rollo and "Can't Take Your Love" by Pauline Henry making their debut.

In the album section 1994's first new entrants appear with *Mirror Blue* by Richard Thompson and Toni Braxton's eponymous album. But it is the re-entries that are really causing the shock waves.

Chaka Demus & Pliers extended and reissued *Tease Me* only just made the Top 30 last July but it romps to the peak of our album charts this week, selling at least twice as many copies as Diana Ross' *One Woman—The Ultimate Collection* which is in second place. *Tease Me* is only the fourth reggae album ever to reign at the top of our charts.

k.d. lang appeared on television on the BBC2 *Unplugged* series and this has meant that *Ingenue* shot back up the charts to #12.

INTERNATIONAL / FILM

NEWS FROM JAPAN

THE TOTAL SHIPMENTS of 25 major record manufacturers affiliated with RIAJ (Record Industries Association of Japan) for the first six months of fiscal 1993 (April to September 1993), according to a survey conducted by *Cash Box* Tokyo, totaled \$2,824 million, down 11.2% from the previous six months (October 1992 to March 1993) of \$3,182 million while going up 6.7% over the comparable six months of the prior fiscal year of \$2,646 million. Of the 25 record manufacturers, the Big Seven labels and their shares of shipments were as follows: 1. **Victor Entertainment**: Total Sales for the term were \$457 million, 15.57% share. 2. **Sony Music Entertainment**: \$454 million, 15.49% share. 3. **Toshiba-EMI**: \$368 million, 12.56% share. 4. **Pony Canyon**: \$320 million, 10.91% share. 5. **Polydor**: \$289 million, 9.86% share. 6. **Nippon Columbia**: \$186 million, 6.35% share. 7. **Pioneer LDC**: \$157 million, 5.34% share.

Individual sales according to items: CDs showed the greatest share of 66% with total sales of \$1,926 million, 8.5% down from the prior six months while up 8.4% over the comparable period of the prior fiscal year. Analogue reached \$780 million with a 0.3% share. Cassette tapes indicated \$116 million, 20% down from the prior six months and a 17% drop from the comparable six months of the prior fiscal year with a 4% share. Video softwares were \$657 million, a down of 10% from the prior six months and 13.3% up over the comparable six months of the previous fiscal year with a share of 22%. Domestic works showed 80% of the total with \$1,825 million while international titles were \$424 million with 19% of the total shipments.

FILM REVIEW

My Father The Hero

Gérard Depardieu becomes a hero to daughter Katherine Heigl and beau Dalton James in the beautiful Bahamas.

HEY, THERE'S NOTHING WRONG with fathers being heroes. That's a terrific trend, as a matter of fact. Wouldn't it be nice if that simple, dynamic title—*My Father The Hero*—struck a sympathetic chord in the majority of wandering, self-obsessed, hormones universally referred to as "teens." 'Course, it'd also be nice if it struck a sympathetic chord in the majority of wandering, self-obsessed, talk-show-fodder apes who appear to be "fathers" by biology only and inspire them to act like heroes (mothers take note too, that wasn't an immaculate conception, but you're not in *this* title)... What the hell, sometimes I just like spittin' in the wind.

This is a delightful movie which says something about relations between men and women on several levels: father/daughter, ex-husband/wife, lovers of all ages. Director Steve Miner smoothly blends the elements of slapstick, reality-based humor—and a neat surprise featuring an uncredited Emma Thompson—provided by screenwriters Francis Veber and Charlie Peters, based on *Mon Père, Ce Héros* by Gerard Lauzier and has pulled it into a fully satisfying piece of entertainment.

Veber and Peters have provided a bit of freshness and acceptability to a potentially touchy premise (especially given the dark sociological air hanging over anything which might touch on presumed child molestation today): 14-year-old daughter passing father off as lover to interest a young man at a Bahamian resort and the father playing along with it. They've done a terrific job.

The main hinge to the success which could also have been the major obstacle is that central role of the father. The casting of Gérard Depardieu seems inspired. He walks the line between outrageousness and tenderness with wonderful confidence and is hilarious in a pair of sequences, one sending up his own *Cyrano* while playing mouthpiece in the dark for his daughter and the other a take-off on fellow Frenchman Maurice Chevalier's "Thank Heaven For Little Girls."

Katherine Heigl is called upon to make the major performing transition from self-willed to understanding and maturing teen and she takes a neat turn with it. Dalton James is solid as the younger love interest. Lauren Hutton shows up briefly as feuding/understanding mom with love/hate relationship with daughter sending her off to vacation with pop.

Photographer Daryn Okada's camera captures and adds a wonderful lightness with all the brightness, warmth and beauty of the Nassau, Bahama beaches. Music by David Newman adds and The Baha Men keep the beaches hopping with several good tunes courtesy of Atlantic Recording Corp./Big Beat Records.

Producers were Jacques Bar and Jean-Louis Livi for the Touchstone Pictures presentation, Cité Films/Film Par Film/D.D. Production in association with The Edward S. Feldman Company with Feldman as exec producer.

TV REVIEW

The Cisco Kid

THERE HAS BEEN A DIALECTIC PROGRESSION of the characters Cisco Kid and his sidekick Pancho. In each incarnation of Ciscos, Warner Baxter, Gilbert Roland and Cesar Romero to the TV serial star Duncan Reynaldo, there was a refinement of the character's character, making him more ethnic without making him more a stereotype. We are talking Hollywood here. So there was always a taint on the authenticity of this Mexican (in reality a Mexican-American) hero.

But in this TV movie (which premiered Feb. 6, but will run on Turner Network Television throughout the month), director Luis Valdez attempts to further dignify the legend of Cisco and Pancho while serving up some family entertainment. These are not modest goals, but Valdez does manage to broaden the image, deepen the legend and have fun.

The latest in this line of Ciscos is former *L.A. Law* star Jimmy Smits, who plays an avaristic, romantically inclined Cisco who is eventually swayed to higher ground by the friendship with Pancho and the love of a woman who is the niece of a French general wrangling Maximillian's occupying army. Pancho is played effectively by veteran comedic actor Cheech Marin as a light-hearted *Juarezista* revolutionary and a dedicated family man. It is the interaction of this pair that boasts the most on-screen energy. Valdez and his cast are not trying to re-invent the wagon wheel, but they do manage to throw in a few twists and turns.

After Cisco and Pancho are unexpectedly saved from the firing squad, they strike up a tenuous alliance and decide to ride together to achieve mutual goals—Cisco wants to sell guns for money to the *Juarezistas* so they may improve their chances to oust the occupying French. He is slowly pulled into the fray as he is double-crossed by his *gringo* partners and begins to fall for Dominique (Sadie Frost), the niece of French general St. Martin Dupre (Bruce Payne).

While much of the film is a succession of battle scenes, swashbuckling western-style fights, Valdez and co-screenwriter Michael Kane work hard to infuse the film with some of the lightheartedness of the TV series and early films. One cantina scene is a snickering send-up of spaghetti westerns. Cisco and Pancho enter this lawless border town to find all the customers in the cantinas with scars on their faces and slurping up, what else?, spaghetti. Even the elderly *senorita* has a scar on her face.

This is entertainment for the family. It's not meant as a treatise on the role of the *caballeros*, in the shaping of the Old West. It gives glimpses, however, to such involvement and provides a little more historical backdrop to Mexico's early political and social development. But it's played for fun—and popcorn. The group War updates its '70s hit "The Cisco Kid" for a spicy addition to the movie. Gary Goodman and Barry Rosen produced with Moctesuma Esparza and Robert M. Katz serving as executive producers.

INDUSTRY PROFILE

Steve Kaplan

STEVE KAPLAN IS LOOKING for new writing talent, comedy writing talent specifically, for the newly formed *HBO New Writers Project* which he is heading up. To accomplish that Kaplan and his Wavy Line Productions, Inc., headquartered at HBO offices in Century City, are accepting projects from new writers—writers, according to submission guidelines, that are not "writing for, or are contracted to write for, a network TV show, national cable TV show or feature film." *New to Kaplan* doesn't necessarily mean that vestiges of the umbilical cord must still be present. He's looking for new "voices," he informed *Cash Box*.

Kaplan has been in the business of uncovering and nurturing new talent since the late 1970s when he formed the Manhattan Punchline Theatre in New York, a theatre company dedicated to comedy only. It was there he discovered talent such as (among others) Peter Tolan who went on to TV's *Home Improvement*, David Crane, creator of *Dream On* and Ted Talley who scripted *Silence Of The Lambs*. *Lambs* couldn't be considered "comedy" but Kaplan is of the belief that "if you discover a great writer, that writer will have a lot of stories." His belief also is that "if you look at the great writers today, you're looking at comedy writers" because the world has "turned around" since the '50s and '60s, and good writers find a way to reflect the times and its inconsistencies. Kaplan believes that the "best way to reflect the inconsistencies of the world is through comedy."

In talking with Kaplan one comes to the conclusion that he's a strong and true believer in comedy and comedy writers. Kaplan's also always looking for a way to allow that talent to "cross over"—from stage and theatre to TV and film—as he did in New York. There he found that the film medium of TV and features drew from the theatre writing talent. A year-and-a-half ago he came to L.A. for a month to look around, and he's still here. He says he saw "lots of theatre" but not the "cross over" for work, "very little recognition of one [film] for the other [theatre]." And he wanted to be "a prospector of young talent for the industry," much as he had been in New York.

Looking around for the best venue, he found it at HBO. "HBO was the cutting edge and it reached a lot of people." They were also "already deeply involved in developing new voices, new talent. He also saw in L.A. a broad diversity and multicultural internationality, components to make up a well-rounded arena of ideas and focuses. HBO went along with him.

Submission guidelines were sent out and are now coming in. Over 800 have been sent—one has been received already from as far away as Germany, to give you an idea of the generated interest. By March the field will be narrowed to 25, "diverse, talented writers" and a late Spring live presentation of the finalists will be showcased here in town. At the moment no plans are being made to film the showcase presentation of the final works but, Kaplan states, "Some writers will be invited to a training workshop" which will be for those who don't know the TV and film formats. He views this as a way of then being able to "create openings for new talent."

"Short Comedy is a good form for discovering new talent," Kaplan believes. It's also a form "I'm comfortable with." It is also a form which can showcase performing talent, which Kaplan is also looking for, which goes along with the material.

He is seeking: one-act plays, solo performance pieces or original 1/2 hour teleplays (no spec episodes). No more than 60 pages in length with no minimum of pages. The play may already have been staged but not currently under option. And a writer may submit up to three plays, or a submission containing plays, performance pieces and/or teleplays.

If you feel you can fill the bill, deadline for submissions must be postmarked by Feb. 15, 1994 (due to earthquake-related problems Kaplan told *Cash Box* there is the possibility of a deadline extension) and sent to: Steve Kaplan, c/o Wavy Line Productions, Inc., 2049 Century Park East, Suite 4200, Los Angeles, CA 90067.

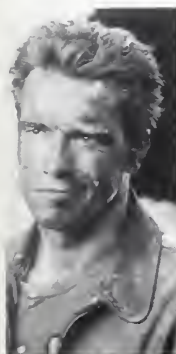

■ STING: "Shape Of My Heart" (A&M 8245)

The more we hear it, the clearer it becomes: Sting's *Ten Summoner's Tales* is simply one of the strongest musical statements that he has ever made. This awesome ballad, which comes in both studio and live versions, is the crowning moment of the album, its beautiful arrangement, touching vocals and stirring musical performance all resulting in what should be an across-the-board, multi-format smash. Featured in the film *Three Of Hearts*.



■ RUSH: "Nobody's Hero" (Atlantic 5430)

What makes the new Rush album stand out from the bulk of the band's past material is the inclusion of lyrics whose personal nature make the band far more accessible to listeners. Less space travel and sci-fi fantasy, more tales of loneliness, the threat of AIDS and keeping love alive. This cut, which is already making inroads at album rock outlets, looks to draw attention to those around us who, in their own quiet way, live the lives of true heroes. On tour.



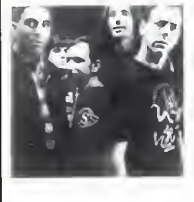
■ JAMES: "Laid" (Fontana 858 217)

Brian Eno took what was a semi-likable band in James, a curious, seven-piece outfit, and has, through the magic of his remarkable production skills, turned the band into a lean, quite listenable group whose latest album, *Laid*, was one of 1993's best releases, though few actually heard it. The title track from that album is beginning to appear on various playlists, and well it should. A fun, loose delivery and a killer choral hook bode well for this gem.



■ BAD RELIGION: "American Jesus" (Atlantic 5475)

Since forming in the S.F. Valley in 1980, Bad Religion has been a band that does things its own way, conventional wisdom and standard industry b.s. be damned. The quintet and its label, Epitaph, recently signed on with Atlantic Records, and the first fruits of that union are the re-release of 1993's fine *Recipe For Hate* album and a remix of this high-velocity rocker, a tune that snagged a good deal of vid and alt radio play when it was first issued.



PICK OF THE WEEK



■ BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN: "Streets Of Philadelphia" (Columbia 5664)

Appropriately somber song is lifted from the Epic Soundtrax album to the Tom Hanks/Denzel Washington Golden Globe winner, *Philadelphia*. This song, written and performed entirely by Springsteen, also grabbed a Globe for "Best Song From A Motion Picture." Written in the first person, this slow-moving ballad documents the struggle of a downtrodden and forgotten soul left to wander the dark streets, out of sight of an uncaring society. Like Hanks' character in the film, Springsteen's unfortunate draws on our sympathy, not because he asks for help but because he appears unable to help himself, an important distinction. One of The Boss' best.

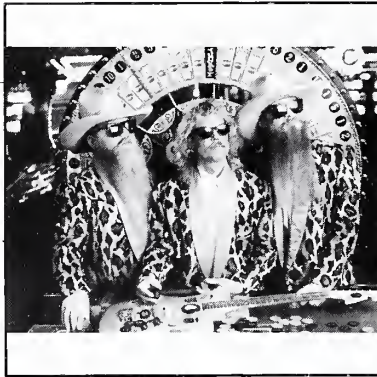

POP ALBUMS

■ MEAT PUPPETS: *Too High To Die* (London 828 484)

The Pups' first major label effort, 1991's *Forbidden Places*, fell just a bit short in the soul department, but, thankfully, Arizona's finest have come roaring back. Produced by Butthole Surfers' Paul Leary with engineering help from Dave Jerden, the trio's eighth release packs a punk/country/guitar wallop on every track. Best of the bunch includes Dead-meets-B.O.C.-ish "Never To Be Found," the pop-luscious "Flaming Heart" and Neil Young-like "Backwater."



■ I LOVE YOU: *All Of Us* (Geffen 24611)

Third album from L.A.'s stoniest crew is non-stop guilty pleasure, packed with lots o' meaty guitar riffs, solid, free-flowing grooves and enough chillin' vibe to slow down even the Dallas Cowboys. With an appreciative nod to the power of '70s guitar rock, producer Chris Goss and band have made an album full of beautiful twists and turns, positively charged lyrics and nary a nasty word. Title track and "Want Something" are key. Best alb of '94 that won't sell.



■ MARK LANEGAN: *Whiskey For The Holy Ghost* (Sub Pop 132)

Striking second solo release from Screaming Trees singer Lanegan, is, like its predecessor, a dark and stirring collection of whiskey-drenched rock 'n' soul music that's a moving companion to his work with his more commercially oriented band. Thoughtfully written and arranged, the songs on this beauty all boast a mesmerizing, powerful life of their own. Don't be surprised if this alb pushes Lanegan to be a solo artist first, a band member second. Drink up.



■ RICHARD MARX: *Paid Vacation* (Capitol 81232)

Marx's records have always been a bit hit-or-miss, with beautiful melodies (1992's "Hazzard") surrounded by inferior filler. This time out, the key word seems to be consistency, as *Paid Vacation* quickly settles into a comfortable, easy-flowing groove and stays there. The man still performs very middle-of-the-road, one-dimensional pop, but one look at his track record proves there's a large audience who enjoys the easy simplicity of it all.



■ BAREFOOT SERVANTS: *Barefoot Servants* (Epic 57503)

L.A.-based band is fronted by guitarists Jon Butcher and Ben Schultz, two players with long, rich musical backgrounds. Album and band both take inspiration from 1930s and '40s American blues, with just the right amount of updated edge and swagger added to give the group's debut a fresh, contemporary feel. Album rockers will find lots of tasty material here, with side-2 trio of "Fire And Gasoline," "Better Off Dead" and "Blackbird" the set's best.



■ KEVN KINNEY: *Down Out Law* (Mammoth 0073)

Georgia boy and Drivin' n' Cryin' singer Kinney returns with his sophomore solo effort, his first for hip indie Mammoth. Like his fine band's music, Kevn's latest is a soulful, evocative collection of folk-based rural rock, plush with Delta blues spirit and good-ole-boy wit. Unlike the band, though, *Down Out Law* is acoustic in nature, drawing on Kinney's raspy vocals and spare guitar work for strength, both reminiscent of Bob Dylan. A solid record.



■ COURSE OF EMPIRE: *Initiation* (Zoo 11054)

Ambitious Texas five-piece sports an interesting fusion-rock style that incorporates intense, often tribal, rhythmic bursts, cutting-edge guitar fills, angry industrial noise and provoking lyrics whose political and social themes indicate a band with brains as well as brawn. Second set for Zoo has multi-format potential, with first single "Infested," bulldozer-ferocious "White Vision Blowout" and the instrumental title track all worth a listen.



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PICK OF THE WEEK



■ KINGS X: *Dogman* (Atlantic 82558) Producer: Brendan O'Brien.

The artistic potential of this dramatic and quite focused progressive three-piece band seems to have finally been realized on this, the Texans' fifth album. This first collaboration with powerhouse producer O'Brien (Pearl Jam, Red Hot Chili Peppers) proves to be a winner as the trio's long-acknowledged muscular virtuosity and keen sense of dynamic in the context of hard rock is complemented by in-your-face, finely tuned studio polish. Enough, in fact, to finally earn the group its long anticipated shot at commercial success. Best tracks include soaring "Flies And Blue Skies," "Dogman," and "Pretend."

VARIOUS ARTISTS: *Big Blunts*—(Tommy Boy TBCD 1077). Producers: Various.

A toker's dream. This collection includes some of the most reknown ganja-flavored, toasted reggae and dancehall tracks available in one place. It's not all fun and games, but it does reflect the respect Generation X has for herb. Classic artists are in effect throughout this pleasingly mellow, 12-track anthology. In addition to a couple versions of "Under Mi Sleng Teng," there are tracks like "Herbman" by Yellowman and Fathead; "Legalize The Herb" by Ninjaman; Rita Marley's "One Draw;" Sugar Minott's "Herbman Hustling;" and "Under Mi Sensi" by Barrington Levy.



KURIOUS: *A Constipated Monkey* (Columbia CK 53223). Producers: Beatnuts & others.

A serious New York City vibe is evident throughout this 12-rap collection. There's less filler here, so there's less s**t to wade through. Kurious does not serve up a particularly unique flow, but he's competent and relies on some def production by the Beatnuts on most tracks to make it work. In addition to the single "Uptown *hit," executive producer Pete Nice teams with homeboy Daddy Rich to produce the autobiographical track "I'm Kurious" a jazz-laced treat. The track "Leave Ya' With This" beats and bops and "Walk Like a Duck" is indeed phat.



LISETTE MELENDEZ: *True To Life*

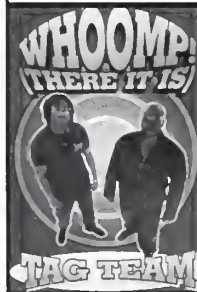

This second effort from the budding New York City dance diva is for sure "Goody Goody" (the title of the first single), but Melendez is definitely demonstrating a will to expand her horizons. Producer's Tony Moran, Kendu and Carlos "After Dark" Berrios provide a varied tapestry for her vocals. Next up single is likely to be "Will You Ever Save Me," but keep an album track eye on "Love Type Situation" and "My Warning (Take This Love and Run)." Old fans will stick close, new fans will run to it.

There's no question the title track has become a national anthem for promoting everything from basketball to soft drinks. It's a tough act to follow, since the album was so long coming. The compelling groove and easygoing party flow vocal is scarcely repeated throughout. There are some real bumpin' tracks on this record. But when you go multi-platinum with your opening single, it's tough to get people to listen to the rest. Likeable tracks, though, are "U Go Girl," "Free Style" and "Gettin' Phat."

He's one of the foremost soul crooners in the business. There's very little change in his approach. Freddie has rarely had to change his approach. The story revolves around the character Lenni (played by Blaze Berdahl) who is a talented singer discovered by the president of a sizzling record company. The mere presence of Salt-N-Pepa (the whole trio is nurturing young children), makes this significant. But to have rappers participate in this PBS special that focuses on reading and writing makes it a potential hit... On another front, indo-smoking group Cypress Hill has donated \$10,000 to a "Goods For Guns" campaign in New York City. The Sony Music recording act last week presented "Goods..." founder Fernando Mateo, who last year began handing out gift certificates in exchange for guns, with the money. It's sort of like the "Black Futures" Black History Month calendar handed out by Sony Music. The message for Feb. 1 is "Youth In Schools...Not Prison."

SOUND NIBBLES: L.A.-based rappers Anotha Level recently signed with Priority Records and their self-titled debut album will be out in March... Salt-N-Pepa will be among the performers at ESPN's *The American Sports Awards*; *The Espys*, slated to air on the network Feb. 28, the night before the Grammy Awards.

■ **ERICK SERMON:** "Safe Sex" (Def Jam/RAI/Chaos/Columbia OSK 5644).

Sermon's flow is ironclad. The production is nearly seamless. And if you need more convincing that this track is radio-ready, here's a list of the good-to-go samples Sermon includes on these four mixes: James Brown's "The Big Payback" and "Dance Floor" by Roger. You can also hear a little bit of Marvin Gaye's "Sexual Healing." The message alone is worth the air time.

■ **PARENTAL ADVISORY:** "Ghetto Head Hunt" (Savvy/MCA).

Produced by Organized Noise, this record is funky, texturally intriguing and features a synthesis of the old and new school. There's a clean single version that kicks out all the musical energy, but there's a gutbucket version that will fire up jeeps and clubs. Sir Jinx of Jinx Productions is responsible for the versions on this single from the *Ghetto Street Funk* album.

■ **KRIS KROSS:** "Da Bomb" (Ruffhouse CSK 77379).

You better watch your back, this title track comes complete with a rolling thunder phat beat, quirky synth feels, a little scratch-and-sniff turntable work. And let's not forget the youthful flow of Daddy Mack and Mack Daddy. It's the Explosive Mix remix that makes this worth a listen at radio. The package also comes complete with the LP version.



Chameleon In The Sun

HE MIGHT CRINGE AT THE NOTION that already he is an icon in music, but the 33-year-old talented bassist, composer, producer Marcus Miller has earned such accolades by being kick-ass and humble without the dichotomy being perceived as contrived. "It's really the *work I thrive on*," he recently told *Cash Box* during an interview at a North Hollywood studio where he was working on tracks for Al Jarreau. Miller's first solo album in several years, *The Sun Don't Lie*, is on the independent PRA Records domestically. It was released last May in Japan on JVC Records, where he did well enough to help, longtime artist manager Patrick Rains to launch PRA with the Miller album.

"I was beginning to feel a need to pursue some personal creative expression," Miller says, "because I had been working pretty steadily on other people's projects and been busy with [two albums] with the Jamaica Boys. So it was time for me to get busy on some more personal creative ideas." By now, the New York City native's collaborations as player, producer and writer with artists like the late Miles Davis, Luther Vandross, David Sanborn, Aretha Franklin, Kevin Eubank, Grover Washington, Jr. and many other notables have been widely chronicled.

And Miller has developed a "Dream Team" of sorts that might play a series of his favorite compositions and songs. Marcus' dream session players would be Omar Hakim/Dennis Chambers on drums, Airto/Lenny White (his Jamaica Boys partner) on percussion, Herbie Hancock/George Duke on keys and Wayne Shorter/David Sanborn working horns.

"Scoop" and "Stevland," the latter a smoldering introspective track, would lead off his top 10 song list. But two tracks he did with Miles Davis—"Tutu" and "Amadla"—also rate high on his list. Other tracks that made the cut include "The Night I Fell In Love" (with Vandross singing), "I Who Have Nothing" (a duet with Chaka Khan and Vandross), "Straight To The Heart" and "Chicago Song" (done with Sanborn) and, rounding out his set, "The King Is Gone," a tribute contained on *The Sun Don't Lie*.

"I've been blessed with the opportunity to perform [with] and produce some remarkable talent, which has challenged me to continue to excel," Miller says. "I mean, I don't sit around thinking how bad I am because I've played with Miles, or David Sanborn or Luther or Aretha. That's actually a pretty humbling realization."

■ **ERNIE WATTS:** *Reaching Up* (JVC JVC-2031-2). Producers: Akira Raguchi & E. Watts.

Ernie Watts is one of these guys who needs more recognition, even though he was a hero guest player on Rolling Stones tours. Nobody in jazz doubts his talents, especially those who have worked with him. Leading a talented aggregation that includes Jack DeJohnette on drums, Mulgrew Miller on piano,

Arturo Sandoval on trumpet and Charles Fambrough on bass, Watts showcases a number of mood and modal proclivities. He can play open, scat-like bop ("Reaching Up"), vamp-heavy bop ("Mr. Syms"), articulate pop jazz ("Transparent Sea") and Latin-tinged soul ("Inward Gance"). Watts is generous with solo space.

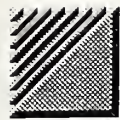

Young turks who care. That's evident from the opening track, one of the total list penned by Chestnut. Chestnut is creating a new dialect among jazz players of his generation. His sidemen—Christopher J. Thomas on bass and Clarence Penn on drums—do not get fresh on the crossover tip. Instead they find ways in the tradition to

express their youth and humor. Chestnut's playing alternates between melodic articulate lines and angular rhythmic excursions. Tracks like "Macdaddy," "Lord, Lord, Lord," "Little Ditty" are the synthesis of Chestnut's molten style. Both bassist Thomas and drummer Penn find the proper pocket for Macdaddy Chestnut.

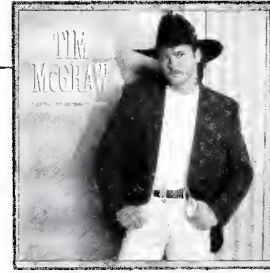

■ TIM MCGRAW "Indian Outlaw" (Curb 1073)

Certainly a unique dance tune, but does every other word have to rhyme. The only thing this indian outlaw is guilty of is the use of hokey indian instrumentals that accompany the lyrics. As gimmicky as the song may be, McGraw's distinctive vocals give this single some redeeming quality.



■ RADNEY FOSTER "Closing Time" (Arista 2652)

From the album *Del Rio, TX 1959*, Foster takes this slow-tempo tune and blends vocals and strong lyrics to create this heart-wrenching song of lost love. Written by Foster and Mark Sager, the song's concept is nothing new, but the lyrics say it so well.



■ TWISTER ALLEY "Young Love" (Mercury 1030)

It's hard to go wrong with a classic song and this is no exception. Off its self-titled Mercury album, Twister Alley uses smooth vocals and stays true to the original, written by Carole Joyner and Rick Cartey. Twister Alley's unique style will help bring a whole new and younger audience of listeners. Produced by Mike Lawler and Harold Shedd.



■ FAITH HILL "Piece Of My Heart" (Warner Bros. 6707)

It's a fair bet that Janis Joplin would roll over in her grave if she heard this remake of her signature tune. Regardless, Hill and producer Scott Hendricks have taken this classic rock song and infused it with country appeal. The single was written by Bert Berns and Jerry Ragavoy, and because the artists' styles are so different, it's almost reminiscent of Pat Boone singing the Little Richard classic, "Tutti Frutti."



PICK OF THE WEEK

■ JOHN BERRY "Your Love Amazes Me" (Liberty 79015)

Berry is no newcomer to music and has independently recorded six albums in the last six years to show for it. This single, however, is off his first self-titled Liberty album. In a time when a ballad can make or break a performer, Berry comes on strong with this single. The poetic lyrics, written by Amanda Hunt and Chuck Jones, are highlighted by Berry's soulful vocals that take this song to a passionate high.

Tanya Tucker: Super Singer

AS SIMPLE AS IT MAY SOUND, Tanya Tucker's career started one day when her father asked her at age nine, "Do you want to leave Willcox, Arizona and be a superstar or live here and be normal?" Tanya's reply, "Let's go." The rest, as they say, is history.

By the time she was 15, she had a Grammy nomination, a greatest hits package, and had graced the cover of *Rolling Stone*. Twenty years later, she's more popular than ever, playing over 200 shows a year. "I think it's just a lifestyle," Tucker says of the road. "I take personal time. I didn't get much last year but I've taken a little time here and there to be with my kids." Tanya has two children (Presley, age 4; Grayson, age 2) and says she wouldn't advise them to follow in her footsteps. "I wouldn't encourage it. I would prefer them to pick a little more stable lifestyle. Getting there is nothing, but staying there is hard."

Tucker's two previous albums, *What Do I Do With Me* and *Can't Run From Yourself* went platinum and she is currently promoting her latest album, *Soon* on Liberty. Tucker said of her long-time producer Jerry Crutchfield, "We just have a real connection in our souls. It just flows with us. He knows me so well, we have been working together since I was 17." In preparation for the album, Tucker noted Crutchfield listened to 3 or 4,000 demo tapes. Tucker said, "I listen for something that could affect me or something I've been through and sometimes it has nothing to do with me. It's mostly a feel thing with lyrics, melody and all of that piled into one.... This happens to be one of my least favorite albums and that doesn't mean much, but I think it's because it took so long and it was hard recording it."

Tanya teamed up with Black Velvet Canadian Whiskey last year to become the Black Velvet Lady, following in the footsteps of supermodels Cybill Shepherd, Cheryl Tiegs and Christie Brinkley. The partnership includes a two-year sponsorship of her "Black Velvet Lady Tour" continuing through 1994. Tucker also spearheads the national amateur two-step competition and charity fundraiser known as the

"Black Velvet Smooth Steppin' Showdown." Monies raised benefit the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, an organization for which she serves as national ambassador. Tanya says of her sponsorship, "It's been good for us. It's the first time I've had a sponsor and they've really done a great job and they're great people."

She uses similar words to describe the people in one of her more original ideas, the *Tanya Tucker Country Workout*. A 50-minute aerobic workout video, led by Tucker that's set to a soundtrack of Tanya's own songs. She tells how the video came about: "The Maier Group pushed me and this is an idea I had 10 years ago, but it just wasn't the right time. I guess with the explosion of country music it just felt like the right time to do it. I had to take one day; all day and all night to film it because I had no time. It was filmed from 11 in the morning till about one the next morning."

Tucker, whose awards are too numerous to list, says of her recent Grammy nomination for Best Country Vocal Performance, Female, "It's great, I always feel honored even though they don't treat country music very good over there. They have a different idea of what country is. When k. d. lang wins Female Country Vocalist, then something's wrong." Country music to Tanya represents, "What it always has; the roots of America. The salt-of-the-earth kind of song. It's getting better and better. I love the old stuff...but I like some of the new stuff now too. I'm just glad that people are catching up to stuff we've known for years."

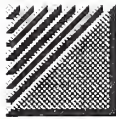
While her video for "Two Sparrows In A Hurricane" won the Academy of Country Music's Video Of The Year, and she was voted Country Music Television's (CMT) 1993 Female Video Artist of the Year, things in the video realm haven't been easy for Tucker. Controversy surrounding her video "Soon" arose quickly and the original video was not aired on CMT because of its revealing nature. Tucker said, "We talked about it, me and my director. I watched it and said, 'I don't think that's a problem,' but they [CMT] thought it was. I really don't see any big deal about it. They didn't like my leg being so revealing. Of course they didn't say a word about Ben's leg showing."

Through the years Tucker has done a lot of changing. "Now I'm an adult, and I think the women know that I've been through some of the things I'm singing about, so they can relate to that. I've found that also I'm kind of a representative for women; dependent and single mothers. All of a sudden I found women looking up to me." She adds that one of the stigmas now is that, "everybody wants to hang on to me 10 years ago. They want to bring up Glen Campbell, which is so dead and gone it's just sickening, and they don't want to let loose of that. I'm doing a lot of changing."

Her recent performance at the Super Bowl almost didn't happen. "At first the NFL said I was too wild," Tucker said. "So I told my dad [who is her manager] to tell them that I don't need football. I've been here 20 years and I don't need it. If they think I'm too wild then get somebody else. So they came back and said, 'Yeah we want you.' It's pretty cool though, because there are lots of other artists and these managers play these power roles and sometimes you get ousted out."

In a career that spans over 20 years, Tucker finds it difficult to say where her own musical career will be in years to come, but one day hopes to go into other areas of the music business. "I think I'll get into something else, like producing or management. I think I would be a great manager since I'm an artist. If I can just get me one race horse."

With no plans of quitting anytime soon, Tucker has blocked off the entire month of May and will go back into the recording studio. No stranger to controversy or the stigma of being labeled "wild," Tanya Tucker is, in reality, just living out her dream that began when she uttered the words, "Let's Go" to her father more than 20 years ago.

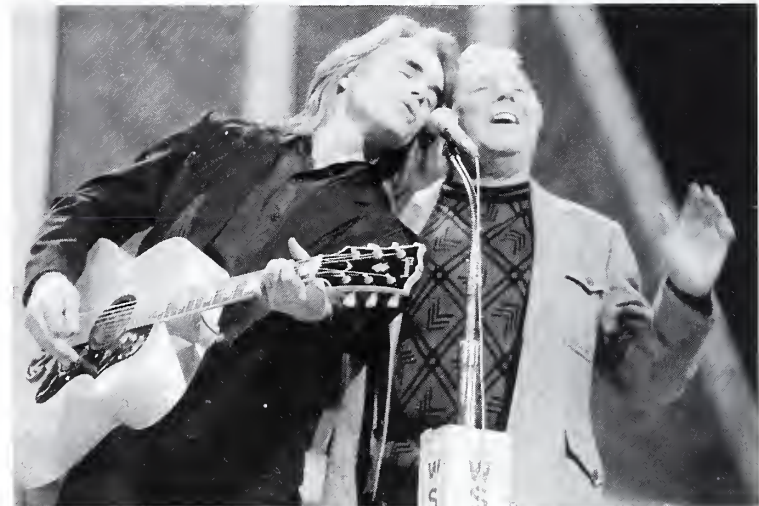

CMTA Names First Board; Stan Moser Elected President

THE CMTA DIRECTORS include Mike Coleman, president of Integrity Music; Bill Hearn, president of Sparrow Communications Group; Terry Hemmings, president of Reunion Entertainment Group; Earl Jordan, vice president of black music sales for Warner Brothers (Burbank); Neal Joseph, president of Warner Alliance; Roland Lundy, president of Word Records & Music; Jerry Park, president of Benson Music Group; Rick Pigott, president of Spring Arbor Distributors; Elwyn Raymer, general manager, gospel division of BMG Music and chairman of the GMA, Matt Seward, president of Innovative Resources; John Styll, president of CCM Communications and the GMA; Jim Van Hook, president of Brentwood Music, Moser and Joe Battaglia, president of Renaissance Communications as secretary /treasurer. Bruce Koblisch, executive director of the GMA, will advise the committee.

In official documents, the CMTA states that its mission is "to provide an environment for maximum growth and penetration of the marketplace for music-related products and services which creatively and faithfully communicate the grace and truth of the gospel throughout the world."

Three committees were established to begin the organization's work: Membership, Finance and Projects. It is anticipated that the CMTA will administrate SoundScan, if and when the technology is implemented by the industry. The organization will also be responsible for sponsorships and production of the Dove Awards telecast beginning in 1995, and will pursue industry-wide marketing initiatives and research projects.

Unlike the GMA, which has a membership comprised solely of individuals, the CMTA's membership is open only to organizations or companies involved in Christian music. Membership dues will be based on member companies' annual growth revenues. Annual dues will be \$1,000 for companies with sales under \$1 million; \$2,500 for sales of at least \$1 million but less than \$5 million; and \$5,000 for sales of \$5 million or more.

In a prepared statement, Moser said, "The CMTA will provide a venue for the development and exploitation of ventures that will benefit the Christian music industry at large. We now have a place to come together as competitive companies and share our resources to actively promote and market Christian music and increase its awareness throughout contemporary culture. The GMA board should be congratulated for initiating this new organization."

CBA Expo Attracts 3,150 Attendees To Nashville Convention

NASHVILLE—The Christian Bookseller Association (CBA) wrapped up its first Winter Expo convention last week in Nashville boasting larger-than-expected crowds and satisfied exhibitors according to CBA president William Anderson.

"We were absolutely thrilled with the way the Expo turned out," stated Williams, "Without a hitch. Attendance was more than we expected and our attendees were delighted with the event."

At final count, 770 retailers were in attendance and sales on the floor were slow but steady. Although figures were yet unavailable at press time, Anderson noted the exhibitors—161 in total—"were pleased with the number and size of orders

filled. With this year's event we made a conscious effort to shift away from conflicts with teaching seminars and exhibits hours. We tried to create a buying mart environment and were pleased with the results. Based on orders and interest retail looks healthy."

Plans are already underway for next year's Expo to take place in January at Nashville's Opryland Hotel and Convention Center.

In other CBA news, work has begun on a new educational program created for bookstore owners and employees that will take training on the road and to the bookstores in 1994.

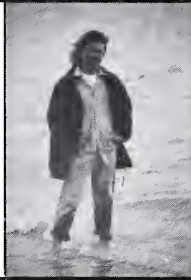

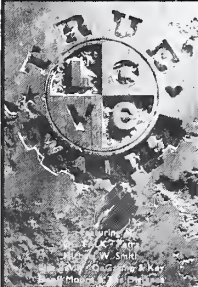
■ MICHAEL SWEET *Michael Sweet* (Benson)

■ MICHAEL CARD *Joy In The Journey; 10 Years Of Greatest Hits* (Sparrow)

With a meaty and satisfying 18 tracks to choose from, Sparrow recording artist Michael Card shows us his journey throughout 10 years of music, message, and musical teachings. *Joy...* starts off with the new recording "Chorus of Faith" an anthem that seems to appropriately tie together years of Card's work and philosophy towards music. A few songs are granted new life through a second trip to the studio. Particularly effective is Card's untraditionally moody second take on "Why" from *Scandalon*. Older cuts like 1985's "God's Own Fool" still sounds as sweet (Did Card ever sing so high?) while "Immanuel"'s orchestral arrangement is as lush and moving as ever. *Joy In The Journey* and Michael Card are a treasure.
