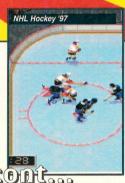

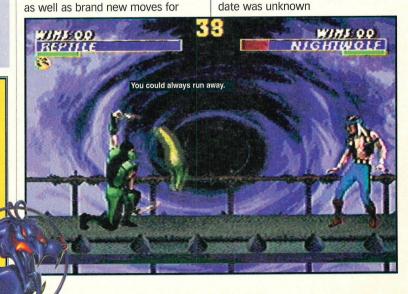

- ➤ As the 3D adventure game is so popular at the moment (Alone in the Dark, Resident Evil, Tomb Raider), it's possibly no real surprise to find that Virgin are themselves working on one. Entitled Fear The Night, all that's been leaked at the moment is that it'll be developed internally at Virgin and that we should expect something a little bit special.
- ➤ Ocean are going to be releasing all manner of bizarre products later on in the year and one of the strangest will be HMS Dreadnought. It's a flying, rendered, super-graphic 3D thing and has been causing all manner of stirrings in the PC world. It's set on the moon in the year 2095 and has you using Victorian-style crafts. Interesting, hmm?
- ➤ Ocean have jumped onto the blood-soaked *Doom/Quake* bandwagon with *Dawn of Darkness*. The game will originally appear on the PC, but a Saturn conversion will be with us by June of next year at the latest. The game features locations shot around London and you play a soldier trying to rid the country of zombies. Monsters!

Slightly miffed at missing out on the English selection we may well be, but being Welsh is contrary to popular belief - better than nothing.

- ➤ The Mortal Kombat splurge continues. We've found out through Williams themselves that Raiden is to star in his own game. Being one of the more interesting characters in the game, there's infinite amounts of possibility for an original development here, and sources close to the pig tell us that the format will follow the well-worn strategy/RPG/ action one. This would surely make a welcome change from beat-em-ups (says us), but how this will go down with hardcore MK fans will remain to be seen.
- ➤ Viper, the superb-looking helicopter arcade game from Ocean now looks to be down for a release early next year. Sources inside the company said that it was possible for a Christmas release, but they decided to wait until the game was developed to its full potential. Therefore, expect big things from Ocean around February/March time.
- ➤ We're sad to report that the Game Gear version of Street Racer will now not be released. This is certainly a great shame, as we'd played it and it was the right side of good and remarkably close to the Mega Drive original. Pointless telling you that though now, is it?
- The good news from Mev Dinc about Street Racer, though, is that as soon as development finishes on the Saturn version of Street Racer 1, they're going to begin on the sequel. More information can be found on that very subject in our exclusive interview on page 27. Go there go there with much speed.
- ➤ Core could be working on their first exclusive Saturn game that, like *Tomb Raider*, will be published through Sega. Finalities are yet to be sorted out, but we believe the game will be a 3D, polygon Streets of Rage style game, but with the likely possibility of three players simultaneously, this could well be something a little bit special.

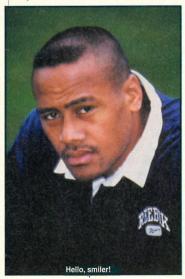

How would you feel about paying up to fifty percent less for your Saturn games? Sounds great, huh? But before you start dancing around

the room whooping with delight at the prospect, stop for a moment to consider the big picture. Like so many things, there'd have to be a trade-off somewhere.

The first moves to mid-priced Sega software has already been made in Germany, where Sega have launched the Hot Price label - putting out back catalogue stuff like Virtua Fighter and Daytona for the equivalent of £22. Sony, meanwhile launching a similarly priced range for Playstation titles in Japan, and both parties have plans for something similar in the UK, £25-£35 being the price range mooted for Sega's line due as early as the end of Summer. Malcolm Miller, chief executive at

Sega UK has already told trade newspaper CTW that 'It's clear there is a need to offer lower prices for younger consumers who haven't got as much disposable income, and for others who maybe bought the Saturn a while ago but couldn't afford to get all the titles they wanted first time around."

The trouble is, this pattern of budget re-releases has been introduced on other formats previously, and always with a detrimental effect - witness the accelerated decline of the Spectrum and Amiga games markets. After all, if everybody wants to wait for a cheaper re-release, fewer people will buy new titles. This forces the budget releases to follow closer on the heals of the full price launches, and new games are squeezed further and further out of the marketplace. Hit games become rarer, companies lose money, and faith in the format is

If this happens before the Saturn has had a few years to fully establish itself, the result could be less titles of NiGHTS calibre and more releases which have had far less money invested in them. Granted, a lower price point will win the war against Nintendo, but it would make far more sense to lower the standard retail price point than mess around with mid and budget-priced rereleases. Indeed, MicroProse's Tim Christian foresees that Sony and Sega will even reduce their standard retail prices to around £30. "How could a mass market then develop around a machine [the N64] with games selling at £70?" Let's hope that will be a strategy Sega adopts. Then game players, game developers (everyone except Nintendo, in fact) will be a winner.

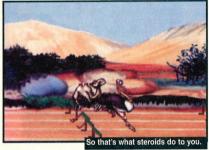

## **Game of The Month**

**NIGHTS** 

Saturn, Sega, Issue 82, 92%

After many arguments and raising of fists, it was finally decided that NiGHTS should be our Game of The Month. True, NIGHTS is graphically the most impressive thing you're likely to see this year on the Saturn, but in the playability stakes it was felt (by us, anyway) that the likes of Exhumed gives it a run for its money. NIGHTS does get better, though, the more you play it. The first time you get a link of over 100 is a moment to savour, when you find Reala and play the two-player game makes your eyes pop out and yes, it is original and yes, despite the hype I have to admit that NiGHTS is rather a special game.



#### **Exhumed**

Saturn, issue 83, 91%

One game that quietly arrived this month with small amounts of fanfare and an almost apologetic smile was Exhumed. Programmed to be the very first Doom variant for the Saturn, it has the unfortunate timing to go out head-to-head with Alien Trilogy. This is a shame, as Exhumed stuffs it cleanly at every count... it's just that I feel people will be swayed by the fancy license.



#### **Alien Trilogy** Saturn, this issue, 83%

Yeah, not bad. Things looked good when Acclaim announced they'd be doing a Doom-style game based on all of the Alien films. The game, however, slightly fails to live up to expectations. The graphics are fine and there's plenty of weapons and atmospheric sound effects, but the levels are too small and the game's

certainly too easy. Not quite

the game we hoped for.



#### Discworld

Saturn, issue 81, 81%

For what Discworld tries to do, it actually manages it quite well. As a graphic adventure with mild amounts of Terry Pratchett-styled humour, rucksack-sized dollops of locations and excellent handdrawn graphics, Discworld is rather pleasing. It will obviously appeal only to fans of Mr. Pratchett or this style of game, but isn't that the case with all of them?



## **Story of Thor 2** Saturn, issue 81, 69%

Taking the graphically superb Mega Drive game and improving only slightly on it could be classed as a mistake. Story of Thor 2 fails to impress with either the graphics, design or complexity of the game. While it might be called stupid to expect much more from inexperienced Saturn programmers, the upcoming Dark Saviour shows what can be done.



#### Earthworm Jim 2 Saturn, issue 82, 20%/85% (if you're new to the game)

Ugh. Taking one of the best platform games ever and putting it in the hands of little more than amateurs for the Saturn conversion wasn't the cleverest thing Shiny ever did. Apart from a few more colours and a couple of extra layers of parallax scrolling, this is the Mega Drive version. A fact that is completely inexcusable.

published which predicts that the Saturn's Japanese lead over the PlayStation is set to widen. In March 1996, both Sega and Sony held 42% of the market. The introduction of the N64 is expected to hit sales of the PlayStation far more than the Saturn, bringing Sony's share down to 36%. This will mean renewed Developer interest in the Saturn, who have up to taken a 'wait and see' attitude to the machine.

>> Tom Kalinske, the chief of Sega of America, has accepted a job with another company. This follows a wider reshuffle of top Sega suits which has seen new arrivals and sackings. The aim is to concentrate more effort on developing PC games so that the company doesn't have to rely solely on the success of the Saturn (normal business practice).

⇒ Guess what? We've just discovered that the cheaper Saturn internals have actually been on-sale in American Saturns since last August! This means that Sega could have sold the Saturn in the USA for much less than they did — at a price Sony would have been unable to match. This might have secured US market leadership.

In response Sega say, "We have never made money on hardware, we make it selling software. By changing to the cheaper version, we still weren't making a profit. We do understand the need of for price advantage and we dropped the price as soon as was possible."

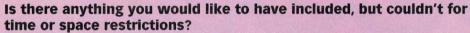
## The developers speak!

Not only are Vivid Image the developers of ALL things Street Racery, they also had a sausage-sized finger in the pie of Second Samurai for the Mega Drive and First Samurai on the Amiga and PC before that.

We take off our hats to Vivid Image as we think they're clever, sensitive and know a hell-of-a-lot more about programming than any of us. With that in mind, we talked to Vivid Image's big boss character, Mevlut Dinc, about the past, present and misty future of computer games and everything.

## How happy are you with the 32-Bit versions of Street Racer?

I am very happy. I always knew we'd pull something rather excellent out of the hat. It just shows that with hard work and effort you can achieve the best possible. That's what we've always enjoyed doing and gained our reputation from that. Even from the early days on the Amiga, ST and now we're doing it on the super consoles.



No, nothing at all. Obviously we took the game from a successful format, but we've done everything that we wanted to.

#### Have we come to the end of the road now with Street Racer?

We'll shortly start work on the sequel and we've got very ambitious ideas for it. Apart from the Street Racer name there's unlikely to be anything there in common with this version – we'll try to keep the gameplay intact though, but it'll possibly be improved.

#### How long has Street Racer Saturn taken you?

13 months, which isn't very long considering we had to learn how to program the machine. We knew what we wanted to do with it, but we had to spend an awful long time learning the hardware to be able to do that little bit more than other people can — which we think we have.

## What's your own, personal favourite aspect of the game?

Apart from the technical achievements in the game, other things I'm most proud of are the simultaneous 8 player options, the fact that it's running at 60 frames-per-second and the sheer depth of the gameplay. There's just so many hidden extras in the game. I think that's what's really been lacking in 32-Bit software. There's some good looking products out there, but not great games. Street Racer is definitely one of those and the more people play, the more they'll discover.

## If you could've written any game in history, what one would it be... and why?

Definitely the Mario games. They demonstrate what good games should be about. There's lots of hidden stuff and, like Street Racer, the more you play the more you discover. Also, as a really playable game, Geoff Crammond's Stunt Racer.

triumphed so does this. Here, in a nutshell, we have a highly playable, stupidly addictive piece of software. Not faultless, by any means, but thoughtful and well designed nonetheless.

As is the norm for this type of product, the player is immediately treated to some substantial statistics. You can make as much or as little of this as you want. If you're "into" players' heights, weights, histories and jockstraps then you'll be well at home with *NHL*'s system. There are 32 teams to choose from with actual NHL players included as well as eight choices of game

including Play Offs, Tournaments, Shoot Outs and Friendlies.

The action is viewed from a top-down perspective and effortlessly flows from end to end providing some exciting confrontations (especially if you take advantage of the excellent multiplayer facility). Problems keeping up with the high speed puck occur but

that's just something you accept with ice hockey games. In fact most of the time you're encouraged to build movements from the back which helps spread the play and create space.

On top of this, there

are also a couple of extra features: firstly, the transfer system which allows you to try your hand at spending and investing and, secondly, the Edit facility which gives you free reign to

build your own team from scratch.

# **Nightmareans**

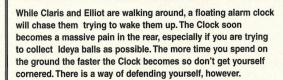




The enemies on the main levels are pretty few and far between. They attack in different ways, such as freezing NiGHTS in mid-flight and causing him to drop to the ground encased in a block of ice, or electrifying NiGHTS and giving him a five second time penalty. They can be a bloody nuisance and have a nasty habit of grabbing you just as you are about to return to NiGHTS' prison, so it's best to take them out with a paraloop as soon as possible. This also earns you 200 or 400 points.

# Beat the clock









When the Clock gets close to you jump up and try and land on his head. If your timing is correct this will knock the Clock over and buy you some time to put some distance between the pair of you until he recovers. The fastest way of getting around on foot is to keep pressing the jump button while your character is in mid flight to give a bigger jump or tumble.

# Get A-Life!



One of the most intriguing things about NiGHTS is the revolutionary Artificial Intelligence system it uses. The cherublike Nightopian characters actually evolve when you play the game.



Having experimented with different save positions we've seen how they react in different situations. If you're nasty to them in following games, they'll run away from you or throw sticks and snow balls at you.



On the other hand if you treat them kindly they will wave and smile at you. Your happy world will be littered with Nightopian eggs that will hatch in front of your eyes.



In every game you will find the Nightopians in different locations doing different things (fishing, having snowball fights, shoplifting). The music also remixes itself the more you play.

# **Tricks**

When NiGHTS passes through the blue and yellow bonus hoop, he has a set amount of time to perform some acrobatic tricks. If you're quick you can pull off ten at a time. The score you get is determined by the number of tricks you do and their complexity.

You can perform the tricks by pressing combinations of the left and right triggers and moving the D-Pad in various directions. While performing a trick you can considerably increase your score by killing a enemy with a paraloop or by collecting bonus items at the same time. There are 35 different tricks that NiGHTS can perform (if anyone has found out any more write in and let us know). Here is a list of all of them:

Links are the most important way of achieving a high score in the game. Links are earned by flying through successive hoops or stars and spheres at speed. Once you have learnt the layout of a course, it's possible to create huge links The Sega Power record now stands at 120 links and we strongly suspect that it's possible to do more! It's best to try and collect your 20 Ideya spheres and drop them off as quickly as possible. This lets you get on with the serious business of bonus time as well as getting the Ideya Palace out of your way (useful as it usually lies in the best link up path).

# Paralooping and spin drilling



NiGHTS can use two different forms of attack, the first of which is the Paraloop. This attack consists of quickly circling an enemy to form a vortex around him, pulling him into the void. The Paraloop can also be used for picking up large numbers of power-ups by circling them.



The second attack is the Spin Drill. To pull off this move press either A, B or C and direct NiGHTS through the objects. If you include a Bonus ball in your link-up path not only will you be scoring extra points for your links but a stream of bonus points will also be yours.

# On foot



We were a bit disappointed when we realised that the only time Claris or Elliot were free to roam around the landscape was when NiGHTS had run out of time flying and had crash landed. Once this has happened Claris or Elliot have either to collect up 20 Ideya spheres and deposit them into a Ideya Palace or (if NiGHTS has already deposited enough Ideya spheres) return to NiGHT's prison and start the next course. (This almost certainly guarantees a F rating so you might as well reset and



start again.) However, there are some things that Claris and Elliot can do on foot that can earn big points and contribute to your score to get that all important overall 'A' rating.

At the beginning of each world Claris or Elliot arrive in front of NiGHTS' Prison where they are robbed of their Ideya orbs by the Nightmarens that inhabit that world. Instead of walking into the prison and bonding with NiGHTS, Claris or Elliot can wander around the landscape and collect



Ideya spheres that are lying around. Some of them are just sitting there waiting to be collected others are hidden (in trees, for instance) and some are suspended in the air and can be reached by jumping or climbing up on things and then leaping in the direction of the spheres. You can also find paddles that can be hit to release Ideya spheres. If you continue jumping up and hitting these, Bonus stars are released and you can form links (we've managed 17), bumping up your score nicely. In some



worlds there are over 100 balls to collect (you can only carry 99 at a time).

Once you are satisfied with the score you have achieved and the amount of Ideya spheres you have collected on foot, return to NiGHTS' prison and you can start the first course with enough Ideya spheres to go straight to the Ideya palace and finish it off. This means that your bonus time will start immediately, allowing you far more time to pick up a huge bonus score.

# Course 1



O Use this spring on the larger course to speed up NiGHTS. This Cage contains eight Ideya spheres (as they all do) and is located to the left of where the fountains first bounce you onto the smaller course. It is wise to leave the cages until you are in bonus time, since they are then worth twice as much.



This giant double loop which has a star in the middle is worth sixty points and is at the end of the larger course, We recommend that you stick to the smaller course though.



O NiGHTS' prison is the starting point of the course. The first thing to collect are the two stars above the prison and then paraloop around the six spheres and then hit the bonus ball and attempt to do a 10 link.

You can use the fountains to bounce NiGHTS into a smaller course which has better bonuses in it. Just fly into the top of the fountain after collecting the stars.

The Ideya Palace is placed just before the two fountains.

Described enthusiastically as 'the worst console racing game I've ever played' (James) it's hard to get excited about something so duff. There's only ever one other car to race against, the two player mode doesn't work and the cars handle like turds on a skidpan, Terrible.

# LAYER SECTION

#### Taito £49.99 SP 75 79%

A frantic shoot-'em-up so loyal to the arcade version they haven't bothered to take the 'Insert Coin' instruction off. It's also damn near impossible with a joypad but worth the coinage with a chunky arcade joystick. Better than the average import game.



#### LEGEND OF THOR Sega £49.99 SP 81 54%

Out on import and thus rather expensive, LoT is another botched attempt at a Saturn RPG. The graphics are risible with no attempt at sprite scaling, no landscape work and no 3D stuff at all. Character interaction is limited, the fighting simplistic and

overall it just isn't worth the effort



# LOADED Gremlin £44.99 SP 83 82%

The PlayStation's premium shooter

gets a Saturn outing and looks none the worse for wear for it. The violence is well over the top and its fun for a while (especially in two-player mode) but the gameplay is ultimately shallow and can get very dull rather quickly.



#### MANSION OF THE HIDDEN SOULS Sega £39.99 SP 75 68%

A thinly disguised re-working of the Mega CD game, this spooky puzzler falls plumply into the 'easy' category. The general atmosphere is good, butterflies flutter (eh?) and disembodied heads float but the gameplay ultimately falters.

An impressive conversion from the best-selling PC version of the game, this has you riding a magic carpet, battling wizards over the possession of manna and ogling some of the neatest landscape graphics we've seen on the new super-console. Challenging, innovative and intelligent - that's what we said way back in Issue 78.



#### **MORTAL KOMBAT 2** Acclaim £44.99

SP 75 89%

The old 2D beat-'em-up is not a game for those looking for the latest next generation thrill. It is, however for those hankering for the good old days of the Mega Drive. It's arcade perfect but hardly next generation gaming. It still gives a ripping good play, however, even though it's now been a bit overtaken by some newer games.



#### MYST Sega £40 SP 73 78%

One of the best looking puzzle/adventure games around, *Myst* errs on the tricky and often strays onto the difficult side of things. Polygon people playing polygon basketball. NBA Action has all the stats, teams and players that you could wish for but the overall gameplay is a little uninspired and the graphics not nearly as impressive as Slam 'n' Jam. A pat on the back must go for the multiple view options on offer though

At first glance, it's a racing game over the roughest terrain. In actual fact, it's a bounty hunting race over whatever gets in the way. The subtle difference

is that cash is the most important bit. The game is bright and cheerful with loads of levels but a very poor split screen/ two player option let it down

#### OLYMPIC SOCCER

US Gold £44.99 SP 83 83%

Polygon people playing polygon football, Olympic Soccer caused ructions in the office. Some people likd the excellent play characteristics (like headers and volleys) whilst some just laughed at the rather sub standard graphics and option screen layouts OS is about the most playable of the Saturn footy games. If it looked even a bit better it'd be worth well over 90%



#### OUTLAWS OF THE LAST DYNASTY Data East £39.99

Three words not associated with Outlaws are, Imagination, Skill and Originality. A more enjoyable game would be to find three different uses for the disc - shaving mirror, frisbee or attractive earing. This beat-'em-up looks like a liquidised version of everything you've seen before. The result is not worth the bus fare home.

A dark and tricky 3D shoot-'em-up type thing. Each stage has a none-toostraightforward mission objective. While you're working out what to do, there are truck loads of things to blast, avoid and be hit by. Good action especially from the cockpit angle.



# EA £44.99

SP 83 81%

The game of the Games Workshop role playing adventure. It's *Doom* with tactics as you have to control not only your character but a team of terminators as well. The monsters are well drawn but the action can get pixellated at times. The tactical element should give the game longevity but might put off a lot of the people who like their out and out shooting action



#### TREET FIGHTER ALPHA

#### Virgin £44.99 SP 79 81%

Yes, it's Street Fighter with a few new characters, a few old ones, new combos and new super combos. It's certainly one of the better 2D fighters on the Saturn but not the update we'd hoped for. It's a toss-up between this. Virtua Fighter 2, Night Warriors and Ultimate Mortal Kombat 3.



# Acclaim £44.99 SP 82 89%

With Euro '96 in full swing, Acclaim quietly release this little game programmed by Rage Software. Whilst it may not boast a club side option, real player names or fancy motion capture, it plays very well indeed. The accent is on arcade pick up and playability rather than full blown simulation but that only adds to the frenetic pace of the game. We didn't think it stood a chance against the opposition but were pleasantly surprised. A worthy alternative to the big guns of FIFA '96 and Euro '96.



#### THE HORD BMG £39.99 SP 79 69%

It's reasonably original - a sort of cross between a god game and a slash-'em-up but it doesn't really master either game style. The music and sound effects are nicely atmospheric but the graphics and the gameplay are a too repetitive for comfort. It's got some good ideas but that's it. It's average



# **Bullfrog £45** SP 73 92%

A conversion from the PC CD ROM, this civilisation sim still outshines the rest of the class. To get your theme park up and running you have to be a bit more careful with the readies than in the Mega Drive version. The added benefit is that you get to have virtual 'go' on most of the rides thanks to the multi-rendering capabilities of the Saturn. A quiet game and one for all the budding capitalists out there.

# Core £44.99 ✓ SP 75 91%

A superb crossover of shoot-'em-up. helicopter flight simulator and tactical game. Mission briefings are excellent and the difficulty level rises at the perfect pitch. Detail in the hovering is

exceptional but the scenic clipping can be a little harsh. By far the best shooter on the Saturn.

#### TRUE PINBALI

#### Ocean £39.99 SP 77 83%

The best pinball sim on the Saturn, it gives a two fingered salute to Sega's Digital Pinball disaster. There is the occasional double-take when the bearing squirts arse-ways but there's plenty here for a good game. And four significantly different tables give reasonable value for money.

# **GT Interactive £44.99**

A perfect port of the arcade Mortal Kombat 3 and an MK fan's dream come true. Loads of the old characters make a re-appearance (there are 22 in all) and all the Fatality/Babality/Animality nonsense is there in full 32-Bit beauty. More than could have been expected. Better than the 2D rest.



#### VALORA VALLEY GOLF Virgin £35

# SP 79 32%

Six different options and multi-player options lift this game's score out of single figures, but only just. After that the negatives start ringing in. The American commentary is annoying and there's only one course for your fifty bucks. On top of that, it's slow, the control system's far from perfect and it's all just a bit boring.



# JVC £39.99

# SP 74 82%

The main aim of this boxing sim is to climb the rankings and go for the title. To prepare for the big bout, practise pummelling the soft headed sparring partners and replay the best moments from up to twelve angles. If it's a boxing game you want then this is the only one you need.



#### VIRTUA COP Sega £59,99/£45.99

# ✓ SP 75 92%

Surprisingly durable shoot-'em-up best played in two player mode and with the 'make my day' gun. Considering the linear design, lack of tactics and variation, there's a surprising pleasure to blasting away the bad guys, especially when they react according to where they're hit. A basic game that plays well above itself.

So you've made your decisions, withdrawn your money and you're ready to plunge into the world of second-hand or mail order gaming. Before you do, take a look at the following to ensure your buying safety.

Buying second hand/reduced price stock is not without its risks and certainly not as simple as going to your local Electronic Boutique. However, with a bit of knowledge and the sense to take the right precautions, you can buy and save with relative safety.

# Second hand shops

Second hand shops owe their customers the same statutory rights as any other shops. The goods they sell must be fault free unless the fault can be attributed to reasonable wear and tear or was pointed out at the time of sale. It is also an offense for the shop keeper to lie or make false claims about an item of merchandise. If you receive an assurance that the games or hardware you buy are in good working order, then you are covered if they don't.

Second-hand shops remain the bargain-hunter's safest hunting ground as most rely on their good reputation to make a living and they won't try to rip you off.

Ask to see your purchase working in the shop - if the place is any good, they won't mind. Look up your local shops/exchanges in Yellow Pages.

#### Computer shop sales

Pretty self-explanatory this one. Most big computer stores have sales, some at the oddest times of the year. Look out for some severe reductions on older (especially Mega Drive) titles.

#### Boot sales

Including jumble sales and the rest. The prices here can be truly eye-opening, but you really do take your chances. Because most car booters are not professional traders they owe their customers fewer obligations. Goods sold do not have to be fault free but they must be as described (it's still illegal to lie).

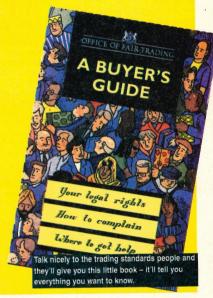
If possible, ask to see your

purchase working. The golden rule is to ask for as many assurances from the stallholder as possible and listen carefully to their answers - it is actually quite hard to lie convincingly. Also never think that the first price you're quoted is somehow set in stone - it's amazing how much it can drop if you seem likely to walk away.

# Small ads

Small ads in the specialist press are quite a good way to get hold of old games, although the prices charged for hardware are often unrealistic. How you actually go about exchanging the goods and money is a question to decide between you and the other person involved but, if you go through Sega Power we will try and sort out any problems that you might have.

If you have any enquiries about secondhand goods or wish to make a complaint against a particular trader, contact your local Trading Standards Office. You'll find their number in the phone book.



# TEN STEPS TO SAFETY

When you're buying from any mail order company, it's worth following these Sega Power guidelines:

- BEFORE YOU send any money, ring the supplier to make sure the item you require is in stock. Ask questions about the company's policy on delivery and returns of faulty equipment. Make sure there are no hidden costs such as postage and packaging. Find out when you can realistically expect to receive your goods.
- ALWAYS READ the small print on adverts.
- companies that do not answer or return your calls
- BY FAR the best method of payment is by credit card. If ordering goods of more than £100 in total value remember that you are legally entitled to claim compensation from some credit companies if the retailer goes bust. Check your credit card company's policy. You can also try to get extra insurance in advance if you want.
- 0
- for an order number. When ordering anything over the telephone, always double-
- IF YOU are sending a cheque, keep a note of the cheque number, the date and the exact value. Make sure you know the exact name of the mail order company. 0
- WHEN YOU receive your goods, check them carefully. If anything is missing or faulty, contact the supplier immediately. 0
- ALWAYS ORDER from the most recent issue of Sega Power. (9)
- IF A PROBLEM does arise, contact the supplier in the first instance. Calmly and misunderstandings that can easily be resolved. If you think you have a genuine grievance, contact your local Trading Standards Officer. The number is in the

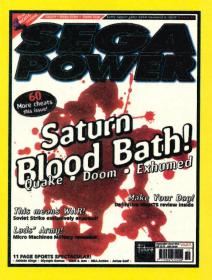

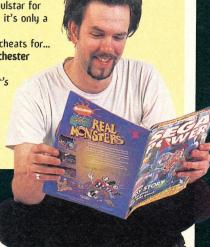

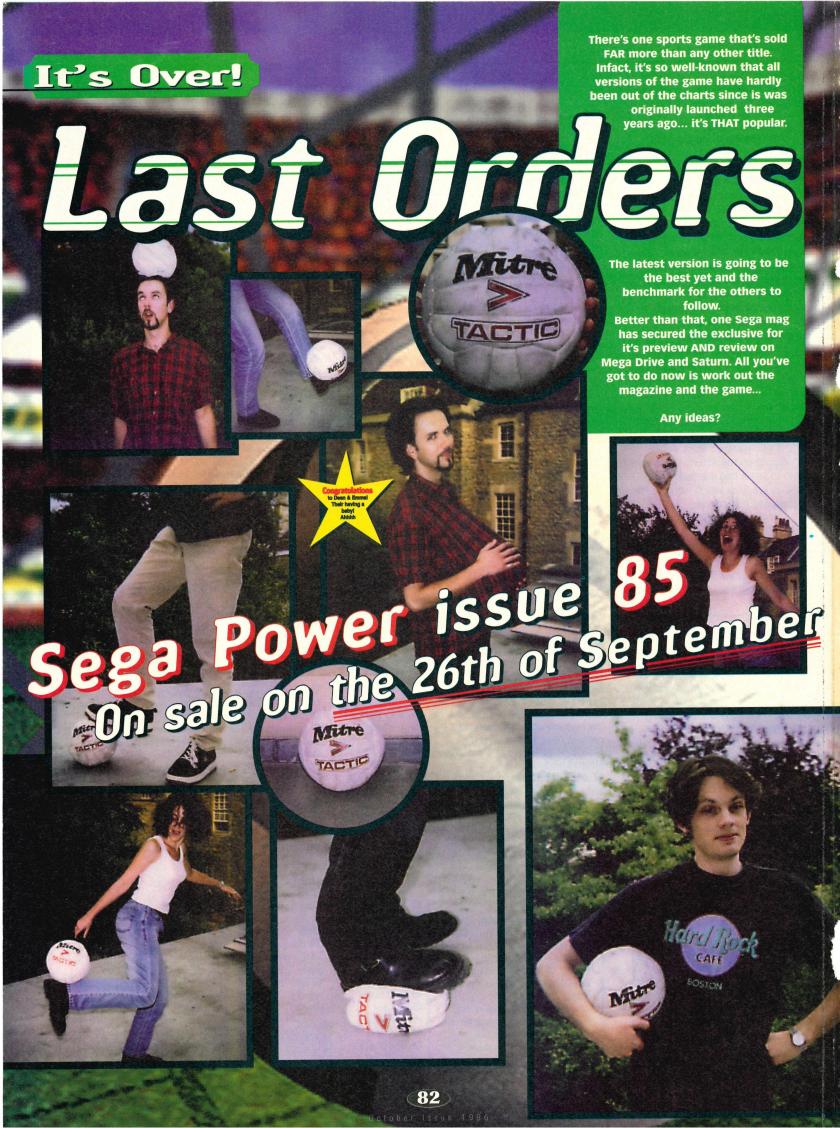
